nfluenced by the Faith Hill single "Wild One," Sherrie Austin purchased a one-way ticket to Music City, leaving Los Angeles and a lucrative acting job as Pippa McKenna on NBC's "The Facts of Life" behind. The native Australian's first public performance was at age 13; a year later she opened for Johnny Cash on his 1985 tour "down under." She was named Best New Talent by the Country Music Association of Australia in 1998, and she returned to Australia for the first time in eight years to receive the award. She co-wrote seven of the songs on her debut album.

Someone told me the day I learned to open my heart would be the day I wrote great songs. When I got my heart broken, it was so scary to write it all down. But when I did, it was like being naked - or showing people my diary. It was more real and more powerful than anything I'd every written. Saying "this is how I feel" is a very powerful thing. It's what drew me to music and it's what set these songs apart." - Sherrie Austin

uch as Loretta Lynn spoke out for women in many of her songs, Martina speaks in the same manner with songs like "Independence Day," "A Broken Wing" and "My Baby Loves Me." The latter song brought letters from teen fans who wrote thanking her for the "love me for myself" message the song conveyed. Even early in her career she was presenting thought-provoking lyrics and videos with songs like "Cheap Whiskey," with its video carrying a strong message of don't drink and drive. Power ballads like "Valentine," recorded with pop pianist Jim Brickman, and "Still Holding On," a duet with Clint Black, showcase her vocal style.

I won't sing some of those lyrics that I hear on the charts. Some of it is so shallow. If that's what it takes to be number one, then I don't want to be there. At the end of the day, I want to look back and be happy with what I've sung. I don't ever want to have to listen to one of my albums and have any regrets. - Martina McBride



Terry McBride was traveling with Ronnie out on the road and they were using the time to write together for the next Brooks & Dunn CD. Terry heard Ronnie and I sing on stage at the end of our show and later got the idea for "If You See Him." When we all heard the song we couldn't wait to get into the studio to record it. It is such a powerful, emotional message, and one that so many of us can, unfortunately, relate to. - Reba McEntire

The opener and title track, collaboration with Brooks & Dunn, is a memorable, orchestral power ballad that features Reba's big vocals curling over every syllable. 
## Tim McGraw

rett and Brad Warren aren't afraid of hard work- they were full-time musicians before they were out of their teens, and by the early 90s they were averaging 300 shows a year. It was a fun life in their native Florida sleeping late, hitting the beach at noon and making good money playing clubs at night, but one day the two realized they wanted more. Their first Nashville gig in 1995 netted \$17; their bar tab totaled \$20. In two years, the brothers had created a buzz that brought out label execs to see them, and they signed with BNA and were in the studio with Chris Ferren by the end of 1997.

If I had to describe it I would say our music is rooted in the pure harmonies of the Everly Brother, the storytelling magic of Johnny Cash and Roger Miller and the heartlands soul of John Mellancamp and Tom Petty.





Wills isn't soon to forget those Buckborad roots, since he wears a necklace with his initials, MW, on it, given to him by a group of loyal fans the last night he played the Buckboard.

My whole deal is the music. I have to have fun with the crowd. The live stuff, it sets me free. It's that hour and a half where I get up there and don't have to worry about what's going on in my life or worry about getting home to this or that or going to cut the grass. That's my little bit of time. A lot of times, I get emotionally involved in the songs. 
"I'll never forget the first moment I heard this song," says Martina McBride. "We were in







# The The Academy Story

Thirty-four years after it was founded, the Academy of Country Music continues to promote country music around the world to both the business community and to country music fans. The success of the Academy has proven over and over again what its founders knew: country music has a broad appeal to a large number of people who support it by buying the records and attending the concerts.

Today that support has expanded to include the purchase of merchandise (T-shirts, jackets, caps, etc.), books, full-length videos and numerous other artist-related products. Our founders' early belief in the music and the people who perform it has helped to transform country music into a multi-billion dollar industry. Original members of the Academy also knew that country music could be integral in promoting products to consumers which businesses wanted to reach.

In addition to educating the business community, our organization works to educate the creators of the music and those who run labels, book the dates and write and/or publish the songs. Members are made aware of legislation that might affect them as well as of new opportunities for country music in radio, television, motion pictures and touring. Realizing that new artists are the industry's lifeblood, the Academy helps them become better known to their peers and the general public through showcases before the industry and the media.

