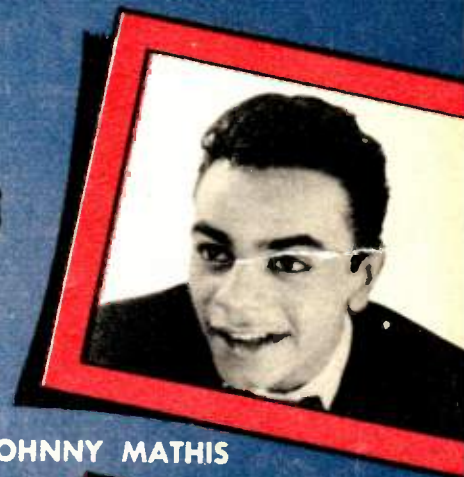

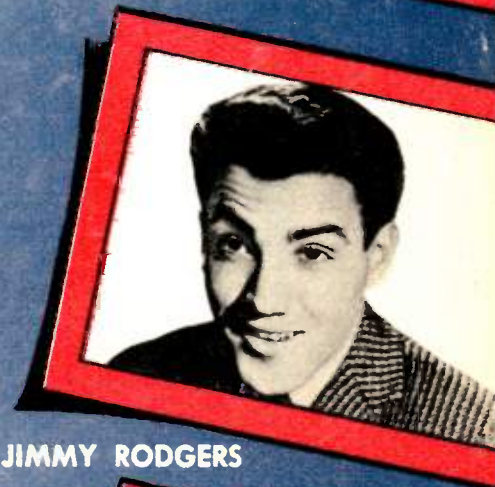

The Delicatessen Called Matinee Theater

Besides money, man power and talent it takes
a lot of coffee to put Matinee Theater on the air.

IT TAKES 500 cups of coffee a day to put Matinee Theater on the air. That amounts to about 4,500 gallons a year or, according to the man who supplies it, Ben Zukin, "enough to take quite a few baths in." Ben has been furnishing coffee and donuts — some 1,500 dozen a year — to the Matinee Theater cast and crew for almost three years now and to the rest of NBC's Burbank color studios for five years. He has practically, but not officially, become a member of the NBC organization.

Ben receives daily schedules in advance so that he will know how much coffee, donuts and sandwiches to have in stock when he drives his truck onto the NBC lot. He arrives daily at 5:30 a.m. and dispenses them all day.

"Since I stumbled onto the NBC lot five years ago," Ben explained, "I have given up the rest of my catering route. Business here has been good — so good that last year I was able to buy a new, fully equipped truck."

The idiosyncrasies of the cast and crew are well known to Ben and he reported that "one director will not allow his cast to have anything but soup before the show" and that the program's creator, Albert McCleery, always has

apple juice or milk in the morning. Ben also said that although most of the show's members fall into a habit of ordering the same thing, John Conte "makes it a habit never to order the same thing two days in a row."

Since Matinee Theater's debut on October 31, 1955 more than 650 programs have been presented — and at 500 cups a program, that's a lot of coffee — in black and white or living color.

The Rock and Roll Story

A YOUNG man (28) in Philadelphia has racked up an impressive Trendex and an impressive salary with a rack of popular records and a room full of dancing teenagers. Dick Clark's every week-day American Bandstand on the ABC-TV network has nearly equaled the combined ratings of the two rival networks and his Saturday night show has doubled ABC-TV's rating for that time period. The show pulls some 8,000,000 viewers (half of them adults) daily and from 20,000 to 45,000 fan letters weekly.

Band Stand Formula

His programming "formula" is simple. He puts it this way. "Basically, we try to give the kids the stars they'd be

most interested in meeting. This means Billy Williams, the Chordettes, Sunny Gale and the other top names, but it also means people like young Connie Francis, the Shirelles and others whose records are just starting to take nicks out of the bottom of the top-tune lists. We book the music and talent with the audience in mind. We'd be out of our minds to work any other way."

Dick's "formula" raises a question: Does a record become a hit because it is played on the air or is it played on the air because it is listed among the "top forty?"

That question can be likened to the age-old query: "Which came first, the chicken or the egg?" No one yet has come up with a completely satisfactory answer to either one. But everyone in the record business, including artists, manufacturers and distributors, does agree that a hit is made by teenagers, like those who appear on American Bandstand. It has been asserted that 87 percent of the single (predominantly rock 'n roll) recordings sold are bought by youngsters in the 8 to 14 age bracket. Because this is so — and apparently there is no argument with the statistics — the men who make their living producing or presenting recorded music have widely divergent opinions on the subject.

