FM Is Big News Again!

Shoved off into virtual obscurity by booming TV a few years ago, FM is now bouncing back in amazing way.



N the past ten years a rather remarkable thing has happened in radio broadcasting. Follow-ing World War II, FM burst on the radio horizon offering a panacea to all the ills to which the broadcasting industry might have fallen heir. It offered a quality of reproduction startling in those pre-HI-FI days. Static and interference-free, FM

radio was the "coming thing. FM stations sprouted like weeds, but something was wrong. Despite all the promises, public acceptance of FM was slow. The bubble didn't break, but the sheen on it was dull. Many of the stations shut down. The majority of those that remained were affiliates of regular AM stations and simply broadcast simultaneously the AM station's programs. So it remained until about 1952.

Then, along came HI-FI. Along came the LP recording. Along came the inexpensive, but good quality FM receivers. And into many homes, came a basic sound reproduction system which could be satisfied only by FM. More slowly this time, but on a far sounder basis, FM Radio began moving into its own.

The Facts

As a result, FM has experienced a virtual resurrection. Today in this area there are almost 20 stations broadcasting on FM. There are now some 927,000 FM receivers tuned in to these stations. A recent survey showed that nearly 47 per cent of Los Angeles homes were equipped to receive FM. Of course, not all of these homes are set up just for FM. As pointed out above, many FM receivers are incorporated in elaborate sound units.

Among the radio stations broadcasting both AM and FM is KABC, which obtained its license in May 1946. Realizing that FM was on the upsurge again, KABC recently began thinking of scheduling separate programming for FM exclusively. But before taking this step, the station manager, John Hansen, decided to have an independent survey made to find out for KABC exactly how many FM receivers there were in the greater Los Angeles area, which means os Angeles and Orange counties.

Results were so unbelievable that a second survey was made to recheck. It came out only one-tenth of a percentage point different. The survey showed the almost million FM receivers in this area.

> Ever since early 1955 when it inaugurated its pioneering Stereophonic broadcasting using two transmitters to achieve the three-dimensional realism of Stereophonic sound, KABC began re-ceiving mail from FM listeners. According to Tom Baxter, KABC's director of FM operations, "it rapidly became ap-parent from both quantity and quality of mail that we were dealing with a type of listener we had seldom met before. How could we make him a regular listener to KABC's programs? The answer lay in special programming of our FM transmitter, separate from the AM program and offering him a set of broadcasting standards he could find nowhere else.

Problem

"When it came time to set up the program schedule for KABC-FM, quite a decision was necessary. The FM stations currently on the air in the Los Angeles area were generally following one of two courses: strict classical programming, or the so-called "background music" programming.

There are advantages to both," Baxter points out. "For reasons best known to a student of sociology, the vast majority of HI-FI fans are also classical music enthusiasts. If HI-FI was our object and these listeners our target, classical music alone would be our ammunition. On the other hand, a great proportion of the

WHY Adventure Shows BECAME TV Clicks

F Jack Heintz, manager of KCOP, hadn't been the kind of person who used to go to movies just to watch the James Fitzpatrick travel shorts instead of the pictures, there might not be any adventure shows as such on TV.

It all happened when Jack Douglas went to Heintz with an idea.

"I've got some clips here of people who have taken unusual trips," he said. "They're really exciting and they should make a good TV series."

Jack debated the issue for just as long as it took him to see the clips. That did it and I Search for Adventure went on KCOP shortly afterwards and soon became one of the nation's highest rated shows.

Then Douglas, who is the real pioneer in adventure shows on TV, introduced Golden Voyage and Kingdom of the Sea.

Heintz realized he had a valuable new property here so he contacted Bill Burrud who was producing similar programs on another station. After some negotiations Bill took his Wanderlust and Vagabond, written by TV-Radio Life's Ted Hilgenstuhler, to KCOP where their popularity skyrocketed in short order.

I THINK ALCOA HOUR'S traffic drama, "No license to Kill," should be made compulsory viewing in schools from junior high up. It was a nerve shaker, but rightly so. Having blinded Victor Riesel do the narration added a special note to the presentation. I talked to Mr. Riesel at a little gathering NBC arranged the Thursday before the show. He told me he had a quick memory and experienced no great difficulty in learning his lines. Some of his more intricate parts were filmed. Someone was always near to give him a light touch to cue him. From what he said I gathered that there is hope someday he may be able to see a little. He told one chap he might be able to tell "whether I'm talking to you or Marilyn Monroe."

CLEVER PRODUCER ALAN HANDLEY should take it as a compliment when NBC-TV assigns him such difficult shows as the movies' Oscar nominations, the **Walter Winchell** opus and now the TV Emmy nomination telecast. This last-named production is a mean one.

