Every Man's Family

Why has One Man's Family enjoyed 25 successive years on radio? Perhaps it is because it has problems like any ordinary American family.

NE Man's Family is celebrating its 25th anniversary on the air April 29. During this period it has endeared itself to the hearts of millions.

Behind this show is the modest, mild-mannered Carlton Morse, creator and producer-director. He explains its success, "The intent of the show has been to portray a true American family in a true perspective."

This has been exemplified through the years by the fan mail the program has received. The father of a family in the middle west gave his children the alternative of going to church on Sunday or listening to One Man's Family. A lifetermer in a southern penitentiary who had been an orphan all his life wrote that he was adopting the radio family as his own.

Mr. Morse explains these heart warming anecdotes by the fact that "Over the years families have come to associate the problems of One Man's Family with their own. This bears itself out since the fan mail from the listeners becomes heaviest when the Barbours get into some kind of predicament; or when they have some problem to solve.

Origin

One Man's Family first originated in San Francisco in 1932. After getting bored with all the murder mysteries he was writing for NBC, Morse thought up the format of the Family. Having come from a large family himself, Morse well knew of the sometimes hectic situations a large family can get into.

After presenting the story line to the president of NBC, and coming to an agreement that if the show was not a success, it would be replaced after three shows, Morse proceeded to write the show under these conditions. Needless to say, this agreement was not necessary. It is interesting to note that after the huge success of this program, soap operas seemed to multiply by the hundreds. Perhaps it can be considered the pathfinder for soap operas.


The show is unique in radio, somehow, in that the cast has had only a few changes since the first broadcast. Evidently the cast feels that they have become a part of the family. There is not one character in the show that has been replaced more than once.

Perhaps it is devotion like this that has made One Man's Family the family of so many millions.

That's just one of the many lessons learned by ABC radio newscaster Sid Fuller . . . who is sixty years old but still going strong.

n February 16, ABC news-caster Sid Fuller celebrated his 60th birthday. He doesn't look his age. Doesn't act it. And as we found out during a lively interview, he certainly doesn't think it.

Naturally a little flattered when told he doesn't show his age, the tall, slightly mustached newsman explains there's no particular secret to keeping young

and active.

"I smoke as much as ever. Maybe a pack a day. Gave it up for three months, but I saw no change in me - I even lost a half pound. So I went back to smoking. I drink very moderately. I don't exercise any more than the average man. But when I go wild boar hunting with my son in the hills of Avalon, where we have a home, I pride myself in the fact that I can keep up with him.

"I will say this much, though: show me a man who does not have a keen and vital interest in something — anything— and I'll show you a sick man."

For his "outside interests," the Chi-

cago-born veteran newspaperman and radio announcer explains that he "can get quite heated over a community debate concerning a school bond issue." And as a former scoutmaster, he has helped numerous boys with their scout activities.

Past Experience

Next to his immediate family (wife Katherine, daughter Mrs. Barbara Peterson, and 19-year-old Winston who is a pharmacy major at USC) Sid's numberone interest, naturally, is News.

A former reporter with the El Paso Herald, the San Diego Sun ,and the San Diego Independent, and with 21 years of service as a program manager and announcer with the Mutual Don-Lee network, Fuller took on his present position with the KABC-Radio staff in No-

"I wouldn't want to do anything else in the world than what I do right now. Although a newscaster is literally in the middle of all the excitement which makes news every day of our lives, there are times when he's the loneliest man in the world. That's when he is sitting in front of the microphone doing his

"For a long time, and even today, I gave many lectures. In front of a live audience you have a chance to see how they are reacting. And after its' over, they can talk back to you. But not with a newscaster. He's all alone. He has no way of judging whether his words are pleasing or displeasing the audience.

"I suppose it's a good thing, but the only time a newscaster hears from his audience directly is when he makes a

mistake

Examples

"I remember one time when I said on the air that Lieutenant General Wainright, the hero of the Philippines, had returned to his home town of Skaneateles. I pronounced it just like it looks. After the broadcast, however, I discovered it should have been Skan-e-atlas. I also discovered there must have been 722 people here in Southern California from that small town because that's just about how many people called me after the broadcast.

