Arbitron Under Fire In Detroit

Arbitron came under fire in two separate situations in Detroit. In the first case, an employee of WWWW was contacted by phone and asked by Arbitron to participate in their upcoming market survey. In order to test Arbitron security measures, the employee, who lives alone, told the company he had a family unit of three. Arbitron duly sent him three diaries, which he took to WWWW General Manager Bart Walsh, who voided each page and dispatched them to Arbitron's Beltsville, Maryland headquarters with a letter explaining the company's error.

Walsh told R&R: "This is another example of the slipshod way in which Arbitron places their diaries. He told them that he needed three and they sent them to him. He could just as well have asked for eight or ten diaries. Perhaps this lack of security is responsible for the wild fluctuations that are known to occur in Arbitron books."

Arbitron National Manager of Communications Connie Anthes responded to R&R: "Prior to August we had a policy that allowed everybody to qualify as a potential Arbitron survey household. The statement that we sent broadcasters in August, however, clearly indicated a change in that policy. Broadcasters were asked to indicate that they are in radio should they be contacted by Arbitron...and asked to participate...thus disqualifying themselves. The gentleman from WWWW did not tell us he was in radio. As far as the chance of unscrupulous broadcasters getting hold of Arbitron diaries, we have a special 'heavy listener callback system' which consists of a series of verifying steps we take when any particular station comes up with a book that seems particularly suspicious."

Asked about the problem of respondents requesting more diaries than they required, Ms. Anthes stated, "It is extremely unlikely that someone from outside the broadcasting industry would ask for more diaries than they should get."

It was Walsh's contention, however, that Arbitron's policy of requiring respondents to identify themselves as members of the broadcast industry was an abdication of responsibility on the com-

pany's part, and one that would continue to offer opportunities for abuses.

WNIC Confusion

Also in Detroit, an Arbitron error in the January/February book for the city caused problems for WNIC. The station, which uses the slogan "FM/100," discovered March 24 that a number of diaries had entries of "FM/100" mistakenly credited to WLOO/Chicago by Arbitron with WNIC in one case losing credit for 64 1/2 quarter hours. Ed Christian, Executive Vice-President/General Manager of WNIC, was forced to mail an explanation of the situation to 200 agency buyers nationwide. Christian told R&R: "Arbitron was first made aware of this situation on March 24...They were embarrassed; but did not pursue the matter until I reached Bill Engle the latter part of the following week. It took them slightly over three weeks to verify that a mistake was made and supply partial estimates of the audience loss through their errors...Amazing, but the burden of proof has been on us." Arbitron has now publicly acknowledged their error, as Christian pointed out in his letter to the agency buyers.

Norman Names Garland At KFRC; Hobbs Picks Nelson For WRKO

Les Garland has been appointed Program Director at KFRC/San Francisco, station Vice President/General Manager Pet Norman announced. He replaces Michael Spears, recently named PD at KHJ/Los Angeles. Garland comes to KFRC from the PD position at WRKO/Boston. Garland had programmed KYNO/Fresno, K100/Los Angeles, and CKLW/Detroit before joining WRKO. Garland assumes his new position May 15, with Music Director Dave Sholin continuing as acting PD till then.

Harry Nelson, afternoon personality at WRKO for the past three years, has been named to replace Garland as the station's new Program Director. WRKO Vice President/General Manager Jack Hobbs told R&R: "We hate to lose Les, but we are capitalizing on opportunities within the chain, using our own people to fill po-

Greater Media, Inc. has filed suit against Globe Broadcasting and the Amatore Group, Inc., for \$2.5 million each for alleged misuse of its "Magic" service marks used at Greater Media's stations WMGK/Philadelphia and WMJC/Detroit, as well as its nationally syndicated "Magic Music" service. Globe is the licensee of WMGC/Cleveland, while Amatore owns KLYX/Houston.

Greater Media, which has been using the "Magic" terminology since 1975, regards its use in Cleveland and Houston as attempts to confuse the national advertising community by associating with Greater Media's previous successes. The alleged misappropriations also potentially damage Greater Media's syndication efforts, they maintain.

