REED BROWNING has learned a lot about people as a result of emceeing KABC Radio's Beat The Record.

He has found out, for instance, that big prizes don't necessarily make a big program. More than 300 letters a week reflect this opinion. "Listeners," Reed says, "are always writing in to tell us that they really appreciate the prizes that we give—even though they're not gigantic. It's the idea they appreciate. It's sort of like Christmas: it's not the gift, it's the thought."

Loyal Fans

"We have also discovered that Beat The Record listeners are the most loyal in the world. And that goes for the studio audience, too. During the tourist season, of course, the studio is really jam-packed with out-of-state visitors but during the rest of the year, I'm surprised at the number of faces that repeat month by month."

"As you know, the whole idea of Beat The Record is for a listener at home to compete—via telephone—with a member of the audience and at least on one occasion this led to complications. It seems that a lady at home was listening to the Arthur Godfrey show and thought she was listening to us. She was right with the name of the record she was listening to, but she had the wrong program!"

Beat The Record, heard daily from 11:00 to 11:55 a.m., gives Reed the opportunity to meet and talk to literally hundreds of individuals personally. He has become quite a judge of character as the result of choosing the contestants for the show.

HIS GIRL FRIDAY, Monday through Friday, Mary Ann Stonert, talks while Reed eavesdrops. Mary Ann assists Reed with all the preparation and paper work that go into making his 11:05-12:00 noon program such a favorite.

"We select the contestants while a record is playing," he says, "and that gives me time to find out just what kind of person I'm going to talk to next. It's gotten to the point where by just asking somebody their name—and the way that they answer—I can tell just how the person will react on the air. But, of course, I miss sometimes, too. But that's what keeps the program interesting."

