Memphis Diary Tampering Case Explodes

Conflicting testimony marked the second day of the **George Klein** conspiracy/mail theft trial in Memphis Tuesday (11-29). Klein, the former Program Director of **WHBQ/Memphis** who was indicted by the federal government on four counts for conspiring with an ex-postal employee to steal **Arbitron** diaries in February, pleaded not guilty to all counts Monday (11-28).

Klein admitted in testimony that he had filled out **Arbitron** diaries in order to boost **WHBQ's** ratings showing, but he denied conspiring with former letter carrier **Robert N. Wammack** to steal the diaries. He stated that he was given the diaries by Station Manager **Dick French** with instructions to fill them out. According to Klein, when he asked where the diaries had come from, French allegedly stated that they had been acquired from a friend. Klein then said that he, Wammack, and a woman had filled out the diaries and returned them to French.

French, who testified earlier for the prosecution, denied the allegations. Under cross-examination, he stated he had never given Klein any surveys and had learned of the alleged diary-tampering plot from a postal inspector. He added further that when he learned the results of the **Arbitron** survey in question, in which **WHBQ** went from 7th to 2nd place, he was surprised, since in his opinion Klein had not been doing a sufficiently good job to account for such a jump.

Wammack, the ex-postal employee, had pleaded guilty to one count of conspiracy, reportedly plea-bargaining with the prosecution, after which three mail theft counts were dropped. His testimony Tuesday was described by

trial observers as taking the form of a surprise witness for the defense. Contrary to his earlier guilt-

ty plea, Wammack testified that he did not conspire with Klein and did not steal any surveys. He said he was approached by French in 1976 and allegedly offered money to supply names and addresses of persons receiving diaries. Claiming he had never actually supplied French with diaries, Wammack stated that on two occasions he had given the Station Manager a total of eight names and addresses where diaries were to be sent. According to Wammack, French said he wanted the names so that promotional materials could be sent to them.

Following further testimony, including an appearance by **Elvis Presley's** father **Vernon** as a character witness for Klein (a longtime friend of Elvis'), the case was expected to go to the jury shortly for a verdict.

FCC Law Judge Recommends WLIR License Denial

An **FCC** administrative law judge has recommended that the license of **WLIR-FM/Long Island** should not be renewed. Judge **James F. Tierney** stated that then-owners **John** and **Dorothea Rieger** had in 1972 transferred control of the station without **FCC** permission, failed to exercise adequate supervision over the station, and had committed multiple technical violations. **John Rieger**, along with Station Manager **Elton Spitzer**, currently owns the station. Spitzer told **R&R** "There is no question that we will appeal" the ruling to the **FCC** itself.

According to Spitzer, the controversy over the Long Island AOR pioneer began in 1972 when the Riegers filed for renewal of their

license and another group, **AMS Radio**, filed a competing application. The key issue in the hearings, which did not start until May 1976, was over the hiring of one **Naji Zalayet** at **WLIR**—the judge maintained that **Rieger** had actually transferred control of the station over to **Zalayet** without securing **FCC** permission, while **WLIR** contended that he had been merely hired as General Manager without assuming total control. Complicating matters further, **AMS Radio** withdrew its application, but the **FCC** continued the case on its own, according to Spitzer.

Following Judge Tierney's recommendation to the **FCC**, **WLIR** has 30 days (plus possible exten-

He came to Capitol's Los Angeles base in 1971 as National Accounts Manager, and was subsequently promoted to National Sales Manager, Vice President of Sales, and Senior Vice President of Marketing before assuming his Executive Vice Presidency in February 1976.

Time Of The Season

The holiday season is here again. For radio stations, it's time for the annual decision: whether to play Christmas music and if so, how much. Many stations have strong reservations on the matter—for some Top 40 views, see **John Leader's** column. But with two Christmas records, **Bing Crosby's** "White Christmas" and **Gene Autry's** "Rudolph The Red-Nosed Reindeer," ranked among the best-selling singles of all time, it's hard to ignore the seasonal sounds entirely.

Christmas music comes in a wide variety—there's something for every format, a lot of records that fit a number of formats, and a few that don't fit any. Originally there were Classical-styled seasonal offerings on the order of **Handel's** "Messiah," plus traditional Christmas carols performed by choral groups such as the **Mormon Tabernacle Choir**. The **Harry Simeone Chorale's** 1958 recording "Little Drummer Boy" is probably the most recent hit example of the traditional style, and remains a programming staple, especially on Pop/Adult and Beautiful Music stations today.

