Infinity Modern Heavyweights Take Roadshow To Promo Execs

In recent weeks, seven representatives from Infinity's modern rock outlets have been on a roadshow to the major labels. Their agenda: "A fact-finding mission to explore marketing opportunities and create benefits," according to WXRK New York PD Steve Kingston, as well as a request to be involved earlier in the development of label projects.

Present at the meetings, besides Kingston, were KROQ Los Angeles GM Trip Reeb and VP of programming Kevin Weatherly; WBCN Boston VP of programming Oedipus; WHFS Washington, D.C., PD Robert Benjamin; and KITS (Live 105) San Francisco OM Ron Nenni and PD Jay Taylor.

Having the PDs of five major stations come calling at a time when many groups are on a quest for new revenue could have been disconcerting for some labels. (One executive, who spoke off the record, arranged for a masseur to loosen up all those present before hunkering down to business.) But Infinity representatives say that the PDs weren't there on a sales call and that pains were taken to separate these visits from some of the broadcaster/label deals that have generated negative publicity recently. And label reps contacted by Rock Airplay Monitor put an equally positive spin on the meeting; at least one has already drawn up a proposal for a venture with Infinity.

Indeed, Universal senior VP of promotion Steve Leeds describes the meetings in similar terms as Kingston. "It was a fact-finding meeting. CBS is

picking up the ball and seeing how [it] can do business with the music community in an efficient manner," Leeds says. "It was a discussion of ideas. They were very candid about not having an agenda."

Similarly, 550 Music/Work Group VP of promotion Joel Klaiman says the message was, "You are in successful record companies, and we're really successful radio stations. There's a lot of money that gets spent [in a] less-directed [manner]—a time buy here, a time buy there. Let's put all our brains together and come up with some new ways to partner and create new and impactful campaigns in the markets."

"It was really the door-opener for what will come in '99," Klaiman adds. Based on the initial meetings, "they'll come to us with ideas or we'll come to them with ideas."

TAKING THE TEMPERATURE

So what were the Infinity PDs there to discuss? "There's obviously a recession going on in the format, and there are very few new bands emerging that create the kind of excitement and profile that we saw a few years ago," says WXRK's Kingston. "We want to make whatever contribution radio can make, realizing that what's good for the record business is good for the radio business, and at the same time just take everyone's temperature on how the business has changed, both ours and theirs."

The meetings, Kingston says, were aimed at "bringing together a group of PDs that is passionate about both broadcasting and music and sitting down early on in [the life of label] pro-



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
World Radio History

Modern Reclaims Some Turf In Fall Arbs

As one might expect from the ongoing presidential sex scandal, it was a good fall book for news/talk stations. But it was also a good fall for R&B, top 40, and even modern rock stations. On the other hand, AC stations continued to slip, especially in younger demos, while country stations posted their lowest numbers in nine years.

Those are the headlines from Airplay Monitor's latest national tally of Arbitron's fall ratings

in its continuous-measurement markets by format. Full breakouts will run in next week's issue of Airplay Monitor. Here are the headlines:

- AC radio remained the No. 1 music format but continued to slip, albeit within its customary 14-share range. AC was down more at the lower end than in older demos.

- R&B radio tied its best 12-plus numbers ever, remaining the No. 2 music format. And that's before most of the new R&B oldies outlets, which should make themselves felt in the winter, appeared.

- Country, after a brief retrenchment last summer, is now at its lowest point since summer '90. And it's only two-tenths of a share ahead of where it was when we started measuring national Arbitron numbers in spring '89.

- Top 40 was off in middays, as you'd expect with the teens back in school. But it was up everywhere else, rebounding from a slightly off summer book.

- Album and classic rock were off, but modern rock, despite its recent station defections, is rebounding. It's not back to its 1996 levels, but the slide has been halted. That, combined with the AC numbers, suggests that modern may be taking back some turf—not that it lost much in the first place—from modern AC.

Mancow Mulls a Moove Into Television?

