

THE CHAIRMAN OF ACM LIFTING LIVES

After serving on the ACM Board of Directors for more than a decade, witnessing the reach of ACM Lifting Lives is very near and dear to me. To see ACM Lifting Lives help music therapy and education programs across the country, expand relief efforts for victims of natural disasters, provide funds for financial and medical emergencies, sponsor a music camp in Nashville for people with developmental disabilities and partner with artists to support their charitable passions is a dream come true to me.

Some of our existing programs have continued to expand. Our grant cycle for music therapy and music education added new programs in Chicago, one of the key cities in a four-year plan to improve lives through the power of music in cities where help is needed most. Beneficiaries include Chicago Children's Choir, Merit School of Music, Ravinia Reach*Teach*Play program, and Snow City Arts. Our Diane Holcomb Emergency Relief Fund continues to provide immediate and confidential financial assistance for people in the country music community who face sudden unforeseen tragedy. The online initiative, "ACM Lifting Lives: My Cause," features artists' favorite charities and allows us to celebrate the artist's good work through our web channels, press releases, social media blasts and a cash contribution to the cause in the artist's name. In conjunction with the Vanderbilt Kennedy Center, we sponsored the ACM Lifting Lives Music Camp for people with developmental disabilities. This year the camp grew and more artists than ever participated, including Darius Rucker, Carrie Underwood, Little Big Town, Wynonna Judd, Brett James, Gary Allan and Odie Blackmon.

This year, we also took on some new initiatives. We held our first-ever stand-alone benefit concert at Joe's Bar in Chicago, which featured performances by country music superstar LeAnn Rimes and *American Idol* runner-up Crystal Bowersox. We also reinstated the ACM Lifting Lives Celebrity Golf Classic, hosted by Darius Rucker on March 31, 2012. The tournament is back after a two year hiatus with the proceeds benefitting the Diane Holcomb Emergency Relief Fund. Our board continues to flourish and we have expanded our Advisory Committee to liaise between the organization and the community.

Tonight's ACM Awards Lifting Lives moment sheds light on a serious issue we have right at home in the United States. While food seems to be everywhere we turn, the hard truth is that 1 in 5 American children do not know where their next meal is coming from. It's a truth that singer-songwriter Hunter Hayes wants to bring to light. Hayes realized the problem with hunger "is in our own backyards," and has co-written "Here's Hope," which tackles the issue head-on. Tonight, ACM Award winners Little Big Town will perform the song live on the 47th ACM Awards to benefit ConAgra's "Child Hunger Ends Here" campaign.

In closing, I would like to thank our former Chairman Gayle Holcomb for her outstanding leadership, President Gary Gilbert and Vice President Bruce Bowman, and the ACM Lifting Lives Board of Directors and Advisory Committee for all of their hard work in making this a successful organization. I would also like to thank new ACM Lifting Lives Executive Director Lisa Huddleson and all of the ACM staff for their steadfast support and hard work. Finally, I'd like to extend a special thanks to all of the artists and industry professionals for their continued support of ACM Lifting Lives*. We appreciate you.







REBA AND BLAKE SHELTON

Tonight's hosts, Reba and Blake Shelton, are

both superstars in their own right. Reba has conquered music, film, Broadway and retail, and Blake has joined the country A-List as a hitmaker and coach on the popular TV show *The Voice*. Each brings something special to their roles as *ACM Awards* hosts, but together they have a chemistry that can't be matched. That special interplay—and lots of laughter—filled the Nashville soundstage where the pair shot this year's *ACM Awards* promos for CBS. Their banter on set proves we're all in good hands tonight.

You now have one of these shows as co-hosts together under your belt already. Blake, what is the best thing about having Reba as your co-host on the ACM Awards?

BLAKE: Somebody to blame things on when it goes south, when it goes badly. If there's ever a line that's messed up, it's usually because her timing is off a little bit. Let's be honest. But the good thing is, I can't think of a disaster that happened last year.

REBA: He's flawless. I thought you did an excellent job. **BLAKE**: Say that again!

REBA: I thought you did a real good job.

BLAKE: Stop there. That's all you've got to say.

REBA: End of the interview (laughs)

Reba, what is great about having Blake up there with you? You've done this with other co-hosts, but you guys have some great chemistry.

REBA: For some reason we both have a unique type personality that, for me, when I get around Blake, it just seems to come out a little bit more. There's not as many guarded gates that come up. It's all 'what you see is what you get,' and that's what I've learned being around Blake. He's such a lovable creature. He's just sweet, adorable. [Blake gives her a loving look] Don't look at me like that. He's adorable. Everybody loves him. No matter what age group everybody loves him. He's a sweetheart.

BLAKE: Keep going. Talk about my looks.

REBA: He's a cutie pie. (laughs) And we have a great time.



Reba, fans have come to expect a lot of different looks from you on the show. How hard is it for you to get all the different looks and pull them together?

REBA: You know honestly after 14 years of doing this, [stylist] Terry Gordon and I are getting it down to a science and we already have our clothes ready. They are ready. This is the first time we've been this prepared. It just worked out, so we're really tickled.

And, you, Blake? What will you be wearing?

BLAKE: I don't do the wardrobe changes.

REBA: You are this time!

BLAKE: No!

REBA: Yeah, Narvel [Blackstock, Reba's husband and manager] has already said you're going to change four times, just like me. BLAKE: Narvel is full of crap. It takes me 15 minutes to get in these jeans, and have you ever tried to put biscuits back in the can after you've opened it, like pushing things in there? That's what I have to do. I'm pushing things in there.

REBA: Maybe it is just going to be one clothes change for him. I didn't know about the biscuits.

Blake, in addition to hosting, you are one of the five artists up for ACM Entertainer of the Year. What is it like to be recognized in that category this year?

BLAKE: Man, I'm not going to sit here and be like other artists that will say, 'Well it's nice just to be nominated.' Bull crap! I'm pumped about it.

REBA: Heck yeah.

BLAKE: Hell yeah. It's cool. **REBA:** That's a big deal.

BLAKE: It is a big deal. And I don't know what my chances are of

winning it but...

REBA: One out of five. **BLAKE**: See, she's so smart.



ACM LIFTING LIVES AND CONAGRA FOODS JOIN LITTLE BIG TOWN AND HUNTER HAYES TO FIGHT CHILDHOOD HUNGER





It's hard to imagine anyone in the United States being hungry. Food seems to be everywhere we turn, but the hard truth is that more than 1 in 5 American children don't have consistent access to enough food to live active, healthy lives. It's a truth that up-and-coming singer-songwriter Hunter Hayes wants to bring to light.

