

Loss (XL-Beggars Group)


While music has already veered well into the mine of new wave and dance via the electroclash scene and its many offshoots, few souls have had the wherewithal to bring back the pop sounds of the once-derided era. Presenting Colin MacIntyre, the man behind Mull Historical Society, and the soul brave enough to release a single called "Watching Xanadu" — a song that not only proudly references a cultural touchstone of '80s film (it starred Olivia Newton John, for gosh sakes), but goes on to make you love it for far more than kitsch value. With a fondness for simple, catchy song structures, MacIntyre uses his guitar, the occasional choir, and, almost as a signature, lots of bells, to create consistently unforgettable bursts of flashback fun. Not that it's all completely retro; echoes of today abound in the glitches and often twisted turns of tune, and an overall anti-corporate-globalization theme in the lyrics strikes a very modern chord. Check out "Barcode Bypass" to hear the number that got rave reviews rolling in the Scottish rabble rousers' native U.K., or try the sing-songy "Animal Cannabus" — but only if you don't mind having a refrain stuck in your head for weeks to come. — **Doug Levy**


The Night Garden (Reflowered) (E-Magine Entertainment)

Imagine falling asleep one night only to find yourself waking up the next morning in the thickest cloud of cumulus cannabis. Ladies and gentlemen, you've just entered Waldeck's *Night Garden*. On this hazy journey, Vienna's Klaus Waldeck enlists the world's most gifted mixaholics to puff away at his classic tracks. The erotic Mushroom Dive remix of "This Isn't Maybe" sets the mood as a hazy lullaby that consumes the body with dreamy textures. Meanwhile, Kid Loco transforms "I Talk To The Wind" into 2002's version of Groove Armada's crowning achievement, "At The River," while Matthew Herbert adds his signature choppy house sound to "Tears Running Dry Part II." Key vocal contributions from Brian Amos and former Incognito member Joy Malcolm add a rich layer of pure sensuality that will put you in a very naughty mood — nearly daring you to try and keep your clothes on. Additional manipulations by Dubblestandart and Urbs lead to a nightmarish Jung Collective remix of the David Bowie-penned "Cat People Dub," which is constructed with the sampling of purring cats. *The Night Garden (Reflowered)* is an inspiring project at a time when record store shelves are littered with commercial remix fodder.

I'm Coming Home (Misra)


St. Thomas is the moniker used by Norwegian folk hero Thomas Hansen and his ever-changing backup group, which can range in members from two to 10 people. Incorporating banjos, fiddles, harmonica, organ and soft snare brushes into his delicate blend of guitar plucks and a quivering falsetto that is sure to bring many Neil Young comparisons, Hansen forges a collection of backwoods country tunes that could just as easily make themselves at home on the range. *I'm Coming Home* marks St. Thomas' first dabble on U.S. soil, despite the fact that Hansen's a virtual pop star back home — he spent much of 2001 in the Norwegian Top 10. Even though these 12 tracks are undeniably country, each has a fragile pop quality that causes the listener to want to hold these beautiful hymns close to their heart. Upbeat opener "The Cool Song" seems the perfect campfire anthem, complete with sing-along choruses and harmonica bursts. "Take A Dance With Me" is a harrowing tale of a man trapped by fear and loneliness ("So come on get along, hang out with me... take a dance with me") that features brooding violins and a banjo melody that makes you want to bring Hansen into your circle of friends. Even though this will be St. Thomas' first time in the States, this Norwegian cowboy truly is *Coming Home*.

One More In The Cabin (Overcoat)

Do you still doubt the supernatural allure of bluegrass? Well, we have one piece of evidence for you: *O Brother, Where Art Thou?* Obviously, after the enormous sales success of that Grammy Award-winning soundtrack, 2001 will go down as the year that banjos and fiddles became more popular than a seedy massage parlor at 3:00 in the morning. That said, the timing is perfect for a band like Jim And Jennie And The Pinetops. Piloted by singer/guitarist Jim Krewson and singer/songwriter Jennie Benford (who also plays a bitchin' mandolin), the talented ensemble is a traditional bluegrass outfit from Philadelphia that formed in 1997. Aside from mercifully expanding the City Of Brotherly Love's cultural contributions beyond cheesesteaks and soft pretzels (we could probably throw *Rocky* in there, too), this group spits out savory 'grass (calm down, Bongzilla). We mean bluegrass) as if it is possessed by the spirit of Bill Monroe himself. *One More In The Cabin* is a 14-track collection of originals that boasts many highlights, including "Driving Rain," the title track, "Elmore Mountain Road" and "The Road To Paradise." — Kevin Boyce

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INDUSTRY NEWS

It's official! According to recently released figures by the International Federation Of The Phonographic Industry, the recorded music industry worldwide posted a 5 percent drop in value and a 6.5 percent decline in units sold last year as the sales of CDs dipped for the first time since the format's inception in 1983. As glum as that sounds, the global record biz still saw \$33.7 billion in profits on total unit sales of 3.2 billion last year. The IFPI says surveys show that mass copying and illegal Internet downloading of music (most notably in the U.S. and Germany) is directly responsible for the worldwide profit decline. • In addition to the hotly contested royalty fees the U.S. Copyright Office is considering for streaming broadcasters, the government office is also considering proposed rules for reporting the play of streamed music by online broadcasters. In case you haven't heard, here is a list of things you may be required by law to report for each song streamed in the near future: name of the service; the channel (call letters) of the program; date of transmission; time of transmission; time zone of original transmission; numeric designation of the place of the sound recording within the program; duration of transmission; sound recording title; the ISRC code of the recording; the album's year of release; featured recording artist; retail album title; record label; the UPC code on the recording; the recording's catalog number; the copyright owner information; and finally, the musical genre (format) of the channel or program. (Phew! Pass the aspirin!). The fed office will hold a public roundtable discussion on the proposed rules on May 10. We'll keep you posted! • NYC-based music and entertainment company StarPolish is branching

out in artist management with the signing of its first client, electronic pop act Casino.