One of the most vehement spokesmen in the anti-rock 'n roll division of the music business is Mitch Miller, musical director for Columbia Records. Another gentleman, who is neither enthusiastically for nor against rock 'n roll but who frankly admits that he looks for hits, is Dick Peirce an A&R man (Artist and Repertoire) at RCA Victor. As an A&R man, Mr. Peirce has the duty of finding material for many artists under contract to RCA Victor.

What Makes A Hit?

"When selecting material aimed primarily at the highly competitive teenage

market," Mr. Peirce said, "I first look for a good melody with a strong beat. Lyrics, I feel, are secondary because a record is an 'impulse' purchase, and it's the melody that first catches the ear. I think that a song must have a 'pulsation' and a melody line with strong repetition. The public (teenagers and young adults) is buying 'sound', it seems, so I look for songs that are constructed in such a way that we can add electronic tricks to get a 'selling sound.' For instance, a current 'sound' that is selling is the echo and the Latin influence. Maybe it's because the kids are all bongo crazy."

For every rule there is an exception — in this particular case it's Johnny Mathis whose phenomenal popularity has put him in great demand for television guest appearances. He has appeared on such top shows as the Perry Como Show, the Ed Sullivan Show, the Steve Allen Show, Patti Page's Big Record and a host of others. His hits — presumably purchased by teenagers and young adults — tend to be more sweet than upbeat. Among his hits are "Wonderful! Wonderful!," "It's Not For Me To Say," "Chances Are," "Twelfth of Never," "Wild Is The Wind" and "No Love."

Following up on the fact that teenagers make the hits, Columbia Records' Mitch Miller took objection to the "top forty" type of programming when he spoke at the National Convention of Disc Jockeys in Kansas City, Mo., recently. He told the station representatives that they had "abdicated (their) programming to the corner record shop; to the 8-to-14-year-olds; to the pre-shave crowd that makes up twelve percent of the country's population and zero percent of its buying power. I know that most of you agree with me that much of the juvenile stuff pumped over the air waves these days hardly qualifies as music. But your standard answer is — 'We're not here to educate. We're here to give them what they want.' What who wants? Certainly not the 75 per-

cent of the nation's over 14-year-olds."

Several local Los Angeles stations have accepted — and have implemented — Mr. Miller's line of thought. A typical example is KPOL. Bob Scott, program director of that station, replied thoughtfully to TV-Radio Life's question: "Why doesn't KPOL program rock 'n roll?"

"There is unquestionably an audience for rock 'n roll. Evidence of this is the success of five or six Los Angeles stations devoting virtually all programming to this type music. But there is also a strong demand for the great standards and show tunes. To play rock 'n roll would surely cost us as many listeners as it would gain. And the loss would be in adults while the gain would be in children."

Both Sides Told

On the other side of the fence — and there are always two sides to every story — Robert M. Purcell, president and general manager of KFWB, answered TV-Radio Life's request to comment on the "top forty formula" in the following manner.

"Formula radio," Mr. Purcell stated, "is a misnomer. All radio is formula, it has a basic recipe of 12, 18, or 24 hours a day. Each radio station does certain things during each one of these hours and during the minutes contained in each hour. Our music policy is limited only insofar as playing the songs and artists' performances that are the most popular with the greatest segment of people."

Based on the tabulation of record sales, the music most wanted by the largest segment of people seems to be predominantly rock 'n roll. Cash Box Magazine, the bible of the recording industry, reported these as the ten top tunes of 1957.

1. All Shook Up, Elvis Presley
2. Love Letters in the Sand, Pat Boone
3. Little Darling, The Diamonds
4. Young Love, Tab Hunter
5. So Rare, Jimmy Dorsey

6. Don't Forbid Me, Pat Boone
7. Singing The Blues, Guy Mitchell
8. Young Love, Dean Jones
9. Too Much, Elvis Presley
10. Round and Round, Perry Como

That was 1957 — this year saw two more young vocalists step into the limelight: Andy Williams and Jimmie Rodgers. Steve Allen's Tonight show gave Andy his big boost. Steve gave Andy free reign in his choice of songs and also gave him the opportunity to branch out into acting and comedy by having him appear in the show's sketches. Andy's hits include "Canadian Sunset," "Baby Doll," "Butterfly" and "I Like Your Kind of Love."

After five years of hard work, "Honeycomb" made Jimmie Rodgers a star overnight. Before auditioning for and being signed by Roulette Records, Jimmie worked in clubs both in his native state of Washington and in Nashville, Tenn., where he was stationed as a member of the Air Force. His other hits include, "Oh Oh, I'm Falling In Love Again," "The Long Hot Summer" and "Kisses Sweeter Than Wine."

