WHAT JULY THE FOURTH MEANS TO

Chucko the Clown

Charles Runyon has some very special, significant and serious reasons for doing the work he does.

HUCKO THE CLOWN (Charles M. Runyon in real life) has had a pet project on his mind for several years now. "They have symbols for the major celebrations and holidays of every year," he declares. "There's Santa Claus at Christmas time. A bunny for Easter. And yet we have no one symbol for the biggest day in each of our lives — our birthday.

Earnestly, and not for selfish reasons, Runyon believes the symbol of a Clown would be ideal for such an occasion. A birthday is a time of merriment; and it's always the day of every child's life. And what is more alluring and fascinating and pleasurable to a wide-eyed child than the costume of a clown?

July 4, of course, is the birthday of ALL Americans. The day that the United States officially declared its independence. And so—we are featuring Chucko the Clown on our cover this week.

There are many other reasons, close to Runyon's heart, why the Fourth of July means so much to the KABC-TV star.

To all of us, July 4 means freedom and democracy.

Chucko the Clown is primarily interested in children. And to him, the American children of today get a greater chance to practice democracy and exert their own individualism in the daily family routine — than at any other time in history, and in any other country.

"The average American child today," Runyon explains "has a chance to express opinions and share both problems and pleasures with the rest of the family. This, of course, is democracy in action at its lowest and most important level.

"They say that the family which prays together – stays together. I think you could add to that: the family which does things together, will also stay together."

Army Experiences

Serious-minded Charles Runyon is not speaking about mere theories—or because he happens to make a living at keeping children laughing—when he tells how important it is for children to participate in family life.

During his five-year hitch in the Army, Runyon spent over three years of that time in Hawaii and the Far East.

"I saw that the children over there didn't have much freedom of expression, or choice of vocation, or even a choice of playmates. As a result, all their moral concepts and even political ideologies were dictated to them by their parents and teachers. They had little, if any, opportunity, to make up their own minds."

That's why Chucko is particularly interested in the current contest we have running in TV-Radio Life offering a trip to the nation's capitol, Washington, D.C.

As the father of three children (Mary, 11; Danny, 9; and Randy, 3) Chucko has an natural love for the young ones. However, his career as a clown came about quite by accident five years ago. That was the time he built a special merry-go-round for Mary's birthday party.

A Clown is Born

After the party was over, he continued to use the merry-go-round by renting it to other children's parties.

"I always went along," Runyon explains "and my clown's make-up was not nearly as elaborate as it is now. But I loved making the children happy and decided to take it up as a full-time career. Needless to say, it's been the biggest thrill of my life. I just wouldn't want to do anything else."

In his professional life as a clown at the Channel 7 studios and on his many personal appearances throughout Southern California, Runyon never has a dull moment — to say the very least. The children are constantly clamoring around him and tugging at his clothes.

Dealing with children as often as he does (and as any parent can verify) there are times when they become annoying. When this happens, Runyon has a trick he uses. Instead of getting upset and using language not befitting a clown — he has some pet Japanese expressions he uses. That way no one but his assistant, Phylis Whyte, knows that he is perturbed about something.

The crew at KABC-TV who work on Chucko's shows also have a language of their own—so that the children will not be able to follow them. Many of the boys also work on Channel 7's Stars of Jazz program. As a result, when they want to communicate with Chucko—and don't want the children to know what they're talking about—they use "jive" talk.

★ SPECIAL APPEARANCE ★

CHANNEL 7's STAR CLOWN, CHUCKO, will make a special appearance this week at the Fourth of July festivities at the Los Angeles Coliseum. The program starts at 7:45 p.m.

For example, one afternoon one of the crew came up to Chucko and Phylis and explained.

"Say - we got a cat in the balcony, doc, that we're gonna have to strike."

Now this wouldn't make much sense to the children – or the grown-ups for that matter. But Phylis and Chucko "dug" the message. Translated it meant:

"We have one of the little fellows sitting in the stands—and from the way he's acting, we won't be able to use him on the show today."

When Phylis went over to see what was the matter, she found a young boy, huddled in a corner, crying his eyes out. When she later found the boy's mother, the woman coldly exclaimed: "Oh, he's doing that all the time."

Blames Parents

Having experiences like this almost daily, Chucko has come to the point, where he seldom, if ever, blames a child for his actions.