The suits indicate that Greater Media is serious in its intent to protect its slogans. The appropriation of programming slogans and catchwords is nothing new in radio, as the wholesale "borrowing" of Bill Drake's "Boss Radio" concept in the '60's attests. But Greater Media's apparent determination to protect the "Magic" con-

cept holds important implications for the radio industry, and the

outcome of their suits will be highly significant.

KUPD, KRIZ Drop Contests After Meeting With Arbitron

A meeting between Arbitron representatives and Phoenix Arbitron subscribers (4/14) has resulted in the voluntary discontinuation of two radio station contests believed to reward inflated listening by diary keepers. KUPD's "Checkbook" contest, which asked listeners to write down the time periods they were listening in their "KUPD Checkbooks" and offering cash for five and ten-hour listening periods; and KRIZ's "Daily Diary" contest, which awarded cash for "quarter hour listening," were dropped by their respective stations after Arbitron Vice President/General Manager Rick Aurichio and West Coast Radio Sales Manager Jack Fawcett met with Phoenix subscribers to attempt a voluntary settlement of the controversial issue.

Arbitron had earlier (4/12) issued a warning to Phoenix clients advising that Arbitron was aware that stations were "presently broadcasting promotions and/or contests which could confuse our diary-keeping participants and could cause the recording of listening entries in the diaries to exceed actual listening by those persons." The mailgram drew "a clear distinction" between "promotions or contests which increase actual listening to a station and promotions or contests which may (through the offer of prizes) affect the way in which diary keep-

ers record their listening without causing corresponding changes in actual listening" (emphasis Arbitron's) terming the latter "improper; regardless of whether or not they are conducted on a regular basis throughout the year."

The meeting between Aurichio Fawcett and the Phoenix broadcasters was described as "very cooperative." KRIZ issued this statement after the meeting: "...Last fall when KRIZ complained to Arbitron about the 'Checkbook' promotion and how it might proliferate, which it did, the warning fell on deaf ears." KRIZ General Manager Neil Sargent and Program Director Alan McLaughlin agreed nonetheless to stop the "Daily Diary" promotion provided that KUPD would do the same. Both stations then agreed to drop their promotions, reportedly much to the pleasure of the other attending Phoenix broadcasters.

KUPD General Manager Lloyd Melton stated that his station's "Checkbook" promotion had been altered "in methodology" after the meeting, but that the "Checkbook" contest name remains on the air.

Arbitron had earlier threatened the following alternatives in the Phoenix case: 1) Cancellation of the April/May survey report; 2) A postponement until discontinuation of the offensive contests; 3) An exclusion of the offending stations' listening estimates; 4) A normal scheduled survey, with audience estimates for the offending stations published in a separate supplement accompanied by an explanatory letter; or 5) A normal scheduled and published survey accompanied by the same sort of explanatory letter. The unusually stern measures apparently had the desired effect.



Rubinstein Resigns—No Replacement Named

Jerry Rubinstein resigned his position as Chairman of ABC Records Thursday (4/14). ABC had been suffering heavy losses over



the last few years, and in 1975, Rubinstein's first year as Chairman, reported a loss of \$28,000,000

(attributed by some sources to the previous ABC regime).

In a prepared statement, Chairman Leonard Goldenson and Elton Rule, President of ABC Inc., expressed regret over Rubinstein's resignation and wished him well in future endeavors. No replacement for Rubinstein has been named.

Van Dyke Joins KLIF, Charlie Brown To KJR

KLIF/Dallas morning man Charlie Brown has resigned his position to rejoin KJR/Seattle in a similar capacity. Charlie Van Dyke, former KHJ/Los Angeles P.D. and current morning man, will be joining KLIF as morning man in May. KLIF P.D. Jim Davis told R&R: "I'm professionally and personally excited about having the No. 1 air talent

in the country joining KLIF. Charlie's talent and KLIF will be an exciting combination."

Chase Resigns At K100

Eric Chase, Program Director and afternoon drive personality at K-100/Los Angeles, resigned both positions effective Thursday (4/14). Chase told R&R, "I can only echo the remarks of Charlie Tuna and Charlie Van Dyke; pro-

gramming a station in Los Angeles while holding down a jock shift is simply too much for one person...Both jobs require total attention, so I feel it's time for me to choose between the two."

