Verdict On Harrison Case

Former Beatle **George Harrison** was found guilty in New York Tuesday (9/7) of "Subconsciously plagiarizing the 1962 Ron Mack tune 'He's So Fine' for his 1970 hit record 'My Sweet Lord' in a much publicized case. Federal Judge **Richard Owen**, a composer himself, ruled that Harrison was guilty of copyright infringement although the judge commented, "I do not believe he did so deliberately." Owens scheduled November 8th for trial on the issue of damages in the lawsuit brought against Harrison by **Bright Tunes Music Corp.** which owns the copyright for "He's So Fine" which was recorded in 1962 by **The Chiffons**.

Lou Adler Kidnapped For Eight Hours

Lou Adler, record producer and owner of **Ode Records**, was kidnapped last Thursday (9/2) at gunpoint by two suspects, a man and a woman, and held for \$25,000 ransom. It wasn't until Tuesday night (9/7) that the story was made public, when the suspects were captured and arraigned in Malibu Municipal Court. According to reports, the alleged kidnappers abducted Adler in

his Malibu, California home and moved him to another of his beachfront properties where after 8 hours he was forced to turn over \$25,000 to them. He was then released unharmed. According to police, there is a third possible suspect in the case. The female suspect apprehended was held with bail set at \$50,000 and the male suspect was refused bail.

E. Alvin Davis To WSAI/Cincinnati

John Bayliss, General Manager of **WSAI/Cincinnati**, has announced that **E. Alvin Davis** will take over as Program Director of the station effective Monday (13). Davis leaves **WNOE/New Orleans** after one year as PD. Davis told R&R: "The last

year has been one of the best of my life. The entire staff had done an incredible job, I will always hold a special place in my heart for the management and staff of **WNOE**. I look forward to the opportunity to work in Cincinnati."

Chrysalis Names National Promo Coordinators

Rounding out their re-aligned promotion staff, **Chrysalis Records** has appointed **Jack Ashton** as National Album Promotion Coordinator and **Susan Harrington** as National Singles Promotion Coordinator. Ashton joins the company from **ABC Records** and Harrington comes from **Rocket Records**.

Lynyrd Skynyrd Guitarist Injured

Gary Rossington, one of the founding trio and lead guitarists of **Lynyrd Skynyrd**, was seriously injured in an automobile accident in Jacksonville, Florida over the Labor Day weekend. The 24 year old Rock star suffered injuries from head to toe and is reportedly in a state of shock. The accident has forced the cancellation of the group's immediate concert dates.

John Long has resigned his Program Director position at **WAPE/Jacksonville**, effective September 17th. His future plans will be announced shortly.

Arthur Crofton is the new Music Director of **KLIF/Dallas**.

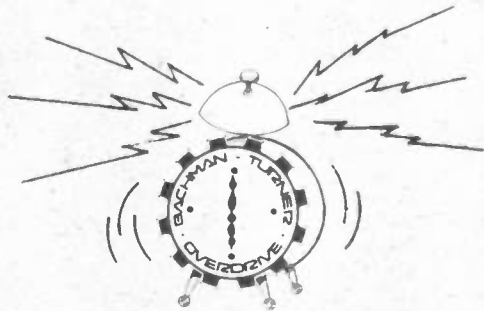
UNDERGROUND RADIO:

ARBITRON NIXES STATION PERSONNEL DIARIES

Arbitron has announced that they will "not knowingly include station owners, station employees and their families, and network personnel and their families" in their samples for Arbitron Radio and Television Reports. According to the announcement, "Recent events have caused people in broadcasting to become concerned about the possible appearance of conflict of interest when broadcasting personnel participate in audience surveys." Arbitron has taken several steps to help implement this policy. First, they have written all station managers and owners advising them of the policy changes. The letter asks management to inform station employees that they should not participate in any broadcast audience survey. Arbitron also asks that they sign statements on an annual basis to the effect that they have informed their employees and that they will make every effort to see to it that the policy is upheld. Further, Arbitron says that they will excuse from participation any random sample households who identify themselves as being a part of the broadcast industry.

