## 222 HOURS STRAIGHT!

### Milwaukee Jock Sets New On-Air Record

WQFM/Milwaukee radio personality Bob Reitman broke the existing world's record for continuous hours on the air as a disc jockey. After breaking the previous record of 220 hours and five minutes, Reitman decided to stop at 222 hours and 22 minutes "...to make it a nice round number." He started the marathon from the WQFM remote headquarters at the Wisconsin State Fair Thursday, August 12th at 9:57. The new record was set nine days, eight hours, and seventeen minutes later.

The 34 year old Reitman's record breaking marathon was done in conjunction with a fund raising drive for the fight against Muscular Dystrophy. Almost five thousand dollars was contributed in the "Fishbowl" at the WQFM State Fair location.

Reitman observed all Guinness rules for the marathon, including the five minutes of rest allotted every hour and no changes in the station's regular format. He took no stimulants whatsoever during the entire stint, even rejecting coffee.

# RADIO

## BROADCASTERS ASSOC. FORMED

Seven Southern California radio stations have formed the Orange County Broadcasters Association. Joining the OCBA are KWIZ-AM & FM, KORJ, KEXY-AM & FM, KAPX and KYMS. KWIZ Station Manager Pat Michaels has been elected as the association's first President. According to Michaels, "Our number one priority is to form a unified effort to get Orange County the equal treatment it deserves as a major media market. In the past we have been looked upon, especially by the ratings services, as a minor suburban market of Los Angeles..." In addition to pushing for more recognition as a major market, the OCBA will work for united community involvement by broadcasters.

## "GREAT QUACK OFF"

According to KTLK's Jay Stone, "Denver went Quackers" over the station's recent "Great Quack Off" promotion. Tying in with Rick Dees' "Disco Duck," they gave away "disco quack packs," which included a duck call, copies of the single, and a night out at a disco. Listeners called in at the sound of the quack to win.

One WGUV/Bangor listener responded to a station contest with another "Duck" line. The "Guest Star" contest gave listeners a chance to guest-jock their own half hour show by writing in 25 words or less why they are good enough to be on the air. One listener used his sense of humor in his answer, asking the topical question: "What do you get off a Disco Duck?...Boogie Down."

## WIFE'S "EAT OUT" CONTEST

Two highly skilled eating teams, comprised of the WIFE/Indianapolis personalities, ate nearly one fourth of their collective weight recently during the first annual "WIFE Eat Out" contest, in conjunction with a local eatery. Team captains were WIFE's Jay Reynolds and the "fastest mouth in the Midwest," Jack Armstrong. Although Armstrong was given an award for continuously talking and harassing the other team, Reynolds' team walked off with the trophies. The Eat Out lasted over an hour, after which everyone crawled off to a dance contest. The entire event was carried live on WIFE.

## THING OF THE PAST WEEKEND

KRBE/Houston became a "thing of the past" during a weekend promotion. All weekend every other record was a hit from the 50's and early 60's, listeners called in to re-

gister to win a 1955 "Heavy Chevy" classic car worth nearly \$3,000. The drawing for the winner took place at a 50's dance at Astroworld, where some of the great groups of the past performed.

## DANCE BENEFIT

A Pittsburgh disco was the site for WPEZ's benefit dance contest. A 94¢ admission price enabled listeners to vie for trophies and stereo systems and runner-up prizes including concert tickets and albums. All proceeds go to the Muscular Dystrophy campaign, with the check presented during the Jerry Lewis telethon.

## CONSTANT CONTEST

WLAY/Muscle Shoals is in the fourth week of their "Consant Contest." They're giving away over \$14,500 worth of cash and prizes over a four month period. To get in on the winning, listeners mail postcard entries, and listen for their names to be called. The WLAY "Call Girl" also makes random phone calls to qualify others for weekly drawings for big prizes.

## "LABOR" DAY

KAKC/Tulsa has planned their upcoming Labor Day promotion. All the station personalities will deliver bouquets of flowers to expectant mothers going into labor in local hospitals.

## ARTIST BENEFIT

WLS and WDHF/Chicago are running public service spots to help Warner Brothers' Bellamy Brothers find \$65,000 worth of equipment stolen during the group's Chicago stay. The spots offer a \$1000 reward for return of the equipment or information leading to its return.

