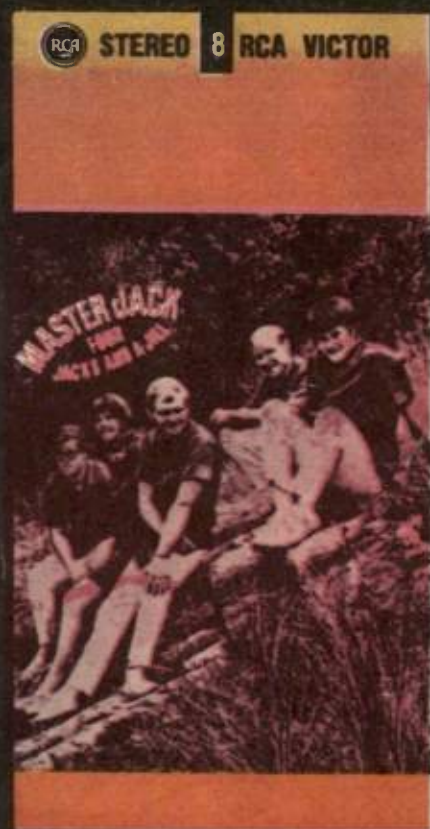

Rascals add a new voice

Not all the voices heard on Rascals' records belong to Dino Danelli, Felix Cavaliere, Gene Cornish or Eddie Brigati. The voices, however, remain in the family, for Eddie's older brother, Davey, is one of the voices of the Rascals on record.

Davey and Eddie talked to GO before a recent Rascals' recording session in which they put the finishing touches on their next single, "People Got To Be Free."

According to the brothers, Davey has been on most of the Rascals' singles and albums. He performed one song with them live at their Christmas concert in Madison Square Garden. Davey, however, prefers to stick just with recording sessions since he is now affiliated with Sid Bernstein, Rascals' manager, and is managing two new groups, The Fuzzy Bunnies and the Brass Buttons.

"My brother is the guy responsible for me being in the record industry," Eddie told GO. "I consider him to be a very controlled technical vocalist. He has been in music longer than I have. Vocally, he taught me every concept I use. He taught me to use my entire voice when I sing."

Davey got his start singing in local groups around Garfield, N.J., the Brigati brothers' home town. When he was 17 he joined Joey Dee & The Starliners. Later Eddie, Felix and Gene found their way into that group before forming the Rascals with Dino.

Davey travels with the group occasionally and may go to Hawaii with the Rascals when they return there in August. He went to California with them because they recorded parts of their last album there.

The reason Davey is recording with the group is no mystery. As Eddie said: "It was a natural thing to happen. There is absolutely no commercial motive attached to it."

The police spotted the long-haired men in an expensive car and stopped to question them at the gas station. It was reported that there was a difference of opinion and the police claimed that offensive words were used.

The police put them in jail and bail was set at \$700. The group consulted with their manager Bob Fitzpatrick in Los Angeles and bail was posted.

After two hours, Bruce's group were released. They forfeited bail rather than face a trial which would interfere with the Cream's booking schedule.

Dear, sweet Tiny Tim! Who could predict that 1968 would be his year to make the charts with a real oldy but goody circa 1929.

But Tiny has come up a winner with "Tiptoe Through The Tulips" and on June 7 at the Santa Monica Civic Auditorium, Tiny will sing the song with Mr. Nick Lucas, the man who first sang it in 1929.

Tiny has long been a fixture on the New York scene, but it wasn't until Reprise issued his first album and he began appearing on the Rowan and Martin TV show that Tiny became a nationwide phenomenon. Now that he has been appearing on the Johnny Carson Show, Tiny has it made.

Tiny's innocence in the face of a sophisticated complex world — and that innocence does seem genuine even though people suspect it is a put-on — probably accounts for his appeal to all kinds of people.

Certainly, he is genuinely interested in the songs he sings. As Tiny once told me, he had more than 400 old 78's at home and he plays them on an old wind-up gramophone. "There is a strange rapport between my whole body and the sound box of the Victor phonograph," Tiny told us.

Even though Tiny will never win any beauty contests, he has captured us all with his unique style and approach to the world. "Life is wonderful," Tiny says. And he means it.