LABEL NEWS

Shaev's No. 2, Sr./VP Promotion

Joel Klaiman will be in total control of Epic's promotion department by the time Shaev heads downtown to Virgin's new offices after May 31. • Lost Highway Sr. VP/Promotion And Marketing Chris Stacey exits for a new, as yet unnamed, venture. • Former Maverick Sr. VP/Promotion Ric Lippincott has been announced at the new National Promotion Director at Immergent Records, the new home of Dishwalla. • Chicago-based Victory Records founder/owner Tony Brummel has sold a non-controlling 25 percent of his label to MCA. • Former NBA player James "Hollywood" Robinson is launching Da Dirty South Records. The label's first release, Don Dada's *My Life, My Pain*, is scheduled to come out this summer. • Octone Records, owned by J Records VP A&R/Marketing James Diener, has secured distribution through BMG. Up first for Octone is the June 25 debut release of L.A.'s Maroon5. • Joan Osborne's Womanly Hips Records has signed a worldwide exclusive deal with Compendia Music Group. Look for Joan's new album, also called *Womanly Hips*, to be released on Aug. 27.

MUSIC NEWS

The music world has suffered two more tragic losses in recent weeks, with the deaths of Alice In Chains singer Layne Staley and former Spring Heeled Jack drummer Dave Karcich. Staley is reported to have been dead for two weeks before his body was discovered at home in Seattle. Although the cause of death couldn't be immediately determined pending toxicity test results, a police spokesman confirmed the presence of drug paraphernalia at the scene and said foul play was not suspected. The vocalist, who was a major influence on modern music with his dark, brooding delivery and angst-filled lyrics, fought a long and high profile battle with drug addiction throughout his career. Alice In Chains was one of the most popular bands of the early to mid-'90s, achieving multi-platinum status with its 1992 sophomore album, *Dirt*. Staley was 34. • Dave Karcich was best known to fans as the drummer of popular ska band Spring Heeled Jack, but had recently joined up with a new outfit, Avoid One Thing. The band was gearing up to tour in support of its debut album when Karcich, 28, suffered a brain aneurysm on April 2. He died three days later without regaining consciousness. A website in his memory, which allows fans and friends to post their condolences and memories, has been erected at <http://www.geocities.com/shjdave/SHJDave.html>. • Ryan Adams is back at it again. Not only is the inexhaustible rocker once more hard at work, he's also managed to outdo the Strokes, who did nothing of note this week, at making news. Adams is reported to have hit the studio to begin work on the follow-up to his breakthrough album, *Gold*. Good news for the fans, except that it comes with the caveat that the new sessions will delay the planned summer release of a number of demo albums. Adams was also on hand for the big Willie Nelson

tribute concert in Nashville on April 14, where he performed with Nelson, Keith Richards and Hank Williams III under the moniker of the Lost Highwaymen. The four covered the Rolling Stones' "Dead Flowers," with Adams returning later in the show to join Nelson for a take on Jimmy Cliff's "The Harder They Come." As for why Adams sported a large bandage on his chin at the concert, it was either due to a fight or a stage diving incident the night before, depending on which report you believe. The star-studded spectacle is set to air on the USA network on May 27. • In non-Ryan news, the Sex Pistols are set to get back together again, but they won't be playing at the Queen's Golden Jubilee in June, as speculated. The punk pioneers will perform later in the summer instead, with a July 21 show at the Crystal Palace National Sports Stadium in London eyed as a strong possibility. A rerelease of once-banned single "God Save The Queen" will still go ahead in time for the Jubilee celebrations, though, which include two days of performances at Buckingham Palace. A staggering 2 million or more people have applied for the 24,000 tickets available for the shows. We mean it, man. • Radiohead drummer Phil Selway has raised over \$30,000 to benefit the Samaritans, a British charity organization, by running in the London marathon on April 14. The money came from sponsors, who were able to pledge through an online form on the band's website. While the outpouring of goodwill from Radiohead fans is heartwarming, the chance to win the drum kit Selway used on *OK Computer* may have contributed a bit to their eagerness to get involved. • A photograph taken by Yoko Ono in 1980 following the murder of John Lennon, has raised over \$10,000 in a London auction. The photo, featuring Lennon's glasses covered in blood, is one of only six prints in existence. The image has also

been used in the U.S. to support a campaign against guns. • Former Verve frontman Richard Ashcroft has become quite flustered following the recent theft of a vintage guitar. Apparently, he's ready to kill someone. The BBC's Radio 1 reports that the singer delivered this statement for the benefit of the guilty party: "Whoever you are out there eating your syrup on toast

strumming it, wherever you are kidda, you can safely take the guitar back to Virgin Records and nothing will be done, or you can find yourself floating in the River Mersey in approximately two weeks. Thank you. Love and peace." • Dave Grohl is taking a break from work on the new Foo Fighters album to rejoin his current favorite band, Queens Of The Stone Age, on drums. Grohl performed the majority of the stickman duties on *Songs For The Deaf*, the new album on the way from QOTSA, and now, after promising to perform with both the Queens and the Foos at the Coachella festival on April 27-28, he's set to join the band on the road for their summer tour as well. As a result, the projected release date of the next Foo Fighters album has been pushed back to September. • Rancid members Tim Armstrong and Matt Freeman have teamed with blink-182 drummer Travis Barker to form the Transplants, a side project that promises a mix of drum 'n' bass and punk. The group will

