












n a chilly overcast day at Nashville's Citation Studios, it couldn't have been warmer inside. As a live DJ played everything from old AC/DC to Johnny Cash and The Gap Band, Luke Bryan and Dierks Bentley hurled vinyl records toward the cameras for the ACM Awards network promos, cracking each other up as only old friends can.

The CBS promo team basically plopped Luke and Dierks down in the middle of a musician's playground with vintage microphones, amps and guitars, giving them the perfect backdrop to showcase their considerable charm. That charm will be on full display tonight here on the T-Mobile Arena stage as the duo once again hosts the 52nd ACM Awards. And they're ready — even for any Academy Awards-style mishaps.

"The Oscars taught us that no matter how prepared we are or how great we do up there, as long as there's a huge screw up at the end, that's all they're going to talk about," Dierks joked.

It's the chemistry between these two friends that makes them the perfect ringleaders for what promises to be one of the most diverse ACM Awards yet. The pair worked closely with the show producers and writers to come up with some moments that will have fans talking.

"They are two very close friends that hang out together not because they're booked together, they hang out together because they really like each other," said ACM Awards Executive Producer Barry Adelman. "Their humor comes from their relationship together, and when you hang with them you hear it all the time. It's our job to get that on TV, and we will."

"I think that's why I kind of took on the challenge of doing this with Luke — that it is a challenge," Dierks explained. "It's something totally different for me. It makes you respect everyone who's ever done it before. Watching the Oscars and Jimmy Kimmel and watching Fallon and watching James [Corden] at the Grammys, and they're so good."

Although the duo is returning for a second year, they're doing it in a brand new venue. After 10 years in the MGM Grand Garden Arena, we've moved across the street to T-Mobile Arena, which has afforded show producers a chance to shake things up on stage. One change is the addition of famed creative director Baz Halpin, who crafted Katy Perry's Super Bowl halftime show and counts among his clients Taylor Swift, Britney Spears, Usher and Pink.

"I like [a new location] because it does put everybody on their toes, and it forces creativity," said Executive Producer RAC Clark. "We brought aboard Baz as co-executive producer to really help us craft the look and feel of the show since we're in a new arena. He's been actively involved as we've been formulating the performances, and it's going to look very different than years past, and we're really excited about it."

Seven-time ACM Award winner Bryan says that no matter what side of the strip you're on, the Vegas location is always a safe bet.

"I think the Vegas factor is always very important for the whole vibe of the show," Luke said. "The fans are coming out here, and you can just feel it in the room that everybody is excited to be in Vegas. It feels like a party, and I think it's kind of up to Dierks and me to create that vibe on stage — create it for the artists in the room and certainly for the fans in the room and at home."

In addition to hosting, Luke and Dierks are both ACM Award winners and come into this year's show as nominees. Luke is up for ACM Entertainer of the Year, an award he has taken home twice. Dierks is vying for three awards, including Male Vocalist of the Year, Album of the Year (*Black*) and Vocal Event of the Year ("It's Different for Girls" featuring Elle King).

ACADEMY OF SOUNTRY MUSIC MISSION

he proud history of the Academy of Country Music® lends credence to its official mission of "improving lives by connecting fans, artists and the industry." In the half century since its inception, the Academy has grown from a regional Southern California trade organization to a national powerhouse dedicated to a higher purpose. Now, more than five decades in, the ACM® is still supporting new artists and established superstars, entertaining country music fans from coast to coast and helping others with charitable good works.

The Academy was officially founded in 1964 in Los Angeles when performer Tommy Wiggins, songwriter Eddie Miller and club owners Mickey and Chris Christensen teamed up with other performers, radio and record label executives to establish the Country and Western Music Academy. Their vision was to promote country music in the western 13 states and to support artists based on the West Coast such as Billy Mize, Johnny Bond, Glen Campbell, Merle Haggard, Roger Miller, Buck Owens, Wynn Stewart, Jimmy Wakely and Tex Williams. In 1965, an official board of directors was formed. The Academy hosted its first official country music awards show in 1966 (after three informal awards banquets held at the Christensens' Red Barrel Niteclub) honoring the industry's accomplishments during the previous year. It was the first country music awards program held by a major organization, propelling country music into the public spotlight for the first time. Winners that year included Kay Adams, Merle Haggard, Bonnie Owens and Buck Owens.

The Academy's signature "hat" trophy was created in 1968, the same year Fran Boyd was hired as the Academy's first paid employee. During the early 1970s, the organization changed its name to the Academy of Country and Western Music and finally to the Academy of Country Music (ACM). The Academy also expanded its efforts to broaden the horizons of the country music industry, sponsoring the "Country Music Caravan" in Los Angeles and beginning its history of charitable endeavors with a "Concern for Prisoners of War" benefit concert (also held in Los Angeles), and, later, the ACM Celebrity Golf Classic.

The awards show hit the airwaves in 1972, broadcast for the first time in national syndication on the ABC network. Gene Weed took over producing and directing the show in 1974, and in 1979 the Academy joined forces with Dick Clark Productions to produce the show. Dick Clark and Al Schwartz served as producers while Weed continued to direct. The Academy named Bill Boyd executive director, and he also served as the talent coordinator for the show. Under their guidance, the ACM Awards moved first to the NBC network and finally to CBS, where it remains today.









In 1995, Fran Boyd (the Academy's first paid employee) became executive director after her husband, Bill Boyd, passed away. Boyd had steered the Academy since 1980 and held many key positions before taking on the role of executive director that was later bequeathed to his wife. After 34 years of service to the Academy, Fran Boyd retired in 2002 and handed the reins over to Bob Romeo, who served for 13 years. In January 2017, Nashville's Pete Fisher became the new CEO of the Academy of Country Music. After 17 years as vice president and general manager of the Grand Ole Opry, Fisher relocated to the Academy's headquarters in Los Angeles, bringing with him more than 30 years of experience in the country music community.

The show is still produced by dick clark productions under the direction of longtime Executive Producers Barry Adelman and Richard A. "RAC" Clark, as well as dick clark's Mark Bracco, Mike Mahan and Allen Shaprio.

After being staged in Los Angeles since the 1960s, the ACM Awards left Southern California for the first time in history and settled into Las Vegas at the Mandalay Bay Resort & Casino Events Center in 2003, then moving to the MGM Grand Garden Arena in 2006 (the Academy also adopted a sleeker, modern version of the "hat" trophy that year). In 2015, the Academy moved the show to AT&T Stadium — the



home of the Dallas Cowboys — to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the ACM Awards. The show (as well as the two-day ACM Party for a Cause Festival at Globe Life Park) sold out in 18 minutes, landing in the Guinness Book of World Records as the most attended live awards show (with more than 70,000 fans in the house). After that triumphant event, the Academy returned to the MGM Grand Garden Arena in 2016, and tonight, it finds a brand new home in the state-of-the-art T-Mobile Arena.

While the Academy strives to foster high-quality entertainment through the annual awards show and ACM Honors in Nashville, many events such as the annual ACM Party for a Cause and ACM Lifting Lives Golf Classic serve a dual purpose as fundraisers for the Academy's charitable arm. ACM Lifting Lives strives to improve lives through the power of music by supporting deserving charities through its annual grant cycle, as well as supporting those in the music industry hit with unexpected and catastrophic expenses through the Diane Holcomb Emergency Relief Fund. To date, more than \$8 million dollars has gone to a variety of causes nationwide — including Seacrest Studios, Stand Up 2 Cancer, Folds of Honor and Nashville's Vanderbilt Kennedy Center for the annual ACM Lifting Lives Music Camp. •





pon winning the ACM Entertainer of the Year trophy last year, Jason Aldean entered the elite class of ACM Triple Crown recipients, following past wins in the categories of Male Vocalist (for 2012-2014) and New Male Vocalist (for 2005). In September, his seventh album They Don't Know impacted the Billboard 200 at No. 1 — his third consecutive album to do so. His relentless touring has kept fans interested in his impressive catalog as "Big Green Tractor" and "She's Country" climbed to triple-platinum status in 2016, while "Burnin' It Down" grabbed double-platinum. Even his debut single, 2005's "Hicktown," notched a platinum certification. Meanwhile, the Macon, Georgia, native is no stranger to the ACM podium thanks to hits like "Don't You Wanna Stay" (2011 Single and Vocal Event, with Kelly Clarkson) and "The Only Way I Know" (2012 Vocal Event, with Luke Bryan and Eric Church). His incredible touring achievements were rewarded with the 2012 ACM Crystal Milestone Award. Now with more than a decade on the charts, Aldean divided his touring time in 2016 by headlining the Six String Circus Tour and sharing a bill with Kenny Chesney on stadium shows. The first two singles from They Don't Know — "Lights Come On" and "A Little More Summertime" — peaked at No. 1. Aldean will launch his They Don't Know Tour in April, followed by an exhibit at the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum opening in May. 