Tony Bennett performing at the Copacabana is a good tiptoe away from Tiny Tim, but the contemporary music scene takes in a lot these days. Tony opened his run at the Copa with numbers like "If I Ruled The World", "San Francisco", "Shadow Of Your Smile" and his new Columbia single, "Yesterday I Heard The Rain".

His style, as always, was outstanding. My particular favorite is his rendition of "For Once In My Life" which was written by Ron Miller, a songwriter signed to Motown. Tony really puts a lot of feeling into that song, and he brought down the house when he sang it.

Though Jacques Brel's name elicit the same sighs from jayboppers as Mike Nesmith's, Brel is an outstanding songwriter.

Current off-Broadway "Jacques Brel Is Alive and Living In Paris" gives money to Brel's talents.

The mama and papa of all lowdowns

Jay Lasker, bossman at Dunhill Records, filled me in on the future plans of the Mamas & Papas. After more than six months of rumors and half-truths, here is where it's at.

There will continue to be a Mamas & Papas, but because John and Michele no longer want to do personal appearances, the group will be doing something similar to what

the Beatles are doing. In other words, while they will record as a complete unit, they will also be doing their own things.

Cass will soon do an album of her own, as well as p.a.'s — John will be writing some songs for her. Dennis will do some single work, both in person and on record. John will be producing new talent. Material and time permitting, there could even be recordings by The Papas and separate ones by The Mamas.

So we will be hearing a lot more from the Mamas & Papas and that's good news. Their next album, incidentally, is currently in preparation and will be released around the end of the year.

The gospel according to Eric Burdon was presented at the Whiskey A Go Go in an emotion-charged evening. Burdon violently attacks war and bigotry and injustice, and just as violently supports peace and love and life.

A torrent of emotion pours forth from the little giant as he pleads with you and me and the people in Washington, Hanoi, Moscow, Paris and everywhere to stop what they're doing and think. "When are they gonna learn!" he shouts.

The special performance was to introduce organist Zoot Money, the newest Animal, to the press. Money, a very fine musician, gives the group a much fuller and richer sound, which is more in keeping with the kind of music they are playing. He's a welcome addition to the Animals.

The highlight of the evening was their rendition of their new single

HOLLIES PLAN GIANT TOUR OF 12 COUNTRIES

LONDON: Tours in 12 countries have been set for the Hollies, including important dates in several big American cities.

Currently on a record-breaking British tour with Paul Jones and the Scaffold — which includes Paul McCartney's brother Mike McGear — tour Swedish folk parks from July 26-August 4, then visit Helsinki, Copenhagen and Germany.

They return to Sweden on September 25 to help promote British weeks, then fly to Iceland for a concert in Reykjavik. The Hollies travel straight on to Canada for an eight-day visit before returning to London.

In late October, they undertake another British tour lasting about two weeks. Next, they travel to South America to appear in Argentina, Brazil and Chile and do TV and concert work in New Zealand and Australia on the way back.

A return visit to South America follows before the Hollies begin an American college tour which lasts until early December.

Their next single and album will be selected from tracks which the Hollies are recording in London now.

A MEMBER of the British Royal family — as yet the identity had not been revealed — has tentatively agreed to attend a spectacular pop concert at the London Palladium on December 8.

The event has been organized by Hollie Graham Nash in aid of charity.

So far, Donovan, the Hollies and the Seekers have agreed to take part, and Paul McCartney has shown interest in the project. The Monkees have also been invited.

It is hoped that \$75,000 will be raised to build a home for underprivileged children. The artists taking part in the concert will each pay 100 pounds (about \$240) to appear.

The concert will be filmed in color and black and white and then offered for sale on a world-wide basis. It is likely to be screened in England as part of the special Christmas programs. It is also hoped that a special album of the concert will be released if the various companies involved can reach an agreement.

LULU is set for a string of cabaret dates in England and an appearance at the Majorcan pop festival — and another American visit this year.

She will appear in cabaret in Los Angeles for a week from June 23 and undertake a guest appearance at Disneyland on July 1. Then she films spots on the Smothers Brothers Show and two other programs still to be set before flying to London.

On July 14, she begins the first of three separate weeks of cabaret in major British clubs. Her trip to Majorca is for the Festival of Pop in which several world names will appear.

