Court Affirms Waits

COMPOSER TOM WAITS stood victorious in his decades-long struggle to keep his songs from being used to peddle goods or services in commercials when a California Court of Appeal last month affirmed an earlier decision that Waits' former music publisher, **Third Story Music**, wrongly permitted two of the artist's songs to be used in advertisements without his consent.

The original 1994 case judge, **Harvey A. Schneider**, wrote in his decision: "Since the Court has concluded that Waits' consent was required for any commercial use of (these) compositions, and since it is unrefuted no consent was obtained from him with respect to the use of his compositions in the Williams Gel and Levi commercials, it is clear there has been a breach of the agreement between Waits and Third Story Music."

The court stated that Waits' views on the use of his material in commercials was made clear by the artist to his then-manager **Herb Cohen**. The decision reads: "Waits also testified that he told (ex-manager) Herb Cohen on numerous occasions before 1977 about his position on the use of his compositions in commercials." And that "the court also observes that Waits' testimony that he unequivocally opposed use of his compositions in commercials stands unrefuted because Herb Cohen did not testify at trial. The fact that Herb Cohen did not testify speaks volumes about the truth of Waits' testimony."

Judge Schneider had ruled following the August 1994 trial that Third Story Music "is required to disgorge all monies received by it by reason of the use of Waits' compositions in commercials..." and that the songwriter is entitled to recover \$20,000 "for embarrassment and humiliation sustained by him."

Third Story appealed and although the emotional distress sum was reversed by the appellate court on the ground such damages should not be awarded in breach of contract cases, the Court of Appeal emphatically re-affirmed the more important issue, namely the right of Waits to decide whether or not the songs at issue can be used in commercials.

Waits, hearing of the decision, commented: "It has always been my belief that anything that degrades the value of the work in turn degrades the artist. Publishers who control copyrights should view it as a stewardship, never betraying the integrity of the catalog. An artist has the right to have his or her work presented as intended and not ruthlessly cannibalized."

"The licensing of a song for a commercial against the wishes of the artist reduces it to a meaningless jingle where it becomes fused with the product and its image, drained of its delicate and dreamlike quality. Publishers who only see songs as merchandise to be bought and sold are betraying their responsibility as cultural stewards. The Artist Rights Foundation and its many members support these principals."

"I will continue to defend my rights of ownership through my authorship and lend my support to others when their rights are ignored."

BMG Expands in Pacific Rim

BMG ENTERTAINMENT INTERNATIONAL, **Asia Pacific**, recently teamed with Japan's **Fun House, Inc.**, Hong Kong-based **Music Impact Entertainment, Ltd.** and Taiwan-based **Elite Music** for investment in the region's domestic music with an aim to expand BMG's presence in throughout the Pacific Rim.

Fun House, Inc. is a new company created by BMG Ent. Int'l and is an outgrowth of Fun House Co. Ltd., home to artists like **Kazumasa Oda** and **Sing Like Talking**. BMG has also formed a partnership to launch Music Impact, which harbors artist such as Cantonese giant **Andy Lau**. The move is expected to bring to 20% BMG's stake in the Hong Kong music market. Finally, BMG has taken a majority stake in Taiwan's Elite Music, and has effectively formed an independent label consortium in that territory.

"BMG has spent the last few years strengthening its regional infrastructure through strategic partnerships in key Asia Pacific markets," comments **Michael Smellie**, sr. vp of BMG Ent' Int'l, Asia Pacific. "We have sought

EAST COAST

CASE SOLVED: Ever look at one of those band tree charts where one unassuming group spawned a whole host of other groups that clung to the same style of playing, but slowly evolved into something else? **The Mysteries Of Life** is such a group. With former **Blake Baby/Antenna** member **Freda Love** and former Antenna guitarist **Jake Smith** (who are married to each other), have gone off on one of those sonic tree limbs. The debut LP **Keep A Secret** on RCA has the light pop feeling that sounds like it belongs in the '90s and at the same time does not. Catchy tunes with sad underpinnings are emphasized by **Geraldine Haas'** cello. The record was made nearly a year and a half ago and **TMOL** has already started to branch out further which was evident when they played at **Maxwell's** on the 27th. The group had brought in an organist to fill out the sound that is much more vibrant live, and allows the group to tug you into a groove as the instruments play off each other in a very friendly way. Opening up for **TMOL** was the Austin-based **Spoon** which has a certain flair. The trio led by **Britt Daniel** who is somehow able to twist his acoustic guitar's voice this way and that with hardly any effects pedals, to give the band that early **Pixies** quality. Their debut album **Telephono** is out on **Matador** at the end of April.