uke Bryan brings a down-home approach to country music, even though he's selling out arenas for multiple nights. In 2016, the superstar notched a platinum album with Kill the Lights, while six singles from throughout his career achieved platinum. Kill the Lights spent two weeks at No. 1 on the Billboard 200 and spawned chart-topping singles like "Kick the Dust Up," "Strip it Down," "Home Alone Tonight" (a duet with Little Big Town's Karen Fairchild), "Huntin', Fishin' and Lovin' Every Day" and "Move." Bryan headlined the Kill the Lights Tour through early 2017. A five-time ACM Awards co-host, Bryan won ACM Entertainer of the Year trophies for 2012 and 2014. After selling 1.7 million tickets on tour and charting six No. 1 singles from his album Crash My Party, Bryan graciously accepted the ACM's Gene Weed Special Achievement Award in 2015. His mantle also includes two ACM Awards in the Vocal Event category: "This Is How We Roll" with Florida Georgia Line (2014), and "The Only Way I Know" with Jason Aldean and Eric Church (2012). In addition, he won 2009 trophies for New Artist and New Solo Vocalist. Bryan grew up in Leesburg, Georgia, as the son of a peanut farmer. He honors his rural roots through Farm Tour concerts in smaller communities, raising money to provide scholarships to area students. Bryan released the Farm Tour... Here's to the Farmer EP in 2016. In February, he performed the national anthem at Super Bowl LI. His latest single is the poignant "Fast."









lorida Georgia Line, the reigning ACM Duo of the Year, showed their romantic side with "H.O.L.Y." Undeniably one of the biggest love songs of the year, the single reached double-platinum within a month and spent 18 weeks at No. 1 on Billboard's Hot Country Songs chart. By year's end, "H.O.L.Y." was the most-streamed and top-selling country single of 2016. The success ushered in the immediate success of their crowd-pleasing new album, Dig Your Roots, and its namesake tour. Florida Georgia Line have been on a hot streak since winning trophies for 2012 New Artist and New Vocal Duo or Group. They also picked up three consecutive Vocal Duo trophies (2013-2015) and a 2014 trophy in the Vocal Event category for "This Is How We Roll," a triple-platinum duet with Luke Bryan. Always up for a collaboration, the duo partnered with Tim McGraw for their latest smash, "May We All." In 2016, Florida Georgia Line accepted a Diamond award, signifying 10 million units, for their career-defining single, "Cruise." They also notched platinum status for the 2014 album Anything Goes and its title track. Additional single certifications in 2016 include double-platinum for "Stay," platinum for "Sippin' on Fire," and gold for "Confession." Hubbard hails from Monroe, Georgia, while Kelley is from Ormond Beach, Florida. They met as students at Belmont University in Nashville and have used their industry expertise to open a music publishing company, Tree Vibez Music. Their latest single is "God, Your Mama, and Me," featuring the Backstreet Boys, who will join the duo on tour this year.





ENTERTAINER OF THE YEAR NOMINEE

arrie Underwood added a dazzling new chapter to her career with 2015's Storyteller, the superstar's latest platinum album. The project's first three singles — "Smoke Break," "Heartbeat" and "Church Bells" — all achieved gold certifications in 2016. The new music kept fans flocking to shows across North America, Europe and Australia. She also tackled "Oh, Sunday Night," a new theme song for NBC's Sunday Night Football. A recipient of the ACM's Triple Crown award, she's received two Entertainer trophies (2008, 2009), three for Female Vocalist (2006-2008) and the New Female Vocalist award (2005). She's also been a winner in the categories of Album (2006, Some Hearts), Video (2006, "Before He Cheats") and Single ("Jesus Take the Wheel," 2005). Proving her enduring popularity since winning American Idol in 2005, Underwood notched numerous album certifications in 2016, including platinum for Greatest Hits: Decade #1 (2014), double-platinum for Blown Away (2012), triple-platinum for Play On (2009), quadruple-platinum for Carnival Ride (2007), and eight-times platinum for Some Hearts (2005). In 2016, she earned the ACM Lifting Lives Gary Haber Award honoring her humanitarian work. She has received the ACM Gene Weed Special Achievement Award for starring in 2013's The Sound of Music Live! Underwood joined the Grand Ole Opry in 2008. "Church Bells" received a Grammy nomination for best country solo performance, while "Dirty Laundry" soaked up more success at country radio. Her new single is "The Fighter," an upbeat duet with Keith Urban.



ENTERTAINER OF THE YEAR NOMINEE

eith Urban wasted no time in dominating country radio in 2016 — this time with music from his newest album, Ripcord. As Urban's latest No. 1 hit, "Blue Ain't Your Color" followed smashes like "Wasted Time," "Break on Me" and "John Cougar, John Deere, John 3:16." Urban experimented with multiple producers to give Ripcord some unexpected textures. Not that he needed to reinvent himself. His remarkable achievements already include ACM Awards in the categories of Male Vocalist (2004, 2005), Album (2004, for Be Here) and New Male Vocalist (2000). An extraordinary guitarist and an exceptional team player, Urban also shared wins in the music Video category ("Highway Don't Care" with Tim McGraw and Taylor Swift) and for Vocal Event in 2008 ("Start a Band" with Brad Paisley) and 2013 ("We Were Us" with Miranda Lambert). In recognition of his worldwide appeal, he was the 2009 recipient of the ACM's Jim Reeves International Award. After wrapping up his role as a judge on American Idol in 2016, the goodnatured superstar kicked off his summer tour of arenas and amphitheaters, playing 70 shows on four continents. He accepted the ACM's Mae Boren Axton Award later that year for his longstanding dedication and service to the Academy of Country Music. Since 2000, Urban has charted 37 consecutive Top 10 country hits — the longest hot streak since Alabama — and has notched 21 No. 1 singles on the Billboard chart. The beautiful "Blue Ain't Your Color" earned two Grammy nominations, while Ripcord competed for best country album. His new single is "The Fighter," an upbeat duet with Carrie Underwood.





A THOUSAND HORSES

A THOUSAND HORSES COMBINED THE WORDS "SOUTHERN" AND "PERSONALITY" to create the title of their debut album, Southernality. The band signaled a strong start with "Smoke," a No. 1 hit that became their first gold single. Growing up, lead singer Michael Hobby and guitarist Bill Satcher met while checking out guitars at the only music store in Newberry, South Carolina. Graham DeLoach, a cousin of Satcher's who plays bass, would come up from Georgia to visit during summers and holidays. They all moved to Nashville and met Brown, a friend of a friend who joined the band on guitar. They lived together and wrote songs, eventually landing a record deal in 2010 with a rock label in Los Angeles. Through that contract, they started working with producer Dave Cobb, who stuck with them after that label contract ended. They got a second chance with Republic Nashville, which issued Southernality in 2015. After "Smoke," the band released "(This Ain't No) Drunk Dial" and continued touring heavily. Their music draws heavily on their Southern influences, such as the Allman Brothers Band, Lynyrd Skynyrd and Tom Petty, while still being influenced by country legends like Alabama, Garth Brooks and Alan Jackson. They released "Southernality" as a single in 2016 and spent months on the road opening shows on Jason Aldean's Six String Circus Tour.


LAUREN ALAINA

LAUREN ALAINA NAVIGATED THROUGH A NUMBER OF PERSONAL SETBACKS before finally arriving with a new album, Road Less Traveled, in January. The title track proved to be the long-awaited hit she needed, paving the way for an opening slot on a tour with Martina McBride. Alaina got acquainted with country fans in 2011 as a 16-year-old contestant on American Idol. She placed second on the series and released a debut album, Wildflower, a few months later. "Like My Mother Does" became the first of her Top 40 country hits, trailed by "Georgia Peaches," "Eighteen Inches" (co-written by one of her heroes, Carrie Underwood), "Barefoot and Buckwild," and "Next Boyfriend." The latter track was the cornerstone of a 2015 self-titled EP. Alaina grew up in Rossville, Georgia, and started singing wherever she could as a young girl. As she entered the national spotlight, she fought with an eating disorder, her parents' divorce and vocal cord surgery. Her poignant song, "Same Day, Different Bottle," was inspired by her father's alcoholism. Produced by busbee, Road Less Traveled features 12 songs co-written by Alaina. She partnered with Jesse Frasure and pop star Meghan Trainor on the title track. In 2016, she announced her first film, also titled Road Less Traveled. Alaina stars in the movie as a songwriter who runs into her high school sweetheart while planning her wedding.





