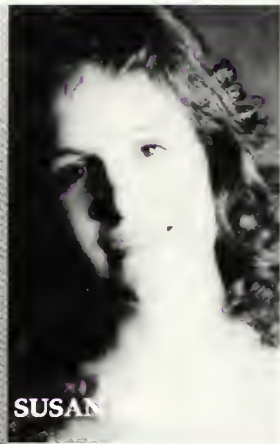

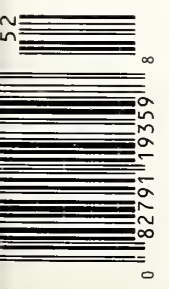

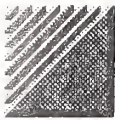

RIAA 1993 TOPS!: The Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA) has released its year-end tally of Gold, Platinum and Multi-Platinum awards, which are based on the sale of 500,000 units for Gold, 1 million units for Platinum, and 2 million units or more for Multi-Platinum.

According to the RIAA's Gold and Platinum Awards Coordinator, **Angela Corio**, "It's been a year of record-breaking news and music milestones. With 521 album certifications to date, 1993 has already surpassed last year's tally of 509."

MULTI-PLATINUM ALBUMS

In 1993, 142 albums certified Multi-Platinum, 147 certified Platinum and 232 certified Gold. Following are highlights from this year's new album releases:

10 Million: *The Bodyguard Soundtrack*—**Whitney Houston & Various Artists** (Arista).

5 Million: *Breathless*—**Kenny G** (Arista); *janet.*—**Janet Jackson** (Virgin).

4 Million: *Unplugged*—**Eric Clapton** (Reprise); *Music Box*—**Mariah Carey** (Columbia).

3 Million: *In Pieces*—**Garth Brooks** (Liberty); *A Lot About Livin' (And A Little 'Bout Love)*—**Alan Jackson** (Arista); *The Chronic*—**Dr. Dre** (Death Row); *Aladdin Soundtrack* (Disney); *River Of Dreams*—**Billy Joel** (Columbia).

DEBUT ARTISTS

There are 45 debut artists that achieved Gold success or higher this year, including kids' favorite dinosaur, **Barney**, for the Double-Platinum *Barney's Favorites Volume 1*. Alternative artists **Blind Melon**, **The Cranberries**, **The Proclaimers**, **Radiohead** and **The Sundays** took home their first awards, as well as reggae artists **Inner Circle**, **Shabba Ranks** and **Snow**. This year's top-selling new artist is **Toni Braxton**, who achieved Double-Platinum success on her self-titled LP.

BOX SETS

Two double-CD sets by accomplished singer/songwriters went platinum in 1993: **Neil Diamond's** *Greatest Hits 1966-1992* and **James Taylor's** *Live*. Seven other multi-box sets went gold: the **Beach Boys' Good Vibrations**, **Journey's** *Time3*, **Led Zeppelin's** *The Complete Studio Recordings*, **Pink Floyd's** *Shine On, Hitsville USA—The Motown Singles Collection* and *The Music Of Disney: A Legacy In Song*.

MULTI-PLATINUM SINGLES

Eighteen singles were certified Multi-Platinum in 1993, of which 16 were Disney classics. Here are the biggest hits:

4 Million: "I Will Always Love You" (**Whitney Houston**)

2 Million: "Rump Shaker" (**Wreckx'n'Effect**).

ATLANTIC RE-SIGNS MARDIN: Atlantic Records senior vp, **Arif Mardin** has signed a new, long-term contract with the label. The announcement was made jointly by Atlantic Group co-chairman/co-CEO **Ahmet Ertegun** and co-chairman/co-CEO **Doug Morris**. 1993 marks the 30th anniversary of Mardin's association with Atlantic Records, a Time Warner company.

Mardin's numerous top ten records include such #1 hits as "Jive Talking" by the Bee Gees, "Pick Up The Pieces" by the Average White Band, "The Wind Beneath My Wings" and "From A Distance" by Bette Midler, and "Against All Odds" and "Separate Lives" by Phil Collins.

In 1990, Mardin was inducted into the **National Academy Of Recording Arts and Sciences** Hall of Fame; he was also named Man of the Year by the Assembly of Turkish American Associations. In 1992, he was awarded the Shofar of Peace Award from the Sephardic Hebrew Academy.

GATT Deal Shirks Entertainment Biz

ALTHOUGH PASSAGE OF THE GATT agreement by 117 nations in Geneva, Switzerland recently was hailed as a milestone, the United States entertainment industry was largely left on the outside looking in, especially in the areas of copyright collections in and access to lucrative European markets. The International Intellectual Property Alliance (IIPA), an eight association member group representing film, recording, publishing and software interests in the U.S., while supporting the recently passed North American Free Trade Agreement, have steadfastly asked for changes in the U.S. position on the General Agreement on Trades and Tariffs (GATT).

President Bill Clinton, however, recently pledged to the entertainment industry that the negotiations with the European Economic Community were not concluded.

IIPA executive director Eric H. Smith has maintained that the agreement will permit continued discrimination against U.S. copyright owners and, thusly, the IIPA members may urge the Clinton Administration to enforce trade rule Special 301 which permits retaliatory action on a case-by-case basis. One particular area of concern outlined by Smith was the agreement with Japan allowing a five-year transition period weaning retailers off the rental of sound recordings. But Jay Berman, chairman and CEO of the Recording Industry Assn. of American (RIAA), said that the overall agreement was a failure.

"The United States and the European Community failed, unfortunately, to reach an agreement to jointly introduce multilateral rules regarding trade in entertainment products," Berman comments. "The EC steadfastly refused to consider a series of U.S. proposals aimed at reducing unfair barriers to market access and securing for U.S. rights-holders revenues derived from use of their works."

Clinton, in a letter sent to segments of the entertainment industry which, according to many figures, represents the second largest export from American shores, stated that negotiations will continue and that "until we reach a satisfactory agreement, we think we can best advance the interests of our entertainment industry by reserving all our legal rights to respond to policies that discriminate in these areas."

BMI Figures To Be The Best

BROADCAST MUSIC, INC. (BMI) has released figures for the year 1993 that show the company has enjoyed one of the most successful periods in its history. Using percentage comparisons against all other performing rights organizations (including main rival ASCAP), BMI reports victories, some quite resounding, in a host of musical airplay categories, award winners and critics' polls.

In song-related categories at the Oscars this year, BMI composers captured 75% of the awards. At the American Music Awards, it represented 62% of the winners, while at the Country Music Awards, that figure increased to 82%.

On the *College Music Journal (CMJ)* Top 100 of the year, BMI represented 59% of the chart, while in trade magazines' Top 10 singles listings for '93 showed a 50-50 split between BMI and the other organizations. Also, 59% of the *Down Beat Magazine* jazz poll belonged to BMI clients.

A five-year recap shows BMI artists winning 56% of Grammy awards since 1989 and 60% of CMA's in that time.