THE TV ACADEMY IS ALREADY BEING attacked because it cut the categories down to 29. Only 9 of these will be included in the Feb. 16 colorcast, five nominees being named for each category for a total of 45.

WHEN I ASKED HANDLEY WHY they were doing a nomination show, he said "Money and ratings — money for the TV Academy and ratings because viewers like to watch the stars on something like this." I understand that Olds, which is sponsoring the program, has guaranteed a nice sum for the TV Academy's coffers.

HANDLEY'S BIGGEST PROBLEM is to give entertainment value to the production. First there's the value of having prospective nominees on screen. This means getting stars to show up for the telecast. This ticklish matter has been left

up to the Academy, which has assured performers they won't be put on camera if they are not nominated. With a promise like this the turnout should be 100 per cent.

BUT IN ADDITION TO THE STARS' appearance, Handley has been working exceptionally hard to provide a real show. He told me he's planning to use a group of Western stars in one number and a group of top singers (Fisher, Martin, etc.) in another.

HE IS PLANNING A JAZZ BAND comprising several stars who play instruments expertly — this will probably be done from both Hollywood and New York with split-screen treatment. Handley also has tricks up his sleeve for Nanette Fabray, Sid Caesar, Gertrude Berg, Steve Allen, Desi and others. On a serious note, Orson Welles will deliver a tribute to television. Handley has really hit on an idea here. In fact, an orchid to TV is long overdue.

HANDLEY, WHO USED TO WRITE, direct and produce Dinah Shore's TV show, has been flying back and forth between (Continued on Page 11)

tremendous growth of FM has been based on a listener desire to have just pleasant music as an unobtrusive companion; a different target and different tactics.

"First, the decision was made to offer music which would interest the listener on any grounds. At seven o'clock we scheduled music with the wider popular appeal, yet with sufficient character that the "background" terminology did not necessarily apply. Although broken into two half-hour segments, the first halfhour generally presents music easy to listen to, and of a lighter nature. The second half-hour, familiar music from Broadway musical comedy. From eight to ten, the music is frankly classical.

since it is our feeling that it is for the music the listener has joined us. Between eight and ten, the classical music is presented with casual, short, and material about the music, the composer, the artists, or the recording itself.

"Judging from the comments we have received to date from our listeners, KABC-FM's approach is a welcome one;

According to Baxter, the FM listener is a very discriminating person with a "capacity of enthusiasm unrivaled since the days of the crystal set and squawking headphones."

"Since the American broadcasting industry is neither government owned nor subsidized, as it is in many other countries, the individual broadcaster flourishes or starves in direct ratio to the surplus or famine of his advertisers," Baxter continued. "Yet, all information on this FM listener indicated he was driven there as a refuge from much of the intense commercialism of standard broadcasting.

"To the FM program director was thus presented an enigma: woo the advertiser and keep the listener. The acrobatics involved in this tightrope treading are far from simple. An educational campaign is necessary for the majority of the advertisers to convince them that only calm, intelligent, low key selling will fit the medium of FM. He must understand that, in general, this FM shouted repetitions or to the premise that quantity of commercial copy cannot make up for quality.

"No FM station which has not subscribed to, or lived by, these basic ideas, has yet been successful," Baxter concluded. "For those which have – a success story bordering on the spectacular has been the result."

Men of Annapolis Ch. 2 KNXT

HOUGH I have heard no direct comment from a barnacle-bottomed sea-dog on Men of Annapolis, it would be reasonably safe to assume that the traditional sulphuric command of the English language would be vigorously upheld on glimpsing this recent addition to television fare.

Men of Annapolis presents all the more sorry picture considering the inherent wealth of material one would normally assume to be part and parcel of a naval school whose products have played decisive roles in national and world history. It is unfortunate that Annapolis and its sea-dog heroes should meet such a major defeat in collision with television.

My first brush with Annapolis via television leads me to suspect there is probably much more to the naval college than can be gleaned from the trivial banality dished up by script writers. Granted that Naval Academy midshipmen are not above romance, it is also conceivable that the rigorous training of one of America's toughest centers of learning offers a mine of dramatic material.

Whether or not the Annapolis heirarchy sat in on the concoction of the show I witnessed, I know not. But the prospect of a future admiral who considers an unseemly proboscis his greatest obstacle at Annapolis left me with a quivering fear for America's future on the high seas. The blighting effect of the unseemly nose really shifted into a high-gear complex when our young mid-shipman felt himself somewhat becalmed on the seas of romance when it came to making time with a Maryland female. That his nose was most unattractive cannot be denied, and it must be admitted that even a man of potential naval might could suffer a twinge or so at being so afflicted. But it was a jolt to see our hero go to a plastic surgeon to have his condition straightened.

