DUKE JUPITER, "DUKE JUPITER", COAST TO COAST/EPIC

I can remember breezing through the Polygram releases, but honestly can't remember a single tune or even the sound of the band. Now, with the new label affiliation, these guys have turned the beat around. "I'll Drink To You" is an absolute smoker. It's pure pop, with a hook a mile wide, great vocals, and plenty of biting lead guitar. The sleeper of the week...Kal and Ray love the track--due for a FRONT RED PAGE shot upon release!

Chain Reaction

THIN LIZZY, "RENEGADE", WARNER BROTHERS

Two biggies back to back for Phil and the boys--#4 Most Added with 25 last week, #1 Most Added this report with another 37, and overall the #2 Most Added of the past two weeks.. New on the Back Page at #49, and when the conversions roll in, it's the leading candidate for Strongest Index Mover honors next week...Raves Paul Heine, WGRQ, "Nice facelift job on the new Lizzy. Traditional Lizzy riffs with a few new twists. Sounds like Pink Floyd Meets Thin Lizzy"...Jim Buckley, WRON, "The only established name to be added this week with what I consider their finest album to date. It's got a refined heavy metal sound without all the rough edges and fuzzy distortion on most metal albums"...Kid Leo, WMMS, "If 1981 was a year for comebacks, I think Thin Lizzy might well carry over the fad one more quarter. This is definitely the one that should have followed 'Jailbreak' 7 years ago"...Rob Barnett, WAAF, "They've gained a melodic quality that differs 'Renegade' from earlier albums"...Bill Simmons, WMYK, "Thin Lizzy has produced an album that is very palatable to the heavy metal freaks out there"..."Angel Of Death" leads followed by "Leave This Town".

HUEY LEWIS AND THE NEWS, "PICTURE THIS", CHRYSALIS

Another stellar performer. The week's highest debut, #32 Index, #31 Metro and #2 Most Added this week with another 32 (for 89 in the last two weeks)...Radio Action: Kid Leo, WMMS, Huey sounds damn good on the radio. It does stick out"...Steve Feinstein, WYSP, "We believe in Huey and the News. Excellent pop with great dynamics"...Steve Huntington, WWL, "It's an album with something for everybody. It's very refreshing to see an album this good and this varied come from the proverbial left field"...Bob Bittens, WHCN, "Getting immediate reaction to 'Working For A Living'"...And Doug Podell, KQRS, "It's always an absolute pleasure to play music like this on the radio. We're starting with 'The Only One'"...And from Jon Russell, KRQR, "Huey is some hot local product we're glad to play"...KOME's Dana Jang reports, "Huey is still amassing heavy phones and really good steady sales this week--in the mid 30's"...On the Song Index, "Working For A Living' debuts at #92.

UFO, "MECHANIX", CHRYSALIS

With 26 reports, we're up to 55 stations in just two weeks, and last week's add/debut conversions made for a #37 Index debut (#35 Metro)...Top songs: "The Writer" debuts at #55, followed by "We Belong To The Night"...First week average play: 2.2 emphasis and 2.9 plays per day...Comments: Kid Leo, "I agree with what I've read in the Sheet. This is the finest UFO since Michael Schenker's departure. The album that comes to mind is 'Lights Out'. I've never understood the reason for their demise, but the time is right for them once again, and they have more than delivered the goods"...Rob Roman, KLAQ, "UFO also gets our attention this week. These guys have been pumping it out for a long time, and have a very loyal following here"...Joe MacCabe, KYYS, "Also impressed with UFO's brighter production"...Dave Lange, WDVE, "We're really high on the UFO. These boys have tightened it up quite a bit, and they have a good cult"...And from Ed Levine, WAQX, "When featured, the new album received positive reaction and quite a few phone calls. The cult is quite active here".

TOMMY TUTONE, COLUMBIA

You've got to be impressed with Columbia's never-say-die attitude on Tommy. That dedication is now starting to pay chart dividends. Note the 41-30 Index prime move, and the 37-26 Metro underline. Simply amazing performance for an album out now 19 weeks...New this week on: KYYS, KSJQ, WZXR, WWCK, WSYR, WRNO, KLAQ, KSAS, WMJQ, WRKI, and WAQX, which should make for another strong chart move when those debuts convert next week...Increased play on WROO, KDKB, WOUR, and KTXQ with heaviest spins now on KISS, KLOS, KRQR, KATT, WHJY, WYSP, KZFW, KWFM, KQPS, and WCMF...Average play 3.9 emphasis and 2.3 plays per day..."867-5309" advances 41-26...On the Checklist, we show an even 19 maintaining, and 19 building including WLIR, KISS, WAAF, KDKB, KOME, KTXQ, KQRS, KBFI, WHET, and WMMR...Of the 45 not playing Tommy, 8 are considering it...Radio action: Rob Roman, KLAQ, "Tommy Tutone's project has shown continued growth and also tested well here. It's an add"...Dana Jang, KOME, "Phones and steady sales on the Tutone."

CHAIN REACTION CONTINUED

BUILDERS:

JOAN JETT, BOARDWALK

Now 10 weeks on the chart, Joan's serious assault on the #1 airplay position continues...Also, it's the #1 Most Played Lp in the Top 30 markets with a 4-1 Metro jump...Also up 3-2 on the Index. "I Love Rock And Roll" is #1 for the 4th consecutive week.

PRISM, CAPITOL

A near prime move, 13-9, on the Back Page, and a 14-9 Metro underline...This week's play increases: WMMS, KSJO, KDKB, KRQR, KZOK, WRIF, WYSP, KTXQ, KBPI, WPDH, WKZL, WAAF, KWFM, WQXM, WILS-FM, WZXR, WRNO, WBAB, WCK, WOUR, KATT, WAPI, WSYR, WTUE, and WHJY...On this week's Checklist: Only 4 not playing, 2 dropping, 24 maintaining, and a whopping 51 building (7 report sales, 12 mentioned phones, and 13 others mentioned both)...Building includes: WLRS, WQXM, WKZL, WIOT, WGRQ, KPRI, KISS, WLUP, WMJQ, DC101, WYSP, KYYS, WZXR, KDKB, WCK, KOME, KSRR, KZOK, WTUE, KTXQ, WRIF, KBPI, KGB-FM, WNET, and KRQR... "Don't Let Him Know" is up 10-4-3 on the Song Index...Comments: Ed Levine, WAQX, "The Prism is starting to pull phones. This looks like it may do something big in town"...Buck McWilliams, WIOT, "The Prism album has the surprise retail award of the week going from 33-19 in sales."

ALDO NOVA, PORTRAIT/EPIC

Aldo comes through with another very convincing add week with 11 reports for #6 Most Added, and a grand total of 110 stations to date...21 current album debuts (including WDVE, WNEW-FM, KSJO, WCOZ, WIYY, WGRQ, KDKB, KRQR, KZOK, WYSP, and KGB-FM) made for another double underline week: 23-16 Index, 25-19 Metro. If you're still not convinced, check these play increases: KGON, KLOS, WIOT, WCMF, WIMZ, WCCC, WPDH, WMJQ, WYFE, KZEL, KISS, WAAF, KWFM, WQXM, WRNO, WCK, and WILS-FM...Max heavy spins on WMMS, WRKK, KQRS, WSYR, WLAV-FM, KMOD, and KZEW...Increased play on: WOUR, KATT, and WPYX...Average play is now up to 3.0 emphasis (from 2.6 last week), and 3.3 plays per day (up from 2.4)... "Fantasy" is also making giant steps up the Song Index, 27-16-8...Comments: The Doctor, WYFE, "Aldo Nova's 'Fantasy' is starting to pick up. By the way, have you seen the video? It's excellent"...Dana Jang, KOME, "The phones on 'Fantasy' by Aldo Nova have already started, primarily males 19-23"...Sky Daniels, WLUP, "The Aldo Nova track 'Fantasy' gains added intensity being played over the air. This is a hot sounding record".

EDDIE SCHWARTZ, ATCO

Another long term performer continues to rack up that airplay...Eddie has now been charted for 11 weeks and, voila, another double underline week--Up 33-26 Index, 35-27 Metro. New on WDVE, WIMZ, WYFE, and WZXR, with new airplay last week on WMJY, KRQR, and KTXQ.

JANIS JOPLIN, COLUMBIA

Still another record expected to stick for about a minute continues to develop nicely...Up 44-40 Index (1 point shy of an underline), up 47-42 for a Metro prime move...Increased play on WMMS, WNEW, KISS, KRQR, WRAS, WNET, WPYX, KTIM, and WXRT...New on WFBQ, WTPA, and KZEW, for a total of 55 stations in 5 weeks...Average emphasis 3.1, average daily play 2.9... "One Night Stand" is up 44-34.

LE ROUX, RCA

A solid builder--22-19 Index, 22-18 Metro, and with this week's super quality add week (WIYY, KDKB, DC101, KGON, WQFM, WLRS, etc.), look for continued significant chart gains next week...Tons of play increases, too: WYSP, KOME, WPYX, KSRR, WPLR, WMMS, WIMZ, WMJQ, WNEW-FM, KISS, KWFM, WQXM, KLOS, WILS-FM, WZXR, WRNO, WCK, WIOT, WOUR, and KATT...Average play: 2.7 emphasis, 2.9 plays per day... Checklist: 11 not playing, 7 considering, 2 dropping, 30 maintaining, and a tremendous 39 building, including KTZQ, WZXR, KYYS, WYNE, WYSP, WNEW-FM, WMJQ, WCOZ, KISS, WIOT, KGON, and WQXM... "Addicted" leads, up 21-16.

JOHNNY AND THE DISTRACTIONS, A&M

We enter the third consecutive outstanding add week for Johnny. 39 week one, 24 last week, and another 18 this week, for 81 stations in just 3 issues...Up 38-29 Index, 40-30 Metro. Key tracks: "Complicated Now" 62-43; "Shoulder Of The Road" and "My Desire"...Increased rotation on KZOK and WMMR, with KGON, KZEL, WRKK, WCOZ, and KGB-FM showing strongest early rotation...Comments: Jose Diaz, WBLM, "The new album is a real find amongst all these formula bands that are coming out nowadays. This new album stands on its own distinctive sound with cuts like 'Complicated Now' and 'Shoulder Of The Road'...Paul Heine, WGRQ, "The album is a perfect marriage of 60's pop and 80's thud"... Rob Barnett, WAAF, "A big vote of confidence for Johnny. I think this one may take a little while to build the kind of facts and figures you wanna see on a new record, but his songs sound very solid".

