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

HOT CHART ACTION: THE AVALANCHES HOLD DOWN RADIO 200, PINQ MOST ADDED

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
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

NO DOUBT

Rock Steady (Interscope)

The three musicians in No Doubt must have a Jan Brady complex; much of the Cali group's fame has revolved around the platinum blonde life of infinitely stylish lead singer (and Gavin Rossdale paramour) Gwen Stefani. It's always Gwen, Gwen, Gwen! *Rock Steady* doesn't do much to shift the spotlight away from Stefani. Over the past 15 years, No Doubt's sonic style has shifted as many times as Stefani has changed her lipstick. Last year's *Return Of Saturn* said sayonara to the string of ubiquitous pop-ska singles from 1995's *Tragic Kingdom* that made them bigger than the devil. *Rock Steady* is almost a misnomer, since it's largely easy-on-the-ears electro-pop — this is a dance album that would make even Madonna proud. For the most part, digital keyboards share space with New Wave-lite guitar riffs and Stefani's sugared vocals on tracks like "Hey Baby," "Detective" and "Making Out." Each song has a list of production credits longer than your arm, and big-name producers like Ric Ocasek and William Orbit lend their talents on *Rock Steady*, giving it a towering pop sheen. Stefani's no longer "just a girl," but a woman who's staked her claim as the quintessential pop diva. — **Amy Sciarretto**



WU-TANG CLAN

Wu-Tang Iron Flag (Loud-Columbia-CRG)

Lately musicians have been paying their respects to New York City by performing songs subconsciously emblazoned with a giant "I ♥ NY" banner. But for Wu-Tang Clan, the Big Apple is a double-edged sword, nurturing art whilst suppressing freedoms. *Iron Flag* is the Wu's first album recorded in New York since its 1993 debut, and it's also the group's most relentless — a constant pummel thick with grime and duality, using the grunge of the streets as inspiration for bewildering rhymes and clobbering beats. Although filthy rich for years, Wu opens with a chaotic look at street violence, followed by "Rules," on which Ghostface Killah angrily emotes about the WTC like someone encroached on his turf. And while many simulate street grit through painstakingly crafted laptop "glitch," RZA still works organically, using samples that lethargically drag tempos, like the incredible bongo break on "Soul Power (Black Jungle)." Here, a frantic Flavor Flav (a brilliant substitute for the incarcerated O.D.B.) chats extensively with Method Man about Long Island heritage. The pulsating one-note insistence of "Radioactive (Four Assassins)" is Cannibal Ox-meets-Bomb Squad, wherein U.F.O. noise devolves into radio static. At its roughest point, a paranoid Meth actually stops spitting rhymes — to literally spit! Raw, they give it to you. No trivia. — **Christopher R. Weingarten**



Word Of Mouf (Def Jam-IDJMG)

Ludacris' new album has so much Southern bounce on it, you could use it to play handball. But despite its fun feel, this album is far from being one-dimensional. With production primarily by Shondrae (Timbaland, Swiss Beatz, Jazze Pha and Organized Noize also contribute), the album bounds through requisite Dirty South beat change-ups and backbeats with refreshing ease. Not surprisingly, the Swizz Beatz track "Cry Babies (Oh No)" has a DMX feel (replete with barking), while Timbaland's "Rollout" is embellished with a touch of 1980s synth and some Jazze Pha funk. Yet not once does the gravelly voiced Ludacris have difficulty maneuvering through the different styles. He's as comfortable running the musical bases as he is spinning tales about the ghetto, his childhood, the trappings of fame, ho's and uh, more ho's; his crazy sense of humor is all over the place ("Freaky Thangs," "Coming 2 America" and perhaps the best cut and most well-known track, "Area Codes"). Possibly the most impressive thing about this album is that the skits are actually pretty funny — another testament to this wacky hip-hop star who obviously doesn't take himself *too* seriously (how rare is that?). Although singles "Area Codes" and "Rollout" have been out since summer, listeners shouldn't assume they've heard all there is to hear on *Word Of Mouf*. — **Lisa Hageman**

GET UP KIDS

Eudora (Vagrant)

If you're salivating in anticipation of the new album from current emo darlings the Get Up Kids, you're going to have to wait a few more months. In the meantime, let *Eudora* tide you over. Named after the Kansas town where the record was compiled and mixed, *Eudora* is a collection of 17 unreleased, out-of-print or new versions of songs that originally appeared on various 7-inches and compilations over the last six years, including The Kids' very first 7-inch, "Breathing Method" b/w "Shorty." Much to their credit, even this early work holds up well when compared to the collection's more recent tracks, such as the alternate version of "I'm A Loner Dottie, A Rebel;" as a result, *Eudora* sounds surprisingly cohesive for a compilation. Highlights include the band's raved-up indie pop-punk treatments of classics like Bowie's "Suffragette City," The Cure's "Close to Me," New Order's "Regret," The Pixies' "Alec Eiffel," Mötley Crüe's "On With The Show," and The Replacements' "Beer For Breakfast." But this is much more than a collection of cheesy covers — even so, don't let the stylish interpretations distract you from rare original gems like the anthemic "Central Standard Time" and the refreshingly somber strains of piano and cello on "Newfound Mass."

