HOST Reba McEntire

Singer, actress, and humanitarian—Reba McEntire wears all three hats with equal pride. Last year the vibrant redhead was the first recipient of the Academy of Country Music's first and only fan-voted award, The Home Depot Humanitarian Award.

McEntire received a beautiful crystal award designed especially by Tiffany & Co. More important, she was privileged to choose a site for a playground to be built through the efforts of The Home Depot and KaBOOM!, a nonprofit organization that brings together volunteers to build much-needed playgrounds in one-day "barn raising" construction events.

She chose to have the playground built in Atoka, Okla. The Home Depot and KaBOOM! volunteers joined with the local volunteers in the construction of the playground adjacent to the new proposed community center.

"My family has lived in the Atoka area of Oklahoma for generations," McEntire says. "I wanted to help provide a playground for the children of the hard-working people of this small town American region."

The Home Depot Humanitarian Award was created to recognize an artist or group in the country music industry that is committed to serving others, has a generosity of spirit, and a dedication to helping build the dreams of those in need. It's a description that could have come right out of a definition of the Oklahoma native, and other organizations have recognized those characteristics in McEntire.

McEntire recently received acknowledgment from the National Organization for Women (NOW) for her sitcom, *Reba*. In the group's annual "Watch Out, Listen Up" report, NOW acknowledged Reba for "portraying a single mom who makes effective parenting decisions."

McEntire is also the recipient of the Country Radio Broadcaster's Career Achievement Award. The presentation will be made in June 2003 in Nashville. The singer is only the sixth person in the group's history to be honored with this award. The recognition is for artists who have made a significant contribution to the growth of country music and country radio.

As she approaches her 30th year in the music business, McEntire is easily one of country music's most successful songhirds, not only in terms of her more than 50 million records sold, but also in her career diversity. As an actress, she has been in movies (*Tremors*), on television (*Buffalo Girls*), on Broadway (*Annie Get Your Gun*) and has had her own hit television series, Reba. As an author, she has penned *Reba: My Story and Comfort from a Country Quilt.* Her tours both in the U.S. and abroad are among the top-grossing concerts, and her recordings continue to sell. In fact, she now has three "Greatest Hits" CDs on the market.

The Warner Bros. television series *Reba* (Friday 9 P.M. EST) began with the Hart family in chaos and dealing with divorce and pregnancy. It continued with two marriages and two births, and this season it examines what happens when a single mom discovers she has to find a job and ends up in her ex-husband's office. The series is a hard look at how to deal with the things life throws a person, but it also shows the irony and laughter that can be found in the journey. Again, it's typically Reba. When critics warned that McEntire's country fans wouldn't accept such edgy material, the singer replied, "Country songs are worse than that lots a times."


McEntire and her family (husband, Narvel Blackstock, and son Shelby) have settled into the California lifestyle, recently buying a home in the Los Angeles area. The television series has given the family the opportunity to spend a lot more time together and has given Shelby a chance to explore the adventures of the West Coast, including surfing.

"This was a great move for him; he loves living out here now," says McEntire. "He's made lots of friends. And we have more family time now than we've ever had since Narvel and I have been married."

THE HOME DEPOT HUMANITARIAN AWARD

The Home Depot Humanitarian Award was created to recognize an artist or group in the country music industry that is committed to serving others, has a generosity of spirit, and a dedication to helping build the dreams of those in need.

The award is the first in Academy of Country Music history to be voted on by fans. Nominations were sent in by artist representatives and narrowed to three finalists by a Blue Ribbon Committee. The three finalists' names and humanitarian efforts were posted on The Home Depot website to be voted by visitors to the site. The voting continued through the first two hours of the live telecast, then was tabulated to determine the winner.

The first winner of the award, presented on the 2002 show, was Reba McEntire. McEntire was not only awarded a beautiful crystal award designed by Tiffany & Co., but also was offered her choice of cities in which to build a playground sponsored by The Home Depot and KaBoom!

KaBoom! is a national nonprofit organization established in 1995 to bring together individuals, community organizations, and businesses to create healthy play opportunities for children by focusing on community-built playgrounds.

The Home Depot and KaBoom! have teamed up to provide the supplies and manpower to build playgrounds in cities that are rich in children but poor in safe play areas. McEntire chose her hometown city of Atoka, Okla., to be the location of the new playground, which she named after her niece Haley.