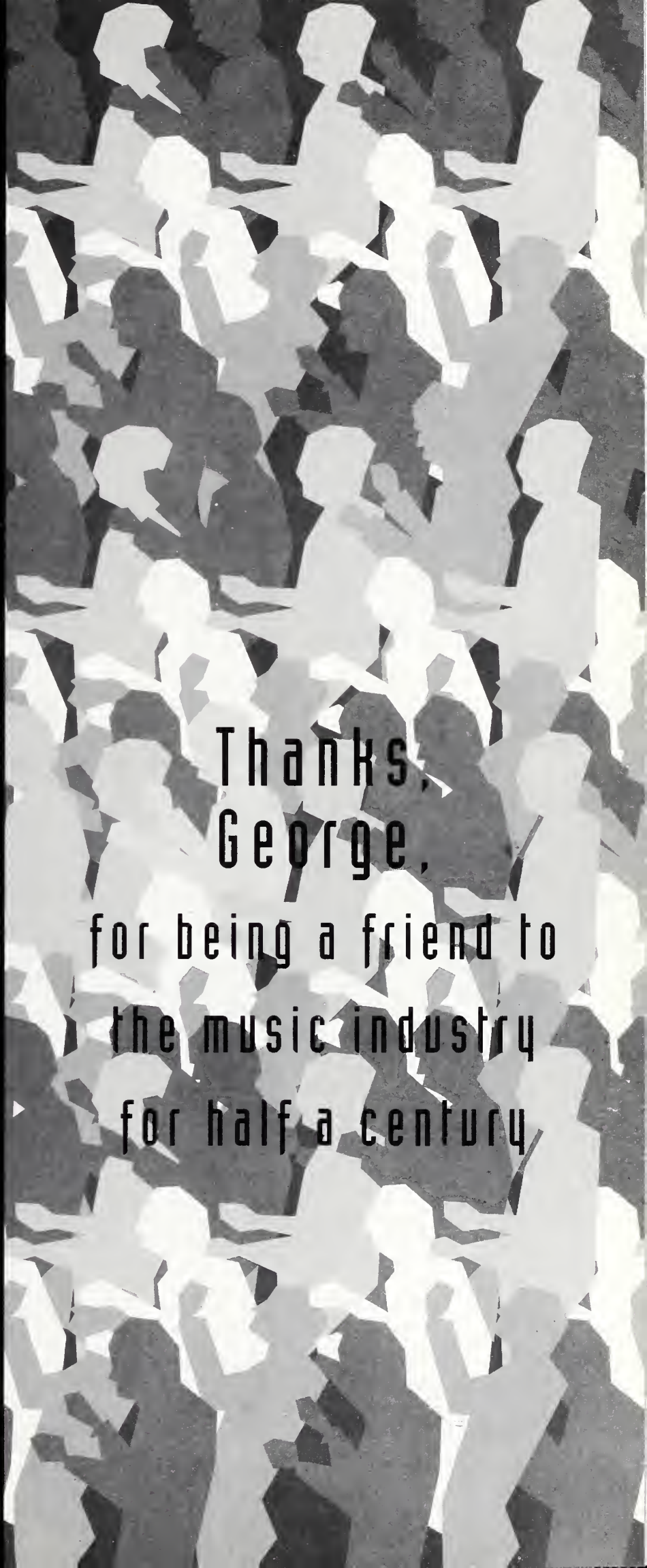

DOING IT TO YOU IN YOUR EARHOLE: Sunday at the Manhattan Center, George Clinton landed an eager army of funkateers here for a re-connection with the Mothership and Planet Earth. And how many other ensembles feature five(!) guitar players, some of them wearing diapers and loincloths, hmm? I ask you. But Pampers have always had a place in Clinton's interstellar potpourri, as he continues to pin the tail on the funky with his latest, *Hey Man, Smell My Finger* (Paisley Park/Warner Bros.). Even in his quietest years, he was still making a big racket via his symbiotic relationship with the entire genre of hip-hop; nobody, except perchance the Godfather, has been sampled as much as Parliament/Funkadelic, and Clinton has just put out two discs as prepared excerpts of his music to make everybody's life easier. A strange and bold step, one that makes me a little nervous, a little like that feeling I got upon my first taste of Snoop Doggy Dogg's recycled "Atomic Dog" and Bobby Brown's "(Not Just) Knee Deep" regurgitation in his *Getaway*...the beginning of the end, like Hammer's superfreaky "Can't Touch This," or just a false alarm?

But Uncle Jam is still alive and kicking, no oldies but goodies incarnation, but still the real thing, doing "Martial Law" and "Hollywood" from *Hey Man*, threatening to rock the walls of the joint to the ground. And while some are arguing that his best may be behind him, it's for sure that *Smell* is a couple of cuts above 1989's *Cinderella Theory* and that a nation still devoid of funk can't find a more vital groove to get under...the show kept the crowd wrapped up for hours and hours and hours, and Clinton always seems to have one more dose of Cosmic Slop ready.

ROCK, ROLL & REMEMBER: CBGBs has been having a big anniversary extravaganza—included in this week's festivities were the Lemonheads, Living Colour, Live, The Damned and quintessential CBs good ol' days alum, David Byrne. On Thursday, Joan Jett and The Blackhearts concert for a slamming, three-chord bonanza, featuring "I Hate Myself For Loving You," "Crimson And Clover" and "I Love Rock And Roll." Ren. Also, watch for new ones from Kings X, Morrissey, Meat Puppets, Course Of Empire and Barefoot Servants, an Epic band featuring guitarist Jon Butcher.

