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EDITOR'S LETTER CONTENTS

HARDER NEWS, BUT EASIER-TO-READ TYPE, IN '98

When Airplay Monitor published its first combined year-end issue in 1995, it threw a few readers who were used to seeing only the compact, easy-to-use Monitor targeted to their specific format. For the next few weeks, we had to explain that this was not a permanent change and that the regular



Airplay Monitor would be back with the first issue of the new year (Jan. 8, 1999, this time around). But after three years, the yearend Airplay Monitor is becoming an eagerly awaited holiday tradition, kind of like the Christmas

Wish, Acoustic Christmas concerts, or "Grandma Got Run Over By A Reindeer." (OK, maybe that last one's not so eagerly awaited. And there are probably some industryites getting a little testy about the holiday concert thing, too.)

This Best of '98 issue spotlights the biggest songs, artists, and labels from all of Airplay Monitor's charts, based on our exclusive monitored airplay info from Broadcast Data Systems. Again. it features interviews with the artists and label personnel who brought you the year's biggest hits. Again, it features Power Plavlists showing the biggest hits of 1998 at more than 200 of our reporters

So what's different? Our first year-end tallies of Monitor's crossover, active rock, heritage rock, and modern adult sub-charts. And a new, more readable layout, with bigger, easier-to-use charts, worthy of posting in any on-air studio. And for the first time, Monitor's year-end issue features an exclusive survey of programmers from all of Monitor's formats assessing the state of the rapidly changing world around them.

All year-end charts and playlists represent the Airplay Monitor charts that began with our Nov. 28, 1997, issue and ended with the Nov. 20, 1998, issue. The year-end charts are based on points that songs accumulated during their chart run-meaning that they reflect not just a song's peak position, but its longevity. The label of the year category, which last year reflected only distributing labels, this year includes any label with its own promo staff. When different labels collaborated on records, either because of soundtracks and shared artists (i.e., Dream-Works. Geffen, Columbia, and Arista on "When You Believe") or because an originating imprint had its own staff of regionals (i.e., Def Jam/Mercury in R&B), the points were divided accordingly.

During 1998, Airplay Monitor welcomed two new managing editors: Top 40 Airplay Monitor's Jeff Silberman and R&B Airplay Monitor's Dana Hall, who was upped from a writer/reporter position. My thanks for their help with this year-end special, as well as Country Airplay Monitor's Phyllis Stark and Rock Airplay Monitor's Marc Schiffman, who has been integrally involved in Monitor's expanded special efforts throughout the year. (1998 also marked our first modern adult special; our first top 40 special, focusing on the state of record promotion; and a spectacularly received fifthanniversary issue.)

The year also saw us give Airplay Monitor charts and features a new, more dynamic look. It saw our fifth and biggest Billboard/Airplay Monitor Radio Seminar and Awards in Phoenix. (Save Oct. 7-9, 1999, for our sixth convention, in Miami Beach, Fla. And yes, there will be a central bar next year.)

Above all, the four Airplay Monitors remained the only publications tackling the hard issues during 1998. More than a year ago, we were the first to report the resurgence of pay-for-play. Incredibly, some other trades wouldn't talk about pay-for-play (or even associated issues like comprehensive artist marketing plans) until well after the consumer press had gotten hold of the story. Airplay Monitor was the first trade to which the record and radio industries were willing to talk candidly about the reportingethics question. And Monitor was the first to tackle the advent of "virtual radio" and the resurgence of automation in general.

In 1999, Airplay Monitor will work harder than ever to maintain its position as the PD's trade publication of record. Our readership surveys continue to show Monitor as programmers' first choice, but, as most PDs will tell you, research can't tell you where you're going. That's why we're counting on your ongoing feedback throughout the year regarding what you'd like to see more and less of. We're particularly interested in what you think should be on Airplay Monitor's forthcoming World Wide Web site and whether you feel we need to offer some daily form of this magazine, via fax or Internet.

My appreciation for a great '98 goes not only to our readers on both the radio and music industry sides but to everybody at Airplay Monitor for the manimoth task that is publishing four magazines each week. And particularly to new Airplay Monitor publisher Jon Guynn for a smooth transition under difficult circumstances

The year was a rough one for many in the broadcasting industry. Some of the industry's most-respected programmers left the business, only occasionally of their own volition. Those who stayed found themselves juggling multiple stations, carrying 14 units an hour, and having less time for music or

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their staffs (or anybody else). It shouldn't have made for great radio. Yet, incredibly, I again found myself fascinated by numerous new radio stations this year. And while I don't necessarily buy into the corporate line that consolidation equals programming diversity, it's hard to imagine a year in which R&B oldies could have become the hot new FM format under any other circumstances.

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new media. Yet the Internet has already significantly changed my own listening habits. And the biggest potential changes, those unleashed by the presence of DARS, are still to come. Whatever changes the delivery system may undergo in the next few years, radio programming will still revolve around being able to identify the right songs for the audience. And PDs can count on Airplay Monitor both to chronicle the changes around us and to remain the best tool for finding the right songs.

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LACK OF QUALIFIED AIR TALENT NO. 1 PD WORRY, ACCORDING TO YEAR-END MONITOR SURVEY

What do radio programmers see as the most important issue facing them today? According to a year-end survey of programmers in all five Airplay Monitor formats, it's finding qualified air talent. Consolidation-related issues, such as spot load and time management, were a close second. By contrast, PDs say that they're not very concerned about radio's heavily publicized new rivals: digital satellite radio and the Internet.

Airplay Monitor polled more than 85 programmers in AC, country, R&B, rock, and top 40 on a wide range of current issues, from the quality of today's available product to job security to the effect of consolidation on programming diversity. Besides finding out what issues most concerned PDs, we also found out which programmers tend to worry more: In most cases, country PDs showed themselves to be the most concerned about various issues, while rock PDs were the most nonchalant. This despite the fact that both country and rock PDs had a fairly bearish take on the state of their own format.

Asked to rate radio's key issues on a scale of 1 to 5, with 5 indicating the concern, most half our nearly panel, 48.8%, ranked finding qualified air talent at a 5. The mean was a 3.97 rating. **R&B** programmers were the most con-

cerned about the issue, with a 4.4 rating. Rock PDs were least concerned, with a 3.35.

Just behind air talent were the effects of radio's increased spot loads and time management problems, tied with a 3.85. Country programmers were, by a slight margin, the PDs most concerned about spot load, with AC programmers second. Despite the widespread concern about spot load, at least one country PD expressed resignation, saying, "You think about it but can't dwell on it. It is reality today." Country PDs were also the ones most concerned with time-management issues. Rock PDs were, again, the least concerned about both.

Coming in fourth was the issue of budget cuts in marketing and/or promotions, which got an average rating of 3.45, with, again, country PDs the most concerned and the rock programmers least concerned. That was followed closely by the quality of current product, with a 3.43.

Of the 13 issues we asked programmers to rank, the rest shook out as follows: The top five concerns were followed by the availability of major talent for station concerts in '99 (3.26), the fear of a direct competitor coming into a market (2.89), and the availability of enough uptempo product (2.77). Job-related issues came next, first with the question of job security (2.55). And, despite their worries about time management, fewer PDs admitted to concerns about job burnout (2.46).

Then came new-technology issues. The specter of Internet programming becoming a viable competitor in '99 earned only a 2.45, as did the specter of direct broadcast satellite. Last was the ubiquitous Y2K bug, with a measly 2.18.

EFFECTS OF CONSOLIDATION

Respondents were also asked to rate the effects of consolidation on radio as a whole and programming diversity in particular, once again on a scale of 1 to 5, with 5 being the most positive. The effect of consolidation on radio as a whole got a 2.71, led by country programmers, who gave it a 2.91. AC programmers were less convinced of the benefits of consolidation, giving it a rating of 2.29.

Consolidation's effect on programming diversity scored a 2.7, with one rock programmer asking, "Can we get over this?" R&B programmers, though, were the most optimistic on the effect of consolidation on programming diversity, awarding it a 3.00. Country

Country was the pessimist format, ranking the effect at a 2.57, only slightly worse than the 2.58 rating given consolidation by top 40 programmers. Oddly enough, many industryites have long claimed that it was radio's Tele-

com Act-era consolidation that spurred major broadcasters to re-enter the top 40 format. (It does make sense, however, that country PDs, who often saw their competition bought out and flipped to another format due to consolidation, would see consolidation as good for radio as a whole but bad for diversity.)

Not only did response to the effects of consolidation seemed lukewarm, the issue's life cycle may be waning. When asked if they thought they'd have the same owner this time next year, 84.8% of responses were in the affirmative, a sign that PDs see radio's baseball card-trading days coming to an end.

