To pronounce any major genre of radio dead, based on a book or two, or one swing of the proverbial pendulum, is overly simplistic thinking and borderline ignorance. Conversely, to pronounce any new format or musical genre the next and only big thing is narrow-visioned and short-sighted. We live during a period of significant cultural/media fragmentation, which simply means there are a number of forms out there which can accurately lay claim to being mainstream and mass appeal. So it comes down to positioning. I hope all of KMET's contemporary competitors jump on the Top 40 bandwagon. It would make our assault on the #1 position all that much easier to attain, being album rock. It just so happens that there is a lot of great Top 40-ish music out lately, and that certainly helps the CHR cause. Also, CHR programmers have become creative and daring again, something that has been a rare commodity in album radio during recent years. There is no doubt that we are in a period of change. The key for album radio programmers to remember is that there is not, and never has been, any one singular form of album radio. There are many options from which to choose, and certainly new ones to be created. As long as there is a Top 40, there will be room for album rock radio.

Album radio is alive and well at WAAF. Although we've successfully played some crossover material, the station's image... "the rocker"... stands on the shoulders of Zeppelin, The Stones, The Who, and the like. The core rock audience got scared, as stations started imaging "new music" in the last year. In the long run, the new music mania will have helped album radio. It's the evolution of the modal era for many stations like WAAF. But evolution is a tricky thing. I learned some lessons about that in '83. You can play Quiet Riot and Bonnie Tyler on the same radio station, but some audiences react very negatively to the dance stuff. It depends on the market. Here, most dance hits don't work. A rock 'n roll station is more than music. It's a lifestyle. If consultants have been the focus of what's going down in album radio, I hope the focus in the coming year falls upon the disc jockey. Presentation is everything! An album radio listener wants a station he can touch. The only way to fight hit radio is with rock 'n roll, the classics, heavy metal, and the best new rock. The answer is not to play

Donna Summer, but rather to make rock radio as exciting and viable in the eighties as it has been in the past.

Album radio is currently suffering no more of a demise than CHR did in 1978/79, when it was hip to convert to a broader-based AC sound. The album radio stations that converted to CHR in the last few months were obviously not in a market dominant situation, and were also looking to broaden their base. It's funny though... what goes around comes around. Many ACs have switched back to a more mainstream CHR sound, and I'm personally waiting for the day when a former album rocker-turned-CHR recognizes the fact that their album rock competition is the only 18-34 game in the market. Album radio as a whole needs to remember just a few basic points to remain successful. First, since you can't match the jock energy and false excitement of a CHR, keep a rockin' musical edge instead; the right list that's tight and bright. Secondly, the jocks need to be entertaining but brief. Current music should be the right new music for the marketplace. It's amazing that Def Leppard continues to have that current perception, and yet the album, to us, is at least 30 weeks old. It's important to find the bands like Big Country,

The Motels and Def Leppard before the competition. Beat the CHRs to the hits. Burn them out, and then leave all those programmers in your market in the dust. It's also important to maintain an impeccable image. Great visibility through outside promotions and TV campaigns will keep the core happy, and the outside come growing. Last but not least, hope your audience grows into the 25-34 demo soon, and pray for Anglo DSP for 18-34's in the 1984 Arbitron.

There's no need to convince anyone that album radio is changing, as is CHR. Our business by its very nature, is seminal. What concerns me most is over reaction by the format to musical fads, and over emphasis on the music component of album radio in general. Anyone growing up with AM Top 40, in the 60's in particular, remembers that those several stations played similar music. The hip station always had something more. There was a feeling of excitement about it. They took chances, were predictably unpredictable, and tremendously topical. I agree that album radio should be the Top 40 of the 80's, and that means more than doing commercial-free hours. There is tremendous opportunity for creative programmers. Album radio needs these people. I would like to compare CHR to conservative, boring radio and album radio to outspoken, creative radio. I would like to, but I can't. Maybe with the help of publications like Album Network, and a renewed interest in entertaining the audience, the excitement pendulum will swing back to our side. It's not the end of album radio, it's just the end of the beginning.