ANGEL CITY, "NIGHT ATTACK", EPIC

The record got out late this week, and early reports rolled in from WAQX, KKDJ, KQRS, WMMR, and WYSP. Based on the considering list, look for major add action in the coming week...Early leaders: "Living On The Outside", and the title track...Comments: Terry Meiners, WLRS, "We'll no doubt catch the bus to Angel City very soon. Good raw kangaroo rock and roll"...Steve Feinstein, WYSP, "Let's hope the third time around is the lucky one for Angel City. Some of the stuff on the album, particularly "Back On You" bring back pleasant memories of the late lamented Motors"...And from Doug Podell, KQRS, "The Twin Cities went crazy for the last album, so we're adding the new one out of the box. Sounds like they put it all together on this one. 'Out Of Control' is our pick".


SIGNIFICANT SONGS:

"RIGHT THE FIRST TIME", GAMMA, ELEKTRA

The more I listen, the more I'm convinced--this song will be their mass appeal career-maker...The #1 Most Added piece of music this week, with 39 reports, including WDVE, KQRS, KLOS, KGON, KYYS, WNEW-FM, KTXQ, KOME, WLIR, KGON, KSJO, KRQR, WRIF, and KZEW...Comments: Terry Meiners, WLRS, "The Gamma advance gives good modulations. Taste it"...Rob Roman, KLAQ, "Love the new Gamma. Arin and I talked about it and decided Ronnie has definitely gotten his act together. Look for 'Right The First Time' to move right up the charts"...Ed Levine, WAQX, "Went with the Gamma 12". These guys just really know how to make music that sounds alive on the radio. Hope the Lp lives up to the 12"...Gloria Johnson, KGON, "Kind of cosmic that success looks like it will come to Sammy Hagar and Ronnie Montrose simultaneously. The new Gamma single is the best most commercially accessible thing they've ever done"...Doug Podell, KQRS, "The Gamma single sounds just great. If this isn't a smash for Ronnie Montrose, I'm going into breaking and entering"...Dave Kane, WCMF, "Gamma's new single has all the elements of a hit. Fine production, nice harmonies, and some crisp axe work by Ronnie Montrose".

"WHITE NOISE", JAY FERGUSON, CAPITOL

The advance 12" hit late this week, and still picked up 25 stations for #2 Most Added single behind Gamma. This week we're proud to bring you an exclusive advance cassette of Jay's new album. Please note: it's a limited edition audiophile cassette tape from Mobile Fidelity Labs, the same folks who did the Billy Squier advance we mailed you last year. I'm knocked out by "White Noise" ("Lunatic Stroke"), but am equally impressed with his cover of "I'm Down", "Tonight", and the single "I Come Alive"...12" reaction: Bill Simmons, WMYK, "The week's most amazing song. I found myself singing along after one listen"...Steve Feinstein, WYSP, "White Noise' sounds like a monster. I can see the kids taking to the street with this record"...Tom Nast, WSYR, "Jay is back with his best effort ever. He is a real rock and roll legend and the new album is gonna prove him to be a superstar"...Charlie Logan, WFYV, "Billy Squier meets Red Rider. With its tape loop and reversed echo, this should pull monster phones".



CHAIN REACTION CONTINUED

"KEEP THIS HEART IN ME", BONNIE RAITT, WARNER BROTHERS

The single is off to a fine start with 19 first week adds and a number of "glad she's rocking" comments...Ilyse Gottlieb, WRXL, "I've been a Raitt fan forever and can honestly say this is her very best. The advance cassette proves that Bonnie has come a long way from her folkie coffee house era of yesteryear to a well produced slick rock and roller. Her NRBO covers are great"...J. David Holmes, KDKB, "The single has some of her best vocals in years. This song has smash written all over it"...Ralph Tortora, WBAB, "Can't wait for the new Lp, the single is great"...And from Larry Reisman, KEZY, "If the rest of the album is as hot as the single, then it will be a guaranteed hit. 'Keep This Heart' is a beautiful melodic upbeat tune, and don't forget about Bonnie's guitar playing. She's one of the best around, male or female"...And from Dave Krusenklous, WKQQ, "I'm pleased with the single, and think it will be a hit. All I can say is it's about time".

"CALLING ALL GIRLS", RICK SPRINGFIELD, RCA

I can't think of anyone who's done a better job of blowing out Top 40 (and even daytime TV) while maintaining a credible FM image. He may well be the ultimate crossover artist. Here monster out-of-the-box play is a given.

"ON THE HIGHWAY", PAUL COLLINS' BEAT, COLUMBIA

Our three week Song Index trend goes 80-75-58, along with a #45 Index debut...New on KKDJ, WLAV-FM, WROQ, WRAS, and WWCT, for 34 stations in the last three weeks...Average play; 2.3 emphasis, 2.7 plays per day.

"OFFICE LOVE", SUSAN LYNCH, JOHNSTON/EPIC

It's sexy, it's controversial, and it rocks--all the ingredients for active audience response... 8 new adds, including KGB-FM, WYSP, WLVQ, WBAB, and WLAV-FM...Comments: Bruce Bond, WZZO, "I think one of the hottest tunes I've heard in a long, long time is 'Office Love' by Susan Lynch. Good hooks, a raunchy, erotic guitar break, and everything is explained when her boss calls on the intercom"... Jeff Kaufman, WTPA, "If you're looking for instant gratification and hot phones, try Susan Lynch and 'Office Love'. This number takes off like a Harley low-rider on the salt flats"...Steve Feinstein, WYSP, "Susan Lynch has seduced us. 'Office Love' has people boogie-ing in the hallways"...Doug Podell, KQRS, "Susan Lynch's 'Office Love' could be a phone grabber"...Ralph Tortora, WBAB, "'Office Love'--now there's a song over 50% of this country can relate to".

"TAINTED LOVE", SOFT CELL, WARNER BROTHERS

The automatics are making upward chart momentum hard for Soft Cell, but those credible adds continue-- New on WMET, WQXM, WPYX, WRKK, KWXL, and WCKO...Some interesting developments on the Checklist-- 55 not playing, 16 considering, 1 dropping (and that's because WBCN has been playing it forever), 6 maintaining, and 20 building, including WHCN, WQXM, WMAD, WPYX, WKLS, WNEW, KOME, WLVQ, WMET, and WMMR--So where it's getting played, it's performing--pay attention...WMET's Dave Benson sez, "Soft Cell is an interesting story in Chicago. The #1 listener's response song of 1981 at a local college station, a monster club record, and just recently a top 30 single in sales. It's been an interesting process getting this record on WMET"...Dick Bascom, WQXM, "Very happy to say that we found room for Soft Cell this week. 'Tainted Love' is a smash that will add a real nice texture to any playlist"... Charlie Logan, WFYV, "Soft Cell--ever since I received the single months ago, I've been hooked. Non-stop erotica taking that stroll on the wild side. Sexy, sensual, hot, steamy, and urban in content. Bowie and Reedish in feel and influence, yet so original in nature. With background vocals by a character by the name of Vicious Pink Phenomenon, this record brings foremost to mind the groundbreaking Velvet Underground in the early 70's"... "Tainted Love" moves up on the Song Index, 72-70.

"DAWN PATROL", 4 OUT OF 5 DOCTORS, NEMPEROR/EPIC

A prime moving track. New on WQDR, WHCN, WDEK, KQDS, WKWF, and WPDH...WQDR's Bob Walton comments, "A big pick of mine this week. This record has it all--hooks, lyrics, melody, and good old fashioned rock and roll. 4 Out of 5 Doctors can't be wrong".

"DON'T YOU WANT ME", HUMAN LEAGUE, A&M

#6 Most Added with 11, heavy on the Indicators, as expected. It's top of Kal's Front Red Page this week, and we're anticipating heavy Top 40 action right around the corner, so keep your ears peeled.

"STICK IT WHERE THE SUN DON'T SHINE", NICK LOWE, COLUMBIA

Double debuts for Nick--#47 Index, #46 Metro, and another solid week: #7 Most Added with 10, including KGB-FM, WYSP, WABX, KZEW, KRQR, KISS, and WLAV-FM...Heaviest play on KROQ, WRKK, WHFS, WQBK, WRAS, WMS, and WNEW-FM... "Stick It" enters the Top 100 at #56 this week...Radio action: Jon Russell, KQRQ, "From Nick Lowe we're playing 'Stick It Where The Sun Don't Shine' which is a subconscious message to those who refuse to play the record"...Lin Brehmer, WQBK, "Well, the Nick Lowe album has not struck me with the same urgency of his last couple, but it is much better than most of the stuff I've heard this year"...David Filipov, WBRU, "I'm also impressed by Nick Lowe's latest. A great pop rock album with Nick's special brand of cynicism and fun".

"EDGE OF 17" Live, STEVIE NICKS, MODERN

The #3 Most Added single with 23 reports, including WMS, WNEW-FM, WIYY, WMMR, WRIF, WQXM, WQFM, DC101, WCOZ, and WGRQ. Considering how much play the studio version has received, subbing with the live version is obviously smart programming...As Kid Leo sez, "This new live version will make album rockers once again play the songs. After all, we have burned it out, and this will give added coverage to the Top 40 play".

"TATTOO", NOVO COMBO, POLYDOR

KYYS, WHJY, and WAAF lead the way on Novo Combo re-adds this week. Still not re-charted, but if this re-add pace keeps up, we should see it back on the Index within a couple of weeks. With the Top 40 interest, it is well worth your serious re-consideration.

"IN BETWEEN LIES", KEITH SYKES, BACKSTREET/MCA

Debuts from Paul Collins, Nick Lowe, and Thin Lizzy pushed Keith to the #51 spot on the Back Page. But we did come up with a Metro debut at #50. Now heaviest on WOUR and KTIM.

