N They Could Do It Over

The famous Amos 'n' Andy team cogitate on their 30-year air career, its joys, a few boners.

BACK IN 1926. Freeman Gosden and Charles Correll when they played Sam 'n' Henry, forerunner of Amos 'n' Andy. On WGN, Chicago.

HIRTY years ago this March 19 when Freeman Gosden and Charles Correll started their fabulous Amos 'n' Andy careers they were doubtful. When one year had rolled around they shook their heads in amazed pleasure and said, "This may be our last one."

Perhaps their greatest mistake was this-underestimating their own careerlongevity. At the end of three decades they are still going strong-on CBS-Radio-and though they are not TV stars, the Amos 'n' Andy CBS-TV series is rolling along, too.

How do Gosden and Correll feel about Amos 'n' Andy now? Ask them if they'd have done things differently and they thoughtfully say "No." "As for handling our careers, we've gotten the maximum out of them," says Correll in another masterpiece of understatement. "We started in radio when it was a baby and didn't know whether it would last. We grew along with it."

The team thinks it came West at the right time. They still reaffirm their decision, "No, we wouldn't want to do TV." So what *would* they have changed? Haven't they done *anything* they wish they hadn't?

"Financially," recalled Correll, "we might have demanded more money at certain times, but we're not of that nature." He went on to tell about the booking they had—70 per cent of the gross and a \$3000 guarantee, making personal appearances in a Pennsylvania coal mining town with a preponderance of foreign born who couldn't comprehend Amos 'n' Andy. So the theater manager had a hard time squeezing out even the guarantee. "He gave us a check for \$3000 and we gave it back to him," Correll explained.

Another time the team turned down \$2000 a week to endorse a product which neither heartily approved. "Two thousand a week would have come in pretty handy," Gosden chimed in.

On the other hand, products they have mentioned kiddingly on the shows have often embroiled them in trouble. One July Fourth when the team was doing a show about the United States and England they made a jest about England wanting to borrow more money, and another comment about the U.S. using England's notes for wallpaper-followed by a serious disclaimer at program's close. Unfortunately many listeners did not wait until the end of the show, they were so upset. Two days later, these irate radio fans had so thoroughly boycotted Amos 'n' Andy's sponsor-product that the Canadian plant was closed.

Gosden recalls another remark about the laundry "tapping the shirt buttons with a hammer and cutting the collar with a razor blade" which got Amos 'n' Andy in dutch with this industry. Some reference in another script about bicarbonate being a follow-up for hamburgers evoked painful howls from the hamburger people. All of these flurries were quickly settled, needless to say.

Today, Gosden and Correll are completely happy with radio, feel that radio sponsors are easier to satisfy than they used to be and much easier than TV because TV is so expensive. They point out that despite TV's capturing a great audience, radio is still going strong and that it is something one can enjoy in any GOSDEN AND CORRELL TODAY as they appear on CBS-KNX's Music Hall.

room of the home, in the car or on the street as in the case of the little new transistor sets.

Gosden and Correll have been equally as faithful to radio as radio and its audiences have been to them. For 25 years they did two shows a day and were never late after that time when Gosden's watch played tricks on him, resulting in his lingering at the tailor's until exactly three minutes before showtime. He ran to the phone, called Correll, who carried on solo, but he had a hard time convincing the sponsor, Campbell Soup, that he wasn't playing hooky. Gosden received a wire from them immediately after the show signed off, saying, "Hope you enjoyed your fishing trip."

After that, both Amos 'n' Andy wore watch bands with a timepiece on each side of the wrist. Check and double check!

Over the years, the famous pair has made it custom to celebrate the passing of another career milestone. On New Year's Eve, no matter what their separate plans, they at least get together to make a toast for the coming months. So last Dec. 31 they actually celebrated what others are observing this monththeir 30th anniversary. They did it with the same words as always: "This may be our last year, so let's make it a good one."

George Burns Thinks You're Smart!