MEGA-CORPS ARE A'COMIN'

We also asked our programmers a series of "agree or disagree" questions: Queried whether the next piece in the consolidation puzzle might be the entrance of a major corporation like Microsoft or AT&T, 67.8% expected that a company of that nature will eventually make a play for one of the big radio companies, 26.4% thought it unlikely, and 5.8% had no opinion. While most formats were in line with these figures, rock PDs bucked the trend, with the panel split nearly 50/50 on whether such a media power play would take place. At the fall 1998 National Assn. of Broad-

casters Radio Show, panelists at the group heads session predicted radio would flourish in a recession. But 65.8% of the programmers we polled thought a stock market downturn would adversely affect radio in 1999, although 32.9% thought radio would escape being dragged down by the market. Only 1.2% had no opinion. Here, it was rock and country PDs who were

most sanguine; only about 50% of each expected adverse impact from the stock market.

On the personal front, only 26.7% of respondents said their job was negatively affecting their personal lives. While that trend pretty much represented all formats, 52% of country programmers said their job negatively was hurting their personal lives. Of those polled, 62.8% thought their duties gave them less time with music than they'd like, although rock PDs were nearly evenly split on that issue, and R&B programmers ran counter to the trend, with only 10% saying they weren't getting enough time with their music.

This time last year, the issue of pay-forplay was starting to gather momentum in various formats. While there hasn't been as much attention given to pay-for-play recently, and while the trend barely materialized in 1998, at least in its most clear-cut form, nearly 60% of our PDs still thought it would be a live issue in 1999, with 38.4% calling it a non-issue and 2.3% having no opinion. Margins were narrow on this issue in every format except mainstream top 40, where an amazing 78.9% of respondents expected the issue to stay on the front burner.

HEALTH REPORT

We broke respondents into five inajor groups: rock formats, mainstream/rhythmic top 40, AC/adult top 40, country, and R&B. When asked to rate the current state of their format on a scale of 1 to 5, with 5 being the best, mainstream top 40 gave itself the cleanest bill of health, with a 4.05 rating. R&B was next with a 3.7, *Continued on next page*

followed by AC's 3.61, country's 3.17, and rock's 2.88.

That trend was paralleled when we asked PDs to rate the quality of music they



got in 1998. Top 40 programmers gave their product the highest ranking, a 3.74, followed by R&B (3.5), AC (3.3), country (3.2), and rock (2.8). It's notable that country was not last, given the generally dire attitude displayed toward available product even by the format's boosters in these pages this year.

We then asked programmers to speculate on the availability of product in 1999 based on what had been played for them so far. Here, scores were lower, and this time, the R&B community was the most satisfied with what they'd heard so far, giving new product a 3.6. Mainstream top 40 followed with a 3. AC and country were both around a 2.8, while obviously disgruntled rock PDs gave the music a 2.2.

IF I RULED THE WORLD

Our survey concluded with a series of open-ended questions. Asked to tell labels what they'd most like in their relationships, top 40 programmers cited more mass-appeal hits. Their AC brethren sought greater help with station concerts. At R&B, time buys and artist availability to radio were key requests, as was more setup on new releases.

The quantity of product worked was a big issue with rock programmers, who asked for "better follow-up with current projects," "less quantity, more quality," and "not to have so many baby projects at one time. Get behind an album and see it through with undivided attention." These sentiments were echoed by one country PD, who implored, "No new acts. Focus on getting the B acts to the A level." One programmer exhorted, "Stop whining and make a real effort to understand how radio stations work—that 'good' radio has nothing to do with how much new music a station plays but how well a station serves its target audience."

SCRATCHING A NICHE

The year saw R&B oldies and the "extreme" modern/active rock hybrid emerge as growth formats. We asked panelists what new niche would break through in 1999. Eighties-based formats were the leading favorite, including '80s oldies, modern rock oldies, and '80s hair-band rock. Country PDs tended toward some form of country rock or country oldies, though one observed, "With swing back in vogue, a carefully fashioned nostalgia station could draw younger listeners as an alternative." R&B PDs are expecting a rise for contemporary gospel.

When asked what one job they'd love to delegate to someone else, budgeting and paperwork topped the list of most programmers, with attending meetings not far behind. But when asked what new tasks they'd like to have in their job description, the majority of programmers wanted to be in charge of the budget for the station, meaning that some, perhaps, expected those budgets to get done by osmosis. And some PDs said they had enough on their plate altogether and wanted nothing more.

Signal deficiency—a bigger concern as metros expand—declining budgets, and "the constant threat of being sold" were some issues programmers cited when asked what was the single biggest problem they faced at their station. The rock formats also complained of oversaturation of product in the market. And as a sign of the consolidating times, one programmer said that "keeping peace between stations in the building" was his biggest problem.

And what would a year-end poll be without asking about New Year's resolutions? Aside from the anonymous top 40 PD who wanted to "have a sex-change operation and marry Mel Karmazin," many wanted to focus more attention on their staff, with "one-on-one meetings," as one R&B programmer said. A rock PD vowed to "treat my staff better, give them more positive feedback, [and] let them know how important and valuable they truly are." And then there was the top 40 PD whose widely shared resolution was to "clean my office."

Reflecting the overarching concern, one country PD resolved to "find and train the next generation of talent." Of course, our favorite was the PD whose professional resolution for '99 was simply "to be a featured PD in Monitor."

PDS' FAVES: '98'S MOST IMPORTANT ARTISTS AND SONGS

Besides asking PDs to rate the biggest issues of 1998, we also asked them to list the most important artists and songs of the year. Here they are broken out by format.

TOP 40: WILL'S IN POWER

Mainstream top 40 gave the top slots to matchbox 20, Will Smith, and (in a tie) the Backstreet Boys and Alanis Morissette. Top songs were Aerosmith's "I Don't Want To Miss A Thing," the Goo Goo Dolls' "Iris," and (in a tie) Smith's "Gettin' Jiggy Wit It" and Natal-



ie Imbruglia's "Torn." 'N Sync was chosen by our voters as the top new act for mainstream top 40. For rhythmic top 40 PDs, the most important song of the year was Brandy & Monica's "The Boy Is Mine."

Matchbox 20 also topped the list of most important acts at adult top 40 formats, followed by Morissette and **Sarah** McLachlan. Top songs were matchbox 20's "3 AM," "Iris," and "Torn." Matchbox 20 also earned adult top 40's favor as its new act of the year. For AC stations, Celine Dion was the most important artist, followed, surprisingly, by a tie between Elton John and the Backstreet Boys. Dion's "My Heart Will Go On" was considered the most important song.

R&B: QUEEN OF THE HILL

Mainstream R&B programmers put Lauryn Hill, Jay-Z, Missy Elliott, Timbaland, Brandy, and Erykah Badu on top of their lists of the most important artists in their format in 1998. Brandy & Moni-

ca's "The Boy Is Mine," Next's "Too Close," Jon B.'s "They Don't Know," and Hill's "Doo Wop (That Thing)" topped the song lists. Adult R&B pro-

grammers called Brian McKnight, the Temptations,

LSG, and **K-Ci & JoJo** the most valuable players for '98, with McKnight's "Any-time" and the Temptations' "Stay" named as the songs they most favored.

LAURYN HILL

The two formats combined to name Next, **Mya**, Badu, **Destiny's Child**, and **DMX** as the year's most significant new acts.

COUNTRY: HE BROOKS NO CHALLENGERS

Thanks to his tour, several new album packages, numerous singles, and massive media exposure in '98, **Garth Brooks** was chosen by the country survey respondents as the most important artist of the year. It was no surprise that

Monument's **Dixie Chicks** were chosen by the panel as the most significant new country act of the year. What is surprising is that the group was also the panel's No. 2 choice after Brooks in the

most important artist of the year category, since the group—first introduced last December—had released just one album and three singles at the time this survey was compiled. **Shania Twain** was respondents' third choice for most important artist of the year, followed by **George Strait** and **Tim McGraw.**

GARTH BROOKS

Steve Wariner's "Holes In The Floor Of Heaven" was chosen as the most important country song in 1998 with a majority of votes. Twain's "You're Still The One" was the panel's second choice in this category. A three-way tie for the third most important song of the year was shared by Dixie Chicks' "There's Your Trouble," McGraw's "Just To See You Smile," and Faith Hill's "This Kiss."

Among the more colorful answers to

the question of the three most important songs of the year came from **KRRV** Alexandria, La., PD **Lon Harris**, who explained each of his choices. They were: "I'll Go On Loving You" ("**Barry White** goes country"), "Honey I'm Home" ("Country goes insane"), and "Husbands And Wives" ("Country goes back in time to find country").