Hayes and songwriters Luke Laird and Barry Dean have co-written "Here's Hope," which tackles the issue head-on with a together-we-can-beat-this attitude. The song will be performed live tonight by ACM Award winners Little Big Town as the ACM Lifting Lives show moment during the 47th Academy of Country Music Awards.

"We didn't realize, and I think a lot of people have kind of missed it that there's a problem with hunger, and there's a problem with hunger in our backyards," Hayes said. "It's not in a different country. It's not in a commercial. It's here and it's your next door neighbor. And our message was kind of like well, 'You know what? It's in our backyard, which means we can help.' They're our neighbors, which means we can do something. There's hope."

Lifting Lives, the charitable arm of the Academy, is spotlighting the issue in conjunction with ConAgra Foods, which has been helping feed hungry children for almost 20 years. Since 1998, ConAgra Foods has donated more than 275 million pounds of food, which translates into more than 200 million meals. The company has also established the "Child Hunger Ends Here" program. In this program, when a customer buys a specially-marked package of brands like Healthy Choice®, Marie Callender's®, Chef Boyardee®, Orville Redenbacher's®, Banquet®, Hunt's®, Manwich®, Snack Pack® or Peter Pan Peanut Butter®, and enters the code from the package, one meal is donated through Feeding America.



In 2011, chart-topping country artist Darius Rucker joined 25 ACM Lifting Lives music campers on stage for a special performance of "Music From the Heart," a song the campers wrote collectively last summer with Brett James and Chris Young at the ACM Lifting Lives Music Camp in Nashville. The first Lifting Lives show moment in 2009 featured Trace Adkins performing "'Til the Last Shot's Fired" with the West Point Glee Club. The performance raised funds and awareness for the Wounded Warrior Project, an organization that aids wounded American troops. In 2010, Toby Keith and Dave Koz performed Toby Keith's "Cryin' for me (Wayman's Song)" to benefit Stand Up to Cancer (SU2C), whose mission is to create and accelerate groundbreaking cancer research that will get new therapies to patients quickly and save lives.

ACADEMY OF COUNTRY MUSIC MISSION



The earliest incarnation of the Academy of Country Music was created in 1964 to bring attention to the innovative country artists based on the West Coast. Now, nearly 50 years after its founding, the far-reaching organization has branched out from its Los Angeles headquarters into the rowdy nightlife of Las Vegas, every corner of the music industry in Nashville, and most of all, directly into the hearts of country fans around the world.

The organization first launched as the Country & Western Music Academy, founded by performers Eddie Miller and Tommy Wiggins as well as club owners Mickey and Chris Christensen. Johnny Bond, Cliffie Stone and Tex Williams—all prominent figures in the California country music scene—each served as president of the fledgling organization.

The Academy's first awards show took place in Los Angeles in 1966, honoring accomplishments of the prior year. Merle Haggard, Buck Owens, Bonnie Owens and Kay Adams were among the inaugural winners. The ceremony was the first country music awards program held by a major organization, thus propelling the region's country music scene into the public spotlight.

In 1968, Fran Boyd became the organization's first paid employee. That same year, the iconic "hat" trophy was implemented. In 1972, the *ACM Awards* were broadcast for the first time in national syndication on the ABC network. Gene Weed began producing the show in 1974. By that time, the Academy of Country Music's new name was chosen to alleviate confusion for those who thought the Academy was a music school.

The ACM partnered with Dick Clark Productions in 1979 to produce the awards show, while Weed continued his role as director. The show moved to NBC under Clark's guidance, then to CBS, where it remains today. In 2012, the Academy and CBS announced a 10-year deal that will keep the *ACM Awards* and the Academy's prime-time specials on CBS through 2021.

Bill Boyd, who was Fran Boyd's husband, helmed the Academy beginning in 1980. When he died in 1995, Fran became the organization's executive director. Following her retirement in 2002, Bob Romeo stepped into the role of executive director. In his first decade leading the company, Romeo grew the Academy's team with new departments such as Creative & Media Production, Membership & Events and Publicity & Marketing.

After decades of staging the show in Los Angeles, the

Academy boldly moved the *ACM Awards* to Las Vegas in 2003. Now the *ACM Awards* routinely sell out the MGM Grand Garden Arena and viewers can help choose the Entertainer of the Year and the New Artist of the Year by interactive voting.

During "The Week Vegas Goes Country", tens of thousands of fans flock to Fremont Street for free concerts by headliners and new artists alike. The ACM Lifting Lives Celebrity Golf Classic, founded in 1983, is now one of the premiere events of its kind in the nation. Plus, fans can get up-close and personal with their favorite country artists at the post-show All-Star Jam and the ACM Fan Jam, which has become a live component to the *ACM Awards* telecast.

In recent years, country superstars and loyal fans have wisely extended their stay in Las Vegas for the once-in-a-lifetime network specials filmed the night after the *ACM Awards*. Taped in 2009, the first prime-time special paid tribute to George Strait, the Academy's Artist of the Decade for the 2000s. Brooks & Dunn's brilliant career was recognized in a memorable night of music called *The Last Rodeo* in 2010, while country music's female superstars received their due in 2011 with *Girls' Night Out: Superstar Women of Country*. Legendary singer-songwriter Lionel Richie and his famous country duet partners will share the spotlight in 2012 for *ACM Presents: Lionel Richie and Friends - In Concert*.

Meanwhile in Nashville, the ACM has presented plenty of all-star events like the Music City Jam and New Faces Show at Country Radio Seminar, as well as the ACM Honors at the Ryman Auditorium. The latter event salutes the winners of the Academy's Industry, MBI (Musician/Bandleader/Instrumentalist) and Special Awards, which are given to musicians, industry leaders, songwriters and legends. Keeping an eye abroad, the ACM also presents the esteemed Jim Reeves International Award to an artist who takes country music around the world.

Amid the glamour and excitement, the ACM is still focused on giving back to the community. Many of the organization's high-profile activities raise money that is directed to their charitable arm ACM Lifting Lives, which is dedicated to improving lives through the power of music. Through its annual grant cycle, the Diane Holcomb Emergency Relief Fund, the ACM Entertainer of the Year matching gift and the My Cause web feature, Lifting Lives has donated millions of dollars to those in need, not just in the western states, but from coast to coast.

THE FIRST EVER DIGITAL
NOMINEES PRESS CONFERENCE



Every year legions of loyal country music fans tune in to see the nominations announcement for the annual Academy of Country Music Awards. This year, they had an even bigger reason to pay attention. For the first time ever, fans from across the country actually announced the nominees for ACM Entertainer of the Year in the Academy's first-ever digital press conference.