Christmas music enjoyed its widest popularity in pre-Rock days, with Crosby's records (his "Silent Night" was also a sizable hit) and Autry's Country-to-Pop crossovers ("Rudolph," "Here Comes Santa Claus"). **Ernest Tubb's** original version of "Blue Christmas" (later cut by **Elvis Presley**) was an early Country Christmas contender, and helped set the pattern for frequent Country Christmas recordings in years to come. **Nat King Cole's** "Christmas Song," still very popular, was a definitive early-Pop styled record.

The coming of Rock & Roll brought standards like **Bobby Helms'** "Jingle Bell Rock" and **Brenda Lee's** "Rockin' Around The Christmas Tree" (both also gaining wide Country airplay). **Chubby Checker** and **Bobby Rydell** teamed up for a new version of "Jingle Bell Rock" in 1962, and the **Four Seasons** updated "Santa Claus Is Coming To Town" in full falsetto fashion. The **Beach Boys** made Santa a hot-rodder with "Little St. Nick" and **Phil Spector** cut what are generally considered the most spectacular Rock treatments of Christmas material ever recorded on his Christmas Album (since reissued twice and a popular staple on Top 40 and some Pop/Adult and AOR stations).

AOR-type artists are not usually inclined toward the sentimental gesture of cutting Christmas records, and there are only a few examples. Most of these are serious social commentary numbers; for instance, **John Lennon's** 1971 anti-war tune "Happy Xmas," **Simon & Garfunkel's** "7 O'Clock News/Silent Night," and **Greg Lake's** "I Believe In Father Christmas" (released in 1976 and reissued this year). AOR staples **Jethro Tull** released a special Christmas EP in 1976, while this year the **Kinks** ("Father Christmas") and the science fictional **Vibra Corporation** (a spinoff of **Passport's** *Intergalactic Touring Band*) have followed suit.

Country artists continue to keep the Christmas record tradition, with **Freddy Fender** ("Please Come Home For Christmas") and **C.W. McCall** ("Sing Silent Night") supplying 1977 discs. **Merle Haggard's**

seasonal "If We Make It Through December" is a popular recurrent, and Country programmers have a vast backlog of albums by **Johnny Cash**, **Buck Owens**, **Tammy Wynette**, **Ray Price**, and even **Roy Rogers** to employ. **Bobby Goldsboro's** anti-commercialization Christmas tune, "Look Around, It's Christmas Time" is another staple item, while **Emmylou Harris's** 1975 "Light Of The Stable" fits Country, Pop/Adult and AOR formats.

Pop/Adult stations have an especially wide range of seasonal records from which to choose, from Bing's classics to contemporary recordings by the **Carpenters**, **Glen Campbell**, **John Denver**, **Jose Feliciano**, **Roy Orbison**, **Roberta Flack** and **Johnny Mathis**. And now **Bing Crosby's** son **Lindsay** has a new record out called "Christmas Won't Be The Same."

In recent years, Top 40 artists have generally down-played the Christmas spirit, though **Elton John's** "Step Into Christmas" (1973) was a spirited exception. Older tracks like the **Beach Boys** and **Elvis'** "Blue Christmas", along with occasional novelties like **Cheech & Chong's** "Santa And His Old Lady" suffice.

Not everyone is dreaming of a white Christmas, as there are a number of sterling R&B-styled seasonal offerings, ranging from **Rockers** like **Chuck Berry's** "Run Rudolph Run" to **Charles Brown's** bluesy "Please Come Home For Christmas" and the **Impressions'** spiritual "Amen." **United Artists** has just reissued an album entitled "Rhythm & Blues Christmas" featuring some of the best examples of these varied stylings.

But the main modern Christmas concentration has been on novelties, from **Jimmy Boyd's** "I Saw Mommy Kissing Santa Claus" (or "Rudolph" itself). Who could forget the **Chipmunks'** sped-up "Chipmunk Song"?

(no matter how they might try)? The multitalented monks later cut a Christmas record with **Blues-Rockers** **Canned Heat** in 1968, and inspired the **Citizen's Band** squeakers **Squirrelly & Shirley** in their Country Christmas album in 1976. The **Royal Guardsmen** contributed "Snoopy's Christmas" following their "Snoopy & The Red Baron" hit, while **Stan Freberg** satirized the more commercialized aspects of the holiday season. And this year the newest musical fad, "Punk Rock", is set upon by a group called the **Ravers** performing a novelty called "It's Gonna Be A) Punk Rock Christmas."