The Chicago Sun Times reports that modern WKXQ (Q101) Chicago-based syndicated morning guy Mancow is talking to two local stations to do a half-hour TV version of his radio show to air weeknights. In other Mancow news, the jock just picked up a metal sculpture of another jock, football star O.J. Simpson, at the court-ordered auction of Simpson memorabilia. Mancow says he will melt the statue down and sell pieces of it to benefit the family of Ronald Goldman, whose murder, along with Nicole Brown Simpson's, Simpson was accused and acquitted of. Mancow, who bid \$3,250 for the 5-foot-8-inch statue, will melt it in a public ceremony and sell pieces along with the message "Remember Nicole and Ron."

MANAGEMENT: HOT SCOTT

N/T WXYT Detroit GM Scott Meyer joins Citadel as group GM for its new Saginaw, Mich., properties, including classic rock WMJA/WMJK and album WKQZ. Nancy Dymond exits.

M Street reports that Joe Puglise is upped from sales exec to GM of Atlantic Star's four Wilmington, Del., stations, including rock WRDX.

FOMATS: END OF THE END

It is the end of the end. Clear Channel's long-time modern outlet WENZ Cleveland has been sold to Radio One, which plans to flip the format to some variety of R&B.

The M Street Journal reports that country WQVR Worcester, Mass., segues to classic rock as the Fox under new owners.

In Santa Rosa, Calif., classic rock KHBG becomes top 40 KSXY (Sexy 95.9).

PROGRAMMING: PRICE IS RIGHT

Album KRRO (the Crow) Sioux Falls, S.D., a.m. driver John C. Price is named PD. Middayer Desiree adds MD duties.

Rock WIXV and R&B WSGF Savannah, Ga., OM Lee Cory joins country WGSQ and AC WGIC Cookeville, Tenn., in the same capacity. He replaces Marty McFly, now hosting the syndicated country show "Nashville Nights."

AC WYCO Wausau, Wis., PD Bryan Cornwell joins crosstown classic rock WKQH and modern WSPT as OM. WKQH afternoon host Tomm

Rivers adds PD duties, as Matt Bahan focuses on programming WSPT. Bahan also shifts from afternoons to mornings, replacing Arnie Wheeler, who exits. WSPT night jock Phil Rivers shifts to p.m. drive, with voice-tracking at night.

PEOPLE: BARSKY BOUND FOR MAX

Former WPLY (Y100) Philadelphia morning man Barsky winds up across the street, doing wake-ups at modern adult WXXM (Max 95.7). In other Max news, MD Ali Castellini relinquishes that title but remains on-air.

Album KGGO Des Moines, Iowa, morning man Larry Morgan ends his 20-year association with the station to go into the world of print.

Triple-A KFOG San Francisco moves traffic reporter Kim Wonderley to morning show executive producer/sidekick. P/T Jim Ziegler takes KFOG nights replacing Linda McInnes. Interim night host John Evans takes mornings at crosstown jazz KKSF.

Remember the scurrulous rumors several months ago that Eastern Long Island, N.Y., rhythmic top 40 WXXP (Party 105) was going to move to the Western Long Island frequency of modern WLIR/WDRE? Well, it's true, but only on late Sunday nights, when WLIR simulcasts WXXP's "Island Underground" mix show with B-Man and Chris The Greek.

With the departure of classic rock WOCT Baltimore PD/afternoons Mike Sommers (reported last week), the contract of morning team Herman and McBean will not be renewed when it ends in March. Night jock Steve Austin takes afternoons.

Album WKLS Atlanta P/T Frazier Hughes joins modern WBZV Blacksburg, Va., for mornings, allowing current morning man Andy Bowyer off the air to concentrate on production.

Classic rock WZGC (Z93) Atlanta night host Brian "Bison" Hollander leaves for the same shift at classic rock WHCN Hartford, Conn., replacing Ken Batten. PD/mornings Peter Dellor seeks a morning show so he can step off-air.

Modern KLYY (Y107) L.A. afternoon host Sherri Donovan exits for full-time mom-hood.

Album WDZD (Asylum 93.5) Myrtle Beach, S.C., P/T Art takes middays, replacing automation. At classic rock sister WWSK, P/T Brook replaces Monkey Boy in nights.

