Turn Over a New Leaf!

BOUT two weeks ago I appeared on your 'Teen Age Trials' program with my daughter who wanted to marry a man seventeen years her senior," said a recent letter to producer Stanley Brady. "This man also had a six-year-old child. He refused to tell what he did for a livelihood.

"Thanks to your program and to Judge Marchetti's advice, the man in question seems to have vanished from the earth. My daughter, I am happy to say, is a very changed girl."

This letter is only one typical of many received by this KRCA series. Each week, when a teen-age panel and a well known

ind a well known judge guest on "T e e n A g e Trials," they express candid opinions on two problems. One is set forth in a letter to the show and the other is presented in person by a masked teen-ager accompanied by masked parent.

The advice offered is so amazingly sound that it is invariably followed. "We hit just about 1000 per cent," Brady disclosed.

An unusual facet of the program is that it grew out of Brady's own problems with his teen-age daughter (now happily married). He is convinced that he should do everything possible to help other parents and children.

Successful Drive

One of the greatest accomplishments of "Teen Age Trials" has been its drive to abolish sale of knives to teen-agers. Shortly after two young boys were attacked with knives, they were brought on the teleshow where moderator Paul Pierce explained the gravity of the situation and civic leaders agreed that preventive steps should be taken. Apparently there had been a law since 1951 prohibiting carrying of such instruments by teen-agers, but no law making it a misdemeanor to sell them. As a direct result of the campaign waged by "Teen Age Trials," the supervisors passed a bill prohibiting the sale of knives with blades three inches or longer to minors.

made his own brass knuckles and black jacks and sold them at school. He was advised by both Judge Nye and the teen-age panel that he was off on the wrong track. In fact the judge stated that he was open to arrest.

"As a result of our program, this boy is now active in the Y." Brady said proudly. "He's also in Boy Scouts and De Molay."

The Man With Ideas-

Jack Douglas is one man who refuses to believe that TV is only for the re-run of old movies. That's why his shows have been so original and provocative.

ACK DOUGLAS recently presented a new show on KCOP called "Kingdom of the Sea." Once more he reiterated his faith in what television can accomplishand once more he gave to the public something challenging, informative, and entertaining.

Jack has never been content to sit back and let others explore new fields. He has come a long way on the TV scene—but he has now hit his stride, and of all the producers he is probably the one most worth watching.

Sea Show

"'Kingdom of the Sea' is the first show I deliberately set out to create." Jack stated firmly. "With 'I Search For Adventure' well launched both locally and on a syndicated basis and with 'Golden Voyage' on its way, I wanted to try my hand at something else. We had covered the land pretty well with the other two shows, Disney had taken care of the fantasy part, and the world of the sky was still too much theory, so there was only one place left to gothe world of the sea. This was the first program devoted entirely to the sea. We are going to cover every phase of this marine life—from the pearl divers and skin divers to the deep.

"Most of the show consists of film but we also had a giant and somewhat foresighted aquarium built for the 'live' segments of the program. The aquarium has three sides of steel and one side of herculite glass which was built for us by the Pittsburgh Glass Company.

"Colonel John D. Craig was a natural choice to star in this new show. He was the only person ever to appear on 'I Search For Adventure' more than twice—and he has made seven appearances. He has a tremendous background in adventure. He was one of the first men ever to exploit and develop underwater photography in b'ack and white and in color and he has written several popular books on adventure. He, with JACK DOUGLAS, man with ideas. He has originated three outstanding new shows recently with "I Search for Adventure," "The Golden Voyage," and "Kingdom of the Sea."

some good looking male and female skin divers, will illustrate the high points of the film for the program.

"I have great confidence in this show—so much so that I think 'I Search For Adventure' will have a fight on its hands.

"I don't plan to concentrate less on 'Search,' that's for sure. My weekends are still very much taken up with screening all the adventure films I receive from all parts of the world. Most of my TV activities will now be centered on this adventure type of show since I believe that is the new trend on television. Look at the increasing number of people who are traveling these days, look at the popularity of travelogue films and lectures.

"I hope to be to TV in the field of real life adventure what Disney has been to fantasy. And I know that's a big statement to make."

Jack then put on the boxing gloves and issued a direct challenge to TV and its future.

Challenge To TV

"TV misses in that it keeps its cameras inside too much." he said firmly. "It wasn't invented just for panel games and quiz shows. It has to get outside, to show life as it is. We simply haven't learned how to use TV yet. It can be far greater than it is.