Hundreds of country stations premiered the track on the morning of September 16, leading the song to debut at No. 1 on Billboard's Hot Country Songs Chart. Proceeds from the sale and streaming of the song were donated to music education initiatives supported by the CMA Foundation. Directed by Joseph Kahn, the innovative video weaves footage of the artists with the glossy imagery of a country music landscape. Artists included Alabama, Jason Aldean, Dierks Bentley, Brooks & Dunn,



KELSEA BALLERINI

KELSEA BALLERINI BRIGHTENED COUNTRY MUSIC with her debut single, "Love Me Like You Mean It," guiding the way to the 2015 ACM New Female Vocalist trophy. The perky, up-tempo track climbed to No. 1, earned a gold certification, and received a stamp of approval from one of her musical heroes. Taylor Swift. Ballerini followed that with two more No. 1 hits: "Dibs" and "Peter Pan." She co-wrote all three of those hits, as well as her latest single, "Yeah Boy." Ballerini was raised near Knoxville, Tennessee, singing in school and church choirs and taking voice lessons. Growing up, she enjoyed a diverse range of music, from Frank Sinatra to Britney Spears, then became a dedicated country fan after discovering artists like Keith Urban, Dixie Chicks, Shania Twain and Sugarland. When she was 15, she moved to Nashville with her mother after her parents split up — a challenging time that inspired her to focus on songwriting. In 2013, she landed a publishing deal with Black River Entertainment and received a record deal from Black River (wrapped as a gift) at the company's Christmas party that year. CMT has included her in its Next Women of Country campaign and tour, while Billboard presented her with its Rising Star award at the annual Women of Music honors. Her debut album is appropriately titled The First Time.


DIERKS Bentley

DIERKS BENTLEY MADE HIS WORLD GO BLACK when the collection of all-new songs arrived in May. The rebound anthem "Somewhere on a Beach" shot to No. 1 and earned platinum certification. After that, the goldcertified "Different for Girls" carried him to the top of the country radio chart for the 14th time - and introduced his duet partner, pop star Elle King, to new listeners. The performance received a Grammy nomination for best country duo/group performance. Bentley filmed the gorgeous music video for "Black" in Iceland with his wife Cassidy, whose maiden name is Black. Bentley also has a long-term relationship with the ACM, since winning the 2003 statuette for New Artist of the Year. That initial victory arrived after staking a claim at country radio with "What Was I Thinkin'?" - a rambunctious song that remains a crowd favorite. He continued to rack up nominations for albums like Up on the Ridge and Riser, as well as the hits "Home" and "I Hold On." The hilarious "Drunk on a Plane" video led to a 2014 ACM trophy, thanks to Bentley's hilarious performance as a buttoned-up pilot (a goofy role based on his reallife flying license). Three prior albums (Feel That Fire, Home, and Riser) also achieved gold in 2016. Bentley is co-hosting the ACM Awards for the second year and is currently headlining his What the Hell World Tour.






VOCAL DUO OF THE YEAR

BIG & RICH

BIG & RICH MARCHED UP THE COUNTRY CHART in 2016 with "Lovin' Lately," their latest collaboration — this time with Tim McGraw. Along with their own unique chemistry, the duo has amassed a stack of hit songs recorded with friends like Hank Williams Jr. and Gretchen Wilson. As Big & Rich, Big Kenny and John Rich marched into mainstream recognition in 2004 with "Save a Horse (Ride a Cowboy)," a suggestive single that immediately became a country music catchphrase. The outrageous video earned an ACM Award nomination, an honor repeated by the poignant "8th of November" and their romantic No. 1 hit "Lost in This Moment." They also landed on radio playlists with singles such as "Holy Water," "Big Time" and "Comin' to Your City." The MuzikMafia cofounders racked up four consecutive nominations for Vocal Duo prior to taking a break in 2008. After pursuing individual career and philanthropic efforts, they issued the 2012 album Hillbilly Jedi. They satisfied their fans with singles like "Look at You" in 2014 and "Run Away With You" in 2015. As songwriters, their shared cuts include Jason Aldean's "Hicktown" and the ACM-nominated song, "Amarillo Sky." Their respective catalogs boast Tim McGraw's "Last Dollar (Fly Away)" for Big Kenny and Faith Hill's "Mississippi Girl" for John Rich. Their new single is "California," from their upcoming album, Did It For the Party.

BROTHERS OSBORNE


BROTHERS OSBORNE BROKE THROUGH WITH "STAY A LITTLE LONGER," a simmering platinum single that anchors their 2016 debut album, Pawn Shop. Of course, the brothers are not exactly overnight sensations. John and TJ were raised in the blue-collar waterfront town of Deale, Maryland, in a family of seven. Their mother was a hairdresser and their father was a plumber, although he wrote songs and played informal shows for friends in a shed behind the house. In time, he converted the building into a home studio for his guitar-playing sons. Then they formed a father-and-sons band called Deuce and a Quarter and started playing covers in local bars. Their repertoire ranged from Merle Haggard and Dwight Yoakam to Lynyrd Skynyrd and Bob Seger. After both siblings moved to Nashville, they formed Brothers Osborne with TJ on vocals. After two Top 40 country singles ("Let's Go There" and "Rum"), they released a five-song EP on EMI Nashville in 2014 and built a fan base through relentless touring. On Pawn Shop, Lee Ann Womack lends her vocals to "Loving Me Back," while musical influences like Hank Williams, Tom Petty and Bruce Springsteen shine through. They launched the headlining Dirt Rich Tour in 2016. Their latest single, "21 Summer," received a Grammy nomination. Brothers Osborne has already been named this year's ACM New Vocal Duo or Group of the Year Presented by T-Mobile.

KANEBROWN

BEFORE LANDING A RECORD DEAL, KANE BROWN CONNECTED TO FANS THROUGH SOCIAL MEDIA. The platforms gave him a chance to express himself by covering his favorite country songs as well as unveiling new material. Brown grew up in Redback, Tennessee, raised by a single mother. In high school, he encountered the music of country star Chris Young and won an 11th grade talent contest with a rendition of "Gettin' You Home (The Black Dress Song)." Then he started filming himself singing songs by Lee Brice, Brantley Gilbert and Alan Jackson, grabbing a significant fan base. In 2014, he had a viral hit with "Don't Go on Me," attracting Nashville's attention. A year later he released an EP and a single, "Used to Love You Sober." The video received more than 15 million views. That momentum led to a record deal with RCA Nashville, which issued the EP Chapter 1 in early 2016. Brown's selftitled debut album followed in December and debuted at No. 1 on the Billboard country album chart. Singles from the project include "Ain't No Stopping Us Now" and "Thunder in the Rain." Throughout the album, Brown draws on his own life experiences, ranging from being biracial and homeless, to facing abuse by his stepfather. Songwriters on the project include Florida Georgia Line and Chris Young. Lauren Alaina appears on the song "What Ifs."


LUKE Bryan

IN 2016, GEORGIA NATIVE LUKE BRYAN NOTCHED A PLATINUM ALBUM WITH KILL THE LIGHTS, which spent two weeks at No. 1 on the Billboard 200 and spawned chart-topping singles like "Kick the Dust Up," "Strip it Down," "Home Alone Tonight" (a duet with Little Big Town's Karen Fairchild), "Huntin', Fishin' and Lovin' Every Day" and "Move." Bryan headlined the Kill the Lights Tour in stadiums through early 2017. A five-time ACM Awards co-host, Bryan won ACM Entertainer of the Year trophies for 2012 and 2014. After selling 1.7 million tickets on tour and charting six No. 1 singles from his album Crash My Party, Bryan graciously accepted the ACM's Gene Weed Special Achievement Award in 2015. His mantle also includes two ACM Awards in the Vocal Event category: "This Is How We Roll" with Florida Georgia Line (2014), and "The Only Way I Know" with Jason Aldean and Eric Church (2012). In addition, he won 2009 trophies for New Artist and New Solo Vocalist. In February, he was in the spotlight performing the national anthem at Super Bowl LI. His latest single is the poignant "Fast."



CAM

CAM IGNITED HER CAREER WITH "BURNING HOUSE," a heartbreaking song inspired by a bad dream about an ex-boyfriend. Fueled by country radio, fans responded to the emotional ballad in a big way. She earned a platinum single, toured with Brad Paisley and received a Grammy nomination. All of this momentum ushered in her debut album, Untamed. Cam released the project through RCA Records in New York and Arista Nashville. Her initial single, the peppy "My Mistake," brought press attention from diverse outlets like Billboard, Perez Hilton and The Washington Post. Cam was born in Southern California, but her family relocated to the northern part of the state when she was a child. Starting in the fourth grade, Cam was part of the Contra Costa Children's Choir, which sang in 14 different languages and toured internationally. She studied psychology research at the University of California-Davis and pursued a music career in Los Angeles before relocating to Nashville. Her fondness for yellow often turns heads. Always incorporated into her wardrobe, the color reflects her cheery and relatable personality. She also shortened her given name of Camaron Ochs to present a friendly nickname to fans. In 2016, she released the striking music video for her single "Mayday," headlined the intimate Burning House Tour in listening rooms across the country and married Adam Weaver in Joshua Tree, California.