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Everlast Wins Round From Sugar Ray

MAIN EVENT: The artists with the boxing-related names slug it out for the fifth straight week, as Everlast reclaims the top spot from Sugar Ray. This marks the ninth time a song has returned to No. 1 at modern rock, but it's only the second time a No. 1 song has done it with nine weeks under its belt (the other is Oasis' "Wonderwall," which made a reappearance for just one more week). Most records to make a return trip to the top do so after being disrupted by another record shortly after becoming No. 1. The only modern records to notch five or more weeks at No. 1 and then return to the top have been Third Eye Blind's "Semi-Charmed Life," which after five weeks was knocked out for a week and then re-claimed the spot for the next three, and "Wonderwall," which did stints of nine weeks and a week at No. 1. With another week on top, Everlast would not only move into second place for most weeks at No. 1 but would also be the only No. 1 record to have been knocked out of the top spot and still notch more than 10 weeks at No. 1.

Metallica becomes only the seventh act with two concurrent top five tracks on the mainstream rock chart, as "Whiskey In The Jar" (Elektra/EEG) joins "Turn The Page." "Whiskey" also reaches the top five of the active rock chart, marking the first time any act has placed two tracks in the top five simultaneously since that chart's inception in June '97. It's only the third time in the Rock Airplay Monitor era that there have been two simultaneous top five tracks by a single act. Stone Temple Pilots accomplished the feat twice in a seven-week span in '94, first with "Vaseline" and "Big Empty" in the July 22 issue, then with "Vaseline" and "Interstate Love Song" Sept. 2. Those songs also spent two weeks occupying the top two slots between them. STP is the only act to have simultaneous top five tracks more than once. The Black Crowes hold the longest run with simultaneous top fives, as "Remedy" and "Sting Me" spent five weeks together in the top five in June and July '92.

STATIONS: WRDU Raleigh, N.C., is removed from the mainstream and heritage rock panels. Current panel sizes are 111 and 61, respectively.

PERSONNEL FILE: Updating an item in last week's Airplay Monitor, senior VP of promotion Hillary Shaev continues to oversee promotion in all formats for 550 Music/Work Group.

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Spin Cycle Starts For Clear Channel, Jacor

With a September closing set for the \$4.4 billion merger of Clear Channel and Jacor, the two companies have begun spinning stations to meet FCC ownership requirements. The spins, valued at \$340 million, will see Clear Channel and Jacor enter one new market, while classic rock WBGB and N/T WZNZ Jacksonville, Fla., have been put into an FCC trust destined for a minority buyer.

In Cleveland, Clear Channel is selling modern WENZ and N/T WERE to Radio One, which plans to flip the stations to R&B. Clear Channel's classic rock WNCX goes to Infinity.

In Tampa, Fla., Clear Channel spins triple-A WHPT and R&B oldies WFJO to Cox, which also picks up WDUV's easy-listening format and Jacor's 105.5 frequency. Jacor will move classic rock WTB's programming to WDUV's stronger 103.5 frequency. Also in Tampa, Clear Channel sells country WRBQ and jazz WSJT to Infinity, sports WZTM-AM to Mega, and WRBQ-AM to ABC for Radio Disney.

In Louisville, Ky., Jacor sells top 40 WDJX, modern WLRS, and religious WFIA to Blue Chip Broadcasting. Jacor also sells AC WVEZ and classic rock WSFR to Cox Radio, which will in turn sell R&B oldies WLSY and oldies WRVI to meet ownership limits.

In Dayton, Ohio, Clear Channel spins top 40 WGTZ (Z93), classic rock WING-FM, and N/T WING to Blue Chip Broadcasting.

Clear Channel/Jacor also nabs a new market, adding top 40 WWHT, AC WYYY, country

WBBS, N/T WSYR, and sports WHEN Syracuse, N.Y., in a swap with Cox.

Elsewhere, the president of ABC's O&O radio group, John Hare, adds oversight of ABC Radio Networks with a promotion to president of ABC Radio.

Root Communications signs former top 40 WIOQ (Q102) Philadelphia VP/GM Dan Savado as CEO of the 29-station group.

