McCann-Erickson Ad Guru Sees Decade Of Expansion

■ Local radio expected to grow at rapid pace

McCann-Erickson Director/Forecasting Bob Coen predicted at least a decade of strong growth for U.S. advertising spending as he told PaineWebber's 22nd Annual Media Conference that total ad spending should rise 6.8% in 1995 to \$159 billion. Local radio is projected to do better than average, but Coen sees smaller gains for national ad business.

"1994 was really a catch-up year," Coen said Monday (12/5). The advertising recovery should have been stronger in 1993, he


explained, but it was delayed until this year by uncertainty over Clinton administration policies.

When 1994 wraps up, Coen expects total ad spending to have gained 7.9% to reach nearly \$149 billion. He expects national radio (network and spot combined) to gain 8.5% to \$2.3 billion, and local to be up 9% to \$8 billion.

Krasnow, MCA Enter Label Pact

Former Elektra Chairman Bob Krasnow has teamed with MCA to create a new, as-yet-unnamed label. This joint venture with the MCA Music Entertainment Group — the first deal for the new multimedia Krasnow Entertainment firm — will be headquartered at MCA's New York offices and staffed at first by A&R execs. MCA will handle worldwide distribution as well as artist development and marketing, to which Krasnow will offer input and direction.

1994: Radio's First \$10 Billion Year?

■ Duopoly continues to spur consolidation; firms enjoy higher ad sales, earnings

Duopoly again dominated the radio business in 1994, as the industry's massive consolidation — begun in late 1992 — continued. Radio companies enjoyed higher ad sales and stronger earnings. But those that tried to go public found that ever-fickle Wall Street had cooled to new radio stocks.

Radio advertising revenues rose impressively in 1994. According to the RAB, total spot sales gained 11% through the first three quarters of this year. When all is said and done, 1994 is expected to be radio's first \$10 billion year.

Station trading continued to be dominated by duopoly strategies, but sales action slowed in the latter part of the year. Would-be buyers complained this was partially because sellers had been carried away by sky-high cash flow multiples in a few high-profile deals and were insisting on unreasonable prices. One example was Infinity Broadcasting's deal to buy KLUV-FM/Dallas for \$51 million, slightly more than 11 times cash flow.

Still, big deals were being made. The largest, by far, was a winning bid by investors Donald Tomlin and Gary Knapp to buy Park Communications for \$711.4 million.

R&R's sources pegged the deal's 22-station radio portion at \$120 million.

While big groups had banks lining up to finance their multimillion-dollar deals, there was finally a ray of hope for small-market buyers. The U.S. Small Business Administration dropped its "opinion-molder rule" and made government loan guarantees available to radio stations and other media businesses.

Several radio companies tried to sell new public stock offerings, but Hefel Broadcasting Corp. was the only one to get the job done. The Spanish station/network company sold \$35 million worth of stock in August.

Paxon Communications went public this year, but not through an IPO. It bought controlling interest in financially ailing American Network Group (which already had

publicly traded stock), then merged the companies.

Merger Impact

Consolidation also had a major impact on the radio network business. Westwood One shareholders approved a deal in late January to buy Unistar Radio Networks for \$101.3 million and turn over management of the merged companies to Infinity President Mel Karmazin. Infinity also acquired a 25% stake in WW1. The merger of the second- and third-largest radio networks created a viable competitor to longtime industry giant ABC Radio Networks.

Despite the creation of a second radio network behemoth, new entrants lined up to challenge the two giants. Unistar principals Nick Verbitsky and Dick Clark announced plans to start anew with their original company name: United Stations Radio Networks. Then Warner Music Group and Sony — each already a giant in the record industry — teamed up to launch SW Networks. By the time the NAB Radio Show rolled around in Octo-

FCC Denies Indecency Intimidation

The FCC defended its indecency fine system last week before a three-judge federal appeals court in Washington, denying that it is intimidating broadcasters with increasingly higher fines.

Attorney Tim Dyk — representing a consortium that includes NAB, Infinity Broadcasting, Evergreen Media, and others — complained that it's unfair the FCC makes broadcasters wait years to challenge indecency fines in court. "They never have an opportunity to be vindicated," he argued.

The broadcast group appealed a May 1993 U.S. District Court's decision that found the FCC's system constitutional. Judge Royce Lamberth had said broadcasters don't have free speech rights as other media do.

ber, both United Stations and SW were busy wooing affiliates.

Rep Firm Deals

The radio rep business had already run the consolidation course. However, both major rep firms pulled off other major financial deals:

• Katz Communications scuttled a \$73 million IPO to accept a Donaldson, Lufkin & Jenrette bid to buy 71% of the radio and TV rep firm for \$99.6 million.

• Infinity President Mel Karmazin kept both Katz and Interep in sus-

pense for weeks as both rep firms pitched proposals to take over national spot sales for the entire Infinity group. When the decision came down in late September, Interep had won the deal to establish Infinity Radio Sales as a boutique rep company. With IRS expected to handle \$100 million in annual sales, Interep is set to surpass Katz in total 1995 radio billings after years as No. 2.

There was even business news in the radio trade publication front. R&R was acquired by Perry Media Corp. in March, four months after being dealt to Westinghouse Credit in the Westwood One reorganization.

Shannon, Mabry Top TM Century

Robert Shannon and Lynne Mabry have been named Exec. VPs/co-COOs of TM Century (Nasdaq: TMCI) following the resignation of P. Craig Turner as President/CEO.

Chairman and principal shareholder Marjorie McIntyre announced the dual promotions and said the search is under way for a new CEO. Shannon has been a VP of TM Century and its predecessor for nine years. Mabry joined the company in 1990 as VP/CFO.

TM Century hasn't yet announced financial figures for its fiscal year that ended September 30. However, the company said it would be reporting "break-even" results for the fourth quarter.

WNYC-FM/ NYC Bidding Begins

Rothschild Inc., a Wall Street investment banking firm, has initiated efforts to sell WNYC-FM and raise cash for the financially strapped New York City government.

Major group owners have started to receive letters from Rothschild, which is handling the sell-off of various city assets. The broadcasters are being invited to sign confidentiality agreements and receive the offering book for WNYC-FM.