KENNY Chesney


KENNY CHESNEY GAVE LISTENERS A REASON TO SHOUT with Cosmic Hallelujah, the latest No. 1 album in his hit parade. Pop star P!nk teamed up with Chesney for "Setting the World on Fire," a magnificent duet that became the country superstar's 27th No. 1 hit on Billboard's country charts. He introduced the album with the lead single "Noise," which made a statement about the distractions of the modern world. With one of the most enduring careers in country music today, Chesney has sold more than 30 million albums since 1994. He claimed his first ACM Award as the 1997 New Male Vocalist. Five years later, he picked up Male Vocalist. Upon winning his first ACM Entertainer trophy, he secured the rare ACM Triple Crown achievement. At the 50th ACM Awards, Chesney accepted the 50th Anniversary Crystal Milestone Award for winning that top award four years in a row (2004-2007). Along the way, he earned trophies for the categories of Single of the Year (2002's "The Good Stuff") and Vocal Event of the Year ("Find Out Who Your Friends Are" with Tim McGraw and Tracy Lawrence). He accepted the 2011 ACM Crystal Milestone Award for selling more than 10.5 million tickets over 11 national tours. Born and raised in East Tennessee, the iconic entertainer headlined the Spread the Love Tour in 2016. His new single is titled "The Bar at the End of the World."

ERIC CHURCH

WHEN ERIC CHURCH SINGS ABOUT HAVING A RECORD YEAR, he's actually diving into his vinyl collection to get over a broken heart. Country listeners found the lyrics incredibly relatable and sent the moody single to No. 1. Prior to that, the North Carolina native caught everyone off guard with Mr. Misunderstood, an unannounced album that arrived at retailers (and at the doorstep of his premium fan club members in the form of a white vinyl record) in late 2015. The title track recalls a young man whose life is changed by music, an early romance and the determination to achieve his dreams by paying his dues. That storyline echoes Church's own journey to country stardom. After battling to get a foothold on the charts, Church won his first ACM trophy as New Solo Vocalist of the Year for 2010. He followed with 2012 awards for the Album Chief and the Vocal Event "The Only Way I Know" with Jason Aldean and Luke Bryan. He received the 2014 ACM Jim Reeves International Award in recognition of his extensive European tour. He added another ACM trophy in 2015 for the "Mr. Misunderstood" music video. His No. 1 hits include "Drink in My Hand," "Springsteen," "Give Me Back My Hometown," "Talledega," and "Raise 'Em Up" (a duet with Keith Urban). His newest single is "Kill a Word" featuring Rhiannon Giddens.

BRANDY CLARK

BRANDY CLARK HAD A BIG YEAR WITH BIG DAY IN A SMALL TOWN, one of the most critically-acclaimed country albums of 2016. "Girl Next Door" became her first Top 40 country hit and she joined good friend Jennifer Nettles on tour. The Nashville Scene put Clark on the cover of its annual country music critics' poll in January, after a strong showing in the songwriter, female vocalist, single and album categories. With songs like "Hold My Hand" and "Stripes," Clark's debut album 12 Stories prompted numerous media profiles detailing her unusual entry into country music. Clark grew up in the small town of Morton, Washington. Her father died in a logging accident and her mother worked in the mill office. Clark was also employed in the lumber industry but dreamed of a country music career like her heroes Patsy Cline, Loretta Lynn and Merle Haggard. She moved to Nashville in the late '90s to be an artist, then started to develop her songwriting talent. In 2010, she landed two songs on Reba's album, All the Women I Am, then broke through as a writer on The Band Perry's "Better Dig Two." Credits like Miranda Lambert's "Mama's Broken Heart" and Kacey Musgraves' "Follow Your Arrow" brought ACM Song of the Year nominations. She begins a co-headlining tour with Charlie Worsham in early April.

DAN + SHAY

DAN + SHAY CLIMBED TO NO. 1 ON THE COUNTRY CHART in 2016 with "From the Ground Up," the lead single from their latest album Obsessed. The duo performed the song on The Bachelorette over the summer, helping the track reach gold certification. These gentlemen have kept their momentum going since first enchanting listeners in 2014 with "19 You + Me," their platinum debut single. Dan + Shay used the last lyric of that song as the corresponding album's title, Where It All Began. Dan Smyers grew up in suburban Pittsburgh while Shay Mooney is a native of Natural Dam, Arkansas. They met at a late-night jam session at Smyers' house in 2012 and found a musical bond in their harmony-driven singing and detailed songwriting. They cite Rascal Flatts, Tim McGraw and Keith Urban as musical influences, along with '90s pop and R&B. The duo built on their early success with the breezy "Show You Off" and a sparkling rendition of "Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas." They notched their first No. 1 single in 2015 with "Nothin' Like You," a sweet ode to romance and individuality. Shay Mooney is a co-writer on Rascal Flatts' No. 1 hit, "I Like the Sound of That." Dan + Shay released a thoughtful new single, "How Not To," in September. Their headlining Obsessed Tour is now underway.

ELI YOUNG BAND

ELI YOUNG BAND OFFERED A UNIQUE SPIN ON SPIRI-

TUALITY with "Saltwater Gospel," a feel-good song that hints at more music to come. The ensemble cranked it up with Turn It On, a 2015 digital EP that ushered in four original tunes. The Texas-based band also landed a country dance hit with "Honey I'm Good," a collaboration with pop star Andy Grammer. Country fans still raise a glass to the band's smash(ed) single, "Drunk Last Night," which reached platinum in 2015. The early buzz on that single helped the band's corresponding album, 10,000 Towns, debut at No. 1 on Billboard's country albums chart in 2014. Eli Young Band examined the heartbreak and thrill of an aspiring artist in their ACMnominated anthem, "Even If It Breaks Your Heart." The song's success followed the double-platinum popularity of "Crazy Girl," the most-played single of 2011 and an ACM Award-winning Song of the Year. Their catalog includes Top 40 singles like "Always the Love Songs" and "When It Rains," which established their presence at country radio in the early 2000s. More recently they have satisfied fans with singles like "Say Goodnight," "Dust" and "Turn It On." Eli Young Band is lead singer Mike Eli, guitarist James Young, bassist Jon Jones and drummer Chris Thompson. This is their fifth nomination for ACM Vocal Group of the Year.



FLORIDA GEORGIA LINE

FLORIDA GEORGIA LINE, THE REIGNING ACM DUO OF THE YEAR, SHOWED THEIR ROMANTIC SIDE WITH "H.O.L.Y." Undeniably one of the biggest love songs of the year, the single reached double-platinum within a month and spent 18 weeks at No. 1 on *Billboard's* Hot Country Songs chart. By year's end, "H.O.L.Y." was the most-streamed and top-selling country single of 2016. The success ushered in the immediate success of their crowd-pleasing new album, *Dig Your Roots*, and its namesake tour. Florida Georgia Line have been on a hot streak since winning trophies for 2012 New Artist and New Vocal Duo or Group. They also picked up three consecutive Vocal Duo trophies (2013-2015) and a 2014 trophy in the Vocal Event category for "This Is How We Roll," a triple-platinum duet with Luke Bryan. The duo partnered with Tim McGraw for their latest smash, "May We All." Their new single is "God, Your Mama, and Me," featuring the Backstreet Boys, who will join the duo on tour this year.

RHIANNON GIDDENS

RHIANNON GIDDENS' STRIKING VOICE WAS INTRO-DUCED TO COUNTRY FANS THROUGH "KILL A WORD,"

a powerful collaboration with Eric Church that is a centerpiece of his album, Mr. Misunderstood. Like Church, Giddens grew up in North Carolina. As a founding member of old-time folk group Carolina Chocolate Drops, she won a 2010 Grammy in the best traditional folk album category for Negro Jig. Although she remains a member of the band, frequently playing fiddle and banjo along with singing, Giddens often explores other avenues to spread her music. She earned raves for her performance in the Another Day, Another Time concert film inspired the 2013 movie, Inside Llweyn Davis. A year later, she was part of a collective behind Lost on the River: The New Basement Tapes, a compilation of songs based on Bob Dylan's unreleased, unfinished lyrics. She embarked on a solo career in 2015 with Tomorrow Is My Turn. Recorded in Nashville and Los Angeles, that diverse album includes her versions of Dolly Parton's "Don't Let It Trouble Your Mind" and Patsy Cline's "She's Got You," along with songs infused with gospel, jazz and blues. In February, she returned to the spotlight with an internationally acclaimed album, Freedom Highway, which she recorded in Louisiana in just eight days. A gifted actress, Giddens also has a recurring role as Hallie Jordan on CMT's Nashville.