SPRINGTIME IN OSHKOSH

WOSH/Oshkosh held a Bikini Promotion on the first day of spring, announcing at 7 am on a rainy, foggy 35-degree day that the first ten listeners showing up at the station wearing bikinis would win \$50 record libraries. By 8:00 all the winners and more had shown up. WOSH morning man Jonathan Brandmeier is shown surrounded by a bevy of bikini'd beauties, including some inventive males who weren't about to be discriminated against with a valuable prize at stake.

James Gang Awarded \$1 1/2 Million From ABC

The James Gang and manager Michael Belkin were awarded \$1.5 million by a Los Angeles Superior Court as settlement of a 1974 suit against the group's former label, ABC Records. The original suit alleged malicious prosecution and interference with business advantage. ABC had earlier filed an unsuccessful contract violation suit

against the group, who then countersued, claiming ABC's suit had adversely affected their negotiations with other labels. ABC, past subject of suits by former artists Three Dog Night and the Mamas and Papas, will appeal the James Gang ruling, according to a spokesman.

Burkhart/Abrams Launch Live Concert Series

Kent Burkhart/Lee Abrams & Associates and their consulted stations employing the "Superstars" format have launched a series of Superstars Concerts for broadcast. The first concert in the series featured Joan Armatrading, and

was coordinated with A&M and Sonny Fox of WYSP/Philadelphia. In June the Superstars network will be expanding its efforts to bring its affiliated stations nationalized concerts and special programs in the series.

KRE-FM Renewal Appealed

The FCC's renewal of KRE-FM/Berkeley's license has been appealed by the Community Coalition for Media Change, on the grounds that KRE licensee Horizon Communications Corporation had failed to meet the needs and interests of the com-

munity and had discriminated in its employment practices. The FCC had granted a renewal to December 1, 1977, pending a decision on a complaint before the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission.

DONNIE & MARIE WALK WITH KFRC

KFRC/San Francisco held its March Of Dimes Superwalk April 2, and over 16,000 walkers took part. Donny and Marie Osmond did the honors at the ribbon-cutting ceremony at Kezar Stadium before thousands, and then toured Seven Bay Area cities on behalf of the Superwalk. Pledges from Superwalkers amounted to \$544,845, and March Of Dimes officials forecast an eventual total as high as \$750,000, making the KFRC Superwalk the largest single California fundraising event in March Of Dimes history. Klein Pleads Not Guilty

Allen Klein, former manager of the Beatles from 1969 to 1973, pleaded not guilty to charges of evading taxes on \$200,000 income allegedly received from selling pro-

motional copies of Beatles LP's. The Federal complaint against Klein claims that he convinced Capitol Records to supply him with large quantities of Beatles

LP's, stipulating that the albums were not to be marked as promotional copies. Klein then allegedly sold the LP's to distributors. A trial date is pending.

Edwards Fired At WOL

Mel Edwards, the WOL/Washington air personality who has figured prominently in the FCC's ongoing payola investigations in the nation's capital, was fired by the station last week. Several other jocks are expected to be disciplined by

WOL. In another payola-related firing, two employees of WOWI/Norfolk were accused of attempting to extort \$3,000 from a local promoter for playing records of groups appearing in the area, and were fired by the station.

Wichita/Central States Conference Announced

The first Wichita/Central States Secondary Radio Conference will be held June 17-18 in Wichita, Kansas. The conference plans to bring together radio, trade and record company representatives to discuss AOR radio, management, music, engineering, programming, and other topics of mutual interest. A combined radio and record meeting and a national trade meeting are also scheduled. Registration fees are set at \$30 for radio representatives and \$40 for record and trade reps, with more information available from Anti/Muscolo Promotions, (213) 651-2383.

CBS Sets Guidelines For Terrorist Coverage

CBS's News Department is the first in the nation to set up specific guidelines on the coverage of acts of terrorism, as announced by CBS division President **Richard Salant**. Salant noted that although these guidelines were to be put into effect in all cases, each terrorist attack is varied in its circumstances, and therefore each case will be treated individually. Among the guidelines set are: avoiding an "excessive platform for the terrorist," no live coverage "except in the most compelling circumstances," making sure communication lines are open for use by authorities, asking experts which questions should be avoided during interviews, telling authorities names of CBS personnel to contact, obedience to police instructions, and not excluding other important news during such an event.