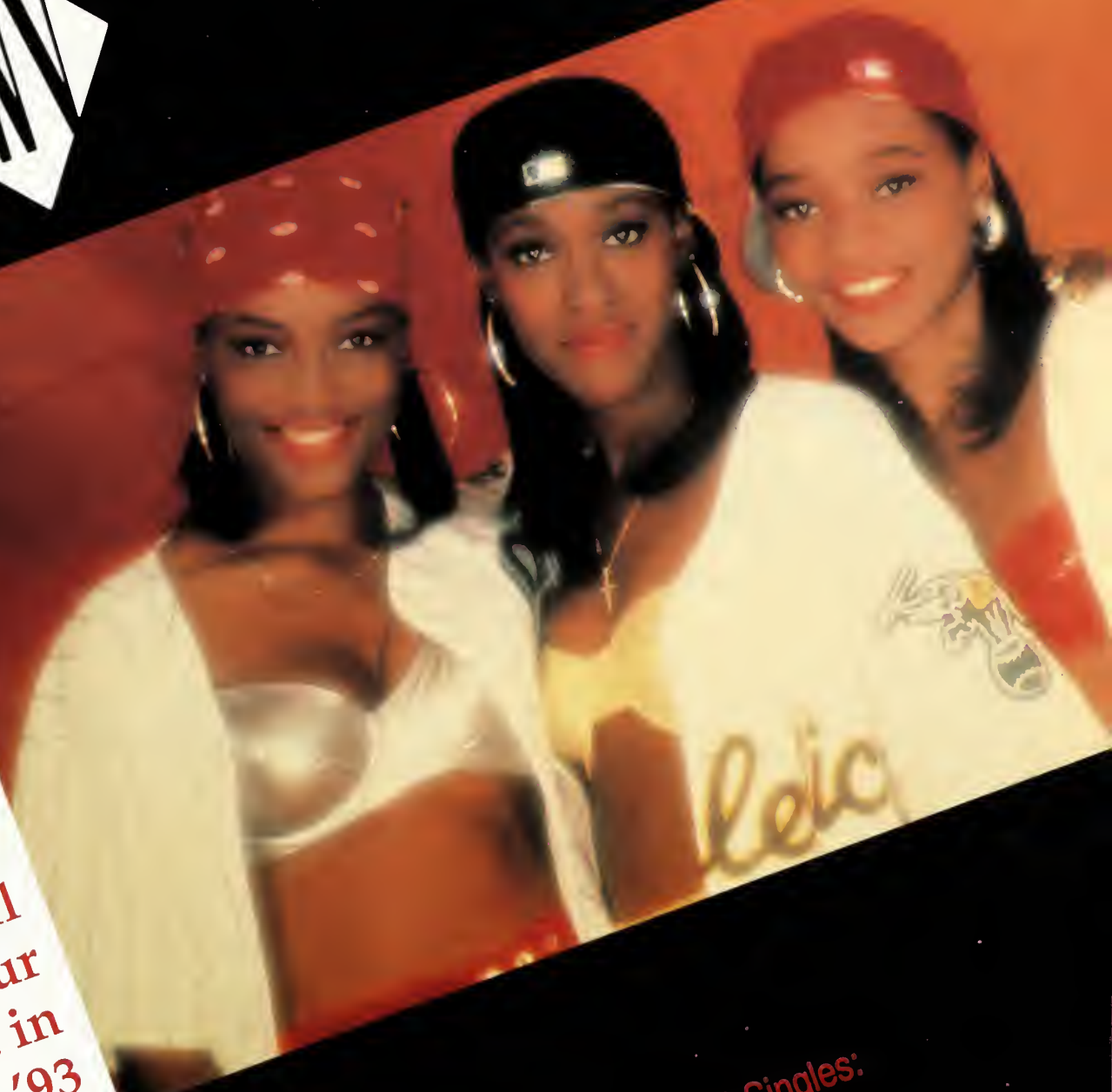

Heaven And Earth

too is a "woman's" story) but without *Wind's* boxoffice legs; probably *Joy Luck's* also, recoupment-wise, owing to the obviously larger budget. It will be interesting to see if that audience which supported the fairly gentle *Joy Luck* will queue up again for the harder-edged *Heaven*.

The Warner Bros. release—in association with Regency Enterprises, Le Studio Canal + and Alcor Films, Ixtlan / New Regency / Todd-AO/TAE Production, Oliver Stone Film—is sprawling, generational and long and would have been better served as an HBO TV mini-series event.

Stone scripted, co-produced with Arnon Milchan, Robert Kline and A. Kitman Ho, and directed. There are those moments that are served best only on the big screen but those are the stunning visuals offered up via the camerawork of Robert Richardson. Story and character suffer. Granted, the Scarlett O'Hara-like central character—well-played by Introductory-billed Hiep Thi Le—is the center post of the tale, for her to be truly effective all those around her must be fully fleshed. The Tommy Lee Jones character is fragmented. So, he's a composite of four others in the books; make him whole. His necessary transitional segments aren't there to take him from caring husband to cruel suicide. Stone also attempts to incorporate a broad definition or course on Buddhism and contrasting ways of life and values between Vietnam and the U.S. It's simply a case of too much. The feeling is that a lot was left on the cutting-room floor—another version for Cable and Home Vid?

Stone's vision of contrast between the peaceful village, gentle people and their survivalist spirit with the excesses of the U.S. with its overweight and crass populace plays out like a *Saturday Night Live* skit. The stoic and noble Haing S. Ngor and Joan Chen come off as saints in contrast to the always excessive Conchata Ferrell and gushing Debbie Reynolds serving as Stone's vision of the prototypical Americans.

Even Kitaro's score soars above the definition of film music and seems at times to be attempting to break the boundaries of Earth's restraints in search of *The Rapture*. There are times when silence is just as noble as crescendo.

Actors who age (Ngor and Chen) are hampered by mounds of obvious make-up which is distracting. Jones' aging goes from flat to potbelly almost overnight while Le's hair styles define her maturation from lovely Vietnamese to driven blow-dried and power-styled American business woman.

Jones' normally seamless and consistent performance values appear fragmented—which is a major reason to think perhaps there's more here than meets the eye. Le never rises from the ground and vows literally that she'll never be hungry again but is carried through the metaphorical machinations of it. She does, however, give a solid performance for her first time out. Ngor and Chen are stoic. Remainder of the cast serve as little more than required reading partners to complete Le's journey to Fade Out.

OLIVER STONE'S RETURN TO VIETNAM is a strange one for him. *Heaven And Earth*, based on a pair of books whose common thread is author Le Ly Hayslip—*When Heaven And Earth Changed Places* written with Jay Wurts and *Child Of War, Woman Of Peace*, with James Hayslip—remembering her journey from peaceful Vietnam through war-torn Vietnam to America. Stone has fused both books into a film that resembles nothing so much as a Viet progeny of *Gone With The Wind*, with a touch of *Joy Luck Club* (this

Philadelphia

THE CITY OF BROTHERLY LOVE is the site and symbol for Jonathan Demme's look at prejudice, homophobia and the disparity gap between class structures in the land of the free and, therefore, metaphorically for the world with AIDS being the central focal point here.

Philadelphia is loaded with good intentions, and Ron Nyswaner's script raises some complex issues and human thought processes, brings out feelings and questions anyone who has ever given five minutes of thought to the AIDS issue undoubtedly has asked themselves but has seldom given vocal freedom to those thoughts and questions. The fear-of-the-unknown questions usually put in the mouths of simpletons and obvious bigots which serve to give the chic and affluent a superior position from which to look down their re-done noses are put into their attitudes here. Nyswaner and Demme hit that target squarely, but the film as a whole has a curiously dispassionate feeling for its first three-quarters. The movements are there, the moments, the *lip service* if you will, while the emotion is misplaced, like the facade its majority subjects paint on.

It's not a light subject, AIDS, though some humor is attempted. We literally watch Tom Hanks' character die from beginning to end. He is aware of his condition from the start. We watch him and the others around him deal, the high-powered law firm he's with attempt to deal with by *not* dealing with *that* subject head on. Nyswaner and Demme's choice of lawyers and their slick circumlocutions to justify their actions is the perfect arena for this. (Listen for rumblings from the lawyer community re: their image in this highly sensitive era.) And Demme's handling of the courtroom action, very controlled at all times, keeping the lawyers in their seats, retaining that *in control*, manipulative gloss with lack of theatrics adds to the dispassionate feel. Perhaps it was by design.

Hanks' performance is strong. He brings an acceptance to the character through his deft light comedy talent but he also reveals depth here. Above all he gives the character an inherent dignity and concern for all around him. Denzel Washington is given the most outwardly complex character—homophobic lawyer who does a turnaround, at least toward Hanks, his AIDS-stricken client. The character is also the most vocally explained on film and Washington handles it confidently.

Supporting cast is one of the strongest in a project this year. Jason Robards as the head lawyer is solid. Mary Steenburgen is affectedly controlled as the hand-picked defense lawyer. The strongly countenanced Charles Napier was the perfect choice for the Judge; the impression he gives just being on the bench is Strength. Joanne Woodward is Hanks' mother—strong, worried, a multi-leveled performance. Robert Ridgely is more than effective as a vocally bigoted firm lawyer and Ron Vawter good as the balancing sympathetic one. Antonio Banderas as Hanks' partner is fine.

Tak Fujimoto's camera work is solid with a single outstanding sequence where, combined with Demme's direction and Hanks' performance explaining an operatic sequence, audience is totally drawn

into the character's emotions via mood lighting, angles and movement. Music by Howard Shore is strong.

In The Name Of The Father

THE TRUE STORY of a petty Irish thief and pals caught in the middle of a brutal British police force and judicial system that make the last two years of events and trials in Los Angeles look like pre-school antics is fascinating material. As envisioned by Jim Sheridan (*My Left Foot*) who directed and co-wrote the screenplay with Terry George, basing it on the autobiographical *Proved Innocent* by Gerry Conlon, the story plays out on two levels: a realistic human occurrence between father and rebellious son and metaphorical allegory between father (Britain) and rebellious son (Ireland).