HEY'RE wearing jokes shorter this year!" according to George Burns. Comedy dialogue, he explains, used to follow the pattern of repeating the straight line. For example: "A funny thing happened to me on the way to the studio," was always followed by the questioning repetition, "A funny thing happened to you on the way to the studio?"

"Nowadays," George points out, "instead of repeating the sentence we just say 'What happened?' The jokes are like ladies' fashions – long one year, short another. This year they are short."

George was discussing the fact that Burns and Allen have changed their show over the years, even during the past eight seasons of their television series. The reasons may be many, but one

of the chief causes is that George believes audiences are growing smarter and smarter. "They're sharp today," he claims. "They know about ratings and other backstage things."

Because you are so sharp, George Burns takes you into his confidence. A little while back he instituted the procedure of detaching himself from the show and making chummy asides to you, commenting on Gracie and the thickening plot. Then this season he hit on a new approach — his "secret weapon." As head writer of the show he converted the TV set in his scriptual den into an electronic genie which he and he alone could command, but with which he, and you, could see what Gracie was cooking up, figuratively, in the kitchen with neighbor Blanche.

George's cozy scheme worked so well he arranged for his TV set to spy on Gracie not only in their own home but also next door at the Mortons. Such a convenience has eliminated the necessity for George to peer and peek around corners or to eavesdrop when aiming to thwart his delicious little wife's zanies. He comfortably retires to his haven. turns on the TV set, and enjoys Gracie's antics along with you.

Explaining his secret weapon, George says blandly, "Everybody today is at keyholes and windows. Besides, if everybody else can tune my show, why can't I?"

Grey Matter

It is no mean feat to dredge up new ideas to keep you sharp people interested and deter you from clicking the dial. George Burns knows this when he states, "The person owning a TV set has his own theater." Monday may be traditionally blue to happy weekenders, but to Burns and writers. "Monday morning is a horrible morning. Five fellows," George continues, "not the prettiest you've ever seen and I've been looking at 'em for years, sitting around and saying 'What can we come up with?"

Out of this sad huddle recently emerged a happy idea – to have Gracie, under hypnotic influence, turn into a very brilliant woman, so brilliant that she can rate an appearance in the isolation booth of a big quiz show. The idea burgeoned into such a long and funny story line that for the first time in TV Burns and Allen will leave their audience cliff-hanging from one show to the next (February 24-March 3). Viewers will see a different Gracie and according to George, an actress whose "performance is so good a lot of people will forget that she is Gracie Allen."

This may be one time when Gracie will prove herself smarter than you. Of course George is smart off the screen as well as on because he sometimes lets you think you're smarter than you may be. As he explains it, "On every show we purposely write two or three jokes on which the audience can beat us to the punch line." THE INTELLECTUAL GRACIE lands in isolation booth of a giant quiz show — makes with glib answer.

HEN Date with the Angels faded from the TV scene, it looked as though once again the charming and talented Betty White would be trying to find the right TV show for herself. It had happened before. But this time, almost inmediately it was announced that she would be seen on ABC-TV in the "new" Betty White Show.

Betty is not entirely happy about this "new" tag. As she remarked, "There has to be a happy medium about this 'new Betty White' business. After all, I have old friends who would resent a change and I wouldn't want to offend them. There will be a new Betty White to the extent that I will try new hairdos, etc. There might be a new BW in some of the skits, but in between there'll be plenty of old Betts."

Format

The new show will be done live and will feature a format based primarily on a comedy of manners. For instance, in one show this question was posed: "Is it possible to get along with impossible people?" Betty then assumed the guise of three different people as she acted out skits bearing on this theme. In another show she may take a subject like truth or honesty and show how a movie star would depict that, how a waitress would, and what it would mean to a housewife. In such skits there will be a guest star or stars - and an actor will be chosen to appear regularly in one of the sequences as Betty's husband. She will also do some singing in the scenes at times. That is the extent of the new show.

