General Tire To Spin Off RKO

In what appears to be a plan to protect its broadcast licenses from attacks regarding alleged improper payments by the parent company, General Tire & Rubber Co. plans to spin off its RKO General Inc. subsidiary.

RKO General, Inc. will be spun off to General Tire shareholders. The announcement was made at a special meeting held in lieu of their annual meeting. The stock distribution plan will be disclosed at a later date. The spin off is subject to a ruling that it would be tax-free for General Tire shareholders and the consent of regulatory agencies including the FCC.

Separating RKO from General Tire "will enable RKO to function in the broadcast area without the difficulties to which it has been subject and may be subject in the future of the company," General Tire President Thomas O'Neil told shareholders. "The board believes that the distribution will thereby protect more fully the value of RKO's broadcast interests and business."

RKO operates television stations in Boston, New York, Los Angeles, and

Memphis, and has radio stations in eight major markets. Following publication of charges that General Tire had engaged in illegal payoffs in Chile, Morocco, and Rumania, and allegedly made payments to remove itself from the Arab League boycott list, a competing group challenged the license of station WNCA-TV in Boston. The matter still hasn't been resolved.

In the past, RKO stations have been charged with reciprocity agreements involving General Tire and there have been allegations that anti-trust laws were violated. Spinning off RKO would end such problems, O'Neil said.

Besides the broadcasting properties, RKO owns a chain of 129 movie theatres in 42 cities and seven soft-drink-bottling plants in Ohio, Indiana, Tennessee and Arkansas, and operates cable TV facilities in 10 states. Also, RKO owns a 58% interest in Frontier Airlines, the nation's third-largest scheduled local-service airline. All of these businesses will be included in the independent company that is to be spun off.

\$3 Million Lawsuit Filed Against WLS

Fred Winston, former morning personality at WLS/Chicago, has filed a \$3,250,000 law suit against WLS, ABC, Martin Greenberg-VP/GM of WLS, John Gehron-PD WLS, Larry Lujack-Winston's air replacement, Rick Sklar-VP/ABC Radio and Chuck DeBare-President of ABC Radio.

The suit, according to Winston, is based on his feelings that the reasons given for his being fired from WLS were in breach of his contract. Winston claims he was terminated, through his lawyer, upon returning from his vacation, at which time WLS management claimed his vacation was unauthorized. Winston noted the so-called unauthorized vacation was actually authorized and that he reported back to work on time.

Winston advised R&R that he has yet to be paid his final check, a full three weeks after termination.

The three count suit breaks down as follows: \$250,000 for breach of contract, \$1 million for what Winston

claims was an unorthodox termination, and \$2 million for civil conspiracy (in that Winston was conspired against by WLS and ABC management and Larry Lujack).

WLS management could not offer any comments at our press time because they had not yet been served with the official legal documents and

therefore were not fully aware of what the suit encompasses. John Gehron, WLS PD, told R&R "All I know is what I've read in the local papers, but I feel like the \$3 million dollar man."

Winston is now looking to relocate, and will consider a smaller market. He can be reached at (312) 787-0478.

Plough Announces Format Changes

Craig Scott, National Program Director of Plough Broadcasting, Inc., reported to R&R the planned changes at three of the company's radio stations. In Atlanta, WPLO-FM will convert to an all disco-stereo format from Country. The new call letters will be WVEE and the station will be using the logo line "V-103." Another disco-stereo format is planned for WMPS-FM, Memphis, with WHRK as the new call letters. WHRK's logo line will be "K-97." Finally, WCOP-FM in Boston will change to Progressive Country, with the new call letters WTTK-FM. All of these new formats will go into effect October 4th.

WMPS/Memphis Vice President and General Manager John Rhea has announced the appointment of Michael St. John to the PD position there. St. John, who held the PD post at WERC/Birmingham will take over at WMPS October 5. Rhea told R&R that the morning air shift, left vacant by former PD/morning man Rick Dees, is not filled as yet.

WKGN/Knoxville is the first AM station to sign on with the successful "Superstars" format offered by Burkhardt/Abrams.



Aussies Claim Stan Kaplan Distorts Facts

Dear R&R:

In the copy of Radio & Records, August 13 in 'Letters' I was very disturbed to read a letter from a Mr. Stanley N. Kaplan which to say the least has distorted the facts and is most unfair to Mr. Paul Drew and the RKO Radio network regarding the enormous part they played in the organization of the Radio Broadcast "Friends Across The Pacific" and the contribution they made to the presentation of the Bicentennial gift of Koala bears from the people of Australia to the people of America. We have a saying in Australia and I quote "Fair go mate" and because of this I would like to briefly state the facts.