A PYRAMID BUILDER RETURNS: **Pharoah Sanders** is one of those names that echoes from the end of the great '60s jazz era. Playing with **John Coltrane**, **Sun Ra** and **Don Cherry**. Now all of them have passed into the ages and Sanders still remains trying out new ventures. His stand at the **Knitting Factory** last week was a place for him to bring these concepts up close. It started out with a piece that drew heavily on non-Western influences and entered into a Middle Eastern trance phase with some heavy droning. The following two works went from fusion to a study on one blues riff. All of the time the leader of the sextet showed himself to be the consummate showman as even the bobs of his head were watched with rapt attention. His latest album was released on March 19th and is entitled **Message From Home** on the **Verve** label.

HOME TEAM GOES ON THE ROAD: If there is a New York group that has put in its just dues it is **Versus**. The group has been refining its guitar-driven, harmony-laden indie rock for over three years. All the while gaining quite a following all over the U.S. With the release of the EP **Deep Red** on the D.C. **Teen Beat** label the group has taken to the road for a 40-show tour in 44 days. Some of the upcoming dates include Atlanta 4/6, Memphis 4/7, New Orleans 4/10, Houston 4/11, Austin 4/12, Oklahoma City 4/14 and Madison 4/18 rounds out the first two weeks. A full album is expected in July on **Caroline Records**. There is no doubt who will be given the champion's cheer.

CAGED HEAT COMES TO SILVERLAKE: Roger Corman's **Concorde Pictures**, the new **Cinemadisc** label, along with **ASCAP** and **A&M Records** came together at **Spaceland** for a party for Corman's latest epic, **Caged Heat 3000**. The women-in-prison series has a remarkably classy pedigree—the original **Caged Heat** was directed by **Jonathan Demme**. But we digress. An Appreciation

A Diva In The Park

SUMMERSTAGE IN CENTRAL PARK, NY last September... What?... Not what, *Who!*... Annie Lennox. First time performing in the U.S. in six years and the only concert appearance in this country supporting her *Medusa* album, which went on to hit Multi-Platinum, along with her earlier *Diva*.

Now, *What!*...what do you go to an Annie Lennox concert for, and especially this one? She has short cropped red hair and dresses in only a Scottish red plaid pants outfit through the entire concert—can you imagine that? A Diva with only a single costume—and it, f’Pete’ sake, is a *pants* outfit, long sleeved, and she has a same patterned, same colored *scarf* on. Where’re the curves?! Where’s the glamour! Where’s the *Show!*—“Hit me with my spot, Hawkeye...I’m ready for my close-up, Mr. DeMille.”

is *there*. Watch closely as she sings, connecting to the audience with those terrific orbs which make it appear as if she’s talking to *you*, looking right into you and picking up on just what you want to hear. You want an image? She’ll give it to you through those eyes, through unseen connective strands of steel pulling you in, through Lennox magic. And don’t kid yourself that she’s *just* a performer; this lady has magic, perhaps more magic than even she knows.

This writer remembers seeing her for the first time 10 to 12 years ago via the music video supporting “Sweet Dreams (Are Made Of This)” and those eyes reached out from under the orange hair to tell me that a multitude of things were cycloning around inside there. Sure, the sound was great, the voice clear and un-digitized, and there was *honesty* in abundance there, from the vocals through the presentation. And I remember thinking someone’s going to make a star of that one. Well, she made a star of herself, she and partner Dave Stewart, from that first *Sweet Dreams* RIAA Gold-certified hit on RCA in ’83. They reached Platinum with the following year’s *Touch* led by “Here Comes The Rain Again” and tripled up with another Platinum in ’85 with *Be Yourself Tonight*, led by “Would I Lie To You.” Certified hits, certified stars.

Lennox, who recently won a Grammy for best pop female vocal, went on to solo Platinum success on the Arista label with her *Diva* and *Medusa* albums and acted in a few things—a TV movie *The Room* and the feature *Edward II*, both rather undistinguished—and she went on her musical way, reinventing herself with various looks, all of which are fascinating. Still, 11, or however many years later it is, I still contend that someone’s going to make a star of this lady because somewhere in there is an actress ready to come out.

Perhaps she’s content to remain in her music world, but there is a *magic* inside of her that, when properly tapped, will spring her loose from being earthbound. That is, understandably, if she desires it, because if she doesn’t there’s still *that* voice which can keep her in whatever castle she cares to reside in in her native Scotland.

Well, this isn’t Sunset Blvd. in Hollywood, or Broadway, and this performer isn’t what is commonly thought of as a glamour gal, remember? This is Annie Lennox. You’ve come to Central Park not to get mugged with a bludgeon or a fashion show, you’ve come to *listen* to the lady offer her special brand of soul music. That’s what you’ve come here for.