"My family has lived in the Atoka area of Oklahoma for generations," commented McEntire. "I wanted to provide a playground for the children of the hardworking people of this small-town American region."

The build in Atoka was one of the fastest in the history of KaBoom!, which has built more than 200 playgrounds since 1995. The success was due to the enthusiastic spirit of the many volunteers in Atoka, which included McEntire's parents, sisters, brother and friends.

The Academy of Country Music is grateful to The Home Depot and KaBoom! for enabling country music to make an even greater impact in the lives of children. We think McEntire's generous and kindhearted spirit is a wonderful example of a true humanitarian.



What a momentous year the Academy and country music have had! In the months after September 11, 2001, country artists voiced their love and support for America through their songs, and fans found strength and comfort in the words the artists sang. "Where Were You (When the World Stopped Turning)," performed by Alan Jackson at the 2002 awards show, won Single Record of the Year and Song of the Year that night; and "Where the Stars and Stripes and the Eagle Fly," recorded by Aaron Tippin, was nominated for Video of the Year. Toby Keith gave a powerful performance of "Courtesy of the Red, White, & Blue (The Angry American)" at last year's awards show.



That same evening, the first fan-voted award, The Home Depot Humanitarian Award, was presented to Reba McEntire. Ronnie Milsap was awarded the Pioneer Award, and members of the group Alabama announced 2003 would mark their last year to tour.

Montgomery Gentry hosted the Bill Boyd Celebrity Golf Classic, helping raise more than \$1 million to date for charity. In 2002, Fran Boyd, executive director of the Academy, announced her retirement. After 35 years of service and dedication to the Academy, she will certainly be missed.

Also, the Academy decided to move its awards show out of the Los Angeles area for the first time in the history of the show, announcing the new venue to be Mandalay Bay Resort & Casino in Las Vegas.

After 35 years Fran Boyd retired from her position as executive director for the Academy of Country Music (ACM) in October of 2002. A native of Alabama, Fran joined the Academy of Country Music in 1967 as executive secretary and was the organization's sole employee until 1974. Fran was named executive director of the Academy after the death of her husband, Bill Boyd, in 1995. He had been the Academy's executive director since 1980.

Over the years Fran has received numerous accolades for her work in the country music industry. In 1999, Radio & Records Magazine recognized Fran as one of Country's Greatest Women in their "Century of Country" special issue. Three years later, Fran received the North American Country Music Assn., International (NACMAI) Lifetime Achievement Award at the Fifth Annual NACMAI Hall of Fame and Awards Show. The esteemed honor was presented to her by country star Kenny Chesney and Peggy Franck, executive director of NACMAI.

Fran is responsible for bringing the Academy to its status today and worked diligently in various roles to ensure the Academy's success. In addition to the organization's daily operations, she organized and planned the logistical aspects of the Academy's award shows, including serving as talent producer. Fran worked closely with the president and chairman of the board, served as editor of the Academy's bi-monthly newsletter and participated in the Country Radio Seminars. She also was involved with the annual ACM Bill Boyd Celebrity Golf Classic. With the help of her staff, Boyd coordinated the entire event, which currently has provided over \$1 million for numerous charities.

While representing the Academy at many functions over the years, Fran remained committed to enhancing and promoting country music throughout the world. On behalf of the entire Academy, we would like to thank her for her extreme dedication and service to the Academy, and we wish her the best in the future.


The results announced at our press conference make up the nominee listing for tonight's live awards presentation on the CBS Television network.







TOP NEW FEMALE VOCALIST



Dateline: Chicago-Sheryl Crow talks about one of the most influential records for her as an artist. "My first instrument is piano, and I think the biggest record for me, as an early aspiring artist, was Tapestry, and I still think it's one of the greatest records of all time," Crow says. "Every song on that record, for me as a singer/songwriter, is not only a great piece of songwriting, but it kind of sums up a time and feeling. And I guess the song on that record 'So Far Away' was the song I learned and played over and over and over. And not only was Carole King one of the first influences for me, but also [she was] a very strong female example of where you could go.