So even if there are occasional radio grumbings, the Christmas record tradition is likely to live on for the foreseeable future. Perhaps Santa has a clause in the contract, but it seems as if nothing can stop seasonal records. And conceivably a lot of listeners are quite happy about that. Season's Greetings.

Isgro Promoted To Vice President At Motown

Joe Isgro has been promoted to Vice President, Pop Promotion, at **Motown Records**, according to label President **Barney Ales**. Isgro, most recently National Director of Pop Promotion for the label, has been with Motown since 1975.

Ales commented that the promotion was "a classic example of Motown's continuing quest to elevate deserving executives from within. During the last two years," he continued, "Joe has made enormous strides with our company, originally heading up East Coast regional promotion and segueing to

the national slot within a short six months. His record as a pop records specialist with strong cross-over capabilities was evidenced further by a number of notable successes during the last year."

Isgro entered the record industry in 1967 as a local promotion representative with **Decca Records**, based in Philadelphia. In 1969 he became East Coast Promotion Director for **Paramount**, and he was National Promotion Director for **Roulette** before joining Motown.

Davis Leaves KLIF; Van Dyke New Operations Manager

Jim Davis has left his Program Director position at **KLIF/Dallas** in the wake of recent changes at the station (**R&R** 11/25). Davis cited "philosophical differences" as the reason for his departure. **KLIF** morning man and former **KHJ** Program Director **Charlie Van Dyke** has been appointed Operations

Manager of the station. **Van Dyke** told **R&R** that the drastic format changes widely rumored to be forthcoming at **KLIF** would not take place. He said the station was "broadening their appeal slightly" with the addition of some album product.

CMA Officers Chosen; Nelson New Chairman

Don Nelson, Vice President/General Manager of **WIRE/WXTZ/Indianapolis**, has been elected Chairman of the Board for the Country Music Association. **Joe Talbot**, President of **Joe Talbot & Associates**, Nashville, was elected to the post of President of the CMA. **Stanley Adams**, President of **ASCAP**, is the CMA's Executive Vice President.

Billboard's Publisher **Lee Zito**, was elected Secretary. **Fred Foster**, President of **Monument Records**, is the new Assistant Secretary. **Sam Marmaduke**, owner of **Western Merchandisers**, is now Treasurer. **Tom Collins**, President of **Pi-Gem Music, Inc.**, is the new Assistant Treasurer. **Jimmy Jay** of **United Talent**, and **Tandy Rice** of **Top Billing, Inc.**, Nashville, were elected Sergeant-At-Arms and Assistant, respectively. **Gayle Hill** was elected Historian.

R&R's Country Editor, **Jim Duncan** will continue on the CMA Board of Directors next year as a board member.

Opposition Mounts To Theater Ads

A series of tests by Cinomavision of Nashville, polling Seattle/Portland area moviegoers on their attitudes toward on-screen advertisements, reportedly revealed that 75% registered opposition. The Northwest test run on Olympia beer and RCA commercials was supposedly a test for future Los Angeles area ad campaigns in theaters. 87% of those opposed to the theater ads also were against TV commercials as well.

At the same time, the head of the Federal Trade Commission's Seattle office told two local theater managers that it was "unfair and misleading" to show ads without first informing customers. He said that theaters should disclose the fact both at the box office and in advertising. The statement was the first instance of FTC action on the new and potentially hot issue; the FTC's San Francisco chief stated that he had no intention of suggesting that theaters advise their patrons beforehand of ad showings.

CBS Plays Games With Record Ads

CBS Records has begun a different conceptual series of television spots for label product. Six 30-second commercials are built around a TV game show motif, with a mythical quiz show called "You've Got The Hits" featuring contestants offering clues about the identities of CBS artists while other contestants eventually guess James Taylor, Boz Scaggs, Chicago, and others. The spots are being aired nationwide.