But if you want dramatics, look into those blazing eyes; that inner fire which fuels the vocal excitement she presents her material with

Annie Lennox...In The Park On Disney

THE DISNEY CHANNEL continues its musical concert series with a special featuring former Eurythmic Annie Lennox in a solo performance emanating from the Summerstage of New York’s Central Park, filmed last September.

It’s a full concert as the Scottish-born diva pleased the crowd with a dozen of her own and Dave Stewart’s hits plus a tailored rendition of The Clash’s “Train In Vain” and Bob Marley’s “Waiting In Vain”—maybe she’s got a thing about “vain” though she didn’t seem too “vain” nor did she spin in the wind like a weather “vane,” she did, however, hit the “vein” of the crowd and had them singing along with her.

The airing special is a La Lennox Ltd. Production in association with 19 Management Ltd. and Partizan Midi Minuit. Director Joe Dyer used multiple—looked to be six—cameras, three static, a riser and two free roving units—to capture the excitement of both the crowd and Lennox, who manages to impart the feeling that she’s thoroughly enjoying herself.

Lennox opened the evening with “Money Can’t Buy It,” moved into “Legend In My Living Room” and got the crowd up on its feet dancing with “Walking On Broken Glass” which was jazzed up for the TV audience with portions of Lennox in the studio recording “...Glass.” Some neat editing by Rick Waller, who performed it again on “Little Bird” and the wonderful blues-tinged “I Love You Like A Ball And Chain,” both being intercut with footage from an earlier rehearsal and sound check.

Lennox moved through the program comfortably betraying none of the nervousness she professed to be afflicted with because, she noted, this was her first time back to NY, live on stage, in six years.

Whether it has been six years or six hours, the audience cared and showed their appreciation as she displayed her soulfulness through “No More ‘I Love You’s,’” “Who’s That Girl,” “Sweet Dreams (Are Made Of This)” and the popular closer “Why?”

Stephen Lipson handled the musical direction and bass. Other members of the group: Keyboards, Andy Richards and David Frank; guitar, Paul Pesco (super on an acoustic-only accompaniment on “Waiting In Vain”); Steve Wolf, drums; Rafael Padilla, percussion; and Tessa Niles, and Katie Kissoon, backing vocals.

Pete Chambers and Simon Fuller produced.

■ HOOTIE & THE BLOWFISH: "old man and me (when I get to heaven)" (Atlantic 6694-2)



Hootie & the Blowfish have found their sound and they're sticking to it. (Wouldn't you?) This, the first single off the eagerly-awaited new disc from last year's mega-ultra-billions-sold superstars won't disappoint the band's legions of fans. "old man and me" is an undeniably infectious, loose-limbed rocker, relaxed, tuneful and fun. The song will undoubtedly become a staple across the board on nearly every radio format. Hootie & the Blowfish will release their full album, *Fairweather Johnson*, on April 23rd. "old man & me" will be commercially-released in a special Enhanced CD single package that includes the track's Dan Winter-directed companion video, plus the non-album bonus track, "Before The Heartache Rolls In."

■ WHITNEY HOUSTON & CECE WINANS: "Count On Me" (Arista 07822-12977-2)

The #1 *Waiting To Exhale* soundtrack shows no signs of losing its considerable legs: "Count on Me" pairs Whitney Houston with her longtime friend, gospel crossover star CeCe Winans for a duet of smooth, inspiring pop melodies and astounding pyrotechnic vocals. The gorgeous harmonies of the two legendary vocalists—which prompted a standing ovation at the recent Grammy awards—float over restrained orchestration with the effortless grace of a helium balloon. Co-written by Houston, Babyface, and Michael Houston, the single was also released as part of a five-song EP featuring four other Whitney Houston classics: "One Moment In Time," her duet with her mother, Cissy Houston, "I Know Him So Well," Houston's take on "Jesus Loves Me" and a rousing uptempo trio with Bebe and CeCe Winans, "Hold Up the Light."

■ TWIG: "Starfish Girl/Barely Dressed" (Fish of Death Records 7")

The B-side of this 7" from Twig, led by Louise Goffin, is a true find. "Barely Dressed" is a moody, eloquent, undulating ballad whose memorable jazzy groove shimmers with dark elegance. This single proves Goffin has inherited the prodigious musical talents of her parents, legendary songwriters Gerry Goffin and Carole King. Goffin will be touring soon as a guitarist for Tears For Fears.

■ SOLO: "He's Not Good Enough" (Perspective PSSAD 00162)

The new single off Solo's eponymous, recently-gold-plated debut disc looks to follow the Top 10 R&B chart success of "Heaven" and "Where Do You Want Me To Put It?" The complex, intricate vocals of the former New York street-singer trio seem telepathically connected; this is a lush, soulful ballad, executive-produced by Jimmy Jam and Terry Lewis, who originally discovered Solo.

