

Prince Revives The Revolution For New Album

The Artist Formerly Known As Prince will release a new album with his former backing group The Revolution, according to a post on his official Love 4 One Another Web site (www.love4oneanother.com), marking the first time the Purple One will record with the groundbreaking pop outfit since 1986's *Parade*. The new album, with the working title of *Roadhouse Garden*, will be released on the Artist's own NPG label and will include new tracks as well as some material from "things left unfinished when the band broke up in the Eighties." The post said that The Artist has offered to let his former collaborators Wendy and Lisa handle co-production duties for the album. "Eye am approaching this like a new record, as tho the band never split because in spirit, eye doubt we ever did," the Artist cryptically explains in the statement. The album is expected to credit Prince And The Revolution, marking the The Artist's return to that moniker. No release date has been announced for the album.

Dead Kennedys Battle With Alternative Tentacles

The long-defunct Dead Kennedys have announced that they have terminated their business relationship with Alternative Tentacles Records, but the label maintains that it will continue to carry all Dead Kennedys titles. In a statement, the Kennedys said that three of the four band members — East Bay Ray, Klaus Flouride and D.H. Placebo Ready To Break In States With Sophomore Album On Virgin


Placebo's image in its hometown of London is all about sex, drugs and the rock 'n' roll. "[The U.K. press writes about us using] 50 prostitutes a night each, 16 grams of cocaine; but [we're] far from it!" bassist Stefan Olsdal says. "We do more interviews than we do boozing!" All those interviews (with *Rolling Stone*, *Spin*, *Alternative Press* and others) demonstrate the early excitement about the band's forthcoming sophomore album (its debut for Virgin Records), *Without You I'm Nothing*. The band's 1996 U.K. smash hit "Nancy Boy" put them in good company, and the band has since played at David Bowie's 50th birthday

bash and opened for U2. Still, the band's 1996 self-titled debut album, released on Caroline Records in the U.S., didn't spark as much interest in the States as it did abroad.

Now Placebo is committed to making an impact in America as well. "With this album, we wanted to make sure we had a better chance of breaking in the States,"



JON SPENCER BLUES EXPLOSION

Acme (Matador-Capitol)

The Jon Spencer Blues Explosion may be the one band able to find the common ground between the raunchy R&B of Andre Williams, the lo-fi delta blooze of R.L. Burnside, the cataclysmic noisecore of early Sonic Youth, and the urban soundclash of the Beastie Boys. Which is precisely why the New York City trio's uncharacteristically traditional turn to straight-faced barstool rock on *Acme* is such a pleasant surprise, especially when the album serves as the follow-up to 1996's gristly, raw, *Now I Got Worry*. The band's hip-hop swagger, punked-out blues riffs and pompadour funk are all still present, but the dirty fuzz has been cleaned up just enough to expose the group's cock rockin' roots in old school AOR, and to allow guest producers The Automator, Alec Empire, Steve Albini and Calvin Johnson to live out their Sun Studio fantasies. *Acme* could very well be Jon Spencer's personal atonement to the Rolling Stones for his defacing of *Exile On Main Street* when Pussy Galore covered the album in its entirety back in the '80s. — Ron Hart

Electro-Shock Blues (DreamWorks)

Take songwriter Mark Everett's (a.k.a. "E") vocals away from *Electro-Shock Blues* and you still have an interesting pop record — a hodgepodge of operatic backing vocals, banjo, strings, jazzy horns, organs and noisy samples. But *with* the vocals, the album is a brutally honest therapy session. Even for a band responsible for a debut album with a hit entitled "Novocaine For The Soul," the depth of emotions found on *Electro-Shock Blues* is startling, exploring issues surrounding the suicide, mental illness and cancer that E recently endured with friends and family. Despite the heavy subject matter, the album's groovy rhythms and catchy choruses ensure that it never sounds maudlin (although E's recreation of his sister's final moments on "Elizabeth On The Bathroom Floor" is appropriately stark and fragile). On the closing track, "P.S. You Rock My World," E proclaims "I was thinkin' 'bout how everyone is dying/And maybe it's time to live," an indication that his recovery has already begun. Luckily for us, *Electro-Shock Blues* captured his pain while it was potent. The result is gut-wrenching and yet somehow hummable. — Wendy Mitchell

FATBOY SLIM

You've Come A Long Way, Baby (Astralwerks)

It took an aging Brit-pop luminary to get kids from Brighton to Brooklyn to break out the cardboard and bone up on their windmills and headspins. Fatboy Slim, one of the many faces of club (and pop) veteran Norman Cook, managed to put the "dance" back into "dance music" in the late-'90s with the chemically imbalanced blend of hip-hop, funk, soul and pulsing house on his 1997 debut, *Better Living Through Chemistry*. *You've Come A Long Way, Baby* is an 11-song manifesto of super disco breakin' beats that owes as much to electro-funk pioneer Afrika Bambaataa as it does to house icon Frankie Bones, and it shows how far Cook has come as a maestro of the U.K. big-beat sound. He brings the energy that made "Goin' Out Of My Head" one of the most party-hard anthems of last year to tracks such as "The Rockafeller Skank" and "Soul Surfing," and he studies the repartee of Dr. Dre on "Kalifornia" and "Gangster Tripping." Showing growth both as a DJ and a musician, Fatboy Slim has come a long way indeed, baby. — Ron Hart

Get Here And Stay (Up)

There's something really warm and comforting about *Get Here And Stay*, the second full-length (and first since the band's growth from a duo to a trio) from Seattle's 764-Hero. The comfort zone set up by the record, however, is crafted from elements as cold and uncomfortable as a stainless steel mattress. But, it's the way the band takes those components and intricately arranges them makes 764-Hero's take on Pacific Northwest emo such a striking anomaly. Led by guitarist/vocalist John Atkins, the band pulls cautious, loping melodies out from Atkins's delicately controlled and precise guitar work and James Bertram's bass playing. Vocally, Atkins offers up slack-jawed mewls and coarse cries in his subtle, pop-informed song structures. Polly Johnson provides no-nonsense, militaristic drumming that remains unwaveringly true and out of the spotlight, effectively wrangling the melodies into set boundaries. The result is a collection of songs that sound clean, simple and subtle, but in truth, each is a triumph in craftsmanship, making *Get Here And Stay* an inviting and exquisitely orchestrated album. — Kelso Jacks



FCC No Longer Requires Reports About Minority Hiring

The Federal Communications Commission has announced that it will no longer require radio and television stations to submit reports about minority hiring. Since 1970, the FCC had required broadcasters to file Equal Employment Opportunity reports that demonstrated the actions they were taking in compliance with the FCC's hiring rules regarding women and minorities. The FCC's decision follows the D.C. Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals' denial of the FCC's request to rehear the *Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod vs. FCC* case. In April, the court ruled that the FCC's Equal Employment Opportunity rules violated the equal protection clause of the Constitution's Fifth Amendment. The lawsuit was filed by the Missouri Synod of the Lutheran Church, which the FCC fined after the group used religion as a factor in hiring at two radio stations it owns. The FCC said it would consider new EEO rules in light of the court decision, and it hopes to adopt revised new rules in 1999. FCC Chairman William E. Kennard said, "I am heartened by the fact that many broadcasters have voluntarily agreed to comply with the Commission's EEO rules in the interim and I strongly encourage broadcasters also to continue to file EEO data so that interested parties can monitor industry trends during the short filing hiatus while the Commission considers the adoption of appropriate revised broadcast EEO rules."

