### **Hard Choices**

#### TAXXI, "STATES OF EMERGENCY", FANTASY

After 100-FM's JUDY MENCUTE busted me last week for "missing" Taxxi, we went back for a second listen and found an intensely involving record. Along with the standard songwriting and performance requirements, Taxxi scores big with some of the most interesting arrangements we've heard in months--unusual rhythms, texture, and instrumentation. You might not get the message on first bounce, but roll side 1 a few times and it will pull you in...We recommend "Cocktail Queen", "I'm Leaving", "Girl (NYC)", and for the single, "The Heart Is A Lonely Hunter"--a little masterpiece.

#### TED NUGENT, "NUGENT", ATLANTIC

All Ted really needed to put him back on the track was a killer tune, and "Bound And Gagged" is the goods, thank you. Patriotism, harmonies, Axe overload, even a semi-rap at the end--whoa! Fans will love Derek St. Holmes being back in the band, and if Carmine Appice ain't the man for the job, who is? Fire it up! Also hot "No, No, No."

#### BALANCE, "SLOW MOTION" b/w "UNDERCOVER MAN", PORTRAIT

Our pick on last year's debut stands out as one of the premier sleeper Choices, as "Breaking Away" kept the LP on the Index for months. Now we're certain the just-released 12" will have the same impact. Peppy, Doug and Bob are consummate musicians and savvy radio observers, and they've wisely injected the melodic qualities of that first album with a mega-dose of raw guitar and shimmering keyboard electronics. An unqualified endorsement from us.

### **Easy Choices**

#### APRIL WINE, "POWER PLAY", CAPITOL

You've got to love the guys because they go for the throat. Four guitars lined up, and drums to push 'em along. We're talking lean, high wattage rock and roll with hooks to crush the 10-24's without putting off the upper demos. "Enough Is Enough" is sitting pretty, 16-B on the Song Index, with "If You See Kay" ready to take on all comers. For hot phones of the week honors, also consider "Anything You Want", "Doin' It Right" and "Runners In The Night".

#### RED SPEEDWAGON, "GOOD TROUBLE", EPIC

In our never-ending challenge of thinking up new things to say about the onslaught of automatic... here's this week's word for the wise. This band could be a bit overexposed, especially if you've been banging the single to death. So I humbly suggest you put a hold on all other RED product for a week or two, and concentrate solely on this nifty new record. We like "Stillness Of The Night" and "Good Trouble" best, but there's plenty more to choose from.

### **Pinch Hit**

#### X, "UNDER THE BLACK SUN", ELETRA

By the standard format criteria, X is off the scale. What can you compare it to?? It's almost like metal with a new wave vocal twist. If I analyze it critically, the musical components really don't hold up, but when you relax and experience it, there is a definite energy and excitement that comes off the vinyl and WILL work on the radio. X seems to have the ability to conjure up images of psychedelic classics while sounding all the while street contemporary, and we like that unusual combination.....So for "Under The Big Black Sun" and "The Hungry Wolf".

### **Chain Reaction**

#### PETE TOWNSHEND, "ALL THE BEST COWBOYS HAVE CHINESE EYES", ATCO

Intelligence, taste, and honesty were the bywords on Pete's new solo this week. It's also noteworthy that such a personal album should yield so many strong radio tracks in contrast to the prevalent 1-track approach...Tracks: "Face Dances Part 2", "Sitt Skirts", "Stardom In Acton" and "Exquisitely Bored"... Comments: Kid Leo, WPM: "The Townshend LP is a very, very personal album. I was somewhat taken back by the amount of ball-songs, however, it is a very, very strong statement. And as Mr. Hard says, he is one of the few who can get away with being himself"...Marc Miller, WBCN: "With the possible exception of John Lennon, Pete is the only rock artist I know who can write such incredibly personal songs and not sound self-indulgent. This is a listening record and all the cuts are recommended"...Warren Williams, WATT: "I'm impressed that Pete Townshend can take experience in life and translate it so eloquently to vinyl"...Lin Brooker, WQBK: "Staff members have covered the album with adjectives like 'personal', 'honest', 'sincere'. Lately Pete's solo material seems to be eclipsing the Who releases. It's great that after all these years Pete doesn't see any need to put out FM oatmeal"...Jeff Kauffman, WTPA: "Some people publish autobiographies. Pete Townshend sings his on 'All The Best Cowboys'. It's kind of a mid-life crisis on vinyl, with a great collection of songs that fall somewhere between those on 'Who Came First' and those on 'Empty Glass'"...Steve Feinstein, WYSP: "The album is magnificent. It's a joy to hear intelligent rock that deals successfully with adult themes. The music overflows with sublime understated touches"...#1 Most Added with 188 stations.

### TIP

#### MISSING PERSONS, "WORDS", CAPITOL

I heard "Words" on KROQ while in L.A. for the bowling party, and it absolutely jumped out of the radio. I had suspicions it was an L.A. phenomenon and really sort of put it on hold. The WYSP add brought it back, and when Ray Tusken called with the L.A. sales figures and Top 40 action, it was Front Page time. "Words" is real!

#### GENESIS, THREE SIDES LIVE, ATLANTIC

Great songs, stellar performances, state-of-the-art recording, and of course, 107 adds blew in. Plus the inclusion of a hot new studio item like "You Might Recall" guarantees strong current as well as live option rotation--a double whack pack...Radio Action: Rad Messick, WFYV, "After having seen at least three Genesis shows and collecting every bootleg album that ever appeared, I'm blown away. Besides possibly qualifying for the performance of the year, the record probably qualifies as one of the highest fidelity discs that's ever come out. Great musicians and great songs that people are really starting to get into at a mass level"...Larry Reisman, KEZY, "The Genesis is quite strong for a live album. 'Powerful' would be the word to describe it. This is definitely one of the better live albums released in some time"...Steve Huntington, WWVL, "Total turntable domination was achieved this week by Genesis. It's a lot like what 'Eat A Peach' did to me 10 1/2 years ago. I just can't get enough"...The Doctor, WYFE, "This album really makes the new stuff shine as well as capturing some of the old favorites that I've always loved. The production is state of the art--just as Genesis is itself"...Bob Majersky, WXUS, "With many of our superstar staples contemplating the parting of ways, watch for Genesis to fill the void. That takes the two week total to 49, and guarantees a healthy Index showing next week...Majors to date: KROQ, WBCN, WLUP, KGB-FM, WIOT, WMMMS, WNEW-FM, WBAB, WEBN, WCMF, WZYR, WMET, KZEW, WLWQ, and KSRR...Comments: Susan Bax, WMET, "We're hoping the Animals medley will give David Johansen the recognition he deserves"...Judy McNutt, KGB-FM, "Very good response from the David Johansen fans and the Animals medley is developing new fans, too. Finally, he could get some recognition"...Michele Robinson Sayre, KLOL, "I can't get enough of this album. He's just got to break on this one with the HOT Animals medley, 'Reach Out' and 'Funky But Chic'"...Curt Gary, WEBN, "When you get the David Johansen Animals medley on the air you realize that it really is Summertime. A log of upper demos have immediate recognition and curiosity calls from our younger listeners"...Greg Gillispie, KEZO, "David Johansen will serve a dual purpose. Even though the lyrics are 18 years old, they're just right for the kids today, while the 25+ crowd will be floored by the resemblance to the original"...Jim Buckley, WRCN, "I think the new David Johansen is terrific, basically the Animals medley. I think it sounds better than I ever heard the Animals sounding."

#### CLOCKS, BOULEVARD/CBS

"She Looks A Lot Like You" sure sounds like a hit on WYSP. WEBN's Curt Gary agrees, "On first impression I wasn't knocked out by the Clocks, but over the radio 'She Looks A Lot Like You' has real hit potential"... From WDHA's Mark Chernoff: "The Clocks' 'She Looks A Lot Like You' is a bouncy tune that could be a sleeper this Summer"...Ted Burton Jacobsen, KKRR, "The Clocks record 'She Looks A Lot Like You' sounds like it's gonna be a winner. Full of hooks"...Greg Gillispie, KEZO, "The Clocks' 'She Looks A Lot Like You' is a hit"...Dave Krusenklous, WKQQ, "The Clocks record is a fresh sound for me. Good harmonies and tight songs. I like 'She Looks A Lot Like You' and 'Nobody's Fool'"...#4 Most Added with 17 including WEBN, KSHE, KSRR, and WLWQ...Already on KROQ, WYSP (up to medium), KZEW, KMET, and WIOT.

#### JOHN WAITE, "IGNITION", CHRYSALIS

Last week's biggest (14 points) Prime Mover comes back with a 35-29 underline...Also igniting Metro 26-18... "Change" is up 72-39-29 on The Song Index...#6 Most Added with 14 including: KDKB, KYYS, WMET, WQMF, and WKQQ...Airplay: 3 up (KROR, WLLZ, WLWQ), 2 down, and 27 steady...On the Checklist: 42 not playing, 22 considering, none dropping, 25 maintaining, and 25 building, including powerful Metro calls: WLLZ, KSHE, KZEW, KLOL, WNEW, KWK, KROR, WEBN, WMMMS, WYSP, KBPI, KYYS, KGB, KMET, KSRR, KZOK, KPKE, and WAVA.

#### JOE COCKER, "SHEFFIELD STEEL", ISLAND

Joe is in the best voice in years, and personally, we find the funky groove of "Look What You Done" preferable to a lot of the formula overload making the rounds. Out of the chute with 13 stations for #7 Most Added...Radio Action: Michele Robinson Sayre, KLOL, "Joe Cocker is back! What an album! Not a bad cut on it! He also puts on a killer live show, having sold out three club dates here recently"...Ron Sorenson, KBLE, "I've been a Joe Cocker fan since the first album. He's been up and he's been down, but when Joe is on, he's one of the most soulful rock vocalists we've got. He's on for this one."

#### CROSBY, STILLS, AND NASH, "WASTED ON THE WAY", ATLANTIC

Our #1 Most Added single with 66 stations (#3 overall). It is interesting to note the numbers of hard rockers who came in right away, including WAVA, WLLZ, WIYY, KWK, and KSHE. Obviously, the upper demo, multi-format appeal transcends the tempo problem...Comments: Bob Walton, WQDR, "Getting wonderful response. Contrary to popular belief, the audience has not forgotten them. It's already a top request item with many calls asking for the album"...Bob Linder, WDHA, "Twilight Zone time for CSN with all acoustic 'Wasted On The Way'. Just a wonderful way to whisk back to the 60's for a minute"...Rob Lipshutz, WHJY, "'Wasted On The Way' by CSN actually says something, and has such a distinctive familiar sound. That violin passage really makes it. This one song puts their last album to shame"...Judy McNutt, KGB-FM, "Lots of very positive calls on the CSN single. I was wondering if the rather dated sound would work, but it does get plenty of calls from both men and women"...Mike Wolf, WQFM, "CSN may sound a bit wimpy on first listen to a lot of folks, but there's nothing to beat the hipness that this group has, even with the younger demos. 'Wasted On The Way' is a good return for them"...Joanne Peterson, WAPI-FM, "Those unmistakable harmonies are irresistible. Can't wait for the album"...Lisa Richards, WMMR, "Did a test on the CSN single. Steve Sutton played 'Jukebox Jury' and found the response 60/40 on the positive side with the positives raving and the negs saying it was 'too country' and 'mellow'. Personally, I think the times are in need of the adult appeal of songs like this."

#### EDDIE MONEY, COLUMBIA

Two bang-up weeks for Eddie. 48 adds takes us to a total of 102 and it's like he never left...On the Song Index "Shakin'" debuts at #24...More raves: Curt Gary, WEBN, "I can't wait for the Eddie Money album. If the single is any indication of what else is on that wax, we'll be playing this one for a long time to come"...Rad Messick, WFYV, "I think it's the best piece of production that Tom Dowd has done in years. The song itself is a Summertime classic with all the rock and roll roots and a great R&B feel"...Michele Sayre, KLOL, "How unusual in this biz that an album so full of insights and truths should also turn out to be so commercial, and so WONDERFUL!"...Bobbin Beam, WLPX, "Both sides of the Eddie Money 12" are smashes. 'Think I'm In Love' is great, and 'Shakin'' is incredible"...Rob Barnett, WAAF, "We also put the Eddie Money single in this week. If there was such a thing as a drought for Money, then this must be the comeback"...Bill Simmons, WMYK, "Eddie Money's 'Shakin' is the strongest track he's ever done."

## BUILDERS:

### MEN AT WORK, CBS

Up a few notches on the Index, 50-48...New on WMMS, WSYR, and KMOD...And most importantly, new at #47 Metro...Checklist looks terrific--19 building, including: KZEW, KLOL, KGON, WHCN, WROQ, KGB-FM, KMET, and WKLS...12 maintaining, 5 dropping, and 31 of 58 not playing are considering..."Who Can It Be Now" is up 75-51.