ROBIN GIBB is the latest member of the pop set to become interested in meditation. Bee Gees drummer Colin Peterson told GO that Robin will almost certainly visit the Maharishi's school in India during his holiday in Ceylon.

The group's manager, Robin Stigwood, is opening a New York office in July. It will handle American artists produce records and handle its own music publishing company.

Barry and Maurice Gibb are holidaying in Australia at Surfers' Paradise, while Vince Melouney and Colin have flown to the Bahamas.

ENGELBERT HUMPERDINCK becoming keenly interested in motor racing. . . Simon Dupree & The Big Sound, one of Britain's top groups, tour America for the first time in September. . . Reparata & The Delrons return to England and a tour on June 14. . . Elvis Presley's new movie "Clambake" will not have a London premiere.

Group 'split' -- hit No. 1

Although Archie Bell & The Drells had a number one record with "Tighten Up", the group have not been able to appear together for eight months.

Audiences at New York's Apollo Theatre who thought they were seeing Archie Bell & The Drells perform recently were actually seeing a group composed of three of the Four Singing Avalons, plus Bill Buttier of the Drells.

The problem is that Archie Bell is in the U.S. Army in Germany and the record was cut in Houston, the group's hometown, when he was on furlough in October.

According to the group's manager, Skipper Lee Frazier, the group do not want to perform without their leader because they are so loyal to Archie.

The Apollo booking was due to a misunderstanding so only Buttier was able to be there along with the Drells' close friends, The Four Singing Avalons.

James Wise of the Drells couldn't appear because he was in the midst of finals at Texas Southern, the college he is now attending. Steve Joe Cross, the other Drell, was in Army boot camp and could not get away.

Frazier says that the group are missing out on \$6,000 to \$7,000 worth of bookings a week because of Archie's absence. They are so close because they have been singing together ever since junior high school.

The group, however, will be reunited this month when Archie returns from Germany for a 30-day furlough. They plan a get-together in New York where they will record and make personal appearances. The T.S.U. Tornados, the group who played the instrumental track on "Tighten Up", will be flown to New York for the occasion.

At that point Frazier hopes that Cross will be out of the army because he is the sole support of his mother and sister. Even if he is not released for good in June, though, Cross will be on leave for the group's reunion.



Dionne Dedicates Fund To Brother

Dionne Warwick, who has recently set up a Warwick Scholarship Foundation chartered by the state of New Jersey, has re-dedicated it to the memory of her younger brother Mancel Warwick Jr. The 20-year-old was killed last month in a car crash near the Warwick's home in New Jersey.

Dionne had set up the scholarship fund to help youth, who otherwise would not be able to attend college, further their education.

This project was inspired by the fact that Dionne attended the Hart College of Music at the University of Hartford in Connecticut on a scholarship she won from the Junior

Leaguers in her hometown of Orange, New Jersey.

"At the time I won the scholarship," Dionne said, "I promised myself that if I could ever provide a similar opportunity for others, I would."

The scholarship foundation is now a memorial to Mancel Jr. to keep his name alive.

Paul McCartney makes a rare solo appearance in a three-minute color promotional film for Cilla Black's new single, "Step Inside Love." McCartney wrote the song with John Lennon.

"Step Inside Love" was a top ten hit in England for Miss Black.

