Top 40's Turnaround: Years In The Making With A Cast Of Thousands

Why is top 40 turning around now? Is it just because the music got better? Or is the explanation more complex?

When top 40 exploded in the early '80s, it was possible to trace the format's resurgence to a handful of watershed events—new stations and superstar artists that helped make the format dominant for several years. In 1996, with top 40 just beginning to show new health in Arbitron shares and station counts, it is already possible to find at least 10 events that were significant in top 40's rebound.

Ask radio folks about the early '80s boom, and they might cite at least one of the following events as key moments in top 40's turnaround:

- The 1981 debut of Mike Joseph's Hot Hits format on WCAU-FM

Is Hot AC Losing Its Religion?

First, there was the realization that Bill Clinton had become a Republican. Then, there was the Bob Dole convention speech in which he almost sounded like a Democrat, if you were able to overlook the illegal-immigrant thing or not letting the pro-choice Republicans speak during prime time. None of that, however, is as baffling as the change in hot AC's identity.

For years, hot AC was the format listeners were supposed to choose in protest when mainstream top 40 got too extreme. Despite this, hot AC was also supposed to have a little edginess. The industry loved the WPLJ New Yorks or KFMB-FM San Diegos that managed to find enough adult-friendly rock'n'roll so that listeners would be impressed by their daring. Hot AC was, to quote the liners, "no rap, no hard rock" and "no sleepy elevator music." Somehow it delivered these things simultaneously.

For hot AC's balancing act to work, two conditions had to be met. Mainstream top 40 had to be doing something to chase away the adults. And adult top 40s needed their own supply of exciting, uptempo records that mainstream top 40 couldn't play. Since hot ACs rarely played currents that didn't start at top 40, their secret weapons were usually the oldies that had disappeared from mainstream top 40 in the past five years. These songs had tempo and texture but were familiar enough that they didn't appear hard. That's why every early '80s AC played "Long Cool Woman In A Black Dress." That's why today's hot AC plays "Losing My Religion."

Today, adult top 40's status as an alternative to mainstream is threatened. There's not a lot wrong with mainstream top 40 right now, or at least not much that can be capsulized in a liner as neatly as "no rap, no hard rock." So many markets have been without a top 40 for so long that it's hard for listeners to remember what they were mad about. And there aren't a lot of oldies that hot AC can own. The early to mid-'80s oldies have been burned out. The late-'80s oldies are, unfortunately, rap and hard rock. Or they're **Linear and Company B**. While WKTU New York has made those titles work in the context of a rhythmic top 40 by playing them next to "Boom Boom Boom" and "C'mon N' Ride It," the few rhythmic hot ACs out there have, so far, been unable to capitalize on those songs.

Listen to adult top 40s now and there's no longer much of an attempt to stand out from top 40. Hot ACs from Charlotte, N.C., to Salt Lake City position themselves around that most-top 40-like word "hits" regardless of whether they've really changed musically. And now that the modern AC format exists, it's possible to hear at least a few AC stations rocking harder than their top 40 competition, at least if you hit them during "Mother, Mother" or "Lump."

It's not that there's no experimentation going on at hot AC. Between the modern-based hot ACs and the rhythmic hot ACs, there's a lot of freshness and diversity, at least for industry types. What's missing is a clear mission statement.

Hot AC almost obliterated itself in the mid-'80s, too. Again, it was at a time when adults could tolerate the top 40 hits. Again, it was at a time when most of the hot AC stations were pretty good, at least from a pure radio standpoint. (There were, among others, the **George Johns** "Class FM" stations with great high-profile talent.) Again, hot AC seemed to have everything except a reason to exist. In the mid-'80s, I used to wonder if hot AC, as we knew it, would exist in five years.

Now we know that hot AC as we know it never exists in five years. It changes as new listeners (and new PDs) move into the demo. But by the late '80s, as top 40 changed again, hot AC still very much existed. Something called hot AC or "adult top 40" will undoubtedly exist in five years, too, especially given the number of changes that top 40 will go through by then.

As for now, adult top 40 needs to make some decisions, although not everybody involved with the format might see it that way just yet. There are still adult top 40s successfully walking the line between "not too hard" and "not too soft." There are still adult top 40s handily beating the mainstream top 40 in their market. There are also a handful of hot ACs in markets with no top 40 hoping to control both positions just a little while longer. And whenever hot AC plays more records, it gets more attention from the record labels, spurred by the fact that the AC reps are getting more attention from their bosses. (One rep told me recently that because of KFMB-FM and KYSR Los Angeles, his bosses are actually asking his opinion in marketing meetings.)

So what's the problem? One is that many of the mid-'80s hot ACs didn't survive the last top 40 revival. Remember WYNY New York? KHTZ Los Angeles? WKQX and WFYR Chicago? WAXY Miami? Despite the handful of hot ACs that stayed relatively consistent for a decade, there were many hot ACs that had to finish their transition to top 40 or soft AC or go somewhere else altogether. Just as album rock in 1983-84 tried so hard to sound like top 40 that it opened up the format for an attack by classic rockers, the mid-'80s hot ACs suddenly found themselves blindsided by the rise of soft AC and oldies stations.

Another warning sign is that national Arbitrums show AC relatively firm in 18-34 but starting to leak upper demos. Even if you accept that adults are supposed to move through hot AC, if they're done with it by age 35, hot AC PDs are probably chasing them away prematurely.

It's always a good sign when other formats want to sound like top 40—it means that top 40 is again the musical center of the universe—but, ultimately, it's not always a good thing, for top 40 or for other formats. We've seen, over the past year, what a dial full of radio stations playing the same rock records has done. As a programming fan, I've always enjoyed the stations that blurred the line between mainstream top 40 and hot AC. But I also enjoy having a lot of distinct choices, and so do consumers.