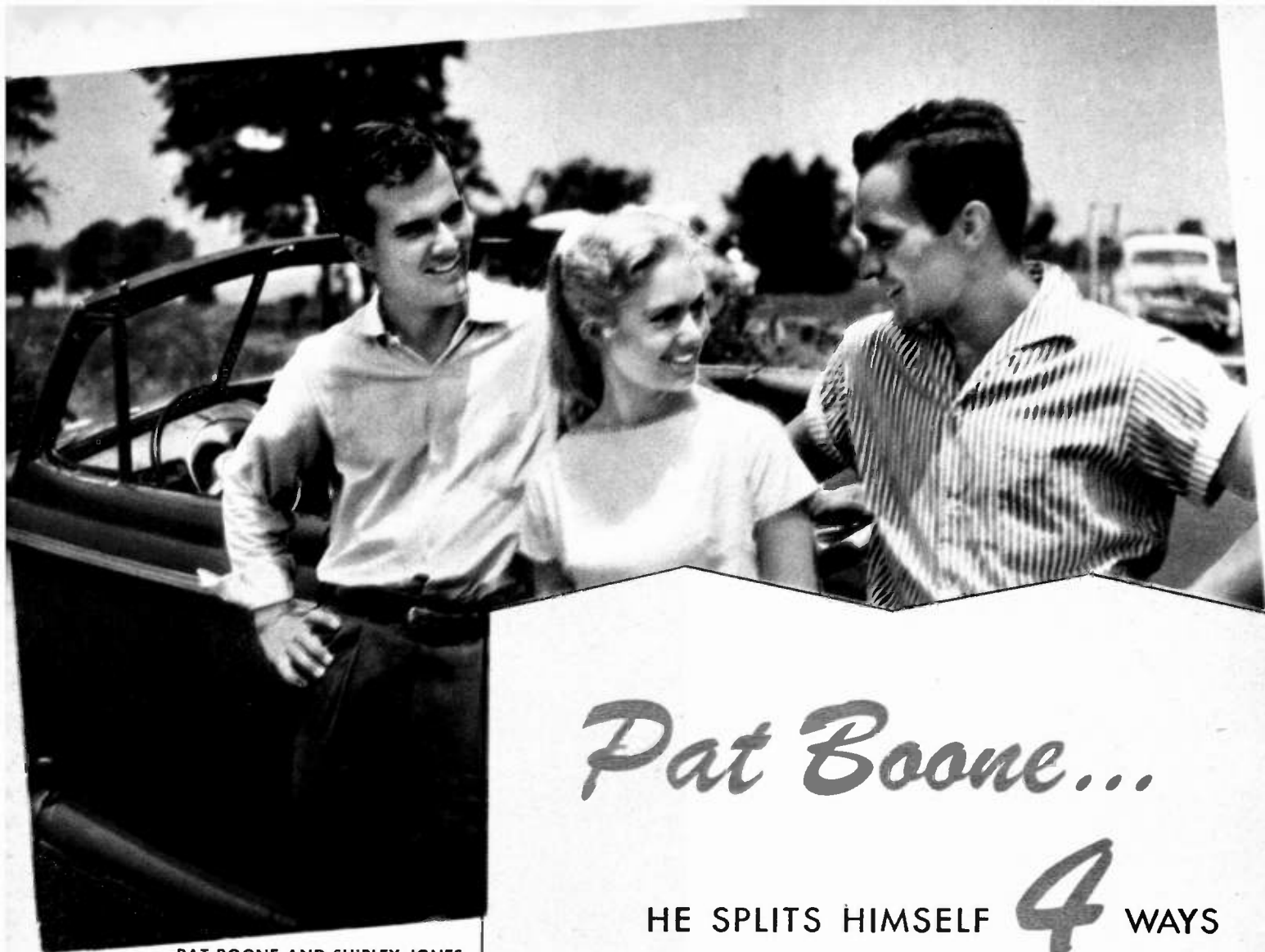
Versatile Approach

And what keeps the program interesting to loyal fans is Reed's quick wit,

warm personality and novel presentation of music, all qualities that he has come by from many years of radio and television experience.

Versatility is the keystone of Reed's and the program's success. Besides emceeing Beat The Record, Reed also co-hosts the Mildred Younger Show from 12:30 to 1:00 p.m. daily and is also featured daily on the 8:00 a.m. news.

Pat Boone...

HE SPLITS HIMSELF **4** WAYS

You've been hearing a lot of rumors about Pat Boone's plans. Here are the facts... and an inside on Pat's secret ambition.

PAT BOONE doesn't lead a double life — he leads four lives. The four, in order of importance, are his marriage, his education, his new ABC-TV show, and his movie career.

Pat was making "April Love," his second picture for 20th Century-Fox. He was finishing this and getting ready to take off for the east to resume his college education and to prepare his TV show.

"Naturally, my home comes first in my life," the very sincere Pat said. "But the way things have been going recently with everything I have to do, I couldn't do all my jobs if I didn't get full cooperation at home. When everything is running smoothly in my home, I find I have more confidence and assurance in the other phases of my life.

"While I was at 20th Century-Fox making 'April Love,' Shirley and our three children were with me. They were also here during production of 'Bernardine.' We rented a house which was

much nicer than the one we have in New Jersey. Frankly, I want to make more movies but they'll have to wait for a while — and I think Shirley is just as glad.

Vacation with Wife

"During 'Bernardine' she saw all the rushes and really shared the experience with me. On 'April Love' she has not gone to any of the rushes. She wants to see the movie fresh when it is released. This picture, though, has dampened her enthusiasm for movies because I had to be away on location in Kentucky for five weeks. Suddenly she sees this sort of thing happening often in any future pictures I make, so she isn't too thrilled about my acting career — for now anyway.

