## They Beg the Women to Sound Off

BILL WELSH undertakes the ticklish subject of asking a lady a controversial question on KTTV's Sound Off. And he gets the answers too!

**B**ILL WELSH of KTTV has what could be considered a questionable job. After all, he spends his days listening to women talk about this, that, and everything on his new show called, appropriately, Sound Off.

But Bill loves every minute of it. In a way, Sound Off completes a cycle for Bill because about ten years ago he was doing a similar man-in-the-street show on TV. Now, of course, it's a woman-on-the-street treatment.

Getting women to talk about provocative subjects without any prior rehearsal can be dangerous—and amusing. But so far he's been riding in luck, for, as he says, "I've not had to worry about the women in the street or the guys who work in industries. They don't give me any censorship troubles. The ones that do worry me are the so-called intellectuals. They really can toss you a few curves."

### Blunt Questions

"I purposely ask blunt and controversial questions on Sound Off. I want to get both sides covered, so if I find that if three or four women are all of the same mind on a subject we're discussing I'll purposely ask the others in the crowd if any of them disagree. And, believe me, I've had a few disagreements."

"Like the time I asked a lady, 'What do you do if your friends' children come to your house and start breaking up things?' This woman said, 'This hasn't happened to me. All of the children I know are well-mannered.' At this point, a lady in the crowd yelled out, 'She's a liar! She's told me about all the trouble the kids have given her in her home.' This naturally lends itself to a more exciting and interesting show."

"There was another woman who was

being asked, would you dye your hair if your husband asked you to?' This lady said she had dyed her hair for this express reason. The woman who followed her on the mike began her comments with, 'That woman who was just here looks cheap.' This is about as blunt as you can get."

Bill's schedule on KTTV is certainly hectic enough. He does Star Shoppers for an hour and then with only a minute's station break he's back on Sound Off. But he shows no signs of being haggard or worn from such a routine. He seems to thrive on it.

One of his most embarrassing interviews, though, was one that resulted from the question: "What do you think is more important—to have all the money you want or to be happy with what you have?" The girl, obviously pregnant, said, that she was happy with what she had because she was going to have a child, she had a chance to stay with a nice couple who would take care of her until the baby was born. And then she planned to give the child to this couple. The payoff was that the girl wasn't married!

"We're always getting domestic problems," Bill went on. "Some of our ques-

tions are based on the mail we get from viewers. One woman said her husband had taken off and was gone four months. When he returned he said he'd had amnesia. The woman wanted to know if she should believe him. Another lady said that her husband had been gone for a few months too but when he came home and wanted to be taken back again she asked no questions—just threw her arms around him and welcomed him back.

"Equally positive was one answer we had when we asked, 'Should the natural mother, after adopting proceedings have been started, have the right to ask for her child back?' This was at the time of the Marie Wilson case. The lady who answered this said simply, 'No, she shouldn't have the right. After all, she's had nine months to think it over.'"

"We give each woman who talks to us a dollar. One lady was obviously having serious domestic problems, so I asked her what these problems were. Said she bluntly, 'I wouldn't tell you for a lousy buck.'"

"This is the kind of thing that makes Sound Off stimulating, to say the least."

And that is the understatement of the year.

# The Things That Happen

## ...Backstage On The Bob Cummings Show

**DWAYNE HICKMAN**, as Chuck, gets a chance to play the youthful lover—Olive Sturgess as the picturesque object of his affections.

**E**VERYTHING goes on on the set of the Bob Cummings Show.

The antics of the four stars on the NBC-KRCA smash are enough to keep the sanest person in a merry state of mayhem. With Bob Cummings at the helm, Rosemary DeCamp, Ann B. Davis, and Dwayne Hickman are caught up in the rush and swept right along.

This, then, is a keyhole peek behind the scenes, a view on the set that the public never sees.

Rosemary DeCamp revealed most of the choice tidbits—as the odd habits of the individual members of the cast.

There is, for instance, Bob's protein diet.

### Bob's Habits

"Bob used to eat the regular three meals a day," Rosemary said with a smile, "but recently he went on a protein diet which means he eats less but more often. We in the cast are very happy with this new set-up since we get more 'Take fives' from Bob—meaning 'take a rest.'"

"Since Bob has been directing the show, we have a lot more fun anyway. And the gags! We've adopted certain catch words or phrases. As, for example, when Bob says, 'You're hurrying on to—' we jump right in with 'doom.' Or he'll start to say, 'You're antici—' and we interrupt to conclude with, 'pating.' Another remark from Bob is, 'You're playing the crazy uncle from Detroit,' which is a show business term meaning you

must follow the plot pattern.

"All such carryings-on add to the general fun. But, of course, we work—and hard. Bob is a fine director because he is also an actor and can show how he wants a scene done. Now that he has been directing for such a long time he more or less lets us play our parts freely.

"Even Harry Wilde, our wonderful photographer, gets in the swing of things. We do three rehearsals for him. One he calls the 'white' rehearsal, which means with no blood—just standing in position for the cameras. Then there is the 'pink' with blood where we just run through lines and finally the 'red' which is the full thing.

"Considering all that happens on our set, I must say that Bob puts up with more than anyone I know. He gets mad but seldom—and yet he never swears. He does toss off a few double entendre comments that are real accomplishments. I like everything about Bob—except when he calls me 'Honey Bumps' or 'Sweety Bumps.' That's his pet name for the girls and it just doesn't fit me.