As if that weren't punishment enough, he then finds that people really liked him better (girl included) before his nasal transfiguration. It wasn't the nose that counted after all; it was himself. Obviously the tactical problem was to restore the nose to its former status.

But the fate of our potentially neurotic fleet commander was neatly, unblushingly and unbelievably solved by the destruction of our hero's rebuilt olfactory organ in a football game. And you'll never guess it - his nose returned to its same endearing ugliness that caused all the trouble in the first place. Annapolis deserves better treatment.

And so do television watchers.

OT MANY TV shows can claim to be aids to law enforcement as well as to be labeled entertainment. KTTV's Code 3 is the exception to the rule. And a welcome one too!

The series has proved that a program can be in the top ten nationally among syndicated shows and yet be of public service. An incident in Nashv:lle is typical of what Code 3 has done.

Ben Fox, the producer of Code 3 and of Waterfront, heard of the Nashville incident shortly after it had occurred. **Nashville Story**

"We had filmed a show called 'Charged Bottle'," Ben remarked. "It dealt with some children finding dynamite caps and plastic bottles containing explosive chemicals. One of the boys was playing with a cap, it exploded, and blew off his arm. It was, unfortunately, a true story.

'A news broadcaster in Nashville had seen this show prior to its being run in that city. He knew that 10 dynamite caps had been taken from a construction camp, so he called the Sheriff's office and invited the deputies to see this film which was to be broadcast the next day. The Sheriff was so impressed that he informed all of the public schools in the city and asked them to urge their students to see the film. Then he went on at the end of the showing to plead for the return of the missing caps.

Two days after the telecast, all 10 caps were returned, thus forestalling what could have been a tragedy similar to the one we pictured in 'Charged Bottle'.

Interestingly enough, the last line on that show, as narrated by Richard Travis, was written by Ben Fox. It read: "If Billy Armstead (the boy in the picture) had seen this show he would still have his left arm." It was a potent close.

The DuPont Company heard of the Nashville incident and wrote a letter to Rheingold Beer, which sponsored Code 3, congratulating them on the public

service aspect of the show. However, the series has more than once purposely set out to present subjects that were of public import.

One of the first programs of the series dealt with a little girl who was lost. At the end, Richard Travis asked anyone who saw a child out late at night alone and who seemed lost to report the instance at once to the Sheriff's office. Before this was written, Ben Fox called Under-Sheriff Peter Pitchess and told him what he wanted to say.

'You'll probably get a lot of nuisance

calls, so will you okay this?" Pitchess remarked, "I'll take hundreds of nuisance calls if it'll save one child.

As a result of that show, the Sheriff's office has had several messages about apparently missing children - and some have been of real service.

Code 3 has also increased interest and attracted attention to the Sheriff's office itself. Both Sheriff Biscailuz and Pitchess have told Ben Fox that the volume of recruits in their office was the highest in the history of the department, a fact they directly attributed to the impact of the show.

"The original concept of the pro-gram came from Hal Roach, Jr.," Ben went on. "He and I worked on it together. We both agreed on one big point – that there would be no star name as a regular in the cast. At first, the sponsors objected to this, but they finally argeed. We simply pointed out that our only stars were to be the sheriffs of Los Ángeles County themselves.

For the most part, Code 3 has used such directors as George Waggner, who has directed the largest number of shows, Paul Landres, Owen Crump, Peter Godfrey, William Thiele, and Ted Post. The writers have been Jerry Lewis, Paul Franklin, Jack Laird, James O'Hanlon, and William Rousseau, among others.

As Dorothy explains "I want to show the women of my audience the nicer and finer things in fashions even though they can't afford them. All women like to look at nice things, such as a Don Loper or a Hattie Carnegie gown. Of course, not all of the fashions I show are above the budget of the average housewife. Some of the clothing is very reasonable. And besides, the clothing that isn't still tends to give the lady of the house some inexpensive dressing hints." Original Creations

Every so often Dorothy will have a certain portion of her program set aside for the author of a book of the month who will read parts of the book and will go into detail about certain of its aspects. "Since I like to show the people the details of things, it is sometimes necessary to have the person connected with an item bring on the program some interesting items that they can show the audience. These usually come from the individual's personal life in relation to his work production," Dorothy stated.

"For instance, I have had Sascha Brastoff on my program several times. He is very cooperative in bringing along his sketches which he works into his china. For example, he had made an extensive trip to South America to get designs for his work and surprisingly enough, brought numerous articles to the show that he brought back with him. I know it was interesting to the viewers to see where the designs of these completed products got their origin."

Through all of this screening a televiewer can be assured of the finest and most tasteful works of art, because as Dorothy says, "I show the things that I might like to see if I were one of the audience.'

