There was a point in LeAnn Rimes' career, after "Blue" had hit it big and the then 14-year-old singer was on the road touring constantly, that people close to her expressed concern for her health. Finally, it got to be too much for the Mississippi-born and Texas-raised teen. In 1999 she decided it was time to rest. By then she had sold millions of records, crisscrossed the country numerous times, and won the hearts of music fans everywhere, including the Vatican, where she performed a special concert for the Pope.


A year later, a very energized and very grownup young lady emerged from the self-imposed hiatus. She was more poised, self-assured, and knew more about herself. That young lady decided that she was not going to take on such a grueling schedule ever again.

In short, LeAnn Rimes, now 18, has come of age. She didn't need a debutante ball to announce it: she just appeared in the movie Coyote Ugly and showed off what many are calling her transformation by way of the silver screen. "When I was off the road, I had some time for myself, and I think I found out who I am," she says. "I know I have a lot more growing up to do, and I really am looking forward to finding out even more about myself."

Rimes has accolades that anyone would envy. She has sold more than 20 million records; written a book, *Holiday in Your Heart*, which was made into a TV movie in which she co-starred; and stayed at number one for 69 weeks on *Billboard's* Hot 100 charts with "How Do I Live." She won two Grammys, three Academy of Country Music awards and one Country Music Association award, as well as four Billboard awards and the BBC's Rising Star award.


Although she has gone through some rough times of late, including her parents' divorce, her management disputes, and disagreements with her label, Rimes has maintained her poise through it all. Much like the 5-year-old who announced to her parents that she wanted a life in show business, this 18-year-old has never wavered in her love for music and being in the limelight.

"I think I know now how to better handle the success," she says. "When you have success really fast, people tend to push and push, and that's what happened to me. That's why I had to take time for myself. But I know that I'll never let things get so out of control again."







Listening to that music paid off because, after winning a talent contest when she was 12 years old, Cochran decided she had to make music her career. Her family backed her wholeheartedly.

As a duo, the Judds have made a long-lasting impact in country music. Individually, Wynonna and Naomi continue to follow their dreams, though sometimes in the same direction.



It will be remembered for the song "I Love You," which was featured in the *Runaway Bride* soundtrack, but the beauty of the album comes from songs like "Love's the Only House" and "This Uncivil War."

Known as an artist who portrays real-life situations through songs like "A Broken Wing" and "Independence Day," McBride continues to set the standard of excellence in song choices for new artists in country music.

"I don't really think of myself as a standard setter. I just do what I do. I try to find songs that are relatable. My music may change, but I think lyrically, I'm always looking for songs that feel right to me... that express something true, whatever that may be."

"A friend sent me an email with this story and I wrote the song in 10 minutes. I wrote it because I felt it. I had to write it. I didn't have a clue how people would react to it. I played it for my publisher and she teared up. Barry Coburn (head of Atlantic Records) heard it and took it to John Michael Montgomery. He cut it two weeks after I had done a demo of it, and three weeks later it was a single. I thought he did a great job with it. Once it was out there we started getting emails and letters from all over the country — the song has affected a lot of people." - Harley L. Allen

The Academy Story



The Academy of Country Music has had a remarkable 36-year history. It began as an organization to promote country music on the West Coast and has grown to be an association that has helped send country music and its entertainers around the globe.

Eddie Miller, Tommy Wiggins and Mickey and Chris Christensen are credited with having the vision to establish the Academy in 1965. In the beginning the organization focused on the western 13 states, with support coming in from artists who were based in that geographic area. Buck Owens, Merle Haggard, Glen Campbell, Roger Miller, Tex Williams, Jimmy Wakely, Wynn Stewart and Johnny Bond were all active in the early years of what was then known as the Country and Western Music Academy.

The name was changed in the early 1970s to the Academy of Country and Western Music because there was confusion that it was the name of a music school. A few years later it took its current name, the Academy of Country Music, because there were not many western singers or western movies with western music in them anymore.

Although the first office of the Academy has been described as being "just a little larger than a closet," folks who believed in the work of the organization dedicated themselves to introducing country music and its artists not only to new fans but to the business community. They held seminars and made presentations to demonstrate to business leaders how country music could help sell their products or draw attention to their business.

The first employee of ACM was Fran Boyd, who was hired as executive secretary for the office at the Crossroads of the World. "I was hired in 1967 to open their first office. They let me bring my son to work with me, and I only worked until 2 p.m. so I could be home

when my daughter got out of school." Boyd remained the sole employee until 1974 when they hired a receptionist. The two of them did everything, from hand addressing the 350 newsletters that went out to members to emptying garbage cans and taking membership applications. "We hand wrote all the membership cards, and I was selling award show tickets out of my house. We did whatever it took to keep the organization going," Boyd said.

