Hard Choice

SILVER CONDOR, COLUMBIA

Can you say "tonnage"? Based on my ears and early radio feedback, Silver Condor will be a multi-format monster in a matter of minutes, and has enough depth to be around for quite a while. It's also unique in that it's commercial to the max, but is so hook-laden and tasty that even hard core progressive types are impressed. Earl "call me Slick" Slick is already famous for his chops, and now Slick discovery Joe Cerisano steps into the spotlight with his great songwriting and super expressive voice--they are indeed a potent combination...Watch out most added!.. "Sake Of Survival" is most mentioned with "Angel Eyes", "Goin' For Broke", "Saying Goodbye", "We're In Love", and "The One You Left Behind" are all hot. Actually you can't pick a bad track--honest.

Chain Reaction

JOHNNY VAN ZANT, "ROUND TWO", POLYDOR

Johnny is smoking out of the chute--49 stations for #1 Most Added, including 11 Level I's, 15 Level II's and 6 Indicators... "Who's Right Or Wrong" is leading... Comments: Bobbin Beam, WLPX, "We played Van Zant at our album preview night to rave reviews from 18-24 listeners. Of course, it's a natural with that Van Zant stamp"... Frank Andrick, XSJD, "Johnny's sound is less southern fried with each vinyl outing. The outside studio help and production combined with the innate sensibilities of the JVZ band makes for one real healthy LP that twangs, rocks, boogies, and croons its way onto the add list"... Joe McCabe, KYYS, "The Van Zant is in this week because I need some good southern boogie to balance the Kim Carnes and Climax Blues Band, Joe Walsh, etc., etc."... Stew Schantz, WPDH, "An excellent second effort. Who would have ever thought that a southern rock band would cover a Beatles tune? It's one of the best versions of 'Drive My Car' I've ever heard. Otherwise, the album offers some real fine southern cooking"... Magic, WYFE, "The follow-up is everything that I anticipated. 'Who's Right Or Wrong' should do very well".

ELTON JOHN, "THE FOX", GEPFEN

Considering the lukewarm response on Elton's last few, I'd call this a great first week--#2 Most Added with 41 reports, and #1 Most Added at the Indicators with 10. "Breaking Down The Barriers" will get most of the attention followed by "Heart's In The Right Place"... Reaction: Kid Leo says, "I feel that Elton is going back and doing the various styles which were successful for him on the album rock level. 'The Fox' is reminiscent of 'Tumbleweed Connection'. 'Barriers' has some of the feel of 'Love Lies Bleeding' and 'Chloe's Song'. A nice attempt at past ballads, and he is trying to regain credibility with the rock and roll crowd"... Rob Roman, KLAG, "Glad to get the new Elton. It has some surprises for me. The first side is definitely more rock-based, with 'Breaking Down The Barriers' surfacing"... Bill Grant, WTPA, "Elton has found the groove again that made him famous. Now, hopefully, he can destroy that image that may still cause programmers to avoid him. Believe me, 'The Fox' is his best in years"... Eddie Wazoo, WPLR, "A very, very good album from Elton. The diversity of the tracks has easily laid to rest the fears that this album would be more reflective of the single. Calls on the first two tracks"... Ditto Steve Keller, WZLQ, "Elton's album has become more than a pleasant surprise. Compared to the single, this stuff is heavy duty"... From John Logan, KLBJ, "This time he's making music that runs as deep as his experience says it should. I think maybe he's beginning to care again, for whatever the reason. 'The Fox' is sly, open, obscure, and frank--all at once".

VAN HALEN, "FAIR WARNING", WARNER BROTHERS

Let's talk airplay muscle! We're looking at #7 on both charts, with 5 tracks on the Song Index: "Mean Street", "Unchained", "So This Is Love?", and "Push Comes To Shove" and "Dirty Movies"... Now in maximum rotation at over 80% of our reporters, with better than average play on more than half the rest... More radio reaction: Dana Jang, KOME, "Immediate smash out-of-the-box. Top phones, top sales, #1 in all categories"... Bill Simmons, WHIX, "Indeed a homerun with #1 sales and overwhelming phones"... Heavy calls just about everywhere, including WYAD, WSYR, XGB-FM, and WYNF, with equally hot first week retail including #1 at WIMZ, #5 at WCOZ, and #2 at WFVV.

CHAIN REACTION CONTINUED

JOE VITALE, "PLANTATION HARBOR", EMI/AT&T

The Vitale is still hot on my book chartable, and the radio reaction appears to be equally positive--#4 Most Added with 20 reports. As you might expect, Joe Walsh references abound...Frank Andrick, KSJO, "Joe Walsh fulfills the guitar promise missing from his own release on 'Plantation Harbor'. This ain't no Eagles album, it's a rock and roll album. Of course, it does exhibit enough of those patented light touches to render Vitale's LP a prime contender for crossover potential"...Roberta Haber, WAAL, "Sounds like the second half of Joe Walsh's solo project. Joe's distinctive guitar absolutely dominates. Nevertheless, this is a beautifully produced and arranged effort"...From Joe Bonadonna, WMMR, "Joe has always been a personal favorite and 'Plantation Harbor' is real fine. I particularly like 'Lady On The Rock'. The telephone conversation with Walsh is hysterical"...And Ron Sorenson, KBLE, "'Plantation Harbor' has the vitality and funk missing on Joe Walsh's solo. Joe Vitale has given us a very strong record".

MARTY BALIN, "BALIN", EMI/LIBERTY

Marty just barely missed the Back Page this week, and with a two-week total of 54 stations, we will see a strong debut next week in the 38 range. At this stage, a fairly even split between "Lydia", "I Do Believe", "You Left Your Mark On Me", and the single...Again, if you can possibly play the single it's the workhorse track--as noted by WKDQ's Dave Krusenklau, "We're playing 'Hearts' and are getting no negatives. In fact, we even beat the top 20's in this market"...Steve Keller, WZZQ adds, "Marty is getting some immediate response. A couple of interest calls on 'Lydia' and requests for 'Hearts'".

"SECRET POLICEMAN'S BALL", WARNER BROTHERS

Due to the nature of the material, not a whole lot of comment on the domestic release now out three weeks--but numbers continue to look great--up 27-22 on the Index, and 30-21 Metro...New on 9 more this week for 83 adds in the last three weeks. We have max play reports from WLPX, KTIN, WIOT...Heavy on KZEL, KLOL, WHCN, WDIZ, WQXM, WCCC, and WHFS... "Pinball Wizard" 78-54 and "Won't Get Fooled" 31-22.

TUBES, "COMPLETION BACKWARD PRINCIPLE", CAPITOL

The stats measure up to the rave we've all read...The Tubes hit the Index at #30--also in at #32 Metro, with 100% of last week's adds converting to debut mentions, reflecting the strong radio belief...Now heaviest on KGB-FM, WRCN, KNFM, WLIR, KATT, WILS-FM, WBRU, KZEL, KTIN, and WJRK... "Talk To Ya Later" is going to be a big track as noted by WMMR's Joe Bonadonna, "We did 'Talk To Ya Later' on Smash or Trash with Kai last Monday morning, and response was overwhelming. Highest response to date on that feature--99% positive"...Rick Van Cleave, WYMF, "It has to be a hit this summer or I'm going to have to get out of radio and manage a McDonald's"...Ted Habeck, KWST, "'Talk To Ya Later' is a turntable favorite at home. This has to be the most commercial song this band has ever done"...Jeff Biedel, KXDJ, "Getting good reaction to 'Talk To Ya Later'"...Here's more: "Ron Pizzi, WRW, "This week the Tubes opened up as our #2 record but tied with The Who and Tom Petty--they're in good company"...Bob Majersky, WXUS, "The Tubes' clean sound is a refreshing break"...Joe McCabe, KYYS, "Some curiosity calls a la 'Who is that band?': Sounds like the hooks are working"...Bob Linder, WDHA, "The Tubes are terrific and the 'Backward Principle' is far ahead of anything in its class".

KIM CARNES, "MISTAKEN IDENTITY", EMI

With the single up 20-11 and "Break The Rules" at #78, Kim grabs a Back Page underline, 24-16. A number of play increases reported too: WYSP, WNET, KPFI, WBRU, KZEL, WPDH, WOUR, WXRT, WIMZ, KLBJ, and WRXL...Max in level I: WMMR, KYYS, KGB-FM, and WLUP. Level II: WCCC, WQDR, WLPR, and WRKK... Also max on WKDQ, KTIN, WROQ, and WZZQ with better than average play on KZOK, WRCN, KSJO, WIOQ, WHCN, WTUE, WMYK, KATT, WIOT, WRLM, and WJAD...Average play: 8 Emphasis; 5.3 Plays per day.

PETER FRAMPTON, "BREAKING ALL THE RULES", AMM

Nothing but cheers for the Frampton--it should be a major airplay item...WQDR's Bob Walton said: "Definitely the best I've heard from him. It is absolutely fantastic. It's good to have him back"... Bob Majersky, WXUS: "The record of the week. We put in as a feature and Peter seems to be back. Already five cuts deep in hot rotation"...Dave Benson, WNET: "Revitalized to say the least. Frampton's vacation seems to have done him some good"...Bob Barnett, WAAF: "The title cut is real good rock and roll"...Rick Ballis, KSHE notes: "He's back to his old ways and I mean that in a positive sense. It seems like a good bet that there will be quite a resurgence in his popularity"...Finally from Bob Lipshutz at WCDZ: "The new album should be titled 'Frampton Comes Back'. Miles of hot guitar and at least three great songs. I guess we're all tired of having to hate Peter Frampton"... "You Kill Me" is my pick, and "Dig What I Say", the title cut, and "Friday" should also be active.

MOODY BLUES, "LONG DISTANCE VOYAGER", POLYGRAM

It will be quite the flashback next week as the Moodies and Frampton battle it out for #1 Most Added. All who have heard "The Voice" are excited...Judy McNutt says, "The 12"? Who cares? I'm waiting for the album. I've heard it, and some tracks are excellent"...Ted Habeck, KWST, "What a fine, fine LP. That's just the thing for the 25+ demo that has trouble getting into the Plasmatics"... Mark Rittler, WJCK, "'The Voice' ranks right up there with all their classics. A superb effort"... Rick Ballis, KSHE, "'The Voice' is a killer. It's destined to be a classic"...Sky Daniels, "Now here is the real psychedelic revival. I'd say this is updated better than the new Maverick"...Malcolm Gray, WRCN, "It's a masterpiece. We immediately went six deep. Nothing like great music from the masters".

SPIDER, "BETWEEN THE LINES", DREAMLAND

They made a lot of friends with the debut, and are picking up where they left off--with 15 first week reports, including WMMR, KSHE, WYSP, and KIM-FM... Loading: "Lines", "Changes", and "Better Be Good" likely to emerge...Comments: Dave Krusenklau, WKDQ, "Gotta think this record will take off in a big way"...Judy McNutt, KGB-FM, "The sound and feel of the album is refreshing and different"...Bob Linder, WDHA, "We love the new Spider, definitely a strong follow-up"...This from Lisa Richards, WYSP, "The second album may well be a different band. Their image and their sounds come across very hip. If I had to classify them, I'd put them between the Cars, Blondie, and UB--you figure it out".

LES OUEK, "GYPSY RIDE", COLUMBIA

After 4 weeks, Les's biggest Index gain--49-30. The Bridges Back Page mover of the week. New on the Metro Chart at #46... "Deja Vu" leads the way, up 59-44 on the Song Index...New in the last two weeks on WQVE, WQMF, WILS-FM, KSMD, WTR-FM, WTPA, KXXY, KLOL, WFRV, KORS, and KZEM.

MARSHALL TUCKER BAND, "DEDICATED", WARNER BROTHERS

New on KSJO, WYMF, WJFM, WRCR-FM, and WBLN, for 52 adds in the last three weeks...increased air on WPDH, KNFM, KSHE, KLBJ, and WQMF...Also heavy on KZEL, WCCC, WQDR, and WPLR...Note the Index prime move, 45-39, and Metro debut at #45... "Desperado" and "Runners" lead.

DAVID LINDLEY, "EL TAYO X", ASYLUM

Consistent progress is the word here. David went on 19 stations the week of April 24th, and in the 4 weeks since, has picked up a total of 24 stations. With major market play leading the way, David is new on the Top 50 at #40 and picked up a Metro prime move 50-44...Our stats show play increases on WPLR, WMMS, and KZEL... "Mercury Blues" debuts at #47. Also keep an eye on "Your Old Lady".

BRAM TCHAIKOVSKY, "FUNLAND", ARISTA

Another consistent builder comes up with a debut--new at #45 on the Back Page...New on KLOL, KISS, WRXL, KTXQ, WXUS, and WQMF, for a total of 47 adds in the last month...Increased on WCCC, WMMS, KZEL, and KSJO... "Stand And Deliver" is out front, then "Shall We Dance".

THE PLASMATICS, "BEYOND THE VALLEY OF 1984", STIFF

With this group's massive publicity and public curiosity, I've got to believe this record is very valuable. The other day, Leo was commenting about his belief in novelty records, and I couldn't agree more. It's really in that vein that Wendy and company work best as a programming tool, and that's not to underplay their major improvement in playability. With heaviest early action in the northeast, it's our #6 Most Added with 15 stations, and plenty of raves typified by: Bob Bittens, WHCN, "It's everything Roy Rosenberg promised. With three or four very accessible cuts on their album, television appearance, and national press coverage of their legal problems, the Plasmatics should have, dare I say it, a hit album. 'Summer Nites' has been on the WHCN airwaves for only a couple of days, but early phone response has been extremely positive. We're getting almost as many Plasmatic requests as Van Halen requests. I don't see how anyone could ignore Wendy and the Boys"...Also quite active as WCCC's Paul reports, "Sounds great on the air. We added 'Summer Nites' along with 'Head-banger'"...These two will be most played.