ASHLEY GORLEY

ASHLEY GORLEY HAS WRITTEN SOME OF THE MOST POPULAR COUN-

TRY SONGS of the last decade for superstars and rising artists alike. In 2016 he was named Nashville Songwriters Association International (NSAI) Songwriter of the Year for the second time. He earned his first recognition from the ACM when Trace Adkins' "You're Gonna Miss This" landed in the 2005 Song of the Year category. Since then, he's written for Jason Aldean ("Just Gettin' Started," "Tonight Looks Good on You"), Luke Bryan ("Kick the Dust Up," "That's My Kind of Night"), Brad Paisley ("American Saturday Night," "Then"), and Carrie Underwood ("Good Girl," "Heartbeat"). Within the last year, artists such as Jake Owen ("American Country Love Song"), Blake Shelton ("Guy With a Girl") and Cole Swindell ("You Should Be Here") benefitted from his songwriting craft. Gorley grew up in Danville, Kentucky, and moved to Nashville to attend Belmont University. A founder of Tape Room Music, Gorley is known for discover $ing \ and \ nurturing \ songwriting \ talent - not \ to \ mention \ his \ relentless \ work$ ethic. His most recent hits include Frankie Ballard's "Young & Crazy," Lee Brice's "That Don't Sound Like You," Chase Bryant's "Little Bit of You," Billy Currington's "Don't It." Dan + Shay's "Nothin' Like You," Brett Eldredge's "Don't Ya," Joe Nichols' "Yeah," and Thomas Rhett's "T-Shirt." This is his fourth consecutive nomination for ACM Songwriter of the Year.

CHRIS Janson

CHRIS JANSON FINALLY FOUND SMOOTH SAILING WITH "BUY ME A BOAT," a platinum-certified smash that followed a decade of paying dues in Nashville. A Missouri native, Janson moved to Nashville at age 18 after turning down a scholarship to study veterinary medicine. He gained a following by playing Tootsies Orchid Lounge in downtown Nashville, with his dynamic stage presence appealing to locals and tourists alike. For a year at Tootsies, he performed four shows a day. Once his reputation spread, he signed two label deals, but neither one panned out. However, his songwriting career kept him going, particularly with Tim McGraw's "Truck Yeah." For the sake of having something new to promote on a summer tour, Janson recorded and released "Buy Me a Boat" independently. Bobby Bones aired it on his national radio show simply because he liked it, then his listeners sent it to No. 1 on the iTunes country chart, CMT got on board and paid for a music video to be shot. The Grand Ole Opry has welcomed him to the stage more than a hundred times. In 2015, Janson released his debut album, Buy Me a Boat, via Warner Music Nashville. His latest singles include "Power of Positive Drinkin'" and "Holdin' Her." He also co-wrote Tim McGraw's 2016 single, "How I'll Always Be." Look for Janson on tour with Sam Hunt this year.




ELLE KING RULED THE ROCK AND ALTERNATIVE CHARTS WITH "EX'S

AND OH'S," an international success that positioned her as an in-yourface songwriter and performer. The double-platinum anthem earned two Grammy nominations and inspired an eye-catching video with babes aplenty - incidentally, all hunky men. The following year she ascended to No. 1 on the country chart with "Different For Girls," a duet with Dierks Bentley that also earned a Grammy nod. For King, country music is indeed part of her musical approach. She cites women like Aretha Franklin, Wanda Jackson and Dolly Parton as key influences, along with AC/DC and soul star Otis Redding. She is the daughter of comedian Rob Schneider and model London King. Growing up she was encouraged by her stepfather to constantly discover new music. As a teen in New York City, she sneaked into music venues by brandishing her fake ID, with a goal to get on stage. She released an EP in 2012 and performed "Playing for Keeps" on Late Night With David Letterman. RCA Records issued a full-length album, Love Stuff, in 2015. The gold-certified collection shows off her raspy vocals and banjo prowess while retaining her undeniable attitude. The heavily-tattooed singer recorded "Good Girls" for the latest Ghostbusters soundtrack and scored another Top 10 rock hit with "America's Sweetheart" — a title she's not at all interested in attaining.

LADY Antebellum

LADY ANTEBELLUM SWEPT INTO 2017 BY ANNOUNCING A NEW ALBUM, NEW SINGLE AND NEW WORLD TOUR. "You

Look Good" made an instant impact at country radio as listeners immediately recognized the superb blend of Charles Kelley, Hillary Scott and Dave Haywood. For the first time, the band used a horn section - another example the group's willingness to experiment. Lady A took a break in 2016 as its members pursued solo projects. Kelley released a solo album that focused on his soulful voice and ear for exceptional songwriting. Scott issued the Grammy-winning inspirational album, Love Remains. Haywood produced an EP by rising band Post Monroe. Reuniting at the Ryman Auditorium, Lady Antebellum hosted the 2016 ACM Honors, televised for the first time in primetime on CBS. Their history with the ACM stretches back to winning the 2007 statuette for New Vocal Duo or Group, following "Love Don't Live Here." They achieved their first No. 1 single in 2009 with the Grammy-winning "Run to You." Their mantle grew more crowded with "Need You Now," an instant classic that led to ACM trophies in the Single, Song, and Album categories, as well as five Grammys. They have won three consecutive ACM Vocal Group trophies (2009-2011) as well as the 2012 Jim Reeves International Award. Their upcoming You Look Good Tour will visit six countries. Produced by busbee, the album Heart Break arrives on June 9.

LUKE LAIRD

LUKE LAIRD HAS BEEN A FORMIDABLE PRESENCE ON THE COUNTRY CHART FOR A DECADE. His co-writing sessions with Carrie Underwood have yielded hits like "Last Name," "So Small," "Mama's Song," "Undo It" and "Temporary Home." Stars like Blake Shelton ("Hillbilly Bone"), Sara Evans ("A Little Bit Stronger") and Rodney Atkins ("Take a Back Road") pulled from his catalog, while Eric Church emerged as a regular co-writer on hits like "Drink in My Hand," "Give Me Back My Hometown," and "Talladega." Laird grew up in Hartsford, Pennsylvania, and enrolled at Middle Tennessee State University in Murfreesboro to study the music industry. He gained early cuts with Lee Ann Womack, Tim McGraw and Rascal Flatts. His abundant catalog includes Little Big Town's "Pontoon," Frankie Ballard's "Sunshine & Whiskey," Brad Paisley's "Beat This Summer" and Kenny Chesney's "American Kids." Newer credits include Luke Bryan's "I See You" and "Fast," Miranda Lambert's "Smokin' and Drinkin'," Tim McGraw's "Diamond Rings and Old Barstools" and Jon Pardi's "Head Over Boots." Laird and his wife, Beth, launched Nashville-based publishing company and management company Creative Nation in 2011. Their roster includes Barry Dean, Natalie Hemby, Lori McKenna and Steve Moakler. Laird won his first ACM Award as a producer for Kacey Musgraves' Same Trailer, Different Park. He won ACM Songwriter of the Year for 2014. This is his fifth nomination in the category.

MIRANDA LAMBERT

years. In 2016 she temporarily stepped out of the spotlight to create The Weight of These Wings, a double album that landed on the country albums chart at No. 1 in November. Lambert wrote or co-wrote 20 of the album's 24 tracks. The first disc is titled The Nerve; the second is titled The Heart. The project received praise from Billboard, Cosmopolitan, Entertainment Weekly, NPR, Rolling Stone and Variety, while the lead single, "Vice," earned two Grammy nominations. Of course the native of Lindale, Texas, is no stranger to industry acclaim. She has acquired numerous ACM trophies for hits like "Smokin' and Drinkin'," "Automatic," "Mama's Broken Heart," "We Were Us," "Over," "Over You," "The House That Built Me" and "White Liar," as well as additional Album of the Year victories for Platinum (which was officially certified platinum in 2016), Four the Record, Revolution, and Crazy Ex-Girlfriend. That impressive success proves her 2006 win for ACM New Female Vocalist was well-deserved. She toured the U.S. on her own headlining Keeper of the Flame Tour as well as a special guest

on Kenny Chesney's Spread the Love tour. She graciously

accepted the first-ever ACM Merle Haggard Spirit Award

at ACM Honors in 2016. Her new single is the self-penned





CHRIS LANE

CHRIS LANE CATAPULTED INTO COUNTRY STARDOM with "Fix," a sensational No. 1 single that surpassed 30 million plays on Spotify and achieved gold status. Like Sam Hunt and Florida Georgia Line before him, Lane mashed up urban styles with a country influence to rise from underground favorite to mainstream success. Lane grew up in Kernersville, North Carolina, focused on an athletic career. Although he played baseball in college, a number of injuries prevented him from going to the next level. Instead he picked up the guitar and started playing in cover bands around his hometown. He independently released an album credited to Chris Lane Band in 2012, then found modest success on the country airplay chart with "Broken Windshield View" in 2014. The relationships he made while promoting that song helped him emerge with "Fix," an undeniable pop-country breakout hit. In late 2015, Lane issued his debut solo album, Girl Problems, which puts his soaring vocals amid musical styles ranging from '80s rock and disco, to modern country and feel-good pop. By this time, Lane had accumulated a strong fan base by touring with Florida Georgia Line, Dustin Lynch and Rascal Flatts. In addition to more dates with Florida Georgia Line in 2017, he will open select shows for Tim McGraw and Faith Hill's Soul2Soul World Tour. His romantic new single is "For Her."