Not that anyone actually needs the book to make a bid. The station is currently non-commercial, so the financial section might as well be blank.

The most recent sales of cash-flowing commercial Big Apple FMs saw WRKS go to Emmis for \$68 million and WYNY to Broadcasting Partners for \$50 million.

Brazell To Expand In Russia

Metromedia International President Carl Brazell is looking to open radio stations in eight more Russian cities after tapping Michael Krafft as VP/Business Development-Russia.

Metromedia International, established last January by Brazell and billionaire broadcaster John Kluge, already owns majority stakes in three stations in Hungary and two in Moscow, and is acquiring two outlets in St. Petersburg.

"We have targeted eight additional markets in Russia, and it will be Mike Krafft's responsibility to get the stations up and running in the foreseeable future," said Brazell.

Krafft was with StoryFirst Communications, another U.S. company with Russian broadcasting investments.

Dyk told the appeals panel that by its inaction, the FCC fosters a climate that intimidates broadcasters and operates a system of "informal censorship" — made worse by threatening speeches or "jawboning" by FCC Chairman Reed Hundt and his fellow commissioners. However, Assistant U.S. Attor-

ney Sally Rider said the FCC is "merely applying indecency standards." She argued that the opponents "have not identified a single broadcast that was not aired." Rider also said broadcasters have a history of settling fines.

"That's not a fair argument. [The process] is dragged out, and it impacts the market," said Chief Judge Harry Edwards.





Gazing into her crystal ball, Schwartz said she could foresee a day when each market will have all of its radio stations housed in two or three buildings, with a few sales staffs handling large inventories from several stations. "Only the programming — the really competitive part — will remain separate."

At radio's current growth pace, Schwartz said the industry's share of the U.S. advertising market should increase from its current level of just over 7% to 9% by the turn of the century — just five years away.

Don Imus gets the headline "Mighty Mouth" and a pre-marital profile in *People*. "There was a question of whether I should marry her or adopt her," he says of his bride, who's 25 years his junior. 10 QUESTIONS WITH...

Q Is the FCC's definition of indecency clear?

A It's very hard to have a bright line definition for something like indecency, because at the heart of it is a subjective decision. It really depends on the community in which the statement is made and the time it's being aired — whether children are likely to be in the audience. There are a lot of factors you must look at when you're looking at something like indecency. It seems to me the Commission's definition is as broad as possible to give latitude that is necessary to take into account the many factors that affect the decision. That might make it tough on broadcasters. They, of course, always want bright lines.

On the other hand, I think it's up to broadcasters to be responsible. They should know that if they're going to air something that could be viewed as indecent at noon, when children are listening, they're taking a risk. It's a very subjective issue.

I'm very sensitive to broadcasters' First Amendment arguments ... I don't like to regulate content. It's not what I'm here to do, and I don't really like that job. But there is a certain responsibility broadcasters must have.

Q What's the reason for the lengthy fine process, particularly in the case of Infinity?

A There's a forfeiture collection process, Sections 503 and 504 of the Communications Act. If a broadcaster doesn't pay a forfeiture when we've issued a Notice of Apparent Liability, the act requires the Commission to issue a Notice of Forfeiture. That's where we are with most of the forfeitures against Infinity. But there is one that is final. It's now ready for the next stage in the forfeiture process: We refer it to the Department of Justice to collect the forfeiture. And apparently those cases take a while to go through that process.

Q Do you think President Clinton has any justification for railing against conservative talk hosts?

A Well, obviously, I don't know what the president thinks; he and I are not exactly close. It's an interesting statement by him. It's hard for me to know what's right or wrong. The president has tremendous access to the media compared to the rest of us. Given our country and the freedom of the press and speech inherent in the First Amendment, people have the right to say whatever they think. So you know, it's politics.

Q How would you assess the FCC's performance on the EEO front?

A I actually think we're doing a pretty good job with the current rules. My understanding is that we focus on sincere, good-faith efforts by broadcasters to recruit and find sources of minority

hires, than to recruit them actively and in a good-faith way. When we do renewal applications, we look at that very carefully, and we've been very serious about it.

We consistently keep telling broadcasters about our rules at every meeting we have with them, and I know NAB does too — just making sure they're aware of them so they can comply.

Q Some small-market broadcasters say it's difficult for them to comply with those rules.

A I recognize that some of our rules may have disparate impacts upon small radio stations, and I always worry about that. One of my main views is that we always need to remember here at the Commission that our licensees don't just comply with our regulations, they run businesses. And that's what they should be focusing on, in addition to fulfilling their regulatory obligations.

But on the other hand, if it really is onerous for them, I wouldn't mind hearing them propose raising the limits [stations with five or fewer employees are exempt from EEO rules] and seeing from a factual point of view what that would mean. I'd like to hear compelling reasons why they think that's necessary.

On the other hand, I hope this isn't just a way to evade our rules. We simply can't have that, for obvious reasons.

Q Some minority broadcasters think the ownership limits are too high; others are pushing for those limits to go higher. What's your stance?

A I haven't made up my mind yet. I'm very sensitive to both sides of the issue. I heard they were concerned at NABOB. On the other hand, I also am listening to the other side. They're saying look, there are many more radio and television stations than there used to be, and with so many outlets, there may not be as much of a reason to have ownership limits. Remember, the purpose of ownership restrictions was to [ensure] a diversity of voices in the community.

Q How would you describe the working relationship between the commissioners?

A A great thing about the current set of commissioners is that we really are very different. We come from different backgrounds, we have different strengths. Take finances. Commissioner [Susan] Ness is terrific — she's a banker, for God's sake! So she can explain to me what a put and a call are and what financiers look at when they're [examining] a designated entity for a PCS license.

And [Chairman] Reed [Hundt] has an antitrust background. He's the king of antitrust around here. Jim Quello is "Mr. Broadcasting," forever. He not only brings his broadcast-

ing expertise but also a very deep knowledge about how this place runs, where the bodies are buried, and what the issues have been through the years. He's been very kind about taking me under his wing and trying to teach me as much as I need to know about how this place runs and what its history is. And Commissioner [Andrew] Barrett has a state regulatory background. He comes from a whole different type of regulatory state [Illinois] than my state, California. So we swap a lot of stories about state issues. He also has a great sense of humor. He always makes me laugh.