also release an album in September on the Armstrong-owned Hellcat Records, which will also feature Tim's wife, the Distillers' Brody Armstrong. • Also coming your way: The next Red Hot Chili Peppers album, due in June, will be called *By The Way*. The band is currently finishing up work on the record with producer Rick Rubin; the Charlatics U.K. will release a retrospective DVD to accompany their b-sides album, *Songs From The Other Side*, on June 18. Both the CD and the DVD, titled *Just Lookin' 1990-1997*, will be put out by Beggars, with both covering the same eight-year period, during which the band was signed to the label in the U.S.; the first stage of the Cranberries' career will be encapsulated on May 14 with *Treasure Box: The Complete Sessions 1991-1999*, a box set including the group's first four albums in expanded form, with a number of b-sides and remixes added to each disc; the second Coldplay album, hitting shelves this summer, will be called *A Rush Of Blood To The Head*. Singer Chris Martin has commented that the record could be the band's swan song. "As far as I'm concerned this will be the last one we ever make," Martin told NME. "But I hope that one day we have some more songs"; the London Suede has also revealed the title of its new album, which had been previously dubbed *Subject To Nicotine Stains*. The album, scheduled for a September release, will actually be called *A New Morning*; Ash, whose *Free All Angels* is finally seeing a U.S. release on Kinetic, is also looking towards the possibility of a greatest hits collection in the near future, to celebrate its 10 years as a band. • In brief: The British Phonographic Industry (BPI) has launched an official investigation into the leak of tracks from the upcoming Oasis album, *Heathen Chemistry*, onto the Internet. Meanwhile, the band is insisting the versions circulating online are not the

final mixes; Mercury Rev has scheduled a series of four West Coast shows for mid-June, including dates in San Diego, Los Angeles, San Francisco and Seattle; a pair of tribute shows for the late Joey Ramone are scheduled to take place in New York on May 19, which would have been the star's 51st birthday. The shows will take place at NYC's Bowery Ballroom and CBGB; Pink Floyd legend Roger Waters went ahead as planned with a show in Beirut, Lebanon on April 17, despite the current unrest in the Middle East. The show, which featured a career-spanning set list, drew a crowd of nearly 6,000. • Finally, while this week's strangest story could have been the announcement of the upcoming tour teaming former Van Halen singers David Lee Roth and Sammy Hagar, but that's been completely trumped by the revelation that

VIRGIN'S TYSON HALLER: Sometimes Nice Guys Finish First

Everyone who has worked with Tyson Haller of Virgin Records knows that he is one of the most honest, personable and hard-working people in the industry today. But what we wanted to find out was how this former choirboy from St. Louis — and Washington University graduate who dreamed of becoming an Air Force pilot — made it to the big city, and where he plans to go from here.

Haller first sunk his teeth into the music industry as a DJ for Washington University's KWUR, co-hosting an electronica show on Sunday mornings from 3 a.m. to 6 a.m. with his buddy Mike Stein. It was love at first spin. Although his school didn't allow freshmen to take internships for credit, Haller convinced the head of the music business program at Elmhurst College in Chicago to find him a position somewhere, *anywhere*. During his summer in Chicago as an intern with Atlantic Records, he met the head of sales and marketing, who said he could use some "unofficial" college rep help in

St. Louis doing flyers and posters at record stores. Haller says this was "the turning point." From there, he went on to working at a local retail outlet called Streetside Records and running errands for acts performing at local clubs. "I got to meet Jakob Dylan from the Wallflowers, I had to make fake blood for GWAR and I had to buy the extra-extra long pantyhose for the Type O Negative guy and the extra large condoms for the Type O Negative guy. That was an interesting job."

Already a smooth talker, Haller convinced his school to give him credit for his internship at Atlantic and one he did at Virgin Records (totally unrelated to his present position) in London, where he lived during a semester abroad in order to add a music minor to his double major in Marketing and International Business. After getting in touch with Chris Elles and Mike DePippa, who ran the Elektra college rep department and gave him an official position, Haller says he was living the dream. "From St. Louis, it's kind of a big deal," he says. "You're talking to



someone in New York City every week, doing conference calls. It was awesome. So I was doing that, doing the record store thing and the clubs thing so I was living the dream. I was eating, breathing, sleeping the music business. I never really thought that term was realistic but it really was. I was seriously dreaming the music business. It's stupid but... a simple thing like picking up my spoon and eating my cereal was like a next step for me in the music business. I really, really thought about it. Everything I did was that next step. My college rep thing, I acted like it was a salary paid job. I'm the Elektra guy in St. Louis... that was my mentality."

Upon graduation, Haller took Elles up on his invitation to come up to the Big Apple for the CMJ Music Marathon and interview for one of two assistant jobs that had just recently opened up at Elektra. "I had to make a decision, how I was gonna handle it, if I got the job etc., he says. "Chris said I could do this internship with them so if I didn't get the job, I'd still be there as an intern for the summer and hopefully, during the summer, something else would open up. If not, I'd go back home. But I was determined that there was no way they weren't gonna hire me."

Haller landed in New York, luggage in hand, on Sept. 4, 1997, after assuring his mother he was getting paid for the internship when, in fact, he wasn't. He says she never would've let him go if she had known the truth. After two interviews, Haller landed a job at Elektra assisting with tour marketing. "The next day, I called my mom and told her to watch the *Today Show* and I went down to [the outside of the studio] where they have the crowd and I wrote on a cardboard box 'Mom, I got the job and I'm not coming home.' I held it up and she saw it. It was a big deal.