Dateline: The Chophouse Studio—Kid Rock and his band invited friends who were coming through town while he was recording his latest CD to stop by. "We had some great jam sessions, with Aerosmith, Hank Jr., Billy Gibbons and Tim McGraw," says Rock. "It's turned into kind of a cool place; they knew they would find good music, good food. That's what it's all about." He also waxes eloquent about country music. "Country and blues is the biggest... ever, and it always will be," Rock says. "I'm talking about the Stones, Skynyrd, Zeppelin—the biggest bands that ever were had a country and blues influence. Kids might hear my record and not know what they're listening to. I didn't when I was young, but it became apparent when I became older. This common thread through music was the blues. And country's just the white man's blues."









But we got \$65 and stayed at a nice hotel; so we were like, 'This isn't a bad life.' "

Dateline: Austin, Texas—Natalie Maines explains that *Home* was an apt title for the Chicks' most recent CD, since it was recorded near where all three singers now live with their families. Says Maines: "We've all bought permanent homes here, and everyone is happily married now. We're all nesting; and it was great to record the album with my dad (Lloyd Maines) and do it in Texas." (Interesting side note: the recording studio was a small stone house in the middle of a field, and the console in the studio once belonged to Elvis.)







Dateline: Armed Forces Bases-Although Jennifer Hanson's song "Beautiful Goodbye" is about breaking up, spouses of military men and women found themselves relating to it as troops deployed to the war in Iraq. In a story in The Tennessean, one soldier's wife at Fort Campbell, Ky., says of "Beautiful Goodbye": "I know it's about a breakup, but when Jennifer sings 'I miss you already, but don't turn around,' I could have sung those words to my husband as he deployed. We've been married 19 years, but it's never easy to watch him go."

Dateline: Los Angeles and Nashville-Jennifer Hanson says she wrote "All Those Yesterdays" from a phrase in a letter from her grandmother, who had returned to Los Angeles after visiting Hanson in Nashville. "My grandmother is dear to my heart, and I love her more than anything in the world. . . . After she went back to California, I got a letter from her telling me how much I'd meant to her all these years and how all the things I'd done musically have brought her so much joy. And the last thing she wrote was, 'If I die tomorrow it'll be okay, because I have all those yesterdays. Love, Grandma.' And it just hit me and choked me up, and I thought . . . song! So I shared the idea with A. J. Masters and Michael Heeney, and we wrote the song."





TOP FEMALE VOCALIST

Dateline: Nashville-People were talking about Faith Hill's Cry way before its release. Some hoped it would be among the country CDs that would bring about an increase in country music sales. Others thought it might be too far away from country mainstream. For Hill, it was an extension of music she loves to sing. "I have fans all around the world, but my country fans are very important to me," says Hill. "I think they will appreciate the fact that I've stayed true to what it is that I need to do as an artist. They have heard a little bit of these kinds of songs before on record and in my live shows."

Dateline: Nashville—Faith Hill is enjoying her stardom, but she also enjoys time spent with her family off the road. "The biggest issue for me now is how to take it all in," she says in an interview with Music Olympus. "It's a challenge. I'm just learning how to take time for myself. Frankly, the thing that I want most out of life is normality. It's difficult, but I try to find time for myself. It's a daily struggle, certainly not a daily accomplishment."





views, we think it is important to remember those brave men and women who have answered their country's call in the fight against terrorism."



ACADEMY STORY



Anyone who makes a living or has made a living from country music is eligible to become a member of the Academy of Country Music. Anyone who joins its ranks joins an organization that is proud of its heritage and proud of its contributions to country music on an international basis.

Eddie Miller, Tommy Wiggins, and Mickey and Chris Christensen are credited with having the vision to establish the Academy in 1964. In the beginning, the organization focused on the western 13 states, with support coming from artists who were based in that geographic area. Buck Owens, Merle Haggard, Glen Campbell, Roger Miller, Tex Williams, Jimmy Wakely, Wynn Stewart and Johnny Bond were all active in the early years of what was then known as the Country and Western Academy.

In the early 1970s, the name was changed to the Academy of Country and Western Music. There was some confusion over whether or not the Academy was a music school. With a lack of western movies, western singers and western songs, the Academy later changed its name to the Academy of Country Music.

Although the first office of the Academy has been described as being "just a little bigger than a closet," folks who believed in the work of the organization dedicated themselves to introducing country music and its artists not only to new fans but also to the business community. They held seminars and made presentations to demonstrate to business leaders how country music could help sell their products and draw attention to their businesses.

