How Diarykeepers Enter Stations

How do listeners identify radio stations in Arbitron diaries? Here are the results of a Spring '96 study of 3000 diaries covering 43,145 separate entries:

A similar survey six years ago found that 56% of entries were by call letters and just 9% were by dial position. It's not hard to figure out the reason for the dramatic change over such a short period: There are more digital radios -- flashing out a station's exact dial position - in use these days, and stations are increasing use of their exact frequencies in their on-air and advertising campaigns.

In-car listening was evenly split between call letters and frequency, but at-home listening reflected more frequent use of call letters. Older listeners used call letters more often: 53% of 65+ listeners identified stations by call letters, while just 17% of 18-24 listeners did so. The Arbitron breakout also found that the typical diary had 2.6 entries per day 15 entries

for the week, and 2.8 stations credited.

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


Fisher told R&R, "I planned on being in Baltimore a lot longer, but I felt things were somehow pointing me in the direction of Minneapolis. This opportunity was too good to pass up.

"[KS95 GM Ginny Morris] and I met each other at some Coleman [Research] roundtables, and we really hit it off. She thought that as long as I was with Capitol Broadcasting, I wasn't going anywhere. But we started talking when the sale of WWMX to American Radio Systems] was announced, and she made it very enticing for me to go to Minneapolis. She really 'gets it,' they want to win very badly, and this is Hubbard of Minneapolis - you can't beat that."

ARS has entered into an LMA with WWMX and expects to close

on the property in about six weeks. Fisher's past programming credits include WEGX/Philadelphia, WBSB/Baltimore, KZZP/Phoenix, WKTI/Milwaukee, WRAL/

Raleigh, and KFIV/Modesto, CA.



RAB At Record Strength

t the same time the RAB announced that its membership rolls have hit the A the same time the nap announced the nap announced the same time in a 13% jump over stratosphere, October radio industry revenues registered a 13% jump over October of last year.

"Our growth is no accident," remarked RAB President/CEO Gary Fries. "[Member stations] no longer view membership in the RAB as just a way to support our industry, but they're taking the many new and improved radio marketing resources developed by the RAB into the local marketplace to help them make more and bigger sales.

Fries said the association is now supported by 4639 stations - roughly double what it was four years ago, not long after he was recruited to lead the RAB.

October's revenues represented the zenith of election-year spending, and Fries pointed out that it was an indicator of good things to come for the entire fourth quarter.

KUPR-FM/SD Flips From AA To Country

The Country battle lines are being drawn between insurance titans in San Diego. Nationwide flipped newly acquired Adult Alternative KUPR-FM to Country last Friday afternoon (11/22) - going head-to-head with Jefferson-Pilot-owned KSON-AM & FM, the heritage Country outlet and longtime 12+ market leader.

KUPR-FM debuted with 10,000 in a row, jockless and commercial-free. No PD has been named following Mike Halloran's exit November 21. A call-letter change is not expected in the short term, said KUPR-FM GM Dennis Gwiazdon.

Regarding the format change, Gwiazdon told R&R, "Nationwide has a long-term commitment to this market, and we intend to make our stations [KUPR, Nostalgia KPOP-AM, and Classical KFSD-FM] successful. We evaluated our options, and all the research suggests there's room for a second Country station in this market. We're testing our beliefs."

Gwiazdon added that KUPR-FM's signal is in the process of being upgraded and by the end of the year it will "compete with any signal in the market.

Meanwhile, KFSD soon will be changing format, and Nationwide is said to be looking to make a deal with another station to adopt the Classical format, Rumors are that Art Astor's Country KOWF-FM/Escondido, CA is a strong possibility. Also, Nationwide recently traded Classic Rock KGB FM/San Diego to Jacor for a couple of Phoenix properties.

KUPR-FM is licensed to Carlsbad, CA with 7200 watts at 550 feet. It's Nationwide's fourth Country outlet, joining WPOC-FM/Baltimore, WCOL-FM/Columbus, and WGAR-FM/Cleveland.

Washington PD At Urban AC WTMP/Tampa

WTMP-AM/Tampa afternoon driver Nat Washington has added PD duties at the Tampa Broadcasting Urban AC outlet. He succeeds Rick Eaves, who had stepped down to concentrate on his airshift; Eaves subsequently announced plans to join NAC WCCJ/Charlotte as an air personality.

"Nat once acted as PD here in a transitional period," GM Chris Turner told R&R. "He has worked with me in Charlotte, Memphis, and Philadelphia, so I'm quite aware of his capabilities.'

Washington joined WTMP two years ago after a stint at WHAT-AM/ Philadelphia. He has also worked at WLOK/Memphis, WOL/Washington, and WGIV/Charlotte.

WOFX's Richards Adds WEBN OM Duties

Jacor Communications has tapped Jim Richards as OM of Rock outlet WEBN-FM/Cincinnati. Expanding his current duties as OM of crosstown Classic Rocker WOFX-FM, Richards assumes the WEBN post in the wake of Brad Hardin's recent departure to WTBT-FM & WXTB/Tampa (**R&R** 11/22).

Richards "I first worked with Jim in a consulting capacity years ago when he was doing an outstanding job programming WSNX/Muskegon, MI," said Jacor VP/National Programming Tom Owens. "I was immediately impressed by his intelligence and enthusiasm. One of

the most satisfying aspects of Jacor's expansion has been our ability to reward exceptional performance with intercompany advancement."

Richards told R&R, "Some of the most talented people in radio are in these hallways. Some of the minds here are as warped as they are brilliant, and that's what real-

ly makes 'EBN stand out." In addition to WSNX, Richards also has programmed WBHV/ State College, PA. He was OM at WMYU-FM & WWST-FM/ Knoxville and spent time as a jock at WLRS/Louisville.

Veronis, Suhler Releases '96 Report

$\hfill\square$ Radio revenues up for third consecutive year

No surprises here: Investment bank **Veronis, Suhler & Associates'** 1996 Communications Industry Report shows that radio revenues increased over the period from 1991 to 1995.

The report is based on the Securities & Exchange Commission filings by publicly traded companies. 1995 was the third consecutive year of double-digit growth, Veronis said, with revenues increasing 18%. Much of this can be attributed to the relaxing of the ownership rules over the past three years.

According to the report, "Radio consolidation proved to be successful in enhancing both revenues and operating margins. The pace of activity increased in the ensuing years." Out in front was **Clear Channel Communications,** which posted a 50.6% increase in revenues in 1995.

Infinity Revenues Rise

Likewise, **Infinity Broadcasting** saw revenues increase 18.8% that year, in part because it was the first full year, Infinity operated **KLUV**- FM/Dallas, WXYT-AM/Detroit, KRTH-FM/Los Angeles, and WPGC-AM & FM/Washington. On a same-station basis, Infinity revenues were up 12%. Clear Channel and Infinity accounted for more than half of the operating income growth among pure radio companies.

Among companies that own both radio and television stations, revenues rose 7.8% in '95. The combined radio/television industry segment was fueled by companies like **Sinclair Broadcast Group**, which posted compounded annual growth for the 1991-to-1995 period of 46% and **Gannett**, which had revenues in excess of \$466 million for 1995.

Veronis, Suhler analyzed the entire communications industry, including radio; television; subscription video services; recorded music; book, magazine, and newspaper

publishing; business information services; advertising agencies; and interactive digital media. Among those segments, television and radio broadcasters had the highest operating income margin — 24.1% and the largest increase in operating income — 12.6%.

The report covered 443 companies. Of the top 50, **Westinghouse** had the fastest-growing revenues over the five-year period, with revenues increasing at a 52.6% annual rate, thanks in part to its acquisition of **CBS**.

A handful of companies that own radio stations made Veronis, Suhler's list of the top 50 communications industry companies (ranked by revenue). Not surprisingly, however, no pure radio companies did. Viacom, ABC Inc., and the Walt Disney Company were ranked fourth, fifth, and eighth, respectively. Gannett, Westinghouse/CBS, and Cox Communications weighed in at 16th, 18th, and 41st.

Cardinal Sues SFX Over Swap

A s if it hasn't had enough to deal with in the past month, SFX Broadcasting is now being sued by Cardinal Communications for breach of contract, fraud, and negligent misrepresentation — even after SFX paid Cardinal \$1 million to settle part of the suit.

Cardinal, which filed the suit in district court in Dallas, says that when SFX bought Cardinal's **KTCK-FM/Dallas** last year (for \$8 million cash plus \$2 million in SFX stock), SFX agreed to make payments of up to \$7.5 million to Cardinal since SFX would reportedly benefit from "synergistic effects" resulting from combining KTCK with SFX's **KRLD-AM** and its **Texas State Network (TSN).** Cardinal claims SFX also agreed to pay Cardinal between \$1 million and \$2 million if it sold either of the stations or the network.

In May SFX sold KTCK for \$14 million to Susquehanna Radio Corp. and swapped KRLD and TSN for CBS's KKRW-FM/Houston in a deal valued at \$70 million. Cardinal attorney John Bickel said Tuesday (11/ 26) that SFX paid Cardinal \$1 million for the sale of KTCK. But in its response (filed 11/25), SFX denied "each and every one, all and singular, of the allegations."

At presstime, an SFX spokesperson would not comment on the suit.

Viacom For Sale

C ontrary to reports in a Chicago newspaper and a trade publication, ABC Inc. is *not* discussing a purchase of Viacom Broadcasting's radio division for \$1.3 billion. But even though ABC doesn't appear to be the buyer, Viacom is for sale — albeit for a hefty premium.

Viacom International chief Sumner Redstone, the person who would make a final decision on such a deal, reportedly has set the sale price at a firm \$1.4 billion. The figure is about 24 times cash flow, according to some estimates. That's because Viacom is looking at paying stunning capital gains taxes and would need lots of motivation to reduce its herd of cash cows.

Earlier, ABC Radio President **Robert Callahan** had teased Viacom Broadcasting President **Bill Figenshu** about the rumored deal, saying the price was outrageous — Disney would pay only \$1 billion. (For another humorous take on the ABC rumor, see Street Talk, Page 20.)

Multi-Market/SFX Merger Offical

S FX Broadcasting (Nasdaq: SFXBA) closed its merger with Multi-Market Radio (Nasdaq: RDIOA) on Friday (11/22). The deal, which was announced earlier this year (R&R 4/11), was valued at approximately \$90 million. Former MMR President Mike Ferrel officially takes over as President/CEO of SFX.

A Multi-Market shareholder lawsuit, settled in October, forced SFX to amend the merger to guarantee MMR shareholders a minimum payment of \$12.50 per share.

The way the transaction finally panned out, MMR Class A common stock and Series B preferred stockholders received .2983 shares of SFX Class A common stock per MMR share. Shareholders of MMR Class B common stock and Original Preferred stock received .2983 shares of SFX Class B common stock per MMR share.

SFX said approximately 1.6 million SFX Class A common shares and 209,000 Class B common shares were issued.

SFX Exec. Chairman Robert Sillerman said, "The companies share Continued on Page 12

Disney, Triathlon, Heftel Report Revenues

W ait Disney Co. (NYSE: DIS) reported a 27% increase in earnings for its fiscal fourth quarter, with broadcasting profits rising "more than tenfold" from fourthquarter 1995.