NEW STATIONS AND OTHER REPORTER CHANGES FROM BDS & AIRPLAY MONITOR

Effective this week, WWZZ (Z104) Washington, D.C. (PD Dale O'Brian, MD Ron Ross, 301-399-3014), is added to the top 40/mainstream panel. Honolulu outlets KQKQ (PD Jamie Hyatt, MD Mars Frehley, 808-591-9369) and KIKI (PD Alan Oda, MD James Coles, 808-531-4602) are added to the top 40/rhythmic panel. Busy week for the Viacom folks at 3500 W. Olive Ave, Suite 250, Burbank, Calif. First, **KYSR** (Star 98.7) PD **Dave Beasing** exits. MD **Angela Perelli** is named interim PD. Meanwhile, soft AC **KXEZ** (Easy 100.3) has finally flipped to rhythmic AC as **KIBB** (B100.3). **Tony Coles** remains PD. B100.3 is currently jockless. **Bobby Ocean** is the station voice. Here's a sample hour: *Ready For The World*, "Oh Sheila"; **LTD**, "Back In Love Again"; **Los Lobos**, "La Bamba"; **Madonna**, "Holiday"; **Mariah Carey**, "Make It Happen"; **Commodores**, "Brick House"; **All-4-One**, "I Can Love You Like That"; **Janet Jackson**, "What Have You Done For Me Lately"; **France Joli**, "Come To Me"; **UB40**, "The Way You Do The Things You Do"; and **DeBarge**, "Rhythm Of The Night."

B100.3 isn't the only rhythmic AC convert this week. **WAMG** (Magic 103.7) Milwaukee flips from soft AC as **Brian Kelly**, PD of sister **WMYX**, becomes PD, replacing **Jim Morales**.

Classic rock **WQZQ** Nashville flips to top 40/rhythm as the Party under new COO **Bob Reich** and director of programming **Bryan Krysz**. GM **Sally McClanahan** exits.

Look for top 40/crossover **KMEL** and **KYLD** (Wild 107) San Francisco to put some musical breathing room between them, with Wild targeting a younger, Latino/dance audience, while KMEL skews a bit older and more R&B, without relinquishing its hip-hop heritage. Meanwhile, expect Evergreen Media's purchase of **WIOQ/WUSL** Philadelphia (and its subsequent effect on Charlotte, N.C.?) to be announced by the time you read this.

American Radio Systems hires Cap Cities/ABC radio president **Don Bouloukos** as its third co-COO. He'll oversee properties in Portland, Ore.; Rochester, N.Y.; Austin, Texas; Dayton, Ohio; St. Louis; Kansas City; and Seattle.

Jackson, Miss., gets its first top 40 outlet in several years, as soft AC **WLIN** becomes Y101.7. **Scott Matteer** remains OM.

Satellite network Radio One, which already offers an adult modern format, adds a gold-based modern AC format.

WEBN/WOFX Cincinnati OM **Marc Chase** is named director of Cincinnati programming operations for owner Jacor.

SFX switches classic rock **WZZU** Raleigh, N.C., to soft AC **WRSN** (Sunny 93.9). **Bob Bronson** (ex-**WVEZ** Louisville, Ky.) is named PD/mornings, teaming with **Jolyn Winter** from **KIOK** Tri-Cities, Wash. WZZU PD **Bob**

Edwards moves to rock sister **WRDU** as PD.

WFMF Baton Rouge, La., moves in a modern adult direction and becomes **Loose 102**, returning to the nickname it used as a '70s album rocker. PD/morning man **Johnny Ahysen** and middayer **Margie Maybe** exit. OM **Chuck Geiger** taps **Spencer Kane** from former crosstown modern **WTGE** as MD. **Loose 102**, which has applied for calls **WLSS**, will run jockless for 45-60 days.

Jerry Clifton's New Planet Radio officially buys **KRTR** Honolulu and new CP **KBLZ**.

KWMX Denver flips calls to **KHHT** to match its recent name change to K-Hits 107.5.

WLTF Cleveland GM **Dennis Best** becomes director of sales for Chancellor's Orlando, Fla., properties, including top 40 **WXXL**.

WDJB Fort Wayne, Ind., PD/morning guy **Scott Thomas** and co-host **Susan Harley** exit, as the station adds the syndicated "Bob & Sheri" morning show from **WWSN** Charlotte, N.C., as well as SuperRadio's overnight top 40 format. Call Thomas at 219-483-9797.

Album **WIXV** Savannah, Ga., PD **Mark Blake** adds PD duties at new top 40/rhythm partner **WSGF** (Hot 103.9).

WJXY Myrtle Beach, S.C., PD **Dave Priest** is named OM for top 40/adult **WSRK** Myrtle Beach, S.C. **Chris Palmer** remains PD . . . **WCEM** Cambridge, Md., OM **Joel Scott** takes middays at AC **WQHQ** Salisbury, Md., replacing **K.T. Harris**.

Expect **WWZZ** (Z104) Washington, D.C., to nail down **Jojo Morales** for nights. Former PD **Ron Ross** is named APD/MD.



Top 40 Adds More Stations In August

Country radio, while still the most-programmed format, experienced its biggest month of station losses in some time in August as part of megapoly-era station consolidations. Top 40, meanwhile, had its biggest month in recent memory, but religious outlets, led by black gospel, posted the biggest gains, according to the exclusive Airplay Monitor/M Street Format Monitor.