HILLARY LINDSEY

HILLARY LINDSEY MOVED TO NASHVILLE FROM WASHINGTON, GEORGIA, in 1994 to build a career as an artist. She studied the music industry and landed a publishing deal, then a record deal. But after the label contract fell apart, she took some time to regroup - and then started writing again. Since that time she has solidified her reputation as one of Nashville's most-recorded songwriters. Sara Evans, Lady Antebellum and Martina McBride climbed the charts with her compositions. Carrie Underwood has built nearly her entire repertoire around Lindsey's talent for co-writing, with credits on 12 singles ranging from "Jesus, Take the Wheel" to "Dirty Laundry." In 2016 she teamed with Lady Gaga to write "A-Yo," "Million Reasons," and "Grigio Girls" for the pop superstar's album Joanne. Lindsey also sang in Lady Gaga's band on Saturday Night Live. Prior to that, she partnered with her pals in The Love Junkies (the collective that includes Lindsey, Lori McKenna, and Liz Rose) to write the Grammy-winning "Girl Crush," recorded by Little Big Town. Additional credits include Gary Allan's "Every Storm (Runs Out of Rain)," Florida Georgia Line's "God, Your Mama and Me" (featuring the Backstreet Boys), and Tim McGraw's "Shotgun Rider." She is currently nominated for ACM Song of the Year with Keith Urban's "Blue Ain't Your Color." This is her first nomination in the Songwriter of the Year category.

LITTLE BIG TOWN

THE REIGNING ACM VOCAL GROUP OF THE YEAR, Little Big Town is still populated with the original four members, even as their audience has grown to millions. The band accepted the ACM Crystal Milestone award last year in recognition of "Girl Crush," which spent 13 consecutive weeks at No. 1 on the Billboard Hot Country Songs chart — the longest run for a group since 1959. The smoldering single reached triple-platinum status, won two Grammys, and paved the way to multiple prime-time performances. The band has accepted ACM trophies for Vocal Group (2012, 2014, 2015), Video ("Tornado") and Vocal Event ("Smokin' and Drinkin'" with Miranda Lambert). In 2016, Little Big Town collaborated with pop star Pharrell Williams for a surprise EP, Wanderlust. Of course, country fans who love harmony singing have adored Karen Fairchild, Kimberly Schlapman, Phillip Sweet and Jimi Westbrook for more than a decade. In 2005, the quartet landed their first Top 10 hit with "Boondocks" and won the 2006 ACM Award for New Vocal Duo or Group. Since then they've charted hits like "Bring it on Home," "Little White Church," "Pontoon" and "Day Drinking." The band received another gold plague in 2016 for their album Pain Killer. A new album, The Breaker, arrived in February, coinciding with the start of a Ryman Auditorium residency. Taylor Swift wrote the album's emotional lead single, "Better Man."

LOCASH

LOCASH IS RIDING HIGH AFTER MORE THAN A DECADE IN THE TRENCHES. Uplifting and up-tempo, "I Love This Life" infiltrated the airwaves in 2015. A year later, their flirtatious follow-up, "I Know Somebody," became their first No. 1 single. By then, the duo of Chris Lucas and Preston Brust had already achieved notoriety as songwriters with cuts like Tim McGraw's "Truck Yeah" and Keith Urban's "You Gonna Fly." (Songwriting talent runs in Brust's family, as his great-uncle Albert E. Brumley wrote "I'll Fly Away.") Lucas grew up on '80s rock and '90s R&B, but fell in love with country music after his dad gave him seats to a Garth Brooks concert. Lucas moved to Nashville in the late '90s and landed a job at the Wildhorse Saloon, In 2002, he met Brust, a fan of Quiet Riot and Motley Crue who had relocated to Nashville from Kokomo, Indiana. Working together at the venue as emcees and musicians, their dynamic chemistry was undeniable. They formed a band called LoCash Cowboys, a riff on the name of Brust's childhood pals - the Locash Money Boys. Starting in 2010, the band enjoyed modest success at country radio and accumulated thousands of fans on the road. Before releasing new music, they simplified their name to LOCASH. An album, The Fighters, arrived in 2016. Their new single is "Ring On Every Finger."

MADDIE & TAE

MADDIE & TAE SPREAD THEIR WINGS WITH "FLY," an empowering Top 10 single they wrote about inner strength and learning as you go. As their second hit, it showed a softer side of the duo, who glided up to No. 1 on the country chart in 2014 with "Girl in a Country Song." Maddie Marlow is a native of Sugar Land, Texas, and Tae Dye hails from Ada, Oklahoma. Growing up as fans of the Dixie Chicks, Marlow and Dye met at the age of 15 through a vocal coach and spent a summer in Nashville learning about music publishing. After interest from Big Machine Label Group, Marlow decided against college and Dye graduated high school early in order to relocate to Nashville. They wrote "Girl in a Country Song" with producer Aaron Scherz on St. Patrick's Day — and luck was on their side. The humorous single rose to platinum status and reminded listeners that women in country music are more than just pretty characters. Following an EP in 2014, Maddie & Tae released their full-length debut album, Start Here, in 2015. The duo co-wrote all 11 songs on the album. In early 2016, "Fly" achieved gold status. In addition to preparing their own fashionable capsule collection for the Bloomingdale's AQUA line, the duo hooked more fans with their singles "Shut Up and Fish" and "Sierra." The pair is currently working on a new album.

SHANE Mcanally

SHANE MCANALLY HAS WRITTEN FOR NEARLY EVERY ACM NOMINEE THIS YEAR, even grabbing a Song of the Year nomination for Miranda Lambert's "Vice." His 2016 hot streak also includes Dierks Bentley and Elle King's "Different for Girls," Brothers Osborne's "Stay a Little Longer," and Thomas Rhett's "T-Shirt." He's received past ACM nods for Song of the Year for Kenny Chesney's "American Kids," Lambert's "Mama's Broken Heart" and Kacey Musgraves' "Follow Your Arrow." His producer credits include Sam Hunt's Montevallo, Old Dominion's Meat and Candy, and the all-star vocal event, "Forever Country," as well as Musgraves' Same Trailer Different Park (2013 ACM Album of the Year), Pageant Material and A Very Kacey Christmas. McAnally was named ACM Songwriter of the Year for 2013. He grew up in Texas and came to Nashville as an artist, but found more success as a songwriter as stars lined up for his songs: Kenny Chesney's "Somewhere With You," Luke Bryan's "Kiss Tomorrow Goodbye," Jake Owen's "Alone With You," The Band Perry's "Better Dig Two," and Lady Antebellum's "Downtown." Newer credits include Midland's "Drinkin' Problem," William Michael Morgan's "I Met a Girl," and Keith Urban's "John Cougar, John Deere, John 3:16."



TIM McGRAW

TIM McGRAW IS THAT RARE MODERN SUPERSTAR with a history that stretches back nearly 25 years. That sense of perspective brought an important dimension to "Humble and Kind," an artistic highlight in the singer's long career. Lori McKenna wrote the thoughtful song as advice to her own children, yet families everywhere responded to the lyrics. The single climbed to platinum certification and inspired a book of the same name. The track comes from the entertainer's latest album, Damn Country Music, which also spawned the hits "Top of the World" and "How I'll Always Be." In addition, McGraw guest-starred on Big & Rich's "Lovin' Lately" and Florida Georgia Line's "May We All." He nabbed his first ACM Award as the 1994 New Male Vocalist. That same year, Not a Moment Too Soon won the trophy for Album of the Year. McGraw's mantle boasts two ACM Awards for Male Vocalist (1998, 1999), five trophies for "It's Your Love" (with Faith Hill) and three for "Live Like You Were Dving." The cinematic video for 2013's "Highway Don't Care" also picked up an ACM statuette. McGraw and Hill's dazzling Soul 2 Soul Tour was rewarded with the ACM's 2006 Career Achievement Award. The couple will return to the road in a new incarnation of Soul 2 Soul this spring. Their elegant duet, "Keep Your Eyes on Me," appears on the soundtrack to McGraw's latest movie, The Shack.