## STATE FAIR

WNDE/Indianapolis will broadcast from the Indiana State Fair for the entire run of the event. Hourly giveaways of albums, back-packs and bumper stickers will highlight the broadcast.

## DANCE MARATHON

WEEO/Waynesboro held a 24 hour dance marathon to benefit the Muscular Dystrophy cause, in conjunction with the local Marine Corp. troop. Twelve local bands supplied live music for the dancers. Station sales exec Bill Brittan raised over \$200 himself by hoofing on the dance floor for nearly the entire 24 hour period.

## BUSINESS NEWS

### Presidential Radio Budgets

Both Jimmy Carter and Gerald Ford are planning heavy radio schedules for the fall Presidential race. Spokesmen for Carter say that upwards of 15% of his entire budget will be spent on radio, while the Ford camp is planning buys as early as this month.

### Special Arbitron FM Analysis

Arbitron Radio has released statistics from a study on FM listening which backs up their earlier announced findings that two top ten markets had higher FM shares than AM.

In the new study, the analysis of 10 selected markets shows that FM popularity was up 11% in the past year. The ten markets in the study include: Detroit, Minneapolis-St. Paul, Kansas City, San Antonio, Oklahoma City, Orlando, Raleigh-Durham, Davenport, Rock Island-Moline, San Francisco, and Norfolk-Portsmouth. All markets showed increases in FM shares. The Norfolk market had the greatest increase in FM listening up 25%. Oklahoma City showed only a 1% increase in the past year.

### License Renewal A White House "Major Issue"

The Director of the White House office of telecommunications has said that broadcast license renewal was one of the major issues under review by his office. Director Thomas Houser told a news conference in Washington that he intends to talk to Congress about the possibilities of de-regulation of the license renewal issue.

### House Committee Acts On Copyright Bill

The House Judiciary Committee has given its OK to the first copyright revision bill since 1909. The bill will extend copyright to life plus 50 years for authors, and would give royalties to cable TV, public broadcasting, and jukeboxes. The current 2¢ record royalty would be upped to 2¼¢ per disc or 6/10ths of a cent per minute of playing time, whichever sum is larger. Operators of jukeboxes would be required to put \$8 per box into a fund for copyright owners. The measure now moves to the Rules Committee, then to the House floor. A similar version of the bill has already passed the Senate.

### Monument Leaves Columbia

Columbia Records and Monument Records have jointly agreed to terminate their domestic distribution pact. The international Monument distribution remains with Columbia, along with Columbia House Record Club agreements. Columbia will retail distribution rights for product from Billy Swan and Kris Kristofferson, although these two artists will remain on the Monument label.

### Capt. & Tennille Reap Top TV Ratings

Politics took a back seat to The Captain & Tennille's ABC-TV special recently. Nielsen ratings show that the Republican National Convention fell well below C&T's showing for the week, even behind the ABC special "Winter Kill." Mr. & Mrs. Dragon scored a huge 51 share of the audience for the kick-off of their fall series.

### High Schoolers' Mistrust Of Media

A survey of over 22,300 teens in the "Who's Who Among American High School Students" shows that a great percentage of these youths feel that the media is controlled by the government to some degree. 73% of those surveyed felt that "government regulates news by controlling what it releases to the media." In the same survey, figures show that TV is still the main information source for high-schoolers, 47% use it as their main source, 46% use newspapers, 28% radio.

### Senate To Study Postal Service

A Senate bill designed to keep the U.S. Postal Service out of deep financial trouble has passed that house and has gone onto the House of Representatives. The bill freezes postal service rates and forces the Postal Rate Commission to act on rate increase requests within 10 months. A committee is planned to study the Postal Service's problems, and will report to Congress in February. In the meantime, no rate raises or cut in services is allowed.

### No Gamble In Jukeboxes

The Internal Revenue Service has ruled that even though some jukeboxes may be rigged to give extra bonus plays, they cannot be termed coin-operated gaming devices.

### Car Prices Up Again

The 1977 model year will see many Detroit auto makers again raise list prices for new cars, according to industry speculation. Although no exact price lists have been delivered to dealers, cost increases in the steel industry and other areas will probably force price increases higher than in some time. Most manufacturers are betting that sales won't be hurt by the price change, since the buying public is now recovering from last year's rampant inflation. Some estimates of the general price increase reach up to \$350 per car.