Commenting further on the subject of "top forty" radio programming, KFWB personality Bruce Hayes reported that "Formula" stations play records that have sold in record stores. And this, according to some other stations, is 'dirty pool.' For some reason, they contend, Mr. and Mrs. America have poor taste in music, and it is up to such an important medium of entertainment as radio to reshape the tastes of John Q."

There has been — and still is — some question in the minds of management and viewer-listeners alike that disc jockeys and hosts of TV rock 'n roll fare may not even like the music they present to the public.

Final Rebuttal

In rebuttal to this charge, Dick Clark may well have been speaking for a great many of Southern California's disc jockeys. "The rock," he said, "is here to

stay. It may even be the second native American form of music — jazz being the first. Personally, I like music, all the way from the longest hair to the shortest. I don't care too much for opera, but I think that's because I don't understand it; I enjoy the music without the words. You know, 'good' music is largely music written by dead 'pops' composers. But if you get it up on too high a pedestal, people stop listening to it and start respecting it. Mozart wasn't working for the ages or for immortality or anything like that — he was writing for an active, enthusiastic audience.

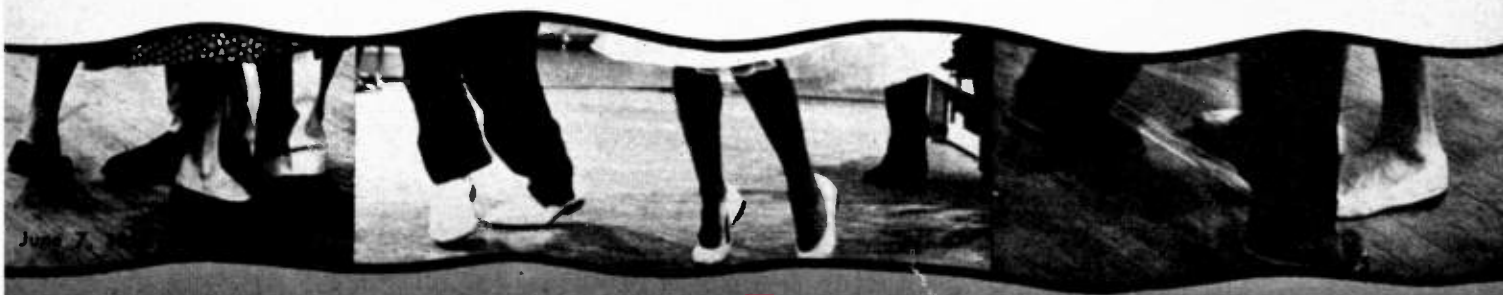
"No, I am not comparing the rock to Mozart; nor would I compare apples to bananas. But I eat both; so do you. Certainly the rock has the most active, enthusiastic audience in history and, despite the hopes of uncomprehending adults, it is here to stay. Rock 'n roll in some form — possibly a more restrained one — will be with us from now on. It's been big for five years now and no mere fad has ever lasted that long."