The first employee of the Academy of Country Music was Fran Boyd, who was hired as executive secretary. "I was hired in 1967 to open the first office. They let me bring my son to work, and I only worked until 2:00 P.M. so I could be home when my daughter got out of school," commented Boyd.

Boyd remained the sole employee until 1974, when the Academy hired a receptionist. The two of them did everything from hand addressing the 350 newsletters that went out to members, to emptying garbage cans and taking membership applications. "We handwrote all the membership cards, and I was selling award show tickets out of my house. We did whatever it took to keep the organization going," Boyd said.

The first awards show was held in 1966, for the year 1965. Kaye Adams was the first New Female Vocalist, and Merle Haggard was the first New Male Vocalist. Bonnie Owens was Top Female Vocalist, and Buck Owens was Top Male Vocalist. Entertainer of the Year was introduced in 1970, with Merle Haggard receiving the award that year.

ABC Television picked up the show in 1972 until 1979, when the Academy became associated with dick clark productions, inc. and moved to NBC Television. In 1998 the show was moved to CBS, where it remains today.

One of the interesting things about the Academy of Country Music Awards show is that it continues to acknowledge its West Coast heritage by inviting some of Hollywood's well-known personalities to be on the show. It's not unusual to see one of country music's top entertainers presenting an award alongside one of Hollywood's top actors or actresses.

Over the years the Academy has sponsored country music shows, picnics, seminars and any other activity they thought might help mix the communities of music and business. In 1983, the Academy started the Celebrity Golf Classic, which was renamed the Bill Boyd Celebrity Golf Classic after the passing of ACM Executive Director Bill Boyd in 1995. The purpose of the golf classic was to give back something to the community that had been so supportive of country music. The tournament has raised well over \$1 million to date for various charities.

Bill Boyd was named executive director of the Academy in 1980. After he passed away in 1995, Fran Boyd was named executive director, a post she held until her retirement in October 2002.

In 1987, the Academy became involved in the Country Radio Seminar (CRS) in Nashville, and the following year held its first Super Faces show featuring Hank Williams Jr. Involvement with CRS has continued through the Super Faces show, talent showcases, hospitality suites and other activities. Past performers of Super Faces are Alan Jackson, Brooks & Dunn, Alabama, The Judds, George Strait, Garth Brooks, Reba McEntire, Bryan White, Patty Loveless, John Michael Montgomery, Tim McGraw, Travis Tritt, Toby Keith and Martina McBride.

The Academy's staff and volunteers contribute time and effort to ensuring that the organization's many activities run smoothly. The Academy of Country Music salutes everyone who puts time and energy into this organization.

Those active in the country music community are urged to become a member and get involved with the Academy's many programs and activities. The people who work to keep country music in the forefront are the people who will shape its future and keep the music alive for generations to come.

Organization's mission is to make a positive difference in the lives of students by developing their potential for premier leadership, personal growth, and career success through agricultural education.






The following are the official criteria and voting procedures used by the Academy of Country Music (ACM) to determine its annual award winners. The criteria and voting procedures are set forth by the Board of Directors of the ACM ("the Board") in accordance with the by-laws, and may be amended from time to time as the Board deems appropriate in the best interest of country music.


Any disputes shall be resolved by the Chairman of the Board in accordance with Roberts Rules of Order.

VOTING PROCEDURE

The voting procedure shall comply with all legal requirements and any requirements of any network airing the awards show. Disputes as to voting procedure shall be resolved by a majority of the Board. Ballots will be tabulated by an independent accounting firm.

- The entire membership will be mailed a blank ballot on which they will write-in one nomination in each of the following categories; Entertainer of the Year, Top Male Vocalist, Top Female Vocalist, Top New Male Vocalist, Top New Female Vocalist, Top New Duo or Vocal Group, Top Vocal Group, Top Vocal Duo, Single Record of the Year, Vocal Event of the Year, Album of the Year, Song of the Year and Video of the Year.
- Any entry receiving fifteen (15) or more nomination votes will go before a review committee to ensure they meet all eligibility criteria (see "criteria" below). The independent accounting firm has permission to provide the names of all nominees reaching fifteen (15) or more votes as they are returned to the review committee so they may begin to research







information pertaining to the nominees. (i.e. composer, publisher, etc.) This will allow the second ballot to be released in a more timely manner.