"HUNGER PAINS", EYE TO EYE, WARNER BROTHERS


WIOT's Buck McWilliams and I are still hooked by "Hunger Pains", but "Nice Girls" seems to be coming on with programmers. Buck says, "I am now to the point where I am humming 'Hunger Pains' hours before a record rep comes to take me to lunch. Eye To Eye is such a high quality album that I'd feel ashamed if I didn't support it"...From Dane Venable, WRAS, "It gets better with each listen. Face it programmers, it's unclassifiable. Just when you're thinking 'new wave', it turns to a nice jazz flavor. If this isn't a relief record from your normal grunge, I don't know what is"... New: WRNW, WDEK, WRAS, WIOT, and WABX.

"HARDER THAN DIAMOND", CHUBBY CHECKER, MCA

That's my pick to click, although we're also hearing about the single and "Burn Up The Night". "T-82" is getting heavy rotation at home...Overall, #5 Most Added with 15 including KGB-FM, WXRT, WMMR, and WNEW-FM.

CHAIN REACTION CONTINUED

"SIMON", GLASS MOON, RADIO RECORDS

Glass Moon narrowly missed the Back Page, but with this week's 10 adds (41 in three weeks), expect a chart showing in our next report. New heavies include: WPYX, WXRT, WIOT, WCOZ, WLAV-FM, WFBQ, WMMS, and WBRU. The Checklist shows 15 maintaining, 56 not playing (20 of which are considering), and 11 Building: WDHA, WKZL, WLAV-FM, WPYX, WIOT, WFBQ, WNEW-FM, WSHE, WDEK, WQDR, KSRR.

"THERE'S A HEART HERE", THE CALL, MERCURY

It may be a bit dramatic for the average MD's palate, but might well stand out on the air for that reason. The lead singer comes across like gangbusters, the production is ridiculously present, and the lack of overbearing lead guitar is a refreshing change. Love those dark and moody Doors overtones--both lyrically and musically.

CHECKLIST RECORDS:

1. CARMINE APPICE, PASHA/EPIC...5 Building (WDHA, WKZL, WPLR, WSHE, KWXL), 16 maintaining, 1 dropping, 61 not playing with 13 of those considering the record.
2. DOC HOLLIDAY, A&M...9 Building including: WKZL, WPYX, WYNF, WDEK, WQDR (top 10 sales), WZXR, KMOD, KOMA, WROQ; 14 maintaining, 5 dropping, 53 not playing, and 8 considering.
3. THE WAITRESSES, POLYDOR...10 Building (with WDHA, WLIR, WPLR, WNEW-FM, WPDH mentioning phones), 5 maintaining, 1 dropping, 65 not on the record and 7 are considering play.

KOME, SAN JOSE, CA M.D.-DANA JANG: "The Gamma single got immediate phones out-of-the-box. It sounds really good. Probably the most mass appeal song that Ronnie Montrose has had out in a long time...I happened to see Aldo Nova open for Y&T this week. The partisan Y&T audience was really appreciative of Aldo, which is really a tribute since Y&T fans are usually rude to the opening band. The phones on 'Fantasy' have already started, primarily males 19-23...Huey Lewis still amassing heavy phones and really good steady sales in the mid-30's...Still continuing steady sales and phones on: Janis Joplin...A few calls for: 'On The Highway' from Paul Collins' Beat...Nothing yet on Prism...Sales from the dance club reaction and college station play on Soft Cell...'Last Ride' from Doc Holliday getting a few calls...Also phones and steady sales on: Tommy Tutone...Top Calls: 'I Love Rock And Roll'--monster phones and ever increasing sales; Van Halen still holding strong with 'Pretty Woman'; teen calls for 'Flying High Again'; and, also teen calls for 'Destroyer' by the Kinks...'Centerfold' still getting teen calls...Sammy Hagar starting to show some phone action on: 'Baby's On Fire'...The Cars album still getting phones: as is: Loverboy, Quarterflash, AC/DC, and Josie Cotton."

KAZY, DENVER, CO M.D.-DOUG CLIFTON: "This Week's Adds: Sammy Hagar--we'll use 'I'll Fall In Love Again'; and, Ozzy Osbourne's 'Again'...Joan Jett's 'Rock And Roll' has been so hot on the phones, we've moved her into hot rotation. We've also added: 'Crimson And Clover'. She is #1 requests; and in retail, the album has jumped from 13-6!...Journey is back in hot rotation, with 'Open Arms' getting lots of female action on the phones...Queen/Bowie single and Police are back into medium, but we've added 'Spirits' from the Police album...Phones: Joan Jett, J.Geils Band, Bob & Doug McKenzie, and Journey are the hots...Retail: Police were in town last week and that helped to move them to #1 retail. The Go Go's opened for the show and also showed movement in retail 7-5. J.Geils slips to #2; Quarterflash steady at #3; Stevie Nicks dropped to #4; Joan Jett #6; followed by: AC/DC, Ozzy Osbourne, Foreigner, and Dan Fogelberg rounding out the Top 10...Considering: Just saw the Aldo Nova video, and I'm impressed with 'Fantasy'-which is definitely the lead album track, but 'Ball And Chain' is the best bet for a single...Other considerations include: Prism, Le Roux, Wabbit, and Eddie Schwartz...Other Releases With Possibilities: Huey Lewis & The News, UFO, Gamma, and Johnny And The Distractions."

WKLS, ATLANTA, GA M.D.-BOB BAILEY: "With so much new (read unfamiliar) music having been added in the last 3 to 4 weeks, we're moving slowly right now in order to let the audience catch up with us. It begins to look as though there is a future for the new rock--3 out of 5 our top sales items fall into this category--Police, Go Go's, and Joan Jett. Also, our most requested song is Joan Jett for the 6th week in a row--and by almost a 6 to 1 margin over Bob & Doug at #2...Bob & Doug is starting to burn a bit (some negative listener calls and much jock wretching)...J.Geils has been a bit of a disappointment saleswise, but phones are still strong and building on: 'Freeze Frame'...Sales and phones are finally coming through on: Loverboy too (wonder why?)...Epic is missing a potential smash in Kim Larsen's 'Rock And Roll City'. It has far greater potential than Susan Lynch, 4 Out Of 5 Doctors, or Angel City. Here's to the future of the punk/bagpipe format."

WMMS, CLEVELAND, OH M.D.-KID LEO: "I agree with the comments I've read in the Sheet--this is the finest UFO since Michael Schenker's departure. The album that comes to mind is 'Lights Out'. I've never understood the reason for their demise, but the time is right once again for them as they have more than delivered the goods...I think Stevie's live 'Edge Of 17' will make album rockers once again play the song. After all, we've burned it out and it'll give added coverage on her Top 40 play...Huey Lewis sounds damn good on the radio. It does stick out...I also want to work in a plug for our latest chapter of POC (Pride Of Cleveland), Moonlight Drive. I see the testimony is spreading to a few other stations. Actually, for the folks who haven't heard it yet, please listen to 'Gloria'. We all know that the Doors phenomenon is not yet dead (again)...1981 was the year for comebacks a la Steve Winwood, Moody Blues, Gary US Bonds, and I think Thin Lizzy might well carry over the fad one more quarter. This is definitely the one that should have followed 'Jailbreak' seven years back...Glass Moon does have a unique sound on the air...I want to thank: Tunc Erim, Alan Wolmark, Judy Libow, Vince Faraci, and Lou Sicurezza for taking me down to the core of the Big Apple...And a big thank you to my brother, Don Jenner."

WDVE, PITTSBURGH, PA P.D.-DAVE LANGE: "I know it looks like I broke out and added a whole bunch of records this week, but that's really due to no report last week. I gave my report to Bill in Orlando--but apparently it got on the wrong airplane...We're really high on the UFO album. These boys have tightened it up quite a bit, and they have a good cult. We're using: 'Writer'...X-15 has been banging around at a number of bars here for a long time; and with the national acceptance of the album coming in fairly strong, we'll be moving with 'Danger Zone'. We also like: 'Jennifer' and 'Is It Him'...Finally got into Eddie Schwartz. With 'Over The Line' coming as the new single, hopefully, Eddie should do fairly well...The Gamma single is right on the money...Thin Lizzy could well be on their way back. We're using: 'Angel Of Death'. Good job on the album cover, guys...Aldo Nova is getting fine phones. Looks like all the pieces are there for him...Joan Jett continues to be one of the first success stories of '82."

WYSP, PHILADELPHIA, PA M.D.-STEVE FEINSTEIN: "First of all, tons of promotions going on here. WAQX, SYRACUSE, NY P.D./M.D.-ED LEVINE: "Two albums that I'm real impressed with are: Angel City and Huey Lewis & The News...Huey's album has a couple of tunes that I feel we'll do real well with: 'Working For A Living' and my favorite, 'The Only One'--which I think is a smash...On the Angel City, 'Long Night' and 'Living On The Outside' are my picks, with the latter sounding almost like it has AM possibilities...The Gamma 12" hasn't sold me yet. A terrific song guaranteed to amaze your friends...My thanks to: Michael Abramson for turning me onto X-15. This album has the same kind of energy and creativity as the first Cars Lp. 'Danger Zone' jumps right off the turntable and smacks you in the face. X-15, the pride of Pittsburgh, is worth your time...A couple of interesting 12" records came in this week. The Gamma tune is powerful stuff. I'm anxious to get my hands on the rest of the Lp...Jay Ferguson sounds promising, too. But then, I'm a sucker for white vinyl...Bizarre record of the week: Terry Scott. The album should be retitled 'Stevie Wonder Rocks Incognito'. KBLE-FM, DES MOINES, IA P.D./M.D.-RON SORENSON: "Hard to find sufficient superlatives to describe the new Dwight Twilley. Certainly the snappiest set of songs yet this young year. WOBK, ALBANY, NY M.D.-LIN BREHMER: "After 19 weeks of airplay, Joan Armatrading remains in our Top 10. The variety and excellence of the songs on 'Walk Under Ladder' continues to amaze us... While the Nick Lowe album has not struck me with the same urgency of his last couple, it is much better than most of the stuff I've heard this year...The Church Lp strikes me as the most impressive debut of the year. 'Me And The Boys' and 'Green Lights' are great rockers...Got some good phones on: Kasim Sulton, 'Evil'; Aldo Nova, 'Fantasy'; and, Johnny And The Distractions, 'Complicated Now'...Some things that are starting to sell include: Janis Joplin, Sammy Hagar, and Soft Cell...Our Top Three Are: Joan Jett, J.Geils Band, and Bob & Doug McKenzie...We'd like to congratulate: Rob, Dave, and Steve at WAAF on their Promotion of the Year award at the Superstars Convention. Way to go, hosers...Please take note that we'd like all our records and money mailed to this address: WPYX, WTRY Road, Schenectady, New York 12309."