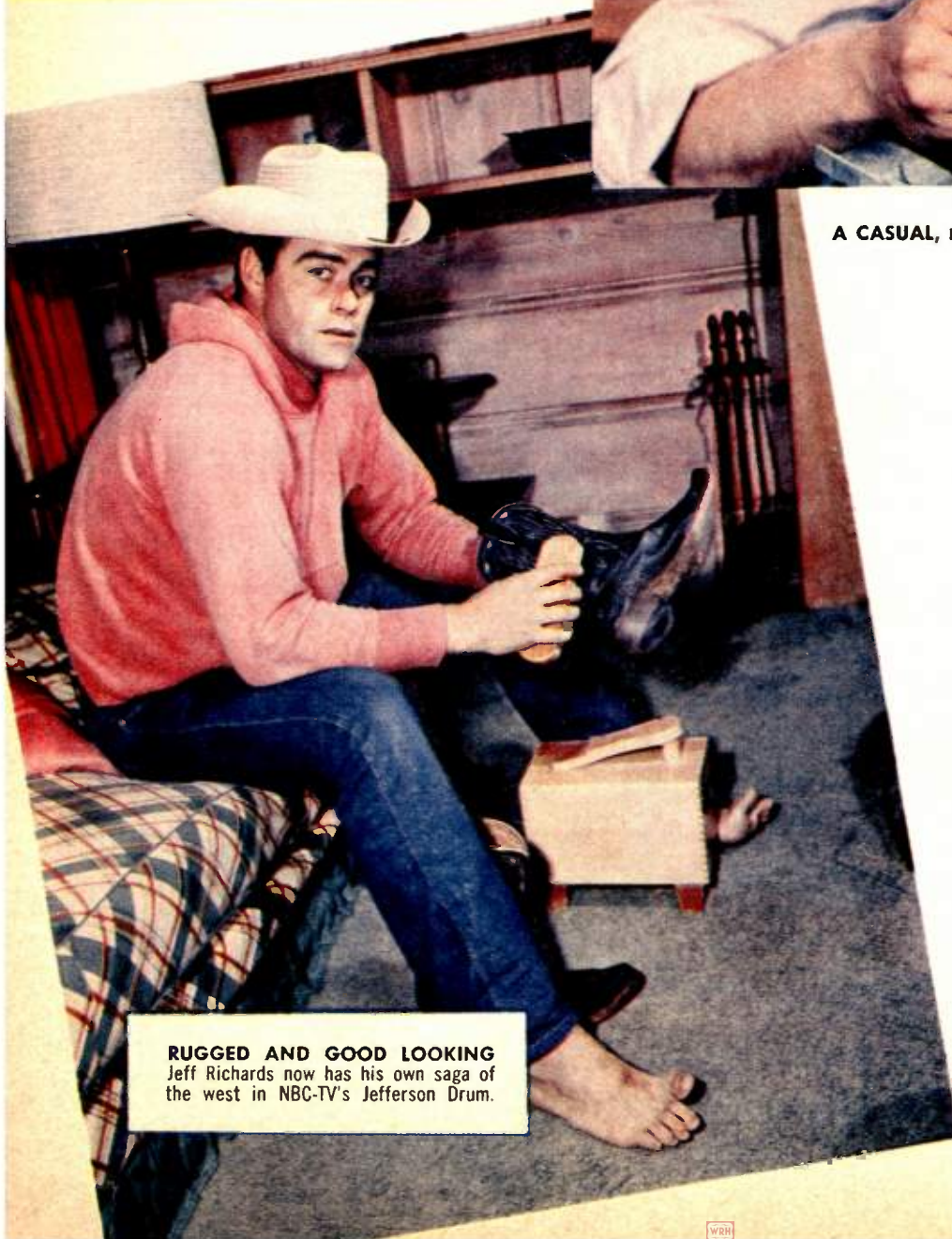


Meet Jefferson Drum

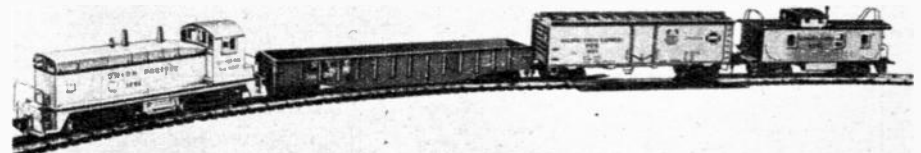

easterner. It's just that type isn't so strong there. My first role in Hollywood was in *Matinee Theater* — and I have also done a pilot film called *Sorority Mother*. Incidentally," she laughed, "I don't like sororities."

"I sincerely hope live TV isn't on its way out although it looks that way. It gives actors more of a chance. Film TV is too concerned with names."

Nancy is at present unattached but dates a good deal. She has a slight English accent which comes from, as she says, "Going to stuffy schools." She is, altogether, a good bet.

Also talked with Rex Allen whose *Frontier Doctor* is still on KTTV. He is now negotiating for another series — a western.

"What else would I do?" Rex asked. "You can't kick success around. Since I'm putting my own money into my next venture I would be silly not to stick with a sure thing — and westerns are a strong guarantee as far as I can see."

"I'm also doing more records — a folk song album and one featuring hymns. The other album I did with Victor Young called 'Under Western Skies' is fortunately still selling well."