The Academy has been a part of Country Radio Seminar in Nashville for many vears. Being at the seminar helps us to keep you informed about the trends in country radio today. Through its involvement with the Super Faces Show, the Academy has presented performances by Brooks & Dunn, Hank Williams, Jr., Alabama, The Judds, George Strait, Garth Brooks, Reba McEntire, Bryan White, Patty Loveless, John Michael Montgomery and Tim McGraw. We have

also sponsored new artist showcases and hosted a suite where members of our board and staff took the time to talk with registrants at the seminar.

The Academy of Country Music realizes the importance of giving something back to the community that supports our efforts. In 1983, we created the Celebrity Golf Classic to raise money for charity. The tournament also gives us the opportunity to bring business men and women in the Los Angeles area together with folks from the country music community. Charities benefiting from the tournament have included the American Heart Association and the M.D. Anderson Cancer Hospital in Houston, Texas. In 1995, the tournament became known as the Bill Boyd Celebrity Golf Classic, named for our late Executive Director, who had dedicated over 25 years to the ACM. That year, \$80,000 was raised for the T.J. Martell Foundation/Neil Bogart Memorial Laboratory for cancer, leukemia and AIDS research, the Shriners Children's Hospital and the Bill Boyd Memorial Trust Fund, Inc. The 1998 tournament raised in excess of \$100,000 for these same charities.

The Academy's first awards show presentation was in 1965. Broadcasts were local until 1972, when the show went into national television syndication. The telecast was then picked up by ABC-TV until 1979, when the Academy became associated with dick clark productions inc. This prompted a move to NBC, where the annual ACM awards telecast celebrated prime time status, becoming one of the most watched awards specials each year. In 1998, we launched a new partnership with CBS Television and in 1999 will be going into our second year with CBS.

One of the unique aspects of our show is that it offers an opportunity for all of us in the music industry to mingle with personalities from different areas of the entertainment field. Many of the presenters at our Awards Show are Hollywood celebrities and television personalities.

Being an Academy member gives us the privilege of voting for these awards as well as deciding who sits on the Academy board. Members receive a subscription to the Academy's monthly newsletter, "Country Focus," which keeps all of us informed of personnel changes in the industry, news on up-and-coming acts, information about the industry and the Academy. As members, we also have the opportunity to network within an exciting industry that continues to evolve and expand.



### Awards Criteria

he following are the official criteria and voting procedures used by the Academy of Country Music (ACM) to determine its annual award winners. The criteria and voting procedure was set forth by the Board of Directors of the ACM ('the Board'') in accordance with the by-laws and may be amended from time to time as the Board deems appropriate in the best interest of country music. Unless otherwise approved by the Board of Directors, the Selection Committee and Video Selection Committee shall be comprised of Directors, the President, the Vice President, the Executive Director, the Chairman of the Board and the Secretary of the ACM.

### THE ELIGIBILITY PERIOD FOR EACH AWARD IS SET FORTH IN THE CRITERIA BELOW:

Any disputes shall be resolved by the Chairman of the Board in accordance with Roberts Rules of Order.

#### 1. VOTING PROCEDURE

The voting procedure shall comply with all legal requirements and any requirements of any network airing the awards show. Disputes as to voting procedure shall be resolved by a majority of the Board.

#### A. COMMITTEE LEVEL

- 1. The Selection Committee and Video Selection Committee shall meet prior to the Board meeting and determine the slate of nominees to be presented to the Board.
- 2. The Committees shall consider all relevant material in arriving at their slate.
- 3. The Chairman of the Selections
  Committee and the Chairman of
  the Video Selection Committee
  shall determine the voting procedure at the selection committee
  meeting after first consulting with
  the Chairman of the Board, the
  President and the Executive
  Director. The Chairman of the
  Board shall resolve any disputes.

#### B. BOARDLEVEL

- The committees shall present their slate of nominees to the Board. The Committees may submit up to 10 nominees in each category, except Top New Male Vocalist, Top New Female Vocalist, Top New Group or Duo (collectively the "New Categories") where they may submit up to 7. By way of clarification, the Committees are not obligated to submit the maximum in any category.
- 2. At the Board meeting where nominees are considered, any board member may make a motion to add a nominee to any category. If seconded, the nomination is put to the Board for a vote. If a majority of the Board in attendance votes in favor of the motion, the nominee is added to the slate.
- 3. Once the nominations from the floor are completed, the Board will vote on each nominee. Each Board member shall vote for only 10 nominees in any category, except the New Categories, where they shall vote for only 7 nominees. The top 10 vote-getters constitute the final slate except New Categories where the top 7 constitute the final slate to be submitted to the membership for the first ballot.