"It is Bob, however, who makes working on this show such a real pleasure. Your director, after all, sets the mood for all the rehearsals and the shows—and if he doesn't know what he's doing or if he is all full of tensions, the production is bound to reflect that feeling. With Bob, it's as perfect a way to work as I ever knew."

Rosemary, of course, in her role as Bob's sister has been one of the main



cogs in the machinery. Any show would be lucky to get her, what with all of her years of experience and know-how. But Rosemary feels that getting Ann B. Davis and Dwayne Hickman was a lucky break for all concerned.

#### Annie and Dwayne

"Annie is the doll of the world," she went on. "She's a great performer, and both she and Dwayne have gained a lot of polish since the show started.

"Annie has a dog named Bijou—a French poodle—who acts as though she's in the cast. There is only one trouble—the dog's nails aren't clipped as much as they should be and she click-clacks across the set, the 'noise' thereby confusing the sound man. She also delights in diving into the waste baskets and eating the remains of our lunch. Bijou is regularly with us—except on shooting day when she must stay home.

"When Annie comes on the set she usually reads the trade papers first and

then she starts working crossword puzzles. Every once in a while she gets me started on a puzzle, but I don't have the stick-to-it trait she has.

"Ann, like all of us, is interested in astrology. Bob is quite an authority on the subject, so we go around 'horoscoping' each other. As Bob said once, 'I think we're all astrologically in tune.'

"Dwayne is, for example, Taurus and one of the traits of Taurus is being conservative. This Dwayne is. You'll never find him in a racy sports car and you won't find him throwing his money away. He spends only what is necessary and saves the rest. I think he's learned the value of a savings account since he has grown up in Hollywood and has seen how fast money can go.

"Dwayne has learned so much from Bob—especially about timing and comedy. He has really grown as an actor, and now he's going to make his first record. His voice is quite good too."

There's a good deal of sentimentality

on this set too—along with the gags—but ever the sentiments get a humorous treatment. Not long ago Rosemary had a birthday so she was given a party almost every day. The cards she got were really something! But everything was in fun—and the climax was the presentation of a huge cake that would have taken Rosemary six weeks to consume.

After talking to Rosemary I went back on the set with her. Joe DePew, assistant, was given directions to the cast—the kind that only the cast could understand.

"Trunks to tails, big production number," he called out. Then a little later, he became equally confusing when he said, "Pull up your tights and light the torches." The cast went to work so it could be assumed those directions had something to do with getting ready for a scene.

Rosemary, Bob, Dwayne, and Annie started to rehearse but a line got them roaring with laughter.

"The scripts that Shirl Gordon, Dick Wesson, and the very wonderful Paul Henning turn out are largely responsible for the success of our show," Rosemary had told me once. "Half the time we're still laughing at a line ourselves when we shoot it. We shoot that fast."

Such is the general happy feeling on this set. And it is a feeling that gives the show itself a lift on TV. Rosemary aptly described what it was like to work on The Bob Cummings Show when she said, "where can you go and work three days a week and have so many laughs? And the nice part is the government can't put a tax on our laughs!"

## Brother to a Beaver

**P**LAYING big brother to little "Beaver" is the biggest thing that's happened to 12-year-old Tony Dow in his short professional life on TV. As yet, however, it hasn't affected his personal life.

"Most of my friends do not even realize I'm working on the show. And I'd just as soon leave it that way," the young co-star of the Leave It To Beaver show explains.

The five-foot, 96-pounder plays the older brother (Wally) to "Beaver" Cleaver on the new successful CBS-TV series. The rest of the cast includes Barbara Billingsley as the mother, June Cleaver; Hugh Beaumont as father Ward Cleaver; and the "star" Jerry Matthews as Theodore "Beaver" Cleav-

er. In more ways than one, they are a happy TV family these days, because after a mediocre start the series finally seems to have caught on, thereby justifying the faith and money that the network has invested in its latest situation comedy.

### How He Landed Job

Offstage, they often refer to young Tony as "TV's Most Versatile Young Actor." And not necessarily because of his acting chores. Up to the "Beaver" series he only appeared in two pilot films for the projected "Johnny Wildlife" stories.

"I actually got the 'Beaver' role on a tip from a neighbor of mine," Tony recalls. "An actor himself he originally wanted to play the father's role on the show — and he asked me to go along with him to test as the 'older brother.' I guess I was surprised more than anyone, when out of 270 boys they picked me. The only sad part about the story was that my friend didn't get the role he wanted."

Although he's still not even a teenager, Tony's "versatility" stems from his non-professional activities. Exceptionally well-coordinated, Tony is an all-around athlete. He is an excellent swimmer and started taking lessons before he was three. His aquatic specialties include surfboard riding and skin diving. When he gets into the gym, because of his great sense of timing, he excels in acrobatics, especially on the trampoline.