'Another time, over twenty years ago mind you, I was talking about Musso-lini's 'pick troopers,' and unfortunately called them 'trick poopers.' Just re-cently, while in San Francisco speaking before a Rotary Club, I was introduced as the man who called Mussolini's 'pick troopers' as 'trick poopers.' Twenty years late — and they still hadn't for-

Unlike many newscasters, Fuller writes and edits every single word that

he broadcasts.

"I must scan through at least 75,000 words a day from the various news sources. I condense that to about 1800 of my own words. As a trick of the trade, in order to get the attention of the 'in motion' radio audience, I try either from my voice or by the writing itself - to arouse and then hold the interest of the listener.'

To round out Mr. Fuller's full life, his hobby — and get this! — is making ammunition at home. No, he's not a crackpot trying to devise new ways to blow-up the world. It's only ammuni-

tion for his hunting guns.

VEN the mighty sea needs a little sex appeal. And that's how Zale Parry swam her way dom of the Sea.

Formerly produced by Jack Douglas, the popular KCOP series is now controlled by Martin Ross and Ed Leftwich of Emperor Productions and syndicated

nationally by Guild Films.

The success story of the 23-year-old blonde is a fairly typical one: Born in Milwaukee, the eldest of six children, she took to swimimng at an early age. Performed for aquatic show in Milwaukee and did precision swimming and surface diving for exhibitions throughout the Midwest. Came to Hollywood six years ago. Worked as secretary at Douglas. Next-door-neighbor press agent Jerry Ross found out she was expert swimmer and skin diver. Zale became interested in skin diving when she met another Parry, Parry Biven, an aquatic engineer, who is now her husband and is a pre-med student at UCLA.

Joins "Kingdom" Cast

At first, the five-feet-two-inch, 110pound beauty was used as a sort of an extra-added attraction on Kingdom of the Sea. She and Col. Craig, the host of the show, would put on occasional demonstrations in a special water tank at the Channel 13 studios. Now Zale, who intends to be an actress some day and who has already done several small parts in TV and movies, is a regular member of the "Kingdom" cast.

"It came at just the right time too," she explained during an interview at the new Harlequin restaurant in Beverly Hills, "because some of the medical books that Pary needs for school are awfully expensive. He'll be studying for another three years, but we're both determined to see him through."

Although her underwater activities may look dangerous, the friendly hometype blonde says she has never had any

real narrow escapes.

"I was scared once by a pelican. I was alone on a small raft and was trying to hold on to a rooster fish, which my husband had handed to me. All of a sudden that pelican zoomed in on me. I can still see that hungry look in his eye and that big bill of his snapping at me. Naturally, he wanted the fish, but I wouldn't let go. Parry saw what was happening and grabbed the pelican's legs from underneath the water. Finally

the pelican flew away-without my fish."

Record Holder

Zale is not just a TV skin diver — doing it just to add showmanship and sex appeal to the Kingdom series. She's the real McCoy — and holds the women's world record for skin diving to prove it.

In August, 1954, with United States Coast Guard officials present, she dove to a depth of 209 feet in the open sea

near Catalina.


"It took about 4 or 5 minutes to get down that far. I even wrote my name at the bottom, just in case anyone would like proof of it," she related. "Coming up to the surface took a little longer. About 13 minutes. You have to do that to avoid nitrogen narcosis. It just wasn't a publicity stunt, either. We were actually testing equipment at the time I made the dive."

The two Parry's (Parry and Mrs. Parry Bivens) live in a ranch style home in Mandeville Canyon. They have no children — not yet anyhow — but they do raise chickens, have a noser dog named Hildegarde — and oh yes — two

Buddy Merrill ... WELK'S NEW STAR

TV fans have already set up a clamor about this young guitarist, but his future has been neatly taken care of by a certain girl

ON'T be surprised if Buddy Merrill winds up as one of Lawrence Welk's hottest at-

Buddy is the young guitarist - he won't be 21 until July - who has registered very strongly with viewers. The older women are impressed by him because they think he needs mothering. The younger girls - well, you should read some of Buddy's fan mail! They're not trying to be any mother to

While Buddy appreciates such en-thusiasm in his behalf, he wasted no time in letting it be known that he planned to marry his high school sweetheart, Faye, in July, right after his twen-

"I've been going with Faye for over two years now," the quiet-speaking Buddy said. "We both decided to wait until I was 21 to get married and we started saving money towards the marriage. My mother has taught Faye to sew, I spend most of my time at her house talking to her and her parents, so we really are one big happy family already.