### Dino Sues WB

Dean Martin is seeking \$1.5 million damages from Warner Brothers Records over a breach of contract issue. Martin told the court that under the terms of his 1970 contract with WB, the company would pay him \$150,000 for each of 10 albums. Martin says that although he has been prepared to cut more albums, WB has refused to let him cut the last five LP's.

### Washington Station OK'd

The Washington D.C. frequency taken away from WOOK last year has been granted to Washington Community Broadcasting. New call letters are WCBG.

### Disputed License Granted

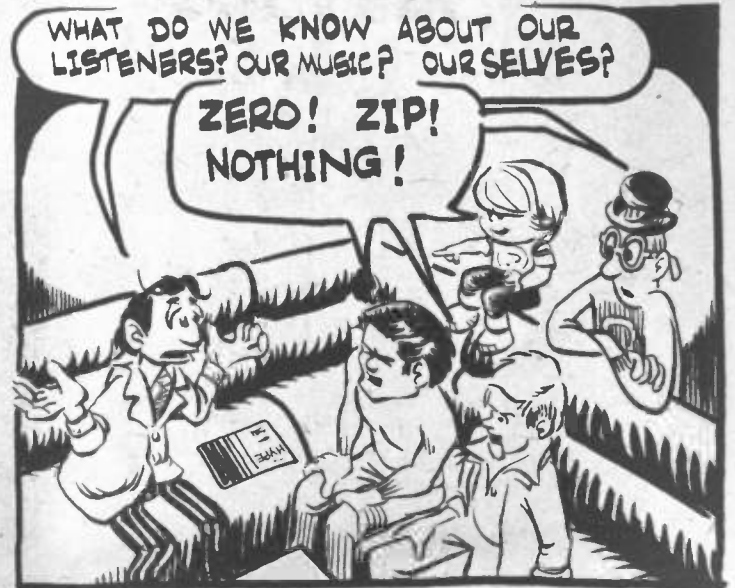
The license renewal of KWFM/Tucson has been granted despite objections raised by a former employee of the station. An independent agency determined that no racial discrimination, which the employee had charged, was found.

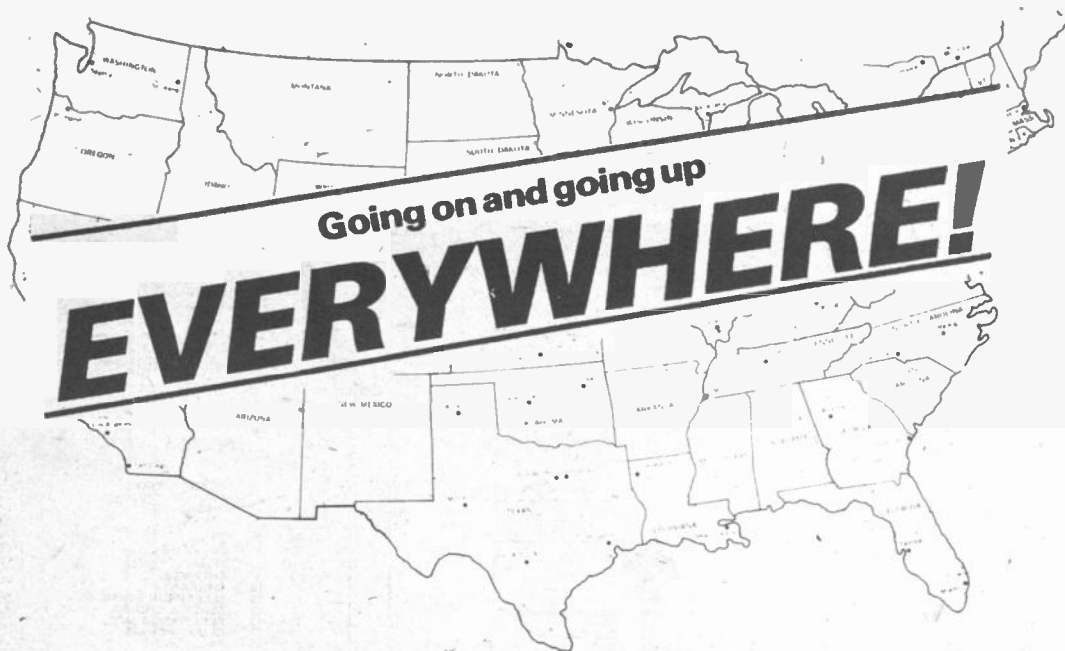

### GM's On PD's



One of the eternal problems encountered by radio people is a breakdown (or even an initial failure) in communication between people in the various jobs and departments of a radio station.