Hollywood Records Creates Latin Division

The Buena Vista Music Group, the music division of The Walt Disney Co., has launched Hollywood Records Latin. Hollywood Records Latin will release Latin pop, regional Mexican music and Rock en Espanol to both Latin and mainstream audiences. The new label's roster includes mariachi singer Nydia Rojas, Rock en Espanol act Chris Perez Band and Los Lobos. Hollywood Latin plans to release new albums from each artist in early 1999. Joe Trevino, former Director of

Promotion and Artist Development for Arista Latin, has been appointed Hollywood's Vice President, Latin. Other employees working for the new label are Cameron Randle, Hollywood's Senior VP of A&R, Latin; Renato Lopez, Walt Disney's Director of Music and Records for Latin America; Cary Prince, Director of Media, Latin; Fabiola Patino, Walt Disney's Coordinator of Music and Records for Latin America; Julieta Garcia, Promotion and Marketing Assistant; and Claudia Garcia, A&R Assistant.

Bruce Springsteen Sued For Blocking Release Of Early Demos

Rock legend Bruce Springsteen, recently nominated for Rock 'N' Roll Hall Of Fame induction, is embroiled in a lawsuit with two small New Jersey music companies over *Before The Fame*, a collection of Springsteen's pre-*Greetings From Asbury Park, NJ* material. A lawsuit filed by Michael Esposito, owner of Pony Express Records and its sister company JEC Music Publishing, claims that Springsteen has illegally blocked them from selling the disc of digitally remastered 1972 acoustic demos, which was to be the label's flagship release, by discrediting it as a bootleg. Esposito is seeking \$3.2 million in damages, \$100,000 for each track on *Before The Fame*, as well as for 19 other songs that he intends to release after the legal dispute is settled. Esposito claims to have obtained the rights to these songs from Jim Cretecos, one of Springsteen's early managers. In the U.K., Springsteen has been in a dispute for more than a year with a London-based company that planned to release the same recordings. His trial with Masquerade Music Ltd. has already begun; the dispute about ownership rights is expected to be settled within a few weeks.

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
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Fall Frontman Mark E. Smith Fails To Appear In Court

Mark E. Smith, frontman for the seminal British post-punk group The Fall, failed to appear in Manhattan Criminal Court on September 30 to face misdemeanor assault and harassment charges. Smith was slapped with a third-degree assault charge in April after he allegedly attacked his girlfriend/Fall keyboardist Julie Nagle, at the Quality Hotel Eastside in New York. He was ordered to admit himself into an alcohol treatment program and to see an anger management counselor a week after the incident, and the judge issued a limited protection order for Nagle, which forbid Smith to go near her except for work-related contact. After Smith missed the court date, the presiding judge issued a stayed warrant for his arrest. If he shows up at his next scheduled court date, November 4, the warrant will be dropped. The Fall is said to be preparing for its stint on the Inertia Tour, which will also feature Pere Ubu and the Buzzcocks.

All Saints, Beastie Boys Lead MTV Europe Music Awards Nominations

The MTV Europe Music Awards nominees are again led by British and American acts, with the U.K.'s All Saints and New York's Beastie Boys garnering four nominations each. Madonna, Garbage, Natalie Imbruglia, Eagle-Eye Cherry and Robbie Williams followed with three nominations each. Jenny McCarthy will host the November 12 awards show in Milan, and All Saints, Aqua, Rammstein, Madonna and R.E.M. are scheduled to perform.

The Artist Postpones Tour Dates After Injury

The Artist Formerly Known As Prince has postponed several U.S. tour dates after tripping on stage equipment and pulling a ligament in his foot during a September 26 performance in Atlantic City, New Jersey. The Artist will follow doctor's orders and rest until October 15, and he will then resume his tour with stops in Los Angeles, San Francisco, Cleveland and Detroit. The tour also includes NPG Records labelmates Chaka Khan and Larry Graham.

Flip Records Signs Industrial Band Dope

Flip Records, home to Limp Bizkit, has signed New York industrial metal band Dope, which pays homage to its drug-enhanced lifestyle with its name and lyrics. The five-member band will head into the studio this month to record its debut album, which Flip plans to release early in 1999.

Frank Black has released a new song, "I Want Rock 'N' Roll," for free download on the Internet. The new track is available exclusively at GoodNoise (www.goodnoise.com) in the MP3 format. Black's new album, *Frank Black And The Catholics* (SpinART) is also available online at GoodNoise. The company has also released Reid Paley's debut solo album, *Lucky's Tune*, online (the disc will be in stores in early 1999). Fans of the former frontman

Abel Ferrara Directs Phoids Video

Filmmaker Abel Ferrara, of *Bad Lieutenant* and *King Of New York* fame, has directed his first rock video for the song "Iowa" by the New York City roots rock band the Phoids. The video features Ferrara's typically dark images, such as shady figures and graffiti-stained New York buildings. Ferrara hooked up with the Phoids when band drummer Michael Chambers (also president of the Phoids's label, Ng Records) served as an executive producer for Ferrara's last film, *The Funeral*. Ferrara also said he was inspired by the concept behind the song, a ballad about a man's futile search for utopia.

Radiohead To Play Amnesty International Concert

Radiohead will play its only European date this year on December 10 at a human rights concert at Bercy Stadium in Paris.

Amnesty International and the Body Shop are sponsoring the concert, which celebrates the 50th anniversary of the United Nations' Universal Declaration Of Human Rights. Other acts slated to appear at the show include Alanis Morissette, Peter Gabriel, Tracy Chapman, Asian Dub Foundation and Kassav. Amnesty International is said to be developing plans for a similar concert in the U.S.



Bongwater Box Set Due October 20

On October 20, Shimmy Disc Records will release *Box Of Bongwater: The Complete Bongwater Collection*, a four-CD box set containing all previously released Bongwater material. The collection, totaling 91 tracks, has been digitally remastered by Bongwater's own Kramer. The group started in 1985 as a studio project between Kramer and performance artist/actress Ann Magnuson in 1985.