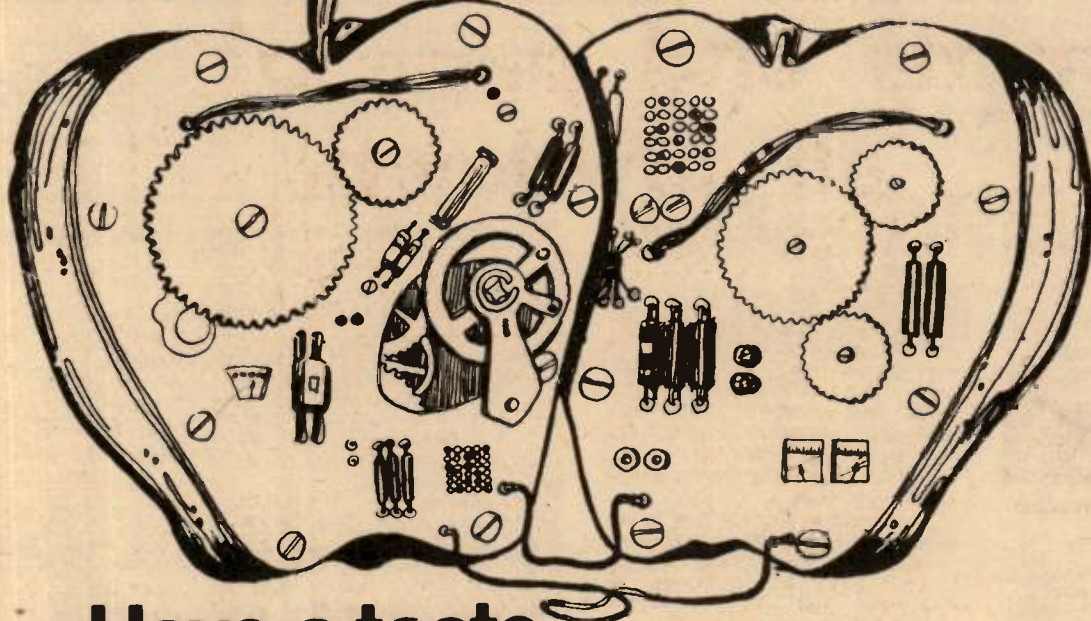

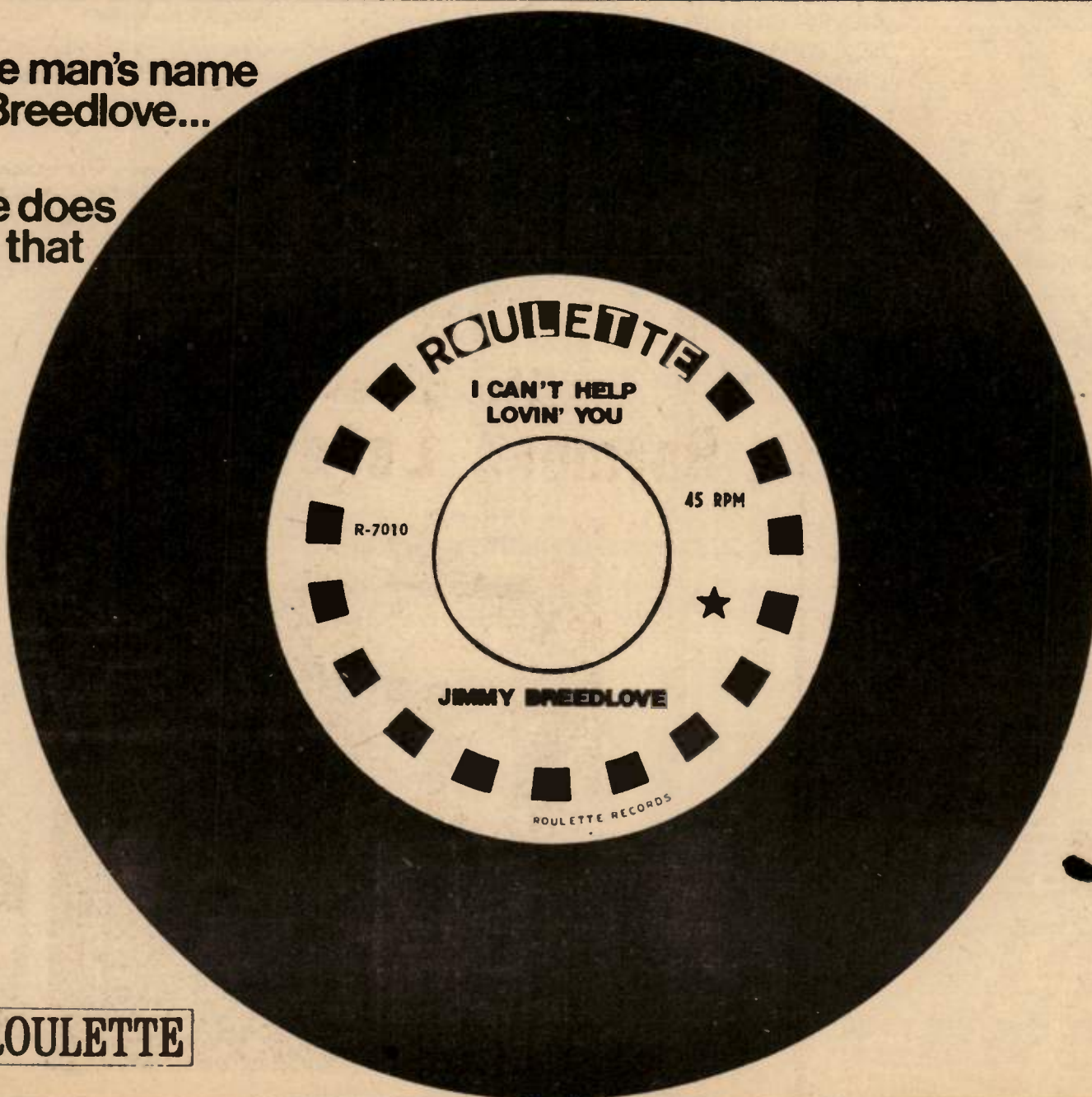

Beautiful — an over-used word but one that describes Joni Mitchell perfectly. Her voice and guitar playing are beautiful. Her songs are beautiful. Her looks are beautiful.

Highly regarded by followers of the folk scene, Joni now has her first album out on the Reprise label. The album contains all originals by Joni and ranks as one of the very best new albums.

Originally, Joni intended to be an artist. She was born in McLeod, Alberta, Canada, on November 7, 1943. After graduating from schools there, she enrolled in the Alberta College of Art in Calgary.

Joni took along a ukelele to play in her spare time and then discovered she could pick up some extra money in a local coffee house by singing. Deciding singing was more fun than painting, Joni took a train to the Mariposa Folk Festival in Ontario. On the way she wrote her first song, "Day After Day," which was in time to the sound of the train on the steel rails.

The trip changed Joni's career plans, for she stayed in Toronto and began singing in coffee houses there as well as writing songs. Joni appeared in coffee houses in Canada and the Midwest and then came to New York where Reprise's Andy Wickham saw her and signed her to the label.

Joni has written about 60 songs so far — among them are "The Circle Game" and "Urge For Going" which have been recorded by artists like Tom Rush and Buffy Sainte-Marie.

Such numbers on the album as "Big Betty", "It's So Easy Falling" and "No Better, No Worse" show that the members of the group are creative writers. Their sound is quite solid and stands up after repeated hearings.

STEVE MILLER BAND (Capitol). The group's debut LP is very impressive and undoubtedly they have a big future in the pop world. The first side contains all Miller originals which are interesting pop-psychedelic tunes. On the second side the group shows off its blues orientation to good advantage.

SILVER SOUND OF THE FUTURE