"I can understand how she feels. We had said that since we had had no real vacation in a long, long time we would

set aside at the end of the picture about six weeks just to relax and enjoy ourselves, to get away alone. She is expecting a baby in February and she won't be able to move about much then, so this was our best chance. But the time we intended to spend by ourselves dwindled considerably. I had three Fair dates I had been committed to, and they took up nine days. Then Chevrolet, my TV sponsor, wanted me to appear at the Soap Box Derby for three days and to make a film commercial with Dinah Shore to plug the 1958 models. This would take another three days. Randy Wood, for whom I make my Dot Records and who is my manager, had okayed an appearance for me on the Gale Storm show which took another three days. Then the New York State Fair wanted me to do a stint there. I finally had to work something out so

Shirley and I could be together, and it meant canceling things I wanted to do. I had to reject the offer from the New York State Fair — regretfully. Chevrolet said I wouldn't have to appear at the Soap Box Derby but I would do the commercial. I squeezed the Gale Storm appearance into two days. So I wound up, with the weeks it took to move from here to New York, with about three weeks for Shirley and me. They were better than nothing."

Education

There have been some rumors recently that Pat would neglect his education now that movies and TV were keeping him so busy. Nothing could be further from the truth. As he said, "I have spent five years working to get my degree and I'm not going to let anything stop me. I have one more semester — and then I graduate."

Pat intends to carry about 18 hours. In addition, he has to prepare for his comprehensive exam which covers all the courses he has studied in four years. As a result, he is working his TV show around his courses. He has to spend Thursday all day on the show since that is the day it goes on, so he will attend classes Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday. He will also, of course, spend time on some of those days in preparation for his KABC-TV show.

"If something has to suffer in this schedule, it will have to be the show," Pat said honestly and flatly. "I know Chevrolet will cooperate with me, though, so I'm not worrying too much. When I finish school then I can devote all the time I have to my career. It's too bad the show couldn't have started in February, but we couldn't wait that long. For one thing, the good time spots

would have been gone and also all the shows begin in the fall. It's too hard to break in a new one in February.

"I'm taking primarily a speech course for my last semester — with classes in diction, dramatics, and English. My major is speech. I'll have at least 36 hours a week of home work — with even more required.

TV Show

"As for the show, it will be a variety program, and by that I mean we won't have comedians and acrobats. We will have guest stars occasionally, and we've already lined up Anna Maria Alberghetti, Bob Hope, Gale Storm, Dinah Shore, and Shirley Jones. Shirley is

working with me in 'April Love.' The emphasis will be on having fun — and it will have no set format. We don't want people to know exactly what to expect, we want to surprise them. I want the show to be strictly my own."

And then Pat said something that was really important. If anyone else had said it, it would have sounded corny, insincere. But you knew Pat meant every word.

"I'm not worried about being on every week," he said quietly. "In fact, I relish it. It will give me a chance to do a lot of songs I never get to sing and I'm ham enough to enjoy singing. But more important — the TV show is the realization of what was my highest ambition. When I was in high school I was in a couple of plays and I was terrible. I thought I'd never be an actor, but I did want my own TV show. Well, I've learned a bit about acting now and I'm hopeful on that score, but the TV program is still very important. I feel that through it I can make genuine, sincere friends of millions of people — simply by coming into their room and talking to them. And singing for them. I want to look out at that camera and make deep, lasting friendships. That is the beauty of television — on it you are looking a fellow in the eye. You don't come into his home to *act* like a friend — you want to *be* a friend. If I can do this I won't have to worry about getting big name guest stars or about figuring up some gimmick to catch viewers. And this is the only way I want to get an audience."

This is definitely the way he'll get viewers because Pat's sincerity will certainly shine through on a TV tube as well as it does in person.

This is a man with a busy life but high purposes and goals. He'll not sacrifice those purposes, those ideals for any fast buck.

How a TV Star Lives

Jackie Cooper's life apart from The People's Choice is most interesting. Come inside his home for a visit.

JACKIE, his wife, Barbara, and son, Russell, in a truly domestic scene. The star of NBC-KCRA's *The People's Choice* and Barbara are expecting another addition shortly.

JK WHEN I finally caught up with Jackie Cooper he was having his hands full.