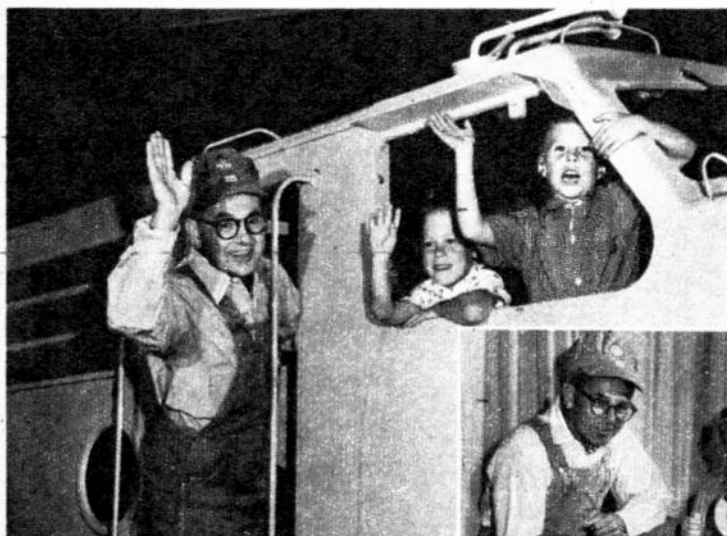

"Cyrano De Bergerac." The usual practice of the motion picture industry is to swathe some mediocre subject in color and pageantry in a effort to make it more impressive, but in this case, a poetic work which fairly cries for such treatment is given a cut rate, even tawdry production. It's only my opinion, you understand and a group of Ferrer's acting compatriot's thought otherwise, but I think a rounded performance of **Cyrano** calls for more than a long nose and well enunciated delivery of the dialogue. **Mala Powers**, as **Roxanne**, and **William Prince**, as **Christian**, fare no better and as an old romantic, I protest such summary rendition of this classic. However, its black and white color and intimate sets should come across fairly well on the TV screen, so what am I beefing about?

"Life of Emile Zola." (5) June 8, 7:30. 1937. Ah, they knew how to do these things in the old days, with magnitude and emotion. This biographical foray stars **Paul Muni** in a wonderful characterization of the old lion of French letters who came out of a useless retirement to lead the fight for the vindication of **Dreyfuss**, the career soldier wrongly convicted of treason. **Joseph Schildkraut** won an Oscar for best supporting performance in this role and while he, too, has faultless diction, he invested the character with more than a little humanity. A fine picture.

"George White's Scandals." (9) Beginning June 9, 9:00. 1945. This thing, and it's going to occupy two and a half hours of prime time on **KHJ-TV** every night for a week, is a dull mish-mash about backstage at the Scandals, a group of aging chorus cutes, and a comedy romance between **Joan Davis** and **Jack Haley**. Produced by **George White**, who had better luck on Broadway.

"Riptide." (11) June 8, 9:00. 1934. **Norma Shearer** can't get her husband to believe that her involvement in a drinking party with **Robert Montgomery** was entirely innocent, so she decides to verify the suspicion by really misbehaving. There follows a reconciliation with hubby that lasts until he learns about her latest escapade and they break up again and then they get together again and it's not a bad picture, really, by early thirties standards. With **Herbert Marshall** and it's concerned with just one thing . . . love and marriage. Or is that two things?

"Fair Wind To Java." (4) June 8, 10:30. 1953. **Fred MacMurray** has done it again. He goes off looking for sunken treasure and is temporarily thwarted by a modern day pirate. As if that isn't bad enough, he meets **Vera Hruba Ralston**.

"The Thin Man." (11) June 9, 10:40. The first of five "Thin Man" movies to be shown on **KTTV** this week Check the logs if you liked these. I did.

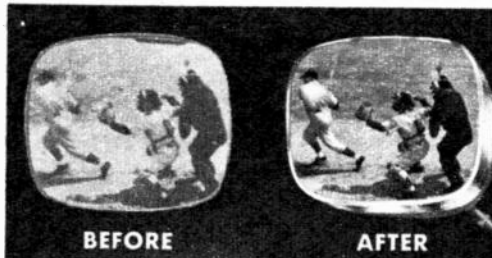

The 1958 major league baseball season is at the one-quarter mark, so this seems like a good time to re-evaluate the teams in both leagues.

The American League is holding true to form. The Yankees are having a much easier time than I had figured. 

KFOX Scores Scoop; Raids Gambling Den


Law enforcement agencies rolled into action last week following an unprecedented raid by KFOX news reporters on a Huntington Beach gambling den. Six KFOX reporters converged on the cafe under the direction of news manager Pat Michaels. They used pocket-sized transistor receivers and minute tape recorders to gain solid evidence of illegal gambling operations and possible police corruption.

After a two-hour stint of gaining evidence inside the establishment, KFOX then contacted Huntington Beach police and made a formal complaint. No police car was dispatched to the scene. KFOX then began broadcasting eye-witness accounts of the raid by their reporters and awaited the arrival of the police. Despite the late hour more than 200 listeners arrived at the cafe to witness the excitement and await the officers. But they did not show up. Some of the listeners stomped irately to the police station to demand that a car be sent to the scene. Others hooted and jeered patrol cars.

The next day police denied they had ever received calls from KFOX reporters. However Michaels proved that the calls had been received. He said the telephone call had been recorded through use of a beeper telephone. The recorded telephone call was subsequently played on the air several times.