WAPI-FM, BIRMINGHAM, AL M.D.-STEVE KELLER: "This week we finally got to three albums that have been hanging around the office for a couple of weeks. First off, Le Roux's 'Addicted' has that nice, clean, power production sound that jumps out of the radio. It feels as good as the first Dixie beer at Mardi Gras...What's in a name? Obviously, plenty of good rock and roll if it's Aldo Nova. Everyone else has been doing well with 'Fantasy', so we're diving head first into it too...I'm real excited about the Johnny And The Distractions record. 'Complicated Now' sounds like a natural that anyone can understand from Sylacauga, Alabama to New York City...It would take a fire hose to cool down Joan Jett. #1 requests and sales. Now, if she'd just come to town, I'd buy the vaseline to help take off the mascara...Better get your calls in early next week 'cause I'm heading to Sick City for Mardi Gras."

WFYV, JACKSONVILLE, FL M.D.-CHARLIE LOGAN: "Records Of The Week: Huey Lewis & The News. The first Lp is still a listening staple at home. I always believed it deserved tons more airplay than it got, but this record should make up for it. What a treat. Fresh, melodic rock and roll that has a happy and clean feel to it. It puts a smile on my face with every listen. While the single is strong, I like 'Change Of Heart' better because it's more rockish and less popish in texture, with some great lead guitar runs. It'll probably fit better into the context of what we're doing. 'Working For A Living' is hot, too, and the lyrics are very relatable in the age of Reaganomics. In brief, a great record from Side 1 through Side 2. Not a bad track in the bunch. Hey, Huey, thanks man. This is by far the best Lp so far in '82...Another record we're not playing yet that I have to comment on is Soft Cell. Ever since I received the single months ago, I've been hooked. Non-stop erotica taking that stroll on the wild side--sexy, sensual, hot, steamy, urban in content, Bowie and Reedish in feel and influence, yet so original in nature. With background vocals by a character by the name of Vicious Pink Phenomenon, this record brings foremost to mind the ground breaking Velvet undertook in the early 70's. It's a new dawn in 1982, and it sounds like there's still hope. Southern programmers tend to be wary of this type of sound and, like Peter Gabriel's last Lp, will probably have to be forced on the record by its success elsewhere. But like Gabriel's 'Games', I think it'll eventually happen...Adds: Aldo Nova. A pretty interesting Lp and a great opening to their video. Never mess with a laser loaded guitar. We'll start with: 'Fantasy', but 'Heart To Heart' is equally as strong--hot guitar with original, creative dynamics...Another interesting new face to deal with is Jay Ferguson--a formulated hit to help a floundering career. That's what we have here. Billy Squier meets Red Rider. With its tape loop and reversed echo, this should pull monster phones. Here you go, kiddies, it's all yours, zzzzzzz...Saleswise: Loverboy is #1; Jimmy Buffett's red hot at #2 with monster sales and phones; Ozzy Osbourne #3; and, Joan Jett up to #4...In heavy rotation at home: Human League. Kudos to: Sky Daniels. Your comments last week about this band and rock and roll radio were right on the money...The Waitresses: Fun, fun, fun...Chubby Checker. Well, aren't pre-conceived notions what modern album rock is all about?...Be on the lookout for Duke Jupiter. This band deserves more than it's received in the past...Personal to Tom Nast: Where were we?"

WBLM, LEWISTON/PORTLAND, ME M.D.-JOSE DIAZ: "Many thanks to Capitol for the half-speed mastered Le Roux cassette. Ditto to Epic with Aldo Nova's cassette. Not only did they allow me to listen to these albums as quick as possible, but they totally brought to life the inside of my car! An excellent idea to be putting out these high quality cassettes...The new Johnny And The Distractions is a real find amongst all these formula bands that are coming out now adays--this new album stands on its own distinctive sound with cuts like 'Complicated Now' and 'Shoulder Of The Road'...I am totally impressed by Aldo Nova's sound. Even though I'm a little confused as to exactly who Aldo Nova is, the songs are streamlined and very well executed. 'Fantasy' should stick with our audience...Sammy Hagar continues to burn up our airwaves. It looks like he's on the way to becoming a major artist. If the rumors are true about a Hagar/Quarterflash tour, it should be one hell of a show...Congratulations to Capitol records on their success with Prism. I noticed 'Don't Let Him Know' went from 10 to 4 on the Song Index and I wouldn't be surprised if it went to #1 before it peaks out...We are experiencing Great White North-mania as our stores in the area can hardly keep copies of Bob & Doug McKenzie's album in stock. 'Take Off' is starting to build momentum as a hot request item...There are certain albums which come out that sound so good to me I end up feeling like commercially they won't be doing much since the music is so good. That's been the case with Huey Lewis And The News though this one seems to be turning around into a commercial success as well as strong rock and roll. It looks like the single 'Do You Believe In Love' is getting significant action...A number of people that I respect have been recommending the new Dwight Twilley to me. I've always been a fan of his music since his first album and I can hardly wait to get a copy of 'Scuba Divers'."

KTYD, SANTA BARBARA, CA M.D.-SUSAN CHRISTOL: "No new music to report as of yet. We postponed our music meeting to make a foray into L.A. last night to see the Police and Oingo Boingo. It was unquestionably the right decision. Sitting there listening, I wondered who could have projected 20 years ago where music would be today. Surely the Police demonstrate that rock and roll's potential is limitless and that we need not fear someday we'll run out of new sounds and textures. Oingo Boingo's euphoric playing to their largest audience ever, and in their hometown at that, was affectively transmitted to the audience as they were swept up in the band's enthusiasm...Monday, February 15th, is Presidents' Day and what better time to inaugurate a rock and roll Western White-House promotion. WYFE, ROCKFORD, IL ASS'T. M.D. -THE DOCTOR: "The Rockford area/Midwest has always been a supporter of UFO and with the new album released, we're going to go with 'The Writer'. I don't feel it's as strong as other UFO Lps but, it's a good effort nonetheless...Other new things that we're going on: Johnny And The Distractions; 'Complicated Now'; Aldo Nova, 'Fantasy' is starting to pick up; and by the way, have you seen the video? It's excellent...Of course, Joan Jett and Donnie Iris are burning up the phones...Mark Thompson says 'Beauty way to go, Bill Shannon from ZUU, Take off and see you next weekend'...As for Brent and myself, g'day!"

WPDH, POUGHKEEPSIE, NY M.D.-STEW SCHANTZ: "Two album adds this week: Steeple Chase is a local band and their debut album is a real rocker that works well for us with the local identity...4 Out of 5 Doctors is a vast improvement over the first album. We like 'Waiting For Roxanne', which incidentally scored a 6.0 on Pete Clark's morning music test...Also tested this week Glass Moon's 'Simon' and it scored an even 6, B52's 'Loveland' a 6.5, and Huey Lewis 'Change Of Heart' a 5.9... Mike Harris's Hooker-of-the-week: The Waitresses 'No Guilt'...Jay Ferguson steps out on a limb with some albino vinyl 'White Noise'. Men 18 to 24 are 33.6. Women 18 to 24 are 23.9. And teens are 59.0. Dr. Demento works everywhere. If you're not carrying the program, give your GM a valium and bite the bullet... Upcoming in concert programs include: the first national broadcast of Sammy Hagar in concert, Quarterflash, and Ian Hunter... Mary Turner's 'Off The Record' specials will be featuring in upcoming weeks: Ozzy Osbourne, Pat Benatar, Lindsey Buckingham, Foreigner and The Pretenders. Keep those affidavit cards coming and we'll see you next week."

JOHN MCGHAN, ROLLING STONE MAGAZINE PRODUCTIONS: "We are in the process of working with 4 programs: three for Album Radio and one for Adult Contemporary. The first show of 'Continuous History of Rock & Roll' has been on now since October 5 and we are getting nearly 400,000 listeners and 200 stations... Our other Album Radio program which debuts March 29 is 'Rock Star Guest DJ', in which the rock star comes in and literally takes over the radio station and acts as the disc jockey for an hour. 'Rock Star Guest DJ' has recorded Peter Wolf of J. Geils, Bob & Doug McKenzie, Billy Squier, Devo, Dale Krantz of the Rossington Collins Band, and Phil Collins. We have close to 50 album stations on that program. We're six weeks away from the debut and we have over 100,000 listeners... The 'Solid Gold Radio Show', which is a joint venture with Paramount Television, coordinated with the Solid Gold TV show, is doing extremely well. We have over 200,000 listeners on that... We're currently in the progress of constructing and clearing a '48-hour Continuous History Weekend', which will play on Labor Day, 1982. The clearances are going on for that right now... Roxy Myza who is manager of affiliate relations for Rolling Stone Magazine Productions and I were both at the Superstars Convention in Orlando, and we have both recovered. We enjoyed seeing everybody."

Question Of The Week

Lately there has been a lot of talk about video games (PAC-man in particular) corrupting the minds of America's youth, and diverting serious dollars from the record economy. Here are some readers' thoughts on this statement.

BOB BAILEY, WKLS: "As far as corrupting the minds, rock and roll is supposed to have done that for 25 years. The psychological considerations I understand in the interaction with machines instead of human beings, but that's a symptom of contemporary society not limited to video games. People are afraid of interpersonal relationships... As far as the dollars go, I'm sure that's the case, but to anyone on the street, entertainment is entertainment whether from movies, records, TV, or whatever. People want cheap entertainment. If they have a choice of spending 25¢ or \$1.00 for entertainment, they choose the 25¢ type of entertainment."