Faye works as a secretary, and, as Buddy put it, "She's a whiz at shorthand — and can I use that! She handles most of my fan mail now. Not that she

Buddy lives in Gardena which is like an overnight trip to the Aragon ballroom where Welk plays or to ABC-TV studios for his TV shows. He is thinking of moving closer in but so far has made no definite strides in that di-

The day I saw Buddy he was all

excited about the new convertible he had just bought himself - naturally, it was a Dodge. The Chrysler Company had already given the boys in the band new Dodges, so Buddy gave his model to his parents and bought the sportier job for himself.

He paid cash for the car, which is no mean feat for a kid of 20. But he has, by law, had to put most of his earnings into a trust fund. The money he does keep he budgets rather carefully.

"I spend more on my instruments than anything else," he said. "I have three, four, five guitars. The Fender Instrument Company gave me a new one that is sensational – really great."

Buddy joined the Welk organization

about two years ago. He had entered Lawrence's national contest and was a winner. The job with the band was an extra bonus and a real surprise.

"Working with Lawrence has been wonderful," Buddy said. "I've learned so much about music — and about people - from being with him. I think I've overcome some shyness too. I didn't ever care much for crowds. I got flustered, but in this job I have to be in contact with people all the time so

you can't stay reserved for long.

"Lawrence is also a good friend in advice he gives me. He even advises Faye and me when we have an argument of some kind. He always points out that such disagreements aren't nearly as serious as most young people make them - and he sure is right.

Buddy was about eight when he started playing the guitar, his father having also been a guitarist. He joined the union when he was eleven and has been playing professionally ever since. Recently, he recorded three songs on the Coral label.

"It's probably odd, but I don't have any records at home," Buddy observed. "I just have tapes. I don't have time to listen to records, I guess.

Buddy's other interests are mechanical drafting, astronomy, and, above all, arranging. He does the arrangements for all of his guitar solos. He has little liking for sports.

Most of Buddy's concentration was centered on Faye, which is only natural, so he did a quick switch from music

back to the girl.

"Faye understands the problems of my job and while she doesn't like being away on tour or the late hours I have to lead she appreciates the fact that they are all necessary," Buddy explained. "I'd like to see her more often than I'm able to, but with the ballroom and the ABC-TV shows the only times we can get together are on a Monday (after the telecast), Tuesday, or Thursday evenings. Sometimes she goes to the ballroom with me.

"We're both sensitive people, although I think she is more so than I am. She has a complex about herself and how she thinks she looks, which I can't understand because she's very attractive. At any rate, she suits me just fine.

"I think she'll be a wonderful wife and I hope I'll be a good husband.' Then with a knowing grin he added, 'There is only one thing I won't doand that's do dishes. That's not a man's



TED MACK, originating two ABC telecasts (Feb. 24 and Mar. 3) of his Original Amateur Hour from Hollywood, found this area to be a gold mine of talent. On Friday preceding his first show from Moulin Rouge his staff had already screened more than 1100 acts. Not here in five years, he was tempted to extend his visit at least one more telecast.

BUT PRESSURE OF A NEW project summoned Mack East. On July 2, Ted is opening an 8-week summer camp for 100 young people on 85 acres he recently purchased in the Berkshires. Phone lines were humming while he was here, as he had to be in almost constant contact with those in New York delegated to prepare the camp arrangements. A staff of 42 will direct nature studies, athletic competitions, musical studies and other recreational activities.

HELPING YOUNG PEOPLE ONSTAGE is a Ted Mack tradition. More than 800,000 amateurs have passed before him, during the 22 years he has aided talent. But offstage, too, Ted and his wife Marguerite have encouraged youngsters. Once he was attracted to a forlorn lad of 10 standing outside Madison Square Garden. He and Mrs. Mack adopted the orphan boy for a year, sending him to school and giving him the affection that he had missed. Presently they have a 12-year-old they are sending to school and providing with the comforts and love of family.

TED MACK, RELAXED IN FRONT OF AN ABC-TV mike, I found just as easy going in real-life attitudes. He makes Perry Como look like a ball of fire. Exceptionally proud of his Amateur Hour "graduates," he pointed out that 40 per cent of the working members of American Guild of Variety Artists had landed their break on his show.