August's figures show country with a double-digit station loss, a net loss of 12 stations, or twice its net loss from the month before. Double-digit drops aren't uncommon in country. Even during the format boom, the influx of new FMs in various markets would usually force the country AMs in that market to flip to Southern gospel, news/talk, or some other format. The current drop, however, is based primarily on FM format changes, as stations duopolize, then destroy, their competition.

Top 40, meanwhile, was up by six stations, twice its net gain from the month before. Some

of that gain was based on stations that had returned to the format from modern rock, which showed a net loss of four stations.

Music-based religious outlets posed the biggest gain of any format. Of nine new stations, black gospel outlets accounted for about two-thirds of those, bringing its individual station totals to 165, meaning that there are more black gospel outlets than sports/talk, modern rock, triple-A, or smooth jazz stations. Spanish-language radio posted a net gain of seven stations, as the format spreads into new markets.

WATCHING THE DETECTIONS

Answers To Your Questions About BDS

Welcome to the third annual Billboard/Airplay Monitor Radio Seminar and Awards. And thanks for your continuing support of Broadcast Data Systems (BDS) and Airplay Monitor. BDS is in the process of refining its online product as well as developing products geared toward retailers and marketing departments throughout the industry. We are working on expanding our current list of monitored stations and on developing other projects, including mix-show charts and new formats.

We'll talk more about these developments at our panel, "BDS: The Road Ahead," to be held the morning of Sept. 7, at the New York Sheraton, but with everybody gathered for the seminar, we thought this would be a good time to answer four questions about BDS commonly asked by labels and radio.

How long is the BDS pattern in a song?

The fingerprints we use can be of different lengths, depending on the song. Patterns can be anywhere from 30 seconds to a minute long. They can be taken from any part of the song. The computer "listens" to a song in its entirety and selects a section that has the greatest amount of unique audio information, which can be taken from instrumentals or vocals.

How long does a record have to be played for it to be detected?

There's a lot of misinformation floating around on this topic, but the length of play depends on the section of a song from which the computer chose to take its pattern and the length of the pattern. Theoretically, a song could be detected after as little as one minute of play, or it may require several minutes. The pattern can be in the second to fifth minute of the song. The computer disregards the first and last 20-30 seconds of a song, the portion over which jocks are likely to talk. We strongly suggest that radio play a song in its entirety to ensure proper detection.

What happens to detections if a monitor goes down?

One of the daily realities of a remote monitoring system is that a number of uncontrollable conditions, such as hardware failure,

power outages, station-signal fluctuations, or special programming can result in few or no detections for a station for a period of time. When the condition occurs for a single station, rather than for all stations on a given monitor, and continues for a period of more than 12 hours (to allow for special programming), we "reuse" information from the most relevant prior period. This procedure is also used if all of the stations on a monitor reflect few or no detections for more than 30 minutes.

Our system cannot reconstruct actual airplay for the time that a monitor is down. Prior information is used specifically to minimize the impact of system downtime, with its inevitable loss of detections, on charted titles. The reuse approach was developed in conjunction with Billboard/Airplay Monitor's chart staff as an equitable method of addressing the realities of real-time recognition. In cases where there is extensive reuse on a particular station—say, more than three days—that station will be suspended from the charts until the problem can be fixed.

What happens if a mix is not encoded in the system?

If BDS does not receive a particular mix of a song from the label, or if a station creates its own mix and doesn't provide BDS with a copy, it is possible—but not always the case—that the BDS computer will not recognize that mix when it's played on the air. We stress that every configuration of a song is needed by BDS to guarantee that that song is detected. We encourage labels and radio to supply us with all records—even music from local acts, some of whom end up drawing the attention of major labels after being seen on local playlists, before being signed. 

Top 40's Turnaround: Years In The Making With A Cast Of Thousands

among them Ray Parker Jr.'s "The Other Woman," Prince's "1999," Marvin Gaye's "Sexual Healing," and Jackson's "Billie Jean."

The 1996 rebirth may be harder to pin down because we're still going through it. If we're lucky, the healthier numbers that top 40 has shown in its recent national Arbitron numbers and its improved station count (see story, page 4) are only the beginning. And with proponents of top 40 having predicted a rebirth for years, it's hard to say when those predictions stopped being wishful thinking.

It is also true that some of the key developments in the format's resurgence took place over a period of several years. Compared to the near-instantaneous success of Z100 and WCAU-FM, some of the top 40s that went from worst to first in recent times did it over the space of two years, not 120 days. But if we're still looking at a top 40 revival in a year, here are some key developments we'll look back on.

• KHKS (Kiss FM) Dallas, which went top 40 in '92, when other stations were going country. It didn't explode instantly, but when Kiss became No. 1 for the first time in '94, it showed that top 40 could still rule a market and attract adults, especially if there was a big-name, mass-appeal morning show attached. Kiss became the model for many other top 40 stations that wanted to lean rhythmic but still play the biggest pop/rock records.

• The resurgence of WFLZ Tampa, Fla. The '89 "Power Pig" edition of WFLZ should have come with a label: "Warning: Do Not Try This at Home," judging from the number of stations that unsuccessfully tried to copy its brand of on-air outrage. The '95 edition was not, despite its publicity, much less outrageous. There was, after all, still Bubba the Love Sponge asking female listeners about their breasts every night. But WFLZ was one of the first stations to prove that a market-leading top 40 could still play both rock and R&B reaction records. That doesn't seem like an outlandish claim now, but it did 15 months ago.