ROCK: A NEW CREED

It was a dead heat between Metallica and Creed for the rock formats' most significant acts of 1998. Days Of The New rounded out the top three. Creed bested the field of significant songs as voted by our rock programmers. "My Own Prison" clinched it, but the band also put "What's This Life For" and

"Torn" on the map. The remainder of the top three had a tie, with **Sevendust's** "Black," **Kenny Wayne Shepherd's** "Blue On Black," and Days Of The New's "Touch, Peel & Stand" top-



ping the vote-getters. Like Creed, Days Of The New and Metallica had multiple song entries in the vote count. And when it came to most significant new act of '98, Creed won hands down with the overwhelming percentage of the vote. 
Monitor BEST OF 98 MONUMENT'S DIXIE CHICKS MAKE THEIR FIRST YEAR A MEMORABLE ONE

In the year since Monument Records released the first **Dixie Chicks** single in December 1997, the trio has gone on to become 1998's most successful country group by a wide margin. In the process, the group's members—**Emily Erwin**, **Natalie Maines**, and **Martie Seidel** have racked up an impressive list of accomplishments.

Their debut Monument album, "Wide Open Spaces," has just been certified triple-platinum and is Sony Nashville's first album to hit the top 10 on The Billboard 200 since Mary Chapin Carpenter's "Stones In The Road" in 1994. Two singles have gone to No. 1, including the title track, which remained at the top of the Country Airplay chart for four weeks.

In September, Dixie Chicks won two Country Music Assn. Awards—group of the year and the Horizon Award—becoming the only new act to have won both categories in the same year. They were recently nominated for two American Music Awards for favorite new country artist and favorite country group and will be appearing on that show Jan. 11 on ABC-TV.



The Chicks have also been a publicist's dream. At a time when it's hard to get exposure for country acts, they've gotten booked on "Late Show With David Letterman," "The Tonight Show With Jay Leno," "Late Night With Conan O'Brien," "The View," "Live With Regis & Kathie Lee," and "CBS This Morning." In print, the Chicks have been featured in People, TV Guide, USA Weekend, and Entertainment Weekly. Rolling Stone included "Wide Open

Spaces" on its list of 1998's essential records, calling the group "the badass queenpins of country."

All that success has earned the group exactly one month off. They aren't working in December but will regroup in January in the studio, where they will spend the next 2½ months recording their next album, which will once again

be produced by **Blake Chancey** and **Paul Worley**. Erwin and Seidel will commute to the studio from their Dallas homes. The group's lead singer, Maines, and her husband moved to Nashville last month.

Among the songs they will be recording for the next album, scheduled for a fall '99 release, are one Maines describes as "kind of a Tammy [Wynette]/George [Jones] fighting duet. We haven't picked who I'll be fighting with." Although the group members collectively wrote about 60 songs for this album, only two or three of their compositions are likely to be included, including one Seidel wrote with Marcus Hummon. which, Maines says, has "a very Irish fiddle thing."

Maines says their only rule of thumb for choosing what makes it onto the album is that the song has to get five thumbs up, three from the group members and one each from the coproducers. For the new project, she says, "we really want to expand the harmonies, maybe make the three-part harmonies a little more interesting."

Maines says there have been discussions about Dixie Chicks being included on a soundtrack project in '99, which may serve as the bridge between their first and second Monument albums. They are also hoping to find time in their schedule to contribute to **Asleep At The Wheel's** second tribute album to **Bob Wills**. Since the Chicks have been known to perform "Roly-Poly" live, it is likely that is the Wills song they will record for the project.

Maines says the band struck a chord this year because its sound is "something different. People were ready for a change." While she says being a trio of attractive blondes may be what drove a lot of people to their music, their unique sound is what kept fans interested. She describes the group's music as "more rocking" than typical country fare, but, at the same time, getting "back down to the roots of it all. We get the younger people saying, 'We like you because you don't sound country,' and the older people saying, 'I like you because you're true country. That's one reason we don't go after the pop airplay, because we really are country girls. I'd rather be the rock stars of country than the lame asses of rock."

Although Maines joined the band three years ago and was not there during its days of playing on Dallas street corners for tips, she says even as recently as when she joined there was a feeling that the group was not yet prepared for success. "We're very grateful for the time it has taken, because we weren't ready," she says. Once the success did come, Maines says, "you get spoiled a little bit, [but] we keep each other grounded. If someone starts to think they're all that, there's two of us there to tell them, 'You're not.' " With group decisions still made by consensus, Maines says, "we all do a lot of give and take.'

The current single, "You Were Mine," is what convinced Maines to join a group once known for singing cowgirl songs and dressing the part. Sisters Erwin and Seidel wrote the wrenching song about their own parents' marital problems. Maines says the girls' mother "can't be too pleased that her life story is . . . on the radio."

After winning the two CMA Awards, Maines says there was a definite difference in how the group was perceived. Despite several other TV appearances, they couldn't get a shot on Leno's show

but finally got a call from that show's booker the day after the CMAs. After winning two big awards, "the price goes up a little bit, [but] it needed to because we weren't exactly overpriced," says Maines. Even after the awards, the group spent much of the rest of 1998 honoring commitments made before they were so successful.

Just before her interview with Country Airplay Monitor, Maines says, the group played "a 40th birthday party for someone and 75 of their closest friends. This year we fulfilled all the lame gigs we booked last year, so it's hard to get a big head."

Doing a radio tour last year also kept the group members humble. "It was a good thing for us to do, but it was very tiring to fly to three cities in one day and to always be on," says Maines. "I think it was [effective] because we were good at it. A lot of people do radio tours and still don't get played on the radio. But the music was there, and we're very genuine, so it worked for us."

Part of Maines' genuineness is that she's apt to say anything, including telling an off-color joke at a dinner for programmers at a radio convention, or calling the group "the country Spice Girls" and referring to the group members as "Easy Spice" and "Slutty Spice" during the New Faces show at Country Radio Seminar. She says her lack of inhibitions is one reason people relate to the group. "I used to just worry and worry over it, and I just don't anymore, because you can't make everyone happy."

Nontor BEST OF 998 MCA BASKS IN EIGHTH STRAIGHT LABEL HONOR

MCA VP of promotion **David Haley** had two goals in 1998: to be Country Airplay Monitor's No. 1 label of the year, and to repeat last year's feat of exceeding 1 mil-



t of exceeding 1 million spins on his product. As has been detailed several times in these pages this year, spin counts are down across the board, meaning no one not even MCA—hit the million mark, although MCA came within 150,000 spins

of the goal. But Haley and his staff can be deservedly proud of being named label of the year for the eighth consecutive time.

After 1997's "year of transition," in which the MCA promotion staff weathered numerous personnel changes, 1998 was a year of stability. Looking back over the year's successes, Haley mentions individual achievements from all of his label's top artists: Tracy Byrd, Trisha Yearwood, George Strait, Vince Gill, and Reba McEntire. But '98 was also the year MCA dropped Big House, George Jones, and others from its roster; lost the Mavericks to the label's pop division; and introduced two new artists, Keith Harling and Allison Moorer, with only moderate success. (Haley was, at press time, anticipating no significant changes in MCA Nashville's operation following the Universal/PolyGram merger.)

Asked what some of the biggest changes in the record business were this year, Haley says, "Maybe the most significant change is the fact that we are so slow to change. We keep doing things the same way we did them five years ago and expecting results that aren't coming."

On the radio side, Haley says, "we're obviously feeling the effect that everyone had talked about a few years ago of less

decision makers. I see it more and more every day, but there is always going to be a place for a regional promotion person working with the local station. That [relationship] is priceless."

Detailing the successes that helped make MCA the No. 1 label again in 1998, Haley mentions the airplay generated by Byrd, who kicked off a good year with "I'm From The Country," a top five record that garnered more than 85,000 spins and remained on the Country Airplay chart for 28 weeks. Ironically, that single was a last-minute addition to Byrd's album. After the completed project had been turned in, his management and the label decided Byrd needed one more hit. Haley recalls "a huge A&R meeting where over 100 song pluggers brought tunes in for the one slot." In the middle of last December, he cut "I'm From The Country," and it was released just a month later.

Another MCA accomplishment was "Trisha Yearwood maintaining her backto-back No. 1 success and the Country Music Assn., Academy of Country Music, and Grammy Awards," says Haley. "It was great to find that consistency again from '97 that carried her through to '98."

Haley continues, "I have to continue to praise George Strait, who last year was the No. 1 most-played artist of all for-

mats, across the board, and when you did the Detection Revolution issue [Airplay Monitor, Oct. 9], it was great to see him as the No. 2 most-played artist of all formats [in the Monitor era, '93-'98], only behind **Mariah Carey**." Haley says Strait managed to garner about 50,000 more detections in '98 than '97, with two fewer singles.

"We were extremely pleased at the No. 1 debut of Vince Gill's 'The Key,' the first time he's ever debuted an album at No. I, and [working the single] 'If You Ever Have Forever In Mind' was an exciting project," says Haley. He describes himself and MCA director of national promotion **Bill Macky** as "country music purists," so both were delighted to be working a record as country-sounding as Gill's first single from "The Key."