"It's not the advertisers' fault that TV hasn't as yet gone as far as it should. They can only buy what the industry makes. As things stand now, television, at least in my opinTHAT'S COL. ion, is primarily a miniature motion picture theatre in the home. It's not meant to be an adjunct or a sidearm of the movies. As the motion picture industry has found that it must furnish a broader scope of entertainment than that on TV, so TV must find a type of entertainment that can't be duplicated or bettered by the movies."

It is natural that Jack's emphasis has been on adventure since he is vitally interested in travel and in the exciting things that some men and women do in real life. But there is more to his shows than this—there is an avid search for something new something different, something previously overlooked by TV.

And yet at home Jack lives a quiet life with his wife and two sons. He gets his adventure here by reading mystery books.

"I can think of no greater luxury than propping myself up in bed and reading Erle Stanley Gardner's mysteries and munching away on a candy bar," Jack laughed. "Of course, my family and I watch a lot of TV and 'Disneyland' is our top favorite. Disney is nothing short of a genius. We also like Paul Coates, 'U.S. Steel Hour.' and 'Lassie.' As for my children's TV fare, I've begun monitoring their programs. It's incredible what some stations put on the air for children to see! Why isn't some discretion, some sense used?"

Jack Douglas is the kind of man TV needs—a man with vision, someone who never settles for the obvious and the routine. How the networks could use him!

More than ever before, TV-Radio Life is becoming color-conscious.

Mental Health TV-airings

The "March of Medicine's" recent airing "We, the Mentally Ill," which originated from St. Elizabeth's Hospital in Washington, D.C. may be the fore-runner of a new trend in television series.

"Medic," which delves into both physical and mental problems had a national rating of 27.9 in the national ARB ratings for April. "Medic" has has gained rating wise since the show's in-ception. Obviously there is an audi-ence for shows dealing with health problems.

There are several series on tap deal-ing with psychiatric problems, "Point of Crisis," a dramatic series based on psychiatric and mental health prob-lems will be filmed at the Hol Roach Studios with the full endorsement and co-operation of the American Psychiatric Association, whose members in-clude more than 8,000 practicing psy-chiatrists. The A.P.A. has made avail-able to Hal Roach technical advice from eminent consultants and access to factual material and to hospitals and clinics.

TV producer Frank Cooper is work-ing on another series "This Is Psy-chiatry," but has stated that he is not in a position at present to reveal too much about the series.

The format is nebulous at present except for the fact that it will be a documentary-drama series. Mr. Cooper feels certain however that a TV series dealing with mental problems has an insured audience and shows of this nature could become a growing trend.

It's also been reported that Jack Barry will co-produce "Conflict," with the help of the National Association for Mental Health.

It appears as though psychology is going to become an important part of the television scene. KNXT's Dr. Herman Harvey becomes a pioneer in this field. His "Psychology on TV" bowed on Channel 2 last September.

I CLANGED THE BELL ON A MINI-ATURE old-time trolley car, walked the gangplank onto the gleaming white paddle-boat which will ply the Rivers of America. In the warehouse I tweaked the ears of the make-believe rhinos which will infest the tropical waters of Adventureland and will "threaten" passengers on their exciting cruise.

TWO MONTHS TO GET THE PARK READY for visitors doesn't seem like much time, but things are moving at a merry clip and knowing how Disney works, we may all rest assured that the press preview will come off in grand style on Sunday, July 17, with the general opening to follow. In the acreage adjoining the castle some men were even taking the ponies around the riding rings so that they'll be accustomed to their routines.

DURING MY VISIT I WAS TOLD that admission price had just been set. For adults, \$1.00 plus tax; children under twelve, 50 cents. This ticket will admit the person to all parts of the park, but will not include any of the special rides which will be features of each "land." For example, in Tomorrowland there will be the Autopia car ride, a speed boat ride and a rocket ride to the moon. In Frontierland there will be stagecoach, buckboard, cone-stoga and river boat rides; in Fantasyland there'll be the Peter Pan, Tea Party, Alice in Wonderland, Snow White and other rides. FOR SOME MONTHS WE have all been watching eagerly while Danny Thomas won awards and "Disneyland" not only lugged off its share of Emmies but kept climbing up and up on the rating charts. Then recently ABC-TV got the Pabst Blue Ribbon Fights for next fall, announced an affiliation with Warner Bros. to produce a onehour weekly TV show on Tuesday evenings and hinted that other big things were in the offing.

COULD IT BE THAT THE NUMBER 3 network was really going to town to give NBC and CBS some stiff competition? When did the tide really turn for ABC? What are the goals?