• WKIU New York. It wasn't the station that started the dance boom. WIOQ (Q102) Philadelphia was first, and WBBM-FM (B96) Chicago never went away. But WKIU is a "worst-to-first" success story of Z100's magnitude. While the slew of new dance stations popping up from Detroit to Savannah, Ga., attests to WKIU's success, WKIU's greatest influence may have been not on the stations that tried to copy it outright by going dance, but on mainstream top 40s that were willing to add a little more rhythm as a result of WKIU's success.

• KHOM (Mix 104.1) New Orleans. You might not think of it in the same breath as KHKS, WFLZ, and WKIU, but KHOM, which signed on last year as an adult top 40 and has since segued to mainstream, became a top five station in New Orleans with a suburban signal, a skeleton staff, and minimal promotion. A number of suburban outlets tried to fill the top 40 holes in their market during the format's doldrums and seemed woefully unequipped. KHOM was the first tangible proof that, even in an R&B-dominated market, the audience was there for top 40 and a station could garner it under less than ideal circumstances.

• The end of the country boom. Country posted its highest numbers in early '93, but the key moment may have been in spring '94, when country stations, concerned that their upper demos were being alienated by the format's rockin' new sound, began to re-add some of the '80s gold that they had purged. That didn't immediately fix the 35-64 numbers—which are now lower than they were when country's boom began in the late '80s—but it did have the effect of sending much of the younger end wandering the dial for something else, whether it was modern rock or top 40.

• The hot AC breakup. Over the past 18 months, mainstream top 40 has seen more than one station that had become a hot AC—with or without announcing it—return to the fold, among them WNCI Columbus, Ohio, WHYI Miami, KWMX Denver, WMXQ Birmingham, Ala., WSSX Charleston, S.C., WDAY-FM Fargo, N.D., WKRC Cincinnati, and WSTR Atlanta. Many hot ACs and adult top 40s that had switched from mainstream realized that the audience expected them to be top 40. Others realized that there was not much of a position wedged between top 40 and mainstream AC or just wanted to reclaim the

top 40 position before somebody else did.

• The Telecommunications Act. While financial pressures sparked by heavy prices paid for stations in the late '80s was bad for top 40, megapoly seems to have been a catalyst for top 40 growth this time around, at least for now. As WDCG (G105) Raleigh, N.C., OM Brian Burns notes, "Why do two brands of AC when you can offer four unique selling propositions under one roof?"

• The renewed interest of major groups in top 40. When NewCity went top 40 in Syracuse, N.Y., this spring, despite the fact that there was already a successful top 40 in the market, it indicated a change of mind on the part of the major groups. Soon, Bonneville and Viacom, two groups that weren't traditionally associated with the format, were in the top 40 arena again.

• The decision last Christmas by WEDJ Charlotte, N.C. (now WNKS), to end its war of attrition with its modern rock, WEND, and move back toward mainstream top 40. Six months later, that move would be duplicated, almost at once, by WHTZ, KRBE Houston, and WPST Trenton, N.J., all of which suddenly added La Bouche and Eric Clapton to their mix, proving that even modern-leaning outlets saw top 40 partisans as a more important target than modern rock purists.

• The success of Spin Doctors' "Pocket Full Of Kryptonite" in 1992-93. "Little Miss Can't Be Wrong" and "Two Princes" came along when legitimate pop/rock hits were rare. Besides reawakening interest in top 40 and modern rock—at a time when Spin Doctors were considered alternative—"Kryptonite" changed the way the industry thought about breaking records. "Kryptonite" had been out for a year when "Little Miss" broke at top 40. That encouraged labels to work records longer and radio to hold on to songs as long as they tested, whether it was "Run-Around," "Hey Jealousy," "Wild Night," or "I'm The Only One."

• Hootie & the Blowfish's "Cracked Rear View." It wasn't exactly a record that top 40 owned, but Hootie typified the type of music for which top 40 listeners were supposedly going to country—70s-influenced pop/rock with relatable middle-class lyrics. And even if they got publicity for the wrong reason—a black artist singing something other than R&B shouldn't be remarkable—Hootie did get the kind of consumer-press attention that Cindi, Madonna, and Michael used to get.

• "Jagged Little Pill." Alanis Morissette may belong to more than one format, but she brought hooks, melodies, and hip-hop beats back to modern rock last year, when modern was becoming the new heavy metal, and top 40 seemed determined to follow it down. And after all that time on TV, she, too, was made for the consumer media.

• "Killing Me Softly" by the Fugees. This was the R&B crossover that most top 40 stations had to acknowledge, even if they'd been afraid of hip-hop since the early '90s. With the return of R&B to a diet that included Morissette, Celine Dion, and La Bouche, top 40 was once again truly the variety format, or, as WPXY Rochester, N.Y., OM Clarke Ingram notes, "Top 40 is the only format that is able to play Alanis into Fugees into Celine Dion, which some people perceive as a weakness, [but which] I feel is the format's strength."

• The "Macarena" phenomenon. It's a record that top 40 owns. It has generated as much consumer-press coverage as any act. And, if "C'mon N' Ride It" follows "Macarena" to similar national prominence, it may be the start of a "dance party" era that looks more like the twist/pony/mashed potato era of the early '60s than the '70s disco era.

Our list isn't all-inclusive. But it shows how many pieces had to fall into place for top 40 to affect even the modest comeback it has shown to date.

In the end, top 40 may have rebounded because, as WNCI Columbus, Ohio, PD John Dimick notes, "it had gotten to the point where there was nowhere to go but up." Now, top 40 will have to avoid an equally long list of pitfalls, ranging from the temptation to rush too far in various musical directions to the tendency to spend more time attacking the competition on-air than serving listeners. But for now, there is encouraging news, something the format hasn't had in concentrated doses since the late '80s. Whether the format has more watershed events is up to the reader.

