N BEHALF OF MY FELLOW COLLEAGUES ON THE ACM LIFTING LIVES BOARD, I welcome you to The Week Vegas Goes Country! We are excited to once again be returning to Las Vegas with the 6th Annual ACM Party for a Cause. ACM Stories, Songs & Stars, the ACM Lifting Lives Topgolf Tee-Off and the ACM Awards Official After Party all directly benefit Lifting Lives. To all of you here tonight, we thank you for your support!

We are extremely proud of all that Lifting Lives has accomplished this year and the significant support we have been able to provide to non-profit organizations, individuals in need and much-needed disaster relief. As we all know, this year was one filled with devastation and national heartbreak. After Las Vegas faced the unthinkable last October, ACM Lifting Lives responded immediately with a \$200,000 donation made to the MGM Resorts Foundation Victim Relief and First Responders' Fund, a \$25,000 donation to The National Compassionate Fund and \$25,000 to the Friends of Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Foundation. This support was utilized to provide humanitarian aid to victims, their families and first responders. Additionally, ACM Lifting Lives is providing funding to Musicians On Call Las Vegas, an effort to launch a bedside performance program in local hospitals.

After Hurricane Harvey's powerful winds and pounding rainfall devastated Houston and communities in Louisiana and Florida, Lifting Lives quickly responded. Donations were made to the American Red Cross, Greater Houston Community Foundation and Mutt Nation to provide immediate relief and supplies to those affected. Most recently, the Thomas Fire that swept through Ventura County, California, brought significant destruction. Dubbed the largest wildfire in the state's history, the fire burned 281,893 acres and more than 1000 structures, leaving hundreds without homes. Lifting Lives stepped in to support the Thomas Fire Benefit Concert, which raised more \$700,000 to help those affected.


The work of Lifting Lives doesn't stop there. We have given grants totaling close to \$250,000 to 23 charitable organizations providing vital work with an emphasis on improving lives through the power of music. Through the Diane Holcomb Relief Fund, individuals working in the country music community received confidential financial support while facing personal emergencies, medical crises or other emergent needs. And we continue to provide support to organizations such as the Vanderbilt University Kennedy Center, The Ryan Seacrest Foundation, St. Jude Children's Research Hospital and many others.

There is so much more work to be done, and with our partnerships and supporters, we are dedicated to fulfilling our mission. We extend our gratitude to the many artists, managers, industry professionals and the dedicated ACM staff who give of their resources, time and talent to Lifting Lives. With your help, we are making a profound difference!



member of the Country Music Hall of Fame and one of the most prolific hitmakers of all time, Reba McEntire has tackled everything from Music Row to Broadway to the Vegas Strip. She is an accomplished actress, businesswoman and national icon with 16 ACM Awards to her credit. She has sold more than 56 million albums worldwide and has charted No. 1 songs across four decades. The entertainment experience and professionalism she brings to everything she does makes her perfect to host the Academy of Country Music Awards.

Reba hosted the first ACM Awards show that was staged in Las Vegas back in 2003. This year, she re-takes the helm once again for the 15th time — making her the longest-running host in Academy history. Tonight, she is also up for ACM Female Vocalist of the Year — a trophy she has taken home 7 times.

"When you win an award, that means people are saying they like what you do, and you're loved and accepted," Reba said after hearing her name called among the nominees. "Everyone wants to be loved, and I'm no exception to that. It gives me confidence to keep doing what I'm doing and keep following my gut."

During her ACM Awards promo shoot in Santa Monica, Reba told us about her ACM experiences and what's coming next.

You took a few years off from hosting, how do you feel about coming back?

REBA: I feel really good about coming back because I missed it a bunch. When you're sitting out in the audience after being behind-the-scenes and knowing what's going on, you're thinking, 'I wonder what they're doing back there? Are they running long? Are they running short? Ooohh, I wish I knew what was going on back there!' So, I really did miss it, and I'm glad to be a part of it again.

After all the live TV you've done, what do you think is the most important thing a host can do?

REBA: The most important thing is to be natural. If you booboo, laugh about it and go on — and let the audience be part of the joke! They know what's going on, and it so much more fun for everybody to be part of what's going on.

Any pre-show rituals?

REBA: No pre-show rituals, just make sure you go to the bathroom. Make sure everything is zipped up and buttoned. My thing is, if I can get through those first two steps to go onstage and the first sentence, then it's all right.



You've been part of the ACM family for a long time. What do the ACM Awards mean to you at this point?

REBA: It means family, friends, coming together and celebrating what everyone has done the year before. It's become sort of a family reunion for me because all of my buddies are there. We're in competition, but we have fun, and we're always rooting for each other.

You're up for ACM Female Vocalist of the Year, which is something you've won many times. What is it about female voices that inspires you most and what would you say they bring to country music?

REBA: Female voices bring to country music that heart...more of the heart and soul. They can sing it and deliver that message and the feelings very, very well because they've lived it. They've been there, and a woman's got a big heart.

You're fresh off winning a Grammy for your last album, which was your first gospel album. What are you cooking up for us musically next?

REBA: I'm looking for songs right now. I want to go into the studio in the near future, and I'm trying to find the greatest songs that I can, so that if I sing it, it can touch your heart.

It's a bittersweet year. The ACM Awards and the country family are coming back together to Vegas for the first time since last October's festival tragedy. Why do you think it's important for us to come back?

REBA: It's very important for us to come back to give that support to the town and the fans, and to let everybody know, we're a team and we're strong. We join together. Music is very powerful, it's very healing. That's our job in the entertainment business is to help people go forward.


N THE HALF CENTURY SINCE ITS INCEPTION, the Academy of Country Music® has grown from a regional Southern California trade organization to a national powerhouse with its sights set on a higher purpose — improving lives by connecting fans, artists and the industry. In 2018, the ACM® is dedicated more than ever to promoting new artists, artists on the rise and established superstars, while supporting the good work of worthwhile charitable causes nationwide through ACM Lifting Lives.

The Academy was officially founded in 1964 in Los Angeles when performer Tommy Wiggins, songwriter Eddie Miller and club owners Mickey and Chris Christensen teamed up with other performers, radio and record label executives to establish the Country and Western Music Academy. Their vision was to promote country music in the western 13 states and to support artists based on the West Coast such as Billy Mize, Johnny Bond, Glen Campbell, Merle Haggard, Roger Miller, Buck Owens, Wynn Stewart, Jimmy Wakely and Tex Williams. In 1965, an official board of directors was formed. The Academy hosted its first official country music awards show in 1966, honoring the industry's accomplishments during the previous year. It was the first country music awards program held by a major organization, propelling country music into the public spotlight for the first time.

The Academy's signature "hat" trophy was created in 1968, the same year Fran Boyd was hired as the Academy's

first paid employee. During the early 1970s, the organization changed its name from the Academy of Country and Western Music to the Academy of Country Music (ACM). The awards show hit the airwaves in 1972, broadcast for the first time in national syndication on the ABC network. Gene Weed took over producing and directing the show in 1974, and in 1979 the Academy joined forces with dick clark productions to produce the show. Dick Clark and Al Schwartz served as producers while Weed continued to direct. The Academy named Bill Boyd

















executive director, and he also served as the talent coordinator for the show. Under their guidance, the ACM Awards moved first to the NBC network and finally to CBS, where it remains today.

In 1995, Fran Boyd became executive director after her husband, Bill Boyd, passed away. After 34 years of service, Fran retired and the position went to talent buyer and longtime ACM Board member Bob Romeo, who served in the post for 12 years. In January 2017, Nashville's Pete Fisher became the new CEO of the Academy of Country Music. Over the past year, the Academy has launched an extensive strategic planning initiative to craft a course that will take the organization into the next 50 years.