SPLIT ENZ, "WAIATA", A&M

Stable chart action here, but healthy add activity--WILS-FM, WAVA, WLAV-FM, WKQQ, WXUS, WPYX, WQMF, and WRKI--Increased play on WBLM, WPLR, WMMS, KWFM, WHFS, and KOME...Also, it's time for the single.

SQUEEZE, "EAST SIDE STORY", A&M

Squeeze was a near miss at #51 on the Metro Chart. New air on KLBK, WQBK, KTIM, KILQ, WGVN, and WKWF... Increased Level I and II support; so we'll see a Chart showing two weeks down the line..."Tempted" is the track.

999, "CONCRETE", POLYDOR

I can't guarantee that you'll find a track you absolutely have to add, but if you take time to listen, you'll hear a much improved group and album with serious airplay potential..."Taboo", "Merry", and "Little Red Riding Hood" for starters.

JIM STEINMAN, "BAD FOR GOOD", CLEVELAND INTERNATIONAL/EPIC

A couple of good jumps for Jim, 26-23 Index, and 29-25 Metro. Play increases: WMET, WMMS, WILS-FM, WPYX, WYFE, KLRJ, and KOME..."Rock And Roll Dream" is up 60-45...It's important to remember this is NOT a Meatloaf record, and it's really not fair to expect the kind of quick retail and requests that a new Meatloaf release would generate. With that in mind, the record looks solid from here.

MOTHER'S FINEST, ATLANTIC

It's still several weeks from charting, but Atlantic continues to pull in credible calls. New this week on WEBN, WAAF, WFYV, and WKWF...Last week's adds: WCOZ and WMMR..."Movin' On" leads.

THE A's, "A WOMAN'S GOT THE POWER", ARISTA

Charlie Kendall and Joe Bonadonna busted down the doors here at deadline to work me over on the new A's album, and I was ready to join the party after one listen to the title track. I'd say it's the strongest album rock track from a Philly band I've heard in four years. Well worth your consideration. A nifty chorus and hook, with typically interesting Nick Garvey production.

PSYCHEDELIC FURS, COLUMBIA

A special treat for collectors. This week we team up with Paul Rappaport and Columbia to give you a first--the Psychedelic Furs import single with a playable picture sleeve!! (which is actually a commercial for the album!!) complete with three-song montage--Neat-0!

THE MOVIES, "MOTOR, MOTOR", RCA

I knew that there was something rather different and interesting about the Movies, and now Bill McGathy tells me this is Joan Armatrading's old backup band. When you listen with that in mind, you can hear a lot of her quirkiness...Check out "Hello From Outer Space", "Hard Heart" (could be a good single), and "Clockwise From The Sun".

WHITESNAKE, "COME AND GET IT", MIRAGE/ATLANTIC

29 adds for Whitesnake in the last two weeks, including WRKK, WCCC, WPLR, WQBK, KBPI, KAZY, WYFE, WYSP, WLIR, and KSHE. So are, it's the title tune, then "Lonely Days" with "Wine, Women, And Song" third...Positives from Jim Kinney, WTUE, "All of side 1 is good"...Phil Kirzyc, "'Wine, Women, and Song' is the best boogie sound I've heard in a long time"...Bill Grant, WTPA, "Class metal that will activate the actives."

"HEART FROZEN UP", G.E. SMITH, MIRAGE/ATLANTIC

That's my pick--and we're also hearing about "Real Love", "Nuns With Guns" and "Powerman"...#8 Most Added with 12, including KOME and WMMS...Ira Gordon is on the money, "Finally a session musician releases a solo that's not junk and stands on its own merit".

"ALMOST SATURDAY NIGHT", DAVE EDMUNDS, ATCO

Moving nicely up 45-28 Metro, and 33-29 on the Song Index...New on WDVE, WMAD, WMET, WGRQ, KBPI, KZAP, and five more for 77 in the last month...Increased play on WMMR, WILS-FM, WPYX, WHFS, KOME, WCOZ, and KNAC..."Almost Saturday Night" goes 69-37-32.

"WRATHCHILD", IRON MAIDEN, CAPITOL

Based on a small but meaty buzz out of the Baltimore/Washington area, keep an ear on this track. It could well develop into something...New on WAVA, WQXM, KISS, and WTPA.

1. The Furs' first album, released last Fall, is now almost 60,000 strong in the States and still sells consistently.
2. In advance of the release of the album in America, import sales were incredible with reorder forms being filled out as soon as the records arrived in the stores.
3. New York, Chicago, Los Angeles, Boston and Philadelphia as well as heavy college markets nationally, such as Austin, Madison and Ann Arbor were buzzing with sales excitement as tour dates had club audiences mesmerized.
4. In addition, the band received a more than favorable press reaction from every national publication from Rolling Stone to the Village Voice to Circus to Creem to Hit Parader to High Times to US to the New York Times.
5. College audiences had found the ultimate spinach. College Media Journal, a national publication, reported the Furs' Lp as the #4 most played album at college radio in 1980.
6. Fur fever began to spread surprising many. Sky Daniels at the LOOP and Scott Muni, the professor of rock and roll at WNEW, were advocating the record citing the fact that listeners "repeatedly called and begged" them to play the Furs.
7. The Furs garnered several mentions as being one of the top bands of 1980 and a band to watch. Response was widespread. Various tracks were listed on Billboard's Disco Chart. Rockpool, an influential national rock club programming guide, charted the Furs' Lp for three months straight with clubs increasing play each week as audiences clamored for instant replays of "We Love You" and "Pulse".
8. "Talk.Talk.Talk", the Furs' upcoming release, was produced by British producer Steve Lillywhite most recently known for his success with Peter Gabriel, XTC, and U-2.
9. The band will once again be touring. Dates are planned cross country from June 24 to July 26. Be on the lookout for a very hot live performance and watch the phones light up.
10. It is not hearsay that a club in Chicago was recently approached by a station for their copy of the new Psychedelic Furs 7" with playable picture sleeve.



Question Of The Week

This week some thoughts on the future of the Warner/Amex music channel. We asked our reporters if they thought the programming would be successful and if they anticipated it would cut into FM/album rock listening.

DAVE LANGE, WDVE: "I think if more high quality software becomes available it could be a real big success. Although radio is far more mobile, it could hurt in ARB numbers because we still count on diary's filled out at home for most of the information...Obviously there are ways to tie into the cable in your market."

JOHN GORMAN, WMMS: "If done right it will be a success. In terms of narrow casting, we're reaching the point where you will have over 100 channels on a cable system. We are already to the stage where a formatted television station could do quite well...I don't think it will cut into radio listening. I think radio has an instant factor about it that a preprogrammed rock TV station cannot match. Actually, it would be beneficial to both parties concerned to do a limited amount of simulcasting between the FM station and the cable TV station."

DICK BASCOM, WYFE: "As a matter of fact, I've been waiting for that to happen for some time now. Glad to see somebody is experimenting along those lines, and I think it's a bit overdue. It could help out the record industry quite a bit. What better way to expose new music especially when radio isn't...I think it will supplement radio, as much as newspapers supplement TV news."

BOB WALTON, WQDR: "I think it's going to be very successful. It's something completely different. The combination of listening to the radio, going to the movies, and it's legal!!
You can't take a TV in your car, or listen to it on the beach, or while you're painting a house, etc. We'll have to see if we can beat 'Three's Company'."

KID LEO, WMMS: "Not having seen the format, it's difficult to answer. We all know that TV rock and roll, for the most part, was done very poorly. I have got to believe that these people know that, and are going to try to put out a damn good product. If they do and can maintain it over at least 18 hours a programming day, I think it would have a good amount of success on a cable outlet, but it's a monumental task...Any time put on the TV cuts into radio listening. On the whole, I don't think it will take away from the strength of radio."

BOBBIN BEAM, WLPX: "Yes, I do think it will work. Cable TV is going to be very big boon to the TV industry in the future. No doubt about that. The fact that it will be coupled with music and radio personalities along with viewers being able to see and hear their favorite performers all adds up to strong potential, especially if it's in 4 to 6 million homes in the next 24 months as predicted...It may cut into radio listening, although people can't take it in the car with them. I understand the audio may be available on the FM band in stereo. Also, they will have very long cables so they can play it while outside relaxing or in other areas of the home where the cable might not normally reach."

BOBBY HATTRICK, KWK: "I'm biased because a buddy of mine, Steve Casey, is involved with that and I've been aware of its development from its infancy...If they are willing to see it through (and every indication is that they are), I think it will work. It should be one of many such services...I assume that what we tend to see in markets with low concert attendance is lower album rock shares, and when concert attendance is on the rise, rock and roll awareness is greater. Album rock tends to benefit from that. My guess is that it will heighten the awareness of album artists and benefit album radio."



DANA JANG, KOME: "I think they will have some success with it, but I think it's going to take a long time due to a couple of factors. 1.) Cable is not fully established yet. In major markets, it still needs a large number of subscribers. 2.) I haven't seen a lot of the video yet, but I think that certain development has to be done in the production of the video to appeal to a broader audience. 3.) Television is going to have to move into more of a radio-type of specialization. Until that happens, a specialized network isn't going to have broad appeal...Radio still offers the fact that you can be doing other activities while listening. Video requires somewhat more attention. Thus I think we'll have shorter viewing time."

TIM SMITH, WLVO: "It's a whole different medium, so I don't think it will cut into radio listening. It will be a supplement to radio, but the novelty of watching a video tape will wear out after you've seen it four or five times. Their success will greatly depend on how wide their library is...By the way, I understand they're running commercials for it in Indianapolis already. Frankly, I think the interactive show I'm working on with QUPE will have a lot more potential."

CURT GARY, WEBN: "I think it will work--but having a wife who is in cable and has worked at Warner, I know that the time frame they're talking about is unrealistic and it's going to take much longer for it to get off the ground. For one, they just don't have the production companies in the wings to get the material. Their budget is undoubtedly very small for the first year of attempting something like this...1984 is just around the corner and pretty soon everybody is gonna be plugged in--and, FM album rock stations that survive will be those tied into the community, just as it's always been, so I don't see any big changes as a result of the cable."

JUDY MCNUTT, KGB-FM: "The problem with those kinds of things is music forms so many pictures in peoples' heads that they are likely to burn out after seeing those videos once. I think their thoughts about programming it like a radio station are invalid...I think it will have little effect on radio listening. For one thing, you can listen to radio away from home and while you're doing other things. Personally, watching TV turns the iron in my blood into lead in my butt. I can't get anything done, so I just turn it off."

RON Sorenson, KBLE: "Yes, it will be a big success. It's going to expose new music in a way that radio can't, visually as well as aurally...My impression is that their target demo is late teens to early 20's and directed more towards late 20's so it will effect stations who target those demos. It may not affect radio listening right away, but will in the long run."

ILYSE GOTTLIEB, WRXL: I think it will cut into listening a little bit particularly at night. However, when you're away from home, there is no way you can watch that channel while you're driving or whatever. The audience is limited because not everybody has cable."

JOHN SIMON, WLRS: "I think it's a risky venture. I haven't seen the proven success of concert-type formats on television yet. "Midnight Special" is gone. I'm afraid there is a high boredom factor. It will be hard for the listener to feel the magic through the television. I wish them luck."

KERRY LAMBERT, WIMZ: "I think there's a void for that type of entertainment. I think cable is to the point where it's reaching more and more homes every day. It's an alternative to any kind of other program on...TV requires your full attention where radio can be listened to while at work, in the car or working around the house. So no, I don't think it will cut into listening."

STEVE KELLER, WZZQ: "Why not? It's just another convenience at home. Music fans will be able to hear and see in the comfort of their own living room. For older consumers it will be a boon. They will have the visuals and won't have to go to a concert and experience that atmosphere...It won't seriously cut into FM listening, but yes, some."

TOM STARR, WOUR: "Well, I hope it's successful because I may be on the verge of buying stock. I think it's unrealistic to think that it won't have some impact on FM listening, but that just goes along with the principle of everything going on around us serving as competition for listening time. Does anybody remember the old Barefoot Jerry song called 'Watching TV With The Radio On'?"

DAVE LOGAN, WLAV-FM: "I think it will be a monumental success. I believe much of the strength lies in the fact that it's being run by people with a strong radio background-- people who understand the medium and the best way to bring it across on both sides."

DAVE BERNSTEIN, WAAF: "I'm in. The Warner/Amex Channel is out."

ROB BARNETT, WAAF: "I don't know."

JOHN LOGAN, KLBJ: "I think it will be a success and should help record sales. I don't know about the video tapes on account of costs...I think it will cut into FM listening minimally, although a good programmer could do some serious damage."

Radio Action

KZAP, SACRAMENTO, CA M.D.-TIM BEDORE: "It's been a long time in coming, but we finally added the Kim Carnes. It's an undeniable smasher here, as it is around the Nation. I don't know if it's our audience that's buying the record, but now they're going to hear 'Breaking All The Rules Tonight'...For once I have to really agree with the promo man and use Sean Coakley's expression and say that Dave Edmunds really jumps out of the radio. Then again, any song talking about Saturday night would, with half a beat, make it anyway...The reaction to Jim Steinman has been very positive. It's a teen anthem, and the kids love it."