### FRANK ZAPPA, BARKING PUMPKIN

Airplay increases and debuts from the previous 70 adds made for a super Chart week--up 41-31 Index. 44-34 Metro--overall the strongest Prime Mover on the Back Page...#3 Most Added with 17, and those conversions should make for another big jump in our next report...New: DC101, WSHE, WCOZ, WLUP, WYSP, WBCN, and WLAV-FM...Up on KAZY, WMMR, WLWQ, and max play on KLOS, WMMS, and WHCN...On the Checklist: Of 39 not playing, 13 are considering, 7 maintaining, 4 dropping, and an incredible 58 building (primarily with requests) including: KDKB, WLUP, KYYS, KMET, WZXR, WKLS, WYNF, WSHE, WMET, WIYY, WMMR, WBCN, WYSP, WSYR, DC101, KLOL, WGRQ, WNEW-FM, KGON, WEBN, WLAV-FM, WQXM, KZAP, and WMMS... Comments: Ted Edwards, WCOZ "We put in Frank Zappa this week. Hell, it's Summer and time to have some fun. Certainly that's what this record is all about. I was a little skeptical about putting it on, but considering the audience's reaction, there doesn't seem to be any problem"...Bob Bittens, WHCN, "'Valley Girl' continues to be our top request along with 'Eye Of The Tiger'"...Jim Buckley, WRCN, "The real surprise of the week has got to be Zappa. It debuts at #13 on our Chart, and we're getting super hot calls for 'Valley Girl'"...Ted Burton Jacobsen, KKRQ, "Bob and Doug McKenzie--move over! Moon Zappa's debut with 'Valley Girl' hits home. Our biggest request item of the week by a 3 to 1 ratio. Gag me with a spoon!"...Bill Simmons, WMYK, "Incredible phone calls on Frank Zappa. Play it heavy before it burns out"...Dick Blackmon, WOWD, "Everything I've heard is true about this Zappa record. We put it in last week. Every third request is for 'Valley Girl'"...That tune jumps 42-26 on the Song Index.

### A FLOCK OF SEAGULLS, JIVE/ARISTA

The majors are finally coming through as evidenced by the 35-29 Metro Chart underline...Steady at #28 Index (good considering debuts from the Stones, Survivor, and Steve Miller)...Airplay: 30 steady, 3 down, and 9 ups: KRQR, KTXQ, KYYS, WROQ, WLWQ, WHCN, WBAB, KMOD, and WLIR..."I Ran" continues to build 37-30 and "Space Age Love Song" debuts at #94.

### GARY U. S. BONDS, EMI

Up 29-26 on the Index, 34-32 Metro, and new on KBPI, KLOL, WTUE, WYFE, KEZO, and KLPX...Airplay: 26 steady, 2 down and 11 ups: WMMR, WNEW-FM, WSYR, WLWQ, WROQ, WHFS, WOUR, KILO, WIMZ...Yes, "Out Of Work" does relate to the current economic situation, but don't forget there's a whole lot more on this record, especially our fave, "Love's On The Line".

### ROLLING STONES, ROLLING STONE/ATLANTIC

With a #5 entry on both Charts, the Stones have our highest debuting live Lp ever. Already in max rotation at nearly 40% of our reporting stations...On the Consultant's page "Still Life" goes 16-13 Pollack, debut 16 Superstars, and #10 Doubleday...They also have a #6 Retail debut...Favorite tracks: "Going To A Go-Go" #7, "Under My Thumb" #65, "Start Me Up" #75, "Let's Spend The Night Together" #78, and "Satisfaction" #82.

### SURVIVOR, SCOTTI BROTHERS

All that concentrated play on the single, and those boiling request lines added up to a #10 Index and a #9 Metro debut...Check these request raves: Bruce Goldsen, WRKI, "Survivor is moving to superstar status phones"...Bob Bittens, WHCN, "'Eye Of The Tiger' continues to be our top request"...Dick Bascom, WQXM, "Not only has the new Survivor been burning up the phones, it also has been blowing out the stores' doors. It came in #1 in sales this week"...Dave Krusenklous, WKQQ, "#1 request killer is Survivor's 'Eye Of The Tiger'"...Jose Diaz, WBLM, "One of our most requested songs"...Dave Kane, WCMF, "Top requests this past week for Survivor"...Joanne Peterson, WAPI-FM, "Survivor is tearing up our phones"...New on WNEW-FM, KRQR, KDKB, KZOK, and 9 more...Already on 75% of our Level I reporters... Lands in the top 10 on all our Consultant's Charts: Sebastian #3, Doubleday #3, Pollack #6, and Superstars #7...Debut #18 on the Retail Index, and "Eye Of The Tiger" moves up the Song Index 4-2.

### FLEETWOOD MAC, WARNER BROTHERS

13 adds bump the total count to 126 stations, and with max/heavy play on 40% of our reporting stations, (including KLOS, KGON, KYYS, WMMR, WLPX, KGB-FM, KZEW, WBCN, WHJY, WMMS, WQXM, WSHE, WLLZ KBPI, and WKLS) the #5 Song Index debut is no surprise...The unanimous nod of approval from the Consultants is no surprise either. "Hold Me" moves 20-14 Sebastian, 16-10 Superstars, 20-14 Pollack, and debuts at #20 on the Doubleday chart.

### ALAN PARSONS PROJECT, ARISTA

"Fingers Burned" has pulled comfortably ahead on the Song Index moving 29-21 with "Psychobabble" also gaining 91-77. The week's biggest Metro mover 29-16. Also an Index underline, 23-15. We log in 16 play increases including: KLOS, KLOL, WCOZ, WMMS, WNEW-FM, KSHE, WBCN, KDKB, and WLWQ. Also 25 steadies, and 3 decreases in play...Comments: Curt Gary, WEBN, "'Fingers Burned' is growing on me day by day. It has a sound unlike any other on the radio right now, and I think that really makes it stand out"...Ted Edwards, WCOZ, "The Alan Parsons record didn't overwhelm me as I previewed it, but once I heard 'Fingers Burned' on COZ, it was all I needed to be convinced it was for real."

### STEVE MILLER, CAPITOL

With a #18 Index/#27 Metro debut, and play spreading to "Keeps Me Wondering Why" and "Cool Magic", Steve is obviously getting his shot...#8 Most Added with 12 reports for a total of 94 Lp mentions in two weeks...We show play on 45% of our Level I stations including: KAZY, WMMS, KTXQ, WQXM, DC101, KWK, KSHE, WMET, WBCN, WNEW-FM, KSRR, KZEW, KGB-FM, WLPX, KBPI, WGRQ, WMMR, KZOK, KYYS, and KDKB.

### GLENN FREY, ELEKTRA

Stiff competition kept Glenn one point shy of an underline, but 15-11 jump speaks for itself--Lp is 15-12 Metro, and 20-17 Superstars, 15-10 Sebastian, 16-14 Doubleday, and debuts at #18 Pollack...The top track is "Partytown" moving 17-12 on the Song Index with "I Found Somebody" 94-70.

### MARSHALL CRENSHAW, WARNER BROTHERS

There has been tons of critical acclaim, and a number of credible adds, and bingo, Marshall now has the stats to convince the doubters--47-39 Index and new #49 Metro...Increased play on WMMR, WPLR, KNAC, WNOR, and KTIM...Also 33 steady, and 2 down...Level I play includes: KBPI, KGB-FM, KLOL, WCOZ, WDVE, WLLZ, WMMR, WMMS, WRIF, and WYSP...Top songs: "Someday, Someway" 58-52 and "There She Goes Again".

### SIGNIFICANT SONGS:

#### "HEARBEAT", KING CRIMSON, WARNER BROTHERS

As expected, the Indicators are right there--WNEW-FM, KROQ, WXRT, KTYD, WRAS, etc., but considering "Heartbeat"'s melodic accessibility, we hear this song in regular rotation on mainstream stations... WHCN's Bob Bittens says, "We got the new King Crimson in this week. The majority of the songs are of the nervous, heavily rhythmic style that dominated their last album. There is one highly accessible track that has begun to really grow on me. Check out the song 'Heartbeat' with an open mind, and I think you'll agree it's worth playing."

#### "SHOWDOWN", RIOT, ELEKTRA

5 new believers, KGB-FM, KRQR, WYFE, WPLR, and WRCN...KGB-FM's Judy McNutt comments, "I was surprised with the Riot. I listened out of obligation and ended up liking it. We're going with 'Showdown' which sounded like Danny Joe Brown, which is surprising"...Already on: WYSP, KSRR, KSHE, KMET, KLOS, WMMS, WPYX, KQRS, WTPA, WPLR, WYFE, KGB-FM, KRQR, and WRCN.

#### "VACATION", GO GO'S, IRS/A&M

Sounds a bit more pop than their last two singles, but come off of a platinum Lp, with a song about Vacations in June, and see how long it takes for the request line to convince you...WRCN's Jim Buckley comments, "Today is the day we started getting all those last day of school requests, and what arrived this morning? A new Go Go's single called 'Vacation'. Needless to say, it's out-of-the-box, heavy"... Lisa Richards, WMMR, "The new Go Go's single is a bona fide smash, and we can't wait for more. It should do for these girls what Joan Jett's second album did for her"...Mark Chernoff, WDHA, "Being an early believer in the Go Go's, I'm glad they're back into a great Summer song with 'Vacation'. An automatic with most stations"...Ray White, WLIR, "Wouldn't you know the Go Go's would come out with a Summer song called 'Vacation' that tugs at the heart? I'm hooked."

#### "I DID IT FOR LOVE", HARLEQUIN, COLUMBIA

Not a ton of call letters yet, but you have to be impressed with KGON and KBPI, especially considering the competition. A solid pop track.

#### "ROCK THIS TOWN", STRAY CATS, WARNER BROTHERS/EMI

Another Indicator special. Many of whom played "Rock This Town" as an import. We'll monitor audience response and pass along the positives...#4 Most Added with 17, led by WXRT, KROQ, WLIR, and WBAB.

#### "LOVE ON THE LINE", ALLIANCE, HANDSHAKE

The label has pledged long-term belief and support on this project, and indeed they continue to bring in real call letters. New in the past three weeks on WLPX, WIOT, WLAV-FM, KQRS, and KSHE...We understand "Love On The Line" is testing quite well.

#### "WHAT DO ALL THE PEOPLE KNOW", MONROES, ALFA

Our airplay stats show 41 steady, 6 dropping in rotation, and 7 builders, KTXQ, WMMS, KGON, KAZY, WQDR, WBRU, and WRNO...We're still crazy about the track and expect the KGB-FM success story to spread. Judy McNutt responds, "Oh boy! Are we having a big success with the Monroes. The record is selling top 5 here and phones are real good on it, too."

#### "LOVE LEADS TO MADNESS", NAZARETH, A&M

Considering the monster hook, we expected much quicker action. However, the holes are filling in weekly, and once Top 40 kicks in, look out. WMMS, CLEVELAND, OH M.D.-KID LEO: "We had some semblance of success with Duran Duran and, in fact, the entire New Romantic movement out of England last year. Duran was the cream of the crop. And while the movement may have been a passing fancy, there is substance to this band...On the Men At Work, I figured I might as well keep somebody working. Actually, I found myself humming 'Who Can It Be Now', so I figured it's about time we put it in...The Townshend Lp is a very, very personal album. I was somewhat taken back by the amount of talk songs; however, it's a very, very strong statement. And as Mr. Hard says, he is one of the few who can get away with being himself. I personally think I'm gonna enjoy the album immensely as time goes by...Not much to say about Genesis except it's going to be a monster...I want to thank Charlie Daniels for an enjoyable day. We spent the afternoon on the golf course. As far as the scores go, they were about as high as the Purple Plum we drank afterwards--and then that night he put on quite a show...Lots of audience interest in the David Johansen."

WQXM, TAMPA/ST. PETERSBURG, FL M.D.-DICK BASCOM: "Not only has the new Survivor been burning up the phones, it's also been blowing out the stores' doors. It came in #1 in sales this week. Not bad for a third album. I guess three times a winner...Reaction to the Townshend import has been very favorable, and now that we have the album, I'm sure it'll pick up nicely. 'Stardom In Acton' is great adult rock and roll...I've never seen an audience react quite as fast or as positively as ours has to the new Zappa--and we don't even have any valleys in Florida. This is one to definitely run with for awhile... Alan Parsons Project continues their solid sales growth maintaining #5 in sales...We're playing the B Side of the Journey single, and I've got to say it's one of the most refreshing pieces I've ever heard Journey do...And speaking of B Sides, check out the flip side of REO Speedwagon's 45 called 'I'll Follow You'. It's from the upcoming album, and it's almost better than the A Side...Axe was in town last week, and I've really got to tip my hat to Bobby Barth. The man wields an axe better than many that I've seen of late, and he works the audience like a true pro. The band is going places."