After being staged in Los Angeles since the 1960s, the ACM Awards left Southern California for the first time in 2003 and settled into Las Vegas at the Mandalay Bay Resort & Casino Events Center in 2003, then moving to the MGM Grand Garden Arena in 2006. In 2015, the Academy moved the show to AT&T Stadium — the home of the Dallas Cowboys — to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the ACM Awards. The show (as well as the two-day ACM Party for a Cause Festival at Globe Life Park) sold out in

18 minutes, landing in the Guinness Book of World Records as the most attended live awards show (with more than 70,000 fans in the house). After that triumphant event, the Academy returned to Las Vegas in 2016. Today, the show is still produced by dick clark productions under the direction of longtime Executive Producers Barry Adelman and Richard A. "Rac" Clark, as well as dick clark's Mark Bracco, Mike Mahan and Allen Shaprio.

While the Academy strives to produce high quality entertainment through the annual awards show and ACM Honors in Nashville, many events such as the annual ACM Party for a Cause serve a dual purpose as fundraisers for the Academy's charitable arm. ACM Lifting Lives improves lives through the power of music by supporting deserving charities through its annual grant cycle, as well as supporting those in the music industry hit with unexpected and catastrophic expenses through the Diane Holcomb Emergency Relief Fund. To date, more than \$13 million dollars has gone to a variety of causes nationwide — including Seacrest Studios, Stand Up 2 Cancer, Folds of Honor and Nashville's Vanderbilt Kennedy Center for the annual ACM Lifting Lives Music Camp.

In 2017, both the single and album gained gold status, while "Different for Girls" rose to platinum. Bentley introduced "What the Hell Did I Say" in 2017, leading into the What the Hell World Tour. He followed that with the thoughtful "Woman, Amen." Bentley grabbed his first ACM trophy as 2003's New Artist of the Year. That initial victory arrived after staking a claim at country radio with "What Was I Thinkin'?" — a rambunctious song that remains a crowd favorite. He continued to rack up nominations for albums like Up on the Ridge and Riser, as well as the hits "Home" and "I Hold On." The hilarious "Drunk on a Plane" video led to a 2014 ACM trophy, thanks to Bentley's comic performance as a buttoned-up pilot (a goofy role based on his real-life flying license). In February, he accepted the CRS Artist Humanitarian Award to honor the money he's raised through his Miles & Music for Kids concert and motorcycle ride. Over the last decade, that endeavor has raised more than \$4 million to benefit children's hospitals across the country. Bentley recorded his upcoming album, The Mountain, in Telluride, Colorado. He'll launch his Mountain High Tour in May.

DANIELLE BRADBERY

DANIELLE BRADBERY WANTED TO MAKE A STATEMENT WITH THE TITLE OF HER SECOND ALBUM: I DON'T BELIEVE WE'VE MET. The reality, though, is that Bradbery was introduced to millions of viewers as a 16-year-old contestant on The Voice. The young Texan frequently covered country songs by artists such as Sara Evans, Pam Tillis and Carrie Underwood on the show, leading to a victory in the fourth season. Her 2013 debut single, "Heart of Dixie," earned a gold certification and paved the way for her self-titled debut album. She spent the next few years touring with artists like Brad Paisley, Hunter Hayes, Scotty McCreery, Miranda Lambert, Thomas Rhett and Brett Eldredge. She sang on Thomas Rhett's album cut, "Playing With Fire," and occasionally popped up at his concerts to perform the song with him. She also joined Thomas Rhett and Nick Jonas on an episode of CMT Crossroads. In the summer of 2017, "Sway" indicated that Bradbery was back in the studio. A number of new songs surfaced with beautiful videos, including "Human Diary," "Hello Summer" and "Potential." By the end of 2017, she had issued an empowering new single, "Worth It," and performed it on Today and The Voice. I Don't Believe We've Met dropped in December. Bradbery co-wrote seven songs on the album, often injecting parts of her own life story into the narrative.

GARTH BROOKS

GARTH BROOKS COMPLETED HIS LONG-AWAITED WORLD TOUR IN 2017, reigniting the passion of steadfast fans while connecting to a new generation of listeners. Over the course of three years, 78 cities, and 390 performances, Brooks sold a staggering 6.4 million tickets, securing the biggest North American tour in history. The mileage and multiple-night engagements paid off as he landed his first No. 1 hit in a decade with "Ask Me How I Know." The impassioned single is a highlight of Gunslinger, the 2016 album that showcases Brooks' songwriting talent. As the ACM Artist of the Decade for the 1990s, Brooks is no stranger to the winner's circle. He claimed 1990 ACM trophies in the categories of Album (No Fences), Single ("Friends in Low Places"), Song and Video (both for "The Dance"). That same year he earned the first of back-to-back Male Vocalist awards. By the end of the decade he accrued six ACM Awards as Entertainer. Compelling music videos for "We Shall Be Free" and "The Red Strokes" claimed ACM trophies as well. Brooks received additional recognition from the Academy with the Jim Reeves Memorial Award (1994), the Gene Weed Special Achievement Award (1997), the 40th Anniversary Milestone Award (2005), the 50th Anniversary Milestone Award (2014) and the Cliffie Stone Pioneer Award (2010). The proud Oklahoma native joined the Grand Ole Opry in 1990, the Songwriters Hall of Fame in 2011 and the Country Music Hall of Fame in 2012. According to the RIAA, Brooks is the top-selling solo artist ever, with 148 million albums sold.

BROTHERS OSBORNE

BROTHERS OSBORNE MAY SING "IT AIN'T MY FAULT," BUT THERE ARE A WHOLE LOT OF FINGERS POINTING AT THEM ANY WAY. That's because the guys are riding a career high thanks to a string of hits from their gold-certified debut album, Pawn Shop. Last year they picked up their first ACM trophies for Vocal Duo and New Vocal Duo or Group. John and TJ were raised in the blue-collar waterfront town of Deale, Maryland, in a family of seven. Their mother was a hairdresser and their father was a plumber, although he wrote songs and played informal shows for friends in a shed behind the house. In time, he converted the building into a home studio for his guitar-playing sons. Then they formed a father-and-sons band called Deuce and a Quarter and started playing covers in local bars. When the brothers moved to Nashville, they formed a duo with TJ on vocals and John on guitar. Brothers Osborne finally exploded with the platinum single, 2015's "Stay a Little Longer." With "21 Summer" garnering even more fans, they wrapped their headlining Dirt Rich Tour in early 2017. Their new album, Port Saint Joe, is named for the Florida town where they recorded it. The duo's latest hit single is "Shoot Me Straight." They'll tour the United Kingdom in May before returning stateside for a tour with their friend Dierks Bentley.



KANE BROWN

KANE BROWN SET A RECORD IN 2017 BY APPEARING AT NO. 1 SIMULTANEOUSLY ON ALL FIVE OF BILLBOARD'S MAIN COUNTRY CHARTS, "What Ifs," a sizzling collaboration with his former classmate Lauren Alaina, was perched atop the Hot Country Songs chart (for sales, streaming and airplay) while the platinum-certified track reached No. 1 on the Country Airplay chart, the Country Digital Song Sales chart and the Country Streaming Songs chart. Meanwhile a deluxe edition of his selftitled debut album returned that set to No. 1 on the Country Albums chart, leading it to gold status. Brown was raised in Tennessee and Georgia, and his album draws on his challenging life experiences, ranging from being biracial and homeless, to facing abuse by his stepfather. He won an 11th grade talent contest by singing Chris Young's "Gettin' You Home (The Black Dress Song)." Then he started finding fans through social media and YouTube. In 2014, he had a viral hit with "Don't Go City on Me," attracting Nashville's attention. His 2015 EP, Chapter 1, featured the gold-certified single, "Used to Love You Sober." With tracks like "Ain't No Stopping Us Now" and "Thunder in the Rain," the original version of Kane Brown debuted at No. 1 on Billboard's country chart in 2016. He joined Jason Aldean's They Don't Know Tour in 2017 and will appear on Chris Young's Losing Sleep Tour this year.