The company reported earnings of \$336 million (49 cents per share) on revenues of \$5.27 billion. A year earlier earnings were \$265 million (50 cents) on revenues of \$3.12 billion. Disney said per-share earnings were down because it issued more shares last quarter. Earnings would have been up 60% had **ABC** been included in last year's quarterly results. Pro forma operating income was \$858 million compared to \$354 million during the same period last year.

> Triathlon's Second Quarter

T riathion Broadcasting Co. (Nasdaq: TBCOA) today announced results for the quarter ended September 30, 1996, the second quarter of its 1997 fiscal year. Triathion completed its initial public offering in September 1995.

The company reported a net loss applicable to common stock of neg-



Too often, managers focus solely on the technical aspects of the job, forgetting that the role of the manager is really only 5% skill, but 95% psychology. Without the understanding that interpersonal skills are becoming so much more important, managers are quickly becoming frustrated with the complex interactions they are now facing with so many more people under the same roof.

In the bestseller "The Peter Principle," Laurence J. Peter wrote that technical skills won't compensate for lack of interpersonal skills. Its central theme was every manager, if promoted often enough, will eventually be promoted to his or her own level of incompetence. The moral of the story was past technical proficiency is no guarantee of future managerial performance, and if we promote solely on the basis of current technical competence, we will eventually put people in positions where they will be unable to handle the challenge.

16 'Psychological' **Strategies**

The solution: brushing up on even acquiring - those new skills and abilities demanded by the consolidation of our industry. Below, we'll identify the 16 "psychological" strategies necessary for you to master to lead your staff toward excellence in the months and years that follow

1 Make your expectations clearly known. How else can you expect people to satisfy them? Never assume that employees know what behavior or levels of performance you expect from them. Never be afraid to tell them exactly what you want

2 Offer every single possible tool and resource to your department heads. Then insist on overachievement across the board --- in every department, by every employee. Shoot for outpacing market revenue growth, 1.8-2.0 power ratios, and dominance in all the key demos.

3 Keep raising the bar, then

them. Teach them how to solve problems for themselves. Put a note on

your door which says, "IP=2S," meaning one problem equals two solutions. Encourage employees to come in asking for advice on which of the two solutions (that they've already thought through for their own problem) makes more sense. Stop coming up with the solutions for them.

 Set up goals and standards, then continually help them track their progress toward these goals and standards. Daily, weekly, and monthly, post team goals for everyone to cheer on.

12 Make people your most important asset. But don't make it a mere trite statement. Really deliver by doing the little things that show subordinates you value them as individuals. Hint: You know what makes vou feel good. Chances are the same things will work with them. People want to feel important; if you oblige them, they'll oblige you.

13 Use meetings to strengthen the team. All stations, all departments, and all team players. Encourage participation and idea sharing. Keep the group focused on goals.

1 Do what you say you're going to do (then remind them that's vour style). Don't make promises vou can't or won't keep. Most people's trust problems have been learned from untrustworthy actions in the past.

15 Remember people stay with you as long as their needs are satisfied. Therefore, it's important to understand what drives people before hiring them - and keep those drives in mind later on. Example: If salary and advancement are top motivators for a valued employee, find a way to reward the employee before someone else does.

16 Whether subordinates admit it or not, feedback from you

One more point. Once you've mastered these 16 points, do one more for your own good: Train your management team so that one or more of them can take over when you leave or get promoted. Insight: You'll be easier to promote if someone's ready to step right in, making the risk of moving you less severe. Your replacement should be working for you

Media Planner Gives Mixed Review Of Radio

E ditor's note: Bryan Farrish, who edits the e-mailed sales newsletter Radio-Media, recently interviewed New Glouster, ME-based media planner Peter Kern, a heavy radio user who nonetheless has controversial views about buying the medium. Radio salespeople will find these excerpts, along with tips he offers to potential radio advertisers, insightful.

Bryan Farrish: What media does your company focus its work on?

Peter Kern: Radio 50%; TV 30%; other media get 20%.

BF: What motivated you to get into agency work?

PK: Money and independence. BF: What are your current responsibilities?

PK: Planning, buying, and writing

BF: What do you like about planning/buying radio compared to other media?

PK: It's fast, effective, and easy. BF: Do you dislike anything about radio?

PK: Yes ... reps who do not listen.

BF: In a given market, do you feel that radio reps should sell against other stations, or sell against other media?

PK: Tough question. However,

it's my job to advise the client on the budget split among available media. Info against other media is interesting, yet does little to put a commission check in the [radio] rep's pocket. So the forced choice is to sell against other stations.

Now, how to do this? By making your station irresistible for a big buy with more spots, points, mentions, value (groan) added, etc. Bad-mouthing another station is of little value.

BF: When planning/buying radio, do you prefer large, medium, or small size markets? Do you find that the reps in any one market size have skills from which the others could learn?

PK: I have seen absolutely no difference between reps in Boston or in South Paris, Maine. Market size, apparently, makes no difference

BF: How heavily does Arbitron

play into your planning/buying? PK: Moderate. A 10% variation

in numbers won't matter unless station A is 50% higher or more efficient than station B. BF: How do you feel about ra-

dio's future with respect to the Internet?

PK: What kind of information could radio provide through the Internet that people might want? So far, only a searchable program listing for a Classical station seems to make sense to me. As a buyer, I wish more stations had e-mail capabilities.

BF: When you buy into a market, how deeply do you normally buy? I know it depends on the reach you want, but is there a general rule of thumb?

PK: We strongly feel that FRE-QUENCY should determine the depth of the buy, not REACH. For example, try to achieve a five frequency with a top station, and if a budget remains, buy a second, then a third, etc. On the other hand, a four-station buy that reaches 60% could bomb if only a three reach is achieved.

BF: Do you ever consider stations

A Buyer's Tips To Radio Advertisers

ere's an excerpt from a newsletter media planner Pe-ter Kern sent to area advertisers. Says Kern, "It's basic, and it works."

Radio's a powerful, affordable, effective ad medium. Here's how to get more for your radio ad dollar:

- 1. Simplify the selection. Get your hands on the latest Arbitron estimates. It will contain over 50,000 different "numbers.
- 2. You only need a dozen or so of these numbers to get going.
- 3. Define one demo, and stick to it. If you want to hit men 25-49, don't let a sales rep talk you into buying women 25-54.
- 4. Define your sales area. If 80% of your customers come from the MSA (Metro Survey Area), don't even look at the larger TSA (Total Survey Area).
- 5. Rank the top stations based on M-F, 6am-7pm "average quarter hour" listeners. Again, don't let the rep confuse you with curnes,
- morning drives, weekends, or other dayparts/data.
- 6. Do a rough efficiency check. Divide each station's rates by its listeners to get a CPM (cost-per-thousand).
- 7. Select three or four stations to negotiate with based upon their audience size and efficiency.

with low ratings as possible buys? PK: Almost never. You can't

save a soul in an empty church. BF: What does a small-market salesperson do for the really small accounts — \$100-\$150 per month who want to cancel their advertising because they aren't getting any business from the locals?

PK: Although monthly budgets are appealing to both advertisers and sales reps, the advertiser is set up for failure if the schedule cannot break through the clutter. Pay the \$100/month and run a proper schedule three weeks per year. Avoid ROS on low budget; better to fix position at 6:15am on a Sunday and at least motivate 10 listeners, than to shotgun over a full week and fail to even break through.





Brooks told R&R. Brooks pointed to the issuance of such guidances as competitive impact statements, speeches by both Klein and DOJ Antitrust Division acting Director Lawrence Fullerton, and "the more than 900 transactions cleared" by DOJ this year.

More than a dozen DOJ staffers attended the meeting, which Baumann characterized as "almost intimidating" before concluding that "when you have that many people there, the boss wants them to hear what the industry is saying. It was a sign that DOJ sees it is important to know what's on the industry's



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mind." He said both sides acknowledged they had little pre-telecom bill experience working with each other, and that there is "lots of concern and lots of uncertainty [caused by] misinformation" regarding what DOJ is looking for in merger deals.

The industry's earlier frustration with DOJ regarding mergers "was created by a lack of information on both sides," Baumann figured, and he concurred when Henneberry told R&R, "It's going along the way it should go. There are no politics involved. We have many substantial disagreements, but there is not in any way a [political] agenda. And we made it clear that we are not espousing that point of view. I know these people, I've worked with them for years, and that's not how they work.'

'Sincere Interest'

In a letter to radio groups, Fritts wrote, "While there are no 'silver bullets' on this one, I came away from the meeting believing that Mr. Klein has a sincere interest in wanting to learn more about the radio marketplace and finding solutions to the problems encountered in the first few Justice investigations of industry consolidation.

Baumann told R&R. "We left with a better sense of understanding on both sides and agreed that we would continue the dialogue and share information." Another meeting between the two parties would be scheduled for next week, he said.

ative \$1.1 million (22 cents) on revenues of \$5.4 million. For the same period in 1995 Triathlon reported a loss of \$130,000 (5 cents) on revenues of \$135,000.

"Since our last quarter, we have made significant progress in implementing our cost reduction programs and realizing the efficiencies of combined operations in the markets we now serve," said Triathlon President/ CEO Norman Feuer.

Broadcast cash flow was \$1.6 million. The company did not operate stations during its second quarter 1995, but assuming Triathlon had owned the same stations, revenues would have increased 3% to \$7.2 million and broadcast cash flow would have increased 8% to \$1.8 million

Katz's Flat Third Quarter

t was a fairly flat quarter for Katz Media Group (AMEX: KTZ), which reported third-quarter 1996 earnings of \$890,000 (6 cents) on revenues of \$43.6 million. Third-quarter 1995 earnings were \$557,000 (4 cents) on revenues of \$43.6 million. Broadcast cash flow was down slightly from \$11.1 million last year to \$10.1 for the third quarter.

According to Katz President/CEO Tom Olson, "For the second year in a row, network television enjoyed an extraordinarily strong upfront market. It is our belief that this not only surprised the advertising community, but it diverted money from other media segments not the least of which included spot television. cable, and radio."

CBC Third-Quarter Results

hildren's Broadcasting Corp. (Nasdag: AAHS) today reported a third-quarter 1996 net loss of \$1.4 million (33 cents) on revenues of \$1.4 million, compared to a loss in the same period last year of \$2.1 million (76 cents) on revenues of \$1.2 million.

Broadcast cash flow was up to \$432.000 from \$182.000 for thirdquarter 1995 for CBC's Radio AAHS Network and up to \$800,000 from \$760.000 in 1995 for CBCowned and operated stations.

"We continue to strategically and aggressively sell Radio AAHS both locally and nationally and will continue to enhance our efforts on both levels," said CBC President/CEO Christopher Dahl. "As we get the newest of our owned and operated stations up and fine-tuned our efficiency factor will grow."

Heftel Reports Loss


eftel Broadcasting Corp. (Nasdaq: HBCCA) announced a net loss of \$45.6 million (\$4.14 per share) on revenues of \$18.7 million for its fiscal fourth quarter ended September 30, 1996. For the same period last year Heftel posted eamings of \$10,600 (0 cents) on revenues of \$17.5 million.

Broadcast cash flow was up 15.3% from \$4.9 million in the fourth quarter 1995 to \$5.6 million this past-quarter.