As a part of Australia's participation in the American Bicentennial year I negotiated with Mr. Dwight Case of the RKO Radio network to set in operation the "Friends Across The Pacific" broadcast. He very kindly put me in touch with Mr. Paul Drew whom we brought to Australia with Mr. Michael Spears to investigate the possibilities. I know Mr. Frank Moore, Managing Director of Radio 4IP Brisbane, whom I co-opted in an advisory capacity to help in this promotion, will support me in paying tribute to the RKO Radio network and to Messrs. Drew and Spears particularly for the tremendous dedication they displayed in making this Broadcast possible. This Broadcast was one of the most successful of its kind ever attempted, not only in this country but in any other country, and I am sure that if there were more such broadcasts it would bring the peoples of the world to a better understanding.

The valuable contribution that Mr. Paul Drew and the RKO Radio network also made, along with other organizations, to the presentation of the gift of the Koala bears helped to make this one of Australia's most successful activities in its participation of the US Bicentennial year.



FCC Rules On Newsworthy Debates

Political debates can be classified as newsworthy items up to 24 hours after the debate takes place, according to a ruling by the FCC. The Commission's vote on the subject overrules a previous decision that said debates must be broadcast live in order for stations not to be subject to equal time requirements. Both the NAB and the Radio & TV News Directors Association had lobbied for the new rule.

Suits Filed Against Bartell Merger

The proposed merger of Bartell Media Corp. and Downe Communications Inc. has met with three class action suits filed against the merger, according to the companies. The suits claim that efforts to obtain outstanding common stock of Bartell's would force an unfair merger. Two of the suits were brought about by stockholders of the companies and the third by a Bartell subordinated debenture holder.

Austin Station Violates Communications Act

The Federal Communications Commission has informed KLBJ/Austin, owned by the Lyndon Johnson family, that they have violated a censorship section of the Communications Act by censoring parts of a broadcast of a political commercial. The clause in the act allows candidates for office control over the content of their advertising. KLBJ had earlier rejected a commercial for a political candidate on the grounds that the spot contained faulty disclaimers.

Cap Cities Projects Net Increase

Capital Cities Communications is looking toward a bright financial future, projecting earnings of \$4.50 per share for fiscal 1976. The company also announced that they are planning to buy 300,000 of its outstanding shares on the open market. The projected share price reflects an increase in earnings of nearly 40%.

Combined Re-finances

Combined Communications Corporation has announced that they have reached an agreement to re-finance current bank debts with a \$40 million loan. The 15 year loan, according to the company, would help interest costs and will retire \$7 million of their current bank debt.

Dylan TV Bombs

Bob Dylan's "Hard Rain" TV special last week ran in last place in the three way network battle, despite strong publicity, including the cover of TV Guide. ABC TV's "Family" debut held a 41 share for the lead, CBS Special "Entebbe" was next with a 23, and Dylan's NBC effort showed a 15 share.

Bonneville Appointments

Bonneville Broadcast Consultants President Martin Taylor has announced that Loring Fisher has been appointed Executive Vice-President of the company. In the newly created position, Fisher will be responsible for the general management of the organization. Fisher has been with Bonneville for five years. In addition, Frank D. Storer Sells WJW

A newly formed Cleveland company has agreed to buy WJW/Cleveland from Storer Broadcasting for approximately \$2.5 million cash. Partners in the new company include WJW's GM Richard Bremkamp and Cleveland Browns football owner Arthur Modell. Sale is subject to FCC approval.

FTC On Acne Treatments

All pimple creams may in fact be alike, according to test results made public by the Federal Trade Commission. The FTC's study was based on whether or not advertising claims, and the test results which substantiate them, are factual. In some cases, the ad claims were not reflected in the test results. One product questioned by the Commission was Bristol-Myers' Fostex brand soap. Ad claims said that the soap was "recommended by more physicians than any other acne product." The company told the FTC that their early advertising was directly aimed at pharmacists, and that sales at that time were therefore based on doctors' recommendations. Among other items questioned were Noxema skin cream, which proved to be "as effective" as competitive products, but not more effective.

The "Rock Awards" this past weekend called attention to a major problem in our industry. The problem is racially defined music.

Earth, Wind & Fire, a group that has million selling albums and this year had two mass appeal Top 40 hits, was classified as the top R&B group, and received no recognition in the "Pop" category.

Why does our own industry continue to keep the color barriers up?

BankAmericard's New "OK" Card

"O.K." has been trademarked by National BankAmericard Inc. for their new check guarantee system. The OK card is still in the development stages. Other plans from the company include changing the original BankAmericard over to a new "Visa" credit card.