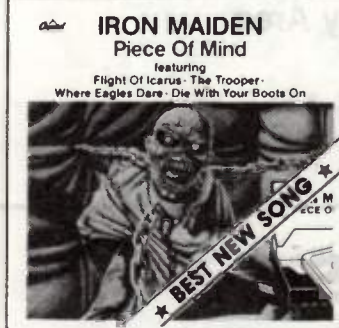

Reaction: Pat's hitting radio with her best double shot: two studio cuts that represent her ability to expand and grow, plus an abundance of smokin' concert material. Live From Earth bumps up the Hottest Nationwide 10 to 6. Bob Bittens/WHCN, "I love both studio tracks. This is one of her most important albums. She really shows a willingness to diversify." Kurt Brown/WXCS, "Looking at the back of the new Pat Benatar album, there are two things I like about this album. The studio tracks, of course!" Jack Silver/KSHE, "Great packaging. Great producing. Great vocals. And great nips!" Joe Blood/KEZO, "Already #8 in sales and pulling #3 phones." Bruce McGregor/KQDS, "Pat leads the Christmas rush with her live set. The Ozzy cut is really stirring up the actives, while "Bow Wow Wow" and "Knocked Down Made Small" continue to snag mentions. Everyone agrees, Was (Not Was) is unique and good FUN! Andy Bloom/WQFM, "Is nothing sacred? Has the bat poison finally gotten into Ozzy's blood?!" Ken Martin/KZEL, "The audience is pleased that Ozzy can do more than just scream." Jane Asher/KTYD, "Was (Not Was) is fantastic. Mitch Ryder's song is full of energy." Richard Remsburg/WNTR, "The Ozzy freaks can't believe how he sounds on Was (Not Was)...and they're responding!" Does Gene Simmons ever get tongue-tied?" Pepe Lopez/KLAQ, "Kiss is back! If you've been holding off on 'Lick It Up' because of an 'image problem,' take a tip from old Pepe. Play that sucker!" Bob Bittens/WHCN, "Major requests. This one's going through the roof. By the response to 'Lick It Up,' I'd bet they could release it as a single." "Lick It Up" jumps 72 to 29 on Power Cuts.

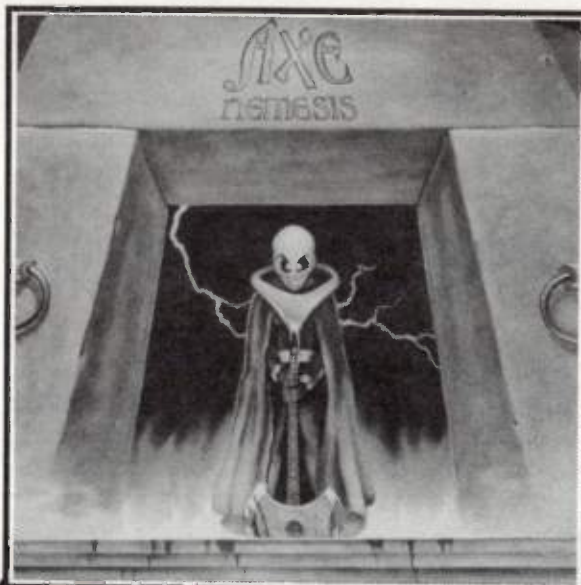

GENESIS. GENESIS. (ATLANTIC). There's no end to Genesis' new beginnings. Here's a band that truly lives up to its name, composing fresh, vital, and completely contemporary music album after album. There's no such thing as a typical Genesis album...just new cycles. Phil, Mike, and Tony make it easy. Place the stylus practically anywhere on the disc and hear the magic of this unparalleled songwriting unit. While "Mama" and "It's Gonna Get Better" command the early attention, we're certain that "Illegal Alien" will become one of Genesis' all time great show stoppers. This is one of the band's most adventurous and touching songs ever tackled, and what a hook! "Taking It All Too Hard" picks up in the Phil Collins' "In The Air Tonight" mood, and "Just A Job To Do" proliferates those wonderful punctuating horns that we've grown to love in recent years. Nikki Stevens at KSJO summarizes, "Genesis knows how to work your ears and milk your mind for all its worth. If this is a taste of what's to come, it looks as if we'll be opening our Christmas gifts to the tune of Phil and the boys."