Mayor Barl Irby of Huntington Beach and Police Commissioner Roy D. Bryant immediately called for a full-scale investigation of the town's police department. Orange County district attorney, Kenneth Williams, also began gathering evidence and was given duplicates of the KFOX tapes. Office of the State's Attorney General also has received duplicate copies of the gambling evidence for possible use by that office. State Board of Equalization announced that it will immediately begin proceedings to revoke the liquor license of the Huntington Beach gambling den.

The raid on the gambling den was handled by Michaels, two "under-cover" reporters, and KFOX news staffers Ron Castle, Penny Olsen and Darrell Druyer. Michaels said ground work for the raid was laid over a week-long period, and even members of the staff did not know the location until the last minute.

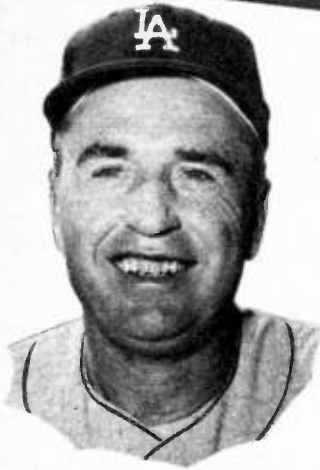

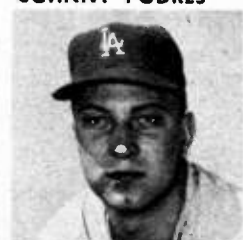

The Teen-Age Rage

THE BIGGEST—and to teenagers the best — noise that has hit our town along deejay row for many a moon is KABC's Don MacKinnon.

One thing is for sure. Daring Don is different. Once you've heard his program, which features "his flat little friends, the records," you will not get it mixed up with any other deejay program. That's exactly the method behind MacKinnon's madness.

"I try to do what other people won't do. There's no room on radio for cornballs, anymore.

"A lot of people think I entertain just for the teenagers. They're an important part of my audience — especially now that I'm on in the afternoon — but I really try to entertain everyone.

"I satirize everything and everyone I can. Sometimes I step on a few toes, but never intentionally.

"I remember one time," Don laughs, "when I kept giving the wrong time on the air. I thought it was funny. But the station didn't. So I had to cut it out."

Brief Bio

On the personal side, Don is still a young man in the radio racket. Born in Yonkers, New York, on Jan. 2, 1933, he attended grammar school in nearby Mount Vernon, New York, and then his family moved to Des Moines, Iowa, where he finished high school. Next came a 3½-year hitch in the Navy during the Korean War.

After his discharge, Don attended Drake University in Des Moines. Married now, and expecting a child, the lean, six-footer had a tough row to hoe financially. To bolster the family income, he got a job as a staff announcer with KWDM. Within four months, he was hired by the competing station in Des

Moines, KIOA — where he blossomed as a deejay — and where John Pace of KABC first heard him.

When Pace took over the reins at KABC, he hired a whole new staff of deejays to tie-in with his new Top Forty tunes program. MacKinnon — only a professional deejay for a year and a half — was one of them.

Listeners to KABC will note that Don keeps his program fast and unorthodox. For example, at the time the Sputniks and Explorers were making headlines nearly every minute, the KABC news department, quite legitimately, was constantly interrupting Don's program. The news flashes took up so much time on his show that Don, in a very serious tone, finally announced:

"Ladies and gentlemen, I'd like to interrupt this program of news bulletins to play for you this very important record!"

Then, as Don recalls it, he put on some real stinkeroo. As a regular feature of his program, MacKinnon also picks one record as "The Flop of the Week." After a loud, boisterous and suitable opening, Don plays the record which he thinks is pretty bad.

Wants Criticism

"Actually," Don says, "when I first used this gimmick, most of the record companies were afraid of it. But now they actually bring me records and ask me to play it as 'The Flop of the Week.' Can you imagine that! I guess they figure it's a good showcase and does a

record more good than harm. Of course, I've made mistakes. Once I picked 'Tequila' as a flop; it became a sensational seller. I'm not really concerned, however, about the popularity of the records. I just want the feature itself to be entertaining."

In person, the spectacled, brown-haired, brown-eyed deejay is conservative in speech, dress and manners and not nearly as wacky and eccentric as he might sound on the radio.

"I play mostly rock and roll because it happens to be the fad of our times. I'm not going to say I'm against it, because no one has any way of knowing what will be popular tomorrow.

"A lot of people ask me what goal I really have in life. I don't have any. I just let things happen.

"I love criticism of my show, whether it's good or bad, because I want to learn. I also understand quite a few people around town have been stealing some of my material. I don't mind that either. In fact, I consider it a compliment.

"A lot of people tell me that I'm too silly on the air. That so much of it has no ending; that it's just bits of information which I pick up from anything I can get my hands on. And incidentally, that's exactly how I do get most of my material — from any newspaper, or magazine, or box tops, or anything else I see around.