CAPITOL HILL NOTICES MICROS

With the Monica Lewinsky matter finished, Congress seems to have awakened to telecommunications issues. House telecom subcommittee chair Billy Tauzin, R-La., has fired a letter off to FCC Chair Bill Kennard demanding he explain his low-power-radio plan to Congress.

Elsewhere on the Hill, Rep. Mike Oxley, R-Ohio, is sponsoring a bill that would remove the 24-year-old ban on newspaper/broadcast cross-ownership. Oxley is also questioning how the FCC paid for its study of minority ad practices.

The FCC has flagged Cumulus' \$4.9 million purchase of album WBUZ Toledo, Ohio, from Radio Toledo citing concentration concerns.

SALES

Capstar is buying album rock WTPA and easy listening WNCE Harrisburg, Pa., from Quaker State Broadcasting for \$15 million . . . Central Illinois Broadcasting sells album rock WWCT Peoria, Ill., to Kelly Communications for \$7.75 million.

Crankin' Craig Dori, last in middays at album WMMS Cleveland, joins classic rock WKHY Lafayette, Ind., as afternooner/production director, replacing Jeff Strange.

Modern WNNX (99X) Atlanta welcomes back Yvonne Monet to the station for overnights.

Dori Homer joins country KORD Tri-Cities, Wash., for nights Feb. 22 from the same at classic rock rival KEGX.

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Don't Leave Them Hanging On The Telephone

Let's face it, returning all your calls is difficult. If you are an on-air PD, it can be nearly impossible. Not only do you have your record calls, but calls concerning promotions and sales and calls from irate or curious listeners. You could spend most of your day on the phone. So how do you take calls, listen to complaints, and play counselor without going mad?

First, listen to all the calls in your voice mail. Note the comments and questions you are asked so that you can have a quick response during your return call. Then, prioritize your return calls. Your first concern must be your radio station. Sometimes that means that you must return calls to your boss first. You'll also need to return calls from your staff immediately in case one of them needs to be bailed out of jail before his or her next air shift. It's also critical that you return calls to irate listeners. That's never fun, but you'll save yourself a lot of agony if you deal with them as soon as possible.

After the first wave of callbacks, decide which calls need your attention and which can be delegated. Sometimes you'll have three calls from three separate people at a record label. Return one of those calls and ask your rep to pass on the information to the others. Try to return the business calls first, and if it's a day when you have a lot of calls to return, keep the social chat to a minimum. One way to do that is to get an egg timer and time your calls. If you have to keep flipping the egg timer over, you may be spending more time chatting about your golf handicap than your radio station.

If all of our phone calls were dry business matters, returning every call wouldn't be such a problem. But most calls are not that simple.

Sometimes it's difficult to return a call to someone who wants something that you know you are not likely to give him or her. If it's a week in which six great songs are released, but you only have room for three, you know that you are going to have at least three calls from people who are upset with your choices. Knowing that it's

their job to work you on a song doesn't make it easier to talk to them. While it might seem easier to ignore their calls and hope that their disappointment passes before the next time they call you, in reality, you're better off returning those calls as quickly as you can. Few reps are more persistent than those who just missed getting a record played. Deal with them and get it over with; you'll save yourself a lot of grief.

Angry calls are the worst to return. When a person goes ballistic, nothing you say matters until he or she simmers down. Dealing with an angry caller provides few good options. Should you ignore the phone calls for as long as possible, or should you allow the angry person to continue to yell at you, or should you hang up on that person while he or she is on a tirade? Only one thing is certain—few things make an angry person angrier than being hung up on.

Many years ago, I hung up on a big record rep. There I was, just out of college, a young promotion director for a top 40 station in Virginia, when I intercepted a phone call from Mr. Big. He was upset with our MD, who had screwed up some promotion, and couldn't get either the PD or the MD on the phone. Mr. Big started cursing at me like a sailor. I wasn't used to that type of language and asked him to stop, telling him I would have to hang up on him unless he calmed down. He didn't stop yelling, so I just hung up the phone. You would have thought I'd hung up on God. It was a disaster. No one had ever hung up on him before. After that, whenever Mr. Big visited the station, the receptionist would lock me in my office so I couldn't offend him with my prissy existence.

