He Knew What He Wanted

Edgar Buchanan almost missed being an actor because he obeyed his practical father.

DGAR BUCHANAN is a persistent man. If he wasn't we would know him today as Dr. Buchanan, DDS, instead of Edgar "Bucky" Buchanan, veteran character actor.

"To please my father, who was a dentist," he explained. "I enrolled in a dental college and at the same time joined the town's little theater group. For two years it was touch and go at school where my records



were completely unimpressive. But my so-called theatrical talents were recognized with a scholarship offer to Yale University's dramatic school.

"It was the thing I wanted to do most but I turned it down. My father convinced me that there would be other stage struck youths who might have far more talent than I and that it was far wiser for a man to have something to fall back upon to make a living.

"I buckled down to get my degree and in the last year at college I met and married Mildred Spence, the only girl dental student at the school.

"For eight long years, we worked hard at building a practice. But during this period I found my attraction for the theater as strong as ever. When my wife suggested selling our practice and leaving Eugene. Ore., for Pasadena, Calif. home of the famed Pasadena Playhouse, I knew that she had been reading my mind and had the courage to give voice to my secret desires.

"We started a practice in Altadena but I'm afraid I spent more time at the Playhouse than I did at the of-

fice. At last I was doing what I had been longing for all these years.

"Yet, as I look back on my career, I sincerely know that if I had to do it all over again I'd select the same detour. By not having things my own way at first it made me work that much harder to become an actor. And although I didn't think so at the time, the years I spent as a dentist gave me a wonderful opportunity to study my patients. Subconsciously I was making mental notes for future character acting."

Today, Edgar Buchanan is known the world over as one of Hollywood's top character actors. The producers of Judge Roy Bean were fortunate when they landed him for the title role. Like most Western teleseries it glorifies the hero who is a self-appointed judge. Actually, Judge Roy Bean was an old reprobate, but emphasis on this frailty would hardly, make a suitable family series.

Edgar is a happy man now. Besides, he never did like grinding some poor guy's teeth.



Jackie Was Through Until ----

ROMANCE PLAYS A BIG PART in the amusing NBC-KRCA series. Pat Breslin is Jackie's romantic vis-a-vis. Cleo is, of course, around to lend sage comments about the proceedings.

ACK COOPER was brimming with confidence and enthusiasm. He looked just like a guy who had found the proverbial pot at the end of the rainbow.

He had just finished doing a scene in NBC-KRCA's popular The People's Choice and was back in his trailer having lunch. The last time I had seen him he was not as confident or as happy as he now appeared. Traces of defeat were etched in everything he said and did.

Defeat

"I had come out of the service and couldn't get any work," Jack said quietly. "The more I waited around for a part the more I began to wonder if I could really act any more; if I were any good. I gradually lost belief in myself. I wasn't sure where I was going, what I could do. And at this point I faced up to the first big decision.

"I had talked to Keenan Wynn and Julie (John) Garfield, both of whom advised me to go back east and do some stage work. I had never been on the stage. I didn't know if I'd ever get a chance, but I decided to make the move anyway. I managed to get in some summer stock and at the same time I looked around for a Broadway show. The hopes for that seemed slim since competition was then—and is now—very tough.

"My first chance to do a Broadway Page Four show came in a play called 'Sleep It Off.' It flopped fast after two weeks in Chicago, but at least I learned from it that I could do stage work — and do it fairly well. This alone made me feel better and gave me a smattering of confidence. I had made up my mind that I was going to prove I wasn't just a movie personality—that I was also an actor.

"Up to this time I had not been able to escape the stigma of having been a child star. I had read for people like Elia Kazan but no one gave me much consideration. The first real challenge came when I was offered a good part in a weak play. The role was that of a prizefighter who was frustrated and who had been so badly injured in the war he had to wear a plate in his head. I was like that guy. I was frustrated and my plate in the head was not being able to prove what I could do.

"I knew this play. 'Magnolia Alley.' wouldn't be a hit but I had to do the part anyway. Then, just before opening, the producers needed \$15,000 without it, the play wouldn't go on. I dug into my savings and gave the money myself. This was, in itself, a big decision. I knew I was also a gamble —that the part would pay off for me. The play, as I expected, lasted only a week, but the part did help me."

Josh Logan saw Jack in the show opening night and came back stage to offer him the role of Ensign Pulver in the road company of "Mr. Roberts." Here again he ran into a challenge—a challenge in the person of Mr. Logan.