McEntire provided one of the year's biggest successes and, simultaneously, one of its biggest challenges with her chart-topping duet with Arista duo **Brooks & Dunn**, "If You See Him/If You See Her," which was included on simultaneously released albums from both artists. Haley says the project involved "an extensive marketing plan. Once we got the single to radio, it basically took care of itself. The real work was in the weeks leading up to the release of the albums. We had a series of three-hour meetings that went on for weeks, up to the release of the single, with management from both camps and both labels.

On the flip side, Haley says, "obviously we were disappointed with the lack of success we had on the second project from Big House. It was just rejected by country radio. One of the most frustrating statements we had coming back [from programmers] was, 'This is an album I love to play in my car or at home. I love to see them live, but I'm scared'" to put it on the air.

This year's Olivia Newton-John comeback was also a disappointment for MCA, but one Haley describes as "a calculated risk. It was one of those [situations where] we were either going to look like geniuses, or not look so good. Country radio sent a message back almost instantly that they were not interested in playing singles from this album. That was surprising because Olivia is an icon. She had so much publicity in the spring around the rerelease of 'Grease.' Ironically, Haley says, stations called with "a lot of requests for interviews" but gave the project no airplay; it did find some takers at AC and top 40. The label has no plans at this time for another country project from Newton-John.

MCA generated a small industry outcry this year when it parted ways with legendary artist George Jones (who has since been signed to Asylum), but while Haley says "the label on a whole got some flack, I'm sad to say I never had one country radio station or programmer comment on it. It's sad because he really turned in an incredible album this last time for MCA." Haley says Jones' departure from the roster was "unfortunately just a situation of economics."

Haley is proud of the progress MCA has made this year with Harling, who is on his third single from his debut album. After Giant act **the Wilkinsons**, Harling was the second-most-successful debut act of the year.

The label also released three singles this year from newcomer Moorer, and a fourth is planned in 1999. Although she

has not been as successful as Harling to date, the label is taking a more grassroots approach with Moorer, generating tour coverage as she plays dates with **Junior Brown** and "just trying to keep her visible to country radio. Our plan is for promotion to do something on a weekly basis to expose Allison in a way other than a chart number, [such as] making sure she is doing any featured new music shows, etc.," Haley says.

Despite the visibility of Moorer's performance in the film "The Horse Whisperer," Haley says breaking her "has been very challenging, like it has been with many new artists at radio. We're just going to step back, reload, and fire again."

Haley, who has been with MCA since 1991, says "promotion has never seemed easy to me," but he admits it's getting even harder, and that trying to break two new acts in the same year is now considered "ambitious. As the windows of opportunity get smaller you have to come up with other ways to break through," he says.

Looking ahead to 1999, Haley says he has "an incredible album coming from **Chely Wright**," including the uptempo first single, "Single White Female." Wright will be part of the 1999 Crown Royal tour, which kicks off in March.

In the spring, MCA will introduce newcomer Alecia Elliott, a Muscle Shoals, Ala., native who will turn 16 on Christmas Day. Haley describes her as "very grounded" with "a great family life." MCA president Tony Brown is producing her debut album.

NEXT STOP: SUPERSTAR STATUS FOR ARISTA

With the single "Too Close," Arista trio Next has achieved the top song of the year at mainstream R&B as well as crossover radio. While group members R.L., Tweety, and T-Low are happy with the song's huge success, R.L. says, "We feel we're still looked at as a group who had a hit song and not as a hit group yet.'

But with more than 1 million albums sold, it's likely people are getting to know Next. "Some people thought 'Too Close' was our first single, though 'Butta Love' was, and it did really well on radio, too," R.L. adds. "But back then, people didn't know who Next was. Now people know us-we just want them to know all our music.'

Although "Too Close" was released late last year, it continues to receive well over 500 spins a week at mainstream R&B radio, which, R.L. says, can have its advantages and disadvantages. " 'Too Close' blew up so large that radio wouldn't let it go. It can be frustrating, but we also appreciate the fact that we've gotten so much support on 'I Still Love You.'

'Too Close," produced by Naughty By Nature's Kay-Gee, was written to balance out the album's slow-groove tempo, says R.L., who admits that the song wasn't his initial choice for second single. "I'm not usually a big fan of uptempo R&B, but we knew this would be

a smash. The key to writing a hit record is, No. 1, not over-singing it. So many artists come out blowing like they did in church. The average person can't sing along with that. You also need to hold back a little-especially on ad-libs and riffs; save that for when you do it live.

"No. 2 is the melody, and No. 3 is the lyrics, the subject matter. If someone can listen to a song and relate to it, they're going to love it," he says.



Also working on the album were producers Prof T. and Lance Alexander, formerly of Perspective Records act Lo-Key? "Back home in Minnesota, we hooked up with Lance and them before we got the deal with Arista," says R.L. "We started the album with them. People describe this album as sexual. But it's not sexual; it's sensual. It's all in the creativeness in the language you use, like in a relationship. You have to be sensual and creative and not just sexual. That's what our albums are about.'

Each of the group's members is currently working on separate projects of his own: producing, a possible label deal for T-Low, and aspirations to get into acting. "But right now we still have to establish ourselves in the music thing,' says Tweetv.

And with another Next album already in the works, R.L., Tweety, and T-Low say the past year has taught them a great deal about the music industry. "We started working on the second album the day after we finished the first," says Tweety. "Even all year as we were on tour, we've been writing and coming up with ideas. It's just about done. It will be called 'Welcome To Nextasy.' Hopefully, it will be out by June.⁴

When we were working in the studio in Minnesota, we had candles and incense lit," says R.L. "We were just chillin', maybe with some ladies over, and playing video games in between work.

"But when we went to the East Coast to work with Kay, it was a total different vibe. Lots of people and noise and activity. We weren't totally comfortable. I think that came across in some of the vocals on the first album. Now, if you listen to the remix of 'I Still Love You,' you hear a very different Next singing. And that's what you'll hear on the new album.'

Not only does Brian McKnight hold the title of adult R&B artist of the year, with three charted hits, he had the adult R&B song of the year for the multi-format hit "Anytime." He also was in the top three for mainstream R&B artist of the year as well as crossover artist of the year, and "Anytime" was top five and No. 6 at mainstream R&B and crossover radio, respectively. And McKnight's album has gone doubleplatinum.

As his third release in five years, the album "Anytime" finally brought the mass-appeal success that eluded McKnight previously.


"A lot of what I was doing earlier in my career was probably a little ahead of the times," says McKnight. "Now the times have caught up to me. I also made a real conscious effort to make a commercial album this time around.

"Yet everything I did was pretty much the same as in the past. I'm still singing the same. I'm still writing and producing just about everything on the project. For whatever reason, people came around to what I was doing-the type of music that really started with Chuckii Booker, back around '91. Then there was me, then D'Angelo, and then Maxwell

"There is a real affinity now for the

singer/songwriter, sensitive-man thing," he says. "For a while, we were so bombarded with rap and gangsta themes, and everything had to have a hip-hop beat. I eople started to look for something a little different.'

Despite this success, McKnight says, you can never stop shaking hands and kissing babies. "All you have to do is look at those people who used to be bionic and decided to be a recluse, and



now they have to go back and start over. You can never disconnect from the people who make or break you. I'll be honest: I don't always love doing it, but this is my career and it's my responsibility. So even if the label

breaks down in some way, myself and my management team will persevere because we all believe in the project."

Ironically, McKnight has been through label transitions for every one of his albums. Most recently, he moved from Mercury to Motown late last year, when the former's R&B department was folded. This year, despite Motown's uncertain future, McKnight's album

attributed to his willingness to promote himself," says Waymon Jones, Motown's senior VP of promotion. "He makes our job easier.' McKnight, who currently has a recurring role on the TV sitcom "Sister Sishopes to gradually expand his cater," reer beyond music. "From my early 20s to now—I'll be 30 next year—I've been

putting my anchor down in music, and it's opened the doors for me to do other things. The challenge for me now is to move into acting more seriously. The thing about movies is that you have to really choose carefully. I've had some offers, but the first thing I do for the big screen, I want it to be something where people will say, 'Wow, I didn't know he could do that!'

The impending Seagram/PolyGram merger is expected to affect Motown dramatically, but luckily McKnight is in a position to decide where he wants to be, although no announcement had been made at press time. "Once all the negotiations are over after the top of the year, you could probably hear a new Brian McKnight single-hopefully if they do everything right—by next August or September," he says.