KDKB, PHOENIX, AZ M.D.-J.DAVID HOLMES: "Masterpiece. It's not a word I like to throw around to describe an album I simply enjoy a great deal, but I don't think it's stretching it all to say that Pete Townshend's 'Chinese Eyes' is a masterpiece. It's one of those records to cherish all our lives. I was listening to it for the first time and following along with the lyrics sheet, when I suddenly realized my eyes were moist. I still don't know if they were tears of joy or sorrow, maybe both. All I know is that I was crying and rocking out simultaneously. It's an extremely moving two sides--Townshend will drain you and fill you up. There's no doubt about it, as far as I'm concerned, it's one of his best. We're starting with 'Face Dances', but my personal picks are: 'Sea Refuses No River' and 'Somebody Saved Me'...Steve Miller's 'Abracadabra' is beating out 'Valley Girl' for most requested song, believe it or not. I know what the consensus tracks are, but don't overlook: 'The Things I Told You' and the McCartney-ish ballad 'While I'm Waiting'. Hope Miller keeps coming up with the quality of this one...Glad we finally had room to add one of the finest and most distinctive voices in rock and roll--John Waite. The Babys were good, but with 'Ignition', John has a good shot at reaching that superstar plateau his old band couldn't. Looks like he's going to the top...We switched tracks on Toto this week to 'Africa', and it sounds fantastic on the air...One of the most under-rated groups of the 70's, 10cc, have released a fine new album. Does anyone else out there think this record is getting overlooked?...Thank God the Book is over, it's only three weeks till vacation time."

WEBN, CINCINNATI, OH M.D.-CURT GARY: "If You See Kay"--play her. It's a real entertaining song on the new April Wine Lp which Capitol bought from someone here in Cincinnati. We've been playing it for a few days now, and the response has been very encouraging...When you get the David Johansen's Animals Medley on the air, you realize that it really is Summertime. A lot of upper demos have immediate recognition and curiosity calls from our younger listeners...On first impressions, I wasn't knocked out by the Clocks. But over the radio, 'She Looks A Lot Like You' has real hit potential...Speaking of which, Alan Parsons Project's 'Fingers Burned' is growing on me day by day. It has a sound unlike any other on the radio right now, and I think that really makes it stand out...A very nice live album from Genesis. The quality is real good, and I'm sure we'll get a lot of live option play out of it, and I'm still working my way through the studio side...The John Waite. Phones are building as the Babys connection slowly but surely works its way into their minds...Glenn Frey called, and we want to thank him for that interview. You got that right, Glenn, Cincy is a partytown...I can't wait for the Eddie Money album. If the single is any indication of what else is on that wax, we'll be playing this one for a long time to come...Fleetwood Mac is an out-of-the-box smash, there's no doubt, but it'll tend to slow the tempo down...The Fleetwood Mac and Crosby, Stills & Nash were a tossup for which slow song would get added. Crosby, Stills & Nash lost, only because we've heard other songs on that record and know there are tunes more suitable for EBN. So bring it on!!!...Considering: Keeping a close eye on the Motels."

KSRR, HOUSTON, TX P.D.-ALAN SNEED: "Texas Jam was this past Saturday and Sunday in Dallas and Houston. We sent a pair of winners to Dallas, along with Catfish and Dayna Steel, to cover the Dallas show. We're the 'unofficial' station for the Houston Jam. We sold over 5,100 'unofficial' Texas Jammer' T-shirts the week before the Jam and gave away 50,000 'unofficial' Jam patches the day of the show at the Astrodome. 'Unofficial' was definitely where it was at. The patches had a 97¢ discount coupon on the back, good for any album by any group playing at the Jam. The patches themselves were good at several area clubs after the show for free admission and a free beer...New music this week: Roxxy Music, our personal favorite; Genesis; Pete Townshend; Clocks (which sounds like a great Summer-time record); David Johansen; old friends, Crosby, Stills & Nash; and, Eddie Money--both sides... Good sales moves this week: John Cougar goes #8, Rainbow to #10, Soft Cell takes a leap to #11, Heart to #12...Big mover: Alan Parsons Project 35-17."

WLPX, MILWAUKEE, WI M.D.-BOBBIN BEAM: "I have to spew forth my adoration for the Billy Idol album. I've been turning people on to this record everywhere I go. They'll be riding in my car and they'll be captive. I don't usually get this excited about a record, but Billy's 'Love's Calling' is where Jim Morrison would be in 1982. I'm mesmerized...I also have to mention the Pete Townshend record. Upon the second listen, I've fallen in love with this one (but it did take me two listens)...Both sides of the Eddie Money 12" are smashes. 'Think I'm In Love' is great and 'Shakin' is incredible... We're also looking into: Riot and Mayday...Rolling Stones are #1 out-of-the-box here in local sales. Sold a thousand copies first week on the street...The Genesis sounds great on the air--almost as good as they do in the studio...David Johansen does the Animals just as good as they do...We've upped Glenn Frey in rotation this week from light to medium...Getting lots of calls on: Steve Miller single... Survivor showing Top 4 debut sales and tons of calls for 'Eye Of The Tiger'...We also added: The Crosby, Stills & Nash single. Good 18-34 record. We're also using it to warm up their upcoming concert...Big calls for: April Wine single."

KGON, PORTLAND, OR ASST. P.D.-GLORIA JOHNSON: "Sales: #1 Asia, #2 Paul McCartney, #3 Scorpions, #4 Willie Nelson, #5 Rolling Stones, and #6 Alan Parsons Project...Requests: #1 Asia, #2 Scorpions, #3 Van Halen, #4 John Cougar, and #5 Cheap Trick...KGON finished up Rose Festival in fine style with an Iris and Mike Morning Show remote aboard the HMCS Yukon, a Canadian ship in town for the festivities. There were a couple of hundred sailors and they served us McYukon's for breakfast. What a great bunch of hosers. We also held an Ozzy Look-alike competition. The four finalists will be on the air, live, tomorrow afternoon with the real Ozzy picking the winner...On the music front, Harlequin is on. 'I Did It For Love' has great lyrics and a bright sound. Having Jack Douglas on production doesn't hurt at all. It'll be my pleasure to watch the big mean Columbia machine take this one to the top...Eddie Money's 'Shakin' is my choice over the single, although I like them both...Men At Work is beginning to buzz... Taking a serious look at A Flock Of Seagulls. Please Bone, don't send me that bag of bird droppings yet...I'm on vacation next week, so you'll be hearing from Inessa York, our Music Assistant."

WQFM, MILWAUKEE, WI M.D.-MIKE WOLF: "Pete Townshend brings to his latest album the same mastery of music he's been doing for years with The Who. Although on first listen there's a little less punch to the album than his last one, there seems to be a lot more depth to the music. Hats off to Pete Townshend for another fine effort...This past weekend, WQFM climaxed a month-long PAC-man Tournament by putting on a rock and roll extravaganza at 'Go Bananas' video arcade. Over 3,000 people showed up to cheer on the 17 competitors. Ray Carlson took home the \$1,000 first place prize by racking up over 177,000 points in 20 minutes--WOW!!...That same night, A Flock Of Seagulls flew into town and put on a great show. Since their debut album was so flawlessly produced, I was actually expecting them to be disappointing live, but such was not the case. I firmly believe that this group's music is a bit ahead of their time, in much the same way that the Moody Blues 'Knights In White Satin' was ahead of its time when it was originally released in 1967. I predict 3 to 5 years from now, A Flock Of Seagulls has the potential to be just as phenomenal...Crosby, Stills & Nash may sound a bit wimpy on first listen to a lot of folks, but there's nothing to beat the hipness that this group has, even with the younger demos. 'Wasted On The Way' is a good return for them...As far as record sales go, there are some pretty healthy debuts: Alan Parsons Project debuting at #6; Kansas at #8; Heart #10; and finally, John Cougar is coming through retailwise, jumping #21 to #9 during the past week...Loverboy continues to be amazingly successful in Milwaukee--they're #1...Also, 38 Special jumps from #6 to #4."

WMET, CHICAGO, IL M.D.-SUSAN BAX: "Due to Dave Benson's departure, Trip Reeb and I will be handling the music here at WMET. I'll be taking music calls anytime Wednesday through Friday...And, I'm happy to say that our first official add is John Waite. 'Change' will undoubtedly be a big hit...Meanwhile, we're hoping the Animals Medley will give David Johansen the recognition he deserves...Also added: Iron Maiden and Pete Townshend. We've been playing 'Face Dances Part Two' for a few weeks now, and we're also going with 'Slit Skirts' for starters...Saleswise: Genesis and the Stones join Asia, Survivor, and Toto in the Top Five after only one week of sales...Finally, an open note to Pat Metheny: You better take real good care of your new tour manager or you'll never hear your music on radio again."

KLOL, HOUSTON, TX ASST. P.D.-MICHELE ROBINSON SAYRE: "First and foremost: Many, many thanks to Journey, Santana, Sammy Hagar, Joan Jett, Point Blank, and all of their managers for helping us put together a hot Texas World Music Festival '82. And thanks, Steve Leeds, for the great dinner at Mama's Cafe and the backstage fun!...Now, music: EDDIE MONEY!!! How unusual in this biz that an album so full of insights and truths should also turn out to be so commercial. And, SO WONDERFUL! Just love 'Shakin', great sexy beat. Also: 'Runnin' Away', 'Hard Life' (what lyrics), and my favorite 'Take A Little Bit'. Nice harp by Eddie, too. Bravo, Tom Dowd!...Joe Cocker is back! What an album! Not a bad cut on it! He also puts on a killer live show, having sold out three club dates here recently. Crazy about: 'Look What You Done', 'Shocked', and 'Sweet Little Woman', with a beautiful version of 'Many Rivers To Cross'. Geffen Records does it again!...Adrian Gurvitz comes through with 'No Fears In The Night'. Wonderful song! But also check out: 'Classic' and a great Genesis-like cut 'End The Story'...David Johansen. I can't get enough of this album. He's just got to break on this one with the HOT 'Animals Medley', 'Reach Out', and 'Funky But Chic'...Bonnie Hayes's album is fun stuff! Beth Rosengard tells me she's great live, too. Ask Beth about Bonnie's sister... Journey! A new song! Of course, as usual, 'La Raza del Sol' is wonderful stuff from this superstar band. Steve Perry's voice was in fine form this Sunday. 'Still They Ride' was even prettier on stage. Jim McKeon: Didn't manage to get an autograph--hint, hint...Also like: Mayday's 'Revenge' (Doesn't the cover remind you of an 80's version of ARS?), Clocks, Harlequin, and the new Hawks LP... To Drew Murray: Well, more 'Zep Ya Fukkers' was finally made official over the weekend in Houston... Oh, I almost forgot Men At Work. Hard at work and on its way to being a hit."...JEFF JENSEN: "Whew! I'm still breathing from those furious strokes, Michele. What a professional, that Michele Robinson Sayre...No image problems with Tammy Faye-Bakker and her sensational 'P.T.L.' album. 'Lord Paint My Mind' is the power cut. Do I hear anthem?...A honk of the horn to: Dave, Ed, and Mike. You share your name with many. Good Luck...By the way, I agree with Jim about Bob Dylan...Hot Sales This Week: Gasoline, beer, ice, and groceries...Question: Why is there a 737 on the back cover of the new 707 album?...What happened, Jeffrey Fey?...And Bill Smith, is that your scribbling on the new Genesis?... Personal to E.T.: Phone home...I heard of a special edition cover of the new REO Speedwagon. Instead of a KLOS sticker, it'll have a sour grapes sticker."

WYSP, PHILADELPHIA, PA M.D.-STEVE FEINSTEIN: "The Pete Townshend album is magnificent. It's a joy to hear intelligent rock that deals successfully with adult themes. The music overflows with sublime understated touches, such as the evocative harmonia on 'Sea Refuses No River'. I sense it's an album that will reveal its treasures gradually. The lyrics are so rich that we'll be deriving new pleasure and meaning from them for years to come. This record is a proud accomplishment by a rocker who can legitimately be considered an artist...Into the studio goes 'Words' by Missing Persons...Up in rotation to medium goes the Clocks, which is not a one-song album. Besides 'She Looks A Lot Like You', check out: 'Here They Come' and 'Without You'...Sales Stories: Motels in the Top 10; and, A Flock Of Seagulls and Marshall Crenshaw Top 25 with only light airplay...Congratulations to: John Bloodwell on his move to WCOZ as Promotion Director...And best wishes and lots of admiration for: Dave Benson on his career switch."

KTXQ, DALLAS, TX P.D.-TOM OWENS: "In an effort to keep comments from KTXQ intact while Drake is on vacation, I spent last night at The Fare (DH's favorite titty bar), listened to every shitty record I could find, I've eaten a bag of Wiseass potato chips, fired up a big one, and I've got a Bud in hand... Now, our obvious #1 add is Pete Townshend. Personally, I like the record, but doubt its longevity on the radio...Billy Idol is a refreshing album. 'Hot Night' sounds like a great pop song for the Summer. We've gone with: 'Wedding'...Scorpions are for real. Hope they don't start doing ballads...707 is coming on...Drake and I both like Nazareth...Long live the Stones...And finally, thanks to: Pace Concerts, Pat Morrow and Journey, Bonnie Simmons, Sammy Hagar, Ed, Steve Liebert, Bill Ham, and Point Blank for helping us with Texas Jam '82 in Dallas (65,000 people)."