CULTURE CLUB. COLOUR BY NUMBERS. (EPIC). One of the things that has always separated rock radio from its competition is its willingness to stay open to a variety of musical styles. Consider 1983 when Quiet Riot, The Eurythmics, Kiss, and Big Country can all be on your playlist at the same time. Then consider that Culture Club is the first band in over 20 years to have three Top 10 singles from a debut album. There's no denying that Boy George is an exceptional singer and songwriter. He evokes the soul and vision of the best of Tamla/Motown, especially Smokey Robinson. While rock radio currently reverberates with a heavy metal "revival," Culture Club can offer balance and strong female and upper demo possibilities. And if you're concerned about imaging the pigtailed Boy George to your harder core, remember that Ozzy wears eyeshadow! "Church Of The Poison Mind" is the first single. If you dabbled with the import or didn't play it at all, now's your chance to edge out the competition in this critical Fall sweep. "Karma Chameleon" is already a worldwide smash, and will likely be the second single. "Miss Me Blind" has "hit" written all over it, and if you really want to hear Boy George tilt the old soul meter, listen to "That's The Way."

JOHN HIATT. RIDING WITH THE KING. (Geffen). Here's an intense and emotional singer/songwriter who's extraordinary, biting vision has been overlooked for too long. We suspect that John's newest Geffen release is about to change all that, as Riding With The King is ready to roll on rock radio. Nick Lowe takes over the production helm, bass guitar, and backing vocals, while mates Martin Belmont and Paul Carrack add their expertise to the recording session. "Say It With Flowers" is an absolute masterpiece. Stunning, exciting, and laced with R&B styles, it should have no problem finally justifying a place for John Hiatt on the airwaves. Other dynamos include "I Don't Even Try," "Death By Misadventure," and Jake Riviera's Harley Electroglide on the cover! John Hiatt could be included in the Elvis Costello/Joe Jackson/Graham Parker school of rock, but he's definitely his own man. Riding With The King is his best shot...no question it oughta be on the radio.

First Tremors

Wait until you hear the Doors' Alive She Cried! We don't know where Elektra dug these live tracks up (under a stairwell, Kravitz?), but they sound like they were recorded last week. Jim Morrison's cover of "Gloria" puts all competition to shame, the Nasty man excluded...We couldn't wait to tell you about the Brian May/Eddie Van Halen collaboration, "Star Fleet." You won't be able to get this baby on the air fast enough!...there's going to be a new Eddie Money album soon. Power vocals, hooks galore...We finally pried the Bob Dylan advance cassette, Infidels, out of Luanne's hands to discover that BOB IS BACK! Undeniably better than any Dylan we've heard since Blood On The Tracks. Produced by Mark Knopfler, the 4-cut advance sampler is due in about three weeks.

Follow Through

JOHN COUGAR MELLENCAMP. "CRUMBLIN' DOWN". (RIVA). 153 Album Network stations know a hit when they hear it! "Crumblin' Down" immediately fires into Power Cuts at #36. Doug Podell/WLLZ, "This is the epitome of rock 'n roll." Tom Stein/WZXR, "Cougar did what he had to, by not putting out another 'Hurts So Good.' This shows a whole new and better side." Ted Edwards/KGB-FM, "I thought he might have taken too much time in between, but this is superb." Look for Uh-Huh at the end of the week.

PAUL MC CARTNEY/MICHAEL JACKSON. "SAY SAY SAY". (COLUMBIA). Sounds like a hit hit hit, and 49 first week believers agree. Michael Jackson's image on rock radio is solid, and Paul McCartney is more uptempo than usual. Joe Folger/KEGL, "This is my 'Song Of The Week.' This is a #1 record...period!" John McRae/WMET, "It sounds like old Wings, which is a good sign." Karen Allen/KBPI, "I love love love THIS! NO trouble at all crossing over to ALL formats."

STREETS. "IF LOVE SHOULD GO". (ATLANTIC). 25 reporters take Streets to the airwaves, and the pre-1p buzz for Steve Walsh's new band is all positive. Everyone who attended the listening party in Atlanta came away knowing that Streets is a band to watch out for. Ron Nenni/WDVE, "This was the highlight of our new music show. Requests have continued to pour in ever since then."

MIDNIGHT OIL. "POWER AND THE PASSION". (COLUMBIA). 10 more reporters burn the Midnight Oil, including KGB-FM, WZIR, WLAV, and KBCO. We're convinced this record has legs, if you're willing to give it the several spins needed to kick it in. Bernie Kimble/WSCY, "How about Midnight Oil? Congratulations to Columbia for finding another fresh act that rock radio listeners will love." Inessa York/KGON, "I'm mad about Midnight Oil. This band has the spirit and punch you'll want."