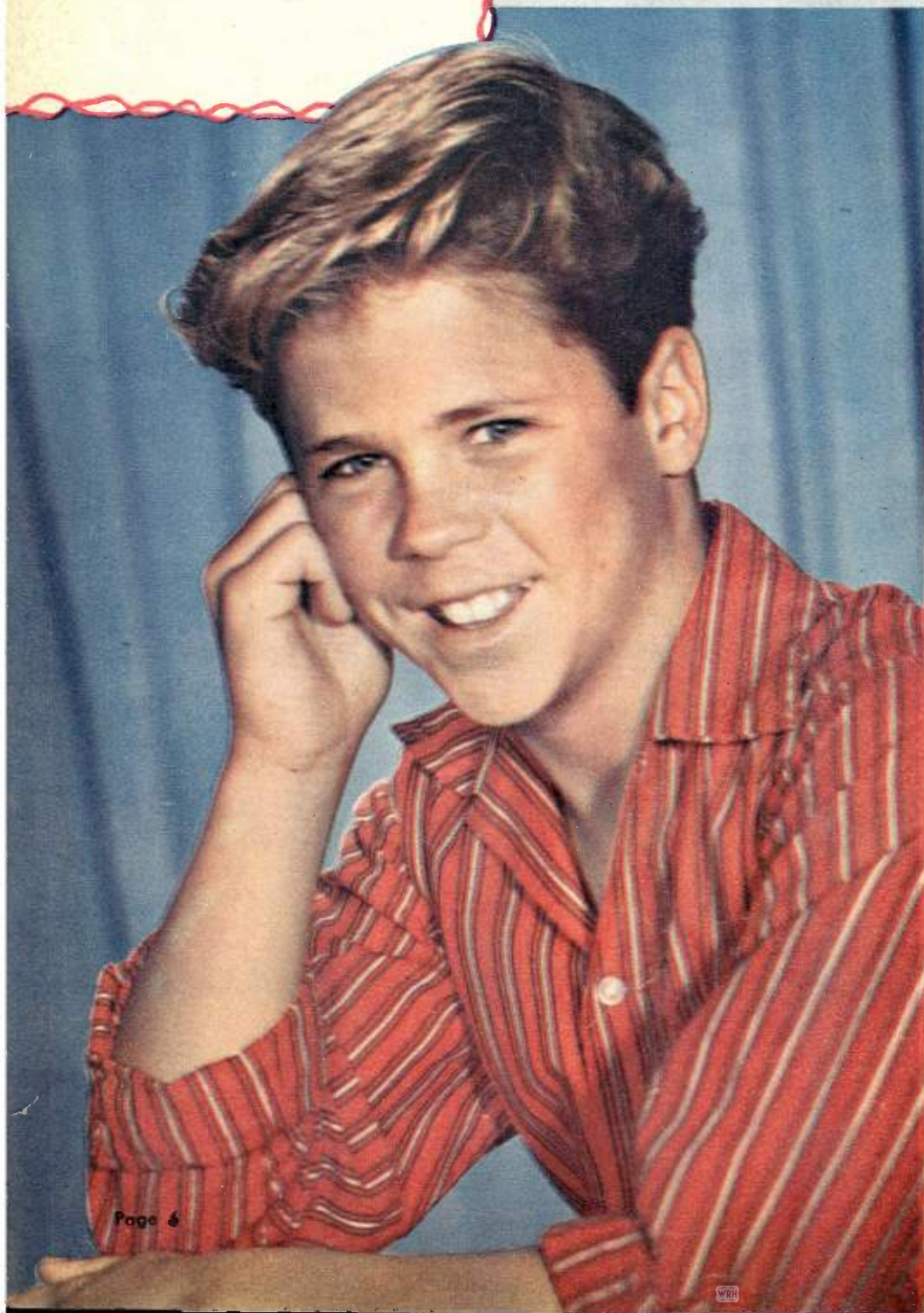
### Show Biz Background

Musically, to add to his versatility, the Hollywood-born actor has studied the accordion and various styles of dancing. "I'd also like to do some singing," he smiles, "but so far I just don't seem to have the right kind of voice."

Although "Beaver" is Tony's first major role, his family has a show business background. His mother, Muriel Montrose Dow, was a Mack Sennett bathing beauty in the silent film days. And his brother, Dion, 26, now a psychologist, had a brief fling in the movies. His father, John Dow, Jr., is a builder and industrial designer in Van Nuys.

On the series, the choice of Jerry as "Beaver" depended a great deal on his physical appearance. The part called for a youngster, who had two boyish, slightly buck-teeth, thereby giving the "beaver" effect. (Many children give this appearance which they later outgrow.) It was only by coincidence, however, that Tony, facially, does bear a great resemblance to his TV brother.

"Nobody ever makes fun of 'Beaver,'" his TV brother declares. "They'd better not! Actually, it's 'Beaver' who always seems to be getting into some kind of a jam and dragging me into it. I don't know what a real beaver's life is like. But being a brother to one — even on TV — is hectic enough."

**T**HE MANY PERSONS WHO HOLD that television is already too complicated "haven't seen nothin' yet!" For soon (tentatively around April 1) it looks as if they'll experience "sublimated subconscious perception" via TV. "S.P.," as it is called for short, is the much-discussed process by which, through television for example, the viewer has flashed before him on the screen a message so rapidly he is not aware that he is receiving it. Subtle, so the experts say, but powerful.

**L.A. AD CLUB DEVOTED** a noon hour to the topic of subliminal projection and perception a couple of weeks ago. This is mentioned because the presentation was made by men from PRECON, the company with which KTLA signed an S.P. contract over the Jan. 18 weekend. I understand that subliminal projection by KTLA, subject naturally to FCC approval, has not yet been commented on by the Commission. But since Channel 5 plans to deliver its S.P. messages only on public service topics, it would seem reasonable to expect that it will receive approval. As yet there is no plan to use the S.P. approach for paid commercials, though it is to be expected that this would be the ultimate goal. Messages are being planned for the body of a given program, the audience being alerted that "during the next ten minutes you will be subjected to subliminal communication," or some such words.