'Mr. Roberts'

"I was all for quitting the show after a few weeks." Jack said. "Josh wanted a lot of wide expression and tremendous projection from me. I confused this direction with being broad. I was mixed up, not because of Josh's direction, but because I just didn't know my business as much as I thought I did. When I told him I wanted to quit, he, fortunately, talked to me and explained that I could do this kind of a part.

"In time I learned my lesson—and by the time the show got to London it was a source of great satisfaction to me to see how well I was received by both the press and the public. Things I learned during the two years I was in 'Mr. Roberts' have even helped me in doing my TV show."

But Jack still had not learned how to have faith in himself. He thought he believed in himself more but a later incident proved he had a long way to go before he grew up.

While he was in London, Leland Hayward, who produced "Mr. Roberts," told Jack that he had found a play that would make him a big star. He told Jack the story, it sounded great, so Jack said that he was very interested. When "Mr. Roberts" closed In everyone's life there are important decisions to be made. Jackie Gooper of The People's Choice is no exception. But the chances he took!

he spent a couple of months abroad and then went back to New York and the play.

"I had been so impressed by the way Leland Hayward had treated me," Jack remarked. "I couldn't even get into his office in 1948. I looked forward very anxiously to reading the script, but when I got it I realized one thing—Mr. Hayward had told a much better play than I read on paper.

"I frankly thought it was a stinker. I remember staying awake all one night trying to decide what to do. I reasoned that since 'Remains to Be Seen,' which was the show, was written by Lindsay and Crouse, two of the country's most famous playwrights; that since Bretaigne Windust, one of the top directors, was to direct it; that since Leland Hayward liked it, I must be crazy. I still had no faith in my instincts, in myself. I did tell Mr. Hayward that I didn't think the show was as good as he had described it to me, but he just said I was wrong. I believed him. And I did the show.

"It was roasted by the critics. The fact that my opinion had been borne out by the critics gave me confidence, but it was a blow to me to find that I hadn't had enough belief in my instincts to follow them. The part in the show, however, was good for me in that it brought me many offers for TV shows — and at a higher salary.

"One of the biggest decisions then confronted me-doing live TV. It was quite an adjustment for me to make, going from movies, which I knew, to live TV with all its hazards and headaches. When 'Remains to Be Seen' closed I had no other job. I wanted to work, so I began doing TV. In 1953, I played 31 live TV dramas. I was soon on so much that I decided I'd better pull back and do only about two a month.

"All this time my agent kept saying I should do a series, but I only said I didn't want to do the same part each week. that I didn't want to be typed. I wasn't interested because I was also. at this time, starting to do some directing. I had directed several American Inventory shows for NBC, I was in the middle of a deal to act and direct for Justice, and life was indeed full.

"And then Irving Brecher came on the scene. He was as good a salesman as Leland Hayward had been. He told me about this TV series. offered me a partnership deal, script approval and all other kinds of inducements. I thought the whole thing over, got more intrigued with the advantages, and then made the big decision to do the series. I haven't been sorry I took the leap."

The People's Choice started out slowly with mixed reaction and then suddenly began building. Not only was Jack a hit but so were Pat Breslin, his romantic vis-a-vis, and Cleo, the sad-eyed hound. It was Jack who helped get Pat the part. He had known her in New York. Recently, Jack and Pat went on a tour and were surprised to find how wide their audience was. Youngsters loved the show because of Cleo. Teen-agers liked it for the romantic appeal. Oldsters found it entertaining and yet a show that every once in a while had a message.

"We're planning to branch out in all kinds of directions," Jack went on. "A year from now no one will know what to expect. I've been able to do almost everything on the show except a neurotic or an alcoholic, and those I've done on TV.

"I only plan to do the show, though, for a total of three years, and then I'll stop. I think three years is enough for me. Too many stars hang on and on and when a show inevitably starts to go down hill, they have to go with it. This is unfortunate and not fair to the performers. Why don't they bring someone new into the show if they insist on keeping it going?

"I have my plans pretty well made. I'll someday form my own company. I want to make some pictures and to direct. I'll do some more live TV — and just keep busy. I know now I can do whatever I set my mind to. I've learned how to believe in myself. The walls have fallen down, and I'm ready for anything."

Jack has indeed won out over himself — his own worst enemy.

How they get those **PRIZES**

From autos and mink coats to hot dogs, false teeth and girdles, CBS-KNX's Robert "Mickey" Finn has given away over a half million dollars worth of prizes in the past ten years.

HIS IS A STORY about a man who has done a halfmillion dollars worth of business during the past and hasn't made a cert

ten years — and hasn't made a cent out of it.

