NYC Without Country Radio: LP Sales Off, But Less Than Nation

It has been nearly three months since WYNY New York played its last country song, leaving the No. 1 market without a country radio outlet. Despite endless speculation and rounds of rumors, no other station in New York has yet stepped up to the country plate, and only one station in a remote part of the adjacent Long Island, N.Y., market, WLIE, has taken up the format, albeit a syndicated version, joining the Island's existing satellite AM daytimer WGSM.

So what has life been like in New York without country radio? It depends on whom you ask.

If your focus is on album sales, the news isn't good. According to extrapolations of SoundScan figures, there were 34,615 country albums sold each week in the New York designated market area in 1995. So far this year, however, country albums have been selling there at a rate of about 27,667 per week, a loss of almost 7,000 units weekly. Considering that those figures take into account the month of January, when WYNY was still on the air, the actual dropoff in sales since WYNY's demise is probably even greater.

Those losses are not as dramat-

ic, however, when compared to country album sales nationwide during that period. Eddie Reeves, executive VP/GM at Warner Bros., has been keeping track of those figures weekly. According to his research data, sales in New York in WYNY's last six weeks averaged 2.18% of the total number of country albums sold. But in the station's first 11 weeks off the air, country albums sold in New York actually averaged 2.51% of the nationwide total, an increase of .33%.

"In a market like New York City, there is the possibility that how people become aware of country music is a lot of other ways [besides radio]," says Reeves. "If there's country fans there, they may be still looking for their country music and buying it. But in the long run, I think, there will more of a sales impact."

The 415,000 country albums sold this year in the New York DMA as of April 14 is actually an impressive figure, considering that there is little opportunity for the music to be exposed. Penetration for cable video outlet CMT is just 34.9% of TV households in the New York DMA. Sister network TNN, whose programming is only partly music-based,







Billboard Online Brings Monitors Along

Billboard Online is now available on the Internet's World Wide Web. And it's bringing Airplay Monitor coverage with it.

The subscriber service provides full-text access to current Billboard stories and charts as well as a fully searchable archive of Billboard articles dating back to 1991 and more than 22,000 charts dating back to 1983. The service also is adding news from the Top 40 and Rock Airplay Monitors to its growing list of archived offerings. Articles from the Country and R&B Monitors already are part of the database.

Until now, Billboard Online archives have been available only to those who purchased a password to a private, dial-up service. Now Internet users around the world can access Billboard Online at <http://www.billboard-online.com>. The ID and password are free, and users can choose from among two billing options:

• The "Music Lover Plan" costs \$9.95 per month and provides access to charts and articles from the current issue of Billboard and articles from the four current Airplay Monitors. Users pay an additional 75 cents for each complete article or chart they view, print, or save. There is no charge for searching or scrolling through headlines.

• The "Professional Plan" provides access to all of Billboard Online's searchable databases for \$19.95 per month. Users pay fees ranging from

50 cents to \$1 to view, print, or save individual files in the database. Again, there is no charge for searching or scrolling.

In addition to data from Airplay Monitor and Billboard, Billboard Online offers considerable data from the magazines published by parent company BPI Communications, including global concert information from Amusement Business and European sales and airplay charts from Amsterdam-based Music & Media. Billboard Online also includes Canadian charts from RPM; gold and platinum sales histories from the Recording Industry Assn. of America; and artist biographies from "The All-Music Guide."

In addition to these subscriber features, the Billboard Online Internet site is packed with free attractions, including a Daily Music Update for those who can't wait for the latest industry news. The Web site includes Chart Beat Chat, the online home of Fred Bronson, author of Billboard's weekly Chart Beat column. Bronson posts a new trivia question each week and answers reader questions sent to him via E-mail.

New Albums I Listen To On My Own Time

L

et's discuss music.

Sure, I've written plenty about the business side of music, and the stylistic/creative aspects of the tunes. And I've been known to preach a little about radio, too. But I've never just let it fly about certain stuff that I'm crazy about. I'm talking about the stuff I listen to when I'm not at the office or at a label listening party or tuned in to the radio.

Those who know me well already know about the albums I hold dear. The ones they'll pry from my cold, dead fingers . . . you get the idea. The majority of those still include surface noise, by the way. (God bless the labels that have active catalog departments. My pops and skips are being replaced by remastered masterpieces, but altogether too slowly to suit me.)

With all the complaints about new country music aside, I thought it might be fun to share some thoughts about the newer material I listen to after 5 p.m. I'm also interested in what you're listening to. Make a list of your own, and stick it in the fax machine.

1. "Borderline," by Brooks & Dunn: This is the Brooks & Dunn album I think we've all been waiting for. Aside from being the most balanced new album I've heard in a while, Kix Brooks never sang better when featured on lead vocals. How many singles do you hear? Six, maybe seven. I'll hold my breath until "I Am That Man" is in heavy rotation everywhere.

2. "Girl Of Your Dreams," by Bobbie Crenner: This record has been like a port in a female country storm for me. It contains well-written, mature themes aimed at a part of the audience with slightly more refined thematic tastes. It's

been a long time since an album by a woman vocalist moved me this profoundly. (By the way, where are you, K.T. Oslin?)

3. "Keith Gattis": I'll never live long enough to understand why much of the industry consistently feels it has outgrown this kind of heartfelt, unapologetic honky-tonk. I'm vindicated when something like this emerges. Too country? What does that mean? It's like too much money; there's no such thing. It's like a girl too pretty . . .

4. "Time Marches On," by Tracy Lawrence: One Nashville reviewer claims he doesn't understand the appeal of this guy's voice or how it made Lawrence a star. "Thin" is the word he used to describe it, I believe. You know what they say: Some people wouldn't know real country if it bit them. Lawrence bit me the first time I heard him sing, and this album should be spinning three generations from now. I officially cast my vote for "Is That A Tear" to be the next single.

5. "Wanted! The Outlaws," by Waylon Jennings, Willie Nelson, Jessi Colter, and Tompall Glaser: OK, so it isn't new, but it is being reissued by Nipper to commemorate 20 years since it became Nashville's first platinum album. The first copy I had was an 8-track. The second and third copies were vinyl (I selflessly lent one to a pal who never returned it). RCA reissued this as a budget-line item several years ago, but trimmed two cuts from the original sequence. This time, the Outlaws return with all the original songs, plus nine unreleased tracks, and a new Waylon & Willie duet, written and produced by Steve Earle. This is one of a select few that if I can't take with me, I'm not going.

RADIO ACTIVE BY PHYLLIS STARK

Mullins, Hunter Start New Promo Venture

Moon Mullins is shuttering his consultancy this week to launch a new venture with former Giant promotion chief Nick Hunter. The Hunter/Moon Group will do promotion and marketing for label clients as well as national call-out research. The staff will include Dallas-based regional Randy Chapman (a former Magnatone regional) and Pittsburgh-based regional Mark Wallace, a one-time Warner Bros. rep. The company's number as of April 29 will be 615-371-6146. Mullins' two associates, Michael O'Malley and Keith Hill, will continue with their current clients, and O'Malley will pick up Mullins' stations.

Bruce Raven-Stark has been named GM at Chancellor's KLAC/KZLA Los Angeles effective April 29. Raven-Stark was GM at Viacom's KDBK and its successor, KSRV San Francisco, from 1991-95 and previously managed KBSS Seattle. He succeeds J.D. Freeman, who's now at AC KDMX Dallas.

Allan Chlowitz, GM at Chancellor's KNEW/KSAN San Francisco, adds those duties at duopoly partners KABL/KBGG, replacing Bruce Blevins. Blevins had been GM at KNEW/KSAN and sister station KMLE Phoenix.

Former KEBC Oklahoma City sales manager Bill Hurley has been named VP/GM of KKAT/KBKK Salt Lake City as well as sister stations KALL and KODJ. He replaces Bill Sauer.

SFX Broadcasting has promoted Reta Thorn from GSM/station manager at WTDR and AC WLYT Charlotte, N.C., to regional VP. She will serve as GM in Charlotte and also oversee the four SFX properties in Greensboro, N.C., including WHSL.

In Albuquerque, N.M., Crescent Communications is selling KRST, KOLT, and AM sister station KRZY to Citadel Communications for \$23 million. KOLT and KRZY will be spun off to an unidentified buyer, leaving Citadel with eight stations in the market, including KASY, which it is also in the process of purchasing.

Mac Daniels has been upped from APD/MD to PD at WMZQ Washington, D.C. He succeeds longtime OM Gary McCutie, who exited in January. Daniels had been acting PD since then.

WESC/WFNQ Greenville, S.C., OM Jeff Garrison has been named PD at KMLE Phoenix. Garrison starts the first week of May. He replaces Shaun Holly.

KIOK (OK95) Tri-Cities, Wash., flips from top 40 to Thunder Country and kicks off with 10,000 songs in a row. John Travis joins as PD/morning co-host. He previously was morning man at crosstown rival KORD. OK95 midday host Jeff Jacobs has been named MD/p.m. driver. KORD news director/morning co-host Charlie Warren joins KIOK in that capacity. KIOK is being consulted by KSON San Diego PD Mike Shepard.

AC KNDE Reno, Nev., is stunting as "K-Garth" with an all Garth Brooks format and will be flipping to country.

KMVK (the Maverick) Little Rock, Ark., PD/MD Tom Travis adds MD duties at sister station KSSN. He replaces Sherry Westbrook, who will concentrate on her air shift at KSSN.

WXXQ Rockford, Ill., night jock Lynn Lacy is upped to middays and assistant MD. She replaces former APD/midday host Carla Coulter. Nights are open; send T&Rs to PD Jesse Garcia.

Midday host Scott Michaels is now MD at WKKG Columbus, Ind. PD John Paul had done music. Also, morning host Jay Gibson exits. Paul is handling that shift for now. Morning co-host Kelly Greene adds promo coordinator duties.

Austin Hill is upped from weekends to overnights at KZLA Los Angeles, replacing "After Midnite With Blair Garner." Also, night jock Max Ryder is out and has been replaced by market veteran Brian Roberts, who previously hosted mornings at crosstown KRLA. Marita Pettitjohn joins as promotion manager from that position at WCOL Columbus, Ohio. She replaces Teri Watson, who's now the Nashville rep for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.

"Mad" Max Wells from WWQM (Q106) Madison, Wis., is the new morning host at rival WYZM (Y105). Ironically, Wells replaces "Mad" Max Collins; Wells will get a new air name.

Shannon Parks joins MJ1 Broadcasting, for which she will serve as a correspondent for the network's daily news and audio service. Her duties also include writing and producing "Country Quiz" and managing the Nashville office. Parks has written for The Nashville Banner and Country Weekly and worked for the Country Music Foundation. She replaces Elizabeth Becker, who moves to SJS Entertainment as a producer, writer, and talent booker in its country music division.

Nix, Neece Upped At Mercury Nashville

obert Nix is upped from director of promotion/artist development to VP of national promotion/artist development at Mercury Nashville. Also, the label ups Sandy Neece from VP of communications to senior VP of media relations.