"There's a Pet Shop Boys line that really hits it for me in the song "Being Boring," and it goes something like 'I never dreamt that I'd get to be/ The creature that I always meant to be' and at that moment, it really hit me. This kid from St. Louis gets to New York City. It was only the first step." And he never looked back. Haller believes part of his success in the business comes from the amount of respect he gives other people, in addition to his unbridled interest in the music he works. "Every phone call I get, however useless it may be or off the mark, or if I'm not the right person, I try to call them back," Haller notes. "It may not be on their time, but I promise to call them back. Every question is legitimate, even if they're asking about a band that's not on Virgin. I don't want to put them in limbo. I'll get back to them, eventually, 100 percent of the time. I think that's a big thing."

"I try to give everyone the respect they deserve and hopefully they feel that. I didn't take this job, I didn't want this job *just* so I could work in the music business. I actually wanted to do be a part of something. In that sense, I don't really want to throw stuff out there I don't really care about or don't want to learn about."

Asked about the present state of college radio, Haller says, "I definitely think there has been a shift in college radio since I started working in it four years ago. I think I came right at the end of a certain phase that I wasn't really a part of but I kind of hear stories about. It was more of a community between the stations and the labels a lot more than there is today... The way I see it now, I think it's a very relative format. I think it means less than it did 10 years ago, but I think it's critical right now for developing a base for a band in general. I can just see from bands that I've worked with, like B.R.M.C., when I started the first six months of the project where I was pretty much the main radio engine for that record — coupled with touring and press and that was probably it. As far as nationally, that was the main push, and obviously there was a reputation and a buzz created through that [campaign]. It wasn't maybe seen in sales for that band but the word got out, across the nation."

"That's what college radio does; it starts a story, it starts a base that you need to start from. It also gives bands a lot of credibility because people don't always see Top 40 audiences being particular music heads. And no matter if people know what college radio is about, they see that audience as being at the forefront of music, being into music and knowing about music. When you achieve success at that format, that band is associated with that credibility."

Haller says he is hoping to continue his career in radio promotion, perhaps as a Senior Director of a commercial format someday. Whatever he does, however, he plans to bring his enthusiasm, his honest Midwestern values and his creativity to the table. "There's a lot of jaded people in this business," he muses. "I'd like to bring a certain naïvete with me, because people will see my passion and I think they will react better to what I'm offering them. It gets down to being more about money at higher levels and hopefully I can be creative with that money. The more I learn, the more creative I can be, the more passion I can bring to the table." **NMR**



SUSANA BACA

Espíritu Vivo (Luaka Bop)
It's more correct to refer to Peru's Susana Baca simply as a world-class singer rather than "diva." There's nothing showy or egomaniacal about her luxurious voice as it wraps itself around equally warm, inviting arrangements of Afro-Peruvian

groove. Recorded in NYC in the wake of 9/11, her third CD, *Espíritu Vivo* welcomed a small audience into the studio; ultimately, her generous approach to music is about communicating with the listener. Intimacy and groove is what attracts players like guitarist Marc Ribot and keyboardist John Medeski to add their downtown spice to the seductive sway laid down by Baca's native band with hand drums, bass and more. Two cover versions reveal much about Baca's artistic desires and motives. Caetano Veloso's "13 De Mayo," expresses both cultural pride and pure musical joy with its call-and-response chorus and lively Latin rhythm. More daring is a haunting take on Björk's "Anchor Song," which proves that so-called "traditional" music can also weave in new ideas and move the music towards the future.

CITIZEN BIRD

Citizen Bird (Stinky)

On the anthemic "Joy," Citizen Bird's lead singer Simon Ohlsson chants, "It's just a simple thing that you call joy" about the pure bliss of hearing a great song. These nutty Swedish art-school grads have a few of joyful moments of their own on their ebullient

stateside debut. The self-titled album harnesses the triumphant energy of a Detroit rock band with a thoughtful, experimental weirdness that's reminiscent of the Flaming Lips. Citizen Bird's strength lies in weaving together songs with a string of well-crafted moments, sometimes dark and hazy and at other times, as sunny as spring. The snappy "Grasshopper" bounces along with a chirpy melody, while "People Get Real" is replete with Ohlsson's hushed crooning, swirling guitars and a pregnant bass line. But the keyboardist is the hardest working Citizen in this band. Psychedelic sweeps and flourishes from an amped-up organ are layered over fuzzy guitars and real(!) drums to drive all the songs toward a series of joyous peaks. — Amy Wan

CROOKED FINGERS

Reservoir Songs EP (Merge)
Cover records are traditionally pretty painful. Of course, Eric Bachmann isn't like most people, so you can rest assured that *Reservoir Songs* is nothing short of amazing. As perhaps no other artist in indie rock could have done, the ex-Archers Of Loaf

frontman tackled songs by legends like Kris Kristofferson, Prince and Neil Diamond — all without even the faintest hint of irony. He courageously tries his hand at Kristofferson's "Sunday Morning Coming Down," turning it into a droning, keyboard-driven dirge. On Neil Diamond's "Solitary Man," Bachmann adopts his throatiest voice and sings over a bed of banjo-plucking and light drumming. Results are similar throughout the disc, which includes the band's haunting take on Bruce Springsteen's "The River," a stripped-down cover of Prince's "When U Were Mine," and an interpretation of Queen and David Bowie's "Under Pressure" — a version, mind you, during which they somehow manage to steer clear of the song's famous bassline. Bachmann gets points for presenting these songs in such a light that they'll appeal to people who may not have been interested in the originals.

Creatures (SpinART)

Like a Chia Pet that sprouts just when you've given up on the power of terra cotta and seed goo, Elf Power is a late-blooming, pleasant surprise. For years, the Athens, Georgia imps played the psychedelic fuzz-pop expected from the Elephant Six Collective. E6's evolution into a

nebulous entity has liberated the Elves, and they're finally channeling the magic that frontman Andrew Rieger always sings about. *Creatures* integrates the ballsy darkness it dropped on 2000's *The Winter Is Coming*, with vintage Elfin guitar-pop. Happily, the band's songwriting has hurdled the "chasm of cloy" that seemed so vast a few years ago. "Let The Serpent Sleep" bounces to a groove as kaleidoscopic as anything Elf Power has released, yet it's more relaxed and assured. "The Modern Mind" proves that the band's ability to write moving songs about monsters and mysticism deserves to be patented. Less a band that makes concept records than a concept in and of itself, Elf Power's growth refutes any notion that it's been dwarfed for life.

