Summer Brings Outdoor Concert Events—And Tales Of Disasters Past

With the first sultry breezes of the new season come the summer concert promotions. For many stations in all formats, these outdoor concert events are the highlight of the year in terms of publicity and listener participation. Promotion directors plan for months in advance to secure locations, confirm performers, establish ticket-distribution channels, rent equipment, and set up remote broadcasting facilities.

But as the old saying goes, the best-laid plans of mice and men can often go awry. Despite stations' best efforts at planning, unforeseen circumstances can turn summer jams into frustrating, surprising, and even scary experiences.

WEATHER OR NOT

Of course, one of the major variables at an outdoor event is the weather. Kellie Shipp, marketing director of top 40 KKRZ Portland, Ore., remembers that two years ago at the station's Last Chance Summer Dance concert, lightning struck the bridge under which Kool & the Gang was performing during a torrential downpour, making a huge noise and "scaring the hell out of everyone," Shipp says. Luckily, the power stayed on, and the band kept playing.

Country WPOC Baltimore promotion director Sheila Silverstein worked for five months to put together a concert and "balloon glow" that was thwarted by bad weather earlier this month. Plans called for Lee Roy Parnell and Bryan White to perform until dusk, at which time 25 hot-air balloons were scheduled to light up the evening sky. Four thousand listeners showed up just in time for a dangerous thunderstorm to hit. A jock went onstage and told the crowd that the safest place to be was in their cars and that they should turn on their car radios and wait for an announcement before coming back. Attendees ended up sitting in their cars for an hour and 45 minutes before the storm cleared.

The concert went on, but because of the late start, it didn't end until after 10 p.m., and, Silverstein says, "no balloons glowed that night."

Country KEEY (K102) Minneapolis' afternoon host Donna Valentine learned about the dangers of gusty winds at last year's Fan Jam. Valentine was onstage talking to the crowd in front of an eight-foot-high booth the station was using to play the game show "Name That Country Tune" between acts. According to promotion director John Nelson, "a big gust of wind knocked over the booth, which hit [Valentine] in the head, knocked her out, and knocked her off-

Big Tie-Ins Planned For All-Star Country Fest

Several radio promos and TV specials are being planned around the Fruit of the Loom All-Star CountryFest '96, a 12-hour music festival set for July 13 in Atlanta. The fest, which is expected to draw 250,000 attendees, will feature Alan Jackson, Alabama, Hank Williams Jr., Pam Tillis, Patty Loveless, Tracy Byrd, the Charlie Daniels Band, Lee Roy Parnell, and Kenny Chesney.

CBS-TV has acquired broadcast rights to the concert and will air a two-hour highlights show July 17 9-11 p.m. EDT. Cable networks TNN and CMT will air pre- and post-show specials,

and TNN will originate several of its regular shows from the Atlanta Motor Speedway, where the concert is being held. TNN has secured the cable rights to the CBS special. Both cable nets have launched promotions around the event.

SW Networks has tied in with Fruit of the Loom and is offering a promo for affiliates of its syndicated "Country's Most Wanted With Carl P. Mayfield." Participating affiliates get 22 pairs of concert tickets to give away to listeners, five pairs for local sponsors, and 22 limited edition concert CDs and posters. **PHYLLIS STARK**

KYCW's Taylor Out; Omaha Gets Country-Rocker

KYCW (Young Country) Seattle GM Gary Taylor is out in the wake of EZ Communications' closing on its \$26 million purchase of the station from Infinity. EZ owns rival KMPS and classic rock KZOK and is acquiring KBKS/KRPM-AM. Fred Schumacher, GM at KMPS/KZOK, will oversee EZ's six Seattle stations. Look for interim PD Matt Bruno to be offered the KYCW PD job. Meanwhile, former sister KYCY (Young Country) San Francisco gets one-year broadcast rights to the Oakland Raiders. Rival KSAN had those rights.

KFMT Omaha, Neb., drops Jones Satellite Networks' country format for a locally programmed country/Southern rock format.

WLWI Montgomery, Ala., GM Rick Brown exits. Colonial Broadcasting's Charlotte Lowder is handling those duties for now.

SFX Broadcasting hires C. Terry Robinson, founder/owner of Pourtales Radio Partners, to serve as special consultant for strategic planning.

WKXX (Kix 106) St. Louis PD Russ Schell exits May 31 to become VP of network operations for Keymarket Radio, which runs the Interstate Radio Network and Road Gang Coast to Coast Network. WKXX GM Bill Viands needs T&Rs.

WSSL Greenville, S.C., MD Ric Larson exits to be PD at WKWS Charleston, W.Va., replacing Jeff Clark. Night DJ Dude Walker is WSSL's new MD.

KZLO Bozeman, Mont., PD Pete Hanson is now WYNG Evansville, Ind., PD, replacing John Swann, now at KRMD Shreveport, La.

WNOE New Orleans MD Lee Sandifer exits. PD Bob Young assumes his duties.

The \$23 million sale of WCLB West Palm Beach, Fla., and sister WIRA Fort Pierce, Fla., from Ardman to Fairbanks has closed.

WJCC Montgomery, Ala., has installed its air staff. In mornings, PD Darlene Dixon is paired with Scott Aber, PD/morning man at KEKB Grand Junction, Colo. WSIX Nashville P/T Bryan Allen takes middays. Former WMYC Mobile, Ala., middayer Scott Free is in afternoons, and hot AC WMXA, Auburn, Ala., morning man Patrick Landers hosts nights. Consultant Ron

Kempff signs on as GM of WJCC, WAFX, and WHHY-AM. Meanwhile, Bill Morgan from WJCC's predecessor, WHHY-FM, joins country rival WBAM for afternoons.

Brad Behnke joins WUSN (US99) Chicago as marketing/promotion director. He previously held that position at crosstown WLXX... KEEY (K102) Minneapolis ups promotion coordinator John Nelson to promotion director.

WRBQ Tampa, Fla., afternoon host Dave McKay joins crosstown WQYK-FM to co-host afternoons with Randy Price. Also, WQYK OM Tom Rivers will guest-host TNN's "Prime Time Country" June 6. WSM-FM Nashville morning man Bill Cody will guest-host the show June 7. In addition, WMTX PD Mason Dixon, whose duties included WRBQ, exits.

WGRX Baltimore hires Kelly Green, former weekends/fill-in at crosstown WPOC, for nights and Jeremiah B. Frog (aka Mike Anderson), former P/T at crosstown WWMX, for overnights.

WCUZ Grand Rapids, Mich., morning man Scott Evans exits, replaced by former morning team Andy Rent and Dennis Sutton. Middayer Mike Tinnes moves to afternoons, replacing Carl E., now at WWWW Detroit. Evening jock Billy the Kid exits. PD Doug Montgomery needs midday/evening jocks. Sister WBCT APD/MD Kelly Iris handles those duties at WCUZ for now.

Sexy-Imaging Controversy As Old As Format

Since country music's early commercialization, the images projected by its female performers have been a source of controversy. That's why it's ironic that certain record executives and radio personnel perceive the sexy imaging of female artists as a '90s phenomenon (Country Airplay Monitor, May 17). There are examples of this kind of imaging throughout the history of the format, and it's often been a double-edged sword. Not all country women wanted the "girl next door" image, and not all of them wanted the sexy stuff either.

Regardless of whether or not the bare-midriff thing and up-close breast and buttock shots are good for country music, it has been a recurrent issue. Here are some examples.

When Kitty Wells released her 1952 blockbuster hit, "It Wasn't God Who Made Honky Tonk Angels," it represented the unthinkable: a back-talking woman's point of view in country music. Yet Wells' imaging remained that of a wholesome, God-fearing housewife. If the song came out today, someone would no doubt insist on a tube-top shirt and something spandex for Wells, but the message of the song was life-transforming for many women without Wonderbras and pierced navels.

On the other hand, there's the famous story about the lovely floor-length gown Jeannie C. Riley had bought to perform her 1968 classic, "Harper Valley P.T.A.," on the Country Music Assn. awards that year. Although the subject matter of the song—released at the height of the women's movement—rebuked small-town hypocrisy by a sexy single mother, the usually go-go boot and miniskirt clad Riley really wanted to look elegant on the telecast. Legend has it that either the show's producer or Riley's label chief ordered her to have the evening dress cut off high above the knees. Riley tearfully obliged, and the dress was remodeled to more appropriately reflect the sassy spirit of the song.

In the '50s, rockin' country mama Wanda Jackson made a guest appearance on the WSM Grand Ole Opry show in a form-fitting cocktail dress with rhinestone spaghetti straps, but she was stopped short of the microphone by Ernest Tubb, who told her she wasn't going onstage "wearing that." Tubb found a fringed leather jacket to cover Jackson's shoulders before her angry performance. According to Jackson, she never played the Opry again.

Where the Opry is concerned, outfits for female performers have been a long-standing issue. In the '60s, Jeannie Seely brought miniskirts to the Opry stage, much to the dismay of management. Seely, however, is tough as nails and to this day appears at the Opry in a miniskirt. She is revered in country circles for helping change the rules and has managed to endear herself to Opry goers and fellow performers without gingham and hair ribbons.

In the '70s, Dottie West adopted a sexy image, appearing in skin-tight cowgirl suits, and was the subject of a photo spread in *Oui* magazine. Music Row gasped, but her fans cheered, and record sales skyrocketed.

Today, the rules are dramatically different, but the issues are basically the same. Sexy imaging will continue to be applauded by some and condemned by others. We've nothing to fear, so long as there are choices for the consumer. The sky won't fall unless all the women in country opt for the less-tasteful look, and we still have plenty who demonstrate modesty and class. And though we've never before had a country album contain shots of pierced body parts (with the exception of a few ears), there've always been those fans who found the sexy image worthy of their record and ticket dollar. The fact that this new incarnation of sexy imaging is drawing attention is further proof that the more things change, the more they stay the same, and that the central issue should be the music, not the packaging.

Brooks Named Solo Best Seller By RIAA

Capitol Nashville artist Garth Brooks is now officially the best-selling solo artist of all time and the second-highest certified artist (group or solo) in the U.S. after the Beatles, according to the Recording Industry Assn. of America. The label celebrated sales of more than 60 million Brooks sets with a '60s-themed party in Nashville May 21. Brooks achieved his RIAA status in seven years (the fastest in history) with only nine albums, compared to the Beatles' 28 albums from 1964-96.

Asylum Records' director of creative services Theresa Blair exits to join Rising Tide in a similar capacity.

Sean Brennan is upped from national promotion director to senior director of operations for Country Club Enterprises.

The roof of the Worlds Fair Park Pavilion in Knoxville, Tenn., came crashing in last week minutes after Tim McGraw had finished his encore and the capacity crowd left the venue. A thunder and hail storm was cited as the cause. There were no injuries, but McGraw's stage set, lighting, and sound equipment for his Spontaneous Combustion tour were destroyed. Several trailers that were being used to transport the tour were damaged. McGraw and opening act Faith Hill performed with borrowed equipment at their scheduled stop

in Baltimore the following night but had to postpone their May 26 Columbus, Ohio, date. The remains of McGraw's stage and equipment were transported back to Nashville for repairs.

Decca Records has signed veteran songwriter Roger Brown to its roster and will release a five-song CD, "Roger Brown & Swing City," June 18.

Decca artist Rhett Akins will launch a 17-city media/retail tour June 4 to promote his new set, "Somebody New." Akins will visit local radio/TV stations and do in-stores and autograph sessions.

WSIX Nashville morning producer Devon O'Day has reached an exclusive agreement with Huntsman Entertainment, which is now offering her voice-over talents for sweeps, IDs, and promos.

To commemorate Tennessee's bicentennial, the U.S. Postal Service is marketing an 11-track CD that pays tribute to the state's musical heritage. The CD, titled "A Taste Of Tennessee," is available starting May 31. The participating artists are donating their royalties to the Tennessee-based charity of their choice. Those artists are Dolly Parton, Johnny Cash, Ricky Skaggs, the Fairfield Four, Tammy Wynette, the Nashville Bluegrass Band, Charlie Daniels, Steve Wariner, CeCe Winans, Marcus Hummon, and Ann Peebles.

Claudia Wagner joins Group W Satellite Communications in the newly created position of manager of international press. She previously was manager/publicist at Herbert H. Breslin Inc.

A group of Chinese and U.S. businessmen have signed an agreement to launch China's first country music hall, according to Reuters. The Buffalo Saloon will feature live performances of U.S. country music stars and line dancing. The \$2 million venture, set to open in October, is being funded by U.S. members of the Sino-American Cultural Consortium, who want to bring American culture to China, Reuters reports.