LUKE BRYAN

LUKE BRYAN LIGHTS UP STAGES ACROSS THE **COUNTRY** with a resounding baritone, undeniable stage presence and an abundance of smash hits. A two-time ACM Entertainer of the Year, the charming superstar entertained fans in 2017 with his energetic Huntin', Fishin' and Lovin' Every Day Tour while numerous multi-platinum certifications poured in. Newly-certified quadrupleplatinum singles include "Drunk on You," "That's My Kind of Night," "Crash My Party," "I Don't Want This Night to End" and "Play It Again." The albums Crash My Party and Tailgates & Tanlines achieved that same status in 2017. Meanwhile his signature hit, "Country Girl (Shake It For Me)," shimmied to five-times platinum. One of the highest-profile artists in country music, Bryan is a judge on the new season of American Idol. After selling 1.7 million tickets on tour and charting six No. 1 singles from his album Crash My Party, Bryan graciously accepted the ACM's Gene Weed Special Achievement Award in 2015. Additional ACM wins include: Vocal Event for "This Is How We Roll" (2014) and "The Only Way I Know" (2012); and New Artist and New Solo Vocalist (2009). Bryan grew up in Leesburg, Georgia, as the son of a peanut farmer. He honors his rural roots through Farm Tour concerts in smaller communities, raising money to provide scholarships to area students. His latest hit singles are "Light It Up" and "Most People Are Good," the latter from his new album, What Makes You Country. Bryan's What Makes You Country Tour will roll through 2018.



GLEN CAMPBELL

GLEN CAMPBELL CONCLUDED HIS EXCEPTIONAL CAREER WITH ADIÓS, a collection of songs that the artist enjoyed, but had not yet recorded. Despite his diagnosis with Alzheimer's disease, he continued to record with trusted collaborators, such as Carl Jackson on Adiós. "Funny (How Time Slips Away)," his duet with Willie Nelson, is a cornerstone of the project. Even in Campbell's final months, his music captured his resonant baritone as well as his ability to share a story through music. For the first five years of a recording contract with Capitol Records in the 1960s, Campbell found little success as an artist, even though he was a soughtafter session guitarist on the West Coast. In 1967, he finally established himself with the now-classic "Gentle on My Mind," which picked up an ACM award in the Single Record of the Year category. In the late 1960s, he received back-to-back awards in the Male Vocalist and Album categories, as well as No. 1 hits with "I Wanna Live," "Wichita Lineman" and "Galveston." Along with crossing over to pop radio, he branched out into film roles and his own television series. "Rhinestone Cowboy" brought him back to the ACM podium to collect 1975 Single Record and Song statuettes. His achievements were honored with the 1998 Cliffie Stone Pioneer Award, the 2015 ACM Career Achievement Award and an induction into the Country Music Hall of Fame in 2005. Campbell died in 2017.

LUKE COMBS

LUKE COMBS BLASTED INTO COUNTRY MUSIC WITH THE FORCE OF A "HURRICANE." That penetrating single brought Combs' rugged music to a huge audience, although he'd been releasing independent EPs and developing his fan base for years. The North Carolina native was born in Charlotte, grew up in Asheville and attended Appalachian State University in Boone, In college, Combs noted the way ASU graduate Eric Church built his career. As a result, Combs started focusing on writing songs, learning guitar and playing countless gigs, thus winning over fans one show at a time. In 2014, Combs moved to Nashville and made the industry connections that led to a 2016 recording contract. "Hurricane" spent two weeks at No. 1 at country radio - a feat not achieved since 2001 by a male solo artist's debut single. He duplicated that feat with the cheeky hit, "When It Rains, It Pours." In 2017, he joined Brantley Gilbert's The Devil Don't Sleep Tour. In February, he launched the Don't Tempt Me with a Good Time Tour and sold out two shows at the Ryman Auditorium. During one of those Nashville performances, he was surprised with a gold plague for his debut album, This One's For You. He co-wrote every song on that project. "Hurricane" hit double-platinum in February, while "When It Rains, It Pours" is platinum. His new single is "One Number Away."

DAN + SHAY

DAN + SHAY DELIVERED ANOTHER RADIO HIT WITH "HOW NOT TO," A YEARNING POWER BALLAD that marked their third consecutive No. 1. That summer smash secured a gold certification, the latest mark of success for the likeable duo. Dan + Shay first enchanted listeners in 2014 with "19 You + Me," their platinum debut single. Dan + Shay used the last lyric of that song as the corresponding album's title, Where It All Began. That auspicious project achieved gold certification in 2018. Dan Smyers grew up in suburban Pittsburgh while Shay Mooney is a native of Natural Dam, Arkansas. They met at a late-night jam session at Smyers' house in 2012 and found a musical bond in their harmony-driven singing and detailed songwriting. They cite Rascal Flatts, Tim McGraw and Keith Urban as musical influences, along with '90s pop and R&B. They notched their first No. 1 single in 2015 with "Nothin' Like You," a sweet ode to romance and individuality. In 2016, they returned to the top spot with "From the Ground Up," the lead single from their second album, Obsessed. The duo performed the song on The Bachelorette, setting the stage for another platinum certification. Shay Mooney co-wrote Rascal Flatts' "I Like the Sound of That." Dan + Shay will tour with Rascal Flatts in 2018. The duo's new single is "Tequila."

DEVIN DAWSON

DEVIN DAWSON MESHES SMOOTH SINGING WITH SMART SONGWRITING on his debut album, Dark Horse. That project arrived in January, bolstered by the lead single, "All on Me." Dawson filmed the music video inside the gloomy walls of the former Tennessee State Penitentiary in Nashville. That environment might have reminded him of growing up in Orangevale, California, just beyond the gates of Folsom Prison. Naturally, Johnny Cash is an influence, along with Alan Jackson, Creedence Clearwater Revival and Marvin Gave. After playing in a metal band for a few years after high school, Dawson relocated to Nashville in his early 20s and attended Belmont University. At the end of 2014, Dawson and a college friend, Louisa Wendorff, filmed a mashup of two Taylor Swift songs - "Blank Space" and "Style." Swift gave an enthusiastic endorsement, which made heads turn in Nashville and beyond. For Dark Horse, Dawson enlisted producer Jay Joyce to bring out the melodies and moodiness in his music. He spent 2017 on the road as a guest on Maren Morris' Hero Tour and Tim McGraw & Faith Hill's Soul2Soul Tour. In March, Dawson's gigs included Nashville club Exit/In, South by Southwest music festival in Austin, and the Grand Ole Opry. Thanks to its pop appeal, "All on Me" crossed over to the Billboard Hot 100. Dawson will join Brett Eldredge on tour this spring.

RUSSELL **DICKERSON**

RUSSELL DICKERSON WROTE HIS SIGNATURE HIT, "YOURS," IN 2014. THEN SPENT THE NEXT FOUR YEARS ON A JOURNEY TO NO. 1 ON THE COUNTRY AIRPLAY CHART. Dickerson grew up in Nashville fascinated by concert DVDs of Garth Brooks and Keith Urban. He also developed an interest in classic country artists like Jim Reeves and George Jones. While he was at Belmont University, he landed a publishing deal, management and a booking agent, allowing him to build a foundation as an entertainer. Dickerson composed "Yours" with two friends from Belmont. On a rainy day in 2015, his wife Kailey shot a black-and-white video for the song at a small airport in Nashville. The clip caught on, leading to the song's prominent placement on SiriusXM and Spotify. The Knot named it one of 2016's best wedding songs. That same year he made his Grand Ole Opry debut and signed a recording contract. Dickerson performed the romantic ballad on The Bachelorette in June 2017. A full-length album, also titled Yours, followed in October. After years of playing his own dates, he accepted an opening slot on 2017 tours with Thomas Rhett and Florida Georgia Line. That exposure helped bring in 100 million streams for "Yours," as well as a 2018 spot on tour with Lady Antebellum and Darius Rucker. His new single, "Blue Tacoma," was featured in the film, Logan.