**WE ARE ALL AWARE THAT** our minds receive not only on the conscious level but on the subconscious as well. If a message is flashed on the screen at 1/60th of a second, experts also tell us that our subconscious or subliminal mind receives the message, and though we cannot recall

or discuss it, its contents can influence us. As one man put it, "Subliminal communication couldn't make you go out and buy a certain kind of soap if you didn't want to, but if you wanted soap, and there were a choice of brands, it could remind you to buy the kind you had perceived subliminally."

**A RECENT TEST OF SUBLIMINAL** projection in an Eastern movie house is said to have featured two subliminal messages. One said "Eat Popcorn," and the other "Drink Coca Cola." The test, conducted over a six-week period and involving about 45,000 patrons, is claimed to have upped popcorn consumption by 57.5 percent and Coke sales 18.1.

**THE AREAS THAT S.P.** might open are at once debatable and overpowering. Those in advertising who favor its use view subliminal projection as an added, positive implement to commercials as we now see them. Those puzzled by it feel that some conclusive and overwhelming test would have to be made to evaluate subliminal communication. Needless to say, if S.P. were to be employed effectively on TV, the FCC would have a monitoring problem, for how could one tell what was being flashed if he couldn't see it?

**THERE HAS BEEN A RUMOR**, unsubstantiated as yet and quite improbable, that a couple of network advertisers have been using S.P. Also one that KTLA has been experimenting. This the channel denies, pointing out that it does not have the equipment—"two large square boxes with dials." Quizzed as to cost of this equipment, KTLA headman Lew Arnold did not want to quote figures "since the thing is experimental," but added, "It won't break our backs."

**ONE EXTREMELY REVOLUTIONARY** result might develop should S.P. be employed effectively on television. It is conceivable that commercials as we know them now might float off into thin air. However there might be one realm

I don't recall the picture." I know which one you mean. Pretty dull, eh? "Once I saw a hilariously funny comedy starring Joan Fontaine. It made an impression, yet I can't remember who was in it." Could it have been Joan Fontaine? "And there was a Barbara Stanwyck movie about three girls, I believe, and a child. Geraldine Fitzgerald was one of the sisters and one of the men was Gig Young. Remember?" Sure, I do... only Young was the child on that gig. In appreciation of your letter, Mrs. MacFarlane, I have used my influence to schedule one of the movies you requested, "Kings Row." See below.

"King's Row." (5) Feb. 2, 1:30. 1941. (See above) Adapted from Henry Bellamann's best seller about lives and loves in a small town (a perennially popular theme, as witness that current adolescent exercise, "Peyton Place") this film provided a large lift to the careers of its young principals, Ronald Reagan, Ann Sheridan, Robert Cummings and Betty Field. It is the story of two boys who grow up together, one to marry a girl from the "wrong side" and lose his legs in a case of medical sadism, and the other to become a doctor and the unhappy lover of a girl involved in an incestuous relationship (only hinted at in the picture, of course). The four leads, along with Claude Rains, Charles Coburn and Judith Anderson give top notch performances under Sam Wood's direction.

"The Big Sleep." (2) Feb. 1, 10:00. 1945. Raymond Chandler's famous private sleuth, Phillip Marlowe, is enacted here by Humphrey Bogart, who is called in by an old man whose two rakehell daughters, Lauren Bacall, a noontime drinker, and Martha Vickers, a dilly who dallies with the bad boys, have left him open to blackmail. There is murder, assault, battery, mayhem, romance and something for just about everyone but the children in this entertaining cops and robbers affair.

"The Hucksters." (11) Feb. 2, 9:00. 1947. Adapted from the Frederic Wakeman novel about Madison Avenue advertising men, this one has Clark Gable as a hustler with integrity who works for a tyrant, Sydney Greenstreet (playing the character supposedly patterned after the late George Washington Hill, who made LS/MFT famous) and in the end is faced with the loss of his job or the gain of his face. With Deborah Kerr, who is pretty much wasted in her American debut.

"Honeymoon." (9) Beginning Feb. 3, 9:00. 1946. Shirley Temple elopes to Mexico with Cpl. Guy Madison and in the tangled process makes life miserable for vice consul Franchot Tone. A mild farce that should cash in on the recent Temple resurgence.

"The Toy Wife." (11) Feb 4, 10:30. 1938. Originally titled, "Frou Frou," this bit of frou frou has Louise Rainer as a giddy wife who makes life a tragedy for herself, for steady husband Melvyn Douglas and lover Robert Young in the New Orleans of 1890.

"The Purple Plain." (2) Feb. 2, 11:15. 1955. A recent J. Arthur Rank release starring Gregory Peck as a suicide bent RAF pilot who falls in love with a simple native girl, Win Min Than, and regains his perspective in a danger ridden trek through jungle, desert swamp and what have

DUG BY JACK HOLLAND

**T**HERE'S been an increasing amount of talk lately about the loot given away daily and one evening a week on NBC's *The Price Is Right*. If you haven't caught this show, perhaps you should give it a look because the lucky contestants go away loaded. There are dozens of quiz shows, I grant you, and one more makes little or no difference on the overall TV scene, but apparently this one has enough interest to get and hold viewers. With daytime TV being generally so dull, this might spark your spare minutes.