WELL. I FOUND OUT THAT WE MAY WIND up with three strong networks. At least this is a completely reasonable possibility, according to Mr. Hudson, who pointed out that prime time on the other skeins has been difficult to obtain, thus creating a hardship for certain would-be sponsors desirous of using television to boost sales. A strong third network makes Class A time open for these businesses, a situation which, according to Hudson, "has a fine economic connotation." He added that "the time is over-ripe for three large networks." What a break for the viewer!

ANSWERING MY CURIOSITY ABOUT the long-range planning entering into the now-rapid rise of ABC-TV, Hudson went on to explain that when the AB-PT merger took place about five years ago, exploration began at once on TV as a basis for expanding the joint operation. "Disneyland," which mlght conceivably have landed on another network had it not been for certain issues which couldn't be ironed out, simply speeded up the network's overall schedule. "It was the first of our major efforts to be finalized," according to Hudson. Now, as we all know, Disney is coming onto ABC-TV this fall with his fabulous "Mickey Mouse Club," and if you think that this is going to be kiddie fare, watch for my upcoming first-hand report on this gigantic television series, which someone has said makes "Disneyland" take a back seat.

WITH EVIDENT RELISH, HUDSON ILLUSTRATED the misgivings of others in the 'TV business when Leonard Goldenson, head of AB-PT, had just completed the pact with Disney. On the same plane Goldenson was flying across the country was the head of another network who observed, "Leonard, you are really a fine young chap, but you've bitten off more with 'Disneyland' than you can chew or swallow." Today there isn't a network alive which wouldn't grab at the chance to get what Walt Disney brought to ABC, with an alliance which has not only been swallowed and digested but has provoked another whopping TV venture.

"THE WARNER BROTHERS PRO-DUCTION on ABC will be an entirely different type program from 'Disneyland'," Hudson explained. Asked about a rumored bigtime program to be pitched opposite Ed Sullivan at 8:00 o'clock Sundays, Hudson replied, "It's too far ahead of Christmas to open the package." Pressed as to whether it would be variety, if there were a program, he said, "a dramatic program would be a more logical possibility on Sunday night." (Subsequently it has been rumored that feature films might be the fare.) While doing everything possible to strengthen programming in blocks on certain nights, ABC-TV is also aiming for "good strong anchors spread through the week."

THERE'S A FEELING OF YOUTH-FUL exuberance at the Number Three network. No ceiling has been placed on 1955 sales. Sky's the limit. Rules aren't stuffy. "We absolutely don't know how to spell 'traditional,' Hudson stated. While interested persons, both trade and laymen, watch developments at ABC, Robert Kintner, the president of ABC, Goldenson, and their men are doing what Hudson himself best described when he quoted: "They' said it couldn't be done, but they, poor fools, went ahead and did it."

CBS-TV HAS TURNED NAME-DROP-PER with the gala line-up set for the June 9 "Shower of Stars." How's this for talent: Edgar Bergen, Harry James, Betty Grable, Marilyn Maxwell, Jack Oakie, Red Skelton, Ethel Merman. PLUS a personality who has been signed but which the network so far hasn't revealed because of certain unpredictable circumstances. Maybe the name won't be mentioned until the person is on camera! I'm sure you know who he is!

It was quite an affair! KTTV, which, Reavis Winckler at the helm, comes up with some of the brightest promotional stunts in the business, threw a humdinger of a party to debut its new show, "Uncommon Valor." about which

more later. The invitations were enticing — nobody k n e w where he was going or what was up. The destination was a secret. So the press bo a r d e d some buses at KTTV and were driven to a military base. It turned out to be the El Toro Marine Base near Santa Ana. And



Santa Ana. And here the fun began. The Base itself is one of the most remarkable operations this columnist has ever seen—and the show put on by some of the Marines was a knockout. The demonstration of the new "vertical envelopment" plan for battle was an eye-opener. About twelve helicopters deposited, in the matter of minutes, forty-eight men in a "battle area." The Marines then took command of the section. In a remarkably short time the helicopters were back delivering supplies to these men. The whole operation was to show—and effectively so—how quickly the Marines could land in a crucial area in an actual battle.

After the demonstration and after some words about the show, "Uncommon Valor." the press were taken by bus again to the Irvine Country Club for dinner and to see one of the "Uncommon Valor" films. On the way, we got into a conversation with Lt. Col. Stadler of the Marines who said he felt this new series, based on the exploits of the Marines in World War II, was a remarkable effort. As he put it, "We got kind of tired of seeing how John Wayne and Errol Flynn won wars in the movies for the Marines and of seeing all the boners pulled, so maybe now people will really know how the Marines operated."