"If you find a child who gets out of hand, is ill-mannered, or who is a little bundle of nerves—then behind that child you can usually find a pretty poor parent."

As a performer – and not unlike other people in show business – Charles Runyon does have an idol. Oddly enough, it's the one man who is probably the world's most renowned comicclown – Red Skelton.

"I was a big fan of Red's even before I became Chucko," Runyon explains. "I've always just admired the man's work. Many times I would do imitations of his various sketches. Of course, since he has done his famous Clown roles, I've come to admire him even more."

The most surprising fact of all is that Charles Runyon — who as Chucko is undoubtedly Southern California's number one clown—has never even met Red Skelton.

"That to me," says Runyon, in a paradoxical childlike manner, "would be one of my biggest thrills."

AVID JANSSEN may be the new screen idol of the femmes as a result of his work in CBS-TV's Richard Diamond, but, to this writer, it's very odd to see him acting like a tough mug, sporting a leer, and playing havoc with the girls.

that was once a very popular radio program starring Dick Powell. Now Dick and Four Star are producing the television version.

It's only odd because, to quote a lovely old cliche, "I remember when.".

It's a cardinal rule in journalism—though I don't know who started the rule—that authors should leave themselves out of a story, that the word "I" should never intrude itself into an article dealing with another personality. But to all this in this instance, I can only say—"So what!" David will have to accept my "Is" here.

I first met David Janssen about ten years ago when he came to my house to read for a small role of a Cockney carpenter in a play that my group, The Stagelighters, was staging. It was only a bit — a couple of lines — but he wanted to do it. He managed to stagger along with a somewhat hesitant Cockney and he was cast.

From this not so auspicious beginning, David did several plays with us, achieving notable success in "All My Sons," "The Play's The Thing," and "The Druid Circle."

In none of these did he play anything remotely akin to a private detective. But in all he was definitely the young man with an earnest, all-consuming desire to act. He had his rough edges but he took a delight in having them knocked off.

It was after his "tour of duty" with The Stagelighters that David came to the attention of 20th Century-Fox, but here he reached an impasse.

"This was in the days when 20th wanted to remake everyone," David grinned, as we sat and renewed old times. "They wanted me to look different. They tried pinning my ears back, they changed my hair, they made a lot of tests and nothing happened. So I went east where I did summer stock for two years at Algonquint, Maine.

"After the session in stock I came to New York, hoping to open in a musical that Mike Todd was going to produce, but it never got off the ground. About this time I could smell the Army breathing down my neck, I had my 1-A, so I decided to come back home to California to wait my call.

"I took a bus from New York to Los Angeles, but I had to borrow five dollars from a girl I knew so I'd have enough to eat on. We got stuck in Ohio and had a two day layover, so by the time I got to L.A. I didn't have a dime. I couldn't make a call to my home to have someone meet me since I had no money, so I'm sorry to say I borrowed' a quarter from a newsstand to get a bus home."

Shortly after this and while he was waiting for the Army call that didn't come, David decided to visit all the studios to see if he could get some work. Universal-International finally signed him.

The Break

"I did a couple of pictures here and

then I went into the Army," David said. Laughing, he added, "I was stationed at Ford Ord where I fought the battle of Pebble Beach — and where I dodged golf balls that were being hit from a nearby course."

David was assigned to Special Services and then upon his discharge he went back to Universal-International. He stayed there about a year and then went on a free-lance status, getting two good roles in "The Girl He Left Behind," and "Lafayette Escadrille," both at Warners.

"I was also in negotiation for a couple of TV series," said the earnest young man who was stepping firmly on that proverbial ladder of fame, "mainly Pony Express and The Californian. I had thought The Californian was all but set when one day one of my agents asked me to go out for an interview with Dick Powell of Four Star and a writer about a series called Richard Diamond. Mr. Powell had played the same role on radio. Much to my surprise, I got the part, and here I am."

Here he is — up to his ears in work. David hasn't changed much since the days I first met him. He has that same ambition, that same quiet kind of humor, he's still living at home with his mother and two sisters, he has no hot romance in his life, and he is still a little dazed about actually finding himself an actor.

From all I could gather, his hat size was also the same. Let's hope it stays that way. He'd never look good in a larger size.