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QUITTERS SOME-TIMES WIN

Significant changes in the offices of the corporations that run the two biggest major labels: in recent weeks, AOL Time Warner's Gerald M. Levin and Vivendi Universal's Edgar Bronfman Jr. have announced that they will step down from their high perches at the two companies. Levin's successor as chief executive at AOL TW will be Richard D. Parsons, who edged out co-chief operating officer Robert W. Pittman, the man who founded MTV; Pittman will retain his position with AOL TW.

Bronfman was chief executive of Seagram when the company oversaw one of the music industry's most seismic consolidations in the late '90s, when Universal, Polygram and Geffen were folded into the Universal label. French company Vivendi bought Seagram last year, and it was rumored that Bronfman was unhappy with his new role as No. 2. No replacement has been named.

In a parting letter to employees, Bronfman pledged support for chief executive Jean-Marie Messier. "I feel comfortable that with the company on such a strong footing and making excellent progress, now is the right time for me to pursue new challenges."

AOL TW's Warner Music and Vivendi's Universal account for a combined 43 percent of record sales in the United States, with Universal edging Warner by 26.9 percent to 16.3 percent, according to figures cited in the *New York Times*.

KILLING US, BUT NOT SOFTLY

The early-'90s compilation series on Kill Rock Stars pretty much laid out that decade's underground/indie/alt-rock framework, and still has repercussions today. Interscope signee And You Will Know Us By The Trail Of Dead had its roots as Mukilteo Fairies, whose

track "We Are Not Your Entertainers" appeared on the 1994 finale to the three-part series, *Rock Stars Kill*. Other artists who contributed to the discs include Nirvana, Unwound, the Melvins, Team Dresch, Boredoms, Rancid, Smog and Kathleen Hanna.

Why are we telling you all this? Because label head Slim Moon sends word that Kill Rock Stars is assembling another groundbreaking compilation. The plan is for a May 7, 2002 release, which will feature all-new songs on two CDs, with up to 50 bands and solo artists participating. Moon released a list of some of those who've already completed their songs, including Olympia hard rockers C Average, Chicago punk-poppers the Dishes, Atlanta garage bashers the Rock*A*Teens and Quasi, who deliver a cover of Curtis Mayfield's "Queen

Los Lone Maverick

Raul Malo leaves the comforts of the Maverick's cult adoration for the big sky world of solo-dom

“Andrea Bocelli had that huge hit, and no one knew what he was singing.”

New York City's Irving Plaza is different this night. Chairs cover much of the main floor, giving the club that “special evening with” feel — a rare setup for an artist who has just launched his first solo album. But Raul Malo is hardly an unproven newcomer. As the lead singer for the Grammy-winning band the Mavericks and a contributor to the Grammy-nominated ethno-supergroup Los Super Seven, Malo has established himself as a star among discerning fans of rock, country and public-radio pop. With a sweet yet booming voice that places him somewhere between roots rocker and Vegas crooner, Malo manages to deliver songs with both punch and swing. It doesn't take more than a song or two into his recently released debut, *Today* (Higher Octave–Virgin), for his band — which includes Santana percussionist Alberto Salas — to establish a solid groove that's sweetly decorated with Latin beats. Chairs are pushed to the side as the once-passive audience stands up and begins to get into the show.

“It's something that I've wanted to do for a long time,” Malo, who's calling from his tour stop in Austin, says of going solo. “I didn't want people to think of this as a whim for me or that I woke up one day and said, ‘I'm going to do this kind of record,’” he says, emphasizing the importance of making a distinct break from his former band.

“This isn't a side project. If anything, the Mavericks or anything else I do now is a side project. We're not enemies, but we are broken up. That doesn't mean that we won't get back together one day and make a record. But right now I'm having way too much fun.”

While the Mavericks, who juggled country, rock and other styles, placed few limits on what Malo could do, *Today* affords him an uninhibited means of purely expressing his influences and tastes. This includes Latin material similar to what was heard on the Los Super Seven record. “I wanted to put Spanish songs on the album and do a Spanish album,” he notes. “But when this record started to take shape, I started writing all these songs in English that had a Latin feel to them.”

“I guess it's kind of a hybrid,” he says, drawing parallels to his own upbringing in Miami by a Cuban father and a mother who was a


classical pianist. “I don't pretend to be a Latin singer by any means, but I surely appreciate all that stuff that I grew up listening to. [Percussionist] Salas, who is very traditional, especially in his approach to Latin music, was always saying ‘You don't do that in Latin music.’ And I'd say ‘Well, we're doing it now.’”

In many ways, a mixed-styles album like *Today* runs up against many of the same crossover problems that Mavericks records encountered, but Malo is encouraged by the welcome he's received so far. “A lot of people know who I am, but this is really starting over and I'm enjoying that, because you don't have the baggage of ‘It's too country for this’ or ‘Too rock for that’ that I had with the Mavericks,” he explains. “We're getting great reception at Adult Contemporary and Triple A, but to me this record is really a pop record.”

“It has certain Latin elements and four songs in Spanish, but it's so subjective,” he argues about what can wind up being popular. “Andrea Bocelli had that huge hit, and no one knew what he was singing.”