EMPLOYMENT APPEAL

KAKC/Tulsa's brand new morning man, Jim Dunaway, and the station devised a promotion to get advance exposure on Dunaway's arrival in the city. Although Jim had already been hired, KAKC PD Ken Curtis sent him out in the street for a couple of weeks prior to starting his airshift, complete with a sandwich sign reading "I Want To Work at KAKC." As he traveled the city, hundreds of residents responded with a flood of calls to the station, some urging his hiring and the stunt also received television and newspaper coverage.

SUMMER CLEARANCE

WFOM/Marietta billed their recent "Summer Clearance" weekend as "the longest and biggest weekend giveaway" ever. Starting Friday night all the way through Monday, Labor Day, the station gave away four prizes an hour, 24 hours a day in an attempt to "clean out" their summer stash of prizes. Albums by Linda Ronstadt, England Dan & John Ford Coley, Steve Miller and many others, as well as clock radios, weather band radios, clothes and much more were awarded to listeners.

SUMMER FULL OF VACATIONS

Vacation trips to a number of exotic sites were given away to KEZY/Anaheim listeners during the summer. Trips to the Bahamas, Ha-

waii, Mexico, and New York have already been given away in drawings, and an end of summer trip to the Colorado River is planned.

RETURN OF "BOZ" RADIO

WISE/Asheville plays up radio of the past in their current promotion. Every time Boz Scaggs' "Lowdown" is played on the air, listeners call in to win Boz's "Silk Degrees" LP in the "Boz Radio Returns" contest.

DATE WITH STARS

WORC/Worcester gave away a celebrity evening to two of their listeners. To enter the contest, listeners sent in reasons why they wanted a date with one of the members of Jigsaw. The best entrants qualified for a drawing to select the winners. The evening started off with limo service to a special dinner with the group, and tickets to the Jigsaw and Tavares concert.

RECORD SPREE

Tying in with a local record store and the Coca Cola company, WERC/Birmingham presented their "Sprite Spree" promotion. Hourly callers qualified for weekly drawings to select the winners of five-minute sprees in the store, where they could grab up as many albums as they could in the allotted time.

KISSOFF

WAIR/Winston-Salem is leading up to the local Kiss concert with the "Great Fresh AIR KissOff." Kiss albums, poster, T-shirts, bumperstickers and concert tickets are given away on the air. In order to win, callers give the station personalities a "kiss" on the air.

ALBUM STASH

Over \$3000 worth of LPs are being given away by KBIM/Roswell in their "Great Album Stash." Certain number callers get the chance to win one album from the station's stash for each of the last four records played on the air that they remember.

CONCERT CONTESTS

WEEO/Waynesboro recently gave away over \$1100 worth of albums and concert tickets for the local J. Geils Band, Mahogany Rush and Atlanta Rhythm Section appearance.

The recent Elvis Presley concert was promoted by WAAV/Huntsville, featuring album and ticket giveaways and daily airings of parts of the Elvis story.

Savannah's Peter Frampton and Gary Wright concert was the earliest sell-out show in the city's history. WSGA held giveaways of custom WSGA-Frampton T-Shirts prior to the concert.



WQXI/Atlanta recently held their Wolfman Jack-Disco Party Night at Six Flags Over Georgia. One of the largest crowds in the park's history joined Wolfman and co-MC WQXI personality Coyote McCloud. Tons of prizes were given away to disco'ers during the party.

BUSINESS NEWS

July FCC Complaints Down

The month of July saw a significant drop in number of complaints logged by the Federal Communications Commission. 2404 total complaints were filed, down over 1700 from June. Comments and inquiries for July totalled 1526, increasing 231 over the previous month.

Carter Backs Down On Fairness Doctrine

The Democratic National Committee has withdrawn its request to the Supreme Court to make a decision on a recent FCC ruling exempting Presidential news conferences and debates from Fairness Doctrine rules. Jimmy Carter retains his stand against the FCC's decision, but apparently felt that immediate Supreme Court action on the subject would make an impact on the upcoming Ford-Carter debates.