In fact, many times the only compensation he has received has been complaints from people. To add insult to injury, the complaints have come from those who have received valuable prizes for nothing.

The man's name is Robert "Mickey" Finn.

"I always use the name 'Robert' on the phone." Mr. Finn explained to us. "I have to. If I use 'Mickey.' some character on the other end of the line will invariably sav. 'Sure. and I'm Tom Collins!' and then hang up. Before I've ever started. I've lost a customer."

In case you're wondering what this is all about, let me explain: Mr. Finn, in addition to his job as director and associate producer for KNX-CBS Radio, is also in charge of getting prizes for such give-away programs as Matinee. Jack Linkletter's "Under 21" and various other local CBS Radio shows.

No Deals

Cf course, Mickey has always re-Page Six ceived his regular salary while working at the station. However, despite the enormous sum of merchandise he has acquired for the station, he has never made any extra or "under the table" money.

"Some men who get prizes for radio and TV shows make something on the side, but I don't think any of the reputable ones would. It's just too risky to pull any kind of a shady deal. You just have too must to lose."

Prizes for radio and TV programs are actually acquired as part of a "trade deal." That is, the station will "trade" in time and plugs what the retail price of the particular item amounts to. For example, if Mr. Finn agrees with a company to give away a \$600 piano, he then makes arrangements to have \$600 worth of air time used to advertise that particular brand of piano.

Cars, Coats, Girdles

Ever since he started at CBS ten years ago, the smooth-talking lrishman has given away a wide assortment of prizes: from automobiles and mink coats to hot dogs, false teeth and girdles.

"The ladies who receive the smaller prizes are usually interested in something to eat. They much prefer a chicken or a turkey rather than an orchid. Young married couples, who are still in the romantic mood, much prefer the orchid." Finn smiled.

The biggest single effort which Finn put forth, and which he worked on with the entire KNX-CBS staff, was the station's "Bonanza" broadcast celebrating its 35th anniversary. A grand total of \$65,000 worth of prizes was arranged for on that occasion.

"That's quite a figure for a local station." Finn boasted. "It's fairly easy to obtain prizes for network programs because the donors like to have things given away on them. It's a lot tougher for a local operation such as ours.

Double Problem

"We know that it's worthwhile for a company to use their products as prizes — because they usually receive more than their money's worth in on-the-air advertising. Each tim2, however, it's a challenge to convince them of it, and when I do make a deal, it's always a great satisfaction to me."

Strange as it may seem, sometimes Finn has his biggest problem — not in getting the prize — but in convincing the winner to accept it.

"Any prize over \$600 has to be declared as income, and many people just can't afford to pay the tax on it." Finn explained."

Then there was the unusual case of the lady who won a \$10,000 mink coat—but who didn't want to accept it.

"Pesides the tax she had to pay, the woman thought it was too 'showy' for her to own. But she won the coat and we had no alternative but to convince her to take it!"

Lifelines TV-RADIO

"WE REFUSE TO CUT OR EDIT any of it!" Medic producer Frank LaTour-ette told me last week after a Medic telefilm detailing Caesarian section had been pulled by NBC, New York, from its Monday evening's scheduled showing. Frank's grim words represented the Medic outfit's stand on this ticklish controversy

"WE ARE GETTING LETTERS and wires," Frank continued. "All are in favor of showing the film."

I HAVE HEARD TWO SIDES to the question and from them gather that this particular subject had been worked out to the complete satisfaction of the Medical Association. About 50 per cent of the Caesarian operation, shot in an actual delivery room, was eliminated from the finished telefilm. NBC Hollywood asked for some further cuts, then granted the film approval. As far as I can gather, the run would have gone on unquestioned had not a syndicated column from here, describing the Caesarian opera-tion, appeared in the New York Times. It was seen by Catholic Father Timothy Flynn, who wrote NBC to register a complaint. There seems to be some difficulty in obtaining direct quotes from the letter (even the Medic office has not been able to get them) but sum and substance was that such a film was unsuitable for TV because it was invading the province of sex education. Though signed by Father Flynn, the letter came from the office of Cardinal Spellman. Also, so far as can be learned, none of the protestants had viewed the Medic production.