NBC Axes Emmy Show

NBC-TV has officially cancelled their scheduled Emmy Awards telecast, charging that the **National Academy of TV Arts & Sciences** failed to meet contractual obligations. NBC also warned NATAS not to make any other agreements with other networks unless they agree to it, and asked the organization for a refund of the \$300,000 the network had advanced the academy for production of the special. NBC President **Robert Howard** noted that 75 major series' stars had informed the network that they would not participate in the event, and that nearly 1/3 of current primetime series are not included on the NATAS ballots, due to the recent split between them and the Hollywood Chapter of NATAS.

Talking To Machines Newest Computer Innovation

A number of companies' employees are seemingly talking to themselves on the job, all because of the newest computer system which automatically responds to the human voice, keeping tabs on inventories, package routing and a number of other functions. The computers are called "voice recognition systems," and give the company the edge by immediately keypunching the voiced information into the computer for future reference. Some complaints on the system have already been noted, in one instance a worker's new set of false teeth caused the computer to not recognize one of the words in its vocabulary. It has proven very effective in other cases, one United Parcel cargo center uses the system to automatically shoot the parcels onto the correct belt to the outgoing truck area.

Warner Tests "Two Way TV"

If you've ever wanted to talk back to your television, **Warner Cable Corp.**'s new "participatory" TV may be a partial answer. Scheduled to start in Columbus, Ohio, the system can enable the viewer to respond to a series of products presented, take part in opinion polls, answer multiple choice questions, and a variety of other marketing ideas. Warner speculates that in the future such a cable system would make it possible for retailers to offer on-air "catalogs" of products for consumers.

Arbitron Reports Heavy Video Game Use

Arbitron's television meter service analysis shows that 4% of their metered sets in New York and Los Angeles now use video games. Additionally, the study found that the heaviest use of the games is during TV's prime time period. New York households used the games for an average of 118 minutes during the one week survey period, in L.A. the average was 66 minutes.

Star-Studded Cast For Carter's Energy Plan

With this week's announcement by **President Carter** of his long-term energy plan, the word is that a long list of superstars will help spread the word to the public. So far, **Robert Redford**, **John Denver**, **Johnny Carson**, and **The Captain & Tennille** will pitch for Carter's energy saving ideas, voicing radio and TV spots with the theme "The difference you make makes all the difference."

Possible "Beerola" Scandal

The **Securities and Exchange Commission** has filed a complaint against the country's No. 2 beer maker, **Joseph Schlitz Brewing Co.**, accusing the brewer of making payoffs through other parties, including their advertising agencies, to beer retailers. The case named no agencies, and the SEC did not say that the ad agencies were involved in any wrongdoing. Also contained in the complaint was the allegation that the agencies employed by Schlitz retailers and wholesalers were used to make cash payments from the brewer to the retailers. Watergate Judge **John Sirica** will try the case in Washington, no trial date has been set as yet.

McCall Joins Lee Jeans' Fall Campaign

C.W. McCall is featured in musical spots for **Lee Jeans** during the current ad campaign, scheduled to run through May. The \$1 million-plus effort will also start again in the Fall, with print ads backing up McCall's singing spots.

Ford's "Fiesta" Introduction Here

Ford Motor Co.'s mini-car "Fiesta" was a smash hit in Europe, and the automaker will introduce the model in the U.S.A. this summer with a massive ad campaign. The company will hit on the fact that the imported Fiesta has advanced German engineering, while maintaining all the economy of small cars.

Ad Battle For New Oil Products

Three major oil product manufacturers are planning their strategy to gain control of sales of a new car oil that offers a longer period between changes. **Mobil** was the first to introduce a "gas saving and change saving" product, and is currently planning a major market radio and magazine campaign. **Pennzoil's PZL** is now past the test-market stage, and will hit nationally at nearly half of Mobil's retail price. The third competitor is **STP**, which will start ads on their even cheaper oil next month.