4. The actual voting shall be by secret ballot, in writing or electronically, and the results shall remain confidential until duly announced by the ACM. The voting shall be monitored by an independent accounting firm and such other persons as determined by the Chairman of the Board.

#### C. MEMBERSHIP LEVEL

- 1. The first ballot shall be submitted to the membership. The top 5 vote-getters, plus ties, in each Category (except the New Categories where the top 3 vote-getters (plus ties) shall constitute the final nominees to be submitted to the membership on the second ballot. The Board shall set time limits for returning the first ballot.
- 2. The second ballot shall be submitted to the membership. The top vote- getter in each category shall constitute the winner. In the event of a tie, each nominee shall be declared a winner. The Board shall set time limits for returning the second ballot.
- 3. An independent accounting firm shall count ballots properly and timely returned.
- 4. Each member shall be required to sign his or her ballot.

## Awards Criteria



### ACM Awards Criteria

Revised by Board of Directors 5/97. Effective for Show 1998 (Formerly known as Explanation of Awards)

#### **ENTERTAINER OF THE YEAR**

This award is presented to the individual, duet or group who showed the most overall success in the country music industry during the prior calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, success of music videos, live concert ticket sales, artistic merit, appearances on television, appearances in films, songwriting, writing and contributions to the country music industry.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

#### TOP MALE VOCALIST

This award is presented to the most outstanding individual male vocalist in the country music industry during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

#### TOP FEMALE VOCALIST

This award is presented to the most outstanding individual female vocalist in the country music industry during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

#### TOP NEW MALE VOCALIST

This award is presented to the most outstanding individual male vocalist in the country music industry who gains either initial fame or significantly greater recognition through his efforts during the prior calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

Any male artist who has been a final nominee on a previous ACM ballot in this category is not eligible. Any male artist who has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in the Top New Male Vocalist category is not eligible.

Any male artist who has had a single record or album reach top 20 or better in any country music industry publication chart during the prior calendar year is eligible.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

### TOP NEW FEMALE VOCALIST

This award is presented to the most outstanding individual female vocalist in the country music industry who gains either initial fame or significantly greater recognition through her efforts during the prior calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

Any female artist who has been a final nominee on a previous ACM ballot in this category is not eligible. Any female artist who has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in the Top New Female Vocalist category is not eligible.

Any female artist who has had a single record or album reach top 20 or better in any country music industry publication chart during the prior calendar year is eligible.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

#### TOP NEW VOCAL DUO OR GROUP

This award is presented to the most outstanding duo featuring a vocalist or group featuring a vocalist (herein called "duo or group") in the country music industry who gains either initial fame or significantly greater recognition through their efforts during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performance.

Any duo or group who has been a final nominee on a previous ACM ballot in this category is not eligible. Any duo or group artist who has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in the Top New Vocal Duo or Group category is not eligible.

Any duo or group who has had a single record or album reach top 20 or better in any country music industry publication chart during the preceding calendar year is eligible.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

#### TOP VOCAL GROUP

This award is presented to the most outstanding group featuring at least one vocalist in the country music industry during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

### Awards Criteria

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

#### TOP VOCAL DUO

This award is presented to the most outstanding duo in the country music industry during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of records, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

In the event that the Board of Directors determines that there are not enough nominees in this category in any particular year, this category may be merged with the Top Vocal Group at the Board meeting and shall be called the Top Vocal Group or Duo.

#### SINGLE RECORD OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the artist, producer and record company of the most popular country music single record during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music embodying the single, and the impact of the single on consumers and the country music industry.

Any single commercially released prior to the preceding calendar year but achieving its highest charted position in any accepted country music industry publication chart during the preceding calendar year is eligible unless it has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in this category.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

#### EVENT RECORD OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the artist(s), producer(s) and record company of the most popular country music event single record during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music embodying the single and artistic merit of the single.

Any single commercially released prior to the preceding calendar year but achieving its highest charted position in any accepted country music industry publication chart during the preceding calendar year is eligible unless it has appeared on a previously published ACM hallot in this category.

To be eligible, the single must be a collaboration between two or more artists who do not normally perform together.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

#### ALBUM OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the artist(s), producer(s) and record company of the most popular country music album during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered include but are not limited to success of singles from the album at radio, sales of prerecorded music embodying the album and artistic merit of the album.