MONITOR PROFILE

John Peake Maintains KRBE's Creative Edge By Playing The Hits—Modern Or Not

In John Peake's words, he was "shocked, amazed, and flattered" when he was contacted about programming KRBE Houston. He was minding his own business, programming Jefferson-Pilot's KWMX (then Mix 107.5, now K-Hits) Denver, when the phone rang. "KRBE is one of those legendary radio stations I've always admired, and my first reaction was, 'Are you sure you dialed the right number?'"

He didn't have time to bask in the glow when he arrived in Houston in April. Tom Poleman was on his way to program WHTZ (Z100) New York. "It was a difficult transition," Peake admits. "A large chunk of the people who held the creative vision of KRBE [went along with Poleman, including MD/nights Paul Bryant, midday Ryan Chase, and programming assistant Sharon Dastur], leaving a huge void."

Thankfully, APD/afternoon DJ Scott Sparks, who has been with KRBE nearly 10 years, jumped in with both feet. "When half the programming staff left, Scott ran this radio station," says Peake, who hired MD Jay Michaels from modern KDGE (the Edge) Dallas. "I needed someone who understood alternative and

mainstream top 40, who could pick hit records, a true music freak," he says of Michaels, who, as a teenager, used to get a subscription to Billboard for his birthday, immediately qualifying him for music freak status.

Peake and Michaels took an outsiders' look at the KRBE music mix—which after years of leaning modern had become almost entirely modern, as a response to modern rival KTBZ (the Buzz)—and found some potential hits missing in action. "KRBE has always had an alternative lean, and, clearly, still does," says Peake. "But when we researched acts like the Fugees, we received an overwhelmingly positive response. Our listeners expected to hear these songs on a hit music station."

Granted, Houston has always had a reputation as an eclectic market, the town where Depeche Mode is king and where KRBE used to fight with then-rivals KNRJ and KKBQ to be first on the new Celebrate The Nun import. "Artists like Erasure, New Order, and Depeche always show up on the first few pages of our auditorium tests," Peake says.

Once the tweaking began, the questions started, both internally and from the record community, most of which consisted of, "Oh good,

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you're going mainstream . . . so now can you play my record?" Whatever reservations the staff may have had about filtering in some mainstream titles were answered quickly. "When 'Killing Me Softly' became our most-requested song, I knew we were doing the right thing."

Here's a recent 4 p.m. hour on KRBE, including that most-requested song: Everything But The Girl, "Missing"; Dishwalla, "Counting Blue Cars"; New Order, "Bizarre Love Triangle"; Alanis Morissette, "Ironic"; Fugees, "Killing Me Softly"; R.E.M., "Losing My Religion"; Primitive Radio Gods, "Standing Outside A Broken Phone Booth . . ."; Des'ree, "You Gotta Be"; Jesus Jones, "Right Here, Right Now"; La Bouche, "Sweet Dreams"; Counting Crows, "Mr. Jones"; Modern English, "I Melt With You"; and Tracy Chapman, "Give Me One Reason."

While the musical tweakage continued, Peake had to spackle over the holes in the air staff. Late-nighter Michele Fisher had initially moved to nights when Bryant left. "Michele is a natural communicator who makes great eye contact with her audience," says Peake, who moved her to middays, as Larry Davis took over nights.

"We had to capitalize on our heritage and presence," he says. KRBE shares the most audience with Nationwide's modern-leaning hot AC KHM (Mix 96.5). "[Mix] recognized the massive audience switch in hot AC, took advantage, and has clearly benefited," Peake says.

Peake recently delivered a "state of the station" report to visiting Susquehanna dignitaries. Among his findings: "This is a very healthy radio station. Musically, we're playing the hit records our listeners want and expect," he says. "We also have, arguably, one of the best morning shows in the country with Sam Malone, Maria Todd, and Psycho Robbie."

Marketing director Mark Sheeterle is another longtime KRBE fixture. "Mark's execution is flawless, and his attention to detail is remarkable." The marketing department publishes KRBE's monthly magazine, the Zone, mailed to more than 100,000 people, which features news about movies, music, concerts, and photos from station promotions. "It's a great way to put KRBE physically in their hands," he says.

Many broadcasters have worked at stations that sounded great on the air, but actually looked like upholstered toilets, but Peake is working in a state-of-the-art facility that looks like the Hard Rock Cafe gave birth to a radio station. "This place looks like what listeners think a radio station looks like," says Peake, who has discovered the joy of continuous meetings. "Just like fast-food joints, there's always one around the corner," he jokes. Speaking of fast food, he adds, "When I'm still at my desk at 8 p.m., zoning out and daydreaming about the Burger King drive-through, I know it's time to go home."

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

Monitor's Restaurant Guide:

Forget Tourist Traps On Your Visit To Fun City

Visitors to Manhattan tend to consume most of their meals in close proximity to Times Square. They also tend to pursue a "see food" diet—that is, they often say, "This looks OK. Let's just go here." Restaurants in the tourist zone count on that sort of lack of ambition, but they didn't count on us calling reps based in New York (or those who visit it often) for restaurant suggestions, which we present here (unless otherwise noted, all phone numbers are in area code 212).

VAL DELONG, LAVA RECORDS

• **Nobu** (105 Hudson St. and Franklin Street, 219-0500). "The best sushi in N.Y. Owned by Robert DeNiro. Order the spicy crab."

• **Il Bigato** (192 E. Second St., 228-0977). "Alphabet City's finest Italian. Very cheap, and the grilled calamari and house white wine are a must!"