Hosted on the Academy's Facebook and Twitter pages, the digital conference revealed Entertainer nominees in a video mashup of fans from across the country saying the name of their favorite artist. Through video posts by *ACM Awards* co-host Reba, fans were invited to submit videos of themselves to the ACM YouTube page for consideration. More than 200 fans

submitted videos in just three days.
The remaining on-camera categories were announced via video posts by *Entertainment Tonight*'s Nancy O'Dell, *2 Broke Girls*' star Beth Behrs,



international superstar Lionel Richie. Fans could log on and see the nominees rolled out in real time.

The digital press conference was the latest effort by the Academy to boost its social media presence, and it paid off in spades. The video posts earned 12 million impressions on Facebook and reached more than 14.2 million users on Twitter. Reba also kept the fun going during the press conference by hosting the Celebs on Facebook page, which has more than 4 million "likes" alone.

"The Academy has always been first to embrace fan engagement, and this year we upped the ante by inviting fans into the nominations process for the first time," said Brooke Primero, ACM SVP PR & Marketing. "In addition to fan involvement, we had more artists, celebrities and VIPs participate than we could ever have squeezed into a real world press conference – the day was a complete success because of how the artists embraced the idea."

The excitement continued throughout the day with participation from many of the nominated artists, whether it was a simple tweet acknowledging the nomination or reaction videos posted from artists like Chris Young, Eli Young Band, Jason Aldean, Lady Antebellum, Love & Theft and Toby Keith. Reactions gave fans a chance to see the whole nomination process unfold in front of them – the announcing of nominations, the press articles, the artists hearing the news and their reactions.



Jason Aldean established himself as



reigning Entertainer of the Year, enchanted fans around the world in 2011 with her lavish Speak Now World Tour. Amid the theatrical setting, however, Swift ensured that her songs remained the star of the show. As the lead single from Speak Now, "Mine" immediately connected with fans, leading to the Video of the Year trophy at the CMT Music Awards and a double-platinum single. Next, the platinum "Back to December" showed a melancholy side of her songwriting. However, Swift strutted through "Mean" with such spirit that even the harshest critics would have to smile. "Mean" received Grammy Awards for best solo country performance and best country song, while Speak Now earned a nomination for best country album. Swift was also named one of CMT's Artists of the Year and Billboard honored her as its Woman of the Year. Her other projects included launching her Wonderstruck fragrance, writing and performing "Safe and Sound" for The Hunger Games soundtrack, lending her voice to the film The Lorax, and releasing a live CD/DVD of her Speak Now World Tour. Just four years ago, Swift earned her first ACM Award as Top New Female Vocalist. Showing her staying power, her self-titled debut reached five million in sales in 2011, while Speak Now has sold four million units. She is the top-certified digital artist in country music history.



Alabama brought their mountain music back to country radio in 2011 with "Old Alabama," a lively

collaboration with Brad Paisley. The distinguished group received the ACM's Artist of the Decade award for the 1980s after winning the Entertainer of the Year award for five consecutive years. They landed their first ACM Award as the 1980 Top Vocal Group, a category they claimed for six straight years. Three of their most popular albums – *Feels So Right, The Closer You Get* and *Roll On* – also earned ACM Awards in the 1980s. Between 1980 and 1999, the ensemble charted 51 Top 10 hits, with 32 reaching No. 1. They are also the recipients of the

ACM's Pioneer Award and Milestone Award. In 2011, original



band members Randy Owen, Jeff Cook and Teddy Gentry returned to the peak position with "Old Alabama" and the digital single achieved gold status. The band also recorded "Are You Sure Hank Done It This Way" for a Waylon Jennings tribute album. In June, they hosted the Bama Rising tornado relief concert in Birmingham, Ala., with a roster of all-star guests. The band is expected to perform around 30 concerts in 2012, with plans for a new album, too.



DIERKS BENTLEY

NOMINATED FOR

Song of the Year (Composer)

Dierks Bentley built his new album, *Home*, on the foundation of party anthems, romantic ballads and a poetic look at patriotism. Along with recording the album in Asheville, N.C., Bentley spent 2011 focused on his Country & Cold Cans Tour, along with raising money for childrens' hospitals in Illinois, Ohio and Tennessee through his Miles & Music for Kids events. Bentley claimed the 2003 Top New Artist ACM Award thanks to his debut smash, "What Was I Thinkin." Since then he's joined the Grand Ole Opry and gathered 14 Top 10

singles, with eight of those reaching No. 1. "Am I the Only One" climbed all the way to the top in 2011 and reached gold status. He followed that success with "Home," a heartfelt ballad that displays his love for his country. Bentley's home state of Arizona chose it as their official song for the state's 100th anniversary. To celebrate the album's release, Bentley headlined a crowd-pleasing show at Nashville's Ryman Auditorium with guests Will Hoge, Little Big Town's Karen Fairchild and musical heroes The Del McCoury Band. For his encore, he sang an adorable duet with his three-year-old daughter, Evie.

Eric Church earned widespread critical acclaim and long-awaited commercial success in 2011, confirming the talent that his dedicated fans have seen all along. With his latest album, *Chief*, Church secured his first Grammy nomination (for best country album) as well as his first No. 1 hit, "Drink in My Hand." The latter song reached gold status, joining his 2011 certifications for "Homeboy," "Love Your Love the Most" and "Smoke a Little Smoke." *Chief* also earned a gold plaque less than three months after it debuted at No. 1 on both the country and pop charts. No wonder this North Carolina native landed last year's ACM Award for New Solo Vocalist. He


spent much of 2011 opening for hard-working stars like Jason


Kelly Clarkson may be one of the biggest pop stars in the world, yet she became an avid country fan while growing up in Burleson, Texas. In the 10 years since winning American Idol, she has developed a country audience by sharing powerful ballads with Nashville's biggest stars. Her incredible duet version of "Because of You" with Reba McEntire carried them to the upper reaches of the country chart and spawned a unique, collaborative tour. Clarkson returned to country radio in a huge way last year as a dazzling duet partner with Jason Aldean on "Don't You Wanna Stay." The No. 1 smash single topped the country charts, crossed over to adult contemporary radio and grabbed a Grammy nomination for best country duo/group performance. Of course, Clarkson remains prominent on the pop scene, too. Her signature sass was showcased on "Mr. Know It All" and her latest album, Stronger, achieved gold status in less than two months. Her impressive hit streak includes "Since U Been Gone," "Behind These Hazel Eyes," "Breakaway," "Miss Independent," "Never Again," "Stronger (What Doesn't Kill You)" and "Walk Away." She delivered the national anthem at Super Bowl XLVI in February.