ARTIST SPOTLIGHT

BOBBY CONN

The 5'1" self-proclaimed prophet of the armageddon is a motivational speaker moonlighting as a rock star. An ex-con who developed something called the Continuous Ca\$h Flow System, Bobby Conn musically disfigures decades of pop and pomp with unchecked egotism, fierce passion and seductive backing by some of the Chicago's finest noise-mongers. Over irreverent porno funk and glammy junk, his buttery vocal histrionics celebrate the "United Nations/Under the rule of Satan" or advise you that "You're never gonna get ahead/Giving head to the Man." In September, the Napoleonic performer unveiled his sophomore album and conceptual masterpiece, Rise Up! (Truckstop-Atavistic; vinyl on Thrill Jockey). You've been warned.

CMJ: You claim to be Christian, Jewish and the Anti-Christ. How does that work?

Bobby Conn: My parents are Jewish. They raised me as a Christian. I didn't find out that they were Jewish until about four years ago. I don't really understand it...So I'm working through *that*. The Anti-Christ thing is more of a numerological thing. It's not 100% sure that I'm the Anti-Christ. I'm *probably* the Anti-Christ. Given that I was born in '67, which is the year that the Anti-Christ is supposed to be born. Which makes you 33 at the armageddon time [year 2000], which is coming up very quickly, I might add. I was also born Friday the 13th, in June. 6.13.67. Those numbers always had a spooky ring to 'em. Given the fact that I'm paranoid and a megalomaniac, it makes me kind of feel like I'm the Anti-Christ. But there are some wrinkles in the whole thing. I thought my first record would be more successful. I went into music to try and gain converts. What I have to do as the Anti-Christ is unite all the governments of the world under the United Nations with me as the head. And also become a false idol that all the people of the world [will] cast aside their faith to worship...This [new] record has been crafted to be very appealing. I'm trying to make music that is gut-wrenching. I don't think I got there with this record. The next record...I wanna make a record that is so shiny, so glossy, that when you open it up and put it on, [smiles] you're gonna vomit. It's gonna be just too much. And that's evil!

Quiz time: *A Dim View Of The Future* sports a track listing by such apocalyptically named bands as **Symphony Of Terror**, **Near Death Experience**, **Skull Flux**, **Confession Of Faith** and **Funeral In Berlin**. Consequently, which genre of music would you suspect this to be compilation cover? If you answered "Gothic," give yourself a point. (Two points if you were specific and said "Gothic, American.") This new release on Hollows Hill Records offers a glimpse into the abyss of these and other new miserable, doomed, black-veiled and pale-skinned stars — and just in time for Halloween!

The 50th release from an eclectic, non-commercial, purely independent label is certainly something to be heralded. Which is exactly why Compost Records has released *Compost 50*, a celebration of its diverse roster. The gathers tracks from **A Forest Mighty Black**, **Move D**, **Fauna Flash** and **Bean Field**, along with contributions from other drum 'n' bass, electro-jazz, downbeat and suitably left-of-center artists.



Rare On Air Volume Four from Santa Monica, California's KCRW, once again shows why the station's morning program, "Morning Becomes Eclectic," is so influential. The disc

makes some of the show's most outstanding, recent live performances available for commercial consumption. The new volume includes tracks from **Radiohead**, **Soul Coughing**, **Ani DiFranco**, **Ozomatli**, **Tom Waits** and 10 others.

With '80s nostalgia all the rage, it only seems inevitable that today's dance music world should crash head-on into the dance music world of 15 years ago. And so, Cleopatra Records brings us *The World's Greatest Club Connection! Remixed Smash Hits*. Sure to fill dancefloors everywhere, the disc features **808 State** remixed by the **Propellerheads**, **Dead Or Alive** remixed by the **Sugar Pumpers**, **Bow Wow Wow** remixed by **Boy Eats Girl** and a handful of other match-ups.

Over a five-day period last summer, the Burlington Music Conference (BMC) showcased bands from the northeastern U.S. and Canada in picturesque Burlington, Vermont. Now, thanks to the people at the BMC, *Good Citizen* magazine and Mezzoman Productions, the sonic highlights of that

event are available on compact disc. *Welcome To Vermont, Now Go Home* features tunes by up-and-comers such as **Dysfunkshun**, the **Rigbys**, **Janus Breed**, **Missing Joe**, **Betty Goo** and others.

With a little more than a tad of angst and a trace of aggression, SRH Records (in cooperation with Interscope) is presenting a new compilation of artists popular with the skater-punk set. *Lose Your Illusion I* boasts tracks by **Buck-O-Nine**, **Pennywise**, **Limp Bizkit**, **Hepcat** and many others.



According to legend, way back in July of 1963, a man named Verrill Keene threw a little soirée called the "Swingers Summit"—and we're talking wife-swappers, not zoot-suited retro music lovers. Apparently, it was quite the lascivious gathering. The sensual jazz sounds responsible for getting partygoers "in the mood" included tunes by the **Rollercoasters**, **Little Joe Washington**, the **Moongooners** and **Bill Lewis**. Del-Fi Records gathers those and other lust artists onto the 15-track *Del-Fi Pool Party*, packaged with an article by a Summit reveler, originally printed that summer in *Gentleman's Folly*.

A scary movie should naturally be accompanied by a soundtrack designed to inspire terror in the hearts of listeners. Thus, the soundtrack to the big-screen feature *Dee Snider's Strangeland*, starring Robert Englund and (of course) Dee Snider, is filled with unreleased tracks by some of rock's more bone-chilling acts. **Marilyn Manson**, **Soulfly**, **Anthrax**, **Bile**, **Pantera** and **Coal Chamber** all appear on this T.V.T. Soundtrax release.



Best-selling author **Deepak Chopra** recruited friends in high places to help him honor 13th century Persian mystic and poet **Rumi**. *A Gift Of Love* includes "music inspired by the love poems of Rumi" plus readings by Chopra, **Madonna**, **Demi Moore**, **Martin Sheen**, **Blythe Danner**, **Jared Harris**, **Debra Winger**, **Rosa Parks** and others. The background music and several instrumental tracks were created by composers **Adam Plack** and **Yaron Fuchs**, working with various vocalists and musicians. The CD is the first release from raSa, the New York-based sister company of Australian Music International.

In addition to singing in hardcore punk outfit **Knowledge**, Nick Traina was one of romance novelist Danielle Steel's nine children. Traina, who had been diagnosed with manic depression, took his own life on September 20, 1997 at the age of 19. The vocalist's mother tells the story in her book, *His Bright Light*, and now, Asian Man Records has released **Knowledge's** final album, *A Gift Before I Go*. Proceeds from the record will benefit the Nick Traina Foundation, which contributes to mental health, music and child-related charities.



As the new millennium rushes towards us, so does the 20th anniversary of the **Legendary Pink Dots'** formation. The mystical electro-pop-meets-psychedelia group keeps plugging away and their presumed latest, *Nemesis Online*, is out now on Soleilmoon Records. This epic work includes 12 new songs, many of them clocking in at over five-minutes.