High Ad Budget For "Deep"

Local radio buys are included in a huge promotional effort for **Columbia Pictures'** "The Deep." Several companies are also doing tie-ins with the film, including **Revlon's "Charlie,"** **Nikon cameras,** and the tourist boards of **Bermuda** and the **British Virgin Islands.** Premiere and advertising for the film kicks off in June.

TV News

CBS Leads The Pack With Easter Specials

For the first time since January, **CBS** lead the Nielsen ratings for the week ending April 10. Their special "Sometime For Joey" was the number one show, helping them reach an 18.1 rating, **ABC** had a 17.4, **NBC** tied with a 17.4 as well. The rest of the top 10 looked like this: **NBC's "Part II of 'Jesus Of Nazareth,' 'Laverne & Shirley,' 'Happy Days,' 'Three's Company,' 'Bugs Bunny Special' 'Peanuts: Easter Beagle,' 'Barney Miller,'** and **"People's Command Performances" special.**

Part I of "Jesus Of Nazareth" came in tops in Los Angeles, according to Arbitron's meter service, followed by: 2) "Laverne & Shirley," 3) "Happy Days," 4) "Barney Miller," 5) "Something For Joey," 6) "Easter Bunny Is Coming To Town" and "Three's Company" tied, 8) "Eight Is Enough," 9) "Bugs Bunny Easter Special" and "Family." In New York, the rankings were: 1) "Happy Days" and "Laverne & Shirley" tied, 3) "Jesus Of Nazareth" and "Something For Joey," 5) "Eight Is Enough," 6) "Easter Bunny Is Coming To Town," and "Three's Company," 8) "Carol Burnett," 9) and six-way tie with "ABC Friday Night Movie," "All In The Family," "Barney Miller," "Bugs Bunny Easter Special," "Easter Beagle," and "People's Command Performance."



The "Money Bunny" Hits Buffalo

A Playboy bunny outfitted "gorgeous creature" is traveling the streets of Buffalo with the WKBW jocks, looking for households with radios tuned to "KB." The "Money Bunny" and air personality award \$50 per radio that is tuned to the station, including car radios, and throw in an extra \$50 for each one playing. WKBW's Jim Quinn told R&R that in the first week of the contest, a miraculous 7 out of 11 houses had radios tuned when the team visited, and that one woman claimed to have a "premonition" that the Money Bunny was going to knock on her door, and had 11 radios tuned to KB. However...she forgot to turn them on, missing out on an additional \$550.

Beach Boys Beat Out "British Invasion"

Land-locked Indianapolis paid tribute to the spirit of surfing in WNDE's "British Invasion Weekend." American songs were pitted against English songs, listeners were asked to call in their votes for their favorites.

A grand total of 18,510 calls were logged, and the victorious group was far and away The Beach Boys. Number 1 was "Surfin' Safari," coming in second was "I Get Around," making it a clean sweep for the native group.

Now...There's A KKHJ

On April 7th, KKLS-AM-FM/Rapid City split their simulcast operation and changed the FM call letters to KKHJ. KKHJ will keep Rockin', with TM's Stereo Rock package.

Shane Forms Media Services Co.

Ed Shane has formed Houston-based Ed Shane Media Services, handling format development and program production. The company's first project is "Count The Music," a stereo FM format developed by Shane for KRLY/Houston, aimed at 12-34 demographics. Shane is also the producer of a daily program on KILT, and producer of the "Burns Media Radio Album" programming services. He has programmed KKDJ/Los Angeles, WGLD/Chicago, and WPLO-FM/Atlanta.

WSGA "Saves" Listeners From "Great Savannah Flood"

For the fifth year in a row, WSGA/Savannah will have a winner an hour for 40 days and 40 nights in their "Great Savannah Flood" promotion. Thousands of dollars in prizes will flood into listeners' hands, including motorcycles, TV sets, stereo systems, bicycles, sail boats and much more. One twist is added to the correct-number-caller method, three to four times a day a \$20 bonus goes to a winning caller who can also give the jock the names of the last three records played.

