


THE FIRST WORD

We have been quite impressed with the direction **Rolling Stone** has taken lately. Some of the things we've liked: the lead review of **Big Country**, the issue on the English scene (surprisingly thorough) and the headline of the **Mick Jagger** story: "He's Hot, He's Sexy and He's Alive." That brings them full circle from the **Jim Morrison** cover story, which was the low point. If this keeps up, they might just become musically vital again.

Congratulations to Michael Plen on his move up to Vice President/Promotion at I.R.S. Records.

RECORD NEWS: As announced by **Todd Rundgren** at CMJ's Music Marathon '83, the next **Utopia** album will be released independently through JEM. No release date has been set . . . JEM will issue a **Johnny Thunders** EP on December 9 on PVC called **Diar, Of A Lover**. Four tracks will be pulled from the French LP **In Cold Blood** plus a remix of "Green Onions" and one new track, "Endless Party" . . . Geffen has signed **Tom Robinson** . . . MCA has signed the British pop group **End Games** . . . The **Wang Chung** LP **Points On The Curve** should finally show up in January. Also look for a new **Madness** LP late that month and a **Berlin** LP in February, all from Geffen . . . Sire has signed the **Smiths** . . . Look for a promotional 12" from **Prince** featuring "Irresistible Bitch," a new track which will also be the B-Side of the new single "Let's Pretend We're Married" . . . The U.S. release of **Kraftwerk's** "Tour De France," which should finally be out by the end of the month, will be a new mix. Both French and German versions will be included. Also coming soon from the Warner Bros.: a new **Van Halen** (12/27), the U.S. release of **Speclmen's Batastrophe** (1/11), **Chliña Crisis** (expect the single "Fire And Steel" shortly, the LP in January), the **Pretenders** LP **Learning To Crawl** (January) . . . **Sammy Hagar** and **Neil Schon** are doing 8 concerts together in California with all new material. They will be recorded for an LP on Geffen and videotaped as well . . . Don't miss **Big Country** on **Saturday Night Live** December 3 . . . Look for **Juluka** on **Late Night With David Letterman** on 11/22 . . . **ABC's** video "That Was Then, But This Is Now" will premiere on MTV 11/19. The LP **Beauty Stab** should appear by the end of the month . . . Look out for the release (not yet definitely scheduled) of a **Jah Wobble/The Edge/Holgar Czukay** project on Island or Mango. It's hot.

JACKPOT! SINGLES, TRACKS, ETC.

★ **EMMYLOU HARRIS** "On The Radio" (LP cut) (Warner Bros., 3300 Warner Blvd., Burbank, CA 91510)—An absolutely achingly beautiful rendition of the Donna Summer hit done this time as a heartbreaking ballad—a treatment you never believed could work until you hear it. Harris's voice is just perfect—sweetly crying out through the pain. A remarkable track from the fine **White Shoes** LP.

★ **GIRLS CAN'T HELP IT** "Rhythm Of Jungle" (EP cut) (Warner Bros., 3300 Warner Blvd., Burbank, CA 91510)—A new version of The Quick's dance hit, produced by The Quick Organization, "Rhythm Of The Jungle" has the makings of a dance classic. The hooks and vocal interplay are terrific, bringing instant familiarity, and a powerful rhythm track carries it along. A sure shot for clubs, and nice for new music and CHR radio stations.

LITTLE STEVEN AND THE DISCIPLES OF SOUL "Solidarity" (12") (EMI, 6920 Sunset Blvd., Hollywood, CA 90028)—A startlingly effective change of pace for Little Steven—a reggae/rock song. Steven's slightly nasal mumblings work perfectly in this setting, giving extra feeling to a terrific lyric. The instrumentation is tight and authentic. Surprising and pleasing.

JUMP 'N THE SADDLE BAND "The Curly Shuffle" (45) (Jump 'N The Saddle Band, P.O. Box 312, Highwood, IL 60040)—A joyous tribute to everyone's favorite Stoooge, replete with Woo-woo-woo-woos. One of the funniest singles of the year. Boogie till you flip.

BILLY IDOL "Rebel Yell" (12") (Chrysalis, 115 East 57th St., New York, NY 10022)—Billy takes the "Ready Steady Go"/"Dancing With Myself"/"White Wedding" formula to its logical conclusion: "Rebel Yell," the ultimate archtypal Billy Idol song. It's three-plus minutes of a primal dance beat, jungle atmospherics, Idol's gritty vocals and addictive hooks. Which adds up to a rock radio smash. Again.