Shelby Lynne, another singer/songwriter who traverses pop and country styles and has had similar struggles and success with that approach, joined Malo for “It Takes Two To Tango,” a clear highlight of *Today*. “She's definitely been an inspiration as someone who's been on the inside and the outside of Nashville and gone on her way to bigger and better things,” he muses. “In many ways I feel the same way, even though I had a lot of fun and success in Nashville. The Mavericks did more than most people thought we would; I mean, we were a country band from Miami with a singer named Raul, for chrissakes! But Nashville is used to doing things a certain way, and I don't feel like I'm connected musically in a way there.”

If not Nashville, then perhaps Hollywood. The title track from *Today* will be featured in the upcoming Disney film *Snow Dogs*, providing this musical underdog another possible avenue for success. And after Hollywood, there's always Vegas. “One of my secret fantasies is that in my golden years of entertaining, I want to do two shows a day at the Mirage,” he confesses. “A matinee and then an evening show for the adults.” Wonder if the seats at the Mirage can be moved to make room for dancing? **NMR**



BEN WA

Disciples Of Retro-Tech

(Stray)

Don't let the title fool you; *Disciples Of Retro-Tech* is about as retro as Pokemon. Instead, the bulk of the second full-length from Bay-Area duo Ben Wa surfs the choppy waves that ripple from the Great Funky Breaks Tsunami of the late-'90s.

The Chemical Brothers have left the most apparent mark on Dr. Ware and Butthouse's sound, to the point where it renders their other influences (primarily funksters like Parliament, as well as old-school hip-hop) as just an undercurrent. It's a deceptively strong tide, though, and responsible for the album's high points. Both the electro "Bad Robot," with its rubbery, paisley guitar riff, and "Dangerous Place," which contains a liberal (though uncredited) sample of Public Enemy's "Fight The Power," stand out as utter realizations of Ben Wa's delicate synthesis. However, it's only during the album's latter, more breakdance-worthy electro, that we truly realize what they've been telling us all along: Ben Wa have balls.

Halve The Light

(Scarlet Shame)

As the clear, bittersweet cry of pedal steel opens *Halve The Light* marooned atop slow drums and acoustic guitar, it's tempting to pigeonhole New York City singer/songwriter Paul Brill as just another alt-country heartbreaker. But

you'd only be half-right. The man also happens to know a few things about rock and pop, making his eight-song debut a richly textured statement that buoys his late-night lamplight sound with enough hooks to carry you through until morning. "Maybelline" sports the sad, sweet slacker charm of fellow New Yorkers Clem Snide, while "Start It Again" has a distinctly pop feel that evokes the lighter side of indie rock luminaries Built To Spill. Throughout it all, however, Brill's commanding performance is consistently affecting, allowing the listener to feel the particular pathos behind every song. So before you attempt to listen to the beautifully dejected tones of "Love Survives Us All," it may be wise to lock up your liquor cabinet and hide the key.

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

Alive With Pleasure


(No Alternative)

A Minneapolis singer/songwriter with a scathing wit to match his hometown's biting cold, Dylan Hicks is an unsung hero among today's tired pouty boy crooners. Never one to feel much pity for himself, Hicks — whose 1998 release *Poughkeepsie*

was a sparkling demo of smart wordplay and pop sensibility — instead chooses to take aim at humanity's golden children: buff frat guys, snooty indie chicks and rock stars, to name a few. Through it all, Hicks' gentle rasp gives his characters a pleasant 3-D feel as his guitar gallops along; "My Best Friend" and "City Lights" embrace lyrical depth and musical texture. Though goofy tunes such as "College Boys" and "All The Rock Star Jobs Are Taken" aren't likely to endure through the ages, Hicks' sentiment is in the right place — the latter even promises his lover that he's happier crawling into bed with her than he ever would be in a band. Spry and full of rootsy pop tunes waiting to happen, hopefully Hicks is one performer who doesn't abandon his musical dreams.

DAYNA KURTZ

Postcards From Downtown

(Kismet)

Postcards From Downtown is Dayna Kurtz's first studio record, but the Paterson, New Jersey singer/songwriter has been getting positive press for years thanks to her hard work on the road. Most recently,

she's been teaming up with the legendary Richie Havens, who makes a guest appearance here. It'd be a mistake to see "singer/songwriter" and just assume that Kurtz was just another folk-inspired strummer; her songs play with sophisticated strands of jazz, blues and folk without ever being complicated. "Fred Astaire" begins the disc with as much grace as the dance icon, as accordion and strings waltz amid the lovelorn tune. Her strong, smoky voice powers "Last Good Taste," a slow-burning tune that smolders as well as anything Diana Krall's ever done. Some songs unwind like little dramas by employing dense lyrical imagery, but Kurtz manages to be intense even on a tune like "Love Gets In The Way" that sounds so direct and effortless you'd guess it was a standard.