KGB-FM, SAN DIEGO, CA M.D.-JUDY McNUTT: "Pete Shelley's 'Homosapiens' is catchy as hell. Who could resist this? I must admit when I was driving around L.A. listening to the radio, I thought at first, 'Agh, just another KROQ song.' But he's definitely got something, and the video is good, too...The Townshend is a very touching work. I think it's high quality all the way, despite the fact that 'Don't Let Go Of The Coat' has been resurrected in 'Face Dances Part Two'. If you can't steal from yourself, who can you steal from?...Finally, Genesis are at their best live. The studio tracks leave me a little cold, but the live stuff takes the chill off fine...I was surprised with the Riot. I listened out of obligation and ended up liking it. We're going with 'Showdown', which sounded like Danny Joe Brown...Marshall Crenshaw stopped by...Dave Edmunds did, too. Dave's new band is a killer. They're so good live, they would knock your hat off. Do yourself a favor and see them if they come to a seedy little bar in your neighborhood...Oh boy, are we having big success with the Monroes. The record is selling Top 5 here. Phones are real good on it, too...Getting a lot of calls for: Taxxi's 'Don't She Love To Rock And Roll'...Getting some calls on: John Waite. People think it's a new Babys record--so they do have some fans out there and they're enjoying this album...Alan Parsons' 'Fingers Burned' doesn't sound like him, but it does sound great...Very good response from the David Johansen fans, and the Animals medley is developing new fans too. Finally, he could get some recognition... I like the Eddie Money songs on the 12"...Lots of very positive calls on: Crosby, Stills & Nash single. I was wondering if the rather dated sound would work, but it gets plenty of calls from both men and women."

WBCN, BOSTON, MA M.D.-MARC MILLER: "One of the best Lp's I've ever heard has been released this week, and that's Pete Townshend's 'All The Best Cowboys'. With the possible exception of John Lennon, Pete is the only rock artist I know who can write such incredibly personal songs and not sound self-indulgent. This is a listening record and all cuts are recommended. On Saturday, June 12th, WBCN broadcast the Disarmament Rally from Central Park with the help of Starfleet Studios. Our own Mark Parenteau was one of the radio hosts for the broadcast, and a marvelous time was had by all...Now I hate to jump on the bandwagon, but we added Zappa's 'Valley Girl'. And, yes, Virginia, it is getting more phones than anything in recent memory. I thought no one in Boston would understand it, but they love it...Also new and hot: Axe's 'Rock And Roll Party In The Street', which is a perfect Summer song...And speaking of perfect songs, here's the new Go Go's single, which will be a huge Summer record... We also like what we've heard of the forthcoming X Lp... To Trish at KTIM: How much are YOU enjoying 'Dream Girls'?...And coming next week, full details of the 4th Annual Rock And Roll Rumble... R.I.P. James 'Honeyman' Scott."

WLUP, CHICAGO, IL M.D.-SKY DANIELS: "Record Of The Week: Pete Townshend's 'Slit Skirts'. By now we've all read Rolling Stone's rather incisive cover story on Pete. In my book, Pete Townshend is the leading rock figure that Elvis couldn't be, John Lennon wouldn't be, and Mick Jagger won't--unless the money is right. So, only Townshend is left to accept the burden--and Pete, I love ya for it... Frank and Moon Zappa's 'Valley Girl' got 'em out of LA-LA-Land and into the Heartland...First Canada, now this. Split Enz from Down Under (they're coming from all corners of the earth this week) put on a highly credible show in Chicago this week. They seem poised for mainstream acceptance. I hope that doesn't mean Prell commercials...Roxy Music has been one of my favorites for years. 'Avalon', the title track, sounds accessible to me. That's twice in two comments, Bill...Which leads me to what's really on my mind: Accessible, safe, fits the format. I think I should quit this business. Rock and roll means far too much to me to earn a living at it. Dave Benson last week called it madness, and I know what he means. Here I am, a job a million people would love to have--money, notariety, success--but is it satisfying? Not at all. Somehow album radio, and rock and roll for that matter, in its quest for fortune, got a little confused. It didn't try to get better--it tried to get safer. So safe, I'm starting to worry it doesn't matter to anyone. Sure a lot of people will listen and ratings will be inflated, but do they care? Well, they won't if you don't...I wish everyone could have heard Marty Schwartz rave about X to me today. He didn't promote me, he raved--like a fan--but behind it all, we both knew album radio doesn't believe in this music. It isn't safe. I remember when rock radio would get excited and proud about something like this because it was their music and not everyone else's."

WCOZ, BOSTON, MA M.D.-TED EDWARDS: "We put in Frank Zappa this week. Hell, it's Summer and time to have a good time, and certainly that's what this record is all about. I was a little skeptical about putting it on, but considering the audience's reaction, there doesn't seem to be any problem...We also put on the Eddie Money this week. Eddie has made some great records in his career, and I don't know if this qualifies as a 'comeback', but its superiority compared to the last two is obvious on first listen...Finally got to put in the Heart this week. 'City's Burning' is the cut. It's one of those songs that might not sound overwhelming when you listen to it on your turntable, but it sounds a whole lot better on the radio...On the same note, the Alan Parsons Project record didn't overwhelm me as I previewed it, but once I heard 'You're Gonna Get Your Fingers Burned' on COZ, it was all I needed to be convinced it was for real...And after all this, I feel compelled to add my support to the hordes of people who are going to rave about the Pete Townshend album. Cut for cut, it may not be as readily accessible to the audience, but the intelligence on this album is awesome. I'll be on vacation next week, and one of the things I'm now looking forward to is being able to burn up a cassette of this in my car. There certainly are cuts that the audience will accept, but for my personal listening pleasure, I don't think there's been an album out in the last year that I found so satisfying... Update: The Frankie Miller continues to do well for us. Seems like the single is gonna be the new cut that works, but the rockers are great...Besides welcoming all these new records to the radio station, we've also got ourselves a new Promotion Director. John Bloodwell from WMMR, Philadelphia is now a member of the team here at COZ. He's just the rock and roller we're looking for, and we encourage you to call up and start a relationship with him here. John arrives the 28th of June."

WFYV, JACKSONVILLE, FL P.D./M.D.-RAD MESSICK: "I can't believe it--it's two weeks in a row that two major live albums are out. First the Rolling Stones with the definitive Stones live performance. It gets on the radio, gets major phone calls, and blows right to the top of the sales charts first week out...And then comes that Easy Choice, 'Three Sides Live' from Genesis. After having seen at least three Genesis live shows and collecting every bootleg live album that ever appeared, I'm blown away. Besides possibly qualifying for the performance of the year, the record probably qualifies as one of the highest fidelity records that's ever come out. Great musicians and great songs that people are just really starting to get into at a mass level...And from the same Atlantic stable in the same week: Pete Townshend. It's better than I expected, a lot of variety. I have a feeling that the songs are going to take a couple of weeks to catch on with programmers before they can decide which ones to play. We're starting with: 'Stardom In Acton' and the import single...Last but not least out of the new stash, Eddie Money's 'Shakin'. I think it's the best piece of production that Tom Dowd has done in years. The song itself is a Summertime classic, with all the rock and roll roots and a great R&B feel...On the sales side: Rolling Stones and 38 Special dominate...Calls are starting to happen for: 707; Soft Cell; and, Glenn Frey, 'Partytown'."

WMMR, PHILADELPHIA, PA M.D.-LISA RICHARDS: "There's a buzz on in Philadelphia with the big Jam at JFK--featuring: Foreigner, The Kinks, Joan Jett, Huey Lewis, and Loverboy--just days away. WMMR is giving away numerous tickets, albums, T-shirts, and even suntan lotion. We're ready for a day of it... Our infamous morning team, Anita and Steve Mortorano, broadcast their morning show live from a local club in Philadelphia yesterday. We gave away free breakfasts from Burger King, and you'd be surprised how many took advantage of the open bar. It was a very successful endeavor. So much so that we decided to put Steve Sutton in the middle of the City for Old Newsboys' Day. He'll be broadcasting his lunchtime show live as part of this annual Philadelphia celebration...On to records: The new Pete Townshend album has become an instant fave around here. Very strong lyrically. Let's face it, this guy's been around and then some, and that's reflected in cuts like: 'Slit Skirts', 'Communication', and 'Somebody Saved Me'...We did a test on the Crosby, Stills & Nash single. Steve Sutton played it on Jukebox Jury. We found the response 60/40 on the positive side, with the positives raving and the negs saying it was 'too country' and 'mellow'. Personally, I think the times are in need of the adult appeal of songs like this and the Fleetwood Mac single for album rock radio...The new Go Go's single is a bona fide smash, and we can't wait for more. It should do for these girls what Joan Jett's second album did for her...Unbelievable production, meticulous arrangements, and great songs on the Alan Parsons Project. I still contend 'Eye In The Sky' and 'Psychobabble' are the key cuts...I understand the Cars comparison on 'She Looks A Lot Like You' from the Clocks. I find numerous cuts very exciting and fresh with a tremendous amount of single potential, especially: 'Nobody's Fool', 'Here They Come', and 'Without You'...And finally, I saw an unbelievable video six months ago--Chas Jankel's 'Questionnaire'. It absolutely blew me away, and my long search for the song finally ended the other day with the arrival of his new album. Love the very heavy lyrical content with that futuristic style. It is the 80's, folks...While retail on the whole is down, we're seeing something amazing here in Philadelphia from a local band, Robert Hazard And The Heroes. They've been selling out every club they've played for a year now, and they've developed a very loyal following. They just released an Ep, and so far have sold 12,000 copies. Anyone interested in hearing these guys should contact City Lights Management at 215-732-1223, or give me a call. These guys are hot."

WZZO, BETHLEHEM/ALLENTOWN, PA M.D.-BRUCE BOND: "We had a great concert with Rainbow and the Scorpions. I have to give a double thank you to: Polygram's Derek Shulman and David Leach, who pulled a great scoop for WZZO by getting Joe Lynn Turner from Rainbow and Klaus Meine and Rudolf Schenker from the Scorpions into the station. The two German guys are all right. We celebrated 'Blackout's gold album status with champagne. If these guys are in your market, they're great on the air...In music this week, I've got a few very strong raves: I'll have to start with Billy Idol. 'Hot In The City' is a 9½, but the album is a 10. We just had to find room for this one...Bonnie Hayes With The Wild Combo, formerly Punts on Slash Records, sounds strange at first, but play it for a week straight and you'll fall in love with this album. Thanks, Beth...Bone gets Flocked and Robyn wants a Haircut. 'I Ran' is being proved, and we added it...Another favorite that's I'm into is 'Double Vision' from Rory Gallagher. It took a few listens--but, it finally hit me...By the way, the quality that separates the Nazareth 12" from other tailor-made radio product is Dan McCafferty's fantastic gravelly voice...In the movement department: Gary U.S. Bonds, Bow-Wow-Wow, Glenn Frey, and Eddie Money all move up to medium...We also added two local bands this week: Triplum from Allentown and Robert Hazard And The Heroes from Philly...Sales reflected the Rainbow/Scorpions concert...Requests were very large on: Moon Unit...I have to thank Joe MacCabe from KYYS for putting my name in his report last week...And yes, it's true, Sports Illustrated now uses three staples in their magazine."

WPLR, NEW HAVEN, CT P.D.-RICK ALLISON: "I just want to alert everyone in radioland to the presence of an album on a small label, Slash, with no history any place but on the West Coast and San Francisco primarily. With the proper assistance, and in some cases a departure into good taste, Bonnie Hayes With The Wild Combo could be a major album. The album's called 'Good Clean Fun'. Listen to: 'Shelley's Boyfriend', 'Separating', 'Joy Ride', and 'Raylene'. It's hot!"

WROQ, CHARLOTTE, NC M.D.-JACK DANIELS: "Pete Townshend--Unmistakable Who influence. Much better overall than his first solo album, and it was great!"

WQMF, LOUISVILLE, KY M.D.-DUKE MEYER: "Adds: Eddie Money, Pete Townshend, Steve Miller, John Waite, and Motels...When your eyeballs are scanning this very page, this greasy little Lebanese M.D. is going to be on vacation. I think that's why it's so difficult to sit down and make an honest attempt at writing this. I'm definitely lame-ducking it this week...Pete Townshend's 'Chinese Eyes' album is real good, definitely my fave in this onslaught of new product. We went with 'Exquisitely Bored' first off, but I agree with BH, 'Stardom' is also a fine cut...I'm glad to see Eddie Money back. We added: 'Think I'm In Love'. In parts, did I detect a smoother texture to his voice or was I dreaming?...The Genesis 'Three Sides Live' album got a good response when we featured it the other night. We're playing: 'Paperlate'. But 'Me And Virgil' is also a good cut...Looking closely at: Clocks and Marshall Crenshaw...That's it, I'm gonna goof off some more. Next week our lovely and talented humanitarian P.D., Tom Owens, will be doing the talking for us. Talk to ya when I get back from vacation."

WTUE, DAYTON, OH M.D.-JIM KINNEY: "Another multi add week. We trimmed it down to 7 this time, including: Genesis, Pete Townshend, Gary U.S. Bonds, Soft Cell, A Flock Of Seagulls, Frank Zappa, and Crosby, Stills & Nash...There's no such thing as a bad Genesis concert, so this album is, of course, good. We're playing lots of live options, and we're also playing the first three tracks on the studio side. The second might be the strongest of the three...Pete's album is real strange for him. Although it's nice when people try new things, this one definitely doesn't me as hard as the first one did on first listen. It was kind of a toss-up between 'Stardom In Acton' and 'Slit Skirts'. We ended up with 'Stardom' instead of the single, which we added as an import last week...Glad we finally had room for Gary U.S. Bonds which is, Springsteen or no Springsteen, a great album. We had to go with 'Out Of Work' to start, but I don't have to tell you how many good tracks are on this album. A personal fave is 'Turn The Music Down', which I think in the end will be just as big as most of the others...Soft Cell was considered for about four months. We weren't quite sure if it was going to do it or not, but it looks like it's going to pull through for us...A Flock Of Seagulls is nice and different. We're on: 'I Ran', although 'Space Age' is just as good...Last but not least, 'Valley Girl' goes in in a very strictly dayparted rotation...As far as sales go: Asia, Loverboy, and Van Halen still holdin' down the top...Rolling Stones up to #6...38 Special, Scorpions, and Human League also in the Top 10...Survivor, after one week, is #23 with beaucoup phones on that one."