In the 1970s Conlon and three pals, who came to be known as The Guildford Four, were arrested and forced to confess to an IRA bombing that had occurred in London. His father, coming over from Ireland to give his son support, and other family members (aunt and two teen cousins) are railroaded along with them as accomplices. The things that occur in British investigative techniques, courtroom and ensuing years of cover-up are brutal to the sensibilities of practically any nation of people with the possible exception of Hitler's Germany. The love, respect and concern that grows between the father and son sharing a cell for 15 years forges a strength that only taking a stroll through Hell together can forge is admirable. Both levels are satisfied and filled out completely by director Sheridan who uses Thompson's concerned lawyer character as a present-day anchor and conduit to bridge both past and present/real and allegory.

The Universal Pictures release of a Hell's Kitchen/Gabriel Byrne Production, Jim Sheridan Film will undoubtedly be a strong critical success. It sports dual Academy Award winners—Daniel Day-Lewis and Emma Thompson—and nominated director Sheridan for boxoffice draws. It will receive strong word-of-mouth so look for it to be a solid money success, if not a blockbuster. It's another of those "thought-provoking" films which need to "find" its audience but once it does, that audience will be a solid one.

Day-Lewis is the central focus of the piece, moving from callow youth to caring son and eventually mature crusader. It's a solid job but the performance of the film is that of the father, Pete Postlethwaite. His character can be maddeningly unbending in his beliefs, but through a simple and direct faith remains true to himself, thus showing his son the way to himself. Postlethwaite gives the character full-rounded dimension and depth. A wonderful job. Thompson's real-life lawyer character really is used for the film as little more than a device but she invests it with a strong belief and conviction. Musician Don Baker makes an impressive acting debut as an IRA terrorist leader. Corin Redgrave, as the unbending, cold, chief inspector offers up a chilling performance.

Trevor Jones' music fills out scenes nicely and original songs by U2's Bono with Gavin Friday and Maurice Seazer are haunting, especially the title tune, done over opening credits, "In The Name Of The Father" performed by Bono and Friday.

Interesting historical note accompanying the film is that one of the original Guildford Four, Paul Hill, once he gained release moved to the U.S. and is married to a daughter of Robert Kennedy.

Executive producer is Gabriel Byrne. Arthur Lappin co-produced.

Wrestling Ernest Hemingway

RETIREMENT IN SOUTH FLORIDA. Ahhhh, sounds wonderful, doesn't it? Could be, unless you're elderly, lonely, family-forgotten and need a friend. Well, that too is pretty simplistic but it's the valid premise of Warner Bros. presentation, Joe Wizan/Todd Black Production, Randa Haines Film, *Wrestling Ernest Hemingway*. Surely not every retired person in South Florida lives in a rundown motel or apartment building and has more to do with their days and nights than the characters Robert Duvall and Richard Harris play in the film. But it's still valid, their characters are valid, and wonderful and touching in both their needs and their survival techniques.

This is a terrific film. It's going to need some special handling to pick up its audience. There is a very definite audience for this, but it may take some time to find it fully. Hang in with it. It's worth the search.

Screenwriter Steve Conrad covers the emotions in this treatise about friendship, and very likely this could have been about any age, it's just that this pair of polar-opposite, 70-odd-year-olds adds a special poignancy to the search. Conrad's feelings are universal and ageless.

Director Haines keeps the tone well-balanced between poignancy, lightness and seriousness, never straying from her central subjects.

Harris, it seems, gets better with age. Those years of...well, *interesting* living have left their marks on him and left him as a character actor should be—a character. He's still the sport from *This Sporting Life*, displaying a physical leanness in several nude scenes here left over from the football field. It's easy to accept he's done all he says he's done in this character. He's gruff, bold, slovenly, likeable and touching in a wonderful characterization.

Duvall as the total opposite proves once again that he's one of our finest actors with impeccable Cuban accent, body language and total submersion of self to character as shy, self-contained, neat but accepting and open for friendship. A superb job.

Shirley MacLaine turns in a special performance as an outwardly rough motel owner, inwardly touched and understanding human being. She doesn't need words to express feeling—that's what film acting's about, folks. Watch her. And Piper Laurie takes a fine turn as a somewhat touched and touching youngster/oldster. Scene between she and Harris in their first encounter at the movies reminds one of pre-teens flirtations and is delectable.

Sandra Bullock is the youth with whom Duvall has a crush. She has a better handle on the art of implication here than in the earlier *Demolition Man* (possibly and probably a difference in directors). She's far better here (better role also) and shows more promise. Micole Mercurio as waitress Bernice has a few very warm and understanding moments to round out the bulk of the casting.

A very warm and friendly "Friends" movie, warmly and lovingly photographed by Lajos Koltai, that deserves a friendly audience.

Afghan Whigs

THE WHISKY, WEST HOLLYWOOD, CA—One of the most anticipated debuts from the major label Class of '93 was *Gentleman*, the Afghan Whigs' first for Elektra, following two fine sets for Sub Pop. The band's cozy blend of soulful, almost-grunge-meets-middle America roots rock has started showing up on the playlists of a growing number of commercial radio and video outlets, including MTV, which is giving clip "Debonair," a song about physical abuse and domestic violence, regular airings.

On stage, the Cincinnati four-piece doesn't stray far from the tightly knit, sharply delivered approach found on its records. What does make Afghan Whigs a strong live attraction though, is the boiling intensity found between the lines, where singer Greg Dulli often hides feelings of extreme pain, loneliness and frustration.

In "What Jail Is Like," one of the 75-minute show's more striking songs, he uses imprisonment as an appropriate metaphor for the feeling of entrapment in an unhealthy relationship. "I'll warn you, if cornered/I'll scratch my way out of the pen." Dulli's demeanor remains calm, even in the face of his words of desperation.

Elsewhere, "I'm Her Slave," with its contrasting funk rhythms and punk drive, the catchy "Debonair" and the painful rage of "Fountain And Fairfax" were show's highlights. Older material, such as "Retarded" and "You, My Flower," also scored well with the overcapacity crowd.

Like Pearl Jam's Eddie Vedder, the Afghan Whigs' Greg Dulli uses disarming lyrics and a disturbing sense of emotional control to dominate the attention of his audience. As the band develops its own sound, a feat nearly accomplished on *Gentlemen*, expect the Whigs to move out of the club circuit and into a much bigger spotlight.

THE STRAND, REDONDO BEACH, CA—Despite the clatter and supper club clamor that was evident throughout his opening set, Mercury recording artist Brian McKnight ably demonstrated why he might be in demand as much as a singer as he is a songwriter. McKnight, whose self-titled album has yielded radio favorites, proved that he is an individual talent. His style, though, would seem to have been forged by his reverence of some great talent.

McKnight's Fender Rhodes piano playing seems influenced by Stevie Wonder and his vocal style is a bow to Luther Vandross and James Ingram, especially on the hit "One Last Cry."

Some of the best work of the evening was when McKnight accompanied himself on the electric piano and let his sensitive vocal interpretations and simple melodic, harmonic and rhythmic structure merge in voice with the plaintive piano chords. The possible exception to this notion was when the singer/songwriter broke into the midtempo "Yearnin' For Your Love," sending a ripple of cheer through the demographically mixed audience. Phat arrangements, McKnight's easygoing engagement of the audience and a tightly rehearsed band made for a successful set. The audience was drawn into the performance without McKnight pandering excessively.

McKnight is a pop artist disguised as an urban music songwriter. It won't be long before everybody discovers his secret.