Trace Adkins

"THERE'S A GIRL IN TEXAS"
(CAPITOL NASHVILLE)

Determination is something that comes naturally to Trace Adkins. In the second grade, he planned to play pro football, and years later, at a solid 6'6", he became a star player, making the all-district team in his hometown, where he was also president of the student council. Adkins continued his education at Louisiana Tech, where a passion for music overrode his pro-bowl ambitions. "Dreamin' Out Loud" is his debut album, due in June.

Paul Brandt

"MY HEART HAS A HISTORY" (REPRISE)

A native of Calgary, Alberta, Brandt sang in church as a boy, grew up on gospel music, and began playing guitar in ninth grade. In high school, he listened to such artists as George Strait, Dwight Yoakam, and Clint Black and entered talent contests. Although he won a \$1,000 prize at the 1992 Calgary Stampede, he chose to pursue a career in nursing and spent two years as a pediatric nurse before switching to music full time. This is the first single from his debut album, "Calm Before The Storm." Brandt, 23, wrote or co-wrote six songs on the album.

"TELL ME AGAIN" (CAREER)

At age 3, Tammy Wynette Graham was teaching herself piano. Six years later, she won local and regional Imperial Miss Arkansas talent titles and placed second in the world competition. Her early teens were spent touring with her own band (which included her parents), and after a few years, she embarked on one of the longest continuous runs by a performer at Caesar's in Las Vegas. This single is from her self-titled debut album.

Paul Jefferson

"CHECK PLEASE" (ALMO SOUNDS)

Growing up in Woodside, Calif., Paul Jefferson had Willie Nelson and Hank Williams, Sr. as his heroes. The co-writer of Aaron Tippin's No. 1 single "That's As Close As I'll Get To Lov-

ing You," Jefferson has a degree in biomedical engineering from UC Berkeley. He worked as a pilot instructor before moving to Nashville to pursue a music career nearly four years ago. His self-titled debut for Almo Sounds was produced by label head Garth Fundis.

Mindy McCready

"TEN THOUSAND ANGELS" (BNA)

When Mindy McCready was 10 years old, she began several years of vocal lessons. After graduating from high school at age 16 so she could pursue singing, she came to Nashville with a one-year deadline. If nothing happened in that time, McCready planned to go back to Florida and attend college. Fifty-one weeks after she arrived in Nashville, McCready signed a record deal.

LeAnn Rimes

"BLUE" (MCG CURB)

LeAnn Rimes has quite a resumé for her 13 years. A "Star Search" winner at the age of 8, she has performed at Dallas Cowboys, Dallas Mavericks, and Dallas Stars games, recorded her first album (on an independent label) at age 11, and logged more than 100 performances in 1995. "Blue" was written for Patsy Cline by DJ Bill Mack of WBAP Dallas almost 35 years ago, but Cline's death in 1963 put the song on a shelf until Mack found the right voice for it in Rimes.

"JACOB'S LADDER" (MERCURY NASHVILLE)

From the small town of Blue Ridge, Ga., comes Mark Wills with a self-titled debut album.



A performer since nursery school, Wills has been influenced by everyone from Bon Jovi to George Jones. Five years ago, he won a talent contest in Marietta, Ga., an Atlanta suburb, which led to a

regular gig at a local club. It was there that he was first seen by record execs and signed to Mercury Nashville.

Summer Brings Outdoor Concert Events—And Tales Of Disasters Past

stage. It stopped the concert until the ambulance came."

Valentine ended up spending most of the concert in the emergency room, getting 10 stitches in her head. She says, "It was complete hell." She recovered, and upon returning to work at the station, she turned the mishap into a two-week running bit that included having the paramedic who helped her come to the station to deliver a helmet. "We had some fun with something that wasn't really funny," Nelson says.

At this year's Fan Jam, scheduled for Sept. 14, Valentine plans to come out in a hard hat, accompanied by medical technicians, perhaps on a stretcher. Nelson says that at this year's event, the game-show booth will be secured to the stage.

Sometimes it's heat that can wreak havoc on a show. Sharon Klein, marketing director for R&B KKBT (the Beat) Los Angeles, says the station's outdoor Summer Jam at local Irvine Meadows frequently gets local headlines that mention the temperature, not the acts. "The first year we did it, it was brutally hot, but the... concertgoers dealt with it. We didn't lose anybody to fainting or anything [but] the reviewers from the general media said, 'Why did they have to pick the hottest day of the year?' and 'The lemonade line was too long'—like it was something we could control."

STAR TURNS

Performers can be a temperamental and unpredictable lot, as many station-event coordinators have found out.

When triple-A WXRT Chicago hired the Replacements to headline the station's annual Fourth of July free concert in the city's Grant Park, no one could have predicted the outcome. "It was their absolute last concert ever," says then PD Norm Winer. "They broke up before our very eyes."

The band had been on the road for a while, extending its tour to include the WXRT show. As Winer watched just offstage, he felt mixed emotions as it became clear what was happening. "They went down in a blaze of glory, playing with a fire and tension that is great rock'n'roll," he recalls. "As the set went on, there was more and more tension and animosity and antagonism. When they left the stage for the encore, they handed their instruments to the DJs, who didn't know what to do. Apparently, they were asking the jocks to go onstage and play the encore... the band just stormed out and left. As it happened, the roadies went out and played the encore. There's a song from that performance memorialized on our first 'Live From The Archives' CD."

KMEL San Francisco marketing director Katie Eyerly has survived nine KMEL Summer Jams, with No. 10 scheduled for Aug. 3. Eyerly's advice: Never make your show a two-day event. KMEL tried it for two years, "and that nearly killed us," she says. "We had booked about 22 acts on each day, and naturally, every act was booked on a very tight performance time line." Because of the sheer number of performers, backstage dressing-room space was at a premium, forcing the station to utilize a convoy of limos to shuttle artists back and forth to the venue with military precision.

Eyerly recalls the limo driver going to pick up an artist for a set, only to find that the artist had disappeared to go shopping. Another well-known female artist refused to get in the limo because her nails were not yet dry. "We've had track artists who have shown up and forgotten to bring the DAT with their backing tracks," recalls Eyerly, resulting in an unscheduled mad dash to Tower Records to buy the album.

Missing DATs have caused problems for artists at R&B WKKV Milwaukee's Summer Jam, says MD Lauri Jones. "Last year, M.C. Breed forgot to bring his DAT, so he had to go out there and do a dry thing, a cappella, which was tough for Breed," she says. "Another time, the group Kut Klose went onstage, but their tape was cued to the middle of the song. They got boxed."

KKBT's Klein recalls a few other artist-related incidents: "In 1994, Jamie Foxx (formerly of TV's 'In Loving Color') tried to beat up a security guard who was taking away his video camera... The incident made it to the paper," says Klein. "Then last year, performances by a pair of big-name

rap groups were impaired by the fact that 'a couple of the members were arrested,'" she says.

According to Monica Starr, PD of hip-hop WEJM (106 Jams) Chicago, rap group Onyx generated some surprise and anger at a Back to School Jam in Chicago when the group decided to pour water on the crowd. While this cool-down tactic would have been perfect at a hot outdoor show, this was indoors, and moisture wreaks havoc on those elaborate, just-for-the-concert hair styles. "You know people had just gotten their 'dos done, and they were mad!" she says.

COME ONE, COME ALL

No matter how many security precautions are taken, how meticulous the planning, or how thoroughly rules are communicated, KMEL's Eyerly says it's inevitable that some young artist, caught up in the sea of love while onstage, will blurt out, "You're a beautiful audience, and you're all invited to the after-party at [insert name of top-secret, swanky hotel where all the artists are staying]."

Then there's backstage crowd control. WEJM's Starr recalls, "At our Back to School Jam... we had an entourage backstage that kept growing until it grew onto the stage. Acts were performing with a backdrop of people."

Thanks to today's home-computer technology, the forgery of backstage passes has become rampant. It's now possible for someone to arrive at the show, get a quick look at a pass, then run home and punch out a close approximation on their color copier and laminating machine, says Eyerly. KMEL and many other stations have had to stay a step ahead by using expensive holographic passes.

Eyerly recalls one pre-holograph year, when KMEL held a 90-minute, pre-show backstage party for contest winners and clients, the only time anyone from the public was to be allowed backstage. "Literally hundreds more people than we anticipated suddenly appeared backstage, crammed together and spilling out the exits," she says. Upon closer inspection, Eyerly realized that all those extra people were wearing forged laminated passes, causing security guards to clear everyone out of the backstage area.

BELIEVE IT OR NOT

Then there are stories that defy categorization. Equipment problems, location snafus, unruly audiences, and other variables can drastically upset the concert equation.

Gregg Steele programs album rock WZTA Miami. But when he worked on the West Coast, he was part of a massive promotion that shipped 300-400 listeners to Cabo Wabo, Mexico, for a three-day festival of music headlined by Alice In Chains. Almost nothing went right. First, some of the other acts on the bill ran afoul of the local constabulary over illegal substances. The labels had brought in radio folks from around the country, and, Steele says, "we had visiting PDs that disappeared. They literally wandered off and were missing for days."

Worse were the Mexican rentals, old VW vans with no air-conditioning. In 102-degree weather, it was Steele's job to ferry artists from airport to hotel, a 20-mile trek down one-lane dirt roads. A similarly rocky 20-mile journey lay between the hotel and the venue for soundchecks. In the haste and frenzy of coordinating all the different schedules, Steele misread the gas gauge and ran out of gas after dropping off his last band halfway between airport and hotel on an abandoned stretch of road in the middle of the night. Steele was alone in the dark and didn't know a word of Spanish.

One year, KMEL decided to have jocks make a grand entrance onstage. "Someone wanted to have [then morning man] Bill Lee come riding in on an elephant," says Eyerly. Several thousand dollars later, the station located an elephant that had to be trucked up from Southern California. They quickly discovered it was too heavy for the stage, so Lee, complete with Aladdin-style garb and cheesy music, had to ride it down the center aisle of the venue. After taking that a budget hit, Eyerly and staff decided to let future jocks just walk onstage.

Unforeseen circumstances don't stop stations from continuing to plan these mega-concert events. Stations stress that the entertainment value and the money raised for charity donations are the bottom line.

MONITOR PROFILE

Tunesmith Sanders Has The Ear Of Radio With Six Songs On The Airplay Chart

With six songs in the top 50 on this week's Country Airplay chart, songwriter Mark D. Sanders seems to have hit on a winning formula for determining what kinds of songs radio wants. But Sanders is the first one to admit he has no idea what that formula is.

"I don't know any secrets. I just write what I write," he says. "Maybe it's because I'm writing uptempo and positive songs. Maybe it's because Mike Reid's been writing an opera... There is some energy to what I'm doing right now. Maybe it's because I have fun writing it so it sounds like there is some energy behind it."

Sanders' current chart-toppers are all uptempo records: George Strait's "Blue Clear Sky" (No. 1), Ricochet's "Daddy's Money" (No. 17), Jo Dee Messina's "Heads Carolina, Tails California" (No. 19), Paul Brandt's "My Heart Has A History" (No. 20), Rhett Akins' "Don't Get Me Started" (No. 27), and Lonestar's

tar's "Runnin' Away With My Heart" (No. 47).

Sanders co-authored Lonestar's previous hit, "No News," and the Faith Hill ballad "It Matters To Me." In the latter song, which was written "from pure emotion" after a fight with his wife, Sanders says he "sort of indicted all strong and silent men, myself included... In my songs the woman is sort of in control. They are sort of pro-woman."

Sanders is also the pen behind Reba McEntire's "The Heart Is A Lonely Hunter," Neal McCoy's "They're Playing Our Song," Rick Trevino's "Bobbie Ann Mason," and John Anderson's "Money In The Bank."

Last week, Sanders set a personal record by having five of his songs cut. Those cuts included two by Lonestar, two by McEntire, and one, "Two Ways To Fall," by Ty England. Sanders co-wrote "Vidalia," on the new Sammy Kershaw album, "Politics, Religion, And Her," plus cuts on new albums by Linda Davis, Rick Trevino, Trace Adkins, and Kenny Chesney.

Sanders, who is signed to Starstruck Writers Group, works regularly with such songwriting partners as Tim Nichols and Bob DiPiero, and labels frequently line up songwriting sessions with these songwriting veterans for one of their artists. Sanders says those

sessions are sometimes productive and sometimes frustrating. "It depends on how directed the artist is... It's a real delicate process," he says. "We've had times where having a third person in there is defeating... It all depends on if the artist is really a writer. Some are and some aren't."