Skepticism On Consumers

In a recent newsletter on super-market products, the Marsteller company warns retailers and manufacturers to take consumers' words with a grain of salt. The study points out that many industries have polled consumers wants and met with a complete turnaround when the public actually bought items. Of two examples, the first is auto industry findings that the public wanted gas-saving smaller models, but in reality bought more high powered bigger cars. The second was research on cereal packaging showing the public resented the large "air filled" boxes. When the cereal companies tried smaller more compact boxes, sales fell off.

"Cheese & Crackers" Get Together

The American Dairy Association will use 30 second radio spots in over 200 markets for their "Cheese 'n Cracker Get-Together" promotion. Sunshine Biscuits Hi-Ho's and Krispy crackers will be tied in for the campaign. The ads offer 50¢ refunds on any cheese when the crackers are purchased at the same time.

[So You Can Understand It]

NEW CONTEST REGULATIONS

The FCC has just amended its rules as respects licensee conducted contests. Section 73.1215 will now provide that any licensee that broadcasts or advertises information about a contest it conducts shall fully and accurately disclose the material terms of the contest, and shall conduct the contest substantially as announced or advertised. No contest description shall be false, misleading or deceptive with respect to any material term.

The key word obviously is "material." The word "material" will vary widely depending upon the exact nature of each contest. It is our opinion based upon a reading of the rule that material terms will include:

1. How to enter or participate
2. Any eligibility restrictions
3. Entry deadline dates
4. Whether prizes can be won
5. When prizes can be won
6. The extent, nature and value of prizes
7. Basis for evaluation of prizes
8. Time and means of selection of winners
9. Tie-breaking procedures.

How to enter or eligibility requirements are usually spelled out and should not prove any difficulty. The same is true with respect to deadline dates and the prizes to be won and who can win the prizes. However, the extent, nature and value of prizes is a key here. The FCC is requiring full disclosure so that each station must be especially careful in putting cash values on prizes such as cruises, merchandise, etc. In other words, the "hype" as respects dollar value of merchandise is now a violation of a specific FCC Rule.

The FCC has kept general the time and manner of disclosure of material terms of the contest. However, these material terms should be disclosed periodically be announcements broadcast on the station. By the same token, the announcements need not be enumerated each time an announcement promoting the contest is broadcast.

Please See Appendix.

APPENDIX

In Subpart H of Part 73, new Section 73.1215 is added, as follows: Sec. 73.1215 Licensee-conducted contests.

A licensee that broadcasts or advertises information about a contest it conducts shall fully and accurately disclose the material terms of the contest, and shall conduct the contest substantially as announced or advertised. No contest description shall be false, misleading or deceptive with respect to any material term.

NOTE 1.—for the purposes of this rule:

(a) A contest is a scheme in which a prize is offered or awarded, based upon chance, diligence, knowledge or skill, to members of the public.

(b) Material terms include those factors which define the operation of the contest and which affect participation therein. Although the material terms may vary widely depending upon the exact nature of the contest, they will generally include: how to enter or participate; eligibility restrictions; entry deadline dates; whether prizes can be won; when prizes can be won; the extent, nature and value of prizes; basis for valuation of prizes; time and means of selection of winners; and/or tie-breaking procedures.

NOTE 2.—In general, the time and manner of disclosure of the material terms of a contest are within the licensee's discretion. However, the obligation to disclose the material terms arises at the time the audience is first told how to enter or participate and continues thereafter. The material terms should be disclosed periodically by announcements broadcast on the station conducting the contest, but need not be enumerated each time an announcement promoting the contest is broadcast. Disclosure of material terms in a reasonable number of announcements is sufficient. In addition to the required broadcast announcements, disclosure of the material terms may be made in a non-broadcast manner.

NOTE 3.—This rule is not applicable to licensee-conducted contests not broadcast or advertised to the general public or to a substantial segment thereof, to contest in which the general public is not requested or permitted to participate, to the commercial advertisement of non-licensee-conducted contests, or to a contest conducted by a non-broadcast division of the licensee or by a non-broadcast company related to the licensee.





The new MD is MIKE HAROLD...TOM GARRISON is now doing afternoons on WIXX...