WCOZ, BOSTON, MA M.D.-ROB LIPSHUTZ: "Well, hey everybody, a couple of years ago it was 'Frampton Comes Alive', followed miserably by 'Frampton Comes In You', and finally another 'Frampton Comes Apart'. The new album should be titled 'Frampton Comes Back'. Miles of hot guitar and at least three great songs: the title cut, 'You Kill Me', and a very credible reading of 'Friday On My Mind'. I guess we're all tired of having to hate Peter Frampton...The Tubes are getting rather popular. Count COZ in on 'Talk To Ya Later'. I'm disappointed, though, that Capitol didn't send out three-piece gray flannel corporate suits to M.D.'s...Van Halen debuts at #5 sales...Rick Springfield is finally moving in quantities. You know, Worcester, MA is not such a bad place after all...Finally, to the 15 year old girl who took off all her clothes and got on stage during intermission at the Grateful Dead concert in Providence, the audience asked me to thank you."



Ron Nenni, WPYX: "With or without Jools, Squeeze is still one of my faves. Song after song, 'East Side Story' is super stuff. I'm glad that the Costello influence isn't that obvious, Squeeze has a great sound of their own."

WMMS, CLEVELAND, OH M.D.-KID LEO: "I feel that Elton is going back to doing the various styles which were successful for him on the album rock level, or progressive as it was called in those days. 'The Fox' song is reminiscent of 'Tumbleweed Connection'. 'Breaking Down The Barriers' has some of the feel of 'Love Lies Bleeding'. 'Chloe's Song' is a nice attempt at past ballads and he is trying to regain credibility with the rock and roll crowd...As is Mr. Peter Frampton with his new album. I think Frampton comes out on top...Marty Balin is the Frank Sinatra of our generation--cocktail music for the pill popping set. But I agree with our Editor as far as play on the single as well as the other strong cuts, because it is one of those ever increasing necessities for that all important 25-34 demo...I want to give a tip of the hat to the Plasmatics. Their PR campaign was one of cold calculation and was successful. The first album got them all sorts of notoriety due to baring breasts, run-ins with the law, and exploding Cadillacs, but no one ever heard them on the radio. Now they've given us two songs that are as viable as anything in the hard rock stance ('Summer Night' and 'Headbanger'). They knew they could make it work the second time around with the same sound, so they've given us a truly viable record. They could be the Kiss of the 80's...Joe Vitale is well known here, mainly because of his day with Barnstorm and Joe Walsh. The album is very pleasant. Matt and Jeff, our morning and midday guys, love this one...On the G. E. Smith, he's my kind of (warped) man. I think he has the same kind of appeal as Warren Zevon. My pick for the lead track is 'Real Love'."

G-MAN'S CORNER: "I may question the legality of the 'Dawn Of The Silver Beatles' album. The Lp is made up of some tracks from the January 1962 demo tapes the Beatles made for Decca (they were turned down) and feature Pete Best on drums. It's too early to gauge listener response, but I expect a lot of curiosity factor calls at the very least...We are gearing up for our Annual Memorial Day Weekend Blitz which will include an all live concert night featuring highlights from the WMMS live archives and solid gold classics from the rock and roll radio roots of the 50's and the 60's. And finally, we are getting hundreds of phone and mail responses from Columbus now that WMMS is available in that market via Qube's FM cable service. They now have 10,000 subscribers."

WBRU, PROVIDENCE, RI M.D.-MICHAEL MACRONE: "We're looking forward to beginning our Summer schedule on Monday, when the pumpkin turns into Cinderella. Bark, bark. (A reference to Zappa, not to our bite.)"

WKQQ, LEXINGTON, KY ASST. P.D.-DAVE KRUSENKLAUS: "Just got the Moody Blues record in this morning. It's amazing, considering the amount of musical trends we've been through in the past ten years, that the Moody Blues can today still fit like a new suit. Although I'm having a real tough time swallowing the single, the outstanding tracks to me are: 'The Voice' and check out 'Meanwhile'--what a nice tune... I'm equally impressed with Split Enz. They seem to have some of the creativeness of some of the early ELP compositions, but with a lot more pep. I'm leaning towards 'History Never Repeats', but I also like 'One Step' and 'Iris'--maybe just for your own ears...Johnny Van Zant is a musical magic wand down here with some of our core audience. Although I think the record is a little weak, I did find one song to get my attention and I think it's the best on the album: 'Shutdown'. I'd suggest if you're looking for rock and roll on a record that you check out the single, then go directly to Side Two...We're playing Marty Balin's 'Hearts' and getting no negatives. In fact, we even beat the Top 40's in this market on the single. They're definitely asleep, because it's a smash...Billy Squier is taking off in a big way here. I still contend that 'The Stroke' can be a major multi-format record. There's mega sales and strong requests to report...As far as requests go, the phones are lighting up heaviest for: Billy Squier, AC/DC, Van Halen, Tom Petty, Kim Carnes, and the Pretenders...Gotta think that the Spider record will take off in a big way. Two outstanding songs: 'It Didn't Take Long' and 'Change'. I think this band could take off in a major way...On Bram Tchaikovsky--I'm not certain that we'll give it a shot, but the tunes on the record I lean towards are: 'Shall We Dance' and try 'Model Girl'. 'Model Girl' has a lot of changes and a hot guitar intro similar to 38 Special's 'Hold On Loosely'...On a brief listen to the Movies cassette in the Sheet last week, I'm interested. 'Hello From Outer Space' and 'Hard Heart' have that David Bowie feel. I also like that harmonica in 'Slavery Time'...I'm impressed with 'For The Sake Of Survival' on Silver Condor. I think it has major potential. Can't wait to hear the whole album... If I could use the word sweet, I would use it to describe the Vitale record. A very light record and not at all what I was expecting. I like: 'Lady On The Rock', 'Never Gonna Leave You Alone', and 'Sailor Man'...On Memorial Day, we're going to have an infield party, Churchill Downs style, at a harness racing track here. Arts and crafts, bands, horse racing, free chili and beer--the works. Certainly Memorial Day will not be all work and no play for yours truly, so call me Tuesday."

KLOL, HOUSTON, TX ASST. P.D.-MICHELE ROBINSON: "This week the big news is sales. After ten weeks on the charts, Phil Collins finally hits #1...A strong sales week also for: Tom Petty; Kim Carnes; Santana; Joe Walsh; 38 Special; 'Secret Policeman's Ball'; Krokus; and, Point Blank...Point Blank seems to have kicked in now that we're cranking the track 'Nicole'...Oh and by the way, there was a debut on our Top 100 sales chart: Billy And The Beaters...In my continued effort to support R&B music (Herschel, are my records still sitting next to your desk?), I want to congratulate RCA for acquiring Diana Ross; and, Elektra/Asylum for Solar Records...As I listen to the radio, I'm hearing Kim Carnes. Ken, Chris and Bill, you're relentless. I'm still a skeptic, but an open-minded one. We'll see what happens...I'm looking forward to seeing Seb here Sunday with Split Enz at the Agora, and looking forward to having Chris back in town."

WLUP, CHICAGO, IL M.D.-SKY DANIELS: "Record Of The Week: Peter Frampton, 'Breaking All The Rules'. When he was at the 15 million plus height of his career, he cared enough to do on-air interviews, ID's and post-concert chats. Obviously more than just a nice guy. Hell, I haven't forgotten, and I'll stick by him regardless of contrived 'image' problems. P.S. to D.K.: Good job done...The Moody Blues. Now here's the real psychedelic revival. I'd say this is updated better than the new Maverick...Tom Petty debuted Top 5 rock retail. We received over 10,000 entries in 48 hours from one newspaper ad. I bet you can guess who I'm laughing at right now...The Loop is sponsoring a Crazy Train Ride with Ozzy Osbourne around Chicago. 98 listeners will ride in an El car before his show with food and drinks provided. No passengers bearing silver crosses or live doves will be allowed...Joe Vitale from the home of the Pro Football Hall Of Fame, Canton, Ohio, throws the big bomb for a TD. I hope the coinciding Walsh release doesn't overshadow it...Greg Kihn obviously did what a tour date is supposed to do. Obviously, both he and Columbia are very committed to this project...Testing the 999. I have my questions, because it's tough to establish that kind of act right now. But I've always loved them...I like the segue on the Van Zant into 'Drive My Car'."






WEBN, CINCINNATI, OH M.D.-CURT GARY: "We're going to do more than give the Look a look, we're gonna give it a shot. Although we may already be on the wrong track ('We're Gonna Rock'), cause the more I listen the more good tracks I hear...You can see where they were coming from on Mother's Finest when they did not put a picture of the band on the album. Anyone who knows Mother's Finest could have been fooled by this one. Decidedly less funk and more rock and roll...Rick Springfield. I've always been behind 'Jessie's Girl', and was just waiting for the right moment to add it to do maximum damage to our competition...Van Halen is kind of surprising. Very little immediate request action. Shows are selling out rapidly; still a lot of interest. 'Fair Warning', I think this new album has people wondering what they are listening to. Eddie Van Halen has really tried a lot of new things, it's just a matter of whether their fans are going to take time to listen...David Lindley will be here with Joe Walsh, and we're doing a pretty good job of putting his name out there so he won't be a complete unknown when he hits town...A lot of negs on the phone on the Jim Steinman. They're saying, in varying degrees of confusion, exactly what are they listening to. I'm afraid the world is not quite ready for theater rock...I love the Split Enz and think 'History' has a really catchy pop hook. I also feel that some people out there are not trained to listen to high harmony vocals and find it irritating...Considering: Hey, the new Moody Blues album is pretty neat. I'm a little worried about it for the same reasons that I'm concerned about the Jim Steinman...Anxious to hear the 20/20 I just received...Looking at the Muffs from Columbus, Ohio."

KGON, PORTLAND, OR M.D.-GLORIA JOHNSON: "Top 5 requests: AC/DC 'Dirty Deeds', Van Halen, Ozzy Osbourne, Phil Collins, Rush...Top 5 sales: REO Speedwagon, Loverboy, Van Halen, Tom Petty, AC/DC 'Dirty Deeds'... Strong sales also on Joe Walsh...KGON did a premier with the New Moody Blues album last night in conjunction with a laser light show at the Planetarium. 92 listeners (ranging in age from 15 to 35) were given free tickets over the air. Great to hear the Moody Blues back together again with a record that should result in immediate acceptance across the board. Can't get the voice out of my head. We've been on the single for a week with good phone response and renewed interest in old Moody Blues material. Also playing the cut 'Veteran Cosmic Rocker'. Many thanks to Jim Del Balzo and Calvin Lew of Polygram for helping to put this together in a little over a week's time...Considering: Ice House (used to be 'Flowers')."

KSJO, SAN JOSE, CA R.D.-FRANK ANDRICK: "It's alive!! It's alive! It certainly was alive. To begin with, Split Enz at California Hall. If I could find a flaw in the band's set, it'd have to tax my imagination to its limits, and the Enz certainly stretched mine. The lighting, song pacing, and in short, the entire presentation was visually and aurally stunning. Each song was like a new face. Tim Finn evokes the best finesse of a rock and roll Marcel Marceau. In his silent moments, his voice is an instrument of its own. To quote Queenie Taylor (of the Old Waldorf), 'This is where the new music genre meets Pink Floyd. I can't believe just how good they really are.' Miss Q., I couldn't say it better...U-2's last stand on West Coast shores came Friday night at California Hall to a packed house of 1,400 fans who paid their \$9.00 to see the pride of Ireland in motion. And move they did--the crowd and the band. First time around, it seemed the sheer excellence of this band's material almost dwarfed them. The concept was bigger than the people. Although the sum is yet even greater than the parts, the parts are now firmly in control and the band's set bristles with bite while still exhibiting the U-2 chimey pastoral sense. A full set and four encores later, the crowd reluctantly left. P.D. Leeroy Hansen was sighted again dancing in the crowd in wild abandon with his 12 year old daughter, Erir... And now this business of radio: Airplay increases to the deserving: Loverboy and Dave Edmunds in the Top 10; with: Pretenders, Split Enz, Kim Carnes, and Marty Balin firmly lodged in the Top 15...Sales and staff favoritism has propelled Tom Johnston, Bram Tchaikovsky, Point Blank, Judas Priest, Romeo Void, Billy Squier, and the Tubes into respectable on-air exposure positions...The Adds: Joe Walsh fulfills the guitar promise missing from his own release on Joe Vitale's 'Plantation Harbor'. This ain't no Eagles album--it's a rock and roll album. Of course, it does exhibit enough of those patented light touches to render Vitale's Lp a prime contender for crossover potential. If the name isn't familiar, the sound certainly is...Johnny Van Zant's sound is less Southern fried with each vinyl outing. The outside studio help and production combined with the innate sensibilities of the JVZ Band makes for one real healthy Lp that twangs, rocks, boogies, and croons its way onto the add list. A definite Tom Mix fave from the git-go...In And Around Town: My buddy, Randy Hock: Good to see you. The visitors are rare, and the Bram support is there...Tony Berardini: Considering the last time I saw you was at the Boulder Creek Theater mixing sound for Terry And The Pirates, what a long, strange... Congratulations on your King Of Hearts situation...And finally, also great raves on first exposure of the new Adam And The Ants single 'Stand And Deliver'...P.S. to Paul Rappaport: The new Psychedelic Furs Lp is a killer. The import is already drawing phones."