Talking to numerous General Managers, Program Directors, Music Directors, jocks etc., I often hear the complaint, "My GM is interfering with the programming of my station," or "The sales department has no concept of what we're doing," or "My Program Director doesn't know what he wants. It changes from day to day." There are hundreds of other examples, which I'm sure you've run into somewhere along the line.

Listening to many of these internal complaints which make their way to external ears, one can draw the impression that the radio stations of our industry are run by either a lot of people who don't know what they're doing or are unable to do what is expected of them. I would prefer to think that the truth behind most cases of radio personnel dissatisfaction lies in people not knowing what is expected of them.

The reason for this lies in this business' built-in peculiarity of varying job definitions from station to station. What is defined as a Program Director at one station is not necessarily the same at another. This inconsistency is consistent all the way down the line to part time disc jockeys.

When people change stations to take a position with the same title at another, they sometimes find that they are in a new role, different from what they were used to or anticipated.

Throughout all this, however, you'll find that the radio station role which is most consistent throughout the industry is that of the General Manager. True, some are owners, some VP's of the corporation, and some neither, but it is usually the GM who sets the pace and standards of the jobs and roles played by the members of their staffs. As a result, they are usually the object of most of the criticism and the cause of most of the dissatisfaction. They are also, probably, the most misunderstood by their co-workers of all radio people.

Taking it one step further, it appears that the relationship between the General Manager and Program Director (call it a love/hate relationship if you like) is often the most tedious, the success of which is subject to the most critical degree of balance and maintenance.

I discussed this subject with some leading GM's to see if there are some obvious parallels in their viewpoints, and perhaps find some attitudes which our readers can compare or contrast with those of their own GM's.

Bob Hensky, GM of OK102½ in Seattle told R&R, "When a PD has difficulty communicating with his staff, but is liked and respected by his staff anyway, you can have a real problem. In a case like that, it appears to the General Manager that the PD is motivating his people when, perhaps, he isn't. To prevent this, a GM should include himself in the process of programming decisions, not for the purpose of stepping on the PD's toes, but to be able to properly support him. The GM should make it his business to know as much about programming as he can."

I asked Bart Walsh, GM of WWWW in Detroit what he expects of a Program Director. He replied emphatically, "RATINGS!" He went on to say, "Unfortunately, that's (ratings) what we all have to live by. A PD should have control over the people that work for him. Jocks are unusual people. They are creative, among many other things, and require a special type of handling. It's the PD's job to insulate the business end of the radio station, which includes the General Manager, Sales Manager and Account Executives, from these creative people who they may not fully understand. He has to be a conduit, liaison and interpreter."

Also in Detroit, GM Al Wilson of WABX pointed out, "The PD should keep the GM fully aware of exactly what's happening in programming. That's where many PD's go wrong in maintaining an understanding relationship with their GM."

I spoke to Bert Levine, Owner/GM of WROV in Roanoke. This station is particularly interesting because: 1) They are the highest rated small market AOR station in the country, boasting a 26.4 share (6-mid. Mon-Sun. total audience ¼ hour average) in the latest ARB. 2) They've accomplished this feat on the AM band utilizing perhaps the most unorthodox of AOR tactics which consists of presenting AOR music in a Top 40 style. 3) For almost the past 6 months the station has been without an actual Program Director because their format is so unusual, it's hard to find someone willing or capable of programming it. Levine told R&R, "People have difficulty differentiating between an Operation Director and a Program Director. In most cases, the PD is expected to be both, someone capable of maintaining the station's day to day programming operations and, as a PD, being able to look ahead. This includes sharing management's view of how to go about capturing the desired audience while projecting where they will be in the future to meet them, without jumping ahead of them. What we need in this business are Program Directors who are capable of translating the verbalized abstracts of the industry into day to day practice. A PD today has to be someone informed about the world, into radio and into music. There should be a partnership between programming and management, not a truce."

Jim Price, GM of KGB AM/FM in San Diego mentioned, "In our own situation, the PD should be in complete charge of programming. I exert my influence to see that the PD understands that radio is a business."