There's a new AOR station starting up in Corvallis, Oregon. KSLY will begin programming albums and needs service. They can be reached at Box K, Corvallis, Oregon 97330. Contact PD/MD David Shult at (503) 753-6633...WKLB has increased their on the air schedule to 24 hours a day. The station is presenting a Jazz show from midnight to 1am and new album releases the rest of the over-night...WKDA-FM took the 5 albums nominated for best of the year at the Rock Awards TV show and gave away one an hour the day of the program. The station is also sponsoring the Nashville premiere of the movie Tunnelvision at three theatres...KFMH won an Iowa balloon race. The station broadcast live from the balloon which was at an altitude of 1,000 feet and covered a distance of 30 miles...KZOZ is playing a benefit softball game against the Los Angeles Playboy Bunnies...WERC gave away a \$2000 stereo system in a drawing held in conjunction with a local stereo store...FM 103 is programming one hour/one artist specials each day at 7pm...KMOD programmed an hour of BOB DYLAN as the Hard Rain TV special was cancelled there...WYDD programmed 24 hours (2 overnights) of classic live concert tapes...There's a new AOR station in Oklahoma City, KJAK-FM, otherwise known as FM 100, otherwise known as "The Cat" The PD is BARBARA MARULLO. They can be reached at 716 SE 79th Street, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73109...WHCN threw a party celebrating the marriage of MD PAUL PEYTON to WENDY LYNN KNECHT at Shaboo. Music was provided by NRBQ and admission to the public was a one dollar donation...JOAN ARMATRAD-ING performed a radio network concert from Washington DC's Cellar Door. The show was carried on WHFS WKTK, WMYK, WRXL and WQCM...WAAF is running a poster contest in which they are asking their listeners to design a poster for the station. The first prize is an \$1800 Pioneer stereo system...KTIM interviewed MICHAEL DINNER...KWST interviewed DERRINGER...STEPHANIE LYNCH and TREVOR LEY have joined the airstaff of WDVE...WCOL-FM interviewed LAW...WLIR interviewed STEVE MILLER and presented EM-MYLOU HARRIS in a live radio concert from My Father's Place...KOME interviewed JACKIE LOMAX...KZAP interviewed MONTROSE...LEE ABRAHMS is now consulting KPRI. LEE ARNOLD is the new Program Director of WGVL-FM...LARRY FEDER is the new National Album Promotion Director for Casablanca Records.

It was a week of travel for me as the Industry's Newspaper visited San Francisco for the NRBA convention and took a little jaunt into New York City for the purpose of gathering interviews for a forthcoming Radio & Records special AOR edition.

I was given the privilege of chairing the convention's panel entitled "Programming Album Oriented Rock Progressively Better" which included as guest panelists, Bill Compton, PD of KDKB/Phoenix; Jack Crawford, PD of WKDA-FM/Nashville; Stan Garrett, PD of KZEL/Eugene; John Gorman, PD of WMMS/Cleveland; Jeff Pollack, Music Coordinator of KBPI/Denver; Ed Romig, PD of KOME/San Jose; and Norm Winer, PD of WBCN/Boston.

The session ran two hours and was attended by approximately 150 people generally consisting of General Managers, Sales Managers, and some programmers from a cross section of formats about 50% of which were AOR.

The general tone of the meeting was low key and conservative, but the dialogue and concepts were direct and to the point, and I have to say that I suspect many of the attendees who did not know what to expect of AOR programmers or had already held pre-conceived notions based on the industry's late 60's perceptions were quite surprised and delighted by the panel's extreme professionalism, dignity, and most important, knowledge.

A variety of topics were covered among which were Compton's discussion of the AOR station that has access to both an FM and AM facility; Crawford's look at the AOR station that enjoys a regional monopoly; Garrett's analysis of the format's maturation and penetration into the world of Pop/Adult; Gorman's pointing out the importance of regionalism in the genre; Pollack's presentation of AOR radio as a mainstream industry force to be reckoned with; Romig's view of the AOR station located in the umbrella of a larger metro market; and Winer's expressing that the ratings do not reflect the nation's college population as accurately as they should.

The topics most discussed were the ways in which AOR radio handled its news and public affairs commitment, probing into ways that they can be more meaningful and attractive and programmable during prime time; and the problems of many agency produced spots not falling into the AOR environment, thus hurting not only the radio station but the advertiser too. This particular subject is one that continues to pop up at such seminars and is obviously a major issue of concern to AOR radio today. One of the generally agreed upon methods of attacking the problem drawn out of the San Francisco meeting is for the stations not to argue the point with the advertising agencies but, rather, try to educate them. Of course, cases of obscenity, blatant bad taste, illegal content, and fraud are cut and dry and it is the station's obligation to reject spots falling into these categories. However, most of the spots that AOR radio has programming problems with do not. The reasons for their being resisted or rejected are subjective rather than objective. In these cases, it was brought out that the station should re-do the spots on spec and try to show the agencies how they should be done before flatly rejecting them. This method serves the dual purpose of educating them while maintaining good relations.