PAT BOONE IS ONE OF THE MOST recent alumni to hit the Big Time. "He was on my show five years ago," Mack told me. "He had an offer of a radio job right away, but at that time he planned to enter the ministry. He was a fine singer even then and a wonderful boy."

FRANK SINATRA, ANOTHER MACK product, elicits nothing but praise from Ted. When asked what he thought of "Crankie" Frankie (Sinatra's new nickname since his Australian debacle), Mack replied, "I admire him. He has his convictions and the intestinal fortitude to stick by them."

MACK THINKS AMATEUR TALENT today is just as good as it used to be, maybe even better because of TV. The amateurs generally have more poise than those of years gone by.

QUITE NATURALLY MACK IS recognized and autograph-hounded wherever he goes. One of the most amusing encounters of this sort occurred when he was in Korea. A young fellow rushed up and exclaimed: "Remember me? I'm Wee Willie Smith. I was on your show!" Ted, recalling the bona fide Wee Willie, realized this youngster had been putting on an act with his buddies. To save him embarrassment Mack went along with the impersonation.

MACK SAID AMATEURS here and everywhere were imitating Presley. "Just the way all of them used to do Sinatra," he concluded.

AT THE FRENCH DINNER party NBC-TV gave to screen "Maurice Chevalier's Paris," the French waiters were eager spectators, let tears trickle down their faces unashamedly as familiar scenes brought back memories of home . . . KTLA injected excitement by televising the Senate hearings. Gil Martyn swung the deal for Channel 5, is to be commended . . . Saw Spike Jones in The Derby. He said he has some TV plans cooking . . . To Jack Linkletter and Barbara May Hughes, who became engaged Valentine's Day. Linkletter sent his paternal blessings all the way from Honolulu.



HEN Lana Turner appears on the Bob Hope show this week on NBC-TV it will be because Bob did what no one else has been able to do.

Up to then, Long has steadfastly refused to risk doing anything on TV, live especially. She has turned down countless offers for dramatic appearances but then one night at

Bob's house she changed her mind.

"I was invited to Bob's place for the evening and he ran a couple of 'kinnies' for me of shows Betty Grable and Ginger Rogers had done," Lana confessed. "They looked so good and so at ease that I decided to take the step. I figured that if they could do it, I guess I could too.

"Actually, while I was nervous at first, **Bob** is so relaxed and so calm that he rubs off on you and I found the show not half as difficult as I thought it would be. I even discovered that it helped to work before a live audience."

And what a live audience! The show was filmed on a Saturday and Sunday before a large crowd of CB's. They whistled so much when Lana came on that the show ran way over its time.

Long was a real favorite with the company. Some had expected her to be difficult and were very happy to find that she was a regular gal, no temperament, no demands, just wanting only to cooperate.

Long was, however, concerned about some things — such as camera angles. The confusion of TV did throw her a little, and it was a new experience to her to be doing dances and to be singing, in addition to the skits she appears in with Bob and Wally Cox.

"I was so delighted with Jack Baker's choreography," Lana said, "that I'd kind of like doing a musical in pictures some time."

One by one the screen's most glamorous figures are succumbing to the lure of TV. Who's next?

George Putnom has had a much more difficult time in the hospital than most people have realized. He has been a sick guy, but at the same time he has run across a couple of hot potatoes which he intends to campaign against when he returns to KTTV. It will be good to have him back on TV.

Still the letters come in about the cancellation of Noch's Ark. It is the same kind of viewer protest as that given Mr. Peepers and Father Knows Best when they were taken off. But it is doubtful if public demand can force the return of the Jack Webb show. From all indications, the end is quite final. However, we shall wait and see. But here again you have a fine show going off because of so-called ratings. When, oh, when! will the public's desires be considered instead of these jig-saw puzzles called rating services?

Paul Coates' Confidential File, which tackled some really controversial subjects in the beginning, is now going in for some sturdier subjects in the near future. Among those topics to be presented are Quack Psychology; Chino, the Model Prison for the World; A Visit to a Girl's Reformatory, breeding place for adult criminals; Dangers of Parlor Hypnotism.

In a recent issue Hal Roach wrote an article about there being no time for temperament on TV. Well, he was right. I would suggest that Gale Robbins read this. From what I saw of her temperamental displays on the set of the Bab Cummings Show recently, she had better calm down fast. This is ordinarily the happiest set in town but Miss Robbins really had the company in tension. Hasn't TV grown past that kind of thing yet?