PAUL YOUNG. NO PARLEZ. (COLUMBIA). This Album Network Best New Music has a great week, nabbing 19 adds, including WXRT, KROQ, WBLM, WOUR, and KBCO. John Mrvos at WXRT is calling No Parlez his "Record Of The Week." Tony Gates/WLAV, "Sounds wonderful on the radio with just a touch of compression. I can't remember the last time we had so many 'Who is this?' inquiries." Tom Stein/WZXR, "This is in the same vein as Bonnie Tyler. The more you listen, the more you realize it's going to be a smashola." "Wherever I Lay My Hat" is the early leader, with mentions for "Love Will Tear Us Apart" and "Come Back."

Angels is another that follows the mold of new, fresh rock 'n roll without sounding like Police, Men At Work, or Flock Of Seagulls imitations."

MOTLEY CRUE. SHOUT AT THE DEVIL. (ELEKTRA). Your audience is shouting down the request lines for this Motley Crue record. Watch this one go crazy at the stores. The #2 Wildcard! pick at Album Network Retail this week, as Brad Bell of Melody Lane divines, "Motley Crue could become another Quiet Riot." Steve Driscoll/KUFO, "Once the word gets out, this will be up there with Def Leppard and AC/DC." "Looks That Kill" and "Too Young" are the early song leaders.

THE WORLD. BREAK THE SILENCE. (ELEKTRA). 10 new adds keep The World spinning closer and closer to a debut on the Hottest Nationwide, and reaction continues to build. QUIET RIOT. METAL HEALTH. (PASHA). They've got a shot at being rookies of the year! Metal Health climbs again on the Hottest Nationwide, 15 to 13. 300,000 units sold in five days last week! Lew Garrett at Camelot Enterprises reports, "This is turning out to be one of our strongest records of the year. It's been #1 here for the past several weeks." MICHAEL STANLEY. YOU CAN'T FIGHT FASHION. (EMI). Lots of positive chatter about the customized "My Town" tapes in radio land. An 18 to 15 leap on the Hottest Nationwide. MSB is back and they're proud! Amy Dahlman/WAQX, "How can you go wrong with as localized a tune as 'My Town?'" You can't, Amy, as "My Town" moves 13 to 11 on Power Cuts.

PETER SCHILLING. ERROR IN THE SYSTEM. (ELEKTRA). Any early "errors" in judgement are quickly converting into upward chart movement. Peter Schilling takes one of the healthiest jumps of the week on the Hottest chart, 21 to 16. Tom Stein/WZXR, "Tremendous phones. There isn't a song on the station that gets better curiosity calls." "Major Tom" flies up Power Cuts, 16 to 14.

ALDO NOVA. SUBJECT...ALDO NOVA. (PORTRAIT). It didn't take long for Aldo to establish his second album. This week's "subject" is the 31 to 18 (!) move on the Hottest Nationwide. Ted Edwards/KGB-FM, "I knew 'Fantasy' was a great song, but when I put 'Monkey' on, I was blown away. I'm a fan!" "Monkey" hops 23 to 13 on Power Cuts.

JOE JACKSON. MIKE'S MURDER. (A&M). 13 more adds make it 103 to date...this little gem is coming home! Mike's Murder goes 28 to 27 on the Hottest. Jim Monaghan/WNEW-FM, "We're getting excellent response. For god's sake, don't pull another Night And Day and let this one get past you!" "Memphis" has a strong week, scaling Power Cuts 42 to 32.

DOKKEN. BREAKING THE CHAINS. (ELEKTRA). Seven more adds help close the gap for these debut rockers; they now claim 103 adds to date. Dokken moves 32 to 30 on the Hottest chart. "Breaking The Chains" is the unanimous choice, climbing 27 to 23 on Power Cuts.

BOYS BRIGADE. BOYS BRIGADE. (CAPITOL). All doubters should now realize that Boys Brigade is a hot new band. This was an important week for the band, and they performed with a 37 to 31 gain on the Hottest Nationwide. "Passion Of Love" moves 70 to 68 on Power Cuts, but don't stop there. Check "Metody" and "Into The Flow."

PAYOLAS. HAMMER ON A DRUM. (A&M). Payola\$ "hammers on" another 10 stations, with 90 adds total to their credit. Hammer On A Drum makes a 39 to 35 hop on the Hottest Nationwide. Bob Kranes/WBCN, "A good mixture of many different types of music. Good accessibility across the board." "I'll Find Another" is out in front, 84 to 77 on Power Cuts, while "Where Is This Love" debuts at #97.