Tremulant


(Gold Standard Laboratories) The Mars Volta is a supergroup formed from a supergroup. Singer Cedric Bixler and guitarist Omar Rodriguez are former members of indie rock's now-defunct saviors, At The Drive-In. Featuring ex-members of Long Beach Dub Allstars and

Royal Trux, it's no surprise that Mars Volta recalls and yet sounds completely different than At The Drive-In, save Bixler's fingerprint-distinct, high-pitched passionate wail. *Tremulant* is three songs of quirkily timed rock, harmonically distorted guitars and weird bits of reverb and electronic loops woven in for a decidedly space-rock vibe. Actually, the way *Tremulant* most resembles ATDI is in its fervent, obvious desire to shatter boundaries and not allow itself to follow any easily digestible formula. The EP emerges with indie cred fully intact, and also has hints of dub reggae and swinging '70s riffs on "Cut That City." As a result, three songs have so much going on within them that they feel like an entire album. You might be exhausted by the time

"Eunuch Provocateur" closes out, but you'll be satisfied.

(Blind Pig) If you don't find yourself stompin' some part of your anatomy while listening to this CD, get yourself to a doctor and tell him you've lost your will to live. And get a transfusion fast so you can appreciate this album, which marks

Mooney's return to Blind Pig Records, where he'd originally been signed a little over two decades ago. He returns a seasoned veteran, his blues natural and sincere with vocals as potent as 20-year-old single malt scotch and guitars (steel and electric) with more soul than a barrelful of crawfish. Gotham


(Gern Blandsten) Radio 4's *Gotham* pays homage to a pre-Sept. 11 city, but further explores the syncopated, dance-infused facade of early '80s British post-punk bands like The Clash and Gang Of Four. Similar to its Washington, D.C. counterparts Dismemberment Plan, the

band's sophomore follow-up to rhythmic jaunt *The New Song And Dance* merges nostalgic spurts of scratchy guitar, floor-thumping beats and funk-heavy basslines. Production team Death From Above (The Rapture, Turing Machine) takes the band to higher levels of dance-club credibility, and political disco rockers "Eyes Wide Open" and "Calling All Enthusiasts" include snazzy percussive loops. Lyrics range from anecdotes about casual affairs in Brooklyn to proclamations of neo-Marxist discourse ("The ideas of the ruling class should not be the ruling ideas"). Over


STARLET

Does the world need another Smiths? Hasn't Morrissey moped enough for the world? Naysayers be damned, on its third full-length, Sweden's Starlet dishes up melancholy, contemplative and, yes, Smithsy guitar pop. Singer Jonas

Färm's vocals are often a dead ringer for Morrissey, and when they're not, they conjure other mopers like Martin Gore and Robert Smith. Sonically, the acoustic strumming, "jingle-jangle" electric guitars and keyboard wash is just as familiar as a worn Cure t-shirt. Still, sounding familiar doesn't mean Starlet sucks — the group is just taking the good stuff from good bands and mixin' it into a tasty paste. Tino's Breaks, Volumes 1 & 2 (Tino Corp.)

Originally packaged as two separate LPs, *Tino's Breaks 1 And 2* have since been consolidated into a single CD that's jam-packed with all you need to know about the drums. Although essentially a guided tour through a drum kit (and

originally intended as an "instructional" CD), Tino's added touches (like the Charlie's Angels theme sample in "Kick Exercise," TV dialogue and movie snippets, etc.) create complete funky, layered grooves rather than a one-dimensional, dry, instructional "How To Play Drums In 10 Easy Lessons" kind of record, like those that taught dances back in the day. Tino makes his way from basic funk grooves, through hip-hop and back out to Latin rhythms, throwing in DJ elements like scratching every now and then, giving added weight to the theory that it's the beat that makes a song as practically every track on this record is guaranteed to get bodies moving, even in the tightest of spaces. Also included on the record are Tino's new track "Jazz Overload" and previously unreleased remixes by Golden Chyld/Fuse 1 and Faust and Shortee. Simplicity reigns on this record, and not one thing is missing. — **Lisa Hageman**

TROUBLE WITH SWEENEY


Play Karen And Others (Basement Life)

Everyone knows that rock journalists all desperately yearn to be rock stars, and that those who try generally embarrass themselves. What then of Joey Sweeney, who writes about rock

and life and anything else that crosses his mind for the *Philadelphia Weekly*? Spin the new record from the Trouble With Sweeney, and it's clear: Joey's a musician, and his writing just keeps his mind moving when he's not crafting songs. The chorus of "Karen" sticks on your brain like a remora sucking on a passing shark — try to not hum it for days, we dare you. The intro to "Most Of It's Mine" channels Hall And Oates's "Maneater," but that's a compliment; it has the same feverishly loveable draw, just minus the cheese factor. Most of *Play Karen And Others* has the spirit of the best '80s pop, all bouncy choruses and saccharine melodies. But Sweeney has the good indie-rock sense to keep the sheen to a minimum and infuse some folksy, almost alt-countryish moods that steer his songs away from the Lite FM doldrums.