"They say all my material is nonsensical. But so's life. So what does that prove?"

He Bulldozed To Stardom

contract. His love scenes with Diane Varsi were so hot the celluloid sizzled and the studio started beating the drums. Stu created the same volcanic impression when he played some searing scenes with Dorothy Dandridge in MGM's "Infamy at Sea."

With all that has happened to him, Stu still likes to recall some of his experiences as a bulldozer. He gets behind the "cat" every once in a while even now to work on the 200 acres in Benedict Canyon that he and his father, who is only 19 years older than Stu, own and are subdividing.

"Once a friend of mine wanted me to get rid of 1800 orange trees—and offered me a dollar a tree," Stu told me with a grin. "I took the 'cat' down, did the job and started to burn the trees, but suddenly the fire department and the police descended on me and said I couldn't do this because I'd be creating more smog. I didn't know what to do with the blasted trees so I finally got Ziv to loan me a wind machine. I took it out to the place, lit one tree at a time, turned on the machine, and watched the smoke—blow out of sight.

"This bulldozing, as rough as it was, enabled me to keep trying as an actor. It also taught me about construction. My wife, Patricia, wanted us to have a house—as did I—and so I built one for us with my Dad's help! I might've had some pressure to bear if I weren't making enough money on this job to take care of us. We're now trying to find a larger place."

Stu and Patricia have four children—Anthony Joseph, 4, Michael Arthur, 3, Linda LaLonde, 18 months and Scott Lance, the new baby.

They live near the beach and Stu and the boys swim in the ocean every day the year around. Pat prefers to be less athletic.

The beach is a prophetic setting for Stu. He and Pat met six years ago one day at an outing at State Beach.

"I liked the way she looked in a bathing-suit," Stu grinned, "so we began dating. But in the winter we'd sort of see each other less. This went on for four years. Pat got engaged to an Air Force pilot and then one October it happened—we eloped. Nobody but us was very happy about that turn of events.

"She's been a great wife to me, though, a wonderful wife. When I began doing those hot romantic scenes in '10 North Frederick' and 'Infamy at Sea' I thought I'd better talk to Pat about them. I told her what was happening.

"Do you mind?" I asked her. "You know what you're doing," she said. "You just bring home the pay check—that's all that matters."

"That's what I call an understanding wife," Stu added with a grin.

STUART WHITMAN used to operate a bulldozer to pay the grocery bills for his wife and children. He still runs the "cat" but not because he has to earn the money.

Success has now settled pleasantly on his doorstep.

The rugged, romantic, and highly talented young man of 29 is one of the really exciting new stars today. Already 20th Century Fox has pacted him to a long-term, TV companies are begging him to do series for them, and, in short, he's so much in demand he couldn't possibly begin to fill all the requests. All this has happened in just a few short months.

The story of Stu Whitman really began when he saw his first stage play at five. To this day he remembers how he felt then—that feeling of amazement and wonder at seeing people on stage acting.

"From that time on I used to get so excited when I went to a movie or to a play my heart would pound like a drum," Stu reminisced. "I guess that was the start of my present career, although I got kind of sidetracked in college. I studied law but gave it up after two years to devote my time to acting. My Dad was really mad at me for that. He even turned me out of the house with a parting crack, 'You say you want to be an actor! What you really want to be is a bum!'

"When I married Patricia LaLonde, her parents had pretty much the same idea about my career. They didn't speak to me until we had had two babies. I guess they thought I was a steadier prospect by then. At least, now they are much happier with me—and my Dad is so pleased with the way things are going for me you'd think he was my press agent.

"Everybody wanted to get in the act, though. My uncle thought I'd be a good fighter. During the war—I wasn't old enough to get in service until 1945—I organized a fight team and we'd do bouts on three day furloughs. I loved

the sport and my uncle began to train me. When my Dad found out about this he was so mad he and my uncle didn't speak for five years—and then it was at my uncle's death bed."

Fighting wasn't the only sport Stu was interested in. He also loved football and played at L.A. City College. However, in one game he banged up his knee. In the remaining seven games he was given three shots of novocain in the knee before going into the fray so he could play. When the novocain wore off, it was murder for him!

Stu still recalls his early days as a struggling actor. He'd take what bulldozing jobs he could get, and then he'd often have two or three interviews at the studios in a day.

"I'd leave the job, rush down to the gas station where I'd parked my good clothes, wash, get dressed, and go to the studio," Stu said. "This happened often for six years—and it was no picnic, believe me!"