I could have saved myself a lot of agony if I had called back and apologized, and that experience did teach me how important it is to take the high ground and stay calm. So take a deep breath, prioritize your calls, and return them as quickly as possible. In the long run, you'll be less likely to make someone angry enough to scream at you.

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MONITOR PROFILE

The Fox's O'Connor Fights Off The Hawk, KXPK With Big Morning Show, Tight List

Mike O'Connor is a veteran of both classic rock wars and Denver radio, making him a logical choice to revitalize Jacor's classic rock KRXF (the Fox), which he programs along with modern KICL. The Fox's 5.6-6.9 rise in the fall Arbitron survey comes after retooling the music to fight crosstown classic hits KKHK (the Hawk). It also sets the station up for a pending battle with modern KXPK, which just picked up Howard Stern and is now targeting KRXF's longtime morning team, Lewis and Floorwax, which just wrapped up the fall book No. 1 12-plus, 18-34, and 25-54.

O'Connor came in as KRXF was struggling with the Hawk's hyper-focused classic hits format. "The Fox was a great radio station, well-marketed, lots of attitude in between the records, with a big morning show. All the things you have to do with classic rock," O'Connor says. "The only thing they didn't do was tighten up their music in response to the classic hits competitor coming on. So they kept their library at 1,200 songs during that initial run of the Hawk."



'We're the more mature rock'n'roll animal'

O'Connor did "the typical thing you do when you're faced with a music-intensive competitor: After 10 o'clock, I made sure our DJs shut up. We tightened the music down to playing the hits, and we got on TV and strategically reinforced our music product."

He says the "strategic objective was to sit on them as much as possible while still targeting men . . . We co-opted their unique selling proposition, which was the 'music-purity' promise. We tightened up our music. We added the 20-in-a-row, \$20,000 music-quantity guarantee to the radio station. We tried to make it so that there was no difference between the Fox and the Hawk, except that we had a big, huge morning show."

Some changes were made to mornings, too. "Lewis and Floorwax were playing no records when the Hawk signed on," he recalls. "We got them to play one record a quarter-hour. But our research over the years has confirmed that even the Hawk's music PIs liked and listened to Lewis and Floorwax. So we felt outside of morning drive [that] as long as we sat on [the Hawk] musically, didn't give them any room to breathe, and added the music-quantity guarantee—we do three 20-song music marathons a day—we could successfully co-opt their unique selling propositions."

KRXF still uses some carefully chosen musical depth. "In between 'Gimme Three Steps' and 'Stairway To Heaven,' you might hear something a little bit more off the beaten path, but it will always be highlighted with special packaging, whether it's a deep-cut setup or a lost classic track or a CD side from a core artist album. We make a big deal out of it when we do go off the page . . . We do deliver on our promise of depth quite frequently, but we also spend a lot of time selling those occasions where we're going to go deep."

Here's a sample hour on KRXF: Foghat,

"Slow Ride"; Robert Plant, "In The Mood"; Edgar Winter Group, "Free Ride"; Eagles, "One Of These Nights"; U2, "Sunday Bloody Sunday"; Journey, "Don't Stop Believin'"; ZZ Top, "Waitin' For Bus/Jesus Just Left Chicago"; Deep Purple, "Hush"; Marshall Tucker Band, "Can't You See"; Alice Cooper, "No More Mr. Nice Guy"; and Van Halen, "Pretty Woman."

Add to all this classic rock activity Jacor's triple-A KBCO, which O'Connor admits has more classic rock in its playlist under PD Dave Benson than when O'Connor was programming it. "He integrates a lot of soft classic rock into his mix. And while our sharing levels [with] KBCO are in the 30s, it's a sound strategy, because KBCO has been able to also keep the Hawk down," he says. "KBCO and the Hawk don't duplicate nearly as many titles as the Hawk and KRXF, but they have much more of a similarity as far as stationality. They're very adult, politically correct radio stations, and so they battle for that same psychographic, while we're the more mature rock'n'roll animal."