HIS ARGUMENT IS THAT WAX WHIRLERS cater to the tastes of the teen-age set which is not the buying force in our economic system. By so doing, the d.j. undermines the commercial power of radio, because the audience which he influences, due to the fact that he plays a certain type of record, is not the one most productive of results for his sponsor.

But this does not make them satisfactory representatives of a broad popular culture." The writer feels that truly popular music can develop only when its audience reasonably resembles the whole public. Maybe this is part of what Bing Crosby was trying to say last week when he lit into the poor quality of current popular music.

At that she looked better than Vikki Dougan who is attracting attention with her extremely low-backed dresses. It was his opinion that there was a good chance that if Chief Parker sued and won on the Mike Wallace-Mickey Cohen affair, none of the settlement would be subject to income tax. He based this opinion on what has been done in antitrust cases.

IT HAS BEEN REPORTED in the trade that Mike Wolloce's sponsor, Philip Morris, has extracted the concession of skipping a show if it looks as if the interview is going to be too hot. Have never heard of any arrangement like this. It's always been that a sponsor signed "for better or worse."





T DIDN'T get much notice except on Ed Sullivan's own show, but the celebration of Ed's ninth year on TV certainly should come in for plenty of attention. In these days when a show is lucky to last out one season, Ed's continued success on the shaky medium is downright amazing. For his show to have stayed at the top for such a long time is even more of a credit to his ability. Ed himself has been panned, ridiculed by all the so-called critics, but he still goes right on doing a job that so far hasn't beeen equalled. The success his show has enjoyed is due primarily to one thinghis knowledge of what the public wants and the big names he has brought on his program to entertain. There is still another reason for his long TV life-Ed has never tried to become a personality. He has stood in the background for the most part, he has adopted no "cute" emcee style, he has not tried to be the star of his own show. Consequently, people, for the most part, haven't tired of the program. Anyone who wants to produce a TV program that will last could get some good ideas by minutely studying the Ed Sullivan Show and its history during the past nine years. Others have tried to copy Ed's format, but none has matched his record. It is very unlikely that anyone will ever approach it, let alone match it.

Bill Weber, who reviews new shows for us, will undoubtedly have his witty and profound comments to make on this show but I had to pass a few remarks here about the George Sanders Mystery Theutre which debuted recently. It was an intriguing start but as clever and charming as George Sanders is, it was a big mistake to try to adopt the Alfred Hitchcock technique. Actually, some of Sanders' dialogue was quite amusing, but every viewer must have been re-

minded too vividly of Hitchcock's own particular style as host of his own series. Frankly, the comparison only made Hitch look that much better. Sanders shouldn't be put in the position of having to "follow" anyone—he's much too good for that. As for the first show itself, it didn't take two guesses to know that the Morse code would be used as the payoff. In spite of these faults, however, the show is certainly more interesting than some of the new ones that have debuted, and it deserves a big bow if for no other reason than the fact that it is one summer show which is not a re-run.


Most of them are operating at a 50% reduction over their winter season rates.

His St. Louis Cardinal teammates laughed in the spring of 1931 when he said that some year he would win 30 games. Three years later he did.

The baseball world laughed in the spring of 1934 when he said, "me and Paul would win 40 or 45 games for the Cardinals." When they had won 45, that wasn't enough, so they won four more and the National League pennant. To the 49 triumphs—30 for "Ole Diz" and 19 for Paul—they added two each over Detroit in the World Series to make the Cardinals the champions of the world.

This is believed to be the first picture ever taken of him in a baseball suit. It occurred when the farmboy started to pitch in the late 1920's in San Antonio, Texas.

Jes, he's really a Millionaire!

A purse-sized view of one of Hollywood's richest gentlemen

S MARVIN MILLER, that "suavie" you see weekly on CBS-KNXT's The Millionaire, really worth a million?

Lots of people think so. "There goes the millionaire!" onlookers exclaim when they see Marvin riding down the street. "I am never a millionaire on the show," Marvin explains, "but there seems to be some notion of the sort and since I drive a Mercedes, people assume I am."

Actually, Marvin is a millionaire. He may not be worth \$1,000,000, but what he possesses and enjoys is more valuable to him than any amount. "I wouldn't swap," he states firmly.

If you were fortunate enough to meet and chat with Marvin you'd find him one of the best conversationalists in Hollywood. He can talk about dogs, sailboating, flying, mountain climbing, painting, photography, the Bible, writing, cooking, woodworking, records, piano playing, singing, dancing, and you-name-it.