Heftel has agreed to merge with privately held Tichenor Media Systems. On August 5, 1996 Clear Channel Communications (NYSE: CCU) completed a stock purchase and tender offer of the company's Class A and B common stock for \$23 per share, giving it a 63% non-voting interest in Heftel.





Virgin Readies U.S. Blitz For Spice Girls

After 3 million in sales and airplay hits around the world.

While few foreign acts make it to the upper echelons of the U.S. airplay and sales charts, Virgin finds itself in the right place at the right time with British vocal quintet the Spice Girls.

Already platinum-plus in their UK homeland. the Spice Girls' debut album, "Spice," has sold around 3 million copies internationally and spawned No. 1 singles in some 30 countries, according to Virgin.



In the UK their first single, "Wannabe," topped the sales charts for six consecutive weeks and sold over 1 million copies. Follow-up "Say You'll Be There" entered the chart at No. 1 and also is near the 1 million sales mark.

The group, managed by Simon Fuller (Annie Lennox), has garnered rave reviews in the national London newspaper The Telegraph dubs the group the "New Lasses," an aggressive feminine counterpart to "New Lads" Oasis and Blur. Spice Girls just concluded a whirlwind promo tour of the U.S. in mid-November, and Virgin plans to ship "Wannabe" to radio on December 18. The single ships to retail on January 14, with the album bowing on February 11.

Virgin Sr. VP/Promotion Michael Plen admits that Pop radio's shift dovetails nicely with the Spice

Girls' music. "When we were evaluating how to release this record last March, radio wasn't really what the Spice Girls album was about, so we scheduled it to be the first record of the new year. In the eight months that followed, radio changed to the point where they are now looking for records like this."

Late December/early January could prove to be an ideal launching point, says Plen. "Record companies are looking for things to fuel sales, so they're releasing a lot of ballads for the holidays. But right now I sense that radio is tiring a little of all the ballads, which is why anybody with a great uptempo record is going to succeed."

Careful Planning

Virgin almost saw things begin to slip away just over one month ago, when CHR/Rhythmic stations

Miami went early on "Wannabe," which the label had been playing for programmers as part of the set-up. Fortunately for the label, because of a combination

of persuasion and the availability of singles from other major artists, radio held back. "This record has been such a success for Virgin

all over the world that its launch in America correctly needs to be strategized, not done on a wing and a prayer," comments Plen. "We're not going to have an album until late January, and programmers would have been 16 weeks in front of the record. I told programmers, 'l can't stop you from playing it, but - beyond this record if you feel that being in business with Virgin is a good thing, then please be a little sympathetic to the fact that you're hurting us. You may be getting a short-term victory for yourself, but the airplay doesn't mean enough to us now.

Plen says he experienced something similar when promoting Neneh Cherry's album 'Raw Like Sushi.' "The single 'Buffalo Stance' peaked when the album hit the street. We sold about 400,000 copies in the States but really never recovered from not having the album in stores at the right time. Our schedule puts the single about one month ahead of the album. which I can live with."

As with many successful international acts. Virgin has to tread carefully to make sure that the Spice Girls don't come across as an overly hyped project. Plen points to listener reaction from the early airplay at KKFR and WPOW as evidence that substance is winning over style. "I'm convinced it isn't hype because people already are demanding the music. The people who put in on the air immediately got requests."

The first promo tour also helped. "When we brought the group to the States, you could see their genuineness. I think other people saw it, too. It's not like we're selling some big hyped project that doesn't have anything behind it. The album is full of solid songs that clearly are well written and produced, and the group played a big part in its creation."

International Inroads

Plen also is keenly aware that international success does not beget

success in States. Nevertheless, the broad global appeal of the first two singles indicates the music is cutting across diverse cultures. The Spice Girls' success is not limited to a handful of countries; when that kind of broad acceptance occurs, the odds for success dramatically increase. "[The international success story] is what gets you in the door. I've worked records that have been huge hits overseas that don't work here. In today's environment you have to see the bigger picture.'

Part of the picture involves video. Virgin has allowed M2 to play the "Wannabe" clip, more as a way to gauge the reaction from the channel's small universe of viewers. Net result: Word is that MTV --- which has seen how well viewers responded to the group internationally — is expected to be an early supporter of the video. Virgin also will be courting national and local TV music shows and video channels in '97.

Virgin is eyeing the Urban and Latino markets as well. A Junior Vasquez-mixed version of the second single, "Say You'll Be There," most likely will be serviced to those formats.

Nevertheless, it's CHR that is the proving ground for the Spice Girls. CHR/Pop WHYI/Miami PD Rob **Roberts** agrees the timing is right for the song. "It's as big a lock [to be a hitl as I've heard in a long time. For a while CHR wasn't getting many songs like this. Now it's swinging back. 'Wannabe' isn't a formula record by any means, but it fits every formula that CHR needs.

"It's also the kind of record the Hot ACs are going to have a tough time with early on. It's a record that CHR --- whether pop or rhythmic --- can own for quite a while."

Roberts cites tempo and mass appeal as key reasons he's bullish on the song. "It's a song that covers all the bases. Even people without rhythm can get into it. And even though we sing this same tune every year around this time, there is a glut of ballads. This song jumps out of the radio when it's juxtaposed next to a ballad."

'Waiting To Fire Away'

KIIS/Los Angeles MD Tracy Austin likens the single, in some ways, to Ace Of Base. "It's almost like Ace Of Base's music in that it fits next to almost anything. I like those kinds of records, the ones that are hard to define.

We have it in the stack and are waiting to fire away. Something like this will probably start off at night. If it does well, we'll move it to other dayparts. It has a sung rap part, so we'll have to see how that comes across.

As for radio's willingness to hold off on the single, Roberts says the agreement highlights one instance where it's best for radio to cooperate with record labels. 'We're holding off because we agreed that it makes sense to wait another 30 days and let Virgin have time to really get behind it. It isn't like what's happening with [Warner Bros. UK dance artist] Gina G. (see Launching Pad story, Page 25), which we've been playing for a long time as an import, and we know that it's going to be another six weeks before anything happens."


KKFR PD Don Parker concurs. "We've played it about 70 times, which is enough to tell us that it's a really good record and has a good chance to be a big hit.

"We decided that since it was still early and the record hadn't had time to kick in, we may as well hold off. Plus there were a lot of other releases we wanted to play, and we needed the space. It's actually going to work out better in the long run, because there isn't a lot of room in the rotation. In a couple of weeks, there will be.'

Commenting on the song's probable appeal to younger demos, Parker notes, "Good records are good records, regardless of the group or who it appeals to. You could go back to the ultimate teen group, New Kids On The Block and 'Please Don't Go Girl,' which was a huge 18-34 callout record. A new group won't get pigeonholed in its early days, and the songs can stand on their own. But this album has some meat to it that we think will go beyond the teens." Sums up Plen, "We know that if

the single and album explode on the street, most programmers are comfortable with records that are retailing well in their market.

Yet after hearing the album, I don't believe this is the kind of thing where radio will give one song a chance and then it's over. I think you'll see the Spice Girls become the phenomenon of '97. I say that with trepidation since a lot of promotion execs say those words a little bit too freely. But I wouldn't say that unless I believed we have a sure thing --- a sure thing that has been validated in so many places around the world and by everybody who's played the record."

'Ooh Aah' — CHR Dancing To Gina G.'s International Hit

Just when it seemed dance was beginning to lose a little lustre in many programming circles, along come a

couple of British singles that have people talking. While **Virgin** is waiting until late December to ship the **Spice Girls'** U.S. debut "Wannabe" to radio (see Sound Decisions, Page 24), **Warner Bros.** is well into a full-court press with **Gina G**.'s first American single "Ooh Aah ... Just A Little Bit."

The track was sixth Most Added at CHR/Pop last week, trailing new records from such artists as AFKAP, Counting Crows, and John Mellencamp. Major-market Pop outlets reporting new adds over the past couple of weeks include KIIS/Los Angeles, KDWB/Minneapolis, WBZZ/Pittsburgh, and KKFR/Phoenix.

Unlike other international hits that are now being worked at Pop, "Ooh Aah ... Just A Little Bit" floated around the U.S. for several months and worked remarkably well for a handful of stations, such as WHYI/Miami and WIOQ/ Philadelphia. The former, for example, has played the song over 750 times and is reporting burn of less than 10%.

Originally signed to **Warner U.K./ Eternal**, the 25-year-old Gina G. only recently inked with Warner Bros. in the U.S. The single — which has sold well over 700,000 copies in the UK and was that country's entry in the '96 Eurovision Song Contest — spent seven weeks in the Top 10 in Great Britain before reaching No. 1. Eventually, it crossed to Europe, where it also reached lofty heights.

Even though her station is just now beginning to back down on the single, WIOQ MD **Dee Dee McGuire** says the record "still gets a lot of requests, and we've been playing it since mid-August, before she was signed in the U.S."

McGuire says the record pulled down top phones for several weeks and was in power rotation for at least one month. "The song has a mainstream poppy sound that fits the format. We're moving in a dance direction, and songs like this definitely appeal to younger demos but are accessible

enough for older listeners as well." C H R / R h y t h m i c

WKTU/New York MD Andy Shane agrees. Having recently re-added the single, he notes, "We had some good early response, and then it got kind of slow. But we've had a resurgence of people interested in the record. A lot of listeners said they missed hearing it on the air."

Shane adds, "It's pretty much representative of the uptempo, danceable sound that works well with what we do, and we believe it's going to work again."

As for set-up, Warner Director/National Singles Promotion Greg Lee credits WHYI PD Rob Roberts with

championing the record (as well as sending out a fair share of DATs to friends). Lee also tips his hat to **John Garabedian** and his syndicated "Open House Party" as another key element in spreading the news. As a result, much of the set-up was already done months in advance.

Lee comments, "You can't ask for much more: a powerful reaction record where word of mouth has resulted in some incredible airplay at some key stations. When it came time to officially launch the project, we already had several major-market success stories to share with programmers. You only get a handful of records like that each year.

"As far as what Rob did, he's almost a dying breed. [Sending out tapes] is the kind of thing people used to do. It renews your faith that there are programmers who are actively look-

ing for new music. We need more of that." Looking forward, Lee says Gina G. is about helfway finished

about halfway finished with a new album. "The depth is there. We're hoping it will be finished next month and out by the first part of next year."

No 'Struggle' With Borrowers

Like the tortoise, slow and steady wins the race. So **Guardian** hasn't been taking a "hare band" approach when it comes to the **Borrowers**, whose "Beautiful Struggle" single is making inroads at Adult Alternative. The track, taken from the quartet's self-titled debut album, has gained a following at KSCA/LosAngeles, WBOS/Boston, KTCZ/Minneapolis, and WRLT/Nashville.

One fan of the single is **WRLT** PD/ MD **Jon Peterson**, whose station has been playing "Beautiful Struggle" for nearly three months. "There's big potential in the song. It kind of sounds like **Bruce Springsteen** trying to sound modern.

"It seems to strike a chord in seemingly disparate musical genres. It has a nice, rootsy feel combined with a modern-sounding drum beat. When an artist straddles the middle, it sometimes doesn't make for good art or radio. But if you pull it off, it can really work, which is what it's doing for us."