FLORIDA GEORGIA **LINE**

FLORIDA GEORGIA LINE IGNORE THE BOUNDARIES WITH THEIR MASHUP STYLE OF COUNTRY, POP AND URBAN MUSIC. The powerhouse duo earned two ACM trophies in 2016 as "H.O.L.Y." claimed a Single Record win and "May We All" (with Tim McGraw) picked up Vocal Event. A standout track from their latest album, Dia Your Roots, "H.O.L.Y." rose to triple-platinum status last year, as "May We All" climbed to platinum. In addition, FGL and Backstreet Boys sent "God, Your Mama and Me" to No. 1 at country radio. It became their third platinum single from the album. Other notable collaborations for the duo include the gold-certified pop hit "Meant to Be" with Bebe Rexha, as well as "Up Down" with country newcomer Morgan Wallen. "Smooth," the fourth single from Dig Your Roots, achieved gold status in January. Tyler Hubbard and Brian Kelley met as students at Belmont University and opened a music publishing company, Tree Vibez Music, in 2015. They have earned three consecutive ACM Vocal Duo awards (2013-2015) as well as the trophy for 2012 New Artist and New Vocal Duo or Group. "This Is How We Roll," featuring Luke Bryan, won the ACM Award for Vocal Event; it reached quadruple-platinum status in 2017. Florida Georgia Line opened a four-story bar in downtown Nashville called FGL House last year. They are scheduled for multiple festival appearances in 2018.




VINCE GILL

VINCE GILL MAY BE COUNTRY MUSIC'S MOST APPROACHABLE STAR. Countless artists have harmonized with him for decades now. In 2017, Maren Morris asked him to sing on her poetic song, "Dear Hate," while Chris Young collaborated with the legend on the No. 1 "Sober Saturday Night." As one of the most exquisite vocalists in any genre, Gill accepted the invitation when The Eagles asked him to join their lineup on a high-profile tour in 2017 and 2018. Gill grew up in Oklahoma and paid his dues in the Los Angeles music scene before relocating to Nashville. He secured a 1984 ACM trophy for New Male Vocalist, but his hits were inconsistent. Finally in the 1990s, he conquered the charts with 22 Top 10 hits. He earned two trophies for ACM Male Vocalist (1992-1993), while "I Still Believe in You" claimed the award in the Song of the Year category. As a guest of Brooks & Dunn, he and Sheryl Crow earned the 2006 Vocal Event award for "Building Bridges." Gill has received the ACM Humanitarian Award (2005) and the Career Achievement Award (2011). Gill was inducted into the Grand Ole Opry in 1991 and the Country Music Hall of Fame in 2007. Known for his generous heart and his incredible musical talent, Gill hosts multiple annual fundraisers for the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum.

ASHLEY **GORLEY**

ASHLEY GORLEY HAS WRITTEN SOME OF THE MOST POPULAR COUNTRY SONGS OF THE LAST DECADE

for superstars and rising artists alike. In 2017 he was named Nashville Songwriters Association International (NSAI) Songwriter of the Year for the third time. ASCAP awarded him his fifth Songwriter of the Year award in 2017 - breaking a record for an ASCAP country songwriter. In a 12-month period, Gorley charted nine No. 1 singles as a songwriter. These include: "American Country Love Song" by Jake Owen; "Middle of a Memory" by Cole Swindell; "Dirty Laundry" by Carrie Underwood; "A Guy With a Girl" by Blake Shelton; "Today" by Brad Paisley; "Dirt on My Boots" by Jon Pardi; "Black" by Dierks Bentley; "Do I Make You Wanna" by Billy Currington; and "Unforgettable" by Thomas Rhett, Gorley grew up in Danville, Kentucky, and moved to Nashville to attend Belmont University. A founder of Tape Room Music, Gorley is known for discovering and nurturing songwriting talent - not to mention his relentless work ethic. He earned his first recognition from the Academy when Trace Adkins' "You're Gonna Miss This" landed in the 2008 Song of the Year category. He has written No. 1 singles for Jason Aldean, Luke Bryan, Dan + Shay, Brett Eldredge, Rascal Flatts, Thomas Rhett, Darius Rucker and more. This is his fifth consecutive nomination for ACM Songwriter of the Year.

HIGH VALLEY

HIGH VALLEY, THE DUO COMPOSED OF BROTHERS BRAD AND CURTIS REMPEL, ARE MAKING A NAME FOR THEMSELVES BEYOND THEIR NATIVE CANADA with hits like "She's With Me" and "Make You Mine." High Valley have roots in a small Mennonite community named LaCrete in northern Alberta. They grew up farming as children, with both brothers driving combines on their family's 1,400 acres. At the age of 12, Brad imagined himself as a radio host and started recording shows on his cassette recorder. A band name he made up for his imaginary guests — High Valley — became official as Brad formed a group with his friends and his brother, Bryan. That lineup evolved to include Brad, Bryan, and Curtis, and the trio made its Grand Ole Opry debut in 2013. Bryan left the band the following year to raise a family, while Brad and Curtis signed a contract as a duo in 2015. The album Dear Life followed in 2016. Country radio supported "Make You Mine," while SiriusXM lined up a Highway Finds tour headlined by the duo. "She's With Me" gave the duo another strong showing at radio. In March, High Valley issued the Farmhouse Sessions EP with acoustic versions of seven songs from Dear Life recorded at their farmhouse outside of Nashville. Following dates in Europe and Australia. High Valley will tour Canada later this month.

TIM McGRAW

TIM McGRAW AND FAITH HILL HAVE BROUGHT JOY TO MILLIONS OF FANS on their multiple Soul2Soul tours - and now, their first-ever duets album. Married since 1996, the couple released The Rest of Our Life and returned to the airwaves with "Speak to a Girl" and the title track. In 2017, the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum opened a magnificent exhibit about the couple's life and career. In addition, their recording of "Keep Your Eyes on Me" landed on the soundtrack to The Shack. Their knockout Soul2Soul The World Tour delivered hits like "It's Your Love" (which won ACM awards in four categories) and "Meanwhile Back at Mama's." A concert film premiered on Showtime in November. McGraw nabbed his first ACM trophy as the 1994 New Male Vocalist. That same year, Not a Moment Too Soon was named Album of the Year. McGraw's mantle also boasts two ACM awards for Male Vocalist (1998, 1999), three for "Live Like You Were Dying," five Vocal Event trophies and a shared 2006 Career Achievement Award for that year's massive Soul2Soul Tour. Hill claimed the 1993 New Female Vocalist award, thanks to "Wild One," "Piece of My Heart" and her multiplatinum debut album. She has earned three ACM Female Vocalist awards (1998-2000) and trophies for signature solo hits like "This Kiss" and "Breathe." This is the couple's first nomination in the ACM Vocal Duo category. Their Soul2Soul World Tour continues in 2018.





SAM HUNT

SAM HUNT SHATTERED A RECORD WHEN "BODY LIKE A BACK ROAD" LODGED ITSELF AT NO. 1 on the Hot Country Songs chart for an astonishing 34 weeks. The captivating single hinted at new music in the pipeline, which fans have been clamoring for since 2014's multiplatinum album, Montevallo. Infused with R&B influences, that tripleplatinum project launched five massive singles: "Leave the Night On," "Take Your Time," "House Party," "Break Up in a Small Town" and "Make You Miss Me." Growing up in Cedartown, Georgia, Hunt seemed poised for a football career. Although he was the starting quarterback at the University of Alabama in Birmingham and spent a brief time with the Kansas City Chiefs, he heeded the call of a music career in Nashville. He'd been writing songs in college and found a publishing deal soon after his move to Music City. His high-profile cuts include Kenny Chesney's "Come Over," Billy Currington's "We Are Tonight," William Michael Morgan's "I Met a Girl" and Keith Urban's "Cop Car." Montevallo bowed at No. 1 on the Billboard country albums chart the same week that "Leave the Night On" topped the Hot Country Songs chart. In early 2017, Hunt married Hannah Lee Fowler, then embarked on the headlining 15 in a 30 Tour. Hunt will join select dates on Luke Bryan's What Makes You Country Tour this year.