WMMR, PHILADELPHIA, PA M.D.-JOE BONADONNA: "We did a 'Smash Or Trash' with Kal Rudman last Monday morning on the Tubes record 'Talk To Ya Later' and the response was overwhelming. Highest response to date on that feature. 'Talk To Ya Later' was 99% positive reaction! The previous week we did Jim Steinman's 'Bad For Good' which received 75% negative reaction. (Steinman just doesn't have the meat)...Van Halen debuted top 10 in Philadelphia...Steve Winwood still dominates at #1, followed by REO, Kim Carnes at #3, Tom Petty in at #4, and Adam & The Ants are #7...The Johnny Van Zant record is a good followup to the first. 'Right Or Wrong' is getting good reaction already...Spider's second Lp 'Between The Lines' is a good record. The track we're using is 'Can't Live This Way Anymore'. Sounds like there are a lot of other songs on the album, too, especially the first three on side one...Joe Vitale has always been a personal favorite of mine. 'Plantation Harbor' is real fine. I particularly like 'Lady On The Rock'. The telephone conversation with Joe Walsh at the end of this track is hysterical...On Silver Condor, we like 'Angel Eyes'. Thanks to Earl for dropping by and saying 'hi' this week, and it was amazing to see Paul Rappaport, too... Getting good reaction to 'Jessie's Girl' so we moved it up in rotation...Still Tove Gary U.S. Bonds 'This Little Girl'...'Almost Saturday Night' from Dave Edmunds and 'Breakup Song' from Greg Kihn are pulling phones...My favorite song of the week is 'Jealous Guy' from Roxy Music...Stray Cats 'Runaway Boys' gets a double exclamation point: Good phones and sounds great on the radio. The import is selling locally."

KGB-FM, SAN DIEGO, CA M.D.-JUDY McNUTT: "A nicely produced album from Spider. The songs are not quite on par with the debut but the sound and feel of the album is refreshing and different...I'm just convinced 'I Don't Want To Wait Anymore' track from the Tubes could be a s-m-a-s-h single--how about it, Kal?! (and Capitol too)...God, we are getting so much response on the Van Halen, it's depressing...Personally, I like the Split Enz, but I don't see it happening in a big way. If it does, I'll be surprised...Moody Blues 'Who Cares'? I'm waiting for the album. I've heard it and there are some excellent tracks on it... Top 20 local sales on Ozzy Osbourne. Who cares again? We added the Les Dudek, D. B. Cooper, and Dave Edmunds, to give the station some dimension. So far, so good...Billy And The Beaters continues to build momentum and now we're looking for Top 40 adds on it...Considering: Joe Vitale...The record company is still hot and heavy after the Who and I hear it's doing pretty well in sales. Locally #5! Our research showed that the single burned real fast, so anyone still playing it is nuts, probably!"







KOME, SAN JOSE, CA M.D.-DANA JANG: "Johnny Van Zant will definitely add to the cult that he has already accumulated from the first album. A pretty good rock and roll effort. We like 'Right Or Wrong', 'Let There Be Music', and 'Nighttime Ladies'...Some catchy songs on the G.E. Smith, especially 'Powerman' and 'Heart Frozen Up'...I think 'For The Sake Of Survival' from Silver Condor is a pretty good song. I'm anxious to hear the entire album...Marty Balin already starting off with a steady sales showing...Immediate out-of-the-box smash for Van Halen. Top phones, top sales--#1 in all categories...The Tubes. Another steady sales week--getting some phones...Willie Nile starting to show some increase in sales. I think he has potential. I saw him in concert this week. Lots of energy on stage...Getting some phones and pretty steady sales on Dave Edmunds...A great show last week from Split Enz. Their lighting is incredible. The album is getting steady sales and phones, especially from people who were at the concert...Marshall Tucker Band is getting light to steady sales and some phones...Light to steady sales for the Tom Johnston. Some phones for 'Wastin Time'...Considering: I love Peter Frampton. I think this is a super comeback from this guy, especially the first two tracks and 'Dig What I Say', 'I Don't Want To Let You Go', 'You Kill Me', and 'Breaking All The Rules'...I also like Elton John, 'Breaking Down The Barriers' and 'Heart In The Right Place'; Moody Blues, 'The Voice'; and, 20/20, 'Nuclear Boy'...Best Calls On: 'Just Between You And Me', April Wine; Gary U.S. Bond, 'This Little Girl'; Eric Clapton, 'Can't Stand It'; 'I Missed Again'; and, 'In The Air Tonight'...Jefferson Starship--getting a lot of female calls for 'Mary', also: 'Find Your Way Back' and 'Stairway To Cleveland'...Getting calls on Journey, especially after our softball game. We lost 24-17 before 5,000 plus fans...Greg Kihn getting phones...Also Getting Phones: Loverboy, 'The Kid Is Hot' and 'Turn Me Loose'; Tom Petty; REO Speedwagon, 'Take It On The Run'; Rush, 'Tom Sawyer'; Santana, 'Winning' and 'Over And Over'; Styx; 38 Special, 'Hold On Loosely'; Van Halen; Joe Walsh; Steve Winwood; Split Enz; Adam & The Ants, 'Antmusic'; Tom Johnston, 'Wastin Time'; Ozzy Osbourne, 'Mr. Crowley' and 'Crazy Train'; Southside Johnny; Rick Springfield, 'Jessie's Girl'; Billy Squier, 'The Stroke'; George Harrison, 'All Those Years'; and, the new Johnny Van Zant."

WDVE, PITTSBURGH, PA P.D.-DAVE LANGE: "I've always had a soft spot in my soul for Les Dudek. I think this album has real potential. We'll roll with 'Deja Vu' but I also like 'Sacrifice The Fool'...I've studied the Tubes record and I'm ready to take the test. We'll be going with 'Talk To Ya Later'...Wasn't as impressed with the Moody Blues single as I thought I'd be, but after hearing one or two other tracks, the album is solid and the single is definitely worth putting on...Van Halen has good phones and impressive sales out-of-the-box...Increased play on: Greg Kihn ('Breakup Song' starting to catch a few ears in the audience), Ozzy Osbourne...I think the Steinman will come thru eventually, sounds real good on the air...Considering: Zed, Silver Condor."

KWST, LOS ANGELES, CA M.D.-TED HABECK: "Turntable favorite at home right now: Tubes, 'Talk To Ya Later'. This has to be the most commercial song the band has ever done. Capitol should have no trouble bringing this one home...Personal thanks to: Ray Tusken, Susan Scharf, and everyone at Capitol Records. They'll never know how much I appreciated it...Congratulations to Atlantic local promotion person, Rock Allan Dibble and Sandy upon the announcement on tying the knot. Personal to Rock: Be sure to make it a slip knot...The new Moody Blues is without a doubt a fine, fine Lp. Just the thing for 25+ demographic that has trouble getting into the Plasmatics. This album far surpasses 'Live Plus Five' and 'Octave'."

WBCN, BOSTON, MA M.D.-MARC MILLER: "We've had a new Program Director here for two weeks and already all the women are wearing loin cloths and all the walls are paisley...In other news: On Tuesday, BCN presented yet another instant radio spectacular--this time we featured the Who from 3PM to 12 Midnight. We gave away Who catalogues, buttons, and memorabilia. But the climax was the drawing of the lucky winner who will be whisked away to England to have lunch with a member of the Who. Festive? You better you bet!!...Elsewhere, AC/DC has the #1 selling album in Boston. A tip of the hat to: Tony Berardini, who predicted this mega stardom six years ago...Kim Carnes, Gary U.S. Bonds, and Grace Jones all are enjoying monster sales and airplay here...If you're not on Mother's Finest yet, get off yo ass and jam!! This album is great rock and roll; as is the Wishbone Ash album, especially the cut 'Loaded'. We'd like to congratulate all the album radio stations that are playing Mother's Finest for finally getting on a Black record...Other Future Hot Ones Are: Squeeze, Bram Tchaikovsky, and Spider. Don't miss these. And remember, if you watch a record, all you see is rotating vinyl. If you listen to a record, you may hear something."

WZZQ, JACKSON, MS M.D.-STEVE KELLER: "This Elton John album has become more than a pleasant surprise. Compared to the single, this stuff is heavy duty. In fact, I'm having a tough time picking cuts to play. I think we'll go with: 'Breaking Down' and 'Heart In The Right Place' for right now...Who could resist Pete Townshend doing songs all by himself? So we went with 'Secret Policeman's Ball'. I swear to God I cannot hear where he went to sleep on 'Won't Get Fooled Again'...I especially admired someone's comments last week regarding the need of a Van Halen album. Both 'Long Distance Voyager' and 'Breaking All The Rules' were delivered this morning and hit the studio turntables the minute they were eligible for airplay. 'The Voice' by the Moody's is a killer. It's destined to be a classic. Other lead cuts are: 'Meanwhile' and 'Nervous'...Peter Frampton has come alive. He's back to his old ways, and I mean that in a positive sense. It seems like a good bet that there will be quite a resurgence in his popularity...Great response coming in on 'Lydia' by Marty Balin...While 'Modern Times' by his old teammates continues to smoke...Tremendous phones continue on: 'This Little Girl'... We were on it earlier, and now that the 'Breakup Song' is out officially I'll give it a little while longer...We lost a Tom Petty concert. He cancelled on us as a sign of the economic times?...Still waiting for a couple of nibbles here and there...kovsky...Top Sales: Who; Van Halen; Kim Carnes; 'Secret Policeman's Ball'; and, Billy...Phones: REO Speedwagon, Phil Collins, Ozzy Osbourne, Rush, and Santana...Considering: Van Halen, Moody Blues, and Peter Frampton."

NY M.D.-LIN BREHMER: "Few bands capture the ineffable essence of good pop music as Squeeze does once again. Distinctive forthright rock and roll that is not pretentious or wimpy. Squeeze tried Tom Petty for top airplay this week...Also new to the Top 10 on the air is: Al Di Meola and friends. It seems to have much wider appeal than one might expect...Check out: 'I Like Boys' by Missing Persons...New songs that turned my head this week: 'Life Is Bizarre' by Leyden Zar; 'Nuns With Guns' by G.E. Smith; 999, 'Bongos On The Nile'; and, 'Better Be Good To Me' by Spider...My favorite song on the radio right now is: Dave Edmunds, 'Almost Saturday Night'...Joan Jett, U-2, and Fast Fontaine are all live in Albany this weekend, thus shattering all hope for my rehabilitation...I like the Elton John. Except for the three-song segue on Side 2, there's a lot of stuff album radio can use...I think the Johnny Van Zant should do very well as 38 Special did. Very well produced. It's good rock and roll, a lot less in the Southern rock pigeonhole. Good choice of cover tunes on that, too...People seem to like the Plasmatics. This is the first Plasmatics we've played."

KISS, SAN ANTONIO, TX P.D.-TIM SPENCER: "The Van Zant is an excellent record. Very well produced, but it lacks the kind of depth that I think it's going to take to bust loose for Johnny...If there is such a thing as an accessible Frank Zappa album, then this is the most accessible since 'Apostrophe'. At any rate, it's restricted airplay, I guess because I love the idea of making a quilt out of panties...I really don't understand the extreme action the Gary U.S. Bonds has been getting around the country, but I guess you guys have forced me to try it out here...Iron Maiden is a locally well known group...Kim Carnes is getting excellent response--immediate positives with daytime play. Interestingly enough, strong male phones, too...So far nothing overwhelming on the Van Halen, but I think it will be a good album for them...Considering: Jim Steinman...And To Mike Bone: If I can find a way of freezing fried okra, two pounds is on the way."

KYYS (KY102), KANSAS CITY, MO M.D.-JOE MCCABE: "Help, help! I'm a wimp!! Marty Balin's 'Hearts' is great...Elton John's 'Breaking Down The Barriers' is phenomenal...Joe Walsh has me hooked...Even the Joe Vitale sounds semi-wimp--and good!! I don't understand. Of course, we won't play any of them right away. Somebody please test the water before I jump in...The Johnny Van Zant is in this week--and it's because I need some good Southern boogie to balance the Kim Carnes, Climax Blues Band and Joe Walsh, etc, etc--all good records, but balance is the key...The staff loves the Jim Steinman. I'm lukewarm...Some curiosity calls on the Tubes--'Who is that band?' Sounds like the hooks are working...The Van Halen is probably their best album to date. Didn't think so on first listen, but the superlatives have already been passed along--just a good album...Two real good success stories developing here: Greg Kihn is breaking wide open. We almost dropped it. Now it's like, man, lookout!!...38 Special's 'Fantasy Girl' seems to be working for us...I like the Moody Blues--catchy. I've got to admit that I'm waiting for 'The Voice'...Retail Moves: You want to see how Kansas City reacts to brand new music? How about this: REO Speedwagon, AC/DC, Loverboy, Styx, 38 Special, John Lennon, Steve Winwood, etc, etc, etc. They just can't wait for it!!...Kim Carnes Top 20...Considering: My wimp records, and still Les Dudek."

WYFE, ROCKFORD, IL M.D.-"MAGIC" DICK BASCOM: "Joe 'Eagles' Vitale goes in this week. The phone rap with Walsh is a killer, but my favorite cut is 'Lady On The Rock'--sounds like the Eagles revisited...The Moody Blues Ep sounds real strong. I'm sure the album will be as strong, if not stronger...Johnny Van Zant's followup is everything I anticipated. 'Who's Right Or Wrong' should do very well...Although I was somewhat concerned about the Kim Carnes record, I finally put it in on a heavily dayparted basis. I think it'll do well, but I'm still somewhat worried about the Modies...The Jim Steinman album is really beginning to take off, from 17 to #11 on this week's Sales Index and requests are beginning to grow. We put in the guitar rap and 'Stark Raving Love' to supplement the single. This is going to be a very big album...The Tubes 'Talk To Ya Later' is so infectious, it'll have you singing along after the first listen. Sure signs of it being a big hit...Ozzy Osbourne jumped up to the #2 sales position this week, but concert tickets for the show this weekend aren't moving quite as well. Not sure I know the reason why...Greg Kihn goes up to heavy this week. Greg's kind of rock and roll has the sure-fire makings of a big album. Sales and requests are building...Billy Squier continues to grow. 'The Stroke' is the leader as far as requests go...And finally, since we put in the Motorhead, believe it or not, we've gotten reaction of a positive variety. I'm not advocating that everybody play it, but if you're a heavy metal market, you might want to consider it."