'Live' Excitement

"I introduce, of course, each skit and sort of set the stage," she said. "In other words, I emcee the doings. I am glad to be back doing live TV again because most of my TV experience has been in live. Ever since my daily hour long show for NBC a few years ago I've wanted to recapture that excitement. With our new format we can immediately arrive at three or more situations merely by announcing each, whereas in a filmed story you require so much footage to build into the situation before the payoff. I'm able to essay three completely different types of gals in three especially written sketches, in the same half-hour time limit, which is hardly possible when you film a socalled situation comedy.

"Sure there are lots of headaches ahead, but there's also a lot of fun."

HIS TIME THERE WASN'T a pot of gold for Ralph Edwards at the End of the Rainbow, though under other circumstances his show might not have been so abruptly cancelled. I think the altruistic guests who were being showered with largesse on End of the Rainbow did as much as anything to fade the program. They were, by and large, a pretty unresponsive bunch, making it dreadfully difficult for the emcee to whip up conversation and inciting disappointment and in one case, embarrassment for the home-viewer who naturally puts himself in the lucky recipient's place and says to himself, "Boy, if I were in his shoes I'd generate a little enthusiasm over all the wonderful things coming my way!

HARD PART ABOUT THIS IS that persons who might normally be responsive often grow numb in front of a TV camera. There may be a germ of truth, too, in the fact that all these persons being gifted so elaborately on End of the Rainbow have been do-gooders, giving of themselves and their material goods so freely that the mere shift of possessions from someone else to them is all in a day's happenings, so why grow excited? Anyway, you can bet that Ralph Edwards will profit by this experience and will bob up with something better, either on this particular program or one of the many others he always has up his sleeve.

TV WILL MISS GRACIE ALLEN - no one can take her place. But no one can blame her for wanting to do some of the things she's always wanted to do-"Sleep, take care of my house, clean out the drawers, invite people for dinner, play gin rummy, visit my daughter and her children and go to New York which I love." She added "I won't get tired of retirement." George said, "I don't think she'll get tired of retirement, but I can't say what might happen in six or seven months after she's played with the grandchildren and they've spilled milk all over her.'

GRACIE, WHO HAS BEEN ON radio with George for 20 years and on TV for eight, will be filming through May and will be seen until Sept. 22. She has been mulling retirement for four or five years, but waited until George was set with his company. An idea of the load she has been carrying may be gained when one knows that out of 46 script pages for a Burns and Allen Show, Gracie has had to learn about 30. It's a tedious job and takes all of her time.

GEORGE IS GOING TO WRITE a pilot for a replacement series, keeping the same persons - Bea Benadaret, Larry Keating, Harry von Zell and Ronnie Burns. No replacement for Gracie – it just can't be done. A whole new format. George expects to have the show ready for fall, will screen the pilot for the sponsor before option time. Burns and Allen have been with Carnation 52 weeks a year for eight years. "If the sponsor likes the pilot, fine!" said George. "If not, I'll smoke smaller cigars.

WILLIAM R. McANDREWS, newly-appointed veep, News, of NBC, was in Los Angeles last week to tell about everexpanding plans for his near-400 staff members and the network's news programming. While the NBC TV and radio budgets are the same as last year, programming is more than last year. Currently six programs are being discussed in the public affairs area. Rather than cutbacks, look for expansion. "Comment" a public affairs program which has been seen in New York, is being switched from Friday to Sunday and will be seen on KRCA at 11:30 a.m. Program is interpreta-(Continued on Page 26)

SINGLE STATION Stereophonic Sound

KBMS-FM demonstrates the amazing new 'miracle of multiplexing'

Multiplexing, a new development in radio broadcasting which enables a single station to broadcast true two-channel stereophonic sound, came into commercial reality last month when KBMS-FM demonstrated this remarkable achievement at the Moulin Rouge in Hollywood.

KBMS-FM was the first station anywhere to successfully broadcast two separate programs on one FM channel. Until this time stereophonic programs have been achieved only by the combination of two stations broadcasting simultaneously. This system necessitated the use of two FM receivers. Now, with multiplexing, only one station and one receiver are required. However, FM receivers currently in use are not equipped to receive a multiplexed broadcast and will only pick up one half of the program. KBMS-FM President Al Schwartz believes that manufacturers will have multiplex receivers and/or adapter kits on the market in six months.