Sunset Boulevard

SHUBERT THEATRE, CENTURY CITY, CA—At this point, Andrew Lloyd Webber could write a musical called *Dictionary*, pairing his sumptuous melodies with the words of Noah Webster, and it would be a hit. When he collaborates with such talents as lyricists Don Black and Christopher Hampton, who also adapted the book from Billy Wilder's legendary film, the project becomes an instant classic.

Such is the case with Lloyd Webber's take on the beloved evergreen, *Sunset Boulevard*, which opened last week for an open-end run at the Shubert Theatre. Even though the production is costly (\$5 mil), plus extensive and expensive renovations to the theater itself, the show has almost broken even in advance ticket sales. No matter what the critics write, this will be an audience favorite that will be around for years.

The composer's music is the magnet that draws the masses, but having a star with the marquee value of Glenn Close, playing one of the greatest characters in movie history, doesn't hurt at all. Close's portrayal of Norma Desmond, essayed in the film by Gloria Swanson, is perfect. She adds a poignancy and dash of humor that Swanson never displayed. Of course, Close is aided by the music, which can augment any emotion in just a few moments.

And those moments are divine. The songs, "With One Look" and "New Ways To Dream," both tributes to silent films, are showstoppers. But the standout moment comes when Norma visits Paramount Studios, and while on the set of Cecil B. DeMille's *Samson And Delilah* sings the hauntingly touching "As If We Never Said Goodbye." It's pure magic.

Besides Close, other cast members who shine are George Hearn as Max von Mayerling and Judy Kuhn as Betty Schaefer. Alan Campbell, who plays the William Holden role of writer/gigolo Joe Gillis, doesn't fare as well. His singing voice is fine, but he lacks the edge that Holden so marvelously brought to the character. Campbell is a little too one-dimensional for so pivotal a role.

Kudos go to director Trevor Nunn, production designer John Napier, costume designer Anthony Powell and lighting designer Andrew Bridge, all of whom bring award-winning style and sophistication to the proceedings. But when all is said and done, it is Glenn Close's show. Her portrayal is so on-the-money it will be the benchmark for those

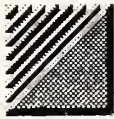

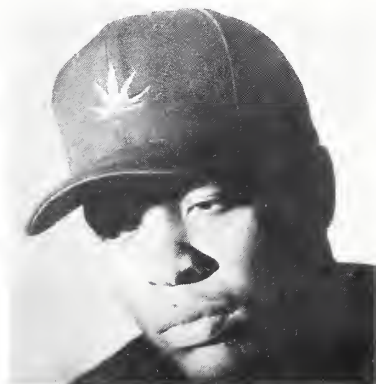

REVIEWS By Troy J. Augusto

■ **RIC OCASEK:** *Quick Change World* (Reprise 45248)
Fourth solo effort from the former Cars singer-songwriter, released earlier this fall, has, for the most part, been overlooked but deserves a second listen. Recalling his old band on many tracks here, Ocasek sticks to his tried-and-true formula of writing and singing from the heart, which, mixed with his uncanny ear for an effective pop hook, makes this alb stand out from most musicians of the genre. Former Cars keys man Greg Hawkes also contribs.



■ **THE BOO RADLEYS:** *Giant Steps* (Creation/Columbia 53794)

Second full-lengther from Liverpool's Boo Radleys, named after the character in *To Kill A Mockingbird*, is the ultimate in eclecticism. Beginning with a semi-standard pop/rock base, the Radleys, fronted by flexible vocalist Sice, then throw in jazz and reggae licks, experimental noise and dub effects and even lushly arranged orchestral stylings. Alb's best includes the spooky "Upon 9th And Fairchild" and the dreamy pop of "Wish I Was Skinny."



■ **MELANIE:** *Freedom Knows My Name* (Lonestar 1947)

The second of two releases this year from '60s songbird Melanie (the first was a Europe-only issue) is a sweetly delivered, thoughtfully arranged collection that shows she's lost little of the affecting charm that made her the top female vocalist in, among other mags, *Cash Box* in 1970 and '71 and won her an Emmy Award in 1989 for her work on the *Beauty And The Beast* series. Highlights include uplifting "I Will Get Over" and folkie "Estate Sale."



■ **DAVID T. CHASTAIN:** *Next Planet Please* (Leviathan 19941)

With only a couple of exceptions, the herd of mid-'80s technical guitar heroes has come and gone, leaving behind only a select few, players whose vision and natural skills (as opposed to the derivative, over-schooled noodlers that got most of the attention) assured them more than flash-in-the-pan careers. One of the survivors is Chastain, a flashy and versatile instrumentalist who sharply combines rock power riffs and progressive jazz elements for a tasty fusion.



PICK OF THE WEEK



■ **VARIOUS ARTISTS:** *Wayne's World 2* (Reprise 45485) Producers: Various

Just as the second *Wayne's World* flick isn't nearly as good as the original, the sequel's accompanying soundtrack doesn't stack up against its superior predecessor. The catalyst for much of the first alb's popularity was the inclusion of Queen's "Bohemian Rhapsody" and the riotous scene in the movie where Wayne, Garth, et al, roll down the highway, lip-synching and air-guitaring all of the tune's many cool parts. In *W.W. 2*, the gang use the Village People's "Y.M.C.A." to try to recreate the laughs. Trouble is, that song pales compared to Queen's tune, hurting the joke. Dino Jr scores, though.

They hope the company will emerge as the next major indie on the block. As label president, J.B. says, "Forget the idea of trying to get a major to sign your act. They're too lazy to expend the energy it would take." The Atlanta-based company's first act will be the "fresh coaster" Julian Kelly, aka Sub-Zero. The artist debuts with the single "Lady Mercedes," which will be powered by a video by award-winning director Dan O'Dowd. The video will feature a bevy of *Penthouse* centerfold women, a group put together by the magazine's long-time photog Earl Miller. The Mercedes car company also cooperated for the shoot. In addition to Sub-Zero, other acts waiting for Sub-Groove distribution include Texas-based pop/jazz ensemble The Brew.