CHARLIE DANIELS

NOMINATED FOR

Vocal Event of the Year (Artist)

Charlie Daniels has stood firmly on the country music scene for nearly 40 years and remains one of its most recognizable stars. His outspoken personality and love for tradition made him a natural fit to join Aaron Lewis' gold-certified single, "Country Boy." Daniels first entered the country charts in 1973 with "Uneasy Rider." Six years later, as the dynamic leader of the Charlie Daniels Band, his career exploded with "The Devil Went Down to Georgia," an instant classic that won a Grammy, reached platinum status and certified him as a country icon. The Charlie Daniels Band also claimed the 1979 and 1980 ACM Awards for touring band of the year. Their enduring career compilation, A Decade of Hits, has sold more than four million copies since its 1983 release,



while 1979's Million Mile Reflection is triple-platinum. Other top-selling titles include platinum albums like Fire on the Mountain, Full Moon and Simple Man, as well as the gold albums Midnight Wind, Saddle Tramp and Windows. In recent years, Daniels has satisfied his fans with a string of new albums from the realms of bluegrass, country and Christmas music. To honor his numerous contributions, Daniels earned the 1997 ACM Pioneer Award.




ELI YOUNG BAND

Eli Young Band exploded at country radio in 2011 with "Crazy Girl," a persistent mid-tempo hit that ended up becoming the format's most-played single of the year. Plus it climbed all the way to No. 1 and reached platinum status. Written by Lee Brice and Liz Rose, the song's momentum helped the Texas-based band land a spot on Dierks Bentley's tour and a slot on Late Night With David Letterman. They followed that with "Even If It Breaks Your Heart," a powerful narrative written by Will Hoge and Eric Paslay. Sung from the perspective of a young man driven to succeed in the music world, the track leads the band's latest album, Life at Best. Known for their energetic live show, Eli Young Band headlined a show at the Houston Rodeo in 2011 and toured Australia with Tim McGraw and Faith Hill earlier this year. Their set list includes early singles like "Always the Love Songs" and "When It Rains," which helped establish their presence at country radio. They'll tour with Rascal Flatts in 2012. Eli Young Band members are lead singer Mike Eli, guitarist James Young, drummer Chris Thompson and bassist Jon Jones.



Sara Evans emerged from a long hiatus

with "A Little Big Stronger," an empowering single that vividly described her state of mind at the time. Naturally, her return was met with open arms as the single climbed to No. 1 at country radio and reached platinum status. Her fans also embraced *Stronger*, her first album of new material in six years. With a radio resurgence, Evans signed onto the Rascal Flatts tour and filmed a cinematic video for "My Heart Can't Tell You No," a longing ballad originally released by Rod Stewart that she always dreamed of recording. Evans also branched into book publishing with *Love Lifted Me* and appeared on *Dancing With the Stars*, five years after she bowed out of the competition to spend time with

her children. At that time, Evans had catapulted to fame with a 2005 ACM Award for Female Vocalist of the Year and No. 1 hits like "No Place That Far," "Born to Fly," "Suds in the Bucket" and "A Real Fine Place to Start." Coming full circle, she updated "Born to Fly" with a bluegrass twist for *Stronger*, ensuring that she always keeps things interesting.



BRANTLEY GILBERT

NOMINATED FOR

New Artist of the Year

Brantley Gilbert keeps his home in Jefferson, Ga., yet he's taken Nashville by storm as a performer and songwriter. With a dedicated fan base known as the BG Nation already in place due to years of intense touring, Gilbert grabbed his first No. 1 single as an artist in 2011 with the gold-certified "Country Must Be Country Wide." He maintained that momentum at radio with "You Don't Know Her Like I Do." Meanwhile, as a songwriter, he's landed two huge cuts with Jason Aldean – the platinum "My Kinda Party" and the double-platinum "Dirt Road Anthem." (Both are from Aldean's ACM-nominated album, My Kinda Party.) When Gilbert was 19, he was nearly killed in a car accident. The experience prompted him to pursue a career in music. His musical influences include Southern rock, rugged country and heartfelt soul. Although he began performing acoustically, he built his following on his electric live show. Gilbert's debut album, Modern Day Proligal Son, appeared on Average Joe's Entertainment in 2009. A deluxe, expanded version of his Halfway to Heaven album arrived on The Valory Music Co. in 2011. Gilbert is opening shows on Eric Church's Blood Sweat & Beers Tour in 2012.



Vince Gill is the only nominee this year to win an ACM Award in the 1980s, the 1990s and the

2000s. The friendly Oklahoma native claimed the 1984 ACM Award for Top New Male Vocalist, thanks to early singles on RCA. As the 1990s began, Gill transitioned to MCA Nashville and enjoyed an enviable career that brought 1992 and 1993 ACM Awards for Male Vocalist of the Year, as well as the 1992 Song of the Year trophy (as artist and composer) for "I Still Believe in You." Meanwhile the album of the same name emerged as a career landmark, with more than five million copies sold. Gill is well-known as a generous collaborator, both musically and

philanthropically. He received the 2005 ACM/The Home Depot Humanitarian Award as well as a 2006 ACM Vocal Event award for harmonizing with Sheryl Crow on Brooks & Dunn's "Building Bridges." Gill returned to the country scene in 2011 with a new

Gill joined the Country Music Hall of Fame in 2007.



HUNTER HAYES

NOMINATED FOR

New Artist of the Year

Hunter Hayes caused a stir among country fans with "Storm Warning," his catchy debut single. At 20, this Louisiana native has already shared the stage with country legends like Hank Williams Jr. (as a 5-year-old accordion prodigy) and contemporary superstars like Taylor Swift (on select dates of her Speak Now World Tour). For his self-titled debut album, Hayes wrote or co-wrote all the songs and co-produced the project with Dann Huff. Hayes also played every instrument on the album. He cites Garth Brooks, Clint Black and LeAnn Rimes as major influences, as well as the Cajun music he heard in his home state. At age 4, Hayes landed a regular gig as an accordion player at a neighborhood Cajun restaurant. When he turned 5, he took the lead spot in the band. One year later he learned guitar and appeared in the film *The Apostle* with Robert Duvall. Now living in Nashville, Hayes has notched writing credits on songs recorded by Rascal Flatts and Montgomery Gentry and landed on the *Footloose* and *Act of Valor* soundtracks. He's also sung on *Late Night With David Letterman* and the Grand Ole Opry. Following his tour with Rascal Flatts, Hayes will tour throughout 2012.