This idea seems simple enough and I'm quite sure most AOR stations have already incorporated it into regular policy. On a positive note, KZEL General Manager Jay West pointed out from the audience that, slowly but surely, the agency people themselves are becoming AOR radio listeners and are becoming educated to the format's environment in that manner, let alone others, which would, of course, speed up the process.

Another area in which the audience showed great interest was in the methods of outside promotion used by AOR radio. Again, the outsiders seemed surprised when they learned of the numerous newspaper, TV, billboard, busboard, and bumpersticker campaigns waged by the AOR stations represented on the panel. Elton Spitzer, WLIR's GM, showed everybody from the audience WLIR's custom designed matchbooks which have inexpensively flooded the Long Island market with the station's name, logo, and image. KPRI GM Dex Allen asked the panel's advice on how to effectively

combat his competition KCBO's incredibly successful bumper sticker campaign in which it seems every other car in the San Diego market sports the "I Q In My Car" slogan. In what was probably my major contribution to the session, I suggested that KPRI create a bumper sticker saying "I P In My Car." A few people here and there got a yuk out of that one and it was later reported to me that the gentlemen from the administration of WMMS leaned over to Dex and whispered, "Do it, do it."

Among those in the audience from outside of radio whom I recognized were syndicators Bob Meyrowitz of DIR and Larry Yuridin of The Daily Planet. My hat is off to record men Jim McKeon, Epic West Coast AOR and Jack Ashton, Chrysalis National Albums for their foresight in attending so meaningful a radio conference.

I wish I had the time to stay for the duration of the convention, it was going so well. What I did experience however, was extremely positive and I believe that the new NRBA (National Radio Broadcasters Association) formerly the old NAFMB (National Association of FM Broadcasters) has definitely added another feather to its cap. Congratulations to KDKB General Manager Eric Hauenstein for the fine job he did as the convention's Program Chairman. This, the organization's third convention, was the first to feature in depth panels devoted to actual radio programming, not only AOR, but Top 40, Country, Pop/Adult and Beautiful Music, with top notch representatives participating from each format. In addition, there was a tremendous exhibit area featuring the wares of radio related industries with almost everything from equipment manufacturers to syndicators present. The convention also featured a special dinner of the FM Pioneers and a unique auction in which many valuable pieces of merchandise were sold for "play" money. The money was distributed free at all the convention's many activities, thus the more events one attended, the more money one gathered.

Interesting, the NRBA is still not as visible as it should be in the eyes of much of the industry. Also, many people still confuse it with the NAB, while others still think it is for FM broadcasters only. I found it a bit disturbing to see the large sign that welcomes people into the Bay Area on the freeway out of San Francisco's airport saying "San Francisco Welcomes FM Broadcasters." Although the organization originally represented FM, it now functions for all radio, hence the title change. As far as the NAB is concerned, it is another fine organization that represents all broadcasting which includes to a major extent television. The NRBA takes the position that radio and television are unrelated in enough areas to warrant radio having its own organization dealing exclusively with radio related matters.

So far, the NRBA seems to be sincerely dedicated to the representation and serving of radio, judging the organization's past and present performance. We at Radio & Records recognize their accomplishments and fully support the organization's future endeavors and growth. This NRBA convention, in addition to the aforementioned positives, set the stage for one of the most historic events in the history of AOR radio. It took place in my hotel room separate from the convention's official line-up of activities. In my numerous discussions with industry people from coast to coast I find that one of the AOR controversies that seems to dominate all others is the question of which is the better way to go, the highly disciplined, researched approach or the spontaneous, almost free-form tact. When I was in New York, Bob Sherwood, National Director of Promotion for Columbia Records suggested that we stage a sort of "Great Debate" between respected programmers from both poles of the AOR spectrum and print the transcript in R&R. Well we did it! It started out as a debate between Norm Winer, PD of WBCN and Bert Kleinman, Director of Programming for Drake/Chenault. I was the moderator. In attendance were all the panelists who participated in the convention's AOR session (except for Ed Romig who hadn't yet arrived in town) plus Bonnie Simmons, PD of KSAN/San Francisco and Clark Smidt, until recently PD of WCOZ/Boston. Everyone was quite loose and comfortable and two tape recorders were rolling. After a very brief period of time it became obvious that there were many more than just two major attitudes toward AOR programming so we opened the debate to everybody in the room. The discussion went on late into the night and all those who experienced it agreed that it was, perhaps, the most stimulating (if not exhausting) encounter of their careers. We will publish this exciting bit of history in the forthcoming Radio & Records AOR Special '76.
