rue or False: Kix Brook and Ronnie Dunn didn't grow up playing in a band together, nor were they friends before they were introduced as potential songwriting collaborators and possible duet partners.

Hard to believe, but the answer is true. Though this dynamic country duo may sound like they grew up next door to each other, each thriving off of the other's music, the truth of the matter is they grew up miles apart (geographically) but just a short distance apart in musical tastes. Both were focused on

solo singing and songwriting careers when they met. Five years later, the two have formed an alliance stronger even than blood brothers might claim, and their musical success has garnered them and their label Arista/Nashville 12 million in album sales and more than 20 major industry awards.

"Togetherness is the key to Brooks & Dunn's success", says a writer for Entertainment Weekly. Whether they're putting on a high energy show, co-writing songs in the recording studio, or jammed inside the bus . . . their appeal stems from

the way they mix style. The music is part lonesome hearted country, part stomping rock and roll.

At a Brooks & Dunn concert, it's easy to see why, in 1994 and 1995, the duo was one of the top five highest-grossing live acts on the country music scene. The two combine the back roads rowdiness and lighthearted intimacy of a sawdust floor roadhouse with the hi-tech visuals of state-of-the-art coliseum rock. While the show is definitely a production, what really drives it is the individual personalities of the two performers. Brooks is the rockin' one who gets the adrenaline pumping, bounding all over the stage and sometimes into the audience, jamming on his guitar and delivering his songs with soul and raw honesty, whether they be uptempo and rowdy or slow and steady. Dunn is the quieter one, wringing emotion from every note of his ballads and drawing the audience into the very heart of the story.

Brooks & Dunn plan to be around for many years to come, and the reason is obvious to all who know them or have seen their show: Kix Brooks and Ronnie Dunn love what they do. And what they do is stand right out there on the edge, delivering songs that will always be a step ahead of the other guys.

HOST FAITH HILL

here is no little irony in the fact that the little girl from Star, Mississippi is now a star in her own right —
Faith Hill established her place in country music with the 1993 release of her Warner Bros. debut album, Take Me As I Am. Since that time, she has been blessed with the kind of vision and artistic voice that has allowed her to join the ranks of country music artists who continue to carry country music forward.

That debut release garnered the young singer the number of fans it takes to sell platinum and have three number one singles. Those fans came to the young singer because they were able to communicate with her and find truth and a lack of pretense in her presentation.

Faith's latest release, It Matters To Me, co-produced with her fiance Scott Hendricks, is a statement of purpose. From the assertive opening of "Someone Else's Dream" to the closing gospel-flavored "Keep Walkin'", the album conveys the conviction of an artist with something to say.

"Alot of the songs I perform in person and on the album deal with communication", Faith acknowledges. "Communication is one of the most important things in life. In communicating you are finding yourself and becoming more comfortable with who you are. That is how I like to live my life, period. That is how I want my relationship with my family, or anybody that is a part of my life, to be."

"It amazes me when I perform a song in one of my shows that peo-


ple really do listen to the words", the songstress muses. "When it's a story song and I receive a letter with the contents of the song in the letter, I know I have done the right thing by including this particular song on the record. It means someone has heard it who needed to hear it."

Faith continues her ability to communicate through her stage show.

She has been touring extensively in

support of It Matters To Me, and she welcomes the opportunity to be out there meeting her fans and performing her music for them.

There's no doubt — Faith Hill is living up to the name of the town which she left to start her journey as a mainstay within the country music industry. Star, Mississippi must be proud of their very own star.

February 7—Bill Boyd, Executive Director of the ACM, died at his home in Burbank, California of a massive heart attack... ACM again participated in the Country Radio Seminar held in Nashville in March... 30th Academy of Country Music Awards Presentation was held in May at the Universal Amphitheatre. In conjunction with the awards show, the Country Star Restaurant unveiled Bill Boyd's star... The ACM again sanctioned FanFest, this second fan driven event was held at the FairPlex in Pomona, CA... THE ACADEMY STORY

> he founding members of the Academy of Country Music were first and foremost fans of the music they proposed to promote. It was their love for the music and its people that moved them to establish the Academy in 1964. More than thirty years later, their motivation continues to drive the thousands of members of the organization to promote country music to all corners of the world, and in doing so to make it one of the most popular forms of music to listen to, buy and perform.