WPLR, NEW HAVEN, CT M.D.-EDDIE WAZOO: "A very, very good album from Elton John. The diversity of tracks has easily laid to rest the fears that this album would be more reflective of the single. Calls on the first two tracks on Side 1 and for the Suite at the beginning of Side 2...A very strong second album from the Johnny Van Zant Band. Strong confident playing; and likewise, more confidence in the vocals. Go Johnny!...The new Joe Vitale album is perhaps his best. Especially attractive is the overall Joe Walsh sound...Marty Balin's album is generally on the mellow side, but I can see appeal from upper demos and particularly females...Leave it to Detroit to put out good old rock and roll bands. The Look fills the bill. Don't overlook this one...After some initial negative reaction, the Moody Blues single is becoming accepted. Good energy level and fairly strong melody...Calls starting on the Plasmatics. Fairly good play on 'Summer Nite'...The local factor is coming through, and we're getting good calls on G.E. Smith...The Tubes continue to grow. Their local fan club is quite large...Although we've dropped 8 records off the chart, we have not dropped any of these records out of our library. Space just doesn't allow us to list everything."

KNAC, LONG BEACH, CA M.D.-JIMMY CHRISTOPHER: "First of all, the new music I'm really high on: 999, 'Concrete'--hot and heavy...The new Tubes is great...Stiff Little Fingers is one of my favorites of the year...Holly And The Italians is a nice strong album without a weak cut...New Musik sounds real nice...We're looking for good things from both 20/20 and the Plasmatics...I saw a couple of great shows this weekend: The Penetrators and Robert Gordon. I'm really hopeful that the Penetrators will go far...The Madness show was nuts in May...Finally, the Garland Jeffreys live gig was high energy and really a good time."

KKDJ, FRESNO, CA M.D.-JEFF RIEDEL: "Adds: Johnny Van Zant, Elton John, and Spio by: REO Speedwagon, Styx, Steve Winwood, AC/DC, and the Who...Phil Collins 'In The #1 requests position; followed by: Van Halen and Billy Squier...We're getting good 'Talk To Ya Later'...Tommy Tutone was in town for two shows last week. Both were nea was more than favorable...Considering: Silver Condor...Looking forward to Joe Vitale.. change in Peter Frampton."

WLPX, MILWAUKEE, WI M.D.-BOBBIN BEAM: "First off our Young Milwaukee Night was a big succe thousand people came to watch the Brewers whip the A's. Once again we offered our \$2.25 disc tickets for Rock and Roll Air Force members. And we had a parade of our stations vehicles: Of firetruck, race cars. Pre-game entertainment was Sierra and Short Stuff and we had our LPX skyo jumping in formation right down to home place with LPX parachutes. Our flying machine was ove looking like a giant bumpersticker--It was a resounding success--We all had a good time...Kim Carr selling. We're getting positive response...The Sherbs--we've checked out this record for at least a and have gotten only positives. Also, getting airplay in important patches around the country--a sle with hit potential! It does extremely well in 18-24 females...I've followed the Tubes from their star I even saw their first and second tours with Quay Lewd and his 18 inch platforms. I've always felt Fee singing was quite strong and versatile. Seems as though they've really found their niche with a new label and a strong new album. 'Talk To Ya Later' has all sorts of good hooks in it...We played Johnny Van Zant at our album preview night to rave reviews from 18-24 listeners. Of course it's a natural with the Van Zant stamp...Considering: Joe Vitale, Dave Edmunds, Marty Balin, Moody Blues, Whitesnake and Spider."

WYNF, TAMPA/ST. PETERSBURG, FL M.D.-NICK VAN CLEVE: "To Elektra/Asylum: Don't let the 'Breakup Song' by Greg Kihn slip away. This record can make it. It has all the signs including most important phones building weekly. It's now a Top 12 phone breaker here...I'd personally like to thank Mom Van Zant. She's the one that's got real rock and roll in her veins. As Johnny continues the Van Zant legacy, the Van Zant clan do know how to rock and make Florida even more famous. 'Right Or Wrong' is the track for us...I can't get enough of the new Tubes record. I swear 'Talk To Ya Later' has to be a hit this Summer or I'm going to have to get out of what I'm doing and manage a McDonald's...Early Phones For: Marty Balin, 'Hearts'; and, Top 3 phones for Van Halen with the second or third complete listen of the album. Eddie is a true marvel...A resurgence of interest for the Phil Collins Lp now that we've spread the tracks. I guess many of us knew all along that the album is pretty deep...A sure fire for next week: Joe Vitale...Give me a call, Ray."

KLBJ, AUSTIN, TX M.D.-JOHN LOGAN: "Moody's for the 80's. For a group that has essentially missed an entire decade, the Moody's sound is as contemporary as groups who weren't around when the Moodys were searching for the lost chord. Proof that they've been listening, if not recording, from the sound of this fresh vinyl. With the street buzz on the upcoming concert here, the album should explode when it hits the stores...Squeeze is like the gum with the flavor center. If you nibble, you don't get the good stuff; but if you bite down hard, it's a taste treat...Jerry Jeff Walker's new one is indicative of his changes. Seems he's cleaned his act up. And while the spirit is still there, the music is cleaner than anything he's done in years. A couple of remakes with some blistering Bonnie Bramlett backup and the Chef with the Muscle Shoals have this one cooking more than on the back burner. Nice to have you back, Jacky Jack...Don't overlook Silver Condor. Straight ahead, solid, classy stuff that deserves an ear and a turntable...Elton John has survived every swipe and accolade that could be taken or given and he's still around. This time, he's making music that runs as deep as his experience says it should. I think maybe he's beginning to care again, for whatever reason. 'The Fox' is sly, open, obscure, and frank all at once. And, if you holler 'image' or 'dated', you missed it, friend."

WRAS, ATLANTA, GA M.D.-DANE VENABLE: "The adds: Elton John, The Bongos, Joe Vitale, The Plasmatics, Spider, 999, and G.E.Smith...Increases in rotation: Squeeze, Cramps, and Frank Zappa...Drops: Costello, Eno Byrne, Point Blank, Magazine, and Rush...Five Most Played Songs: 'What's He Got', 'Nightwatchman', 'Antmusic', 'Mercury Blues' and 'Message of Love'."

WRNW, BRIARCLIFF MANOR, NY P.D.-RON RIZZI: "This week the Tubes opened up as our #2 record, tied with the Who and Tom Petty. They're in good company. 'Talk To Ya Later' and 'Sushi' are leading the race. We're waiting for this one to break open at our reporting stores...The new Moody Blues Lp is a masterpiece. They're always worth waiting for. 'Veteran Cosmic Rocker' is the summation, with very touching lyrics. 'The Voice' and 'Meanwhile' also will be favorites at WRNW...It's good to have a few albums like Lee Rittenour (which is selling well for us), Robbie DuPree, John Klemmer, and Joe Vitale. They're easily programmed and do well with our older listeners. DuPree's 'Street Corner Heroes' and 'Brooklyn Girls' are great, especially if you remember all those nights you hung around on the corner shooting the breeze... Other exciting things this week: Interviews in the city with Roger Taylor and Tom Johnston. Both are extremely talented individuals with great music behind them and better ahead! Their recent solo efforts have been well received here...This Week's Adds: Robbie DuPree, Jerry Jeff Walker, Kraftwerk, John Klemmer, Joe Vitale, Any Trouble live (There you go, Roy.), Spider, Johnny Van Zant, Silver Condor, and the Moody Blues...No, Mr. Volmark, I didn't divorce Beverly and marry Wendy. It's a threesome. Yes, it's true I go the route this month getting engaged to a wonderful lady who loves motorcycles, rock and roll, radio, and being crazy. Not necessarily in that order...Roy, I'm not avoiding you. And who said it's your breath? It's hers!!...xxx, Riz."

KMOD, TULSA, OK M.D.-CHARLIE WEST: "For the Zappa, an incredible performer is captured at his best on this double album set...The Tubes is a very good record from start to finish...Marty Balin is just incredible--a refreshing voice. I stopped counting the hits at 4...On 'Secret Policemen's Ball', Pete Townshend's true talent shines at its best...Getting some light sales and pretty good phones on the Edmunds single...Also calls on Phil Collins 'In The Air Tonight'...Tom Petty naturally h-o-t and Joe Walsh is starting to do pretty well...Considering: Johnny Van Zant, also the G. E. Smith and Wishbone Ash."

WTUE, DAYTON, OH M.D.-JIM KINNEY: "The Moody Blues are a serious contender for comeback of the year. A fantastic album, especially since they haven't changed their sound. Many thought they wouldn't be able to do the same thing they always have and pull it off, but they'll put all those comments in the wastebasket as of now. Nobody's happier about it than me. It's so refreshing to hear people like them and Fogelberg mixed in with all the rock and roll. (By the way, where is Danny-boy?) We're starting with: 'Talking' and 'Nervous'...Also in this week is: Marty Balin and Whitesnake... 'Hearts' is a hit for Marty, but we're gonna start with 'Believe'...All of Side One on Whitesnake is good. We're on the title. 'Wine' is also good and 'Till The Day I Die' is one of those tunes that I like a lot, but I'm not sure if others will...Lots of promotions are keeping us guys busy as hell around here. We just gave away a Van Halen Night-On-The-Town, and we're doing a private showing of the 'Lone Ranger' flick. We're also sending two winners to the Indy 500. Listeners had to identify tunes to qualify...Starting this Tuesday and running for the next 10 Tuesday nights, we're doing live broadcasts with all the bands that are on our homegrown album. We definitely believe in supporting local talent around here...This week was a very interesting sales week. First of all, Homegrown is #2 in town; Ozzy Osbourne keeps killing at #4; and, Kim Carnes is up to #5!!!!!!...Van Halen enters at #6; Loverboy still at #8; Tom Petty #10; Joe Walsh up to #15; 'Secret Policeman's Ball' is #23; Gary U.S. Bonds up to #25; Rick Springfield #26; Greg Kihn and Billy Squier both crack the Top 30; and, the Dregs are in the Top 40 after only one week of airplay."

KTIM, SAN RAFAEL, CA M.D.-BILL: "I can't believe that all you Southern folks subsist on so much grease. I guess it's easier to slap palms that way. Red-eye gravy, country ham, sausage, catfish, hushpuppies! The Memphis in-laws were in and the waistline is out. Vacation was simply fattening. I'm rested and ready and still talking about last week's Question Of The Week, which I found most informative and entertaining. (Incidentally, I'm wearing purple today.) But I didn't see anyone mention a new trend that seems to be prominent these days, albums by session people. David Lindley, G.E. Smith, Joe Vitale--all established and accomplished musicians with new Lp's. 'Plantation Harbor' by Joe Vitale is wonderfully funky and diverse, even more so than the Joe Walsh Lp. Start with the lead track 'Let It Go'; and on Side 2, you'll be pleasantly surprised to hear some great vocal accentuation by Mickey Thomas. In fact, Bill Szymczyk is soon to produce Mickey's solo effort and I can't wait...As long as I'm into local folks, how about a page on the new Tubes album. Can't go a page? All right. Let me just say that the new Tubes Lp is absolutely incredible. They've taken every sound they've ever experimented with and combined it with their new found musical ground to produce some jaw-dropping mixes. Let's not take this one for granted. Stay on the case, Judy!...Special thanks to: David Lindley, whose live show is far better than the album. I expected that, but I didn't expect to be so blown away by such a well developed style. O.K. I'll admit it to everyone. I love the album. It's great. David spent about two hours on the air with our nighttime DJ, Michael Hester, talking and picking music to play. This happened in the wee hours of the morning, and Lindley made sure it was known that it was his choice to reach an audience that compared to all others is negligible...David is not the only one spending time at KTIM lately. Sweet Willie Nile came by, as did Tom Johnston, Marty Balin; and today, Rick Springfield. There is not a better place to be in Springtime than the Bay Area."

KZOK, SEATTLE, WA M.D.-MICHAEL KNIGHT: "We added the Jim Steinman this week, using 'Rock And Roll Dreams Come True', which puts rock radio in a strange light. We're using the little disc that's glued to the side destined to end up a collector's item...Also we added: Stanley Clarke and George Duke. Stanley is the best known of this group, but George Duke is someone whose career I've followed for a long time. He's had so many character changes that we now expect him to change his hat with each release. He was a high school teacher, played cool jazz with Vince Guaraldi, was equal to all of Frank Zappa's musical demands, fostered a diverse solo career, and now we see him collaborating successfully with Stanley Clark. This new release features ballads, funk and humor. The Seattle sales were undeniable, and the songs are being heard all across town on practically every format...Interesting response to: Billy & The Beaters--the staff likes this excellent live recording...Dave Edmunds is still my fave rave. He will single-handedly bring back musical styles that many rock stations thought passe, and his attitude towards harmony and the simple 4/4 beat are classic illustration of what rock and roll is all about--from the roots up... 'Tempted' by Squeeze was the easiest record I've gotten added since I arrived here. All we had to do was play it...With the exception of one station, Marty Balin was added across-the-board in the Northwest. He was going to make a personal appearance up here, but apparently the S.F. party was more fun or more work than anyone could handle down there. He's been MIA ever since... Considering: Peter Frampton, Moody Blues, Tubes, and Pointer Sisters."

