



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

Tricky Leaves His Island Home

British trip-hop luminary Tricky has left Island Def Jam Records. The artist is departing from the label several months after the release of his fourth album, *Juxtapose*, a collaboration with producers DJ Muggs and Grease. The *NME* has reported that the rapper/producer, whose contract was up for renewal, is unhappy with the company. Susan Mainzer, a publicist at Green Galactic, the firm that handles publicity for Tricky's Durban Poison label, said that the parting was amicable. When asked if Tricky might consider issuing his work on Durban Poison, Mainzer said that the performer is currently talking to various record companies and exploring his options. In 1995, Island released Tricky's debut, *Maxinquaye*, which was

Artemis Makes Deals With Man's Ruin, E-Squared

Artemis Records has entered into a joint venture with Man's Ruin, the punk and hard rock label run by visual artist Frank Kozik. Artemis will fund the production, marketing and promotion of select Man's Ruin releases. The San Francisco-based imprint, which Kozik founded in 1995, has issued heavy records by such bands as Kyuss, Helios Creed, Killdozer, the Hellacopters, the Dwarves and the Melvins. 

BECK

Midnite Vultures (Bongload/Geffen-Interscope)

Beck Hansen wants to be your soopaman lova. Your #1 freak daddy. Your rhapsody in thrift-store blue. At least that's what the hip-hop folkie seems to be saying on the "official" follow-up to his landmark 1996 LP *Odelay*. Having channeled his earnestness and poetic fortitude into last year's sublime *Mutations*, the artist is currently getting in touch with his inner playa; on *Midnite Vultures*, Beck unwinds in a thick vat of party groove stew prepared from 11 deliciously over-the-top, unclassifiable tracks. More than any other title in his career, the new record emphasizes that the man is an entertainer par excellence. The first single, "Sexlaws," is a full-throttle detonation of technicolor retro-pop that wouldn't seem out of place as a musical feature on *Rowan And Martin's Laugh-In*. From there, *Midnite Vultures* scavenges Soulsonic Force-style electro-funk, Gram Parsons-esque country soul, Revolution-era Prince, and West Coast hip-hop, contorting and siphoning the forms into a trash culture manifesto. The work's zenith, however, is its brilliant endnote, "Debra," a hilariously cheeky take on an R. Kelly-style slow jam. It could very well stand as Mr. Hansen's single most surreal moment on wax.



ANI DIFRANCO

To The Teeth (Righteous Babe)

You probably never thought of it this way, but Ani DiFranco is a bit like your grandfather. She tells such intimate, vivid and detailed stories that she forces you to live with her, in the moment. This acclaimed gal with an acoustic guitar strums folk songs replete with wah-wahs, banjos, trumpets, Wurlitzers and quirky beats, but she most accurately defines herself through her lyrics. *To The Teeth*, the prolific Buffalo institution's 12th album and her second effort within the year, proves that, like poet Ezra Pound, the songwriter is insistent upon making it new. On the title song, her take on the Columbine shootings, DiFranco sings "And if I hear one more time/About a fool's right/To the tools of rage/I'm gonna take all my friends/And I'm gonna move to Canada/And we're gonna die of old age," thoughtfully bringing the event, which has been commented on from nearly every analytical and emotional angle, back into perspective. DiFranco's music is her therapy ("God I wish I was stronger/This song could never be long enough"), which is perhaps why her ardent, rabid fanbase supports her so wholeheartedly. She relates, she knows.



AT THE DRIVE-IN

Vaya (Fearless)

A preliminary glance at *Vaya*'s lyric sheet — largely nonsensical, if vividly impressionistic — doesn't do much to prepare you for the music's purely visceral message. At The Drive-In's metronomic guitar charge and strangulated shout-alongs impressively call to mind Fugazi's explosive, post-hardcore wallop, working up to a blood pressure-raising intensity via tightly controlled fits and starts. Propelled by Tony Hajjar's pummeling snare thwack, which is mixed determinedly up-front, the seven-track *Vaya* documents a young band in a glorious state of flux, its frustrations and energies turning its performance into a dramatic tug-of-war. Just when the crew's soft-loud dynamic approaches convention, it doubles back on itself, refusing to give in to the easy payoff. Cedric Bixler's soaring, erupting vocals haven't helped At The Drive-In distance itself from comparisons to the emo scene, but the quintet's jagged, dual-guitar burn and rattling low-end thunder are more pointedly aggressive than the flailings of many of its similarly minded peers. Catch this band now, while its internal urges are still gloriously grappling with its more tactile ones.

Calle Salud (Nonesuch)

Francisco Repilado, the 93-year-old better known as Compay Segundo ("second friend"), is *segundo* to none when it comes to relating the rich, bittersweet history of traditional Cuban music. The master's second effort, following his pivotal turn as the spry, devil-grinned veteran in the Buena Vista Social Club, gives off a wariner, yet more refined vibe than his 1998 release, *Lo Mejor De La Vida*. Today, Segundo is known as a pioneering songwriter and guitarist (his seven-stringed invention, the *armanico* tastes of both Spanish guitar and Cuban *tres*), but in his early days, he was also an accomplished clarinetist. The mellow reed instrument was central to Cuban music well into the '40s, when it was eclipsed by the power of brass; its melancholy strains give a romantic, cosmopolitan glimmer to the breezy, rustic tunes of *Calle Salud*. The record conveys the contrast of intense sorrow and absolute bliss that permeates the best Cuban music. Driven by bright guitar lines and the steady, galloping beat of hand percussion, songs such as "Amor Gigante" feel like heartbreak and falling in love at the same time.