After dinner, **Richard Moore** of **KTTV** made some highly amusing remarks (what an emcee this man could be!) about the cost of the party and that he didn't want to infer that just because KTTV had spent so much money this meant the press had to give the show good reviews. There was loud laughter at this. And then he intro-

duced General Holland ("Howlin' Mad") Smith of the Marines who acts as host for the series.

Finally, we saw the show. And even if KTTV had just taken us to the corner drug store for a coke or if it had made us pay our way to help "defray" their expenses we'd still have come back raving about "Uncommon Valor." This show, which begins this coming Wednesday at nine p.m., is sensational. The episode the press saw dealt with the battle of Tarawa. A different one will be shown for the opener. The actual Marine films of the campaign plus the use of some captured Japanese films were mightily impressive. Watching them you got a tremendous thrill and you were proud to be an American. This is no flagwaving series. This is no blatant propaganda. This is simply a bit of our history. And if it makes you feel like waving flags later, what's wrong with that? Bill Karn is the producer-writer of the series and his efforts are worthy of the highest plaudits.

"Uncommon Valor" is on the order of the great "Victory at Sea," only it emphasizes the land exploits of the Marines whereas "Victory at Sea" naturally played up the sea battles. This is a show that is most heartily recommended. It is not to be missed. It makes television look really adult.

In fact, it is so good you could even understand why Dick Moore introduced and gave a plug to Mr. Tuttle of Holmes-Tuttle for having the foresight to sponsor such a show!

Odds and Ends: Lorraine Bendix Munro, who wrote our delightful story on Bill Bendix, has been appointed to the board of directors of the Writers Guild of America. She has sold sev-eral TV scripts and this is indeed an eral TV scripts and this is indeed an honor for the young lady. . . She has gone from one TV show to an-other, one of her latest being in "Science Fiction Theatre.". . The net-works aren't having any too easy a time scheduling summer replacement shows, which doesn't sound too good shows, which doesn't sound too good for the season. It is fondly to be hoped that this year the summer programs don't turn out to be the kinds which wilt easily under the heat... Loretta Young, while improved, is still in the hospital. She has been gaining some much-needed weight but she's been a much sicker person than most people realized. Knowing Loretta, though, she'll bounce back in a hurry with more of her indefatigable energy and enthusiasm. . . Xavier Cugat and enthusiasm. . . Abbe Lane did what was expected of them at the Cocoanut Grove—turned on a plenty hot show. Watching Ab-be's gyrations and listening to her tempestuous numbers makes you won-der if TV could ever handle her. She'd certainly create a rip-roaring controversy if she ever transferred her antics to a 21-inch screen. The men, at least, would never want to leave their sets when she was on!

What Would You Have Done - If You Were Rev. Tanimoto on "This Is Your Life"?

When the Japanese minister met the pilot of the plane which dropped th Atomic Bomb on him and his people, it brought up the important question: "How private can TV get?" When can the little guy say "No!"

When Capt. Lewis Young came forward and shook hands with Rev. Dr. Kiyoshi Tanimoto it was undoubtedly one of the most suspenseful moments even seen on television.

telecast. Dr. Tanimoto, the subject for the evening, was in this country with a group of Japanese girls who had been injured in the blast on Hiroshima He seemed to be unfamiliar and natduring World War II and who are now being treated in New York. Dr. Tanimoto was himself a victim of the blast on that momentous day.

Capt. Lewis, who piloted the plane which dropped the bomb, was choked up and visibly shaken when he shook hands. It was a crucial emotional experience for him, and he hesitated to look his former enemy in the face.

The sad-eyed, courageous Rev. Tanimoto was equally taken back at their meeting. The sympathy of the audience was definitely focused on the Japanese minister.

For the first time, on any large scale, the program and particularly this one incident was questioned by many vlewers. They claimed that Rev. Tanimoto was subjected to personal discomfiture, that it was in poor taste and preyed on his private emotions.

How Private Can You Get?

Others claimed it "was the most dramatic thing ever seen on TV." Of course, the question is up to each in dividual viewer to decide.

Ralph Edwards is not only one of TV-Radio Life's most admired and re-spected stars, but he is one in whom we have found great integrity and sensibility. We know that, as on all his past shows, he planned and performed this one in the best of faith. Through the co-operation of Norman Cousins of the "Saturday Review of Literature" and other persons, "This Is Your Life" took every possible step not only to surprise Dr. Tanimoto but to put on a good and a powerful show. Any pro-gram on the effects of atomic warfare naturally involves the deepest of human emotions.

However, this telecast did bring up one very important issue: how far can TV go? What safeguards does an in-dividual (and that includes everyone) have on his private life?