The first awards show was held in 1966, for the year 1965. Kaye Adams was the first New Female Vocalist and Merle Haggard was the first New Male Vocalist. Bonnie Owens was Top Female Vocalist, and Buck Owens was Top Male Vocalist. Entertainer of the Year was introduced in 1970, with Merle Haggard receiving the award that year. ABC-TV picked up the show in 1972 until 1979, when the Academy became associated with dick clark productions, inc. and moved to NBC-TV. In 1998 it was moved to CBS TV where it remains today.

One of the interesting things about the ACM Awards Show is that it continues to acknowledge its West Coast heritage, inviting some of Hollywood's well-known personalities to be on the show. It's not unusual to see one of country music's top entertainers presenting an award alongside one of Hollywood's top actors or actresses.

Over the years the Academy has sponsored country music shows, picnics, seminars and any other activity which they thought might help to mix the communities of music and business. In 1983 the Academy started the Celebrity Golf Classic, now called the Bill Boyd Celebrity Golf Classic, in order to give back something to the community that had been so supportive of country music. The tournament raised more than \$130,000 for charities in 2000.


Bill Boyd was named executive director of the Academy in 1980. After he passed away in 1995, Fran Boyd was named executive director, a post she continues to hold today.

In 1987 ACM became involved in Country Radio Seminar in Nashville, and the following year it held its first Super Faces Show featuring Hank Williams, Jr. Involvement with CRS has continued through the Super Faces Show, talent showcases, hospitality suites and other activities. Others who performed for Super Faces are Alan Jackson, Brooks & Dunn, Alabama, The Judds, George Strait, Garth Brooks, Reba McEntire, Bryan White, Patty Loveless, John Michael Montgomery, Tim McGraw and Travis Tritt.

The Academy now has an office staff of five and a membership of more than 2,600. There are also volunteers who contribute time and effort to helping the office and the ACM's many activities run smoothly. The Academy salutes everyone who puts time and energy into the organization. As it moves forward to carry country music to new fans and new territories, the Academy will never forget its humble beginnings or the wishes of those early members who worked so hard to make the ACM a viable organization within the country music community. It will always strive to present country music as one of America's

true art forms, and one that will stand the test of time again and again.

Awards Criteria



The following are the official criteria and voting procedures used by the Academy of Country Music (ACM) to determine its annual award winners. The criteria and voting procedure was set forth by the Board of Directors of the ACM ("the Board") in accordance with the by-laws and may be amended from time to time as the Board deems appropriate in the best interest of country music. Unless otherwise approved by the Board of Directors, the Selection Committee and Video Selection Committee shall be comprised of Directors, the President, the Vice President, the Executive Director, the Chairman of the Board and the Secretary of the ACM.

THE ELIGIBILITY PERIOD FOR EACH AWARD IS SET FORTH IN THE CRITERIA BELOW:

Any disputes shall be resolved by the Chairman of the Board in accordance with Roberts Rules of Order.

1. VOTING PROCEDURE

The voting procedure shall comply with all legal requirements and any requirements of any network airing the awards show. Disputes as to voting procedure shall be resolved by a majority of the Board.

A. COMMITTEE LEVEL

- The Selection Committee and Video Selection Committee shall meet prior to the Board meeting and determine the slate of nominees to be presented to the Board.
- 2. The Committees shall consider all relevant material in arriving at their slate.
- 3. The Chairman of the Selections
 Committee and the Chairman of
 the Video Selection Committee
 shall determine the voting procedure at the selection committee
 meeting after first consulting with
 the Chairman of the Board, the
 President and the Executive
 Director. The Chairman of the
 Board shall resolve any disputes.

B. BOARD LEVEL

 The committees shall present their slate of nominees to the Board.
 The Committees may submit up to

- 10 nominees in each category, except Top New Male Vocalist, Top New Female Vocalist, Top New Group or Duo (collectively the "New Categories") where they may submit up to 7. By way of clarification, the Committees are not obligated to submit the maximum in any category.
- At the Board meeting where nominees are considered, any board member may make a motion to add a nominee to any category. If seconded, the nomination is put to the Board for a vote. If a majority of the Board in attendance votes in favor of the motion, the nominee is added to the slate.
- 3. Once the nominations from the floor are completed, the Board will vote on each nominee. Each Board member shall vote for only 10 nominees in any category, except the New Categories, where they shall vote for only 7 nominees. The top 10 vote-getters constitute the final slate except New Categories where the top 7 constitute the final slate to be submitted to the membership for the first ballot.
- 4. The actual voting shall be by secret ballot, in writing or electronically, and the results shall remain confidential until duly announced by the ACM. The voting shall be monitored by an independent accounting firm and such other persons as determined by the Chairman of the Board.