It had been quite a week. His father-in-law was in the hospital, his mother-in-law was ill, the heat had just about caved in his wife, Barbara, who was four months pregnant, and he had just gone through a rather emotional experience seeing his 10-year-old son off to school for the first time.

"The place is a shambles!" explained the popular star of NBC-TV's *The People's Choice*. "But something always seems to be happening around our house."

Jackie, his wife, and their 16-month-old son, Russell, live in an ultra modern home in Benedict Canyon, situated on an acre, and peopled mainly by deer and quail. The living room is 50 percent glass; the roof is two-by-fours supported by walls that overlap into the different rooms. There is a free form sort of pool which is featured by intermittent placing of rocks to break up the set line. At the end where you would normally find the diving board there is a huge rock on which have been built steps at various levels.

"It's a good-sized home," Jackie said, "but it's not big enough for us. We're only renting and I'm thinking of buying a new house or building one. For one thing, I don't like seeing baby's toys and things in different rooms, in the hall, or in the yard, so I'd like a house where Russell has a room for his things. Then there is the work I do—my writing, principally. I need a place where I can get off by myself. And there are my drums. I could use a music room for the drums, the piano, and other musical instruments.

"I could also use more closet space. I have a fairly big wardrobe closet be-

cause of the clothes I have. I have more than most men since I use them so much in my work."

Jackie has about 12 suits, 12 jackets, the same number of slacks and a good supply of sport and dress shirts.

Boss?

"Our home is really run by Russell," Jackie grinned. "Oh, there are signs being made of my being the man of the house. When I'm working I notice that dinner is served at the hour I prefer, that I am treated very solicitously, but when I'm not working the schedule certainly alters and Russell takes over.

"My wife is quite wonderful in her manner of being both a good wife and mother. She never becomes neurotic about our child and she manages to spend time with me—which I like. I couldn't stand a wife who could think only of her child and let her husband go hang. Yes, I'm what you call a doting father. In fact, I'm a pretty normal father considering the pressure of my work.

"I'm sure that my association with my son, Jackie, is good. At least, we have a ball together. We like to go fishing a lot—usually to the High Sierras and to the Rogue River in September. He doesn't live with me all the time, his mother and I being divorced, but we are very close. He likes the drums too, just as I do, and often I have his friends to the house to swim

or I take them to a movie.

"As for Russell, I have noticed that he cries for 'Mama' when something goes wrong but when Barbara and I are both in a room together with him he wouldn't think of touching ash trays or anything in the room. However, if I'm not there he goes around picking up everything—almost defiantly. Barbara doesn't seem to mind too much unless he breaks something. He knows he can't get by with this with me.

"Barbara is, of course, a girl of even temperament. Not that she can't go straight up to the ceiling when something goes wrong, when there is a crisis. But we have both learned to talk out our problems. Sure we have arguments, but we settle them—we don't leave them dangling. I admit I'm rather hard to get along with at times since I'm moody but I don't stay that way long. I don't allow myself the privilege of being moody on the set because my feelings are somehow taken over by the whole crew and this is bad. Now that I'm directing the show I can't indulge in moods."

Jackie is not only directing *The People's Choice* but he has also written a script around the character of Skippy, a role he played in pictures once. He intends to shoot a pilot this fall and he insists it will be a show for adults primarily. "Not that we mind if kids tune in too," he said.

After watching the premieres of some of the much bally-hooed new shows on TV, I can hardly wait until next summer when they are showing repeats of these same shows and I won't have to watch them again.

"Night And Day." (2) Sept. 28, 10:00. 1946. A musical extravaganza based on the life of pleasure loving **Cole Porter**, one of America's foremost composers of popular melodies, this filmic tribute stars **Cary Grant**, **Alexis Smith**, **Mary Martin**, **Dorothy Malone**, **Monty Wooley**, **Ginny Simms**, **Jane Wyman** and **Eve Arden**, each doing his part in presenting such Porter favorites as the title tune, "Begin the Beguine," "Just One of Those Things," "I've Got You Under My Skin," "Easy To Love," and some twenty other standards. The plot is something about the difficulties of marriage and allegiance to one's parents but the story's main purpose is to serve as a framework for the songs, which are, of course, first rate.