KSCA MD **Nicole Sandler** agrees, especially with the Springsteen comparison. "The more we listened to it, the more we liked it. It has a great texture that grows on you. Those are the records that, in my book, last longer because they don't burn quickly."

One key element in the strategy to break the Borrowers at Adult Alternative, says Guardian VP/Marketing & Promotion Chris Hensley, was creating a partnership between radio and retail by making time buys in select markets where airplay had reached a certain level. "We wanted to make sure the relationships between radio, retail, and the artist were as strong as possible. We especially wanted radio to be rewarded for staying with the band once they came to the party."

Hensley has the band on the road doing radio shows, beginning November 29 in Philadelphia and ending December 16 in Los Angeles.

Taking on the format's 'monsters'

God could come down and do a talk show, and it would still be years before some stations could unseat the long-established giant in their cities. After all, a handful of Talk radio behemoths have had a quarter-century head start in Talk and a 75-year advantage as the dominant station.

This is a tale of five cities. The first is St. Louis, where upstart WIBV has been attempting to chip away at the incredibly dominant KMOX since April 15. What's especially unusual here is that almost everybody at WIBV worked for KMOX at one time or another. WIBV PD Fred Zielonko, for instance, was a producer for the renowned Jack Carney, who spent many decades at

KMOX until his death in 1984. Carney's son, John, also moved up the dial to join Zielonko at WIBV.

Zielonko says KMOX hasn't been the same since the 1991 death of longtime GM and St. Louis legend Bob Hyland, Zielon-

ko is reverential when he says, "We're trying to recreate what Bob Hyland taught us. We feel we're carrying the torch of the original KMOX. He was a great man who understood radio and

knew what made it work. He had a great knack for finding talent."

Some of the talent discovered by Hyland, like sports personalities Bob Costas and Dan Dierdorf, moved on to national prominence. Most chose to stay in St. Louis and, until recently, at KMOX. The first and foremost "defectors" were KMOX morning drivers Bill Wilkerson and Wendy Wiese, who now get up early for WIBV.

Says Zielonko, "We're trying to go back to the way we used to do things at recreate what Bob KMOX. They've Hyland taught us. gotten away from a one-oncarrying the torch of one personable approach and the original KMOX. into formatics. WIBV is less strictly format-ted and more

personality-oriented. We're more into content and letting the personalities be themselves."

WIBV's billboards and bumper stickers declare, "I moved up to 1260," a dial position with a signal handicap that will soon be remedied when GM Tim Dorsey (another KMOX vet) closes on his recently announced purchase of KSD (on the much more signal-friendly 550 kHz). Meantime, KMOX's 50,000 watts carry all the big sports franchises except the Rams (currently on KSD), but Zielonko says WIBV may chase play-by-play in the future.

Zielonko left KMOX in March after Dorsey green-lighted the new format. When I asked Zielonko how many staffers from KMOX have joined him, I imagined a shuttle bus showing up at the CBS giant near the Gateway Arch. (Hyland, by the way, had a lot to do with putting the arch there in the first place.)

After Wilkerson and Wiese, the list of ex-patriots (with their former KMOX jobs in parentheses) includes ND Joan Beuckman (news producer), Sports Director Jim Holder (sports reporter), reporter Matt Murphy (reporter), News Editor Trish Muyco-Tobin (news editor), evening talk host Dianna Proffitt (overnight talk host), Production Director Paul Arca (production director at KMOX sister KLOU), sports reporter Dan McLaughlin (sports reporter), and David Strauss (weekend trivia show host) ... you get the idea.

Arbitron before the big switch (Winter '96) had the station at an anemic 1.5 share. Immediately, the audience nearly dou-

bled, reaching 2.7 in the spring book and 2.8 in the summer survev. KMOX, on the other hand, was off a point compared to a year ago. However, since KMOX's Summer '95-Summer '96 dip was 14.2-13.2, it would be safe to say it's not exactly trembling in its boots just yet.

Zielonko says, "KMOX continues to promote the people who stayed behind. Their reaction is that they haven't been impacted, but the numbers speak otherwise. We got a lot of publicity because of the shift of people. Our listen-

ers tell us we sound like we're having a lot of fun. They've been very loyal and patient because of the signal limitations.'

Zielonko repeatedly emphasizes that, in his opinion, KMOX isn't what it used to be since the " death of the man he clearly re-

spects. He adds that it's easy to give the ex-KMOX people creative freedom because "everyone who worked for Bob Hyland was a seasoned pro. We all had occasional battles with him, but we had many more great times.

Motown Matchup

It was the death of another radio legend that some observers say accelerated the changes at another Midwestern powerhouse, WJR/ **Detroit. Doug Gondek**, PD of crosstown WXYT, hopes that shifting listener habits auger well for his silver-medal Talk station.

Gondek claims WJR's morning show cume dropped 30% during the year between the death of J.P. McCarthy and his eventual replacement by Paul W. Smith, adding, "The book's still out on Paul." Smith debuted in McCarthy's long-held time slot near the beginning of this year's summer Arbitron, the most recent for which weighted figures are available.

WJR's entire schedule had its lowest 12+ ratings ever this summer, despite the annual assist from Tigers baseball. It finished with a $6.\overline{2}$ share, good enough for a second-place tie, but off from the previous summer's 7.9 and the spring book's 6.8. WXYT has been steady through the year, ranking 10th this summer at a 3.8 share. It had 3.8 the year before and 3.7 in spring. In 25-54, this year's summer spread was much narrower. WJR had a 3.5 share to WXYT's 2.4.

Gondek doesn't envy WJR's current situation. "They need to expand their demos without jeopardizing their heritage situation, he says, adding, "We're not look-ing to dethrone WJR. Our competition is more FM than AM. Besides, what's good for 'JR is good for us because it brings more peo-

ple to the AM band.'

Gondek says both stations have been busy with changes of late. "We did a complete lineup revamp, except for Mark Scott and Rush Limbaugh. to find hosts who relate to metro Detroit.

'JR has tried to 'hip up' its demos by getting rid of some longtime talent. They put [newspaper sports columnist/ESPN commentator] Mitch Albom in PM drive, where he does a kind of 'Zoo.' They also expanded Dr. Laura [Schlessinger] from one to three hours [1-4pm on tape] around July."

WJR has also, in recent months, terminated shows by Jimmy Barrett, Jimmy Launce, Joel Alex-ander, and Dayna Mills and brought aboard former DJ Ken Calvert. In a recent article titled "Who Shot 'JR?," Detroit News reporter Tim Kiska noted that the many changes have unsettled WJR's traditional audience. He quoted WWJ GM Rich Homberg as saying, "WJR is a great radio station ... [but] the changes they

should have made incrementally over the course of 20 years are being made massively in one fell swoop.'

The same article quotes WJR GM Mike Fezzey: "We want to contemporize the talent and content so that we are talking to an emerging generation of people and not excluding anyone. ... We didn't blow this place up and become a different format.

WXYT's Gondek is optimistic about his station's future on the changing landscape. "We're extremely encouraged by our cume growth, the highest it's ever been. We expect a little TSL dip while our changes take hold. We're carrying the Lions for the first time this year. Wish they were winning more.3

WXYT's new lineup starts off with longtime TV anchorman Bill Bonds (6-9am), Mark Scott (9am-noon), Limbaugh (noon-3pm), Barrett (3-6pm), then Ike "The Mega Man" Griffin with sports talk. The former Michigan State football player handles 6-9pm, followed by syndicated hosts Tom Leykis and Gil Gross, and a Limbaugh repeat.

Morning man Bonds started soon after McCarthy's death over a year ago. Gondek has high hopes for the former anchorman. "J.P. was a big event for the market in the morning. Bill Bonds was born and raised in Detroit. He's a great interviewer, and he has clout. He can get anybody, is very opinionated, guest-driven, reacts to the news, and has a terrific personali-

Steel City Showdown

One of the biggest "monsters" of all has got to be KDKA/Pittsburgh. The station is generally accepted to be America's first commercial station, signed on by Westinghouse in 1920. Interestingly, though it's never been sold, KDKA might soon lose the "Westinghouse" connection when the company splits its industrial and broadcast divisions (assuming the name goes along with the industrial unit).

Hearst's WTAE is the other

Steel City Talker, and PD Bruce Gilbert says, "We be the underdog, there's no question about that. They're legendary. They're not going away. We don't sit over here and act crazy and say we want to kick their butt. We have to differentiate ourselves. Flanking is the word we use."

Gilbert accepts it as "a given" that KDKA owns the franchise for "the basics, full service, information. They're great at that. We focus more on entertainment and sports." WTAE carries the Steelers, Penguins, University of Pittsburgh sports, and sports talk from 6-11pm. Former KDKA overnight man Doug Hoerth, who handles PM drive, was "our top-ranked host and unquestionably the star of the summer book," according to Gilbert. In that Arbitron, KDKA was No. 1 with 12.7. WTAE was ninth with 3.9. In 25-54, they're at 5.6 and 2.9, respectively.

Since March, WTAE has been running Dr. Laura Schlessinger on tape directly against KDKA's Rush Limbaugh nature because we're live. As of summer. Limbaugh delivered an 11.7 to Dr. Laura's 4.7. Gilbert says,

In the just-released trends, WSB shot back up to first place (9.9), thanks in no small part to the red-hot Braves. WGST moved up to 4.7.

WGST's Zintak says, "We don't think about topping WSB. But we're aggressive by nature because we're owned by Jacor. We like a good fight, but we don't get up in the morning thinking about overtaking WSB." Zintak says WGST doesn't counterprogram, per se. "We do compelling programming. 

CONTEMPORARY HIT RADIO

A Programming Legend Speaks

□ Highly respected radio veteran Mike Joseph discusses the state of CHR

Mike Joseph will celebrate his 50th year in radio next year, and he's still as resolute in his beliefs on programming CHR now as he was when he started. In the first of a two-part interview, I go one-on-one with one of America's all-time Pop radio greats and pick his brain on the format — then and now.

Joseph began his career at WTNS/Coshocton, OH, where he was PD, MD, ND, a traffic reporter, copywriter, and just about everything else. Then he built his Top 40 founda-

Mike Joseph tion as PD of

WJEF/Grand Rapids from 1952-55, just as rock & roll started happening; Joseph spotted the trend and got in on the ground floor. Next, he took the PD slot at WTAC/Flint, MI, one of America's first Top 40 stations.

Joseph would then work his way up to National PD for Founders Corporation. averaging 55%-75% audience shares in the first books at his turn-around stations. That success catapulted him into the mainstream. Joseph can also boast of becoming the first programming consultant in January 1958, working with outlets owned by ABC (he took WABC from 11th to first in early 1961), CBS. NBC, Greater Media, and Capital Cities — where he served a stint as VP/Radio from 1959-60.

He credits his work at ABC's WKBW/Buffalo for cementing his career. He's also made stops at WPRO/Providence, WKNR/Detroit, WMAQ/Chicago, KNBR/ San Francisco, WFIL/Philadelphia, and WCAU-FM/Philadelphia and even launched Salsa-intensive, Spanish-language WKAQ-FM (KQ105)/San Juan, PR.