LADY **Antebellum**

LADY ANTEBELLUM BURST BACK ONTO THE SCENE WITH 2017'S "YOU LOOK GOOD," a sultry single that prompted the crowd-pleasing You Look Good World Tour. The trio took a few years off while its three members Dave Haywood, Charles Kelley and Hillary Scott pursued solo projects. After a breather, they reunited for a highly-anticipated album of all-new material, Heart Break. The mature title track is one of 11 songs on the album co-written by Lady Antebellum and some of their favorite collaborators. Lady A's members slipped out of Nashville to record the project in Los Angeles and Florida with producer-songwriter busbee. The change of scenery gave them an opportunity to reach beyond their Nashville influences, thus giving Heart Break a modern pop vibe. Of course, Lady A is familiar with crossover success. Released in 2009, "Need You Now" is a modern classic that led to ACM trophies in the Song, Single Record and Album categories. The band has also claimed the ACM Jim Reeves International Award (2012), three trophies for Vocal Group (2009-2011) and New Vocal Duo or Group (2007). The band's family continues to grow as Dave Haywood and his wife, Kelly, welcomed a new daughter in December, while Hillary Scott and her husband, Chris, announced the birth of twin daughters in January. Lady Antebellum will co-headline the Summer Plays On Tour with Darius Rucker this summer.



MIRANDA LAMBERT

MIRANDA LAMBERT IS THE REIGNING ACM FEMALE VOCALIST, an award she's received eight consecutive years. She wrote or co-wrote 20 of the 24 tracks on her newest release, The Weight of These Wings. Highlighted by singles like "Vice" and "Tin Man," the platinum project won an ACM Award for Album of the Year — the fifth time she's won in that category. She showed off her comical chops with the colorful video for "We Should Be Friends." Loaded with new material and road-worn hits, she embarked on the Highway Vagabond Tour with Old Dominion and Aubrie Sellers in 2017. The Lindale, Texas, native has acquired numerous ACM trophies for hits like "Smokin' and Drinkin'," "Automatic," "Mama's Broken Heart," "We Were Us," "Over," "Over You," "The House That Built Me" and "White Liar." That impressive success proves her 2006 win for ACM New Female Vocalist was well-deserved. Lambert graciously accepted the first-ever ACM Merle Haggard Spirit Award at the 2016 ACM Honors event in Nashville. She supports the next generation of women creators through a songwriting scholarship at Belmont University while continuing to raise awareness for shelter dogs through her MuttNation Foundation. She kicked off the Livin' Like Hippies tour in 2018 with opener Jon Pardi, Later this year she'll launch her Idyllwind lifestyle brand with Boot Barn and team up with Little Big Town for The Bandwagon Tour.

LANCO

LANCO SERENADED LISTENERS WITH "GREATEST LOVE STORY," a romantic single that achieved platinum certification even before the release of the band's 2018 debut album, Hallelujah Nights. The sweet song received a boost when the band performed it during a one-on-one date on The Bachelor, LANCO's lead singer and lyricist Brandon Lancaster grew up in the Nashville area and started writing songs as a teenager. He met drummer Tripp Howell at a music festival in East Tennessee. When they discovered they were both moving to Music City, they stayed in touch. In time, Lancaster met guitarist Eric Steedly, who introduced him to bass player Chandler Baldwin and keyboard player Jaren Hampton. The five young men formed LANCO (formerly Lancaster and Company) in an effort to shape a band around Lancaster's songs, while still drawing on the musicians' Southern rock and classic rock influences. Lancaster spotted producer Jay Joyce at a Keith Urban concert in 2014 and introduced himself, briefly stepping away from his job selling hot dogs. After further conversations, Joyce took a chance and produced the songs that would form the band's 2016 self-titled EP, as well as 2018's Hallelujah Nights. "Greatest Love Story" ascended to No. 1 at country radio in November after a 38-week climb. Look for LANCO on Chris Young's upcoming Losing Sleep Tour. Their new single is "Born to Love You."



HILLARY LINDSEY

HILLARY LINDSEY IS ONE OF NASHVILLE'S MOST VERSATILE SONGWRITERS, crafting hits for Lady Antebellum ("You Look Good") as well as Lady Gaga ("Million Reasons"). Lindsey grew up in Washington, Georgia, and has been writing songs since she was 10. She moved to Nashville in 1994 to study the music industry at Belmont University and seek a career as a recording artist. She quickly landed a publishing deal, garnering eight cuts in her first year. A subsequent recording contract fell apart, so she took some time off before writing again. Since then, she has solidified her reputation as a talented composer with a commercial ear. Lindsey received a 2005 ACM nomination as a songwriter for Carrie Underwood's "Jesus, Take the Wheel." That led to three more nominations in the Song category: Gary Allan's "Every Storm (Runs Out of Rain)" (2013), Little Big Town's "Girl Crush" (2015) and Keith Urban's "Blue Ain't Your Color" (2016). Lindsey is only the second person to receive the Nashville Songwriter Association International (NSAI) Song of the Year three times. Her songs have been recorded by Sara Evans ("A Little Bit Stronger"). Martina McBride ("Blessed"), Tim McGraw ("Shotgun Rider") and many others, Recent No. 1 hits include Kelsea Ballerini's "Legends" and Florida Georgia Line's "God, Your Mama and Me," featuring the Backstreet Boys. This is her second nomination for Songwriter of the Year.

LITTLE BIG TOWN

LITTLE BIG TOWN IS STILL POPULATED WITH THE ORIGINAL FOUR MEMBERS, EVEN AS THEIR AUDIENCE HAS GROWN TO MILLIONS. A 2017 album, The Breaker, coincided with the start of a Ryman Auditorium residency. Taylor Swift wrote the emotional lead single, "Better Man," which went platinum and won a Grammy earlier this year. Their prior album, 2014's Pain Killer, also jumped to platinum status in 2017. Little Big Town is the reigning ACM Vocal Group, an award they've won four times (2012, 2014-2016). The band accepted the 2015 ACM Crystal Milestone award in recognition of "Girl Crush," which spent 13 consecutive weeks at No. 1 on Billboard's Hot Country Songs chart — the longest run for a group since 1959. The smoldering single reached triple-platinum, won two Grammys and paved the way to multiple primetime performances. Band members Karen Fairchild, Kimberly Schlapman, Phillip Sweet and Jimi Westbrook have won ACM Awards for New Vocal Duo or Group (2006), Video ("Tornado"), and Vocal Event ("Smokin' and Drinkin'" with Miranda Lambert). Today their set list stretches from early hits like "Boondocks" to contemporary favorites such as "Pontoon" and "Day Drinking." In 2018, Little Big Town will bring Kacey Musgraves and Midland on The Breakers Tour. After that, Miranda Lambert and Little Big Town will unite for The Bandwagon Tour.

LOCASH

LOCASH IS RIDING HIGH AFTER MORE THAN A DECADE IN THE TRENCHES. Uplifting and up-tempo, "I Love This Life" infiltrated the airwaves in 2015, introducing their music to millions of listeners. A year later, their flirtatious follow-up, "I Know Somebody," became their first No. 1 single. By then, the duo of Chris Lucas and Preston Brust had already achieved notoriety as songwriters with cuts like Tim McGraw's "Truck Yeah" and Keith Urban's "You Gonna Fly." Lucas grew up on '80s rock and '90s R&B, but fell in love with country music seeing a Garth Brooks concert. Lucas moved to Nashville in the late '90s and landed a job at the Wildhorse Saloon. In 2002, he met Brust, a fan of Quiet Riot and Motley Crue who had relocated to Nashville from Kokomo, Indiana. They formed a band called LoCash Cowboys, a riff on the name of Brust's childhood pals — the Locash Money Boys. Starting in 2010, the group found modest success at country radio and accumulated thousands of fans on the road. Before releasing new music, they simplified their name to LOCASH. Following the 2016 album The Fighters, the duo earned a gold certification for "I Know Somebody." They filmed their sleek music video for "Ring on Every Finger" in Las Vegas. Their first single from an upcoming album is "Don't Get Better Than That."