With *Gunsmoke* now riding the crest of the wave, rating-wise, a few facts should be considered about this show's continued popularity. For one thing, almost without exception the scripts are on a high and adult level. Few descend into the realm of the mediocre. Westerns are also so popular now but *Gunsmoke* is the one which actually led the way for the current crop. Norman Macdonnell who has guided both the TV and KNX radio versions also has had much to do with this show's brilliant record. James Arness, Dennis Weaver, Amanda Blake as stars have certainly carved fine niches for themselves with their expert performances. And yet one of the contributing factors has been the first class direction by such men as Ted Post, who has done a goodly number of these shows. Post's know-how, his intelligence, and his general good taste have helped to keep *Gunsmoke* up on that A-1 level. Considering his success with this show and others, then, how come that CBS-TV, to whom he is under contract, has not seen fit to hand him an hour or an hour and a half show to direct? Certainly he is capable of moving on to greener pastures. And certainly he would do very well as director of one of the network's live TV

shows such as *Studio One*, *Climax*, or *Playhouse 90*. However, the general idea seems to be to keep him on film, although he was, prior to his coming to Hollywood, one of the east's best directors of live TV. Let directors like Ted Post, Andy McLaglen and others of equal calibre grow in this medium by giving them challenging and new things to do, for it is with such men that television itself can avoid becoming stagnant and getting into a rut.

Capitol Records pulled off a nifty when it got the Broadway smash hit by Meredith Wilson, "The Music Man" on its label. The original cast is featured on the album just released and it's a good buy. Meredith had nursed "The Music Man" for a long time during his stay in Hollywood where he was — and is — an important figure in radio. Now he has a smash on his hands and his friends couldn't be more pleased. Speaking of Capitol, it is also releasing a couple of other nifties in Tommy Sands' "Sing Boy Sing" album from his picture, the score of "A Farewell To Arms," and also the jazz album called "Dance Craze" featuring performers like Ray Anthony, Stan Kenton, and Nelson Riddle.

**Odds and Ends:** Allene, the gal who is so clever in making up decorations and favors for parties now has her own hobby show called *Hobby Corner* — on Saturdays from 2 to 2:30 on KTTV . . . Speaking of KTTV, they're really hot on the new series, *Sea Hunt*, starring Lloyd Bridges, which starts next month. According to the boys there, this is a show you can't afford to miss. This department hasn't seen it yet so we can only hope it's as good as advance reports claim. Bridges is at any rate a fine actor . . . See that *Screen Gems* has been handed a large hunk of Columbia's finest pictures for TV release, among them "Lost Horizon" and "It Happened One Night." KNXT will present them here. And so once again the controversy rages about studios selling their product to

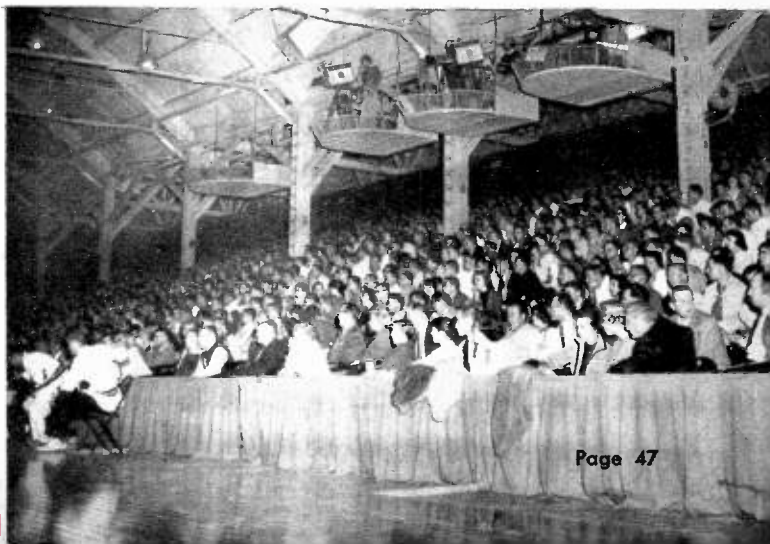

# ? WHY IS Dean Martin ?

## LIMITING HIS TV APPEARANCES? ?

**T**ELEVISION is tough. You've got to think way out — not just for today, but for the tomorrows if you want to stay alive as an entertainer."

Dean Martin was referring to his refusal to do a regular show and why he was limiting his television appearances. His first solo appearance was October 5, and another solo appearance for November.

"Some say I don't like to work," Dean said. "That isn't true. The first danger threatening a performer today on television, of course, is over-exposure. An entertainer, like any other human, can wear out his welcome. I don't want to end up a season wondering if audiences still want me.

"Secondly, the regular weekly show brings up the question of material and preparation. When you consider the time and preparation that goes into a feature length picture, and no matter how hard you try, they do sometimes lay an egg, it doesn't stand to reason that a weekly television show is going to be the performer's best. The entertainer who thinks he can give his best under such conditions is just kidding himself. He's short-changing his audience and don't think an audience doesn't find this out.

"Thirdly, I think there is a lot to living, that is, enjoying one's family and living a normal human existence.

"Naturally I'll sing, with a bit of easy comedy thrown in. People know me as a singer, but if I can give 'em a laugh or two, so much for the better. But the big thing is that they don't expect me to knock them off their seats as a comedian. Since I am a singer, I do not have the same problem as a comic whose audiences are challenging him, daring him to be funny and make them laugh.