Sony Music's Worldwide Revenue Drops

Sony Music Entertainment's global revenue fell 12.8%, to a total of \$1.5 billion during the second fiscal quarter, which ended on September 30. The company's music sales fell 13.5%, to a total of \$1.5 billion. Ricky Martin's self-titled album, which has sold 3.5 million copies worldwide since its May release, was Sony's best-selling title for the period.

During the same period, the company's operating income also dropped 38%, to a total of \$25 million. Sony attributed its losses to the delayed street dates of many of its new albums and to increased spending on talent, marketing and promotion.

Columbia Misses Option For Next Black Crowes Record

According to a release issued by the Black Crowes' publicity firm MSO, Columbia Records did not exercise its option to keep the group signed to the label. The band's most recent album, *By Your Side*, was issued in January. The title was the first Columbia record released in conjunction with American Recordings.

The press statement reports that Crowes manager Peter Angelus is in negotiations with Columbia. In response to rumors stating that the act had been dropped, a label source told Reuters, "It's not correct to say they've been dropped. The band is no longer technically on the label." Columbia did not return CMJ's calls. Sources close to the band told CMJ that *By Your Side* was the final album of the band's restructured three-record deal with American. (Last year, American switched its distribution from Warner Bros. to Columbia Records.) Columbia believed that *By Your Side* was only the second release of the deal.

The Southern rockers are no strangers to label intrigue. In 1992, American, which issued the first four Black Crowes records including their 1990 debut *Shake Your Money Maker*, apparently forgot to exercise its option clause.

Columbia may not have been paying close attention to the Crowes, but the group's fans aren't losing interest. The band's October tour with Jimmy Page resulted in three sold-out shows at New York's Roseland Ballroom and two sellout dates at the Los Angeles's Greek Theater. The Crowes' publicity firm reports that Angelus and Page's manager, Bill Curbishley, are discussing the possibilities of sending their clients on another summer tour and issuing a live album of tracks by the performers.

Former Spiritualized Members Form New Band

Guitarist Mike Mooney, bassist Sean Cook and drummer Damon Reece have formed a new group called Lupine Hole. In July, Jason Pierce ousted the musicians from his space-rock band Spiritualized. The exiled trio is currently working on a new album. Massive Attack will produce the affair. The NME claims that later this month, the new band will self-release its debut single "Vapriozor." John Baggart, who has worked with Portishead, plays keyboards on the song. Cook described the music as "psychedelic soul — Atlantic [Records] soul with a mad Spencer Davis beat with a touch of blues and Krautrock."

When asked about his relationship with Pierce, he added, "We were just so disappointed about everything that went on. Relations had been getting steadily worse and they just deteriorated. Now we just avoid each other. It's the same old story of the extras getting fuck-all and the stars getting everything."

Tripping Daisy Guitarist Dead At 28

On October 27, Tripping Daisy guitarist Wes Berggren died in his Dallas home. According to the *Dallas Observer*, the 28-year-old musician went to bed around midnight on Wednesday. His wife Melissa, woke up the next morning at approximately 4:45 a.m. and found her husband in an unconscious state. Police and firefighters were unable to revive him. At press time, Allstar reported that area police have ruled out foul play as a potential cause of death. Officials are awaiting the results of toxicology tests.

Berggren, vocalist Tim DeLaughter and bassist Mark Pirro formed Tripping Daisy in 1991. At that time, the guitarist was enrolled at the University of North Texas. The band, rounded out by drummer Mitch Marine, issued its most popular single, the alternative radio hit "I Got A Girl,"

in 1995. Island Records signed Tripping Daisy one year after the release of the act's 1992 indie-issued debut. The major released three of the quartet's albums — *Bill* (1993), a re-press of the debut, *I Am An Elastic Firecracker* (1995) and *Jesus Hits Like The Atom Bomb* (1998). In 1998 the label dropped the band. Earlier this year, the quartet founded its own recording company, Good Records, which was scheduled to release a new, eponymous Tripping Daisy effort on January 15. The band had also booked a series of shows in Texas, on November 7, 12 and 13.

Berggren's loved ones held a public memorial on October 30, at Dallas' Unity Church. Donations in the guitarist's name may be made to the Salesmanship Club, 400 S. Houston St., Dallas, Texas 75202.

Hoyt Axton Dead At 61


Hoyt Axton, 61, the songwriter and actor who wrote Three Dog Night's classic "Joy To The World," died on November 2. He had been plagued by a series of heart attacks during the two weeks leading up to his death. According to CNN.com, Axton passed away peacefully, surrounded by family and friends at his Montana ranch.

"Joy To The World," the biggest hit of 1971, spent seven weeks at number one. Axton also wrote singles for Ringo Starr, Elvis Presley, Joan Baez, Waylon Jennings, John Denver, Linda Ronstadt and Steppenwolf. Musicality seemed to run in the tunesmith's family; his mother, Mae Boren Axton, wrote Presley's "Heartbreak Hotel." Axton was also a recording artist, known for performing his hits "Boney Fingers" and "When The Morning Comes." The songwriter also worked as an actor, on television and in such films as *Gremlins* and *The Black Stallion*.

Axton is survived by his wife, Deborah, and his five grown children.

Jade Tree Signs Turing Machine, Pedro The Lion

Jade Tree has signed New York City math-rock trio Turing Machine and David Bazan's one-man band Pedro The Lion. James Murphy (Trans Am, Les Savy Fav, Rachel's) and Tim Goldsworthy (the ex-U.N.K.L.E. remixer who has touched up tracks by Beck, Can and Radiohead), mixed and produced Turing Machine's *A New Machine For Living*, which will arrive in stores on January 18. The record was recorded by Bill Kellum (Doledrums, Rake). The band itself is comprised of former members of Pitchblende, among them guitarist Justin Chearno, who also plays in the group Doldrums. On March 14, Jade Tree will issue *Winners Never Quit*, the follow-up to Pedro The Lion's Made In Mexico-released 1998 full-length, *It's Hard To Find A Friend*. Bazan played and recorded *Winners* in his home.