Any album commercially released prior to the preceding calendar year but achieving its highest charted position in any accepted country music industry publication chart during the calendar year is eligible unless it has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in this category.

Any album, which contains more than three (3) previously released selections, including but not limited to "best of" or "greatest hits" albums are not eligible. The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

#### SONG OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the songwriter(s), publisher(s) and artist performing the most popular country music song of the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered include but are not limited to the success of the song at radio, sales of prerecorded music embodying the song and the impact of the song on consumers and the country music industry.

Any song contained on a single commercially released prior to the preceding calendar year but achieving its highest charted position in any accepted country music industry publication chart during the preceding calendar year is eligible unless it has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in this category.

Any song, which has been a previous ACM song of the year winner, shall not be eligible.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.


#### VIDEO OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the producer, director and artist performing the most popular country music video during the prior calendar year. Emphasis shall be placed on creativity, production, visual appeal and impact on consumers and the country music industry. Other factors to consider include but are not limited to success of any single record for which the video was made at radio, sales of prerecorded music embodying the single record for which the video was made, and success on any accepted video chart in the country music industry (sales or performances).

Any country music video released prior to the preceding calendar year but which

achieves its highest charted position in any accepted country music industry publication chart during the preceding calendar year is eligible unless it has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in this category.

The nominees shall be selected by the Video Selections Committee. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

#### ARTIST OF THE DECADE

The nominees for this award are selected and voted on by the Academy Board of Directors. This award is presented to the artist who has made substantial contributions toward the exposure of country music during the decade.

#### SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Presented for unprecedented, unique and outstanding individual achievement in the field of country music during the preceding calendar year, voted by the Board of Directors. (THIS AWARD DOES NOT HAVE TO BE GIVEN EACH YEAR.)

#### CAREER ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

To an individual artist who has had fame in prior years - has made a substantial come -back in the preceding calendar year, voted by the Board of Directors. (THIS AWARD DOES NOT HAVE TO BE GIVEN EACH YEAR.)

#### JIM REEVES MEMORIAL AWARD

To an individual, not necessarily a performing artist, for outstanding contributions to the acceptance of country music throughout the world during the preceding calendar year, voted by the Board of Directors. (THIS AWARD DOES NOT HAVE TO BE GIVEN EACH YEAR.)

#### PIONEER AWARD "The Cliffie"

Outstanding "pioneer" in the field of country music. Individual receiving the highest number of votes by the Board of Directors on a single ballot will be so honored. (THIS AWARD DOES NOT HAVE TO BE GIVEN EACH YEAR)

#### TEX RITTER AWARD

(Motion Picture)

A movie released and/or receiving major exposure during the preceding calendar year, featuring or utilizing country music, voted by the Board of Directors. (THIS AWARD DOES NOT HAVE TO BE GIVEN EACH YEAR - can be voted by the Board or the membership - Board's decision as to voting procedure.)

#### MAE BOREN AXTON AWARD

\*Not a televised award

The Mac Boren Axton Award is given in recognition of years of dedication and service by an outstanding individual.

#### NIGHT CLUB / CASINO / TALENT BUYER & PROMOTER\*

The nominees for these awards are selected by a panel of Blue Ribbon Judges. They must have bought or promoted at least twenty (20) country concerts / dates during the calendar year of the award, be in good standing with all agents and help to promote country music ticket sales.

The winner will be notified two weeks in advance of the Academy of Country Music Awards Show.

#### DISC JOCKEY OF THE YEAR\*

This award is presented to the outstanding country music "on-air" radio personality of the year, selected by a panel of Blue Ribbon Judges in a two-ballot concept. In order to be considered for the award, an audiocassette composite demonstration tape of the Disc Jockey/personality's "on-air" presentation of a maximum length of ten (10) minutes, must be submitted to the ACM office along with a one-sheet (8-1/2 x 11) description of the radio station's best attributes including market share/ratings information for the calendar year of

the award; community involvement, public service, charitable contributions, etc.

All entries become the property of the ACM. A panel of Blue Ribbon Judges, approved by the Board of Directors, shall give consideration to ratings, public service, community involvement, entertainment and professionalism of the demo tape in determining the top ten (10) nominees for the first ballot. The winner from the previous year is ineligible to win the award for the current calendar year.

The winner will be notified two weeks in advance of the Academy of Country Music Awards Show.