For the eighth week in a row, the JEFFERSON STARSHIP is the most played album on AOR radio. RONSTADT moved up to number two and could be a strong contender for the top slot next week. MILLER inched back up. ORLEANS maintained superb airplay. BOZ enjoyed a tremendous increase. YAMASHITA came on very strong jumping into the top ten. H&O nudged up. AWB maintained. FLYER grew. FRAMPTON resurged. The album refuses to stop selling and the phone requests keep it on the turntables. BENSON had a very good week showing major gains. ARMATRADING made huge jumps. CHICAGO and C/N were stable. BOC was solid. STEELY held firm. MAC enjoyed a resurgence. The album is now into its second year on the chart. GREENE was the week's highest debut. AUTOMATIC debuted impressively. FIREFALL maintained. JUDY debuted. PARSONS is hanging in there. F&E, HANCOCK, and CHERRY debuted. McVIE bounced back onto the chart. ANDERSON nudged up. C.J. McDONALD, CITY BOY, MICHAEL DINNER, and the DOOBIE BROTHERS almost made the chart in that order.

This chart is based solely on airplay and does not attempt to fabricate a trend. The artists in italics are those receiving the most rapid gain in airplay.

Together, we try to merge the commercial and artistic aspects of the medium to be able to provide the audience with what they want and the owners with what they want."

R&R's Country Editor Jim Duncan spoke to a few Country radio GM's about this topic.

Verl Wheeler, GM of WUBE in Cincinnati told Jim, "I expect, first of all, numbers. Secondly, I feel a Program Director should over-see the programming of the station from all levels, from the jocks to the sound of music we want for our Country station. Country music is becoming so hard to define, it is necessary that he makes sure our sound is consistent. He has got to be a motivator of people. He also has to be a person who is capable of taking the young new talent and molding them into the future drive jocks for this station or for other stations. So he is a teacher, instructor, and a motivator. Even though we have a Music Director, he is still responsible for the sound of music our audience will hear."

In discussing his view of Program Directors, Hal Smith, GM of KNEW in Oakland-San Francisco explained, "I expect him basically to run his department. I divide the radio station into two departments. Sales Manager handles sales. Program Director handles everything else. I expect him to run his department to be strong, to be responsive, and most important to be in the audience business more than anything else."

Charlie Warner, GM of Chicago's Country giant, WMAQ stated, "A Program Director must make the decisions of hiring and firing of the talent and be responsible for their continued performance evaluations and control. He should supervise the maintenance and control of the format. To recommend and institute format changes. To be responsible for the selection of the music. To be responsible for the majority of the ideas for promotions. To supervise all on-the-air production spots for contests. To consult with the News Manager on the presentation and scheduling of the news. He doesn't have anything to do with news content, but he is responsible for the style and voices heard on his newscasts. Presentation is the key. He has to manage all of the budgets for his department for promotions and contests. He must deal with the union contracts for his talent. I give my Program Director total autonomy. He controls everything on-the-air, from the play by play announcer to the jocks, promotions, sales promotions, everything must be cleared through him. If he says no, it does not go on. There have been very few times I have ever overruled him on anything. He has total control over the sound and format of the station."

There you have, as they say, "a view from the top" of the relationship between the GM and PD. It's tension or compatibility, has a direct bearing on just about every member of a radio station's staff. It also accounts for many of the reasons that the Program Director is usually the second least understood member of our industry's radio station families.

Well, Kent said to me one day, "Don, the greatest thing you have going for you is your voice!" He went on to say that I had the most identifiable voice in radio. And then, all of a

sudden, my mental block was gone! I discovered I didn't even need reverberation behind me to make me sound ballsier!

And that was when I finally became Dr. Don Rose. The whole person. The real "the-reason-I-sound-weird-is-because-I-am!" sort of guy that was always lurking right below the surface. And it was okay to be funny, but somehow I remembered to stop and smell the roses, and show the rest of who I am, too. When Bobby Darin died, I remember

stopping for a couple of minutes before I played "Mack The Knife," to tell how close I had come to death myself, because of heart disease. And there was the time our dog got lost, and we had people all over Danville, California, looking for him. And the time my youngest son Johnny was in the hospital with a temperature of 105°.

So how do you figure out how to be yourself? I thought you'd never ask. TRY EVERYTHING! Nothing's too bizarre, or too far out!