"Boom Town." (11) Oct. 4, 8:00. 1940. One of the great boxoffice smashes of its day, this **Clark Gable-Spencer Tracy-Claudette Colbert-Hedy Lamarr-Frank Morgan** epic presents the two heroes as a pair of wildcat old drillers who strike it rich, go on to oppose each other in big business machinations, and finally wind up broke, together again and wild-cattling. Miss Colbert, as the wife, and Miss Lamarr, as the siren, are incidental to the adventures of the two roustabouts. Big and entertaining.

"Swingtime." (9) Beginning Sept. 30, 9:00. 1936. **Astaire** and **Rogers** again, this time in a **Jerome Kern** musical that

offers such hits as "The Way You Look Tonight," and "A Fine Romance." Once again, the plot is unimportant, but there is a welcome bit of comedy from **Victor Moore** and **Helen Broderick**. All right, you want to know the plot? Boy gets girl, loses girl and ... you'll have to watch it. I'm not going to give it away.

"Frankenstein." (5) Oct. 1, 9:00. 1931. This world famous horror film was the first of its particular species and catapulted **Boris Karloff** into a twenty year career as a monster that only recently has been relieved by a few stage roles of more classic proportions. A man named Frankenstein creates a pretty ugly looking fellow out of nothing and what happens then is known to every devotee of the face-at-the-window dramaturgy. I think it should be noted, however, that this picture, the original of many horrors to come, has a tenderness that has been almost totally lacking in its successors. And it's pretty scary, too.

"Kentucky." (11) Sept. 29, 11:00. 1938. **Loretta Young** and **Richard Greene** are members of two old Kentucky fueding families dedicated to improving the breed ... of horses, that is, Loretta finds out who Richard is, will have nothing to do with him, and then it's eve of the Derby and the two hot horses belong to the two families and guess who wins? Distinguished mainly for the wonderful shots of the blue grass racing stock and a good performance by **Walter Brennan** as an old curmudgeon. In fact, it won him an Academy Award for best supporting player of the year.

"Fingers At The Window." (11) Sept. 30. 10:30. Thumb fun, eh? Only every time it slams down it gives me a pane.

What's Behind the Gobel-Fisher Combo?

THE GEORGE GOBEL Show premieres Tuesday, September 24.

The Eddie Fisher Show debuts Tuesday, October 1 . . . exactly one week later . . . same night, same time . . . and both over NBC.

Thereafter through the season the two shows will alternate with each star doing a guest stint on the other's show in his off weeks in addition to other guest stars. Both shows are one hour; both follow a flexible variety show line; both are the star's first hour show.

And thereby hangs a tale. For the unique arrangement, never before attempted in television showmanship, may indicate a future trend in programming that will protect the television personality from "over-exposure" and at the same time insure better shows for viewers.

"But I don't think you can say George and I are working as a team," Eddie explained. "Each show will have its own identity and independent producers and writers. How large a part we will play in the other's show remains to be worked out on the basis of how George and I react chemically."

Since George and Eddie have worked together before in guest spots, the chemical possibilities have the potential of setting off a chain reaction.

When asked if the combining of the two talents meant George might sing a duet with Eddie, George drawled: "Well, why not—if Eddie can sing in my key."

"We're both in pretty fast company," George continued, as he recalled another joint appearance with Eddie—a bicycle race around the studio lot. "I won hands down. Maybe it was because Eddie's manager stopped the race. Evidently Eddie wasn't as heavily insured as I was."

"The hour length will give me a chance to turn around," George said in an interview just after he had gotten in from a round of golf at Lakeside Country Club. "It means a lot in that it will not only give me an opportunity to do a song and dance now and then, but also because the half hour is cramping to a comedian. You no sooner got off the ground at the beginning of show with a joke than it was time to wind up. I'll have more to carry, but it'll be easier working. The hour length also calls for a bigger budget which means greater production values."