AT A SPECIAL PRESS SHOWING, the portion devoted to the Cacsarian section proved rapid and absorbing. Press consensus was that the film was suitable for viewing by all adults (it did not violate good taste) and chil-dren in homes where parents ap-proved. One parent pointed out that sex education of his boy and girl had been very forthright and had developed naturally as the need had arisen. Others agreed. Another pointed out that though he agreed, there might be parents who would not want their children to see such a film, but whose children might just as well be "exposed" to it if other boys and girls were permitted to see and discuss it later. The entire problem seemed to center around the procedures and de-sires of individual families.

I IMAGINE THAT TV-RADIO LIFE readers will be both pro and con. The real point of the situation, to my way of thinking, is the matter of pressure on the network. Apparently one's religion doesn't have too much bearing on opinions. Several Catholics with whom I talked expressed the feeling that the film should not have been cancelled. "Let those who wish to see

it do so," they said. "If you don't want to see something you can alwant to see something you can al-ways turn the dial to something else." Others resented the fact that a pro-test had been lodged without the film having been viewed. Some said NBC should not have backed down. "I think," LaTourette told me, "that the pressure will be so great that NBC will have to give in."

THE "HIGH TOR"-"RICHARD III" weekend will go down as one of the scason's greatest. Bing's vehicle was perfectly tailored to the Crosby measurements, Nancy Olson was charm-ing, and Julie Andrews made a tremendous impression which left audiences wanting more. Bing, who looked great, proved again that he can play a romantic lead with the youngest and purtiest of 'em. Ever so many people I know said they wanted to go to the theater to see the "Richard III" movie in color, so the TV exposure may not hurt the box office as much as critics thought. And wasn't the "Richard III" music superb?

A DISTRESSING THING HAPPENED to a friend of mine who had just sat down and become engrossed in "Richard III" when company arrived. Without resorting to plain orders, the friend tried all her subtle powers to get her guests interested in the teleshow, but efforts were unavailing and she finally had to miss the presentation.

THIS INSTANCE RAISES A MATTER which has long been in mind. I've formulated my own personal code for TV and guests, but I am wondering what TV-Radio Life readers have done about this problem. Will you please write to tell me? Do you turn off your set? Leave it going and try to visit over it? Turn it on for special programs only? Or put a sign on the front door: DO NOT RING. TV IS ON. GO AWAY!

THINK there will be a great cultural renaissance. but not in my lifetime. We're ripe for a renaissance if we can have faith in something. This is an era of waiting." So stated Dr. Frank Baxter, KNXT's host for the new "Renaissance on TV" series. He was discussing the over-all significance of the Renaissance and speculating on a cultural resurgence at this time.

Dr. Baxter, who still expresses amazement that a "broken-down, bald-headed school teacher of 60," through his Shakespeare on TV. could arouse coast-to-coast interest, is equally enthusiastic about presentation of the "giants in their field" the five famous men who will appear on ten of the eighteen video programs which began February 4 and continue for seventeen successive weeks.

The television series comes as a fortunate outgrowth of a University of Southern California lecture program underwritten by the Francis Bacon Foundation of Pasadena. As an aid in selecting the scholars for the University series, a list of the ten greatest Renaissance figures in the United States was assembled and from these names a final five were chosen. Dr. Baxter, who initiated the lectures, was instrumental in scheduling these "giants" for TV.

Aims

"This television series may be an illumination to many people," Dr. Baxter voiced hopcfully. "So much we have today is due to the Renaissance. Take Bacon. for instance." and in his inimitable fashion the Shakespearean expert painted a word-picture of Bacon and his companions riding along the countryside in their coach on a cold winter night, of their comments on the bitterness of the weather, of how sheep in the field

would be covered with snow, and amazingly, how the meat would be in perfect state of preservation come spring; how one of Bacon's companions threw out the idea, "I wonder if cold might not be a way for vittling food for armies in the field?"

"Here's the forerunner of today's deep freeze," Dr. Baxter glowed.

As he waxes more enthusiastic about the meaning of the Renaissance he recalls the great discoverers and explorers of the time, especially Drake, sailing up the California coast; the excitement of writing, of art, the Reformation, and "to those who speak English, Shakespeare at the center of it all!"

He mentions the growth of cities, the beginning of commerce, the emergence of the individual, the tremendous stimulation of this period which will be discussed by experts on Renaissance on TV. And he sums it up, "It is as if the Middle Ages had been in lower case type and now they'll be in caps."

Indicative of KNXT's faith in the Renaissance series is the action of station manager James Aubrey who withdrew one of the most salable times, 4:00 to 4:30 p.m. Sundays, to offer this program. Dr. Baxter himself will fill in the eight remaining lecture periods not taken over by the visiting scholars and will be assisted by other scholars, either visiting or local, in rounding out the schedule.