C. MEMBERSHIP LEVEL

- 1. The first ballot shall be submitted to the membership. The top 5 vote-getters, plus ties, in each Category (except the New Categories where the top 3 vote-getters (plus ties) shall constitute the final nominees to be submitted to the membership on the second ballot. The Board shall set time limits for returning the first ballot.
- The second ballot shall be submitted to the membership. The top vote-getter in each category shall constitute the winner. In the event of a tie, each nominee shall be declared a winner. The Board shall set time limits for returning the second ballot.
- 3. An independent accounting firm shall count ballots properly and timely returned.
- 4. Each member shall be required to sign his or her ballot.



The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

TOP MALE VOCALIST

This award is presented to the most outstanding individual male vocalist in the country music industry during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

TOP FEMALE VOCALIST

This award is presented to the most outstanding individual female vocalist in the country music industry during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

TOP NEW MALE VOCALIST

This award is presented to the most outstanding individual male vocalist in the country music industry who gains either initial fame or significantly greater recognition through his efforts during the prior calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

Any male artist who has been a final nominee on a previous ACM ballot in the Top New Male Vocalist category and does not win is eligible to be nominated in this category the following year. The second nomination of a person for Top New Male Vocalist is permissible only if it is in two consecutive years. Any male artist who has previously won the Top New Male Vocalist category is not eligible to be nominated again.

Any male artist who has had a single record or album reach top 20 or better in any country music industry publication chart during the prior calendar year is eligible.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

TOP NEW FEMALE VOCALIST

This award is presented to the most outstanding individual female vocalist in the country music industry who gains either initial fame or significantly greater recognition through her efforts during the prior calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

Any female artist who has been a final nominee on a previous ACM ballot in the Top New Female Vocalist category and does not win is eligible to be nominated a second time in this category the following year. The second nomination of a person for Top New Female Vocalist is permissible only if the nomination is in two consecutive years. Any female artist who has previously won the Top New Female Vocalist category is not eligible to be nominated again.

Any female artist who has had a single record or album reach top 20 or better in any country music industry publication chart during the prior calendar year is eligible.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to

approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

TOP NEW VOCAL DUO OR GROUP

This award is presented to the most outstanding duo featuring a vocalist, or group featuring a vocalist (herein called "duo or group") in the country music industry who gains either initial fame or significantly greater recognition through their efforts during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performance.

Any duo or group who has been a final nominee on a previous ACM ballot in the Top New Vocal Duo or Group category and does not win is eligible to be nominated in this category the following year. The second nomination of a duo or group for Top New Duo or Group is permissible only if it is in two consecutive years. Any duo or group who has previously won the Top New Duo or Group category is not eligible to be nominated again.

Any duo or group who has had a single record or album reach top 20 or better in any country music industry publication chart during the preceding calendar year is eligible.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

TOP VOCAL GROUP

This award is presented to the most outstanding group featuring at least one vocalist in the country music industry during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall

be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

TOP VOCAL DUO

This award is presented to the most outstanding duo in the country music industry during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of records, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

In the event that the Board of Directors determines that there are not enough nominees in this category in any particular year, this category may be merged with the Top Vocal Group at the Board meeting and shall be called the Top Vocal Group or Duo.

SINGLE RECORD OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the artist, producer and record company of the most popular country music single record during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music embodying the single, and the impact of the single on consumers and the country music industry.

Any single commercially released prior to the preceding calendar year but achieving its highest charted position in any accepted country music industry publication chart during the preceding calendar year is eligible unless it has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in this category.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

VOCAL EVENT OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the artist(s), producer(s) and record company of the most popular country music event single record during the preceding calendar

year. The factors to be considered include but are not limited to success at radio, sales of prerecorded music embodying the single and artistic merit of the single.

Any single commercially released prior to the preceding calendar year but achieving its highest charted position in any accepted country music industry publication chart during the preceding calendar year is eligible unless it has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in this category.

To be eligible, the single must be a collaboration between two or more artists who do not normally perform together.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

ALBUM OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the artist(s), producer(s) and record company of the most popular country music album during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered include but are not limited to success of singles from the album at radio, sales of prerecorded music embodying the album and artistic merit of the album.

Any album commercially released prior to the preceding calendar year but achieving its highest charted position in any accepted country music industry publication chart during the calendar year is eligible unless it has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in this category.

Any album, which contains more than three (3) previously released selections, including but not limited to "best of" or "greatest hits" albums are not eligible.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

SONG OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the songwriter(s), publisher(s) and artist performing the most popular country music song of the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered include but are not limited to the success of the song at radio, sales of prerecorded music embodying the song and the impact of the song on consumers and the country music industry.

Any song contained on a single commercially released prior to the preceding calendar year but achieving its highest charted position in any accepted country music industry publication chart during the preceding calendar year is eligible unless it has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in this category.

Any song which has been a previous ACM Song of the Year winner shall not be eligible.