Fugazi To Tour U.S.


Post-punk act Fugazi will embark on a three-week, East Coast tour, which will commence in December. On December 3, the quartet, which is co-fronted by singer/guitarists Ian MacKaye and Guy Picciotto, will play the Roxy in New York City. The remaining dates had yet to be confirmed at press time. During the first week or so of the outing, the band will be accompanied by veteran Dutch noise-punk act The Ex, with which Fugazi had played on the West Coast. The latter group had spent the last month touring Europe. Its most recent release, *Instrument* (Dischord), is the soundtrack to independent filmmaker Jem Cohen's arty Fugazi biopic. Following the tour, the band will take an extended break from performing, which will enable it to write new material. According to a statement by Picciotto, drummer Brendan Canty will spend the time with his wife and the couple's second child, who is due in March. Rollins To Reissue His Solo Albums

On November 23, former Black Flag frontman Henry Rollins's 2.13.61 label will reissue a remastered version of his first non-spoken word solo album, the 1987-released *Hot Animal Machine*.

That same day, the company will also reissue the Rollins Band's 1988 album *Life Time* (produced by Fugazi's Ian MacKaye) and its 1989 album *Hard Volume*. The now-defunct Texas Hotel label originally issued the aforementioned titles. The singer will also release a remastered version of the Rollins Band's previously unreleased work *Live In Australia 1990*. The new pressings of the albums will contain bonus tracks and the artist's own liner notes.

The Rollins Band — the new lineup of which consists mostly of members of Mother Superior — will release its next album, *Get Some Go Again*, in January of 2000.

Germany's Edel Music AG To Acquire 80% Of RED Distribution

Hamburg, Germany-based Edel Music will acquire an 80% stake in RED Distribution, according to the Billboard Bulletin. Terms of the deal were not disclosed. Sony music owns the independent distribution company, which is responsible for the domestic distribution of 19 labels. Koch currently distributes Edel Music's titles in the U.S. As a result of the new deal, Sony will provide Edel with support services in markets outside of America. Sony will continue to distribute certain releases through RED, including titles on Loud Records. Edel CEO Michael Haentjes believes this acquisition will help his company grow in America.

Rondor Music To Be Auctioned?

Rondor Music, the publishing company owned by A&M founders Herb Alpert and Jerry Moss, might be sold via auction, according to the Billboard Bulletin. The pair reportedly began to think about putting the company on the block after they witnessed EMI Music Publishing consume Japanese Music publisher Windswept Pacific for a cost of \$200 million. That acquisition seemed to signal that the majors are more than willing to shell out big bucks for an independent music publishing company.

Despite having sold their label to PolyGram one decade ago, Alpert and Moss retained their publishing enterprise. But Moss told the Bulletin that he wasn't about to let go of the company just yet. "There is nothing going on right now," he said. "Like any indie, we get calls. We're not selling at the present time." Rondor's value could total as much as \$500 million, based on calculations derived from the net publisher's share.

Mushroom Records Owner Starts Company

Michael Gudinski, the man who founded the Australian label Mushroom Records, which he sold last year to Rupert Murdoch's News Corp., is building a new music business venture, Mushroom Marketing. (Under his agreement with

Murdoch, Gudinski could retain his company name.) The company will promote its clients through endorsements and licensing. In addition, the Mushroom founder's one-year, non-compete agreement with News Corp. has expired; he will now launch Liberation Records, a joint venture with former Mushroom Managing Director Warren Costello. The label's forthcoming releases include a CD compilation of performances recorded on Australian talk show *The Panel*, and a five-CD set compiling Australia's top 100 songs, as voted by several of the country's newspapers.

Fort Point Acquires Catapult, Spinning Records

In an effort to launch a label group, the Boston-based Fort Point Entertainment Group has acquired fellow Beantown residents Catapult and Spinning Records. Fort Point has also signed an exclusive contract with the Planetary Group; the indie publicist will handle promotion for subsequent Catapult and Spinning releases. Fort Point also oversees a publishing arm and a film music department.

Catapult, which was founded in 1994, has released music by such acts as Cherry 2000, Star Ghost Dog and Fuzzy. Spinning, which was also founded in 1994, has issued titles by What About George, Flying Nuns and the Banjo Spiders. Garret Vandermolen, VP of Fort Point Label Group, said in a statement, "We're very excited about both the catalog titles and new releases that Catapult and Spinning are bringing to the table. With our current Banjo Spiders release and both a new Star Ghost Dog disc and an Adam Franklin (Swervedriver) solo release scheduled for 2000, this arrangement with Planetary will help us properly promote and market these important artists."

Underhill Recordings Makes Deal With Redeye Distribution

Los Angeles-based record label Underhill Recordings has made a distribution deal with Redeye Distribution. The North Carolina-based distributor special-

izes in pop and Triple A-format music.

The first release through the new venture, Americana group Davis Waits's *The Evolution Of...*, arrived in stores on September 21. Future releases through the deal include a solo album by Underhill owner and Davis Waits member Ken Kunin and a record by singer-songwriter Leslie King. Kathy Sharp of Underhill Records said, "We are very excited to have Davis Waits out via Redeye. Their track record and reputation is what sold us on choosing them as a distributor."