KATT, OKLAHOMA CITY, OK P.D.-JEFF FREUND: "I got to hear portions of the new Robert Plant album, and my feeling is that it's going to be one of the hottest albums to come down the pike this year. Plant's voice is sounding as good as it has during the past five years. Get ready for a monster album..."

M.D.-WARREN WILLIAMS: "I'm impressed that Pete Townshend can take experience in life and translate it so eloquently to vinyl."

**WAAF, WORCESTER, MA M.D.-ROB BARNETT:** "'Chinese Eyes' is Pete Townshend's 'Blood On The Tracks'. There's an immediate love affair going on with the album here, and the tracks getting the most initial response are: 'Slit Skirts', 'Somebody Saved Me', and 'Stardom In Acton'...It took a bunch of listens, but I'm very high on the 'Olympia' track from Jon Anderson's new album. Lots of talk about 'All In A Matter Of Time', but 'Olympia' is the better rocker...We also put the Eddie Money single in this week--'Think I'm In Love'. If there was such a thing as a drought for Money, then this must be the comeback...Promotion of the week: Tickets, air fare, hotel, etc. for a whole slew of Stones European dates. Listeners mail in cards and pick the country of their choice. We're even able to help them with passport arrangements...Listening, looking, watching, and making excuses for: John Waite, Stray Cats, Men At Work, Rory Gallagher, Nazareth, Mayday, Riot, Marshall Crenshaw, and so on...Bring on the Calvary...Officially, our new address is: WAAF, 19 Norwich Street, Worcester, MA 01608. Effective June 21st. Same phone number...I'm packing now, more next week."

**WMYK, ELIZABETH CITY/NORFOLK, VA P.D./M.D.-BILL SIMMONS:** "Excellent Lp from Pete Townshend. My personal favorite is 'Exquisitely Bored', but I see 'Face Dances Part Two' as the primary track for album radio...Eddie Money's 'Shakin' is the strongest track he's ever produced...Incredible phones on: Frank Zappa. Play it heavy before it burns out...Top retail this week goes to: Rolling Stones, surprising no one with a #1 retail debut...Retail surprises this week are: Squeeze and The Clash, both Top 20...Promising retail: Axe and the Motels."

**WHCN, HARTFORD, CT M.D.-BOB BITTENS:** "If I had any heroes, Pete Townshend would be high on the list. The man has consistently been among the best rock songwriters in the world--and he's been doing it for over 15 years. While the new album may not have the hooks to grab you on first listen, don't let that discourage you. After a couple of repetitions, the incredible depth and beauty of his songs will become obvious to you. Townshend has created a masterpiece...We got the new King Crimson in this week. While the majority of the songs are of that nervous, heavily rhythmic style that dominated their last album, there is one highly accessible track that has begun to really grow on me. Check out the song 'Heartbeat' with an open mind, and I think you'll agree it's worth playing...Originally, when we added Stevie Wonder, we were happy just because we got no negative calls. You can imagine how pleased we are now that we're getting a respectable amount of requests for 'Front Line'. It just goes to show that if you play any good song often enough to make it familiar, even one that is not necessarily in the mainstream of your station's style, it'll eventually become acceptable to your listeners...The new Rods will no doubt be acceptable to our younger listeners. 'Too Hot To Stop' will help us fill the metal and bizarre sex quota this week. It's hard to believe that the same people who are so supportive of bands like A Flock Of Seagulls and Haircut One Hundred are also behind a band like The Rods, but that's what makes this business so interesting. I guess we all eventually learn to compromise between our personal taste and the quest for the almighty dollar... 'Valley Girl' and 'Eye Of The Tiger' continue to be our Top 2 requests...In the 'big sales from-relatively-little-airplay' department: A Flock Of Seagulls and Squeeze are doing very well here... Still hot on the home turntable: Men At Work. This album is great, don't let it get lost in the pile of product."

**WAQX, SYRACUSE, NY P.D./M.D.-ED LEVINE:** "This past week I saw the absolute detonation of the Zappa record to the point that very few records have ever gotten. It dominated our requests this week by a 4 to 1 margin. However, by the time this Sheet comes out, we'll probably have started our easing off phase since the negs are already starting to trickle in and the average age of callers has dropped to about 12. For two weeks, it has been a huge record, and I'm glad we're the one that's been banging it...The other record that's destined for stardom is Survivor. It came in strong #2 requests, and people are really looking for the album...However, the new record that I really want to talk about this week comes from some guys out of Central New York, called 805. They've played the bar circuit for years here, slipping their originals in among the standards that you have to play on that circuit, all the time waiting for their chance. With the release of the new album and RCA solidly behind them, they've got the goods to do it. The whole Lp is strong a la early Genesis. From past experience, though, the first two cuts on Side 1 are the tracks that will draw reaction for you. I really think these will be the guys to finally make it BIG out of this area...Loved Hard's comments on the Crosby, Stills & Nash single ('Dump Nixon!! Who's got those papers', etc)--best review of '82. We're playing it in a dayparted situation...This week, the self-proclaimed Rock Doctor or the ayatollah of rock and rollah, Barry Lyons, is moving on to Chicago. Our friendship is well known, so I'll just simply say, he's the best and in six months everyone in Chicago will be agreeing with me...This week also sees the departure of Messrs. Castle and Nast from the competition, although to two completely different situations. The competitive situation in Syracuse in the last 2½ years has become legendary. I wish them both the very best (seriously) in the future. I'm gonna miss you, but boy are you guys lucky you left town."

**WLIR, LONG ISLAND, NY M.D.-RAY WHITE:** "Time for the good news: After months of Washington/FCC-style red tape and having to deal with absolutely no signal, we're finally ready to go. WLIR now resides on the tallest building on Long Island with our best signal ever. To all our friends who have had trouble finding us over the last few months, flip your dial to 92.7 and check us out. Needless to say, it couldn't have happened at a better time, with all of New York radio ready for the biggest battle ever...It's been a fun week for guests, including the likes of: Jackson Browne, Bob Weir, Rod Morgenstein (of the Dregs), David Johansen, and Ian Anderson...DeBella's Screamer This Week: A Flock Of Seagulls, 'Telecommunication'...I couldn't be happier that the Stray Cats have finally cut an American deal. These Long Island boys are the hottest, and just wait till you see them live. They defy categorization, much like Thorogood, so don't lump them in the rockabilly bag. 'Runaway Boys' was the Screamer a year and a half ago, and it's been drawing calls ever since. Setzer is not afraid to play his guitar and just might be the best young American guitar player to come down the pike in a long, long time...Wouldn't you know the Go Go's would come out with a Summer song called 'Vacation' that tugs at the heart. I'm hooked...May I recommend listening to the new Townshend Lp while reading the Rolling Stone interview? It not only sold me on the record, but it gave me a deeper respect and understanding of the guy and his band."

**WBRU, PROVIDENCE, RI M.D.-DAVID FILIPOV:** "Pete Townshend is one of those few artists who can make an uncompromisingly personal record that, nonetheless, merits all the attention it's getting. Our favorites so far are: 'Stardom In Acton' and 'North Country Girl'...Translator single on 415/Columbia has a great sound that we haven't heard for years--literally. Yardbirds updated. It's great!...Speaking of the 60's, there's not much to say about the Crosby, Stills & Nash single that the music doesn't say for itself. Their classic sound for sure. We're looking forward to the album and the tour...Adrian Belew and King Crimson albums in the same week? Hear them both in a dimly lit music office near you. Both will take some time to absorb, to say the least."

**WGRQ, BUFFALO, NY M.D.-BILL WESTON:** "After 2 months as pseudo Music Director, I'm pleased to announce I'm official!! In his infinite wisdom, Paul has decided to drop his shift to two hours, and put me on afternoons, 4-8PM, with the tag on the door that says, 'Music Director/Free Meals & Lp's Department'... Call me on Monday or Wednesday, between Noon and 3:00, to talk radio, records, or to talk period."

WAPI-FM, BIRMINGHAM, AL M.D.-JOANNE PETERSON: "Crosby, Stills & Nash--those unmistakable harmonies are irresistible. Can't wait for the album...Survivor is tearing up our phones. 'Eye Of The Tiger' is a smash."

WKZL, WINSTON-SALEM, NC M.D.-CHUCK HOLLOWAY: "The Pete Townshend has to be the album of the week. It's a real pleasure. It's like having a new Who album. Sort of a middle-aged 'Tommy'. So many good cuts to choose from. We'll start with: 'Stardom' and track other cuts as well...Survivor is an absolute smash--into power rotation after only two weeks...Adds This Week: Pete Townshend, Glenn Frey, and the Crosby, Stills & Nash 12"...Congratulations to: Our own night-rocker, Rod Davis, who's leaving us at the end of this month to become co-host of PM Magazine on WFMY-TV in Greensboro...Also, welcome back to one of my oldest friends in this business, Al Moss, who rejoins the Wynn Jackson indie team in Atlanta. To Al: Keep on smilin'."

WSYR, SYRACUSE, NY M.D.-TOMMY NAST: FROM HOWIE CASTLE: "Thanks to everyone for their assistance and support here at 94ROCK for the past 2½ years. You've all helped make the station an overwhelming success and the dominant station in Syracuse. I'll be talking to you from WOVE next week."...FROM TOMMY NAST: "Well, I thought you all should know that as of July 5th, I'll be working for the Album Network. I look forward to working with all the people who have been friends to me in the past and all those whom I'll get to know. I personally wish to thank Bill Hard for his support over the past 2½ years. Bill, you're truly a class act, and I hope we don't lose contact. I can't believe that now I'll have to deal with Ed Levine each week, oy vey!...On to music: Favorite of the week goes to: Taxxi. 'Cocktail Queen' is an out and out smash. One listen to this and you're hooked. After one listen, I was singing it; after two, I'm now raving about it...The Pete Townshend is getting phones already. His Who influences and solo influences mesh together for another great record...A Flock Of Seagulls has proven itself to be a legitimate hit. Besides, I had a dream the other night that A Flock Of Seagulls flew over Mike Bone and simultaneously shit on his head. I woke up laughing so hard I had to add this one...Clocks is the kind of record that will be around for this Summer. 'She Looks A Lot Like You' is the cut that made the phones light up...Great reaction to: Eddie Money. After one week, it's already Top 10 requests...Rolling Stones debut #1 in sales this week...The Rods continue to get stronger phones each week. Also, these guys put out so much energy live, make sure you're looking for them on tour this Summer...We're proud to announce that 94ROCK once again had the world debut of another major release. We featured cuts from the brand new REO Speedwagon last night and sure enough, the 'cease and desist' came flying through. The record's real, real good. The title cut 'Good Trouble' is my favorite right now. Also check out: 'The Key' and 'Let's Be-Bop'...So that's it for now."

KEZY, ANAHEIM, CA M.D.-LARRY REISMAN: "Adds: Genesis, Pete Townshend, Clocks, and Stray Cats... Looks like another big week for Atlantic Records. The Genesis is quite strong for a live album--powerful would be the word to describe it. We're playing four of the live cuts, along with the new single. This is definitely one of the better live albums released in some time...I'm afraid that Pete Townshend's album doesn't at all compare to his 'Empty Glass' record. There are two cuts I like a lot, which are: 'Stardom' and 'Slit Skirts'. Although 'Slit Skirts' starts slow, I think it's the hottest cooker on the album. It'll be our lead track...Crosby, Stills & Nash are personal favorites of mine and a mainstay here in Southern California. I think the single is a bit on the pretty side, but it should do well because of the band's hip image. If Crosby can stay out of jail, I'm sure they'll have one helluva tour...The Stray Cats will be a record for all to deal with. With the success we've had locally with The Blasters, the Stray Cats are a shoo-in. We're going with: 'Rock This Town'. We're already seeing sales, with the record in the stores for only a couple of days...Top Five Sales: Missing Persons, Asia, Paul McCartney, Frank Zappa, and Toto...Glenn Frey debuts at #11...The Clocks is kind of a cross between Cheap Trick and the Cars--very commercial."

WCMF, ROCHESTER, NY M.D.-DAVE KANE: "Let me just say this about that. The April/May Birch report is out and WCMF maintains its #1 position in the City with a 12.8, out-distancing our direct competitor with the widest margin yet...Record-wise, the WCMF adds this week were: Fleetwood Mac, Eddie Money, Jon Anderson, David Johansen, Pete Townshend, Genesis; and, a conversion add for Steve Miller...Records that I'm crazy about and will get in shortly are: Billy Idol, John Waite, and Stray Cats...Also look for a new RCA album from Rochester's own 805. There are a number of really nice textured songs including: The title 'Stand In Line'...Top requests this past week for: Survivor and Human League...Congratulations to: Elektra's Barry Lyons on his move to Chicago...And best wishes to: Thruway buddies, Tommy Nast and Howie Castle on their respective moves out of Salt City."