Perhaps you have noticed that when Ralph Edwards is about to unfold a particularly spectacular life he asks permission of the person involved.

In the case of Rev. Tanimoto it has been pointed out, however, that the show itself was a complete surprise. Pag. Thirty

He seemed to be unfamiliar and naturally he didn't know who was going to be the next person to walk between the curtains to greet him.

Face to Face

Then came the man who helped to drop death, destruction and despair upon his people. It was a tense moment for him-and everyone else.

Perhaps, if Rev. Tanimoto had had something to say about it he would have protested, "Please, not this. I will meet him alone if he wishes, but not before millions of people." But before those TV cameras, Rev. Tani-moto was as helpless as he was the day of the atomic bomb.

What if YOU had been Rev. Tani-moto? What would you have done? What chance does the "little guy" have under such circumstances? In have under such circumstances: In TV today, the network, a station, a producer, a director or a sponsor can say, "I don't like this! Cut it out!" And out it goes. But what about the Joe and Jane Does? When can they stand up for their rights and say, "No, way say this to me! My private you can't do this to me! My private life and feelings are private." These are some of the questions TV-Radio Life has bumped into while investi-gating this potent gating this potent program.

Another criticism of the hand shak-ing came from a viewer who thought it was wrong to make an Oriental lose face by showing such emotion. It was pointed out, however, that actu-ally when the minister embraced Christianity he gave up such Oriental concepts.

For the record, Capt. Young was eager to appear on the program as soon as he heard that Rev. Tanimoto's life was to be done. Also for the rec-ord it should be known that Rev. Tanimoto was aware that there was such a person as Capt. Young. In fact, the minister carries with him the Satur-day Review story and before the program, while showing it to a friend, he was asked if he had any bad feelings toward the captain for helping drop the A-bomb. "No, it was his job," Rev. Tanimoto replied.

Various Opinions

Most of the persons whom TV-Radio Life asked for an opinion thought that the handshake was all right and that the pilot was sincere in his emo-

tional reaction. They were in favor of him discussing the bombing and greeting the minister. The gesture was good for people of different groups don't take the A bomb too seriously ... good for the pilot and the minis-ter to shake hands in peace, because as individuals they were not responsible for the bombing. Some felt that it would be wrong not to have given voice to the victims of war. Those especially in favor of the telecast were realistic and said that facing facts was part of life and things unpleasant in this world should be acknowledged rather than ignored.

But when these same persons were asked what they would do if they were faced someday with the same problem confronting Rev. Tanimoto, they didn't know. Probably the answer is nothing. Absolutely nothing. They'd do exactly as the minister did . . . stand up and "take it," grin and bear it, like it or not.

"Eye Witness" Looks Ahead For Top Stories in New Approach to TV Journalism

This week it's the jet flight from N.Y. to L. A. Next week: who knows? But Gil Martyn and his KTLA are thinking today about tomorrow's news.

There are times when "Eye Witness," KTLA's interesting and different newscast, anticipates headlines in order to bring their viewers up-to-theminute events. Last week, as we went to press, we learned that "Eye Witness" had scheduled an interview with First Lieutenant John M. Conroy for Sunday, May 22. Lieutenant Conroy is slated to make the first Los Angeles to New York and return flight in a North American F-86 Sabre Jet at sunrise, Saturday, May 21. With the exception of stop-gaps for refueling Conroy's objective is Floyd Bennett Field in New York and return to Los Angeles by sunset the same day. The Yan Nuys pilot anticipates making the round trip in about eleven hours.

"Eye Witness" is out for a scoop, which they undoubtedly will have. All this is part of their format of going

News chief Gil Martyn and his two leg men, Dick Keusink and Marvin Petal, believe in making the news stories of the day come alive by presenting eye witnesses to round out the news reports.

Gil and his staff do a tremendous behind-the-scenes job of tracking down people connected with news events. It isn't as easy a task as it may appear on the surface. Sometimes grueling hours a day are spent tracking down witnesses. They may vary from someone who chanced upon a sordid crime to someone who has merely officiated at the dedication of a new wing of a children's hospital.

Gil at Work

As a result of many reportorial years, Gil has established invaluable contacts for obtaining information. He has gained both the confidence and cooperation of the police, fire and sheriff offices, Civil Air Patrol, California Highway Patrol, the FBI, wire services and publications.

However, this chore has its restrictions. Bold headlines sell newspapers but the TV station repels tablold news tactics and avoids sensationalism. "Eye Witness" must exercise discrimination or else it will invite trouble from the FCC.