According to the program producer, Bill Whitley, the final ten minutes of each telecast is being devoted to an exchange between Dr. Baxter and the guest speaker. This segment was inspired by a previous experience when, as Bill expresses it, "I was fortunate enough to get Aldous Huxley and Baxter together on a free exchange of ideas, and the result was very exciting."

Pressed for an answer as to our

He Took On The Indians

7 TS STILL HARD for me to think of handsome Keith Larsen as an Indian. I'd always thought of him primarily as a tennis player.

When I first met Keith he was living and breathing tennis but in between times he was toying with the idea of acting. He appeared in a couple of shows which I produced and directed, but he wasn't exactly the most fired-up guy I ever met about turning actor. Then the breaks started coming his way — and now even the tennis has taken a second spot.

Typed?

"When I was making 'Chief Crazy Horse' at Universal-International," Keith remarked as we chatted over old and new times, "I was asked to test for Brave Eagle. At the time, I wasn't too interested since I had already played about four Indians, was doing another in the picture and I didn't want to be listed in the Players' Directory under 'Indians.' However. I did make the test later. I came off looking like an Indian and I got the part. I've been happy about that ever since.

"Since I began the TV series I have been offered other parts as Indians, but I think now is a good time to avoid being typed. I don't want to become Keith 'Cheyenne' Larsen."

Keith's attitude towards acting as a profession changed gradually. From his earlier take-it-or-leave-it idea he became what he is now—an earnest and ambitious actor.

Turning Point

"I think the change in my attitude began about 1951 when I went to Europe to look for a job as an acto.. I lived in the Place Pigalle, loved every minute of the life there, but wound up eventually as a publicity writer. I also like writing, you see.

"While I was in Paris, I coached French actors in American dialogue. I went with one company to Madrid and Rome. Then, I was asked to help out an actor who was testing for a role in a picture. I did the other part with him in the scene. When I returned to America, I kind of smuggled that bit of film back with me. I took it to an agent who proceeded to take it to Allied Artists — and I got a contract."

The first time Keith played an Indian was in "Hiawatha." From then on, he was handed the feathers and the war paint rather consistently, all to his advantage.

Has Masssey Pulled a TV BONER?

At long last Mr. Raymond Massey, one of the greatest actors ever produced by the American stage and movies, is now seen each week on KRCA.

NO BEARD, and he's not giving a Lincoln speech, but he's still Raymond Massey. It's his new role as "Anton" on the I Spy series seen on Channel 4. (Guild Films photo.)

AYMOND MASSEY is more than just a man. He's a tradition in both theater and the movies. His credits as an actor. director and writer are as long as my last name.

Now he's in TV — as Anton, the "master spy," and host of Channel 4's Guild Film series, I Spy. Described as an "authentic and fascinating dramatization of political spies who have changed the course of history." the KRCA show presents each week a "little known but true-to-life episode about secret agents who, with intrigue and ingenuity, have rocked countries. precipitated wars and upset balances of power."

Filmed in New York, it's the first regular TV series for Massey, who lives permanently in a Connecticut farm house with his wife, lawyer Dorothy Ludington.

Coast-to-Coast Commuter

Luckily. Massey happened to be in Hollywood working on a Ford Star Jubilee TV show—and was available for an interview at the time his "spy" series debuted in Los Angeles.

Offhand, it came as a bit of a surprise to many people who idolize Massey, particularly for his role of Abraham Lincoln, that he should use a spy series as his first steady TV series.

During a long and friendly chat — which, in our cyes, only added more dignity and stature to an already noble and erect 6-foot 2-inch frame — Mr. Massey explained his reasons for doing the show:

"I have had several offers to do various types of TV shows, but none of them. I felt, was quite what I wanted. Also. I didn't want to do any series that had a continuous acting part.

"When I first read the I Spy scripts. I liked them. I also liked the idea of doing the role of 'Anton.'

"I don't consider it any great achievement as far as acting is concerned." the dark-haired, rugged actor laughed. "but I do consider the stories themselves to be entertaining and honest.

Just the Host

"The main purpose of this series is adventure and entertainment. Nothing else.

"To date, I haven't done any of the actual roles in the series. and I doubt if I will. 'Anton' is merely there to tell the people what the show is about. and. if appropriate, to explain its moral and purpose. Anyone who criticizes 'Anton' as an acting part is being a bit silly."

Mr. Massey was also quite honest when asked his candid opinion of the shows that have been seen so far.