GEORGE JONES

NOMINATED FOR

Vocal Event of the Year (Artist)

George Jones' magnificent voice continues to inspire today's top country artists while still embodying the genre's rich traditions. Jones earned his first Top 10 hit, "Why Baby Why," in 1955. And over the next 35 years, his distinctive baritone graced 78 Top 10 country hits. Perhaps his most famous recording is "He Stopped Loving Her Today," a song that prompted 1980 ACM Awards for Single, Song and Male Vocalist. Five years later, his video for "Who's Gonna Fill Their Shoes" also claimed an ACM Award. In a nod of admiration, Kenny Chesney partnered with Jones on a remake of "Small Y'All" on the ACM-nominated Hemingway's Whiskey, while Jones and Aaron Lewis grabbed a gold single and an ACM nomination for their



collaboration, "Country Boy." In addition, Jason Aldean name-checks the Possum in the double-platinum "Dirt Road Anthem" by singing about "swerving like George Jones." The country icon celebrated his 80th birthday in 2011 with a special Grand Ole Opry show featuring friends like Alan Jackson, Jamey Johnson, The Oak Ridge Boys and Lee Ann Womack. In recognition of his brilliant career, Jones earned the 1992 ACM Pioneer Award. He joined the Country Music Hall of Fame in 1992.



TOBY KEITH

Toby Keith charged ahead in 2011 with two memorable hits, the gold-certified "Made in America" and the platinum "Red Solo Cup." Known for taking a stand, as well as poking fun at himself and others, this Oklahoma superstar has satisfied his loyal fans for more than two decades. After offering a long string of hit singles to radio, such as "Should've Been a Cowboy," Keith took the reins in 1999 by switching labels and releasing a bold new project, *How Do You Like Me Now?* The title track became a huge hit and helped Keith

win ACM Awards for Male Vocalist and Album of the Year. Since then, he's repeated in both categories – and also claimed the 2002 and 2003 Entertainer trophy. In addition, "Beer For My Horses" landed ACM Awards both as a music video and a film. In 2011, Keith performed for the USO, sang on *Dancing With the Stars* and raised \$20,000 for NSAI with a Bluebird Café concert. To top things off, he launched Wild Shot Mezcal, just in time to toast *Glee's* rendition of "Red Solo Cup." The title of Keith's latest gold-certified album, *Clancy's Tavern*, pays homage to his grandmother's supper club.



Lady Antebellum owned more than just the night in 2011. To start the year, band members Dave Haywood, Charles Kelley and Hillary Scott secured five Grammys and "Need You Now" rose to five million digital downloads. Meanwhile, "American Honey" reached platinum and "Lookin' for a Good Time" grabbed gold. That momentum led to a headlining tour and appearances on



American Idol, Dancing With the Stars and Saturday Night Live. Plus they were named a CMT Artist of the Year. On a more somber note, they performed the national anthem at the NFL season opener on the 10th anniversary of 9/11. By the end of 2011, they scored No. 1 hits with "Just a Kiss" (which ultimately reached double platinum status) and "We Owned the Night" (a gold single). Both tracks are from their Grammy-winning platinum album, Own the Night. The trio won the ACM's New Vocal Duo or Group just four years ago. Along with past trophies in the Song, Single and Album categories (for "Need You Now" and its namesake album), they are the ACM's reigning Group of the Year, winning for the last two years. Following a string of U.S. dates, the group will tour Europe this summer.




MIRANDA LAMBERT

Miranda Lambert delivered two acclaimed albums in 2011, while still maintaining an active tour schedule and a new marriage to fellow country star Blake Shelton. Her radio presence led to numerous certifications in 2011, including platinum plaques for "The House That Built Me" and "White Liar," as well as her second album, Crazy Ex-Girlfriend. In addition, "Heart Like Mine" and "Only Prettier" reached gold status. Over the summer, she teamed with singer-songwriter friends Ashley Monroe and Angaleena Presley to form the Pistol Annies, a tough-yet-tender trio that often surprises fans at Lambert's concerts. Later that year, she checked in with "Baggage Claim" and a brand new solo album, Four the Record. Perhaps four is her lucky number because her music brought in four ACM Awards last year, including victories in the Single, Song and Video categories for "The House That Built Me." She is also the reigning ACM Female Vocalist of the Year, winning for the last two years. Her previous ACM trophies include New Female Vocalist, Album (for Crazy Ex-Girlfriend and Revolution) and Video ("White Liar"). Lambert and Shelton co-wrote her new single, "Over You," about Shelton's late brother. She launched her On Fire tour earlier this year.



Aaron Lewis followed his heart from modern rock to contemporary country with a gold-certified single, "Country Boy." Joined by Charlie Daniels and George Jones, the Staind star attracted new fans with his nod toward traditional country, while placating longtime listeners with his rugged, edgy vocals. Following up "Country Boy," Lewis continued his momentum with an EP, Town Line, recorded in Nashville with producer James Stroud. Released in March, the album debuted at No. 1 on Billboard's country chart. He's currently working on a full-length follow-up. Growing up in rural Vermont, Lewis spent summers with his grandfather, a World War II veteran and an avid country fan. That early influence also affected Lewis' songwriting style, as he often employs an acoustic guitar and straightforward lyrics. With an Australian tour just wrapped, Staind will launch an



arena tour in the U.S. in April. Their biggest rock hits include the gold-certified singles "It's Been a While" and "Right Here." Their 2001 album, *Break the Cycle*, has sold more than five million copies. They've also enjoyed double-platinum success with 1999's *Dysfunction* and platinum plaques for 2003's *14 Shades of Grey* and 2005's *Chapter IV*. An outdoor enthusiast, Lewis lives in rural Massachusetts with his family.