AIRPLAY HOT BES EVEN WITHOUT TOP GUNS, ARISTA SCORES ACROSS THE BOARD AT MAINSTREAM R&B

It's a clean sweep in '98 for Arista in mainstream R&B, as the label takes top honors for label of the year, with a total of 29 charted titles, as well as top artist (Usher) and biggest song (Next's "Too Close"). And don't let us leave out the top rap crown, with 25 charted titles.

Lionel Ridenour. senior VP of black music for Arista, acknowledges that "it's a real tribute when you have all four titles. And a large part of it is based on two acts that were very important to usone of those being a sophomore project



from Usher, and the other being a brandnew breakthrough artist in Next.

"New acts are definitely the lifeline of our industry . . . What people fail to realize is that during this great run that we've had—about three years now—we really didn't have any of our top guns out. It's been about us breaking baby acts. Before this year, we didn't have a Whitney Houston project or Toni Braxton or TLC ... The success we've had has all been with acts that no one really knew five years ago-Monica, Faith, Mase, Next, Total, 112, Deborah Cox, and even Puff Daddy," says Ridenour.

Ridenour also notes the leadership at Arista and its distributed labels helps to produce the "the crème de la crème" of music projects. "I think it's a tribute to the genius of the heads of all three labels-Clive Davis at Arista, L.A. Reid and Kenny Edmonds at LaFace, and Sean 'Puffy' Combs at Bad Boy. That's where it all starts. They each put so much time and effort into the projects personally, it would be criminal if we didn't work as hard as we do to try and make the records happen," he says.

The Arista R&B promotion team, which has been fairly consistent over the past several years, has recently gone through a series of changes, including the imminent departure of VP David Linton (to head Capitol Records' return to black music) and field national Butch Hartfield's move to DreamWorks as VP of promotion. "With success there are pitfalls, and one of those pitfalls includes the fact that other labels will come after the players on your team. Sometimes there are some golden opportunities for them, and you have to support their decision to move on," says Ridenour.

To balance out the moves, Arista has brought aboard former Motown exec James Cochran, Priority Records VP (and former Arista staffer) CeCe McClendon as senior national director. Stacy LaCroix as field national based in Atlanta, and Clifford Brown as West Coast regional. In-house, senior national Vanessa Barryer is promoted to VP of promotion, while L.A. regional Mike Avery moves to the Southwest region.

With several major artists' albums out now, including Houston's, Arista is heading into 1999 with a full plate. And there's more to come. Ridenour says, "There will be a TLC album in February, and we're looking forward to getting back to work with Toni Braxton." Other projects due include Naughty By Nature, which recently signed to Arista, and a Shanice Wilson project on LaFace. The label also recently signed a deal with Profile Records, bringing them DJ Quik, Run-D.M.C., and Camp-Lo.



where they started from. "George really took the label and turned it around in under one year. We started to see a real difference in making money in September. Our catalog sales exploded last month . . . but we have to understand that this isn't a performance issue. We can't take it personal. I have a great deal of respect for George and what our team has accomplished in 1998.'

DANA HALL

MOTOWN, ADULT LABEL OF THE YEAR, HANGS TOUGH

The close of 1998 is bittersweet for the promotion staff of Motown Records, Airplay Monitor's adult R&B label of the year, with 19 charted titles. While Motown also picks up top adult R&B artist and song for **Brian McKnight** and his breakthrough hit, "Anytime," its staffers were, at press time, still dealing with the uncertainty of the Universal/PolyGram restructuring. Waymon Jones, Motown's senior VP of promotion, says, "Despite all the turmoil, we've been able to main-



tain focus . . . but it's been tough." Last year at this time, the Mercury staff and roster were folded into Motown. "The very week we took 'Anytime' to No. 1, we had to lay off half the staff and transition over to Mo-

town. Fortunately, the upheaval didn't affect the momentum of the album, which went on to sell 1.3 million more records after Motown took over. The album is now double-platinum.'

The comeback story of the year was provided by a Motown legend, the Temptations, who enjoyed their biggest hit in at least a decade with "Stay." Jones says, "We hear it all the time in this industry that you haven't done anything if you haven't popped a new group. Well, we popped an old group and preserved a tradition. That's just as difficult in

"I give a lot of credit to [Motown president] George Jackson for not trying to overdo the record or over-mix it. We could have released a remix with someone rapping on it, but that would have sounded silly-that's not the Temptations," says Jones.

Although adult R&B radio is not often viewed as a format that breaks new records or artists, Jones contends that "instead of looking at adult R&B radio as a place you go when you fail at mainstream, we look at it as a starting point for many of our records, and that's part of the reason why we are so successful there. We make records for them," says Jones. "If that format knows we are going after them as a priority and not as just 'gravy,' then they appreciate that as well.

Motown also experienced some bad press when the members of super-group Boyz II Men publicly expressed their displeasure with the label over the support of their last album, "Evolution." Jones explains, "We have to remember, this has been a transition for Boyz II Men as well. We in the business tend to focus on how these label changes affect us, but it also affects the artists. They're dealing with a whole new company, a new set of people," says Jones. "I felt the 'Soul Food' soundtrack [on LaFace], which also featured 'A Song For Mama,' dramatically affected the Boyz II Men album sales.

Jones says he is most proud of what he and his staff were able to accomplish with McKnight and the Tempts, but he also notes that there were several baby acts on Motown that he hopes will get their due recognition soon. "Willie Max and Debelah Morgan are just at the beginning of their careers. We've been able to set up the imaging, but they are going to have to start all over again. A lot of us have a sense of what our personal fate might be with the company, so I'm sure there are discussions going on with the artists at this time as well.'

In question are the futures of such groups as 702, the entire Biv Ten roster, as well as legends Diana Ross, Smokey Robinson, and Stevie Wonder. Reports have several Motown groups, including Boyz II Men, heading to Universal, while speculation is that Kedar Massenburg will head up the new Motown, bringing his roster of "neoclassic soul" artists, including Erykah Badu and Chico DeBarge.

Jones says he's happy with the accomplishments of his staff, considering



Ask **Fastball's Miles Zuniga** about radio's acceptance of "The Way," which, among all the band's inroads at various formats, helped make it triple-A's highest-ranking new act, and he paraphrases "Saturday Night Live's" Chico Esquela character. "Radio been very, very good to me," he says.

On a more serious note, he admits, "I'd never in a million years thought we'd have a hit single. It's something I've always dreamed of, but the same way you might dream of getting to go out with the head cheerleader when you're drooling on yourself in school. You're a little nerdy guy or whatever. It's just never going to happen. Something really far away and unattainable It's the same feeling like, 'Maybe in my wildest dreams,' but probably not."

Zuniga remembers that "there was a lot of actual creative struggle between that song, because **Tony** [Scalzo, bassist/vocalist] wanted it one way. I wanted it another way. We fought it out. The producer added his two cents, and it all coalesced into this thing. It just came out.

"It was definitely a compromise and a lot of arguments and stuff, but it was totally worth it," he says. "And we didn't know it would be a hit . . . It came out completely different probably than anyone thought it would be. And I really think that's what



making music's all about."

Zuniga says dealing with the day-to-day implications of radio success is "a lot harder than it looks. Everybody thinks a successful band is just living in a sea of drugs, alcohol, *Continued on page 43*

CREED LEARNS THE ROPES FROM RADIO, VAN HALEN

Creed lead singer Scott Stapp confesses, "In our own ignorance, we just thought that if you got a record deal, you get huge and sell millions of records and you're going to be famous and it's going to be great ... We thought that that's what happened

to every band that got a record deal." Once the deal was signed, though, he



"realized that our lives had just begun, as opposed to just winning the lottery. Then our eyes kind of opened up, and we realized that, hey, we've got to work now. There's

tons of other bands. Just because you're on the radio doesn't mean you sell records."

But, ironically, "everything happened how we thought it was going to happen anyway. It was like a fury tale come true," Stapp says. Airplay was always a goal for the band.

"We always wanted to be on the radio," says

Stapp. "We thought that the best venue for people to hear our music, besides a live show, would be on the radio. So, that was something that we really wanted to work close with and let [programmers] know that we appreciated them and that we wanted to continue giving them songs that they could play... It's part of your rock'n'roll fantasy: to drive down the street and turn on the radio and hear yourself."

Still, his first experience hearing his band on the air may not have been quite as envisioned. It was back in the group's Tallahassee, Fla., days, when a local station played its song on a local-music specialty show. "We were an unsigned band, and they had gotten a copy of 'My Own Prison," Stapp says. "We were all sitting around there, and they were like, 'Next, coming up, local band Creed' ... We've got 'play' and 'record' on there, and we've got girls over there that we're trying to impress, like, 'Yeah, we're on the radio.'