Joseph, firmly established as one of Top 40's hottest, most successful, and respected programmers, introduced the hugely successful Hot Hits format at WFBL (Fire 14)/ Syracuse in June 1979. But it wasn't until September 1981 at WCAU-FM/ Philadelphia when Joseph took the station 3.4-6.8 in its first book by dumping Disco

that people started to notice how hot Hot Hits really was. He later launched KITS/ San Francisco and has since evolved his consulting focus toward the News/Talk and Spanish formats.

R&R: What is your standard formula for CHR?

Mike Joseph: Play the most popular music — regardless of genre. That's the way it is. I'd counterprogram and expand or tighten the playlist to compete, depending on the market. Even in 1958, WPRO and WABC played 30 records. Play the biggest-selling songs.

R&R: Did you have to specialize in one particular style of music?

MJ: No. It depended on the market. Each market had a different musical base.

R&R: But you'd play all genres of music?

MJ: Yes! That's my point.

R&R: So you're saying you'd play Snoop Doggy Dogg on the same station as Shania Twain, as long as it was a top seller?

MJ: Yes. The key is in knowing your audience, your market and competition, and dayparting correctly. They don't do that today. The music isn't the only part - there are 1001 other things that make up a [successful] format.

R&R: What makes up the rest? MJ: The remainder is personality, promotion, marketing, merchandising, jingles, techniques, formatics, basics, basics, and basics.

R&R: You don't believe in any type of research except retail sales. so how do you predict the future with current-based music?

Top 40 is they don't know how to research it. I only believe retail record store research — that's the box office. At every station I've pro-

R&R: Could you please walk the reader through your musical decision

research every record store, department store, and discount house that sells records and find out what the major volume stores are. I'd also find the ethnic base for each location. If I'm doing an Anglo-based station, I wouldn't use any stores that are more than 50% ethnic.

When I had great success in Philadelphia, there were two Sam Goody stores. One was white, one was black. Both of my stations made it instantly, and I didn't research the black store. I only played crossover black music that Anglos accepted. Daytime listeners were the squares; nighttime listeners were hip college and high school kids - the ones really into music and the arts.

You can't have the same music on 24 hours a day. You can only fastrotate the mass appeal hits. You can't fast-rotate heavy metal, punk rock, rap, or urban.

R&R: Do you research singles or just albums?

MJ: Singles are meaningless. They're not being purchased by suburban housewives, secretaries, or yuppies. [Years ago] it was primarily singles, but as years went by femphasis went to] album sales.

R&R: How many songs from the week's top-selling albums would comprise your entire music library?

MJ: It depends on the market. It could range from 30 to 100. It depends on how many hits I could get out of each CD. CDs outsell singles by as much as 100 to 1. You find out what the hit cuts are.

R&R: What do you say to owners and programmers who may think you're insane when you say

you can have just 30 records in your entire library?

MJ: I've got to refer to other media. There's only interest in the top 30 books or top 10 movies and TV shows. They make headlines now. In every other media, everybody can use numbers, [vet] I'm not allowed to say "this record is number one!" Why can't I do that?

Everybody's niching AOR and Urban; why can't we niche Top 40? Why can't I play 30 records as a niche? They're diluting their audience for niche formats. I'm being proven right because the ratings are getting lower and lower for each station. It's happening in TV, too. As they niche more and more, and now with cable networks, the ratings get lower. Pretty soon everyone will be at a 2.5. What will you sell?

R&R: What about ethnic balance? In L.A., for example, you have a large Hispanic population, a loyal African-American audience, and a growing Asian population.

MJ: The mistake made today is [programming's] concentration on the center city. What made Country was the demise of Top 40 because it overplayed Urban and rap. What helped Alternative was the lack of a modern Anglo-based Top 40. It's a matter of knowing your market and audience.

R&R: You said one should also put quotas on music according to the eth-

nic population. Can you explain that? MJ: It's the total minority population of the total metro audience. In L.A., since the Hisparic population is 36.7%, [after checking retail

R&R: As music goes through its cycles — disco, "Urban Cowboy," punk, alternative, etc. - do your quotas help you mirror the market and not overdose on any one cycle? MJ: Yes, that's

right. Remember, I only fast-rotate mainstream music that is mass appeal to every demographic. I put a demographic, gender, and race on every tune, so I know who's buying that music. That's where dayparting comes in handy. I got that from my old network days because I worked with so many affiliate stations. Just like TV today, you have to daypart. Radio quit doing that.

R&R: What do you say to people who think you're out of touch with radio today?

MJ: How can I be out of touch?! I've never played gold or looked back. I only do today formats. News/ Talk and hits [formats] are 100% contemporary. How can I be out of touch when I research the market and play what they're buying today? I'm going right to the box office. My sound is "Space Jam" with Michael Jordan this week, not "First Wives Club," which is already history. I'm playing the music of today and tomorrow! How can I be out of touch? Who else is doing that?







WRKS (98.7 Kiss) & WOHT (Hot 97)/New York Sr. VP/GM Judy Ellis is a veteran of the Big Apple radio wars.

After management stints with RKO Radio, Metromedia, Infinity, and Doubleday, she started with Emmis Broadcasting as GSM when the company bought Hot 97 in 1986. Ellis was later elevated to Station Manager and then advanced to VP/GM in 1989. On December 1, 1994 Emmis assumed control of Kiss from Summit, naming Ellis President/GM of the combo.

R&R: It's been almost two years since you unveiled the all new Kiss. Talk about the launch and the station's evolution.

Judy Ellis: When we rolled out the format with the "12 Days Of Kissmas" and our direction changed to Classic Soul and R&B, it was an instant magnet for all types of listeners because --- very simply --- we were playing really good music. Music that people had not heard in a long time.

We're still playing a mix of clas-sic soul and R&B —both goldoased and current, although the percentages have been adjusted. We recently modified our positioning statement to better reflect our mu-The today, which is "Classic Soul And Today's R&B."

Artist Interaction

R&R: What have you found to be the most effective method for getting the message across to your audience?

JE: The TV spots we've produced make it very easy for the viewers to know exactly what they'll hear when they turn on our station. That's the goal of any television marketing campaign for radio.

Steve Smith: We felt we could apply the same kind of direction in artist involvement that we had done at Hot 97. We nar-

rowed down a list of appropriate artists and hit the ground running with Barry White. The first Kiss spot featured White, Anita Baker, and Luther Vandross.

White is also the day-to-day imaging voice for Kiss. R&R: You've

been able to secure one of the top names in music to speak on

behalf of Kiss in your latest spot. SS: We brainstormed about who

we felt the top artist in America was who could best represent today's R&B. Overwhelmingly our top choice was Toni Braxton. So we met with L.A. Reid and Babyface: they loved the idea and helped us put it together.

R&R: Talk about Toni Braxton — the actress. Was she easy to work with?

JE: Unbelievably easy. Toni was very cooperative and she's very talented.

R&R: Explain the unique mix of personalities on Kiss.

SS: Early on we looked at the artists who are core to this format. Ashford & Simpson are probably the most successful songwriting team in R&B history. They've been married for 20 years, and they represent stability in marriage which is the right image for Kiss.

Roberta Flack does a Sunday brunch show that is now nationally syndicated. She really emphasizes the music and through her numerous relationships and experiences relates to all facets of the R&B world. She talks about the new artists, too: Mary J. Blige, Toni Braxton, and the Fugees.

R&R: What about specialty programming?

SS: There's "Kissing After Dark" from 7pm-midnight. It's basically love songs but not always slow. Lots of flavor. Shayla hosts, and she's dynamite at it. Then we air mini-concerts that feature three in a row by a Kiss artist; we generally try and get live versions to really enhance the feature: O'Jays, Marvin Gaye, etc.

R&R: How many currents is Kiss playing and how are they structured?

SS: It depends on the current climate, and right now it's the best it's been. We don't


SS: One of the staples at Kiss is the "Top 500 Classic Soul Countdown" on Memorial Day weekend. It's entirely driven by the audience. We get them to tell us their five favorite classic soul songs, and then we promote the special for weeks in advance.

R&R: Kiss boasts a long legay of community activity in New York. What projects have you initiated to help ensure that image?

JE: We have the Kiss Cares

Foundation. We presented a classic soul concert featuring Gladys Knight, Aretha Franklin, Isley Brothers, and Kool & The Gang. It was held at Madison Square Garden, and we supplied blocks of 100 tickets to numerous charities in the area. They were then able to auction, sell, give away, raffle, etc. to

suit their needs.



that helps the community. For instance, Harlem Hospital has a huge pediatric ward and it's never had bedspreads and pajamas in kid sizes. So we supplied the hospital with those items.

Separate Sales Divisions

R&R: Kiss and Hot 97 was the first duopoly in New York. Are they sold in combo or completely separate?

sales responsibilities, Director/Sales Robin Sloan also shoulders the job of being the traffic cop. She communicates what's going on from one station to the other, overseeing the sales efforts for both and one sales development person for the two.



Summertime ... And The Ratings Were Ugly

Country Ratings Index off another 3%

That "clunk" you heard last summer was the format taking its third-largest, book-to-book nosedive of the last nine years.

Once again Country was beaten up in the summer ratings, with the Country Ratings Index falling by 31.8 points — just over 3% from the Spring '96 results. That puts the Summer '96 shares down 5% from a year ago, off 13% from two years ago, and down 17% from three years ago.

Indeed, the top two steepest bookto-book declines have come in summer books — and it's probably not a coincidence they've come in the two previous summer sweeps: Spring '94-Summer '94 the CRI dropped 32.4 points while the Spring '95-Summer '95 CRI fell 46.9 points.

Few Silver Linings

To be honest, even being the format cheerleader 1 am, it's tough to find anything to jump up and down about in the summer book.

Perhaps the best news comes in 25-54 rankings, where the number of stations that rank first-fifth in their markets remained stable from the last couple of books. Unfortunately, that number is down by 10% from a year ago.

Some of the attrition among the ranks is due to the number of decently ranked stations that have exited Country in the last year. For instance, of the five FM outlets that dropped the format this past book,

four ranked in the Top 10 25-54.

It's important to remember that many, if not most of the stations dropping the format aren't doing so because they were doing badly. Instead, they were casualties of consolidation. For instance, four of the five FM outlets that dropped Country during the summer sweep had been purchased in one form or another by a company that already owned a Country outlet in the market. All of that said, however, I would like to reiterate something 1 wrote in the ratings analysis for Spring '96 (**R&R** 9/6): The fact is, every market has experienced an overall compression of shares the last few years. That compression may prevent any meaningful, year-to-year share comparisons.

Reluctant as I am to declare the last 10 years of CRI information and all other share-related data — "worthless," it does merit some consideration when comparing a format's performance over the years. The only meaningful manner of judging how a format is doing may well be a comparison of how formats perform relative to one another through the years.

More Questions Than Answers

The continuing ratings slide raises many questions. Among them: Where have the folks who used to listen to Country gone? How disappointed/disgruntled are they? and How easy or hard will it be to get them back? What's happening with TSL among those who still use the format regularly? What's it going to take to get our P1s to stay with us longer?

Has Country radio — now in the seventh year of its last reincarnation — becoming predictable? Or worse, boring? Is it time for the format to reinvent itself, is it time to shake things up? Are we just a couple of new superstar acts away from getting back what we've lost, or is the problem deeper and more fundamental than that? Or, is this just a cycle every format goes through and we just have to make the best of it until it's "our turn" again? These issues and more will be tackled in future columns.