"Car Box" and "Hot Box"

WGBB/Long Island has a different version of a bumpersticker, called the "Car Box." The small boxes are displayed in the rear windows of cars, enabling the owners to listen for their license numbers on the air to win prizes. Another twist was added to the annual contest this year, a giant mock-up of the car box has been made, and all the air personalities will be touring Long Island asking people to sign it. At the end of April, sports and show business celebrities will throw darts at the box, with the listeners' who's names are hit winning trips to Miami, Las Vegas, TV sets and many other goodies.

WLOF/Orlando also offers great vacation packages in their "Hot Box" game, patterned after TV game shows. Hourly callers have 15 seconds to answer three trivia questions on one previously announced category. Prize packages change each hour, including trips to the Bahamas and other resort areas.

Easter Wrap-Up

WTAR/Norfolk Program Director Dick Lamb and several other jocks "laid eggs" all over their 7 city coverage area for Easter. The plastic eggs were filled with Easter candy, coupons for Jack In The Box hamburgers, or a certificate for \$5 or \$10 cash. The promotion is continuing way past the holiday, since the WTAR staffers were clever enough to hide the eggs in places, with dozens still to be found.

Over 3000 attended WIFE/Indianapolis' annual Easter Egg Hunt this year. All the station jocks helped children locate the eggs, and none other than WIFE's Jay Reynolds was the Easter Bunny in residence.

A huge 75 pound solid chocolate Easter Rabbit was the grand prize in WEEO/Waynesboro's Easter contest. Contestants had to send in pictures and drawings of what a 75 pound rabbit would look like.

"Super" Walk-A-Thons, Skate-A-Thons, Tele-Thons

To spark interest and participation in this year's Jacksonville "Superwalk '77," WAPE air personalities "Spanky" and "Markus" are competing to get the most listeners to wear a Spanky or Markus T-shirt on the walk. Listeners must design their own shirts depicting the two jocks, and will gain added prizes if their "team" out does the other. Members of either Spanky's or Markus' walkers will get a free copy of Aerosmith's "Walk This Way" and a custom "Big APE If It Fits Wear It" T-shirt to replace the one they de-

Members of the Colorado Rockies National Hockey League team joined the staff at five area rinks. Over \$36,000 was raised in the effort.

KSLQ/St. Louis is busy planning their second annual "Walk For Mankind" benefit, scheduled for April 30th.

KSTT/Davenport just completed their United Cerebral Palsy walk-athon, gathering 3000 walkers on the 12 1/2 mile route. The station broadcast live remote from the starting point, with jocks using news cars to follow marchers and interview them along the walk.

Saturday Night "Dead"

WERC/Birmingham felt that the local NBC-TV affiliates' decision to drop the late night "Saturday Night Live" show from their lineup was unfair, and got listeners to support their feelings. 
Rick Dees has signed to appear in a new movie shooting this summer in Hollywood. I understand the flick will be about the record biz.





The show runs each night from 11pm to 4:30am. Interestingly, KAAY has one of those monster AM signals at night, so Becker Street can be heard in over 20 states and 13 foreign countries. According to Stuart, he receives letters from as far away as Central America and has quite a huge following in Cuba.

Having just finished interviewing **Rusty Weir** and **Starz** on the show, Stuart was raving about KAAY's magnificent new studios. They're even letting him use them. You see, up until recently, Becker Street originated at the KAAY transmitter site.

Milner Takes Action Against Bogus Tickets

Gene Milner, General Manager, of WSHE-FM & WSRF-AM/Miami, has announced (4/14) that his stations are offering a reward of \$5,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of those responsible for the manufacturing and marketing of counterfeit concert tickets in the Miami area.

According to Milner, at the same time, both radio stations will conduct "an intensive campaign to make our audiences aware of the counterfeit problem and how to avoid losing their money to a cruel con game." He pointed out that concert-goers who buy a ticket in the parking lot of a sold-out show fool themselves by thinking that they're dealing with a scalper selling legitimate tickets.

The problem of counterfeit tickets has been a growing one in Southern Florida but the recent **Boston** concert at the Hollywood (Fla.) Sportatorium was the "straw that broke the camel's back" and prompted the stance. Some 500 counterfeit tickets were turned away, leading to the storming of the Sportatorium walls and injuries to at least four private security guards. Angry ticket buyers were also reported to have attacked police vehicles, trying to reach counterfeit sellers who had been arrested.