> In its early years, the Academy sought not only to interest the general public in the appeal of the music, but to demonstrate to other industries the value of using country music in its advertising, and its celebrities as spokespersons for its product.

Inside the industry itself, the Academy worked hard to educate and inform both the performers and the business people about what was going on within the trade. Panel discussions kept members abreast of changes in legislation that might affect their business; guest speakers at luncheons made members aware of new opportunities for the music in radio, television, motion pictures or touring.

In addition to addressing the business of country music, the Academy worked to help newcomers become better known to their peers and the general public. Showcases featuring new talent introduced these performers to others within the industry as well as to the media.

Publication of the monthly newsletter, Country Focus, keeps members abreast of personnel changes in the industry, news on up-and-coming acts, information about the industry in general and the Academy specifically.

The Academy continues these great traditions. Its involvement in the Country Radio Seminar in Nashville has kept the association at the forefront of what is going on in country radio today. Additionally, through its former involvement with sponsoring the Super Faces Show and current sponsorship of the New Artists Showcases, the Academy is continually connected to the heart of the music — the men and women who perform it. What better way to say thank you to country radio than to present concerts by Brooks & Dunn, Hank Williams Jr., The Judds, Alabama, George Strait, Garth Brooks and Reba McEntire? And how better to present the next generation of music than through performances by Steve Azar, Mandy Barnett, Paul Brandt, Junior Brown, 4 Runner, Marty Haggard, Frazier River, Marcus Hummon, Mark Luna, Jo Dee Messina, Rich McCready, Charlie Major, M.C. Potts, Great Plains and Rhonda Vincent?

StarFest, established in 1994, is one of the Academy's newest involvements. The country music fan festival, held in Pomona at the L A County Fairplex in the spring, brings together the current stars and the newcomers, along with the veterans in the country music business, to present four days of continuous entertainment for country music fans.

Research has always been a mainstay of the Academy. The recent "What's This Country All About?" in an overview of country music and its status in the business world today, further educated people about country music's viability in today's marketplace.

While the Academy has had continuous support from its members as



well as the community around it, it also understood that one of its obligations is to give support in return. In 1983 the association began sponsoring the Celebrity Golf Classic, which was a wonderful opportunity for the members of Los Angeles business community to mix and mingle with business leaders within the country music industry as well as its celebrities. Since its beginning, the Golf Classic has raised monies for charities which include the American Heart Association, M.D. Anderson Cancer Hospital in Houston, Texas, the T.J. Martell Foundation/Neil Bogart Memorial Laboratory for cancer, leukemia and AIDS research, the Shriners Children's Hospital and AMFAR.

The Academy first presented awards for musical achievements in 1965. First presented locally, in 1972, the show was syndicated to national television. Two years later ABC-TV picked up the telecast, and in 1979 the Academy associated itself with dick clark productions inc., necessi-

tating a move to NBC, where the 180minute awards show was given prime time status.

The Awards show is yet another opportunity for Academy members to network outside the country music community. Presenters of the shows' awards to recording artists, songwriters, publishers, producers, record companies, radio stations, disc jockeys, night clubs, talent promoters, musicians and other individuals have included Hollywood celebrities and television personalities.

Membership in the Academy includes a subscription to Country Focus, voting privileges for the annual awards and in the election of officers and board members, and the opportunity to network in an industry that is continually growing, expanding and improving.

While the board members and officers are given the task of overseeing the work of the Academy, numerous individual members volunteer for specific tasks throughout the year. Without their support and dedication, the Board and Officers would find it hard to carry out the many activities of the organization throughout the year. Therefore, the Board and Officers would like to take this opportunity to thank each member who has taken the time to make a special effort to help the Academy achieve its goals. Because of your continued support, we all work in an industry that is loved and respected throughout the world.