SHANE McANALLY

SHANE MCANALLY IS SHAPING MODERN COUNTRY MUSIC by blending traditional craftsmanship with a contemporary slant. Two of his compositions are competing this year in the Song category: Sam Hunt's "Body Like a Back Road" and Keith Urban's "Female." In the Single Record category, Midland's "Drinking Problem" is a collaborative songwriting effort with the band, McAnally and frequent co-writer Josh Osborne. In addition, McAnally earned a producer credit on Old Dominion's nominated album, Happy Endings. Country radio playlists are peppered with McAnally's hits, such as "Different For Girls" by Dierks Bentley featuring Elle King, "I Met a Girl" by William Michael Morgan, "If I Told You" by Darius Rucker, "Stay a Little Longer" by Brothers Osborne, "Unforgettable" by Thomas Rhett, and many others. The cutting-edge music video for his remarkable all-star mashup, "Forever Country," was named 2016 ACM Video of the Year. McAnally grew up in Texas and attempted a recording career, but none of the singles from his 1999 album broke through. He retreated to Los Angeles, then found a more welcoming response in 2008 when Lee Ann Womack recorded "Last Call." McAnally has received prior ACM nods for Song of the Year with Kenny Chesney's "American Kids," Miranda Lambert's "Mama's Broken Heart" and "Vice" and Kacey Musgraves' "Follow Your Arrow." He was named ACM Songwriter of the Year for 2013. This is his fifth year to be nominated.

REBA MCENTIRE

REBA MCENTIRE RETURNS TO ACM HOSTING DUTIES IN 2018, NOTCHING HER 15TH TIME LEADING THE PROCEEDINGS. Of course, the high-profile entertainer has spent plenty of time on the ACM stage for nearly four decades. She landed her first nomination for 1980 New Female Vocalist. Three years later, she claimed her first of seven trophies for ACM Female Vocalist. Always an innovator in music videos, she soon picked up two awards in that category ("Whoever's in New England" and "Is There Life Out There?"). Finally, McEntire heard her name called as 1994 ACM Entertainer of the Year, establishing her as a genuine county superstar. Since then, she's done TV shows and Broadway productions, along with constant touring and comical commercials. The Academy has honored her with 2001's Humanitarian Award, 2005's 40th Anniversary Milestone Award, 2010's Career Achievement Award, 2014's 50th Anniversary Milestone Award and 2016's Mae Boren Axton Service Award. Earlier this year, she secured a Grammy for her latest album, Sing It Now: Songs of Faith and Hope. The project includes her favorite spiritual songs with special guests like the Isaacs, Kelly Clarkson and Trisha Yearwood. McEntire continues to partner with Brooks & Dunn for a Las Vegas residency at Caesars. She was inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame in 2011. Tonight she competes for ACM Female Vocalist of the Year, her 16th nomination in the category.

MIDLAND

MIDLAND MIXES THE VIBE OF '708 AND '808 COUNTRY WITH A MODERN FLOURISH, bringing back a classic sound to longtime listeners. The intriguing trio is composed of lead guitarist Jess Carson, bass player Cameron Duddy, and singer-guitarist Mark Wystrach. Their story begins in 2013 when Carson and Wystrach attended Duddy's destination wedding in Jackson Hole, Wyoming. When the guys started picking songs during some downtime, they realized how much their musical tastes clicked. Shortly after Duddy's honeymoon, the ensemble recorded at Sonic Ranch in El Paso, then relocated from the West Coast to Texas. They played gigs to small audiences and kept recording demos. Meanwhile all three members contributed to the band's visual appeal by drawing on past experiences: Duddy directed award-winning music videos, Wystrack worked as a model and actor, and Carson owned a vintage clothing store in Portland, Oregon. In time, their artistic approach caught the attention of songwriter-producer Shane McAnally, who shared their fondness for country gold. The band's 2016 EP showcased the enchanting single "Drinkin' Problem," which the band members wrote with McAnally and Josh Osborne. The platinumcertified track steadily climbed to No. 3 at country radio and their debut album, On the Rocks, dropped in September. In 2018, they are joining Little Big Town's The Breakers Tour as well as Thomas Rhett's Life Changes Tour. Their newest single is "Make a Little."



MAREN MORRIS

MAREN MORRIS HASN'T HIT THE BRAKES SINCE WINNING ACM NEW FEMALE VOCALIST LAST YEAR. She has racked up gold certifications for "80s Mercedes" and "I Could Use a Love Song," then picked up platinum for "Craving You," her collaboration with Thomas Rhett. In turn, Morris enlisted Vince Gill to sing on a heartfelt recording of "Dear Hate." Morris first marched onto the scene with her 2016 single, "My Church." Although she invokes musical heroes like Hank Williams and Johnny Cash in her lyrics, that breakout single offered a new slant on spirituality. Growing up in Texas, Morris would sing in her parents' beauty shop and started learning guitar when she was 12. In high school she began playing in bars whenever she could get in. Her tastes ran from Chaka Khan to Clint Black, indicating an early comfort level with R&B and country music. She moved to Nashville at 19. Inspired by artists like Sheryl Crow, Dixie Chicks and Patty Griffin, she worked on crafting original material. After writing "My Church" with busbee, she stashed it away in case she ever landed a record deal. In 2016, her debut album HERO arrived at No. 1 on the Billboard country albums chart while "My Church" was certified platinum. Her newest single is "Rich." She will tour with pop star Niall Horan in 2018.


WILLIE NELSON

WILLIE NELSON HAS WON ACM AWARDS FOR EVERY DECADE SINCE THE 1970S. Claiming the 1979 Entertainer of the Year trophy, Nelson set the stage for a remarkable period in the 1980s. He earned 1982 ACM awards for the single "Always on My Mind" and the album of the same name. His inclusion in the Highwaymen led to a 1985 win for "Highwayman" in the Single Record category. Nelson's groundbreaking career stretches back to the 1950s and 1960s as a fledgling songwriter and recording artist. After finally breaking through as an artist with 1975's "Blue Eyes Crying in the Rain," Nelson thrived as a performer. Since then he's been honored with the 1991 ACM Pioneer Award, the 2003 Gene Weed Special Achievement Award and the 2016 Poet's Award. As country music's most prolific collaborator, he has collected ACM trophies for "Mendocino County Line" with Lee Ann Womack (2002, Vocal Event) and "Beer for My Horses" (2003, Video). He sang "Funny (How Time Slips Away)" with Glen Campbell for the late legend's final album, Adiós. Nelson's contributions to country music will be examined in a new exhibit at the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum titled Outlaws & Armadillos: Country's Roaring '70s. Nelson entered the Country Music Hall of Fame in 1993. He issued the album God's Problem Child in 2017. His latest album, Last Man Standing, will be released this month.

OLD **DOMINION**

OLD DOMINION BEGAN A NEW CHAPTER OF THEIR CAREER WITH HAPPY ENDINGS. The album debuted at No. 1 on Billboard's country chart in August. Already, two of its singles — "No Such Thing as a Broken Heart" and "Written in the Sand" - have risen to gold status. Four of the five members of Old Dominion have connections to Virginia, which prompted the band's name. Singer Matt Ramsey and drummer Whit Sellers met in middle school around Roanoke. Sellers befriended guitarist Brad Tursi and bassist Geoff Sprung at Harrisonburg's James Madison University. Separately, they relocated to Nashville to pursue music careers, eventually meeting up with Detroit-raised multi-instrumentalist Trevor Rosen. Written by all five members of the band, "Break Up With Him" first broke through at SiriusXM's The Highway, then crossed over to terrestrial radio. After establishing a significant fan base on the road, Old Dominion signed a contract with RCA Nashville to release the 2016 album, Meat and Candy. Other successful singles from that project include "Song for Another Time" and "Snapback." Old Dominion earned the 2015 ACM Award for New Vocal Duo or Group. Individual band members have written hit songs for Dierks Bentley, Luke Bryan, Kenny Chesney, Blake Shelton and Keith Urban. In 2017, they joined Thomas Rhett's Home Team Tour. This year, their own headlining Happy Endings Tour will visit the U.S., Canada, Europe and Australia.