Guitarist **Gary Lucas** has a legendary past as a former member of **Captain Beefheart And The Magic Band**, and lately, Lucas lent his axe to the work of **Jeff Buckley** and **Joan Osborne**. But his solo guitar work is also worth noting. On *Busy Being Born*, his most recent release for John Zorn's Tzadik Records, he flaunts his gifts by taking on traditional Jewish hymns, psalms and folk songs with a backing featuring Zorn and Jonathan Kane (LaMonte Young's band, ex-Swans).



Following in the footsteps of Shaquille O'Neal and 1985 Super Bowl champs the Chicago Bears ("Super Bowl Shuffle"), yet another American athlete has stepped up to the mic. **Alexi Lalas**, star defender for the Metro Stars major league soccer team, has just released his debut album on CMC International. Lalas, who is one of the most internationally recognized redheads since Lucille Ball, plays guitar and sings on *Ginger*, a full-fledged rock record of original material.

ESD To Release Old, New Works By Wendy Carlos

East Side Digital has signed a deal with composer and electronic musician Wendy Carlos to release her new material and back catalog. Her recently released label debut, *Tales Of Heaven & Hell*, includes "Clockwork Black," a sequel to Carlos's score for Stanley Kubrick's *A Clockwork Orange*. In November, ESD will release the first CD editions of her 1971 ambient album, *Sonic Seasonings*, and her complete *A Clockwork Orange* score. In 1999, ESD plans to issue a box set of Carlos's classical electronic music and reissues of the *Switched-On Bach* titles, as well as *The Well-Tempered Synthesizer*, *By Request*, *Digital Moonscapes*, *Beauty In The Beast* and *Secrets of Synthesis*. Carlos is also working on a new film score.

New Cure Album Recorded At English Estate

The Cure is wrapping up the recording of its upcoming full-length album at St. Catherine's Court in Bath, England, where the band also recorded 1996's *Wild Mood Swings*. The Court, owned by actress Jane Seymour, was a monastery in medieval times and it is also said to be haunted. The as-yet-untitled album is due in spring 1999.

Madonna's MTV Performance Debated By Hindus

Several conservative Hindu groups may have been outraged by Madonna's performance at the MTV Video Music Awards in September, during which she donned Hindu holy markings on her face while wearing a sheer tank top and dancing suggestively. But at least one Hindu spokesman has stepped forward to defend the Material Girl. Spiritual leader and scholar Swami B.V. Tripurari, the Vice President of the World Vaishnava Association, said, "The Hindu community and Eastern spiritual seekers should be happy for Madonna personally in terms of her genuine interest in enlightened life, and grateful to her for her sincere efforts to attract others to the same."



Tibetan Freedom Concert's Lightning Strike Victim Releases Benefit Compilation CD

Lysa Selfon, the 26-year-old law school student who was struck by lightning during June's Tibetan Freedom Concert, says she has been amazed at the outpouring of support since her accident. Anthony Kiedis of the Red Hot Chili Peppers visited her in the hospital, Live donated money for her medical bills, R.E.M. and the Dave Matthews Band sent her gifts, the Beastie Boys invited her backstage after a recent concert, and Erin Potts of the Milarepa Fund (one of the concert's organizers) has kept in close contact with her.

"I'm constantly overwhelmed by how interested and humanitarian people have been throughout this," Selfon says. Selfon has decided to take all this attention and put it to good use — she has founded the Burning Bush Fund, a charity to benefit Washington Hospital Center, the regional adult burn unit where she was treated for her injuries. Selfon's rabbi came up with the charity's name, a reference to the Biblical bush that was burned but not consumed (much like the burn unit's survivors).

The fund, working with Splash Records, has just released a benefit compilation CD, *One Little Corner*, which features 11 eclectic tracks from up-and-coming D.C.-area acts including Tramps Like Us, Tierney Allen, Lisa Williams, Divine Static, Kalahari and Origen. "I thought if I could raise money for the burn unit and help local bands try to get some exposure, it seems like a win-win situation," Selfon says.

Despite her extensive injuries, Selfon reports that she is healing very well and that she is "taking it day by day and trying to enjoy life." When she was hit directly by a bolt of lightning in her seat at RFK Stadium, she went into cardiac arrest and was given CPR by a surgeon and a trauma technician who were standing nearby. Selfon suffered second and third degree burns on 20% of her body, internal burns, a blown eardrum, and a chunk of her hair was also burned off. While most of her burns have healed dramatically, Selfon still suffers from some short-term memory damage, and she also has painful problems with the nerve endings in her arms and legs.

Selfon, who is in her third year of law school at George Washington University and is a co-owner of a paint-your-own pottery store, has found a positive side to her personal tragedy. "It reaffirmed for me the innate goodness in people," she says. "Whether it's a concern for my health or a concern for the burn unit that I started, I am just so thankful and impressed by strangers' ability to just reach out."

The Burning Bush Fund held a record release party for *One Little Corner* on September 28 at Washington, D.C., club The Bayou. The album is available at several D.C.-area record stores, and also at <http://DCSOUNDS.com> or through 800.924.2733. Splash Records has pressed 5,000 copies of the disc and hopes to raise \$35,000 for the Burning Bush Fund.





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


German Band Einstürzende Neubauten Returns With First U.S. Album In Five Years

Pioneering industrial group Einstürzende Neubauten has returned with its seventh proper full-length album, *Ende Neu*, its first stateside release in five years and its debut for Nothing Records. The influential group, which formed in Cold War-era Berlin in 1980, made a name for itself by using sheets of metal, homemade instruments, jackhammers and cement mixers in its performances, which sonically resembled a cross between a riot and an air raid. Like many innovative groups, Neubauten's cacophony of industrial sounds and bombastic, pounding rhythms caught the attention of fans and influenced generations of musicians interested in using industrial or mechanized sounds in their music.

"I hope for two things to happen," singer Blixa Bargeld says of the group's new four-record deal with Nothing. "I hope for affirmation, the acknowledgment of our existence. I hope for a broadening as well, to make [the music] available to a wider audience."

Yet even as audiences have become receptive to rhythm-heavy, electronic-based music, Einstürzende Neubauten has moved closer to a more melodic sound, even using the Brussels Symphony Orchestra string section to great effect on *Ende Neu*. When asked if the group has become more conventional, Bargeld says, "I don't know. For me it is pure interest. Just to broaden my vocabulary. You can't avoid that you learn something. Sometimes I admire the freshness in which I started the whole thing. But you can't deny the fact that I've

learned a lot of things over the process of doing this."

One thing Bargeld learned was how to work as a trio instead of as a quintet. After nearly a decade with the group, Marc Chung and F.M. Einheit both left the band during the recording of *Ende Neu* to pursue other interests. The album's title translates roughly to "new ending," which reflects the band's recently changed lineup. "By the time that we were finishing the record in Belgium, we were only a three piece and at that time it looked to us that we would just start all over again," Bargeld says. "Because when Mufti [Einheit] left we were like, 'OK, let's just forget the whole thing.' A couple of months later we decided that we wanted to finish it."