• **Lucky Cheng's** (24 First Ave., 473-0516). "All the waiters are transvestites. The food is incredible, and they play great disco and old school. Order the fried rice."

• **Sylvia's** (328 Lenox Ave., Harlem, 996-0660). "The best Southern cooking north of the Mason-Dixon line . . . The fried chicken and greens will make you think you went home to Mama's!"

• **Oyster Bar** (490-6650). "Grand Central Station's trademark. The oysters followed by a cold brew are unbeatable anywhere in Manhattan. Great wine selection also."

CHARLIE WALK, COLUMBIA RECORDS

• **Wax** (113 Mercer St., between Spring and Prince streets, 226-6082). "Preferred by many actors and bands for its low-key atmosphere and its ability to stay fully packed through the wee hours. Owner Nur Khan makes his own music tapes and changes the tunes as the crowd changes throughout the night. Open until 6 a.m."

• **Jet Lounge** (286 Spring St., between Varick and Hudson streets, 675-2277). "The sibling to South Miami Beach's popular club, Groove Jet. You'll feel like you're partying in the '70s. Broken mirror pieces plastered to the walls, the music plays all night, and you'll dance to '70s, '80s, and early '90s classics."

• **Pravda** (281 Lafayette St., between Houston and Prince streets, 225-4696). "Cigars, martinis, and caviar. The beautiful crowd. Vodkas from around the world as well as homemade specialty flavors on ice. Reservations required for access."

• **Morgan Bar** (237 Madison Ave., between 37th and 38th streets, 726-7600). "In the basement of the Morgan Hotel; however, you will see no actual bar. The drinks are made behind the scenes in the Kitchen Bar. Couches,

candles, models, and music. George Clooney's home away from home when in New York."

• **Club Macanudo** (26 E. 63rd St., 752-8200). "Owned by General Cigar Co., maker of the Macanudo cigar. Very upscale. A true cigar club featuring light fare and desserts. A nice place to impress a date or smoke a Cuban with a friend." Jacket required. No jeans.

• **Patsy's** (236 W. 56th St., between Broadway and Eighth Avenue, 247-3491). "It's where Rush Limbaugh and Scott Shannon eat. Make sure to ask for Frankie or Joey—tell 'em Ellis sent you. Sit facing the door and order a nice bowl of pasta or calamari—Sal will make it for you. Can't leave without a double espresso and some tiramisu."

• **Hatsuhana** (17 E. 48th St., between Fifth and Madison avenues, 355-3345). "The best sushi in New York . . . So fresh, the fish is still moving when they bring it to you! Great yellowtail and fatty tuna. Speak Japanese and move to the front of the restaurant!"

• **Hanson's Times Square Brewery** (42nd Street and Seventh Avenue, in the heart of Times Square, 398-1234). "A microbrewery with personal kegs to bring out the best in you. The Mike Preston burger is a particular fave. Sit on the second floor for the best views of people walking by. Note: The women who work outside are *not* employees of the brewery!"

The food is great—especially the catfish fingers, grilled chicken, and macaroni and cheese, [which is] the best in the country." (Also a recommendation of Jive's Larry Kahn.)

• **Chaz & Wilson's** (201 W. 79th St. and Amsterdam, 769-0100). "Another African-American-owned eatery with a similar vibe. The food is good, especially the Caribbean chicken. They make great calamari and mashed potatoes. And they make the best cosmopolitans in Manhattan."

• **Blue Ribbon Sushi** (119 Sullivan St., between Prince and Spring streets, 343-0404). "A seafood hangout renowned for its raw bar and table mini-grills, where you can cook your own appetizers and entrees." (Music Choice's Karr says it has "an . . . amazing raw bar, eclectic cuisine.")

• **River Café** (1 Water St., Brooklyn, 718-522-5200). "Delicious food, romantic decor, and secluded, with a beautiful view of Manhattan. Continental cuisine. It's pricey but worth the atmosphere. It's a great place to chill out, and it's easy to get to."

WHAT TO LISTEN TO

New York's Radio Market Is More Volatile Than Ever

How influential is Airplay Monitor at the radio level? Let's put it this way: For the last year, knowing that we'd be having our convention in New York for a third straight year, we've been pressuring New York radio stations to change format so that you'd have something new to listen to, and we'd have something different to write about. And damn near all of them obliged.

The hardest part was getting that pesky Telecommunications Bill passed. That one dragged on forever. Then there was talking all our Wall Street friends into capitalizing station sales at 16-times cash flow. We were in so many meetings that we didn't have time to make airchecks on stations before they changed again. But as the *deus ex machina* of the industry, we felt that we owed you no less. (In fact, we feel that owners owe the banks no less than \$163 million per signal, but that's another story.)

If you were last in New York for the '95 Billboard/Airplay Monitor Radio Seminar and Awards, you heard WXRK playing classic rock (when Howard Stern wasn't on), WPAT-FM playing soft AC, WSKQ-FM doing a bilingual dance format, WHTZ (Z100) on the verge of being a modern station, WYNY playing country, WNEW-FM as an adult modern outlet, WAXQ (Q104) playing hard rock, WBLS doing gold-based adult R&B, and WMXV sounding like a mainstream AC. If you wanted to hear any of those things again, we hope you made airchecks, although WPXY/WVOR Rochester, N.Y., OM Clarke Ingram could probably cover you on that score.