"This has been a two-year development for us," Mr. Schwartz said, "and we feel proud of being the first station in the country to publicly demonstrate the 'miracle' of high fidelity multiplexing."

Mr. Schwartz explained that multiplex broadcasting (the stacking of one program on top of another) is possible because of the great width of the normal FM channel. Further explanations of the process become involved, but Mr. Schwartz resorted to metaphor in an attempt to make it clear: "Multiplex broadcasting is like a four-lane freeway with a car in each lane but with only one lane_and one car visible to the naked eye. The other three can only be seen_with special equipment."

Zorro will probably leave a good many of us oldsters sitting on the sidelines wondering what all the shouting is about, for Zorro – and, ah, what a rich, singing, sonorous name – lives in a world of his own, a legendary fairy-tale in which one always knows the hero will arrive at the crucial moment of life-and-death, that evil will be resoundingly punished, and that no bullet will dispatch the brave and good. Add to this the golden time of early California, a black mask and a cape.

And, of course, there's something more to it than this. Zorro is no accident, for he springs from a long lineage of heroes in the tradition first made famous by Robin Hood – the nobleman who thumbs his nose at his own class by striking out against them in behalf of the poor and downtrodden.

The elemental appeal of this ageless story is not hard to fathom. Few of us are noble, rich, or powerful—a galling thought when you come to think of it to which the only satisfactory conclusion is that the noble, rich, or powerful are nothing but black-hearted scoundrels who would toast their mothers on a barbecue spit if advantageous to their ambitions.

And what greater proof can we have of our sneaking suspicions when one of the noble, rich and powerful crowd comes over to our side and starts kicking his erstwhile cohorts around. There is nothing so winning and appealing as confirmation of our resentments. And by some strange alchemy the mere presence of just one noble on our side seems to ennoble us all. Thus, this is hardly a legend to be discounted and one still very much alive with all of us. as seen, for example, in the hero worship accorded the late Franklin D. Roosevelt.

He who would challenge Zorro would be foolhardy indeed. And that parent who, in an unguarded moment of weakness might question his offspring's adoration of the masked Mr. Z, let him remember his own day of innocence where good and evil were simple things because good was eternally triumphant – or, better yet, just let him try topping the exploits of the dashing, dauntless don.

CITES KNX

In a recent book about the United Press, authored by Joe Alex Morris, KNX Radio is credited with being one of the first radio stations in the country to broadcast a special news dramatization provided by a wire service.

According to Morris in his book, "Deadline Every Minute," a 50-year history of the U.P. for which he worked as Foreign Editor, the wire service permitted certain radio stations to use its reports in the early 1930's.

In Chapter 20 of "Deadline Every Minute" Morris reports, "In 1931 the agency's news reports were being broadcast by certain radio stations affiliated with client newspapers. In addition Frank Bartholomew (now president of United Press Associations) sold a special service to KNX in Los Angeles. Under this deal KNX had access to the United Press report for four daily dramatizations of current news."

According to United Press business records in New York, the west's oldest nightly newscast, "The Richfield Reporter" started using United Press dispatches June 9, 1935 to rank that newscast among the first U.P. Radio clients. "Richfield Reporter" is now heard on KNX and the CBS Radio Pacific Network, 10:00-10:15 pm. 12:15

Early Morning Magic

is provided for children everywhere by bewhiskered Bob Keeshan, better known as Captain Kangaroo.

HE portly gentleman faintly resembling a railroad conductor wearing a blue serge coat with huge pockets has had children entranced on the East Coast for some ten years with a daily and Saturday morning show.

He has now come to the West Coast – daily. He has been seen in the past – on KNXT and the CBS West Coast Network – on Saturdays only. His 45 minute daily session has given mothers from coast to coast reason to be grateful – for when Captain Kangaroo appears on the screen, the younger set settles down, bewitched by his bewhiskered magic for a full 45 minutes of fun in a children's paradise, peopled with warm, entertaining characters who can and do penetrate a child's understanding.