Martina McBride is the first artist featured in a new music series launched last week by Cinemark Theatres that will feature artists from many genres. More than 70 million moviegoers are expected to hear the Cinemark series annually at more than 1,200 theaters. Exposure includes McBride-narrated audio (including several of her hits) play-

ing between movies and continuously in the theater lobbies and full-size movie posters of McBride in the lobbies and at record stores that are part of a cross-promotion. Blockbuster Music is featuring point-of-purchase displays and discount pricing on McBride product on a regional basis throughout the promotion. Also, each moviegoer will get a flier with coupons and information about McBride. Barry Freeman has resigned his position as VP/country editor at Network 40 over philosophical differences. He will remain until a successor is named or he lands another job. Also out at Network 40 is country radio editor Jamie Matteson.

Arista's Steve Wariner will be inducted into the Grand Ole Opry cast May 11. He will become the Opry's 72nd current cast member.

Rising Tide has inked a deal with Dolly Parton. Foster & Lloyd will reunite for one concert May 10 to mark the release of "The Essential Foster & Lloyd" on RCA. The Thompson Bros. Band will open the show at Nashville's Exit/In.

has a penetration of 70.3% of TV households in the market, according to a network spokesman.

'BAD SIGN' FOR CONCERT BIZ

Few country concerts have come through town so far this year, making the effect of WNYN's demise on the national concert business unclear. The March 28 Tim McGraw/Faith Hill show at the Paramount Theatre sold well, according to booking agent Ron Baird of Creative Artists Agency, but the promoters booked the show in a smaller venue than the tour has been playing, partly because they knew there would be no radio support.

"We deliberately chose a medium facility on a show that's been selling large capacities," says Baird. "We were satisfied with the total sales for Tim and Faith but believed that it could have benefited from WNYN's participation."

"Not having a station will not prevent country music from performing in New York, but it is obviously to our advantage to have one," says Baird. "[Radio] is the most obvious and most commonly used form of media for promoting and advertising a show, and by not having one, we [artists, managers, agents, and promoters] are restricted in our ability to advertise and promote a show in the metropolitan market . . . It's too early to scientifically tell, but the general consensus among promoters in the area and the general feeling is that . . . it's a bad sign. Anyone in the industry has to look at losing WNYN as a bad sign for the industry."

WNYN's departure has been more detrimental to the club business and, consequently, to developing artists. "It has had a devastating effect from my standpoint in presenting country music," says Allan Pepper, co-owner of the Bottom Line in Manhattan, who says he is doing significantly fewer country shows now. "New York City is not a big country music town anyway, but when there was any kind of interest, it came from the radio station having some interest, so we were able to present some national acts. Without any outlets for

exposure, it's really hard to consider bringing in a baby act, because nobody knows who they are."

"There was a time when we had a very active country station in New York [with] an administration at that radio station that understood that they could be very helpful and supportive," says Pepper. "At that point, we were doing more and more country shows. We were getting support not only from record labels but also radio. Now we have none of the above."

WHERE DID THE LISTENERS GO?

As for the effect of WNYN's departure on local radio, there have been several apparent beneficiaries of the 1.9 12-plus share the station had in the fall 1995 Arbitrums. In the recently released winter ratings, AC WLTW was up 4.6-5.4, making it likely that the station picked up many former WNYN listeners. Some may have gone to all-news WINS, which was up 3.5-3.8, and jazz/AC WQCD, which rose 3.1-3.5 12-plus. WNYN's successor, dance station WKTU, came on strong, scoring a 3.4 share in its first book. (See complete ratings information, page 4.)

In the Long Island book, WGSM, which advertised heavily on WNYN during its sign-off, showed for the first time in two books with an 0.6 share. WGSM's sister FMs, WRCN/WMJC, have just been sold and are the topic of massive format speculation, along with pending Viacom acquisition WANQ (Q104.3) New York.

The oddest beneficiary of New York listeners may have been ABC Real Country affiliate WWKB Buffalo, N.Y. While WWKB is an 50,000-watt AM located eight hours from New York and audible in the market only at night, the network logged nearly 2,000 calls from New York and Long Island during February.

Although no commercial station has emerged to fill the country void, Pepper says he is seeing more support for the format, or at least the "alternative country" version, during specialty shows like Vin Scelsa's free-form weekend show on WNEW and at college outlets like WFUV, WFDU, and WKCR.

WYRK's Johnson Navigates 'Death Valley' By Respecting Roots, Serving Upper Demos

Ken Johnson believes classic country should be treated with respect. "There was a time when stations were referring to older country artists with some kind of disdain," using liners like "none of that tired old stuff," he says. "That was for marketing and positioning, but I question what that says about the integrity of those stations . . . If you don't want to play it, just don't deal with it, but you don't have to degrade it."

"A few years back, it seemed like the country industry in Nashville was trying everything it could to get old music positioned as undesirable," Johnson says. "For about the last five to six years it seems that that music . . . has been purged from the air. If you're a longtime country listener, there is no opportunity [to hear] it."

At WYRK Buffalo, N.Y., where Johnson is PD and midday host, Merle Haggard, George Jones, Roy Acuff, and Ernest Tubb are no more likely to be in the mainstream mix than at any other station, but for the last six years they have

and 'Queen Of My Double Wide Trailer' [don't appeal to them]." Hearing those songs as a new country listener, Johnson says, "would I be convinced this was the music for me?"

WYRK targets a 30-plus audience because, Johnson says, "in the Northeast there is not a great deal of young country listeners. Most people did not grow up with country in the household in the Northeast, [so] there is nothing to promote a positive audience for country." He thinks more mature listeners are more apt to like country music. "My contention has always been that you have to have lived a little bit to understand country music," he says. "To truly appreciate it you really need to have had your heart broken. Most people don't experience that until they are into their 20s or 30s."

He says WYRK has never exceeded a 50/50 mix of current to older music and never turns over currents more quickly than every four hours. His list contains just 30 currents, but he says all of those songs get a fair hearing, with no strange rotation categories like "night play [or] every-other-Tuesday play."

Here's a recent afternoon hour: Marty Stuart, "Tempted"; Neal McCoy, "You Gotta Love That"; Mary Chapin Carpenter, "I Take My Chances"; Brooks & Dunn, "My Maria"; Alan Jackson, "Livin' On Love"; Vince Gill, "High Lonesome Sound"; Doug Stone, "A Jukebox With A Country Song"; Shania Twain, "You Win My Love"; Hank Williams Jr., "All My Rowdy Friends Are Coming Over Tonight"; Collin Raye, "Not That Different"; the Judds, "Born To Be Blue"; Ricochet, "What Do I Know"; and Kenny Chesney, "All I Need To Know."

In the winter Arbitrums, WYRK was No. 1 in the market with a 10.1 12-plus share. Its rivals are new Real Country AM affiliate WWKB and the 1.5-share WNUC, which runs Westwood One's Hot Country format, which Johnson believes is a mistake in Buffalo. "Young Country never happened here in the Northeast," he says. "In most Northeast markets, most of the country stations have about a rounded 10 share. There is not a huge universe of people out there listening to country—one in 10—so you want to be cautious with how many songs you're playing. Your margin for error isn't great."

In fact, Johnson says, labels call the Albany/Syracuse/Buffalo/Rochester, N.Y., area "Death Valley" because stations in those markets are often the last to add records.

As for WWKB, which signed on in late '95, Johnson says, it probably won't fare well because it's an AM. "Music listening on AM, unless it's someone that's been doing it for a long time, isn't going to be effective. [Garnering] new audience on AM [today] is a difficult proposition."

After a 11.1-9.1 dip between fall '94 and last summer, WYRK implemented a 12-in-a-row posture and switched from three to two stopsets an hour last fall and was able to rebound to a 10.3 share in one book. WYRK also got some fresh music research in the fall, in which much of last year's music fared poorly. "We found a lot of that music tested lower than the music from a year or two years ago," Johnson says. As a result, some of that music was dropped down to lower rotations and some was yanked outright.

"I had a feeling during the first part of last year that the music wasn't as good," says Johnson. "Part of my shift is a request hour, and I noticed a lack of requests for a lot of new material. Most requests were going back a year or two."

But this year, Johnson says, there have been more "impact songs that seemed to catch fire right off the bat," including "My Maria," "The Beaches Of Cheyenne," "Bigger Than The Beatles," and ballads like "It Matters To Me," and "Not That Different." PHYLLIS STARK







Nine Who Would Lead: Airplay Monitor Profiles Up-And-Coming Industry Figures

Among the dangers of deregulation and the proliferation of syndicated programming is the possibility of losing the "farm team" system that trains the next generation of industry leaders in small markets and develops their careers through jobs of increasing responsibility in ever-larger markets. That may be happening to a degree in country radio, but there is still no shortage of up-and-coming broadcasters who are likely to become the major-market PDs and industry leaders of the future. This group includes the nine people profiled below, who were most often mentioned in an informal Airplay Monitor industry poll as being among those most likely to succeed.

TOM ADAMS, PD/MORNING HOST
KMIX MODESTO, CALIF.

As an avid snow-ski racer, Adams says, he's been competing all his life. "I still race, and that makes me much more competitive than the average person," he says. "I'm extremely intense, [and that] intensity and the passion I have for winning will keep me successful."

Adams' radio career has included jobs in top 40, album rock, and even air-traffic reporting. He got his first

taste of programming as PD/MD at KQBR Sacramento, Calif., and later at KQBR's successor, KRAK. His career goals include "doing whatever it takes to provide my wife with the home she deserves and get my kids (ages 4 and 6) through Dartmouth. To do that, it is necessary for me to obtain a major-market programming gig and win. I want to go up against someone that everyone says is unbeatable and win." Ultimately, he would like to cross to the record-label side.

With the recent changes in radio brought on by deregulation, Adams says, "you either have to adapt and move or you're going to get crushed, if you don't change with the times." Still, he is concerned that because of the changes, PDs like himself are working 16-hour days and handling multiple jobs. "PDs are having to wear almost too many hats and concerning themselves a little more with budgets than the programming of the radio station," he says. "I think we're exhausted."

MARK BAUER, MD
KEYY (K102) MINNEAPOLIS

Bauer believes the best quality he brings to his MD job is "an absolute obsession with music. It's obviously what





Kantor ABC Prex; Another Big Sale\$ Week

A

BC Radio Networks executive VP David Kantor has been named president of the networks; he replaces Robert Callahan, who was named president of Capitol Cities/ABC radio last week.

SFX Broadcasting has agreed to acquire Multi-Market Radio. The \$100 million deal will give SFX 77 stations in 25 markets. MMR chief Mike Ferrel will become president/CEO at SFX and will join the company's board of directors. SFX CFO Geoff Armstrong adds COO duties. SFX CEO Steve Hicks will relinquish those duties but remains on the board.

Sinclair Broadcast Group has agreed to purchase River City Broadcasting, owner of country WOGY Memphis and WGGY Scranton, Pa. The merged group, which will be christened Sinclair Communications, will own 28 stations and control 10 more through LMAs. River City CEO Barry Baker becomes president/CEO of the new company. In addition, River City's Keymarket division will relocate to Baltimore, as will Keymarket principal Kerby Confer.

Two former Chancellor employees have found jobs outside the format. Ex-KZLA Los Angeles GM J.D. Freeman joins top 40/adult KDMX Dallas in that capacity replacing another former country GM, Jennifer Grimm. Former KMLE Phoenix PD Shaun Holly has been named operations director at crosstown oldies combo KOOL-AM-FM.