Ah-So-Me-Chat

Went down to Negril for a few days (November 3-7) to soak up the tropical sun and to get some spiritual healing. Walked into a record store and came face to face with the **Bunny Wailer** live LP. Yes, I found it, it actually exists—the album was recorded last December 25 at the Youth Consciousness Festival Part 1 at the National Stadium in Kingston. It includes "Blackheart Man," "Amaggedon," "Crucial," "Dance Rock," "Rock 'N' Groove," "Ballroom Floor" and "Toughest." When will it reach the States, you ask? I don't know, yet . . . I caught up with **Jimmy Cliff** while he was filming a video for his song "Reggae Night" from the new CBS album *The Power And The Glory*. For three days Jimmy and Umelight Productions of Los Angeles were shooting on location in Negril. Producer **Simon Fields** is the same man responsible for **Michael Jackson's** video, "Billy Jean." It was fascinating watching the making of a music/reggae video and participating in a dance party scene. I uncovered RAS recording artist **Peter Broggs** (*Rastafari Liveth!*) playing the part of the trumpet player during the party scene. The video should be ready for MTV, clubs and the like momentarily. On hand at the shooting were CBS's **Jack Rovner** and **Debbie Newman**. Jimmy Cliff was as friendly, upful and positive as ever . . . Just before taking off for Jah Mek Ya, I bumped into a copy of **Stephen Davis' Bob Marley** biography. One major difference from **Timothy White's** book released earlier this year is that Davis tells of some similar incidents but without sensationalizing them. Davis has based his research for the book on personal interviews with Marley and his extended family, friends and musicians, as well as on hundreds of documentary items in archives in Jamaica, England and America. The copy I have was published in England by Arthur Barker Limited, 91 Clapham High Street, London, SW4. No word yet regarding an American printing . . . On November 2, Music Of The Heart Productions held a party 'Celebrating The Coronation' at the Studio Stop in Manhattan. **Miley "Dread At The Controls" Campbell** provided the music, videos were shown and Ital refreshments were available. I picked up a flyer there for the Reggae Superjam at the National Stadium in Kingston December 28-30, 1985. Scheduled to appear are **Dennis Brown**, **Steel Pulse** and **Beres Hammond** (Dec. 28), **Black Uhuru**, **Chalice** and **Leroy Sibbles** (Dec. 29) and **Peter Tosh**, **Gregory Isaacs** and the **Skatalites** (Dec. 30). Mind you, I heard no word of this show while I was in Jamaica. But let's say hypothetically this show is really going down, seen? December is when the rates go up due to tourist season and it's pretty expensive to fly to JA. Well, what if I put together some kind of charter from New York with discounted rates that went to Kingston December 23-January 2. Give me a call at the office just so I can get an idea of who would even consider going. What I don't get about this show is that it's not billed as Youth Consciousness Part 2, yet it's being held the same time of year and same place as last year's show. And what of Wintersplash? What is the true story with the concerts in Jamaica, anyway? . . . If you're on the West Coast on November 26, get ready for the third annual all day reggae festival. From noon till midnight there'll be local bands, crafts booths, food and plenty of music at the Santa Monica Civic Auditorium. **Black Uhuru** headlines the bill, being promoted by Adventurous Attractions in LA. Last year's festival attracted 5,000 people. At this time there's no more bands confirmed, but rumors about **Pablo Moses** as well as the **Ital**s are in the air . . . Dates for the December/early January **Pablo Moses** tour are being handled in the US by Variety Artists out of Minneapolis and L.A. Cities set, so far, are Chicago, Detroit and New York. Dates and more info soon come . . . The LA-based magazine, *The Reggae & African Beat*, is now full-color and available by subscription. If you can, subscribe. If you can't, please help them find a distribution point near you so that you can pick up *The Beat* each month. Contact C.C. Smith, Editor and Minister of Information at Bongo Productions, P.O. Box 29820, Los Angeles, CA 90029. Give thanks for one of the most thorough, comprehensive, dependable reggae publications in the US . . . The *Melody Makers* album on EMI Records is due out in March . . . *Musical Youth's* second album for MCA has been described as an eclectic record. It includes songs by **Boy George** and **Stevie Wonder**. The single, "She's Trouble" will be out soon. It was originally written for **Michael Jackson**, and he in turn passed it on to *Musical Youth* . . . The new album from **Manfred Mann's Earthband**, *Somewhere In Africa*, includes a cover of Bob Marley's "Redemption Song" . . . **Little Steven And The Disciples Of Soul** have released a 12" reggae 45 "Solidarity" on EMI America. Quite a departure from his usual rock 'n roll—check it . . . New releases from VP Records include the *Meditations* 12" single "Sit Down And Reason" b/w **Lee Van Cleef's** "Jam It Tonight" (Jah Guidance), a **Yellowman** 12" of "My Rosie" b/w **Ronnie Davis' "Want To Be Love"** (Reggae Sound), **Robert French's** 12" of "Pumpee Sweetie" b/w **Ronnie Davis' "Love"** (Reggae Sound). **Barry Biggs'** album *Coming Down With Love* (Lightning) includes his hit "Love Comes Down." If you haven't gotten these records, check with Chris at (212) 291-7058 or write to: 170-21 Jamaica Avenue, Queens, NY 11432 . . . I was very disappointed to learn that November isn't mango season in Jamaica . . . Irie . . .