Underneath the guise of the portly, paternal Captain is a remarkable young man of 30 by the name of Bob Keeshan, who started his career as a network page boy in New York City before joining the Marine Corps. Following his discharge he returned to his former position and became acquainted with Bob Smith, who took Keeshan along as a special assistance when the "Howdy Doody" show was born.

In this position Bob handled the props, talked to the small fry guests and occasionally wandered "on camera" with the prizes. Next thing he knew, someone suggested he come out on stage clad in a clown outfit. And that's the way Clarabelle was born. Happy with the success of that portrayal, Bob wanted to branch out and create a gentle character who would guide and attempt to establish better living habits for youngsters through the medium of television.

Eight months later he conceived Corny the Clown and debuted "Time For Fun" on a New York regional television network. Pleased with the reaction of the children to Corny, Keeshan then created Tinker the Toymaker for another show. "Tinker's Work Shop." Then came Captain Kangaroo – and

Then came Captain Kangaroo – and the rest is history. With handy-man, gardener Mr. Green Jeans (portrayed by Hugh Brannum, who joined Bob in 1955) Captain Kangaroo is the keeper of the keys to a children's haven where he offers beautiful music, exciting dances, unusual games and toys, live animals, simple studies of nature, humorous little cartoons and many other delights of childhood.

As the father of three small children (Michael, 7, Laurie, 4, and Maeve, 2%,) Keeshan has a deep feeling of responsibility to children and is sincerely interested in doing the best he can for them. He believes that by setting the proper example for them at all times, they will absorb and retain most of the

lessons, if subtly given, and thus form good behavior patterns for later life. He feels that cruelty and violence, or any suggestion of such, has no place on a children's program. This philosophy and his inherent affection for children and their problems chalk up "success" for Captain Kangaroo.

More recently Bob and his producer, Jack Miller, opened up another area of interest on the award-winning program by adding another member to the regular cast: eight-year-old Karen Waters.

Karen will join the Captain and Mr. Green Jeans in the Treasure House from time to time, taking part in the program's sketches. Both Bob and Jack agree that she seems "like any little girl living just down the road," which is precisely the role she will portray.

With Captain Kangaroo already a proven success on the East Coast, KNXT officials are sure that homes along the entire Western seaboard will be soon be echoing with the early morning request: "Mommy, turn on the Tee-Wee... Captain Kangawoo is on."



Happy to be a Hopper, but ...

T WAS no strain for William Hopper to sell thousands of dollars worth of automobiles because that's exactly what he did for a living for eight years. And right here in Hollywood, too.

The toughest job the handsome CBS-TV star has ever had was to sell himself. In case the name isn't familiar, the

role that Hopper plays might be. He's "Paul Drake," the private detective in the current Perry Mason series on KNXT, starring Raymond Burr.

In many ways Hopper is an enigma. In person he's a quiet, pleasant and affable person. But on TV, he plays the part of a rough-and-tough detective.

To complicate the enigma, Hopper is tough. He just doesn't show it. But his war record does. While in the Navy

during World War II, and because he was an ardent swimmer and skin diver, Hopper volunteered for the top-secret O.S.S. After his initial and rugged training, he was sent overseas with an underwater demolition team. "Overseas" is hardly the word for it.

In rapid succession his demolition team played a major part in the Peleieu and Anguar Islands operation, and the landing on the strategic island of Ulithi (which the Third and Fifth Fleets later used as their home base for their "strikes" on Japan itself). Next came the bloody invasion of Leyte and finally the pre-landing activities at Lingayen Gulf.

Decorated

For the service which he rendered above and beyond the line of duty, Hopper-in addition to the regular campaign bars-also received the Bronze Star with a combat "V" for heroic action.

Understandably, Hopper doesn't talk too much about his wartime activities. However, when it comes to his private and professional life, he's quite proud of his background, his career, and most of all his wife, Jane, and their 9-year-old daughter, Joan.