Ford Alters FCC Nominees

After many people in Washington have speculated that President Ford's nomination to the FCC of Margita White may be a conflict of interest, due to her husband's D.C. law firm post, Ford has re-aligned his Commission appointments. White is now nominated to fill the two-year post vacated by Charlotte Reid. Joseph Fogarty has now been selected to fill the 7 year post formerly held by Glenn Robinson.

NAB Re-Aligns Execs

The National Association of Broadcasters has named Jim Hulbert as the Senior Vice President for station relations, a newly created post. Hulbert had formerly been public relations VP for the organization. In addition, Erwin Krasnow is now the NAB's new General Counsel.

Chrysalis Chooses Canada Distrib.

Chrysalis Records President Terry Ellis and Arnold Gosewich, President of Capitol Records-EMI of Canada have announced the signing of a licensing contract under which Capitol will distribute the Chrysalis label in Canada.

NAB Asks FCC For CB Approval

The National Association of Broadcasters has told the FCC that it supports revision of existing rules restricting rebroadcast of CB transmissions on stations. The NAB feels that certain information that could be broadcast directly from a CB source would be to the public benefit.

Report Gives OK To Senate Broadcast

A report made for the Commission on the Operation of the Senate has proposed that the US Senate be open for broadcast of its sessions. Although the Commission has not officially adopted the report, it opens the door for future discussion of such broadcasts. Recently, a House of Representatives committee had ruled against a similar plan in their House of Congress.

FCC Reprimands KLBJ

KLBJ/Austin, owned by the late President Lyndon Johnson's family, has been issued a reprimand by the FCC for refusing to run spots for a local political candidate. The station argued that the refusal to air the commercials was due to objections to certain portions of the pre-produced spots.

WZZM-FM-TV Sold

West Michigan Tele-Casters Inc. has agreed to sell WZZM-FM-TV/Grand Rapids to Wometco Enterprises Inc. for a \$14 million figure. Sale is subject to final agreement between the companies and FCC approval. Wometco currently owns television outlets in Washington, Florida, North and South Carolina.

Free Sample Regs Urged

A member of Congress has urged the Federal Trade Commission to require that advertisers who offer free samples in advertising specifically spell out exactly what consumers can expect from their freebies. Democrat John Murphy of New York feels that potentially millions of Americans have been or may be disappointed by the free goods that companies offer. Regulations would make suppliers designate exact amounts and sizes of the products offered.

Final Star Stations Vote

Star Broadcasting Co. stations, KOIL & KEFM/Omaha, WIFE-FM/Indianapolis and KISN/Vancouver, have been voted down by the FCC for the final time. In a 3 to 2 vote, the Commission ordered the stations off the air. The FCC now has 30 days to determine whether they will grant temporary permission for other parties to take over the stations' frequencies.

A Conversation With Ringo

RINGO: That came about because I decided there's not much movement you can make while playing the drums so I tried nodding my head... doo dah doo doo.

R&R: Do you think of yourself as a personality first or a musician first?

RINGO: Yeah, I am a personality. That's how I go out. But I am a great drummer. And not a bad singer. Not a good one, but not a bad one. That's another thing, with the vocals, people would say, "Ah, he can't bloody sing." That's a load of crap. I know I'm getting better all the time. The more I'm working, the better I'm getting as a singer. Singers in L.A. respect me. But the writers are still saying, "You know what they said in '64, he can't sing, so we better keep saying that." They should stop and listen for a while. I don't care if they say it's a load of crap, as long as they stopped to listen and not just follow in that old story.

R&R: You still feel a reluctance by the Rock press to accept you?

RINGO: Oh, yeah. Oh, yeah. It's changing, but changing slowly.

R&R: Looking at the Beatles as a group of four people, what role did you play in the personal relationships between them?

RINGO: I was the only one who could stay friendly with the other three, no matter what went down. They have such intense personalities. Three very strong-willed people, all totally different.

R&R: Were you opposed to the split?

