Thieves hit Canned Heat for \$30,000

Canned Heat awoke recently in Cleveland to discover that their whole van of equipment and amplifiers had been canned by some of the local thieves.

The van which held all the equipment worth \$30,000 was parked outside their hotel. Rather than risk walking down the street with all the equipment, the police assumed that the thieves took the whole truck.

The amplifiers were designed by engineer Frank Cooley, and were considered one of a kind. There haven't been any other like them made and they were designed to meet the specialized needs of the group.

Canned Heat are currently in the midst of a highly successful national tour. For the remainder of the tour they will have to use rented equipment. The group are offering \$500 with "no questions asked" for information leading to the whereabouts of their equipment.

There may just be a hex on the Canned Heat. The same night that their equipment was stolen, the home of their secretary, Ruth Berkowitz, burned to the foundations in Laurel Canyon, near Hollywood.

SO-BUSY DAYS FOR THE BEACH BOYS

The Beach Boys are currently appearing in concert in London. While in Europe, they will topline an all-star musical revue for three television specials — all to be filmed there.

They were recently seen in group appearances which took them to Glasgow, Scotland, and Offenburg and Stuttgart, Germany, for three days of filming.

Following this, the boys are headed for Brussels, and Belgium. Stops in Amsterdam, Holland, Paris, France, and Italy are on the agenda.

The Boys are due to release their new album entitled, "20-20".

Traffic are in a jam. The highly successful British group have split up. Stevie Winwood, the lead of the group, is away in Holland and unavailable for comment. A spokesman for the group said in England that Traffic have cancelled all their work and are not going to do any more recording.

There are still a lot of unreleased tracks, recorded by the group, which have never been released. There is speculation that these tracks will be packaged into a last album at some time in the future.

Trouble has not been too far away from Traffic at any time in their existence. Dave Mason has left and returned to Traffic so many times that he was beginning to look like a yo-yo. So perhaps Traffic have always been moving towards the inevitable breakup.

All the members of Traffic feel that there is merit in the breakup because they think the group concert in music is beginning to dissolve. They just feel they are moving with the times.

One of the post-break rumors is the speculation that Stevie Winwood will now form a group with Eric Clapton.

Clapton, a member of Cream until they split up, said earlier this year that he would like to do some work with Winwood. The speculation on this point has the two either forming a group, or at least doing a record together.

COSBY AT YOUR SERVICE, 'SAH'

Bill Cosby has just opened his own limosine service in Los Angeles. The limosine service is named "Sah". Sah is supposedly the sound that is made just before the delivery of a karate chop.

The limosine service will be run by Mariette Burr, a long-time Cosby friend and employee in his personal office.

Lulu will portray a teenage girl in her second film which should go into production next year. It was reported in London that the film will be called "On the Subject of Jennie" and Lulu plays the heroine.

The film will be a drama with music. So far no one has been set to portray Lulu's romantic interest.

Lulu, who is back in the British top ten with "I'm A Tiger" is said to be very excited about the film.

The British singer's first film was "To Sir With Love" which starred Sidney Poitier.

Sly & The Family Stone broke attendance records at Long Island's Action House recently. The previous record had been set by them earlier in the year, but their return engagement drew even more people.

The group returns to its native San Francisco during Christmas week to play the Fillmore West December 26-29. Sly and his group have just finished an engagement at the Flamingo Hotel in Las Vegas.

In March the Epic Records stars return to the Electric Circus in New York. They broke all attendance records there during a previous engagement.

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RANDY IN FILM DEAL

RANDY NEWMAN has just been signed by Tetragrammaton to do the musical score for the film "A Picasso Summer". The movie, which stars Yvette Mimieux and Albert Finney, was produced by Campbell-Silver-Cosby, of which Tetragrammaton is a part. The film will be distributed by Warner Bros./7 Arts, with whom Campbell-Silver-Cosby has a five-picture deal. Tetragrammaton has also done the sound track for "Girl On A Motorcycle", starring Alain Delon and Marianne Faithfull. A single, "Theme From Girl On A Motorcycle", has recently been released, and an album from the movie is scheduled for release in the near future.