"I was born in New York," Hopper explains. "But came to California when I was still quite young to attend the Catalina Island School for Boys.

"I guess in more ways than one I've always had show business in my blood," Hopper explains. His father, De Wolf Hopper, was an actor, and his mother is the famous columnist, Hedda Hopper.

"After I graduated from high school, I worked in summer stock at Oqunquit, Maine, and then went to Broadway. I had some invaluable experience working in 'Romeo and Juliet' which starred Katherine Cornell and Basil Rathbone."

Comeback

Prior to the war, Hopper worked for five years in countless Hollywood movies. After his discharge, however, he abandoned his acting career and that's when he became an automobile salesman in Hollywood.

"But I guess once you get the acting bug, it's impossible to get rid of it. A war and years of absence didn't change the tremendous urge I had to get back into the theater."

Hopper's first big role in his "comeback," was as Jan Sterling's boy friend in "The High and the Mighty." Other top movie parts since then have been as Robert Mitchum's brother in "Track of the Cat," and Natalie Wood's father in "Rebel Without a Cause," and Patty McCormack's father in "The Bad Seed."

"The best thing the movies ever gave me, though," the congenial actor laughs, "was my wife. We first met when I did a screen test with her. Since we've been married, she's given up any idea of a career."

As Hopper explains it himself, being the son of famous and theatrical parents has "both helped and hindered me."

"On the helpful side," he declares, "is the fact that my mother, by virtue of having been an actress on Broadway and in pictures, plus being a famous columnist, is a walking theatrical historian. She has wonderful anecdotes about the theater, its background, its greats, and its lore. As an individual I have learned a lot about acting just through my conversations with her.

"On the debit side, of course, is the problem of being recognized as an individual and *not* someone's son. Through the years, I had quite a time establishing the fact that I was a separate entity. I am proud of my parents, of course, but at the same time it is nice to be recognized because of your own efforts rather than because of your parentage." Chalk up another first for Bill Burrud . . . he was the first to do an Adventure-Travel show. Through a technicality, he was also

First with Treasure

WO YEARS AGO, in June of 1956, Bill Burrud narrated a film on Superstition Mountain on his KCOP Wanderlust series written by Ted Hilgenstuhler. At the end of the show, as an afterthought, he ad libbed that any one interested in the lost gold mine could net themselves a map and other information by writing a letter to him. Bill didn't know what he was letting himself in for. When the mail started arriving by the bag full it didn't take a stroke of genius to recognize the potential of an entire series based on hidden or lost treasure.

According to the Bill Burrud Productions' research department, there are more than two and a half billion dollars in treasure known to be still unearthed in the world today – treasures that are waiting for the lucky stumble or unexpected glance that will recover them and make the finder wealthy beyond his dreams.

"Potentially," Bill reported, "Treasure' can be the biggest give-away show ever to be on television. What show can match 40 barrels of gold? And that's the prize for the treasure hunter who can find Major Savage's lost barrels of gold – gold that is known to be hidden in the Yosemite Valley. And that's only one of many stories we'll present on the show. Our research staff will dig up as much material as there is available on each treasure and we'll present the historical information through a dramatic re-enactment, then report on the maps, clues, previous findings and credibility of the treasure's existence.

"In some cases, reports of lost or buried treasure or valuable antiquities are completely unfounded in fact. One interesting case of that nature," Bill continued, "is relatively recent. According to folk lore and legend the crown jewels of the Emperor and Empress Maximilian, rulers of Mexico, went down off Cape Materas aboard the good ship Merida. independent treasure hunters and at least one diver lost his life before someone pointed out that the crown jewels rested not on the bottom of the sea but in a museum in Mexico City. Stories like this – which are true – will be told as sidelights on the show."

During the course of the conversation Bill never, even by insinuation, indi-cated any knowledge of another show being seen on another channel with a similar title. But under direct questioning, he replied that he knew that the show was on the air and that it was similar and that he made a point not to watch the show so that he would not, even subconsciously, have anything intentionally similar in his own series and finished up by saying, quite frankly, that 'Treasure' was the first show of its kind on the air in Los Angeles. The pilot show, written by Ted Hilgenstuhler, based on the Wanderlust program that had such a fantastic mail response, was auditioned on-the-air for the KCOP management and potential sponsors in May of 1957 – almost a year after the original idea had been conceived.