HELIX. NO REST FOR THE WICKED. (CAPITOL). Helix pushes onward and upward on the Hottest, 42 to 38. In the midst of heavy metal mania, Helix has maintained a steady growth pattern, week after week. "Heavy Metal Love" jumps 5 points, 38 to 33. Now it's time to check out "Don't Get Mad Get Even."

Y & T. MEAN STREAK. (A&M). Seven adds, and a 46 to 42 streak up the Hottest Nationwide. A&M's persistence is paying off for these rough and ready rockers. Ron Nenni/WDVE, "Y & T has been a steady phone grabber." "Mean Streak" blasts 47 to 41 on Power Cuts.

TORONTO. GIRLS NIGHT OUT. (MCA/SOLID GOLD). A dozen adds bring Toronto's add cume to 65, with a solid debut at #44 on the Hottest chart. Curt Gary/WEBN, "Try 'Girls Night Out' at 5:15 in the afternoon, and see if you don't get laid that evening!" "When Can I See You" and the title track are working, with major new action on "All I Need."

QUEENSRYCHE. QUEENSRYCHE. (EMI). The Northwest's favorite metal mongers debut on the Hottest Nationwide at #48. 61 Album Network adds to date on this Best New Music, and Queensryche's story is spreading. Bill Weston/WGRQ, "The metal heads have demanded that we play Queensryche...and we shall!" "Queen Of The Retch" is at #60 on Power Cuts.

TAXXI. FOREIGN TONGUE. (FANTASY). 64 adds to date. If you're still holding out, you're missing a safe and sensible play that's performing quite well. Foreign Tongues makes its debut on the Hottest Nationwide at #49. Meanwhile, "Maybe Someday" climbs 74 to 66 on Power Cuts, and we're still getting feedback on "Gold And Chains."

JO BOXERS. LIKE GANGBUSTERS. (RCA). RCA is dedicated to this project, and Jo Boxers is lookin' stronger than ever, with a debut at #50 on the Hottest Nationwide. Tom Stein/WZXR, "You've got to be poppin' your fingers when this comes on. I feel very positive about this band." "Just Got Lucky" jumps 87 to 70 on Power Cuts.

T-BONE BURNETT. PROOF THROUGH THE NIGHT. (WARNER BROS.). We've been telling you all along that T-Bone is an American classic, deserving of your attention. Proof Through The Night now stands Next at #53 on the Hottest Nationwide. "Fatally Beautiful" and "The Sixties" are outstanding airplay items, and "Murder Weapon" was just added on MTV.

Kiss surely is stirring them up at retail, scoring a second consecutive #1 WILDCARD finish! All early indications point to platinum for **Lick It Up**. John Timmons of Phoenix Records in Louisville states, "It's just amazing! I ordered light initially, and have been paying for it ever since." Gary Podsedlik of Cavages says, "Initial response is real good. Radio here is also feeling the buzz." Many accounts cite Kiss' MTV special as a prime factor to the immediate success of this record.

A Los Angeles heavy metal band is shaking up retail this week, too. **Motley Crue** makes its WILDCARD! debut at #2, as more and more Album Network retail reporters swear that **Shout At The Devil** is headed for top ten sales action. Cathy Hubka of Independent Records in Englewood, Colorado says, "Motley Crue is our best seller this week." Leslie Mazda of Tower Records in San Diego explains, "Moderate radio airplay and a cult following are selling **Shout At The Devil**." Brad Bell of Melody Lane sums up Album Network's feelings exactly, "This band could be another Quiet Riot."

Linda Ronstadt makes her third WILDCARD! showing, this week up one spot to #3. A classy concert tour with the **Nelson Riddle Orchestra** and more TV airtime than money can buy are bringing Linda's new style to record buyers of all ages. Barry Boffger of Homers in Omaha tells us, "What's New is blowing out of here. An incredible cross section of buyers." Cindy Dodero of Harmony House in suburban Detroit says, "This record is so hot, we sold a box in one day. I just can't keep it in stock."

X returns this week to score their third WILDCARD! showing. A solid cult following is quickly becoming a solid mass following, as **More Fun In The New World** is attracting new fans for this Southern California band, all over the USA. Bob Hall of Harvard Coop in Cambridge says, "X is doing very well here. Boston is a great market for new music." Donnie Gillisple of Back Alley Disc tells Album Network, "We've been giving X a lot of in-store play."