THE IRISH ROVERS performed at two fund raising dinners recently, held to make up the deficit raised by Robert Kennedy's presidential campaign. At the express request of

Wearing his pin-laden Russian Czarist cap and a jacket emblazoned with emblems, slogans and decals, Spencer enchanted his young audience with songs by the late Leadbelly. He accompanied himself on the 12-string guitar and harmonica.

After his "class", Spencer signed more than 200 autographs and sent a mimeographed message and personal signature to every student.

While he was in Virginia, Spencer also taught. He did a guest set for a German class at the University of Virginia.

Spencer is fluent in German. He received a degree from the University of Berlin.

Because the Spencer Davis group tour is so successful, they are extending their American visit for three more weeks. They were scheduled to perform in Prague, Czechoslovakia, on December 22 — but are postponing the date until late January.

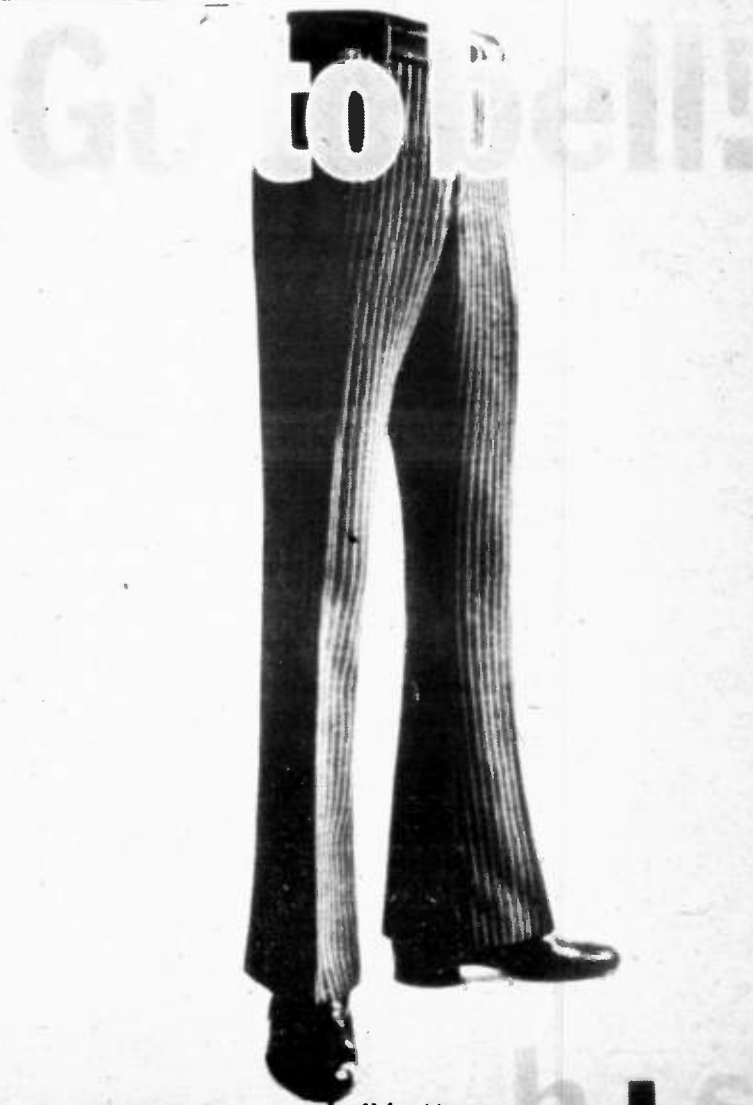

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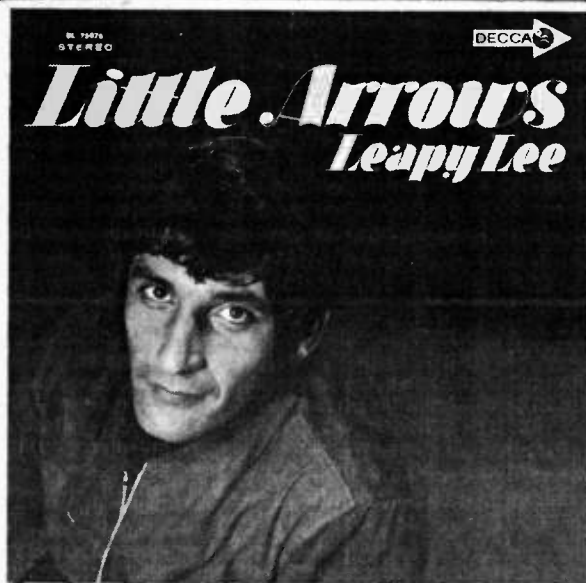

UNEXPECTED TOM MIX

WONDERWALL MUSIC (APPLE) George Harrison

The first cut on this album is a little bit trying on your ears unless you have grown up with Indian music. From there however the album moves on to a sometimes melancholy, sometimes light and happy mood. Combined with the predominant Indian theme, George Harrison has added steel guitars, harmonicas, a flugel horn, drums and piano. The mixture of these Western instruments and the Indian bag produces a happy album. "Drilling A Home" is perhaps the best cut on the album, and "Cowboy Museum" is inserted at just the right time to give the album a touch of unexpected Tom Mix. The Indian instruments are played by accomplished Indian musicians. The whole album comes off as a good investment in entertainment.

FABLES (RCA VICTOR)

Four Jacks & A Jill

This is the second album for the Four Jacks & A Jill since their smash hit "Master Jack". It follows closely in their tradition or style of a quasi-folk bag, probably because this is what they do quite well. The album, taken as a whole, is quite good. There is no outstanding single cut such as "Master Jack", but it all holds together both instrumentally and musically.