- The entire membership will be mailed the second ballot, which will include a Scantron ballot to be marked. Only one vote can be cast for each category. The five (5) nominees receiving the most votes in each category will be placed on the third ballot. In the case of a tie, the additional nominees will be included on the third ballot.
- The third ballot will be mailed to the entire membership, and will be completed in the same manner as the second ballot.
 The nominee receiving the most votes in each category will be deemed the winner. In the case of a tie, both winners will receive an award.

ADDITIONAL CATEGORIES VOTED ON THE THIRD BALLOT


A Blue Ribbon Committee will submit nominees to be approved by the Board for the third and final ballot in the following categories; Nightclub of the Year, Casino of the Year, Talent Buyer/Promoter of the Year, Radio Station of the Year and On-Air Personality of the Year based on the criteria for each category (see "criteria" below). The nominee receiving the most votes in each category will be deemed the winner. In the case of a tie, both winners will receive an award.

MBI BALLOT

The MBI ballot is mailed to only those members that are classified in either the Artist/Entertainer category or the Musician/Band Leader/Instrumentalist category.

A Blue Ribbon Committee will submit five (5) names to be approved by the Board for the MBI ballot in the following
categories; Guitar, Keyboards, Bass, Drums, Steel Guitar, Fiddle and Specialty Instruments. The nominee receiving the
most votes in each category will be deemed the winner. In the case of a tie, both winners will receive an award.

ENTERTAINER OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the individual, duet or group who showed the most overall success in the country music industry during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include, but are not limited to, success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, success of music videos, live concert ticket sales, artistic merit, appearances on television, appearances in films, songwriting, writing and contributions to the country music industry.

TOP MALE VOCALIST

This award is presented to the most outstanding individual male vocalist in the country music industry during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include, but are not limited to, success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

TOP FEMALE VOCALIST

This award is presented to the most outstanding individual female vocalist in the country music industry during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include, but are not limited to, success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

TOP NEW MALE VOCALIST

This award is presented to the most outstanding individual male vocalist in the country music industry who gains either initial fame or significantly greater recognition through his efforts during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include, but are not limited to, success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

An artist may be a nominee in this category for two consecutive years. If an artist is a winner in this category his first year on the ballot, he will not be eligible in this category for a second year.

TOP NEW FEMALE VOCALIST

This award is presented to the most outstanding individual female vocalist in the country music industry who gains either initial fame or significantly greater recognition through her efforts during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include, but are not limited to, success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

An artist may be a nominee in this category for two consecutive years. If an artist is a winner in this category her first year on the ballot, she will not be eligible in this category for a second year.

TOP NEW DUO OR VOCAL GROUP

This award is presented to the most outstanding duo featuring a vocalist or group featuring a vocalist (herein called "duo or group") in the country music industry who gains either initial fame or significantly greater recognition through their efforts during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be

considered in arriving at this award include, but are not limited to, success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

A duo or group may be a nominee in this category for two consecutive years. If they are a winner in this category their first year on the ballot, they will not be eligible in this category for a second year.

TOP VOCAL GROUP

This award is presented to the most outstanding group featuring at least one vocalist in the country music industry during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include, but are not limited to, success at radio, sales of prerecorded music, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.

TOP VOCAL DUO


This award is presented to the most outstanding duo featuring at least one vocalist in the country music industry during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered in arriving at this award include, but are not limited to, success at radio, sales of records, live concert ticket sales and vocal performances.


In the event that the Board of Directors determines that there are not enough nominees in this category in any particular year, this category may be merged with the Top Vocal Group by the Board, and shall be called the Top Vocal Group or Duo.

SINGLE RECORD OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the artist,







producer and record company of the most popular country music single record during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered include, but are not limited to, success at radio, sales of prerecorded music embodying the single, and the impact of the single on consumers and the country music industry.

Any single commercially released prior to the preceding calendar year, but achieving its highest charted position in any accepted country music industry publication chart during the preceding calendar year, is eligible unless it has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in this category.

EVENT RECORD OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the artist(s), producer(s) and record company of the most popular country music event single record during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered include, but are not limited to, success at radio, sales of prerecorded music embodying the single and artistic merit of the single.

Any single commercially released prior to the preceding calendar year, but achieving its highest charted position in any accepted country music industry publication chart during the preceding calendar year, is eligible unless it has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in this category.

To be eligible, the single must be a collaboration between two or more artists who do not normally perform together.