DAVE KRUSENKLAUS, WKQQ: "I question whether it is corrupting the minds of American youth. I do think it has had a direct effect on record sales. We've seen records like the new AC/DC that appeal to teenagers severely bottom out in sales this past month. And 9 out of 10 times, when I go to a mall, there are 3 times as many kids in the arcades as there are in the record stores."

ILYSE GOTTLIEB, WRXL: "First of all, I think the demographics are different. But I do think that a great way to divert some of the money that goes to video games back into album sales would be an ad campaign sponsored by a label or the industry as a whole that would highlight a group of kids standing around a video machine just about ready to drop in their last quarter with a caption, 'If I hadn't played 20 games of PAC-man, I could have had the new Foreigner album'. I wonder how much money is being diverted from drugs into video games? Maybe that's not so bad."

BOB WALTON, WQDR: "First of all, the minds of our youth were corrupted long before video games ever came out. (The folks running radio and records is a case in point). As far as diverting money from record companies, I'd rather play 24 video games than buy one record, excluding Stones, Police, etc. The choice is obvious."

JOSE DIAZ, WBLM: "I've never really seen video games as competition for records. In fact, in many arcades, I find that rock music complements kids playing video games. I imagine this would be the same situation at home, where they would listen to a record and play a game. When you really think about it, eye to hand coordination of the players is vastly improved. You can ask the Armed Forces who are starting to use them in their training for eye to hand coordination. Perhaps it all comes down to when World War III hits, we'll have a whole generation of mechanical geniuses to hold off the enemy."

QUESTION CONTINUED

JON RUSSEL, KRQR: "I think there could be a little bit of a problem, as far as diverting money from buying records, because everybody's into playing PAC-man and Space Invaders. But, frankly, I think Rock and Roll will always remain on top. I don't see the video games as really taking over the music in a person's life."

STEVE FEINSTEIN, WYSP: "I think video games are great for people's hand/eye coordination. It's their brain/reality coordination that concerns me. If the music industry puts out records that are compelling enough, kids will desert the machines and spend their bucks on music."

BUCK MCWILLIAMS, WIOT: "There are a lot of older people who aren't necessarily record buyers who play a lot of PAC-man so I've never associated the two."

SKY DANIELS, WLUP: "I must absolutely concur. Television, by and large, beyond just video games, has had an effect on the audience's participation at concerts. Kids view the act as if they were watching television, much more passive than ever before. Video mania, obviously, is diverting dollars and should be stopped. Perhaps radio's current involvement with video games in promotions and the like are detrimental. Think of it as the record industry did of blank cassettes. It is taking away from our very own product."

ED LEVINE, WAQX: "I think that any radio station that fails to see the importance of video games with the 12-17 demo is missing out on a real chance to score. We are doing a big promotion with video games beginning next week. It could possibly hurt record sales, but I just see it as an apples and oranges situation. Is television taking listeners away from radio? It becomes the same sort of question. I think we should concentrate on competing within the medium because, even if they are taking sales away, what are record companies going to do?"

DICK BASCOM, WQXM: "Pool never really damaged anybody from the 60's, so I don't really see how video games could. Yes, sales will be hurt, especially on the teen level, but they still always scrimp and save to buy that AC/DC album--so, if the music is there, the money will be too."

GLORIA JOHNSON, KGON: "I still believe that if a person has a hit, people will buy the record. A lot of people are spending big bucks on PAC-man and I've got a pocketful of quarters right now."

STEVE HUNTINGTON, LOVE94: "I don't know that video game parlors are eating any more of young people's money that might be spent on records any more than pinball halls did when they were popular. I don't think we're in direct competition, necessarily, with video games."

TOM NAST, WSYR: "Video games are the same thing as what pinball games were in the 50's, and I don't know if people were saying that those were corrupting. They are two separate entertainment markets. Video games and records are similar only in the fact that they are entertainment sources for people of all ages, not just teenagers."

RON REGER, WNOR: "The only comparison I can see, for myself, is how much time and money of mine got plugged into the slots of pinball games. I find it quite humorous when people talk about video games as being corruptive. We have some of that going on local, now, in one of the cities, and it's just a joke. I can't see how anybody can seriously believe that is a possibility...Yes, I do believe that it does divert entertainment dollars. People are going to do what they enjoy the most, and whoever is on top of what people want is gonna be the people who make the money."

LIN BREHMER, WQBK: "I think attributing the lack of record dollars to video games is the newest wave of record company paranoia. Video games, I don't think are corrupting, just very boring."

JIM ROBINSON, KSJO: "I don't think that video games will take away from the record dollar anymore than movies would. Maybe the record industry is looking for excuses for their own marketing problems."

DAVE BENSON, WMET: "I think God may have provided young men with the biggest diversion in life, ever, and it's generally located at the end of their wrist. I don't think there are any cities or states that have successfully outlawed pinball machines and video games, and think it's generally media hype and won't last. In my opinion, PAC-man diverting dollars away from record company profits is another lame excuse for the record companies own bad business tendencies."

JUDY MCNUTT, KGB-FM: "Sounds like a record person came up with this question (credit Jim Sellers, Chrysalis). The record industry has got to learn that when you're up to your ass in alligators, make Gatorade and luggage byproducts. Video games, like rock and roll, are a means of escape. What's wrong with playing video games while listening to rock and roll on the Walkman? (You can't chew gum and listen at the same time, hosehead?) Rebellious attitudes manifest themselves in many ways. Consider the possibility of them rejecting music all together. That would be a nice pickle...Actually, I think call-out rock is the real culprit. 25 Exposure to Touch and you're a PAC-man fiend."

MICHELE ROBINSON SAYRE, KLOL: "I don't know if I agree that they are corrupting the minds of the young, but I do believe they will make some changes in the way young people perceive things and look at the world. It's obvious that when a kid spends \$10 in quarters at his local 7-11, that's one or 2 less albums he'll be able to buy. We can't deny the fact that video games are going to affect the economy in terms of spending for pleasure. To what extent, we can only wait and see."

ROB LIPSHUTZ, WHJY: "As a PAC-man freak, I can attest to its addictive appeal. I don't see it taking more money away from record purchases than anything else does. I don't think it has anything to do with the record industry's problems, but money is tight and video games are a cheaper thrill."

DOUG PODELL, KQRS: "I think it's absolutely true. Here in the Twin Cities, I've observed that some of the younger oriented clubs have converted their downstairs into huge arcades with all the latest games. People are lined up to play PAC-man and nowhere to be seen near the jukebox. I totally agree with that statement."

TIM SMITH, WLVO: "It's all-out stealing, and not just from the record companies. I heard a good story about some kids who were in a video arcade and they had flexible magnets. They were sticking those up inside machines to get the money so they could go play PAC-man...It's a different medium. If someone is gonna spend their money on records, they will, and if they are going to spend it on video games, they will spend it there. It's still cheaper to buy blank cassettes and tape your favorite songs off the radio."

TRISH ROBBINS, KTIM: "I would tend to agree somewhat. I feel that it's too easy for kids to waste time banging around the balls, or whatever, and not reading, listening to music, or something more productive. However, I don't feel those things are bad, but I think parents need to keep an eye on where their kids are...I think that if a person is standing pumping money into a machine, it is certainly diversifying the market, and not necessarily the record market."

JOE FOLGER, KBPI: "I suppose video games are like cigarettes. Once you're hooked, it's hard to stop. I've never smoked cigarettes."

ALAN SNEED, KSRR: "I personally don't see video as the same type of entertainment as music, however, I can relate to that point of view. It seems to me that 12-24 year olds will find the money to spend on the entertainment that they perceive to be the hippest at that point in time. In other words, if a record is happening, and they also enjoy playing PAC-man, they'll find the money to do both."

RON NENNI, WPYX: "As far as corrupting the minds of young people, that should be the least of our worries when there are other things corrupting their minds like drugs and alcohol, and social trauma. As far as video games surpassing the record industry in profit, people spend their money on entertainment where they find the most enjoyment. It reinforces the fact that new music isn't doing what it should be doing. Let's hope it changes."

STEVE KELLER, WAPI-FM: "Yeh to both of them."

CHARLIE LOGAN, WFYV: "Yes, I feel it diverts money away from kids buying records. But video games are like TV. They are a pacifier, and with radio not caring about providing any stimulation to our audience, there's nothing to keep the kids out of the arcade. The games are more exciting than radio. The games bring the kids to walking the edge and taking a chance---something that radio doesn't create for them."

J. DAVID HOLMES, KDKB: "I think people have their own priority. I think if it came down to a game of PAC-man over the new Journey album, the money would be spent on the record. The video games-mania may or may not be a fad, but rock and roll is here to stay."

MARC MILLER, WBCN: "No to both questions. It's not corrupting their minds, no more than TV. It takes nothing away from the records. It's basically unrelated."

MARK MILLER, WWCK: "No, I don't think it's corrupting the minds of American youth. If anything, it may be sharpening it. The U.S. Government uses video games for training, so if it's good for the Government, it's got to be good for the youth. As far as diverting money from album sales, since when did a quarter buy an album?"

RALPH TORTORA, WBAB: "Video games are corrupting the minds of youth today as much as pinball corrupted us. The only reason they are bigger today is because they have all of us plus today's youth. As far as taking away from sales of Lps--no. Back when I was younger, I spent all the money I received for graduation at the local arcade, and it didn't effect my music library."

JIM BUCKLEY, WRCN: "I don't think video games are any worse than the pinball machines or jukeboxes I used to dump my money into. Although the video games are definitely more captivating. It more than likely does effect the record buying habit, but at the same time, if there is an album that they want to get their hands on (AC/DC or Ozzy), they're going to find a way to buy it, whether it means a week's withdrawal from PAC-man or just asking Mom for an extra five."

ROB ROMAN, KLAQ: "I would say this is not a passing fad. Video games are a big reality in this market, as I'm sure they are in every other market. We, as a station, are contemplating using the idea of a championship because our core audience is definitely attracted to this phenomenon...I would have to say no. I think, at this point, it is a valid form of entertainment. But there have always been alternate forms of entertainment, i.e., movies and pinball machines. These people are still going to concerts and still supporting their favorite artists. They are being much more selective in the way they are spending their record dollars, but I don't think there is a necessary correlation between video games and record buying."