Why They Clicked

"Adventure shows as such have been popular, I think because most all of us want to travel to far-off places and have the exciting experiences that those who made the films had," Jack Heintz explained. "At first, none of us knew if these shows would go. It was a gamble, but it has certainly paid off. They paid off because thousands of people are armchair travelers.

"We have carefully presented these shows in blocks to increase their popularity. Search is on for an hour and Golden Voyage and Wanderlust are combined for an hour, as are Vagabond and Kingdom of the Sea. We have found this type of presentation has done much to attract viewers.

"Wanderlust and Golden Voyage are enough different in type to give a nice change of pace because the places visited on Wanderlust are those easily accessible by all whereas Golden Voyage covers the world. The same applies to Vagabond and Kingdom of the Sea.

"We're now bringing in two other shows — Wonders of the World, which features the travels of the Hal Linker family, and Jungle, which is on every day and presents amazing film clips of the animal world. We expect Wonders of the World to have real appeal too because it will give viewers a look at a truly interesting family."

In the beginning, KCOP carried its first adventure show, I Search for Adventure, on sustaining for two months since few sponsors could see the value in such a show. They changed their mind in short order, however, and took on the program.

Presentation

"I think Search – and the others – have caught on because the presentation is down-to-earth," Jack Heintz continued. "They never talk down to their audience, whereas some travel shows have been too sophisticated, too aloof in approach. Douglas' attitude is always friendly and appeals to the average viewer, just as is Slim Barnard's happy, informal style.

"The interesting thing, too, about our shows is that while some are done by commercial photographers the majority is the work of top amateurs. They prove that anyone could come up with such films if he wanted to take the time and 'he trouble. No stock shots at all are used. Everything is al just the way they were taken with pathing gussied up

al, just the way they were taken with nothing gussied up. "The only show that might be difficult for an average pe in to film is Kingdom of the Sea which deals with a ver specialized kind of adventure. Yet, we hear this show has ontributed much toward building up interest in skin diving."

The Academy of Television Arts and Sciences has also recognized the value in two of these adventure shows. I Search for Adventure and Kingdom of the Sea have been nominated three times for an Emmy. That neither won the coveted award remains a fantastic puzzler and has only added fuel to the argument that Emmys are given out in some cases in a rather slap-dash manner.

When these shows go on your TV set, probably the most avidly interested viewer of all is Jack Heintz, who sits glued to his set not to criticize or appraise but to have himself a ball. After all, he has never been out of this country and he has traveled but little, so all of this is exciting to him.

Jack Douglas, Bill Burrud, and Slim Barnard have proved that TV is not limited just to quiz shows and family situation comedies. They have proved, too, that audiences are interested in something worthwhile. Their faith in the intellectual capacity of their viewers is one of the most significant aspects of the shows' success.

THE STORY OF

> uite unexpectedly, it all began on the night of March 24, 1954. Two people who had never met before.

They had a lot in common – professionally and personally. They were both basic-

ally show business people. Both at the crossroads of their careers. He, a piano player and singer and composer was making a good living. But nothing "big" was happening. She, a former actress, was looking for something to do to keep her busy. She didn't know exactly what.

They shared another common and unfortunate experience. They were both married and divorced. Each, a devoted parent, had two children at home.

The piano player was called Bobby. Julie was her name.

An ardent fan of good jazz music, one night Julie London was "making the rounds" with a group of friends of the various combos in town. They stopped at the Celebrity Room where Bobby Troup was playing. Bobby knew Julie's friends and was introduced to her.

"I didn't know who she was," Bobby recalls, "but I thought she was awfully pretty." (The understatement of the year for anyone who has seen the blueeyed, golden-haired, well-proportioned beauty.)

"The first thing I remember saying," Julie recollects, "is that we looked alike. Our noses and forehead come straight down," she gestures with her hands. (Facially, they do resemble each other. But the comparison ends there – quite thankfully.)

Later in the evening, Julie invited Bobby to her house for a late snack with her friends. Merely for fun, Julie sang a song.

sang a song. "I just couldn't believe what I heard," Bobby continues the story. "I had no idea she could sing. And she didn't want to sing, either. At least professionally. She had only done it once before. As a band vocalist when she was 14 years old."

It took a lot of convincing, but Bobby finally persuaded Julie to open at John Walsh's 881 Club. The rest is show business history: Julie's smash recording of "Cry Me A River;" her "Julie" album; and her latest album success "Calendar Girl."

Bobby, meanwhile, who acts as her unofficial agent and arranger (without any direct monetary compensation, we might add) has been on the upswin career-wise with nightly appearances at the Keynoter on Santa Monica Blvd., movie assignments, recording dates, and of course, his own Stars of Jazz program on KABC-TV.

What about the marital status between these two who very obviously have more than show business on their mind when they look into each other's eyes?

"Not yet," says Bobby. "We've both been hurt before. We want to make absolutely sure this time."