"I don't go for this calypso and rock 'n' roll stuff. I want to sing songs that are understandable, that have meaning to millions of Americans, songs that have an emotional impact as they bring back happy memories. Although fads in the musical world come and go, the songs that remain alive stay alive because they mean something to listeners. When my boy heard the songs of my

latest album, 'Pretty Baby,' he asked me, 'What's that?' Then he went upstairs to listen to his Presley records. But I think that he, like other teenagers, will come back to the old songs with meaning.

"It's a healthy thing for every performer to always know that he is expendable, that there is always someone to step into his shoes. This is always a sobering thought to me, a reminder that a performer is only as good as his last performance. You can't stand still. You either go ahead, or slip back.

"The teenagers are the most important part of the public today in finding new talents and personalities. I have them to thank for putting Jerry and me over. However, as the group of teenagers who discovered you matures and grows older, the entertainer must grow too. Thus, the entertainer must expand his talents, develop a more mature style and strike out in different fields. As growing adults, the audience that discovered Martin and Lewis will demand more from each one."

Dean's going his own way will permit him to more fully develop his talents as a singer and also try his wings in another direction — as a dramatic actor. His first appearance will be in the motion picture, "The Young Lions" with Marlon Brando and Montgomery Clift.

"I've never done anything like this, playing a dramatic role. I want to see if I can . . . and I seem to be making it judging from the scripts I've been getting from studios who have heard of my work. My enthusiasm for pursuing a career as a dramatic actor has been whetted by having the opportunity to work with Marlon and Monty. Working with them has been an inspiration. They're two wonderful guys.

"However, I'll never do a dramatic role on a live TV show. I'd be scared stiff. And the fact remains that television is a motion picture medium. In a live television show, the actor is har-

assed by mechanical consideration rather than being able to give his full attention to his role. Audiences will see better, more fully developed performances with the dramatic play on film rather than live. I think television is turning in this direction, too, judging by the increasing number of major dramatic shows that are now being filmed rather than sent out live.

"But whatever I may achieve as a dramatic actor, I'll never give up singing and light comedy."

In addition to his television appearances, Dean plans two pictures a year, night club work, and making recordings.

Getting back to the perils of television, Dean pointed out the weaknesses of the 'guest star' system to bolster shows. "The cost of a guest star appearance is almost prohibitive. Added to this is the fact that so many guest stars have shows of their own. You can't blame a star for not wanting to make too many appearances in addition to carrying the weight of his own show. In other words there just aren't too many guest stars. What will happen is that more talent will be developed, increasing reliance will be placed on great talents who have not quite reached the star magnitude. Thus the door will be opened for a wider array of talent rather than concentrating on the few. In inviting guest stars for my own two shows I am doing this year I am more interested in talent that has not already been over-exploited."

It was inevitable that the discussion would get around to Dean's break-up with Jerry Lewis as a team.

"I think I hinted at it before, the necessity for growth, for maturing. As members of a team grow older their talents and abilities become more highly individualized. The confidence that comes with success leads each member of the team to experiment with talents that he as a team member never had the confidence or time to develop. It's not