WPYX, ALBANY, NY M.D.-RON NENNI: "The new Pete Townshend album is the thinking person's record of the year. It's full of emotion, autobiographical lyrics, and tremendous songs. 'Slit Skirts' says it all for us right now. I think 'The Sea Refuses No River' will end up the classic from the album. 'Saved Me' is one of my favorite tracks. And another great radio song off the album would be 'Stardom In Acton'...All right! The Go Go's are back. 'Vacation' is less bubble gum and more accessible--maybe sugarless bubble gum. Sure hope A&M is hooked up with a travel agency. Yes, we want to do a promotion, too... 'You Might Recall' has surfaced as a standout studio track on the new Genesis album. The album is selling extremely well first week out...Rolling Stones debut at #3--not too shabby... Genesis #4...A Flock Of Seagulls is starting to sell. Just goes to show you, you believe in a song long enough and it does happen...Alan Parsons Project debuted at #17...The phones are lit for Frank Zappa. #1 requests; Survivor #2; and, Steve Miller #3...Can't wait to hear more of the Eddie Money album. That song sounds real good...As does Crosby, Stills & Nash...I listened to the X album; and, hopefully, we'll have room to play this record. I think they're the first band to reflect the late 60's in the 80's with Jefferson Airplane-like vocals and music reminiscent of the Doors. I was pretty impressed with the first song on the album and the last song on the album. They are a guitar band, so they might have a future on most album rock stations."

WHJY, PROVIDENCE, RI M.D.-ROB LIPSHUTZ: "About the new REO Speedwagon--well, what did you expect? It's a follow-up album with the emphasis on 'follow', as in the formula. It's not as severe a case as Boston's 'Don't Look Back', though there are some real clunkers to avoid. So what's good? To my ears, 'Keep The Fire Burnin', 'Good Trouble', and 'Sweet Time' stand out...We've got a lot of faith in The Clash's 'Should I Stay'. Very compelling, dramatic rock. Their following is huge. The Lp is #3 in sales...'Wasted On The Way' by Crosby, Stills & Nash actually says something and has such a distinctive familiar sound. That violin passage really makes it. This one song puts their last album to shame... We switched to the edit of Squeeze's 'Black Coffee'--still garnering requests and Top 10 sales after six weeks...Also of note: Requests for Axe's 'Rock And Roll Party'; and, #11 sales for Marshall Crenshaw...The Townshend album is a real challenge. Aside from 'Face Lances Part Two', I wonder if our audience will accept its advanced style?...I'll be vacationing with family and friends in New York and Philadelphia next week. P.D. Jim Murphy will handle music. Be real nice to him."

WQBK, ALBANY, NY M.D.-LIN BREHMER: "Our favorite new release of the week has to be the new Pete Townshend. Staff members have covered the album with adjectives like 'personal', 'honest', and 'sincere'. Lately Pete's solo material seems to be eclipsing the Who releases. It's great that after all these years Pete doesn't see any need to put out FM oatmeal. Of course, that was exactly Bill's point when he mentioned 'the credibility to get away with being himself'...We got the first Stray Cats Lp at the end of March 1981. So the new Stray Cats Lp sounds to us like a greatest hits package. We've raved about the Stray Cats in these pages more than a few times. The French edition of Playboy's Readers Poll picks Brian Setzer as the rock guitarist of the year. With some touring in the USA, this band could be a major act. I wish I could pick out a choice cut or two for you to key on, but I love them all. We are 7 cuts deep...Top 3 Airplay this week: The Clash, Marshall Crenshaw, and the Rolling Stones...A personal favorite these days: Ry Cooder 'I'm Drinking Again'."

KTIM, SAN RAFAEL, CA M.D.-TRISH ROBBINS: "This apparently is the year that super-bands rank up; i.e., the Eagles and the Doobies. But we benefit from the individual efforts. We lose the group, but not the solo artist -- like Glenn Frey and Cornelius Bumpas. Cornelius already has an Lp out, too, on a small label, and is touring to back the Lp. It's been sounding great on KTIM, and we co-presented the gig here in town. When he came by for a chat, I found him to be a most interesting and lively interview...Also, this week, Ashford and Simpson performed, and I loved it. Even on the first show of a tour, these professionals have got their act together. They deliver up fine vocals wrapped around excellent song writing, and they both can sing, and they're both foxy! They have a new Lp on Capitol, and it is out of sight...The Tam Jam this past weekend enjoyed a sunny and warm day, and a thousand people also enjoyed their beautiful afternoon listening to: Michael Hedges, Maria Muldaur, Cornelius Bumpas, George Winston, and Mark Naftalin. As it was a benefit concert for Big Brothers of Marin, it added to the sweet surroundings...Things are groovin' here in the Bay, hope you're feeling good too."

WWVL, MIAMI, FL M.D.-STEVE HUNTINGTON: "Total turntable domination was achieved this week by Genesis. It's a lot like what 'Eat A Peach' did to me 10½ years ago. I just can't get enough, and, although 'Three Sides Live' is a tremendous Lp, the concept of 3 live sides and one studio side is possibly jinxed. What super group released one in '77 that didn't make the top 25 (after their previous studio Lp - 4½ years earlier - went to #1)? And more recently, how about Al Stewart's generally overlooked offering of the same structure. Genesis will pull it off, though...Roxy Music fans can now come out of hibernation! 'Avalon' is true cause for celebration. We've started on-the-air with 'True To Life'...Steve Miller's new album is clearly his best since (you fill in the blank). 'Things I Told You', 'Give It Up', and 'While I'm Waiting' have all joined the single on the Love 94 airwaves...We welcome some new Love 94 staffers: Michael Ross (heavy credentials there), Cory James (also a former SHE, plus the Magic WBUS), and, local phenom (if he had his way) Darryl Gillian."

WHFS, BETHESDA, MD P.D./M.D.-DAVID EINSTEIN: "The Stray Cats import has been a staple here for a couple of years now, and this new domestic compilation is a fine set of rock and roll...The new Go's single got instant phones, both sides...Other singles and 12 inches pulling phone response: B Movie, Moonsoon (a monster here), and Missing Persons 'Words'...The heaviest phones are far and away for Frank and Moon Zappa's 'Valley Girl'...We had the King Crimson cassette in advance of the Lp, and phone requests were strong. Expect it to do well here...Also anticipate positive reception for the long awaited Adrian Belew...And, good local talent nationally bound is Tommy Keene. Check it out on Avenue Records."

KNAC, LONG BEACH, CA P.D./M.D.-JIMMY CHRISTOPHER: "Let's talk shows: Last night (Tues., June 15th), The Clash and The English Beat at the Hollywood Palladium. Sweaty, dancing, slamin', loud, and rockin'. I'm glad I was in the VIP balcony, thanks Epic...I'm real fired up for Kid Creole and the Coconuts this Friday at the Roxy. They're doing 4 nights there and I'll talk on that next week... Let us not forget another show I've been looking forward to for a long time. This Sunday at the Country Club it's A Flock Of Seagulls and Slow Children...Music wise: Get into the Billy Idol, a great summer album. Listen to it a couple of times because I think there is something for everyone... The New Order import single 'Temptation' is true to New Order's form...And, I like the Soft Cell import single 'Torch' and 'Insecure Me'...There is a local rock-a-billy man named Rip Masters and the album is 'The Cool And The Crazy'. It is nice, clean rock-a-billy. I got an advance of the test pressing, and that's gonna be some hot stuff for Elektra/Asylum...And, finally, we interviewed: Chrome Dinette, Joe King Carrasco, and Marshall Crenshaw...That's it. Be good and I'll see you next week."

WLAV-FM, GRAND RAPIDS, MI P.D.-DAVE LOGAN: "Sean Coakley's comments on Pete Townshend, as usual, appeal to the inner ear. Though for all of Pete's fans, the album shoots straight at your heart-- a bullseye of the deepest variety for Tony's all-time hero. Bill, your comments last week said it all...Add our applause to the legions of Genesis fanatics who have already spoken so elegantly of this effort...Call me an airhead for forgetting to report Frank and Moon these past two weeks. Requests are as they said, 'tubular to the max, fer sure'...Question: What do Asia, Alan Parsons Project, and Pete Townshend have in common? Answer: The CMI Fairport, the instrument of the 80's...I sympathize with all my friends in the record industry who are both blessed and cursed by the current deluge of superstar and work projects. I respect your positions, and many of you have done a marvelous job in gearing our ears for that ever elusive shot. Unfortunately, personal picks must always take a back seat to priorities. There is the consideration bin and the reality bin. When I'm looking at ten legitimate superstar releases in the next two weeks, bottom line must rule...Personal to MM: Hope the monitoring went well."

WIOT, TOLEDO, OH M.D.-BUCK McWILLIAMS: "Congrats to: WMMS, Leo Gorman, and the staff on their big victory last week. Those of us who grew up in Cleveland knew from its inception that there is only one rock station in that town, and now WMMS has proven it again...From the 'random thoughts' department. Records we tried with no success: Chas Sandford, Split Enz, Jon & Vangelis, Dave Edmunds, Monroes, and Elton John...Records in trouble: Heart, Cheap Trick, and Frankie Miller...In heavy at home: King Crimson, Adrian Belew (what great timing on that release--now both may suffer), The Clash, Gary U.S. Bonds, Alan Parsons Project, and Steve Miller...What's this? No airplay in some markets on Alan Parsons and Gary U.S. Bonds? Somebody's missing the boat...On that subject, one of the only guys I ever did favors for was Dan Zam at A&M, and now he's gone. Guess that's one less outfit I ever have to do favors for. By the way, this top-notch promo man can be reached at 313-372-8467... Now let's discuss X. This high priority project is more accessible than anything they've ever done. They may have alienated some of their wrist-slashing fans, but the weak point of this record is just what we've been expecting to be the strong point--the vocal production. Ray Manzarik seems to have left out the aggressive vocals to match the texture of the songs. Still, I think we'll add it because I strongly believe there's something in this project, and we're the kind of station that will go out and prove it. Look for: 'Under The Big Black Sun', 'Hungry Wolf', and 'Riding With Mary' to lead. It's time to play The Clash, and this is the week...Upward moves this week: Glenn Frey and Eddie Money, medium to heavy...Finally, thanks for the road trips to Toledo from: Linda Baker, Warners; Mike Stone, Elektra; Ron Count, Atlantic; Louis Heidlemeyer, Capitol; and, Frank Shively, Epic."

**WKQQ, LEXINGTON, KY P.D.-DAVE KRUSENKLAUS:** "My favorite album to be released so far this year is Pete Townshend. Lyricaly the album is a personal diary of what Pete's been going through over the past few years. Since he quit drinking, he seems to sing better. And musically the album is solid and, I think, more consistent than 'Empty Glass'. Early reaction is very strong. With the exception of 'North Country Girl', all cuts are solid. We're going to start with 'Face Dances Part 2' and 'Slit Skirts'...I hear the Crosby, Stills & Nash record is good. For me, the single is a little sleazy, although I have to agree the harmonies are intact. But for our purposes, we're going to give the single a good shot...Finally going with Marshall Crenshaw this week...And Eddie Money is back with his patented-brand-pop. I don't see how 'Think I'm In Love' can avoid being a hit record...Top priority when I get back from vacation is Billy Idol's 'Hot In The City'. A great Pinch Hit pick. So far this Summer, I don't think I've heard a better roll-down-the-sun-roof-cruise-through-the-streets song better than this one...Also very close to Gary U.S. Bonds. 'Out Of Work' is the natural choice for high unemployment areas, but I think 'Love's On The Line' is the album rock winner...The Clocks record is a fresh sound for me. Good harmonies and tight songs. I like 'She Looks A Lot Like You' and 'Nobody's Fool'...Response is very strong and from a wide variety of demographics for Glenn Frey's 'Partytown'...The #1 request killer is Survivor's 'Eye Of The Tiger'. Some regional retail people have told me that 'Eye Of The Tiger' is one of the most requested records in years...Once again I'll be on vacation the week of June 21st, and the list will be frozen."

**WBLM, LEWISTON/PORTLAND, ME M.D.-JOSE DIAZ:** "Pete Townshend has given us an album that shatters all pre-conceptions. This record stands on its own two legs in a very personal way, yet it all comes together and makes a lot of sense. The strongest cut at this point would have to be 'Stardom In Acton'...We all know Genesis is on a roll nowadays after years of paying dues. There's not much I can say about this live Lp that hasn't been said before. It will definitely go to the Top of the charts...It's taken a few listens but the Fleetwood Mac song is rather infectious. At first I thought it was rather light but the more I listen, it turns out to be one of their strongest songs since the days of the 'White Album' and 'Rumours'...It looks like John Cougar has a hit around these parts. 'Hurts So Good' is all over the dial...One of our most requested songs is 'Eye Of The Tiger' by Survivor...We're also starting to develop a good request pattern on 'Partytown' by Glenn Frey...For a band that is more well known for its heavy metal crunch rock sound, 'Love Leads To Madness' is a very refreshing change that makes Nazareth far more valuable than before."