Behind the scenes of the Gobel Show there will also be an entirely new set-up with Alan Handley as producer and two new writers. Handley is credited with establishing the television success of Dinah Shore.

"The hour length every other week also gives you a breather from that sword hanging over the head of every television personality — over-exposure," George went on. "As Mark Twain once said about the weather—everybody talks about it, but no one does anything. It's simply one of those occupational hazards. I've often wondered if Santa Claus' big success is due to the fact he only appears once a year. I shiver to think what his ratings might be with a weekly show. Imagine—Santa as a bearded bore! Great thing about him is that he doesn't have to work for a living. But a television comedian does."

"Oddly enough a distinctive comedy style can be a handicap after a while in that the very things the audience found appealing only leads viewers to demand more in asking the comic to top himself each time. This is rough. You can either lose your mind over it, or accept it for what it's worth. I think every television comic is faced with this for the first four or five years until a

levelling point is reached when the audience finally accepts you without putting you through the wringer.

"The vast amount of material needed is another problem. And hand-in-hand with this is the fact that in working night clubs and vaudeville before the days of television, the comedian had the opportunity to work out his material on audience after audience, perfecting his techniques and timing. All of that is out the window, of course, on television. It's new material every time. You're on. And away you go—wondering if you're making a darned fool of yourself in front of a few million people and wondering what the kids and wife will think. Those are the moments when you wonder if it's all worth it. But doing any other kind of work—? I'd rather be nervous than tired," George quipped.

"Ratings? Yeah, I've heard of 'em. That's another one of those things like

ing from place to place, catching trains at all hours of the night. I like being at home with the wife and kids too much to go for that. Whatever headaches television may have—and I don't know of any line of human endeavor that doesn't have 'em—television still offers the entertainer the greatest opportunity he's ever had. You don't want to be looking a gift horse in the mouth—especially since those teeth are solid gold. I'm strictly a television man."

If Eddie had any qualms about his new show, no anxieties were visible as he gamboled about at the bidding of photographers in a three-hour session of sittings in the NBC photo gallery.

"Sure it's a challenge," Eddie laughed. "but if you're going to progress and develop in show business I don't know of any new venture that doesn't present a challenge. You simply take it in stride."

And Eddie's one to take it in stride. He had just returned from a trip "half-way around the world in 40 days"; had just turned 29; had just bought a new dual Ghia; and as an adoring father was bubbling over with exuberant conviction that Carrie Frances Fisher—called Dynamite by her father and almost one year old—is the most remarkable human personality he has ever met.

"You've got to see her to know what I mean," he chortled.

And Eddie, like many another father, seeing that some of the bright and gaudy props used in his picture session might appeal to his daughter, politely appropriated a balloon, a large plastic ball, and a little horn . . . the little horn, by the way, which the irrepressible Eddie blew merrily as he later sailed down the boulevard.

Guest on Eddie's opening in addition to George will be producer Mike Todd. Bob Hope is scheduled for two appear-

ances and other guest stars will be announced later. Three guests will appear on each show.

"The show," laughed Eddie, "will be a combination of the Perry Como, Dinah Shore, Ed Sullivan and Steve Allen shows — we hope."

Playing opposite Eddie and George on Tuesday nights will be Phil Silvers' Sgt. Bilko and Hugh O'Brien's Wyatt Earp.

"They're good friends of mine," Eddie explained, "but I think the day is gone on television where there is any point of worrying who or what you're playing against. The competition is too tough. There's no point in looking for a soft spot so you can keep alive."

"The only comment I can drop on this thing of 'exposure' is that the only thing worse than exposure is no exposure."

When reminded that Bing Crosby had kept away from a regular television show due to the threat of exposure, Eddie said: "First of all, Crosby's in a class by himself—plus the fact I've got to work for a living. And don't forget that as a young singer starting out, Bing probably couldn't afford to pass up any appearances either."