Yet, such drawbacks don't seem to faze the man with printer's ink in his veins. Smiling broadly, Gil said: "It's the satisfaction a newsman gets from his job. Certainly there's no glamor attached to it. We strive to deliver clear, concise, honest reports. Interviewing an eye witness who was on-the-spot at an accident is certainly far more vivid reporting than merely reading the cold headlines. I believe this is the first time our type of journalism has been attempted in a television series."

"Eye Witness" interviews are conducted by KTLA staff announcers. The program is unrehearsed and the announcers, working from lead sheets, must be trigger-minded to circumvent any libelous statements an eye witness might make. The interviews are brief yet encompass the basic information.

Variety

The wide variety of newsworthy events and people appearing on each show are selected with an eye to satisfying every viewer's interest. On a recent telecast a dancer at a burlesque house told viewers what it was like to have an "admirer" in the audience, who was carrying the gun with which he later—that evening on the stage—killed himself. Another interviewee, Bill Veeck, one of the most publicized figures in baseball, told of his efforts to bring major league baseball to Los Angeles.

The program has caught the public's fancy because it humanizes the news. To keep abreast of things the only deadline "Eye Witness" recognizes is airtime.

Whittinghill Wit Wins Watches

Fun-loving Dick Whittinghill sparks his KRCA movie host chores with amusing and unusual gimmicks. We stopped at the studio recently to interview the dee-jay (KMPC), movie host and the imaginative Dick enlisted our aide in some pre-movie shenanigans. Interview

Whittinghill acted as happy as a bumble bee about the interview he was going to have with a TV-Radio Life staffer. As he praised the magazine he turned to the staffer, who was sitting on the set and abruptly shoed her away. Off camera, the director gestured wildly to Dick that he had shooed away his interviewer. Then the ham came out in both the movie host and the allegedly hurt staffer while he apologized and she forgave. All this for a lead-in to a movie. You never can tell what Dick's going to do on his Channel 4 show and that's what the viewers like about him.

Once our shenanigans were over and the film got rolling Dick gave us his attention. That is if you overlook interruptions for commercials.

We learned that Whittinghill, who has to get up at 4:30 in the morning to do his KMPC stint from six until ten, gets many letters commenting on his informal manner on both his radio and TV programs. "I wanted to use TV performers, along with those actors with no experience to get new faces in the pic-ture." Mark commented. "This is a documentary type movie and I felt new people would be better than estab-lished actors."

King Calder is entirely happy with the assignment. He frankly prefers film to television. As King commented, "How long has this thing called movies been going on?"

Working in TV, as well as in movies, gives Mark Stevens real know-how when it comes to producing a picture. He is using some of the things he has learned in television too.

"It's actually easier to do a TV show, though, than it is to do a picture," he said. "After all, on 'Martin Kane' we had five days rehearsal. You can't do had five days renearsal. You can't do that much rehearsing for a picture. Some people think that there's too much pressure, doing live TV especial-ly, but I never noticed that. Of course, I'm not even bothered by the work involved in producing, directing, and writing a movie. Maybe I'm easy-going because I realize I can't afford to get upset Too many people are depending upset. Too many people are depending on me Once a director starts blowing everybody does.

Senseless 'Takes'

"When you do TV you learn how to make full use of time and of a shooting schedule. You learn economy of shots—and you learn how to get the most out of actors without dissipating their talents and energy by sense-less 'takes.' We're doing 'Timetable' less 'takes.' We're doing on a twenty-one day schedule, which is considered very short in some circles, but it's plenty long for me. I have learned—I hope—to shoot only those scenes which will appear on the screen. I don't want to do all kinds of 'takes' on one scene and then leave the picture up to the film cutter. I'm not resorting to these measures just be-cause I have a limited budget. If I had a million dollars I'd still film it in the same way. Even in film TV there's not the time for endless 'takes,' so why shouldn't the same principle work for a movie?"

Not Big Shot

Mark is also helping in designing sets and wardrobe and he works with Walter Scharf, who is doing the musical score.

It isn't that Mark wants to be the Big Shot. In fact, right now he's trying to get an okay to leave his name off some of the credits. He is only interested in doing a good job. He must be okay because he took on the direction of "Big Town" at the sponsor's specific request.

"Timetable" is only further proof that what some people thought impossible is now not only possible but is a reality—movies and TV are learning that they not only can work together but they have to if either is to survive.

I don't believe those responsible realize how important a dollar still is to most people. My husband is an engineer and has definitely an above average income; however, I don't feel that we would often care enough about a program to spend a dollar. On the other hand, we would be much more tempted if the price were 25c. By the same token, there would be many, many other people who feel the same way. I'm afraid even 50c would be too much for us.