Committed to the group concept, Neubauten has replaced the departed members with two new ones: Jochem Arbeit and Rudi Moser, both from the German band Die Haut. Already tested on a European tour, Bargeld calls this lineup "probably the best live formation we've ever had." American audiences will be able to judge for themselves when the band hits the U.S. in late November through January. Expect sets to be comprised of work from *Ende Neu* and 1994's *Tabla Raisa*, along with several unrecorded songs and two or three older pieces. No cement mixers will be on hand, yet fans should still be awe-struck by the band's immensely powerful live performances.

The Dead Kennedys founded the independent label in 1983, and the band's fourth member, Jello Biafra, has been the sole owner since 1986. The other three members of the politically charged punk band claimed that the label "was paying Dead Kennedys (without their knowledge or consent) less per CD than the other artists on the label." Biafra, who was out of town for the September 30 meeting planned by his former bandmates, issued a statement that read, "This whole action is a sham: Their motive is sheer greed...With some very wild claims and heavy-handed tactics, the ex-members of the DKs are trying to destroy our label, hurt the other artists and our staff." Biafra explained that all four members of the Kennedys had been in a partnership called Decay Music, which collected artist royalties and made sure all band members were paid properly. Biafra said East Bay Ray has claimed for 10 years that the label underpaid the band's royalties, despite his yearly approval of Alternative Tentacles' accounting procedures. Biafra explained that Ray's allegations are based on the fact that from 1989 to 1997, Dead Kennedys' royalties were based on a suggested retail list price of \$10.98 per CD, the amount agreed upon in 1989. In 1997, Ray asked that the rate be changed to \$13.98, a higher amount than the one used by most independent labels. At that time, Biafra said he offered to recalculate the royalties and reimburse his bandmates for the difference, but they never responded to that offer. This recent battle over royalties, Biafra said, also stems from his refusal to let Levi's Dockers use the Dead Kennedys' song "Holiday In Cambodia" in an advertisement. "In retaliation for my refusal, ex-members of the band are making baseless claims that Alternative Tentacles and myself are deliberately ripping them off. Nothing could be further from the truth," Biafra said. "Through thick and thin, the label has made sure everyone whom we owe money to is paid back every dime — even if it meant paying them out of my own pocket."

a \$2.3 million loss from its recently curtailed U.S. media-buying operation, a fourth-quarter loss of \$1.2 million from soft sales and a decrease in profit margins on sales of its domestic mid-line and budget music products, and \$400,000 of start up costs for K-tel Express. For the fourth quarter, K-tel reported a loss of \$3.1 million on revenues of \$21 million, compared with earnings of \$90,000 on revenues of \$24

million last year. "In fiscal 1999, the company's objective is to continue its focus on developing K-tel Express as a synergistic asset to its music business and related marketing operations," K-tel Chairman/CEO Philip Kives said.

Olsdal says. Virgin also has high hopes for the band. "[Placebo] is a company-wide priority," explains Mike Newman, Virgin's National Manager of College Promotion. "Being on Virgin now, they have a little bit higher profile. Just because the label is bigger [than Caroline], there's more staff behind it to work the record and there's more visibility." The band will headline a November 5 Virgin showcase at the Millennium Hotel's Hudson Theater during CMJ's Music Marathon & MusicFest. Placebo will then play several Christmas shows sponsored by commercial radio stations and embark on other U.S. dates. The band's profile will also increase with the release of *Velvet Goldmine*, the upcoming Todd Haynes glam rock film in which Placebo's members play musicians from that era.

The album's first single, "Pure Morning," has already been picked up by several major commercial stations, pushing Virgin to release the album on November 3, rather than to wait until early 1999. While Newman calls the single "an obvious hit," the rest of the album is edgy enough to capture college radio's attention as well. "It has a really raw sound," Newman says. "I think [frontman] Brian [Molko]'s voice is amazing—it's so intriguing. And his androgynous looks will interest a lot of people."

The album's raw yet glamorous rock reflects the diverse backgrounds of the trio. American-born guitarist/vocalist Brian Molko draws inspiration from PJ Harvey and Sonic Youth, Swedish-born Olsdal grew up with ABBA and later Depeche Mode and English-born drummer Steve Hewitt was force-fed Elton John before discovering Captain Beefheart. Olsdal says *Without You I'm Nothing* shows obvious growth from Placebo's debut album. "We weren't playing as much as a unit as we're doing now. When Steve joined about two years ago, the band really solidified and really took on a new life," he says. "We've branched out musically as well. I think the compositions and the songs on this album are a lot more diverse. They're deeper emotionally and musically more complex."


Despite the increasing buzz about Placebo, Olsdal says he doesn't really find it hard to live up to the expectations. "This is definitely the best live band I've ever been in. It's about us keeping our heads and doing it with a passion, really."

The Big Rip-Off is an online radio show that defines itself as "A Denial Of Genre," subscribing to freeform radio's philosophy that a metal song can just as naturally follow a rap song, followed by a jazz tune, and so on. The show's playlist reads like the hippest college radio station you could imagine, covering everything from electronica to indie-rock to jazz and then some. In addition to having the live two-hour show on Tuesdays 8 p.m.-10 p.m. CT that is The Big Rip-Off, programmers Bill Turner and Philip Crabtree program Rip-Off Radio, a continuous stream of eclectic music (Jazz, Prog Rock, Underground, Funk, etc.) that runs all-day, every day. A random sampling of that playlist finds Lou Rawls, Steve Reich, Renegade Soundwave, Rush, Saint Etienne and the Sea And Cake all sharing space. The Big Rip-Off is in its 15th month, with each week's program boasting a different theme. Past shows (most of which are catalogued on the site) have included "Viva Variety!" "The Cyclons Attack" and the cute "(insert description here)." The Big Rip-Off is also home to an IRC chat room where listeners can gather while listening to the live broadcast. Like many of the newer audio Web sites, the Big Rip-Off also keeps its listeners informed with a weekly newsletter.


Since 1986, the DC area has been blessed with Vinyl Ink, a store which stocks independent releases almost exclusively. Over the years, the store has played host to performances by Lou Barlow, My Bloody Valentine, Sonic Youth and Stereolab, among others. Lately, the store has

seen growth in its used CD selection as customers have begun selling entire collections. "The last customer I had," says George Gelestino, Vinyl Ink's owner and buyer, "he just had his fifth child, and it costs a lot to feed five mouths!" When such a collection comes in, Vinyl Ink usually advertises the acquisition. Gelestino says imports are also a major part of VI's sales, particularly releases from Belle & Sebastian and Stereolab. "Basically anything good that you can't get on a major label over here," he says. Recently, Vinyl Ink acquired its own domain name, and now makes its home at www.vinylink.com. Although the site is still under construction, Gelestino maintains a 1,000+ email subscription that informs customers of new releases. The site also fuels a fair amount of online sales for the store, helped along by the advertising that Gelestino has placed throughout cyberspace.