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LITTLE GRIZZLY

I'd Be Lying If I Said I Wasn't Scared (Quality Park)

Much like young filmmaker Harmony Korine composes unflinching shots of rednecks, insufferable squalor and verbal abuse in his visions of small-town America, Little Grizzly creator George Neal inspects

life's underbelly while reserving judgment. The talented singer — whose voice holds the engaging cracks and creaks of Wayne Coyne and the fervor of Modest Mouse's Isaac Brock — reels out beerhall anthems of "poor townie scum," riverside rapes and Pogues-like tragedy on the Texan quintet's latest. Between the stark guitars ("Today Is The Day") and tightly stitched tunes filled with organic percussion and trilling tempos ("Keeping Her Head About It"), Little Grizzly is busy trafficking in some mighty heavy subject matter. And more power to 'em: this is an album crafted with care, from the old-timey love ballads ("Charlotte") to poignant twilight epic freakouts ("She's Away"). Neal, who spent a year and a half recording the record, has created something for serious music fans and folk fetishists alike. Think of this as the soundtrack *Gummo* never had.

WILLARD GRANT CONSPIRACY/TELEFUNK

In the Fishtank

(Konkurrent-Touch And Go)

As singer in the rootsy Willard Grant Conspiracy, Robert Fisher details life in America's shadowy corners, describing the drunks and deviants like a musical

Raymond Carver. Surprisingly, he also produced two records for Dutch rock band the Cords, whose two primary members went on to start the electronic project Telefunk. As musically divergent as their paths may be, Telefunk's Simone Pieters-Holsbeek and Arnoudt D. Pieters invited Fisher and the WGC to team up for an *In The Fishtank* session. Rather than add electronic beats to their American friend's songs, both sides got to choose three traditionalals, which they then interpreted on acoustic instruments with Pieters adding the subtlest of mechanical shadings. The collaborators rework the winding "Cuckoo" to include rich acoustic bass and a breathy narrative, and the bluegrass favorite "Dig A Hole In The Meadow" becomes a slow, sultry lament. "Glug Glug" is the highlight, though, deftly mixing old-time and modern sounds; too bad they didn't get to do more.

But I just want you all to know that the past seven years have been fun and I've enjoyed working with you. I depart with a smile. Will I be back? Eh, I have my thoughts. But only time will tell. And so... stay metal... live in peace..." We'll miss the LD — who wears at least one piece of cowhide, even in August — and he might be gone (for now) but certainly won't be forgotten.

INDUSTRY PROFILE

CHUCK BILLY SPEAKS

Testament frontman Chuck Billy is battling a form of cancer that settled in his chest, near his heart. He's recovering from open-heart surgery, but he's bored so he wanted to just do interviews and talk to people. Here's what he said:

On downtime:

I am trying to pass the time. I haven't gone anywhere or done anything. I couldn't be around people when my counts were low. After surgery, I can't lift anything or do much with my arms, saw my chest open to get inside me, stitched it back up with titanium wire, takes six months to heal.

On Music Therapy:

I'm working on music, listening to new songs and coming up with lyrics for them for Testament, and I am working on a side project with Steve DiGiorgio of Sadist. It doesn't have a name yet, but we're writing music and don't have a drummer or guitar player.

On hairlessness:

I finished chemo in August. I was completely bald; [my hair] all fell out but it's growing back fast now. That was the hardest part. It's a heavy trade-off. I lost everything; I had no eyebrows and didn't shave for three or four months.

If he's healthy, here's what 2002 will bring:

I hope to get back on track, on the road, put out a good record and keep it going because we have a strong lineup. Years before that, we were hiring musicians, and now we have a locked lineup.

On getting in touch with his Native American roots:

I went to Indian medicine men. It was a spiritual experience, going back to [my] Native American heritage. I went to a sweat lodge, had a ceremonial healing with a fire pit, went to mountains and went to a direct descendent of Geronimo to heal me, [saw] untamed wolves roaming property. If he was meant to see you, the wolves let you pass. [who is 'he'? god? A spirit? The wolf?] If not, the wolves will growl. I had a strong mind



and was positive the whole time and believe that the tumor is shrinking. It was the size of a squash, they couldn't operate, and were surprised it didn't erupt and kill me instantly. I learned techniques to make myself believe it was shrinking and it all worked. This will all manifest itself in lyrics big time, since so many ideas and feelings that I want to express, trying to write songs about things that really happened. My dad has been sick the past few years; I wrote about that, but it wasn't my own experiences. [Now] I've got more personal material to talk about.

sums of money (usually on eBay) to obtain a copy of this much sought-after early work. Mudvayne wants to protect its fans from Internet music piracy and from bootleggers making loot off of their passion and inability to secure old material. That's one gold star on the band's report card. More importantly, a lot of headbangers had dismissed Mudvayne's *L.D. 50* as a mere gimmick because its members wear face paint and were nationally exposed by Slipknot. That's a shame, because they're ignoring the fact that the Peoria, Illinois band features some immensely talented players. The Mudvaynians cranked it back in the day — before Epic snatched them up — like Korn caught in a vice grip with Slipknot. Pit bull riffs abound on "Seed," "Some Assembly Required," "Fear" and the future evolution remix of *L.D.*'s "Dig," which broke Mudvayne at MTV and radio.