Depending on what you consider a format change, there have been up to nine on New York's music FMs since last year's convention. If you were able to hear Long Island radio—which you won't from the New York Sheraton—you'd also be able to hear WMJC spinning country, WLIR playing modern AC under its old call letters, and WBLI evolving from mainstream AC back toward top 40. Whether you can hear several other suburban outlets of note, including much-respected young-end rocker WRGX (X107) Westchester County, N.Y., and heritage rocker WDHA Morristown, N.J., depends which side of the high-rise you're on and what the atmospheric conditions are Sept. 5-7.

Here's the '96 airchecker's guide to New York:

WXRK (92.3)—WXRK signed on as New York's first full-fledged modern rock station last January, at a time when neither Z100 nor WNEW-FM had vacated the position, so it offered a diet of what one co-worker calls "pure testosterone"—all the hard rock, none of the triple-A crossovers. WXRK is now playing Sheryl Crow, the Dave Matthews Band, and the Wallflowers. But it's also playing Gravity Kills, Rage Against The Machine, Stabbing Westward, and "You Make Me Feel Like A Whore" by Everclear. And it has those records to itself. New PD Steve Kingston isn't expected in the building until November, but the jock lineup has been in place for the past few months, including Airplay Monitor's John Loscalzo on weekends.

WPAT-FM (93.1)—Another first-quarter format change. WPAT-FM segued from English-language soft AC to Spanish-language soft AC as Suave 93.1 under its new duopoly partner, WSKQ-FM. With WSKQ-FM having segued from Spanish AC to salsa several years earlier, WPAT-FM debuted as a more focused version of what the old WSKQ-FM had been in the late '80s/early '90s. It signed on with a lot of English-language music, including a surprising number of R&B oldies (e.g., "Reasons" by Earth, Wind & Fire and "I Want You" by Marvin Gaye). You'll still hear some English-language titles, such as "How Deep Is Your Love" by Take That, as well as the Spanish versions of familiar jingles—"Siempre Coca-Cola!"

WPLJ (95.5)—One of the few stations with the same format as last year, WPLJ has still been affected by the world around it. At this time a year ago,

WPLJ could be the disco station for the market, the mainstream top 40, the classic rocker, the '70s oldies station, the personality station, and, oh yeah, the adult top 40 station. Now, it grapples

with WKTU for ownership of "I Will Survive," and, with WAXQ having gone classic rock, it's no longer the only place to hear "Landslide" by Fleetwood Mac. WPLJ has made one significant programming change since last year. It's traded the '70s/80s show for night hosts Danny and Onions, who join Rocky Allen and Scott and Todd in the station's pantheon of high-profile personalities. Otherwise, it hasn't conceded the classic rock thing to Q104, as evidenced by a top-of-the-hour ID about its 25 years of rockin' New York. And APD/MD Mike Preston has helped revive more than one rock title over the past year, including Peter Gabriel's "Solsbury Hill" and the Monroes' "What Do All The People Know?"

WQHT (97.1)—This isn't Beijing, but you can still tell a lot by reading the wall posters. For years, Hot 97's chief positioner was "Where Hip-Hop Lives." This year's subway cards, however, promise "Hip Hop & R&B Flava," which says a lot about how the station has evolved over the past year. With no other mainstream R&B outlet in town, Hot 97's music is much more female-friendly these days, although the presentation and the lineup has stayed constant, including p.m. driver Wendy Williams, who can sometimes match morning hosts Doctor Dre and Ed Lover for outrageousness. Labor Day weekend on Hot 97 was one of the station's Mixmaster Weekends starring veteran mixers Red Alert, Funkmaster Flex, Marley Marl, Kid Capri, and Pete Rock. At press time, an all-star weekend with Montell Jordan, Horace Brown, Outkast, and Blackstreet was



scheduled either for this weekend or next.

WSKQ-FM (97.9)—During the six months in which the new WKTU was just a rumor, WSKQ-FM tried to reinforce its position as the market's dance station with bilingual transit cards and a number of English-language dance titles. WSKQ-FM was one of the stations that declined most noticeably when WKTU debuted, although it's hard to tell which listeners went to WKTU and which went to WPAT-FM. Now, it's apparently ceded the English-language music in favor of more salsa and merengue, under new PD Al Fuentes from WXDJ Miami.

WRKS (98.7)—A year ago, Isaac Hayes was just one of this R&B adult outlet's celebrity voices. Now, he's the station's celebrity morning man, joining a roster that includes Roberta Flack, Ashford & Simpson, and motivational speaker Les Brown, who will now host a mix of music and motivation from 9-10 a.m. Musically,

WRKS has evolved in the past 15 months. The oldest gold—a heavy part of the station's early success—now gets showcased in special programming, while the '80s adult R&B titles receive a heavier emphasis.

WHTZ (100.3)—It took Z100 almost two years to evolve from mainstream top 40 to the cusp of modern rock. The return under new PD Tom Poleman has taken three to four months. The hardest

modern stuff is gone. Tom Petty and John Mellencamp are back. Rhythmic titles are back, too, on a case-by-case basis, most

noticeably the Quad City DJ's and Billie Ray Martin. At this writing, you can still hear Z100 going from Nirvana's "All Apologies" to STP's "Creep" at night, but that may change. You'll also hear an all-new staff, including Elvis Duran, Elliot Segal, and Christine Nagy in the morning; Lisa Taylor from WYNY in middays; and MD Paul Bryant in afternoons.

WCBS-FM (101.1)—The station celebrates its 25th anniversary next year, so it's taking this year off from its highly publicized New York radio reunions. But you will hear Dandy Dan Daniels (also from WYNY) as the latest market veteran doing P/T on the station, which is planning a double-play weekend for your listening pleasure during this seminar. It's also planning to add an R&B oldies show from 10 p.m.-midnight on Wednesdays in the near future. (If you can't wait, there's another cult favorite, Felix Hernandez's Saturday-morning R&B oldies show on noncommercial WBGO [88.3].)