EDITH FROST

Telescopic (Drag City)

On *Telescopic*, Edith Frost sounds like somebody may have slipped her a few tabs of acid — “Walk On The Fire” launches the singer/songwriter’s sophomore full-length with more mind-clouding fuzz



than you’ll find on an old angora sweater. The vintage guitar distortion effects, heart-breaking harmonies and ride cymbal pulse of “The Very Earth”

also depart from Frost’s usual spartan musings. Rather than clutter her lackadaisically smooth voice, the support provided by some prominent backing musicians nurtures her craft, downplaying Frost’s vulnerability and eccentricity, and helping her overcome any potential girl-with-guitar novelty status. In addition to absorbing more acidic textures, *Telescopic* paves over large sections of the country road that cut through Frost’s debut album with chummy, easy listening ’70s pop. But nothing on *Telescopic* embraces slickness or saccharine sentiments. While at times Frost plays it too cool, her detachment is a stylish adornment to her expertise in downhome, avant-garde songwriting. — *Jordan N. Mamone*

Ende Neu (Nothing-Interscope)

Spawned during Cold War-era Berlin in



1980, Einstürzende Neubauten (which translates as “collapsing new buildings”) helped launch the industrial music movement by performing apoc-

alyptic music using found and/or unusual objects, such as sheets of metal, oil drums, 20-foot-long stringed instruments and jackhammers. Since the late-’80s, the band has moved away from the bombast of its earlier work, choosing to explore the starkness created by ominous ambient sounds and actual singing from guitarist Blixa Bargeld. *Ende Neu*, the group’s first release for Trent Reznor’s Nothing label, uses varied textures, yet continues to refine Neubauten’s sound: an orchestra adds a sophistication

to the music, and Bargeld even croons a few ballads. Highlights include the lovely duet with Meret Becker, “Stella Maris,” and the majestic Nick Cave-like “The Garden,” which is sung, uncharacteristically, in English. — *Tad Hendrickson*







What happens when semi-noteworthy aggression-addicts join forces? Judging by Dirty Old Man River's second album, they mellow out—sort of. Julian Mills, formerly



of Chicago's Drunk Tank, trades in his bass for a piano on *The Saddest Movie Screen*, while Ben Miller (of Destroy All Monsters and Sproton Layer), joins

DOMR on prepared tabletop guitar. But don't look for any freeform freakouts. The band's precision rhythm section retains a tuggish might, but lively ivory-tickling, cabaret-influenced bone-rattling and Mills's methadone groan iron out the brawn. Miller's chainsaw hum sputters almost subliminally, lurking in the shadows of the mix. *The Saddest Movie Screen* packs a classy, lumbering punch of impending doom; it lays you out like one of those polite, well-dressed James Bond villains. You have to watch those quiet types. — *Jordan N. Mamone*

FLASHBACK

The Singles: 86-98 (Mute-Reprise)

During the latter portion of Depeche Mode's career, the British synth-pop troupe said goodbye to the cult-hero status it had held since its '81 debut as it became a platinum-selling, arena-filling pop machine of lasting importance. Unlike many "alternative" bands that rode to success on the hype of a particular scene, DM's recognition developed thanks to a rabid, steadily-growing fan base and a slew of landmark singles. These classic 12" and 45s explored themes of sex, love, sin and redemption and proved to be every bit as timeless as they were timely. *The Singles: 86-98* is a two-CD, 21-track showcase of highlights from the band's golden era, featuring singles from some of its most revered



and popular albums: *Black Celebration*, *Music For The Masses*, *Violator*, *Songs Of Faith And Devotion* and *Ultra*.

The collection sheds light on the band's increasing musical maturity and evolution, pinpointing the breadth of DM's influences revealed on recent projects, including country, blues and gospel, as well as rock. "Only When I Lose Myself," the one new track on the release, is a somber, captivating offering that effectively demonstrates the band's relevancy in 1998. — *M. Tye Comer*


DOCK BOGGS

ROOTS 'N' BLUES

His Folkways Years 1963-1968 (Smithsonian Folkways)

Dock Boggs was an American music icon, a folk musician and banjo slinger unlike any other. His music was simultaneously to-the-bone traditional, but idiosyncratic and unique as well. The characters in Boggs's songs and the sentiments in his lyrics were never trite; they were complex, emotional, nearly

sublime entities that seemed to live and



breathe and walk among us. In the same way that obscure blues musicians of the '20s were rediscovered in the '60s, Boggs

was rediscovered by Mike Seeger. Boggs had all but retired from playing music at the time of his first modern recordings for Folkways in 1963. All three of Boggs's '60s LPs are repackaged on this two-CD set. In the liner notes, Seeger reflects on his efforts to preserve Boggs's music, providing an historical context for an important musical legacy. — *James Lien*



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JOHNNIE RAY



"Poor ol' Johnnie Ray." So goes the opening line to Dexy's Midnight Runners' '80s hit, "Come On Eileen." If you look back at Morrissey's early days with the Smiths, he sometimes donned a hearing aid for concert appearances, not to remedy anything amiss with his hearing, but to pay visual tribute to one of his idols — the very same Johnnie Ray. It was my own obsessive teenage admiration of Morrissey that introduced me to the older singer. An early '50s American pop phenomenon (before rock n' roll, so we're talking Lawrence Welk-style pop), Ray made a name for himself with weepy dramatics and over-enunciation. But there was justification for that: at age nine he was struck deaf. Ray's hearing impairment also caused him to stiffen his words with deliberate precision. Poor ol' Johnnie Ray, indeed. To alleviate the alienation brought on by his hearing loss, Ray took up songwriting, and understandably, his songs tended to be on the depressing side. But in true '50s style, the morbidity usually possessed a positive twist. In 1951, after several luckless years, his career took off and his singles sold millions, remaining on the charts for months at a time. Of all Ray's singles — "Hernando's Hideaway," "Here I Am Broken Hearted," "You Don't Owe Me A Thing," "What's The Use?" — my favorite is "Cry." It was his first chart-topper, and it established Ray's "tears are good" trademark. Note the otherworldly cooing of a chorus, a piano's tiny plinkings, the mournful stand-up bass and the scratching of a brushed snare. Bringing it over the top is Johnnie Ray's voice. Crisp, clean and utterly gut-wrenching, he breaks the listener's heart with every word, especially when he utters "cry." With his signature style it's transformed into "CAH-rieeeeeeee" and it sounds so...right. — *Kelso Jacks*



There is but one focal point on Scout's *Someplace Would Be Nice*: Ashen Keilyn. The vocalist, guitarist and songwriting backbone of the trio has the voice of a tough, well-armored woman, yet her songwriting never gives you the impression that she is unlovable. Scout's intelligent rock showcases Keilyn's low, gutsy voice, which is astoundingly emotive without ever becoming flirty or fake. Her range of soft to loud vocals is perfectly matched by the music's varying moods, which often change within the same song. Keilyn splices simple guitar strumming into a sonic charge of electric guitar and effects pedals with a well-timed natural finesse. — *Kelso Jacks*



Communication masterminds Coldcut and CamArt, are set to premier **Vjamm**, a new software tool used to make collages of audio/visual information and to create video remixes. The Vjamm program was originally developed by Coldcut for use in the duo's live performances. It is sold with a CD-ROM containing videos and clips, including samples of Coldcut's "Atomic Moog," "Timber" and "More Beats + Pieces" videos. Program users can up-load the clips to create their own interactive Coldcut video remixes. The developers of Vjamm hope that advanced users will sample text from other sources (TV, film, home video, etc.) to make new video clips, which will then work in the Vjamm format. A demo version of the program will be released along with the Coldcut remix album, *Let Us Replay*, on January 26. 