Wave Motion (Mush)

Wave Motion is the first full-length instrumental release from Fat Jon, perhaps best known for his association with the Five Deez. A mellow, jazzy album, Jon adds embellishments like various vocal samples (i.e. KRS-One in "Watch Out") and snippets of familiar instrumentation over emphasized bass lines (it is, after all, hip-hop), which enables him to avoid the instrumental album pitfall of overused melodic lines. At times, the album can be a little too smooooooooth jazz-y with its ethereal effects — the relatively harder, edgier tracks resonate more — but overall, hip-hop fans used to dissecting lyrics will enjoy the new challenge of picking apart the sounds in this multi-layered labor of love. Big Boi And Dre Present...Outkast (Arista)

If there's one good thing to have been culled from the whole lounge beats phenomenon, it's that it has broadened the language and appeal of DJ and electronic music, turning into an open-armed celebration of all things less frenetic and giving jazz and hip-hop heads a sonic entrance to a "new thing." Of course it's weird that DJ booths are now set up in hotel foyers and spa waiting rooms full of \$1,000 suits, but better mellow grooves played by a DJ than Muzak over cheap speakers, right? Or have the two just become part of the same thing? Following in

the footsteps of the phenomenal *Buddha Bar* series, the two-disc *Paris Lounge* and *Berlin Lounge* compilations draw the distinctions between the musical vibes produced and admired by the martini-swilling sets in two of Europe's cultural capitals, showing off the down-tempo and upbeat tastes of each scene and the musical differences between 'em.

With Paris being the more international and diverse town, it makes sense that its *Lounge* mixes would reflect the daring and the different — the Argentine-bred Gotan Project's smoky chanson dub, DJ Cam's weeded-out Gallic hip-hop, Le Tone sticking a Billie Holiday vocal over quirky leftfield beats, a classic early-'60s Jeanne Moreau ditty — sounding like what might happen if Gilles Peterson's *Worldwide* took to the City of Lights. When the Parisians hit the *Lounge*'s dancefloor, they tend to do so to the strains of jazz-infected, organic-meets-electronic hybrids of the St. Germain or "flute loop" school — sort of a Disco 2001 take on Austin Powers' shagadelic parties. Always fun, always groovy, bay-bee!

Berlin Lounge mavens sip from a different kind of mellow. The fun is less obvious in their soundtracks, the chords played far closer to the ambient jazz of Eno and Cluster's dreams, and "global influences" usually mean cribbing Brazilian and the Afro-Caribbean vibes and the slinky, poly-rhythmic clatter of Latin music. German lounge also inevitably leads to two labels: Munich's Compost and Nürnberg's Stereo Deluxe, whose artists and catalogs make up a lion's share of Berlin Lounge. Of course, every once in a while they do find the funk: De-Phazz swings on a great Prince-ly one, Boozoo Bajou spins a psychedelic soul-jazz tapestry and DJ Spinna's remix of Terranova's "Midnight Melodic" is a fresh breath of hip-hop soul on a mix that could stand more of them.

But maybe the compilers were saving those for *Vienna Lounge*, which should inevitably be on the horizon.

When Saúl Hernández, leader of Mexican supergroup Jaguares, recently took the stage after an intermission, he appeared holding an acoustic guitar while the nearly packed house affectionately sang out “culero” to goad him to play more. “This about a man who is in love with a prostitute — a seller of illusions,” he said in Spanish, introducing the song “Convertirse En Alcohol” (“To Turn Into Alcohol”). While he strummed the Pink Floyd-like dirge from Jaguares’ previous incarnation, the exalted proggy-rock band Caifanes, fans chimed in at the top of

their lungs, almost drowning out Hernández’s high, keening voice. There were plenty of other Caifanes hits (at least in Mexico) throughout the set,



evoking a good sense of the band’s history. Now a trio — including guitarist Cesar El Vampiro López (Manás’ first

guitarist) and drummer Alfonso André (an original Caifanes) — Jaguares has had a revolving cast of players both on and off stage. After two post-Caifanes albums, on which the Hernández and André took time to re-establish an identity minus celebrated guitarist Alejandro Marcovich, Jaguares released the epic arena-rock album *Cuando La Sangre Galopa* (“when blood gallops”), earlier this year; it’s already a bestseller. No longer the outsider, El Vampiro reveled in this newfound confidence at New York City’s Hammerstein Ballroom on Nov. 25, soaring through Stevie Ray Vaughn-

inspired workouts. When not moshing to some of the harder-rocking moments that recalled The Cult’s slow-grinding tracks, the audience held on to Hernández’s every word. Like the indigenous Mexican symbols tattooed on Hernández’s arms, his layered lyrics hold pre-Columbia themes, Rumi-esque affections and urban surrealism seem to have been born with him. After draping a fan’s Mexican flag over his mic, he dedicated the brooding song “Tu Reino” to the working-class raza, muffling his voice until El Vampiro’s power chords kicked in for the chorus, “This is your kingdom.”