Love and Theft have taken another look at the country charts with "Angel Eyes," their first single as a duo. Eric Gunderson of Charlotte, N.C., and Stephen Barker Liles of Palm Harbor, Fla., met in Nashville in their early 20s. Both are pastors' kids who once led services in their home churches. Prior to landing their first record deal with Lyric Street, Gunderson did tile and carpentry work, while Liles parked cars and worked at Blockbuster Video. Musically speaking, they both cite Elvis Presley as a major influence, as well as the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band and Roy Orbison. Early in their career, the former trio landed an opening spot on Taylor Swift's tour. (In fact, Liles was the inspiration for her song, "Hey Stephen.") Plus their breakthrough single, "Runaway," cracked the Top 10 at country radio, helped secure a tour with Tim McGraw and Lady Antebellum, and led to a Grand Ole Opry performance. Liles' songwriting credits include Martina McBride's "Wrong Baby Wrong" and Canaan Smith's "We Got Us." The band's first project for RCA is expected later this year. Their name is borrowed from an acclaimed Bob Dylan album.

throughout her incredible career. And she rewarded their loyalty by taking chances on her latest album, *Eleven*. The title fits perfectly because it's her 11th album, it contains 11 new songs and she is the most-played female artist at country radio over the last 11 years. She recorded the album in Atlanta and promoted it with a cross-country Amtrak trek. A confident performer and a compassionate artist, McBride connected with her audience in 2011 with "Teenage Daughters" and the Grammy-nominated "I'm Gonna Love You Through It," her first two singles since signing

to Republic Nashville. She also sang on *Dancing With the Stars*, hosted a network special about adoption and appeared on the Opry stage as the famous backdrop turned pink to raise awareness of breast cancer. With such a powerful voice and a kind spirit, it's no surprise that she's a three-time ACM Female Vocalist and an ACM/The Home Depot Humanitarian Award winner. More than a dozen singles from her tenure at RCA Nashville are collected on the new compilation, *Hits and More*. Of course, fans enjoyed a mix of old and new material when she joined George Strait on tour in early 2012.





SCOTTY McCREERY

Scotty McCreery made the leap from a deep-voiced American Idol hopeful into a platinum-certified country star in 2011. More than 38 million viewers tuned in to his winning moment, which shuttled the likable young singer into the elite ranks of Idol winners (and ACM nominees) such as Kelly Clarkson and Carrie Underwood. Within three months, he had headlined the American Idols Live! Tour and earned a platinum album for his debut project, Clear As Day. Meanwhile, his first two singles, "I Love You This Big" and "The Trouble With Girls," have reached gold status. His countless TV appearances include Good Morning America, The Tonight Show With Jay Leno, the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade and Hart of Dixie. McCreery says he decided to audition for Idol to get some professional feedback on his talent. Just 17 when he ultimately won, McCreery returned to finish high school in his hometown of Garner, N.C. He has cited Elvis Presley and Josh Turner among his musical heroes, as well as classic country stars such as Johnny Cash, Merle Haggard, Conway Twitty and Hank Williams. In addition to recording new music, McCreery will tour with Brad Paisley's Virtual Reality Tour this year.





Montgomery Gentry are still on the run

after more than a decade of success in country music. In 2011, they overcame personal and professional obstacles to release a new single, "Where I Come From." That confident tune is found on their latest album, *Rebels on the Run*, their first project for Average Joe's Entertainment. In recent years, Eddie Montgomery and Troy Gentry faced significant setbacks as Montgomery was diagnosed with prostate cancer, in addition to the duo exiting their longtime record label. Nevertheless, the guys bounced back with a performance at the Grand Ole Opry, which they joined in 2009. For more than a decade, the duo has been a



favorite among country fans. They accepted the 1999 ACM Award for New Vocal Duo, thanks to early hits like "Hillbilly Shoes" and "Lonely and Gone." Along with a solid stretch of success at country radio, their charitable efforts also led to the 2009 ACM/The Home Depot Humanitarian Award. Montgomery Gentry have scored 15 Top 10 hits, including the No. 1 singles "If You Ever Stop Loving Me," "Something to Be Proud Of," "Lucky Man," "Back When I Knew It All" and "Roll With Me."




GRACE POTTER

Grace Potter had never met Kenny Chesney when he invited her to sing on "You and Tequila." However, he was a big fan of her charismatic albums and dynamic voice, so he reached out to work with her. Just three days after receiving the phone call, she joined Chesney in a Nashville studio to cut the bittersweet ballad. They filmed the sun-dappled video in Malibu, Calif., because the song reminded Chesney of breezy sunset drives along the Pacific Coast Highway. A Vermont native, Potter draws on her soul, rock and songwriting influences to create an invigorating and electric style of music. Potter and her band, The Nocturnals, headlined three concerts at the Ryman Auditorium in Nashville this fall. Over the winter, she voiced a character in Disney's animated *Prep and Landing*, released a Christmas EP and unveiled her signature Gibson Flying V Guitar. Grace Potter & The Nocturnals' bold new album, *The Lion The Beast The Beat*, is due this summer. Following their performances at Coachella Music & Arts Festival and the New Orleans Jazz & Heritage Festival, Grace Potter & The Nocturnals will open shows for Kenny Chesney and Tim McGraw's Brothers of the Sun Tour this summer.



Rascal Flatts surged in 2011 with a platinum album, an innovative tour and a welcome invitation to join the Grand Ole Opry. The trio's 2010 project album, Nothing Like This, has sold a million copies, thanks to hits like the platinum-certified "I Won't Let Go" and the gold-certified "Easy" with pop star Natasha Bedingfield. They also serenaded Oprah Winfrey for the final season of her iconic talk show. Meanwhile, Vince Gill surprised Gary LeVox, Jay DeMarcus and Joe Don Rooney on stage with an offer to become Grand Ole Opry cast members and he personally inducted them to the fold in October. On tour, the group brought along a wedding chapel (inspired by their peppy hit "Why Wait") along with a karaoke



contest and a traveling museum. Needless to say, the band has garnered countless accolades to display. Two years after earning the 2000 New Vocal Duo or Group award, Rascal Flatts picked up the Song of the Year (for "I'm Movin' On") and the first of seven consecutive trophies for Vocal Group of the Year. They also received the 2007 ACM/The Home Depot Humanitarian Award. Rascal Flatts will headline The American Band Tour over the summer. A new album, *Changed*, arrives on April 3.




STEEL MAGNOLIA

NOMINATED FOR

Vocal Duo of the Year

Steel Magnolia parlayed their victory on CMT's Can You Duet? into a Top 5 country hit, "Keep on Lovin' You." The duo of Joshua Scott Jones and Meghan Linsey first heard each other sing in a karaoke bar, a moment that inspired the storyline in the "Keep on Lovin' You" video. They soon teamed up, personally and professionally, and combined their unique musical influences. Linsey grew up in Louisiana and sang with a local band starting at age 14. She cites blues singer Susan Tedeschi and country legend Tanya Tucker as her influences. Meanwhile, Jones was raised in rural Illinois and found inspiration in The Beatles, Waylon Jennings and Gospel music. The duo's self-titled debut album, issued in early 2011 and produced by Dann Huff, also features the singles "Just By Being You (Halo and Wings)," "Last Night Again" and "Bulletproof." Linsey and Jones wrote or co-wrote seven of the project's 12 tracks. They celebrated the release with a concert at Nashville's Wildhorse Saloon, where they earned their record deal. Along with a performance spot on *The Late Show With David Letterman*, Steel Magnolia maintained an active touring schedule in 2011, opening for artists like Blake Shelton and Reba.