"I'm pleased with them. They are complete and utter entertainment. There's enough fact and enough hokum thrown in, I think, to please everyone."

Never Tires of Abe

Of course, it's almost impossible to talk to Raymond Massey without mentioning his famous portrayals of Abraham Lincoln. Some actors, especially in TV. are afraid of being "typed" because of playing one part too often. They get tired and bored with the role, with themselves, and with other people who always associate them with "their other self."

Fortunately, Mr. Massey doesn't fall into that category. His voice rings with the sincerity of Honest Abe himself when he says:

"The Lincoln role is the greatest part I have ever had or ever will have. Never will I tire of it. Far from getting sick of it, I'm very happy and proud that people associate me with truly one of our greatest Americans."

Still Looking

Massey fans might also be interested in knowing that the Canadianborn, English-bred. naturalized American (since 1944) has not yet found the TV role or series that will bring out the immense power and magnitude of his true acting ability.

"I'm still looking." Massey commented.

His role as "Anton," then, when taken in its proper light, can not be looked upon as a TV mistake for Massey. So if you watch I Spy on KRCA, prepare for some good adventure stories and some excellent acting. But don't expect to hear Raymond Massey break out into "Four score and seven years ago, our fathers brought forth ... etc." It just won't happen.

Meet Your Movie Host



T THE END of his first week on Channel 2. Dick Norris, host on KNXT's Early Show and Big Hit Movie

five days each week, reported some surprising happenings involving his new audiences.

"People call up and ask me where they've seen me before. Others who come into our studio keep trying to place me and finally ask where they've met me before," he said.

Dick likes his role, but he's convinced that it is 'much more pleasant when one's guests know the "what, when, where, who and how" of their host.

To clear up the "I remember the face, but who are you?" question. Dick is an established actor, both in the East and in motion pictures. Ilis last big break was in "The Caine Mutiny Court Martial." in which he played in the stage version, in the motion picture and in the television production. He was cast as the psychiatrist, "Dr. Bird," and later was Henry Fonda's understudy in the play.

His "big picture" was the lead opposite Joan Dru in Bing Crosby's production of "Abie's Irish Rose." He also has had numerous lesser roles in pictures.

Dick has been an actor since he was eight years old, when he was featured on the Adventures of Jerry Parker on KFH, Wichita, Kansas, until he was 14 and moved to Huntington Park.

Dick's acting interests came about naturally. His parents, John and Lucille Norris, were vaudevillians. He was born in Fort Worth, Texas, while his parents were on tour, and was exposed to the theater from the time he can first remember.

Dick was graduated from the Huntington Park High School and went almost immediately into the U. S. Air Corps. He spent six years as a pilot, much of that time in the South Pacific area. Seriously wounded, he was two years in military hospitals. When the doctors had patched up his entire right side, including both his right arm and leg, he had to learn to walk all over again.

Intent on following his career once he was out of the service. Dick succeeded in conquering a noticeable limp and plunged back into acting by enrolling at the Pasadena Playhouse in 1945. Less than two years later he won the lead in "Abie's Irish Rose."

After several other motion picture roles, Dick went to New York and did summer stock for several seasons.

"New York is experience but Pasadena is home." is the way Dick explained his return to the West Coast.

^{*} Being a young man of ingenuity and imagination, he soon was back in the swing of things. Among his friends was Dick Powell, actor-director in motion pictures and television. One day Powell introduced Dick to Paul Gregory, who was getting ready to launch the stage version of "The Caine Mutiny Court Martial." Gregory took Dick to New York, where he played the role of the psychiatrist who testified against Captain Queeg.

"Of all the roles I've ever wanted to play, this one offered most possibilities and challenge. I needed experience and I got it," Dick relates today.

Norris is one of six cast members who never missed a stage performance. During most of the New York run, Dick also was understudy to Henry Fonda.

TV Credits

Among Dick's television credits are roles in I Led Three Lives, Mr. X, Celebrity Playhouse, Father Knows Best. and the part of "Sergeant Hatch" in Dragnet.

He recently completed a feature role in the Humphrey Bogart starrer, "The Harder They Fall," at Columbia.

Dick and actress Karen Petersen were married in 1947 in Van Nuys. They have a daughter. Kristen, and a son, Jason Richard, whose birth occasioned Dick's greatest dramatic role. "Our son surprised us by arriving unexpectedly." Dick relates, "and I didn't have time to think about acting while waiting for the doctor. I was the doctor, nurse and hospital staff." When the doctor arrived, Jason Richard had already arrived on the scene.