'Tis The Season For Holiday Music

Christmas servicing brings new and old from major country labels, acts

In case you haven't noticed, you'll find the month of December when you turn your calendar page next week. Among other things, it means the time has arrived for lavish parties and the clinking of champagne glasses.

No, we're not talking about the Country Radio Seminar, which is still months away. But the holiday season is here, and Country labels are making it easy to add a little freshness to your station's musical offering.

Arista's 'Star'

In terms of variety, Arista/Nashville has delivered the season's treasure trove with "Star Of Wonder," a compilation featuring most of the label's roster. Additionally, the collection includes sister label Career with cuts by Lee Roy Parnell, Tammy Graham, and Brett James, who each recorded remakes of holiday classics.

Arista has serviced the single "Rudolph The Red-Nosed Reindeer," Alan Jackson's contribution to "Star Of Wonder." The track does not appear on Jackson's 1993 release "Honky Tonk Christmas." New original holiday songs are provided by Brooks & Dunn ("Cabin In The Valley") and Diamond Rio ("Christmas Spirit") along with "Swingin' Home For Christmas" - a track from last year's "Have Yourself A Tractors Christmas." Familiar holiday songs are updated by Steve Wariner, Radney Foster, BlackHawk, BR5-49, and Michelle Wright.

New Albums

In a testament to Alabama's career longevity, the group has become one of the few acts in any genre to release more than one holiday album. Expanding the band's holiday repertoire with "Alabama Christmas II," RCA has serviced "The Blessings" as a single.

As previously reported in R&R. several new releases have similar, if not identical titles. Collin Raye's Epic album and Kenny Rogers's Magnatone project both bear the title, "The Gift." A more eclectic Columbia release by the Nashville Mandolin Ensemble is titled "Gifts."

Raye and Rogers enlisted the assistance of some impressive friends for

their Christmas albums. Raye sang lead vocals on "Sloop John B." for the Beach Boys's all-star tribute album "Stars & Stripes," released this year. The group returns the favor by providing background vocals on Raye's version of "Winter Wonderland." Johnny Cash makes a guest appearance on Raye's recording of a new song "It Could Happen Again." On his album, Rogers duets with Wynonna on "Mary, Did You Know."

Two other new holiday albums include Shenandoah's "Christmas" (Capitol) and the Bellamy Brothers's "Tropical Christmas" (Bellamy Brothers/Intersound). Intersound has also reissued Crystal Gayle's "A Crystal Christmas" for the first time on CD.

Compilations, Singles

Mercury/Nashville and the RCA Label Group/Nashville have serviced compilations to make it easy to keep tabs on their holiday music. "Mercury Country Christmas 1996" marks the first time Shania Twain, Hank Williams, and Boris Karloff have been included on a single disc.

The Mercury collection features Williams's "I Saw The Light" and Karloff on two tracks from the Dr. Seuss holiday TV favorite "How The Grinch Stole Christmas." The disc features Twain's new recording of "God Bless The Child," along with tracks from previous Christmas releases by Sammy Kershaw, Toby Keith, Kathy Mattea, and the Statler Brothers.

Highlighting RLG's new acts, "A BNA Holiday Compilation" features Mindy McCready's "Silent Night" and Ray Vega's "Take A Walk Through Bethlehem," as well as more familiar recordings by Lorrie Morgan, John Anderson, K.T. Oslin, and Lonestar. "RCA Christmas Compilation" includes Elvis Presley's classic "Blue Christmas" and tracks by Alabama. Clint Black, and Aaron Tippin. A highlight is Martina McBride's version of "O Holy Night."

Decca has prepared two CD singles: Mark Chesnutt's "What Child Is This" and Gary Allan's "Please Come Home For Christmas.

TNN Revamps News Coverage

The Nashville Network (TNN) is dropping "TNN Country News' for "Today's Country," a new program hosted by Lorianne Crook and Charlie Chase. Both shows are produced for TNN by Jim **Owens & Associates.**

"TNN Country News," a 30minute weeknight show, apparently leaves the air sometime in December. "Today's Country," premiering January 6, is an hour-long program to be telecast on Mondays and Thursdays. The cable network will also be providing a similar weekend program, "This Week In Country Music.

Spokespersons for TNN and Jim Owens & Associates would not comment regarding the departure of "TNN Country News." However, the show is not listed on the network's program schedule for the first quarter of 1997.

Crook & Chase left TNN's "Music City Tonight" last year, and now host a syndicated weekday talk show. While they will preside over the weeknight editions of "Today's Country," hosts of the weekend show will be announced at a later date

The new shows will focus on breaking news, interviews, remotes, and in-depth feature stories.

Background

Born in Oklahoma City, 28-yearold Jeff Wood was still in high school when an Oklahoma State University student impressed him with a brief acoustic performance at a schoolsponsored recruitment banquet. The singer: Garth Brooks.

Meeting following the banquet, Brooks phoned Wood's mother the next day to tell her where she could buy a 12-string guitar like he used. The instrument became Wood's next Christmas present.

Wood later became a regular at Brooks's gigs at the Holiday Inn in Stillwater, OK. Wood tells R&R, "He was unbelievable. It wasn't necessarily his singing or guitar playing, but you could just sense that he was special."

The Right Time

Wood first visited Nashville in 1989, around the time Brooks's debut single "Much Too Young (To Feel This Damn Old)" was released. Wood said. "He took me around town and would introduce me as a songwriter. I didn't say anything at the time, but I thought, 'I want to move here to sing and perform.

However, Brooks told him moving to Nashville would be a major struggle. Wood explains, "I figured I needed to move back to Oklahoma, grow up, and figure everything out.'

He began attending law school, which he says was "probably chasing everybody's dream but my own." While not in class. Wood was performing at local clubs, including a regular gig at Brooks's old stomping ground, Wild Willie's Old Time Saloon.

'Cowboy Love'

After Wood moved to Nashville in 1993, Capitol-Liberty/Nashville President Jimmy Bowen signed him to Liberty. When Liberty folded, Wood was dropped from the roster before he had recorded his first single. But he had also become a staff writer at EMI Music Publishing.

"The people at EMI told me not to pitch any of my material, but the secretary didn't know that. John Michael Montgomery's road manager came into the office and heard one of my songs over the sound system."

At the road manager's request, she made a copy of the tape. An

hour later, Wood got the call that Montgomery was going to record the song, "Cowboy Love." Wood laughs, "I said, 'Go right ahead!"" It was Wood's first cut as a songwriter.

The Music

Wood's deal with Imprint resulted after label executives saw him perform an acoustic showcase at the Sutler, a Nashville club. "I didn't know they were there. I got a call the next day from [VP/A&R] Tracy Gershon."

"Between The Farth And The Stars," Wood's debut album, was produced by Mark Wright, known for his work with BlackHawk and Burnin' Daylight. Although the album showcases Wood's songwriting, the first single --- "You Only Get One" was written by Vince Gill and Don Schlitz. Wood jokes, "They needed a break. I was real fortunate to be able to cut that song. Don is a friend of mine, and he had mentioned it to me. Liked it the first time I heard it It's one of those songs that the more you hear it, the more it grows on you. It's a positive message."

Wood was a little nervous when Gill came to the studio to play guitar and mandolin on the track. They had met once, when Wood managed to slip backstage at the rehearsals for the 1994 CMA Awards show.

Wood wanted Gill to autograph an old guitar he kept for that purpose. "I had all these signatures of songwriters, but I really didn't have any stars' names on the guitar." After getting several signatures, he waited until Gill left his dressing room. Wood recalls, "I jumped up and was holding this guitar and a Sharpie like a knife. I think I scared him. He must have thought I was some kind of a nut.

When Bright told him Gill had agreed to play on the album, Wood adds, "I just prayed that he didn't recognize me. And he didn't."

lywood friends had kind words for the singer's acting ability after they worked together on the upcoming "All My Friends Are Cowboys. Well, he thinks they were kind words, anyway. Diffie says, "Wilford Brimley says I'm a natural, but he didn't say a natural what!"



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

Waking Up To Great Numbers

□ KESZ/Phoenix's morning show shares outperform the station's other dayparts

While naturally wanting to win morning drive ratings battles, most AC programmers would admit being quite happy if wakeup numbers were competitive. They know that midday and, to a lesser extent, afternoon drive are their big bread-and-butter payoffs.

But several ACs such as KESZ/ Phoenix have morning shows that actually outperform the rest of the station. Among women 25-54 and 35-64 in this summer's Arbitron, for example, KESZ's six-year pairing of Beth McDonald & Bill Austin is the market's top-rated morning show. The station places fifth total week in both demos --- unable to approach Beth & Bill's numbers in any other daypart.

"The unique angle is that she's the boss and leads the show," explains PD Mike Del Rosso. "We're a female-skewing station, and a woman likes to be talked to by another woman. [The 35-year-old] Beth is a mother of three and knows what other moms go through each day. She's had to leave the air because her baby's sick, and we mention why she left early. When you think about it, that's not bad because our audience relates to things like that."

Ideal Match

Beth is a radio veteran; the divorced, 40-ish Bill is a former weathercaster at Phoenix's NBC-TV affiliate. "When we first put them together, it seemed like a match made in heaven," remarks Del Rosso. "Bill occasionally throws in a line about his ex-wife, which is fine. He's willing to take a back seat and interject something when he feels it's appropriate. They both have healthy egos. But fortunately for us, they're very easy to deal with."

While bits, voices, and a cast of characters don't play much of a role in KESZ's 5:30-10am show, "It's very conversational, real, and topical," according to Del Rosso. "Beth & Bill go with what people are talking about. He does a 'What's This World Coming To?' feature, and she reacts to it; they also announce the day's birthdays and anniversaries.

It's a safe bet that, when a KESZ television spot airs, the morning team will be prominently featured in it. "Even if the spot promotes middays, evenings, or whatever we're doing, they'll appear representing the station."

Beth's radio savvy -- combined with Bill's initial lack of it - seems to work well in their favor. "He reacts differently from the typical radio sidekick," Del Rosso remarks. "It took a little time for things to mesh, but Beth & Bill have the right chemistry.

Few Rules

The amount of morning drive music is dependent on what else is happening on a given day. "George Carlin was in the studio the other day. and we didn't play any music for 30 minutes," recalls Del Rosso. "We generally play just a few songs an hour. It's better for us to continue with our entertainment than play music."

Del Rosso tries to allow Beth & Bill to do as "non-traditional" a morning show as possible. "It doesn't matter if they're in and out of a bit in a certain amount of time, or if they front- and back-sell particular songs. It's pretty unstructured, and there aren't many rules they need to follow."

Frustrated by the fact that Beth & Bill's ratings prowess doesn't carry over into other dayparts, Del Rosso notes, "Hour-by-hour breakouts are very mysterious because there's a

big drop in our 9-10am numbers. We don't know why people aren't listening to us when they get to work. We're constantly juggling and struggling with promoting Beth & Bill as well as the rest of the radio station. They've almost overpowered the station."

Gender Equality

Female-female combos have been tried elsewhere, but Del Rosso doesn't endorse that concept. "Music is a relief from talk, commercials are a relief from music, and a male's voice gives listeners relief from a female's voice. It's a bit of overkill to have two female voices on the air, and — interestingly enough - it turns women off.'