Sanders says his current favorite artist/writer is Lonestar's John Rich. "Other writers and I agree that this guy is a songwriter," he says.

According to Sanders, a hit record "has to have about three defining musical moments that just stick with you." It also helps to have a star singing them. "It's harder to get radio to play it if it's not a star," he says. "If it's not a star it has to be compelling to [give radio] a reason to play it."

Among his favorite artist interpretations of his songs are Messina's "Heads Carolina, Tails California" ("she had the vocal energy that matched the energy of the song"), and Anderson's "Money In The Bank" ("the perfect song for the perfect voice").

Writing uptempo songs is a fairly recent thing for Sanders. "I used to write a bunch of slow, sad songs for years," he says. "I was sad and depressed for a lot of those years... Since I turned 40, I've been writing more up." Sanders says writing with DiPiero "taught me that songwriting can be fun. To write [a song like] 'Money In The Bank,' you can spend the afternoon laughing and still make a bunch of money."

When he's not writing hit songs, Sanders devotes time to charity work and says "I have a compelling need to help other people. I'm trying to figure out where that comes from." He and fellow songwriter Tony Arata recently organized "Hats Off To High Hopes," a benefit dinner, auction, and guitar pull that raised \$50,000 for a local school for special-needs children.

Although complaining about country radio is a popular pastime among his fellow writers, Sanders says he has few complaints of his own.

"I don't think it's as bad as everybody keeps saying it is. Of course I have a lot of songs on it, so maybe that's why," he says. "There is some stuff that's not up to snuff, but just when you think it's rotten, you hear something great. I think it's always been like that."

Sanders believes in the songwriter theory that "if you have a song on the radio, you hate everything else on the radio." And while he concurs with his fellow writers that country radio can get boring, predictable, and safe, he admits that he sometimes gets that way himself.

"Maybe in three years I won't have any songs on the radio and I'll have a theory of what's wrong with radio," he says. "But right now I can't complain."



Rimes' Retro-Sounding Debut Hit 'Blue'—Once Planned For Patsy Cline—Astonishes Industry

by Phyllis Stark

MCG Curb VP Carson Schreiber knew he had "magic" with "Blue," the debut single by 13-year-old LeAnn Rimes, but the reaction the retro-sounding record had at country radio surprised even him. Although he wasn't officially going for airplay until May 20, the record debuted at No. 49 with a bullet on the May 17 Country Airplay Monitor chart and moves up to 38 with a bullet this week, with an increase of 1,126 spins over last week.

Schreiber says he had asked stations just to test the record two weeks ago, but the reaction was "basically . . . like that potato-chip commercial—'betcha can't eat just one.'" In the case of "Blue," however, it was "betcha can't play it just once." The record got 12 spins May 6, 32 on May 7, 30 on May 8, then jumped to 147 on May 9.

Programmers tell some surprising and funny stories about reactions to the song from listeners and

themselves.

"I gave it to our night guy and told him to play it sometime during that evening," says WMZQ Washington, D.C., PD Mac Daniels. "I had a meeting that evening and on my way home turned on the radio in time to hear him say, 'Man, this thing is taking off. For the third time tonight, here's "Blue" by LeAnn Rimes.'" Daniels says he immediately called the jock, who explained that listeners were calling and demanding to hear it again. By the time Daniels arrived at work early the next day, the morning man was in his office asking what the song was, because he had gotten so many requests for it.

Daniels ended up letting all of his jocks play the record that day, but took it out of the studio the next day as an experiment "to see what the passion was. By the middle of that afternoon, I was getting hate calls from listeners. One guy actually called and accused Faith Hill and Reba McEntire of getting to me and paying me not to play it, so they wouldn't have competition."

KKBQ (93Q) Houston PD Dene Hallam says the record not only generated the first E-mail about a record he has received since the station installed its World Wide Web site on the Internet several months ago, but also a call at home from Hallam's air-conditioner

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

Fall Ratings Survey To Add 33 Markets

Beginning in the fourth quarter of this year, Arbitron will add a fall survey to 33 markets that currently are measured only in the spring. The addition of these markets brings the total number of markets surveyed in the fall to 205 of Arbitron's 263 markets.

Four-Way Format Swap In Louisville This Week

Louisville, Ky., is home to a four-way format change this week that sees Clear Channel's soon-to-be acquired WHKW-FM (the Hawk) move to the frequency currently occupied by ABC Real Country affiliate WKJK. WKJK's format moves to the Hawk's AM. Meanwhile, WHKW's old frequency goes to classic hits as "Star 107.7," replacing former '70s outlet WQLL, which, in turn, segues to smooth jazz. WHKW PD Don Christi stays on to program "Star 107.7" for now. WHKW morning hosts Michael Bandy and Jason Bailey exit. Former WHKW's Beth Bradley goes to new top 40 outlet WJGG (the Cat) Lexington, Ky., for mornings. WHKW p.m. driver Shane Collins will go to afternoons at WJGG.

Citadel Communications has started an LMA on its previously announced purchase of KRST Albuquerque, N.M., and also has a joint sales agreement for KRST's duopoly partners, KRZY-AM-FM. Bob Proffitt, GM of Citadel's other Albuquerque properties, adds those duties for KRST only. Chuck Hammond remains GM of the KRZY twins.

As tipped last week, KEYV Las Vegas flips from country to oldies under the direction of new PD Brian White, who arrives from WMAS Springfield, Mass. KEYV is now known as Big Oldies 93 and has applied for the calls KBGO.

WEEJ Fort Myers, Fla., flips from country gold to the market's fourth mainstream country station as WFSN (Sun Country 100). Craig Scott remains the consultant. Jim Radford from WYYY (Y94) Syracuse, N.Y., is the new director of programming for WFSN and owner Osborn's other Southwest Florida stations. No air staff has been hired; Radford, who was once part of a four-way battle in the Riverside/San Bernardino, Calif., market, needs T&Rs from potential jocks.

Rumblings out of Tampa, Fla.: Clear Channel's local VP programming for WRBQ (Q105) Mason Dixon and his AC WMTX (Mix 96) co-host Bill Connelly are off the air, pending the resolution of "a firm offer [elsewhere] in the market," according to station sources. Meanwhile, Gan-

nett's crosstown AC WUSA morning team of Bob Judd, and Nancy are, coincidentally, in a contract window.

Tribune Broadcasting has sold Interstate Radio Network to River City Broadcasting for an undisclosed price. IRN, which has more than 50 affiliates, broadcasts five hours of programming, seven nights a week, that includes country music, talk, weather, road conditions, and other information targeted at cross-country truckers.

Triathlon Broadcasting Co. has closed on its \$8.75 million purchase from Silverado Broadcasting Co. of KNFR Spokane, Wash., and its two sister stations.

KHEY El Paso, Texas, MD/midday host John Hunter exits. PD Jay J. McRae assumes MD duties and is now taking music calls. Production director Mike Daniels takes over middays.

Former KCIN Seattle MD Lia Knight joins KXDD Yakima, Wash., as MD/midday host. She replaces Bob Reese, who exits.

At KPLX Dallas, Jon Griffin moves from nights to middays/production, Teresa Brown moves from overnights to nights, and Todd Thomas is upped from P/T to overnights.

WMTZ (the Mountain) Johnstown, Pa., GSM Paul Pasqualini nabs a sales post at WXTU Philadelphia.

PD Wes McShay moves himself from middays to mornings, at least for the rest of the spring book, at KOEL Waterloo, Iowa, following the departure of Jay Scott and Danielle. P/T Jeff Michaels is handling middays.

KFTZ Idaho Falls, Idaho, PD Rich Summers joins KIZN Boise, Idaho, as APD/p.m. drive, replacing Lance Tidwell.

Does this sound like some place you've worked? The New York Times reports that the residents of the Boarda Psychiatric Hospital in Buenos Aires have begun a nationally syndicated show called "Loony Radio," which now, the story says, comes millions of listeners on 12 radio stations. Besides allowing the mental patients to discuss political issues of the day, "Loony Radio" features reports from a man claiming to be the show's correspondent on Mars.

Time For A Traditional Country Backlash

When I was an MD, promotion people occasionally told me their frustrations. Other times, I was the source of those frustrations, and they probably vented to other folks. At any rate, I've grown fond of listening to their concerns, whether it be radio-related or, these days, chart-related. One of my favorite topics is the plight of underdog records and underdog styles within the format.

No one cheered more than I did when the Academy of Country Music crowned the Mavericks with the top vocal group award, and I cheered just as heartily after Alan Jackson performed "Home" on the same show. I know that for the sake of balance on the air, it takes all hands and the cook to deliver the right stew.

With that said, it's time once again to bellow about certain traditional-sounding records that are taking it in the shorts at radio. We have an overabundance of contemporary-sounding releases, which tends to shift the format's bi-rhythm. Promotion people tell me that there's a prevailing attitude among programmers that the only records capable of exciting the audience are the rock-edged or AC-sounding ones.

Obviously, there are traditional-sounding records that fare extremely well on the radio and on the charts. "High Lonesome Sound" by Vince Gill is the most notable example at the moment. Gill has put banjos back on the radio, and this track enjoys the support of the entire chart panel. But it probably wouldn't be as well-known if it were by an unknown artist.

Another notable example is LeAnn Rimes' "Blue" (see story, page 1). But there are plenty of others that aren't enjoying such success.

David Ball's new release, "Circle Of Friends," should have been one of the most anticipated new releases of the entire year, yet radio is dragging its feet because it's too country. After one month on the chart, the record still has less than half the panel. Why? It's criminal that this guy turns in one of the best sounding albums in years and the lead single is being penalized because it's too country.

Daryle Singletary gave us "Too Much Fun," one of the hottest records in recent memory, yet the follow-up release is being treated as if the guy had never opened his mouth before.

RCA gives us an exciting, young, videogenic artist in Keith Gattis, and precious few programmers got it on the lead single. Why?

Ken Mellons turned in a hillbilly masterpiece with "Stranger In Your Eyes," and it's still in the 50s after five weeks.

This one I really don't get: Sammy Kershaw's "Meant To Be." By this time in its life, it should be basking in top 10 sunshine.

It's time we stop hiding behind lame excuses and start a serious stylistic debate in country music. One senior Nashville promo exec who was around when all the country records started sounding the same in the '80s recently told me we're headed down the same road—radio records that all sound the same, and albums that don't sell. I hope he's wrong, and I think he hopes he's wrong, too. What we need as a format is a traditional country backlash that would make the one orchestrated in the '80s by Randy Travis, Ricky Skaggs and a few others look like a piccolo recital. If it doesn't happen, we should begin searching for another name for the format and get on with it.

A native of Calgary, Alberta, Brandt sang in church as a boy, grew up on gospel music, and began playing guitar in ninth grade. In high school, he listened to such artists as George Strait, Dwight Yoakam, and Clint Black and entered talent contests. Although he won a \$1,000 prize at the 1992 Calgary Stampede, he chose to pursue a career in nursing and spent two years as a pediatric nurse before switching to music full time. This is the first single from his debut album, "Calm Before The Storm." Brandt, 23, wrote or co-wrote six songs on the album.

★ Paul Jefferson

"CHECK PLEASE" (ALMO SOUNDS)

Growing up in rural Woodside, Calif., Paul Jefferson had such country singers as Willie Nelson and Hank Williams Sr. as his heroes.

By listening to those artists, he learned how to combine music with songwriting. The co-writer of Aaron Tippin's No. 1 single, "That's As Close As I'll Get To Loving You," Jefferson has a degree in biomedical engineering from UC—Berkeley. He worked as a pilot instructor before moving to Nashville to pursue a music career nearly four years ago. His self-titled debut for Almo Sounds was produced by label head Garth Fundis.



Jo Dee Messina

"HEADS CAROLINA, TAILS CALIFORNIA" (CURB)

After performing at a local radio show in Nashville, Jo Dee Messina was introduced to a producer who took an interest in the singer and began working with her in the studio. In a chance meeting in the producer's office, she was introduced to labelmate Tim McGraw. The two became friends, and when it was time for the album, McGraw helped produce it.

"BLUE" (MCG CURB)

LeAnn Rimes has quite a resumé, despite her 13 years. A "Star Search" winner at the age of 8, she's performed at Dallas Cowboys, Dallas Mavericks, and Dallas Stars games, recorded her first album (on an independent label) at age 11, and logged more than 100 performances in 1995. "Blue" was written for Patsy Cline by DJ Bill Mack of WBAP Dallas almost 35 years ago, but Cline's death in 1963 put the song on a shelf until Mack found the right voice for it in Rimes.