Life and Death Of An American Fourtracker (Barsuk)

John Vanderslice's newest pop opera, *Life And Death Of An American Fourtracker* introduces the Holden Caulfield of bedroom four-track recordings. Weaving the saga of the eccentric ex-boyfriend of his sister into a psy-

chedelic odyssey, Vanderslice re-imagines art rock for the modern age. Sheding the typical prog-rock pitfall of overplaying, this album instead relies on production craftsmanship and individual vision. Musically, the album floats and morphs as intoxicatingly as a film score, while his emotive voice acts out the roles in this sublime suburban fable. Vanderslice's affinity for analog recording in his own Tiny Telephone studio gives *Life And Death* a homespun feel while achieving a lush, vibrant sound. The love song to equipment, "Me And My 424," should make readers of *Tape-Op* and gear heads everywhere weep. Themes of alienation and creative oddity combined with the concept-album format make Pete Townsend and Roger Waters comparisons inevitable. However, the lack of pretension and high-school

theatrics insure no one will be referencing laughable attempts at the story album such as Styx's *Kilroy Was Here*.

ALICE IN CHAINS' LAYNE STALEY: 1967-2002



Rock music suffered a devastating blow when Alice In Chains vocalist Layne Staley was found dead in Seattle on April 19. He was 34.

Responding to a call to check on a person's well being, police discovered the body on Friday evening at Staley's apartment in Seattle's University District. Following an autopsy by the King County Medical Examiner, the deceased, who was reportedly not immediately recognized because the body had begun to decompose, was positively identified as Staley on April 20. The *Seattle Post-Intelligencer* reported on April 22 that Staley "lay dead in his North Seattle apartment for two weeks, his body surrounded by heroin-injection paraphernalia."

While it is widely believed that his longtime struggle with drug dependency was the contributing factor in his demise, laboratory results that would determine the exact cause and time of Staley's death are still pending and could take several weeks. "It was natural death or an overdose — that's the way it was determined by our investigators," Seattle Police Department spokesman Duane Fish told CNN.

Born in Kirkland, Washington in 1967, Staley

formed Alice In Chains while still in high school. By the time his creative equal in the band, guitarist Jerry Cantrell, joined in 1987, Alice In Chains was gradually moving away from its pop-metal origins into darker musical territory and was signed by Columbia Records in 1989. With drummer Sean Kinney and original bassist Mike Starr (who was replaced by Mike Inez in 1992) completing its lineup, Alice In Chains became a fundamental piece of the grunge puzzle — which also included Seattle's Nirvana, Pearl Jam, Screaming Trees and Soundgarden — that inundated America in the early '90s.

The band's debut, *Facelift*, which features the rock radio staple "Man In The Box," was released in 1990 and promptly went gold. In 1992, the group followed *Facelift* with a five-song EP, *Sap*, and soon after landed one of its more popular tracks, "Would?," on the soundtrack for the Cameron Crowe film *Singles*. Coincidentally, "Would?" was partially inspired by Andrew Wood, vocalist for the pre-Pearl Jam outfit Mother Love Bone, who died of a heroin overdose in 1990.

Alice In Chains peaked in September of 1992 when it

released its brilliant sophomore outing, *Dirt*. A solemn album that is lyrically centered on the gloomy realities of drug addiction, *Dirt* was defined by unforgettable songs like "Down In A Hole," "Angry Chair," "Them Bones" and "Rooster" and went on to sell over three million copies.


In 1994, the band released *Jar Of Flies*, a No. 1 EP that featured the hits "No Excuses" and "I Stay Away." A self-titled full-length followed in 1995 that boasted the fan favorites "Heaven Beside You," "Over Now" and "Again." Also in '95, Staley provided his instantly recognizable vocals to *Above*, the debut album from Mad Season, a band that also featured Pearl Jam guitarist Mike McCready and Screaming Trees drummer Barrett Martin. Despite surfacing in 1996 for a memorable MTV *Unplugged* performance and a corresponding album,

the eponymously-titled *Alice In Chains* stands as the Northwestern group's final studio outing. Columbia Records has released a slew of AIC-related collections since 1996, including a box set, two greatest hits collections and a live album that featured tracks spanning the group's entire career (including its last show opening for KISS in 1996).

While Cantrell has gone on to establish a respectable solo career (his debut, *Boggy Depot* was released in 1998 and his second album, *Degradation Trip*, is due in stores on June 25), Staley had remained particularly quiet over the past six years, surfacing only for a one-off appearance on the soundtrack for the film *The Faculty* in 1998 (he sang on a cover of Pink Floyd's "Another Brick In The Wall"). Even though it hasn't released a studio album

since 1995 or mounted a major tour since *Lollapalooza* in 1993 (Staley's drug use prevented the band from regularly touring), Alice In Chains continues to be remembered as one of the most significant rock bands of the past 15 years, and its influence can be heard in countless bands thriving today, including Creed, Days Of The New, Godsmack, Tantric, Craving Theo, Dust To Dust, Staind and Puddle Of Mudd.

"I wrote about drugs, and I didn't think I was being unsafe or careless by writing about them," Staley told *Rolling Stone* in a 1996 interview. "Here's how my thinking pattern went: when I tried drugs, they were (expletive) great, and they worked for me for years, and now they're turning against me — and now I'm walking through hell, and this sucks."



KILLSWITCH ENGAGE

Alive Or Just Breathing (Roadrunner)

Like a glass of 1987 California merlot or a brand-new copy of *Cheeks* magazine, a masterpiece like Killswitch Engage's *Alive Or Just Breathing* should be savored as if it were the last thing one would experience before departing this life (and having their body discarded behind a crematory in Georgia). We warn you now: this album is more addictive than crack cocaine that's been smothered in caffeine and nicotine and drenched with chocolate. We shit you not, kids — this album is that good. As attentive metalheads may recall, the Massachusetts band released a nine-song disc through Ferret Records in 2000, and while it became a metalcore favorite, KSE's first outing pales in comparison to the instant classic that is *Alive Or Just Breathing* — it's like weighing a grassy knoll in New Jersey against Mt. Everest. Starting with the track "Numbered Days," this 12-track platter never takes its foot off the throttle. "My Last Serenade" is easily the best cut on the album, while the intro to "Life To Lifeless" could pass for an unreleased riff from Metallica's *Ride The Lightning*. The last minute of "Temple From The Within" is so heavy that, if played loud enough, it could eradicate every living thing within 25 square miles. "Just Barely Breathing" and "Self Revolution" round out our favorites.