’60s-inspired Brit-pop, Beach Boys rock, go-go pop and Os Mutantes escapades. A No. 1 hit in Argentine radio, “Como Estamos Hoy” is a Kinks-like jingle that builds to a bluesy two-chord riff for the catchy chorus “How are we today?” “Otro Día En La Vida” (“Another Day In Life”), rich with cotton-candy harmonies, groggy melodies energized by exclamatory phrases and a weepy guitar solo, obviously pays homage to *Sgt. Pepper*. Three vocalists — drummer Person, guitarist Mario Barassi and bassist Fernando Blanco — take turns behind the mic singing songs they penned. Guests include members of La Mosca Tse-Tse, Los Pericos and Los Auténticos Decadentes, who together brought horns, strings, clavichord and the *bandeón* (Argentine accordion) to add more luster to Juanchi’s (Pericos) already radiant production. And Jorge Maronna, guitarist for Les Luthiers, Argentina’s infamous Monty Python-esque troupe of singer/actors, picked through the bossa nova rock song “Cosas Perdidas” (“Lost Things”). Lyrically, Super Ratones tend to navigate through a maze of metaphors that take snipes at social injustices and human beings’ frequent lack of humanity. On the solemn ballad “Ricky,” Person utilizes a steel-string guitar to narrate the tale of losing his friend to heroin. *Mancha Registrada* is mighty nice, and thankfully, there’s no cheese to be found in this mouse house.



Vancouver, British Columbia's DJ Meta4 (a.k.a. Ian Menzies, former A&R man for Wicklow Records) has assembled — and sequenced so carefully it plays like a mix CD — some burning global grooves. While Bebel Gilberto and Natacha Atlas are the well-known names, they're actually the weakest,

compared to some throw-down hip-hop from Sultana (Turkey's answer to Lauryn Hill) or the hyper tabla 'n' bass of Karsh Kale's "Chilla," which is better than anything on his solo album. Meta4 blends the fiery Middle Eastern *oud* and beats of Smadj into the Colombian dance frenzy of Sidestepper and makes it a perfect fit, while his own "Silk Road Samba" leaps tall boundaries like Superman. House to hip-hop, electronica to ethnobeat, this shows the world is becoming a very small place indeed — and it's getting together on the dancefloor.

Q&A

Latin pop sells in vast quantities, but it's outshone at the tills by something far more obscure: Mexican *corridos*, a type of broadside ballad with a polka beat. However, since the vast majority of the corrido tapes and CDs are never SoundScanned, you won't find them on any charts. And the most popular form of corrido? Narcocorridos, songs of the drug trafficking trade. Writer Elijah Wald has examined the genre in his new book, *Narcocorrido: A Journey Into The Heart Of Drugs, Guns And Guerrillas* (Rayo, \$24).

What prompted you to write the book?

I wrote a piece for the *Boston Globe* and became fascinated. I spent about eight months researching in Mexico, and a little more time in the southwestern United States, then took about a year to write it.

While narcocorridos are the most popular, there are other styles of corrido.

The vast majority of the corridos written in the last 20 years are about the drug traffic. The rest are socially conscious corridos, often at a local level. The big money is around a limited number of themes about drugs. The analogy between this stuff and rap isn't far-fetched, to the point where the L.A. corridos guys are just now including one or two rap cuts in English on their corrido releases. The average corrido buyer in the American Southwest is buying narcocorridos and gangsta rap.

So where might the corrido go in the future?

There isn't one answer. In L.A. it could be a bilingual corrido-rap fusion. The street corrido guys have virtually no interest in rock en español. But then there are the musicians who play on buses in Acapulco. That stuff's not about drugs, and it's hardly changed in 100 years, and it probably won't change much soon.

The Hated Music (Ecstatic Yod)

This improvisational recording from saxophonist Flaherty and drummer Corsano snuck out with little fanfare, but there is nothing quiet about the music of these backwoods Northeasterners. Six high-octane performances are rattled off, revealing a paint-peeling intensity in Flaherty's

playing that is both rough-sounding (think Peter Brotzmann) and prone to lengthy excursions that seldom leave him or the listener time to breath. Corsano is right there with him, rolling like a freight train pumping out a mighty but unsteady rhythm that seldom flags. As a duo, their chemistry is palpable and there is an intrinsic trust where each shines brightly, but never eclipses the other, instead egging each other down one ferocious passage after another. Squeals and explosions, thinking less and working more — yes it can work.

BILLIE HOLIDAY

Lady Day: The Complete Billie Holiday On Columbia 1933-1944 (Columbia Legacy)

As one of the greatest singers of all time, no one deserves a lavish box set more than Billie Holiday. Every Holiday fan has their preferences as to which version they prefer, either the young, fun-loving party girl full of moxie or the later-era queen who'd been around the block too many times and had left everything but her soul on the street.

Either way, Holiday was a musician who was able to transcend on so many different levels. Not a prolific writer, she had that rare ability to take practically any song and turn it into a song about her. When she sang a lyric, she took it and twisted and stretched it to her needs, basically rewriting the whole thing, melody and all, into something that seemed incredibly personal. It's a cliché, but she seemed to live those songs, and (sadly) those hard-times blues numbers were oftentimes all too true.

This box focuses on the early years, starting with her first recording (with Benny Goodman) and goes up through an all-star jam recorded as a victory disc sent out to the armed forces. Of the 230 tracks on this 10-disc box, there are a 153 master takes recorded for Columbia, Brunswick, Vocalion, OKeh and Harmony records. Of the 77 outtakes, radio broadcasts, airchecks and rarities, 35 of the tracks have never been released domestically.


The music is obviously the important component but Legacy, with its usual flair for packaging, surpassed itself in the packaging of this project. The whole set is encompassed in what looks like a photo album. Inside, there is a full sized picture book with essays by noted critic Gary Giddins and Holiday biographer Farah Griffin, as well as track analysis and session background information by project producer Michael Brooks. Of course there are tons of cool pictures and memorabilia. All in all, there's enough to look at and read to fill the hours spent going through the discs.

