

ISSUE 882 Perhaps to allow Courtney Love to afford fighting her three current legal imbroglios (and a couple of doozies she's planning—our office pool has 2:1 odds on “passing out naked in a salad bar at an Olive Garden”), Universal Music Enterprises will release a box set by our favorite Vaselines cover band... Nirvana! Details about the box are hush-hush, but the three-CD set will be ready for the holiday season (we suggest scrawling a Flipper logo on your stocking so Santa knows you're down). The limited-edition version of the box will feature a DVD, which includes footage of the band playing a 1987 house party. The box was originally set to be released in 2001—coinciding with the 10th anniversary of *Nevermind*—but was sidelined by a Courtney lawsuit regarding Dave Grohl and Krist Novoselic's planned use of the track “You Know You're Right.” Released this year, the set is inexplicably timed to coincide with the 10th anniversary of the Spin Doctors' *Turn It Upside Down*. Hopefully the extra income made by the box set will enable Krist Novoselic to go another year without making an *Eyes Adrift* record.




films based on the original 40 songs on *The Commercial Album*—splattered out by over 42 visual artists from all over the world. The original record was another manifestation of the legendary San Francisco group's embrace and rejection of pop music—40 one-minute-long songs, without repeating verses and choruses, reducing pop music to its absolute essence. Hey, that might make even make emo listenable! *The Commercial Album* features “Special Secret Appearances” by Lene Lovich and XTC's Andy Partridge, making this the first album you buy this year without a Ludacris cameo (you just can't say “beyotch” in a song called “Act Of Being Polite”). CD and DVD are due November 2.

★ National Security Advisor Peter Gabriel (right, sweet beard) is holed up in his U.K. Real World Studio with revered producer Daniel “Danny Lanny” Lanois, remixing tracks for an upcoming DVD of his groundbreaking videos. The project will let listeners peep such monumental tracks as “In Your Eyes” (and probably such



Since David Lowery donned a gold record-plated *Kerosene Hat* in 1994, CVB sounds more “Low” than “ZZ Top Goes To Egypt,” but there’s still plenty of violin freakouts, post-ironic surrealism, faux-ska and middle eastern prog—sounding like a piece of major-label *Key Lime Pie* that never got dry and hardened.



Joyful Rebellion (Astralwerks)

Dropping an lively dose of hip-hop somewhere between '70s-era Jimmy Cliff and Michael Jackson circa *Off The Wall*, Toronto-via-Trinidad B-boy K-Os unifies Caribbean riddims with conversational, conscious rhymes à la Wyclef Jean or Michael Franti. Following up 2003’s pseudo-spiritual *Exit* with gentle uprisings, *Joyful Rebellion* trespasses many genre boundaries yet avoids target status, solely from K-Os’ excited lust for life. Be forewarned, K-Os carries across-the-board appeal whether singing, rapping or improving grooves to make the breakers move.



The Big Eyeball In The Sky (Prawn Song)


Les Claypool can wring a full-length record out of damn near any jam session (except a Primus one) these days. Here he teams with erstwhile GN'R guitarist Buckethead, erstwhile Primus/GN'R drummer Brain Mantia and Funkadelic keyboard master Bernie Worrell—essentially, Praxis without Bill Laswell and DJ Disk. Instrumental-funk acrobatics abound, each member going nuts while Claypool rants about Thai noodles and floating eyeballs. Those allergic to wank should proceed with caution, but Claypool's jam legions will be more than satisfied.

ELVIS COSTELLO

The Delivery Man (Lost Highway)

This rhythm 'n' roots effort isn't the most ambitious Costello record, but it's done right. Recorded down Fat Possum way in Oxford, Mississippi (where the dirt roads of country, blues and soul meet), Elvis welcomes guests Emmylou Harris and Lucinda Williams to add the heartbreak you can only get from male/female vocal interplay. On the best tracks you can hear Elvis' love for the howl of Howlin' Wolf ("Needle Time"), the tear-jerking country-politan strains of George Jones ("Country Darkness") and classic Americana ("The Scarlet Tide").

THE DELGADOS

Universal Audio (Chemikal Underground/Transdreamer)

It's a wonder that Scottish quartet the Delgados aren't as faithfully worshipped Stateside as they are overseas, what with other inventive and lush pop bands like the Flaming Lips enjoying open arms aplenty. Perhaps their last release, *Hate*—arguably their pièce de résistance up to that point—was too soupy and sprawling? If that's the case, *Universal Audio* (the band's fifth) can clear that: Returning to the more direct melodic pop of their earlier work, the disc is still awash in atmosphere—concise and direct, yet just as gorgeous.

The Folded Palm (Absolutely Kosher)

Had Isaac Brock obsessed over the Birthday Party instead of Talking Heads while making *Good News*, we might have gotten *The Folded Palm*: a pop record at heart, but a flailing, spitting one, packed with Waits-worthy treatments and the barely contained whirlwind of Carey Mercer, their alternately slurring and frothing frontman. Is this what Clinic would sound like if they were actually experimental, instead of just pretending to be? The Black Heart Procession as New Orleans funeral march? Hell if we know. But it's one of the weirdest, most wonderful records of the year.

Lyrically, he's as sharp and snarky as ever ("I like my nations in constant revolution/ And my booty wide), and musically, he's even more delectably jittery.

Pshaw on all those political pollsters... true tastemakers in Radioland suggest a different kind of post-convention bounce. Bounced out of office, that is. MoveOn's action PAC-ed Future Soundtrack For America takes over No. 1 and the equally propagantastic (*n. fantastic propaganda*) Rock Against Bush Vol. 2 (4-9) surges into the top five, suggesting there's lots of Bush-bashing going on. Meanwhile, revolutionary verbal gunslinger Steve Earle (48-48) and his FCC-baiting tunes await their own Dubya-drubbing bounce. On the other side of the pond (with no anti-Blair content from what I can tell), Clinic (11-D) makes one of the mightiest debuts of the year. Honestly, it's not a groundbreaker for them, but still good and weird. And to be fair, Domino hasn't made a false move all year. Speaking of good and weird... fast-moving Björk (8-149) puts her mouth where her mouth is on the vocal-driven *Medúlla* — cameos from Rahzel and Robert Wyatt make for an interesting listen. Two contrasting debuts also worth a listen are the beautifully rockin' thrust of Japan's Guitar Wolf (41-D) on Narnack followed by the latest pedal-steel opiate from (oddly enough, not from Japan) Japancakes (49-D). We're loud about our support of some great loud bands of late and the beast of the moment is our new No. 1 at Loud Rock, Mastodon (167-86), who grab the Crossover Of The Week award (actually, it's not so much an award as it is a coupon for a free sub when you buy one of equal or greater value). Mastodon and fellow Relapse chums Dillinger Escape Plan are schooling indie-rockers on what the new sound of "challenging" sounds like. Lead, follow or get trampled.