Tony Travis' new album for RCA-Victor, "I See Your Face Before Me," is smooth listening. This Tony has a good voice and a nice personality. The album ought to do well.

Pollowing is my entry in the Colgate "Pick the Picture Contest" (I think I'll sue them over that title): I want to see "Blossoms in the Dust," because I know that nothing could get those flowers cleaner than a box of Fab and there's nothing better than clean pictures, I always say. (Please send tickets for Hawaiian vacation care of this magazine.)

"The Human Comedy." (11) March 11, 10:15. 1943. William Saroyan's chief concerns are mirroring the big emotions of the little people, and reiterating the theme that man is good. These precepts are the main ingredients of this heartening picture, a good adaptation of Saroyan's rambling dissertation of the good people of Fresno, California. The time is World War II and we watch the courage and spirit of these citizens through the eyes of a messenger boy, Mickey Rooney, whose deliveries of the good and bad news of the day enable him to observe the results of both. There is no plot, just a few incidents and anecdotes, related with simple care, a bit soporific at times, but always sincere. With Frank Morgan, Van Johnson and Jack Jenkins.

"Ruce Street." (9) Beginning March 12, 9:00. "This is the violent story of a man whose burning hatred makes him defy the underworld and . . . etc., etc." George Raft, Marilyn Maxwell and William Bendix in a thing about Eastern syndicate mobsters trying to take over San Francisco gambling. All I know is, Mickey Cohen said on Bill Stout's "Eye to Eye" program that he never heard of a gambling syndicate, so this film is obviously a sham from beginning to end.

"Random Harvest." (11) March 15, 8:00. 1942. Ronald Colman loses his memory and begins a new life with new wife Greer Garson. Then he regains his memory, forgets his



interim life and wife and Greer has to go to work for him as a secretary in order to lead him back to the bliss that was theirs. The power of James Hilton's book was that the reader didn't know until the last page that the wife and secretary were the same. The picture is unable to bring this off without disguising Miss Garson and that's hardly possible . . . imagine her with a mole on her nose or something like that . . . unbelievable. Besides, she wouldn't do it.

"Wings of the Navy." (5) March 11, 7:30. 1939. What a vogue there was for this sort of thing from Warners before World War II. Brothers George Brent and John Payne vie for the affections of Olivia De Havilland when they're not flying and training...well, trainees...in the Naval Air Schools. I sometimes think Warners singlehandedly prepared our country for war.

"Voice of Bugle Ann." (11) March 14, 10:15. 1936. Lionel Burrymore kills a man because he suspects him of skull-duggery regarding his pet foxhound, Bugle Ann. Besides asserting that a dog's life is worth more than a man's, this film espouses very little other than the joys of fox hunting. With Eric Linden, for those of you interested in the Tab Hunter of yesteryear.

"I Know Where I'm Going." (7) March 9, 7:30. To the dogs, ch? Pretty foxy...there's that pesky hound, again ... Blow, Bugle Ann.



"On Camera"

Captain Grief Ch. 11, KTTV Thursday, 7:30 p.m.

Captain Grief's first voyage into the squalls of television gives hope for greater things to come than was evident in the first saga of the romantic captain derived from stories of Jack London.

The dramatic ingredients of this story were potent—the moral cowardice of a newly-married husband and his attempt to escape when his bride is stricken with cholera on a South Seas island. Here are all the raw elements of powerful drama, but the net result, in this reviewer's opinion, suffered from misplaced emphasis and superficial development of the central characters involved.

I had the impression that either the scripters failed to see the significance of the material or were somewhat confused as to how to bring in the character of Captain Grief, who, other than captaining the ship bringing the couple to the island and getting in for the tag line, was more or less incidental to the story.

Considering the above-mentioned ingredients of such a story, it is imperative that the emphasis be on the two persons involved, a penetrating exploration and development of the chief characters and their relationship when confronted with death. To achieve maximum effect this cannot be done by bold, crude strokes, but must be built through the cumulative effect of subtle detail, careful craftsmanship, and human insight. Anything less results in the jerky antics of stock characters.