SUGARLAND

At the top of their game, Jennifer Nettles and Kristian Bush scored a platinum album for *The Incredible Machine* and a double-platinum certification for the undeniably catchy single, "Stuck Like Glue." They found an excited audience in Europe and all across the U.S., while showcasing their creativity and enjoyable material. Even the upbeat catalog hit, "Settlin," reached gold status in 2011. Ending the year on a happy note, Nettles quietly married Justin Miller, a model who appeared in the duo's sensual "Want To" video. Hooking fans on early hits like "Baby Girl" and "Something More," Sugarland claimed their first ACM Award as the 2005 New Vocal Duo or Group. The Band Perry has proven itself worthy of winning the ACM's New Artist award in 2011. The sibling trio of Kimberly, Neil and Reid Perry has been heard on numerous TV shows, multiple radio formats and countless concert stages thanks to their smash breakthough hit, "If I Die Young." Written by Kimberly Perry, the single reached No. 1 at country radio, sold four million downloads, crossed over to the pop charts and led to a Grammy nomination for best new artist — the only country performer in the category this year. Their follow-up hit, "You Lie," also captured gold status, while their self-titled debut sold more than a million copies. Last year, they toured with superstars such as Tim McGraw, Reba and Keith Urban, along with headlining dates on their Purveyors of Performance Tour. They wrapped up the year with an appearance on *Dick Clark's New Year's Rockin' Eve.* Along with unexpected covers (such as Queen's "Fat Bottomed Girls"), The Band Perry can fill their set list with radio favorites like their debut single, "Hip to My Heart," as well as the gold-certified No. 1 hit, "All Your Life." Look for them in early 2012 on tour with Brad Paisley.






CARRIE UNDERWOOD


Carrie Underwood shared the spotlight with movie stars and music icons in 2011, yet her singular voice still stands out to loyal country music fans. Early in the year, Underwood appeared in *Soul Surfer*, an inspirational film that featured her as a wise youth minister. She also recorded with the likes of Tony Bennett ("It Had to Be You"), Brad Paisley ("Remind Me") and Randy Travis ("Is It Still Over"). Her solo career, of course, remained strong. "Mama's Song" received a Grammy nod for best country solo performance and her album *Play On* reached double-platinum status. In addition, the singles "Just a Dream," "Last Name," "Remind Me" and "Undo It" each sold a million copies. Underwood also visited Australia on a promotional tour, as well as her hometown of Checotah, Okla., to build a community playground. Underwood is an ACM Triple Crown winner, following her victories as New Female Vocalist, Female Vocalist (three times) and Entertainer (twice). Her single "Jesus Take the Wheel," her album *Some Hearts* and her video for "Before He Cheats" have also collected ACM Awards. She will release a new album featuring her latest hit "Good Girl" on May 1.



CHRIS YOUNG

"The Man I Want to Be," "Voices," "Tomorrow" and "You" to No. 1 at country radio. Young toured extensively in 2011, opening for artists like Jason Aldean, Rascal Flatts and Blake Shelton. In April he performed for U.S. troops in Iraq and Kuwait on behalf of the Stars for Stripes organization. His newfound momentum also led to appearances on *Good Morning America* and *Late Night With Jimmy Fallon*. Young, who has wanted to be a country singer since he was a freshman in high school, co-wrote seven of the 10 songs on *Neon*. In early 2012, "You" and "Voices" also reached gold status.





ZAC BROWN BAND

NUMINATED FOR

Vocal Group of the Year

The Zac Brown Band fed their fans a steady diet of No. 1 hits, invigorating concerts and home-cooked meals in 2011. Early in the year, "Colder Weather" climbed to No. 1 and reached gold status. Their live album, Pass the Jar, also struck gold. And by the end of the year, "Knee Deep" (with Jimmy Buffett) and "Keep Me in Mind" topped the country chart, too. Meanwhile, their You Get What You Give album received a platinum certification, and Brown earned a Grammy nomination for contributing "Where the River Goes" to the Footloose soundtrack. Last year, the hard-working ensemble won an ACM award in the vocal event category for "As She's Walking Away," a wise look at love featuring Alan Jackson. They were also named the 2008 Top New Vocal Duo or Group, thanks to their debut single, "Chicken Fried." That tasty track led to more big hits, including "Whatever It Is," "Toes," "Highway 20 Ride" and "Free." They played stadiums with Kenny Chesney over the summer, then headlined the Southern Ground Music and Food Festival in Charleston, S.C. Brown, a former restaurant owner, has been known to help cook hearty meals backstage for lucky fans. On stage, though, every band member - fiddler Jimmy DeMartini, keyboardist Cov Bowles, bassist John Driskell Hopkins, drummer Chris Fryar and multi-instrumentalist Clay Cook - is given a chance to shine.



CLIFFIE STONE PIONEER AWARD

EMMYLOU HARRIS

Emmylou Harris brought a graceful delivery, beautiful harmonies and a wealth of exceptional material to her career in country music. Harris was discovered at a nightclub in Washington D.C., then provided her signature vocals to Gram Parsons' seminal recordings. On her own, she arrived on the country charts in 1975. Over the next decade, she racked up 21 Top 10 singles, including five No. 1 hits. The *Trio* album with talented friends Dolly Parton and Linda Ronstadt earned the 1987 ACM Award for Album of the Year, Harris was elected to the Country Music Hall of Fame in 2008.



BILLY SHERRILL

Billy Sherrill produced many of country's most famous names and wrote numerous classics throughout the 1960s and 1970s. The Alabama native

joined Epic Records in 1964, where his credits as both a producer and songwriter included David Houston's "Almost Persuaded," Charlie Rich's "The Most Beautiful Girl" and Tammy Wynette's "Stand By Your Man." He also served as a producer on George Jones' "He Stopped Loving Her Today" (which earned Sherrill an ACM Award for Producer of the Year), as well as Johnny Paycheck's "She's All I Got" and Tanya Tucker's "Delta Dawn." He joined the Country Music Hall of Fame in 2010.

RICKY SKAGGS

Ricky Skaggs energized country music in the 1980s by taking his traditional sound in a lively new direction. Over that decade, the Kentucky native charted 19 Top 10 singles, including 11 No. 1 hits. Rather than writing his material, he gathered first-rate songs by the likes of Guy Clark, Bill Monroe, Webb Pierce, Mel Tillis and Cindy Walker. He was named the ACM's 1981 Top New Male Vocalist and received five ACM Awards for Touring Band of the Year. Since that time, Skaggs has focused on bluegrass music and now leads one of the most respected ensembles in the genre.