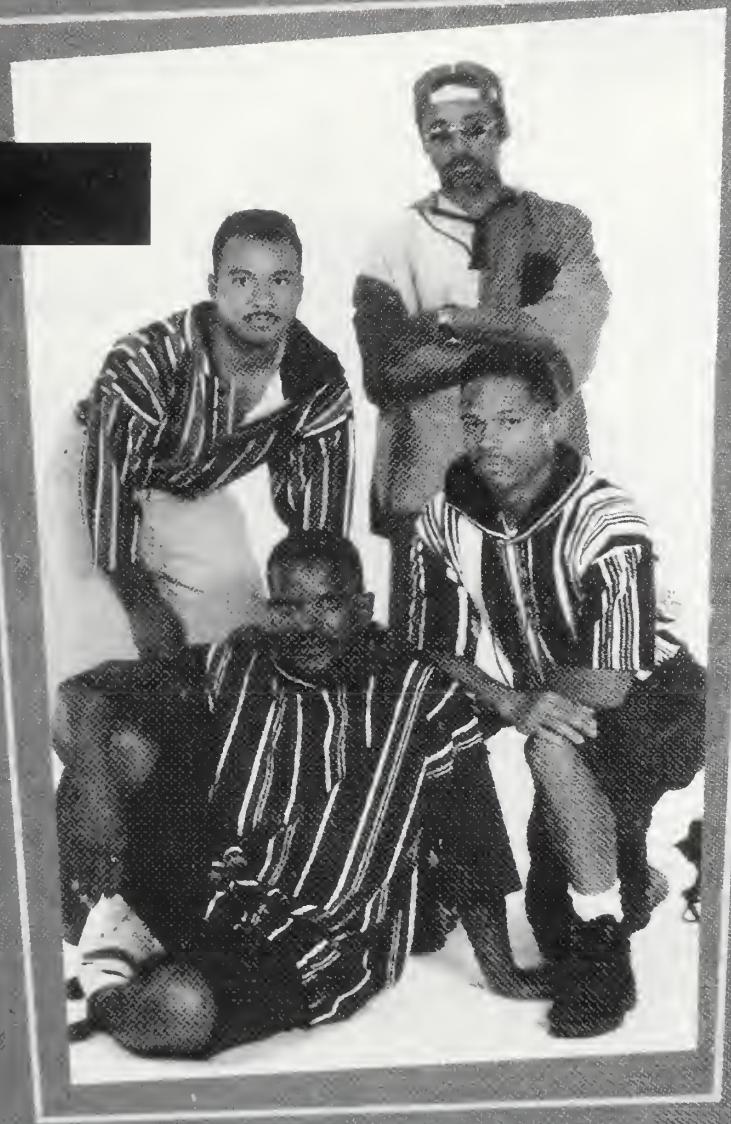

THE ELECTRIC SPANKING OF RAP BABIES: Yes, they've brought some of this upon themselves. But the nearly relentless media spanking of some of rap and hip-hop's hottest names was shameful, and it made it easier for the public to ignore some of the creative things that rappers and hip-hoppers did throughout 1993. As the last moments of this year mercifully tick away, there are a couple of things we need to reiterate from previous columns. Let's start with Rodney O & Joe Cooley who were detained in a Santa Monica, CA park while being interviewed by *Rap Sheet* editor Darryl James by the city's finest on grounds that they fit the description of car thieves. When asked what the perps looked like, a policeman allegedly answered, "They were black." Then let's go talk about Tupac Shakur, Snoop Doggy Dogg and Flavor Flav, all of whom have fallen upon legal hard times and have helped renew the controversy over hardcore and gangsta rap being a bad influence on the nation's youth, especially considering music produced by this trio or their posses' sell-throughs and is critically acclaimed by much of mainstream press. Then, on a more positive tip, there's the emergence of rap/jazz fusion, which has broadened the musical dialogue and clearly demonstrated that the music is alive, well and will continue to prosper—creatively and commercially. And finally, rap/hip-hop has kept the independent ranks strong throughout the year, and they have continued to be a ripe source of new talent in this genre for major labels. And that just scratches the surface of major stories that will unfold in the coming year. Happy Holidays to all and to all a prosperous New Year!

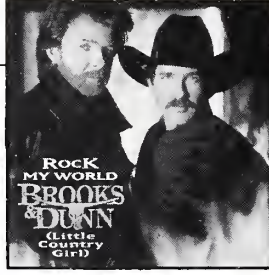

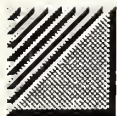

According to the newly released 1993 *Simmons Study of Media & Markets*, almost 42% of the U.S. population (that's 77.3 MILLION adults) regularly graze on Music City's most famous export. 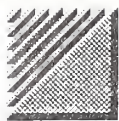

demonstrated country music gains in Europe and The U.K. The following paragraph was copied directly from the CMA newsletter:

Country Music's growth knows no boundaries. Once regarded as a "cult" format in places outside North America, Country Music is steadily entering the entertainment mainstream outside of the United States. Recently, a consortium headed by John Wellington and Bill Bebb received the only new music station license issued for the London area by the U.K. Radio Authority. The station, which is slated to be on the air by April 1994, will reach a potential London audience of over nine million with different styles of country music. Emphasis will be placed on today's country music.

A potential audience expansion of nine million is indeed excellent news for the genre of country music. But what about a potential audience of over 70 million. That's correct—70 million. While it's been widely publicized the Country Music Association is taking efforts to broaden the base of the country music market into other countries, there is one such market which may have been overlooked: shortwave radio. Although shortwave broadcasting has been in existence for decades, its current perception in the United States is that of the ham operator listening with scratchy earphones from other hams worldwide. Overseas, this could not be further from the truth. Governments use shortwave much like we use AM & FM here in the states. They are able to cover entire countries by the use of very few transmitters with easy control over programming. Almost all shortwave radio stations are today government-owned, such as the Voice of America, Radio Moscow, BBC, and Swiss Radio International. There are only a handful of commercial, non-government-owned shortwave stations. WWCR in Nashville is one of these. By the way, in the United Kingdom alone, there are over 70 million shortwave radios. By way of comparison, there are only 20 million television sets. There are even less televisions connected to cable systems. On a positive note, CMT: Country Music Television is now available to over 7 million of these sets. Again, this is excellent news for the genre, but wouldn't 70 million listeners be even better news? Check this out:

World Wide Country started as a two-hour show airing prime time in Europe on Sundays. After the first broadcast, because of overwhelming response, *World Wide Country* was expanded to twice on Sundays for prime time U.S. coverage. As of one month ago, WWCR is broadcasting seven days a week, Monday thru Friday from noon to 6 p.m., which is 6 p.m. to midnight in London and most of the rest of Europe, give or take an hour. If the trend and the fan mail continue, *World Wide Country* is considering broadcasting 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Shortwave owners can currently tune to WWCR at 15.610 from 12:00 to 4:00 p.m., and 12.160 after 4:00 p.m. A quick note to the novice: Shortwave signals, unlike other radio or TV signals, "bounce" off the ionosphere, an umbrella several hundred miles above the Earth's surface. The bounce continues back and forth between the Earth and this umbrella until the signal strength dissipates from repetition. How far the station reaches depends upon the angle of the original transmitted signal, much like a ball being bounced. The signal at WWCR is set off at a low angle and cannot even be heard well within 200 miles of Nashville. BUT, these far-off bounces result in reception virtually around the world.

Vince Ebo Dead At 39



CASTRO VALLEY, CALIF.—Recording artist Vince Ebo died from a self-inflicted shotgun wound to the head sometime between the evening of December 14 and December 15, 1993 according to longtime friend and manager, Phil Arnold.

Arnold stated that Ebo had been despondent over the unsuccessful release of his Christian debut album, *Love Is the Better Way*, on Warner Alliance and other career setbacks in '93 that included being dropped from the label's artist roster last March. Friends of Ebo are quick to respond that although he was discouraged by his recording career, it played a small part in the

complex nature of the problems their friend faced.

Unknown to many, Ebo first attempted suicide in November, but friends and family were confident that Ebo, who was in counseling at the time of his death, was feeling positive about his career and the future.

Ebo left a short note saying that Christ had forgiven him and he hoped that everyone else would also. In addition, he left a statement to the police absolving the, as yet, unknown owner of the gun he borrowed stating, "I borrowed it under false pretenses."

Ebo had been recently selected to become the national spokesperson for Project Impact, a juvenile court diversion, family counseling and job training program for "at risks" youth. His video, "Make It Work," was slated to become the organization's new slogan and soundtrack for an infomercial about the program. It was for this organization that he made his last public appearance on December 13 performing for 600 graduates of the program and their families.

Ebo had just completed work on 15 new songs and was actively pursuing a new record deal. He was also performing with a new San Francisco-based quartet, S.F.O., while working on a book tentatively titled after his album, *Love Is The Better Way*, that chronicled his life and faith.