Q What strengths do you bring to this job?

A I think it's very handy to have someone who has been a regulatory lawyer. I did two stints, one as an FCC lawyer at a private law firm [in Washington, DC] for a couple of years doing mostly mass media work.

Second, I practiced very substantially in California in front of the state utilities commission. There I was doing work in the wireless telephone area — mostly cellular, a little bit of paging; a little international work, a little satellite.

It gives me a unique view of how the federal regulatory arena interacts with the state telecom arena ... a somewhat unique view to have here at the Commission.

I'm a lawyer — someone who is very analytical and has emphasized writing in my career. Coming from a private law firm, I'm used to working very hard — long hours and weekends don't bother me, I'm used to it.

And the last thing is, I have an irrepressible sense of humor. I would like to say I've helped lighten up the eighth floor [of FCC headquarters, where the commissioners' and chairman's offices are located].

Q In what areas do you wish your background was stronger?

A I wish I was more technical and that I'd taken more economics classes in college. It would have been helpful in this job. I rely heavily on the technical engineers and our crack economists for their help.

Q What do you think about the FCC's impending move to the Portals?

A I have been assiduously staying out of this one [laughs]. I haven't followed the history of this case; I understand it's a long and gory history. Frankly, to me an office is an office. Wherever we're told to go, we'll go.

Radio Fee New York

NY-based talent agent Ken Franklin wants to revive the Alternative/Progressive program "Radio Free New York" in mornings on multi-ethnic WNWV/Newark, N.J. The show ran for nine months before money woes derailed it in July '93. Franklin recently sent a detailed proposal to 18 labels claiming that if he can pool \$1,032,000 per year, this will ensure an airplay of new Alternative music for adults in the Big Apple.

Heritage Media President/Radio Paul Fidlick is set to chair an NAB Group Head Fly-in on February 6-7 at the ANA Hotel in Washington, DC. Hot topics are expected to include the new GOP Congress, duopoly rules, and national ownership limits. Group heads (stations in three or more markets) who are NAB members may register at (202) 429-5402.

Jones Satellite Network VP/GM Eric Hausenstein becomes the NAB's newest Radio Board Member, replacing Mike Tyler in a network radio seat.

NY, L.A. Arbitends

The latest NY Sept/Oct/Nov. Arbitrends show Emmis CHR WQHT inching into a tie for second. Hot AC WPLJ leads the market among 18-34s, and market-leading AC WLTV is tied for first with Gold WBS-FM among 25-54s. Howard Stern is still solidly in front in mornings.

In L.A., Talk KFI — powered by a strong performance in mornings — climbs to third overall, trailing market leader Ranchera KLAX and CHR KPWR. Recent Talk convert KMP5 shows up at .8, and Progressive sign-on KSCA holds at .9. KLAX still reigns in L.A. mornings, followed by KFI and Stern on KLSX.

Attorneys for Contemporary Media and its affiliated broadcast companies (owners of eight radio stations in Indiana and Missouri) have asked the FCC to hold off any decision on whether to begin license revocation proceedings resulting from the conviction of sole owner Michael Rice on several sodomy and sexual assault charges involving minors. Rice, who's begun serving an eight-year sentence in Missouri, will be eligible for parole in two years. The attorneys say the radio properties are being managed by experienced employees under VP Janet Cox, and the stations will present "sound legal reasons" why no revocation proceeding is needed.

Pyramid Communications has asked the FCC for a waiver of the one-to-a-market rule to allow Leonard Leiberman to serve on Pyramid's board of directors. Although Leiberman is a director of Outlet Communications, which owns a Rhode Island TV station whose signal overlaps with those of Pyramid's Boston radio stations.

KGO's Owens Goin'?

KGO-AM/SF's Ron Owens has been off the air since December 1, owing to contract negotiations. According to the *San Francisco Chronicle*, Owens may leave KGO to host a nationally syndicated, Bay Area-based radio talk show.

On November 30, Owens told listeners that if he was unable to negotiate a new contract with station management, he may be talking to them "real soon from somewhere else."

Tichenor Media System Inc. has agreed to purchase Fort Bend Broadcasting's KMPQ-AM & FM/Rosenberg (Houston), TX and KMIA-FM/Jasper, TX for an as-yet-undisclosed price.

When Imago VP/Sales & Mktg. Jim Kelly and Dir/Sales & Mktg. Richard Sarbin finish their contracts at year's end, they'll become

A GLANCE BACK

CHR Is Alive And Well, Maneuvering Its Way Through Duopolies, Format Fragmentation

Yes, here it is ... the end of another year, and CHR/Top 40 is still alive. In many cases it's flourishing again.

For example, take the Top 100 markets in the Summer '94 Arbitron — 57 out of 102 (55.8%) CHR/Top 40 stations ranked in the Top 5 12+. Kudos to KPWR/Los Angeles, KHKS/Dallas, WPGC/Washington, KGGI/Riverside, KLUC/Las Vegas, WKRZ/Wilkes-Barre, KBFM/McAllen-Brownsville, KQKQ/Omaha, WNNK/Harrisburg, and KPRR/El Paso, all number one in that summer sweep.

Duopolies, further fragmentation of the format, new techniques for marketing, and surviving a bad book are just some of the major issues this column covered in 1994. Here's a look:

Duopolies



Matt Mills

VP/GM Matt Mills of Pyramid's Boston duopoly of Pop & Rhythmic CHRs WXKS (Kiss 108) & WJMN (Jam'n 94.5) addresses his biggest problem operating 30 minutes apart.

"My top priority is keeping everyone happy and giving everyone enough attention. I spend Monday, Wednesday, and Friday at Kiss and Tuesday and Thursday over at WJMN."

The stations' sales departments remain separate, but that area is still a prime concern for Mills. "On the sales front, Katz is repping both stations. But locally we have to be careful that individual sales reps don't knock the other station just to get on the time buy. The idea is to take money from the other stations in the market, not from the sister station. WJMN is getting the bulk of the younger buys, while Kiss gets its share of them as well as some 25+ business."