**KBLE-FM, DES MOINES, IA P.D./M.D.-RON SORENSON:** "I'm totally excited about the Duran Duran album! They're the only band successfully combining elements of the new romanticism movement with mainstream rock. 'Rio' shows major growth in song writing too. Go for 'Last Chance On The Stairway', 'Nightmare', 'Save A Prayer' or 'Rio'...Pete Townshend's 'Chinese Eyes' is another station favorite this week. What comes across plainly is that this man, in addition to his obvious skills as a composer and musician, is a caring person, deeply committed to improving the human condition. Thanks for sharing this one with us...I've been a Joe Cocker fan since the first album. He's been up and he's been down; but when Joe is on, he's one of the most soulful rock vocalists we've got. He's on for this one! Try Steve Winwood's 'Talking Back To The Night', Bob Dylan's 'Seven Days' or Andy Fraser's 'Sweet Li'l Woman'...Short shots: Thanks to Genesis for the new material on 'Three Sides Live'. It's much more than filler...Bonnie Hayes--if you played the Go Go's you should listen to Bonnie...Stray Cats--about time that we had a monastic release on this fine band. We like 'Rock This Town', 'Stray Cat Strut', and 'Lonely Summer Nights'...Twas good to see all the bodies at the Upper Mid West Communications Conclave this past weekend. Hi and howdy doody to George Garrity, Bob Catania, Margo Knez, Steve Brack, and a special thank you to Chuck, Eric, Dan, and Bob from E/P/A for the magnificent pig roast. Eric: I'm taking you up on the offer for next year. Most memorable quote of the convention came from MCA's Candy Fleming, who, when suddenly unable to embrace an old friend, explained by saying, 'I was gonna give you a hug, but my hand's stuck in Ron's pants'...Adds: Genesis, Pete Townshend, Joe Cocker, Duran Duran, Stray Cats, Thomas Dolby, Billy Idol, Ronnie Hayes, David Sanborn, Rory Gallagher and CSN 12."

**WMAD, MADISON, WI M.D.-DALE WOLTER:** "The book is over, I'm taking it easy this week! Bye now!"

**KILO, COLORADO SPRINGS, CO M.D.-ART PHILLIPS:** "Listening to Pete Townshend's new album is like being tapped into Pete's personal diary. It's not apparent that Townshend takes more important music away from The Who; and like any masterpiece, this record has the ability to make you laugh and cry. For starters, 'Face Dances Part 2', 'Stardom In Acton' (a sleazy London suburb where Pete grew up) and 'Exquisitely Bored'...Finally the Stray Cats land a deal. Now watch for these greasers to pick up where the Blasters left off. We played the import with mild success last year and we'll start with 'Rock This Town' and the 'Stray Cat Strut'...Instant phones on the Johansen Animals Medley. A couple of listeners actually thought that Eric Burdon had put the Animals back together...Kim Wilde's taking off with phones and a mild trickle of retail...Alan Parsons is filling that precision-pop void...And Marshall Crenshaw is very close to taking it all the way. Crenshaw is much more than just this year's model--he's got the talent and the delivery...Congratulations to Steven Spielberg who has given us the best the film industry has to offer with 'E.T.' Just as we still look forward to the magic of movies like 'Wizard Of Oz', 'E.T.' will be loved for generations to come!"

**WOWD, TALLAHASSEE, FL P.D.-DICK BLACKMON:** "After adding 11 pieces last week, we had to go easy this time. The Pete Townshend and Genesis Lps are our only adds. Genesis moves into heavy...Well, everything I've heard is true about this Zappa record. We put it in last week. Every third request is for 'Valley Girl'. We give them a standard reply, 'okay, fine, fer sure, fer sure'...Asia, McCartney and 38 Special are still the sales leaders...Speaking of which, thanks to Train, Buddy Bear and Marg for the great time at the Iron Maiden, Point Blank, 38 Special show last week. More power to a rock and roll survivor! On the new album, we'll start with 'Stardom'...The big mover last week was the Survivor 'Eye Of The Tiger'. Phonewise it leaped up from nowhere to be one of our most requested new tunes...John Cougar's phones are also building and we're seeing phone action on Alan Parsons, Gary Bonds, and Bow-Wow-Wow...Adds: Eddie Money, Pete Townshend, April Wine...Conversions: John Cougar to h-o-t. Survivor, Alan Parsons into medium...New Hampshire Sales: Asia, Motels, Van Halen, Stevie Wonder, Paul McCartney and Toto."

While 'Chinese Eyes' might not have the musical punch of 'Empty Glass', the lyrics soar, baring his soul for rock and roll. This album really makes the new stuff shine as well as capturing some of the old favorites that I've always loved. The production is state of the art, just as Genesis is itself...Pete Townshend? It's going to be fun watching the marketing on these two records...Ron says, 'Don't by any means miss the boat on the 'Eye In The Sky'. We still think that's the lead track. I bet it'll be a hit single and contrary to what Bill implied two weeks ago, the last album was a hit monster. So, don't forget 'Eye In The Sky'."

We're being flanked by major releases on one side and deserving acts that need a break on the other. Finally, able to spare some room for John Waite...Waiting for some room for the Stray Cats, the Clocks and Gang Of Four--yes, Gang Of Four. 'I Love A Man In A Uniform' has quite the hook...Moving to superstar status phones: Zappa and Survivor...Personal to Bill McGathy: Call me anytime and if you follow through on your threat to visit, make sure you pick a sunny weekend and I'll reserve a quiet beach for us to stage a final assault a la the Falklands."

KWXL, ALBUQUERQUE, NM P.D.-BILL STAMBAUGH: "Thanks to Joe Bravo and Epic Records for a great time in Phoenix at the Clash concert this past weekend. I got to tell you this, Joe, I like Bob Conrad's pool better--the water in yours is just a bit muddy...For all the Italian Gormets out there, the Italian Grotto in Scottsdale is the place to go...From DOUG DAVIS, M.D.: "I'd like to thank everyone for the warm welcoming. It's great to be back in radio and Bill Stambaugh and the staff here at KWXL are great to work with. I will be taking calls after my air shift 6-10AM beginning July 1st."

KEZO, OMAHA, NB P.D.-GREG GILLISPIE: "Adds: Pete Townshend, Genesis, Steve Miller, Gary U.S. Bonds, Jon Anderson, David Johansen, Clocks, Eddie Money 45...Last week I talked about the slow start of Heart, Kansas, Cheap Trick and Queen. Witness 'Stardom In Acton' our favorite song, along with 'Face Dances'...The Genesis Lp captures the true wizardry of this band. The live material stands out as being truly dimensional. We also like 'You Might Recall' off the studio side...The Clocks 'She Looks A Lot Like You' is a hit. Enough said about that one...The David Johansen will serve a dual purpose. They are out there doing their job just so that they can make their house payments and car payment just like us. Do not be condescending to them. They are human beings and deserve respect."

BOB LINDER, WDHA: "Asia. I've lots of patience to deal with large personalities and I personally love their current effort, even after wearing out the album. I sincerely believe in their great potential if they can stick together. And I would make sure that they did an ID for WDHA/North Jersey (hint, hint)."

ART PHILLIPS, KILO: "I'd go on the road with Elvis Costello just so I could take him around the country and knock some sense into people after they saw him and realized that he is the greatest. My second choice is the Stray Cats, but I'm not getting any tattoos."

DAVE KRUSENKLAUS, WKQQ: "First of all, I think I would find it a little difficult to be a road manager. I guess I'm not cut out for the one-night stand life style. In my many meetings with acts that have come through this town since I've been here, I have a feel for just how grinding that can be...I think if I had to pick a group though, it would be Journey. The people in their organization that I have met are a class act. And given the stature of the group, I bet the pay's real good."

JOSE DIAZ, WBLM: "A band like Asia. They're essentially a new, exciting, refreshing band, yet they seem to have a professionalism to make the job of road manager easier than if you're working with young kids that had never been on the road before."

RON SORENSON, KBLE: "Pat Benatar or Wendy Waldman for all of the obvious reasons. Or Jackson Browne or the Kind cause I really like their music."

JOEL WEBBER: "I would have liked to have been a road manager in the days before rock and roll was an every day occurrence in even the smallest towns in the U.S. I remember rock and roll shows being major events that people looked forward to for months. It all seems so commonplace nowadays. Can you imagine what it must have been like to be with successful British rock bands in the 60's like the Stones, Beatles, Who or Kind, and play in a town like San Francisco or Detroit for the first time? The kids must have gone complete apeshit! There was no 'circuit', just towns and people. It must have been fascinating to be part of creating what has now turned into one of the biggest parts of show biz. It also must have been a hell of a good time...If I were to be a road manager now, I'd like to work for Roxy Music for the glamour and Pia Zadora for the---er, prestige."

BOB CATANIA, RCA: "Blondie. Any job that would require me to spend long hours involved with Debbie Harry would be the ultimate joy. This infatuation stems from a long-lasting love affair with her first promo poster on 'Private Stock'. Oh yea, the music's real good, too."

MICHAEL ABRAMSON, ISLAND: "Probably would have been Jimi Hendrix. He always was and still is my idol. To this day there has been no one more influential in rock and roll music than Jimi was. I don't know if we'll ever see another like him."

LENNY BRONSTEIN, HEAVY LENNY PROMOTIONS: "That's easy. The Tubes! The world's most fun band. Since the day I met the Tubes, in September of 1974, I felt that they were the most creative, intelligent, and far-seeing band of our time. There's a zaniness, a joi de vive, and sense of history about them. Having known them and worked with them for all my years at A&M, I don't think that there is a more straight ahead, hard-working band that has paid more dues than the Tubes. That's been my formula for success, and in the long run, it's paid off for the Tubes, too."

JON SCOTT, MUSICVISION: "Tom Petty and the Heartbreakers, because they're the greatest band in the world. They're not hell raisers, and don't tear up hotel rooms, and most times act as gentlemen...Also the Pinups. Who wants to travel with guys all the time. Right, M-Man?"

MIKE BONE, ARISTA: "I would like to be the road manager for Krokus because I've been involved with the band since before their first album was released on the States. I have a relationship with the members of the band and as importantly, the members of the crew, on a personal and intellectual level. For instance, they're straight, none of them use drugs, and neither do I. The group believes in hard work and what they're doing and so do I. I guess my second choice would be Rush. I genuinely like those guys as human beings."

PAUL RAPPAPORT, COLUMBIA: "I would love to road manage ZZ Top because in the fine Texas tradition, they are some of the nicest people around. I just can't seem to get enough of that Texas boogie. Besides all that, Billy Gibbons is one of the greatest guitar players on this earth, and it would give me a good chance to steal some licks."

SEAN COAKLEY, ATCO: "I'd like to do sound for Marcel Marceau because there's not much to carry."

JERRY JAFFE, POLYGRAM: "I'd either like to be the road manager for Shooting Star or Prism. If I were the road manager for either band, I would not have to actively schlep their equipment, and I would never have to make any arrangements for them beyond making a telephone call lasting longer than 7 seconds. The other possibility, if I may, and if we could put them back together, would be road manager for The Village People. I would have eliminated the competition for women backstage."

J.B. BRENNER, A&M: "Wayne Newton, an incredible talent who could make maximum dollars for me with a minimum amount of travel. I could hang-out during the day at Lake Mead and gamble and play with the show-girls at night."

## QUESTION CONTINUED

BOB BITTENS, WHCN: "I'd be the road manager for Steely Dan. I'd never have to leave my apartment. Easiest job in the world."

JIM BUCKLEY, WRCN: "Probably the Jefferson Starship. I've been in love with Grace Slick since the mid 60's, and even with all their problems, they always seem to be having a good time and making money."

BOB MAJERSKY, WXUS: "It'd have to be Ozzy Osbourne because I've always wanted to be a veterinarian."

RAD MESSICK, WFYV: "I'm mad at Dave--he got my job. No hard feelings, just bring him to town. If it had to be anybody else, it would be a toss between Yes and The Who. They are the greatest."

ROB BARNETT, WAAF: "Springsteen--self-explanatory."

BILL SIMMONS, WMYK: "Stevie Nicks--self-explanatory."

WARREN WILLIAMS, KATT: "I think I'd like to experience life through the eyes of John Cougar. I'd sort of like to rock with him, have a beer with him, etc. He has a clear definition of common experiences in life. I'd just like some insight into the man--not to mention that the end product is so good."

STEVE HUNTINGTON, WWL: "It would have to be Bruce Springsteen because he is so good and honest, and we share our Jersey Shore roots."

STEVE FEINSTEIN, WYSP: "Talking Heads because they are a perfect blend of the cerebral and the emotional. I'd settle for other artists like NRBQ, Tom Verlaine, or Richard and Linda Thompson."

RALPH TORTORA, WBAB: "Bonnie Raitt, simply because I'm in love with her...Rod Stewart, to see if he really is that rowdy on the road...And I would have liked to have been involved with Cream in any way possible."

DAVE KANE, WCMF: "The Rods, so I can get in on their photo sessions. In all seriousness though, Bruce Springsteen. Out of all performers, I have the most respect and admiration for him."