■ GODS CHILD: "Female Elvis" (Qwest/Warner Brothers 2-46089-A (CD))

Gods Child first came to prominence with its "Everybody's 1" single off the debut album, and rock-till-you-drop touring with Green Day, Hootie & the Blowfish, Collective Soul, Candlebox and Joan Osborne. This whimsical and fun single offsets humorous lyrics with a simple but evocative melody. Off the band's *Aluminum* disc, "Female Elvis" has a straightforward, classy rock n' roll charm, kinda like Warren Zevon for the '90s, with an anthemic, radio-friendly vibe and inventive musical flourishes.

PICK OF THE WEEK



■ DISHWALLA: "Counting Blue Cars" (A&M, AMCDP 0012 2)

Up-and-coming alterna-rockers Dishwalla have hit on their breakout, chart-climbing single with this, a memorably languid, wistful rocker that will stick in your head for the rest of the day after one go-round on the radio. A natural for heavy music and alternative stations, J.R. Richards' fluid, resonant voice and "Counting Blue Cars" beautiful, sparkly harmonies could also be a welcome addition to more mellow formats. Off the Santa Barbara-based band's debut, *Pet Your Friends*, and highly recommended.

■ STEREO LAB: *Emperor Tomato Ketchup* (Elektra 61840-4)

If Sade ever decided to collaborate with Kraftwerk, the results might sound a little like Stereolab. A thoughtful, entirely mesmerizing album, *Emperor Tomato Ketchup* lulls the listener into its subtle, gently repetitive universe—which turns ominous just when you're ready to enter a trance state. Vocalist Laetitia Sadier has a sophisticated, restrained style that plays counterpoint to the music's textured, intricate pulse. Stereolab's minimalist pop is critically well-regarded and a must for college markets, but grown-ups and jazz fans might also enjoy the smooth, keyboard-heavy, cocktail-lounge vibe of cuts like "Cybele's Reverie."



■ ASS PONYS: *The Known Universe* (A&M 3145404782)

Already a much-lauded cult favorite, this Cincinnati-based band blends a rustic, cry-in-your-beer edge with witty stories which usually concern the bizarre (like "Redway," a true tale about a local drunk who dies from eating an entire barrel of pickled eggs). Like a down-home sonic version of a David Lynch movie, Ass Ponys' 1994 major label debut, *Electric Rock Music*, was picked up after being cheaply recorded for indie release. Now, armed with a bigger budget, Ass Ponys wield bigger, more lush and twangy chords. The

first single, "God Tells Me To," is winging its way to college radio at this very moment.

■ SHONEN KNIFE: *The Birds and the B-Sides* (Virgin 7243 8 41414 2 4)

Shonen Knife's insane mix of jaunty '60s girl-group pop, surfer-fuzzbox-punk and a gleefully loony view of the world has long garnered them a dedicated underground audience. In fact, e-mail from fans helped determine the line up for this compilation, which catalogues some weird and delightful rarities from the Japanese trio. *Birds...* includes skewed covers of the Carpenters' "Top Of The World" and Martha & the Vandellas' classic, "Heatwave," along with Shonen Knife originals like "I Wanna Eat Choco Bars," "Strawberry Cream Puff" and "Fruit Loop Dreams." (Why are so many Shonen Knife songs about food? Who knows?)



■ MARK KNOPFLER: *Golden Heart* (Warner Bros. 9 46026-2)

The lead singer of Dire Straits returns with a fluid, intelligent solo disc. The spare, acoustic lilt of the title track is offset by the percussive, moody syncopation of "No Can Do" and the unabashed twang of "Nobody's Got the Gun" and "Are We In Trouble Now." Both tracks feature guest vocals from Vince Gill and are perfect candidates for country crossover. "Imelda" is a thoughtful meditation on politics and shoes, while Sonny Landreth and several members of the Chieftans grace other tracks on this interesting collection of songs.

■ THE JESUS LIZARD: *Shot* (Capitol 36778)

No band in recent memory has as much street cred as the Jesus Lizard, who steadfastly resisted signing to a major label for years. The Chicago-based group is releasing its first album on Capitol, but *Shot* was actually preceded by seven independent releases and many singles, including a track on the soundtrack to *Clerks*. The Jesus Lizard routinely sell out fairly hefty-sized venues, and were part of Lollapalooza '95. The experience shows. Jesus Lizard has come up with a tough and always unpredictable disc whose bigger production values weigh in against David Yow's murder-about-to-happen vocals. *Shot* veers from dark, soundtrack-ish glamour to a sharp-edged, industrial grind without missing a beat. College fans, alterna-kids and headbangers will all love this disc in unison.





