
L. A. Gets 1st West Coast heater TV

TV Keeps 'Em **Close to Home** In Milwaukee

Telephone Survey Shows 10% Boost Since 1942 Poll

MILWAUKEE, Dec. 23.—Is tele-vision actually keeping more peo-ple at home than ever before? A survey, which top WTMJ-TV executive Waiter Danim claims is the first of its kind in the indus-ity, answers this question with a positive "yes".

Milwaukee study is based on percentage of attempted phone calls against completed phone calls arrived at in stuff check made in pre-TV days, compared with calls made inday, when 49, per cent of families here are set owners.

Calls were made over a two-week period to 26,396 homes se-lected at random fram the tele-phone directory. A five-day week-

pinois directory A five-day week-pinois in November, 1950, resulted in 82.7 per cent "at home" calls. Previous check in May, 1942, prior to impact of television in Mil-waukée, found only 71.3 per cent "at home" during the same hours "Percentage-wise, the number of completed calls were greater at night, tho the blaggest gain in stay-at-homers was picked up during the afternoon hours when video shows were being aired.

shows were being aired. Biggest single evening gain in "at home" calls was Monday eve-hings. A similar study showing same general results was made in January of 1950 and was bused on 37,370 calls. At that time 23.4 per cent of all Milwakee families owned television receivers.

They point out that a new com-mission ratio from ½ to 50 per cent downward (½ on new equip-ment, 50 per cent on old) would auit them fine, but when they ex-plain to locations that increased cost of doing business requires lower commissions, the reaction is "that's too bad, but it's your prob-lem!" lem!" In other words, the location owners just don't feel any sym-pathy for the ops, and there isn't any difference by types of loca-tion, transient, office, institutional, school or industrial—they all have the same answer, "lower the rate on somebody else, not nue."