New Orleans got two new country stations recently, as WYLA and WYLK signed on at 94.7 and 104.7, respectively. The stations, which use the handle "the Lake," simulcast a mainstream format, according to OM/afternoon host Kevin Bonner. Owner/GM Charles Winstanley and Bonner previously worked together at KCIL Houma, La., which Winstanley also owned. Market veteran Captain Humble is hosting mornings. Kim Stiles from WAKT Panama City, Fla., hosts middays. The station is automated at night.

KMIX Modesto, Calif., GM Al Grosby exits. Also, APD/afternoon host/promotion director Cajun Ken Carr exits for the PD job at top 40 KUTQ Salt Lake City. KMIX PD Tom Adams is looking for a new afternoon jock/promotion director and wants T&Rs.

At WSTH (South 106) Columbus, Ga., Shane Collins joins as MD/midday host. He previously did mornings and sales at oldies WZBQ Tuscaloosa, Ala. Also, Keith Redding moves from middays to nights.

Paul Donovan fills the long-vacant p.m. drive position at KYGO-FM Denver. He was p.m. driver at top 40 duopoly partner KWMX.

Jeff Freeman joins KRBT (Outlaw Country) Fresno, Calif., for mornings from nights at crosstown rock station KRZR. He replaces Don Weaver, who's now production manager at crosstown N/T KMPH.

Several weeks ago, WLLR Davenport, Iowa, midday host Jack Carey resigned with the stated purpose of leaving radio. This week, Carey resurfaces at country rival KBOB in middays. KBOB also loses morning host Boots McKay, who returns to Las Vegas. WLLR, meanwhile, moves Ron Evans from afternoons to middays and

night jock Pat Leuck to afternoons.

WWW Detroit afternoon jock Michael J. Fox exits radio to join the family catering business in Baltimore. Karen Dalessandro moves from middays to afternoons. Tom Sommers joins for middays from that shift at crosstown WKQI.

At KTOM Monterey, Calif., new PD Erik Foxx adds p.m. drive duties, moving Joyce Montgomery to middays. Former midday host Kary Ann Hamilton is now in mornings. Also, night jock Steve Herra adds an early extra hour to his shift, which now starts at 6 p.m.

Scott Hershey joins Radio One Network's Go Country! format for mornings. He was PD/morning man at KIDX Billings, Mont. PD D.C. Caverder moves from mornings to middays.

Tim Burns is upped from LSM to GSM at WGRL Indianapolis.

Steve Daniel has been named sales manager at WMMU Nashville. He previously was with Opus Media Group in Savannah, Ga.

Following its purchase of much of the Huntington, W. Va., market last week, Commodore Media has named WJBR Wilmington, Del., VP/GM Jay Sterin regional president for WJBR and the Huntington stations, including country WBVB.

Westwood One will offer its country affiliates a live, five-minute special to mark the first anniversary of the Oklahoma City bombing April 19. The feature includes five seconds of silence followed by Oklahoman Garth Brooks' reflections on the bombing.

WUBE and WGY Cincinnati will be among the many stations marking the anniversary of the bombing with events of their own. The stations' "Oklahoma . . . Remembered" campaign includes distributing thousands of blue ribbons to listeners and asking local TV anchors and politicians to wear them, requesting that listeners turn on their car headlights during the day, running liners from artists thanking Cincinnati for being part of "Oklahoma . . . Remembered" and airing Brooks' "The Change" at 10:02 a.m. EDT, which is when the blast occurred.

Guest Hosts Replace Wopat; Olsen Exits RCA

Tom Wopat is out as host of TNN's "Prime Time Country" after just a few months on the job. His last show will air April 16. Wopat will be replaced by a rotating series of guest hosts who will fill in for one or two weeks each until a replacement is named. Guest hosts will include Marty Stuart, Katie Haas, Gary Morris, Bob Eubanks, and Gary Chapman. TNN will continue to air "The Dukes Of Hazzard," which stars Wopat.

A Bullet-Proof Song May Not Be Over

T

he second-most-annoying cliché (after "taking it to the next level") is "perception is reality."

When it comes to music charts these days, perception isn't always reality. For chart watchers, when a record loses a bullet, the perception is that the record is over, done with, fried, outta here. At that point, this is often reason enough for programmers to drop the song, sometimes regardless of how well it might be working in their market. There's two sides to that story, too. With the overabundance of product aimed at country radio, it's tough to justify hanging onto a record after its chart life.

The question then becomes, how do you know when it's really over? When does the fat lady begin singing? Furthermore, how can programmers tell the difference between when she starts singing, and when she is merely warming up?

It's the oldest promotion trick in the book: record loses bullet, competition circles like buzzards telling stations the record is "over."

In today's arena, we're utilizing exact information to help programmers and promotion departments determine their own answers. With technology-based charts, it isn't unusual for a record to lose the bullet one week and regain it the next. It has happened many times since the Broadcast Data Systems began six years ago, but among the most-recent examples are "Tequila Talkin'," the debut release from Lonestar, which lost the bullet twice and became a top 10 hit, and Tracy Lawrence's "If You Loved Me," which lost its bullet in the top 15, then bounced back to peak at No. 4. Last week, "The Love That We Lost" by Chely Wright was down by a mere nine spins, but it

bullets again this week with an increase of 67 spins.

In most cases in which records lose bullets, the song is only down by a few spins. In order to accurately use all the information that BDS provides, it's vital to look beyond whether or not a song is bulleted. Even before BDS, it wasn't that uncommon for a record to lose its bullet and continue climbing. The example cited most often predates BDS: "It Turns Me Inside Out," the 1981 debut track by Lee Greenwood, which lost the bullet several times and managed to climb to No. 17.

As we move into the late '90s, and technology-based information steamrolls ahead, we need to dismiss the notion that a record is dead because it loses a bullet. We need to dig a little deeper and make those determinations based on a closer look and a second opinion. If programmers are in touch with how songs are performing with their audiences, they most likely will know when a record is really over, and perhaps we'll see fewer cases of knee-jerk reactions to records that stay basically even over a two-week period but may show an ever-so-slight decrease in spins.

This information is exciting to watch and use as a tool for programming. It's only misused when the antiquated, chart-watching, bullet-oriented mentality takes over programming decisions. If we're truly monitoring the development of individual records, we're no doubt paying more attention to the amount of spins gained or lost and less attention to whether or not they maintain a bullet from week to week.

To really know whether the fat lady is singing or just clearing her throat, we have to take that closer look.

Trace Adkins

"THERE'S A GIRL IN TEXAS"
(CAPITOL NASHVILLE)

Determination is something that comes naturally to Trace Adkins. In second grade, he planned to play pro football, and years later, at a solid 6'6", he made the all-district team in his hometown, where he also was president of the high school student council. Adkins continued his education at Louisiana Tech, where a passion for music overrode his pro-bowl ambitions. "Dreamin' Out Loud" is his debut album due in June.

Steve Azar

"SOMEDAY" (RIVER NORTH)

Hailing from the Mississippi Delta, Steve Azar grew up in the heart of blues country. Musical influences included B.B. King, Bruce Springsteen, Hank Williams, and John Mellencamp. At age 12, he began guitar lessons and discovered songwriting. After seven years on the road with his own band, Azar moved to Nashville to pursue a record contract. This is the first single off his debut album, "Heartbreak Town." Azar co-wrote 11 of the album's 12 cuts.

Paul Brandt

"MY HEART HAS A HISTORY" (REPRISE)

A native of Calgary, Alberta, Brandt sang in church as a boy, grew up on gospel music, and began playing guitar in ninth grade. In high school, he listened to such artists as George Strait, Dwight Yoakam, and Clint Black and entered talent contests. Although he won a \$1,000 prize at the 1992 Calgary Stampede, he chose to pursue a career in nursing and spent two years as a pediatric nurse before switching to music full-time. This is the first single from his debut album, "Calm Before The Storm." Brandt, 23, wrote or co-wrote six songs on the album.

Keith Gattis

"LITTLE DROPS OF MY HEART" (RCA)

This Austin, Texas, native won a Texas State Finals talent competition at 16 and was asked to headline at the Future Farmers of America Nationals in Kansas City for a crowd of 26,000. That experience spurred Keith Gattis toward a musical career. Gattis played with Ernest Tubb's Texas Troubadours and on tour with Johnny Paycheck before signing up with RCA. He wrote or co-wrote eight of the 10 tracks on his self-titled debut.

Tammy Graham

"TELL ME AGAIN" (CAREER)

At age 3, Tammy Wynette Graham taught herself piano. Six years later, she won local and regional Imperial Miss Arkansas talent titles and placed second in the world competition. Her early teens were spent touring with her own band (which included her parents), and after a few years, she embarked on one of the longest continuous runs by a performer at Caesar's in Las Vegas. This single is from her self-titled debut album.

Marcus Hummon

"GOD'S COUNTRY, USA" (COLUMBIA)

The son of a U.S. diplomat, Marcus Hummon lived in such diverse places as Africa, Italy, and the Philippines. He first performed with his three sisters in the Washington, D.C., area, where he picked up the musical influences of James Taylor, Cat Stevens, Willie Nelson, and the Judds. His songwriting cred-

its include Wynonna's "Only Love" and Alabama's "Cheap Seats." This song is from his Columbia debut, "All In Good Time."

Mindy McCready

"TEN THOUSAND ANGELS" (BNA)

When Mindy McCready was 10 years old, she began seven years of vocal lessons. After graduating from high school at age 16 so she could pursue singing, she came to Nashville with a self-imposed one-year deadline. If nothing happened in that time, McCready planned to go home to Florida and attend college. Fifty-one weeks after she arrived in Nashville, McCready was signed to a record deal.

JoDee Messina

"HEADS CAROLINA, TAILS CALIFORNIA" (CURB)

After performing at a local radio show in Nashville, JoDee Messina was introduced to a producer who took an interest in the singer and began working with her in the studio. In a chance meeting in the producer's office, she met Tim McGraw. The two became friends and, when it was time for the album, McGraw helped produce it.

Gretchen Peters

"WHEN YOU ARE OLD" (IMPRINT)

Within months of arriving in Nashville (via Boulder, Colo.), determined to have her songs heard, Gretchen Peters quickly got a publishing deal. Her songs have been topping the charts ever since. "Independence Day," recorded by Martina McBride, earned Peters the 1995 Country Music Assn. Song of the Year Award, and "You Don't Even Know Who I Am," recorded by Patty Loveless, was nominated this year for a Grammy. "Chill Of An Early Fall," "Let That Pony Run," and "My Baby Loves Me (Just The Way That I Am)" were penned by Peters as well. "The Secret Of Life" is her debut album.

Ricochet

"WHAT DO I KNOW" (COLUMBIA)

Three years on the road helped to refine Ricochet's sound, which is distinguished by four-part harmonies. In motel rooms, the band spent hours practicing those harmonies and picking apart arrangements to achieve just the right blend. At a showcase appearance in Nashville, the group was offered a four-song developmental deal; a full-fledged record deal soon followed. "What Do I Know" is the first single from Ricochet's self-titled debut set.

★The Sky Kings

"PICTURE PERFECT" (WARNER BROS.)