■ **TOTAL: "No One Else" (Arista 79051-2)**

As Teddy Riley did with the whole New Jack Swing sound, Sean "Puffy" Combs is playing the songs he wants the whole world to sing. This single is phat and well in line with the Bad Boy's tradition of hip-hop. The addition of Da Brat, Lil' Kim (who is everywhere lately), and Foxy Brown certainly adds an edge that will rock any spot to new party heights. There are two remixes of this single and each is unique. Radio should be happy with both.

■ **REV RUN: "Sanctified" (Benson 1244)**

While this track kicks with some smooth R&B grooves, it does not deliver what one might expect from one of rap music's key pioneers. The song lacks energy and focus and is in need of a good remix if it is to do well in the marketplace. Run certainly has the talent, however, what he needs now is some direction.

■ **JACKERS: "Down 4 Life" (Immortal ESK7756)**


This track is as infectious as the track that it borrows from, Gil Scott Heron's "Angel Dust." Now with the help of Bay Area rapper Mr. Doctor, Jackers could have a hit that lingers on the taste buds for quite a while. Although Muggs (from Cypress Hill) put together a good club remix, the clean version of the single will be a crowd favorite as well. Maybe this could be the single to start Immortal Records on an upward climb.

■ HERBIE HANCOCK: *The New Standard* (Verve 314 529 584). Producers: H. Hancock & Guy Eckstine.

Always in possession of a kaleidoscopic perspective, Hancock finds the right swatch of color and energy for nearly every track on this collection of cover tunes (save the Jean and Herbie Hancock composition "Manhattan [Island of Lights and Love].") The expanse of material from which the pianist (in fine form throughout

this collection) draws from ranges from Peter Gabriel's "Mercy Street" and Kurt Cobain's "All Apologies" to Kenny "Babyface" Edmonds' "When Can I See You" and Prince's "Thieves In The Temple." And you'll barely recognize any of these pop tunes as Hancock and special guests Michael Brecker (saxes), John Scofield (guitars), Dave Holland (bass), drummer Jack DeJohnette and percussionist Don Alias have a penchant for taking a song's melody on harmonic and rhythmic excursions. Already #6 with a bullet on the *Cash Box* jazz albums list, radio and retail are responding to this richly-textured album.


■ CASSANDRA WILSON: *New Moon Daughter* (Blue Note CDP 7243 8 32861 2 6). Producer: Craig Street.

More indigo moonlight, folky- and smokey-voiced musings from this inventive song stylist, this sophomore release for Blue Note and 10th overall as a leader carves out deeper purchase on the rarified acreage she established in her label debut—*Blue Light 'Til Dawn*. The marvelous mixture of disparate material included with her original compositions are tightly woven into a comprehensive aural mosaic by her inimitable voice, astute interpretations and the apt and unobtrusive accompaniment. Wilson's rendering of "Strange Fruit" is appropriately uncomfortable in its presentation, a jagged lament that fits the dark subject matter. On the other end of the spectrum, and equally cogent in its presentation, is her cover of the U2 track "Love Is Blindness." Hell, she even has a hip spin on The Monkees' "Last Train To Clarksville." The gentle introspections of "Until" are among the best of her self-penned works on this collection.



■ TOM COSTER: *From The Street* (JVC JVC-2053-2). Producer: T. Coster.

Coster went for the jugular with this sonically dense slab of music. Although he can play straight-ahead, that's never quite good enough, as he has to meld his panoramic perspective into nearly each track. Take this record's opener, the cheekily-titled "Can't We All Just Get Along?" Coster's traditional piano approach on this track is underscored by his synth textures and the



seamless funk, solos and rhythm breaks supplied by his stellar group of sidemen. Some of them include tenorists Bob Malach (particularly on the opener) and Michael Brecker, guitarist Steve Cardenas, drummer Dennis Chambers, Shelia E. on percussion and Mark Isham on trumpet and cornet. Coster creates a myriad of moods throughout the record, which seems poised to attract a spectrum of radio airplay. Some notable tracks include "Monk-E-Shines," the Weather Report-esque "From The Street," the Chambers-

driven "Dennis The Menace" and the equally percussive and exotic "Amazon Life."

■ EARL KLUGH: *Sudden Burst Of Energy* (Warner Bros. 9 45884-2). Producer: E. Klugh.

A forebearer of what has come to be known as the New Adult Contemporary (NAC) musical genre, Klugh, provides some accessible and tasty licks on this collection which is a celebration of his musical perspective rather than a re-invention. Klugh's clean, pristine style has rarely sounded better, even though he does not challenge the parameters of the material here. As always he's lyrical, particularly on the track "Sunset Island." The guitarist does permit his playing to become more pungent on the funky track "The Wiggle," which appears to be a sure bet for urban, A/C and jazz radio airplay. And the lively, rollicking vigor of "Slow Boat to Rio" is a vintage serving of Brazilian carnival-flavored soul.