O'Connor characterizes the Fox's stationality as "high-brow locker room . . . It's attitude for the 25-to 44-year-old. We'll have legal IDs that say, 'The station that stands behind the Nuggets . . . way behind,' because the Nuggets are a terrible team. When the Kansas City Chiefs came to town, we gave away E.U.C. T-shirts. We're the station that threw thousands of rat traps on the ice when the Colorado Avalanche played the Florida Panthers a couple of years ago."

KRXF is "notorious" for its series of outrageous billboards, usually merging popular figures from the news with classic rock-themed headings. So when the Oklahoma City bombing trial was taking place in town, the station ran a drawing of Timothy McVeigh in an electric chair, with the heading "Start Me Up." Says O'Connor, "We got it up for about a day, and then they pulled the plug on it"—so to speak.

He thanks Arbitron for its campaign to aid at-work-listening reporting by asking for at-work ZIP codes. "[If] you're an 18-year-old who happens to work in the graphic art department of some company that had the Fox on in the background, when the diary's prompting you for your at-work ZIP code, you're also most likely recalling that big chunk of listening to a station that may not have been your favorite for music, but you were there." He sees it in the Fox's first No. 1 25-54 ranking in years. "We can directly attribute that to increases in the young end."

KRXF is massaging at-work listening with the usual battery of time spent listening/at-work contesting and a product called Real Call, which taps the KRXF work-force database and allows the morning show to "leave answering-machine messages to members of our database," O'Connor says. "We can leave messages to about 60% of our database at a fraction of the cost of direct mail." KRXF now does this once a quarter.

With the Hawk fading in his rear-view mirror, O'Connor sees a new problem on the horizon with modern KXPK (the Peak) now helmed by Mike Stern. "They've decided to drive a wedge right through Jacor's rock cluster with a mainstream current-based alternative format and Howard Stern," says O'Connor.

"The entry of Stern in the market is going to impact us. Our goal is to make it negligible. No matter what we do, he's going to take some share away from those guys." So O'Connor is going on the local offensive. "We're marketing the hell out of them on the air," he says. "We have a campaign called Denver's hometown heroes, obviously to spotlight Lewis and Floorwax as the local funny morning show. And we've used local celebrity athletes to appear in campy 'Sports Center'-esque like spots to help position those guys as both funny and local. And we're spending a ton of money on that, too."

Infinity Modern Heavyweights Take Roadshow To Promo Execs

jects to hear music in its early infancy. Maybe we can help make suggestions on how to ready it for radio. Maybe we can make commitments to play these songs much earlier in the development of the music, as opposed to waiting until the local rep from a record label drops it on our desk after all the marketing plans have been laid out and a lot of the decisions have been made."

At CBS Radio, which spun off Infinity last year, has a history of group initiatives on behalf of new music. Last March, the CBS moderns added God Lives Underwater's "From Your Mouth" in tandem. Last fall, the group's modern ACs did the same for Alanis Morissette's "Unsent," which was ultimately chosen as the next single.

CBS was also one of the first groups to seek the label marketing dollars that many broadcasters believe have wrongly gone to print instead. In late 1997, Airplay Monitor reported that CBS executives were having similar discussions with many country label reps that initially included paid spins in specialty programming. Finally, in early 1998, CBS approached country labels with a package of five sponsorships ranging from paid back-sells to a new music program that no longer included a spin commitment.

NO MENU, NO MANDATE

This time, however, all parties stress that there was no menu of choices for labels to sign off on. "We're not going in with a mandate to explore revenue opportunities. That's not what this was about. Obviously, if there are revenue opportunities as a result of these meetings, we will explore those. But our mantra and our marching orders from everyone from corporate to our local management has been ratings—'You guys are in the ratings business. You're not in the revenue business.' We're not the sales managers; we're the PDs," says Kingston.

"This was more a mission of strategically aligning these radio stations with record companies on a product, on a content, on a programming level, as opposed to going in and jacking them up for money. If that was the case, we would have sent the sales department," he adds.

Clearly, based on conversations with Kingston and label reps, the possibility of marketing campaigns, perhaps in concert with some sort of retail campaign, was part of the discussion. And one of the stations involved, KROQ, had already partnered with labels on a video compilation. Labels contributed artist videos to the compilation, which was then distributed on the street and to anyone who bought that artist's albums at Tower Records. The station got a time buy, and the label got end-cap displays and distribution of as many as 30,000 copies of its artist's video.