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Rimes' Debut Hit 'Blue'—Once Planned For Patsy Cline—Astonishes Industry

pair man, who "was a big fan of the radio station and was comfortable enough to call me at home that night to tell me I had hit the jackpot" with "Blue."

When KKBQ afternoon jock "Cactus" Jack Talley played it for the first time and asked for calls, Hallam says, "We literally got hundreds within a half-hour. Not one was negative."

WXTU Philadelphia PD Kevin O'Neal says that 10 minutes after playing it the first time, a record store called, because a customer wanted to buy it. (A commercial single will be available in cassette and CD versions, as well as a vinyl 45 version for jukebox operators, June 4.)

O'Neal recalls a showcase for Rimes in Tampa, Fla., set up by the label for programmers. Among the attendees were some notoriously tough critics, such as WAMZ Louisville, Ky., PD Coyote Calhoun and WIVK Knoxville, Tenn., PD Les Acree. and O'Neal describes it as "a pretty tough room . . . They had these risers set up, and I thought, 'They're going to put a 13-year-old on there singing to tracks. I don't even want to see the massacre.'" But when Rimes came on, O'Neal says, "in 30 seconds, we were all spellbound."

COULD HAVE BEEN BLUE

If MCG Curb hadn't taken what Schreiber describes as a "grass-roots approach" to introducing Rimes, she may not have gotten off to such a splashy start. "The Light In Your Eyes" was originally slated as the first single, although it does not show off Rimes' vocal athletics to nearly the extent "Blue" does. Label reps took a four-song sampler and an electronic press kit featuring the video for "The Light In Your Eyes" to radio stations for five months. Based on radio reaction to "Blue," the label switched gears on the single and decided to forgo a debut video.

Rimes and "Blue" got some radio exposure during performances in the label's hospitality suite at Country Radio Seminar at showcases in Tampa and Dallas, and, more recently, during the Gavin Country Seminar in Los Angeles.

"Blue" was originally recorded on an independently released CD Rimes released when she was 11, which, she says, sold about 15,000 units in the Dallas and Fort Worth, Texas, area. In a story that is becoming legend, the song was written for Patsy Cline by WBAP Dallas DJ Bill Mack. Cline died before she could record it, and Mack held onto the song until he met Rimes and decided she had the right voice to sing it.

Her debut MCG Curb album was just completed last week and will be rush-released to meet a July 30 street date. In addition to "Blue" and "The Light In Your Eyes," it will contain the other two songs that were on the sampler, "Hurt Me," which Hallam is already eyeing as a potential album cut, and "My Baby." Rimes has signed with Creative Artists Agency and will be booked by agent Rod Essig for a tour to begin this summer. Her touring band will comprise veteran Dallas-area studio musicians.

YODELING FROM THE GRAVE

Although the reaction to "Blue" has been overwhelmingly positive, there were pockets of resistance and some concern from PDs about the record's retro sound. When morning man Gerry House played it on WSIX Nashville, the first round of calls he took were all negative and included such comments as "it sounds like Patsy Cline yodeling from her grave." House, who clearly disagreed with the verdict, took the unusual step of taking a second round of calls—all positive this time—after a commercial break. (The yodeling, incidentally, was not originally written in the song. Rimes says it was her

idea.)

Although KZLA Los Angeles PD John Sebastian says, "I'm really behind this song and this artist," he reports some negatives in his research, because "it's a very odd record. People say, 'Who is this person and why is she cracking her voice like that?' . . . It's even produced like an old country song—bare-bones production—so it really sticks out on the radio. But we sure get calls whenever we play it."

"This record had the chance to be either a major bust or a hit, and boy, is it a hit," says O'Neal. "You're dealing with something that could be polarized. That style will either work today or it won't. What led me to believe it would is that 'Crazy' and 'I Fall To Pieces' test so well everywhere."

Programmers say they haven't seen a reaction record like this since Tim McGraw's "Indian Outlaw" and "Don't Take The Girl" and Billy Ray Cyrus' "Achy Breaky Heart." Unlike the latter, however, they say "Blue" is not a borderline novelty but, according to O'Neal, "a bona fide hit record."

PDs are pleased to have a record that people are talking about during the critical spring Arbitron ratings period. "These are the types of songs we need . . . Songs that will get people talking about the format during the ratings book," says Daniels. WMZQ has already booked Rimes for its Bull Run Country Jamboree June 23.

FROM ANNIE TO PATSY

Rimes, who has been performing onstage since the age of 5 and was a "Star Search" winner at age 8, is poised and mature beyond her 13 years. She is already aware of the importance radio will have in her career. She spent the day May 15 calling stations to thank them for their support.

She is as influenced by Broadway show tunes and such artists as Barbra Streisand and Judy Garland as she is by Cline and McEntire. Rimes auditioned for the musical "Annie 2" on Broadway at age 6 and says she almost got the part, but "they thought I was too young to carry the show."

Although she is co-managed and produced by her father, Wilbur Rimes, the artist insists she wasn't pushed to be a prodigy. "I told my mom and dad this is what I wanted to do at the age of 5," she says. "All little kids have dreams of what they want to do when they grow up. Mine never changed . . . I've kind of pushed my parents more than they're pushing me. They've never been backstage parents. I told them what I wanted."

Despite her young age, Rimes says, "I didn't really set a time line for myself. I really just wanted to accomplish my dream of being something."

Veteran manager Narvel Blackstock took an early interest in Rimes, as did Decca Records, whose representatives flew to Dallas to see her in January 1995. Instead of signing with Blackstock, however, the Rimes family opted to set up a management company headed by Wilbur Rimes and attorney Lyle Walker, who owns the Norman Petty Studios in Clovis, N.M., where part of her MCG Curb album was recorded. Rimes says they decided on that arrangement because they felt "we would have a little more control of my career if we did it this way." They also chose to sign with the Curb label, rather than Decca, last spring.

Because of a busy performance schedule that included 107 dates last year, and what she refers to as "a lot of trouble in school with kids," Rimes has been tutored at home for about a year and a half and says she's too busy to miss being in school, despite having no friends her age. In seventh grade, she was pretested and advanced to ninth grade, so next fall, she will begin the equivalent of the sophomore year of high school.

MONITOR PROFILE

David Wood Programs Fun Into WFMS While Minding Not To Step On The Bear's Toes

Before landing his first country programming job at WFMS Indianapolis in January, veteran AC PD David Wood says he was jealous of the format.

"I've always been someone that listens to country but had never actually done it," he says. "I was always envious of the format because of the fun it was from a programming standpoint [and] because of the access to the artists and just the relationship the artists have with country radio. I would always watch the [Academy of Country Music Awards] and think, 'Wow, they thank radio.' I couldn't imagine anyone in the pop or rock arena doing that."

Despite his AC background, Wood says he "wasn't completely ignorant" about country music and, since joining WFMS, has "caught on pretty fast. When [station manager] Charlie Morgan hired me, he said he liked the idea of having someone

from a different perspective. He said, "There are enough people in this station who know the music. I'm interested in you for the other things."

Morgan's gamble paid off in the winter Arbitron book, in which WFMS rose 10.8-13.4 to recapture the No. 1 12-plus slot from album rock WFBQ. Wood, however, refuses to take the credit. "I've had people come in and pat me on the back and say, 'Great job,' and all I did was rearrange the office furniture," he says. "I haven't had time to do anything else." Wood says his former station, WWMX (Mix 106) Baltimore, "had a great book in the winter that I probably had more to do with, but I'll never get an ounce of credit for that."

Despite his claims of having done nothing yet, Wood admits to doing some "fine-tuning" that was necessary because WFMS had been without a PD for six months prior to his arrival. The fine-tuning included "tightening the list some, trimming the gold library some, getting a little more focused in our music research, and getting a little slower in our approach to currents. We're hanging on to strong records longer." The gold library was trimmed not by era but "just by strength of song," Wood says. "It had gotten a little unwieldy in size."

WFMS plays 37 or 38 currents, but Wood says he tries not to play "the chart game. That has been a frustration of mine, seeing the song peak at No. 1 and the next week it's No. 14. I'm thinking, 'Does that mean it's not as strong as it was last week?' And there's so much pressure from labels to go on to the new ones." Wood just recently dropped "What I Meant To Say" and "Hypnotize The Moon" to recurrent.

"I don't see any reason to penalize the listener and take their favorite song down to a lower rotation just because the chart says it's

over," he says. "We went through a period for maybe 12 consecutive weeks in research where there was not one song that was 100% familiar. It just blew me away. I figure a song that is your No. 1 or No. 2 record ought to be 100% familiar. I think we burn through records [too] quickly. That's something that concerns me. That tells me we're not developing these records fully . . . At times we shortchange the audience."

Here's a recent afternoon hour on WFMS: Jo Dee Messina, "Heads Carolina, Tails California"; Rhett Akins, "Don't Get Me Started"; George Strait, "The Fireman"; Alan Jackson, "I'll Try"; Mindy McCready, "Ten Thousand Angels"; Vince Gill, "Take Your Memory With You"; Bryan White, "I'm Not Supposed To Love You Anymore"; Brooks & Dunn, "My Maria"; Garth Brooks, "Unanswered Prayers"; Lee Roy Parnell, "Givin' Water To A Drowning Man"; John Michael Montgomery, "I Can Love You Like That"; Ricochet, "Daddy's Money"; and Shenandoah, "The Church On Cumberland Road."

In addition to the musical fine-tuning, Wood is in the process of "trying to get the fun back" at WFMS, something he says was accidentally lost in trying to steer the station away from hot country sister station WGRL (the Bear). "It's something that the station may have overreacted to. In trying to stay out of the way of the Bear, [we] sacrificed some of the fun, creative things on the air," he says. "That's one of the things we're trying to get back into . . . We're a full, family-oriented station, but we're also working very hard at bringing some entertainment value into it."

That effort includes "working with the individual jocks, trying to bring more fun into their presentation," taking "a different approach with our production elements," and being "a little more aggressive with our approach on promos," including buying "a new, fun-sounding jingle package," Wood says.

Between WFMS and WGRL, Wood says, the Indianapolis country audience is served "from womb to tomb." He also says the two stations are "competitive but not destructive." WGRL, which was ranked No. 6 12-plus in the winter book, targets 18-34 but aggressively goes after teens. The WFMS target audience is 25-54.

The two stations collaborate on just two promotions a year. The first is a Halloween haunted house in which the Bear targets high schoolers and WFMS targets their parents. The second is a spring country music expo that both stations position on the air as their own event. WFMS will sponsor a July 4 free concert featuring Joe Diffie and James Bonamy. Its spring book promotion is an in-office listen-and-win contest, dubbed "Love Your Country At Work," with \$100, \$200, and \$1,000 prizes.

Prior to joining WFMS, Wood was PD at WWMX and WSSF Baltimore, WRAL Raleigh, N.C., and WSNX Muskegon, Mich., and hosted mornings at WLIT Cincinnati and WNDE Indianapolis. 

Women Artists Opt For Fashionable, Sexy Image Over 'Girl Next Door' Look

Shania Twain may have taken some heat from the press in the past year for her midriff-baring outfits and flirtatious videos, but she has sold 7 million copies of her second album, "The Woman In Me," and taken home a shelf-full of industry awards. In what is partly a byproduct of her success, there is a trend toward sexuality taking a front-and-center role in the packaging of female country artists. In fact, we're seeing so many belly buttons these days that one industry wit refers to the new young female artists as "the navel patrol."



Davis

Mindy McCready's debut BNA album, "Ten Thousand Angels," features several shots of McCready in midriff-revealing fashions, and one inside-cover shot shows just the navel itself, which happens to be pierced.

Linda Davis' last Arista album, "Some Things Are Meant To Be," features not only Davis' navel but also a shot of her reclining on a boat in a short dress; another picture shows her stretched out on a bench in skimpy shorts. The label has been servicing calendars featuring similar shots of Davis to programmers once a month.

Artwork for Ronna Reeves' River North album, "After The Dance," includes the requisite navel, which is also visible, along with a black lace bra, in her video

for "My Heart Wasn't In It." In addition, the album art features a shot of Reeves pulling a camisole strap either up or down, depending on your interpretation.

Bobby Young, River North's VP of promotion and artist development, is among those who say these images are "a sign of the times. As country grows up, our listeners have matured and are used to that kind of marketing. It's just country coming into the '90s."

A similar marketing strategy has been effectively implemented for a number of tight-fitting-jean-clad male artists for years, and some female artists, such as Dolly Parton, have played up their sexuality for a long time. What's different now is that so many young female artists feel comfortable utilizing that element in their own imaging. And, despite a longstanding industry belief that female artists need to project a "girl next door" image, there is surprisingly little resistance to this change, even from female programmers.