Hurvis Latest Ad Agency Bankruptcy

The Chicago-based ad agency Hurvis, Binzer, and Churchill was declared bankrupt this month as a result of a petition by three creditors, one of which is radio station WSB/Atlanta. The agency went out of business October 10, and reportedly owes up to \$1 million to creditors. Owing to tax problems, the receiver for the agency stated that it was unlikely that any of Hurvis' creditors would receive any payment. Recently, following the bankruptcy of the Lennen & Newell agency, CBS Inc. was denied the right to demand media payments from the agency's client, Stokely-Van Camp, because the court found that CBS had prior knowledge of Lennen & Newell's precarious financial situation. Observers indicated that Hurvis had also been in trouble for some time, but its creditors had advanced credit nonetheless. No specific claims against Hurvis have yet been filed.

Retail Ad Spending Increases, Ratio To Sales Drops

Spending on advertising by the 50 largest general merchandisers and supermarket chains increased 14% in 1976, to an estimated \$2.92 billion. Encouraging as the increase was to the economy as a whole, the spenders also found encouragement in a declining ratio of spending to sales volume. Ad spending represented 3.2% of total sales volume in 1975, but dropped to

3.06% in 1976 for a 4% decline. The 50 advertisers were also reported using broadcast media more frequently to supplement their staple newspaper advertising campaigns.

Number One For The Money, Not The Quality

The National Advertising Division of the Council of Better Business Bureaus ruled that in cases where a product is labelled "Number One" in advertising, the designation should refer to sales leadership rather than alleged superiority in quality. The test case was print and TV advertising for Vacor rat killer, which was termed "America's No. 1 rat killer" for supposedly killing rats more quickly and effectively than another leading brand. The claim was found to be inconclusive, and the NAD ruling received agreement from Rohm & Haas, manufacturers of Vacor.

NAB, Others Attack CAB On Airline "Image" Ads

Two Civil Aeronautics Board proposals were strongly attacked by broadcast and airline organizations last week. The NAB urged rejection of a CAB proposal that institutional or "image" advertisements be excluded from airlines' operating costs and thus no longer be payable in the long run by consumers. A public interest group called ACAP (Aviation Consumer Action Project) had contended that institutional advertising costs were not business-related and should not be passed along to consumers. The NAB stated that although institutional advertising was "more subtle" than ordinary commercial messages, its "long-range purpose" was the same, and that any attempts to define institutional advertising would involve the CAB in censorship and possible First Amendment violations. ABC also opposed the proposal citing the FCC's recent decision against excluding AT&T institutional ads from the company's operating costs.

The CAB had also invited comments on an ACAP proposal to establish a spending ceiling on airline advertising, possibly based on a set percentage of revenue. Various airline companies contended that advertising needs varied from airline to airline and a ceiling would be an artificial and unworkable constraint.


TWA Off "On-Time" Ad Claims

Trans-World Airlines, which had termed itself the "on-time" airline in advertising since 1975, has dropped that angle in favor of stress on its new aircraft models and destination availabilities, with an entirely new campaign being designed for introduction shortly. TWA had run into conflict with the CAB and other airlines over the claims, and had previously modified them in advertising early in 1977. A new official survey, however, showed TWA losing to American Airlines as the airline with the best on-time record, which led in turn to TWA's dropping the claim entirely.

Congress To Examine Ratings' Effects On Minority Formats

The House Communications Subcommittee will hold a hearing on the effect of broadcasting ratings services on minority-owned or formatted stations. The session arose out of complaints from minority-oriented stations that their audiences are frequently overlooked by ratings services, affecting the stations' abilities to attract advertising. December 13 was the date set for the Subcommittee hearing.





TV News

Barry White Special Gets Prime-Time Repeat Action

A 90-minute salute to Barry White on a recent edition of the "Merv Griffin Show" will receive a special edited one-hour repeat treatment on Metromedia television outlets on the weekend before Christmas, owing to response on the initial airing. Metromedia stations in Los Angeles, New York, Washington, and others will broadcast the salute...Capitol's Sylvers are set for a "Donny & Marie" appearance on December 2 over ABC...A heavy concentration of music artists on TV is coming around New Year's, with more specific information upcoming.

NBC Topples ABC From Ratings Lead

The final two segments of the four-part "Godfather" special had enough ratings firepower to overcome ABC's strong lineup and help boost NBC to its first weekly Nielsen victory. NBC took home a 21.2 rating for the week ending November 20, while ABC garnered 19.8 and CBS 18.4 for third (though still ahead of its season average). Part 4 of the "Godfather" was 4th for the week, while Part 3 was 5th, and other NBC specials "Superstunt" and "Memories of Elvis" contributed heavily with 11th and 13th rankings respectively. "Elvis," however, was beaten by CBS' "Celebrity Challenge of the Sexes" which finished third for the week. ABC stalwarts "Happy Days" and "Laverne & Shirley" were easy 1-2 winners overall.

