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

Knife threat -so Animals leave Japan

Eric Burdon & The Animals arrived in Los Angeles this week after a harrowing and aborted Japanese tour that featured a knife point abduction of their manager, ominous surveilance by Japenese gangsters, and an attempt at extortion.

Animal manager Kevin Deverich revealed the details of the surrealistic escapade in his Hollywood office, and noted that "As I examine the situation in retrospect, I have to admit that it sounds like a discarded 'Mission: Impossible' script, but you know what they say about fact being stranger than fiction."

According to Kevin, the Animals arrived in Japan only to find that the promoter had extended their tour by including 12 extra shows over an additional two days with no increase in their fee. After negotiation, the Animals agreed to stay one extra day and perform two shows. Thinking things to be copacetic, the Animals began their tour and were in the midst of their schedule when the bizarre chain of events began.

Manager Deverich was approached at a bar and led at knife point into the street. There he was surrounded by several of the henchmen and forced to enter another bar in which the promoter was sitting. At this time he was informed of and threatened with "imminent dangers" facing the Animals unless they conformed to the promoter's wishes for even more dates at no increase in salary. Deverich agreed under duress and was released to his hotel where he and the Animals decided to leave the country immediately, with no intention of completing the tour. The next morning as they attempted to leave their hotel and take cabs to the airport, they were accosted by the promoter and several of his associates. Again under

duress, Deverich was forced to write three checks totalling \$25000.00 to insure the safety of the group. Only after he turned the checks over to the promoter was the group allowed to board their plane and leave Japan.

Immediately upon the plane's arrival in Hawaii for refueling Deverich contacted the bank on which the checks were drawn and stopped payment. It was learned later that the promoter had released a story citing the Animals with breach of contract for their cancellation.

At present Eric Burdon, the Animals, and Kevin Deverich are safely in Los Angeles, preparing to contact the Japanese Consulate to begin criminal proceedings.

Once again the police moved in and instead of doing something about Paula, they arrested actor Rip Torn and David McMullin, the chairman of Leacock-Pennebaker, the firm associated with Godard in the film.

Torn was charged with harrassment and McMullin with failure to get a permit, they were issued with summonses and released.

In the midst of all this commotion, the film crews, earning their salaries, filmed the entire spectacle, a record for posterity, which may in time be released on its own as a short subject.

Ex-Bee Gee guitarist Vince Melouney has joined Ashton, Gardner & Dyke, a new group signed to Apple Records. Their first single - written, produced and arranged by Vince - is 'Will Everybody Stand Up And Sing''. It's expected to be released by mid-January.

Vince plays lead guitar in the group he first heard perform in Britain about three months ago. Tony Ashton is organist, Kim Gardner bassist and Ray Dyke drummer. These three have been playing together for six months, but were in other groups before getting

Originally, Vince was just to be the producer, but he decided to join the group when he made up his mind to leave the Bee Gees.

Vince told GO: "I left because I wanted to be independent, to produce and record the type of things which I enjoy playing. I had done as much as I could with the Bee Gees and now is the time for me to branch out".

Ashton, Gardner & Dyke expect to visit the U.S. For 10 days of television appearances as soon as their single is released. In the spring they may do selected concert dates in this country.



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



George Harrison, Chet Atkins, the Rolling Stones — what do they have in common? They all use Gretsch guitars and amplifiers. George Harrison and Chet Atkins both use the Country Gentleman and the Tennessean models. The Country Gentleman is a 17-inch double cutaway guitar with a Electrotone Hollow Body, two inches thick. It has a Neo-Classic fingerboard, double filter tron pickups, Gretsch Bigsby tremolo and tailpiece, high ratio gears, 24-karat gold metal parts, a built in muffler and a padded back. The guitar finish is mahogany grained.

The Tennessean electric guitar is a 16-inch hollow, single cutaway model. It has the same fingerboard, tron pickups, tremolo and tailpiece as the Country Gentleman. However, its finish is a dark, cherry red hue, accented with polished chrome metal parts.

Gretsch general manager, Mr. Phillip Grant, has given some guide lines on what to look for in a guitar to benefit the young buyer. First, make sure that the neck is straight. The action should not be too low. This would cause buzzing of the frets. Look closely at how the inlay is put on, and the details. Be sure that the pegs are put on correctly. A good beginner's guitar sells for \$33. From then on it is only a question of stepping up to an electric guitar. According to Mr. Grant, an electric guitar is more preferable because of its double cutaway and twin pick ups. This makes it possible to get better sound. The pitch can be varied to a much greater degree, producing more variety of sounds. Gretsch amplifiers play an important part in the entertainment field. The three largest models, the Tornado, the Nashville and the Rogue offer special features. The most important one is the Gretsch tri-button pedal

console. This is a remote foot control that lets you get reverb, magic echo and tremelo by pressing for the effect you want. This makes it possible to play with uninterrupted pace. The best model is the Tornado, a solid state column amplifier. It has 150 watts true output with 200 watts peak, coming out of two 15-inch Lansing speakers in each column. Each channel has separate bass and treble controls. Channel 1 has normal inputs.

In the finishing process, the guitars are hand rubbed several times to insure a rich, deep finish. The most expensive guitar Gretsch puts out, the White Falcon, costs \$1,000. Its white finish is accented with gold-plated metal fittings. This guitar

could last indefinitely if given adequate care. Besides the Country Gentleman and the Tennessean — the original Chet Atkins guitar — the Nashville is very popular. It has established itself as a pacesetter because of its good looks, highstyling and excellent sound. The popularity of the guitar also stems from its low action design which gives easy fast fingering, and lightning changes without fatigue. The body is sixteen inches with a double cutaway design. Like the Country Gentleman, it has 24-karat gold-plated parts. The case is finished in amber red.

Gretsch also makes electric bass guitars in an assortment of long and short scale models. They are available with double or single bass pickup design. All have leather shoulder straps,

padded backs and built-in mufflers. Their is a choice of finishes in either red grained mahogany or shaded golden sunburst hue.

Gretsch also makes a 12-string guitar, preferred by the top

groups today. Twelve strings give fuller, preferred by the top groups today. Twelve strings give fuller, richer sound and strength with finer tonal shading. Like the bass guitars, the 12-string model comes in a choice of finishes — in natural or shaded golden sunburst.

Gretsch Solid Body and Flat Top guitars are also worthy of note. The Flat Tops are the guitars of the folk singers, and the Country and Western artists. The Rancher is the true Western model, with a deep extra large body and powerful tone. The body and neck are made of rock maple, with a coarse-grained spruce top.

The other Flat Top, the Folk model, is the perfect guitar for voice accompaniment. The body is made of Honduras mahogany with pearl dot inlays, and a rosewood fingerboard.

Wild clarinet. A mystery man who refuses to be photographed. And five new sound messengers. That's Daniel & The Lions, an explosive rock group that will soon enter the 45 r.p.m. and LP groove on one of the major U.S.

Hurried phone calls right up to press time failed to uncover the identify of Mystery Man Daniel, but speculation has it that this masked musician is a Superclarinetist who is going to travel the rock scene to the top, incognito. Daniel, himself, refuses to be interviewed or have his face photographed.

Sought after by six major recording companies for their wild sound innovations, Daniel and the Lions have introduced an entirely new concept to the rock genre - spiraling around Leader Daniel and his amplified, Multi-vided Conn clarinet. Add sensitive lyrics and an uncanny sense of arrangement to place the Lions on a pedestal all their own.

"Everybody Needs A Love", one of their four new singles, is an extremely sensuous recording that begins with a pulsing, polyphonal intro - the kind that drives sound engineers into little circles on the ceiling.