Whatever you do, make sure your best material is at the beginning of the tape. And if you have the chance, customize your tape to fit the radio station you're sending it to. Most important of all is practice. If you don't have access to a studio to practice in, do it at home. I got a phone call the other day from a high school kid who hooked up two turntables, a mike and a tape machine to a cassette deck at home and makes demo tapes all the time. He has the right idea, because after all--the only way to learn this business is by doing it. And there's some "air personality consultation" that you don't have to pay someone in New England for.

It really is unfortunate that the Scottish band APB hasn't been signed to an American deal. Maybe after their current U.S. Tour some major label might take notice of this fine band...Several new records have excited us here at WFNX starting locally with Boston's own NOVEMBER GROUP. I attended the Music Marathon in New York City last week. It was very interesting, for the most part, although I was a little disappointed with a few of the discussions: It seemed as though some of the guests were very cautious with their comments, especially those that were made at the panels concerned in particular with the future of radio and radio programming. However several things were discussed that sparked my interest; not the least of which were those ideas spoken about the "Evolution of Contemporary Music Radio" panel. It was said that programmers (in particular, but not exclusively) in commercial radio today are ignoring the very factors that got them where they are in the first place. That is, the creativity, intuition and motivation that guided them and made them stand out in the eyes of others have been bypassed in favor of a more cautious attitude toward programming; letting the market dictate entirely what is listenable to (and therefore suitable for airplay) rather than helping to create the demand (and therefore a market) for the music. Judging by the questions which followed the panel, it seemed to me as though most of the college radio personnel in the audience found the comments discouraging; I, however, found them inspiring. Let us not forget, after all, that we are the future of radio, and although it was said time and time again that radio is radio and music is something else entirely, and that the bottom line is points, points, points. I will never believe that creativity cannot exist concurrently with profitability in a viable format. While we're on the subject, let's talk about "New Music." I've got a crusade going for some basically neglected artists: WAS (NOT WAS)'s "Out Come The Freaks" with lyrics like "She don't even care/If he ain't got no hair/She says: Long as he signs the check/I figure what the heck/I'll get him a toupee..." How can they miss? Positively noteworthy: SIMON TOWNSHEND'S "I'm the Answer"; YES' new one "Owner Of A Lonely Heart"; BLANCMANGE'S "Blind Vision" and WAS (NOT WAS)'s "The Party Broke Up." Locally some great talent coming out of the metro Philadelphia area these days... Check out THE NUMBERS new EP Five Numbers... I got a chance to see the U2 video "Live At Red Rocks" at the CMI Convention and all I can say is that I was overwhelmed by the intense performance and superior production. I don't know about anyone else, but I found it too much of an intensely personal experience to want to get up and make merry... Something about their final "Two Hearts Beat As One" answered a whole lot of questions for me.







U2 Under A Blood Red Sky (EP) (Island, 444 Madison Ave., New York, NY 10022)—Great live records (a great recording of a great performance of great material which does more than simply reiterate the studio versions) are rare indeed—you could probably count them on both hands. Add this one to your list. It captures the musical and emotional excitement of the last tour, brilliantly showcasing Bono's ability to captivate an audience; as a live vocalist and performer he certainly ranks among the best. *Under A Blood Red Sky* features versions of six previously released tracks ("Sunday Bloody Sunday" and "Gloria" stand out) plus two never before released in America: "11 O'Clock Tick Tock" and "Party Girl." An outstanding collection.

THREE O'CLOCK Sixteen Tambourines (Frontier, Box 22, Sun Valley, CA 91352)—The Three O'Clock has moved, ever so slightly, away from the psychedelic revival they emerged from into a more pop-oriented sound. There are shades in the music of pop bands from Shoes back to the early Bee Gees—they even cover "In My Own Time," an early Gibb track. It's a neat combination, fitting easily into college, new music, rock and CHR radio, and ripe for a major label pickup. A truly likable record. Top cuts: "Tomorrow," "A Day In Erotica," "Jet Fighter."