MADE IN AMERICA A ROUSING SUCCESS


Ostensibly, Made In America was a benefit held by the newly-formed jazz alliance to raise money for the victims and heroes of Sept. 11 tragedy. But it was a statement by the jazz community. The event came together in light of the fact that jazz, arguably New York City's signature music, was not represented at any of the myriad music fundraisers held this fall. The line-up was awesome, with one once in a lifetime band after another doing a song or two. Even amongst all the highlights, k.d. lang backed by Joshua Redman, Brad Mehldau, Christian McBride and Brian Blade was absolutely sublime. More troubling were the rumors swirling just hours before the performance: ticket sales had been sluggish and there really wasn't much publicity of the event outside the jazz community. There were whispers of frustration about the Jazz Alliance (a new group of jazz industry captains whose mission is to increase jazz's profile) not being able to make decisions about the event, thus allowing for a well-laid out plan. In typical jazz fashion, it all came together in the end, making for a great night of music where more than \$250,000 was raised for the Robin Hood foundation.

COPE WITH IT

This business constantly amazes me. The independent retail sector has been under fire for so long they feel like they've been living in Tora Bora, Afghanistan under U.S. bombing. Yes, we have our coalitions—CIMS, LINCS, the DMRC and Music Monitor Network, along with a number of local and regional urban coalitions—but the fact remains that these coalitions do little for the rest of the independent music retailers. Don't get me wrong, I'm sure most have seen the trade publication that recently paid tribute to CIMS. It was well done and told the story about how a group of stores got together and became a powerhouse in the music industry. Good accounts run by smart people = successful coalition. Many said CIMS would never last, but of course they are the same ones now standing in line to buy into CIMS programs. The idea with many labels is that if you've covered one or two of the coalitions, you've covered independent retail—and that's the problem.

The real story is with all those accounts that have no affiliations—

good, strong retailers that labels don't hit when they push that "coalition button." Of course, these are also the same accounts that label A&R departments spend thousands of dollars using SoundScan's Robo A&R program, to try and find out what they are selling and what the next big thing breaking locally is, so they can scoop them up and sell billions.

There is an opportunity coming up at NARM this year with AFIM (which has now officially joined with NARM) in representing the independent sector. As an indie retailer I would encourage participation with NARM/AFIM. You may need them and they need you. This isn't just about coalitions; it's about survival of a species—the independent retailer. We will cover more on the upcoming events surrounding NARM/AFIM in future issues, but in the meantime, surf over to either websites at Narm.com or AFIM.com and take a look.

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SPEAK OUT

We got so many comments from retailers sounding off and summing up their 2001 thoughts, we thought we'd kick it off with the always articulate Bruce Godwin and continue with retailer-perspectives into our Year-End issue.

Bruce Godwin, Record Rack, Houston

Why do labels self-fulfill the singles prophecy? Singles don't sell, so we won't make them available—because they aren't available and don't sell! Gee that's smart. I understand singles are low profit for labels, but they are high profit margin for the retailers. I realize the

whole idea is to sell albums, but don't expect people to stop downloading their favorite remix if the labels don't make it for sale to the consumer. HELLO. It doesn't take a genius to see this policy is stupid. Why can't the labels issue more limited edition maxi CD singles at \$7.98 list? Sony has done several, but then foolishly only put one long mix on them! Pop/Dance buyers want the 12" remix they play in clubs and on the radio. Customers will buy Maxi CD Singles only if they are in stores. Labels are dumbfounded when consumers download the

songs for free, well THAT'S THE REASON WHY IDIOTS! Nothing's available.

If I wanted the new Madonna Mega Mix (which Warner's did not put on her GHV2 CD), I would try to find it free online. The label pays tens of thousands to have it mixed, then presses the single with full artwork as a promo, and then doesn't release it. Doesn't it make more sense to press 20,000 more while they're at it and sell them? Wouldn't that pay for the expense of the remixes that are done to promote the full CD sale? What is

the point in making Ebay and collectors money? People would have bought 50,000 more Madonna GHV2 if it just had one extra mix on it (Madonna fans already have every Madonna CD). The label could have sold thousands of CD Maxis at \$7.98, but no, Warner's did neither. Marketing is at the hands of overpaid execs who have no clue what customers want. Executives stop eating your expensive lunch at the Peninsula for one hour and go ask people in store what they want to buy! If you don't, you get what you deserve, low sales, then we're ALL fucked.

So we all know Beggars, right? Home to 4AD, Beggars Banquet, Mo'Wax, XL Recordings, Wijiia, Too Pure, Sulfur, Mantra and some of the greatest music in the last quarter century. Beggars U.S.A. is off to a great start this century as well. Born six years ago as the stateside heir of its now 24-year-old U.K. parent, the American branch of Beggars is clearly coming into its own.