Each of the three members of the Sky Kings has, over the years, helped set the foundation for the music we hear today. John Cowan of the New Grass Revival, Bill Lloyd of Foster & Lloyd, and Rusty Young of Poco first pooled their talents a few years ago at the suggestion of a producer. In 1994, the group was signed to Warner Bros. The result is the self-titled debut album, due June 25.

attracts most people to radio. It's why I got into it, and to work with it on a daily basis as intimately as I do is the best job in radio."

One problem Bauer says he encounters almost daily is having his station dealt with by Nashville "on the basis of how my competitor would respond. I would rather we be dealt with on the basis of our support for that label and the label's artists, not through how a competitor might deal with that particular label. Everyone is entitled to do business in this town with both radio stations, but I don't think it's equitable when one station's support of the artist might have been more fervent. About a third of the labels understand that, another third understand it some of the time, and another third don't understand it at all."

Bauer has spent his entire 11-year radio career in Minneapolis. He joined K102 as morning show producer after a similar gig at crosstown WLOL and was upped to MD in 1992. He would ultimately like to be a PD, but he says he'll never be the kind of programmer who isn't directly involved with the music. He harbors an embryonic notion of someday owning a music-related business, perhaps having something to do with emerging technologies like the Internet. "PD is definitely the next step, but ownership of a business is my supreme goal," he says.

MIKE BROPHEY, APD/MD/AFTERNOONS WXTU PHILADELPHIA

Brophey has been working at WXTU's 92.5 FM frequency through four formats and at least seven PDs. His career has included jobs in every radio format but news/talk and classical, and he says country is by far his favorite.

"This has been the most interesting and entertaining format I've ever worked," he says. "It took a few years for me to become a country music pig, but that's what I am. This format allows people to be much more involved in the music industry than other formats."

Brophey would like to land a major-market programming gig within the next few years and ultimately would like to become a group PD, then a consultant. He says the biggest issue facing country radio is competition—not from other country stations but from sporting events, books, computers, and "everything that distracts the listener from country radio."

GREG COLE, MD/MIDDAYS WPOC BALTIMORE

"If you're dealing with the music at your radio station, you need to have a love for music and an interest in it," says Cole. "It helps that I played trumpet and guitar . . . and I'm still a player at heart, so I have an understanding of the process musicians go through to create the music."

He believes that love should extend to hearing music performed live. "It's essential [in] any [radio] decision-making team for one of [the parties involved] to be out seeing the artist live," he says. "I'm proud that I get to about 90% of the shows in the Washington, D.C./Baltimore area . . . The full picture of the artist has to be obtained live."

Cole has worked in a broad base of formats and has been MD/midday host at WPOC since 1986. He would ultimately like to program, preferably for WPOC parent Nationwide Communications.

TONY MICHAELS, MD/AFTERNOONS KRTY SAN JOSE, CALIF.

"When I get a full CD in, I spend time with it, take notes, and try to be one step ahead of the labels," says Michaels, who takes it upon himself to call the labels and tell them what cuts he thinks will work for radio. He takes pride in beating labels to the punch on music calls. Not surprisingly, Michaels would like to work one day in the A&R department at a label.

He is fond of artists and songs that sound traditional, yet are still contemporary, like Tracy Byrd's "Heaven In My Woman's Eyes," and says those kinds of records "take you back but move the format forward at the same time." And while he doesn't believe a record can be "too country," he is a fan of artists, such as Kim Richey, who may

"go a little to the left or right" of what is considered mainstream.

Michaels would like to program a start-up station one day. Building something from the ground up, he says, "can give you a good idea of how well your philosophies or ideas fly . . . I think I could take a station up there. I would not want to compete against me."

DEANO ST. CLAIR, APD WTQR WINSTON-SALEM, N.C.

"I believe to be successful, your radio station has to have a personality beyond the music," says St. Clair. "The star of country music is the music. It's like a great painting. The picture may be great, but the better you can make the frame look, the better the painting looks. We are the frame."

St. Clair grew up on a dairy farm in Michigan but was bit by the radio bug at age 23. His years in the business, along with his extracurricular activities, have taught him the value of teamwork. "It was ingrained in me from playing sports that you win as a team, not an individual, and that theory had served me well here," he says.

He would like to program some day, but not just yet. "At times I've thought it might be time to move on, but when I really thought about it, I realized I'm still learning things here every day."

BUBBA THOMAS, OM/PD/MORNINGS WHKR MELBOURNE, FLA.

"There is nothing wrong with nepotism. It's worked real good for me," says Thomas, who has spent most of his career at family-owned stations in Florida, including WHKR, for which he co-hosts the morning show with his sister.

While working for the family certainly has been an advantage, Thomas says he brings a strong set of skills to the job, including "a real knowledge of country music—I have been listening to it and into it since the late '60s and have seen it grow and evolve into what it is today—and a real passion for the radio business."

In keeping with the family tradition, he would like to own a station of his own one day.

KELLY THOMPSON, MD KXKC LAFAYETTE, LA.

"I love music, and I have a passion for it, so when I get something I don't just listen to it, I feel it and live it and spend a lot of time with it," says Thompson, a 14-year radio veteran. "You should not be doing this job if you don't love music."

Like Michaels, Thompson says he'll frequently give the labels feedback on advance music he receives. And like Michaels, he would like to work on the label side one day. "I would love to take my knowledge of passion for music and transfer it to the other side," he says. "I would rather be . . . shaping what comes out of Nashville."

His station combines country music with the regional sounds of zydeco/Cajun music, and it rotates records more slowly than chart-watchers would dictate. "If a song is still working for us, we'll keep playing it," Thompson says. "Just because it's not on a chart any more doesn't mean anything to us."

JEFF WINFIELD, PD KHAK CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA

"As a PD, I'm pretty level-headed," says Winfield. "The pressure has continued to increase, and so far I haven't wiggled out and jumped out the window."

It helps that he's programming a station in his home state and that he has no other career ambitions beyond "keeping this booger at No. 1 . . . I don't see myself stepping out of that position right now . . . There is no job I'd rather have."

One issue he's keeping an eye on is the product glut in country music. "There is an uneasiness with the listeners with the amount of new product we have to filter through," he says. But "the old systems still work. We're just the first line of defense to see if a record works. The listeners ultimately decide it by buying the record."



WIL Programmer Ray Massie Enjoys Most Concert Presents, Big Lead In St. Louis

It has been a year since WKX (Kix 106) St. Louis resumed promoting and accepting advertising dollars for concerts being presented by crosstown rival WIL, ending what amounted to a yearlong boycott of area concerts designed, in part, to convince promoters that St. Louis shows should be neutral. But little has changed in the market since then. Of the 17 country shows announced in the market so far this year, only three have been neutral and the rest have gone to WIL.

That's just the way it should be, according to WIL PD Ray Massie, who says, "St. Louis is about WIL having 70% of the country share."

"One of the things we hear about with artists doing shows is their desire to treat radio stations as equals," he says. "That's OK in some markets [but] . . . there is no equality in St. Louis and never has been . . . We spend a great deal of time and money differentiating ourselves, and those efforts need to be recognized . . . We may have a situation where two people report to the

trades, but it's not anywhere near equal . . . Neutral, whatever that means, doesn't make things equal . . . A neutral or equal situation in St. Louis we perceive as a loss."

Not surprisingly, WKX PD Russ Schell has a different view. "I don't begrudge [WIL] anything they can get. That's a great radio station, and they deserve to continue to be great. I'm just saying the shows should be neutral," he says. "[Then] you'd have two great radio stations promoting the concert, benefiting the artist, the promoter, and the listeners. Market share should have nothing to do with that."

Despite his strong feelings on the neutrality issue, Massie insists he isn't concerned with what WKX does on the air. "There is no reason to follow something that is not as successful as what you're doing. I'm aware of what they do but, in our case, the difference between the two stations is so wide that there is not a whole lot I gain in paying attention to them that I don't gain in focusing on how we can be the best radio station we can be. The radio in my home is always on WIL, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. I couldn't tell you, honestly, things about what currents [WKX] plays or doesn't play."

In the last year WIL has increased its Arbitron share 7.2-9.3 and was No. 2 in the market

12-plus in the last book. WKX was up 2.9-4.2 in the last year, No. 8 in the market overall.

When Massie joined WIL nine years ago, the station's cume was 190,000 people. "By treating it as a political situation, shaking hands, kissing babies, and doing fish fries, barbecues, and square dances, we've built the radio station [by] almost [a] half-million people," he says. "It's just been a remarkable run for a remarkable radio station."

One reason for the station's steady growth has been its stability in ownership and personnel. WIL was purchased by current owner Heritage Media in 1987, and Massie, GM Dick Williams, and most of the air staff have been in place ever since. Massie joined the station after programming stints at WYNK Baton Rouge, La., KFKF Kansas City, WLLR Davenport, Iowa, and WFMA Rocky Mount, N.C.

Massie describes WIL as an uptempo station that is "uniquely St. Louis . . . We may not follow what everyone else across the country is playing, but that's OK with us because we're not programming the rest of the country." He plays more gold product than what is standard in other markets and says labels tell him he's slower on adding currents than most.

Here's a recent afternoon hour of WIL: Alabama, "Reckless"; Shania Twain, "You Win My Love"; Travis Tritt, "Take It Easy"; George Strait, "Blue Clear Sky"; Clint Black, "Life Gets Away"; Neal McCoy, "You Gotta Love That"; Robert Ellis Orrall, "Boom! It Was Over"; Randy Travis, "Is It Still Over?"; Alan Jackson, "Mercury Blues"; Pam Tillis, "The River And The Highway"; Sawyer Brown, "I Don't Believe In Goodbye"; David Lee Murphy, "Out With A Bang"; Mark Chesnutt, "It Wouldn't Hurt To Have Wings"; Aaron Tippin, "There Ain't Nothin' Wrong With The Radio"; and Tim McGraw, "All I Want Is A Life."

Promotionally, WIL prefers big-money contests that combine cash with an element of fantasy. In a recent contest a listener was given tickets to the Cardinals' season-opening game and won \$1,000 each time the team scored. Another contest winner not only won front-row George Strait concert tickets, but also a visit backstage, where Strait presented the winner with a check for \$5,000.

As a longtime country programmer, Massie is concerned that the country music industry is spending too much time fretting about losing its market share, rather than concentrating on maintaining it. "People tend to spend more time worrying about the bad things that can happen to us than the good stuff that is going on," he says. "We are now what we wanted to be in the 'Urban Cowboy' era. We are the mass-appeal format. Our job is to take the wonderful stuff that comes out of Nashville [and] translate that into making our format even bigger. It's when we take our eyes off the ball that we run the risk of having the problems that all the doomsayers are predicting."



Shania's Sales Trophies Send Domestic Labels Fishing For Canadian Country Acts

Through a combination of the breakthrough success of Shania Twain, the stepped-up efforts of the Canadian Country Music Assn. to expose its artists in Nashville, and the improved professionalism and savvy of the artists themselves, there are more Canadian country artists than ever signed to Nashville labels.

Several of the artists are brand-new to American audiences. Two others, Charlie Major and George Fox, have attempted to break into the U.S. market but are now signed to different labels and plan to try again.