LORI McKENNA

LORI MCKENNA HAS NEVER LIVED IN NASHVILLE, yet she's gradually become one of the most desirable cowriters in Music City. At her kitchen table in Stoughton, Massachusetts, she wrote a heartfelt message to her five kids in the form of "Humble and Kind." Tim McGraw carried the song to No. 1 and it is nominated this year for ACM Song of the Year. "Humble and Kind" also led to McKenna winning her second consecutive Grammy for Country Song of the Year. The first one was for Little Big Town's triple-platinum single, "Girl Crush." One of McKenna's earliest champions was Faith Hill, who recorded "Stealing Kisses" for 2005's Fireflies. McKenna continued recording her own albums as more stars cut her songs, including Hunter Hayes ("I Want Crazy") and Keith Urban ("The Luxury of Knowing"). Listeners with an appreciation for craftsmanship studied songs like "How to Survive," "Numbered Doors," and "Your Next Lover." When McKenna was 7, her mother Lorraine passed away, a life-changing event that inspired the songs "Leaving This Life" and "Still Down Here." She released a new album, The Bird & The Rifle, in 2016. The project received a Grammy nod for Best Americana Album, while "Wreck You" was up for Best American Roots Performance and Best American Roots Song. She is a co-writer on Little Big Town's new single, "Happy People."

MAREN MORRIS

COUNTRY FANS SANG THE PRAISES OF "MY CHURCH" as the 2016 breakout hit from Texas native Maren Morris ascended the chart. Although she invokes musical heroes like Hank Williams and Johnny Cash in her lyrics, the dynamic single offers a new slant on spirituality. Growing up, Morris would sing in her parents' beauty shop and started learning how to play guitar when she was 12. In high school, she began playing in bars whenever she could get in. Her tastes ran from Chaka Khan to Clint Black, indicating an early comfort level with R&B and country music. She moved to Nashville at 19. Inspired by artists like Sheryl Crow, Dixie Chicks and Patty Griffin, she started crafting original material. After writing "My Church" with busbee, she stashed it away in case she ever landed a record deal. Her debut album HERO arrived at No. 1 on the Billboard country albums chart in June. A month later, "My Church" was certified platinum. She toured North America as a guest on Keith Urban's tour, then returned to the airwaves with the upbeat single "80s Mercedes." Highlights of 2016 include four Grammy nominations and a Grammy win for Best Country Solo Performance, as well as two collaborations with Alicia Keys (for ACM Honors and CMT Crossroads) and an appearance on Saturday Night Live. Following a number of club dates, she will support Sam Hunt on tour starting in June. Morris has already been named this year's ACM New Female Vocalist of the Year Presented by T-Mobile.

KACEY MUSGRAVES

KACEY MUSGRAVES MAY NOT BE CUT OUT FOR BEAUTY PAGEANTS, but it's likely she'd win talent competitions with her witty songwriting, sweet voice and clever music videos. She topped the Billboard country albums chart with 2015's Pageant Material and indulged her love of kitschy country with the music video for "Biscuits." She followed that with another music video costarring one of her heroes, Willie Nelson, singing a duet of his lesser-known gem, "Are You Sure?" Other musical contributions include her most delightful rendition of "A Spoonful of Sugar" for the We Love Disney compilation, as well as lending vocals to "Guess You Had to Be There" on Brian Wilson's album, No Pier Pressure. Her composition "You Can't Stop Me" also landed in the series Nashville. As a new artist, Musgraves brought a fresh perspective to country music with Same Trailer Different Park, a collection that candidly portrayed small-town life on "Merry Go Round" and offered open-minded social commentary on "Follow Your Arrow." Same Trailer Different Park won the 2013 ACM trophy for Album of the Year. After touring with the likes of Kenny Chesney and Katy Perry, the East Texas native opened George Strait's concerts in Las Vegas in 2016 and 2017. She also released her first holiday album, A Very Kacey Christmas. She will open shows for Willie Nelson and John Prine later this year.



OLD DOMINION

OLD DOMINION ENTERED INTO A COMMITTED RELATIONSHIP WITH COUNTRY RADIO when the band shot to No. 1 with "Break Up With Him." That breakthrough platinum single led the band to receive the 2015 ACM Award for New Vocal Duo or Group of the Year. Four of the five members have connections to Virginia, which prompted the band's name. Singer Matt Ramsey and drummer Whit Sellers met in middle school around Roanoke, Sellers befriended guitarist Brad Tursi and bassist Geoff Sprung at Harrisonburg's James Madison University. Separately, they relocated to Nashville to pursue music careers, eventually meeting up with Detroitraised multi-instrumentalist Trevor Rosen. Written by all five members of the band, "Break Up With Him" first broke through at SiriusXM's The Highway, then crossed over to terrestrial radio. In 2016, the band opened stadium shows for Kenny Chesney and earned gold certifications for the single "Snapback" as well as their debut album Meat and Candy. By year's end, "Song For Another Time" returned the band to the top of the country airplay chart. Individual band members have written songs for Dierks Bentley, Luke Bryan, Kenny Chesney, Blake Shelton, and Keith Urban. The band recently released "No Such Thing As a Broken Heart," the first single from its upcoming album.

JON PARDI

JON PARDI EARNED A RADIANT RESPONSE FROM CALIFORNIA SUNRISE, an album that echoes the music of his honky-tonk heroes. Pardi grew up in Northern California and gained an early interest in country music. He started writing songs at 12, joined a band at 14 and decided to move to Nashville at 19. Along the way he has worked for a number of unexpected employers - from a grocery store and a car dealership, to operating machinery and being a lifeguard. In time, Pardi landed a record deal and scored his first hit, "Up All Night," from his debut album Write You a Song. The single was certified gold, giving him enough momentum to play clubs across the country and build a substantial fan base. "Head Over Boots," the lead single from California Sunrise, became the inescapable feel-good tune of 2016. Country fans who latched onto his charisma from the very beginning found themselves shoulder to shoulder with new listeners as Pardi's approach to music appeals to traditionalists and contemporary fans alike. "Head Over Boots" was certified platinum, setting the stage for a successful follow-up, "Dirt on My Boots." This year he is warming up the crowds for Dierks Bentley's headlining tour. Pardi has already been named this year's ACM New Male Vocalist of the Year Presented by T-Mobile.



It may have been her first appearance at country radio, but she's no stranger to dominating the charts with collaborations. In the late '90s, she recorded with the R&B bands Basic Instinct and Choice. In 2000, her career exploded with Can't Take Me Home, an album that spawned three hit singles and a tour with 'N Sync. Two years later, she teamed with Christina Aguilera, Mya and Lil' Kim for "Lady Marmalade" from Moulin Rouge, while 2012's "Just Give Me a Reason" (from the No. 1 album The Truth About Love) featured Nate Ruess. Although she's clearly a team player, P!nk is an unquestionably singular talent, incorporating aerial acrobatics and power anthems into her impressive arena shows. She was born as Alecia Moore and grew up in Doylestown, Pennsylvania. She takes her name from a character named Mr. Pink in the film Reservoir Dogs. Singles like "So What," "Raise Your Glass," "Get the Party Started," "Try" and "Blow Me (One Last Kiss)" remain crowd favorites. Rose Ave., an exquisite duet project with her friend Dallas Green (and credited to You+Me) landed in 2014. P!nk provided the raging single "Just Like Fire" to the 2016 film, Alice Through the Looking Glass.



CASSADEE POPE

CASSADEE POPE CONTINUES HER UNIQUE JOURNEY

THROUGH COUNTRY MUSIC, going from a punk-pop band to reality TV to a No. 1 country single. Pope grew up in West Palm Beach, Florida, and began developing her singing talent in middle school. In 2008, she and guitarist Mike Gentile formed the band Hey Monday. Their demo was discovered by Fall Out Boy's Pete Wentz, who signed them to a record on his own Decaydance label, in a joint venture with Columbia Records. Hey Monday released a full-length album later that year, followed by three EPs over the next three years. The band went on hiatus while Pope pursued an opportunity to sing on The Voice. As a member of Team Blake, she won Season 3 and landed a record deal with Big Machine Label Group. Her platinum single, "Wasting All These Tears," arrived in June 2013; in October, the album Frame By Frame debuted at No. 1 on the Billboard country chart. She toured with Tim McGraw and Dierks Bentley in 2014, in addition to making multiple TV appearances and releasing a follow-up single, "I Wish I Could Break Your Heart." She reappeared in 2016 with the irresistible Chris Young duet, "Think of You." The recording led to new fans, a Grammy nomination and a spot on Young's tour. Pope released an EP, titled Summer, in 2016.