We also know that powerhouse Brit sales and media adoration don't necessarily take root on Yankee retail soil. But last year's Beggars U.S.A. stateside campaign for Badly Drawn Boy's *Hour Of Bewilderbeast* (XL Recordings) has proven it can be done by an indie. (2001 has now seen sales of *Bewilderbeast* come in over the 100,000 mark). Beggars worked the CD for more than a year, which is how they choose to do business. Artist development stateside is a Beggars commitment — and it's paying off. Their smaller developing artists (Hefner, Delgados) are beginning to move as many as 10,000 copies per release, and their mid-tiers (i.e. Kristin Hersh) are coming in with totals of more than 25,000.

Beggars is in the unique position of releasing amazing catalog and reissues in addition to their new artist releases here in the States. Last year's *Pure Cult: The Singles 1984-1995* has come in at a respectable 85,000 (U.S.), and the label's six-CD Christmas box set has already pushed over 12,000. February will see the release of three new Love and Rockets reissues, and 2003 holds the hint of acquiring Pixies catalog rights. We're not even scratching the surface yet.

Independent retail is key to all Beggars growing successes, according to Lesley Bleakley (Beggars Group VP). "Independents are essential for doing business in the U.S. and for breaking our new artists," she notes. "They've been so good to us, and we try to nurture those relationships as much as we can." Beggars is very hands-on in micro-managing those relationships as well. At Beggars, the college and commercial radio people actually coordinate with their sales staff, who then call and talk to every account where a college and/or commercial radio story occurs. The label is often very generous in supporting in-store performances.

Current breakout markets for Beggars include San Francisco, New York City, Seattle, L.A., Boston, Baltimore and Washington, D.C. Watch for new releases from Tanya Donelly (ex-Throwing Muses) and Neil Halstead (Mojave 3) in the new year. Beggars artist-friendly slant, enviable indie roster and increasing U.S. sales won't keep them under the radar very much longer.




Are you currently on the air?

I hope we're on the air. If we're not, it's because either Rhyan went outside to smoke, or Brant fell asleep in the control room, or Greg was fooling around with the software, or Rusty's flirting with chicks, or probably because Joey broke something.

How many watts is your station? How many people do you reach?

91-ONE is 8,500 watts. Our antenna height is 716 feet and our part of Louisiana is an extremely flat terrain so our signal goes far for a college station. Our total market is just under 400,000 people. Because we stream, we reach people in faraway places like Europe, Australia and even East Timor. Locally, Arbitron calculated our best audience at 16,000 people! Pretty cool, huh?!

What's the station's motto/your personal programming philosophy?

It was Rock Ass Radio. Our faculty advisor/station manager got tired of hearing it because the word 'ass' was in it. So basically the motto now is simply "RAWK." My personal philosophy is to just push out the best music we can get our hands on. We all try to promote local artists as well as cater to the bizarre and unique musical artists worldwide.

How long have you been MD? How do you abuse your power?

I have been MD since July of 2001. I'll hopefully stay MD until I graduate in the spring of 2002. I like to think of the connections that I make, and the perks that I get, and all of the powers granted to me are used to benefit the station, my staff and maybe... my band called MAROON. Ha!

What do you do to build your station's audience?

Our station has always been a leader in college radio. The audience that we have today was built by the legacy that is 91-ONE - KXUL. I take no credit alone; I'm just another weirdo in line to carry the rock radio torch.

Who are you most proud of bringing by the station?

I think I'm most proud of bringing Shiner to town. They came here, killed the fatted calf and punished the masses. They are very appreciative of the spins we give them. They rule.

Are you on the air? What kind of show do you do?

I do the Top 40 countdown every Saturday night from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. in a show called Music Trax. Our Top 40 is excellent; we are very proud of it.

Have you ever had sex (or done something equally as naughty) in the booth?

How about 10 times as naughty? One time... I can't do this... sorry, I'm just too close to graduation.

What's the best use for a CD other than for storing music?

I'm a big fan of hurling them at people I don't like. They work like throwing stars. See, look, there goes your mom... whoosh... ouch!

Does your station still play vinyl?

We mainly play 8-track cassettes. Just kidding, to tell you the truth, we record music from just about every medium onto a massive hard-drive system. Don't get me wrong, we love vinyl, but does the medium really matter anymore?

Why did you go into college radio?

I'm on this planet for one reason — to rock. Ya hear me? The free discs are great, though.

What's your major?

Radio, television and film, with a minor in hallucinogens. Can I get a job at CMJ with this degree? [Ed. Note: Hell, Yeah!]

If you could see anyone live (dead or living), who would it be and why?

One word response: Plexi. What the hell

happened to Plexi? They were the coolest rock band of the '90s. They had it all; awesome songs, a seamless and frothy psychedelic scary album called *Cheer Up*, and a deal that jumped from SubPop, to Lava, and then to Atlantic. I never caught not even one of their shows and to be honest it frustrates me so much that I could kill myself. I found the members' phone numbers and I call them all on a regular basis to harass them and tell them to get back together. They have recently begun to recognize my number on their caller ID. They stopped answering the phone. God, I love Plexi. I wish I could see one of their shows. Just one. Please.

What's your favorite Behind The Music episode?

The Smashing Pumpkins documentaries are always the best. It's so fun to see Billy Corgan whine and bitch about how hard his life is. What makes him moan so much? Is it really that difficult to wake up in the morning and look at Billy Corgan in the mirror? Get a life, Billy.