No set prices have been established. However, it is our opinion the top price will be a dollar, while the majority of programs (if approved by the FCC) will range from ten to twenty-five cents. It is unlikely that the public would pay much more for any type of program.

You are the best dime buy by far! A letter in the recent Eye, Ear column made me thoroughly irate. A certain person had written in saying that she objected to the loud and inappropriate music on certain programs. She suggested that the musicians should be paid to be quiet. I agree that on some shows it is too loud, but this is the fault of the audio engineer, not the musicians. As for being inappropriate, does she realize that practically all of these shows use "canned" or prerecorded music? (That music was not intended for use on the air.) "Live" music is made according to the "Live" music is made according to the individual play and the composer has the script to follow. Also, higher-ups have the final say. So, if, Mrs. X, you want good, soft, appropriate music, don't bludgeon the musicians, but appeal to the sponsors to let their shows have live music, with real musicians on the scene. There are 1500 odd musicians in L.A., of whom less than half make their living in music. Thanks for letting me speak my piece.

amazing control and musicianship as she wends her way through the maze of modern the accompaniment of a small combo with ef-fortless ease. All seven selections on this Emarcy twelve-inch LP extended are versions of stan-

dards, with Helen Merrill given free rein in her imaginative vocalizing.

Yank Lawson's Dixieland Band (Riverside) offers convincing proof that Dixie, at its best, remains as fresh, vigorous and skillful a form of jazz as ever. As we've pointed out before, good musicians can always make a band and Yank has rounded up names like Gowans, Russell, Johnson, Con-don, Haggart, Spargo, Silloway, Stegmeyer and Marsala to guarantee the results. These previously unreleased waxings, made in 1944, are as great as the makers—and Yank's full piercing tone and driving trumpet has rarely been better than it is here.

Carmen MacRae (Bethlehem) hasn't been around too long, but long enough to establish herself as one of today's top jazz vocalists, equally at home with a ballad, rhythm or torch tune. The four songs Carmen waxed with the Tony Scott Quartet will remind you of the Wilson-Holiday sides of the late thirties. The others with the Mat Mathews Quartet are more on the modern side and feature Herbie Mann on tenor and flute, but enough for the accompaniment . . listen to Carmen MacRae and applaud.

During the late twenties, when the jazz centers were firmly located in New York and Chicago, Bennie Moten's Orchestra remained equally firm in its own territory, and the Moten jazz em-pire was built in Kansas City. Aside from occasional recording trips to Chifrom occasional recording trips to Chi-cago, the band rarely left home. Listen to Moten play "Terrific Stomp," "Kan-sas City Squabble," "Let's Get It" and other re-issues on this "X" LP and you get a clearer picture of true Kan-sas City styled jazz than has ever been presented. —A.M.

HIS STORY is about basic training for your dog, the most important kind. Individual tricks such as sitting, rolling over and similar stunts can be learned later. They require time and space and can be taken up only after the "basic," which actually is as much a plan for training the owner as for training the dog.

The greatest kindness that can be shown any dog is to give him at least a fundamental training. I don't believe in "trick" dogs and the family dog does not need the extended training necessary to equip him for screen stardom, as in the case of Lassie.

This is what you will need in training your dog. First, patience. Next, a collar on your dog, a leash or piece of rope about 10 feet long, and a pocket full of tidbits to serve as a reward for learning his lessons well.

Your first problem with your new puppy will be housebreaking. Do not delay this. Get a large box which will be his headquarters in the house until he is broken. Whenever you can't watch him, put him in the box so that he cannot leave it. His keen sense of smell will cause him to be revolted if he makes a mess in his living quarters, so he will try to restrain himself as long as he can. Then, as soon as you take him from his box, lead him outside and keep him there until he does his duty. Then praise him and pet him and next time you bring him outside, bring him to the same spot.

Remember to take him outside the first thing every morning, immediately after each meal, and the last thing in the evening. If you stick to your schedule regularly you will find that your puppy will be housebroken in considerably less than a month. He will start to show restlessness when he wishes to perform his duty. At the first such sign, quickly put him outside, and praise him for his cooperation.

As your puppy grows up there are several potential bad habits that must be dealt with. One natural desire of all young dogs is to chew any and all objects. The best way to counteract this is to provide him with rubber balls or toys which become his own. When he switches his affections from his toy to your possession, scold him, hold his mouth together, and then give him his own plaything.

Jumping up on his human friends is another natural instinct, When he jumps up, grab his upraised front paws and hold them up in the alr then step gently on his back paws. He soon will learn that jumping up is a game in which he comes off second best, and then he will discontinue it.