New Media Network, TVN Entertainment Form Digital Music Venture



Catapult act Fuzzy

The New Music Network (NMN) has entered into a business partnership with TVN Entertainment. The companies will launch eGroove, a digital music site. TVN has also acquired a majority stake in NMN. Next year, NMN plans to begin building a chain of bricks-and-mortar retail stores, which the company will complement with its www.egroove.com site.

The retail outlets will sell CDs and on-demand music products, such as music downloads. The music will be marketed through a kiosk system, which will use TVN's digital cable technology. followed by the 1996 effort *Pre-Millennium Tension* and the 1998 title *Angels With Dirty Faces*. In 1996, the artist released an album under the pseudonym Nearly God.

Nice also notes that the packaging will please even the most rabid fans. "The booklet in particular is unbelievable. I think it's nearly 80 pages long, and each song contains a written piece about that song from one member of the band."

The Beasties have even baited the work with a brand-new cut, "Alive." The video of the song has been appropriately stamped with the familiar Beastie hallmarks (e.g. fisheye lenses, matching jumpsuits, miniature bicycles, and copious shots of goofing around in NYC). On November 1, the trio debuted the clip in person, on MTV's *Total Request Live*. Fans can also view the vid at www.beastieboys.com.

In terms of unconventional marketing, Capitol, in conjunction with Musicmaker.com and several other participating online retailers, is selling 150 archival Beasties songs, from which fans may create their own, customized retrospective CDs. The online outlets will burn fan-selected tracks onto customized discs, which the fans may purchase. Individuals who buy the product will be treated to a free download of "Alive." Interested parties have until December 31 to cook their own personal b-boy bouillabaisse and settle disputes over the songs that never made it onto *The Sounds Of Science*. (No "Looking Down The Barrel Of A Gun"? Where's "The Maestro"?) The Beasties, who were among the initial big-name performers to support the free distribution of online sound files, gave out gratis Internet navigation software on their sold-out 1995 tour. Thus, the custom CD promotion seems like an appropriate way to market their greatest hits album.

As far as college radio is concerned, the medium has shown some love for the CD5 of "Alive," sending it to #65 during the single's second week on the Radio 200. Capitol will send a rock remix to commercial radio within the next few weeks.

the organization re-emphasized its goals, citing the exemplary anti-online piracy efforts of its individual chapters. Some of these chapters' efforts have resulted in the shutting down of thousands of illegal sites and in the eradication of thousands of pirated MP3 files.

In Sweden, more than 60 artists, including Roxette, signed an open letter that called for the increased protection of online music. Other artists, including French singers Jean-Jacques Goldman and Pascal Obispo, Italian musicians Claudio Baglioni and Luca Barbarossa, and Chinese superstars Leslie Cheung, Jacky Cheung and Andy Lau, also supported the cause.

In the U.S., the Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA) has taken to issuing information subpoenas. These subpoenas, which are made possible by a provision in the Digital Millennium Copyright Act, require that the Internet Service Providers (ISPs) of troublesome sites disclose the site operators' contact information. The RIAA in turn locates the potential offender, asks the site to shut down, and fines it.

The IFPI applauds these international efforts. But the organization is also asking that its chapters comply with the WIPO Treaties, a 1996-created legal framework that, if ratified, could support copyright legislation and artist protection. A total of 30 countries must validate the treaty; only 10 have agreed to do so.

In related RIAA anti-piracy news, the organization has settled its lawsuits against mobile disc jockey company Complete Music, Inc. and CD plant Americ Disc. The suits were settled for \$650,000 and \$10 million, respectively.

Beastie Boys (continued from cover)

"They've done so much material over the course of 15 years, with so much variety, that I think it's as good a time as any. Why not let people hear why they can still be excited about this band and know that they're still making important records?"

The Sounds Of Science anthology (Grand Royal-Capitol), which will arrive in stores on November 23, spans two discs and contains a whopping 42 tracks. Video classics such as "Sabotage" and "Hey Ladies" share space with album cuts, rare versions of familiar songs, and nuggets from the trio's early hardcore punk days. The set is a worthy assessment of an impressive career.





College radio continues to be charmed by indie-rock artists who mine the rich pop influences of the '60s world. The Essex Green's *Everything Is Green* (Kindercore) is enough of a throwback to lush Beatles and Beach Boys arrangements to make it nearly indistinguishable from the originals. It's a compliment indeed, considering both the difficulty of emulating the greats and the stiff competition to do so among today's underground. Featuring members of Ladybug Transistor and the Silver Jews, the Essex Green makes a decisive 100-position jump on the Radio 200, boosted by an impressive Core debut at #27.

Industry-watchers know that the Stone Temple Pilots have their work cut out for them when it comes to promoting *No. 4* (Atlantic), the band's "comeback" album after a brief split and a litany of legal troubles for lead singer Scott Weiland. With Weiland currently serving a one-year jail sentence, the rest of the band has been making promotional appearances (the DeLeo brothers recently showed up on MTV's *Total Request Live*), but a tour, arguably the band's forte, is obviously on hold. While they wait out Weiland's sentence, though, the Pilots can look to fans at college radio to support *No. 4*, regardless of the band's circumstances. Though the lead single from the album, "Down," continues to do well at commercial alternative outlets, the album leaps 67 positions on the Radio 200 and garners another 65 reports in its second week out.







Liberty Digital Invests \$50 Million In Internet Companies

New media company Liberty Digital, Inc. has acquired equity stakes worth approximately \$50 million in Internet companies Online Retail Partners, UGO Networks and netLiberty. Liberty's investment portfolio already includes iVillage, Digital Music Express, Drugstore.com and Priceline.com.