MEMORIES (Vanguard)

Richard & Mimi Farina

The music of Mimi Farina and her late husband is a collector's item. There is the customary soft folk ballad, and the electric folk of the

underground scene. There is also some reference to the classical European folk bag on the album. The thing which makes this album stand out is that there are two cuts on it by Mimi's sister, Joan Baez. She is as great as usual, and gives a lift to the album. The album could stand alone, but with the Baez bonus-freebie the album is even better.

LITTLE ARROWS (Decca)

Leapy Lee

As is the custom today, the hit single is the precursor of the album of the same name. Leapy Lee follows this tradition. The album - in addition to "Little Arrows" - contains some hits of other artists. "Harper Valley PTA" is one and "Little Green Apples" is another of these. These hits as well as the rest of the cuts, are handled nicely by Leapy. His smooth style and easy voice make the album good listening and he should catch on here just as he already has in Britain.

RICHARD P. HAVENS 1983 (VERVE)

Richard Havens

What is there left to say about Havens that hasn't already been said? If you groove with Havens then this album will make you flip, mainly because it's a double LP. If you dislike Havens give it a listen anyway, it's worth it. In case you're undecided, the album will convert you. On the four sides Havens goes through some of his own stuff, some of Dylan's, and some of Donovan's. He also does a lot of Lennon-McCartney. All of it is Richard P. Havens at his best.

THE BOOK OF THE TALIESYN

Deep Purple

The musical talent of Deep Purple cannot be denied. In some of the cuts from the album they sound a little bit like a basic hard rock group, but this is not the case. To find out just what they are about, all one had to do is listen to their version of "We Can Work It Out", a Lennon-McCartney tune. They don't become typed into becoming copy-cat artists who can't do something on their own. Their long introduction into this song should be proof enough that they are fine musicians who will have a lot to say in the future of popular music. Buy it.