JOSH OSBORNE

OSBORNE IS ON THE FAST TRACK AS A CO-WRITER OF SAM HUNT'S "BODY LIKE A BACK ROAD," which set a record in 2017 for the most weeks spent at No. 1 on the Billboard Hot Country Songs chart. Osborne also co-wrote Hunt's prior platinum No. 1 hit, "Make You Miss Me." His memorable songs have been milestones for many artists, from Kasey Musgraves' "Merry Go Round" and Miranda Lambert's "Vice" to Billy Currington's "We Are Tonight" and Keith Urban's "John Cougar, John Deere, John 3:16." In addition, Kenny Chesney has earned hits with Osborne cuts like "Come Over," "Wild Child" and "Setting the World on Fire" featuring P!nk. Blake Shelton also scored with "My Eyes" and "Sangria." Along with his trusted collaborator Shane McAnally, Osborne wrote "Drinkin' Problem" with the band Midland, who earned multiple ACM nominations this year. In 2014 Osborne's name was added to the prestigious Country Music Highway which runs through the state of Kentucky and near his hometown of Virgie. Osborne joined McAnally's company, SMACKSongs, as a partner and songwriter in 2015. He has contributed to new albums by Eli Young Band, LANCO, Dustin Lynch, Old Dominion, Parmalee, Thomas Rhett, Darius Rucker and Blake Shelton. His songs have also been cut by Luke Bryan, Kelly Clarkson, Reba McEntire and Tim McGraw. This is his third nomination for Songwriter of the Year.

CARLY PEARCE

CARLY PEARCE CLICKED WITH COUNTRY LISTENERS FIRST ON SIRIUSXM'S THE HIGHWAY when that outlet picked up her sensitive single, "Every Little Thing." The song spent three weeks at No. 1 on The Highway and led to Pearce signing to Big Machine Records in January 2017. The label remastered the single and shipped it to country radio that spring. "Every Little Thing" steadily climbed to the top over the course of 35 weeks. It's only the fourth time in 15 years for a solo female artist to land a No. 1 debut single at country radio. "Every Little Thing" reached gold in 2017. Pearce is a Kentucky native with roots in bluegrass music. She began touring with a local band when she was 11 and recorded tracks for several bluegrass compilations. At 16, she traded high school for homeschooling in order to be a performer at Dollywood. She moved to Nashville in 2008, the year she turned 18. To make ends meet she found odd jobs like working at the mall and cleaning vacation rentals. After she released "Every Little Thing" to iTunes, The Highway put the song into rotation. Since 2015, she has performed on the Grand Ole Opry nearly 50 times. In 2018, Pearce is appearing on tours with Blake Shelton, Thomas Rhett and Rascal Flatts. Her new single is "Hide the Wine."


JON PARDI

JON PARDI EARNED A RADIANT RESPONSE FROM CALIFORNIA SUNRISE, AN ALBUM THAT ECHOES THE MUSIC OF HIS HONKY-TONK HEROES. "Dirt on My Boots" dominated playlists in 2017, paving the way for "Heartache on the Dance Floor." Pardi grew up in Northern California and developed an early interest in country music. He started writing songs at 12, joined a band at 14 and decided to move to Nashville at 19. Along the way he worked for a number of unexpected employers: from a grocery store and a car dealership, to operating machinery and being a lifeguard. In time, Pardi landed a record deal and scored his first hit, "Up All Night," from his debut album Write You a Song. The single was certified gold, giving him enough momentum to play clubs across the country and build a substantial fan base. "Head Over Boots," the lead single from California Sunrise, became the inescapable feelgood tune of 2016, leading to the ACM trophy for New Male Vocalist. In 2017, he earned gold certifications for California Sunrise as well as "Dirt on My Boots." He strives to incorporate the vibe of '90s country into his own modern sound, particularly from artists like George Strait, Marty Stuart and Dwight Yoakam. After hitting the road with Dierks Bentley and Miranda Lambert, Pardi will join Luke Bryan's What Makes You Country Tour this fall.

RAELYNN

RAELYNN OFFERED FANS A TENDER SIDE OF HER LIFE WITH "LOVE

TRIANGLE," a single that ushered in her debut album, WildHorse. In April that collection debuted at No. 1 on Billboard's county albums chart. The Texas native co-wrote 11 of the 12 songs on WildHorse. Her friends Dan + Shay sing on the album cut, "Say," RaeLynn made a strong first impression on The Voice. When she competed on the show in 2012, she performed Pistol Annies' "Hell on Heels," a choice that perfectly showcased her musical influences and lively personality. After her run on the series ended, she impacted country radio in 2014 with "God Made Girls," which achieved gold status and became her breakout song. The innovative video received two CMT Music Award nominations. She also co-starred in Blake Shelton's fun-loving video for "Boys 'Round Here" and chimed in with the occasional "That's right!" alongside Pistol Annies. RaeLynn, whose given name is Rachael Woodward, made her Grand Ole Opry debut in 2014. That same year she charted as a vocalist on Shelton's album cut, "Buzzin'." An endearing EP titled Me dropped in 2015. Her Top 40 country singles include "Boyfriend" and "For a Boy." Earlier this year she traveled with the CMT Next Women of Country Tour with Sara Evans. She will join select tour dates with Shelton and other artists this summer.

THOMAS RHETT

THOMAS RHETT. THE REIGNING ACM MALE **VOCALIST. HAS COUNTLESS REASONS TO SMILE.**

His romantic "Die a Happy Man" achieved triple-platinum status in 2017, following ACM wins as Single Record and Song of the Year. He landed another platinum single with "Craving You," a duet with Maren Morris. Since last year's show, four more singles have gone gold: "Vacation," "Star of the Show," "Unforgettable" and "Marry Me." In addition, Life Changes debuted at No. 1 on the Billboard 200 albums chart, becoming the first country project to do so in 2017. He launched his Life Changes Tour in April, riding the wave the popularity from last year's The Home Team Tour, A Nashville native, Rhett's songwriting credits include Jason Aldean's "I Ain't Ready to Quit," Lee Brice's "Parking Lot Party," Florida Georgia Line's "Round Here" and LOCASH's "Ring on Every Finger." Rhett incorporates a mashup of musical styles — country, pop, R&B, rap, rock, and oldies - to create his signature blend, "Die a Happy Man," which he co-wrote, spent six weeks at No. 1 on Billboard's country airplay chart. Other platinum hits include "Crash and Burn," "T-Shirt, "It Goes Like This," "Get Me Some of That" and "Make Me Wanna." In 2017, Thomas and his wife, Lauren, marked the official adoption of their two-year-old daughter, Willa Gray, and the birth of their daughter, Ada James.





RUNAWAY JUNE

RUNAWAY JUNE ARE STEALING HEARTS LIKE JESSE JAMES WITH "WILD WEST," their second Top 40 country single. The band is composed of Naomi Cooke (lead vocals, guitar), Hannah Mulholland (vocals, mandolin) and Jennifer Wayne (vocals, guitar). Cooke grew up in Florida listening to pristine vocalists like Alison Krauss. Upon moving to Nashville, she landed a gig at Tootsie's Orchid Lounge. Mulholland was raised in Malibu, California, and has been writing songs since she was 6 years old. Also a California native, Wayne abandoned an opportunity to be a pro tennis player in order to pursue songwriting in Nashville. She received a 2015 ACM nod as a co-writer of Eric Paslay's "She Don't Love You." Runaway June's name alludes to their commonalities: Wayne's grandmother and one of Cooke's sisters are named June, while Mulholland completed a life-changing 25-day, 220-mile hike in the month of June. Plus, they all felt compelled to "run away" from their homes and toward their dreams. In 2016, their debut single "Lipstick" cracked the Top 30. The empowering song shows off their harmonies as well as their positive attitude. Garth Brooks invited the trio to perform during a Nashville show last year, while Alan Jackson picked them to open some dates in 2018. They joined Jon Pardi and Midland on the 2017 CMT on Tour. Their first album is expected this year.