Reeves

"It sends a message to everyone that women in country music are finally taking their place in country and creating their own images, and people are ready for it and loving it and buying it," says WBCS Boston MD Ginny Rogers. "It's great for the format."

"If some of them are a little more sexy, it's exciting for the format, as long as the talent is there," agrees WUSN (US99) Chicago MD Trish





I'd like to respond to my quote in the April 3 issue of Country Airplay Monitor ["Gavin Attendeas Ask Where The Fun Went"]. My statement, "Radio has been lucky to get the product for free," was said in jest. My tongue-in-cheek tone (and intent) was not mentioned in your article. This should have been evident by the chuckles from myself and others in the room at the time. I was merely trying to ease the somber and grim cloud that seemed to fall over the group while discussing this topic. In fact, my true feelings about the service that smaller stations get (or don't get) from the record companies is more of a mirrored sentiment of [WHKR Melbourne, Fla., OM/PD] Bubba Thomas' statement ["All stations ought to

get label service for free"].

The fact that some radio stations get single service and free promotional product while smaller-market stations find it hard to get a phone call returned and must pay for singles is not fair. In that sense, the larger-market stations could be considered lucky compared to the smaller-market stations. That was the basis for my jovial statement in the session. In addition, while I understand the immediate economics of not serving small markets, I believe the long-term implications will eventually hurt not only radio, but the record industry as well.

Country Outlets Most Sold In First Quarter

The majority of stations sold between Jan. 1 and April 30 have been country outlets, according to financial radio publication BIA. Of the 916 sales tracked in that period by BIA, 186 are country, representing 20.3% of the total number of stations sold. Adult contemporary had the second-highest number of stations sold, with 114 (12.4%). News/talk and sports formats ranked a close third with 113 stations (12.3%). Of all stations sold in that period, 52% were in the top 100 markets.

Speaking of which, in a deal with country stations on both sides, Cox Broadcasting has acquired NewCity Communications for a reported \$250 million. NewCity's Dick Ferguson and other principals become part of Cox. The NewCity managers will continue to report to Ferguson. That transaction, which would imply a new format for WHEN-FM Syracuse, N.Y., in the only market where both groups do country, caps yet another week of mega-deals, including Clear Channel's buy of Radio Equity Partners, which has country outlets WNOE New Orleans, WTQR Greensboro, N.C., KXXY/KTST Oklahoma City, and WCKT Fort Myers, Fla. Clear Channel has also named its Austin, Texas, VP/GM Stan Webb chainwide senior VP/operations.

In more sales news, KSON San Diego has officially purchased oldies duopoly partner KBZT (K-Best 95); Saga Communications has picked up country WPRC and WWTE Springfield, Ill., from Central States Network as part of a four-station, \$6 million acquisition in that market; and country WKAK (K-Country) Albany, Ga., gets classic rock WJAD/oldies WEGC as new duopoly partners.

Peter Connelly joins WWWW Detroit as station manager, replacing former GM Phil Lamka. Connelly had been sales manager at sister station WKQI.

WSM-FM Nashville PD Lee Cory is out. No replacement has been named.

Scott Bohannon is upped from APD to APD/PD at WOWC Birmingham, Ala. He had been acting PD there since October.

At press time, KEYV Las Vegas was in the process of simulcasting country sister KFMS in preparation for an upcoming format flip.

Morning man Jim "Patches" Paczkowski has been promoted to PD at KTEX Mc Allen, Texas, replacing Bruce Clark. Paczkowski will probably move to afternoons.

Longtime country PD Jon Wailin returns to the format as PD of WBWN (B104) Bloomington, Ill. Wailin had been consulting; he was last a PD at co-

After a week of stunting as "K-Garth" with an all **Garth Brooks** format, KQNV Reno, Nev., has flipped to "New Country 100.9" under GM **Kevin O'Brien** and consultant **Jaye Albright** and is airing 10,000 songs in a row. No word yet on a PD or air staff. Across town at incumbent country outlet KBUL, P/T jock **Valerie Ferrari** moves to middays; night host **Chuck Reeves** goes to afternoons; crosstown KWNZ's **Adam Jeffries** joins for nights; and **Anthony Marini** joins for overnights.

KOIT San Francisco PD **Allan Hotlen** is named GM of co-owned WXTR Washington, D.C., and its sister station, country WQSI Frederick, Md.

Like It Or Not, '80s Style May Work In L.A.

Wade Jessen has the same flu bug as the rest of Nashville. This week's guest column is written by Airplay Monitor editor Sean Ross.

For a station that's touched off plenty of controversy within country radio, John Sebastian's KZLA Los Angeles (Country Confidential, May 10) isn't so different. It's just different from most of what we've heard recently.

KZLA, with its tight current list, minimal jock talk, and classic rock crossovers, is essentially an early '80s country station. With the possible exception of the crossovers, it's not so different from the Burns-Somerset "continuous country" station that KZLA was at its inception in the early '80s.

KZLA, by the way, was successful then. Like a lot of its brethren, it was reviled in the industry, but it proved that Los Angeles was not a market that hated country radio. Add its shares to AM rival KLAC and Orange County's KIKF and the ratings for country were well ahead of what they are now. So even if the industry didn't like it, listeners did.

L.A. may just be a market where country listeners never wanted to be led into the '90s, and there's some evidence that New York is the same. As an industry person, I found

WYNY a much more interesting station with a 1.7 share than it was with a 3.5. Clearly, the listeners didn't agree. They were happy using WYNY as a soft AC station in disguise, and they weren't thrilled when the Bellamy Brothers gold gave way to today's hot new country. So far, the evidence suggests that they felt the same way about KZLA.

Like Wade Jessen, I don't necessarily agree with the classic rock crossovers on KZLA. Those always worked best in markets with no country heritage or lifegroup, and, as the ratings show, L.A. had more of a country heritage 15 years ago than anybody realized; it's just been a while since anybody knew how to exploit it. And if there really is music that appeals to the country listener that isn't being played by country radio, it's as likely today to be "Let Her Cry" or "Roll To Me" as "Desperado," and at this writing, there's no sign of KZLA having ventured into triple-A/modern crossovers—yet.

Turning KZLA into the KZLA of old, and leaving it that way long enough to get a fair read on it, is worth a try, since not much in the intervening decade-plus has worked. Strangely enough, it's also true to the format's roots, since Sebastian is again doing the kind of country station that used to work in L.A.—fashionable or not.





Women Artists Opt For Fashionable, Sexy Image Over 'Girl Next Door' Look

Biondo. "Shania Twain has done wonders for our format. She's extremely talented. The girls like her as well as the guys, and she doesn't do anything too overboard."

IMAGE VS. SUBSTANCE

While they agree there is always the danger that the image may overshadow the music for these young artists, it is a chance both the labels and artists are willing to take. "What we're selling is what's on the inside," says Young. The image "might help with marketing, but if you don't have a hit record inside, nobody's going to buy it."

"Mindy is a 20-year-old woman who's gorgeous, with a great body, but that's not what it's about," says Joe Galante, chairman of the RCA Label Group. "She's a great goddamn singer." Galante says BNA staffers were careful in McCready's debut video "not to make her a sexual dynamo as much as a young woman who's strong . . . We're not sitting there strutting the stuff out in anybody's face."

Reeves says that on her previous label, Mercury, "the image was for me to be the girl next door, conservative, natural. That really wasn't me. I always dressed fashionably and had a cool hair style. I never dressed western. I sang country music my whole life, but I never bought into the boot thing. I signed to Mercury and suddenly was wearing boots, jeans, and a prairie shirt. I went along with it, but it wasn't me . . . I got tired of being looked on as this young girl. I felt like I wasn't really being taken seriously."

"I was always told that women wouldn't accept other women [with a sexy image]," Reeves adds. With her new deal on River North, Reeves has "the freedom and the choice to dress how I want to dress, and women seem to be more accepting of it. I see it is a trend with the other females, like Faith Hill, being able to stretch out and show a little more sexuality. Men have gotten away with it for a long time, but women always said, 'I better not do this' . . . What I'm trying to do is make people understand I'm a 29-year-old adult . . . and I should be able to make my own decisions."

LET THE MUSIC TALK

Most programmers contacted for this story claim the packaging has little bearing on their music decisions.

"I let the music talk first," says KMLE Phoenix MD Gwen Foster. "In fact, that's the only thing that talks to me and convinces me to play a song. In this format, people have the tendency to look at an artist and say, 'They don't look country, so their music can't be country.' You have to not look at the image of the artist; you have to listen to what they're doing."

"We're playing the records because they sound good," says WUSN's Biondo. "The fact that somebody may look good or be sexy is a bonus . . . As far as country music is concerned, we're looking for the audio. But you need to cover every aspect, because we live

in a visual world. Sex sells."

"I realize [that] with the age of video, people are visually oriented, but this is radio," says KNCL Sacramento, Calif., APD Jennifer Wood. "The only thing I listen for is the music."

The exception is KKBQ (93Q) Houston PD Dene Hallam, who says, "If anything, [sexy imaging] prejudices me against the music before I've heard it, because I think if they're trying to make me focus on the physical appearance of the artist, maybe the songs aren't as good. Restaurants with fantastic views notoriously have mediocre food."

NO 'BAD GIRL' IMAGES

Still, Hallam and others say the images most of these artists project are intended to be more high-fashion than sexual. None of the female country artists, for example, have gone for the "bad girl" image of such pop stars as Madonna, WBCS' Rogers points out.

"Country music artists in general are more willing to show the world their hip side that probably always was there," says Hallam. "Bare midriffs and showing off navels in general is a hot fashion trend in all parts of the entertainment business, and country music is just one portion of it."

"All these years in the industry, I looked at pop and rock [artists] and never understood how they could dress how they wanted to and still be accepted," says Reeves. "I have always loved so many different types of music and . . . felt cheated a little in country that we could never really express ourselves as an artist as far as fashion . . . [Then] Shania Twain popped out and . . . she was like that from day one. She didn't worry that she was going to offend anyone."

"This is not offensive, it's fashionable," Reeves adds. "If it's done in good taste and I'm comfortable wearing it, it's OK."

STILL NOT THE NORM

While sexy images are becoming more common, they are not yet the norm. Many artists, including Mercury's Terri Clark, Epic's Stephanie Bentley, and Curb's Jo Dee Messina, have broken through without taking the "navel" route. And not having a sexy image hasn't held back the careers of some other female country artists.

"Wynonna just played here seven months pregnant and put on one of the finest shows I have ever seen," says WYYD Lynchburg, Va., PD/MD Robynn Jaymes.

Label reps agree that a sexy image can only work for artists who are comfortable with it. "If it's really them, that's the way you go," says Jack Weston, VP of promotion/artist development at Arista. "I don't know how you can make a Linda Davis or a Shania Twain not look sexy."

"I hope it's not a trend," says River North's Young. "Every artist is different, and they should be packaged to maximize what they bring to the table."

"In our format, there are limits that we just don't cross, because it doesn't fit the music," says Galante. "But some of these folks are in their 20s, not their 40s. There's a different attitude that these people have, and I don't think there's anything wrong with it . . . as long as you stay true to the music and the artist's vision."

MONITOR PROFILE

WBBS PD Lauber Uses Conservative Tactics To Popularize Country In 'The Last Frontier'

Syracuse, N.Y., is a market where old-fashioned stereotypes about country music persist, partly because the city went for years without a country FM of its own, depending on stations from adjacent cities. Since WBBS (B104.7) Syracuse signed on in the format a little more than three years ago, its No. 1 priority has been educating the market about what its positioner, "today's hot new country," really means.

Although PD Rich Lauber says the station has made a lot of progress in positioning the format as "something very broad and mainstream, not just a niche," the sales staff still occasionally encounters resistance from potential advertisers, and Lauber says he still sees things that make him "cringe," like a TV commercial for a local businesses that tries to capitalize on country with chuck wagons and hoedowns.

The station's recent ratings may go a long

way toward helping break down country bias in the market. In the winter Arbitron book, WBBS was No. 3 12-plus with a spectacular 7.4-10.3 gain, and it went to No. 1 25-54 in the market for the first time.

With three other country signals penetrating the market, country's combined 12-plus share in Syracuse is 16.3. Nevertheless, Lauber believes there is room for only one country station in the market. His closest competitor, WHEN-FM (2.4-3.1), was already in the process of being sold from Park Communications to Cox Broadcasting, when the announcement came that Cox was also buying WBBS owner NewCity.