WQCD (101.9)—This was one of the first "smooth jazz" stations to demonstrate that a jazz station could also double as a market's adult R&B outlet in the days before WRKS became the first of New York's two urban ACs. It was also one of the first smooth jazz stations to

present itself like a soft AC. The station is in a state of transition, with PD Fleetwood Gruver having exited recently, but the speculation is that CDI101.9 will go further toward the soft AC side.

WNEW-FM (102.7)—This station has been through three discernable positions since last year's seminar. The short-lived "rock alternative" adult modern format gave way to triple-A, which, as the amount of classic rock in the mix increased, evolved back to the heritage rock position that WNEW-FM had occupied for the better part of the last decade or so. New PD Steve Young has returned Soundgarden and Metallica to WNEW-FM, but with Q104 in town, there's still plenty of "You're My Best Friend" and "Born In The U.S.A." on the

station, too, as well as such acts as Pete Drogue or the Why Store that would have fit in just fine during the triple-A period. One noticeable change in recent weeks is that WNEW-FM, once a famously talky radio station, is getting in and out of music much faster.

WKTU (103.5)—This station may have filled an obvious musical hole by launching its dance format last February, but it also went after WPLJ's high-profile personality franchise. RuPaul, Freddie Colon, and Michelle Visage may host mornings, but Efren Sifuentes, Bill Lee, Hollywood Hamilton, and Diane Pryor all do morning shows, with a lot of phones, in their respective dayparts. Musically, whether WKTU has expanded since its gold-and recurrent-heavy sign-on depends on whether you look at the number of oldies that are still getting 10 plays a week or whether you consider that PD Frankie Blue and MD Andy Shane added both "I Love U Baby" by the Original and "Ooh, Aah . . . Just A Little Bit" by Gina G as imports. Also, after a brief stretch in which WKTU seemed to be downplaying R&B crossovers, there's more Toni Braxton and R. Kelly on the station again.

WAXQ (104.3)—At times, the new Classic Q104.3 crunches as hard as any classic rocker. At times, it seems to be targeting the folks who might have been using WPLJ as their classic rock station with a lot of "Evil Woman" by

ELO and "Romeo's Tune" by Steve Forbert. While Q104.3 is often Arrow-esque in its music, it's more high-profile in its presentation than the original Arrow stations, even talking over intros.

WMXV (105.1)—When PD Steve Weed got to Mix 105 last year, he took it out of WPLJ's way and made it a softer, more traditional mainstream AC. Then the fall test that shook the world came back, and WMXV began leaning so hard on some of the pop/modern crossovers that it outranked WPLJ at times. Then WKTU came along to drain off a lot of adult listening just as Mix's musical changes were beginning to take hold. As a result, WMXV, which has been without a full-scale morning show since Jim Kerr's departure, has become the market's most-gossiped-about radio station. Then again, it's been written off a lot of times in the past before sneaking back into contention.



WNWK (105.9)—A brokered ethnic outlet for years, WNWK becomes New York's reggae FM in morning drive and 6 p.m.-1 a.m. with Ken Williams, Dub Master, and market veteran Gil Bailey. The station has also added an 8-9 a.m. "world music" show.

WLTW (106.7)—New PD Jim Ryan, who made WBEB (B101) Philadelphia noticeably more



aggressive during his time there, will get to New York just about the time you read this. Over the past 15-18 months under PD Kurt Johnson, now at WAXQ, there have been a lot of surprises on Lite-FM, including the addition of contesting, special weekends (this one will feature the Beatles to go with the band's new video anthology), and a nightly love songs show.



WBLS (107.5)—At this time a year ago, WBLS was trying to reclaim the gold-based R&B adult position from WRKS, with no apparent success. When PD/p.m. driver Frankie Crocker began his third highly publicized tour of duty last fall, he took WBLS in a decidedly more eclectic direction but didn't take it out of the adult R&B bag. At this writing, you'll still hear a lot of oldies on WBLS—as I write, WBLS' Grandmaster Flash is mixing from "Nobody Can Be You" by Steve Arrington to "I Owe You One" by Shalamar—although you'll also hear imports, such as the two cuts from British R&B hit maker Mark Morrison that Crocker has been playing with for the past few months.

The Most-Played Oldie Is A Current, Too

One of the identifying signs of the monitored-airplay era is that when you put together a list of the most-played gold at top 40 and adult radio, the distinction between oldies, currents, and recurrents is heavily blurred. Nothing better demonstrates that than the success of Blues Traveler's "Run-Around."

In late August, when we compiled these lists of top 40 and adult radio's most-played oldies in honor of the Billboard/Airplay Monitor Radio Seminar and Awards, "Run-Around" was clinging to our adult top 40 chart in its 66th week! But, using records that peaked before Dec. 31, 1995, as our arbitrary dividing line between gold and recurrent, the song also qualified as the most-played oldie on our combined panel of AC and adult top 40 stations, according to Broadcast Data Systems. "Run-Around" didn't do as bad at top 40 radio, where it made the top five on a combined survey of rhythmic and mainstream top 40 stations.

Another hallmark of the monitored-airplay era is that titles are more enduring in their chart afterlife than their peak position would have led one to expect. Fun Factory's "I Wanna B With U," Montell Jordan's "This Is How We Do It," and Diana King's "Shy Guy" are all songs that mainstream top 40 resisted at their peak but remain important in recurrent/gold categories.