ALBUM OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the artist(s), producer(s) and record company of the most popular country music album during the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered include, but are not limited to, success of singles from the album at radio, sales of prerecorded music embodying the album and artistic merit of the album.

Any album commercially released prior to the preceding calendar year, but achieving its highest charted position in any accepted country music industry publication chart and greatest commercial success during the calendar year, is eligible unless it has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in this category.

Any album, which contains more than three (3) previously released selections including, but not limited to, "best of" or "greatest hits" albums are not eligible.

SONG OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the songwriter(s), publisher(s) and artist(s) performing the most popular country music song of the preceding calendar year. The factors to be considered include, but are not limited to, the success of the song at radio, sales of prerecorded music embodying the song and the impact of the song on consumers and the country music industry.

Any song contained on an album commercially released prior to the preceding calendar year, but achieving its highest charted position in any accepted country music industry publication chart during the preceding calendar year,

is eligible unless it has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in this category.

VIDEO OF THE YEAR


This award is presented to the producer, director and artist performing the most popular country music video during the preceding calendar year. Emphasis shall be placed on creativity, production, visual appeal and impact on consumers and the country music industry. Other factors to consider include, but are not limited to, success of any single record for which the video was made at radio, sales of prerecorded music embodying the single record for which the video was made and success on any accepted video chart in the country music industry (sales or performances).

Any country music video released prior to the preceding calendar year, but which achieves its highest charted position in any accepted country music industry publication chart during the preceding calendar year, is eligible unless it has appeared on a previously published ACM ballot in this category.

RADIO STATION OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the outstanding radio station in a one-ballot concept. The radio station will submit to the ACM office a (15) fifteen-minute (maximum length) composite demonstration tape or CD of the station's on-air presentation and a (1) one-sheet (8.5 x 11/front and back) description of the radio station's best attributes including





market share/ratings information for the calendar year of the award, community involvement, public service, charitable contributions, etc.

All entries become the property of the ACM. A panel of Blue Ribbon Judges, approved by the Board of Directors, shall give consideration to ratings, public service, community involvement, entertainment and professionalism of the demo tape in determining the top (5) five nominees for the ballot. The winner from the previous year is ineligible to win the award for the current calendar year.

The winner will be notified two weeks in advance of the Academy of Country Music Awards so they may make arrangements to be in attendance for the presentation of the award.

ON-AIR PERSONALITY OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the outstanding country music "on-air" radio personality of the year, selected by a panel of Blue Ribbon Judges in a one-ballot concept. A composite demonstration tape or CD of the Disc Jockey/personality's "on-air" presentation of a maximum length of ten (10) minutes must be submitted to the ACM office along with a one-sheet (8.5 x 11/ front and back) description of the radio station's best attributes including market share/ratings information

for the calendar year of the award, community involvement, public service, charitable contributions, etc. All entries become the property of the ACM. A panel of Blue Ribbon Judges, approved by the Board of Directors, shall give consideration to ratings, public service, community involvement, entertainment and professionalism of the demo tape in determining the top (5) five nominees for the ballot. The winner from the previous year is ineligible to win the award for the current calendar year.

The winner will be notified two weeks in advance of the Academy of Country Music Awards so they may make arrangements to be in attendance for the presentation of the award.

NIGHT CLUB OF THE YEAR

This award is presented to the outstanding country music night club of the year, selected by a panel of Blue Ribbon Judges. The panel will submit nominees, which will be placed on the ballot once approved by the Board. The night club must have bought or promoted at least twenty (20) country concerts/dates during the calendar year of the award, be in good standing with all agents and help promote country ticket sales. The winner from the previous year is ineligible to win the award for the current calendar year.

The winner will be notified two weeks in advance of the Academy of Country Music Awards so they may make arrangements to be in attendance for the presentation of the award.

CASINO OF THE YEAR

The same criterion applies to Casino of the year as Night Club of the year.

DON ROMEO TALENT BUYER/ PROMOTER OF THE YEAR

The same criterion applies to Talent Buyer/Promoter of the year as Night Club and Casino.

GENE WEED SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Presented for unprecedented, unique and outstanding individual achievement in the field of country music during the preceding calendar year, voted by the Board of Directors.






We know this move will bring a whole new spirit and energy to our show and since we're already known as Country's "Party of the Year," what better place to hold it than in the World's Biggest Party town!