VOCAL GROUP OF THE YEAR

RASCAL FLATTS

RASCAL FLATTS RACKED UP THEIR LATEST NO. 1 SINGLE when "I Like the Sound of That" topped the chart last spring. The feel-good, goldcertified single is their 30th Top 10 single in Billboard, and their 13th No. 1 hit. The band has continued to tour relentlessly since getting their start in 2000 with "Prayin' for Daylight." Throughout their career they have found crossover success on career singles like "Bless the Broken Road," "Life Is a Highway" and "What Hurts the Most." Band members Gary LeVox, Jay DeMarcus and Joe Don Rooney spent the late '90s playing gigs in downtown Nashville and as sidemen on other artists' tours. Early in their career, they received the 2000 ACM Award for New Vocal Duet or Group and won 2002 Single of the Year for "I'm Movin' On." Remarkably they racked up seven straight years of winning ACM Vocal Group of the Year, for 2002-2008. The ACM honored them with the 2007 Humanitarian Award, while the Grand Ole Opry inducted them in 2011. In 2014, the trio accepted the ACM's Jim Reeves International Award for promoting country music abroad. They released a Christmas collection, The Greatest Gift of All, in 2016. In January, Rascal Flatts announced a new single, "Yours If You Want It." This is their 12th nomination in the Vocal Group of the Year category.


THE LOVE AFFAIR CONTINUES BETWEEN THOMAS

RHETT'S "Die a Happy Man" and romantic country fans. In early 2016, it became the first single since 2008 to spend six weeks atop the country airplay chart. In May it surpassed double-platinum status; by the end of the year it landed a Grammy nomination for best country song. But this is no overnight success. Thomas Rhett earned his first No. 1 country single in 2013 with the double-platinum "It Goes Like This." He returned to the summit with "Make Me Wanna," which also reached platinum. He titled his new album Tangled Up to reflect all the musical styles that influenced its irresistible sound - country, pop, R&B, rap, rock and oldies. Among the other platinum singles on the project, "Crash and Burn" casually shrugs off another failed attempt at finding love, while "T-Shirt" is an irresistibly sexy tune. In October, the Nashville native released a deluxe edition of Tangled Up featuring newest hit, "Star of the Show," along with guest appearances from Danielle Bradbery and Tori Kelly. His songwriting catalog includes material recorded by Jason Aldean ("I Ain't Ready to Quit"), Lee Brice ("Parking Lot Party") and Florida Georgia Line ("Round Here"). Following a number of arena shows opening for Aldean in 2016, Thomas Rhett embarked on his international Home Team Tour in February.





CHRIS STAPLETON


CHRIS STAPLETON PICKED UP ACM TROPHIES IN FOUR CATEGORIES LAST YEAR - Male Vocalist, New Male Vocalist, Album (Traveller) and Song ("Nobody to Blame"). The recognition arrived more than a decade after becoming a standout songwriter in the Nashville music community. Traveller captured the attention of country traditionalists and mainstream media as Stapleton made the transition from best-kept secret to Saturday Night Live. Stapleton grew up in eastern Kentucky. His father, who was a coal miner, introduced a diverse array of music while driving with his son — and those sounds of outlaw country, Ray Charles and Otis Redding seeped in. With encouragement from some Nashville songwriters he knew, Stapleton moved to Music City in 2001. He's had major cuts with Kenny Chesney, Thomas Rhett, Darius Rucker, George Strait and Josh Turner while earning Grammy nominations as a member of a blues-influenced bluegrass band called The SteelDrivers. Stapleton wrote or co-wrote 12 of the 14 songs on Traveller. Produced by Dave Cobb, the project achieved double-platinum certification in 2016. Gold singles were also awarded to "Fire Away," "Nobody to Blame," "Parachute" and the title track. His powerful music video for "Fire Away," which shines a light on the often taboo topic of mental illness, is nominated for ACM Video of the Year presented by Xfinity.


CARRIE UNDFRWOOD

CARRIE UNDERWOOD ADDED A DAZZLING NEW CHAPTER TO HER CAREER with 2015's Storyteller, the superstar's latest platinum album. The project's first three singles — "Smoke Break," "Heartbeat" and "Church Bells" - all achieved gold certifications in 2016. The new music kept fans flocking to shows across North America, Europe and Australia. She also tackled "Oh, Sunday Night," a new theme song for NBC's Sunday Night Football. A recipient of the ACM's Triple Crown award, she's received two Entertainer trophies (2008, 2009), three for Female Vocalist (2006-2008) and the New Female Vocalist award (2005). She's also been a winner in the categories of Album (2006, Some Hearts), Video (2006, "Before He Cheats") and Single ("Jesus Take the Wheel," 2005). On (2009), quadrupleplatinum for Carnival Ride (2007), and eight-times platinum for Some Hearts (2005). In 2016, she earned the ACM Lifting Lives Gary Haber Award honoring her humanitarian work. She has also received the ACM Gene Weed Special Achievement Award for starring in 2013's The Sound of Music Live! Her new single is "The Fighter," an upbeat duet with Keith Urban.


KEITH URBAN WASTED NO TIME IN DOMINATING COUNTRY RADIO IN

2016 — this time with music from his newest album, Ripcord. As Urban's latest No. 1 hit. "Blue Ain't Your Color" followed smashes like "Wasted Time," "Break on Me" and "John Cougar, John Deere, John 3:16." Urban experimented with multiple producers to give Ripcord some unexpected textures. Not that he needed to reinvent himself. His remarkable achievements already include ACM Awards in the categories of Male Vocalist (2004, 2005), Album (2004, for Be Here) and New Male Vocalist (2000). An extraordinary guitarist and an exceptional team player, Urban also shared wins in the music Video category ("Highway Don't Care" with Tim McGraw and Taylor Swift) and for Vocal Event in 2008 ("Start a Band" with Brad Paisley) and 2013 ("We Were Us" with Miranda Lambert). In recognition of his worldwide appeal, he was the 2009 recipient of the ACM's Jim Reeves International Award. After wrapping up his role as a judge on American Idol in 2016, the goodnatured superstar kicked off his summer tour of arenas and amphitheaters, playing 70 shows on four continents. He accepted the ACM's Mae Boren Axton Award later that year for his longstanding dedication and service to the Academy of Country Music. His new single is "The Fighter," an upbeat duet with Carrie Underwood.

BRETT YOUNG

BRETT YOUNG BOUNDED ONTO THE COUNTRY LAND-

SCAPE with "Sleep Without You," a sweet introduction to his rich vocal and confident delivery. Young grew up in Orange County in Southern California, and established himself as a promising baseball player. An elbow injury ended his athletic career in 2003. Unlike many artists, Young didn't grow up singing. Instead he played guitar while leading worship services, but only stepped up to the microphone to sing when the leader of the band was unavailable. But in 2014, he heard Gavin Degraw's album Chariot and found the inspiration to pursue music. He started writing and recording independent albums before deciding to make the leap from California to Nashville. Healing from a broken heart, he found a receptive community of songwriters to help him tell his story. His demos caught the attention of Big Machine Label Group as well as the publishing arm Big Machine Music. Shows like USA's Chrisley Knows Best, MTV's Real World and E!'s Kourtney and Kim Take New York featured his music. Drawn to emotionally expressive singers, he cites Marvin Gaye, Kenny Rogers and Tim McGraw as primary vocal influences. Following a tour with Brad Paisley, he will join Justin Moore and Lee Brice on the road in 2017. Produced by Dann Huff, Young's self-titled debut album arrived in February. His new single is "In Case You Didn't Know."



CHRIS YOUNG CONTINUES TO MIX TRADITIONAL COUNTRY with heavy metal - in the form of numerous gold and platinum certifications. In 2016, he grabbed gold for his newest album, I'm Comin' Over, as well as the huge duet with Cassadee Pope, "Think of You." He also earned platinum status with the sensual single "I'm Comin' Over," while career-making songs like "Aw Naw," "Gettin' You Home" "Who I Am With You" and "You" climbed to that same level. It's been more than 10 years since Young's rise from Nashville Star to bona fide country star. He won that competition series in 2006, but neither of the singles from his first RCA album cracked the Top 40. His luck changed in a big way when "Gettin' You Home (The Black Dress Song)" exploded in 2009, becoming the first of five consecutive No. 1 hits. A native of Murfreesboro, Tennessee, Young has wanted to be a country singer since he was a freshman in high school. One of his musical heroes, Vince Gill, provides vocals on "Sober Saturday Night," Young's latest Top 10 hit. In 2016, a dream came true with It Must Be Christmas, the singer's long-awaited holiday album with guests like Alan Jackson, Brad Paisley and Boyz II Men. In addition to an opening spot on Jason Aldean's tour, Young will perform at festivals throughout the summer.