BLAKE SHELTON DELIVERED HIS SIXTH NO. 1 ALBUM ON THE BILLBOARD 200 WITH TEXOMA SHORE. proving he's one of country music's most bankable stars. Through 14 seasons of coaching on The Voice, he has charmed millions of viewers, while catchy songs like "I'll Name the Dogs" have kept him on the forefront of country radio playlists. Over nearly two decades, he has accrued 25 No. 1 hits. He landed two ACM nods in the early 2000s for New Male Vocalist but didn't win any hardware until the 2009 Vocal Event trophy for "Hillbilly Bone" with Trace Adkins. With the explosion of hits like "Honey Bee" and "God Gave Me You," he earned the ACM Male Vocalist trophy in 2011. He co-wrote the 2012 ACM Song of the Year "Over You." Shelton also accepted the 2012 Gene Weed Special Achievement Award for well representing country music to a national audience on The Voice. "I'll Name the Dogs" is Shelton's third No. 1 of 2017, following "A Guy With a Girl" and "Every Time I Hear That Song," Shelton ranked as People's Sexiest Man Alive and the most-played country artist of 2017. He also won the 2017 Billboard Music Award for top country artist. He kicked off his Country Music Freaks Tour in 2018. His new single is "I Lived It."



CHRIS STAPLETON

CHRIS STAPLETON STEPPED UP WITH TWO HIGHLY-ANTICIPATED ALBUMS IN 2017: FROM A ROOM: VOLUME 1 AND FROM A ROOM: VOLUME 2. Amid incredible expectations, both sets debuted at No. 1 on Billboard's country albums chart and the first volume was certified gold within five weeks of its release. Earlier this year, Stapleton won Grammys for best country song ("Broken Halos"), best country solo performance ("Either Way") and best country album (From A Room: Volume 1). Stapleton hit the big time with his 2015 debut album, Traveller, which ushered in ACM trophies for Male Vocalist, New Male Vocalist, Album and Song ("Nobody to Blame"). Stapleton grew up in eastern Kentucky. His father was a coal miner who introduced his son to a diverse array of music - and those sounds of outlaw country, Ray Charles and Otis Redding seeped in. With encouragement from some Nashville songwriters he knew, Stapleton moved to Music City in 2001. As a songwriter he has secured hits with Luke Bryan, Kenny Chesney, Thomas Rhett, Darius Rucker, George Strait and Josh Turner, Stapleton wrote or co-wrote 12 songs on Traveller. The platinum-certified "Tennessee Whiskey" is an outstanding George Jones cover and "Was It 26" was his late father's favorite Charlie Daniels song. Produced by Dave Cobb, Traveller achieved double-platinum certification in 2016. Gold singles include "Fire Away," "Nobody to Blame," "Parachute" and the title track. Stapleton will join The Eagles in June at a stadium concert in Dallas. He will continue his All-American Road Show through November.

CARRIE UNDERWOOD

CARRIE UNDERWOOD REMAINS ONE OF COUNTRY MUSIC'S MOST EMPOWERING ENTERTAINERS. On uplifting singles like "The Fighter" (with Keith Urban), she proves that poise and power are a winning combination. She added a striking new chapter to her career with the 2017 concert film, Carrie Underwood: The Storyteller Tour — Stories in the Round, Live from Madison Square Garden. That tour was inspired by her 2015 album, Storyteller, which spawned hits like "Smoke Break," "Heartbeat," "Church Bells" and "Dirty Laundry." The new music kept fans flocking to shows across North America, Europe and Australia. A recipient of the ACM's Triple Crown award, she's won two Entertainer trophies (2008, 2009), three for Female Vocalist (2006-2008) and the New Female Vocalist award (2005). She's also claimed awards in the categories of Album (Some Hearts), Video ("Before He Cheats") and Single ("Jesus Take the Wheel"). Underwood joined the Grand Ole Opry in 2008 and has been the voice of NBC's Sunday Night Football for five seasons. In addition, she received the ACM Gene Weed Special Achievement Award for representing country music in her starring role in 2013's The Sound of Music Live! In 2016, she earned the ACM Lifting Lives Gary Haber Award honoring her humanitarian work. The Oklahoma Music Hall of Fame inducted her in 2017. She unveiled a commanding duet with rapper Ludacris, "The Champion," prior to Super Bowl LII.

KEITH URBAN

KEITH URBAN CRAFTS A COMPELLING MESSAGE IN HIS MUSIC, whether it's a platinum anthem like "The Fighter" (with Carrie Underwood) or a topical single like "Female." For nearly two decades, fans have been listening closely to hear what this superstar will do next. Since winning the 2000 New Male Vocalist award, Urban has accrued dozens of hit singles. One of the most prominent is "Blue Ain't Your Color," which soared to No. 1, received two Grammy nominations and reached double-platinum status. Meanwhile, four of his catalog albums earned platinum in 2017: 18 Kids - Greatest Hits, Get Closer, Fuse and Ripcord. "John Cougar, John Deere, John 3:16" rose to platinum last year as well. Urban picked up ACM Male Vocalist awards for 2004 and 2005. as well as a 2004 Album of the Year trophy for Be Here. He has also won ACM trophies in the Vocal Event category for "Highway Don't Care," "We Were Us" and "Start a Band." In recognition of his worldwide appeal, he was the 2009 recipient of the ACM Jim Reeves International Award. He accepted the ACM Mae Boren Axton Award in 2016 for his longstanding dedication and service to the Academy. Urban joined the Grand Ole Opry in 2012, and earlier this year, he invited Chris Janson into the fold. With "The Fighter," Urban scored his 38th consecutive Top 10 hit. He will support his new album, Graffiti U, with a world tour.

BRETT YOUNG

BRETT YOUNG BOUNDED ONTO THE COUNTRY LANDSCAPE WITH "SLEEP WITHOUT YOU," a sweet introduction to his rich vocal and confident delivery. That radio favorite hit platinum in 2017 and opened the door for the sensitive single, "In Case You Didn't Know," which rose to triple-platinum status earlier this year. He also earned gold status for his self-titled debut album and his charming hit, "Like I Loved You." Young grew up in Orange County, California, and established himself as a promising baseball player. An elbow injury ended his athletic career in 2003. Unlike many artists, Young didn't grow up singing. Instead he played guitar while leading worship services, but only stepped up to the microphone to sing when the leader of the band was unavailable. But in 2014, he heard Gavin DeGraw's album Chariot and found the inspiration to pursue music. He wrote and recorded independent albums before moving to Nashville. Healing from a broken heart, he found a receptive community of songwriters to help him tell his story. Television series like Chrisley Knows Best, The Real World and Kourtney and Kim Take New York have featured his music. Drawn to emotionally expressive singers, he cites Marvin Gaye, Kenny Rogers and Tim McGraw as primary influences. He reached new fans in 2017 by opening shows on Lady Antebellum's You Look Good Tour. His new single is "Mercy."

CHRIS YOUNG

CHRIS YOUNG HAS GROWN INTO ONE OF COUNTRY MUSIC'S MOST CONSISTENT HITMAKERS, with the sultry "Losing Sleep" striking gold and landing at No. 1 in 2017. The satisfying album of the same name debuted at No. 1 on Billboard's country chart, marking his second project to do so. Losing Sleep is his third project in less than two years and the title track is his eighth No. 1 as a songwriter. A native of Murfreesboro, Tennessee, Young has wanted to be a country singer since he was a freshman in high school. Last year he reached platinum for his hit duet with Cassadee Pope, "Think of Me," as well as his 2011 album, Neon. It's been more than 10 years since Young's rise from Nashville Star to bona fide country star. He won that competition series in 2006, but neither of the singles from his first RCA album cracked the Top 40. His luck changed in a big way when "Gettin' You Home (The Black Dress Song)" exploded in 2009, becoming the first of five consecutive No. 1 hits. One of his musical heroes, Vince Gill, provides vocals on Young's "Sober Saturday Night," a No. 1 hit that achieved gold status in 2017. Gill invited him to join the Grand Ole Opry in 2017. Chris Young will continue his headlining Losing Sleep Tour in 2018.