Universal's Leeds acknowledges that some sort of station/retail tie-in, a characteristic of previous comprehensive artist parking plans (CAMPs) at other stations, was discussed: "If we could all figure out a way to get price and position in the retail environment, utilizing radio would be a big win." He also says, "The competitive issues in the marketplace were discussed, including concert business and breaking new bands."

Addressing the marketing campaign aspect, Kingston adds, "If [these discussions mean] we make commitments to products way early in the lifeline and brings us online sooner and gives us more input and gives them more access, and as a result creates opportunities from a marketing, from a revenue, from a support standpoint, sure, that's the result. But it's not, 'Throw some money at us and we'll put your record on the radio.'

TREADING CAREFULLY

Because of the negative publicity surrounding several group marketing initiatives, particularly a recent Chancellor Media deal involving Bryan Adams' "On A Day Like Today," as well as the recent exclusivity deal between Cumulus Media and independent promoter Jeff McClusky, Kingston says the group was prepped by CBS counsel prior to the meetings "in light of the recent mostly negative press that certain companies have received because of deals being made with labels or independents or whatever. That was a point of discussion, that we wanted to learn from their mistakes," says Kingston.

"We are being extremely careful in how this is being presented and couched in what we do or

don't say, because we don't want to get into another one of these Bryan Adams [situations]. We're being very careful and respectful of the label side of the business and our side of the business. We just don't want to make those kinds of mistakes. We're walking very softly and responsibly," he adds.

A source close to the Infinity legal department, who spoke on condition of anonymity, notes that any marketing campaign will be pursued only after the stations select the music according to their own policies and at their own discretion. Infinity, the source says, is going to great lengths to make sure that there is a clear delineation between deciding what goes on the air and approaching labels for marketing-enhancement packages. (Chancellor has made similar claims on behalf of its stations' involvements with the Adams single.) And, Kingston says, "no one will ever approach us and say, 'We're going to make a cash contribution to you or your company or your sales department. Let's see what we can do with this particular piece of product.'

LABELS ARE AMENABLE

At least one label rep contacted about the meetings saw them as an attempt to do the opposite of the recent Cumulus deal and several other group owner/independent exclusivity pacts, bolstering, rather than restricting, PDs' direct contact with labels.

V2 head of promotion Matt Pollack says, "I give [the Infinity PDs] a lot of credit for doing it. A lot of times in the game of promotion there's a lot of middle people involved. What they were trying to do was establish if they're going to be the marketing tool in exposing music; if there are dollars to be spent, they're the primary source—why not spend it there?"

As for the overall tone of the meetings, Pollack says, "I don't think anybody walked away feeling they were being strong-armed." To him, the message was, "We want to partner with you. Please consider us in your marketing." He saw it as an extension of Benjamin's annual presentations on his station's HFS-tival show. "I wish more companies would do that. I give them a lot of credit on making their rounds."

Like the other label reps we spoke to, Pollack says he is amenable to the possibilities of future Infinity/label partnerships. When offered the reach of the Infinity modern rock stations, "what record company isn't going to be excited about that? There's a ton of money spent at record companies," he says. "[And] millions of dollars mis-spent. If you can spend it on your primary driver, radio, that's good."

"From a promotion standpoint, they're all great stations," says 550's Klaiman. "I wish there was a way to get them all en masse... If they all feel really committed to one band, I'd like to think they'll come to us with a proposal." And while labels are not, as some execs have emphasized when confronted with radio's desire for more record revenue, a bottomless pit of money, Klaiman says this type of meeting "enables me to plan ahead with my budgets if I know more campaigns are more available."

Atlantic Records, meanwhile, was impressed enough by its meeting to immediately propose a project involving artist Kid Rock. Starting with a video promotion similar to the KROQ model, but that will include all five stations, the Atlantic promotion encompasses a time buy and a retail tie-in with Tower Records, as well as artist participation and a concert flyaway for winning listeners. "If 80% of our records are sold in the top 20 markets," says Atlantic's Danny Buch, "I look at [targeting major-market PDs, such as the Infinity reps] as an avenue" toward those sales.