Meanwhile, the staff of EZ Communications' Pittsburgh duopoly, CHR WBZZ (B94) & '70s Gold WQKB (The Point 100.7) is under one roof. But there are still problems to conquer. VP/GM Tex Meyer says, "The reality is that everything doubles and then some when you combine two operations like this. Time management is a priority because handling phone calls for both stations and interfacing with all staffers have really mushroomed. My workday begins at 8am; I can rarely leave before 7pm. And I've got to devote about three hours on the weekend at home for what I call 'quiet work time' so I can slow down, strategize, and look at the big picture. The key to getting things done day to day is support staff." (R&R 10/14)

THE YEAR 94 IN REVIEW

Format Fragmentation

High-energy dance emerged as one of the newest musical trends in 1994. "We've made the streets come out of the speakers," says KOHT (Hot 97.7)/San Jose PD Bob Perry. "We've discovered the audience has a bigger appetite for high-energy dance music — the 'freestyle' and 'house' [genres] — than in the recent past. The return to a more rhythmic approach has made all the difference in the world for us in terms of total audience and our core demos."

Pop/Alternative also emerged with a vengeance. Spurred by huge CD sales of Pearl Jam, Stone Temple

Pilots, Soul Asylum, Blind Melon, Green Day, Offspring, Counting Crows, and others, a number of stations have changed their music's texture to a pop/alternative sound.

Steve Wyrostok, now a consultant working with Guy Zapoleon, views alternative music's influence on CHR with mixed feelings. "It's a trend with two parts: The music produced by alternative artists is more mass appeal than ever, and CHR is opening its arms to this music style as a component of the format. I worry about stations moving too far too fast. A turning point will come when PDs will be forced to learn which alternative records are hits by ratings success or failure. There are only 'X' number of hits. When you go beyond them, you get into dangerous territory."

Former WHTZ (Z 100)/New York APD/MD Frankie Blue reflects on the station's successful transition last year from pop/rhythmic to pop/alternative-leaning CHR. "Z-100 cashed in on music that is exclusively ours. Before, we programmed music for which people had lost passion. And that was shared with two or three stations. Pop/alternat:ive

music's popularity has given us a more unique position and allowed us to redefine Z100 and New York's Top 40." (R&R 4/8)

Database Marketing

Among what new methods have you explored recently to program and promote your radio stations? If you haven't investigated interactive database marketing — and apparently most CHR stations haven't — you could be overlooking a valuable tool.

WXKS/Boston PD Steve Rivers sees interactive database marketing as "the most efficient way of communicating with the station's core audience. Since they deliver the bulk of the quarter-hours, we formed the 'Kiss Club', which is over 100,000 card-carrying members strong. The idea is to directly market your radio station to the people already listening. I don't think there is a better way to begin the process than with database marketing."

Fairwest Direct President Reg Johns offers: "If you advertise your interactive number in a general media campaign, you'll end up with 100,000 people very quickly. But how many of them are meaningful? You want the people who listen to your station so you can convert casual listening into heavy listening. If the national average for cume is 8%, the true AQH growth isn't going to come from new cume as much as it is from making the other 92% of your listeners listen more."

"Smaller markets without the funding for a complete interactive system can generate the information from listeners via faxes, holding recruitment parties, or by promoting a 'listener club' on the air and plugging the data in manually. If you do a general mailer, it will be a less pure database, so include some kind of qualifier — like the name of your morning personality or the station's positioning statement — to prove that they listen to your station."

Media Gallery President Ruth Presslaff has an idea why CHR has been slow to pick up on database

marketing. "CHR does one huge outrageous promotion after another. So database marketing may seem too subtle and is wrongly perceived as not being visible enough — especially when you're asking stations to put dollars into relationship marketing vs. the quick bang of a typical CHR promotion."

Once you establish a database, Presslaff suggests you:

- Send birthday cards to listeners
- Launch direct mail campaigns
- Produce an annual calendar of station/local events small enough to put on a refrigerator. (R&R 7/29)

Surviving A Bad Book

Veteran PDs also offered advice on how to survive the ratings rollercoaster.

KKRZ/Portland PD Ken Benson lives by this rule: "The quickest fix in preventing one bad book from taking the station into a tailspin is to sit everyone down and lay out your observations about the station and the rest of the market. Then involve them in the big picture. And let them know you're not going to overreact or second-guess yourself."

Gannett flagship KIIS-AM & FM/Los Angeles President/GM Marc Kaye says the first step in analyzing a ratings book is not only to evaluate what went wrong, but what went right. "Patience is extremely important, especially in a fragmented major market where it may take Arbitron's methodology three to six months to reflect positive programming changes. It's a mistake to react to one down book."

"But the worst mistake is making panicky, knee-jerk decisions because of sales pressure. [And don't forget] to rally the troops. Be open and honest, but don't fail to focus on what they did right. You can't let any jock feel he's dragged the station down."

'Freestyle' Vs. 'House'

"High-energy dance music" can be broken down into two main genres: "freestyle" and "house." Here are the descriptions and examples of each.

• **Freestyle** — Also referred to as "Cha-Cha" or "Latin Hip-Hop." It's more Hispanic in appeal and crosses easily to non-ethnic audiences. Examples: Johnny O's "Runaway Love" and Corina's "Temptation."

• **House** — This more well-rounded, beat-driven sound — about 126 beats per minute, also is simply called "Dance." It's almost tribal sounding, with a deep bass-line groove. Examples: Reality's "Yblanda," Rob-In S's "Show Me Love," and Bizarre Inc.'s "I'm Gonna Get You." (R&R 1/28/94)

Cookin' Up A Banner Year In Country

A label explosion, a slew of TV shows, and several all-star compilations highlighted the year in country. Here's a look back at some 1994 events that continued to help push forward country music and artists.

The biggest news in Nashville: labels cropping up all over town. The year began with the rebirth of Decca, MCA/Nashville's little sister. And they just kept coming ... Patriot started with a bang in April, Polydor/Nashville was reactivated in May, River North Nashville began flowing in June, MCG/Curb was set to go in August, and Magnatone opened its doors in September. The only casualties were Capricorn, which folded its country division in September, and the short-lived Sun Records, which shut down last week.