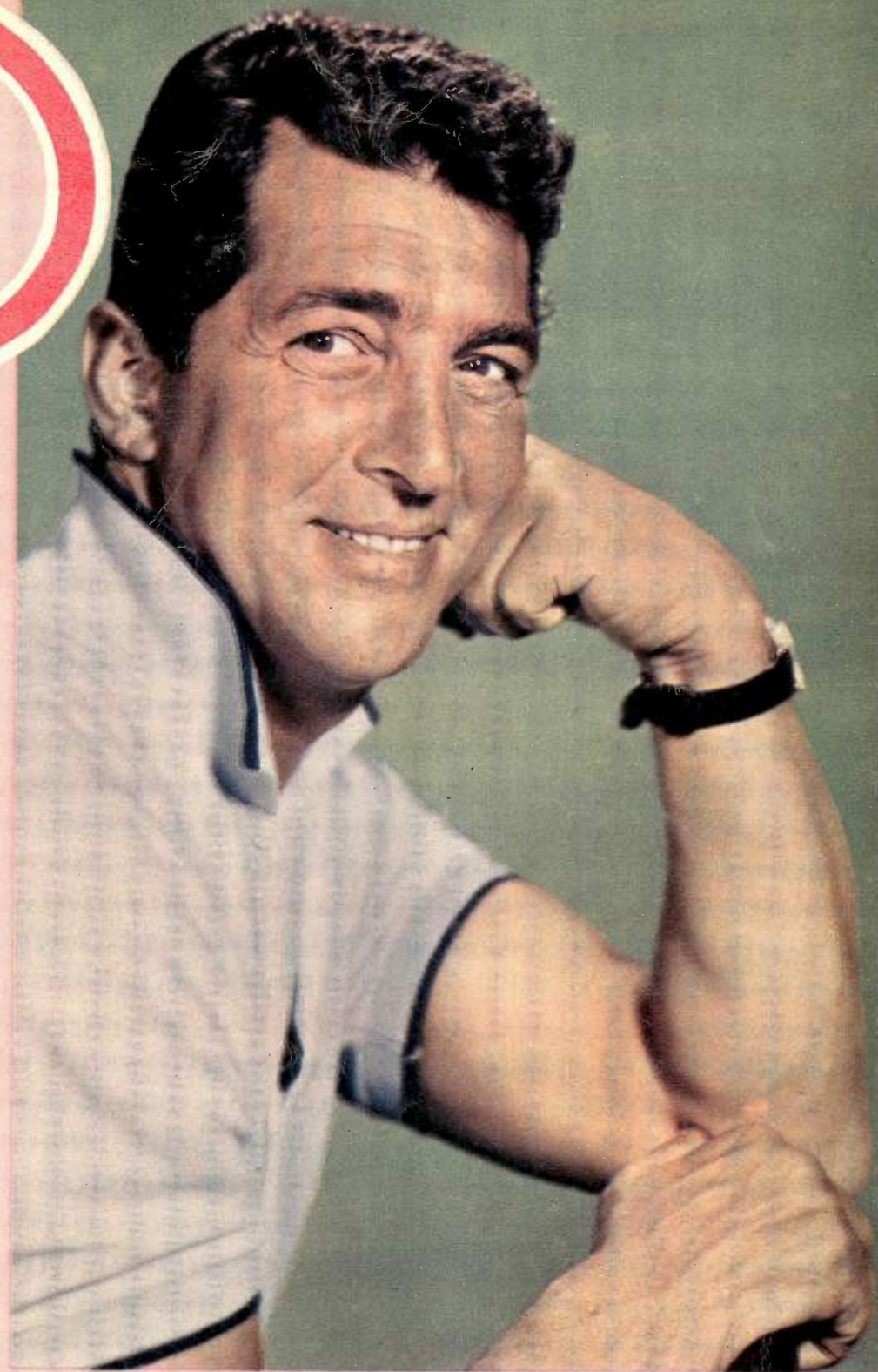


*In making his first appearances as a single, Dean comes up with some sound answers to questions facing every star.*

any different than with any other human as he matures. Interests change, not just because of the passage of years, but with the development of the individual's personality. I think it is inevitable that as any team of young performers develop along their individual lines, they will eventually find working as a team restricting them, holding them down. Naturally you get in each other's hair. And, too, I believe the time comes when the audience of a team expects the individual to do more on his own.

"I'm on my own now — completely," Dean said intensely. "It has made me realize that I've got to work harder. Also, there is a much greater incentive. There's no one else there to rely on when you're carrying the whole show yourself. It sharpens one's talents and thinking and develops your sense of daring. Jerry and I had gotten into somewhat of a rut. Whenever we'd try something new and get ourselves out on a limb, we knew we could drop back into our old stuff and bring down the house. That makes a person lazy. It's a challenge to sink or swim on your own. But when you make it on your own, you get rid of all the doubts you may have had about yourself. I've always wanted to try myself, to be able to stand on my own two feet.

"It gave me a lot of confidence in handling the 19½ hours telethon for the City of Hope. They tell me the \$804,000 taken in is the largest amount that has ever been drawn in a telethon. It proved I could do a show by myself, that I didn't have to rely on someone else, somebody standing next to me to carry the burden if I didn't come through.



"On my own I feel better, that I have a whole new life with the opportunity to prove to myself just what I have and what I can do. Whatever happens I know that I alone am responsible.

"Another thing that is important to me in being on my own is that I can plan and enjoy a family life. This you can't do when faced with the responsi-

bilities of working with another person as a team. The team must come before family life — before everything. In other words, I am relishing being a complete individual. That means a lot more responsibilities, but at the same time a lot more freedom and a greater sense of accomplishment. Those are important things to a man, don't you think so?" Dean concluded.





# The Richfield Reporter Breaks a Tradition . . .

*On NBC since its conception, the nation's oldest news program started the new year on CBS.*

**JOHN WALD**—the voice of the Richfield Reporter.

**F**OR a frustrated actor, John Wald has certainly come a long way. More years ago than John likes to remember he was on the road with traveling shows, hitting the famous Chautauqua circuit, playing small towns throughout the midwest. Then radio "happened" and John decided to play it straight.

"My only claim to fame," John reports, "is that I have probably worked longer and steadier than almost anyone else in this business. As of this past January 1st, I'm in my 30th year of radio broadcasting without ever losing a week's wages. I should at least get the maximum old age benefit."

Of the 30 years John has been broadcasting, 21 of them have been spent as the nightly Richfield Reporter, the nation's oldest news show. The program itself started in 1931. Writer Wayne Miller joined it four years later; then, in 1937 John Wald became the voice of the Richfield Reporter. Writer Miller and Newsman Wald have become a crack team over the years they have worked together. Miller tackles the daily deluge of wire service material with a blue pencil and a keen eye for news evaluation. Out of the mass of material comes the script from which Wald broadcasts the two nightly programs.

Two shows are necessitated because of tradition. The Richfield Reporter is always heard at 10 p.m. and because of the time differential, the program for Arizona and Idaho is broadcast at 9:00 p.m., then the regular West Coast show is broadcast at 10 p.m.

Speaking of tradition, a long standing one was broken recently when Richfield Reporter moved from NBC to CBS. "I feel both happy and sad about leaving KFI," John relates. "However, I think the change was necessitated due to NBC's lack of live shows originating from the West Coast. Those that do have a West Coast originating point are done live here but taped and sent East for rebroadcast to the coast."

As this is being written KFI (NBC-Los Angeles) reports that the Reporter's old 10 p.m. time slot is being filled by a news program and that plans are under consideration to build a production news show to fill the spot permanently.

At KNX (CBS Radio, Los Angeles), 10 o'clock News Wire, the news show that KNX felt was the Richfield Reporter's chief competition finally fell before the onslaught. It has been replaced by the program it fought so many years.