It's Del Rosso's intent that Beth not do the show solo. "She'd be successful, but we'd want her to have someone to interact with. She's quick-witted, and the show sizzles

when Bill matches wit with her."

KESZ listeners. Del Rosso notes. are real people who converse in everyday language. "They don't talk to us in 'radio speak.' We want to relate to them in everything we do, including marketing and promotion.

People tell us that we play great music, and that's what we say on the air. In real life, people don't say that a station plays 'the best variety of the '70s, '80s, '90s, and beyond.' We avoid radio speak at all costs — especially in the morning show."

WDOK: Not Trapped In 'More Music Mornings'

Earlier this month (11/13), "Trapper Jack" Elliott celebrated his first anniversary as WDOK/Cleveland's morning show host. Hiring the high-profile morning personality --- who formerly handled similar duties for crosstown AC competitor WLTF was quite a departure for the Soft AC. But as WDOK

available. It was clear to me that this was the opportunity we were looking for. When Trapper was at 'LTF, his strength was always among women. It's still a mystery to me why they let their Albert Belle [the former Cleveland Indians outfielder who signed with the White Sox] get away but their loss was our gain."

Admitting that the move was especially risky for a Soft AC, Wilson recalls it wasn't met with unanimous approval. "That's not what people expected from us. They reminded us how refreshing it was that we played so much music in the morning. While giving up that franchise was very frightening, that franchise wasn't giving us any numbers."

'Everyday People'

Among women 25-54 in the summer Arbitron (Monday-Friday, 6-10am), WDOK is second to Oldies WMJI. But unlike KESZ/Phoenix (see story above), WDOK is able to carry over morning drive numbers and is just 0.1 behind UC WZAK for the total week. Among women 35-64, WMJI and WDOK are 1-2 in mornings; WDOK captures the total week title. Additionally, WDOK is No. 1 in middays among women 25-54 and 35-64.


Crosstown WQAL is also a significant ratings force. The Mary Ellen Kachinske-programmed Hot AC is No. 2 (mornings and total

week) among women 18-34. Anchoring morning drive is 30-year broadcasting vet Larry Morrow. "He's well known, well loved, and - unfortunately --- very good competition," Wilson acknowledges. 'Larry was WQAL's morning announcer when the station was B/EZ and made the transition to Hot AC.

'He's a great personality and sounds wonderful on the air, but he isn't living the lifestyle of his typical listener. He's in his 50s, and his kids are grown. Trapper has a 4- and 7-year-old and makes his lifestyle a major part of the show. There are other great Cleveland morning shows, but they have scheduled and produced bits. Spontaneity is the best part of our show because Trapper's able to bring in -- and get the most from - everyday people."

Cleveland's recent nasty snowstorm actually may have helped WDOK because it enabled Trapper Jack to do what Wilson claims he does best. "It's a female-targeted show, and Trapper's unbelievable with phones. We had to buy a bigger phone system because he's able to get people to participate and discuss what's on their minds. Jack doesn't do bits, comedy routines, or song parodies, but the show is very entertaining."

The two other members of the 5:30-10am "Trapper Jack & The Morning Show" trio are News Director Jim McIntire and sidekick Robin Benzle. "The three have formed a wonderful team and socialize a lot on weekends," says Wilson. "They're good friends, and it comes across that way on the air.'

Good Timing

Prior to Trapper Jack's arrival, Wilson briefly tested the morning personality waters by inserting onetime WMMS talent Matt The Cat into the morning slot; Matt The Cat has since segued to afternoons. "We'd been the 'more music morning' station for about seven years," notes Wilson, who celebrates her ninth year at WDOK this Sunday (12/1). "Many Soft AC programmers think listeners come to our stations only for music and are reluctant to abandon that position. The thinking is that, since music is everything, we should just shut up and play it.

"By pure luck, Trapper became



NAC Label Summit: Beyond Ranting And Venting

CAROL ARCHER

Execs discuss the radio/label/artist relationship and the state of music on the radio

Earlier this month ($\mathbf{R} \& \mathbf{R}$ 11/1), this column was devoted to some music industry executives' concerns aired at $\mathbf{R} \& \mathbf{R}$'s recent NAC Label Summit. That discussion now continues.

"

Broadcast Architecture VP/ Programming Allen Kepler attended the first part of the meeting and fielded questions from participants. Kepler noted that with deregulation, radio is currently in a highly volatile state and that 17 BA NAC client stations have been sold in the past year. Then the conversation turned to the difficulty labels experience in maintaining cohesive national momentum on a record when it may take several months to break it. "I do care about sales, because if there are no sales, labels will stop recording music that moves the format forward," Kepler added. "That's why we've increased current rotations and why we want to see artists sponsored [in concert] by our stations.'

Homogenization Healthy?

After Kepler's departure, attendees observed that while BA's particular vision of the format has made a much wider audience available for NAC music, its safe, nonedgy approach presents labels with a real challenge in getting fresh, musically sophisticated material exposed. One exec questioned BA's seeming indifference to regional musical appetites, citing [format defector] **KLJZ/New Orleans**'s lack of NAC-flavored Cajun soul as an example. "Why is it that a station in Wichita sounds just I do care about sales, because if there are no sales, labels will stop recording and there will be no new music to push the format forward. —Allen Kepler

like one in Boston?" he asked. I posed the theoretical question whether, in a corporate radio climate that demands higher profits from stations than ever before, homogenization may be one vehicle for achieving that kind of success.

Π

At that point, **R&R** Publisher/ CEO Erica Farber commented, "Deregulation is the greatest thing that's happened in radio, because it's finally a legitimate business. When more than 50% of all stations are losing money — and less than 250 radio stations made more than a quarter-million dollars in profit as little as two years ago — this is a [difficult] business to be in. We now have companies that are real broadcasters that can come into a

major market with five or six radio stations and know that not every one is going to be number one. They realize they can flank that top CHR, or whatever's going to make that big money, and be able to stay in NAC and give it the money to make it work."

One label president expressed frustration with the lack of upward mobility for talented MDs within the format. "Programmers are coming in from outside the format, and the pros — the vets who have contributed to the growth of the format — are being passed over and not given a shot,"

Another promotion executive suggested that labels need more data on album performance. (In response, the NAC Albums Chart page is being redesigned to include Most Added and Most Increased information.) Farber added that **R&R's** web site receives 185,000 hits each week, and she encouraged label representatives to link their artist web sites to **R&R's** to increase awareness,

'Audio Valium'

Another leading executive noted "a very serious problem" currently afoot in NAC: the blandness of the music being aired (as opposed to the vitality of the music being recorded). He cited Joe Sample's "Hippies On The Corner" and Herbie Hancock's "Thieves In The Temple" as notable exceptions. Another likened much of the material embraced by today's programmers as "audio Valium." He elaborated: "I've gotten more tracks added by BA this year than ever because I've sold out my principles. But those tracks don't even sell albums. More and more programmers are no longer looking for musically aggressive tracks. So I think it's my job to go back to being an album promotion person [with the hope of] offering a different view than the formula tracks."

"And now, artists are going into the studio with BA in mind, and they create a bland track specifically for them," another executive interjected. "Another downside is that once that safe track is added, chances are people won't ever get to hear the cool tracks," someone else pointed out.

An additional area of concern, the group continued, is the challenge of locking in label marketing departments — beyond price and positioning — to try and maintain their long-term commitment to a project where one track at a time

agreed: "Tracks have really created more identity to a radio audience for a particular artist than album cuts."

Instinct's John Knox White added, "Chart position is very, very important for us. We're behind every record we put out — sometimes five a month — and I can't keep the sales staff's interest for months at a time. Retail chains are big business and they are pulling away from supporting acts for a long time. And over many months of steady sales, they still won't do you any favors.

"The thing I find most discouraging," said **Shanachie**'s **Wayne Martin**, "is the amount of time it takes to get from one track to another. If you're trying to get that secakes six months.

ond track and it takes six months, you can kiss your record goodbye. There's hell to pay because there's no more budget if you can't get the second track [in a timely fashion]." But, on balance, he added, serial airplay on more than one track has proven highly beneficial to his company's sales.

NAC NOTES By Carol Archer

C huck Loeb's "The Music Inside" (Shanachie) holds the top position handily for the third consecutive week, but Jeff Lorber's "Katherine" (Verve) is poised to displace Loeb, perhaps next week.

The airplay heat turned way up on **Soundscape**'s "Morning Song" (**Instinct**) this week. The track is top Most Increased at +182 and surged into the top ten at 8*.

Keiko Matsui's latest offering — and many think her best to date — "Bridge Over The Stars" (Countdown/Unity) glides 14-10*, demonstrating strong momentum.

It's nearly unheard of for an artist with a top Dance

record to break on NAC radio, too. But Vanessa Daou's "Two To Tango" (MCA) is performing very well in this format. Daou moved 27-22* Breaker on Tracks and debuted at 27* on Albums. KMJZ/Minneapolis moved this track 10-18 plays and KBLX/ San Francisco 4-12 plays.

KBLX's distinguished MD Ron Cadet says Eric Benet's fine new release "True To Myself" (Warner Bros.) reminds him of Stevie Wonder's "deep" projects from the early '70s. He's playing the tracks "What If We Was Cool" and "Femininity," but says he thinks "Chains" would work for many other NAC stations. I've had my attention directed to Khani Cole twice in recent months: First, by KYOT/Phoenix PD Nick Francis, who's been playing the track "Everyday" from her forthcoming Fahrenheit CD, "Piece Of My Soul," for months. More recently, BA's Frank Cody described Cole as a uniquely refreshing talent and an "uncommercial" one, in the sense that her music isn't bland or predictable.

Granted, I am biased with regard to **Curtis Mayfield**. I've always thought he is a genius. His new CD, "New World Order" (Warner Bros.), particularly the title track, is brilliant! Is it a format fit? You tell me.

Bubba The Love Sponge Joins The Rock Ranks

How does a personality who has spent his career in CHR/ Top 40 make the transition to the world of Rock? Most Rock people in the industry tag CHR personalities as "pukers." Even if the talent in question *does* puke, odds are slim he'll be given the chance to convert to a delivery compatible with the format.

So what's different about Bubba The Love Sponge? The former WFLZ/Tampa night personality left the CHR/Top 40 outlet on November 6 to pursue a syndicated career, and his first four affiliates are all Jacor Rockers. Why does Bubba want to transition to this format? "For the last five or six years, people have been telling me my show would work better on Rock stations. I've never had the opportunity to work in Rock, but I've always known that what I do plays better with men than with kids and women. Nothing about my show has changed since syndication.

Every show opens with an AC/DC record — Bubba's all time favorite band. Aside from that he doesn't plug music in the show, but affiliates can add music if they prefer. Jacor Dir./ Cincinnati Programming Operations Marc Chase founded the Bubba Radio Network and WTBT-FM & WXTB-FM/Tampa OM Brad Hardin (WEBN/Cincinnati PD until two weeks ago) markets it. Bubba says, "We've taken 'EBN's night numbers to their highest since 1985 and for the first time we're beating [News/Talk competitor] WLW-AM 25-54, which is unheard of."