Y & T make their WILDCARD! debut at #5, with their third A&M album, **Mean Streak**. This San Francisco based heavy metal unit, known a number of years ago on a different label as **Yesterday & Today**, has been together for nearly ten years. They boast a built-in audience in the States, Europe and Japan, that knows all too well the potency of Y & T's live act.

Consensus Analysis

There's no stopping the **Police**! **Synchronicity** marks its fourth month at #1 this week. **Quiet Riot** overtakes **Def Leppard**, to become this week's heavy metal king. Retailers are amazed at how strong **Metal Health** has become in the past four weeks. **Robert Plant** makes his strongest showing to date, making a 6-3 jump on the **Retail Consensus**. **Def Leppard** drops two points to #4, yet remains potent at most retail accounts. **Billy Joel** falls one to #5, due to the big surge of the Plant album (the same goes for the **Talking Heads**). Both records make solid showings in all regions. **Pat Benatar** scores this week's only debut, at an impressive #7. **Live From Earth** shapes up to be one of the big holiday gift items of '83. **Stevie Nicks** stays level at #8, with significant gains noted in the Northwest and Southwest regions. **The Motels** make the strongest move on **Album Network's** chart, jumping up four places to hit the Top 10 for the first time. **Little Robbers** will be The Motels' most important album to date, according to key retailers across the country. **Big Country** falls back two points to #12, due to the strong showing of Benatar and Motels. Meanwhile, solid gains are realized on **The Crossing** in all regions. **Elvis Costello** moves 15-13...**Punch The Clock** surely must be Elvis' best selling album to date. **Loverboy** gains two...touring and heavy radio/video play are keeping this album near the top. The **Moody Blues** score their second upward-week in a row, posting a two point gain to #15. **Huey Lewis** shows significant increases at key accounts, to move 19-18 on the chart. Sales on **Sports** are strongest in the West and Northeast. **Peter Schilling** shows upward momentum (to #22), on the strength of "Major Tom."

RETAIL CRUSADES

NORMAN HUNTER. RECORD BAR. This year's Record Bar convention was special because it was the first time we held the convention here in Durham. Over 75% of the store managers were seeing the head office and warehouse for the first time. The size of the warehouse knocked them out. It's one thing to see 1,000 records on paper...it's just four digits. But to see them stacked up is another thing entirely. We also put a lot of emphasis on training this year. Record Bar, as has the music business, has had a good year. Now is the time to solidify our gains. We have grown from a small to a medium business, and we're now ready to take the next step forward. It's reassuring for our managers to know they are working for a company that is looking forward to an expansion planned for the next five years. Everyone came away feeling extremely positive. We also had great entertainment. Stevie Ray Vaughan was incredible. Miss Kay Jenkins, my hard-working assistant, could not contain herself, and felt obligated to dance in a frenzy to his music in the aisles. Marshall Crenshaw played for the second year in succession. One of my personal faves, The Morells from Springfield, MO., were great, as were The X-Teens on our own Dolphin Records. Less Active and Chairmen Of The Board, with their brand of Southeast beach music, also played. It would take days to explain beach music! It's strictly a Southeast phenomenon. Earl Thomas Conley and Steve Warner (RCA country artists) played at the picnic on Sunday. Accessory dealers set up booths and gave presentations on their products, and the labels played a lot of new stuff for everyone. I feel this was a very successful convention for everyone involved. One last note, CBS played the new Bob Dylan album for me, and it is orgasmic! The best cut is "Neighborhood Bully." It is electric, and his best work since Blonde On Blonde. (919) 493-4511

GREG MALTA. RECORDS ON WHEELS. A lot of new bands are very much helped with airplay here in Toronto. We work very closely with both AM and FM stations in compiling the records which are selling, as well as the up and coming bands. In the last year we have had a lot of new bands climb up our charts that were not getting airplay in The States. That's a change, because we always listened to American radio. Big Country, Bonnie Tyler, The Fixx, Eurythmics, Headpins, Payola\$ and Bryan Adams are just a few who cracked open here first. This has been because radio has stayed in touch on a weekly basis with our major retailers and head office on what's moving. Then they can get an idea on what the public is really buying, and not only what they are playing. I feel that radio staying in touch with the street scene has made Toronto more responsible for exposing new music. I would like to see radio listening more to the retailers' and distributors than depending on what radio consultants have to say. Also, the record companies need to get down to the street and listen closer to retailers. Radio can play records but that doesn't mean they will sell. (416) 475-3550