John has stored up a wealth of anecdotes about his stint as the voice of the

Richfield Reporter. His favorite naturally enough concerns his work. Just about the most difficult job he ever encountered, he says, was during the March of 1938 rainstorm which flooded the Southern California area, marooning thousands, flooding highways and disrupting electrical power service. "We were operating," John reports, "in a darkened studio on auxiliary power, and I was using a flashlight to read the script but we didn't miss a single broadcast."

Never missing a show has its drawbacks, especially when it's a six-nights-a-week show. A point in fact: his daughter Susan. Since he saw her participate in a May Day pageant when she was in the first grade he never saw her in another school affair until she graduated. The graduation ceremonies were held in the afternoon—everything else had been held in the evening and John Wald works every night, except Sunday, as the Richfield Reporter.

## How old will you be in 2008?

*Dr. Martin Klein speculates  
on what kind of world you'll  
find fifty years from now.*

**I**N VIEW of the current rash of interest in things scientific and scientification, TV-Radio Life decided to go to the man who keeps his head in the clouds professionally: Dr. Martin Klein, genial host of *Adventure Tomorrow*, KCOP's Tuesday evening science show who keeps busy during the week as Consulting Engineer for Cohu Laboratories.

As a jumping off place, TV-Radio Life asked Dr. Klein in what kind of a world we would find ourselves in 2008. He replied:

"These are difficult times in which to figure out what will happen in 50 years. It seems to me that there are several possibilities. One of them is that Russia will continue on its program of engulfing us scientifically. In other words, they are graduating about 100,000 trained scientists a year and we barely one third of that. The result may be, as time goes on, that we will be reduced progressively in our importance as a world power. Their program seems to be one just such as this, whereby eventually they will have sufficient scientific advancement over us so that they will literally engulf us because we will have to turn to them for so many things.

"In terms of down to earth living, the world will probably be very much the same as it is today. True, we'll be getting our power from reactors and fusion energy but this is a basic advancement which will not affect everybody in his day to day activities. There is no doubt that considerable electronic gadgetry will be added to everyday life and there will be progress in the medical field but in general, activities will be much the same as they are now. If somehow we come to the realization that we must increase our scientific research pro-

grams, there is a possibility that we will not be engulfed by Russia. But in spite of everything that has happened, it does not appear that anyone is actually taking this seriously enough to make the necessary drastic steps. The other possibility is that there will be a war during this interval, in which case, the answer is simple: we'll all be wearing leopard skins and we'll all be carrying clubs."

If in 50 years, Dr. Klein, the current East-West political situation still exists, how will space travel be accomplished and how will it affect life on Terra?

"I very much doubt that the situation will still exist for the reasons I gave in answer to your first question. But if it does, space travel will not be accomplished. It is a simple matter of economics to see that the cost of space travel is enormous, even in comparison with present day budgets. Space travel is enormously more complicated, enormously more expensive and I doubt that any single government could support it to advantage. It would take a collective effort to accomplish space travel. If it can be accomplished, then it seems obvious that the problems we have here on earth will become relatively minor."

Will colonization of other planets in this galaxy become a necessity or for adventurers only?

"It is inconceivable to me that any number of people will ever colonize another planet. I do not preclude the possibility that there are 'people' on other planets, but if there are, they certainly do not resemble us in any size, shape or form. To be able to adapt themselves to their environment, they would have to be chemically considerably different than we are. It would be a very tiring effort to live on, say, the moon, where the temperature varies from the boiling

to considerably below zero. It would be difficult to adapt to an environment where there is no air and little gravity. I, for one, cannot see that any number of people would be willing to walk around in space suits for the rest of their lives. The other planets seem even less promising, especially since the time to get there is so great. This looks strictly like another program for 'I Search For Adventure'."

Let's blast off and get back to firm ground. Based on current fact and experimentation, would you speculate on the daily life of an average family in 2008?

"That's not too difficult at all. I think people will get up substantially at the same time that they do now. They will eat as little as most of them do for breakfast now, except that they will take a simple pill—which is available right now—so that they will not feel hungry for the balance of the day. I think people are tending to eat less than in the past. They will get to work in automobiles which will still get stuck on inadequate freeways. They may possibly all have telephones in their cars, at any rate, they will be more common than they are today. At work, the automobiles will still be parked in a very hap-hazard manner. They will work in buildings which contain a considerable amount of glass, but which are, nevertheless, all air-conditioned. The working day will be five hours. People will come home in the early afternoon and, just as they do today, will spend the rest of the day and evening sitting in front of the television set. The sets will be much larger and much flatter and will resemble large murals, but the material they watch will not have changed one bit. In fact, we'll probably still be watching the same people in the same roller derby. I think they will spend more time visiting their psychiatrists and less time visiting their dentists. Automobile repair bills will be larger and magazines and books will be sold even less than they are now."

In digest form, Doctor, would you summarize your speculations?

"I would say all that one has to do to speculate on the future is to look back during the past fifty years, the interval from 1908 to the present. Our way of life has not changed very much at all. It is true that we have many more conveniences and we can do some things considerably faster than we did them before, but our basic way of life is the same. We still eat three meals a day. We still travel along the same roads. The next fifty years of scientific development are of a very basic nature and will find their uses in basic industry, such as the chemical, power generation and aviation industries. Fifty years is too short a time for these developments to filter down very far into society and to affect it very much. In this respect 2008 will be much the same as 1958."