Now, most of these things you try, won't work. When something doesn't work, throw it out! 95% of the things you try may not work. Say, "Hey! This isn't me!" and TOSS! It may be the greatest, but if it isn't you, get rid of it! Now—and this is the most important part—after you've thrown out everything that doesn't work, for twenty years or so, WHAT'S LEFT WILL BE YOU!

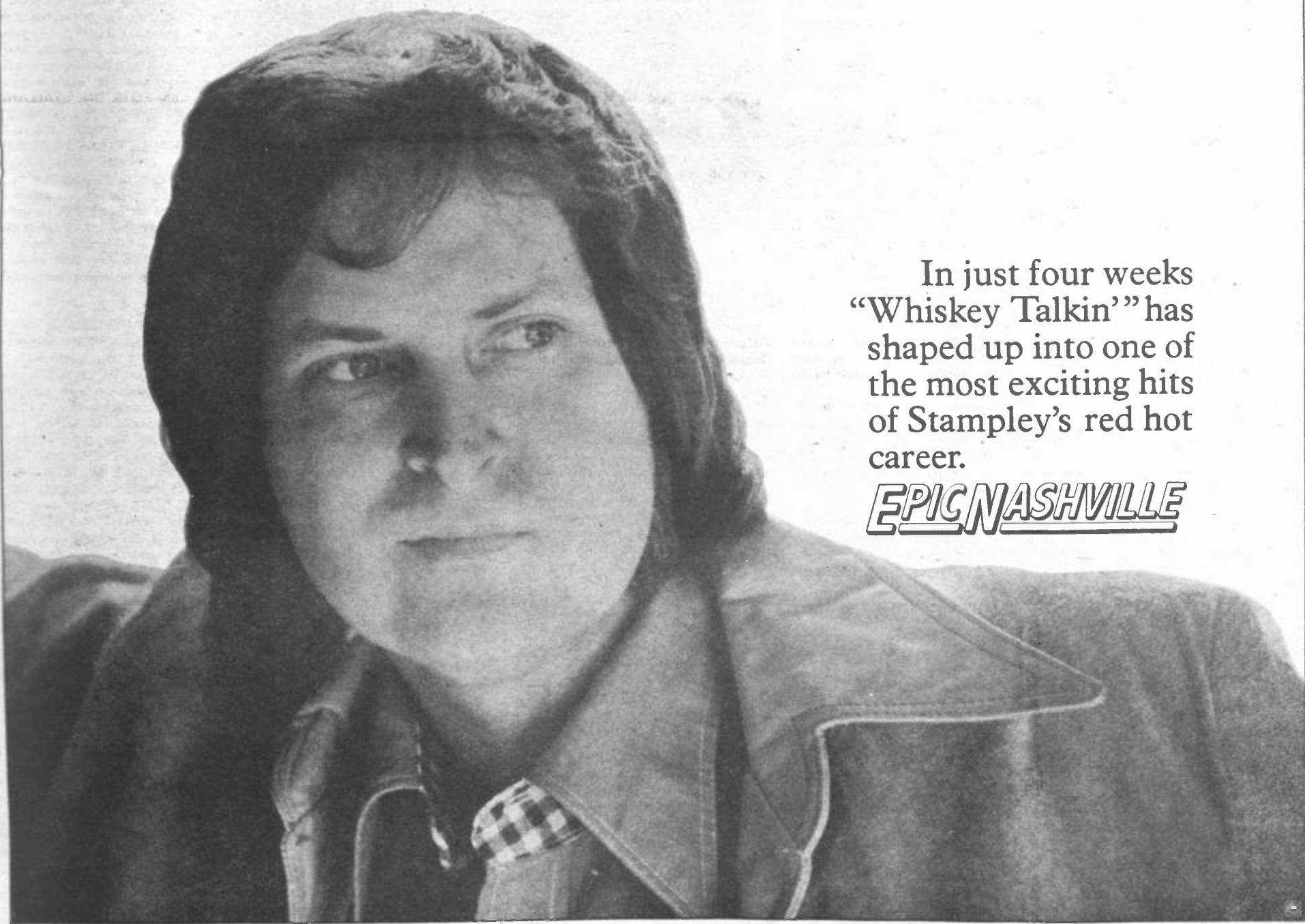