Ebo's career included commercials, modeling, TV and movie appearances as well as records on A&M, Soul Train and Warner Bros. Records. In the '80s he performed in the groups Sun Bear with Roger Smith and The Fits with Chuck Gentry. Many thought his fluid R&B vocal stylings were unparalleled, and he did frequent studio work for the likes of Ben E. King, Todd Rundgren, Michael W. Smith and Russ Taff.

However, it was for his six-year vocal partnership with Charlie Peacock and the Charlie Peacock Trio that Ebo was best known. Ebo, Peacock and guitarist Jimmy Abegg's unique sound was known worldwide and made them a favorite on Contemporary Christian music tour circuit. Ebo was scheduled to join Peacock in the studio in January to begin work on a new Peacock project for Sparrow. A representative for Peacock said the project was on hold indefinitely. Peacock was unavailable for comment.

Funeral services were held December 19 in Rancho Cordova, California. Ebo is survived by his parents, Mr. & Mrs. Walter Ebo, two brothers, and fiancée Kim Flemming. Charlie Peacock is reportedly organizing a memorial service for Ebo in Nashville. Ebo's management, Thrill Entertainment, is currently setting up a Vince Ebo Scholarship Fund in conjunction with Project Impact. Interested parties should contact Phil Arnold at 510/487-6930.

Neil Joseph, president of Warner Alliance, had this to say about Ebo, "Vinnie was a star. He had true star quality. He had unique qualities as a vocalist but as a communicator he had an unbelievable way to communicate to audiences unlike any other. We at Warner Alliance have lost a good friend."

1994—Year Of Gospel Music

We offer our heartfelt appreciation to the Congress of the United States of America for recognizing and giving this treasured art form a special place in the annals of American history."

GMA executive director Bruce Koblisch stated, "1994 proves to be a very special significant year for gospel and contemporary Christian music. These exciting announcements today are providing a new platform from which GMA and our industry will realize growth and visibility in greater measure than ever before. The united effort that this represents sends a message which reflects the power and strength of the gospel message contained in our music."

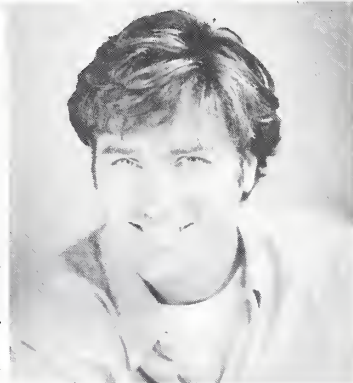

Steven Curtis Chapman is once again everywhere, winning just about everything there is to win. Whether he's wishing "Happy Birthday" to his daughter Emily at the Grammy Awards or picking yet another basketload of Doves, Chapman continues to charm us exhibiting the best of what this industry has to offer.

Michael W. Smith celebrates an unbelievable 10 years in the industry and Reunion Records rolls out the red marketing carpet with lots of product to remember him by.

January

The year kicked off with the announcement that **Bertelsmann Music Group (BMG)** would purchase 50 percent of **Blanton/Harrell Management** and **Reunion Records**. BMG Music Publishing also would go on to buy 100 percent of Reunion Music Group catalog of copyrights and jointly establish a new publishing company.

Star Song Communications started the new year with what would become a regular rumor—a possible buyout or investor involvement. Negotiations with both **Thomas Nelson** and **Zomba Music** would prove fruitless.

Spectra shocked the industry and most of its 27 distributed labels as it shut its doors and laid off its staff January 29 just one week after its well-attended sales conference. President **Bob MacKenzie**, who filed Chapter Seven on behalf of Spectra, notified each of the labels of the company's inability to pay monies due them from net sales for November through January 27. On February 1, **Diadem Records** president **George King** announced that he was hiring several of Spectra's top sales people and forming **Diadem Distribution**, a sales system for its own Diadem and Tribute product as well as stranded Spectra-distributed labels.

February

Sandi Patti held a press conference for select media hounds in Nashville on February 12, performing selections from her new *Le Voyage* album and answering questions regarding her impending divorce from husband, **John Helvering** and a disclosure that she was sexually molested as a child. Patti's *Another Time, Another Place* would go platinum.

March

Steven Curtis Chapman and **4HIM** were the big winners in Dove nominations walking away with seven and six respectively. Chapman took home his second Grammy for Best Pop Gospel Album for *The Great Adventure* while **Bruce Carroll** saw his second Best Southern Gospel Album with *Sometimes Miracles Hide*. **Petra** won Best/Rock/Contemporary Album for *Unseen Powers*.

April

On April 1, Steven Curtis Chapman would go on to win an unprecedented six Dove Awards. The list of winners are as follows: Song of the Year, "The Great Adventure"; Songwriter of the Year, Chapman; Artist of the Year, Chapman; Best Group, 4HIM; Best Male Vocalist, **Michael English**; and Best New Artist, **Cindy Morgan**.

May

The Federal Bureau of Investigation confirmed that it was investigating allegations that lawyer, **Samuel Chapell**, diverted funds intended for clients, **Sandi Patti** and **Carman** into his own personal accounts. Chapell would later be indicted by a Federal Grand Jury on June 23 on five counts and defrauding three local banks of more than 500,000. Chapell was sentenced October 8 to a 25-month term and repayment of debt.

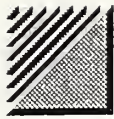
June

Amidst rumors of filing Chapter 13, **Frontline Music Group (FMG)** would feel its biggest shake-up in its eight-year history. Four of the company's top executives, president **Brian Tong**, executive vice presi-

dent **Michael Mac Lane**, vice president creative services **Ed McTaggart** and chief financial officer **Dennis Uno** left the company April 15. FMG announced it would restructure the company making "an effort to

Owner **James Kempner** returns to oversee the restructuring of the company stating that he had no plans to file Chapter 13 and that it was business as usual. FMG Distribution announced the formation of an advisory board with the intent to form a new distribution company which would become the **Diamante Music Group (DMG)**.

Meat Loaf: Still ridin' high

MCA IN EUROPE...MCA Music Entertainment has unveiled its pan-European expansion plans which involves six new record companies on April 1—no joke this! It was announced at the opening of the company's international office in London that Belgium, France, Holland, Italy, Sweden and Spain were to follow.

International president **Jorgan Larsen** also said that it was anticipated that further territories would be announced during 1994. Last September MCA made a five-year deal with **BMG** to handle its manufacturing and distribution in each territory.

Chairman **Al Teller** says the planned expansion puts MCA in an excellent position to grow its A&R base and market share without having to invest in costly manufacturing and distribution facilities which may have a limited life.

CD PRICES...It now appears that Britain's Monopolies and Merger Commission has given the pricing of CDs a clean bill of health. This has not been officially announced at the time of writing but the MMC is now thought to be focusing on: music retailing (probably concerning the W.H. Smith group); record contracts and labels' ownership of masters; performance royalties for records and music videos; and restrictions on the release of sessions recorded for radio and TV.

Recent rulings by the MCC on other industries give the music industry every reason to be optimistic.

ASCAP...ASCAP UK regional director **James Fisher** has left the US rights society for "personal reasons" after more than 12 years in the position. The organization is currently searching for a suitable replacement but the position is not expected to be filled for about three months. UK office membership representative **Michael Donovan** has now been promoted to a new post of senior director of repertory.

BUMPER CHRISTMAS...The UK Budget was not as dramatic as many had forecast and this, plus an improved and increased release flow containing many quality titles, has dramatically increased the prospects of a bumper Christmas as far as record sales are concerned, at a time when UK album sales are already running at more than 7% above last year.