Sixth place, following the two ABC champs, "Challenge of the Sexes," and the two NBC "Godfather" installments, was taken by CBS' "60 Minutes," followed by 7) "Charlie's Angels," in a big comeback from a disappointing 23rd finish last week 8) ABC's "Three's Company" 9) NBC's "Little House On The Prairie" and 10) ABC's Monday Night Football contest. Most prominent skid for the week was "Soap," as the consistent Top 20 ABC show fell to 44th. Ratings for the week ending November 27 will include a number of music-oriented specials, including NBC's Beatles showcase and CBS' ambitious "Rolling Stone 10th Anniversary" special, so stay tuned to next week's TV News for those results.

"The Godfather" dominated Arbitron's ratings for the week ending November 18, sweeping the first four places in the New York rankings. Part Three was first, followed by Part Four, Two and One. Trailing far behind were 5) "Charlie's Angels," 6) a three-way tie between "Eight Is Enough," "What's Happening" and "Happy Days" (all ABC) 9) NBC's "Newscenter 4" Monday at 11pm, and 10) a five-way lockup between "Newscenter 4" for Saturday and four ABC series: "Barney Miller," "Baretta," "Laverne & Shirley," and "Welcome Back Kotter."

In Los Angeles, "The Godfather, Part Three" barely edged "Laverne & Shirley" and "Happy Days" for first place (the last-named two shows tied for second). Next came 4) "Godfather, Part Four" 5) Monday Night Football (ABC) 6) "Eight Is Enough" tied with "Charlie's Angels" and 8) a three-way tie between "Barney Miller" and "The Godfather"'s first and second installments.

FCC Update

Inquiry Set On Proposed Conversion Of AM Radiation Patterns

The Commission has instituted an inquiry looking toward simplifying the engineering studies required in the processing of AM applications by converting authorized directional antenna patterns to ones which could be computerized.

The FCC noted that in 1971 it adopted new rules governing the design of radiation patterns for AM stations with directional antennas. Section 73.150 was amended to provide for a defined method of calculation of radiation patterns that could be computerized. Such patterns are called "standard patterns."

Section 73.152 also was amended to provide for the use of a modified standard pattern to take into account deviations from the standard pattern when the directional array actually had been constructed and put into use. Recently some minor changes were made in the method of calculating standard patterns.

However, the Commission said the requirement of using a standard pattern applies only to applications for new stations and major changes in existing stations, and therefore, very few stations actually have standard patterns instead of those using theoretical patterns with MEOV. (MEOV is the abbreviation of "Maximum Expected Operating Values.")

The FCC said that since it had adopted the standard pattern rules, the number of pending AM applications had increased dramatically, providing a strong incentive to find methods of streamlining the processing of applications. It said one method would be increased computerization of the processing.

It said if all domestic stations were converted to standard patterns the savings in processing time would be significant both for it and for applicants. Neighboring countries also would receive some benefits since they would no longer use MEOV in their calculations concerning U.S. stations, it added.

While processing time would be saved if all patterns were standard, the Commission said there were some potential detriments that must be considered before concluding all stations should be converted.

It said if all were converted, the predicted service areas and protection from predicted interference would be increased for some but decreased for others. However, it said, the benefits to be derived from the simplification of the overall allocation process would outweigh the shifts in interference and service areas since these shifts would occur primarily on paper.

The Commission said that more than 2,000 patterns would have to be converted and this would involve: recalculation and replotting; checks for accuracy; and notification to foreign governments in accordance with international agreements.


It said it could not absorb the workload with its existing staff and continue to process applications at the current speed.

Therefore, the Commission invited comments on several methods of implementation, such as conversion being performed entirely by FCC staff; conversion being performed entirely by licensees; conversion being contracted out; or some combination of these methods.

Comments on the inquiry are due January 23, with replies due February 22, 1978.



You spend a lot of time researching your market each and every week of the year... research to help you program what you believe to be the best possible music blend for your radio station. You call retail stores, tally requests, perhaps even do passive research, check with the jukeboxes, talk to your next door neighbor...you cover it totally because you want to be sure that it's right!

Then it's December and once again the old problem raises its head and you have to deal with it: Christmas music. I term it a "problem" because it doesn't fit into any of the neat research compartments we have built for ourselves.