Here's the rundown:

• Imprint Records recently signed singer-songwriter Major and plans to release a single, "I Do It For The Money," this summer and an album, "Lucky Man," later this year. Major is an Ottawa native who now lives in Nashville. He has won the Juno Award for country male vocalist of the year for the last three years, has had six consecutive No. 1 singles in Canada, and was the CCMA's 1995 entertainer and male vocalist of the year. His debut album on BMG Music Canada, "The Other Side," is ap-

proaching double platinum (200,000 units). Major released a U.S. album on Arista several years ago.

• Curb has inked a co-venture with Warner Bros. Canada and will be reintroducing Fox to U.S. programmers via a radio tour tentatively scheduled to start in June and a single to be released in August. Fox, who has been called the "Randy Travis of Canada," previously released several records here through Warner Bros. Nashville.

• Warner Bros. is already scoring with "My Heart Has A History," the debut single from Calgary, Alberta, native Paul Brandt. The artist wrote or co-wrote six of the songs on his debut album, "Calm Before The Storm."

• Warner Bros. also has a long-term development deal with Chris Cummings, who is working with label president Jim Ed Norman in the studio but whose unfinished project is not yet on the label's release schedule.

• Jamie Warren will release his debut album, "Fallen Angel," on River North in September. The album has already been released in Canada, where two singles have charted in the



WSIX Captures Fifth ACM Station Award

WSIX Nashville has won the Academy of Country Music Award for radio station of the year for the fifth time. Also, WSIX morning man Gerry House has won the ACM Award for DJ of the year for the fourth time.

The station previously won the ACM honor in 1989, 1990, 1991, and 1995. House was previously honored in 1991, 1992, and 1995.

The Crazy Horse Steak House & Saloon in Santa Ana, Calif., won the ACM Award for country nightclub of the year, and George Moffett of Variety Attractions in Zanesville, Ohio,

was named talent buyer/promoter of the year.

Winners in these four categories were announced April 8. They are voted on by the artist/entertainer, manager, and talent-agent category members of the academy. The awards will be presented to the winners during the televised ceremony April 24 at the Universal Amphitheater in Los Angeles, where awards will also be announced in 14 other categories, including the Pioneer Award and the Special Achievement Award.

Country Gold Outlet Goes 'Garth Free'

Last year, WKJK Louisville, Ky., got a lot of attention—some of it unwanted—for advertising its gold-based country format as "More Possum, Less Garth." Now, Chattanooga, Tenn., has a new country gold station billing itself as "Garth Free!" as WSGC flips from pop oldies under new PD Jerry Venable from crosstown WFXS.

New York may still be missing a country station, but eastern Long Island, N.Y., gets one this week, as WLIE signs on with Westwood One's mainstream country format. Lauren Grant from AC sister WBAZ is the station manager/PD. WLIE, named after the Long Island Expressway, is using the slogan "The country road to the Hamptons." Meanwhile, Long Island's other country station, WRCN, has just been sold to Barnstable Broadcasting along with its FM sister WMJC/WRCN, raising speculation about a possible flip to country at those stations.

Former WHEN Syracuse, N.Y., interim PD Ray Knight joins KRAK Sacramento, Calif., in the newly created PD spot and will also host afternoons. Former afternoon jock Captain Bob Greiner is now at sister KNCI.

Robert Callahan Jr. is named president of Capital Cities/ABC Radio. Callahan, who has been president of the ABC Radio Networks for the last six years, replaces the retiring James Arcara.

Donn Seidholz is the new GM at Triathlon Broadcasting's newly-acquired KXKT and sister rock station KRRK Omaha, Neb., replacing Robert Dean. Seidholz previously ran Triathlon's four stations in Colorado Springs, Colo.

WCUZ-FM Grand Rapids, Mich., will stay country following its sale to Clear Channel, which is also acquiring crosstown WBCT (B93), according to WBCT PD Doug Montgomery. WAKX, WCUZ's FM duopoly partner, was not included in the sale. Meanwhile, WCUZ PD J.L. Fisk is still looking for a MD/p.m. driver to replace WWWW Detroit-bound Carl E. and wants T&Rs.

Former KCIN Seattle PD Ray Randall is officially a free agent following that station's format flip two weeks ago; reach him at 206-337-2792.

Myrtle Beach, S.C.'s country market gets a bit less crowded as recent addition WMYB flips from country to '70s-based classic rock as "the Beach."

No deal had been struck at press time, but look for WIXY Champaign, Ill., PD/morning man Clint Marsh to join Columbia as Midwest regional promotion director. He would replace Steve Massie, now with A&M Nashville.

WHUB-AM-FM Cookeville, Tenn., have been sold by WHUB Inc. to Paxson Communications, owner of crosstown WPTN/WGSQ, for \$3.8 million. The AM and FM have had the same owners since signing on in 1940 and 1964, respectively.

WRCA (Thunder Country) Washington, D.C., ups production director Vicki Sayers to APD, replacing Dave Dylan. PD Chris O'Brien moves from middays to Dylan's old afternoon shift.

WIRK West Palm Beach, Fla., moves Jack Albert to afternoons from mornings, where PD Ron Brooks joins Audrey Lynn for now. At crosstown WCLB, area vet Greg Budell takes mornings, as J.R. jumps to modern WHYT Detroit for same.

KCUB/KIIM Tucson, Ariz., morning newsman Dan Gates will retire April 30 after 46 years in radio. No replacement has been named.

Former KYCY San Francisco morning hosts Dean Goss and Erin Garrett, who left the station about nine months ago, are reunited in mornings on local sister station KFRC.

Marc Schiffman has joined Airplay Monitor as a writer/reporter. Schiffman will contribute stories and help to cover the industry for Country, Top 40, Rock, and R&B Airplay Monitors. He was most recently with the Friday Morning Quarterback—Album Report, where he was news editor and triple-A radio specialist. Prior to that, he wrote and produced nationally syndicated radio programs with Denny Somach Productions.






Trace Adkins

"THERE'S A GIRL IN TEXAS"
(CAPITOL NASHVILLE)

Determination is something that comes naturally to Trace Adkins. In second grade, he planned to play pro football, and years later, at a solid 6'6", he made the all-district team in his hometown, where he also was president of the high school student council. Adkins continued his education at Louisiana Tech, where a passion for music overrode his pro-bowl ambitions. "Dreamin' Out Loud" is his debut album due in June.

Steve Azar

"SOMEDAY" (RIVER NORTH)

Hailing from the Mississippi Delta, Steve Azar grew up in the heart of blues country. Musical influences included



B.B. King, Bruce Springsteen, Hank Williams, and John Mellencamp. At age 12, he began guitar lessons and discovered songwriting. After seven years on the road with his own band, Azar moved to Nashville

to pursue a record contract. This is the first single off his debut album, "Heartbreak Town." Azar co-wrote 11 of the album's 12 cuts.

Paul Brandt

"MY HEART HAS A HISTORY" (REPRISE)

A native of Calgary, Alberta, Brandt sang in church as a boy, grew up on gospel music, and began playing guitar in ninth grade. In high school, he listened to such artists as George Strait, Dwight Yoakam, and Clint Black and entered talent contests. Although he won a \$1,000 prize at the 1992 Calgary Stampede, he chose to pursue a career in nursing and spent two years as a pediatric nurse before switching to music full-time. This is the first single from his debut album, "Calm Before The Storm." Brandt, 23, wrote or co-wrote six songs on the album.

Keith Gattis

"LITTLE DROPS OF MY HEART" (RCA)

This Austin, Texas, native won a Texas State Finals talent competition at 16 and was asked to headline at the Future Farmers of America Nationals in Kansas City for a crowd of 26,000. That experience spurred Keith Gattis toward a musical career. Gattis played with Ernest Tubb's Texas Troubadours and on tour with Johnny Paycheck before signing up with RCA. He wrote or co-wrote eight of the 10 tracks on his self-titled debut.

★Tammy Graham

"TELL ME AGAIN" (CAREER)

At age 3, Tammy Wynette Graham taught herself piano. Six years later, she won local and regional Imperial Miss Arkansas talent titles and placed second in the world competition. Her early teens were spent touring with her own band (which included her parents), and after a few years, she embarked on one of the longest continuous runs by a performer at Caesar's in Las Vegas. This single is from her self-titled debut album.

Marcus Hummon

"GOD'S COUNTRY, USA" (COLUMBIA)

The son of a U.S. diplomat, Marcus Hum-

mon lived in such diverse places as Africa, Italy, and the Philippines. He first performed with his three sisters in the Washington, D.C., area, where he picked up the musical influences of James Taylor, Cat Stevens, Willie Nelson, and the Judds. His songwriting credits include Wynonna's "Only Love" and Alabama's "Cheap Seats." This song is from his Columbia debut, "All In Good Time."

Mindy McCready

"TEN THOUSAND ANGELS" (BNA)

When Mindy McCready was 10 years old, she began seven years of vocal lessons. After graduating from high school at age 16 so she could pursue singing, she came to Nashville with a self-imposed one-year deadline. If nothing happened in that time, McCready planned to go home to Florida and attend college. Fifty-one weeks after she arrived in Nashville, McCready was signed to a record deal.

JoDee Messina

"HEADS CAROLINA, TAILS CALIFORNIA" (CURB)

After performing at a local radio show in Nashville, JoDee Messina was introduced to a producer who took an interest in the singer and began working with her in the studio. In a chance meeting in the producer's office, she met Tim McGraw. The two became friends and, when it was time for the album, McGraw helped produce it.

Gretchen Peters

"WHEN YOU ARE OLD" (IMPRINT)

Within months of arriving in Nashville (via Boulder, Colo.), determined to have her songs heard, Gretchen Peters quickly got a publishing deal. Her songs have been topping the charts ever since. "Independence Day," recorded by Martina McBride, earned Peters the 1995 Country Music Assn. Song of the Year Award, and "You Don't Even Know Who I Am," recorded by Patty Loveless, was nominated this year for a Grammy. "Chill Of An Early Fall," "Let That Pony Run," and "My Baby Loves Me (Just The Way That I Am)" were penned by Peters as well. "The Secret Of Life" is her debut album.

Ricochet

"WHAT DO I KNOW" (COLUMBIA)

Three years on the road helped to refine Ricochet's sound, which is distinguished by four-part harmonies. In motel rooms, the band spent hours practicing those harmonies and picking apart arrangements to achieve just the right blend. At a showcase appearance in Nashville, the group was offered a four-song developmental deal; a full-fledged record deal soon followed. "What Do I Know" is the first single from Ricochet's self-titled debut set.

Shania's Trophies Send U.S. Labels Fishing For Canadian Acts

top five and a third is climbing the charts.

And Patricia Conroy, who had a hit in Canada with "My Baby Loves Me (Just The Way That I Am)" before Martina McBride's U.S. version, has signed to independent Inter-sound Records, based in Roswell, Ga.

Those artists join a roster of other Canadians already established at U.S. labels, including Mercury Nashville's Twain and Terri Clark, Capitol Nashville's Lisa Brokop, and Arista's Michelle Wright.

So is the Canadian country industry coming into its own or are Nashville A&R reps looking north for talent? The answer is both. But while it is easy to credit Twain's 6 million album sales as a primary reason for the new interest in Canada, the trend actually started before she became a household name. Brandt and Cummings have been in development at Warner Bros. for about two years. Clark and Conroy were knocking on doors in Nashville for years before they were signed, as was Twain herself. And some A&R reps say they have always kept an eye on Canada as a potential source of talent.