But he was used to the no-breaks business. Ever since he had returned to his native California in a road show company of "Here Comes Mr. Jordan," he had been knocking his brains out against studio walls. He was seen in that play by Sophie Rosenstein, who was then head of talent at Universal-International. She got the studio to sign him. But she died two weeks later and he was there nine months without doing a thing.

"They wanted to call me Kip and decided I should change my walk and pluck my eyebrows," he said with disgust. "That did it as far as I was concerned."

After getting a few parts here and there Stu started to move when Henry Kessler of Ziv gave him the part of a fighter in the Dr. Christian pilot. Stu was so great in it that Ziv kept him busy for over a year. And then came lead roles in other series and important parts in motion pictures. But the bonanza really arrived when 20th Century-Fox tested him for "10 North Frederick" and not only gave him the part but a

"Sugartime"

MADE THEM BIG TIME

SIX YEARS ago, nobody heard of the McGuire Sisters—except the neighbors around Middletown, Ohio. After the night of December 1, 1952—when they took top honors on Arthur Godfrey's show and were subsequently hired as a permanent part of Arthur's gang—they were seen and heard from coast-to-coast.

Oddly enough, however, it's only been during the past six months that the McGuire Sisters have become really Big Business in the world of Show Business. A lot of different factors have caused this great burst of popularity—but if one turning point had to be singled out it would have to be their recording of "Sugartime."

Prior to the release of "Sugartime" they had recorded quite a few solid hits for Coral, including "Goodnight Sweetheart, Goodnight," "Muskrat Ramble," "Something's Gotta Give," "Sincerely," "He," "Picnic," and "Goodnight My Love." But it was "Sugartime" that put them in the big time for the simple reason that this particular record was a tremendous favorite with the teenagers.

It is generally acknowledged today in the record business that teenagers make or break a song. If the youngsters buy a record, and "take it up" among their friends, that's all that's needed to make it a financial success. The McGuire Sisters, judging from previous hits, had a nice, solid substantial following among the teenagers. However, with "Sugartime" they really hit the jackpot.

"Sugartime" hit the million mark. Both Life and Look magazines featured the McGuire Sisters on their covers. And their manager, Murray Kane, revealed in an exclusive TV-Radio Life interview (arranged when the McGuire Sisters flew in for a surprise appearance on The Dinah Shore Show at NBC-TV), that the famous sisters were now "ready for their own TV show."

"Their own TV show is something the girls have always dreamed of," Kane said. "We could have had a show before. But I didn't want it. I felt the time wasn't right."

"In our business, there is a time when you can do your own show. And there is a time when you shouldn't do it. Too many stars have picked the wrong time, and have burned themselves up in 13 or 26 weeks. Others have been more fortunate and have lasted much longer."

"Of course, you have to have talent. But talent is not always enough. As I said, you have to know the right time—and for the McGuire Sisters, the time is now!" Kane concluded.

Coming to Cocoanut Grove

The time element and their tremendous current popularity are not the only reasons the McGuire Sisters are "ready." Professionally, they are now polished enough so they can be strictly on their own. The poise and experience have come about mainly because of their successful night club act. The same act which Southern Californians will be able to see in person when the McGuire Sisters open next month at the Cocoanut Grove on July 3.

Unlike many of Godfrey's gang (Julius LaRosa, Marion Marlowe, Frank Parker, and a legion of others who were fired by the outspoken redhead) the McGuire Sisters have had Godfrey's blessings and encouragement in their rise to fame. Godfrey has always played "father" to the three sisters—even to the point of meddling in their private lives. The most famous case being the time he broke up a possible romance between Dorothy McGuire and Julius LaRosa.

What About Future?

Godfrey allowed the girls to play in night clubs, make records, and even per-

sonal appearances on other shows—and still welcomed them back on his own whenever their schedule permitted. This is the kind of privilege that Godfrey has seldom, if ever, granted as graciously to other members of his cast.

Because of their perfect vocal blending, it is hard to tell which sister sings which part. Actually, it is Phyllis who carries the lead; Dottie the middle voice; and Chris the second alto. (Whenever they perform, Phyllis is in the middle, with Dorothy on the left and Christine on her right.)

Vocally, the girls are quite equal. But maternally, Christine (the only one currently married) is two up, both boys, on her divorced sisters.

Each of the girls readily admits she could give up singing and concentrate on being a housewife and mother. But for the present, they are going to continue their careers.

This news makes their millions of fans happy—and one man in particular: their manager, Murray Kane, who has guided the destinies of the girls ever since 1951.

"Sure the girls could quit. Anytime they want to. But I'd rather not think about that," Kane philosophizes.

And who can blame him? Nobody likes to think about losing a million dollar's worth of business.