SAMANTHA JOHNSON. TOWER RECORDS. I feel strongly that radio and retail need to develop a stronger communication through store reports. It has been ages since any of the album radio stations in the Seattle market have called our store for sales reports on records. We are located in the heart of Seattle, and I feel we have a strong pulse on the buying trends in this market. It would seem to me that checking record sales with retail is a very important way to gauge radio's listener response as well as to keep abreast with their current buying trends. People are talking about the resurgence of heavy metal, but Seattle has always been a heavy rock 'n roll market. Even a few of the European metal magazines are beginning to focus in on the rock scene here for insight. Metal has just gone underground here because the stations have quit playing the music. I believe strongly in streamlining playlists to one style of music. Listeners are being forced to switch around the dial constantly to find their own kind of music instead of staying tuned to "their station." Advantages of streamlining would be that a station playing straight forward rock 'n roll could expose more of that format by deleting new music or vice versa. Stations are trying to appease too many people, and are thus alienating people who are looking for their own style of music. (206) 632-1187

DEXTER BEAN. MUSICAL SALES O.S. Buying trends have changed considerably in the last year for us, largely because of the new modern music station, WIYY, here in Baltimore. Catalogue sales of the "old favorites" such as AC/DC, Black Sabbath, and Led Zeppelin have dropped off considerably. Now we are starting to sell more and more catalogue of the new bands. It's very refreshing to see this change occur. Another attribute of WIYY is their ability to stir enthusiasm in the record buyer by playing a record before it hits the stores. This lead time before releases has been very beneficial in creating excitement over new releases in this market. Our Top 5 records this week are Quiet Riot, The Police, Robert Plant, Talking Heads, and Def Leppard. We are doing really well with the new Huey Lewis and the News album. This LP and the new Linda Ronstadt completely took us by surprise. Motley Crue, Michael Sembello and the new Kiss LPs are proving to be good out of the box sellers for us as well. (301) 675-1400

FRANKIE HOUSTON. SOUND WAREHOUSE. We have a successful relationship with our local stations and work very closely on store reports. We always get a good influx of people into the store after running promotions or advertising with them, proving to me that the radio audience listens and responds. As a retailer, I would like to see radio take more care in back announcing songs. Competition between the stations in the Dallas/Ft. Worth market is so intense that they have long commercial free periods where they promote themselves as "the more music station." The idea is wonderful, but unfortunately, not all of the tunes in a twenty minute period will be back announced. This causes chaos for our staff trying to help those listeners to locate product, as well as hurting exposure for an artist. Even if stations could only identify the artist played in a set it would be more beneficial for all involved. (817) 737-8831



PAUL BUECHEL. HARMONY HUT. WHGZ is the only radio station that calls us for regular store reports. We give them album, 12", and single reports. A few stations used to call but don't anymore. WHGZ is a diverse station that crosses over from rock to artists like Bonnie Tyler, and has helped instigate great sales. Heavy metal sells without exposure on radio because there is a built-in market for it. Sales have picked up since school opened. Our top selling records right now are Billy Joel, Asia, The Police, and Flashdance. Our best new release is Linda Ronstadt. Older people who don't normally come into the store are coming in to buy her album. Big Country will really take off if they release the single "Big Country." We are running a great in-store promotion giving away a great promo mirror with David Bowie's Let's Dance cover, to the best paragraph or photo about the most bizarre "Modern Love." Last week Southside Johnny came into the store while we were playing his new album. He was really knocked out, and sent us a letter thanking us for all of our support. This really means a lot to us.