"No, a singer doesn't have the same tough problem regarding material that a comedian has, but you can get in a few sleepless nights wondering what will happen if a music show is slipped in right before your time slot and the singer elects to do the hit tunes you are all set to do the same evening. That gives a singer pause for something or other—and not the pause that refreshes," Eddie laughed.

But whatever the combination of Gobel and Fisher spells in new programming trends, it does spell two exciting new shows offering two of television's brightest stars.

the weather. Since there isn't any other way, you live with 'em. But I can't help wondering if the public at times is looking for ratings rather than entertainment. There's nothing the comic or entertainer can do about it so there's no use getting panicky about it. You're doing the best you can. And that's about all there is to it.

"At least you don't have hecklers that plague you like they do in night club work—some spook hollering at you. Although it's becoming less of a headache today in the better clubs, the heckler used to be the terror of every act. The beginners would arm themselves with books of heckler jokes to squelch the noisy offenders."

"Sure, television has its problems. But when I hear entertainers talk about the 'good old days' of vaudeville and the road I wonder who they think they're kidding . . . living out of a suitcase for weeks at a time, one night stands jump-

Walter Brennan:

FAMOUS...
BUT WHO KNOWS HIM?

ALTER BRENNAN is an enigma. For he is one of the best-known, and yet least-known actors in Hollywood.

How come? The explanation is quite simple.

A three-time winner of the coveted Oscar, he is unquestionably one of Hollywood's finest and most famous character actors. He is also one of the most imitated. Whenever a comedian satirizes other performers, Walter Brennan's distinctive voice is invariably used.

However, when it comes to his personal life, the public knows very little about Walter Brennan.

Ask anyone questions about Walter Brennan, and in most cases you'll probably get the answer: "Gee whiz. I really don't know. Never have read or seen much about Walter's personal life!"

To find out the cause for this was one of the reasons we drove to the RKO studios in Culver City for an interview with Mr. Brennan. The other reason, of course, was to talk to him and watch him work on his new ABC-TV series, *The Real McCoy*s.

His Family

The first and most lasting impression of the former doughboy of World War I is how much he genuinely enjoys talking to people. It can be young Cathy Nolan or one of the "McCoy" children on the ABC-TV show. A director or prop man. Even a reporter. Whoever it is, Walter acts appropriately.

With the kids, he's helpful, encouraging, playful, advising—in short, the fatherly type. With the boys, he's a good Joe. With the ladies, a perfect and entertaining gentleman.

With the press—he's good copy.

"You wanna know why so few people know about my private life? Well," Walter smiles, "you can blame all of that on my wife. We've been married for 17 years, you know. During that time, I guess we've just led a normal

life, and therefore it has not been publicized too much.

"As a matter of fact," he laughs, "I guess if it hadn't been for my wife—I could just as easily have been a drunkard! I would have had a lot of spare time on my hands to get into mischief anyhow. Along with my work—my family has kept me too busy to think about anything else."

Just for the record: Mr. and Mrs. Walter Brennan have three children two sons and one daughter—and six grandchildren! One son, Arthur, runs the Brennan's 12,000 acre ranch in Oregon. The other, Walter Brennan, Jr. is an actor (using the name of Andy Brennan) and a stand-in for his father.

His TV Show

As far as his new TV series is concerned, the 63-year-old star admits that he's a little nervous about the public's reaction to it.

"I'm confident, mind you," Walter asserts. "Or else I certainly never would have done it in the first place. I think it's good, wholesome entertainment.

"Basically it's a comedy. But we have our sad and serious moments too. Why,

just the other day, after we finished one scene, I looked around at the crew and I could see quite a few of them wiping their eyes. It wasn't the smog, either.

"It was an emotional scene, and they were reacting the way I hope the audience at home will when they see it."