TV Goes Country

Television continued to roll out country music series and specials. Tribune Entertainment/High Five Productions' syndicated series "The Road," which premiered in September, spotlights country artists on a weekly basis; the weekly "ABC In Concert Country" featured live performances throughout the summer.

Reba McEntire brought her hit song to life with "Is There Life Out There," a CBS-TV movie that aired in October. Dolly Parton continues to struggle with the CBS sitcom "Heavens To Betsy," which has been put on hold twice and is now on its third producer. "Lorelei Lee," starring Lorrie Morgan as a police detective/single mother/parttime country singer, never made it on the air. And although "XXX's And OOO's" — featuring Lari White and Pam Tillis — fizzled on TV, the title song by Trisha Yearwood hit No. 1 in September.

Movies 'N' Mags

A few movies captured the attention of country fans in 1994. "Maverick," starring Mel Gibson, Jodie Foster, and James Garner, featured cameos by Clint Black, Brother Phelps, Carlene Carter, Janis Gill, Vince Gill, Waylon Jennings, Hal Ketchum, Kathy Mattea, Restless Heart, and Randy Travis. Its Atlantic Nashville/AG soundtrack includes tunes by Black, Gill, Tracy Lawrence, Restless Heart, and others. If you missed it in theaters, "Maverick" was released on video last week.

Travis Tritt co-starred in "The Cowboy Way," which featured the Gibson/Miller Band's remake of Willie Nelson & Waylon Jennings's 1978 hit, "Mammas Don't Let Your Babies Grow Up To Be Cowboys." And Randy Travis resurfaced again in the direct-to-video release of "Texas," based on James Michener's novel of the same name.

Two new magazines dedicated to country music and artists hit newsstands this year, too. *New Country Music*, an interactive publication featuring CD reviews and artist profiles, debuted in February; *Country Weekly*, which features artist news and interviews, set sail last spring.

All-Star Albums

Many will remember 1994 as the Year of the Tribute Album. BNA's "Keith Whitley: A Tribute Album" was released in September; MCA/Nashville's "Skynyrd Frynds," a salute to Lynyrd Skynyrd, and Arista/Nashville's "Mama's Hungry Eyes," a tribute to Merle Haggard,

hit record stores in October; and Mercury/Nashville released its nod to the King of Rock 'n' Roll, "It's Now Or Never —The Tribute To Elvis," this week (12/6).

A pair of all-star compilations heated up record stores as well. More than 20 country and R&B artists paired up for MCA's duet album, "Rhythm, Country & Blues," released in March; just as many also gathered to fight AIDS with Mercury/Nashville's "Red Hot + Country" compilation. Kathy Mattea, who spearheaded the latter project, received the Harvard AIDS Institute's first AIDS Awareness Award last week (12/1) during the Country CARES AIDS benefit concert in Nashville.

'94 News

Several noteworthy events occurred in 1994, including the Country Music Foundation's decision to move the Country Music Hall of Fame downtown. Also this year, the Desert Rose Band called it quits; John Berry and George Jones underwent major surgery; and two "fan fairs" —the Country Music Fan Jam (in Ft. Worth) and the Las Vegas Country Music Fan Festival —debuted.

It was a big year for country clubs and restaurants, too. Music City saw the opening of Gaylord's Wildhorse Saloon and the Nashville Country Club, and we became one of the growing number of cities claiming a Hard Rock Cafe. Los Angeles got in on the act as well, as the Country Star Restaurant opened its doors this fall in Universal City.

Revisiting A Redefined Rock

■ Sales, plays per week top issues; heritage stations trade classic for new music

As the new year quickly approaches, I'll take a look back at some of the important issues faced by the format's radio and record execs in 1994.

What Is Rock?

In a recent comparison, 70% of the Rock chart's Top 10 tracks also charted on Alternative; 30% of the same artists were on the Progressive chart. One Rock outlet's playlist reflected that diversity. When WAVF (96 Wave)/Charleston, SC PD Dave Rossi asked "What is rock?" he found it was like asking "What is love?" or "What is religion?" "Depending on where you were raised or how you were brought up, everyone has his own and different answer. The overwhelming response turned out to be that rock is what our audience expects from us. At WAVF, we can play an artist like Lisa Loeb and have nothing but positive response to it. But we also can play Helmet and Neil Young with success." (R&R 8/19)

Niche Debate

The proliferation of music previously labeled Alternative gained mass acceptance this year in Rock. The pattern has continued since then with Rock's adoption of many "Alternative" bands, including Meat Puppets, Offspring, Green Day, and Smashing Pumpkins. Is there a connection between blurred music party lines and the state of the format? According to Sinton, Barnes & Associates' Tom Barnes, "We're starting to see markets unable to support five permutations of Rock or of any other format. After a foothold has been established with

a niche strategy, the only way for market share to increase is for the niche to widen its appeal.

"The key to growth in the next two to three years is to find the most viable position or unique selling proposition relative to a target demo — then begin to broaden as that position and demo will allow. In other words, service the key demographics — not the format. Format holes and vulnerabilities aren't determined by music availability (music not being played in the market) so much as they are by identifying an underserved demo."

His strategy for niche programming and effective marketing:

- Identify an underserved segment from a pre-existing market.
- Establish the validity of the hole or underserved demographic.
- Supervise the segment with the right music and texture. (R&R 10/7)

Plays Per Week

The advent of plays per week has affected music reporting more than any other event in recent history. Sharing their views:

"The biggest change I've noticed is that plays per week has improved the record industry's attention to personal selling details," says WAAF/Boston PD Ron Valeri. "The simple add is just not good enough any more. Labels are staying after records a lot more; they don't just get the add and forget about the project. With the new system, you can see when the emperor is wearing no clothes."

KISW/Seattle PD Steve Young noted, "People are realizing that the life of a record is a lot longer than the industry had been conditioned to believe and that records don't break in a week."