For his part, Kingston says that he hopes to see the industry "using us as a focus group... We've all proved that we have good instincts and good ears and have good judgment over the years. That's the way to get it done, and that's exactly what we want to accomplish. If lightning strikes, and this group of influential radio stations decides to jump unilaterally on a project, maybe there's some value there... We're trying to throw some structure into this thing and see if we can work together and make it more of a one-stop shopping opportunity to affect as many markets and as many PDs and MDs with one fell swoop and hopefully make a significant contribution."

Modern AC **KDMX** Dallas gives winners Grammy packs of CDs and qualifies them to win a trip for two to the big show. Modern **WPXY** (Y100) Philadelphia midday **Bret Hamilton** will broadcast live from backstage at the Grammys with a celebrity co-host. Top 40 **WPXY** Rochester, N.Y., has **Round the Clock Grammys**, in which every hour of the day, the eighth caller wins a Grammy-nominee CD and qualifies for a chance to win a trip to see the event. Nominees for Grammy promo producers of this column are **Amber Noble, Loren Condron, Kelly Gross, and Tristano Korlou**, respectively.

Wayne Collins of R&B WJTT Chattanooga, Tenn. "More, smaller giveaways increases the perceptions that you're giving away lots of cash, especially among contest-hungry listeners."

Country KNIX Phoenix's Vicki Fiorelli says, "We are giving away a lot of money this year, as is the competition. We want many people to win cash instead of one lucky winner. Besides, that big winner may not even be a loyal listener."

Which raises the issue of how to weed out contest pigs. WPXY's Korlou has a database that lists all the winners who have won more than once in 30 days, so they can be disqualified as the prize abusers. WJTT's Collins also has an in-house computer system that can constantly cross-check contest winners. "It will also eliminate the need for paper winner's records and prize-claim receipts," he notes. "This is all possible through a combo of MS Exchange Server and MS Access."

Barbara Luchsinger from triple-A KKZN (the Zone) Dallas doesn't have a cash budget to speak of; nevertheless, she has something that's almost as good. "We found that we could get a lot more 'mileage' from buying miles from American Airlines and lock into our listeners' minds with theater-of-the-mind radio offers," she explains. "At a cost of 2 cents a mile, we gave away 2,500 miles daily, from Monday to Thursday (cost: \$500) and 200,000 miles on Friday (cost: \$4,000). Listeners had to identify two songs in a row from the week's featured artist. Jocks pick a destination anywhere in the world; they surf the Net to research that destination and [plug] the [contest] by [describing the destination as] a world-class adventure [listeners] could take if they won the miles."

QUICK HITS

Jumping on the hottest headlines, album rock KEGL's morning show sent its stunt boy, dressed in the purple Teletubbie outfit, to the gay district in Dallas, looking for a date. **Loren Condron** was the matchmaker.

R&B WVEE (V103) Atlanta is having a triple-prize weekend; prizes include tickets to a **Lauryn Hill** concert and the play "What's Love Got To Do With It," plus a grand-prize drawing for a trip to the Grammy Awards. **Lenny Whiteside** is the ticket broker.

Country KEY Minneapolis will debut its modified race car, which will travel all over the state's race circuit, at a car show in Minneapolis. Pressing the pedal to the metal is **Diana Buckmann**.

When he was at modern WBCN Boston, country WNYW (Y107) New York's **Jason Steinberg** mastered the "drop" stunt: dropping things from a high point to watch them smash on the ground. Successful drops always pull massive attendance and media exposure. Try vans (good way to get rid of an old one), pumpkins (800 lbs.-plus), money, turkeys (à la *Les Nessman*), and typewriters (for *Secretaries' Day*). His all-time fave: a grand piano in honor of *Elton John*. "Five towns shot us down for permits," he says. "Finally, one town let us do it. Over 5,000 people saw it."

Rhythmic top 40 KLUC Las Vegas held a **Mystery Mouthful** contest, where listeners guessed what was placed in their mouths. Finding it hard to swallow was **Vanessa Thill**.