WMYK/WZAM-AM, ELIZABETH CITY/NORFOLK, VA M.D.-BILL SIMMONS: "Van Halen proves that it is indeed a homerun with a #1 sales debut and overwhelming phones. Phone callers have already picked out 'Mean Street' and 'Unchained' as their favorites...Billy Squier is really starting to shine with Top 20 sales. 'The Stroke' is #1 phones...Good initial response to the Tubes. All positive--no negative...Others starting to make progress are: Rick Springfield and Marshall Tucker Band...Very good sales on: Kim Carnes. I'll take all the credit, since I'm the only album rock station in town playing it."

WZZO, BETHLEHEM, PA P.D.-LYN COREY: "Adds: Elton John, Moody Blues Ep, Joe Vitale, and Johnny Van Zant... It seems to be an off week for music, but it could be the calm before the storm...From what I heard, the new Moody Blues is hot. This could be the album they need to bring them back to their top-rated standing...From all the talk about Frampton, it sounds like a real strong Lp. Now that's an artist who's overdue for sure!...Saleswise, strong moves for: Billy & The Beaters, Tom Petty, and 38 Special... Top Requests: AC/DC--watch out, Adam & The Ants and Phil Collins are pulling in those phones...Cinda loved the Vitale. A touch of Joe Walsh really finetunes the album...Elton John hasn't sounded this strong since... He's gone back to his roots and, throughout the Lp, maintains those roots solidly... Tom Hunter: Next time you need a jock from the competition, call them instead of me."

WROQ, CHARLOTTE, NC M.D.-JONATHAN WHITE: "Silver Condor is one of the best bands I've heard to come out in 1981. The cut 'Carolina' is a killer, and there are others on here that are of equal quality...I made a comment a couple of weeks ago that I want to explain, maybe just to myself. The comment was pertaining to rock bands rolling with the flow of whatever was selling at the time. I said something about money being the bottom line. To some people, somewhere, that is somewhat true. But how about those of us who, so to speak, 'sold our souls'? It sure as hell wasn't for money. All those R&R bands out there making dimes and beans putting up with all the bullshit. Or how about the dimes and beans radio? God knows, album rock jocks are not along the tops of the great 'income totem pole'. Let's face it. As much as we may bitch, we do what we do 'cause we love it. Although, the money sure comes in handy."

WAFF, WORCESTER, MA M.D.-ROB BARNETT: "The Tubes and Mother's Finest are in--'Talk To Ya Later' and 'Movin On' are on. Our double shots have made their way to Boylestown Street!!! Rock and roll, boys!!! ...Tomorrow night the Gary U.S. Bonds show. A recap will be forthcoming. Connections are everything--I'll be at the other Bonds June 3rd...The Moody's made their way into my hands as I'm typing here. Hold on a minute--it's on. So far I hear 'The Voice'...Here comes Frampton--and that's on as well. The title cut is real rock and roll. Thanks, P.W.!...We got Bone hard on the vibrating rock and roll pants promotion. Lucky winners picked on Monday--pictures on the way...New bumper stickers and t-shirts are here with the new logo...Hey, Harrison's 12" is surprising everyone and working well in heavy airplay... The Van Halen debuts at #4 sales; Ozzy shoots up to #5; and, Gary U.S. up to #12...Solid Phones For: Phil Collins, Ozzy Osbourne, Rick Springfield; and, 'Dirty Deeds'...An official printed welcome to: Tom Watts, our new Creative Director...My comments are in, and I'm out."

PANIC ACTION CONTINUED

WQDR, RALEIGH, NC P.D.-BOB WALTON: "Let's talk music. We're having continued success with Cold Chisel. 'The Sand' is getting hotter and hotter, especially on the phones. I strongly urge that track as the next single. Many thanks to the band and all involved for calling WQDR all the way from Australia for an interview. Good songs on the interview as well...I don't know who said it, but MAGIC is the best word to describe Zed...The new Peter Frampton is definitely the best I've heard. It is absolutely fantastic! It's good to have him back...We also added Bill Wray this week. The only trouble we had was picking cuts. It's very good from beginning to end. We can't help but think we may have another Delbert McClinton type success story. My recommendations are 'Blue Eyes White Lies' and 'Paired On Radio'...My pick of the week is the Ghost Riders. I can't help but think that this is a very important album. At least we haven't had this kind of music to consider for a long, long time."

WAQX, SYRACUSE, NY P.D. & M.D.-ED LEVINE: "Over the weekend I had a chance to hear some tracks from the forthcoming Kings album. Some of them were very basic, one didn't even have vocals yet. But I will say this: The first album was top 10 in Syracuse, and this one I really believe will spread it all the way. It has much more of a heavy feel to it...Speaking of advance listens, J.B. gave me one on the new Frampton, and I have to concur with the Hard Choice. It will be an automatic add...The Mavis Brodey/Neil Lasher road show made its way to town, but Marty Balin would have been an add anyway. 'Hearts' is something we can play dayparted. We'll also use 'You Left Your Mark On Me', my personal favorite...Johnny Van Zant's album will continue the progress he made in this market on the first. It was top 20 for a number of weeks in Syracuse...One album that's been around for a while and simply exploded this week is Phil Collins. Up to #4 in retail mainly on the strength of 'In The Air Tonight'...Gary U.S. Bonds is #12 in retail this week on the heels of an excellent show in town. The fan has paid his dues and is amazingly modest about how things have turned around for him...As strange as it may be to say, the Tom Petty album, in the eyes of the consumers, is not as major a piece of music as we may think. The record is selling, no doubt about it, #14 this week, but it's not blowing out...Dave Edmunds is getting strong airplay on the top 40 in town too. We were picking up phones before adding it, and I think this one could be a real important top 40 tune...Billy Squier is in trouble. As much as I think 'The Stroke' has major possibilities, it just ain't happening yet...Also want to make note that the Rods will be putting out an album on Ariola/America soon. They are heavy metal!! Be looking for it."

WMAD, MADISON, WI M.D.-RON PHILLIPS: "Another week where nothing really grabs my ears...I am looking forward to the Silver Condor record. The sampler is good, but I heard a couple of other tracks from the lp that are absolute smokers. The cover looks like a religious experience...Phones light up immediately for Townshend's acoustic version of 'Won't Get Fooled Again'. Everybody needs to play this record, and at a cheap list price it should have no problem selling through...Local sales and good promotion finally put us on the Dave Edmunds...Up in rotation: Billy Squier; Greg Kihn, with good top 40 action here in town; and, of course, the phones are heavy for Van Halen...The Spider record is not bad on first listen, but are they trying to pattern themselves after Blondie?...The Moody Blues 12" is a disappointment. I sincerely hope for a strong lp...Thanks to Tom Moran for a great evening at the Willie Nile-Greg Kihn show. Both acts were super strong and I'm convinced of Willie's commitment to his music...We're letting listeners design a new logo for the station, with the winner receiving a \$1,300 stereo system. Response so far has been great."

WSYR, SYRACUSE, NY M.D.-TOM NAST: "First off, the new Van Halen album is getting great phone response. Sales are a bit slow, although that will only be a temporary problem. 'Unchained' is leading the pack for requests so far...Boy, was I happy with the new album from Spider. This group has always done wonders in this area. They are no strangers here. Great phones starting on it already. Looking forward to seeing them play in town real soon too...The new Johnny Van Zant album is by far our #1 most requested new record. This album will be gold before you know it and platinum soon to follow. 'Who's Right Or Wrong' and 'Nighttime Lady' are standout cuts and retail is developing already...After the world debut of the new Moody Blues, we caused a lot of excitement in Syracuse with people waiting us to keep playing it. Well, finally we can. This will do real good for putting the Moody Blues back...A surprise this week is Phil Collins up to #1 in sales...It was great to see Terry Van Dyne in town. Terry, the next time you spend two nights at my house, I have to get in better shape. You are a maniac...A pleasure to meet Mavis Brodey. She and Neil Lasher (talk about beauty and the beast)...Rumor has it Ed Levine is giving promotional ideas to Rochester. What other good ideas will you give them Ed? Joe Perry did a good show in town last week. Too bad the crowd didn't show up...Gary U.S. Bonds was brilliant in concert...Considering: Split Enz and Don Henley."

WOUR, ITHACA/SYRACUSE, NY M.D.-TOM STARR: "I can understand bailing out on a record when it shows no signs of life after a reasonable period of reasonable play. But, how kihn a station drop a good record they admit indecent exposure on just when it's beginning to break in markets where stations are showing serious commitment? I mean, Holy Toledo, what the Buck is going on? We've been in the vanguard on the Kihn and Cold Chisel and won't be eating anyone's dust on these...The Chicago/Petty fiasco has been interesting to follow & is certainly no Petty matter. I don't care how high on Sky Tom Petty may or may not be, it shows a real lack of discretion on his, his management's and/or the Label's part to slam the door on other stations that have figured in establishing Petty's stature in the market. As for WMET bring Earl Slick everything he's deserved over the years. We're heavy on the advance, and so is the listener response where the record stores are already reporting requests...Our Rock Of CNY Weekend was a great success. Area musicians and promoters did guest slots on the air throughout the weekend. Our own ROCK OF CNY VOLUME II is in the works and should be along in the late Summer...The WOUR Rock And Roll Patrol is on the streets for a new season of bumper sticker spotting. Labels can get lots of mentions for artists if they'll send us bulk for Rock And Roll Patrol giveaways."

WFYV, JACKSONVILLE, FL M.D.-AL FLEISCH: "The great summer sales race looks like it's on. Van Halen debuts this week with a 2 and Tom Petty moves 13 to 3. Joe Walsh moves 9 to 8, and Ozzy Osbourne moves 20 to 15...Van Halen continues to get great response from young males...Phil Collins' 'In The Air Tonight' is such a monster now that the local top 40's are playing that instead of 'I Missed Again'...38 Special continues to be the leader in town in sales and requests. They put on a great concert last Saturday night with the Danny Joe Brown Band. Of course, Danny Brown used to be the lead vocalist for the Molly Hatchet Band and he cranked out a couple of old Hatchet tunes which got the crowd crazy. We took 21 Special winners back stage after the show, and then fed them a BBQ dinner that was hosted by 38 Special. Thanks very much to Richard Pachter of A&M Records, who really busted ass to coordinate everything."

WYSP, PHILADELPHIA, PA M.D.-LISA FITZGERALD: "Silver Condor's my favorite record this week. I hear 'For The Sake Of Survival' as a major top 40 smash. It's got too much of a haunting hook to be anything less...The new Moody Blues record is going to cross over everywhere. The current single doesn't do much for me, but there are tons more to choose from. Lyrically, the strongest album I've heard in too long. 'Talking Out Of Turn' is my early favorite...The new Spider really impressed me. I wasn't into the sugar-coated style they presented on their first album. This second album may as well be a different band. Their image and their sound come across very hip. If I had to classify them somewhere, I'd put them somewhere between the Cars, Blondie, and U-2--you figure it out...Whitesnake, 'Don't Break My Heart' proves that once you've got your drums and bass line down, you've got it. Alan, here's the tune you should key in on: 'Darlin'."

AND, ME M.D.-JOSE DIAZ: "I got a chance to see Van Halen in Portland this last week. Their warm-up dates for their world-wide tour. Let me give everybody fair warning-- they're a great show. These guys have never forgotten their audience and it shows in the show. The Fools opening weren't half bad either. It was a real pleasure to meet the Fools. They are very nice people. Many thanks to: Jack Dougherty of EMI/America for making it possible for me to spend a nice time with the band...Onto new music: Probably the most outstanding record of the week is: Johnny Van Zant. A very strong followup. Our lead cuts are going to be: 'Right Or Wrong'...Frankly, I didn't care for the Marshall Tucker single when it first came out. The album has a great song on it called 'Silverado' that's probably the one to key in on if this album has any merit...Speaking of Silverado, I foresee the band of that name doing very well with this new album, especially on the single 'Ready For Love'. Already hearing on various Top 40's...To take care of the Frank Zappa cult, obviously 'Fine Girl' is the new album...The cut that's most palatable for us on the new Elton John is 'Breaking Bad'. It's very reminiscent of 'The Bitch Is Back'...I just found out that Whitesnake will be opening for Foghat. Looking forward to the show. 'Come And Get It' is definitely the lead cut on the album...Going back to last week's adds, 'Mercury Blues' by David Lindley is playing around here than I ever expected. It has definitely become a jock favorite...It's that 'Tempted' will be the new Squeeze single. This is a very solid album for this band, they can make some inroads on this Lp...We're getting a barrage of requests for the new Van Halen. The lead cuts around here right now are: 'Mean Street' and 'Unchained'. Believe it or not, I feel this is the most sophisticated music Van Halen has made to date. There are some things on this Lp that go beyond the heavy metal mode...Finally, if the Tubes is not a hit on album rock, I don't know what is. Every time I hear 'Talk To Ya Later' or 'Sushi Girl' on the radio, it sounds better and better--an incredible album."

WLIR, LONG ISLAND, NY M.D.-RAY WHITE: "By the time everyone reads this, the Islanders will have done it one more time. Congratulations, guys. You're one helluva hockey team and LIR loves you!!...If Magazine's new single on IRS is any indication of the strength of the forthcoming album, then I really believe some of us are going to have a good time with the record...One of my favorite American drummers, Joe Vitale, has released his second Lp. Having totally loved Joe's first album while at WHCN, I was a sucker for 'Plantation Harbor'. Joe hasn't stepped out front for at least six years, so it's about time. DeBella's all hot about that in the morning."