The \$5,000 reward will apply only for the arrest and conviction of the person or persons behind the counterfeiting. Milner states, "There is little to be gained in arresting the youngsters who are tricked into pushing the bogus tickets. Often they are selling the tickets because they've been promised a free one themselves or they get a part of the selling price. They are victims, like the purchaser, but they expose themselves to the anger of the buyers who get hassled and turned away at the door, poorer by twenty or thirty dollars, and still outside the walls."

In addition to the reward, WSHE/WSRF News Director **Tom Webb** is instituting an on-the-air awareness campaign that will entail a continuing series of announcements concerning counterfeits, how to spot them, and why it's best to abandon them without hope of ever getting in.

According to Webb, "We will begin with a series of special reports next week on the scope of the counterfeiting operation and what is being done about it in other cities. There is little doubt that counterfeit concert tickets are becoming a threat as serious for our industry as bootleg tapes or pirated albums."

The theme of the radio campaign is: "Counterfeits are Concert Crushers."

The war against concert ticket counterfeits seems to be gaining momentum. Recently (as reported in R&R) concert promoter **Bill Graham** offered a sizeable reward for information about counterfeiters in the Bay Area. That campaign has reportedly been successful, thus far, in drying up the amateur counterfeiters in that region.

Klaatu Mystery Solved?

With all the talk going on around the country concerning the mysterious identities of Capitol recording artists **Klaatu**, DC101/Washington D.C. Program Director **Dwight Douglas** decided to do some investigative reporting of his own. Douglas informed R&R that he sent one of his staff members to the U.S. Department of Commerce copyright office in Washington to find the names of the people whose names Klaatu's music is registered under. Here are the findings: **John Woloschuk**, aka **L.M. Carpenter** and **Chip Dale**; **Terry Draper**; **David Long**, aka **Dee Long**; and **Dino Tome**.

Referring to the mention of a train going between New York and Washington in their song "Sub Rosa Subway," Douglas summarized his findings in the following statement issued to R&R, "The last stop for Klaatu is Washington D.C. where there is still a little bit of truth, and the truth is that Klaatu is not the Beatles."

Nevertheless, the "Klaatu mystery" has provided many stations with a vehicle for stimulating and entertaining promotions. It is doubtful that there ever was a serious belief on the part of programmers that the two groups are one and the same. At this point, I'm pretty sure that listeners and programmers alike will judge the group and their record on musical merits. After all, that's the only fair thing to do.

Biff Collie Inside Nashville

EDDIE MILLER died the other day, Easter. He was a songwriter. He wrote over 1,000 songs. His hits included "After Lovin' You," "Thanks A Lot," "There She Goes" and one of the biggest money making songs of all time, "Release Me." Because of the enormity of that classic, his friends affectionately called him "Eddie One-Song." His group at one time was actually the LIGHT CRUST DOUGHBOYS, successor-group to the original, which included BOB WILLS. (He named a daughter after Bob). He and TOMMY WIGGINS started the awards show in California which became the Academy Of Country Music. He and BUDDY MIZE started the Nashville Songwriters' Association International and was it's first President. He taught his wife BARBARA to write and she is now one of the most prolific Gospel writers around. He had a religious experience five years ago and later said, "I've gotta either throw away a bunch of songs, or clean 'em up." He started by writing Christian lyrics to "Release Me." The first record, by Gospel Hall of Famer JAMES BLACKWOOD, won

a Grammy. The last song he wrote, two weeks before he died has already been recorded by SIX Gospel artists, titled "Jesus Let Me Write You A Song." CONNIE SMITH, JAMES BLACKWOOD, THE AGAPE SINGERS, a group he championed, and his daughter PAM MILLER, all sang at his funeral. He died of a heart defect, which, according to his mother, put him in the hospital first at the age of 14 months. It was a well-kept secret which he didn't share, even with his closest friends. Eddie was 57. That he never shared either. He always gave his age as "85 with a bullet." He was my friend. I loved him.