Before the announcement, Lauber said he had prepared his station for an aggressive format assault from Cox. "We have the research [and have] fine-tuned the radio station, and we're ready in case that's their decision," he says. "I've tried to anticipate any of their attacks." He also says, "If it were me coming into the market, it seems there would be other potential formats where it would be easier to achieve Arbitron success and meet revenue goals," he says.

Lauber and consultant Rusty Walker program WBBS to be as familiar-sounding as possible with a 35-record list of currents and a couple of hundred gold records, most dating back no earlier than 1990.

"We are probably one of the most conservative stations out there," says Lauber, who likes to play singles for 15-17 weeks. "When I play a song, I like to continue to play it for a long time for that familiarity factor. The really successful songs that shoot up the chart in seven or eight weeks, those are the best songs to be playing, [but] keeping in mind burn, I'd like to continue playing those records for a number of weeks after they lose their bullet or

are off the chart. When the next single comes out, I'm not even close to finished with the [previous one]."

Here's a recent 2 p.m. hour: Mary Chapin Carpenter, "I Take My Chances"; Rhett Akins, "That Ain't My Truck"; George Strait, "Blue Clear Sky"; Alabama, "T.L.C.A.S.A.P."; Clay Walker, "Hypnotize The Moon"; Tanya Tucker, "If Your Heart Ain't Busy Tonight"; Little Texas, "Kick A Little"; Faith Hill, "Take Me As I Am"; Garth Brooks, "The Beaches Of Cheyenne"; John Michael Montgomery, "I Love The Way You Love Me"; Vince Gill, "High Lonesome Sound"; the Judds, "I Know Where I'm Going"; Neal McCoy, "You Gotta Love That"; Reba McEntire and Linda Davis, "Does He Love You"; Lee Roy Parnell, "On The Road"; and Alan Jackson, "Home."

Lauber, like many programmers in Northeast markets, is cautious of certain country records that may be national hits but don't work well in his market. Specifically, he is wary of "the ones that have the more nasal or twang sound or have themes where the lyrical content doesn't match the lifestyle of the Syracuse listener." He says his longevity in the market helps him determine what those songs are.

He has worked in Syracuse since 1980 and been with parent company NewCity Communications, for 11 years. He started with the company hosting afternoons at sister AC station WYYY (Y94), then moved to that shift at WBBS when it signed on. He added PD duties there 2½ years ago.

WBBS was not only his first programming job, it was his first encounter with country music. In that respect, however, he says he is typical of the 25- to 54-year-old listeners he is targeting.

"Before we put B104.7 on, there was no country station in Syracuse for a long time. It was kind of the last frontier," he says. "So, like a lot of listeners in country, I didn't know the format. Now I love it."

Because country is still in the process of catching on in the market, Lauber is forced to be conservative musically because his audience is still learning the format. He cites a focus group he conducted just a year ago from which he heard such comments as "I really like that new girl, Trisha."

That "new girl," Trisha Yearwood, is on the bill for the station's second listener appreciation show, the B104.7 Hot Country Jam, which is slated for June 16 and will also feature Shenandoah, David Lee Murphy, and Keith Gattis. Last year's show drew 10,000 people.

Two of Lauber's biggest challenges at WBBS have been finding a morning team that could compete with some of the heritage shows in the market and building his station without hurting his two top-ranked sister stations, Y94 and news/talk WSYR. The first challenge was met when he teamed Dan Meaney and Ron Bee in mornings a year and a half ago. They are now ranked No. 3 25-54 in mornings.

As for the second challenge, NewCity goes into its sale with three of the top four stations in the market 12-plus. "It comes down to defining the competitive philosophy," Lauber says. "In duopoly, we're all trying to determine to what degree we compete with our sister station and to what degree we don't. We have a sibling rivalry but draw the line where it would become cutthroat competition."





Weather, Change In Arbitron Methodology Blamed For Country's Down Winter Book

It may have been methodology. Or the weather. Or the product, depending on whom you ask. But all the winter Arbitron books are in, and the overall news for country is not good. In the top 100 markets, 40 stations lost at least a full ratings share from the fall book. Of those 40, 11 stations lost 2 shares or more.

Among the hardest hit were KXXY Oklahoma City (12.1-8.5), KKCS Colorado Springs, Colo. (12.2-9.4), WRKZ Harrisburg, Pa. (9.7-7.0), K11M Tucson, Ariz. (16.2-13.6), WOKI Knoxville, Tenn. (7.6-5.1), and WOW-FM Omaha, Neb. (10.1-7.7).

In 13 of the top 100 markets, both or all of the country outlets lost shares: San Francisco; Detroit; Boston; Minneapolis; St. Louis; Tampa, Fla.; Memphis; Fresno, Calif.; Sacramento, Calif.; Orlando, Fla.; West Palm Beach, Fla.; Scranton, Pa.; and El Paso, Texas.

There were only four markets in the top 100 for which the winter book brought good news for both or all of the country stations: Phoenix; Birmingham, Ala.; Toledo, Ohio, where one station has since changed format; and Coastal N.C.

The winter was not without its individual success stories. In the top 100

markets, 24 stations had a 1-share gain or higher. Of those, eight had gains of 2 shares or more, most notably KFDI-FM Wichita, Kan. (9.1-12.7), WSSL Greenville, S.C. (11.4-14.5), WBBS Syracuse, N.Y. (7.4-10.3), and WCOS-FM Columbia, S.C. (9.2-12.1). But overall, the winter was bleak for country.

HISPANICS CAUSING PANIC

In some instances, an individual station's loss can be directly attributed to a rival's gain. But the most-often-cited reasons for the format's overall decline, based on an Airplay Monitor survey of programmers, were the severe winter weather, which may have caused some listeners to switch to news/talk stations; increases in Arbitron sample size in many markets; a lack of good product available to program; and, in markets with large Hispanic populations, the use of bilingual interviewers at Arbitron. In Fresno, for example, Spanish KLBN surged to the No. 3 spot in the winter with a 3.7-7.0 jump, while both country stations were off.

"I think weather has a lot of impact on a lot of it, but there were some markets out west where the new treatment of Hispanic diaries had some impact, too," says consultant Rusty Walker. "In



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

Southern Calif. Radio Makes My Finger Itch

Itend to feel somewhat displaced and sort of "country-boy lonesome" when I'm in a city as big as Los Angeles. Don't get me wrong; Los Angeles is an exciting city, and the week I spent there attending the Academy of Country Music festivities was far from uneventful, but it left a little something to be desired as far as radio was concerned.

Some of my associates tend to think I'm a little obsessed with listening to country radio when I'm in another city. I find myself spending an unusual amount of time either in the car or in my hotel room listening to the radio.

Remember my forlorn lament when WYNY went off the air? Going to New York just isn't as exciting any more, although I can't wait to hear the new Long Island stations. At any rate, I got a different sort of feeling from the country radio in Southern California this time. Being aware of the regional differences in the format, I still felt a little bit undernourished in the L.A. market. The Anaheim, Calif., and Riverside, Calif., stations provided relief, but their signals weren't as clear in the city as KZLA, and I found myself punching buttons incessantly.

I was trying to get that familiar feel from KZLA, only to find that it was playing a few classic rock tracks in its mix. I'd hear Bruce Springsteen next to current country hits, and my button finger got itchy.

I'd hit KFRG and hear the new Sammy Kershaw record. I'd crank it up and wait at the top of my lungs, just as the signal got a little scratchy. Then it was back to KZLA. If I was lucky, it would be playing Alan Jackson or the Mavericks. But there was always that pesky possibility that I'd hear "Crazy Love" by Poco. Again. So, off I'd go in search of KIKF or KFRG, on which I'd hear a good mix of country currents, recurrences, and, in most cases, some blockbuster recent gold, but no Springsteen.

I'm sure if I lived in L.A. I'd single out a favorite station, but I had a hard time in just one week. One thing is for sure, I'd get out of town on the weekends. I might even buy a Jeep with a high-dollar sound system.

And I'm sure you'd find it parked at Tower Records. Frequently.

As good as Los Angeles radio is, I couldn't really cozy up to it. But then, I remind myself that nothing there is really as it seems, and country radio probably isn't an exception.



Weather, Change In Arbitron Methodology Blamed For Down Winter Book

El Paso, both country stations fared very poorly. In Fresno . . . there were some real oddities. The whole format just kind of fell out of bed."

Walker believes that some country stations enjoyed "artificially high shares in the fall" and that the winter book was simply a leveling-off period. "Maybe the fall was high and winter was low and reality is somewhere in between," he says.

"It's pretty obvious country's cooling," says WQYK-FM Tampa OM Tom Rivers, whose station was off 7.9-5.9 in the winter. "You [used to] see a country station typically No. 1 or 2 [in the ratings] on a regular basis. Now you look at the country stations and find them [further down] in the pack.

MORE SAMPLE = LESS STABILITY?

"Arbitron increasing the sample size hasn't helped country," Rivers adds. "Country stations traditionally have been market leaders. One side effect [of the new sample size] is Arbitron picks up more ancillary listening, so a station that may have been a 10th- or 12th-ranked station can roll in a 5- or 6-share month and all of a sudden be a player. When you had a smaller number of diaries, it favored the market-leading stations."

"It was a fluke in this market," says KEEY (K102) Minneapolis PD Gregg Swedberg, whose station dipped 6.8-5.5 and whose rival, WBOB-FM, was off 6.3-5.4 in the winter. "It was a bizarre come runoff where people just [left] the format, if we believe that. It could be Arbitron's new sampling procedure and where they put diaries."

After Arbitron, weather was the reason most often cited for country's winter losses, but consultant Keith Hill says blaming the weather for country's problems is "bogus . . . The weather keeps people inside. AM N/T stations do better and radio in general does better [in severe weather] because people do more listening to the radio . . . If you have a good information image, you pray for bad weather."

DON'T KNOCK THE PRODUCT?

Hill is more inclined to blame the available current product for the format's losses, a view challenged by others. "The fundamental reason why country, in a broad brush stroke, was off was because the current product that we got from Nashville in January-February was not as good as we've

had in the past," he says. "Nashville has gotten themselves in a couple of ruts. One of them is a formulaic rut where they use some of the same performers, sounds, and production techniques, so a lot of the country became a lot more homogenous. Also . . . what was selected primarily for the purpose of selling records didn't work as well for radio."

Walker is among those who disagree with Hill that the available product was to blame. "I've heard that for 20-some-odd years, and I've never believed it," he says.

"Country is at a point right now where there is so much tremendous product out there," says WUSY Chattanooga, Tenn., PD Bob Sterling, whose station was off 22.8-21.1 "If you're not No. 1 in your market, don't try to blame it on the music."

"If you look at the music we did during the winter, it was pretty good," adds KSKS Fresno PD Ken Boesen, whose station was off 5.2-4.1. "We had some stars. I don't think there was any product problem. If you go back and look at the music we played during the winter book, we had Lee Roy Parnell, 'Heart's Desire'; Bryan White, 'Rebecca Lynn'; George Strait, 'Check Yes or No'; and Aaron Tippin, 'That's As Close As I'll Get To Loving You.' A lot of artists had some pretty career records."

DO NOT DO 'VOODOO'

Despite the bad winter book, nearly everyone contacted for this story believes the format is still very healthy, has plenty of current hits to play, and will bounce back in the spring.

"I still believe from everything we see [from] stations doing perceptual research [that] the format seems to be really strong," says Walker.

"I'm not concerned about the format," says K11M PD Herb Crowe. "We've got Garth Brooks coming to the market June 2-3, and he sold 29,000 tickets in, like, two hours . . . The fact that Garth is out touring is a good thing for the format, because it rejuvenates country in the markets where he appears and stimulates interest in the format. I get my Garth hit in the third phase of the spring book, so I'm just smiling."

"I sure would hate—a week after getting the book—to say this is the reason why" country is off, says K102's Swedberg. "I think it turns into a voodoo session . . . The whole thing will sort itself out, and I don't think people should be too panicked by it."

Additionally, a majority of radio people are working day-in, day-out just to make a living for our families. This Winter, Nugent Thanks GARth (And Service Images) For WGAR's Rebound

In a quarterly ratings period when the vast majority of country stations were down, WGAR Cleveland was one of the few that managed to score a major ratings increase. PD Denny Nugent says Garth Brooks is one big reason why WGAR was one of only a handful of winter Arbitron success stories, up 7.7-8.9 12-plus.

After Brooks sold 80,000 tickets to his four March shows at the Gund Arena in about three hours, WGAR began heavy contesting—giving away Brooks tickets as prizes that, Nugent says, "gave us a real strong final phase."