A&M Sr. VP/Album Promotion J.B. Brenner concurred, "Plays per week has extended the life of hit records. A lot of big records were missed in the past, but with the plays data radio can see how well records are really working. Most of the lunar rotations have bottomed out, too. The high plays per week on Alternative and current-based Rock stations is the reason for the attention they get." (R&R 8/5)

Airplay = Sales

The significant correlation between Rock airplay and sales was also a major topic of discussion. Island's Sky Daniels speculated that Rock's sales potential is "about 300,000-400,000 units on a pure Rock project uniformly supported by the format. There's been a bias against Rock from a record company's perspective for a long time. On one hand, it was well deserved because most stations averaged 15-20 plays per week on any given track, which is insufficient to stimulate sales. But the emergence of many active Rock stations with high current percentages — some as high as 70% — and hot rotation has started to challenge that old perception. This type of station breeds more active consumers interested in new music."

Geffen's Alan Oremen noted, "Records that start at Rock and cross over, or vice versa, obviously end up being the biggest records in a shorter amount of time. But there are still Rock-only success stories, like Jackyl and White Zombie. The format is healthier now than it's ever been because programmers are taking some risks and are more open to playing new music." (R&R 9/2)

Brave New World

Toward the end of the year, a change started brewing as several orthodox Rock outlets recently dropped the majority of their classic rock titles, then began adding a lot of new music and playing those currents in high rotations. Citing audience burn as the primary factor

for his outlet's transformation, KLOS/Los Angeles PD Carey Curelop said, "When Arrow [KCBS] went on the air, three stations [with Classic Rock KLSX] now were playing a fairly core rock library, which just increased the burn. And we wanted to differentiate ourselves and be more rock-driven and contemporary. Growing with your audience doesn't necessarily mean you'll just continue to play old records. The 25-34s or 25-44s are the most burnt on classic rock. So

automatically assuming you're growing with your audience by playing library records is incorrect." WBCN/Boston PD Oedipus noted, "The real turning point for us was Woodstock. When we saw its impact, we started to adjust our format. Clearly the industry is investing in these new bands — 'heritage rock' as we once knew it is over. We're proud we played Led Zeppelin as a white-label test pressing. But while we're proud of our heritage, 'heritage' doesn't have to equal 'old.'"

ing qualitative aspects. Paul Goldstein describes NAC as "mass appeal with class appeal." It is also the only format to enjoy increasing TSL. NAC's forward momentum is strong and persuasive. But will it endure? It will.


• If operators, managers, and programmers adopt the attitude that their format can now take its rightful place among others who have attained maturity.

• If management maintains that relevance by staying in touch with their listeners' needs;

• If PDs program with a sense of boldness and adventure, using research and charts as tools rather than rules;

• If stations learn from the commonplace and musical constellation that are the hallmark of other formats, and stay ahead of the curve;

• If stations embrace, rather than resist, change.

Format's Vital Signs Are Strong

■ '94 was year of gains in ratings, revenue, sign-ons, and corporate support

What a spectacular year for NAC! The past 12 months witnessed tremendous format gains on every front: ratings, revenue, station sign-ons, and corporate commitment.

Ratings & Revenues

There were few ratings surprises for NAC programmers this year. The numbers continue to climb, confirming the format's ever-widening appeal. Stations in major markets such as WQCD (CD101.9)/New York, WNUA/Chicago, KKSJ/San Francisco, KOAI (The Coast)/Dallas, and KIFM/San Diego now routinely rank Top 5-25-54. The stations that pioneered the format continue to dominate the ratings story for the most part. But relative newcomers in Atlanta and Portland posted impressive gains as well.

And the number one daypart trend increases with each book. For example, WQCD's nighttime personality Holly Lewis and KTWV (The Wave)/Los Angeles afternoon drive talent Don Burns hold the top-rated music radio daypart position with adults in their markets.

Revenues and profits are up, too. The number of stations experiencing million-dollar months is increasing all the time. But the real story is NAC rapidly becoming a staple for adult buys. The format is pulling more available dollars, relative to market size, with more expanded strength than last year. As KOAI GM Skip Schmidt notes, "The billing power ratio for NAC is closing fast on — even surpassing in some cases — AC and other formats."

New Sign-Ons

Another positive indication of NAC's health has been the number of stations adopting the format in the past year, many of them in major markets. New stations include Vallejo, CA (KJZY/Albu-querque and KXDC/Monterey). The choice of NAC over AC or 70s Gold speaks to the format's burgeoning mainstream appeal.

But as Broadcast Architecture Director/Programming Allen Kepler observes, "The quality of the broadcast companies investing in NAC — Pyramid, Viacom, Westinghouse, Granum, Brown, Noble, Tribune, among others — says more about the future of the format than anything."

With Pyramid's recent acquisition of WJZZ/Philadelphia, the firm became the second major radio group to own more than one NAC outlet. That represents a serious corporate

sonel shifting among stations this year. Among them, Shirley Mal-donado exited as WQCD PD for the WNNR/Raleigh. Stepping in for her was former WFLC/Miami PD Fleetwood Gruber. Since his March arrival, the station has been given a high approval rating by agencies, and \$1 million+ in billing per month, and is ranked Top 5 with adult listeners. MID Steve Williams was upped to APD in September.

More Stations; Higher Ratings

■ Tighter playlists, outpacing Rock rivals also among the year's trends

One of Alternative's biggest developments in 1994 — outsize its astonishing growth — was the widespread acceptance of tighter playlists and higher rotations. The outcome for many stations utilizing this tactic was higher ratings.

Tighter Playlists

To help build familiarity and come, CHR formatics became a prominent programming philosophy. KTCL/Ft. Collins-Denver PD John Hayes said, "The higher you rotate them as currents, the more familiar and comfortable they'll be when they become recurrent and, ultimately, gold" (R&R 1/28).

"We play 21 [current] songs and expose them with three to five plays a day," XHRM (The Flash)/San Diego PD Sherman Cohen noted. "I usually give a song about 300 plays before it becomes a recurrent. We play 37 songs five times or more per week. And we're playing the hits; I'm not looking for trendy fly-by-night songs" (R&R 6/24).

After signing on in February, WRXQ/Memphis PD Tony Williams admitted, "We use the same philosophy as Top 40, but we're doing it with Alternative music. We're playing the hits, rotating them often, and staying with the ones that are working" (R&R 5/27).