"And the DJ comes back on and goes, 'Yeah, I bet these four guys are sitting at home right now, with a bunch of chicks they just brought over ,trying to impress them' ... We all kind of looked at each other, like, 'Oh my God, we're busted'...." A little over a year since Creed caught fire, Stapp says, he's developed some great relationships with programmers, staying in touch with some on a regular basis. "I've got PDs that have just had children, and I talk with them about, 'Does your kid do this?' And we've actually become pretty good friends through the whole experience."

Playing the radio show circuit allowed Creed to meet heroes Van Halen. Stapp remembers as a 9-year-old seeing the band on TV and "standing on the coffee table like [David Lee] Roth," while guitarist Mark Tremonti was "emulating Eddie Van Halen."

"To actually get to meet those guys and just realize that they're just regular down-toearth guys like we are" was a high point of Stapp's year. "Eddie came to our dressing room, [and] we all hung out for a couple of hours, and he talked and we joked around.

"It was a really positive experience, and I think it was good for them to do to us, because it's almost like passing the torch of respect and how you should treat other bands ... It was almost like they were showing us the ropes a little bit and letting us know that you can be cool to other bands."

NOT JUST A RADIO HITMAKER, BUT A CUSTOMER

For Semisonic's Dan Wilson, whose band was the top new modern breakthrough of 1998, radio was there for him long before it made "Closing Time" a hit single. "I've always listened to the radio, much more than anyone else I know," he says. "It's always been my main source of musical enjoyment and inspiration." Raised in Minneapolis, Wilson cites **KDWB** (for "the pop thing") and heritage rocker **KQRS** for its constant companionship during his formative years.

Even before the group signed with MCA, its demo tape, which had been circulating among friends, found its way to a local radio station. "That was extremely exciting," says Wilson. "We had worked so hard on the songs but never expected to hear them on the radio. When [**KEGE**] the



Edge played it, it was a complete surprise, very fulfilling.

"Radio has definitely changed since my

childhood," continues Wilson. "Artists today are seen as the purveyors of the one, fun hit single. They are not expected to have depth or longevity." The guitarist points to **Smashing Pumpkins'** "Mellon Collie And The Infinite Sadness" as an example of a project that transcends radio's hit-driven mind-set. "It's rare for an album like that to come along in the rock realm, something that at least aspires to be grand and huge and inspiring. 'Mellon Collie' was a complete work; it was about more than just one or two popular songs."

Wilson lived in Boston in the mid-1980s and credits **WFNX** and **WBCN** for exposing him to new music. "There was a lot of excitement in radio back then," he says. *Continued on page 53*

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Kentor Ke COLUMBIA HITS HOME WITH OLD


From legends like Aerosmith to newcomers like Our Lady Peace, Columbia charted 16 titles at album radio in 1998 at the direction of senior VP of rock promotion

Jim Del Balzo, Chris Woltman, and Trina Tombrink.

Despite Aerosmith's format perennial status, Del Balzo savs the success of "I Don't Want To Miss A Thing" was not a foregone conclusion. "A [ballad] is not a slam-dunk. A lot of

DEL BALZO guys told us when it first came out, 'I don't

play ballads. "Crazy" and "Amazing" don't work for us anymore,' Del Balzo says. "We basically said, "This is a hit, and I don't care what happened before. The reason why



they're not on your radio station today is because you played them so many times before, [and] people got tired of hearing them. It doesn't mean they weren't hits when they were currents.'

Columbia overcame PDs' protests that Stabbing Westward's "Save Yourself" was too edgy to "the point where at a lot of radio stations now, they're almost a core act," says Del Balzo. Also despite initial PD objections, Columbia brought Our Lady Peace from selling 80,000 units of its Relativity album to 700,000 units-plus on the strength of "Clumsy," fueled by the band's relentless touring.

While the music is different, Del Balzo likens OLP to Bon Jovi on the verge of its breakthrough. "You knew that if Jon and the band delivered the right record, which happened to be 'Slippery When Wet,' they were going to explode. Our Lady Peace is at the point that if they deliver the right record next time, they're going to explode," Del Balzo says.

Jerry Cantrell presented a different artistdevelopment challenge to Del Balzo and staff. "We have to take an act from this huge mega-band and get another band out of that, to the point that in another album or two albums, hopefully, Jerry will be at the point that he's selling 4 million records," Del Balzo says.

On the disappointment side was Bruce Springsteen. "Radio worries too much about research [and] not about ticket sales [or] the importance of an artist," he says. "They have other agendas . . . I get that. But it doesn't make it any easier for me to accept."

He calls the loss of WRCX Chicago "a terrible thing," noting that none of the top three markets have active rockers. That causes labels to "think twice about mainstream rock bands," he says. "It's easier to sign an alterantive-leaning band, because the rewards tend to be quicker . . . If we had a bunch of stations like WXTM in St. Louis, it would be a lot easier to break rock records.'

CAPITOL'S 2 BRIANS CREDIT IG, STRONG TE

When Capitol's two Brians, MacDonald and Corona, look at the success they had this year with the likes of Everclear, Beastie Boys, Marcy Playground, and Radiohead, Corona compares his label to the 1998 Yankees.

The bands are the players, he's the pitching coach, and Mac-Donald is Joe Torre.

In the upper-management office are former label head Gary Gersh, senior VP of A&R Perry Watts-Russell, and promotion boss Phil Costello. "Without all



these other people, these things wouldn't have happened," says Corona, senior director of national promotion.

For MacDonald, VP of alternative promotion, timing is key. He's learned that Capitol's approach to artist development all boils down to, "When do you pull the trigger to take that record to other formats?'

With Everclear's third album, "we're on their third single, 'Father Of Mine,' " Mac-Donald says, "and this is really the first real serious push at pop radio."

While some see modern as a starter format, to MacDonald it's where you build your core. "If you super-serve them patiently," he says, "album to album, track to track to track, then you get these seemingly out-of-nowhere explosions: Radiohead dropping 50,000 units first week, Beasties dropping 680,000 first week. It's not out of nowhere, because [we've] been patient and really given the term 'artist development' its true definition.'

When a label rushes a first single to pop, 'you can't develop the core," says MacDonald. "Labels as much as radio create one-hit wonders.'

MacDonald has developed Beastie Boys

over three albums, remembering back to the quizzical responses from programmers to the release of "Check Your Head."

Even in 1998, "Half the panel came in pretty good on 'Intergalactic,' " says Corona, "but the others were



fighting us," even after the sales success. McDonald is amazed by modern's persistent resistance to even those acts that garner big sales numbers. "Think of the bands that don't have nearly the cachet that the Beasties have-

that are reaching people and touching people but just don't have those numbers yet, that maybe never break through that. It's not cool."

Barenaked Ladies named their 1997 live album "Rock Spectacular," but it was 1998 that became the group's truly spectacular year. And for Reprise senior director of adult formats Alex Coronfly, triple-A was integral to the story. Coronfly supports the format's support of Barenaked Ladies going back to "The Old Apartment," "If I Had \$1,000,000," and "Jane." It was a pretty good year also for Reprise, which exploded on the triple-A charts with 11 tracks to its credit.

Barenaked Ladies have been brewing at the label for years. "You talk about artist development," says Coronfly. "I don't think there's any denying that radio has any doubts that Barenaked Ladies is on Reprise Records, because our locals have been so

tenacious for the last five or six years about this band. They've had so much passion for it. I think the passion translated this year to radio.¹

And "Rock Spec-tacular" may well have been the catalyst. Coronfly sees the live version of "Brian Wilson" almost as a setup track for "One Week" and "Stunt." "We knew we had a great song with 'One

ing response this song has gotten has been a great gift for us," says Coronfly.

from Chris Isaak and Eric Clapton, including the latter's seven-week No. 1 "My Father's Eyes," but its most surprising triple-A hit was Green Day's "Time Of Your Life (Good Riddance)." Coronfly remembers, "When I came to Reprise, the first thing I did was I sat in Steve Tipp's office, and I said, 'You're going to think I'm on crack, but I think we can work Green Day at the format.' " In fact, he praises Tipp, Rich Fitzgerald, and Howie Klein for being triple-A-friendly and backing him on chances such as Green Day. Coronfly adds, "Triple-A is a lifestyle format, and I'm not saying Green Day was right for all triple-A stations, but for 80% of the panel, it was perfect . . . It's really about the song.'

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





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Intor KES MATCHBOX 20 WINS RAD

Its debut album may have come out in May '97, but Atlantic Records act matchbox 20 lighted an airplay bonfire at radio in 1998. The most-played act at the mainstream top 40, adult top 40, and modern adult formats charted four singles this year, including two in the top 10 of each format. "3 AM" was the year's No. 2 song at mainstream top 40 and No. 4 at adult top 40 and modern AC. "Real World" was No. 6 at modern adult and No. 8 at mainstream top 40 and adult top 40.