THE DOCTOR, WYFE: "I don't think it's corrupting the young kids. It's all in fun. Thinking back to my college days, I spent \$1,000 or more on pinball machines, and the only thing affected was my studies. I still bought as many records then as I do now. So I don't think it relates to the music industry nor fouls the minds of our youth."

CARLA LEONARDO, KZEL: "Corruption? What are you talking about corruption?! Gimme my roll of quarters so I can play 'Centipede'. If we can't blow up little men on the screen, how the hell are we going to take out our agressions? Besides, the replay button is the ultimate video addict's buzz...You can just pump so much into a machine and the rewards are too fleeting. I don't think it has any serious impact on record sales."

BILL SIMMONS, WMYK: "I'll tell you what. I'd rather play a good video game than listen to some of the music that is being released these days."

DAVE LOGAN, WLAV-FM: "Horse shit!! Gimme a break. The money gets spent the way the kids wanna spend it. Show me something in the teenage constitution that says a certain percentage of recreation money must be devoted to records."

DOUG CLIFTON, KAZY: "I think there could be a lot behind that. A lot of kids who hang out in the arcade are spending those bucks in the machines. When I was a kid, I spent my money on records because all we had were pinball machines."

DANE VENABLE, WRAS: "I don't mind the playing it in the game room, but face it, those damn little beeps on the TV advertisements are about to drive everyone up the wall. If they can pay for it, let 'em play it...I think the majority of people who are seriously into PAC-man are usually seriously into AC/DC and REO, which don't seem to have too much trouble selling. Serious music listeners will always keep their eyes out for good music."

TOM STARR, WOUR: "My guess would be that, sure it's having an impact. Just exactly how much is one answer I hope that someone else answering the Question Of The Week can tell me."

TERRY MEINERS, WLRS: "I really haven't had much time to think about that since I use every spare moment (and every spare quarter) in the neighborhood PAC-man machine. I'm hooked. I've gotten up to the 3rd key. Any takers?...Welcome to the 80's. Rock and roll isn't king anymore. The kids are off on all sorts of different avenues. If record companies started pressing albums with fire buttons, maybe the kids would start looking at them."

SUSAN CHRISTOL, KTYD: "Actually, I think it's basically games like that that are socializing the youth of today into tomorrow's hi tech society. I think that there will always be competitors for music dollars, but nothing could ever take its place."

Very shortly we hope to have The Waitresses on video right here on the Jerry Todd Show (Jerry Tah-had)-along with an encore performance of Mel Torme singing the famous hits of the Police...Moving along on the Jerry Todd Show, Rush also had a video--wonderful weekend in the U.S. last Saturday with MTV showing a one-hour Rush video concert with a simulcast on the ABC radio network. The folks at Polygram and Jerry Todd say thanks to all concerned, especially John Sykes at MTV and ABC's Denise Oliver. Hi, Denise, and thanks for all those cards and letters...We here at the Jerry Todd Show (Jerry Tah-had) are also very proud of our SCTV co-stars Bob and Doug McKenzie who appeared this week on the 'David Letterman Show' and ABC's 'Entertainment Tonight' where those two zany hosers were interviewed by Father Guido Sarducci. Also thanks to all those Northeast radio stations who hosted Bob and Doug in their studios...Finally, you know Jerry Todd started out in regular radio just like some of you, and I would certainly recommend listening to Polygram's The Call. MIKE BONE, ARISTA (212-489-7900): "Was Bobby & The Midnites a hot show or what? The Capitol Theater show knocked me out. Good to see the Professor and the Depressor and Monaghan on deck...Starfighters continue to rack up more adds. Texas is in the crosshair bite for destruction this week, then on to LA...The Kinks continue forever as a hot request item. By the way, the New Year's Eve (1980) concert will be broadcast February 19th over the Source. Thanks Sam and Harriet...GNU STUPH (It's about time). The GP-EP (Graham Parker Ep) will ship February 17, so you will have it in your grubby paws on Monday, February 20th. 'Temporary Beauty' will be an instant hit. Nuff said (Blue grass fans will love the B side, think about it)...What was the buzz in Orlando? Can you say Dreggs? All you Dreggs fans who have been waiting for a song you can play, your prayers have been answered. The Ep of 'Crank It Up' featuring VOCALS by Alex Ligertwood (Santana 'Winning') will be on your desk Monday, March 1st. The Outlaws, Dreggs, Jeff Lorber, Krokus, Graham Parker, and Gino Vannelli albums all come in March, but I'm getting ahead of myself. More on this later...Several people have mentioned A Flock Of Seagulls in their comments. Ask your local Arista representative for a breath of fresh air, if you're interested in this group. There has not been a national mailing of the Ep to album radio for obvious reasons. Ask and you shall receive...Personal Stuff: Consider the Kansas City radio market: KUDL, KWKI, and KY102. Someone should be able to come up with a sick line out of those call letters...Bittens, I've been having a mysterious pain in my back. Hayden told me you have a doll in your office with pins stuck in it. Is there any connection?...Nice to see Thin Lizzy have a hit. It's been a long time since the boys were back in town."

MARKO BABINEAU, A&M (213-469-2411): "Hello, everybody! It's good to be back in Record Action. I've got so many good things to tell everybody. For one, thank you for the belief in Johnny And The Distractions. This is a record that we'll take to the max and make everyone's ears very happy. 'Complicated Now' is going through the roof with 'My Desire' and 'Shoulder Of The Road' close behind. The rotation moves within three weeks of airplay is devastating. That's right, ladies and gents, we have a smash...Moving right along, I hope you all saw the jump on Doc Holliday on the Song Index with that burning guitar cut 'Last Ride' leaping from 84 to 48 WOW!! We'll be releasing a 12" featuring 'Lonesome Guitar' (a classic rock and roll song that will go down in '82 history), the flip side 'Don't Stop Lovin' Me', which is a cut we can all relate to, and of course, the scorcher 'Last Ride'. If you get a chance to see this band, bring your rock and roll shoes and no boogie-woogie flues allowed...Next on the agenda, that little kid from Canada who refuses to get off the road who we all know and love as Bryan Adams. In case you haven't added this record yet, have no fear 'cause even the K-Mart chain is coming in. Bryan just got off the road with the Kinks and is running wild with Foreigner. As I said earlier, he refuses to go home. 'Lonely Nights' is now a top 3 cut in America, so I hope everyone will check out 'Don't Look Now' and 'Fits Ya Good'. The man of the hour. God bless you Bryan, keep up the good work...Last but definitely not least, A&M Records has released what could be one of the strongest records of 1982, a band from England on Virgin Record. The Human League. Look out Soft Cell. This band's got the goods. If you like hypnotic songs that you hum in your sleep, you've got to sit down and check out 'Don't You Want Me' (which is a phrase I never use), followed by 'Love Action' and 'Seconds'. Don't be fooled by this record. It'll make you sleepwalk. People laughed at the Go Go's at first. Well, this is a similar situation--the more you hear it, the more you love it...P.S. If you were fortunate enough to see the Police/Go Go's tour, then I know how you feel. I've seen them the last three nights in LA, and I'm just appalled. Without a doubt, the best tour of the year. The second leg of the Police tour will be minus the Go Go's, but the Fleshtones will be stepping in (another band not to miss)."

JIM SELLER, CHRYSALIS (212-935-8750): "Only my third column and already I've found something that's really got me fired up. Fortunately, it has nothing to do with records vs. radio or vice versa. It's television's distorted image of our business. For weeks now, we've heard more and more about how '60 Minutes' is going to do a feature on the promotion end of the business. First of all, the average listener probably could care less how a record gets played on the radio. What she/he does care about is the quality of what is being played, the product's personal acceptance level, and its availability in the marketplace once the decision is made to purchase. Great stuff for a 20-minute segment, eh?...Secondly, 'Good Morning America' recently did a feature on the PAC-man phenomenon. The 'authority' was a gentleman whose claim to fame was that he's been thrown out of several Vegas casinos (Ken what's his face?) for 'card counting' at blackjack tables. So in a moment of genius, this 'expert' writes a book on how to beat the PAC-man machine. His final statement dealt with the extraordinary amount of money being spent on these games, and how millions of dollars are being lost in record and cassette purchases because of it. Nonsense!! Arcade games have always been around and garnered their share of the market. It's like making Maytag responsible for the fact General Motors is selling less cars...Lastly, in an interview after his release, General Dozier was told by an interviewer he should receive a medal for being forced to listen to loud rock music during his capture. Personally, I'd prefer that to listening to a bunch of fanatic radicals threatening to blow my head off if ransom demands weren't met. Without being too much of a flagwaver, I'm proud to be a part of the record business, and I daresay my colleagues would be in some other line of work if they didn't feel that same pride...And now, the local headlines: Huey Lewis And The News continue to rack up adds, and the additional reaction from retail is terrific. We have definitely spread the News...Right on its tail is 'Mechanix' from UFO. Radio is fast discovering this is indeed their best effort in years. 'The Writer', 'You Belong To The Night', and 'Doing It All For You' lead. Thank you radio for making the last couple of weeks the greatest...Until we meet again."

RECORD ACTION CONTINUED

BILL MCGATHY, RCA (212-930-4095): "It was great seeing everyone at the Abrams Convention in Florida last week. In fact, it was great to be in Florida period. We're talkin' Chamber of Commerce weather while we were there...Had a chance to play some of the new stuff coming from the Nipper, and got great reaction to: the new Rick Springfield, Franke and the Knockouts, Lamont Cranston and the new Triumph single 'Say Goodbye'. Thanks to Larry Mundello and Mike Levine from Triumph for helping me run the 'discreet suite'...This is the week we go hard after Lamont Cranston's 'Shakedown' album. You will be receiving a new copy of the album in the mail and one from your RCA rep. This album will still have a Waterhouse label, but do not be fooled. The RCA labels are being put on the album as you read this. This great band shall not be denied. Check out 'Upper Mississippi Shakedown' and 'Two Trains Running'. 'Till next week. Cheers!"

JOHN SCHOENBERGER, RADIO RECORDS (305-565-7700): "Glass Moon has had 2 great weeks of adds, and I'm expecting many more. We are seeing sales action already in the Carolinas, New York, and Cleveland. 'On A Carousel' is the first single. Other great reaction cuts include 'Simon', 'She's On', and 'Political Action'. Please play Glass Moon. I can guarantee you'll get instant phone reaction. Thanks go out to all the early supporters. You certainly have good taste."