Because he has established himself as one of the finest actors of all time (and that's no exaggeration) Mr. Brennan naturally had to be careful about the first TV series he appeared in. One bad TV series wouldn't destroy his magnificent movie record, but it would change the public's final outlook on his long career.

"Not too many people know this," Walter explains, "but I made three TV pilot films before it was decided to do this one for ABC-TV. Norm and Irving Pinkus kept after me for two years trying to persuade me that the *Real McCoy* was the right vehicle for me. I hope they're right."

So far, Walter Brennan has only one complaint about his new career in TV.


"I'm working too hard," he remarks, half-smiling, but half-serious, too. "When I agreed to do the series, I didn't think it would be this tough."



Eastern TV's Last Chance?

The DuPont Show of the Month is an ambitious undertaking and a challenging look at the future of TV. It is also considered an all-out effort to keep both live and New York TV from doing a fade.

THE DuPONT Show of the month is CBS-KNXT's answer to those who claim TV is designed for the satisfaction of morons. This one may not be strictly for the intellectual but it is certainly not going to make the intelligentsia unhappy. It is also apt to give the average viewer a bit to hope for.

This series will include four musical specials and six dramatic presentations. Leading off will be "Crescendo," starring Ethel Merman and Rex Harrison. It will be a study of the various kinds of American music. The emphasis, according to CBS, will be on the entertaining and not just to present a technical study of music in general.

Other musicals to follow are "Aladdin," with music and lyrics by Cole Porter, and a musical version of "Junior Miss." In the dramatic line, Talent Associates will produce "The Prince and the Pauper" and A. J. Cronin's "Beyond This Place."


Birth of Series

Hubbell Robinson, CBS-TV executive, disclosed how the series came about.

"DuPont wanted to do a series of 10 shows," he stated. "They had planned on doing all dramatic shows. They asked us what we had coming up during the year and when they heard we had planned on doing four musicals they decided to change their projected schedule and do four musical shows and six dramatics. So was born the Show of the Month."

The varied productions under the DuPont banner will be listed generally in the category of "spectaculars." At least, they will preempt regularly scheduled shows. But they will never appear on the same day each month during the run of September to June.

"Actually, CBS is doing more spec-

taculars this year than last," Robinson stated. "In addition to the DuPont series there will be five Lucy and Desi shows, seven Lowell Thomas special productions, and six with Art Linkletter."

"We only want to do a limited number of musicals since we feel you can't do many and do them well. We hope that those we do live up to the term 'spectacular' in every sense of the word—in stories, in cast, in budget. We've been working for months on the various musicals we'll do this season. On "Cinderella," which was seen last season, we began preparation on it last September. For Playhouse 90, too, we started work on that in August, 1955, and it didn't begin until the fall of 1956. We learned a big lesson from that show. It taught us the importance of taking plenty of time to work out a production. And it proved to us that it never pays to get in the position where you have nothing set to do in the middle of the season so you have to rush in any old thing to fill the gap."

"We'll just go on trying to find shows worth doing and when we find them to give them every possible care, thought, and attention so that we will really have a production of note, to make them memorable nights in the theater. Our

aim is to get the best talent in America and then give that talent the time to create a first-rate job."

For the dramatic portion of the Show of the Month, David Suskind and Talent Associates are in charge. They have produced "Pinocchio," some of the Armstrong Theatre shows, the Rexall specials, and some Broadway productions.

"Casting 'The Prince and the Pauper' was indeed a challenge," Suskind said. "We launched a nation-wide contest to find a boy who looked like Rex Thompson, who will play one of the twins. The boy we are hunting for also has to be able to act. This is going to be a tough job, we know."

"Once the right boy is found he will be brought to New York and put into the show."

"We plan to do four classic stories for this series and to do two originals by top TV writers. All our productions will be done live and will originate from New York. We hope that what we do will be a voice for live TV, which is fast dying out, and a voice for eastern TV, which is also quickly shrinking."

The DuPont series then is a test in more ways than one. It will be interesting to see what it proves.