Bubba's studio guests include politicians such as **Jeb Bush**. "I'm very much a Republican, believe it or not. If the politicians are young and have the balls to go on a controversial show, then I'll put them on if I support and like them. There's a lot of polarity with my show. Some candidates might take a lot of shit from conservatives for being on my show, but they realize that I'm usually No. 1 25-54 and I can help sway some people. You've got to respect the candidates who have the balls to go on my show."

Earlier this year, Bubba and his producers — **Cowhead** and **Guido** — were responsible for saving the life of one of their listeners. A wom-

an preparing to take her own life called wanting to hear **Stacy Q's** "Two Of Hearts." "At first I thought it was just a prank," reveals Bubba. "But after she explained how she had rigged a hose from the exhaust pipe to the cab of her truck, she revved the engine, and in the two or three minutes that she was on the phone her speech became groggy.

"At that point she hung up, and we knew it was only a matter of minutes before she'd die. So we played the call on the air and asked if anyone knew

the woman. By the grace of God, someone did know her and called us. When we tried calling her back there was no answer, which really freaked us out.

"We called 911 and gave them the info, then went back on the air and played the song (which I can't believe that we even had) and hoped she was still conscious and begged her to hang in there. The emergency crew arrived at her house and broke into both her garage and truck because she had locked everything, and were able to revive her. They said that if they had gotten there one minute later she would have been dead.

"I've talked to her a couple of times since then. We sent her flowers, and she was grateful that we saved her life." The deed garnered national press attention including "Inside Edition," "American Journal," and loads of local press.

Citing the Bubba Radio Network (BRN) as his reason for leaving WFLZ, he says, "Not many Rock stations in America have an outlet for putting a personality on who can achieve No. I ratings almost instantaneously. I'd like to get BRN as big as it can be. Obviously the stations that want the show have to be openminded because we're pretty crazy." With Monday (12/2) as his first

Bubba is laying the groundwork for his dream of syndicating both a morning and night show.

The shows for BRN affiliates are taped at 10am daily. Bubba cuts 18 breaks that are then fed to the affiliates via satellite. "If I could wave a magic wand, here's what I'd do: I'd offer my morning show that I'd do live with real-time syndication, and I'd offer the produced BRN night show. Stations could choose what's best for them."

Of the 18 breaks Bubba cuts each day for the three-hour night program, three breaks are localized for each affilate. Bubba credits Guido and Cowhead as the unsung heroes of BRN. "They gather information from all the affiliates like newspapers and local news video clips, and that's how we know what to talk about in the local breaks."

Along with Chase and Hardin, Bubba cites Jacor President Randy Michaels and VP/Programming Tom Owens, WFLZ PD B.J. Harris, and Tampa/Sarasota Market Manager Dave Reinhart as those responsible for his growth into syndication. "Without any of them, I'd be hosed and there wouldn't be a Bubba Radio Network. They put up with my shit when there is shit and praise me when it's deserved. Only a company like Jacor with a man like Randy running it would be able to do what we're doing now with BRN.'

Entrepreneurial Sponge


Bubba has become an adept businessman by making the most out of his notoriety in Tampa. His ventures to date:

- Owns Bubba's Beach Club, where an altercation between Jennifer Capriati, her boyfriend, and a waitress occurred last June that attracted national headlines.
- Air Bubba Beeping Network (beeper service)
- Love Sponge Limos
- Air Bubba Wireless Network (cell- phone service)

Clearly, Bubba's free time amounts to nil. "I spend most of my time juggling the four different ventures. But 1'm heavily into watching pro football. So other than that, I don't have much of a life."

With the network and the businesses, it seems Bubba could be well on his way to carving out a nice retirement plan. And while he says he would like to retire before turning 40, he does admit he'd like to be on the air as long as possible.

"I don't know what I'll do when I retire. Whenever I do have a little free time, I go crazy. The small businesses are fun, so maybe I'll keep at that. I also think I'd enjoy consulting personalities and marketing radio stations."

Is Alternative Dead?

□ Top programmers discuss their take on the challenges the format faces

In last week's column, label executives spoke about an air of cynicism filtering into the general perceptions of Alternative. This week, radio industry execs share their views on the state of the format.

Many industry observers believe that Alternative's prognosis lies in how committed ownership is toward incorporating the format in its marketclustering strategies. The logic goes that if owners elect to use the format to secure 18-34 targets, its overall strength will be underscored.

Entercom COO/CFO David Field is very deliberate in his assessment of the situation. "Alternative music is in great shape. The problem you refer to lies in the oversaturation of Alternative approaches in various markets. Frankly, I would like to see some of the later converts revert to other formatic approaches. We may see some stations abandon the format, but I


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think that is required at this point because there is a finite audience for this music.


Inevitable Fragmentation

Consultant Jeff Pollack counts such Alternative stalwarts as WNNX/ Atlanta, KTBZ/Houston, and WHFS/Washington as clients. He's also heard the clamor surrounding the format's health. "There certainly has been a lot of discussion regarding the



question the music's viability, though. In fact, the popularity of the music created the scenario. The bigger the format got, the inevitable occurred --- massive fragmentation. Other formats emerged as niche competitors, which is going to force Alternative stations to have a point of view, be it pop or rock. No longer can one station represent the entire musical spectrum.'

Pollack asserts that much of the furor surrounding Alternative's "demise" is manufactured within the industry. "The panic that is out there is the usual industry hyperventilation. Has the format peaked? Yes. at a strong place. Labels will now have to develop a more diverse genre approach. As Alternative stations determine their specific coalition in reaction to market conditions, they will represent demos and musical styles more specifically - rock-leaning, younger-male; pop-leaning, upperdemo female: etc. Alternative stations can't afford to assume they own the position, they have to reinforce their ownership.



Pollack feels, as many others do. that Alternative must not stand still in rising to new challenges. "PDs such as [WNNX's] Brian Philips are looking for exciting new styles [from acts] like Orbital to enhance their Alternative image. This doesn't mean you play to exclusive fringe concerns and start being all Korn/Tool/Marilyn Manson. Rather, you include the most active genre styles as part of your approach. Don't get caught up in providing only polarizing music as a representation of who you are. The basis of this format is still incredibly strong. Anyone who suggests Alternative is dead is an idiot."

Realistic Expectations

One of Pollack's programming clients, WDRE/Philadelphia PD Jim McGuinn, has been an outspoken advocate of Alternative's need to address the very issues it now faces. "The format could be fine, as long as no one maintains expectation of six shares. This is a very active psychographic we deal with. Not every one in the masses will adopt

this format. Alternative is being forced to face challenges to its original, broader targeting. Originally, it sought musical inclusion for male/female. rock/pop inter-With inests. creased competi-



Jim McGuinn tion, it's harder to own listeners. It's easier for Active

Rock to do an exclusively male-based format that falls back on its library. Active Rock realized it could co-opt Soundgarden and segue them nicely into Led Zeppelin."

McGuinn believes the active psychograpic it possesses will allow it to find new, fertile opportunities. "The challenge increasingly exists for Alternative to address talent development, particularly in mornings, as well as marketing and production. If you want to compete, compete at all levels. As far as music goes, I trust the format will find the right balance between hits and developing acts.

'If other formats feel the essence of the music isn't worthy anymore, fine. Once pop and rock competitors abdicate their involvement with alternative acts, watch shares for Alternative grow.

Industry Hysteria

Many people cite the industry's tendency to study certain flagship stations' performance as a gauge to any format's success. As the TSL of some of those stations shrank, alarms went off. WKQX/Chicago PD Bill Gamble must feel like a fireman these days.

Gamble recently decided to address the TSL issue head on, creat-

ing a "superclock" that, in some cases, would provide 70 or more plays a week in power rotation. He calmly stated, "Bigger pie, smaller slices. The hysteria that surrounds Alternative's 'demise' stems from the format getting just big enough to create increased competition. With more options on the dial, we decided to carefully study how people use ra-- which can differ from how dio they feel about artists.

'My findings may show a P1 loyalist possibly listening to a station 14 hours a week. The supercore only gives you 40 minutes at any given time. We believe average listeners come to radio to hear their favorite songs. They'll hear them with this clock.

Gamble is quick to point out that this decision was arrived at with greater concerns than just "math. Taking risks and being aggressive about music is the hallmark of Alternative. If we don't follow emerging trends and potential breakouts closely, we won't differ from pop competitors. This clock doesn't eliminate the potential for new, emerging acts - it accentuates the potential for real hits to develop.

"Every PD in this format sits and stares at a bunch of records in their B category that never connect. When have there ever been more than three or four real hits? There never are 10 or 11. I put Bush's 'Swallowed' in our new power and requests doubled. We hope this will help us recognize quicker which mistakes we are making. The good news is we still will be willing to try to break new acts."

Gamble feels, ironically, that reaction to his superclock is indicative of the industry's "watchdog" mentality that fuels speculation about Alternative. "Everything you do in high-profile situations is held up to immediate scrutiny in this day and age. One of the downsides to BDS is it makes PDs tentative to experiment. The minute you put a song on to see how it feels, five promotion VPs, two indies, and a manager are on the phone pleading for an add.

"Every PD wants the opportunity to hear records in the context of real life on his station, not a music meeting. I'm playing Chemical Brothers to see how it fits. Sometimes, there are records you don't hear at first that you want to check out. Not every record is a '#1 Crush' by Garbage that you know will work. Some are the Cardigans, where you need to ease them in. Hey, I'd like to dictate to the audience sometimes, but you need to be realistic. Our wants in this business tend to overshadow reality.'

KXTE/Las Vegas PD Mike Stern believes that "reality" is what you make it. "Every great format is smoke and mirrors. You enhance an intended image. Accentuate the fringe music you play, but don't overplay it. Alternative is far from dead, but it has lost footing lately. Much of that is a lack of focus. Al Ries wrote recently that you really have to define your target in competitive scenarios. We saw an organic climb that went from a two share playing Depeche Mode and New Order to a seven share playing Nirvana. The problem was Active Rock fought back for the Rock faction rights. Stations now have to decide what their specific target is. You heighten your showcasing of new music and really sell it. If I hear one more Alternative drop a new song in a 40-minute sweep without setting it up, I'll scream.

went into a market and took on a heritage Rock monster WCMF. He believes, even in that competitive scenario, a demand exists for a forward-thinking Alternative. "This is not Classic Rock that's made

all its good music. There is still great, vital artistry to surface. We have to forge a better loyalty to our superstars. We can create legacies for tomorrow by building supercore artists. Look at one of Rock's great hopes - Van Halen. When you see a situation that fractured and screwed up, how much future do they have?"

Anderson agrees with Stern that Alternative must dedicate itself to selling its artists. "We can't just play a new record. We have to develop a relationship for that act with our listeners. We want our audience to feel they know the act and what it stands for. If they feel that awareness, they will commit more to the act. We bring bands in for shows, do on-air features, and anything to help create that allegiance to artists. We can't just go hit to hit. We have to build a core to stand on.'

Alternative is at a crossroads in the radio race. The stakes have risen. That means there are competitors with their own high stakes, ready to be driven into this format's heart. The only way to silence the nay-sayers is by winning in a thoughtful, dedicated fashion. We've already seen how fast Alternative can travel. How far the format goes in breaking artists while under intense ratings pressure will depend on the commitment, nerve, and ethics of its programmers.

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

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