Country music will always represent the heartland — the men and women who, like yourselves, work hard every day and carry on the traditions of this great country. Welcome to the 31st Annual Academy of Country Music Awards Show, and thank you for being a part of this great country music industry.

Thirty-five teams, the largest field of golfers ever, began registering at 9 a.m. on a beautiful clear day to participate in the shotgun scrambles tournament.



onight we continue a tradition which began in 1965 when the very first Hat awards for country music achievement were given. Tonight's awards are being presented for excellence during the calendar year 1995 as voted by the members enrolled in the Academy of Country Music.

Balloting procedures for our awards have to be conducted in strict compliance with the organization's bylaws and rules of the network for a television special. In December, a Selections Committee was appointed by the Chairman of the Board and began the long and tedious task of selecting the preliminary nominees. Utilizing trade publications Billboard, Radio & Records, The Gavin Report, Performance, Amusement Business, along with information from the Recording Industry Association of America. Sound Scan and other research materials, the committee determines those most qualified for eligibility in the calendar year for which the awards are given.

After selections are made, each category is presented to the board, which can approve the committee's recommendations or discuss and vote on any motions regarding a change. Changes are voted on via a machine which tabulates the vote and insures each board member a confidential voice.

Once the slate of nominees is approved, ten (10) in each category with the exception of Top New Male, Top New Female and New Vocal Duet or Group, which have five (5) nominees each, the ballot is

prepared and given to the accounting firm of Call and Call. Under the supervision of Dwight V. Call, ballots are mailed to professional members whose membership is in good standing ninety (90) days prior to the show.

In accordance with the organization's by-laws, no company or organization is allowed to enroll, sponsor or have in its employ a number of members which exceeds ten (10) percent of the total membership of the Academy.

Record companies, depending on their status (gold or silver) are allowed either thirty (30) or ten (10) members per label.

Each member is furnished with voting instructions, a nominee listing, and return envelope, and is allowed to mark one (1) nominee in each category on the scantron ballot. If the nominee of their choice is not listed, the member may utilize the write-in page which is enclosed with the scantron ballot. In either case, each member is entitled to cast only one (1) vote per category.

Ballots and write-ins must be returned to the accounting firm by a specified date. Once verified, the ballots are removed from the ballot envelope to ensure a confidential vote. The scantron ballots and writeins are tabulated and the top five (5) nominees, three (3) in the newcomer categories, receiving the highest number of votes appear on the final ballot. Members are then asked to cast one (1) vote in each category and return this second and final ballot to the accounting firm prior to the deadline date specified. The returns are counted in secrecy and the results are delivered to the



awards telecast by Dwight V. Call. The results are made known for the first time when the envelopes are opened during the telecast and the winners announced.

Instrumentalist award winners are selected under the same voting guidelines Call and Call uses for the telecast awards with one exception. The initial ballot is mailed to members of the Academy who are enrolled in the Artist and Musician categories as the board feels these members are more knowledgeable and better qualified to nominate and cast votes that determine the winners of these awards. The initial ballots are blank and each eligible voting member is asked to make one (1) nomination for each of the following instruments: Bass, Fiddle, Guitar, Steel Guitar, Drums, Keyboard and Specialty Instrument.


These nomination ballots must be received by the accounting firm prior to a specified date and are tab-


ulated. The individuals receiving the greatest number of nominations (top three [3] and ties) appear on the final ballot. Each eligible member is mailed a final ballot and allowed to vote for one individual in each of the instrumental categories. Upon return, the ballots are counted by the accounting firm and the results are given to the Academy of Country Music, who notifies the winners and issues a press release approximately two (2) weeks prior to the telecast.

Balloting for Radio Station/Disc Jockey/Night Club and Talent Buyer/Promoter of the year is an entirely different process. The Board of Directors of the Academy calls upon the expertise of Artists/Entertainers, Managers and Talent Agents. These individuals will be asked to submit to the Board of Directors, on the First Ballot, one (1) nominee in each category who has been most influential in the field of country music. The ballots will then be tabulated by a committee

appointed by the Chairman of the Board and the three (3) nominees receiving the highest number of votes will appear on the Final Ballot, from which the winner will be determined. The recipients of these awards are notified, a press release is issued and the winners are announced to the industry.