"I've been to Canada many times in the last 14 years," says Paige Levy, VP of A&R at Warner Bros. "There is a wealth of talent up there . . . Canada has a lot of small towns, rural places, and Canadian values seem to be very similar to the genre of people that traditionally listen to country music."

But Levy also says she signed Brandt not because he is Canadian but because he sounds different. "I prefer artists who are not in Nashville because I feel like they bring something different to the table," she says. "I don't think I'm going to go back to Canada just because of Paul. I feel like there's a lot of talent outside of Nashville, and I'll go anywhere to find that something special."

Tracy Gershon, VP of A&R at Imprint, tells a similar story about Major. "We didn't sign Charlie because he was a Canadian, but because we all fell in love with his record," she says. "We knew about his success in Canada . . . but he really fits into the Imprint philosophy [because] he's different and fresh, not cookie-cutter . . . If he was Japanese, it wouldn't have mattered."

Others say that it is the professional caliber of the artists themselves that is landing them their deals, but that Twain's success hasn't hurt.

"There are just a lot of talented [Canadians] that are pursuing label deals in the States," says Bobby Young, VP of promotion and artist development at River North. "With Shania breaking, people are more willing to pay attention. It's just a more visible situation."

Gershon is among those who believe Twain has opened doors for other Canadian country artists here. "I think at one time, there was a prejudice against Canadian artists that they can't sell, and Shania has broken that," she says. (Part of that perception probably stems from the fact that the Canadian population is about one-tenth the population of the U.S. A gold record in Canada, therefore, represents sales of 50,000 units, as opposed to 500,000 here.)

"Over the past five to six years, more people have been getting into the Canadian country industry, just like in the U.S., [and] people have become much more professional and [are] going after U.S. record deals that maybe they were intimidated to do before," says Tom Tompkins, director of programming at the

Pelmorex Radio Network and president of the CCMA. "Canadians have been much more aggressive in terms of making inroads into Nashville than they ever have before."

But Tompkins also believes there is some follow-the-leader thinking happening in Nashville. "It's like rock'n'roll, where Nirvana is signed out of Seattle, and all of a sudden, all the bands are coming out of Seattle. Once one Canadian artist does well, and I mean really well, people start paying more attention to Canada."

"Shania Twain has opened so many doors in Nashville," Tompkins continues. "It's no longer, 'Well, you're Canadian, I don't have time to talk to you. I have too many Americans waiting in line' . . . The more people that achieve credibility in the States that are from Canada, the more it helps the artists of the future."

Tompkins also believes the efforts of the CCMA to make inroads in Nashville has benefited Canadian artists. "CCMA started going down to Nashville a couple of times a year about eight years ago, and I think that really helped increase the knowledge and perception of the Canadian country music industry in Nashville and [showed] that we realize that we can no longer stay within our borders," he says. "We exposed our industry and made people realize we're not just a bunch of Eskimos up here."

"Certainly over the past 15 years, we've seen the Canadian country music infrastructure grow tremendously, so many of the artists now are better at putting their best foot forward," says Brian Ferriman of Savannah Music, who manages Wright, an artist who broke through in the early '90s, when immigrants were fewer and farther between. "But the great thing about it is that would be immaterial if the talent wasn't there, and it's certainly cause to celebrate when we're seeing the belief from the decision-makers [in Nashville]."

Despite the fact that Canada has been the source of so many signings, some industry observers, including Canadians, say the country should not be viewed as a huge untapped resource brimming with unsigned talent, but rather as one more potential source of music.

"I think the talent's always been there, and maybe the Canadian industry is better at bringing it to Nashville's attention," says Ferriman. "At the same time, the success of some Canadians would lead any diligent A&R person to think there is more where that came from. [But] I've always said Canada is just another talent source."

"The talent pool is as abundant in Canada as it is in Oklahoma or South Carolina," says Tim Moffat, VP/GM of Balmuir Inc., a management and publishing company that manages Fox.

But because Canadian radio stations have to play 30% Canadian music by law and because there is much less competition for airplay than in the U.S., one PD says not enough money has been spent on developing, producing, and promoting country artists in Canada.

"There is an attitude [among labels] in the North, 'Well, they're going to have to play us anyway,'" says John Roberts, who spent 18 years in Canadian radio, most recently as PD of CISN Edmonton, Alberta, before moving to KIKK Houston as OM last November. "I don't think [the talent pool] is as deep as they think it is."

Columbia's 'Queen' Fleischer Earns New Title As VP Of National Country Promotion

Her staff affectionately refers to her as "queen," but when it comes to country promotion, no one more aptly fits the title than Columbia Records' Debi Fleischer. Last week, the label recognized her contributions by bestowing on her its own title: VP, national country promotion.

The success of Fleischer's team speaks for itself. With four singles released off Wade Hayes' debut album, it managed to take one to No. 1, two others top five, and a fourth top 10 and established Hayes as Billboard's top new country artist of 1995. The debut single from Ricochet hit the top five last week, becoming the first debut single to attain that status this year. And the same team was previously responsible for the first No. 1 records for Mary Chapin Carpenter and Rick Trevino.

Fleischer says she's under plenty of pressure to deliver, but it's not really coming

from the label. "The pressure I have felt came more from me than anyone else, and it's because you want to make somebody's dream come true," she says.

While she acknowledges that the competition among labels has heightened dramatically in the years she has been in record promotion, she also recognizes that the radio landscape has changed as well. Labels must adapt to those changes, she says.

"Obviously, I think labels have to be more sensitive to the constraints that radio must live with, and I believe we must always treat our stations with the respect that they deserve," Fleischer says. "It is wonderful when we're all on the same page, and when we're not, I'll fight like the dickens to make it go my way, but we have to show respect for the fact that they have to do what's best for their radio station."

"You've got to have the goods on the record side," she adds. "Relationships are important but will only take you so far. The music and talent have to be there. Bells and whistles don't mean anything anymore."

Like other label reps, however, Fleischer is concerned that the changes in the radio business are taking programmers' focus away from the music.

"There are still, thank goodness, more [PDs] that do listen and care about the music than not, but just the pressure of the competition in radio has put so many programmers' focus on so many other areas that much of it is just a time-constraint factor," she says. "But I do believe that spending time with your main product—which in radio's case is the music—has to be the top priority. I would hope that one's gut would play a role in listening to the music. We can research it all we want, but if we

rely on the numbers and get away from what a piece of music makes us think or feel, we will lose something in the long run."

In an effort to make sure PDs paid attention to the music with Ricochet, Fleischer did something rather unusual. The band was sent out on what became a five-month radio promotional tour (most last six to 12 weeks).

"We didn't start out [knowing] exactly how long we would do this, but it was so impactful that I knew we had to keep going," she says. "Being out there and showing the stuff they're really made of opened the door for that record to get on the air and show it was a hit record. I don't believe, in this day of increased competition, that if we hadn't been out there doing what we were doing, people would have paid as much attention as they did. [It gave] radio the confidence that this is not a one-hit wonder scenario."

Fleischer launched her career as a publicist for United Artists Records. She later became tour manager and VP of operations for Crystal Gayle, with whom she worked for 2½ years at a time when female road managers were rare.

Fleischer joined CBS Records in 1981 as promotion coordinator and, for the next six years, held various jobs in that department until she became Columbia's country promotion manager for the central region. In 1993, she became director, national country promotion, and, the following year, was upped to senior director, national country promotion.

Following her recent promotion to VP, Fleischer says, "I have been overwhelmed with the amount of calls, notes, and flowers I have received from my friends in radio and in the industry. I know it's been genuine, and that's made me the most proud. I believe I have earned the friendship and respect of a lot of people."

"I'm very proud of the fact that I have held every position in this department—coordinator, secondary, regional, national, and now VP," she says. "That has served me well in understanding everything that everybody that works for me goes through, because I've gone through it."

But she gives her staff most of the credit for Columbia's success. "I'm proud of the people I've hired," she says. "They do the work. If I look good, it's because they make me look good."

Her department is undergoing one major change now as Bob Mitchell relinquishes the director of national promotion position this month to return to Bakersfield, Calif., and RCA's Ted Wagner assumes the role (Country Airplay Monitor, March 15).

"No one will replace Bob Mitchell," Fleischer says. "He has been everything I could ask for in an employee and a friend and them some . . . We will all miss him tremendously here but . . . being able to bring Ted Wagner in has just been a joy. I've known him a long time and have always respected him. He has a wonderful reputation. I'm looking forward to continuing the success Bob and I had with our team with Ted."

Fleischer and her team will remain plenty busy this year. They will continue to work Ricochet, plus new projects by Carpenter, Trevino, and Hayes, and will try to break two new artists, Deryl Dodd and duo Butch Baker & Sam Hankin.

Chancellor's Shamrock Takeover Shows Clash Of Radio Cultures

Two years ago, Shamrock Broadcasting was in control of seven country stations that were as close to a dynasty as the format has produced. Among the seven were influential large-market stations, such as KMLE Phoenix and WWW Detroit, which were stocked with a well-respected roster of management talent.

But in recent years, many of the Shamrock stations—which were, despite their respect in the industry, not hugely profitable—have found their leadership positions eroded by neck-and-neck battles. Others, such as KZLA Los Angeles, began to erode even without direct competition. And since the group's sale to Chancellor Broadcasting closed Feb. 14, the trickle of personnel departures that began when the sale was announced last summer has become a flood of major players exiting.

Some of those employees were laid off. Many others chose to leave, sometimes without having other jobs lined up. (Since Shamrock managers were given a financial incentive to stay through closing, many waited until that happened to make their move.)

Many of the departing employees describe their new owner as driven by bottom-line considerations and not people-oriented. Chancellor

president/CEO Steven Dinetz, for his part, says many of those who left weren't able to deal with an organization that demanded "more accountability." And many of the changes may be natural attrition of the sort that goes with any major sale. Whatever the case, Chancellor's takeover of Shamrock showed a distinct clash of corporate cultures.

Among the changes in recent months: KZLA was particularly hard hit, losing PD R.J. Curtis, APD Cary Rolfe, and marketing director Teri Watson. Then, last week, GM J.D. Freeman gave his three weeks' notice.

KNEW/KSAN San Francisco lost OM Alan Sledge, APD Craig Bowers, sales manager Michael Somberg, director of engineering Erick Steinberg, and night jock Jason Dean.

KMLE lost PD Shaun Holly, marketing director Kathleen Fraser, and morning hosts Tim Hattrick and Willy D. Loon, whom many considered the cornerstone of the station.

KEEY (K102) Minneapolis lost GSM David Haeg and director of engineering Mike Gorniak. Last week, marketing director Laurie Belleau added her name to the list.

In Detroit, Chancellor is spinning off WWW to Evergreen, but not without first losing VP/GM Phil Lam-



Freeman Exits KZLA; KCIN Staffer Goes Gold

KZLA Los Angeles GM J.D. Freeman has resigned effective April 18. Freeman says he is working on several options and will have an announcement shortly.

Steve Swan, former GSM of the late KCIN Seattle, segues to crosstown country gold outlet KJUN as GM/GSM. Eddie James remains OM for the station and assumes PD duties, as Tom Reddick concentrates on new R&B sister KBLV. KJUN took advantage of KCIN's abrupt death last month and let KCIN's air staff say goodbye.