■ ROBERT STEWART: *In The Gutta* (Qwest/Warner Bros. 9 46167-2). Producers: R. Stewart & Craig Morton.

Although music by Ben Webster and John Coltrane fortuitously sparked his interest in the saxophone, young Robert Stewart owes more of his sensibilities to Webster, Gene Ammons and Coleman Hawkins than to Trane, although his youthful exuberance as a composer can run the gamut of blusey, introspective jazz language. But his tenor tone is telling, especially on the cover of the Erroll Garner standard "Misty." The Northern California Bay

Area native will easily forge out a following among lovers of the rootsy, *hoi polloi* aspect of jazz. It's music for just plain folks, y'all. But this young man's technical facility, which he also displays on organ, is not to be trifled with. His rendering of Marvin Gaye's "Inner City Blues," is an apt selection for Stewart, who resists the urge to prettify the soul of the music, but does make the cut shine with his harsh, pleasantly abrasive tones and lyricism.

RECORD SALES ALONG THE SUPER HIGHWAY: Enso Audio Imaging is the name of the new division created by Seattle, WA-based music library Muzak. The new venture is set up to design, program and serve up music for music retailers, radio stations and record labels doing business on the World Wide Web. Enso's first feature is the MusicServer, a technology using Progressive Networks, which recently introduced RealAudio 2.0 software which makes possible delivery of quality audio on demand to Internet users with multimedia computers and 28.8 modems and a standard phone line—all without a delay in downloading sound clips.

Claiming the world's largest music library for recorded music, technical expertise in digital music programming and boasting a department that can navigate the legal pathways involved in securing music rights, Muzak says that its customers can program web sites to offer digitally produced samples of any recorded music.

"Recorded music sales are already one of the most lucrative revenue categories on the Internet," comments Jim Harrison, Muzak's sr. vp of sales and marketing, who cited findings of the recent FIND/VSP's 1995 American Internet Users Survey as support for his contention. The survey ranks music among the top three of all commerce-related categories, along with software/hardware and books. The survey says 15.6% of users have already purchased from the Net and that 60% have already retrieved music.

CDnow (<http://www.cdnw.com>) is currently using MusicServer, which allows its browsers to listen to over 1,000 full-length songs from dozens of record labels on its Internet Jukebox (<http://interjuke.com>), which features classical, jazz and blues, pop and rock, techno and ambient, alternative and other music from more than a dozen record companies. The CDnow catalog boasts more than 165,000 titles and hopes to expand capabilities to include music videos as well.

Another Internet entertainment resource site, Agents, Inc., recently launched, and also employs MusicServer, to deliver music samples to consumers that use its Firefly music recommendation service (<http://www.fly.com>), which sorts through a user's profile and suggests CDs to consumers that fit their profile, permits them to sample the music and then purchase what they like.

The already beleaguered music retail outlets, many of which are gearing up to join the cyberspace revolution in their own promotion and sales efforts, must realize that they could become an anachronism if they do not attempt to compete on the Info Super Highway.


QUICK HITS: Tickets for this year's Lollapalooza alterna-music fest will be offered for sale for the first time in cyberspace. In a deal with Ticketmaster, which has been developing its online ticket sales service for months, Lollapalooza last Monday re-launched the Lollapalooza Internet website to offer the tickets and also permit consumers to purchase merchandise. The address is <http://lollapalooza.com>. Festival organizers expect that about 250,000 general admission tickets will be sold through the festival's website during the course of the 25-city summer tour...Navarre Corp.'s multimedia publishing and distribution subsidiary Digital Entertainment recently signed an exclusive multimedia distribution agreement with the Hal Leonard Corp., considered one of the largest music print publishers. The deal calls for Digital Entertainment to exclusively distribute all multimedia titles from Hal Leonard and affiliated music partners, the first of which is Music Maker, a CD-ROM product that converts computer keyboards into musical keyboards permitting the user to play a myriad of songs...The Save The Earth Foundation will be auctioning about 10-pieces from a series of limited edition lithographs created by the late Jerry Garcia via the Internet. The auction, will start on "Earth Day," Monday, April 22, and run through May 20th. The auction's address is http://www.commerce.com/save_earth.

Paramount's *Primal Fear* Is Prime Fare

IF THE WORLD ISN'T COMPLETELY worn out on ego-driven, big \$ lawyers and the manipulation of the American justice system, *Primal Fear* should pull in enough to hire the dream team again—or at least spring F. Lee Bailey before July 4th.

It's all here, leanly carved for the screen from William Diehl's novel by screenwriters Steve Shagan and Ann Biderman and done to near perfection by director Gregory Hoblit in his feature film directing debut, and an impressive one it is.