Translation at retail: 7 million records and counting. Such success isn't "something we're aware of all the time," lead singer Rob Thomas told Billboard's Chuck Taylor this year. "You enjoy it, but it doesn't seem at all like it's real. Little pieces of it are what you thought it might be, but you never consider



that everything is still going to go on in your daily life. So, now I'll be famous Rob, but the real Rob still has to keep going through the day, getting things accomplished, just like always.

Matchbox 20 finished a grueling twoyear-plus touring schedule last summer, then embarked on a press tour in Europe.

Throughout the act's climb up the charts. "we've kept the same audience [on tour]; it just grew," Thomas says. "There have al-ways been 13-year-old girls and their mothers, frat boys, and businessmen. We love it, and it's great that all these ages are getting into the music. When we started, there were 10 people, but they were a diverse 10. Now there may be a thousand, and they're still diverse, only louder."

As for the future, Thomas believes that the band members' low-key, "regular guy" background and image will enable them to extend their success, as it forces the audience to concentrate on their music. "Every now and then, bands like us that are so-called hip, that don't have a gimmick, are lucky enough to squeak by," he explains. "We just hope people listen to our body of songs and take them as they are."

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Verve or somebody, and I think that's a good diet. I like radio stations where the playlist isn't so strict and regimented. I was lucky to get my musical education from being in a good town. Not everybody has that. It'd be neat if radio stations could also help educate MARC SCHIFFMAN people."

So much for the so-called "sophomore jinx." After a gold debut album that produced a top 10 hit, LaFace/Arista phenom Usher came through with "My Way," an album that boasted three of the top 11 rhythmic top 40 songs

and three of the top 40 crossover hits of 1998. In all, the 20-year-old Chattanooga, Tenn., native was the mostplayed artist for both rhythmic top 40 and crossover formats.

Usher's triple-play featured "Nice & Slow," "You Make Me Wanna ...," and "My Way," which were Nos. 5, 8, and

11, respectively, in rhythmic top 40 and Nos. 4, 15, and 32 in crossover. "I could definitely tell this record was going to be something

special," Usher says. "I put a lot of time and dedication into getting it right. After every late-night recording, I'd get up the next morning and make sure I got the right feel to the music, until it finally came together."

The singer credits executive producer Jermaine Dupri and guest producers Babyface and Teddy Riley for providing just the right collaborative atmosphere. "It took a long time, but I had dope producers who let me collaborate with them on a lot of ideas, then Jermaine would just let me run with them.

"I can't pick any favorites," he says of the repertoire. "But I did play the songs to everyone, from people who don't normally listen to this music to kids-the fans I really have to worry about-and their parents. I need their approval, too. I don't want my music to be too risqué or raunchy."

Expect Usher to exert even more oversight on his music in the future. "I'm always coming up with more ideas," he says. "It'll be interesting to try different ways of doing music. I want to do a few new things and do more of them my way. I'll work with a few more people, too.'

However, his music plans are on the back burner, as Usher will be making his presence known on the silver screen, beginning with an acting part in the Robert Rodriguez science-fiction film "The Factory." After that come roles in the Babyface and Tracey Edmonds feature "Light It Up" and an untitled project with director Forest Whitaker.

"I will go on tour next year, as well as do a lot of soundtrack work," Usher adds. "I'm young, but I look at it as being in my prime. Michael Jackson was between 20 and 23 when he did a lot of his best stuff, so I'm going to keep it moving.'

and pleasure-and that's there," he quips, "but that's only a piece of the pie. There's a lot of work that goes on behind the scenes that you never hear about until you're actually doing it. And it's pretty grueling. It's no surprise that bands break up right after they've had a big record."

He sees it as more than just a job, because "it's like 24 hours a day, basically, because you're away from home and you've got to be on top of it at 8 in the morning for that TV show or at midnight for the actual show, and then people want to talk to you after the gig. And you don't want to be an asshole, because they're buying your records, and I'm totally grateful to anybody who's going to buy my record or buy a ticket to the gig.

"I don't have that English attitude," he says. "I guess if you're from England, you

feel like it's your birthright to be famous; people should just kiss your ass."

Toiling in the vibrant music scene of Austin, Texas, Zuniga "always thought you would turn the corner, and then you'd be on easy street. That was my illusion, just get to this point and then it's all smooth sailing, but what you realize is you're just in a different pond now. Now you have to compete with Madonna and Garth Brooks, and they're ass-kickers. You're like, 'Oh, my God. I was just competing with all these other wannabe bands. All of a sudden now I'm on a chart with Snoop and Wu-Tang. It's tough.''

Maybe toughest of all were the radio shows. "I remember the first was in Atlanta," Zuniga says, recalling a summer gig in front of 15,000 people. "We've only been in the public consciousness maybe two months. A lot of people don't even know who we are.

And you have to go up there, and all of a sudden you're on this huge stage. You don't have any pyrotechnics or whatever. You don't get to fly above the crowd. All those things that help bring the show home, we didn't have.

"There's also this ritual that goes on, which is throwing shit at the band, that they do to every band, to sort of test your mettle-just bored kids. So that was my first encounter with projectiles and how to move around to avoid them. I think that's part of the reason Mick Jagger moves the way he does. He's so used to dodging bottles that he bobs his head back and forth. It's hard to get a bead on him.'

Living in Austin, Zuniga is a fan of triple-A KGSR. "I like that you can get rootsy music," he says. "You can get real traditional Los Lobos or whatever, and then they'll play the

Monitor BEST OF 98 MULTIPLE HITS FROM ALL GENRES POWER COLUMBIA TO TOP 40 LABEL CROWN

It was nip and tuck all the way, but when the last spin was counted, Columbia Records triumphed as the mainstream top 40 label of the year. Leading the charge of its 17 chart records were **Will Smith's** four hit singles and two apiece



from **Savage Garden** and **Aerosmith**. Savage Garden's "Truly Madly Deeply" was the third-most-played single in the format, with Aerosmith's soundtrack smash, "I Don't Want To Miss A Thing," coming in at No. 5. The label's senior VP Jerry Blair and senior VP of promotion Charlie Walk credit, as Blair says, "an amazing, wide spectrum of music," from artists as disparate as Aerosmith, Lauryn Hill, Savage Garden, Smith, and the Offspring for Columbia's triumph. Ironically, "we didn't know what we had on our platter at the beginning of the year," Blair says. "Aerosmith's 'Armageddon' single turned out to be very special, and no

one knew the magnitude of the response for Lauryn Hill. Without any expectations, our staff just worked hard every day. They knew their markets and loved the music."

Walk adds, "Our job was to make every single tastemaker in music radio hear our music. Yet every single was treated differently. There was no such thing as an easy record. With Will Smith's 'Gettin' Jiggy Wit It,' people said it wouldn't work, because he didn't have 'Men In Black' behind it. Some programmers wanted to edit the biggest hook of the song out. After that single broke, we heard some of the same complaints about the follow-up, 'Just The Two Of Us.' [Some said] it was too slow and had too much rap. It was almost like starting over."

The closest thing to a sure thing was Savage Garden's "Truly Madly Deeply," which took off from a base established

by "I Want You" and the first go-round for "To The Moon And Back." " 'Truly Madly Deeply' was the culmination of all three songs," Walk notes. "Savage Garden became very important to the kids, because their album had multiple hits."

Blair explains, "That's how we develop artists and their careers. With each album, we build a bigger base as the multiple hits continue the growth of the artist."

UNDER NEW VP MAFFEI, ARISTA RULES RHYTHMIC AND CROSSOVER AGAIN

Arista once again flexed its considerable skills at rhythmic music promotion in 1998, winning label of the year honors on the rhythmic top 40 and crossover charts—the latter being broken out separately from rhythmic this

year. Three of rhythmic top 40's top 10 acts were Arista's—**Usher** (No. 1), **Next** (No. 2), and **Monica** (No. 8), with **Total** coming in at No. 21. Usher and Next were also Nos. 1 and 2 in crossover.

Tom Maffei didn't assume Arista's VP of crossover promotion post until Feb-

ruary, yet it didn't take him long to grasp the label's massive clout. "[The promotion staff] is a machine," he says. "1'm working with the best people in the business, who know how to maximize records and squeeze every possible spin out of each one."


Maffei admits that he "didn't expect Next's 'Too Close' to be as big as it became, but once it got locked in, radio



couldn't get rid of it. We had a pretty good idea how [Usher's] 'You Make Me Wanna . . .' was going to turn out, and 'Nice & Slow' kept that momentum going. However, some people were initially worried that 'My Way' wasn't going to be as strong as the first two, so we fought to make sure radio picked up on it.

"Beyond that, though, their success is a testament to both Usher and Next, who are such incredible people," Maffei continues. "They did a lot of radio and, in fact, did everything they needed to do to succeed."