Liberty Digital is majority-owned by the Liberty Media Group, which has implemented a strategy that involves the development of enhanced cable networks, that facilitate interactive shopping via television. President and CEO of Liberty Digital Lee Masters said, "We see [potential] synergies between what a number of our investments are doing, and what Liberty Digital is working on in the area of creating new interactive television programming."

Liberty Digital recently announced that it will purchase approximately \$150 million worth of common stock in Emmis Communications, a media company that maintains radio and television broadcast holdings and a magazine publishing division (for complete story, see CMJ issue #642).

Customdisc.com Signs Exclusive Marketing Deal With Shanachie

Custom CD outlet Customdisc.com has signed an exclusive marketing and distribution agreement with Shanachie Entertainment. The online company has taken on the label's catalogue of more than 6,000 tracks, which consumers may now include on their custom compilations. "Shanachie Entertainment has a fabulous catalog of music, and is a highly respected independent label," said Customdisc.com CEO David Gould. Customdisc's current library of more than 250,000 tracks will be boosted by the addition of songs by such artists as Ladysmith Black Mambazo, Chuck Jackson, Chuck Loeb and Popa Chubby. The partnership marks the conclusion of Customdisc's months of aggressive independent label dealmaking; earlier in October, the company inked similar deals with Thirsty Ear, Silva Screen and Bottomline Records, among others.

Amazon.com Reports Losses, Sales Increases

Internet retail powerhouse Amazon.com reported a third quarter net loss, the total of which is four times greater than the net loss reported by the company for the same period in 1998. Despite having seen a 132% increase in net sales during the quarter, Amazon.com reported a net loss of \$197 million, or \$.59 per share, for the three-month period that ended on September 30. The figure pales in comparison to the company's net loss of \$45 million for the same period last year.

A total of \$111 million was lost in the form of non-cash charges for acquisitions, stock compensation and investment costs. Despite these figures, the company reported that its third quarter net sales totaled \$356 million, up from the total of \$154 million it reported during the same period in 1998. Amazon.com also obtained 2.4 million customers during the 1999 period, which brings its total number of clients to 13.1 million.

RioPort Receives \$30M In Financing, Unveils RioPort.com

Paul Allen's Vulcan Ventures and Oak Investment Partners Digital have supplied digital music company RioPort with an initial-round financing of \$30 million. RioPort, which is partially owned by MTV Networks

Online and S3 Inc., will use the capital to invest in Internet and content development activities. It will also invest in application software development.

RioPort President David Watkins said, "What we wanted to be able to do was create RioPort as a standalone and give us the opportunity to grow the business quickly, and to do that, we have to bring some key investors."

True to Watkins' word, RioPort officially unveiled RioPort.com, a one-stop digital music destination, where enthusiasts can access a wide array of music in both the MP3 and Windows Media Audio formats. The site also houses one of the Internet's largest selections of spoken audio programming. From the site, visitors can also download the RioPort Audio Manager jukebox software and witness interactive flash demos of new portable hardware.

Through December 31, Beastie Boys fans will be able to create customized two-CD sets containing up to 40 of the trio's songs. Participating online retailers are allowing site visitors to select from over 150 Beasties songs, among them rarities and previously unreleased tracks. Users may arrange the cuts in whatever order they choose. They may also choose the compilation's album title, which will be displayed on the compact disc and on the CD cover. The CDs, which cost \$17.85 apiece, will be shipped on November 23, which is the street date of the forthcoming two-CD Beasties anthology, *The Sounds Of Science...CDnow* (www.cdnow.com) and Atlantic Records will sponsor a special Internet charity auction of collectible items autographed by some of the label's most famous artists. The companies will donate proceeds to the Nordoff-Robbins Music Therapy Foundation, a global charity that finances the use of improvisational music as a means of communication in treating children with autism and other disabilities. Matchbox 20's studio sheet and a Stone Temple Pilots drum head are among the items for sale...On November 6, esteemed punk rock mouthpiece John Lydon (a.k.a. Johnny Rotten) will unveil a new program on the all-talk Internet radio Web site eYada.com. The live and uncensored Rotten Radio will air every Saturday, from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. EST. The show will broadcast both audio and video from the "newly wired living room" of Lydon's Los Angeles home...Korean consumer electronics manufacturer HanGo will release a portable MP3 player capable of storing 4.86GB, or up to 81 hours of music. Compaq (www.compaq.com) designed the Personal Jukebox player, which utilizes a 33MHZ Motorola digital signal processor. The device weighs 9.9 ounces and it is substantially larger than current MP3 players, but it also houses a large 12-by-64-pixel graphic LCD screen. The Personal Jukebox, which will arrive in stores this month, also includes a rechargeable lithium ion battery that facilitates 10 hours of playback, software provided by Fraunhofer and Thompson, and a USB connection...Audio software and hardware provider SRS Labs, Inc. has given birth to an Internet music subsidiary, SurroundMP3.com. The new entity's imminent music Web site of the same name will utilize SRS technology in its surround-sound audio Web casts, music videos, chat rooms and entertainment/educational content. For the third quarter, which ended on September 30, SRS reported a net income of \$310,422, up \$118,912 from the same period in 1998.

AQUABATS!

The Aquabats! Vs. The Floating Eye Of Death! (Goldenvoice-Time Bomb)

Crash McLarson, M.C. Bat Commander, the Mysterious Kyu, Catboy and four other costumed crusaders make up the elite force known as the Aquabats! Are they a collective of superheroes? Well, no, they're more along the lines of characters from a punk-rock comic book. Their music is standard stop-and-

start, three-chord punk topped off by blasts of trumpets and trombones, but their real asset is their sense of humor. The stupendously titled tracks on *The Aquabats! Vs. The Floating Eye Of Death!*, among them "Giant Robot-Birdhead," "The Thing On The Bass Amp" and "Canis Lupus" (which concerns saving the domesticated dog; we wonder how Catboy feels about that one!), are drenched in inspired, moronic lyrics, which the group sings with the fervor of genuine madmen.