Former KZDG (Z92.5) Denver PD Jeff Baird resigns as PD of KBUL Reno, Nev.

As WKSJ-AM-FM and WMYC (Young Country) Mobile, Ala., complete their transfer from Pountales Radio to Capitol Broadcasting, owner of crosstown WDWG (the Dawg) and two other stations, WMYC will flip from country to classic rock as WRKH (the Rocket) and will pick up the syndicated John Boy and Billy morning show. Jeff Funk (aka J.J.) moves from afternoons at WKSJ to that shift at WRKH. He is replaced at WKSJ by market veteran Bill Black.

Gulfstar Communications names John Cullen president/COO and Paul Stone executive VP/CFO. Cullen previously was regional VP at SFX Broadcasting. He replaces George King. Stone was VP/chief accounting officer at Hicks, Muse, Tate & Furst Inc., Gulfstar's parent company.

WKIX Raleigh, N.C., has been sold from Alchemy Communications to the Curtis Media Group, owner of crosstown WPTF/WQDR, for \$16 million. In other sales news, WRSF Elizabeth City, N.C., has been sold from Multi-Market to East Carolina Radio, which has been programming the station under an LMA since last June, for \$950,000.

Also, WKBG Augusta, Ga., and album sister WRXR have been sold from Multi-Market Radio to Wilks Broadcasting Acquisitions for \$5 million. GM Kathy Allen and PD/afternoon jock Robert Marx exit. The station remains country but changes slogans from "Big Country" to "Sunny 107.7." Rob Ashe, managing partner at Wilks, adds GM duties at WKBG and is looking for a PD and a live morning show to replace ABC Radio's Moby. Savannah Johnson moves from middays at WKBG to that shift at sister WEKL. Also, Cadillac Jack returns to WKBG for afternoons after a stint at sister rock station WRXR.

Dewayne Wells is upped from MD to PD/MD at KCKR Waco, Texas, replacing John Q. Morris. With the changes, David Hodges moves from middays to mornings and Gary Quinn goes from P/T to middays.

Dale Van Horne returns to WXCL Peoria, Ill., as VP of programming. Morning man Dan Dermody is upped to the vacant PD slot.

At KIKN Sioux Falls, S.D., midday man Jay Williams is named PD, replacing Rob Carpenter. Also, Captain Jim and Scotty, from West Palm

Beach, Fla., and P/T, respectively, are the new morning hosts. Radio veteran Magic Christian joins KIKN for afternoons.

KCWS Abilene, Texas, flips from '70s oldies to Radio One Network's "Go Country" format.

WCUZ Grand Rapids, Mich., MD/p.m. driver Carl E. is the new MD at WWW Detroit.

Wanda Myles joins WRBQ-FM (Q105) Tampa, Fla., as MD. She previously hosted nights at WWKA (K92) Orlando, Fla. Myles fills a position that had been vacant since APD Ronnie Lane was promoted to PD last October.

WRCY Washington, D.C., MD/p.m. driver Dave Dylan exits April 12 to concentrate on his acting career.

At WUSW (US96) Oshkosh, Wis., night jock Billy "Boomer" Cannon is upped to APD/MD. Mad Max Collins joins for mornings from WYZM (Y105) Madison, Wis. Kim Clarke from WLLR Davenport, Iowa, replaces Kelly Mercer in middays.

Former WMXV (Mix 105) New York MD Mary Franco becomes the group programming assistant to Paxson Communications, working with corporate PD Alan Mason.

KMDL Lafayette, La., MD/midday jock Chuck Childress exits. The 18-year radio vet is looking for a new opportunity; call 318-788-3882.

As part of Wahoo, Neb.'s campaign to be named the new "Home Office" for "Late Night With David Letterman," WOW Omaha, Neb.'s morning show had engaged in a series of attention-getting stunts, including driving a bathtub attached to a tractor around the market. When Letterman got wind of this and asked for serious bribes, like cars and furniture, listeners donated a '76 Pinto and a used loveseat, which the station is now driving to New York along with, they swear, a 6-foot taco that looks like Letterman.

Songs By Women Come In Many Stripes

Girls, girls, girls. The past month or so, I've taken an unusual number of calls regarding country's female artists. A few weeks ago, when the top three slots on the chart were held by women, reporters came out of the woodwork. "What do you make of this resurgence among country females?" quizzed one. "Has this ever happened before?" asked another. "Is this happening because all the male records sound the same?" yet another wanted to know.

In one report on TNN, local reviewer Robert K. Oermann described this so-called female trend as "nothing short of a female comeback in country music." According to Oermann, women in the country field lost a lot of ground, then came back in the '90s with blood on their teeth to reclaim their share of the market. Then there's a popular theory on Music Row that female artists are making the most interesting music in the genre. I would suspect that many promotion pitches for females are peppered with this line of thinking.

The females in the format have, historically, developed and evolved at a much slower pace. They still do. In the early days, women in country were almost exclusively part of a family troupe or the featured "girl singer" in a male headliner's show. Then, in 1952, along comes Kitty Wells with a firm yet polite retort to Hank Thompson's blockbuster hit, "The Wild Side Of Life." Wells' song, "It Wasn't God Who Made Honky Tonk Angels," changed the predominant viewpoint in country music. The hillbilly female solo star was born. We all know the rest of the story. (If you don't, you might want to buy a copy of Oermann's book, "Finding Her Voice," and you'll be up to speed.)

For today's country music market, females tend to be much less restricted from a creative standpoint than males. Their influences are

more varied, and their themes are dramatically different. This is as it should be, since the male viewpoint in the music has had the floor for so long. Clearly, two of the artists responsible for expanding mainstream country's sonic horizons have been Rosanne Cash and Mary Chapin Carpenter.

In 1995, along comes Shania Twain with a very definite message about female spunk. She's different from the mainstream, but not as removed from it as, say, Cash was. She sells a bazillion records, and you can practically hear songwriters' briefcases popping open to make more of those types of songs.

It's great to have new superstars in the format to see record companies making money, and the audience seems to be excited. So what's the problem? In the industry's mood of post-Shania-itis, we could see a drive for female tempo that homogenizes female artists as much as the males.

There are some great records by women getting overlooked in the process. It's frustrating to see such powerful records as Chely Wright's "The Love That We Lost" and Bobbie Cryer's "You'd Think He'd Know Me Better" take so long to develop. Why did "Standing Tall" by Lorrie Morgan not have a longer run on the radio? It's a crime that these songs aren't among the biggest hits of today.

It's critical at this time in the format to take notice of everything that's available and not get too enamored with one style. The uptempo female sash records add great spice, but for a balanced diet, I believe we should look at more ballads by women. There is enough product from which to choose in order to tailor a station's sound, and unless I'm dreaming, having "It Matters To Me" by Faith Hill in heavy rotation didn't run off too many listeners, and the song will be around as a treasured oldie. How many other records can we say that about today?

Asylum, Capitol, Rising Tide Make Regional Moves

Lisa Puzo moves from the West Coast regional promotion manager position at Asylum to the Northeast promotion slot at the label. She replaces Shari Reinschreiber, who moves to Rising Tide. Asylum VP of promotion Denny Mosesman is looking for a new West Coast regional.

In other Rising Tide news, former Giant/Reprise West Coast regional promotion manager Gary Greenberg joins the label in that capacity. He is replaced at Giant/Reprise by Lisa Andrick, formerly of Genesis Software.

Eric Beggs has resigned the Southeast regional promotion job at Capitol Nashville. He will not be replaced, but the territories of other regionals will be expanded. Beggs joins the five other Capitol staffers who exited a few weeks ago, including international VP Cindy Wilson, associate director of catalog development John Johnson, and senior promotion coordinator Kelly Williams.

Also, a rumor making the rounds has Rob Dalton, Epic's senior director of national promotion and artist development, moving to Capitol. Dalton says he's still under contract at Epic. No word on what, if anything, the move would mean for Capitol's senior VP of promotion Bill Catino and VP of national promotion Terry Stevens.

After 12 years with Gavin, Cyndi Hoelzle has resigned her position as country editor and Nashville bureau chief. She will remain with the magazine through its country convention, which is being held April 25-27 in Los Angeles, and then will be looking for a new opportunity on the publicity side.


Julie Ballweg is upped from director to senior director of A&R administration at MCA and Decca.

Hailing from the Mississippi Delta, Steve Azar grew up in the heart of blues country. Musical influences included B.B. King, Bruce Springsteen, Hank Williams, and John Mellencamp. At age 12, he began guitar lessons and discovered songwriting. After seven years on the road with his own band, Azar moved to Nashville to pursue a record contract. This is the first single off his debut album, "Heartbreak Town." Azar co-wrote 11 of the album's 12 cuts.



Paul Brandt

"MY HEART HAS A HISTORY" (REPRISE)

A native of Calgary, Alberta, Brandt sang in church as a boy, grew up on gospel music, and began playing guitar in ninth grade. In high school, he listened to such artists as George Strait, Dwight Yoakam, and Clint Black and entered talent contests. Although he won a \$1,000 prize at the 1992 Calgary Stampede, he chose to pursue a career in nursing and spent two years as a pediatric nurse before switching to music full-time. This is the first single from his debut album, "Calm Before The Storm." Brandt, 23, wrote or co-wrote six songs on the album.

Keith Gattis

"LITTLE DROPS OF MY HEART" (RCA)

This Austin, Texas, native won a Texas State Finals talent competition at 16 and was asked to headline at the Future Farmers of America Nationals in Kansas City for a crowd of 26,000. That experience spurred Keith Gattis toward a musical career.

Gattis played with Ernest Tubb's Texas Troubadours and on tour with Johnny Paycheck before signing up with RCA. He wrote or co-wrote eight of the 10 tracks on his self-titled debut.



Marcus Hummon

"GOD'S COUNTRY, USA" (COLUMBIA)

The son of a U.S. diplomat, Marcus Hummon lived in such diverse places as Africa, Italy, and the Philippines. He first performed with his three sisters in the Washington, D.C., area, where he picked up the musical influences of James Taylor, Cat Stevens, Willie

Nelson, and the Judds. His songwriting credits include Wynonna's "Only Love" and Alabama's "Cheap Seats." This song is from his Columbia debut, "All In Good Time."

Mindy McCready

"TEN THOUSAND ANGELS" (BNA)

When Mindy McCready was 10 years old, she began seven years of vocal lessons. After graduating from high school at age 16 so she could pursue singing, she came to Nashville with a self-imposed one-year deadline. If nothing happened in that time, McCready planned to go home to Florida and attend college. Fifty-one weeks after she arrived in Nashville, McCready was signed to a record deal.

JoDee Messina

"HEADS CAROLINA, TAILS CALIFORNIA" (CURB)

After performing at a local radio show in Nashville, JoDee Messina was introduced to a producer who took an interest in the singer and began working with her in the studio. In a chance meeting in the producer's office, she met Tim McGraw. The two became friends and, when it was time for the album, McGraw helped produce it.