BOB DYLAN Infidels (Columbia, 51 West 52nd St., New York, NY 10019)—"Freedom's just around the corner for you/But with truth so far off what good will it do?" Bob Dylan has always searched for that profound freedom and that profound truth—no matter what type of transient bent he was going through at any given time. Leaving his "reborn" days behind, Dylan delivers his finest recorded work since *Blood On The Tracks*. With a stellar back-up unit (Sly & Robbie, Mick Taylor, Mark Knopfler, and Alan Clark) the music is crystal clear and Dylan's voice hasn't sounded this bitterly sweet in nearly a decade. The ballads, as usual, stand out, especially "Jokerman" and "Sweetheart Like You." There's two classic Dylan shuffles: "Man Of Peace" has a musical similarity to "Maggie's Farm," with the lyrical bite of a barracuda; and "Don't Fall Apart On Me Tonight" is the Dylanesque love plea at its finest with harmonica overflowing to the brim. Also try the rocker "Neighborhood Bully." It's called *Infidels*, but Dylan has once again made believers of us. Nothing less than superb.

PAUL SIMON Hearts And Bones (Warner Bros., 3300 Warner Blvd., Burbank, CA 91510)—Paul Simon has, very quietly, re-carved out his very own niche in pop music. For the first time since the sixties, his sound has evolved to the point where nobody else sounds like him. It's a beautiful blend of pop, rock and jazz which challenges but also has enormous mainstream appeal. Simon's songwriting is stronger now than in years—intensely personal while at the same time universal. "The Late Great Johnny Ace" is a loving tribute to John Lennon, perhaps the best so far. The title cut, while probably holding a deeply private meaning for Simon, cuts squarely into everyone's feelings about love. Also give a listen to "Song About The Moon" and "Think Too Much (a)" (featuring Nile Rodgers and Bernard Edwards).

RAIN PARADE Emergency Third Rail Power Trip (Enigma, P.O. Box 2896, Torrance, CA 90509)—Atmospheric psychedelic sixties pop which sounds a bit like the Byrds at their strangest. The production is striking, helping to capture the spirit of times gone by yet with a clean, contemporary feel. They've written some nifty tunes, too, with "I Look Around," "Saturday's Asylum" and "Talking In My Sleep" the standouts.

ROLLING STONES Undercover (Rolling Stones, c/o Atlantic, 75 Rockefeller Plaza, New York, NY 10019)—*Undercover* is the sleaziest and roughest Stones LP since *Exile On Main Street*—the kind of down and dirty rock 'n' roll they haven't made in years. "Undercover Of The Night" and "Too Much Blood" show the band close to street level R&B, a change from the disco/pop infused hits of their last few LPs. What's most remarkable is that after over two decades they will probably still top the charts—this record deserves to. Top cuts: those mentioned, plus "She's Hot," "It Must Be Hell" and "Wanna Hold You."

REGRESSIVE AID Effects On Exposed People (Rhesus, 383 Lawrenceville Road, Lawrenceville, NJ 08638)—Intense hard dance music featuring propulsive rhythms and harsh, exciting guitar work. Yes, there's more to New Jersey than the Bongos. Top cuts: "Abominable," "Slack Ave."

STANLEY CLARKE/GEORGE DUKE The Clarke/Duke Project II (Epic, 51 West 52nd St., New York, NY 10019)—The second duet recording by Stanley Clarke (bassist) and George Duke (keyboardist) is, like the first, not a jazz effort but an LP chock full of funky pop. The interplay cooks, and with nice back-up percussion they get the chance to shine as they hardly can on their own. And, of course, you can dance to it. Top cuts: "Great Danes," "Every Reason To Smile," "Heroes."

PHIL 'N' THE BLANKS Head Screwed On (EP) (Pink, 1342 West Newport, Chicago, IL 60657)—A slight change in direction for these college radio faves—Phil has moved more into keyboard land, giving the band a more lush, European feel which nicely complements their quirky pop roots. It doesn't contain anything quite as charming or funny as their early tunes, but it's a solid record, nonetheless, and a bit more danceable. Top cuts: "Dance Dance," "Head Screwed On," "You Look Like Someone."

KATE BUSH Kate Bush (EMI, 6920 Sunset Blvd., Hollywood, CA 90028)—The re-service of this 5-song mini compilation LP in conjunction with a cross-country college-radio video presentation of Kate Bush "Live At The Hammersmith Odeon" is certainly reason for celebration. It's almost criminal that international superstar Bush can barely get a tumble in America—her grand panache jousts with her characteristic angelic vocals to become a solo rock and roll extravaganza. Too quirky for American ears some may say. We say open your ears and hear a talent of monumental proportions. Favorites: "James And The Cold Gun" (live version), "Babooshka" (Jackpot! pick in NMR #19) and "Sat In Your Lap".