Human Patterns (Compost)

The electronic funk and jazz hybrid invented by Munich's Beanfield perfectly combines the old and the new. *Human Patterns*, the group's second full-length, sounds like a classic '60s Blue Note groove album fired into a sleek, '90s dance club. The recording pulses with rump-shaking electronic rhythms and funky, syncopated beats.

Tobias Meggle uses an arsenal of burbling analog keyboards to keep the music focused and interesting. Compost label head Michael Reinboth's formidable DJ skills create panoramic musical atmospheres, but his sampling work never overshadows the group's grasp of history. The

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German trio reanimates the souls of its musical forebears even as its modern grooves get the club kids steppin'. — Tad Hendrickson



The Salty Tang (Archenemy)

This Boston foursome's second album is a twisted, yet thoroughly beguiling mess of form-free pop with jaunty guitar and haunting groans of cello splintering the songs. The disarmingly playful and oddly sinister voice of Leah Callahan is the sweetly unruffled force that holds together these 10 songs, most notably on "Melvin Belron's Wedding" and "Dead Animals."



Guitarist Tom Devaney and drummer Dave Nelson help establish *The Salty Tang*'s richly textured, jazz-like identity, which is fractured by found sounds, random percussion and eerie washes of noise. BLACK WATCH

The King Of Good Intentions (Not Lame)

When your band is led by an English Ph.D. who enjoys playing oddly tuned, windswept pop music, you're probably going to come up with some pretty uncommon songs. The Black Watch's violinist, J'Anna Jacoby, and its guitarist/vocalist, John Andrew Fredrick, play the moody, slowly shifting melodies that gauze over *The King Of Good Intentions*. On the woozy zenith of the

Art-noise jungle? Fractal mathematics-based drum 'n' bass? Electro-acoustic electronica? Oh, forget it. One could invent

COCTEAU TWINS

BBC Sessions (Bella Union-Rykodisc)

For the majority of their 15-year existence, the Cocteau Twins made some of the world's most unique and influential modern rock. Their singularity stemmed from



the chemistry between the angelic acrobatics of vocalist Elizabeth Fraser and the lush, psychedelic dream-pop orchestrations of guitarist Robin Guthrie and bassist Simon Raymonde. The trio almost singlehandedly launched Europe's ethereal pop movement, inspiring such bands as Lush, Slowdive and My Bloody Valentine. This *BBC Sessions* retrospective attempts to chronicle the Scottish outfit's development through two discs of live radio broadcasts spanning the years 1982 to 1996. The material doesn't stray far from the original studio recordings, but Fraser's alien operatics do become more alluring and strangely poignant in a non-studio environment. Unfortunately, the collection, which includes such rarities as recordings from John Peel's radio show and a startling cover of the Billie Holiday chestnut "Strange Fruit," fails to include any material from the band's highly successful '85-'93 period, but it nevertheless remains a rewarding document of the Cocteau Twins legacy.

Violin, Sing The Blues For Me (Old Hat)

Before the guitar became the favored instrumental conduit for heartache, the fiddle was largely responsible for conveying emotional woes. *Violin, Sing The Blues For Me*, a 24-song compilation of original 78s recorded by African-American violinists, documents a moment in American musical history located between the era of string bands and the rise of guitar-based blues. Although songs such as "Baby, Please Don't Go" possess the tempo and melodic structure of classic blues, others, such as the hopped-up, jaunty "Ted's Stomp" betray their string and jug band antecedents.



Aside from its sheer entertainment value — where else are you gonna hear a washboard scrubbed with such rhythmic conviction? — this compilation stands as a reminder of how powerful music was when it was made with only the simplest of tools.

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
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BRUCE SPRINGSTEEN

The River (Columbia-CRG, 1980)



The first concert I ever attended was a 1985 show by Bruce Springsteen & The E Street Band. Go ahead, strip away all my indie/punk cred, but I will not deny the value of the Boss (though I will admit to not being crazy about his nickname). I was nine years old when *The River* arrived in stores. I distinctly remember hearing "Hungry Heart" on the car radio and being a very happy little kid. I had no idea that the song was about a guy running out on his family, but I loved the simplicity of the music. I soon got a copy of the LP — a big ol' double-vinyl album. I played it to death. Today, its gatefold cover is held together with Scotch tape. So what's so special about the work? The answer has been said a million times. The magic behind Bruce is his soiled blue collar. As a Brooklyn-born and -raised woman whose high school-educated, truck-loading father raised her to be proud and strong, and whose mother — while the kids were still of school age — went back to work to help pay the bills, I felt Springsteen's lyrics. So what if they're nostalgic and corny? At least they're honest. *The River* is about real life and real love — not the smarmy Celine Dion drivel, but the love of the average, ordinary Joe. "I would drive all night/Just to buy you some shoes/And to taste your tender charms," Bruce sings. The keyboards, the saxophone, and that sandpaper throat all come together to make guitar rock something special. I guess what I'm trying to say is... *The River*'s got cars, girls, sex, unemployment and alcohol; when you've got a hot band behind you, making all that stuff resonate, well, brother, that's called rock 'n' roll. — Kelso Jacks