Barking rampages can be dealt with. Stop him immediately with a scolding voice. Hold his mouth closed with your hand and punish him with severe words. If a reprimanding voice doesn't do it, use a flat newspaper resoundingly, but gently, on him.

Likewise, when he chases an automobile or motorcycle, catch him the first time or two. Scold him and confine him. If this fails, tie him with a lengthy rope to a tree or pole, within sight of passing cars or bikes When he takes off after one, he'll be jerked up suddenly when he reaches the end of his rope. A few experiences like this and he will decide it's more comfortable just to sit and watch the cars go by.

Another bad and dangerous habit is that of scavenging for food. If you notice your dog prowling into garbage cans in the alley, set a trap for him, a mousetrap just under the surface. When he goes for it he'll get a surprise that won't encourage him to return.

Regularity of training lessons is important. You must devote at least fifteen minutes a day to it. A lesson may last a half hour, never more. Do not let your pupil grow tired.

First lesson in your dog's training should be launched when he is between six and eight months of age. A vital factor in successful training is the voice. When you call on your dog to obey your direction, you are issuing a command. It should be given in a voice that is firm and full of authority. When you are praising or rewarding him, show your pleasure by the tone of your voice. And when you wish to punish him speak harshly as you exclaim "Naughty! Naughty!" or "No! No!"

in the same tone of voice and with the same words. Your dog does not understand immediately the actual words you use, but he assimilates very quickly the meaning of your tone.

You must constantly encourage your dog by speaking to him, petting him, and, if you use my system, rewarding him with a tidbit when he does well. Such actions on your part will build up your dog's faith in you, and successful training cannot be accomplished without this.

Only one person should train a dog.

While conducting your lessons, work in quiet surroundings. Evening is generally the best time. Take your time, or don't try to hold "school." If your dog is not feeling well, give nim a vacation. It's better not to try to train him when he isn't in the mood.

Don't smoke or drink while conducting your training. Dogs don't like tobacco and they don't care for the aroma of alcohol.

Don't try to teach him every trick in the book in one lesson. For the best results, stick to one trick until it is mastered. Tricks already learned, however, should be reviewed frequently, so that he won't forget them.

The Private Eye Who Really Was...

Veteran actor William Gargan, star of NBC's "Barrie Craig, Confidential," tells about his early career as detective.



FLASHBACK OF THE GARGAN FAMILY taken ten years ago. Barrie, named after Sir James Barrie, Leslie Howard, named after the famed actor, and the lovely Mary Gargan jestingly cast scornful glances at the senior Gargan.

Bill GARGAN is one actor who can boast that his private eye portrayals have a ring of authenticity. Long before Bill ever dreamed of becoming a thespian he was a sleuth for a nationally known detective agency.

"Both my sleuthing and acting happened accidentally," Bill admitted frankly. "My father had been a member of the secret service and he kept it so secret I never knew about it until long after his resignation. Dad's occupation, however, had nothing to do with my becoming a detective. While on the road selling I met someone who told me of an opening with a credit investigator simply because it paid more than my selling job. After learning the ropes with a small outfit I applied for a job with the William Burns Detective Agency. It was with this organization that I learned a lot about the ins and outs of sleuthing. Some of the people I met were incongruous characters and completely unbelievable if written into any fiction piece.

"My on-the-spot experience has been of the utmost help in portraying my various detective roles. These roles include 'Martin Kane' which I created. 'Ellery Queen,' 'Ross Doland,' I Deal in Crime,' and my current assignment, 'Barrie Craig, Confidential'."

Resentment

Like any normal, cocky young man Bill Gargan became resentful when after doing all the leg work on a case a more experienced detective was called in for the "kill." Because of this frustration he bent a willing ear when his actor-brother Edward Gargan told him of an opening in the Broadway musical "Rose Marie."

And so Gargan again changed his profession. The footlights fascinated the young ex-detective and after "Rose Marie" he landed a job in "Aloma of the South Seas," in which he was disguised as a Tahitian. Gargan found his niche and from then on moved right in.

The high spots in his career were "Animal Kingdom" which starred the late Leslie Howard, after whom one of his sons is named. Gargan literally stole the show and as a result of his performance was elected by the Drama Critics as the Outstanding Actor of the year. He has also been nominated for an Oscar for the best supporting actor award for his role in "They Knew What They Wanted."

After more than a quarter of a century as an actor, Gargan is a man with ideas and he knows what he wants. He plans to combine his acting and detective experience and package a series based on the county medical examiner's reports.