"During that year the series was in production. We have thirteen shows 'in the can' now but we don't anticipate staying more than five or six weeks ahead – mainly because each show breeds another show. If we don't get too far ahead we can stay pretty current."

At this point, the idea occured to the interviewer that perhaps the show might run out of lost treasures. "It doesn't seem possible," Bill replied, "nearly every one I talk to about the show has heard about a treasure somewhere – our biggest worry is checking them out – not running out."

And then, before he knew he had been trapped, the interviewer answered: "Did you ever hear the story about the mountain near Kanab, Utah where the treasure of Montezuma is supposedly hidden?" When he looked up Bill Burrud was making notes.



So You Want A Divorce .

If you do, take a look at Preliminary Hearing first and then make up your mind.

F Preliminary Hearing, KHJ-TV's new provocative interview type show, has its way, divorces will be cut far below their present figure – which now stands at four out of every ten marriages ending in divorce.

This production, produced by Ralph Andrews and moderated by Dr. Paul Popenoe of American Institute of Family Relations, is not exactly a counseling show in that it deals primarily with interviews with couples who have filed for divorce. They state their problems, so if any of their difficulties can be applied to others' situations, then perhaps there is a bit of counseling involved. It is actually a preliminary preliminary hearing. Preliminary Hearing is not going to be like Traffic Court with actors portraying the characters. The actual people who are getting a divorce will be on the show.

"And here is one of our biggest problems,' Ralph Andrews stated, "getting couples who are willing to go on the show. We called several hundred and only got four who would agree. We check the people very carefully to be sure we have no exhibitionists or cranks around or those who are just getting divorced for a lark. Our other problem is the constant concern over someone perhaps getting so excited or incensed during the show that he or she uses questionable language. Since this program is entirely unrehearsed this could happen. Dr. Popenoe won't even see the people until he meets them on stage, although he will, of course, have checked their files before doing the show."

With the natural reluctance towards airing their problems before the public as a stumbling block, just what powers of persuasion does Andrews use on them?

"We pay the couples a reasonable fee for their appearance," he continued. "We also offer them free the services of the American Institute of Family Relations. To those who are really hoping to salvage a marriage, such services are of definite value."

Dr Popenoe has been counseling for over 40 years and has been with the Institute for 29. Consequently, he has some pretty firm opinions about divorce and its causes.

"Divorce is much too quickly entered into in nine out of ten cases," he began, "and is too easily granted, here especially. I think it would be wise to make a 60 day cooling off period mandatory before any divorce could be granted. There should be this stage between filing for divorce and getting one. Certainly where there are children divorce should be made more difficult to get. According to our statistics, it is interesting to note that most people don't *really* want a divorce and that about 25 percent of those who do split up later say they'd like to remarry the one they divorced.

"I think that almost any two people who are intelligent and who really want to can make a marriage last.

"Most divorces stem from one thing, though – a failure on the part of one or both to grow up emotionally. Not being adult in approach to problems is basically a hang-over from being babied too much as a child. The mother-in-law problem is another big cause with the husband's mother now the one who is causing most of the difficulty. But what's wrong with a husband or a wife who lets a mother break up a marriage? Where is their maturity? A third cause is difference of opinions about how to raise children. This seems like something that should be be settled in a more sensible way than divorce.

"Such are the causes you'll undoubtedly hear discussed on Preliminary Hearing. If by our show we can save one marriage we'll feel we have done a job."

There is another factor that causes divorce – TV. One couple recently were splitting up and TV likes and dislikes was a cause. He liked Maverick and westerns and she hated sage brush operas.

"Since we're on at the same time as Maverick, we hope we don't find too many couples who have this same problem," Ralph Andrews laughed. "All that switching back and forth could be upsetting."