KATE INGRAM, DB RECORDS (415-928-6952): "I am pleased to announce that DB Recs (be sure to spell that with c's, not 'x'), is taking a new, more aggressive promotional stance this year. All it took was one look at our financial book and a glance at the Billboard chart to convince us. In the future, we will not just sit back and make great records while others that are mediocre get hyped into the limelight. Guess I was different than most Music Directors nowadays in preferring to listen myself rather than being told by promotion people (what is hip). Well, this Monday, (after Mercury goes direct--thanks Darrell), our new Pylon single is being shipped along with the debut Lp by Love Tractor. Pylon's new single is a nice progression for them, and its more commercial sound coincides nicely with FM radio's move to the right. And you'll have to decide when you hear it which is the A side--since both the band and the record company can't decide. So, if you're on our mailing list, look forward to receiving this new release imminently. If you're not on our mailing list, you never played any of our records before; but it's not too late. Just give me a call. So, as the saying goes, this is not a threat, it's a promise--the new improved, more aggressive DB Recs promo team will be on your case!"

JOEL WEBBER, INDEPENDENT (212-255-7408): "Happy Valentine's Day to all you folks who love rock and roll and have helped make Joan Jett and the Blackhearts the first major new act of the year. If the rest of '82 is as active as the past month has been, we're in for a hell of a year...There's no new act on the street right now that is as inventive and accessible as OMD. You owe it to yourself to listen to 'She Is Leaving' and 'Souvenir'. OMD defies categorization. They play modern music that anyone can relate to. 'Souvenir' has been a major hit in just about every other country in the world. It's about time we caught up...If anyone out there has a video tape of the 'Bullwinkle Show' that aired February 6th, please let me know. During a segment called 'Mr. Know-It-All', Bullwinkle demonstrated how to get a record played on the radio. Boris Badenov played the crooked DJ. I must get a video copy of that show so I can show my grandchildren what I did for a living. By the way, I understand that the morningman and the newscaster at WHCN do a wicked Boris and Natasha imitation. This I've got to hear!..Coming soon: Bruzer (listen to the sample cassette), The Act (finally), and the debut of the first independent heavy metal record company. Details soon."

STARVIN' MARVIN GLEICHER, ELEKTRA/ASYLUM (312-635-6611): "The food was like puppy chow, and in the hotel you left your first born as a deposit for your room, but it was great to see and meet everyone in Florida. The music was smoking with Gamma, Greg Kihn, Fay Ray, Don Henley, Lou Ann Barton, and Terry Scott...Gamma 3 releases on February 19th with 'Right The First Time' out now as a 12". It is a massive-active-passive smash...Oh! By the way, Mr. Bill, did you ever recover the ship's log from our sinking vessel. It had the Cars Lp as #1. The Cars tour with Nick the Knife just ripped up Philly, and is on its way through Cleveland and the Midwest...Lindsey Buckingham was great on Saturday Night Live performing 'Bwana' and 'Trouble'...Del Shannon's tour is hot. Don't miss him!.. Bill Champlin continues to grow on album radio with 'Runaway', 'Stop Knockin'', 'Up Town', and 'Sara'. These are 4 hot tracks...Please check out the following tracks from Lou Ann Barton: 'I'm Old Enough' and 'Brand New Lover'...Also, Terry Scott's 'Over And Over' and 'D.I.A.D.'...A quote from Bruce Lundvall, president Elektra/Musician, 'It's been a personal dream of mine to start a record label devoted to the creative statements of musicians whose work I feel represents, beyond entertainment, some of the most lasting contributions to the musical language of our time'. Elektra/Musicians first release contains 9 Lps: Charlie Parker 'One Night In Washington', Lee Rittenour 'Rio', Material 'Memory Serves', John McLaughlin 'My Goals Beyond' (re-release), Griffith Park Collection with Stanley Clarke, Corea, Joe Henderson, Hubbard and Lenny White, Eric Gale 'Blue Horizon', Freddie Hubbard 'Ride Like The Wind', and Red Rodney/Ira Sullivan 'The Spirit Within', and a sampler musicians guide at \$5.98 with all the Lps plus 'Echoes Of An Era' with Chaka Kahn. I hope that all of you in radioland (and tip sheet land) are as inspired by these works as I am."

MICHAEL ABRAMSON, PROMOTIONS (212-243-2972): "Looking for something new, something fresh to help add some depth to sagging playlists? Well, look no further. X-15 is just what you need to fill the bill! Spunky rock and roll with some fine harmonies to add spice. Check out 'Danger Zone', 'Gimme Your Love', 'Jennifer', and 'You're So Cruel'. X-15 not only sounds great on the air, but does motivate listeners to buy the album. DON'T BE SKEPTICAL ABOUT A NEW GROUP ON A NEW LABEL. Remember, A&M and Chrysalis weren't full grown when they began...Belated congrats to Denton and Curt at WEBN for their clean sweep, and to Lee Arnold who deserves the best (I taught him well)...The 'Rocker Doctor's' home fave--4 Out Of 5 Doctors 'Waiting For Roxanne' and 'Dawn Patrol'; Bill Champlin 'Take It Uptown' and 'Stop Knockin' On My Door' (great vocal chops and long overdue); Maxus 'The Higher You Rise' and 'They Danced' (an uptempo Steely Dan feel); Nick Lowe 'Stick It Where The Sun Don't Shine' (and if you're not on it, you should); Lou Ann Barton 'I'm Old Enough' and 'Brand New Love' (hot new lady produced by Glen Frey and Jerry Wexler)...Till next week."

BONNIE SIMMONS, (213-666-1308): "Well, hi there sailors. Back again and working on a record I really like--Lou Ann Barton on E/A. It's produced by Glen Frey and Jerry Wexler, and her background includes performing with the Thunderbirds from Texas and Room Full Of Blues from Rhode Island. My favorites on the album are the Frankie Miller song 'I'm Old Enough', 'Brand New Lover' and the ballad 'It's Rainin'', which is a version of an Allen Toussaint song that was a hit record by Irma Thomas. Although I also like 'Finger Poppin' Time', and I think lots of you will like her version of the Chantells' hit 'Maybe'...Well, after Soft Cell's 'Tainted Love' being my favorite song for many weeks, it's been dethroned by 'Momma Said' by Junior. If you're an R&B fan, you will love this one when you hear it...My turntable is lonely. If anyone would like to send some records this way, I'd love to listen to some of the things coming out. My address is 2030 1/2 Rodney Drive, Los Angeles, CA 90027...Talk to ya soon...And Momma said there'd be years like this."

DON WASLEY, MCA (213-508-4020): "First the currents. Six months later the Donnie Iris story continues. Airplay in the teens on the Index for the second time. We may still be supporting this record in '84, who knows?...The Wabbit attack continues. As airplay increases, ATI comes aboard. Watch this agency do a number on Wabbit. Their first date in the States, by the way, will be March 3rd from the Cleveland Agora. Heard live on WMMS!...For those missing the boat on Buffetts' 'It's Midnight And I'm Not Famous Yet!'--and Keith Sykes' 'In Between Lies', do yourself a favor and give 'em a couple minutes each. The three of us would appreciate it...Lastly, down the road apiece lies two monsters. David Bowie singing the title track from the 'Cat People' and the new Point Blank Lp. Bowie sounds better than ever, and is reminiscent of Morrison at his best...Point Blank's 'Let Her Go' sounds like a #1 record. And the 'Great White Line' sounds like 'Freebird' and 'Stairway To Heaven' can finally move over."

MICHAEL PLEN, IRS (212-980-6874): "The Go Go's move 9* to 3* in Billboard. The only thing keeping it from #1 is Journey and J. Geils, but we're going for it. Watch the Grammy's on February 24th to see if they get picked as Best New Artist...Please go back and listen to the Fleshtones. A very much overlooked record, I'm sure. Album radio is prime for songs like 'Shadowline', 'Roman Gods', 'Ride Your Pony' and 'I've Gotta Change My Life'. Please go back and give it a new listen. We've already seen sales, not only in places where it's getting played, but where it's not, due to their strong tour...Coming soon: Jøels Holland and his Millionaires. He is the former keyboard player in the band Squeeze. Please don't confuse him with the Jules from the Polar Bears... Also, the 'ERASERHEAD' Soundtrack."

SEAN COAKLEY, ATCO (212-484-6400): "The cut to play from Eddie Schwartz is 'Over The Line' with positive research tipping the majors in LA, Denver, St. Louis, Detroit, and Washington. Please hear this cut-- it's the next single, and will help answer the question 'Who the hell is Eddie Schwartz?'...Give us a call if you don't have Stevie Nicks' live 'Edge Of 17'. It is without a doubt the highest quality radio only 12" live track I've ever heard. Yup!"

JIM SOTET & DEREK SHULMAN, POLYGRAM (212-399-7814): "In your hands now is a debut album by The Call. I am extremely excited about the band and the music. I hope you'll take the time to give the band and their music your attention. Really listen to 'War Weary World', 'There's A Heart Here', 'Upper Birth' and 'Flesh And Steel', to start. I hope you'll find this album as exciting as I do. Thank you for the early preview on Moon Martin, Mr. Tusken. I'll trade you a copy of The Call for a copy of Moon!...A rotation: REM single, Future Looks Bright cassette, Romeo Void, Junior, the tapes of the new Jam Ep, and The Blasters...This programming note: Martin Briley is still available for airplay as witness KGB-FM, KENO-FM, and KBLE. Thank you Mr. Sorenson. Great music--give it a re-listen. Thank you!...Keep your ears open for new music from Scorpion, John Cougar, Rainbow, and J. J. Cale...P.S. Don't forget Def Leppard." Derek: "Derek who? Do you remember that slightly stocky character who fronted Gentle Giant? No? Never heard of him? Well, it just goes to show how well we did on radio. Anyway, I thought I'd just introduce myself officially in FMQB. As you can see, I've joined Jerry Jaffe and Jim Sotet et al, in the rock department here. This is a brand new era for me, personally, which is very exciting. I'm looking forward to this opportunity which will be a whole lot of fun and quite a challenge. I'm working with some great people and real good music. I'll be in touch."