Hoblit knows his way around courtrooms, shaded areas of perpetrators' and lawyers' minds, cells and offices after stalking the territories as producer and director on such class TV acts as *Hill Street Blues*, *L.A. Law*, *Hooperman* and the currently-running *NYPD Blue*—nine Emmys' worth

anyway. He opens up the vistas to accommodate the excess area he has to work with on the move from small to big screen but also brings the edginess of story, character and movement those shows so wonderfully possess—which keeps audiences coming back. This property was an excellent vehicle to carry Hoblit to the silver screen where he more than succeeds.

In the process Hoblit has done two more things: Given star Richard Gere the most solid and viable product he's had recently; and hands the movie-going public debuting Edward Norton, the most exciting new talent since Leonardo DiCaprio, who'd now better get something *damned good* on screen and quick.

There are some familiar elements to the *Primal Fear* storyline, but that's where Hoblit's previously-mentioned TV training ground sets him in good stead; he's able to make his audience forget the scent of a fading rose and convince them it's the new aroma of a fresh-bloomed daisy, as those shows did, and do, every week. Hopefully he will continue teaming with Steven Bochco for continued TV quality, but he has shown he definitely knows the big screen arena also, and has a future in it.

To go into the story, other than to say it's a Chicago-set murder mystery, would rob you of the complete deliciousness of enjoyment. It's a rarity when I'll go back to see a film a second time—I will see *Primal Fear* again.

Richard Gere's patented contemporary sleekness works excellently for the character of big-time attorney Martin Vail and he plays it—as well as plays against it, which helps to move a contemporary audience into forecasting outcomes, then leads them away from a shadowy focus; as fine a job as he's offered in five years.

Edward Norton's performance is, simply, brilliant and puts his talent immediately onto the -A- "acting" wish list.

A smart move was made by Hoblit and casting directors Deborah Aquila and Jane Shannon to populate the cast with talents recognizable from similar themed shows and who had worked with Hoblit before. Nothing succeeds like success.





■ **LA BANDA DEL SWING: *Y Es Fácil?... No Es Fácil*** (BMG U.S. Latin, 74321) Producer: Luis Almonte. TROPICAL-MERENGUE.

Since their debut on BMG, La Banda del Swing has been obtaining a very sizeable following. Their second album, *Es Fácil?... No Es Fácil*, is proof again that this group can deliver great danceable merengue music. Consisting of lead vocalists, Andy "Boy" Velez, Robert Abbel, Richie Gómez, and Jimmy Vargas, the group sways right through with apparent ease from their opening cut, "La Perdición del Negro," to the last number, "Tonto Corazón." Watch for these young merengeros to continue their rise to wide-spread popularity.

■ **MAMA VACA: *Hombre Verde*** (NRT, 1032) Producer: Mama Vaca. ROCK.

Mama Vaca (Mother Cow) is rather an odd name even for a rock en Español band. Nevertheless, the group generates enough of a charge to cause heads to turn. Sure, they're strange (e.g. Como Como Vaca), but it takes real guts to "moo" onstage! Mama Vaca delves into a mix of styles, mostly improvised, like reggae, rap, ska, and pop. The first promo single, "El Borracho," brings reggae to a whole new level. I was really "mooved" by the jazzy beat on the "Babylon." A real cool debut project by what has to be one of Argentina's best imports on the rock scene.

A TROPICAL TRIBUTE TO A TEJANA: The fallen Tejano star, Selena, has been the intense focus of many posthumous tributes and specials. One of the most eclectic, however, would be a tropical music salutation by some of the most illustrious contemporary stars of that genre.

RMM Records recently announced plans to release the album, *Recordando A Selena* (Remembering Selena). This is part of its continuing tradition of paying homage to such legends in the Latin music industry. A press release from RMM states that although Selena became a household name in 1995 after her untimely death, it is her "record-breaking sales and airplay" that apparently prompted the recording project.

The release of the album, coincidentally, follows the recent *Siempre Selena* special which aired last week as a two-hour special on the Spanish-language television network, Univision. The program highlighted various phases of the slain singer's life along with numerous video clips.

The novelty album features established RMM artists as well as impressively showcases new additions to its roster. Under the helm of executive producer, Ralph Mercado, and co-producer, Isidro Infante, the album itself signifies quite an incredible cross-genre achievement. There are four renditions of Selena songs which are particularly strong. This is due to the efforts of popular artists like Merengue idols Manny Manuel with his "Si Una Vez," and Celines with her "Tus Desprecios," followed by Salsa vets Tito Nieves with "No Me Queda Más," and Jose Alberto's "Fotos y Recuerdos."