The contesting included awarding a pair of Brooks concert tickets every time one of his songs aired over a three-week period. The station also used its regular "scan and win" promotion, which Nugent describes as "an electronic wheel of fortune," to award some tickets. For "scan and win," WGAR staffers bring an electronic card reader to remotes and invite listeners to have the bar code on their loyal listen-

er club cards scanned to determine what prize they will win. (Prizes are awarded to about two-thirds of the listeners who participate.) The contest usually draws a few hundred people, but Nugent says as many as 1,000 people came to some winter remotes in an attempt to win tickets. "It was just phenomenal, the buzz and excitement over Garth tickets," he says. In total, WGAR gave away about 400 pairs of tickets in the five weeks before the shows.

The other half of WGAR's winter ratings success, Nugent says, is simply a rebound from the summer and fall, when the station had 7.6 and 7.7 12-plus shares, respectively. WGAR is now back to where it was a year ago. "It was partially a bounce back," Nugent says. "The fall book in Arbitron wasn't as good as it should have been. It was . . . flatter than usual in total audience, and I don't think it was real. Fortunately, we held onto good rankings—No. 2 12-plus and 25-54 in the fall."

Another reason WGAR managed to survive the winter book unscathed is its focus on news and information. This was especially important this past winter, when severe weather caused many music stations to lose audience to news/talk outlets. "We maintain a strong information base," Nugent says. "We give the audience the news they need. They can get it from us without switching stations, [so] even though we had a really lousy winter here, it didn't cost us any audience."

Other than playing a few more Brooks records than normal, Nugent says, WGAR didn't make any programming changes in the winter and remains "consistent and conservative with our music. We don't play games, and we don't take any chances . . . Philosophically, I've always believed you're not hurt by what you don't play, so we are very late to add new artists." WGAR has no format competition, and Nugent says, "CMT is a nonfactor here, and there's not much of a nightclub scene, so . . . we don't have people calling us to play things [by]

new artists, because they don't have another option of where to hear it."

Those new artists "really have to establish themselves and get a foothold nationally before we'll start playing [them]," says Nugent. "Our research indicates that our audience doesn't want to hear new music. Typically, songs will be in the low 30s or upper 20s [on the chart] before we play them if we have any doubts about them. Other songs that come out of the gate flying we won't wait [to add]. We added JoDee Messina in the mid 40s, just a few weeks after its release. It's so tough for the new artists, and I have empathy for the labels, but up here . . . the listeners react much more favorably to established artists."

"I'm a firm believer in keeping the list at a manageable level," Nugent adds. "[The playlist has] generally about 35 songs, and even our lights are scheduled to play about 18 times a week. It doesn't make sense to add a song and play it eight to 10 times a week. It's not fair to the artist or the label. It's just a waste."

Nugent, who has been programming WGAR for seven years, says the station plays "quite a bit of gold," which is "still an important part of the mix. It never went away at this station, and we still go back to the early '80s for records if they've stood the test of time."

Here's a recent afternoon hour: JoDee Messina, "Heads Carolina, Tails California"; Neal McCoy, "You Gotta Love That"; Hal Ketchum, "Small Town Saturday Night"; David Lee Murphy, "Every Time I Get Around You"; John Berry, "I Think About It All The Time"; Toby Keith, "He Ain't Worth Missin'"; Garth Brooks, "The Change"; Sammy Kershaw, "She Don't Know She's Beautiful"; Paul Brandt, "My Heart Has A History"; Joe Diffie, "Bigger Than The Beatles"; Clint Black, "Summer's Comin'"; John Michael Montgomery, "Long As I Live"; Tanya Tucker, "Some Kind Of Trouble"; and Vince Gill, "High Lonesome Sound."


"The real key to the station is what's between the records," Nugent says. "We're personality-oriented, but that doesn't diminish the music-intensive nature of the station. It's a big part of why we're still one of the few markets where there is only one station . . . I wouldn't say we're bulletproof, but we're very, very strong."

Nugent says WGAR is more than ready to take on a format rival should one surface. "With all the buying and selling of radio stations, Cleveland could be ripe for someone to come in," he says. "We're set and ready to go . . . Corporate has the war chest on standby, and we would come at [a competitor] with both guns blazing."

"Time and time again there have been markets with stations that do a good job and are well defended and no one can get a foothold," he adds. "KYGO in Denver is a station similar to ours. They were prepared for competition and met the challenge and competition went away."

WGAR has become so well entrenched and respected that it won the Country Music Assn.'s station of the year award in 1995 and this year took home the humanitarian award from the Country Radio Seminar. "Part of what I've tried to do here is create consistency, and now it's paying off in ratings and revenue and even in picking up awards," Nugent says. "The community involvement and public service is key here . . . It's a way of life. We know that it doesn't just serve the community, it serves the station well."

Nugent's main concern for the format right now is its "shortage of superstars . . . The format needs big names to drive loyalty from the audience," he says. "That, to me, is a key factor right now to drive record sales, concerts, and to draw listeners back to the format. It was the Garths and Billy Rays in the early '90s that drove a lot of people to country." **PHYLIS STARK**

Country's Earning Power Down To No. 7 Spot In Annual 'Power Ratio' Study

Because of the larger number of competing outlets, the average country station took fewer dollars out of the marketplace last year, according to the new "power ratio" study on the relative earning power of major formats.

The study, which measures a station's earning power vs. its ratings share, gave country radio a share of 1.24, meaning that if a single rating point is worth \$1 million in a given market, then the average country station should take in \$1.24 million for each share.

The good news is that the average country station still takes a disproportionately high percentage of a market's ad revenue. The problem is that country fell from fifth to seventh place in 1995, down from 1.30 the previous year and down steadily from 1.49 in 1988, when it was the No. 1 power ratio format. The 1.24 number is the weakest power ratio for country in the study's 10-year history.

The power ratio study comes from the North Hollywood, Calif.-based accounting firm of Miller, Kaplan, Arase & Co. George Nadel Rivin, a partner in that firm, says that, ironically, country's earning power is a victim of the

format's own success.

"In 1988, there was the point where the peak of people discovering country intersected with the point where there were no [competitors] within the market," Rivin says. "From '88 to '89 and again from '90 to '91, more and more stations [came] into the format, diluting the exclusivity these stations enjoyed in the '86-'88 frame."

(By contrast, some of the formats with the worst attrition in recent years have made some of the strongest gains. Top 40's power ratio is up 1.09-1.18 (and up from 1 in 1989). Album rock is up 1.29-1.33 (and up from 1.04 in '86). AC, despite its widely noted problems of recent years, remains the leader among formats, up 1.48-1.49 in this study and up from 1.31 in 1991.)

While Rivin says advertisers "perceive country as a format that they want to be involved with," country's reduced earning power also stems from the increased number of competing formats in recent years. "In some cases," Rivin says, advertisers "may be buying not only formats they had been buying but maybe mixing in a new rock or a '70s oldies, and that may dilute slightly some of the



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Gavin Attendees Ask Where The Fun Went

Why are so many good programmers leaving radio for jobs on the record side? According to attendees at the Gavin Country Seminar, held in Los Angeles April 25-27, it's because radio just isn't as much fun as it used to be.

At a closed-door, radio-only session (a label-only session was held at the same time down the hall), about 35 broadcasters agreed that money wasn't the only reason former PDs like Doug Baker, Larry Pareigis, Tim Murphy, Brad Chambers, and Craig Powers have moved to the label side. Thanks to changes in the radio business in the last few years, programmers have less time to spend with the music now and have so many other responsibilities, said R.J. Curtis of After Mid-Nite Entertainment. "We got into this business because of the music," he said. On the label side, "they can be close to the music every day."

Eel Salamon of Westwood One said that "the lack of creativity" in radio today was the key reason for the attrition. "There is less freedom [when] the owner or GM questions every decision," he said. Salamon, who was one of the first PDs to use research as a programming tool, says it now pains him to see how programmers are using research to protect themselves and inhibiting their own creativity in the process.

Many of the small-market programmers at the session expressed frustration at not getting service from labels, some of which tell them to subscribe to CDX instead of providing product themselves. "That's bullshit," said Bubba Thomas, OM/PD at WHKR Melbourne, Fla. "All stations ought to get label service for free." Consultant L.J. Smith of BP Consulting Group countered that radio is "the only retailer that asks for product for free so [we] can resell it. I think we've been lucky to get the product for free."

Long Island Gets Its 2nd Country FM

Two weeks ago, Long Island, N.Y., got its first country FM. This week, it gets its second. Album WMJC flips to country under PD Jim Asker, previously PD of triple-A WRNX Springfield, Mass. Asker has programmed country WFLS Fredericksburg, Va. Look for WMJC's duopoly simulcast partner WRCN to follow suit at some point. WMJC's AM, WGSM, currently a satellite country outlet, should begin simulcasting sister adult standards outlet WHLI. Rusty Walker is reportedly consulting.

Although no deal had been signed at press time, look for KBEQ Kansas City PD Mike Kennedy to join Asylum Records in a newly created national promotion position.

David Felker has been named PD for Westwood One's Hot Country and Mainstream Country formats, replacing Steve Penny. Felker previously was music programmer for the two formats and also programmed, produced, and wrote two syndicated shows for WWI.

Jim Hays has been named OM at WHOK and WLLD Columbus, Ohio, effective May 13. He most recently programmed KHEY El Paso, Texas. Hays replaces Jim Shea.

KUPL Portland, Ore., is part of a \$103 million sale from BayCom Partners to American Radio Systems that also includes KUPL's sister stations in Portland and San Jose, Calif.

Longtime top 40 WHHY-FM Montgomery, Ala., flips to country as Cat Country 102 and will apply for new calls. Scott Hamilton remains OM for the Cat and its duopoly partners; Darlene Dixon from the morning show at WKSJ Mobile, Ala., is the new PD. Rusty Walker is consulting. Walker is also consulting the new KRAZ (Krazy 100.9) Santa Rosa, Calif. Rick Jackson, APD of crosstown KRPO, is the new PD.

Country WEBB (B98.5) Augusta, Maine, and its top 40 sister station, WMME (92 Moose), have, like many of their brethren, begun automating several shifts via hard-drive. The difference is that WEBB and WMME are being automated from Syracuse, N.Y., at Pilot Communications' co-owned WNTQ/WAQQ. Staffers at those stations record their breaks and send them to Augusta via

ISDN lines. WEBB remains local in morning and p.m. drive.

AC CKLU Winnipeg, Manitoba, flips to country as CKMM (Star 103). PD Matthew McBride and the rest of the staff stay... Satellite country KNGV Corpus Christi, Texas, flips to AC as KKBA (the Bay)... WQBE Charleston, W.Va., GM John Gush adds those duties for newly acquired duopoly partner WWSR/WBES.

KUBL Salt Lake City MD Travis Moon adds APD stripes and moves from afternoons to mid-days, replacing Randy Rose, who is now PD at sister KBER. Richard Cano joins for afternoons from crosstown top 40 KUTQ (Q99).

Two weeks ago, WLLR Davenport, Iowa, mid-day host Jack Carey, who had announced he was leaving radio, showed up at crosstown KBOB in the same slot. This week, former morning man Mike Kenneally, who had left WLLR under similar circumstances, shows up at KBOB in mornings, replacing Boots McKay, who returned to Las Vegas.

CKRY (Country 105) Calgary, Alberta, has been sold by Redmond to Shaw Communications. In other sales news, WJLK-AM Monmouth/Ocean, N.J., and its duopoly partners have been sold from New Wave Communications to Nassau Broadcasting for \$16.75 million. Also, WRWD Poughkeepsie, N.Y., is sold to the new Hudson Valley Radio Partners. And WQHK Fort Wayne, Ind., reaches its limit of three duopoly partners, picking up both album WBYS and classic hits WFVI in separate deals.

WMTZ Johnstown, Pa., GM Alison Dame is exiting to change markets with her husband, WMTZ GSM Paul Pasqualini. No replacements have been named.

WGNE Daytona Beach, Fla., morning co-host and news director "Super" Dave Terry adds production director duties... KASY Albuquerque, N.M., moves overnighter Dave Crosier to mornings, replacing Catfish and Herb.

WIRK West Palm Beach, Fla., PD Ron Brooks, who recently took over the morning shift, would like to take himself off mornings. Send T&Rs.

P/T Lana Conroy joins the morning team at WLJE (Indiana 105) Valparaiso, Ind.

Finally! Awards For The Best Awards!

The 31st annual Academy of Country Music Awards show April 24 just might go down as the most balanced, politically correct show in history. Dick Clark and Gene Weed's annual production of the Left Coast hillbilly glitz fest should receive high marks for its musical presentation, smooth production, and star power.