LIN BREHMER, WQBK: "I'd be the road manager for Tom Verlaine. I think I would enjoy the company. I would be excited by what would surely be a challenge, and I would love the music."

RON DIAZ, WYNF: "I'd want to be a road manager for Mink DeVille, cause my brother-in-law is the lead guitar player, and I hear Willie likes to party...Other than that, Girlschool, because I'm a dirty young man."

RON NENNI, WPYX: "I hope my wife doesn't read this, but I'd like to be the road manager for EmmyLou Harris, and I hope her husband doesn't read this either. The reasons are obvious."

TIM SMITH, WLVO: "I've always been an admirer of The Who, but at this time, I'll take Pete Townshend. It would be much easier with a band that is already established and is wanted, as opposed to a band whose promoters are trying to push them on the public."

DAVID FILIPOV, WBRU: "I think U2 would be a good group to road manage. I'd feel like I was on the edge of something about to go big."

DOUG PODELL, WLLZ: "Huey Lewis And The News. It looks like they're going to be around for a long time, and the charisma, class, and energy all together is the kind of artist I'd like to deal with."

JEFF JENSEN, KL0L: "It would probably be Genesis for me. Since every album they've done is completely different, every tour would be completely different."

THE DOCTOR, WYFE: "No question about it, the Grateful Dead. Having been a Deadhead for many years, I have no choice."

RON REGER, WNOR-FM, "Frank Sinatra. They're my kind of people."

BOB BAILEY, WKLS: "Steely Dan. They don't go on the road. A great job. Can you imagine a better job? I'd stay home for five years and get a terrific salary."

CRAIG MARTIN, KZOK: "I don't think I'd wanna be a road manager for any artist. It's gotta be 10 times more hectic than this end of the business, but I guess it might as well be the Rolling Stones so I can do it first class. You know, ride around in Lear jets and all that."

JIM KINNEY, WTUE: "Pink Floyd, simply because they're the best."

BOB WALTON, WQDR: "Well, let's see. First and foremost I'd like to be a road manager for Glass Moon to get them out on the road. Right now I wouldn't mind being the road manager for Axe to be in on the ground floor and watch 'em take off...I would not want to be the road manager for Van Halen or the Rods. I like brown M&M's and I don't have a Polaroid."

BRUCE GOLDSSEN, WRKI: "Steely Dan. They make lots of royalties but they don't tour. It's easy work."

MIKE LYONS, WDIZ: "The Who. My absolute dream rock and roll band. They have defined the spirit and deliverance of true rock and roll for me ever since 1965 when Pete Townshend made his leap from the top of his Marshall Stack in 'Baba O'Reilly'. He killed the first four rows at Madison Square Garden. I think their jaws are still frozen open."

NEIL LASHER, WKLC: "In the 5 years I worked for Polydor and EMI Records, the group I probably loved working with most of all was 10cc. They didn't have a cocky, 'I hate America' attitude. They were professional musicians who put on a good show if two people or 20,000 people showed up. If I could manage a band, it would be them. (I'd try to convince them to be a little more commercial, cause they deserve to be millionaires.)"

GREG GILLESPIE, KEZO: "I definitely gave that some thought last Fall when I was looking for work. The bands that initially came to mind were Journey and Blackfoot. Both are first class organizations and know how to work with radio. Having a radio person in their entourage could only help."

DAN WALSTON, WIMZ: "Fleetwood Mac--because you wouldn't have to tour all the time, but when you did you would reap the rewards."

JACK DANIELS, WROQ: "Genesis. First, I love their music and second, coming off the success of 'Abacab' and the single on 'Three Sides Live', they have a lot going for them financially, and that would be nice."

DICK BASCOM, WQXM: "It wouldn't be Ozzy Osbourne. I'd be a memory in a week...I guess I would really like to work with Sammy Hagar. In my opinion, he's one of the hottest rockers around and a nice guy--and that's really the biggest thing. He'd probably be the easiest of the heavyweight rockers to work with."



RANDY HOCK, ARISTA (212-489-7400): "Sometimes it is difficult for me, as a promotion man, not to think of music as everything. For the last six months, it seems that the first words out of my mouth have been 'Haircut One Hundred' this or 'A Flock Of Seagulls' that. I'd like to take this opportunity to talk about 'OUR music' in the proper context. As being part of. Something extraordinary happened this past Saturday in NYC. A great body of humanity gathered in Central Park for what may be the largest peace rally ever in this history of this country--between 500,000 and 750,000 people. It would be easy for the cynic in all of us to dismiss the day as one last grand demonstration--one final outpouring from all the social and political activists, the burnouts, and malcontents of the 60's and 70's. But this turnout was so much more than just the refugees of Woodstock. It was a magnificent cross-section of humanity from short order cooks to surgeons--people of all ages, races, and religions (many of whom had never, ever dreamed of joining a protest). Men, women, and children from Boston, Berlin, Hiroshima, Poland, and Jerusalem gathered on the Great Lawn to make it clear to the world they were frightened and concerned about the future of this planet. A sea of signs and placards voiced their feelings: 'Don't blow us--good planets are hard to find', 'Nuclear war is the height of arrogance', 'Employment, not Deployment', and a classic message around the neck of a bloodhound, 'I want to live to see my grandpups'. An impressive list of speakers from Coleen Dewhurst to Orson Welles to Coretta King climbed on stage throughout the afternoon to present a variety of comments and perspectives on the danger of the current massive nuclear buildup to people. The message was simple--you can only destroy a planet once. Both sides now possess more than enough nuclear muscle to reduce this earth into smoldering ash. It is time for the mighty to turn their attention to the real needs of a world riddled by war, hate and recession. If I were to sum up the hopes and aspirations of all who attended--If I were to capture in one moment the spirit of the day, I could not do any better than Jackson Browne, Linda Rondstadt and Bruce Springsteen as they harmonized on 'The Promised Land'. I have never been so moved in all my days of rock and roll. I am still in awe. I hope I never forget."

PAUL RAPPAPORT, COLUMBIA (212-975-8616): "Heiss, thanks for the fudge. It's historical!...Well, I should be starting my comments out with Men At Work, but first I'd like to take a commercial break and talk a little about the Plimsouls. Wow, what a track! 'A Million Miles Away' has a guitar riff that will absolutely captivate you. Kind of like the Byrds, the Love, and the Rolling Stones all rolled into one. However, this rave should not be misinterpreted to mean that you should add the Plimsouls before you add Men At Work, but I sure would add it right afterwards if I were you... The Men, by the way, is burnin'. I know we are not supposed to talk call letters here, but we are boasting over 80 stations strong with an accent on heavy in a lot of traffic out there. Both 'Who Can It Be Now' and 'Down Under' are ultimate phone-burners. Ask McNutt and the people in Texas, not to mention the mighty MET and a host of others. The Strawberries' people are so excited about the play on BCN that they are giving us an extra month of displays. Gloria, it looks like you pick another one!!!...Speaking of Gloria, how would you like a job in our A&R department? First Loverboy, then Men At Work, now Harlequin! This baby is just out and already we are getting feedback on 'I Did It For Love' (your choice) and 'Hard Road', a song penned for our beloved Editor...And how about that Eddie Money guy?! Thanks to all for the love and support for this all-star. I agree with Doug Podell. 'I Think I'm In Love' is destined to take the place of 'Two Tickets'. We've been waiting a long time for a new Eddie Money album, and when they played us this, it blew our minds... Attention! Attention! Attention! There is a new sparkler being rush-released. It is the long-awaited new Elvis Costello. Some of you who already know about it know that it is brilliant. For those who are a little on the skids with Elvis, let me set the record straight--it's a fucking masterpiece! Yes, the whole album is not rock and roll, but the song 'Man Out Of Time' will fix that... Lastly, but certainly not least, check out the new Rosanne Cash Lp. (Susan loves it.) There are two killers for THE format: One is 'I Look For Love', and the other is 'It Hasn't Happened Yet'... In conclusion, I would just like to say that I take great heart in the fact that so many people are involved in discussing and working for nuclear disarmament. I never have understood war, nuclear or otherwise."

JERRY JAFFE, POLYGRAM (212-399-7044): "Amongst a selected few groups, Yes remains a cornerstone of album rock radio. Their influence on modern music is undeniable. The driving force behind Yes, their main composer and vocalist, Jon Anderson, has just released an Lp 'Animation' on Atlantic which contains some amazing music which is both distinguished and programmable. I would have loved to have had this album on Polygram, but Atlantic holds the U. S. contract. The opening cut 'Olympia' is a majestic and melodic anthem that is also no-holds-barred rock and roll. 'Surrender' is as timely a message opus that you can get that also zips along against the grain of the backbeat. Many other great songs appear on the album that should be classics on any Yes album. As we 'speak', Jon is rehearsing an all-star band on the West Coast for a major tour, commencing in July. If radio puts its ears to Jon's album, I am positive that audience response will force it to the top of the Airplay Index in no time. I implore Jon's friends, record company associates, and those who respect this creative gentleman and musical innovator, to take some time from their other obsessions (the Rolling Stones and Asia to name but two), and give Jon Anderson his rightful boost. If this happens, album rock radio will be greatly enhanced this Summer."

LENNY BRONSTEIN, HEAVY LENNY PROMOTIONS (213-450-6224): "One of the most inane memos I've ever read is the BRILLIANT new suggestion of debuting three edited songs as a five minute feature every three hours on the Superstars stations, and pawing it off as exposing much more new music. If I was a listener, and heard an exciting new cut on the radio which was cut off a minute-and-a-half into the song to play some other unknown item (whether dubious or meritorious), I'd wanna bomb that radio station. It's bad enough that the 'P' category is being pawed off as a medium when it ranges between lunar and light, but this has got to be one of the great abominations of all time... However, in defense of modern music programming, it's refreshing to see Atlanta finally readjusting the flow-sheets to allow for this glut of superstars and emerging talent to be exposed. Hopefully, it is a good sign for the future. With all the 'modern music' emanating from KROQ-type radio stations, and possibly the expansion of that format into other markets (could San Francisco be next?), there is more refreshing new music on the radio for the casual or even active listener than at any time in the last 5 or 6 years. Congratulations A&R departments, and pat yourselves on the back radio for finally getting ahead of the Joneses...Personal to movie buffs: You must see 'Road Warrior', 'Firefox', 'E.T.' and 'Poltergeist'. Check here for a review next week on 'Blade Runner'. 'Dead Men Don't Wear Plaid' is only for future film editors, rabid Steve Martin fans who don't mind shitty scripts, or people who love to look at Rachel Ward...Stay heavy."

Sources have told the Rock Report that PHIL COLLINS of Genesis may be putting together a solo tour for the Fall. Musicians include Chester Thompson, Alphonso Johnson, Peter Robinson, and the Earth, Wind & Fire horn section.

The name of the new RUSH Lp is "Signals". It will be out by the end of August. Some of the songs are "Subdivision", "Digital Man", "Analog Kid", and "The Weapon".

The new TED NUGENT album, simply titled "Nugent", will be released shortly. A short one-month tour of some of the Western states starts July 13th in California, and moves through Arizona and New Mexico, and ends on July 25th. No plans to hit the East Coast yet.

JETHRO TULL will tour the States in the Fall. According to Ian Anderson, that's when he'll write material for the next Tull project.

The new RINGO STARR album is now complete, though there is no title. The release date is sketchy though it will probably be out by the end of the Summer. The record was produced by Joe Walsh, who also plays guitar on it.

ALICE COOPER is finished with his new Lp, and it will be out by the end of the Summer. It was produced by Alice himself and his bass player, Erik Scott. The ROCK REPORT has learned that a feature on the Lp is a duet between Alice and Patty Donahue, who is the lead singer of The Waitresses.

The OUTLAWS' Summer tour is scheduled. They'll be playing in June on the 24th in Pittsburgh; 25th in Syracuse; 26th in New York City; 27th in Poughkeepsie; 28th and 29th in Philadelphia; and the 30th in Asbury Park. Those dates are with Duke Jupiter. In July, they'll tour with Rainbow and Riot, and go through Virginia, Maryland, North Carolina, Tennessee, Georgia, and Florida.

JONI MITCHELL's new self-produced album will be out by the end of September. Now, she's deciding on the title and the cover art work. Also playing guitar on the record is Steve Lukather from Toto.

**FOR YOUR INFORMATION:**

When reading the individual station report, please remember that there are three ways in which album rotations are tracked.

- PLAYS PER DAY** - This refers to the actual number of exposures an album gets between 6 AM and Midnight on an average day of the reporting week.
- PLAYS PER WEEK** - Most of our weekly play reporters go back over their music logs for the previous week, and those totals are relayed to us and printed up.
- AIRPLAY EMPHASIS** - Be careful not to confuse this with **PLAYS PER DAY/WEEK**. EMPHASIS is a system of relative scaling, based on 5. If the highest rotation album gets 8 spins per day, it receives 5 points. If another album gets 4 spins, it merits 3 points, etc. This allows a much more detailed rundown than the conventional light/medium/heavy system.

The Airplay Index is our ranking system for the amount of play on albums as a whole. We determine rankings by converting all daily and weekly play reports to a 1-5 emphasis system and totalling the points on a given Lp. We use a simple percentage breakdown to indicate the amount of play on each track.