WDIZ, ORLANDO, FL M.D.-MIKE LYONS: "Tom Petty and Joe Walsh are doing really well, and so is Van Halen. It's good to have these three names out at the same time...Peter Frampton sounds really good. That's probably going to be an add next week...We also like the Joe Vitale. 'Lady On The Rock' is definitely a future possibility, if I could figure out the lyrics...The Tubes is excellent...The Johnny Van Zant is a good followup, too...The Jim Steinman is finally catching on here, and it's really encouraging to see this kind of acceptance."

WDHA, NORTH JERSEY, NH G.M.-BOB LINDER/P.D.-MARK CHERNOFF: "Congrats to the folks at WLIR for having the heaviest record buying listeners in the country, per Arbitron's new Qualidata Service. Since per capita income is even higher in North Jersey, I would guarantee WDHA would also show quite well were Arbitron to measure us...On the subject of excessive cost, I can't believe Geffen Records payed over \$8,000 for the cover art on the Elton John album, not to mention the other costs involved. It's a good album, but not that good. 'Breaking Down Barriers', 'Heels Of The Wind' and 'Nobody Wins' are good radio cuts, but I certainly don't see 'The Fox' as a multi-platinum album, which its costs imply...Love the Moody Blues. Justin Hayward is a real star, but they're all 'veteran cosmic rockers' for sure. If Pink Floyd and Alan Parsons can be superstars amidst the cacaphony of punk and metal, there's a firm place for the Moody Blues forever. We love 'The Voice', 'Meanwhile', 'In My World' and, of course, the ELO-inspired 'Gemini Dream'...The Tubes are terrific and the 'Backward Principle' is far ahead of anything in its class...A bright spot in this week's new music has got to be New Musik, which we're seriously considering for next week. I was surprised to find no negative tradeoffs in its CX coated noise reduction. Perhaps the noise reduction will also be minimal. We'll find out when CBS eventually gets some decoders out into the world. We'd love to help CBS promote their asterounds series on a weekly Sunday night feature, but they repeatedly turned us down...We love the new Spider album, definitely a strong followup to their first. 'Change' and 'Better Be Good' are real strong...Whitesnake is good metal with melody...Joe Vitale is refreshingly different, but real easy to get to know. We recommend the initial cut, 'Never Gonna Leave You Alone' and the 'Lady On The Rock'...Marty Balin is gonna be a superstar in his own right when the masses catch up with his great new album...Thanks to the visits from Dave Morell and Debby Gould with news of upcoming label plans, and thanks to Alan Rosenberg for setting up the Tom Johnston interview...Any other rock stars wanna take on the Jersey Giant Bird as did Ozzy Osbourne?"

KBLE, DES MOINES, IA P.D.-POW SORENSON: "It's a pleasure to be able to help spread musical magic like the Ghost Riders. I've been waiting for weeks to put this sucker on. With out emphasis on the 25-35 demo, this record was made for us. Although we like it all, 'Look To The Skies', 'Moroccan Nights', 'Shine On Together' and 'Sea Rider' lead... 'Plantation Harbor' has the vitality and funk missing this time on Joe Walsh's solo...Joe Vitale's given us a very strong record. We're four tracks deep: 'Sailor Man', 'I'm Flying', 'Laugh, Laugh', and 'Man Gonna Love You'...Luxury is a Des Moines band. Their 'Green Hearts' single was widely played and was included on the Declaration of Independents collection. Ep #1 features six tracks at least two of which are as good as 'Hearts'. For service, write Angry Young Records, 3701 Carpenter, Des Moines, IA 50311. Stations which play jazz should immediately audition the Roxx/Levine Band on Head First records. It's distributed by MCA, so you ought to have it. Very listenable crossover instrumental music. Pat Metheny guests on guitar...Adds: Ghost Riders, Joe Vitale, G.E. Smith, Ross/Levine Band, New Musik, Any Trouble Live, Luxury, Elton John, Ph.D., Kittyhawk, Spider, John Klemmer, Jerry Jeff Walker, and Robbie DuPree."

WWV, CHARLOTTESVILLE, VA M.D.-PHIL KIRZYC: "Managed to get the music done this week on time. Last week we went on the Tubes, Zed, and Van Halen, which I'm not at all impressed with. AC/DC's at the top next to Zeppelinas my favorite band, so it's not that I'm a wimpburger. 'Fair Warning' is gonna take a while to grow on me, but if I were here to satisfy myself it wouldn't be in medium rotation... I agree with everyone else that it's not Harrison's best, but it's the thought that counts... Whitesnake's 'Wine, Women And Song' is the best boogie song I've heard in a long time. I realize it's not one of the key cuts, but check it out. With some good push behind it, 'Wine, Women And Song' could be this summer's party theme. We also went on 'Girl', and 'Come And Get It'...Joe Vitale has some fine work to offer, so we're starting with 'Lady On The Rock' and 'Bamboo Jungle'. We're letting the jocks do what they want on this one...Finally, Dave Edmunds and Tom Johnston are doing well enough to go to medium, right along with the 'Secret Policeman's Ball'."



Thanks to Rob Barnett and WAAF for the great support at the co-promotion...G.E. Smith. People are starting to listen; people are starting to react. G.E. is a monster! When he hits the road, you'll understand what he's all about. Until then, take some time out to listen to his 'In The World' Lp. Bill has been talking about it for two weeks. Get in touch with this record. I'm partial to 'Real Love' and 'Heart Frozen Up'."

ROY ROSENBERG, STIFF (212-765-3977): "Have I mentioned the Plasmatics new album 'Beyond The Valley Of 1984' to you yet? Obviously I have! The Rosenberg perseverance is just beginning and so is the build up of facts and figures. WLIR, WCCC, and WPLR are first out-of-the-gate! WMMS goes out of the box, 3 cuts deep! WHCN is the first superstar station to join the fold adding 'Summer Nite' immediately into moderate rotation. Believe me, there's more--just check out the most added boxes of the various trades and tips. The tracks definitely are 'Headbanger' (already radio people are telling me that vocally Wendo O. sounds like Chrissy Hine on this track) and 'Summer Nite' (a rock tear jerker). By the way, if you missed Wendy O. and the boys on the Tom Snyder show, watch for the group coming to your town on the '1984 World Tour'. And how about this K-Rock promotion--the winner gets Wendy O. to come to his or her home and actually destroy the family TV. Oh the electricity! Oh the sparks!...Now I'm serious folks, you should have the Any Trouble live promo disc, honestly and truly. The two new tracks ('Yesterday's Love' and 'Working On The Night Shift') are worth checking out. The next album will be out mid to end of June and is tentatively entitled 'Wheels In Motion'. JUDY LIBOW, ATLANTIC (212-484-6063): "It was a sad state of affairs last week following the untimely death of Jamaica's #1 son, Bob Marley. I realized for the first time how much more reggae is than just a musical style--it's life there. Marley represented Jamaican spirit--the loss was quite evident...Back in the States; however, life goes on. Just out: Whitesnake's new album 'Come An' Get It'. They will be on tour with Judas Priest and Iron Maiden--watch out! Ph.D., featuring Tony Hymas (who did keyboard work on Townshend's 'Empty Glass' Lp), and Jim Diamond. I don't know of anything that's comparable--it's got a full unique sound. Try 'Little Suzie's On The Up' and 'I Won't Let You Down'...G. E. Smith is a dynamic guitarist with a list of credits that includes Hall & Oates, Bowie and Garland Jeffreys. The talk is already on the street. Cuts: 'Heart Frozen Up' and 'Nuns With Guns'...L.A. is rock and roll from the Midwest (Cleveland to be exact)...Developing nicely: Zed, (the new single will be 'Dark Horse'--please give this track a listen)...Mother's Finest is definitely a contender for album airplay. Some believers: WEBN, WBCN, WCOZ, WMMR, WKLS, KZEL and a host more. If that's R&B, my ears aren't operating!...Manhattan Transfers 'Boys From New York City' is a Top 40 smash! I may doo-wop myself to death with it!...On other fronts, enjoying the Squeeze Lp...LOVE the Tom Petty album (yes, Jon, she finally comes around!); and 'History Never Repeats' from Split Enz...Well, I think I got a little carried away here. But, as they say in Rastaland--'cool runnin', mon' (loose translation: 'relax, it's o.k.'!)"

JOHN BRODEY, BAP (617-944-0423): "It was mildly disheartening this past week seeing Valerie Bertinelli (come on she's got stubby little fingers) mentioned more often than Bob Marley. A big fat one for live spiritual support of the Ghost Riders tour to KTIM, KVRE, KFAT, KKSX, KZEL, KKDJ, KOZZ, KFML, KBCO, and KTCL. **SUPER SEGUES:** Bob Dylan, 'All Along The Watchtower' b/w D. B. Cooper 'For Whom The Bell Tolls'; Ghost Riders 'Sea Rider' b/w Fleetwood Mac 'Future Games' or 'Beautiful Day'; 'Whitebird'-Ozzy!Mr. Crowley'b/w S. Arthur Brown 'Fire'; Chicago 'Just You And Me' b/w Kittyhawk 'Wind, Sand And Stars'...**NEWS OF NOTE:** One week from today, Ronald of Rizzi makes the big plunge, marriage. The couple met at the Grand Nationals in Laconia, NH...Berardini of Boston tells me that Celtics fever has left many staff members still green around the gills...**Hot at the Hacienda:** Ghost Riders 'Roll Away'; Kittyhawk 'Mo'; D. B. Cooper 'Small Town Talkin'."

JOHN COSTA, JEM (201-753-6100): "New stuff: Reissues of four Brian Eno back catalogue items, 'Here Comes The Warm Jets', 'Taking Tiger Mountain', 'Another Green World', and 'Before And After Science'...In an effort to create radio interest we've put together an compilation Lp entitled 'Music For Airplay' (clever). The album consists of Eno's most commercially accessible pieces gathered from the four albums mentioned. It is for promo use only and not for sale. It is however, to be enjoyed. Those of you looking for the 18-34 demo should appreciate the latest Camel release coming next month from Jem. Incredible album...We expect another big seller from the latest 'Wild Gift' from LA's own X. Most of you have received that by now. Check 'White Girl' and 'Adult Books'. That's all for now."

MIKE BONE, ARISTA (212-489-7400): "This is the week that was for the Wham of Bram. We're off to a great start this week with KLOL and CHUM-FM. Bram's 'Funland' Lp debuts in Billboard with bullets this week. We are in the process of wrapping up a rap tour encompassing Los Angeles, Chicago, New York, Philadelphia, and Boston. The rock and roll tracks are: 'Breaking Down The Walls Of Heartache' and 'Shall We Dance'. Don't let all the work Jerry Jaffe put into this act go for naught. The 'Funland' album is without a doubt one of the finest records on the street today. Do it for Bone, do it for Jaffe, but most importantly do it for Bram...I would continue these comments, however, doing them in person is a drag. So I'm signing off now to take Bram by WMMR to go on the air with Mr. Relay-40 himself, Michael Tearson...**Personals:** Alex Demers: Sorry I left you OUT...Chris Miller: Thanks for following my instructions. You're a gentlemen and a scholar. See you July 20th."

BETH ROSENGARD, INDEPENDENT (213-508-4550): "I'm convinced that the calendar is completely screwed up. It must be Christmas because that's when the vinyl onslaught happens every year, but, if this is really December why is it so hot outside?...Speaking of hot, that's exactly what it was on stage at the Country Club last weekend when Robin Lane and The Chartbusters opened for Split Enz (love those suits, guys!) The Chartbusters really were burning and 'Solid Rock', the about to be released single from 'Imitation Life', was just great. If you've been playing 'Send Me An Angel' and think it's time for a second cut, 'Solid Rock' is the one...The just released epic by the Moody Blues, 'Long Distance Voyager', is an album of fantastic depth and complexity. Each time I listen, something new catches my ear from a bit of pedal steel guitar to a stunning lyric line or an unexpected lick from a harmonica. My favorites are 'The Voice', 'Veteran Cosmic Rocker', 'Talking Out Of Turn', and I believe the single is going to be a smash whether you like it or not...ZED, a trio of top British studio musicians, is just starting to make some noise and when the 'no room' dilemma starts to ease up, interest on this record is going to translate into some very significant airplay. 'Darkhorse' will be the single and there is additional interest in 'Luckless Romantic' and 'No Prisoners'...I've been spending time at home recently with Diesel (thanks for the tip, Michigan Mark Miller), David Lindley, and Marty Balin (what a voice)...If you'd like to send records, I'd love to hear them. The address is c/o of MCA Music, 70 UCP, Suite 425, Universal City, CA 91608...And, for anyone who suffered through my bad jokes recently, blame it on Drake Hall and Curt Gary, the tastebreakers."