Success Abounds

The format's strength intensified in markets of all sizes. Some of the biggest ratings triumphs occurred in Los Angeles, Atlanta, Minneapolis, Denver, Washington, San Jose, Salt Lake City, Madison, Santa Barbara, and Champaign, IL. Stations in large and small markets experienced equal success. Here are a few highlights:

KDGE/Dallas cracked a three share for the first time in its six-year history. "The station research and my



own gut instinct told me our musical position was more narrow in its appeal than it needed to be in this particular marketplace," said PD Joel Folger. "The currents really aren't that much different, but we play them more often. Our quickest rotation has been narrowed down from five to four hours, and we're keeping our hit records longer" (R&R 2/11).

KJEE/Santa Barbara scored immediate results in its first book (Spring '94): 5.6 12+ and No. 1 18-34. PD/MD Heather Luke reasoned, "People in Santa Barbara were tired of the same old stations, and there was a tremendous hole for this music. Alternative is really big now — not just stations, but the whole industry is growing. We couldn't have come on at a better time" (R&R 9/16).

As the year comes to a close, KXRK (X-96)/Salt Lake City is riding a trend of five straight up books. VP/Operations & Programming Mike Summers noted, "We've had the luxury of most competition [avoiding] our product for a long time. Rock and CHR stations haven't dealt with much of anything that had to do with us" (R&R 11/11).

Alternative Defeats Rockers

Another milestone was the number of Alternative stations that leaped ahead of their Rock competition. KITS (Live 105)/San Francisco VP/Programming Richard Sands acknowledged, "We're taking more listeners away from Rock stations. For example, typical Rock listeners might think that Live 105 is the station for weird music. If you asked,

"Did you know we play Pearl Jam, Stone Temple Pilots, and Billy Idol?" they would say 'no' because in their minds those are not artists we play. Now with Rock stations playing these artists, when listeners scan down the dial or see our TV commercial, they realize Live 105 isn't so weird" (R&R 8/19).

WKQX (Q101)/Chicago PD Bill Gamble remarked, "[Alternative] is the most popular music out right now, so there's a blurring from CHR and Rock in a lot of markets. If you look at most markets, the dominant Rock station in more markets than not is the Alternative station. I think Alternative snuck up on people.

"Everybody likes to use the line 'Rock Of The '90s.' Finally it's starting to make some sense — that's what Alternative radio is. Mainstream AORs sound pretty old playing Deep Purple, Lynyrd Skynyrd, and CS&N mixed in with a Pearl Jam cut once and a while. We're the Rock station. Rock isn't necessarily

screaming guitars over and over."

XTRA-FM (91X)/San Diego OM Kevin Stapleford pointed out, "AOR was once the viable, exciting format for breaking bands — [but] it doesn't have the monopoly on that in a lot of markets anymore. Alternative stations are really viable in terms of being able to surpass AOR on the basis of just playing better music. AOR helped develop bands like Soundgarden and Pearl Jam, but there aren't that many over the past five or six years. Without Alternative stations, these bands wouldn't be as big as they are today. MTV helped, too."

Talkin' 'Bout An Evolution

A few noteworthy Alternative evolutions unfolded in '94: WMMS/Cleveland, WRZX/Indianapolis, WLUM/Milwaukee.

All eyes remain focused on Alternative-leaning CHR WHYT/Detroit. About 50% of the station's playlist are songs on R&R's Alternative chart. Stay tuned!

Dawn Of A New Progressive Era

Format earns new respect, finds new faces, faces new challenges

In 1994, Progressive radio came of age. R&R initiated weekly charts and column coverage of the format for the first time, new converts showed up in a number of major markets, and the format appeared to finally forge its own identity.

THE YEAR IN REVIEW

So what was Progressive in 1994?

KOTR/San Luis Obispo, CA owned Bruce Howard and PD Drew Ross's explanations seemed to define it best (R&R 9/9). "A real intuitive music station that's programmed by the DJs," said Ross. "We have over 10,000 pieces of music, but people still bring in their own collections. Each person brings something unique, so it isn't homogenized radio. It's almost like we're talking one-to-one to our listeners. We've all developed the sound of the station and refined it. It isn't based on charts."

Howard pointed out that the format must be done by those who have a passion for the music. "It's something that has to be in their blood or it won't work. The humanness of the DJs is a critical part of the station's sound."

Getting The Word Out
With all of the stations entering the market this year, one of the key issues facing Progressive was how to

for designing promotions as well. KSGR/Austin PD Jody Denberg outlined some of the station's music-based promotions (R&R 8/19). "We named June 'Music Month' and highlighted different songs from an artist every hour, emphasizing the depth of our library and showing we weren't just playing the hits. Two or three times a year we do 'Select-A-Set Weekends.' We put an ad in the newspaper that serves as an entry form; listeners choose five songs they think would sound good on the station. Then, for an entire weekend, every set is called from the Select-A-Set entries. With close to 1000 entries coming in, it's a major production.

Los Angeles Marketing Director Robert Lytes was to use the format's unique nature as a media hook (R&R 7/29). The first step was to issue a press release stating that the station, which flipped from AC on July 1, was L.A.'s first Progressive station. "It's important to get as much publicity as possible — it's the best form of advertising, since you don't have to pay for it. We're an exclusive format in this market, featuring a lot of music that hasn't been heard here before. All the major papers did a story the day we signed on, and some have done follow-ups. Everything has been positive. "I called the TV stations, too. The Channel 5 morning news covered us the day we signed on. PD Mike Sandler went over and talked about the new format and brought over CDs and T-shirts for the staff. It was a great exposure. 

Hot AC/Adult CHR Come Of Age

■ But several ACs flip to '70s, and FSA disappears

In this pivotal year of development and transition for the format, this publication brought you news about a variety of formatic and personnel changes. But in '94, R&R also made industry news.

With the April 22 debut of the Hot AC/Adult CHR chart, our format contributed to R&R's expansion.

THE YEAR 94 IN REVIEW

Among the 38 charter panelists were such major-market newcomers as WPLJ/New York, KYSR/Los Angeles, and KIOI/San Francisco.