Due to its close confines, television offers greater scope than any other dramatic medium for detailed nuance or character. For when it comes right down to it, drama and conflict arise from the interplay and strife of the human animal. Thus, the deeper the penetration of the human heart and mind, the greater the intensity of drama. Too many television writers are in too big a hurry, too eager for physical action, too eager to pull the strings from the sidelines, rather than permitting a story to develop its own intensities from the inner wellsprings of characters in conflict.

It may be argued (and all too frequently is) that the pressure for speed placed upon the writer to satisfy the demands for television material is a causative factor. This, I am afraid, is an illusionary argument which pays off only in the diminishing returns of a declining audience for the show in question.

This is not to imply by any means that Captain Grief is so categorized. As a new show it bears promise. The raw stuff is there.



Man in Flight

ORE than two years of work went ORE than two years of work went into the Walt Disney one-hour film, screened as a Tomorrowland feature on Disneyland March 6. Actual production required an additional year for this ABC-TV show.

In researching for this highlighted history of aviation, Disney personnel studied authoritative books and documents dating back to Greek mythology and ancient China. They learned of man's constant desire to emulate the birds. They discovered the little recognized contributions to man's conquest of flight by such personages as the celebrated Leonardo Da Vinci, who primarily is known as an artist. It was Da Vinci who built the first parachute and invented the helicopter, which he called the "Aerial Helix."

Disney researchers and production heads imported and viewed rare documentary films concerning aviation from throughout the world. Many of these motion pictures were of famous as well as little known historical flights. Enough footage alone was seen to comprise the annual production of 26 hour-long "Disneyland" shows.

Industry, Armed Forces Cooperation

Virtually the entire American aircraft industry, plus the U.S. Armed Forces, gave unstinting cooperation in the production of Man In Flight.

The aviation industry made available thousands of feet of film footage, as did the Armed Forces. That selected for the TV presentation was merged to form a beautifully dramatic ending consisting of an impressive symphony of wings.

A score of living pioneers of aviation's history, too, cooperated with director Hamilton Luske; Dr. Heinz Haber, Disney Studio science consultant; and writer Milt Banta. This is remarkable in view of aviation's heavier-than-air history of 54 years - less than the average man's life span.

For the sequence recalling Leonardo Da Vinci's contributions to man's knowledge of flight, Disney artists actually animated the illustrious Italian's own original drawings.

First Da Vinci was dramatized as neglecting his famous Mona Lisa painting to develop theories of flight. He was depicted test-flying the models of the first parachute and the first helicopter.

Revealed also was Da Vinci's note writing in reverse to preserve their secrecy, thus resulting in the first classified technical information in the very beginning of aviation.

Veteran Disney Studio composer-musician Oliver Wallace fashioned an original musical score to melodically highlight Man In Flight. His excellent original score is particularly fine during the concluding symphony of wings.





Lucky Gudes

HILE Charles Van Doren is pulling viewers to their screens to watch NBC-TV's Twenty-One, a young couple name of Erik and Helena Gude have been attracting lookers to CBS-TV's Do You Trust Your Wife?

As we went to press last week, the Gudes had already won \$100 weekly for 19 years. People were speculating on how much longer their winning streak would hold and what the Gudes were planning to do with all their loot.

"A lot of people" says dark-eyed Helena Gude, "think we should be walking around with great suitcases full of greenbacks — but this just isn't so. We get our money at the rate of \$100 a week — except for the \$1200 we won on the original quiz show (Oct. 16, 1956), which we were paid right then when the show went on the air.

"So, as this money comes in, we use some of it to pay bills, and some to buy things we need for the children or the house."

The Gudes have three cars — but the youngest of these is a sprightly six years old — Helena insists they need a new car, but the more conservative Erik wants to hold off on this for a while until "We can see exactly where we're going."

Gude, who is now employed by the Macco Corporation, a construction firm, is an engineer in the organization's pipeline division — a job that pays him \$550 a month. He has no ideas about quitting, although he does want to go back to school and get a degree in business administration to go along with the engineering degree he received in 1950 upon graduation from the U. S. Naval Academy at Annapolis.

Plenty of Advice

They're getting advice, say the Gudes, from just about everyone they know or meet—"and they're not all people trying to get our money, either," adds Erik. But the most serious advice they've received, he says, was from Steve and Dorothy Rowland, the Los Angeles couple who last year won \$74,000 on Do You Trust Your Wife? The Rowlands invested their money in an ever-increasing investment trust with a Los Angeles bank, and Erik and Helena Gude think eventually they'll do something along that line.