With each successive release, the remarkable thing about Chris Isaak remains his voice. *Speak Of The Devil* showcases his full range of talent, from buttery-smooth Roy Orbison-style pop (the lead single, "Please") to gritty, bluesy roots music that recalls John Fogerty ("Speak Of The Devil"). Also vital to Isaak's music is the detailing that fleshes out his style, which visually consists of his perfect pompadour and sharp suit and musically of the use of Swingle Singers-style backing vocals on "Flying." Isaak is an avid surfer, and you can certainly hear surf-pop winding its way through *Speak Of The Devil*, but for the most part, the album leaves behind his soft rock past and goes for a more rocking sound.





other dimensions

Other Dimensions is a monthly column dedicated to new fringe jazz and improvised releases.

This month's Other Dimensions column looks at two releases teetering on the edge of jazz, that are from two distinctly different schools. The **Acme Rocket Quartet** is an incredible, but underrated, lounge group from Davis, California. *Ultra High Frequency*, the group's second full-length on Lather Records (503.235.3548; www.harvester-usa.com/lather) showcases the group's subtle style that harkens back to the panoramic soundtrack work of Ennio Morricone (one track even has horses whinnying in the background). Led by the tasteful trumpet of John Killebrew and the sinuous guitar work of Roger Kunkel (formerly of underground desert-rock group Thin White Rope), the band is equally comfortable taking on straight lounge, Tex-Mex, moody rock and jazz. *Ultra High Frequency* is not to be overlooked...**Air Traffic Controllers' Assistant To The Assistant** (Parallelism; atc@parallelism.com) is the third disc from this New York City improv duo, comprised of guitarist Gerard Cosloy and drummer Claire Pannell. Cosloy seems to be the one leading the way here: playing guitar, utilizing treated electronic sounds to create a myriad of sound loops and randomly tweaking just about every knob on his effects rack. Pannell's drumming is effectively rudimentary, complimenting and emphasizing Cosloy's sonic stunts with a sturdy hand. Recorded live in the studio, this is a frenzied, intense freeform recording that is not for those with fragile musical sensibilities, but a real treat for anyone who thrives on music created in the moment. — Tad Hendrickson

KUNV's Switch To Jazz Draws Protests

A group of musicians, current and former KUNV staffers, and Las Vegas community members have rallied together to protest KUNV's switch to jazz programming. As CMJ reported in issue #574, the University of Nevada-Las Vegas station elevated its "Rock Ave." programming because, as the station said in a statement, "The listener share and funding support for alternative rock on KUNV has been dropping steadily." The newly-formed Rock Avenue, which touts itself as "not anti-jazz, but pro-alternative," has already gathered more than 5,000 petition signatures protesting KUNV's programming change, and former KUNV Rock Music Director Ducks Slaughter hopes more will sign up in an upcoming protest concert. More than 11 local bands will play at the June 20 concert at the Huntington Theatre in Las Vegas. A number of local businesses are sponsoring the show, and petition forms are also available at other participating businesses in the Las Vegas Valley. Slaughter said he is protesting not only the station's change to an all-jazz format, but also the way he and Co-Music Director Tigger were told about the decision. Slaughter said he was called to the station at about 6 a.m. on May 19 (after summer hours had ended) and told to clean out. *Continued on page 35*

WHIGS

UPTOWN AGAIN

"I don't listen to the radio anymore for precisely the reason that there's nothing on there that interests me," explains the Afghan Whigs' frontman, Greg Dulli, with just a hint of smirking contempt in his voice. "I have to listen to R&B radio. And I can't even listen to that all the way through without hearing 'Just The Two Of Us' by Will Smith [before] I want to stick my finger down my throat." Dulli's on the phone from his home in Seattle, talking about the influences behind his band's sixth and latest album, *1965*. It's a recording that makes clear once and for all that the Whigs—once lumped in with Sub Pop's early '90s cluster of snarling, guitar-toting post-punks—have always been a rhythm and blues band just waiting to happen. Or more importantly, that Dulli's persona as the predatory ladies man has as much to do with his need to emulate the groin-nudging croon of soulmen like Marvin Gaye or Al Green as it does the wanderlust of his own libido. "It's the new chapter," Dulli says of the album. "It's the naughty, naughty."

Recorded in New Orleans between countless round-the-clock benders and other undocumented merriments, *1965* takes the Whigs' undertow of churning, boozy rock 'n' roll and adds dashes of classic soul, Crescent City jazz, a touch of funk and even some gospel, resulting in what may be the band's most spirited, booty-shakin' performance on record. Even the notoriously soul-ravaged Dulli sounds like he's having fun here, playing up his sexual pomp without allowing the depths of his typical emotional turmoil (documented with staggering power on 1994's *Gentleman*) to overshadow his good time. "I've managed to stay out of any sort of complicated romantic entanglements, so that has my head happier now," Dulli explains. "I mean [laughs], I love girls, and I've pretty much spelled that out over the years. [But] this time I was dating rather than being in a relationship. Actually sometimes 'dating' is a little too formal of a word for what I was doing [laughs]. Gettin' to know the community. Reaching out." When asked if his, er, social engagements in New Orleans informed the tone of the album, Dulli's responds with typical winking bravado. "Uh—huh. And it can go on 24 hours a day [there] my friend," he chuckles. "And it did, sometimes for 72 hours at a time — 'til I finally went to sleep."

While Dulli's reputation as the sneering, alternately self-aggrandizing/self-loathing rake has only grown larger over time, his band's sonic veneer has become more refined and increasingly subtle over an 11-year history. Formed in Cincinnati, Ohio, sometime in the late 1980s, the Afghan Whigs released their first album, *Big Top Halloween*, on their own label in 1988. That thrashy wallop of roughshod aggression and literate songwriting quickly landed the group on Seattle's then-flagship grunge label Sub Pop, making them the first non-Northwestern American band to record with the label (and erroneously tagging them as another "Seattle grunge band"). The two albums the band released under Sub Pop's banner, *Up In It* and *Congregation*, further distanced the Whigs from their label brethren, the latter fully revealing the hidden power in Dulli's soulful howl and Rick McCollum's muscular, expressive guitar work. After signing with their first major label, Elektra Records, the band produced its most ambitious record to date, the emotionally oppressive and musically adventurous *Gentleman*, followed by the equally implusive *Black Love*. Both albums received their share of accolades, but they never connected with the larger public, as expected by the band's growing legion of fans.