The nominees shall be selected by the Selections Committee and are subject to approval by the Board. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.

VIDEO OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the producer, director and artist performing the most popular country music video during the prior calendar year. Emphasis shall be placed on creativity, production, visual appeal and impact on consumers and the country music industry. Other factors to consider include but are not limited to success of any single record for which the video was made at radio, sales of prerecorded music embodying the single record for which the video was made, and success on any accepted video chart in the country music industry (sales or performances).

Any country music video released prior to the preceding calendar year but which achieves its highest charted position in any accepted country music industry publication chart during the preceding calendar year is eligible unless it has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in this category.

The nominees shall be selected by the Video Selections Committee. The winner shall be determined by a vote of the membership of the ACM.



The nominees for this award are selected and voted on by the Academy Board of Directors. This award is presented to the artist who has made substantial contributions toward the exposure of country music during the decade.

SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Presented for unprecedented, unique and outstanding individual achievement in the field of country music during the preceding calendar year, voted by the Board of Directors. (THIS AWARD DOES NOT HAVE TO BE GIVEN EACH YEAR.)

CAREER ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

To an individual artist who has had fame in prior years — has made a substantial comeback in the preceding calendar year, voted by the Board of Directors. (THIS AWARD DOES NOT HAVE TO BE GIVEN EACH YEAR.)

JIM REEVES MEMORIAL AWARD

To an individual, not necessarily a performing artist, for outstanding contributions to the acceptance of country music throughout the world during the preceding calendar year, voted by the Board of Directors. (THIS AWARD DOES NOT HAVE TO BE GIVEN EACH YEAR.)

PIONEER AWARD "The Cliffie"

Outstanding "pioneer" in the field of country music. Individual receiving the highest number of votes by the Board of Directors on a single ballot will be so honored. (THIS AWARD DOES NOT HAVE TO BE GIVEN EACH YEAR.)

TEX RITTER AWARD

(Motion Picture)

A movie released and/or receiving major exposure during the preceding calendar year, featuring or utilizing country music, voted by the Board of Directors. (THIS AWARD DOES NOT HAVE TO BE GIVEN EACH YEAR — can be voted by the Board or the membership; Board's decision as to voting procedure.)

MAE BOREN AXTON AWARD

*Not a televised award

The Mae Boren Axton Award is given in recognition of years of dedication and service by an outstanding individual.

NIGHTCLUB / CASINO / TALENT BUYER & PROMOTER*

The nominees for these awards are selected by a panel of Blue Ribbon Judges. They must have bought or promoted at least twenty (20) country concerts/dates during the calendar year of the award, be in good standing with all agents and help to promote country music ticket sales. The winner from the previous year is ineligible to win the award for the current calendar year.

The winner will be notified two weeks in advance of the Academy of Country Music Awards Show.

DISC JOCKEY OF THE YEAR*

This award is presented to the outstanding country music "on-air" radio personality of the year, selected by a panel of Blue Ribbon Judges in a two-ballot concept. In order to be considered for the award, an audiocassette composite demonstration tape of the Disc Jockey/personality's "onair" presentation of a maximum length of ten (10) minutes, must be submitted to the ACM office along with a one-sheet (8-1/2 x 11) description of the radio station's best attributes including market share/ratings information for the calendar year of the award; community involvement, public service, charitable contributions, etc. All entries become the property of the ACM. A panel of Blue Ribbon Judges, approved by the Board of Directors, shall give consideration to ratings, public service, community involvement, entertainment and professionalism of the demo tape in determining the top ten (10) nominees for the first ballot. The winner from the previous year is ineligible to win the award for the current calendar year.

The winner will be notified two weeks in advance of the Academy of Country Music Awards Show.

RADIO STATION OF THE YEAR*

This award is presented to the outstanding Radio Station in a two-ballot concept. The Radio Station will submit to the ACM office a (15) fifteen-minute (maximum length) audiocassette composite demonstration tape of the station's on-air presentation and a (1) one-sheet (8-1/2 x 11) description of the radio station's best attributes, including any and all of the following: 1) Market share/ratings information for the calendar year of the award; 2) Community involvement, public service, charitable contributions, etc.

All entries become the property of the ACM. A panel of Blue Ribbon Judges, approved by the Board of Directors, shall give consideration to ratings, public service, community involvement, entertainment and professionals of the demo tape in determining the top ten (10) nominations for the first ballot. The winner from the previous year is ineligible to win the award for the current calendar year.



MUSICIAN*

This award is presented to the outstanding musicians in seven categories: Specialty Instrument, Guitar, Fiddle, Steel Guitar, Drums, Bass and Keyboard.

Winners in the Musician categories are selected and voted on by their peers in a two ballot concept. The first ballot is blank. The CPA takes the top three nominees, and any ties, from the first ballot and these names appear on the final ballot. All entries become the property of the ACM.