Many retailers are reporting that the first week in December's figures are the best they can remember. In an industry that has proved that "there's many a slip between cup and lip" so often even the pessimists have been seen to smile, while some gung-ho indie dealers are taking about a 30% increase year-on figures.

CHARTS...Mr Blobby is still getting more column inches in our national newspapers than all the other pop stars put together and, just like Father Christmas, he has been appearing at more than one place at the same time and the **BBC** have confirmed that there could be more than one! God forbid!

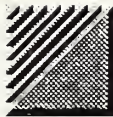
The fat, pink-and-yellow costume character increased his sales by more than 80% during the current week but drops from his top spot to #2 because **Take That's** "Babe" roars straight in at Number One. These two acts are selling more singles than the rest of the Top 10 put together. In addition, the live video *Take That: The Party—Live At Wembley* is top Music Video and *Mr Blobby* is selling even more being at #6 in the Video charts. Above him are *The Muppet Christmas Carol*, *Jungle Book*, *Beauty And The Beast*, *Home Alone 2* and *The Bodyguard*. The #7 position? You've guessed it—*Take That!*

Another strange thing about the Music Video charts is that Irish country singer **Daniel O'Donnell** who records for indie label **Ritz** has no less than three separate releases in the Top 30: *A Date With Daniel Live* is currently at #3 and *Follow Your Dream* and *An Evening With* are at the bottom of the chart—but they are one- and two-years-old respectively!

Take That, from the north of England, really have made 1993 their own because "Babe" is their third Number One this year—they are the first act to achieve this since **Jive Bunny** did it in 1989, and only 11 acts have equalled this in the history of our charts. Incidentally the single that takes over from "Babe" will be our 700th Number 1!

During this history only 33 singles have made their debut on the top and **Take That** are probably the first group to have three debut at Number 1 consecutively!

They may have pushed **Meat Loaf** out of the Top 10 singles but *Bat Out Of Hell II—Back To Hell* is still in pole position in the album section. So much so that it is still quite likely that we could be eating **Meat Loaf** instead of the traditional turkey this festive season! There are no new entries in the top 40 at all and no really dramatic movers.



NEWS FROM JAPAN

TEICHIKU RECORD CO., one of the major record manufacturers in this country, has established two subsidiary companies this year; **K.K. TMC (Teichiku Music Corporation)** and **K.K. Tricle** through complete financing of the parent company. According to **Nobuyuki Kuwata**, president, the purpose of these two new companies is to reinforce creative fields in the Teichiku Group. "The most essential part of the operation to the record manufacturers is in the capacity of creativity," said Kuwata. **Hiroshi Matsu**, chief of the third creative section of Teichiku Co. has been named president of **K.K. TMC**. TMC will have two labels, **Teichiku** and **TMC** and its capital is \$1.9 million, wholly invested by the parent company. **Takehisa Goto**, chief of the first creative section, has been named president of **K.K. Tricle**. According to persons concerned, these two new subsidiary companies have various functions in which creating original works, design of jackets, total advertisements and public relations and sales promotions are included.

ACCORDING TO RIAJ, (Record Industries Association of Japan), the total shipments of audio and video softwares here for October 1993 were \$620 million, 12% down from the comparable month of 1992. This represents, in volume, 43.727 million, a 6% drop from the month state above. Audio softwares were \$483 million, 6% down while video softwares showed \$263 million, a 28% drop. Exception to the whole downward trend with both audio and video was CDs, with an increase of 12% to \$127 million over the comparable month of the prior year.

TOKIO SUKA, management division chief of **Alfa Records**, has been selected as the representative executive of the company following the resignation of **Chuichi Kanoko**, president, who has taken office of the advisor of the company.

PONY CANYON RECORDS CO., has experienced decreases in both total revenues and net incomes in the first six months of fiscal 1993 (March 21, 1993 to September 20, 1993). According to the company, the total revenues in this term were \$335 million, 16.4% down from the comparable months of the prior fiscal year of \$400 million. A breakdown of revenues according to items shows: Audio softwares were \$165 million, 73% of the prior comparable months of \$225 million while video softwares showed \$140 million, a 3.2% drop from \$147 million. Miscellaneous softwares including DM were \$19 million, 96.8% of the comparable months of the prior fiscal year of \$20 million. In this term, some medium-sized hits have been on the market from the company by **Chage & Aska**, **Airi Hiramatsu**, **Shizuka Kudo**, **Kai Five**, and **Hikaru Genji**, however, the company has not been blessed with large scale smash hits as in the comparable six months of the prior fiscal year. As to the video softwares, the company has been able to release a big hit, "Bijyo To Yajyuu," ("A Beautiful Girl And A Wild Animal"), however the total sales of the division were down 2% due to a low-toned market of the total visual industries in this country.

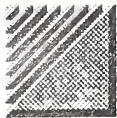

Valley Survey Reveals High Earnings Potential Of New Dart Machine "Game Package"

CHICAGO—Valley Recreation Products, Inc. recently commissioned an independent earnings test, conducted in the Minneapolis/St. Paul area, to determine the effects of the new games that were added to Valley's new Cougar Dart machines. The added games are 701, 901, Mark 21 (a no-score type of Cricket game) and a play-the-computer feature called "Ernie."

With the introduction of the new games in March of this year, Valley also gave away packets of in-bar promotional materials as back-up for attracting player interest.

The results were dramatic, according to Valley officials. New Cougar machines with promotional materials posted earned 20 percent more than the previous Cougar model. Additionally, installation of the upgrade kit in older Cougar models (with promotional materials posted) produced similar results—an average 20 percent earnings increase.

Valley offers the new games in kit form, for updating previous Cougar machines, at under \$100.

As explained by Dick Shelton, Valley's senior vice president and general manager, "We tested new Cougar Dart machines with the new games and in-bar promotional materials against our previous-generation Cougar models, so that we could tell Valley operators what value there would be in upgrading their older models and stress the importance of posting the in-bar promotional materials."

The test utilized some 17 machines over a 12-week period. "The results were 'solid' but were nonetheless confirmed by extending the test an additional four weeks," he added. Shelton noted that the earnings increases "may well not be permanent."

"The newness factor is undoubtedly operative," he said, explaining that earnings increases are often inspired by new features and new promotional materials, the question being how long the higher level of earnings will prevail.

He pointed out that, even if the higher income erodes over a period of a year or so, a 20 percent increase can add up to a good deal of money in six months time.

The upgrade kits consist of several replacement buttons, an electronic board and a new instruction panel overlay and can easily be installed, on location, in about a half hour, according to Valley's technical service staff.

The promotional materials packet is available from Valley "for the asking" with the purchase of a new Cougar Dart machine or the update kit, for a limited time.

"We had expected that the new games alone would increase earnings and that the 'Ernie' in-bar promotional materials would help earnings along a little further," stated marketing manager Scott Schroeder. "But what we found out is the promotional materials are the key element." He noted that increased plays came from the "old favorites" more so than the new 701, 901 and Mark 21 games.

When the inevitable occurs and the effects of the promo materials wear off Schroeder promised, "There will be more, hopefully, even better materials coming forth as Valley continues its commitment to maintain a flow of new promotions for its operators."

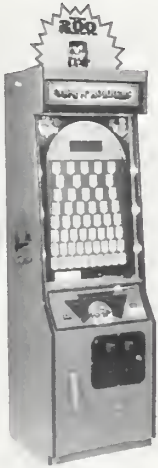

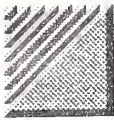