Marvin's knowledge of these topics was not gleaned from books. At one time or another he has actively participated in doing or studying them.

"We (meaning wife Elizabeth and Marvin) operate on the principle that you never stop growing." This dogma makes the Millers' life pretty fascinating.

They love dogs, currently have two boxers, "see eye-to-eye with professional dog raisers." They kept a sailboat at San Pedro for three years, finally gave it up because there was no time to enjoy it. Both Millers were student pilots in Chicago just before World War II, then they came to Southern California where there was a 150-mile blackout, so their licenses lapsed. "But in case of emergency, we know how," .Marvin points out.

Elizabeth's career is art. She has worked in all forms. "I had always been sympathetic to her career," Marvin said, "but one day she told me I didn't truly understand her problems as an artist because I had never participated. I was only up to my neck in radio work at that time — Beulah five times a week, and Sinatra among others, but I took up painting for six months and Elizabeth was very complimentary."

Lensers

Both Millers are intensely intrigued with photography. Their current project is the shooting of a 16 mm color documentary series for schoolchildren. Using as "star" their own six-year-old Melissa, Marvin and Elizabeth are filming the world through a little girl's eyes. One portion (London) has already been done. A desert sequence, too. Plan is to cover every big city. Though the project is primarily Elizabeth's, Marvin expects to help her in editing and narrating.

In their many travels Marvin likes to collect maps, match books, programs and memorabilia which he assembles into a jumbo scrapbook already a foot thick. Title of the book is "Us." Photographs are included. Marvin likes to take the stills, but is not as interested

in this aspect as Elizabeth, the "pro." She has shot some of his best publicity pictures, Marvin proudly admits.

Same teamwork characterizing other phases of the Millers' hobbies also applies to writing. Marvin contributes to this field, as you who listen to his Behind the Story on KHI probably realize. But Elizabth has a finger in this pie, too, and turns out many of his scripts to assist chief writer, Bob Turnbull.

More Interests

Both Millers play piano. Marvin sings exceedingly well, took lessons for several years. Before long-play records came into vogue, he had one of Hollywood's largest classical collections oc-cupying one entire wall of the living room. The Miller house, which occupies two levels and sprawls on a Brentwood site, is done in Chinese. "At least half of it is," Marvin laughed, "small objects and furnishings. We are very interested in Chinese art." There is a workshop where Marvin has turned out easels and tables for his wife's studio. She is a skillful seamstress, makes most all of Melissa's clothes and many of her own. She is also a wonderful cook, right now has a new kind of cookbook in the works. "I am not a good cook," Marvin confessed, "for in this case I can't see any reason to duplicate what Elizabeth does so well. But I am an epicure, or if you wish, a gourmet.'

Marvin sums up his philosophy with "If you like what you're doing, the doing itself will be your reward. When I recorded the Bible it was very hard work, but I accepted the challenge. What I did not receive in money was compensated by other rewards. It evens up, as long as you keep busy.

"There isn't anything wrong with money. Don't look down your nose at it. It's the *love* of money which is the root of all evil. And money can't bring you happiness.

"I am always hoping to make more money. If I had more right now I would travel. I've never been to the Orient.

"But Orient or no, I am a millionaire. Not to the world's way of thinking. But to my own."

OLKA PARADE, featuring polkas from different countries of Europe, is hosted by a Scotsman, Dick Sinclair. Although this may not seem unusual, Dick's knowledge of polkas date back to many years in radio. His radio show is beamed to the armed forces overseas and as far east as the Mississippi River.

Dick says of his KTLA show, "We do not feature only polkas on the program, we try to work in popular numbers too. There is only one popular mode that is taboo on the program and that is rock 'n' roll. For some reason this does not appeal to the family as a whole. And this brings us to the prime purpose of our program. We try to mold the program to the families' wants and needs for entertainment. We want to appeal to children as well as to grandmother and grandfather. Perhaps this is why our show is so successful."

Dick's statement is born out in the fact that tickets to the program are reserved a month in advance for all the shows. The show gets between one and

two hundred letters a week, most of which are complimentary.

The critical letters are aimed at the dance routines. As Dick points out, "We have a group of professional dancers on the program and naturally the routines are modified to suit tastes of the general public.