A tax expert has advised Gude that, based on continuation of his present income and the extension of present tax structures, he'll have to pay only about one-fourth of his winnings in income taxes. That's because they get the money spread over such a long time at \$5200 per year.









Because of this tremendous exploitation, the Bumsteads are well known to grownups of today. The younger generation is now getting a chance to see and hear the Bumsteads in action on NBC-TV's new Blondie series.

The format is still pretty much the same: "Dagwood" gets in a jam. Comes close to, or gets fired by his boss, "Mr. Dithers." Then Blondie, or someone else, comes to the rescue. All ends well, natch, though with some confusion. The show is supposed to be funny. And from what we've seen so far, occasionally it is.

The behind-the-scenses story of how Blondie finally got on TV is not so funny, however. And it never would have happened if Hal Roach, Jr. was not a persistent man who had faith in this timeproven format and thought it was a 'natural" for television - especially for the kids in the family.

How It Happened

For several years, after Blondie folded on radio and in motion pictures, Roach had the TV rights to the Chic Young property, but couldn't sell the idea. Even when he sold a sponsor, he couldn't get the right time slot on one of the

major networks. A thousand and one different things blocked Blondie's TV debut.

Finally, in March, 1956, a pilot was made. Casting was no particular problem. For the role of "Blondie," Roach selected Pamela Britton, an established star in motion pictures and on the stage. She is probably best remembered for her role with Frank Sinatra in "Anchor's Aweigh," and her two-and-a-half year stint with the Broadway musical, "Guys and Dolls."

"I was actually called in by Mr. Roach over two years ago," the wideeyed actress explained during a lunch break at the Hal Roach commissary. "I never took a screen test or anything for the part. Mr. Roach just explained to me that he intended to do the series and said how he wanted the role of Blondie portrayed. Naturally I agreed with him," she laughed. "But the first time I ever stepped before the cameras was when we made the first pilot some two years later. I think that's some sort of a record in this business.'

And who was going to play Dagwood? Who else but Arthur Lake! The original "Harold Teen," Arthur was the immediate choice of Columbia Pictures to play "Dagwood" when that studio began filming Blondie back in 1938. He's played it ever since - for every picture, every radio show, and now the TV role.

Not Typed — Dead!

"I know that some actors are afraid to be 'typed' in this business," Arthur related, sitting next to his blonde TV wife. "That is, when they play one role too long, they are afraid no one will ever hire them to do anything else. If that's the case, I guess I'm a dead duck. Because I'm as 'typed' in this role as

anyone will ever be. And you know what? I'm not complaining one single bit." he smiled again.

Because he was typed as Dagwood, Arthur did have a few tough years in show business. "But I didn't mind too much," he smiled again. "I did a few things on TV and was very interested in doing some travelogues for the theaters. As a matter of fact, we did shoot three of them - in Guatemala and Japan. And we were just going to try to get them on television, when the Blondie show came back. I'm still interested in doing them, however, and will do so the first break we get.'

As for Pamela, she intends to capitalize on her "Blondie" role with personal appearances and her own nightclub act, during which she sings and

"After people see me on TV as Blondie, I think it will come as a surprise to them that I can sing and dance, she explained. "And this should make it all the more entertaining for them.

Comparison With "Old" Blandie

As far as the role of "Blondie" itself is concerned - and in comparison to the way Penny Singleton did it for so long - Pamela is playing it pretty straight. Penny made Blondie a cute, but still pretty silly housewife. Pamela's "Blondie" is more sincere and not as dumb. Whether or not this makes for better entertainment is for the public to decide.

Probably the strangest fact of all which Pamela revealed during our interview was that she had never seen Penny in the role of Blondie. And in her present circumstance, it's probably just as well because now she can give the role a fresh approach without being prejudiced by Penny's treatment.

Another point which both Pamela and Arthur elaborated on was that "Blondie" is not the "big heroine" in each script, as she was in most of the old radio and movie shows. In the NBC-TV version, each situation will be resolved by a dif-ferent person — either Dagwood, Blon-die, or one of their neighbors or friends. Sometimes even Daisy the dog will get into the act.