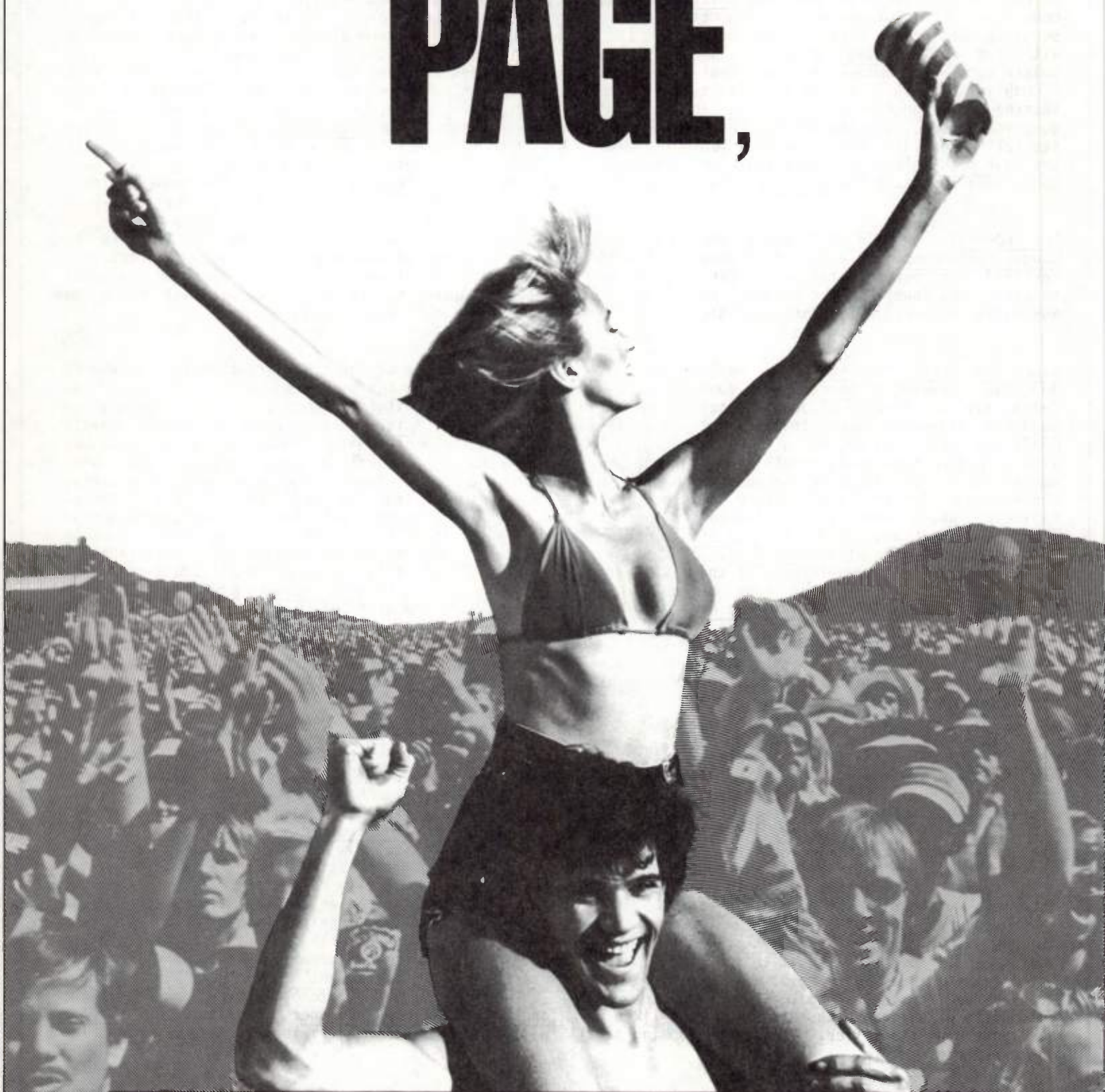

Elvis Costello isn't afraid to express his opinions, no matter how controversial. In an upcoming Off The Record Special with Mary Turner, he discusses the current video explosion and the state of rock music with his usual candor.

EC: To be honest, I think video's pretty much of a red herring, or a dead end. It flatters the vanity of boring, talentless bands. I think they take the mystery out of the music, seeing all those conceited fools prancing about in their spandex trousers--or worse--pretending they're Humphrey Bogart.

MT: You're not too crazy about rock, either. You've been quoted as saying, "I hate rock, but I love rock 'n roll."

EC: Yeah, I hate the rootless formula, Les Paul, "we're gonna do it all night" style of rock. I love rock 'n roll records. You don't hear too many these days, because it's hard to come up with another combination of the 12 bar blues which is fresh. But, occasionally you hear the odd song by The Blasters or The Fabulous Thunderbirds that has some understanding of the basic principles of rock 'n roll which still makes sense without being a pointless revival of something that was made nearly 30 years ago.

MT: Lyrically, you've taken a lot of heat and have often been misinterpreted.

EC: Yeah. I won't print any more lyric sheets, that's for sure. I think far too much attention was paid to the lyric sheets on Punch The Clock. Criticisms have been made of the lyrics being overly glib, which might have been justified on Armed Forces, but I resented people who were obviously too stupid to use the English language themselves, telling me that I shouldn't use it.