How long have you been MD? How do you abuse your power?

I've been co-music director with J. Robert Buckley (pictured, left) since summer 2001. Robert is an upstanding citizen in his own right. The best part of the job is the volcano-god-fruit-basket offerings left at the door.

How many watts is your station? How many people do you reach?

We operate on 250 watts, reaching a 30-mile radius of listeners. So, I guess about 10,000 people could groove to our sexy tuneage.

What's the station motto/your personal programming philosophy?

One late night I definitely witnessed a haunting. A Todd Rundgren vinyl came rolling at me from the music library! Seriously, it was frightening! I guess it acted out of neglect.

What was your most embarrassing radio-related moment?

Well, to tell you the truth, I sometimes get groovy during my show and dance around a

little, lights turned down and whatnot. One time, a tour group walked by the window, and I was way busted. They loved it, though.

What's the best line a promoter ever used on you to get you to play a record?

Some of those ladies out there flirt like mad. Sure it's egolicious, but it's not a guarantee for plays — or is it?

What's the best promo item you've ever received?

I'm a sucker for colored vinyl. I dig posters, stickers — standard fare. Once, I got a Hot Wheels Mercedes CLK-LM. Dope!

What's the best use for a CD other than for storing music?

We've all seen the movie *Gremlins*, right? Well, if you put a CD in the microwave for two or three seconds, it makes a great wall ornament. It's hot!

Every station has that one old dude from the local town that's been doing a show since anyone can remember. Who is it at your station, what kind of show do they do, and what's their deal?

Ours is Brad. I'm not sure what his deal is, but he's good at it. He plays an ambient, new age, space show. I don't know anything about the genre, but he's pretty serious. He's got a section of his own in the library. He's been here as long as I know, and his cosmic vibes will outlast my time here.

Why did you go into college radio? Free CDs?

I came for power. I stayed for love.

What's your major?

I'm a Graphic Design major. I covertly slipped into an executive position usually held by a Com kid, which is pretty cool. Robby is a Psych major, so we've got the spread.

When will you be graduating?

We'll both be done in May. I'm sad to go, it's been really fun. And funny.

If you could see anyone live (dead or living), who would it be and why?

Am I so wrong to say that I think Queen would've been a kick-ass time?

Are you interested in going into the music industry? Doing what?

Even after my academic training in the arts, I am drawn to the industry. I'd like to perhaps combine my skills; anyone need an album cover designed? My rates are reasonable.

What's your favorite *Behind The Music* episode?

I guess the *E! True Hollywood Story* counts, eh? I just saw NKOTB, and I never realized what kind of a crazy sexfest their tour was!



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


MACROCK 2002



COPE WITH IT

I've been thinking the last few weeks about how difficult a task it is to break an artist these days, let alone break a new format. My curiosity peaked when I finally purchased a DVD home theatre unit — the one that plays regular CDs, 5.1 surround sound, DTS, MP3s, and just about everything else you can get into the player (with the exception of Quad. I tried — it doesn't work). Already my world has opened to new things I didn't care about before, like purchasing from each of these formats to increase my new listening and dining pleasures: DVD movies, box sets, music DVDs, TV shows on DVD (I must find *The Avengers*) — and of course playing it all through amazing 5.1 surround sound.

I was fortunate to have been turned on to DVD Audio by Donna Ross, VP of Sales for 5.1 Entertainment/Silverline/Immergent Records. When you get to add in all the other vocals and instruments that didn't make it on the original recording, it's like WOW! Tremendous care goes into "rebuilding" this music. The Beach Boys "Sail On Sailor" or Fleetwood Mac's *Rumors* now sound like nothing you've heard before. Silverline is just one company at the forefront; there are a number of WEA titles available in the format now (I'm sure I'll be hearing from those I've forgotten to mention here).

OK, now step out of music-biz mogul mode and into the shoes of the regular consumer. What do you want? Do you feel intimidated by all the different format choices out there? Do you want to buy

developing artist titles or new releases? The question is: are we, as a business, really educating core customers about these new formats or are we just expecting them to spend money because they have a new toy with nothing to put in it? The answer is price matters as much as education, and so does sticking with a product for the long haul. Like good artists, DVD (both music and 5.1) needs to be nurtured, especially since it's beginning to spell the industry's future.

Breaking new artists while trying to break new formats — interesting. What is the future of this business? Will it continue in audio CDs? DVD? Is the message of DVD 5.1 surround sound (full sensory experience) making its way to the consumer? Or is a tremendous opportunity slipping through our fingers? While on the hunt for new goodies, I had to search — a lot. DVD Audio is lost in many stores. Not because labels aren't supporting it with ads, dump bins, educational tools, etc., but because there is a volume of crap in stores. It's almost impossible to find what you're looking for. It's up to labels *and* retailers to educate and make product visible. We can't put obstacles in front of consumers who are willing to upgrade their music experience. Did I mention Quad? Do we remember Beta? Do we learn from our mistakes?

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SPEAK OUT

Referring to Mark Cope's column two weeks ago about his experience as moderator for NARM 2002's "Meet The Mythical Consumer" panel, Baker & Taylor's Steve Harkins weighs in on the cost of reaching "Gold."