MIKE COOPER ON IMPORTS (404-355-8686/627-2834): "Hats off to those responsible for the domestic release of new albums from the Human League, Orchestral Manoeuvres In The Dark, Altered Images, and The Church-- all groups previously mentioned in this space. In the case of the first three, these are perfect examples of some of the new music from England that is in no way too 'weird' to receive airplay here. And The Church are simply a good Australian band...The Human League already have a fine new single out that has topped the British charts, called 'Don't You Want Me?', and the same is true of Altered Images' 'I Could Be Happy'. Along similar lines, it's good to see increasing airplay for Soft Cell's 'Tainted Love', which is back on the British charts where it's been for almost six months. They aren't hose-heads in Canada, either, as 'Tainted Love' is now the #3 single in Canada, where, last time I checked, musical tastes aren't that different from the good ol' U.S.A...I've had the chance to hear a rough mix of the probable single from Gary Numan's next album. 'Music For Chameleons' has Numan sounding a bit more like Pink Floyd, and a bit less like a practitioner of sterile music. Now, if he could only fly his plane. He just had his second crash-landing in six months...A brief look at some new albums on the U.K. music scene: 'La Folie' is the best Lp from The Stranglers in some time, with a, dare I say, commercial single on it ('Lolden Brown')...Sad Cafe's new Lp 'Ole' is pleasant...Scorpion drummer Herman Rarebill has a solo Lp out that's fairly good...On the single front: XTC has another pleasant pop single out with 'Senses Working Overtime', one of their best...Punk band, the Anti-Nowhere League has a distinctive racous version of Ralph McTell's 'Streets Of London'. In the words of one BBC disc jockey, 'He's not even singing, he's just shouting! Why do they bother?' The disc, however, is one of the best noisy singles in some time...Chris & Cozy from Throbbing Gristle have an Lp called 'Heartbeat' that sounds very Tangerine Dream influenced...Jona Lewie has another 'quaint' single cut called 'I Think I'll Get My Hair Cut'. About as exciting as one, though cute...One more single of note, from the band Theatre of Hate, called 'Do You Believe In The West World'...Glad to see British cult band The Enid on the verge of having a new record contract that will include new studio material and a live album recorded a few years ago...Sorry to learn of the death of Alex Harvey, who was a punk when punk wasn't cool. Early albums by the Sensational Alex Harvey Band which were released on Mercury here were a nice combination of R&B, heavy rock, and strangeness. Pretty good for someone over 40, eh?...The latest idle rumors making the rounds in England: Whitesnake is breaking up because David Coverdale wants to form a new band. Topper Headon, Clash drummer, is being sacked. Both are being denied by appropriate spokesmen...Memorable quote of the week from a British music paper's review of the Go Go's: 'I don't think the Go Go's would be A&M recording artists if the music they play was played by boys'."

WENDY PRICE, STIFF (212-431-1600): "Let's begin with the simple library ad--Juke Box Dury. Now there's no need to go figuring out on which Dury Lp you can find 'Sex And Drugs', 'Hit Me', 'Wake Up', 'Reasons', et al...Next, in the dance-oriented vein, don't forget the new releases from Fingerprintz, Yello, and the Bush Tetras. All three acts are bulleting up the Billboard dance chart, with both Fingerprintz and the Bush Tetras currently touring...Thanks to MTV, Tenpole Tudor is gaining in sales in the Midwest. What did you say about video?...We'll know that you're playing AC/DC and Joan Jett. So what? Girlschool is coming!"

KEN BENSON, EMI (800-421-4155): "EMI Records is proud to announce that the Dwight Twilley album 'Scuba Divers' is on your desk NOW!! Do yourself a large favor and listen to it. The best place to start is cut one, side one where Twilley makes it clear 'I'm Back Again'; the single 'Somebody To Love'; for you metalheads, get into the helter-skelter rhythm of 'Crying Over Me'; and to hear Twilley give the album a Lennon-esque touch, listen to 'Fallin' In Love Again'. On behalf of everyone here at EMI, I hope you enjoy Twilley at much as we do."

JUDY LIBOW, ATLANTIC (212-484-6063): "Spring training has officially begun, and I'm back in the saddle again! Just returned from a trip abroad (well, as far as the West Coast) and by the time I came home one P.D. had resigned, a station lost their license, and the snow melted in NYC! You sure you want me to come to your town????!! But seriously, good seeing all you folks...To the records. 'Nuff said!...Just shipped: new single and 12" from the Henry Paul Band 'Brown Eyed Girl' (and it's an eye-opener on the radio). This Lp is picking up on the retail side too...Also out: a new promotional 12" from Kix (remember?) of the song 'Atomic Bomb'. This album is still selling weekly and they're a great live band. Please give a listen...New singles from older Lps: Stevie Nicks 'Edge Of 17'; Foreigner 'Jukebox Hero'...Other cuts happenin': Genesis 'Man On The Corner'; 'AC/DC 'Evil Walks/C.O.D.'...On tour: AC/DC, Foreigner, and MINK DEVILLE (Jackson B. ready for round two?)...Well that just about covers it for now--talk to ya later...P.S. Leo: Long story short, let's up the bet on New Orleans. In a more lucid moment, I realized I could really make some money off you!"

EDDIE HUMBER, MAKING TRACKS (707-585-2105): "An incredible week for rock and roll in San Francisco. The Tubes started the week with a truly amazing show. Nils ended the week proving himself deserving of all the praise he's garnered of late. One hell of a show!...Nice to see local talent happen. Congratulations to Chrysalis on the Huey Lewis showing...Watch for Lamont Cranston released February 16 on RCA. With the already incredible base built and now with major distribution, this one should explode... Dwight ('I'm Back Again') Twilley should be in your hands by now, which should mean it's on your playlist. Just drop the needle on side one, cut one and Dwight tells you the whole story...**Cookin' at the Coop:** Lamont, Dwight, The Edge, Johnny and the Distractions, and little Timmy Goodman."

BRUCE MOSER, COULD BE WILD (716-885-5200): "Could be birthday wishes for **Bill** and **Collie**, and **Michele Robinson Sayre**...Aldo Nova will be this year's **Loverboy**. This album has taken off faster than any other debut act in recent memory. Not only airplay, but strong sales out of the box. This album will be around for a long time as it is at least five tracks deep. Aldo has kicked off his first American tour with a Coffee Break Concert at WMMS today. If you like the record, you must see this band live. They are awesome. Aldo Nova will be opening for the Hall & Oates tour for the next month...Speaking of WMMS, next Wednesday will be a historic day in Cleveland. Michael Stanley Band will be doing a Coffee Break show, and the mayor will give the station the key to the city for being named 'Radio Station Of The Year' for the 3rd consecutive year by Rolling Stone Magazine. Well, time has proven me right. I would like to congratulate Bryan on having two top 5 songs on the **Song Index**... I'd like to thank WSYR for co-sponsoring the Moonlight Drive date. This band is hot and their version of 'Gloria' will bring instant phones from any Doors fan. The record is top 25 sales in Cleveland with good sales starting throughout New York State...Last but not least, Eric Anderson will be doing a showcase on February 18th in NYC at The Mudd Club. Eric will be presenting his new band and material. If interested in attending, give me a call."

REO SPEEDWAGON have been rehearsing new songs for the past month. They told the Rock Report they are heading into the studios this week for the follow-up to their multi-platinum 'Hi Infidelity'. The new album will have the same production team as the last one and is expected to be on the street by June.

After finishing their world tour in Japan this January, **STYX** took a well deserved vacation. But they've informed the Rock Report that they'll meet sometime this week to discuss their plans for 1982. There is talk of the new Lp, a possible movie, and a tour. We might even see a solo project from guitarist James Young later in the year.

THE GRATEFUL DEAD are still at work on their next Lp. They'll do a short tour in May to iron out the tracks for the new one. Meanwhile, the Rock Report checked out Bobby and the Midnites on their just completed U.S. tour. They'll get back on the road with some new material by May. In the meantime, the Midnites drummer, Billy Cobham, will be keeping busy working on a 'how to' video on drumming with his production company. He will also record 2 lps with his band and tour the States-probably by the summer. The Alphonso Johnson project will record an Lp in April and the bassist will include drummer Chester Thompson in this band.

STEELY DAN producer Gary Katz told the Rock Report that there will be another 2 months of recording and mixing before we see Donald Fagan's solo album. As usual with Steely Dan, Fagan will be calling on a collection of studio musicians to help out on the Lp. Katz says that this is 'the best batch of songs we've worked with in a while'. Meanwhile the other half of Steely Dan, Walter Becker, is recuperating from a bad accident and hopes to get some studio time in shortly.

British heavy metalists, **DEF LEPPARD**, are currently in pre-production for their follow-up to 'High 'N Dry', with Mutt Lange again producing. They are presently writing and rehearsing songs, and will head into the studio at the end of February-with the Lp expected by the summer. They'll tour the States to support the new release.

FLEETWOOD MAC has just finished recording their new Lp in L.A. The as yet untitled album is scheduled for release April 28th. Although nothing definite has been confirmed, the Mac will probably get on the road to support the new one by the summer.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION:

When reading the individual station report, please remember that there are three ways in which album rotations are tracked.

- PLAYS PER DAY** - This refers to the actual number of exposures an album gets between 6 AM and Midnight on an average day of the reporting week.
- PLAYS PER WEEK** - Most of our weekly play reporters go back over their music logs for the previous week, and those totals are relayed to us and printed up.
- AIRPLAY EMPHASIS** - Be careful not to confuse this with PLAYS PER DAY/WEEK. EMPHASIS is a system of relative scaling, based on 5. If the highest rotation album gets 8 spins per day, it receives 5 points. If another album gets 4 spins, it merits 3 points, etc. This allows a much more detailed rundown than the conventional light/medium/heavy system.

The Airplay Index is our ranking system for the amount of play on albums as a whole. We determine rankings by converting all daily and weekly play reports to a 1-10 emphasis system and totalling the points on a given Lp. We use a simple percentage breakdown to indicate the amount of play on each track.