Obviously, someone at Clark's company heard the critics of prior awards shows complaining about too many performances of unfamiliar songs. Maybe it was a coincidence, but this year's ACM show featured a delicate balance of new material and familiar songs. If the television audience responded as positively as the attendees, the fans were the ultimate winners. Ratings and record sales will tell the tale.

As is customary, every awards show has the great and the not-so-great moments. Here's my opinion of the telecast and the awards.

Best overall performance: "Home" by Alan Jackson. Jackson's brief, humble introduction to the song showed the difficulty many artists have performing autobiographical material. Nothing's been quite this personal since Loretta Lynn's "Coal Miner's Daughter." Genuine rural themes are shamefully absent from contemporary country music today. God bless this man—1996 male vocalist of the year—and his music.

The only real performance glitch: Shania Twain was hampered by poor sound in the house. General consensus in my area of the

amphitheater pointed to a poor vocal mix. I'm sure the song was lovely, but unfortunately, we couldn't make out the lyrics.

Best presenting job: Billy Dean's remark on the "view from up here," while standing next to Loni Anderson.

Worst presenting job: I understand that Jay Leno is a big country fan, and I appreciate his charisma and humor. What I don't understand is why he insists on those stupid outfits. We've tried for years to shake those nasty, rube-like stereotypes. If they invite him back next year, let's hope he loses the hat. However, the back of his jacket ("Possum... The Other White Meat") more than made up for the tacky threads.


Award that most excited the audience: A tie between Bryan White (new male vocalist) and Patty Loveless (female vocalist of the year).

Sins of omission: For the second year in a row, the academy snubbed Tim McGraw, who was nominated in five categories and went home empty-handed. What does this guy have to do? He should've gotten at least one trophy.

Best outfit: Patty Loveless in pastel leather. Worst outfit: Shelby Lynne. Her outfit wasn't so bad, but someone should tell her that faux blind is definitely out of fashion.

Most confusing category: Top vocal duet. Only half of the nominees here perform regularly together; the other half were vocal events. It should be split into separate categories.


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Country's Earning Power Down To No. 7 In Annual 'Power Ratio' Study

dollars."

Then there's country's increasing strength on the young end, which, Rivin says, "does tend to result in a reduction in the power ratios, since there are so many buys placed on a 25-54 basis." Rivin says he considered breaking out younger- and older-leaning country stations in the early '90s and was discouraged from doing so by country broadcasters and the Country Music Assn., which wanted to present the format as a united front.

In addition to the power ratios, Miller, Kaplan includes information on the percentage of stations in each format that do better than a power ratio of 1. AC won that contest, with 94%, followed by album rock (87%), oldies (84%), classic rock (82%), and sports/talk (71%).

Country ranked seventh in that race, too, with 68%, losing four points from last year and continuing its downward trend on that front from '93's 84%. By contrast, Spanish-language radio earned the greatest increase over '94, rising 48%-62%.

Despite country's drop, Rivin remains optimistic. "I would think there were some years in the late '70s and early '80s when some people would love to even have a 1.2," he says.

COMPETING FORMATS

Here's a look at how other formats did in the 1995 power ratio study:

- AC made its best-ever showing of sales strength. This is the third straight year AC topped the list, garnering its highest power ratio in the 10 years in which the study has been conducted and tying for the highest power ratio of any format.

Despite a ratings decline and the defection of a number of AC stations, Rivin says, "AC has been very steady. The fact that it targets the 25-54 demo as well as it does and is so long established really makes it an extremely viable format. In a lot of cases, the established AC in the market has long-developed relationships and is really the model of consistency, which is so important in maintaining the sales level that yields a strong power ratio."

- Sports/talk, which Rivin just started tracking in this study, comes in with 1.48 out of the box. While emerging formats usually bow at 1, Rivin says, "the sports/talk format will always enjoy a very high power ratio, due to the fact that it has a very limited target demo and, therefore, will never enjoy a significant audience share. As a result, there's not a tremendous amount of relying on traditional... business; but you've got tremendous promotional and cross-promotional opportunities with sports/talk."

- Rock formats nabbed two of the top five slots, with classic rock off (1.43-1.34) to tie oldies (1.33-1.34) for third place and album rock in fifth place. Modern rock, which has been included in the study since 1993, posted its highest number yet (1.0-1.05).

Rivin praises modern rock for "taking chances that the modern rock listeners of today are the people that are going to be there with larger and larger spendable incomes in the near future."

- While the two current-based rock formats showed nice growth, top 40 posted the biggest gain between 1994 and 1995. Its 1.18 is the for-

mat's most successful rating in the 10 years of the survey. Rivin says top 40 "has reinvented itself from the rap-dominated [format] it became during the late '80s and early '90s. There's a lot of top 40 stations that fell by the wayside during the early '90s, and so the stronger top 40s are the ones that are still there."

- Spanish-language radio was up 1.12-1.16. Rivin calls it "a format that's really coming on. A lot of the growth in Spanish radio revenues is [coming from] new advertisers... Hispanic [stations are] able to differentiate themselves within a market such that the buys are going deeper. Instead of buying one Spanish-language station, maybe you now buy three."

- On the other end of the scale, jazz/AC—despite its immense building period of the last year—took the biggest hit, off 1.25-1.02, followed by classical's .84-.62 dip. Rivin attributes the classical shortfall to three factors. During its late '80s heyday, classical was one of the first out of the gate with qualitative research, and it attracted large numbers of image advertisers. Eventually, the rest of the market joined classical in the qualitative game, and since the early '90s revenue dry spell, image advertising has not been used as much. In addition, Rivin says, jazz/AC "has siphoned off some listeners and, moreso, some revenues."

If that's the case, why is jazz/AC off so steeply? Says Rivin, "There are a large number of smooth jazz stations that signed on the air between the latter part of 1994 and the middle part of 1995 that are included in our sample. Those stations have yet to mature."

SOFT AC = '90S EASY LISTENING

Other scores include news/talk (1.33-1.26), soft AC (1.22-1.12), R&B (.89-.84), and adult standards (.62-.47). Newly tracked '70s oldies starts its run in the study with 1.07.

A traditional power ratio stalwart, soft AC is getting lost in the shuffle of all the contemporary offerings on the dial, Rivin says, and is in danger of becoming the easy listening of the '90s—in more ways than just its programming. "In fact, if we were to look at the 1995 list of soft ACs around the country, we might find that maybe half of those had been [easy listening] stations a decade ago," he says. "When soft ACs had only AC, album rock, and top 40 to deal with, they were able to do pretty well. Now, they also have oldies to deal with and '70s oldies and modern rock and classic rock."

While R&B radio—a format with traditional sales problems—is down, Rivin praises the effort of the format's stations to "tell their story better and improve things" in recent years. "They've been very successful with that. Even with .84, it's a tenth of a point higher than the average between '87 and '90. [But overall], urban stations always experienced a significantly lower power ratio than audience share might dictate, and there are all kinds of reasons cited for this—everything from the obvious discrimination-type issues to the fact that the demo did not have the expendable income of certain other demos."

The healthy debut of '70s oldies in the study this year doesn't mean such stations don't have challenges ahead of them. For Rivin, their primary mission is "to differentiate themselves from classic rock and album rock stations, and from ACs that are heavily oldies-based. If they can successfully do that, they should be able to find a place for themselves."

WJJK PD Mateer Relishes Underdog Spot In Battle With Miss 103

Scott Mateer says his second career as a songwriter makes him even better at his primary job—programming WJJK (Kapitol Kountry) Jackson, Miss. "Because I do have songwriter ears, I am at a distinct advantage over most music directors," he says.

Mateer's most successful cut so far has been Lorrie Morgan's "Dear Me," a song he co-wrote with Carson Whittett that went to No. 9 in 1989 and was included on Morgan's greatest hits album. Mateer, who has been working in Jackson radio for nearly 20 years, has been writing songs since high school and going to Nashville to pitch them since the late '70s, when he remembers "walking up and down Music Row with a sack full of tapes and these very horrible demos." One of his first cuts was Kenny Star's "Cry Your Eyes Out Girl." More recently, he says, he "came within a cat's whisker" of getting "Actions," a song he co-

since Mateer was unwilling to leave either Jackson or country radio. "I can't tell you what a blessing these people have been for me," he says.

Nevertheless, moving to a start-up after years of dominating the market has been an adjustment. "We have a long, hard job making a dent in a heritage country station," he says. "I've never been in a situation like this. I'd always been in winning situations. I had gotten kind of complacent. Now I have to fight and compete, and it's been real healthy for me."

When WJJK entered the format, the FM country race in Jackson became a four-way battle. In the fall Arbitron book, Miss 103 had a 12 share 12-plus, WJJK and WMSI's younger-leaning duopoly partner WKTF (Catfish 95) were tied with a 2.8 share, and WBKJ had a .9.

Although he says the four-way battle "makes our fight longer and harder," Mateer believes he has three advantages—his heritage as a successful morning man in the market, the support of ownership, and "one of the most level-headed and normal staffs I've ever worked with."

Mateer says Kapitol Kountry is "fairly conservative" with a playlist of about 35 currents, but says he's "very much a believer of letting the merit of a song dictate whether a record gets played. You don't have to be a superstar artist in my book to get an add out of the box if you come to me with a record like 'Heads Carolina, Tails California.' I treated 'Indian Outlaw' and 'Achy Breaky Heart' and 'Thinkin' Problem' [that way] when I had people turning up their noses at me." WJJK recently hired consultant Charlie Cook, although he has not yet begun to work with the station.

Here's a recent afternoon hour: Faith Hill, "Another Little Piece Of My Heart"; John Michael Montgomery, "Long As I Live"; David Ball, "Thinkin' Problem"; Reba McEntire, "Ring On Her Finger (Time On Her Hands)"; Garth Brooks, "Ain't Going Down (Till The Sun Comes Up)"; Clay Walker, "Hypnotize The Moon"; Kenny Chesney, "All I Need To Know"; Dwight Yoakam, "A Thousand Miles From Nowhere"; Hank Williams Jr., "Family Tradition"; Neal McCoy, "You Gotta Love That"; Alabama, "It Works"; Shenandoah, "I Want To Be Loved Like That"; Tracy Byrd, "Heaven In My Woman's Eyes"; the Judds, "Grandpa (Tell Me 'Bout The Good Old Days)"; Aaron Tippin, "That's As Close As I'll Get To Loving You"; and Bryan White, "I'm Not Supposed To Love You Any More."

His ultimate goal is to challenge Miss 103, and Mateer says he's using WJJK's underdog image to accomplish it. "When a concert comes to town, Miss 103 is the welcoming station, [but] I get all my staff surrounding the venue, and as the cars come in to park, we hand them \$2 to park and put a sticker on their car and introduce ourselves. We try to take every situation as the underdog that we are. We don't just want to lay down and let [Miss 103] take that position. We're very sporting about it and not intrusive. We would never try to wreck a promotion of theirs."

Mateer says his former station is taking notice. "Miss 103 has never had a competitor come in and successfully compete; they've just lightly tapped on the door. When I was there, we never even acknowledged [competitors]," he claims. "Now they take shots at us on the air, so I know we're doing something right."

wrote with Kostas, cut on the latest Wynonna album. He is now pitching that song to Morgan.

Mateer says he would one day like to move to Nashville to pursue songwriting and, perhaps, work in A&R. "I would have gone further as a songwriter by now if I lived there, because you have to be present to win, but I had a good career [in Jackson]," he says. "Ultimately, I'd like to live there. When I have completed my mission with this radio station, that will be the determining factor in a move to Tennessee, but I have committed to these people, and they have committed to me."

The people in question are WJJK's owners at Meridian, Miss.-based NewSouth Radio, who hired him for mornings at their month-old country outlet last August (he added PD stripes in November), after he left a successful six-year stint as OM at crosstown rival WMSI (Miss 103) and AC WLIN and as morning man at Miss 103. Mateer says he left Miss 103 "under some tragic circumstances." His fiancée, Shari Schneider, had been morning host at sister station WJDX but left that job last summer and subsequently filed a civil suit claiming sexual harassment, sexual discrimination, and assault and battery against WJDX, parent company SFX Broadcasting, and VP/GM Kenneth Windham.

"Obviously, with her pursuing every legal avenue that she had to protect herself, it was impossible for me to stay there in the same building," says Mateer. "They were not making it uncomfortable for me, but I knew there was no way I could continue there, working for SFX, when they were being sued by my fiancée."

He called NewSouth and said "I know this sounds crazy, but I'm the No. 1 morning man in town and you're brand-new and I want to come work for you." They said, "What's the catch?" It proved to be a good move for both,

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

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