DWIGHT YOAKAM

Dwight Yoakam captured the imagination of traditionalists and new listeners alike by giving hillbilly music a modern twist. Born in Kentucky but based in Los Angeles, Yoakam debuted with a twangy cover of Johnny Horton's "Honky Tonk Man," which led him to the ACM's 1986 Top New Male Vocalist trophy. In all, Yoakam landed 14 Top 10 hits - some he wrote ("I Sang Dixie") and others he revived (Elvis Presley's "Little Sister"). Along with acclaimed albums and music videos, Yoakam proudly partnered with Buck Owens on the endearing 1988 duet, "Streets of Bakersfield." He remains active in music and film.

CAREER ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

VINCE GILL

Vince Gill returned to the country scene in 2011 with an appealing new album, *Guitar Slinger*, and the enthusiastic response proved that he had been missed. Nashville Mayor Karl Dean proclaimed an official Vince Gill Week in conjunction with the album's release. Gill also served as Grand Marshal of Nashville's Christmas parade. In addition, Gill and wife Amy Grant graced the cover of *Good Housekeeping*, while Sting shared the stage with him on an acclaimed *CMT Crossroads*. Meanwhile, the Country Music Hall of Fame member appeared on multiple talk shows and earned a Grammy and ACM Song of the Year nod for "Threaten Me With Heaven."



CRYSTAL MILESTONE AWARD

KENNY CHESNEY

Over the past decade, four-time ACM Entertainer of the Year Kenny Chesney has sold more than 10,500,000 tickets on his 11 national tours, selling out stadiums across the country. His successful shows have promoted the entire genre to delighted fans while helping other country acts and cross-over artists gain exposure nationwide. The Academy is honoring Kenny for this remarkable achievement.



JIM REEVES INTERNATIONAL AWARD




ALAN JACKSON

Alan Jackson's down-home music and laidback personality has translated well internationally. He played for eager audiences in Sweden and Norway in August 2011, brought back by popular demand following his 2009 shows. Jackson's album, Good Time, has also earned platinum sales in Norway. Jackson also toured Australia for the first time in March 2011. He'll play four arena shows in Canada in April 2012, as well as a summer concert at the Craven Country Jamboree in Saskatchewan. Jackson won his first ACM Award as 1990's Top New Male Vocalist, an honor that coincided with career-building tour dates in the UK and Germany.

ROGER MILLER



Roger Miller charmed listeners with characteristic wit on classics like "King of the Road" and "Dang Me." Miller, an Oklahoma native, grabbed early songwriting success with Ray Price's "Invitation to the Blues." In 1985, he earned acclaim for writing the score of the musical *Big River*. To honor his brilliant career, he received the 1987 ACM Pioneer Award. Miller died in 1992 and was inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame in 1995. Contemporary stars like Brooks & Dunn and Alan Jackson have kept his legacy alive with terrific renditions of "Husbands and Wives" and "Tall, Tall Trees," respectively.

MAE BOREN AXTON AWARD

GAYLE HOLCOMB

By all accounts, Gayle Holcomb is a force to behold. Her boundless energy and unshakeable confidence have served her well in her rise as an agent at William Morris. Those attributes also have bolstered the Academy of Country Music during her 17 years as a board member and five years as ACM chairman. During her tenure as chair, Holcomb was a driving force for the organization's rapid change and growth, lobbying—and ultimately prevailing—to boldly move the Awards show from Los Angeles to Las Vegas in 2003. Holcomb helped launch ACM Lifting Lives in 2005, guiding the vision for the charity as it got underway initially, and continuing her support of the organization by becoming chairman. She made the initial endowment to form the ACM Lifting Lives Diane Holcomb Emergency Relief Fund, in honor of her mother, to enable the Fund to respond quickly to unforeseen, immediate financial needs of ACM members, staff and members of the country music community.





You may know him from his time with the

Commodores ("Brick House," "Easy," "Sail On") or his legendary hits of the '80s ("Dancing on the Ceiling," "Hello," "All Night Long"). Now, legendary singer-songwriter Lionel Richie is diving into his country roots with a duets album and the network TV special ACM Presents: Lionel Richie and Friends – In Concert, set to tape April 2nd in Las Vegas.

Born and raised in Tuskegee, Alabama, Richie says country music has always been one of his influences. His grandmother was a classical musical instructor at Tuskegee University, but he was surrounded not only by classical music but also by Gospel, R&B and country. He later turned that country influence into gold by collaborating with the country legends who cut his songs, including Conway Twitty ("Three Times a Lady"), Alabama ("Deep River Woman") and Kenny Rogers ("Lady").

"How I became the songwriter that I did was because of all those little songs in my head," Richie recalled of his musical melting pot in Tuskegee. "I couldn't help but tap into them one by one."

The singer's new country album, aptly titled *Tuskegee*, hit stored in March on Nashville's Mercury Records. The project features duets of Richie's classic hits with country's elite stars, many whom had grown up with Richie's hits as a kind of soundtrack to their formative years.

"I think for the first time we're going to kind of look at me as a songwriter and what made me write these songs. After a while I got over the fear of letting my kids – I call my songs 'my kids' – get all changed around, "Richie said. "I said to each artist, take these songs and make them yours, as if you were walking out on the stage and you were going to perform

them on your show...and that was good. They did a killer job."

The lineup for the ACM special includes country heavy hitters Jason Aldean, The Band Perry, Luke Bryan, Kenny Chesney, Sara Evans, Lady Antebellum, Martina McBride, Tim McGraw, Jennifer Nettles, Rascal Flatts, Kenny Rogers and many more.

Show producers R.A. Clark and Barry Adelman have had a long association with Richie through dick clark productions and the *American Music Awards*, which the singer famously hosted in 1985 with his buzz word "out-RAGEOUS!" They both say the Lionel-country connection is a natural one.

"Both of us go way back with Lionel and we have witnessed firsthand the power of his songs across all musical genres," concurred Clark and Adelman. "That's why so many top country artists are excited to be part of this special."

Richie is thrilled his duet partners are coming to Vegas to perform with him live, but he's even more excited about the unexpected things that could happen onstage at the MGM Grand Garden Arena.

"We've got surprises for you. Even in my own show I'm going to be in awe of what's going to happen," Richie said. "This has been a long time in coming and I just want to make sure that everybody gets a chance to see this. I'm going to be having the best time of my life."

Tickets for *ACM Presents: Lionel Richie and Friends in Concert* can be purchased online at acmcountry.com or ticketmaster. com. Proceeds from the show will benefit ACM Lifting Lives, the Academy's philanthropic arm which works to improve lives through music.