Daisy and Arthur, incidentally, are the only two vets left over from the old cast. All the rest of the regulars - Stuffy Singer as "Alexander," Ann Barnes as "Cookie," Hal Peary as "Woodley," and Hollis Irving as "Mrs. Irving,"—are new.
The situations, however; the dialogue;

the characterizations; and even the poor, perpetually knocked-down mailman (played by Lucien Littlefield) are still the same.

If you liked the old version of "Blondie," you'll probably enjoy this TV series. Some people though, who even chuckled occasionally at the former antics of this famed American couple, may feel that TV has grown up a bit - while the Bumsteads haven't. That's something that only time - the ratings - and the sponsor's response - will definitely con-

THE SURPRISE HIT OF THE YEAR

COLLEGE SENIOR HERB STEMPEL was one of the most successful contestants, winning \$49,500 on the show. At one time his winnings were up to \$69,500.



T'S a very odd thing about Twenty-One, the new NBC-TV show which is now slotted against I Love Lucy and is doing all right. It came along in a rash of new quiz shows. Break

the Bank, Tic Tac Dough, Giant Step, and others were launched at the same time, and for a while it looked as though none of them was going anywhere fast. In fact, Break the Bank has since given up the ghost in spite of its \$250,000 jackpot.

Twenty-One made no terrific splash at first, although most people found it interesting. And then, suddenly, it became the most talked-about show of the season. Since then it has built to such proportions that it looks like a sure shoo-in for awards and certainly for high ratings.

Twenty-One isn't chicken about giving away money. A contestant can go on winning dough as long as he can answer the questions right. The ceiling is the limit. But it is not the money awarded that makes Twenty-One the surprise hit of the year. It is again the people. The NBC-TV show is further proof that if the contestants are interesting, that is all that matters.

Charles Van Doren

A young bachelor, Charles Van Doren, a teacher of English at Columbia University, was probably the most exciting contestant on Twenty-One and the person who helped to bring the program all of its attention. He was the first person in TV to win over \$100,000 - and, at this writing, he is aiming for more. During his long stay on the show he had a couple of nervous and harrowing moments, as did the audiences watching him, but he managed to come back with a big splash. Maybe this is one of the things that make Twenty-One interesting to viewers. A contestant can make a mistake and still go on to win.

Van Doren, of course, had a tremendous background that helped him hurdle all the barriers. His father was the noted author Mark Van Doren and his uncle was the equally noted author Carl Van Doren. Both men had won Pulitzer Prizes for their work. On the show his most stalwart competitor was Ruth Miller, a text book writer. At one point in the first game she had a chance to oust Van Doren because she had a 16-11 lead. She chose to continue, unaware that she was ahead. This is one of the gimmicks that make Twenty-One interesting.

Most people thought quiz shows were doing a fade and then along came Twenty-One.

Can this one buck the tide?

How Played

For those who haven't caught the show yet, it is played by two contestants in separate soundproof studios competing in a race for 21 points by answering questions from assigned categories. The winner receives \$500 per point for the difference between his score and that of his opponent. A winner may stay on the show opposing new challengers until he is defeated or elects to stop and take the money he has already won. The amount won by a victorious challenger is subtracted from the former champion's total.

During the first 17 weeks of the show a total of \$152,000 had been awarded to contestants with Herbert Stempel, a senior at City College in New York being the previous high winner — before Van Doren. He had attained \$69,500 at one point but his take-home total was \$49,500. It was Van

Doren who ousted Stempel, as a mater of fact.

Jack Barry

Jack Barry is the emcee of Twenty-One and quiz shows aren't new for him. He was at one time in the same spot for the not-so-successful Big Surprise. This new chore is much more to his liking since, while complex, the game is more interesting and not buried under so many gimmicks. His job on Twenty-One is so unlike his Big Surprise stint that you'd hardly believe it was the same man who had done both shows.

Another contributing factor, aside from the contestants and Barry's personable emceeing, to the success of Twenty-One is the fact that there is no one category for each person. The categories change after each round. Consequently, only contestants with a very good all-around knowledge can

qualify for Twenty-One.

It looks very much as though NBC has itself a winner in Twenty-One. It has come along just when most people thought that quiz shows as such were doing a fast fade. It will be interesting to see what the coming weeks will hold for Twenty-One and whether it caught on because of one man — Charles Van Doren — or because it was a literate, intriguing show by itself.