"They're kinda like my kids," says Dulli about his band's recorded work. "[1965's] kinda like the newborn that everyone's paying attention to. *Up In It* is the one that's older that went off into the world and I don't talk to very much. This is the baby and we're all fussin' over it. The last record [*Black Love*], is probably, in terms of my children, my 'special' child. The child that maybe got made fun of at school. That's the one that I really tried to stretch. *Gentleman* is my popular child that I never have to worry about, but I felt [*Black Love*] got a bum rap."

Frustrated by *Black Love*'s less-than-stellar commercial reception, Dulli and co. took a two-year break from recording as a band after the album's release. In the downtime between the sessions for *1965* and the band's subsequent label jump to Columbia, Dulli teamed-up with pals Shawn Smith (Brad, Satchel, Pigeonhed) and Harold Chichester (Howlin' Maggie) to form the Twilight Singers, a one-off recording project which further indulged Dulli's interests in the kind of soul and R&B music that had been creeping into the edges of the Whigs' work. *Twilight As Performed By The Twilight Singers* will be released by Columbia Records sometime next year.

Taking off from that point, Dulli went into *1965* with a stronger sense of his own abilities as a singer and as a lyricist. "I wanted to simplify as a writer," he explains. "I've told this to people before and no one believes me but I'll try it one more time. I had one template that I based everything that I did on this record against, and that's the complete works of Dr. Seuss. Just the simple but memorable passages that he put together. If it didn't hit me in a Dr. Seuss kinda way, it was outta there."

"[But] I have one musical hero in my life, and that's Marvin Gaye," he says. "I ain't never gonna be able to sing like Marvin Gaye, I ain't never gonna be able to work it like Marvin Gaye, but ya know, I'll spend the rest of my life trying."



Since moving six months ago from the relatively small Fort Apache label/studio to the huge Atlantic Records conglomerate, Gary Gorman has made the transition from working with a select roster of alternative rock artists to promoting an extensive, eclectic collection of up-and-coming and platinum-selling acts. Current Atlantic releases include new albums from Kid Rock, Martin Sexton and Duncan Sheik, along with a live, three-CD box set from Rush and the highly-anticipated sophomore release from Jewel. Gorman spoke to us recently about what's it's like to live life on both sides of the industry fence.

Describe a typical day in your life.

You should ask Jon Landman [of The Syndicate] about this one. When anyone asks about me, he tells this story of a typical day in my life. It goes something like this: "Gorman wakes up, smokes a cigarette, drinks a cup of coffee, has a bagel, smokes a cigarette, has a cup of coffee, calls a station, has a cup of coffee, etc..." That's not really that accurate though. My days really are whirlwinds: indies, radio, advertising, tour support, managers, budgets, meetings...cursing midgets.

Tell us about your pre-Atlantic industry experience?

I interned for Jay Harding at Reprise Records during my senior year at Ithaca College. Ithaca had a satellite program available with classes at night and internships during the day. Anyway, Jay put me on the phone and just let me go. He went to bat for me constantly while I was there and actually wound up helping me get my first real post-school gig at the label division of Fort Apache in Cambridge, Massachusetts. I was hired to handle college/specialty radio promotion. Later, when the label folded, I worked strictly for the management clients: Tanya Donelly, Juliana Hatfield, Polara, Fuzzy... I spent a year and half at the Fort and I guess you can say it was one of those experiences you know won't be repeated. It was very unique. The recording studios, the artists, the label...there was a lot going on for a little place.

What is the main difference between working for a small company and working for a major record label?

Of course, the attitude at Fort Apache was very D.I.Y. It was 12-hour days all the time, we worked on top of an oil company, did our own mailings, etc... I guess one of the biggest differences is that there was about a dozen people who worked at the Fort. At Atlantic, there are at least a dozen assistants just on my floor! There is also quite a difference in protocol. For the most part, I had one person to report to at the Fort. At Atlantic, it's a bit more splintered. At the same time though, there is something to be said for 50 people being excited about a project as compared to five.

Now, about Juliana Hatfield and Atlantic...

I get asked about that by a lot of stations. I was at the Fort when Jules left Atlantic. Atlantic wanted nothing more than to continue a relationship with her, but she wanted to explore some different avenues so there was a mutual split. Having the unusual experience of working at both camps, I think I can offer that as a pretty accurate representation of what went down. She had an EP out on Bar/None last year that I think represents some of her finest moments. She's also got new record now on Zoë. She is truly a great musician and a wonderful person. I'm a big fan.

Did you ever do college radio?

Yeah. WICB in Ithaca with Jon Landman, Mike Powers [now at Maverick] and Jamie Mather [now at The Planetary Group]. I worked at the station from 1993-96. Jon transferred in from a smaller school upstate and really took the station by storm. I remember a point where both Powers and I were interviewing to be his

whipping boy. I was so psyched when I beat him out. I still believe the only reason I got the spot was because Powers was a recovering Phish-head and Jon never was too down with the noodle dance. When I went to Los Angeles, Powers took my job at WICB. When I came back, Powers went to the L.A. program and picked up where I left off at Reprise. Later, Jamie Mather would do the same.

How did working at WICB help you understand the biz?

I think college radio gives you a background in music, the fundamentals of dealing with record label personnel, and some insight into your ability to interact with these individuals. If you want to look at the big picture as exposing and supporting artists to a listening audience through college radio, then your view is really not that different than someone at a record label.

How do you think the industry as a whole sees college radio?

As a strange mystical entity. Everyone I talk to outside of college radio doesn't really understand it, but they think they do. People are generally confused...190 adds on a record that only 60 stations report, a band is number one on a station's chart although it only got three spins...If I had a dollar for how many times I've been asked, "When are adds on the next single?"

Which artist that has been the biggest pleasure to work with?

Well I was closest to Tanya Donelly, who is, without a doubt, one of the most amazing people on the planet. I also loved working with Bad Religion and Tori Amos. Right now, working with Kid Rock is an absolute blast.

Who's your all-time favorite recording artist?

Pixies, R.E.M., Talking Heads, Hüsker Dü...I dunno. I like Pavement, The Whigs, Jawbreaker....

What did you buy the last time you went record shopping?

A Frappe import 7".

What was the first concert you ever attended?

R.E.M. was the first big rock show I ever attended, although, years earlier, my dad told me he was taking my brother, sister and I to a Huey Lewis And The News show — it never happened. That's too bad, 'cause I still need a new drug.



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