Gretchen Peters

"WHEN YOU ARE OLD" (IMPRINT)

Within months of arriving in Nashville (via Boulder, Colo.), determined to have her songs heard, Gretchen Peters quickly got a publishing deal. Her songs have been topping the charts ever since. "Independence Day," recorded by Martina McBride, earned Peters the 1995 Country Music Assn. Song of the Year Award, and "You Don't Even Know Who I Am," recorded by Patty

Loveless, was nominated this year for a Grammy. "Chill Of An Early Fall," "Let That Pony Run," and "My Baby Loves Me (Just The Way That I Am)" were penned by Peters as well. "The Secret Of Life" is her debut album.




Ricochet

Chancellor's Shamrock Takeover Shows Clash Of Radio Cultures

ka, GSM Mary Bennett, MD Kevin Scolin, and business manager Jolayne Thompson.

And in Denver, the entire staff of KZDG was let go, including GM Bob Zuroweste, when the station flipped to classical in February.

WAS IT PEOPLE VS. PROFITS?

So what's going on? None of the current or former Shamrock/Chancellor employees we spoke to were willing to speak for attribution. But the theme that emerged repeatedly was the "people vs. the bottom line" issue. Some also believe that Chancellor bought over its head with the Shamrock acquisition and that its efforts to merge the Shamrock properties into the Chancellor fold have been poorly handled. Others complain that decision-making power has been taken away from individual station managers.

One current employee claims the Chancellor organization is "so disorganized [that] people can't get their jobs done." Another former manager says he opted out because he felt he could no longer have "a positive influence" at his station, as decisions were being forced on him. "I think there is a bit of arrogance with Chancellor," he says. "I'm not sure if they are about operating radio stations or really just about the money."

"It's tragic to look across the country at all the good, talented people that are leaving," says a former manager who believes the exodus is "just the tip of the iceberg . . . I'm shocked that they let Tim and Willy get away. I'm shocked that they don't recognize [the talents of] Alan Sledge. These are not unsuccessful people that are leaving."

"They're just not a people-oriented company," says another former employee. "They just don't seem to care . . . I also think that they stepped up and bought a really big company, and they were and are in way over their heads."

"Throughout this whole process, they have treated quality broadcasters, people who could just blow their doors off, like rank amateurs. All this clumsy, oafish stuff they've done has just convinced all these quality broadcasters to leave."

"The thing that bothers me the most is that all the people who are flowing out of the building at light speed love radio. They are passionate about this business," he continues. "I don't think the guys at Chancellor do. They are in love with the deal, [but] if they keep at this pace they're on, the asset value of the company will be compromised."

OR WAS IT ACCOUNTABILITY?

Most Chancellor employees do not share the view of the former Shamrock staffers. Tim Closson, OM of Chancellor's Cincinnati properties, WUBE and WGY, has been a Chancellor employee since 1994 and has only good things to say about the company. "From my standpoint, it is a fabulous company, and they are going to be, without a doubt, one of the . . . best and biggest broadcasting companies in America," he says.

"This company is owned and operated by

broadcasters from top to bottom," Closson adds. "We are excited about being in this business, and we plan to be in this business for a long time. We are not a company on the cheap. We are smart operators."

Closson points also to Chancellor's successful track record. "Prior to the Shamrock merger, every one of its stations in every one of its markets was a winner in ratings and revenue," he says. WUBE, for instance, handled its "young country" competition, WGY, by buying it, preventing the war of attrition that other Shamrock country powerhouses found themselves in.

Similarly, Chancellor's Dinetz points out that the situation with the Shamrock stations he inherited is unusual. "If you look at the Chancellor company, you'll see that very seldom do the positions ever turn over," he says.

Dinetz also believes he holds his managers to a higher standard than other companies, and that some of the employees he inherited were unwilling or unable to meet his goals. "The environment is different," he says. "We are much more hands-on, and we hold people accountable . . . A lot of people aren't ready to be held accountable."

Chancellor also did not purchase a particularly healthy stable of country properties and needed to make some changes to turn them around. Of the seven Shamrock country stations, only KZLA and KMLE were considered profitable, thanks to fierce competition in all of the other markets.

"If Shamrock had operated more successfully, they'd still own them. That's the bottom line," says one former Shamrock manager. "But there probably were better suitors for the Shamrock chain than Chancellor."

Still, the Chancellor way was a shock for some employees who had gotten used to the Shamrock philosophy. "We have a saying within Shamrock that great people make great radio," says Shamrock president/CEO Marty Loughman. "Your competitive advantage is the people that work within the station. That's what dictates your success." Although he chooses not to comment on Chancellor's operation, Loughman says, "I am disappointed that people I worked with and cared very much about have chosen to go to other situations, because they were very valuable to this organization."

BLOCKING & TACKLING

Nevertheless, Dinetz is optimistic that the changes he's implementing will ultimately make all of his new country acquisitions winners again. "We think these are outstanding properties that need a little TLC and a lot of attention," he says. "Just by blocking and tackling more effectively, and paying more attention to the stationality and the rotations, these stations have improved."

"We love this business, and we work very hard," Dinetz adds. "Some people don't want to work as hard as we choose to work, [but] the real winners in our business know what it takes to win."

WPOC At Birds' Opener; KSON's Short Parade

WPOC Baltimore morning host Laurie DeYoung broadcast live from Oriole Park April 1 from 5:30-9 a.m. for the Orioles' opening day. The broadcast was co-hosted by news director Bill Vanko and Epic artist James House. During the broadcast, DeYoung gave away three trips to major-league ball parks courtesy of Southwest Airlines.

KSON San Diego hosted "the world's shortest St. Patrick's Day parade" March 17. The entire parade route was just 97.3 feet long. Nevertheless, morning co-hosts Tony Randall and Kris Rochester broadcast live and gave away free shamrocks, balloons, bagels, and coffee.

WKJN (Kajun 103) Baton Rouge, La., will host its 13th free listener-appreciation concert April 21 at the Parish Fairgrounds in Livingston, La. Performers will include David Ball and JoDee Messina, as well as local favorite Elvis Barker, whose "Forever Or Nothing" is currently No. 1 on WKJN.

WFMS and WGRL Indianapolis hosted their second Country Music Expo March 29-31 at the Indiana State Fairgrounds. The event featured a Friday evening Garth Fest, a "Country Love Connection" dating game, a western-wear fashion show, line-dance lessons, a local country-band contest, and a "cutest cowkids contest." The event also included a series of seminars on such subjects as songwriting, and how to make it in Nashville. National acts performing at the expo included Ricky Skaggs, Philip Claypool, Mindy McCready, Great Plains, Rich McCready, Bobbie Cryner, Keith Gattis, and Baker & Myers.

MONITOR PROFILE

Country Programming At Q105 A 'Delight' For Top 40 Vet Ronnie Lane

When Ronnie Lane was upped from APD to PD at WRBQ-FM (Q105) Tampa, Fla., last October, he believed the station lacked consistency.

"It was like listening to several different radio stations, depending on who was on the air," he says.

He quickly made several changes, including hiring Ken Cooper from KZLA Los Angeles for mornings, teaming him with local talent John Ritter, then making the morning show "the anchor of the station and modeling everything after that." Lane also put on a morning-style show in afternoon drive, made the other dayparts high-personality but music-intensive, and hired Hoss Burns as station voice. Now, Lane says, "everybody is on the same page."

The changes he made have been paying off. In the last two Arbitron books, Q105 was up 5.3-5.8-6.2 12-plus, making it No. 3 in the market in the fall '95 book. In the two Arbitrums released since the fall book, the news has been even better: Q105 was up to 6.3 in the first trend

and 6.8 in the second, making it No. 2 overall. Rival WQYK-FM, meanwhile, was off from its No. 1-ranked 7.9 12-plus fall share, dipping to 6.8 in the first trend and 5.5 in the second, putting it in seventh place.

Lane describes Q105 as "an uptempo, personality-oriented new country station." He defines "new country" as "a mass-appeal country music that reaches across all demos," although Q105's target audience is 18- to 49-year-old women.

Q105's gold library goes back to 1991-92, with a few older songs that fit the station's sound by having "a rock edge or a new country flavor like 'Born To Boogie' by Hank Williams Jr.," Lane says. His music mix is about 80% currents and recurrants and 20% oldies.

Lane also says he tends to be "so tempo driven" that he is slow on some ballads, including Garth Brooks' "The Change."

Here's a recent afternoon hour on Q105: Doug Stone, "Born In The Dark"; Mark Chesnutt, "It Wouldn't Hurt To Have Wings"; Rhett Akins, "She Said Yes"; David Lee Murphy, "Party Crowd"; Lori White, "Wild At Heart"; Collin Raye, "If I Were You"; Neal McCoy, "You Gotta Love That"; Trisha Yearwood, "Thinkin' About You"; John Michael Montgomery, "Cowboy Love"; Mary Chapin Carpenter, "The

Bug"; Toby Keith, "Does That Blue Moon Ever Shine On You"; Lee Roy Parnell, "Heart's Desire"; Martina McBride, "Safe In The Arms Of Love"; Clay Walker, "Hypnotize The Moon"; and Brooks & Dunn, "Hard Workin' Man."

Despite the ratings gains Q105 has made, Lane says he still faces a formidable competitor in WQYK. "They are a heritage station that's been here 25 years," he says. "Tom Rivers [the OM] and his staff are consistent, they have little turnover, and they are well known throughout Tampa Bay [and have a] loyal audience."

Musically, Lane says, Q105 is more of a top 40-type presentation compared to WQYK's "AC presentation [and] we are more upbeat and current than they are. We emphasize fun on the air [and] do a lot of contesting. The long-range plan is . . . to rule the 18-49 demo in country."

The morning show focuses on zany stunts. Morning man Cooper says two of his favorites are "yelling man/woman," and "the drive-by dater." The first stunt involves having a listener with a cellular phone go through a fast-food drive-through window and yell the order. If the order-taker says, "You don't have to yell," the customer wins \$50. The second stunt involves putting a single man on a busy street corner with a cellular phone and having female listeners drive by and "peruse the merchandise" as they listen to him talk to the morning team on the air. Interested women can call the station and leave their phone number.

Lane launched his radio career after graduating from college in 1979. He landed on-air at top 40 WKDQ Evansville, Ind., where he worked his way up to MD and PD. He moved to Tampa in 1985 for overnights at then top 40 Q105. After two years there, and several ownership changes and format adjustments, he was promoted to afternoons at Q105's then top 40/adult format in 1990. He remained in afternoons during the station's transition to country in 1993, then added APD duties the following year. He relinquished his air shift after being upped to PD last fall.

Lane had spun some country records at a hometown station when he was in high school, but, like a lot of other top 40-to-country converts, he had to learn the format almost from scratch when Q105 flipped to country. "It was a bit overwhelming at first due to the fact that I hadn't even played a country record since my high school days," he says. "I knew nothing about new country. I knew who Reba McEntire, Garth Brooks, and Brooks & Dunn were. That's about it."

He immediately embarked on an educational process that included spending hours watching CMT and TNN and "reading everything [about country] I could get my hands on."

With Lane's recent hiring of MD Wanda Myles from WWKA (K92) Orlando, Fla., Q105 has become the only country station in the U.S. with an all-African-American programming team.

Although he is one of only a handful of African-Americans programming a country station, he says his race has never been an issue with any of the people he encounters through his job. "Country has been quite a pleasure and a delight for me," he says.