"Our slogan is happiness," said Danny Taylor, one half of Silver Apples. Kapp's new group. Simeon, the other Apple and the one who plays the oscillator, added: "Our music is emotional. I think it's something you feel. We like happiness, clapping hands, dancing."

Simeon first got interested in the oscillator when he was part of another group and a friend demonstrated the electronic instrument to him. He started using it and then joined another group.

"I could do things with the oscillator that the lead guitarist couldn't do on his guitar," Simeon told GO. "So one by one the members of the group dropped out until just Danny on drums and Simeon with his oscillator were left."

The boys recorded their first album for Kapp in April and it is available in the stores now. The album has no overdubbing at all on it. It is just the two Silver Apples.

"We want to reproduce in the studio the way we sound live," Simeon explained. "Anything on the album we can do live. In fact, there are a lot of acoustical things we do live that we couldn't get on the album."

Simeon's one oscillator turned into eight at this point and he has connected them with switches and plugs so that he can work all eight together. He is able to capture the sound of just about any instrument or any combination of instruments on the electronic machine.

In fact Silver Apples are currently negotiating deals for the manufacture of an oscillator which will be marketed under the name of 'Simeon'.

Simeon got his start in music performing with a jug band, playing jugs and spoons as well as singing. "So," he said, "the whole thing of playing home-made instruments was natural for me. That's why I put together my own oscillator set-up."

Danny's style of drumming is unique because he plays melodies on his drums. "I tune them to a scale," he says, "What I do is play a melody. By playing the drums tuned this way I have rhythm and drive and can get a melody."

Lest you worry that Silver Apples' sound may be too complex for you, here's what Simeon said: "We don't come on as super electronic people. Basically we're simple rock musicians."