RINGO: No, because it was splitting anyway. People think it just went, "Oh, well, we'll split." Well that wasn't the case. It had been going on for like a year, 18 months. It was like a creeping thing, you know. Then it got to the point that it was better finished. Better finished because we could always get back together, if we wanted to. Which we don't want to, right now.

R&R: Are you being met with resistance in your attempt to further pursue a movie career?

RINGO: No, I'm turning a lot down. I think I've done enough of those little parts. I don't want to be the star of the movie but I want some parts with meat in them, though.

R&R: What type of part would appeal to you.

RINGO: All types. You see, at the beginning I wanted to be a film star. Now I want to be an actor. I'm not interested now in being in some silly Rock and Roll movie. Suddenly, now, there are 20,000 producers wanting to do a Monty Python movie and they seem to call on me.

R&R: Do you listen to the radio?

RINGO: Only in the car.

R&R: What's your impression of American radio?

RINGO: Well, this is radio-land. I think that radio here is fine. There's such a choice. It's great for the record business. In England you have such a small outlet. England was great in the '60's with all those pirate stations. There was such competition. There was excitement. That excitement still exists in America because of all the competition. You can see what's happening in England. Look at the charts. Look at the groups that are supposedly "heavy" groups over there. Not to mention any names. That's because you have a panel in the BBC, although I never met them, of 95 year old ladies who I'm not putting down because they're old but because they're not into music.

R&R: You hear people in the music business talk about the 10 year cyclical phenomenon theory. As honestly as you can tell us, was the Beatles phenomenon the pre-fabricated master plan of a genius mind or did it even take those closest to it by surprise?

RINGO: Well, it surprised the hell out of me. We didn't actually sit down and think we were going to conquer the world, musically. We were just sort of interested in conquering Liverpool. Then we covered England. Then it went to the Continent. We were very nervous when we came to America. We had two records here that didn't do anything and we were used to the crowds in Europe, but at first it didn't look like anything was about to happen here.

R&R: How did it happen here?

RINGO: When we flew into London from Sweden, Ed Sullivan was also flying into the same airport from New York. He never heard of us, but there were 10,000 kids at the airport waiting for us. One the strength of that he spoke to Brian (Epstein) and booked us on his show for 10 grand for 2 performances, one in New York and one in Miami. Then we got this deal with Capitol and we forced them to promote, because that's very important. We also happened to have a number one record. As our records were climbing out the charts they were interspersed with all these news items about what was happening with us in Europe, all the crowds and stuff. When we got to New York to do the show, there were millions of kids all over the place. We didn't expect that. All the things that happened to us was magic.

R&R: Do you think it'll happen again in Rock and Roll?

RINGO: It's hard to say. I can't really say. It's like, what is Rock and Roll?