During its brief but fulfilling mid-'90s tenure on planet newsstand, *Ego Trip* magazine established itself as the most respected (and feared) publication in hip-hop, the quintessential voice of a generation that dared to attack the wack and bet the bank on the underdog. On November 30, the lauded rag, which also wrote up indie, punk and alternative rock, will make its long-awaited return in the form of *Ego Trip's Book Of Rap Lists*, an urbanized spin on Dave Marsh's *Book Of Rock Lists*. The 352-page tome, which is vying to become rap's ultimate bathroom reader, is veritable packrat's attic of hip-hop knowledge and images. Compiled by former *Ego Trip* editors and renowned hip-hop scribes Sacha Jenkins, Chairman Mao, Gabriel Alvarez, Brent Rollins, and Elliot Wilson (the latter of whom once edited this here section), the publication bites with the satirical sting of the magazine, compacting 25 years of rhymes into such run-downs as Can't Knock The Hustle: Rap Personalities Who Admit To Having Worked At Fast Food Chains; Rejected Titles Of 22 Rap Albums; The 10 Greatest Mix Tapes Of All Time; Rap Movie Soundtracks That Don't Suck; (*Continued on page 31*)



Other Dimensions is a monthly column dedicated to new fringe jazz and improvised releases.



Joe Morris is one of the most innovative jazz guitar players working today. His long, sinuous lines share more in common with the work of saxophone players like David S. Ware than they do with that of other jazz guitarists. The master has released a steady stream of discs throughout the '90s on AUM Fidelity, Soul Note, Knitting Factory, and others. On his first disc for Omnitone, *Underthru* (phone: 718.832.2805; email: jazz@omnitone.com), Morris is joined by violinist Mat Maneri, bassist Chris Lightcap and drummer Gerald Cleaver, who is new to the quartet, subtly under-


pins the group's melodies while simultaneously propelling the overall sound forward. Much has already been said of the symbiotic chemistry between Maneri and Morris, but

their improvisational interplay on *Underthru* manages to supersede their past accomplishments. Maneri's leaping lines and sharp wedges of tone provide the perfect foil to the leader's own probing lines. Of the album's five tunes, only one is under 10 minutes long. But if one takes the time to deal with the 16-minute title track, the rewards are immense. This tour de force is one of the guitarist's most memorable and beautiful songs...When he's not working with his quartet, Morris pursues one-off improv meetings. One such meeting resulted in *Racket Club* (About Time; phone: 781.326.3582). The second installment in Morris's "loud trilogy," the aptly named album finds Morris joined by two horn players, two drummers and a bassist. Where *Underthru* is gentle and cerebral, *Racket Club* is forceful and visceral. Morris attacks his melodic lines with a vengeance, and his backers play with near rock-like intensity. A glorious racket indeed.

Led by percussionist Bill Summers (ex-Headhunters), drummer Jason Marsalis and young trumpet lion Irvin Mayfield, the Hombres Calientes are a major new force in jazz.

13 Pieces (Knitting Factory)

The Other Quartet is an ambitious project that features Ohad Talmor on sax, Russ Johnson on trumpet, Jim Hershman on guitar and Michael Sarin on drums. This free-thinking collective draws upon their broad musical experience; these 13 tunes are an exciting and ear-opening listen.

Billy Milano screams, "Do you wanna fry?" and the sleeve artwork is a culinary goof on the veteran metal band. The B-side, "Raise Your Sword," is a mock o' Manowar's *Mad Max* warrior metal. S.O.D. — hooligans!...New Jersey's Ferret and Trustkill Records joined forces to issue the raw, 24-song *Choice Cuts* hardcore compilation. 



An interview with **The Causey Way**

You'd be hard-pressed to name two more entirely American enterprises than rock 'n' roll and religious cults. The Gainesville, Florida-spawned Causey Way unites those domestic institutions in its self-described "new testament wave" and "pulpit punk." Punctuating Jimmy Swaggart/Stephen Covey-ish theology with Y2K alarmism, the band's new album, *With Loving And Open Arms*, is doing alarmingly well on the CMJ charts.

Long ago, leader Causey, once a professional skateboarder named Scott Stanton, studied guitar with none other than David Koresh. Having severed his ties with the Branch Davidian musician, the Causey eventually developed his own Way and, in 1997, he formed its five-member Aural Communications and Entertainment (ACE) division, which borrows personnel from Servotron and Man Or Astro-Man?. The organization, which denies any cultist allegations, seeks to convert America's youth to the Causey Way. The band, on the phone from the Alternative Tentacles label compound, took a break from touring in order to elucidate its twisted system of belief. Causey revealed himself as something of a troubled soul — a man tormented by personal demons and biscuit powder.

So, what does one have to do to follow the Causey Way?

Causey: First of all, you can donate a love offering of \$150. If you don't have any money, you can give us a talent offering. You could be in our — what the MTV generation calls — "band." A guitar, vocals — any kind of instrument could go toward the ACE. You just basically have to attend a service to believe, and once you do, you will indeed. The Causey conversion rate for this tour has been 95%.

My motivation was completely skewed. I used to do it for the nookie, but Causey gave me a cookie and I saw the light.

Could you tell our readers what a typical show — I mean, service — is like?

Causey: It starts out with hugs. We play spiritual music over a PA system and we get everyone in the mood to touch their souls. Then we approach the stage and basically begin to devastate everyone with our beautiful tones. My guitar tones are the best you've ever heard. Once you get past the tones, we enter into the three-count faith explosion. The crowd joins in, the band joins in, and on the count of three, we all feel the Holy Ghost — we call it "Causey," but if you're from a Pentecostal background, you'd call it the Holy Ghost. I usually try to get at least \$500 from the crowd. Sometimes we won't even continue on with the set until we get \$500. Last night, we had to cut it at two dollars — that was in L.A., where the beautiful people are. They didn't quite feel it there. Although it was a packed house... and we did heal someone with a neck brace.

I'd imagine that you wouldn't want to taint yourself while away from the compound. How do you decide what bands are safe to tour with?