BRUCE SHINDLER, ELEKTRA (212-355-7610): "The new Joe Vitale album is out. It's called 'Plantation Harbor'. A great Bill Szymczyk production for Joe Walsh's talented drummer. Check out the people playing on this album. The cuts to play are 'Lady On The Rock', 'Bamboo Jungle' (good phone call), and 'I'm Flyin''. A quality album...Speaking of Joe Walsh what else is there to say? The national airplay speaks for itself. Can't wait for the tour with Lindley and Vitale...David Lindley's 'Mercury Bues' is testing well at stations. I can't see how you can't hear this one. C'mon slowpokes!...Cold Chisel keeps going up in the charts. How about giving Chisel a shot and see what happens with 'My Baby', 'Standing' and 'Rising'? All those Aussies enjoy good music like you and me. They can't be all wrong...Roger Taylor getting strong airplay from Washington, D.C., Boston, Connecticut, and Los Angeles. Check out 'Let's Get Crazy' (a great Summer record) and 'Airheads'. This guy is a star...Last but not least, Greg Kihn's upsurge in the charts proves that radio is really behind this artist. 'Breakup Song' is kicking in at top 40's and sales have picked up. Now's the time to add other cuts off the album. All the programmers around the country who supported Kihn from the beginning--Thanks!...Tony Dwyer: Please forgive me for leaving out your name last week with regard to the Taurus party in Cleveland but I don't remember too much of that evening. Are you the one who stepped on my hand?...Bruce Goldsen, Ron Rizzi, and Bob Kranes: Always good to see you...Signing off."

DENNY SOMACH, NBC SOURCE NETWORK: (Denny produces the Rock Report which airs over the NBC Source Network on 267 radio stations and a television rock magazine for Westinghouse). Here are some excerpts from this week's report: "John Ryan will produce the new Allman Brothers Lp. In the past he has worked with Styx among others. The album will be out in July and two of the songs on the album are: 'Maybe We Can' and 'Brothers On The Road'...Ray Manzarek, one of the members of the Doors, told me that they have discovered recordings of the Doors at the Isle of White from over ten years ago. They are going to listen to the recordings, and if they are as good as they remember the show being, there will be a live Doors album out later this year. It'll include some of the latter day stuff like 'LA Woman' and an incredible version of the Van Morrison tune 'Gloria'. He also said that due to the success of the recent 'Doors Greatest Hits' package, they may issue another compilation of the more esoteric Doors tunes...In other Doors news, the long talked about television special, based on the successful book 'No One Here Gets Out Alive', should be out in the Fall on cable TV. It includes interviews with all three remaining members of the Doors, as well as rare interview and concert footage of Jim Morrison, interviews with producer Paul Rothchild and other unreleased concert footage...Bob Weir of the Grateful Dead will put out a new album later this year with his off shoot band, Bobby & The Midnights. The band includes Alphonso Johnson, Brent Mydland, Billy Cobham and Robby Cochran...The new Blackfoot should be out June 19th and is called 'Marauder'...Styx may expand on the 'Paradise Theater' theme for a Broadway production. They may release a compilation or live album sometime in the future...Earl Slick, currently with the band Silver Condor, said he was tired of playing session and that's why he formed a band. Slick has played on 'Double Fantasy' with David Bowie, and most recently on the forthcoming Yoko Ono album 'Season Of Glass'...**Birthdays this week:** John Fogarty 36; Pete Sears 33; Stevie Nicks 33; Levon Helm 39; Papa John Creach 64; and John Bonham would have been 33."

MARCO RABINEAU, A&M (213-400-411): "Look out America--we're about to break all the rules! It's all true. Ever since Sgt. Tupper, Peter smoked cigarettes, has an occasional nip or two and even goes out with real girls--the type you would like to bring home to meet the folks. Matter of fact, he's even athletic and definitely gets high on life. 'Hey, What A Guy'. Cuts: 'Breaking All The Rules', 'You Kill Me', 'Friday On My Mind', 'I Don't Want To Let You Go', 'Dig What I Say' and 'Rise Up' for starters. The other three cuts are just as equally strong. What more can I say? Frampton has returned. He's a re-born rocker. I'm also mailing out next week in the Sheet, the Oriental Torture Technique Kit for you slow listeners...I witnessed one of the all time classic shows last Saturday in the country club in L.A. when Split Enz set the house to a frenzy. Their show rolls so fast, before you know it, it's encore time. If you get a chance to see Split Enz on this tour, it's a rock and roll must. 'Hard Act', 'One Step' and 'History' are the trend setters. If you haven't seen the action on Squeeze, then you evidently haven't done your homework...Dave Edmunds gave us 'In Quintessence' which is a killer cut. 'Tempted' is our answer to Steve Winwood and will be the first single...Elvis has evidently pulled all that hidden Beatle influence and brought Squeeze to where they belong...Leyden Zar comes straight out of Canada and they're riding on a hit single called 'Backstreet Girl' which is an album rock taste maker. 'Life Is Bizzare' has been compared to the answer to the Cars. A record not to be overlooked...Nine Below Zero will be entering the country for the first American tour with the Kinks. If you like house rocking music, then you'll love Nine Below Zero. They do a great version of 'Rockin Robin'...Hey, Ozzie Bone, sorry I missed you on the Nazareth tour. I really like that opening act Kroke Horse...Jon: 'I'll be solar-pixing you later...Bill, that machine is a gone-wild Gator...My song of the week: 'Nobody Wins'--hello Tom Jones. My album of the week: Johnny 'quitar' Van Zant...Highest awards go to Michael, Craig, Steve, Wynn and Al the blitz brigade...P.S. Drake, you don't deserve her!"

J. B. BRENNER, A&M (212-826-0477): "I can't say anything about Peter Frampton that hasn't been said before. We're not selling his face or his image. We're selling his music. Bill's Hard Choice comments of last week were right on the money. Enough said."

MARK COOPER, ROPY (404-451-5997): "Happy holiday! Now we're ready to roll into summer! Get ready for 'Have Paid Will Travel'--the best ever from Grinder Switch."

MICHAEL PLEN, IPS (212-826-0477, Ext. 27): "WAER, Tom Erwin and Patty DiSalvo have given a new meaning to Breaking Records. As I walked into their station this morning, they were breaking my Cramps record over the desk. Vinyl was everywhere. When I asked them why, they said they were doing it in disgust. Disgust over the fact that neither commercial competitor in town was playing the record. Despite them destroying one copy of 'Goo Goo Muck', they're still playing the record regularly...Magazine's new single 'About The Weather' was added to a good amount of stations this week. Reaction has been good. It's from the forthcoming Lp 'Magic, Murder And The Weather'. It's due out the second week in June. Check it out. It'll make your station sound less boring. Coming soon: five little girls from L.A. called the Go-Gos. They've already had a hit in this country with their import single called 'We Got The Beat'. I can't promise you that you can abuse these little girls, but I can promise you that the music is good and that they'll tear the shit out of you if you don't play it. Don't nice little girls have good images?...Would give much more but am busy being on the road. Talk to ya later...VEJUR QUOTE: To Mr. Linder, WDHA: I'm not asking corporations to lose their millions of investment money by playing Dead Kennedy's 'Too Drunk To Fuck'. As a promo person for a company that has chosen to invest money in a recording project such as those of the DK's, I offer it for sampling. I will not ask anyone to play something that could affect their radio station. You've misinterpreted the fact that IRS doesn't view radio as the only source outlet to sell records. It's only one small piece of the pie. Consider all the other outlets that have made our records substantial successes in this industry. Find out what the IRS is all about on the cable news network, Ted Turner's channel on the evening of May 29th at 10 P.M. on the West Coast and 1 A.M. on the East Coast when there is a short piece on the music industry featuring the IRS."

JIM DEL BALZO, GEORGE MEIER, JIM SOTET, POLYGRAM (212-399-7075): "Just in case you hadn't noticed, Polygram Music has reached a level of consistent quality month after month which it has never attained in the past. Off to a running start for May are the Moody Blues, Johnny Van Zant, Spider, and 999 (the band which we will make a household number before we are through)...Still potent are Pure Prairie League and Southside Johnny...Finally the Tom Dickie & The Desires show has really come together. They generate unusual rock and roll intensity..."...JIM SOTET: "Rush at Madison Square Garden was truly one of the most incredible live rock and roll shows for a number of reasons. But it was the audience who really were the stars. They were with the band from the first note. A great experience. Geddy, Neil and Alex --congratulations. You deserve all the success...Another incredible show was Public Image Ltd at the Ritz Friday. BONNIE SIMMONS, WARNER BROTHERS (213-841-2400): "Thanks to all for a great start on the Van Halen record. Looks like 'Mean Street', 'Push', 'So This Is Love' and 'Dirty Movies' are the most prominent cuts. Van Halen has started their tour and will be everywhere as always...The early response to Elton John's album has been great. Last week when I mentioned cuts I forgot one that's popping up, 'Heart's In The Right Place'. We're certainly getting good response on 'Barriers', 'Faces' and for those of you who have a softer sound, try 'Chloe'...You've probably received a cassette in the mail which says 'Beat Of Love' on it. It's a preview of an album to come next week by--Randy Van Warmer. We particularly like 'Suzi'...I want to remind you about Kraftwerk, already charted in England at #14. 'Pocket Calculator', the single, seems to be selling well in several areas of the country...Thanks to all so far on the D.B. Cooper. 'Dangerous Curves' is certainly a perfect song for the summer. Let's see, dangerous curves---motorcross races, car races, Marilyn Monroe or Jayne Mansfield as depicted on the cover, or Fernando Valenzuela in reference to his pitching not his curves (So what, Susan, 8-1 ain't bad)...MTB is out on tour and we're getting good response to 'Rumors' and 'Silverado' off his record...One last record that's already out I want to mention is Gang Of Four. I think 'Cheeseburgers' is a pretty good cut and you should all consider it...Coming soon: Gary Wright (I like everything on the first side, so you pick); Arlo Guthrie (which may surprise you. Along with Russ Kunkel, Bob Glaub, Hank Devito, Jai Winding, he has guest vocalists who include Rickie Lee Jones, Phil Everly, Leah Kunkel, Bill Champlin, and Gwen Dickie); Jim Messina (try the first two on the first side and second cut second side with Pauline Wilson from Seawind)...We also have albums coming from Yoko Ono, Hilly Michaels, Pat Metheny, Kid Creole, and the English Beat but we'll have to get more specific next week. I got a feeling Susan's about to say I'm out of room. But, I don't care what Susan says...We're very excited about the Tommy Johnston album. We just hope everybody sticks with us through cause we plan to be there with this record for a long time...Having seen great live shows already this week from Robin Lane, Split Enz, and Robert Gordon, I have to get home and now prep myself for the PBC special on Casey Stengel."

RECORD ACTION CONTINUED

MIKE COOPER ON IMPORTS: (Mornings 404-627-2834/ Afternoons 355-8686) "A lot of releases to talk about this time around, most of them quite good. A bit pop, but very energetic and quite infectious are the two singles that have been released from Kim Wilde. The first, 'Kids In America', was a Top 20 hit in the U.K. and Australia, and a second single has just been issued from this British female vocalist called 'Chequered Love'. These records need to be released here!...Adam & The Ants have a new single (not on the current Lp), called 'Stand And Deliver'. Certainly as strong as anything on the Lp, and having equal chart success in Britain...Gary Numan's back-up band, Dramatis, have their first single on their own following Numan's retirement from music. But it's very much in the Numan mold...My personal favorite import single of the month is 'Is That Love' from the new Squeeze Lp that's out on both sides of the ocean...The Chris Difford/Glenn Tillbrook combination has never been stronger! An early Marc Bolan track 'Sing Me A Song' is charting in the U.K., after being pulled out of the vaults. It's pleasant enough, though not to be compared with T. Rex's best days...Japan sounds a bit like Roxy Music on the new single 'The Art Of Parties'. This is the same Japan that had a couple of albums out here a few years ago...Echo & The Bunnymen have a live EP which includes almost 30 minutes of music, including 'Crocodiles' and 'All That Jazz'. By the way, the second Lp from the Bunnymen is done and ready to be released...Strong albums from the U.K., based on tracks that I've heard are those from: Tenpole Tudor, the band to emerge as the stars of last year's Stiff Records tour in the U.K.; The Undertones, with a single 'It's Gonna Happen', which is a bit more pop and less harsh than some earlier stuff. As well as Lps from: The Cure and Stiff Little Fingers which are also quite strong...A single which has been out for some time but is finally doing well comes from Department S, called 'Is Vic There?' which stems from an old Monty Python sketch... From other countries, there are the following notable releases: In Belgium, former member of Herman Brood's Wild Romance, Danny Lademacher has a Tom Petty-ish single out called 'Where Are The Girls'; In Canada, a B-52s-ish single from The True Confessions, called 'Mating Games'; and from Australia a heavy metal band called The Angels, who have a new single called 'Into The Heat'...Finally, a look at some news from the British music scene: Former Wings member Denny Laine is already working with a couple of musicians following his departure from the band...Rumors persist of a Led Zeppelin-Yes combination group forming that would include Robert Plant, Jimmy Page, Chris Squire, and Alan White...Don't believe rumors that Phil Collins would join Wings...Thanks!"

FOR YOUR INFORMATION:

When reading the individual station report, please remember that there are three ways in which album rotations are tracked.

1. **PLAYS PER DAY** - This refers to the actual number of exposures an album gets between 6 AM and Midnight on an average day of the reporting week.
2. **PLAYS PER WEEK** - Most of our weekly play reporters go back over their music logs for the previous week, and those totals are relayed to us and printed up.
3. **AIRPLAY EMPHASIS** - Be careful not to confuse this with **PLAYS PER DAY/WEEK**. EMPHASIS is a system of relative scaling, based on 10. If the highest rotation album gets 8 spins per day, it receives 10 points. If another album gets 4 spins, it merits 5 points, etc. This allows a much more detailed rundown than the conventional light/medium/heavy system.

The Airplay Index is our ranking system for the amount of play on albums as a whole. We determine rankings by converting all daily and weekly play reports to a 1-10 emphasis system and totalling the points on a given Lp. We use a simple percentage breakdown to indicate the amount of play on each track.