Sleepless Over '70s

AC's ranks thinned out in '94, and '70s Oldies was clearly the big beneficiary. Several programmers observed that this new format craze created pitfalls for AC competitors. Among them was Jack Taddeo Communications President Jack Taddeo: "In many cases, there's not much an AC can do to counterprogram '70s Oldies. It's very frightening to see how some people are reacting."

"Some reactions are very subtle, but you can tell there's been discussion inside the station regarding how to

react. To add '70s music [haphazardly] to a Hot AC or Soft AC to try to protect against a '70s-driven Oldies station is a mistake" (R&R, 5/20).

KVIL/Dallas PD Bill Curtis concurred: "Ongoing sleepless nights shouldn't be spent on anything but your own station," he remarked (R&R, 11/4). "Some owners, GMs, and PDs spend too much time and energy focusing on new competitors and become obsessed with it. Their mentality is to always react; sometimes that's the worst thing you can do."

Lite AC WLTE/Minneapolis PD Gary Nolan added, "I can't play much of that '70s music, because it doesn't match what we're doing. These '70s stations will take [audience] from Classic Rock, AC, and traditional Oldies stations" (R&R, 11/4).

Full-Service Out Of Gas?

A stunning majority of AM Full-Service powerhouses in the Top 100 markets have gone all-Talk. AC once boasted giants like WBZ/Boston, WJR/Detroit, KMOX/St. Louis, KDKA/Pittsburgh, WCCO/Minneapolis, and a host of others. But music's been gone from some of these stations for several years now.

When Clear Channel's WRVA/Richmond yanked its "Overnight Truckin' Show" in April, it marked yet another Top 100 market Full-Service outlet's move to all-Talk. According to seven-year PD Tim Farley, "It would've been wrong for us to continue doing Full-Service. People didn't tune to us for music, and it became tougher and tougher to find the right two or three songs to play each hour. The only people we lost were those who wanted music — we could never have satisfied them anyway."

Farley says the lack of music in middays and afternoon drive hasn't hampered his station. "Our air personalities are at their best when there's no music. Music on FS stations is a relief factor that gets you from one event to another. FS's big attraction is the warm and fuzzy relationship the station has with its audience. We're doing lots of open phones where people can have some angry discussions or talk about their favorite chicken soup recipes."

Focus On Marketing

Personality remains an important ingredient on WRVA, which celebrates its 70th birthday next year. "You can't do shotgun news here," explains Farley. "[WBZ/Boston] does its news in a snap-snap/story-story fashion. We're still laid-back and jovial, and we chat about things."

Farley warns Top 50 Market FS PDs, "Unless you have a unique situation, it will be very difficult to continue doing Full-Service. You must focus on marketing — it's hard to get people to remember what you're all about. We might have been able to get away with keeping the format on a bit longer, but it wouldn't have been easy."

So, What Are You Doing For Christmas?

Christmas presents a unique annual programming challenge for Talk radio stations. Here's a look at how some stations will handle the holiday that celebrates two concepts not usually associated with the Talk format — peace and goodwill.

• **WLS-AM & FM/Chicago** OM Drew Hayes says his stations will do some special Christmas programming while doing their best to uphold the spoken-word spirit of the format. On Christmas Eve the stations will air ABC Radio's "Mrs. Bush's Storytime" followed by the radio play "A Christmas Carol." Overnight will feature repeats of notable WLS shows from '94.

• **WXYT/Detroit** will carry holiday music from the Christmas Music Network beginning at 3pm Christmas Eve through 9pm Christmas night. Network beginning at 3pm Christmas Eve through 9pm Christmas night. According to GM Michael Packer, it's no big deal for a Talk station to abandon the spoken word for a few hours.

• **WTMJ/Milwaukee** PD Steve Wexler says the station will broadcast football games on Christmas Eve and Christmas night. In between, it will carry the Christmas Music Network.

• **KMOX/St. Louis's** holiday highlights include a special holiday edition of the station's nightly sports talk show on Christmas Eve. Then, after an overnight of Christmas music, it runs an early morning newblock that includes numerous holiday features. From 9am-noon, KMOX airs its traditional live broadcast from sportscaster Jack Buck's home.

• **WMLA/Washington** attempts to provide a little something for everybody by offering a mix of special holiday programming and regular talk shows. The centerpiece of the station's lineup is "Christmas Eve at the Kennedy Center," a program of live local music hosted by WMLA personalities.

• **WGFR/Buffalo** is offering its NHL-staved listeners a Christmas gift of hockey. Following its broadcast of Christmas Eve church services, the station will air a marathon replay of memorable Buffalo Sabres games.

Format Stays Steady in Turbulent Year

■ Talk held its own with loyal listeners, despite baseball strike, media criticism

It would be safe to say Talk radio encountered some rocky moments during 1994. However, the format continues to thrive despite challenges, including media criticism, the baseball strike, and even a few jabs from President Clinton.

The past year saw several prevailing trends in the format. For example, Talk was front and center in politics, with the general media suggesting the format's hosts have become heavyweight opinion-molders, who can make or break candidates.

The year's hot political topics and candidates received their share of attention from talkers. While some Talk PDs were hesitant to admit their hosts could make or break a candidate or issue, they did agree hosts wield some influence. As **WBAP/Dallas** OM Tyler Cox said, "Talk listeners and callers are pretty informed, intelligent people who have already made up their minds. We do try to reflect what people are thinking to reflect what people are thinking."

Most programmers stand behind their hosts when things get hot. Take the brouhaha over **WABC/NY** host **Bob Grant** and his portrayal in *New York* magazine as a venomous racist hater. How did PD **John Mainelli** feel about the spotlight on his station and host? "I'm loving it," he admitted. "I love to defend what we do because I believe in it. I don't know that all publicity is good publicity. But this will certainly make more people aware of what we do. And I think that's good." (R&R 11/4)

Simpson** and covering other local and world issues. Because of the actual sound quality, **WBAL/Baltimore** Station Manager **Jeff Beauchamp** decided 100% radio coverage of the pre-trial hearings was not the way to go. His solution: "We'll assign a staffer