#### RADIO STATION OF THE YEAR\*

This award is presented to the outstanding Radio Station in a two-hallot concept. The Radio Station will submit to the ACM office a (15) fifteen minute (maximum length) audiocassette composite demonstration tape of the station's on-air presentation and a (1) one-sheet (8-1/2 x 11) description of the radio station's best attributes, including any and all of the following: 1) Market share/ratings information for the calendar year of the award; 2) Community involvement, public service, charitable contributions, etc.

All entries become the property of the ACM. A panel of Blue Ribbon Judges, approved by the Board of Directors, shall give consideration to ratings, public service, community involvement, entertainment and professionals of the demo tape in determining the top ten (10) nominations for the first ballot. The winner from the previous year is ineligible to win the award for the current calendar year.

The winner will be notified two weeks in advance of the Academy of Country Music Awards show.

Bill Rains has been called "the first great sculptor to recognize the worth in preserving our American heritage in country music." Bill has merged his love for country music with his art in bronzes of Jim Reeves, Ernest Tubb, Elvis Presley, Buck Owens, and Hank Williams. In 1999, Bill will complete life-size bronzes of Keith Whitley and Hank Snow. For his contributions to country music Bill Rains has received honors from the states of Oklahoma, Tennessee, Texas and Montana. Bill's work in country music has been exhibited in galleries and museums throughout the United States. Bill has been commissioned to create sculpture gardens of country music's greatest legends for two new museums:

### THE ACADEMY OF COUNTRY MUSIC'S PIONEER AWARD STATUE DESIGNATED AS "THE CLIFFIE" IN HONOR OF CLIFFIE STONE

The Board of Directors of the Academy of Country Music has voted to designate the statue presented to the winner of it's annual Pioneer Award as "The Cliffie," in honor of the late Country Music legend Cliffie Stone, a previous recipient himself. The Award, which has been presented since 1969 to outstanding pioneers in the field of Country Music, will be presented on the 34th annual "Academy of Country Music Awards" special, airing May 5 on the CBS Television Network, bearing it's new nickname. The recipient of this Award is chosen by the Academy's Board of Directors.

Among previous recipients of the Award have been Roy Acuff, Eddy Arnold, Chet Atkins, Gene Autry, Johnny Cash, Roy Clark, Charlie Daniels, Tennessee Ernie Ford, Merle Haggard, George Jones, Loretta Lynn, Roger Miller, Patsy Montana, Willie Nelson, Buck Owens, Patti Page, Minnie Pearl, Charley Pride, Tex Ritter,

Roy Rogers, Ernest Tubb, Kitty Wells and Hank Williams, Sr.

Cliffie Stone passed away in 1998 at the age of 80. At the time of his death, he was serving as the historian for the Academy of Country Music. An entertainment industry veteran of more than 50 years, Stone first came to prominence in 1946 when three of his song collaborations reached the Top 5 — "No Vacancy" (Merle Travis), "New Steel Guitar Rag" (Bill Boyd and the Cowboy Ramblers) and "Divorce Me C.O.D.," which had three different versions (Merle Travis, The King Sisters and Johnny Bond), all of which reached the Top 5. Also, in 1946, his highly successful "Hometown Jamboree Show" began on television and radio, and ran through 1960. The show was a launching pad for many who went on to stardom, including Johnny Cash, Tennessee Ernie Ford, Eddy Arnold, Jim Reeves, Tex Ritter and others too numerous to mention.

Stone wore many hats in the music business — musician, singer, comedian, radio disc jockey, songwriter, music publisher, artists' manager, record company executive and TV, radio and record producer. He served as Vice President of the Country Music Association and during his lifetime, had been President, Vice President and

a member of the Board of Directors of the Academy of Country Music.

During his career, Stone produced over 14,000 television and radio shows, including serving as Executive Producer for five years on NBC-TV's "Tennessee Ernie Ford Show." He also served as Ford's personal manager for a time.


He was inducted into the Country Music Disc Jockey Hall of Fame in Nashville in 1979, received the Country Music Association's Hall of Fame Award in 1989, and a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame, which was

unveiled in 1989.

During the television special, awards will also be presented to the Top Male Vocalist, Top Female Vocalist, Top Vocal Duet or Group, Top New Male Vocalist, Top New Felmale Vocalist, Top New Vocal Duet or Group and for Top Vocal Event of the Year, Single Record of the Year, Song of the Year, Album of the Year, Video of the Year and Entertainer of the Year.

The special is a dick clark productions, inc. presentation with Clark and Gene Weed serving as Executive Producers, with Weed also directing.

Producing is Al Schwartz.