I spoke with several stations last week and asked them what they planned to do with Christmas music this year. The picture is not bright if you've just written a dynamite new Christmas classic. **Bill Tanner at Y100/Miami:** "We'll play a minimal amount, just for flavor and usually just the week before Christmas." **Rick Brady at KTLK/Denver:** "...One per hour at first and then two per hour closer to Christmas, sticking with the traditional Top 40 things." **John Sebastian of KDWB/Minneapolis:** "We'll feel out the market, might play Bing Crosby as nostalgia, might play none at all." **Joel Denver at 96X/Miami:** "We'll end up playing some but not a lot." **Ron White of WGRD/Grand Rapids:** "...Play the big contemporary Christmas hits, Carpenters, Elvis, things like that." **Jerry Rogers, WSGA/Savannah:** "As little as possible, maybe a week before one per hour, but none 7-10pm."

What it all means is generally Top 40 programmers are not too "thrilled" at the prospect of airing seasonal music. You can't call the shops and get a retail read-out on most Christmas product. The requests will be there (or not be there), but is the request line by itself a true barometer for the total audience? What about passive research? If it hasn't already been done maybe it's about time to check out Christmas music at the level of your research. Most of us would agree that a portion of the Top 40 audience expects and wants to hear Christmas music. Where we would most certainly disagree is in determining just how large that "portion" of the audience is. Maybe this year we can find out... what do you think? Let me know.


It Was A Very Good Year







Here's hoping your Thanksgiving was a pleasant one. Thanks to the many AOR reporting stations that changed their schedule this past week in order to get into the newspaper in spite of the shortened work-week. We came amazingly close to our usual amount of station reports.

Thanksgiving radio was marked by the **DIR North American Rock Awards** program which ran on more than 250 of this continent's AOR radio stations. I had the privilege of co-hosting the show with **Grace Slick**, but as was the case with most of the program's participants, I didn't actually hear the complete show until it ran on the radio. The golden days of live radio theatre have yet to be revived, so this program was put together in "bits and pieces" over a period of time in a variety of cities.

The fine staff of DIR are to be commended for producing such a straightforward and entertaining program. "Award" programs are notorious for plasticity and ego-massaging politics. This one was credible and classy, proving that radio remains the perfect catalyst for mental theatrics. I was proud to be a part of it.

WNEW-FM Program Director and afternoon air personality **Scott Muni** was the first recipient of the **Tom Donahue Memorial Award** for outstanding contributions to FM (Progressive-AOR) radio. Upon accepting the honor, Scott was very clear about giving due credit to all of the form's broadcasters and recording artists in addition to praising the listeners themselves for "finding" commercial radio's "stepchildren" on the FM dial back when the form was an alternative. His remarks constituted a great moment in time (literally and figuratively) for each station upon which they were carried.

I worked with Scott as morning man at 'NEW back at the beginning of this decade and am one of the many, many members of this industry who were influenced and inspired by his foresight, dedication, and willingness to explore uncharted territory for low pay, long hours, and uncertain recognition...after having already been "on top" (Scott was once one of the nation's leading AM Top 40 disc jockeys).

So many of today's AOR programming and promotional concepts, on all ends of the mechanical and philosophical gamut were the results of his early "gut" experimentation. Congratulations, Scott!

Lots of excitement around **R&R** as we approach the end of the year and the holidays. Initial reaction to the convention has been extremely positive; it seems the industry is ready for another widening of convention horizons and increasing the input that creates that familiar rush of post-convention stimulation. I, personally, can't wait to attend **Marshall McLuhan's** keynote address, as I'm sure most of you are looking forward to hearing the thoughts of, perhaps, our age's greatest media mind.

On the internal front it's been extremely rewarding working with the newest members of our **R&R** family. Top 40 Editor **John Leader** and Associate Country Editor **Hugh Cherry**. Newly appointed AOR Editor **Jeff Gelb** arrives from San Diego (KGB) this week and will be taking the reigns of this section, as well as this particular column page.

You'll notice that we added **KXXK/Bakersfield**, **WLVQ (Q FM 96)/Columbus**, **KFMQ/Lincoln**, **KGON/Portland**, and **KISW (FM100)/Seattle** to our growing family of AOR reporting stations. They are all extremely fine operations and we welcome them. The list of AOR stations wishing to report is growing, so once again we request patience on the part of those waiting. More will be added at the beginning of the new year.