In fact, Maffei's biggest challenge was in spacing the bevy of hits. "We looked for telltale signs on when the records are just about to hit, then we went full-



force to maximize them," he says. "Video exposure and sales also play into this; it gave radio additional ammunition to power them up and provide maximum play." Besides the

just-released Whitney Houston album,

Arista will have a live Usher album for '99, as well as new product from **Deborah Cox**, Next, and Monica, among many others.

"It's going to be phenomenal," Maffei says. "We'll have a lot to talk about next year, too."

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Contor BEST AC ARTIST TITLE JUST ONE JEWEL IN DION

To the surprise of absolutely no one, Celine Dion was the most-played artist on AC radio in 1998. For the record, two of her songs, "My Heart Will Go On" and "To Love You More," finished the year as the Nos. 5 and 8 most-played songs on the format, respectively. Dion's duet with Barbra Streisand, "Tell Him," was the No. 35 song.

Yet those honors are just part of a year full of superlative achievements for the French Canadian. Her latest album, "Let's Talk About Love," has gone eighttimes platinum. Her contribution to the "Titanic" soundtrack was largely responsible for that record selling 25 million units worldwide. What's more, her 29-date U.S. tour grossed \$35 million; she performed duets with Streisand, Luciano Pavarotti, the Bee Gees, R. Kelly (currently the no. 1 single at AC), Paul Anka, and George Martin; and she performed on VH1's "Divas Live" concert. And don't forget her French-language album and the just-released Christmas record.

"I didn't want to record another album after [the 1996 Grammy-winning] "Falling Into You," Dion told Billboard's Chuck Taylor earlier this year, "but we couldn't refuse all the opportunities. People kept sending great songs. 'Titan-



ic' came, and then all those duets . Then came the Christmas album and the tour.

'In show business, timing is the most important thing," she continues. "I've been trying to take a break for years, but it could wait. There's just been no perfect time yet.'

However, that time is coming in the foreseeable future. "I started working when I was 13," she says. "Now I'm 30, and the longest I've ever stopped is a month. I need to have a normal life for a while, to spend some time with [husband and manager] Rene [Angelil] while we're both young at heart. I want to cook at home, to picnic, to swim in my pool. I need time to be sick and time to recover, time to take a car and listen to music when I'm going nowhere.

The time off will also replenish her creative juices. "I don't ever want to be bored with show business and going onstage," Dion states. "I need time to miss it. And I don't want people to get tired of me.'

deep that I can't even comment on it, other than to say that it is both startling and beautiful."

Since "Closing Time," Wilson has been 'amazed by how full the days have become. When we were not in demand, I had all day to go to the local coffee shop and sit around writing lyrics. Now there are demands on every day just to keep the momentum going." He is considering taking a few months off in 1999 to write songs for Semisonic's next release.

"I keep thinking about airports and lonely customs lines," says Wilson, who has seen more than his share of both this past year. "I have a feeling that all of this traveling is going to bring a lot of new imagery to the music. I'm just not sure how, yet."

BACKSTREET BOYS GROW UP AT AC RADIO

While teen acts have maintained a steady presence at top 40 over the last two years, 1998 was the year that PDs began to worry that their upper-demo appeal was waning. Kids and parents, PDs said, were again drifting apart.

So more than a few eyebrows will be raised when those PDs actually see this year's list of top AC acts and discover that the second-most-played act was none other than the Backstreet Boys. The so-called teen-appeal group had three hits in the top 30: "As Long As You Love Me" (No. 6), "I'll Never Break Your Heart" (No. 17), and "Quit Playing Games (With My Heart)" (No. 19).

"It's unbelievable," Howie Dorough of the Backstreet Boys noted when Billboard's Melinda Newman caught up with him at the Billboard Music Awards. "It means so much to be [honored] in the AC category . . . We're putting out music we hope everybody would like. We're young boys, we have all the time

teen appeal, mind you. And judging by the high-decibel reaction they get wherever they play, they don't have much of a choice in the matter. "It's definitely a compliment to have all these screaming young girls," group member Nick Carter said earlier this year. "But at the same time, we feel our music is for everybody. We want it to be for young, old, black, white, anything. [Now] we're starting to see adults getting into it. We love that, to be respected by older people."

More than 8 million records sold and three AC hits can engender a lot of respect these days.

"Each station wanted to be the one that would bring the new, cool thing to your ears first." He is less enthusiastic about radio in the '90s. "There seems to be a constant struggle to keep variety afloat. Every time a station tries to expand into something a little more adventurous, they get crushed under the corporate wheels, or they can't seem to make enough money.

"But," he adds, "that may be ending. I have high hopes that we're exiting this

phase of radio life where everything is about trifles-little treats-and more about long-term careers for artists and meaningful, thoughtful music.¹

Wilson describes Semisonic's visits to radio stations around the country as being "incredible opportunities to get to know the people who listen to our music." An appearance on the syndicated "Lovelines" was particularly memorable. Wilson recalls that the first caller the members of the band took "was a fan of Trip Shakespeare [Wilson and bassist John Munson's pre-Semisonic band]. We were stunned. It makes you realize that there are people out there who are really paying close attention to what you are doing.

"It amazes me to hear fans open up to us, telling us how useful our music has been in their life, psychologically or emotionally. People tell us how they share Semisonic songs with their friends, to show people how they feel." Wilson describes fans' reaction to his songs as "so


Montor BEST OF '98 Shania's crossover propels mercury to adult contemporary label crown

To paraphrase Marie Osmond, a little bit of country helped Mercury Records become the No. 1 AC label in 1998. Much of the credit has to go to country hitmaker Shania Twain, who was the No. 4 AC artist on the strength of "You're Still The One" (the second-

most-played AC song of the year) and "From This Moment On" (No. 31).

"We started working 'You're Still The One' Jan. 5, and it was a daily grind," Mercury senior VP of promotion Steve Ellis



says. "There never was a turning point for the record. We were persistent and paid constant attention until it peaked in July. 1 credit [VP of adult top 40/AC promotion] Kerry Wood and the nevergive-up attitude of our local staff, who worked the record in all formats." What resistance there was to country crossovers disappeared with the release of "From This Moment On" in August. "The obstacles weren't there anymore, as Kerry set up the record really well,

and it delivered quickly," Ellis notes. As of Nov. 20, it was bulleted at No. 2. Of course, Twain alone couldn't have

brought the AC crown to Mercury. Also contributing were John Tesh's "Give Me



Forever" (No. 11) and "Mother I Miss You" (No. 40), Vanessa Williams' "Oh How The Years Go By" (No. 24), and Lionel Richie's "Time" (No. 27).

Again, Ellis credits Wood for setting up the records. "We had the best person in the chair. She and her locals got the most out of our product. With Lionel, our people did some nice promo runs, and there's no better promotional tool than Lionel himself, who made a lot of friends in radio."

Ellis also praises AC PDs for not playing it too safe. "We never assumed they would, because we've seen AC step out

on some records that other formats initially didn't," he says. "They took their chances when it came to breaking certain records, and they paved the way for our artists to break into other formats as well."

ATLANTIC'S GANIS PRAISES MODERN AC, ADULT TOP 40'S NEW VISION

Two out of three turned out to be pretty damn good for Atlantic Records in 1998. The label, which came within a whisker of winning the mainstream top 40 label honors for the fourth year in a row (Columbia won), managed to repeat as the adult top 40 and modern adult king.



Five acts gave Atlantic 14 chart hits at adult top 40 and 13 at modern AC.

Complementing **matchbox 20**, the most-played act on adult top 40, modern AC, mainstream top 40, and even triple-A, were

• Edwin McCain—No. 10 at adult top 40 and modern adult, No. 33 at adult top 40, and No. 40 at modern adult. • Sugar Ray—No. 23 at adult top 40 and No. 27 at modern adult.

• **Hootie & the Blowfish**—No. 30 at adult top 40 and No. 32 at modern adult.

"We were certainly fortunate to have exceptional artists, such as matchbox 20 and Edwin McCain, leading the charge over the airwaves, as they each went on to have banner years," executive VP Andrea Ganis states. "We all felt like proud

parents when Edwin earned his first gold album and matchbox 20 rocketed to ... seven-times-platinum."

Ganis, who also cites the label's recent success with **Jewel** and Hootie, is quick to point out that Atlantic doesn't view adult top 40 and modern adult as mere stepping stones to mainstream top 40 success. "We don't look at our records formatically," she notes. "Whenever a station reports good research on a record, or where we see sales strength in a market, we really go for it. That way, we were able to break matchbox 20 from rock radio, while we broke Edwin McCain from airplay on a variety of stations, primarily in the South.

"Of course, these achievements were made possible in great part by the esteemed group of programmers whose vision has made

to be reckoned with, along with those who have forged modern AC into a thriving, viable new format," Ganis continues. "In major markets and beyond, these stations turn listen-




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