The Video Award is a Board of Directors award and is voted upon by only the officers and members of the board. The Board Chairman appoints a committee which begins the selection process by viewing all videos submitted for consideration. The committee selects what they feel are the top videos. A compilation tape is made and sent to all members of the board along with a ballot. The directors vote for five (5) videos. the votes are tabulated and at the March board meeting a final vote is cast. The video receiving the largest number of votes is announced during the awards telecast.

While most of the rest of us have altered our appearance, a bit, we still share a common love for the




more highlights than my wildest dreams could have imagined. Our late night telecasts with ABC in the mid-seventies were the foundation for things to come.

TOP NEW FEMALE VOCALIST Same as Top New Male Vocalist.

TOP NEW VOCAL GROUP OR DUET

Same as Top New Male or Female Vocalist.

TOP MALE VOCALIST

This award is presented to country music's outstanding male vocalist who has achieved success and recognition via radio, records, television and stage performances for the preceding calendar year. Voted on by the membership of the Academy.

TOP FEMALE VOCALIST

Same as Male Vocalist.

TOP VOCAL DUET

This award goes to the country vocal duet composed of two members who have achieved success and recognition via radio, records, television and stage performances for the preceding calendar year. Voted on by the membership of the Academy.

TOP VOCAL GROUP

This award goes to the country vocal group composed of three or more members who have achieved success and recognition via radio, records, television and stage performances for the preceding calendar year. Voted on by the membership of the Academy.

This award goes to the most popular country album of the preceding calendar year. Voted on by the membership of the Academy. Re-released or reconstructed albums (such as "Greatest Hits") are ineligible. The award is given to the artist, producer and record label.

SONG OF THE YEAR

This award goes to the country song receiving initial fame and mass recognition during the preceding calendar year. Voted on by the membership of the Academy. The award is given to the composer(s), publisher(s), and artist.

SINGLE RECORD OF THE YEAR

This award goes to the most popular single record of the preceding calendar year. Voted on by membership of the Academy. The award is given to the artist, producer and record label.

ENTERTAINER OF THE YEAR

This award goes to the individual, duet or group who performs together regularly on television, stage, recordings, films, etc., and has contributed to the growth, acceptance and popularity of country music during the preceding calendar year. Voted on by membership of the Academy.

SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

This award is presented for unprecedented, unique and outstanding individual achievement in the field of country music during the preceding calendar year. Voted on by the board of directors. This award does not have to be given every year.

PIONEER AWARD

This award goes to an outstanding individual who has enhanced country music and contributed to its growth. The person receiving the award would be a pioneer in country and/or western music. Voted on by the Board of Directors of the Academy, the nominee receiving the greatest number of votes on a single ballot is honored.

JIM REEVES AWARD

This award goes to an individual, not necessarily a performing artist, for outstanding contributions to the acceptance of country music throughout the world during the preceding calendar year. Voted on by the Board of Directors. This award does not have to be given every year.

INSTRUMENTAL AWARDS

This award goes to individuals, selected by their peers, to be the very best at a particular instrument. The collective group of members — bass, drums, fiddle, guitar, steel guitar, keyboard and specialty instrument — would comprise the ultimate band. Voted on by members of the Academy enrolled in the Artist/ Entertainer and Musician categories.

RADIO STATION, DISC JOCKEY, NIGHT CLUB AND TALENT

BUYER/PROMOTER OF THE YEAR Winners of these awards are chosen by an entirely different process than the other awards given by the Academy. The Board of Directors of the Academy calls upon the expertise of Artists/Entertainers, Managers and Talent Agents, who are asked to submit to the Board of Directors on the first ballot one (1) nominee in each category who have been most influential in the field of country music. The ballots are then tabulated by a committee appointed by the Chairman of the Board. The three (3) nominees receiving the highest number of votes will appear on the final ballot, from which the winner will be determined.

VIDEO OF THE YEAR

This award is a Board of Directors award and is voted upon only by the officers and members of the board. It goes to the best video of the year with consideration given to production and performance.