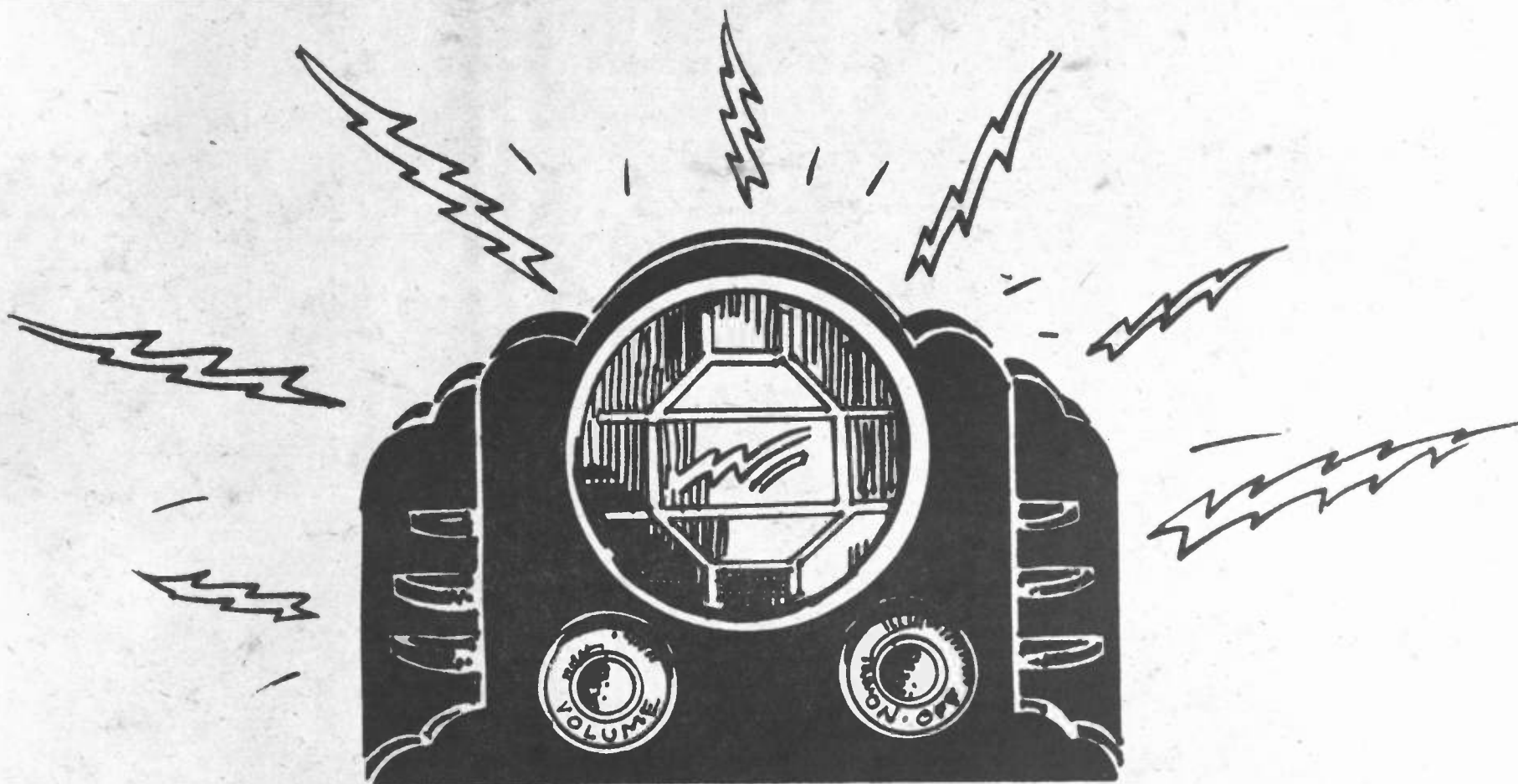

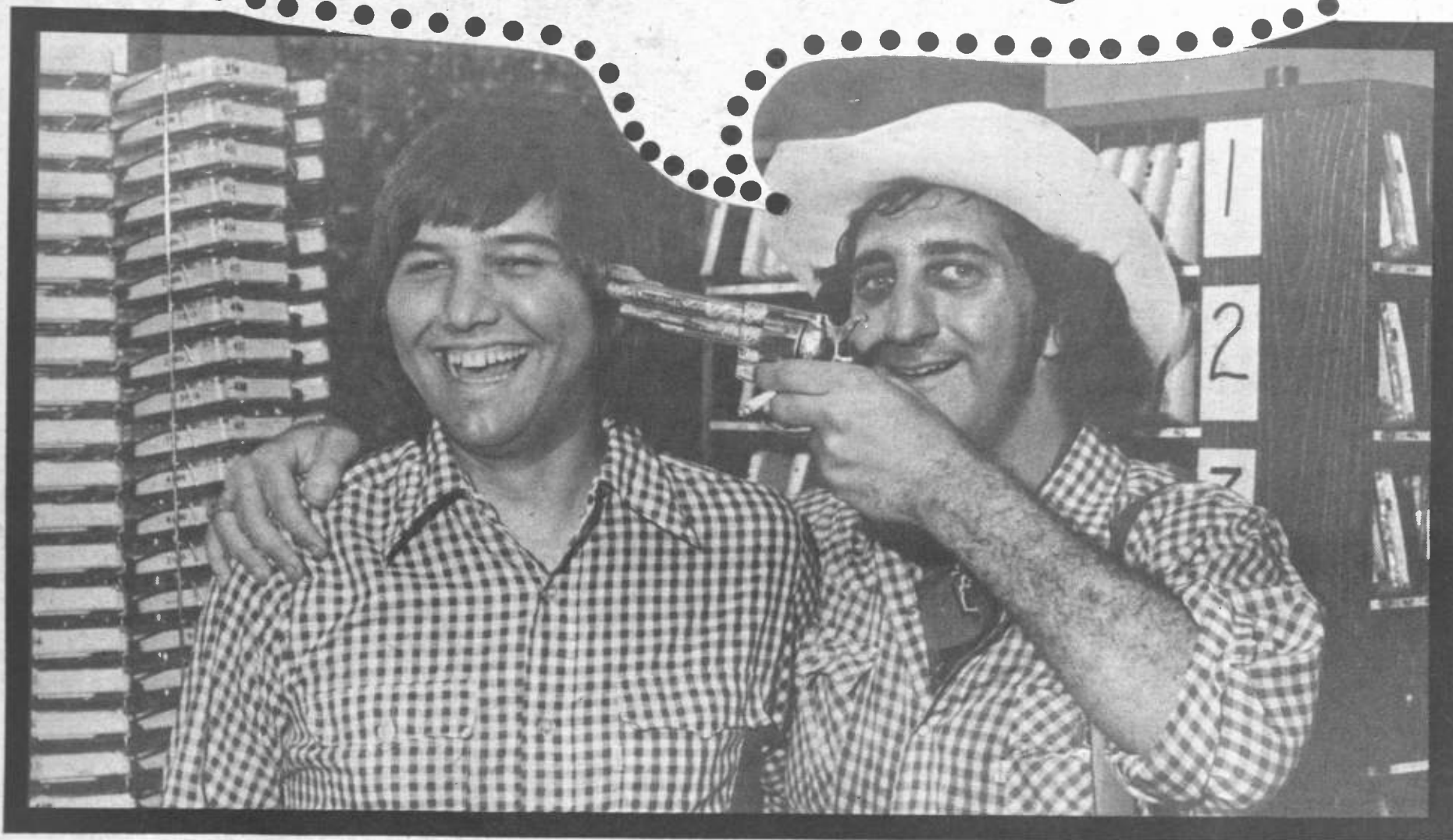

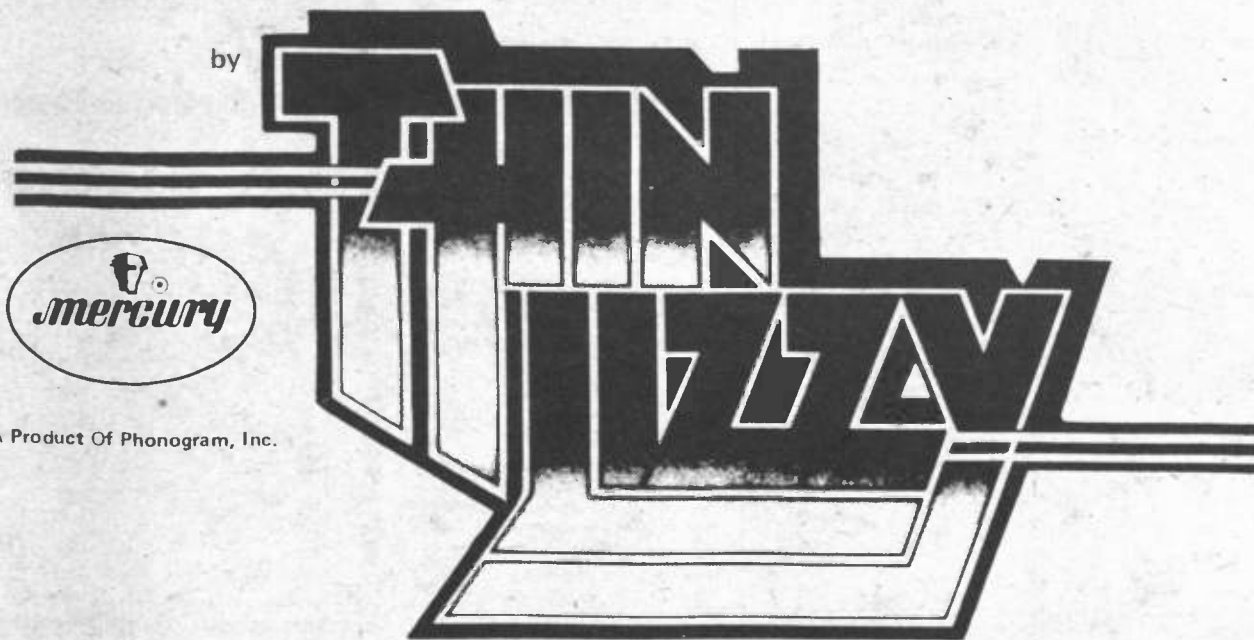

A Conversation With Ringo



R&R: What led to your association with Atlantic Records?

RINGO: Well, the contracts were running out with the other company and they didn't seem to want to offer me anything, so I said if they're not really interested in having me, then I'm not interested in making an album for them, so we waited until we found whoever we'd be with next. We didn't know who it would be. Also, one of the pluses for me with Atlantic is that that's the only way I could work with Arif (Mardin), 'cause they won't let him out, you know. (Ha) They won't give Arif a break.

R&R: So we should add your name to those who have a tremendous respect for Arif Mardin as a producer.

RINGO: You've got to. Look at his record, are you kidding? And, he's a fine man. He's a gentleman. It's a tricky situation, a producer and an artist. Especially when you don't know each other, but just on what he's done, I knew I would like to work with him. So he flew to London for an hour and we just sat in the same room together and after an hour I said I'd still like to do the album with you and he said he'd still like to do the album with me. But I said, I can't do it in New York, you see that's where he does most of his