There are five other selections including RMM newcomer and co-producer, Isidro Infante and his band, Elite. Along with three vocalists, Infante recorded "Dondequiera Que Estés." He also produced Yolanda Duke's version of "Amor Prohibido." Duke is one of the most impressive female singers of contemporary tropical music.

And speaking about crossover potential, the former lead vocalist of the Johnny and Ray band, Ray Sepulveda renders his version of "Dreaming Of You." The other English-lyric number is "I Could Fall in Love" done by Johnny Almendra and his group Los Jovenes del Barrio. The icing on the cake comes with "Latin Jazz Medley," a Hilton Ruiz arrangement of Selena hits featuring special guest and fellow RMM artist (on the TropiJazz label), Dave Valentin.

Always filled with surprises, Mercado introduces his newest young talent, Michael Stuart, on "Yo Te Amo" with an arrangement by Angel Fernandez. Composer William Liriano, of RMM, provided the lyrics for the selection "Recordando A Selena." The number, the first promotional single, features all eleven artists on the RMM label. Street date release was set for April 9th.

The album, *Tropical Tribute to The Beatles*, was the first homage to the music legends of the world by RMM. The current promotional single, "And I Love Her" (Mi Gran Amor Le Di), by José Alberto "El Canario" should fare very well. The romantic Spanish-lyric ballad features some excellent acoustic guitar touches.

SORAYA SIGNS WITH POLYGRAM MUSIC PUBLISHING: Soraya, whose much-anticipated debut album *On Nights Like This/En Esta Noche* was recently released simultaneously in Spanish (PolyGram Latino) and English (Island Records), has signed a publishing deal with PolyGram. 
Album Reviews By Wendy Newcomer

■ BILLY DEAN: *It's What I Do* (Capitol C2-30525)

Billy Dean is not a rocker. He's not a note-bending, rowdy cowboy—and thank God the producer of *It's What I Do* didn't try to make him sound like either of these stereotypes. Dean's reunion with producer Tom Shapiro is a welcome return to the sound that made him country music's answer to James Taylor. As always, the ballads are a joy to listen to—"In The Name Of Love," "Play Something We Can Dance To," and the title cut are the best of the best. And to be fair, even a few of his uptempo songs ("Down To Your Last One More" and "When Our Backs Are Against The Wall") are without the forced fierceness that has accompanied him in the past. Dean's singer/songwriter voice has that warm, fuzzy quality that Taylor possesses. With *It's What I Do*, he's decided not to fight it.




■ BROOKS & DUNN: *Borderline* (Arista 18810-2-07822)



Borderline brings to mind images of all-night partying and morning after blues. The fourth album for country's most popular contemporary duo, it banishes any thoughts that B&D might be stagnating in their own success. Album gems include the cover of "My Maria," the drinking songs "More Than A Margarita" and "Tequila Town," "My Love Will Follow You," and the hit-in-waiting "I Am That Man." Much has been said of the opposing styles of Ronnie Dunn and Kix Brooks, but it is that fire-and-ice quality that will keep them interesting *and* on the charts.

■ PAUL OVERSTREET: *Time* (Scarlet Moon Records 08732)

It's been awhile since we've heard from Paul Overstreet: he's been too busy singing, writing and producing in the Christian country market. *Time*, his re-entry into the stratosphere of secular country, is a solid effort from the man who gave us the Grammy-winning songs "Forever and Ever, Amen" and "Love Can Build A Bridge." This album contains first-rate cuts such as the lead single, "We've Got To Keep On Meeting Like This," "Mr. Miller" and "Even When It Don't Feel Like It." The album occasionally becomes too-sugary sweet ("Blackberry Cobbler"), but overall, it walks the fine line between schmaltz and sincerity. Overstreet sings quietly, but his writing and unwavering integrity make a whole lot of noise.



PICK OF THE WEEK

■ JO DEE MESSINA: *Jo Dee Messina* (Curb D2-77820)



For a few months now, radio listeners have pondered the identity of the singer who belts out "Heads Carolina, Tails California." Well, the wait is over. Jo Dee Messina is the voice behind the catchy tune that has everyone wanting to take a road trip. Although it sounds corny, no other word better fits Messina's delivery than "spunky." She's always right-on in terms of confidence, as in the album opener "You're Not In Kansas Anymore" and the smoldering "Do You Wanna Make Something Of It." She fares just as well on the ballads, bringing tears and quiet desperation to "He'd Never Seen Julie Cry" and "I Didn't Have To Leave You." Messina's self-titled debut album already carries with it the clout of a hit song and a team of producers who are accustomed to radio singles (Byron Gallimore and Tim McGraw—yes, *that* Tim McGraw). Messina's debut project is self-titled, just in case anyone should forget who she is. Not likely.





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
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