I've often wondered why gold status remains a plateau in our industry. Five hundred thou-

sand copies sold by one artist, on the surface, still sounds impressive to me, however:

From a label perspective I've often heard the return on investment to reach gold status does not yield great financial dividends when one accounts for the expenditures from promotion to marketing the album. I'm not saying the approach is right or wrong from a business perspective, that's just generally what I've

heard over the years. Randomly discussing with artists their achievement reaching gold status, I've often heard they see a relatively small reward for it, because their studio, video, marketing and promotional expenses keeps them in debt to the label. It did not surprise me to hear the producer at [Cope's NARM panel this year] state the label policy of "Gold or Gone." I recall recently discussing with a prolific artist/personality who

had reached platinum-plus sales on their debut release and how when it was all said and done they cashed a \$70,000 royalty check! WOW, one half percent of the wholesale revenue generated back to the artist.

Good or bad contracts, good or bad business practices, the fact is this has been an issue long before the creation of the "downloading, mythical consumer".



DVD is shipping nearly 3k (good for the format, since the biggest selling DVD Audio has sold around 11k). Listing at \$24.98. Tower, Musicland, Transworld, Compact Disc World, Streetside, Twist & Shout have all come on strong for this format with Dishwalla. CD shipped 60k.

(This is not a radio note, but "Somewhere" is hitting Triple A hard): Dishwalla are a well known group with a Gold record under the belt who are pushing into their latest release into new format. First time a label has hit both day and date for both CD and DVD audio with the same title.

This DVD is very cool for fans. The disc is full of "Easter Eggs" that include video clips of the band when you discover them: footage of JR falling from Pet's drum kit, "Michael Godard" video, Opaline Demos.

A lot of the press surrounding the DVD has come in from trades and consumer publications highlighting or praising the new format. Recent support has come in from *Sound & Vision*, *Sterophile*, *Billboard*. Major dailies have been coming in too, *Miami Herald*, *Philadelphia Enquirer*.

Sr. VP of Sales for Immergent/Silverline/5.1 Entertainment, Jeff Dean (who can explain everything about the format and why it's becoming the music industry's future) is heading to London to panel a multi-national discussion on the format.

Consumers are more aware of Dolby and DTS than of 5.1 Surround Sound, but the Dishwalla Disc (which was mixed in 5.1—thes best, cleanest, and fullest sound of the three just mentioned) is coded to play on any DVD player. Best sites for DVD audio titles: audiorevolution.com, digitalhifi.com.

Immergent and 5.1 Entertainment's Silverline imprint are working with retailers to up in-store profile of both the format and the Dishwalla DVD audio with new sections, literature and educational ads for consumers, stuffers, samplers, etc. There are 32 million people with DVD players out there. One of the country's top 5 comm. AAA stations, WXRT (Chicago), has added "Leavened Heart (I Tumble Down)." Support also coming from WDST, WKZE, WDET, WVWD, WRLT, WYYB and over 200 college/non-comm stations. The day WXRT added it, Crow's Nest sold out of their original order.

If Rattlesby gets a firm commitment from VH1 that they'll add it, Janah will make a video (wink, wink).

First single is "Complicated." Promo tour began (in addition to those above). The Angus Drive EP was serviced to college radio and has been getting support on the East Coast and Midwest. "Skater Boi" appearing on CMJ's Certain Damage radio/in-store play disc next month.

Video for "Complicated" shot March 4-5 in LA and has been serviced to all video outlets around the country. Video was directed by The Malloys (Blink 182).

Without a publicist even, rave reviews from Chicago's *Sun Times*, *CMJ New Music Report*, *Modern Drummer* and the *Atlanta Constitution* (they're hiring on PR as we speak). Jeff Wisser (*Chicago Sun Times*) heard "Leavened" once and flipped — tracked it down.

Wherever Janah plays they're selling CDs to sometimes over 50% of their audiences. After SXSW showcase, band invited to play 10 festivals this summer: High Sierra, WXRT's Rockin' De Mayo, Nashville's Earth Day Festival, Beale St.

Take a walk along the University of New Mexico campus and you'll see a quaint black and white spotted building nearby. No, it's not a Ben & Jerry's and it's not a Gateway computer store either. It's a great record store posing as a Dalmatian. Its slogan, "Where Music Is Your Best Friend," says it all.

Bow Wow Records was started in 1983 by Andrew Horwitz and his personal record collection. Andy was a veterinarian, tired of the medical grind, but with a soft spot for animals (or was it a soft spot in his head?) — hence the name Bow Wow, its slogan and the spots all over the building. BW has been at its current location fourteen years now. Scott Madden started working there in 1996 and purchased the store in May 2000. His background was music retail, starting at In Your Ear, a small store in Ruidoso, NM, and then later working for Hastings.

Bow Wow carries everything from reggae to soundtracks, but its emphasis is indie rock, punk/hardcore and underground hip-hop. Bow Wow focuses on independent releases and goes out of its way to support local artists (check out Scott's comments on the local New Mexico music scene and how Bow

Wow gets involved in last week's "Speak Out"). Bow Wow stocks CDs, vinyl, posters, t-shirts, patches, buttons, and used music. They have two listening stations, a monthly e-mail newsletter, show and practice space and an awesome base of loyal customers. Bow Wow also has an upcoming website launch (www.bowwowrecords.com — check it soon). At BW there are several opportunities for labels to market releases, including print in the *Weekly Alibi*. BW also works closely with local KUNM (school station) and gets a lot of free plugs. BW has a friendly relationship with its local neighborhood indie competition as well,

Natural Sound. The difference between the stores is: students shop at Bow Wow while professors frequent Natural Sound. But Bow Wow Records is the hub for local musicians looking to start bands, fill gaps, and sell their art. BW will soon be making room for in-stores and a small recording studio.


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