stuff. We'd have to do it in L.A. So, we agreed to that. And then we got a big list of musicians. He knew all the musicians, but he hadn't worked with a lot of them, the Los Angeles musicians. So we picked different groups for different tracks and then we went through picking the tracks themselves, because we had 30 possibles. And we sat down for a couple of days and went through stuff. He found the key for me...

R&R: Have you considered putting together your own intact group that would provide a consistent showcase for you and your talents?

RINGO: This year, I thought about putting together a band for the purpose of going out on the road next year, after the next album, which I'll do in January. We would do the songs of those two albums and the past two albums. But I really don't want to go out with the attitude, "Here I am for two and a half hours." I don't really think I've got that many songs. So, I want to go out with some sort of review situation, where I'll be relieved. Dancers, elephants, whatever. Other artists. We worked it out, but with the people I wanted to use and the places I wanted to go, we'd have to work two shows a night for four months (Ha). Too long. So I'm thinking about it again, only going out a different way, you know. But maybe I'll go out. I'm just not definite. But I think I'd like to go out.

R&R: Do you think that you're developing a following that looks upon you as a solo artist and not just one of the Beatles?

RINGO: Yeah. It started to grow with the first album. It's getting better all the time, as they say.

R&R: When I was at the Wings concert in L.A., you were sitting a few rows in front of me. I heard a lot of people saying, "I wonder what Ringo is thinking now. Could you share some of your personal thoughts at that concert?"

RINGO: The main thought was that the band's a lot better and they're helping each other out. I saw them when they were playing in England and Paul, aw—he's a professional, he was working so hard, and he wasn't getting much support from his band. At the Forum, it was more like a band. Everyone was supporting each other. That's what it takes with a band. And they played very well. I liked the show and I love him, so...then it got to the end with the flowers. That was just some sort of silliness we got into. It would have been too hokey to give him the flowers and just a disaster to give Linda the flowers, so I thought I'd give them to Denny Laine. Everyone wanted me to give them to the other two so I thought I'd give them to Denny for a Ho Ho Ho. That was all. I had nice thoughts. I enjoyed the show. I mean, I like going to a show and enjoying it. I hate going to a show and have it really boring.