Causey: We make the bands pay us \$250, and if everything goes right, they'll get it back. But the bands are usually Causey members — Servotron and Man Or Astro-Man?.

We'll also tour with Mike Watt, who gave us a love offering. We've also toured with Wesley Willis.

Would you tour with Danielson?

Causey: We'd love to. I would love to get into a theological debate with Danielson. If you could hook that up for us, that would be good.

What's the role of women in the Way?

Causey: Well, obviously the road is not a place for women. [Female keyboard player] Dr. St. Causey is back at the compound overseeing preparations for Y2K, working in the kitchen, doing feminine things. We did fly [female bass player] the Truth into San Francisco — we didn't want her driving.

[Truth, in the background, agrees to whatever Causey says. The leader, who sounds unsettled and claims that he must attend to "label business," hands the phone to his organ player; Button.]

What did you do before this?

Button: I was in the field of rock 'n' roll, but my motivation was completely skewed. I used to do it for the nookie, but Causey gave me a cookie and I saw the light. *[He pauses while he is passed a message.]* Causey's made a proposal that I've never heard before. He's asking if you would like to have a date.

That's against my religion.

Button: That's just mumbo jumbo, isn't it? I think you're gonna have to deliver that message yourself — I could lose a limb. He's never been turned down. *[Scuffle ensues; Causey gets back on the line.]*

Causey: Have you decided whether you want to go out with me or not?

[silence]

Causey: See, that's why we can't have women in this organization. They start fouling me up, when we got these serious things like Y2K to worry about... This isn't normally how we conduct this recruit... *[In an ominously flat voice, as if someone has flipped a switch.]* We went on a fast when we were recording the record. The only thing we ate was biscuit powder... Are you laughing at me again?... I'm sorry, I'm sorry. Don't make me kill myself.

Vital Statistics

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KEITH MOERER

Music Editor-In-Chief, Amazon.com

What site features are customers demanding?

The "search" function is a very important tool for Amazon.com's visitors in general. I can't give you breakdowns or statistics, but a lot of people come to the site and they either know that they want to buy a CD or they know they are interested in a particular artist and do a search. People will look on the album detail page and read the reviews, read customer reviews in some cases, listen to song samples, etc., so reviews are clearly a very important part of what we do. Another extremely important and successful feature on the site is our recommendation center. That's a section on our site that allows music fans to really look at our editors' recommended recordings sliced and diced a lot of different ways.

What future trends do you see for online music?

Well, I really think that digital downloads are going to continue to be important as a promotional tool to help sell physical CDs. Clearly, over the course of the next few years, digital downloads are also going to be a major component of the music industry in terms of the way that music fans and customers buy music as well. The digital delivery of music is going to be, in some ways, the biggest technological change during the next few years.

How has your free music download area evolved?

We launched in June with about 18 digital downloads — mostly major label artists at that time, although there were a few independent artists. Now we offer more than 120 digital downloads. It's really a mix at this point of major label artists, artists with independent deals and our New Music Spotlight, which is largely independent artists who've either self-released CDs or are signed to small, independent labels and don't have access to worldwide distribution. We're making the music of independent artists who are shut out of commercial radio instantly accessible to millions of potential music fans and buyers. I think that's going to be an important part of Amazon.com's offerings.

Have there been any success stories to date?

An example that immediately comes to mind is a techno/pop artist named Fisher. At one point, I think she was 662 on our sales ranking. When you consider that we have more than 300,000 titles, the ability of an independent artist like Fisher to sell as well as she has at this stage of her career without access to commercial radio [is] really phenomenal.

Will Amazon increasingly focus on independent artists?

Absolutely. Amazon.com is committed to helping independent artists, authors and publishers to distribute their works, particularly with digital downloads. I think there's another opportunity that we're just starting to explore but will continue to expand in a major way. Independent artists and labels typically complain about two things. One is that they're shut out of commercial radio play, though certainly college radio plays a key role in helping to build the buzz and give exposure to independent artists. The other complaint is that even if they get their CDs in stores, exposing a large number of people to their music is very, very difficult.

So what are you listening to these days?

I listen to all kinds of things. [I like] Cesaria Evora, who's a great singer from Cape Verde with a new album that's just really wonderful. Yesterday I [listened] to Magnetic Fields' *69 Love Songs* about three times in a row. I actually think the new Fiona Apple album is really quite good. I'm also listening to Astor Piazzolla, who's an Argentinean tango musician. And I really love the Moby album *Play*. It's really an amazing album.

Keith Moerer knows his music. As the editor-in-chief for the music side of Internet retail behemoth Amazon.com, he is responsible for all of the site's related content. Thirteen years of editorial experience with publications such as *Rolling Stone* and *Request* have prepared him to meet the challenges of maintaining fresh and innovative music content in an increasingly competitive industry. CMJ talked to Moerer about Amazon's latest editorial endeavors and site features.

So Amazon.com has its own editorial staff?

We have what I believe is the largest music editorial staff on the Web. We have 15 music editors, most of whom have music specialties. We have a jazz editor, a classical editor, a dance/DJ editor, etc.

Why have your own editorial staff? Why not just license content from other sites and publications?

I suppose the main reason is that based on the experience of the book site — what Amazon customers have told us consistently both for books and music, and I'm sure this is also true with video as well — they look first and foremost for an Amazon.com review. I think we present editorial and reviews in such a way that music fans can discover great music.

Is the average visitor concerned with the background of your editors?

For some visitors to the site, knowing the qualifications of our writers and editors is very important. I suspect for some visitors, they're going purely on our recommendations without necessarily caring about bylines. That certainly would be true of any print publication as well.