R&R: Were you gripped with any nostalgia when some of the Beatles songs were played?

RINGO: Not real nostalgia. I don't think he does them as good as we did.

R&R: What are some of your interests outside of music? What else have you been doing with your time?

RINGO: Not that much really. I'm trying to get some sort of movie career together. Most of my energies go into the album. Just 'cause the album's done and you're not in the studio or on stage, people think you're not doing anything. We're into the ads. We're into doing these interviews. We're into promotion. And then in the next weeks, when we're done here, we hit Europe and do the whole thing across Europe. All being well, I should be able to stop with this album around November. Then I start in December getting the next one ready. So I don't really have that much time off.

R&R: People's perception of you as a drummer has definitely gotten more positive over the years. Back during the Beatles days, your particular talents were looked upon with a degree of scepticism. Then, right around the Bangladesh concert, it started to change. Now I've heard people, including musicians and great drummers refer to you as one of Rock's greatest drummers. Can you account for this evolution?

RINGO: When we started out, nobody thought it was me on the records.

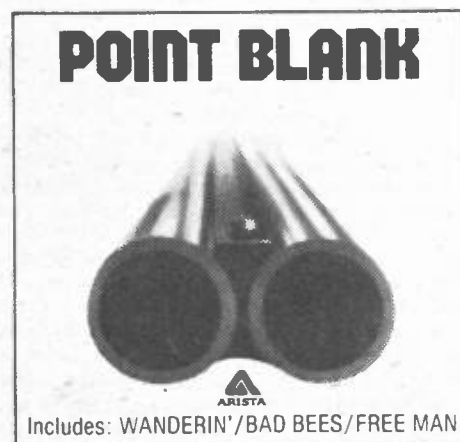

I don't know why! But, you see, once these things start, people tend to stay with it. They don't look anywhere. It's sort of, "I'm gonna say this, so you ought to say the same." So, I was always put down within the musical paper industry, which then created it with people who'd read it and then say "Look it says it here so I guess he doesn't play." But I always did play, but I wouldn't fight it because I knew what I was doing. I knew I was playing on those records. It was only when we started coming over here and meeting a lot of musicians that I started to realize that whenever a drummer had a session, everyone would ask him if he played like Ringo. I didn't know that I was creating this amazing situation going on. Technically, I'm not very technical at all. I train not to be technical. I don't practice ever. I don't want to know what I'm doing when I'm playing the drums. I mean I know what I'm doing when I'm playing the rhythm pattern. But when there's fills or anything... I love a good mistake. That's what some of those are, those fills, I mean, they're in time but they're just weird. You don't know how you did it. You could never do them again. You only get it once out of me. It comes from within me. It's not a brain job where I'm thinking, "two bars ahead of me Tch-Ka Boom Dih Dih (etc)." I could never do that. If the singer's singing, I don't need to play anything. I just keep it going, right? But if he stops, I mean, I will dive in there. With anything. And a lot of the time it works. But now I've decided to fight that craziness about people not thinking I played. I did play. I am a drummer. That's my job. What do you think went on all these years. Then because we didn't play between '66 and Bangladesh people would say, "Ooh look, he can raise his arms and hit the drums, look at that." That's when it started to change, because we had a lot of exposure from that, besides the thousands of people that were there. Maybe that's when people began to say, "Oh, maybe he can play." But I don't know. But, I am a good Rock and Roll drummer. That's all, Rock and Roll. I mean I'm not Buddy Rich who you have to admit can do more with one hand than I could do with two hands and two feet. But I don't particularly like the way he plays. He's not my favorite. My favorite happens to be Keltner. For me, I use him all the time on the records. 'Cause he's the most adaptable. And we're such good friends. We don't have competition time. There's not battle of the drummers between Jim and I. You know, I've been in the two drummer situation where it really gets silly. You're not listening to what the track is doing, you're listening to this other drummer and it gets into this battle situation. That's not constructive.

R&R: Beyond music, your personality and style while drumming have been imitated.

RINGO: You mean the nodding of the head?

R&R: That's a definite part of it
