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

INSIDE TOP 40 WITH DAVE SHOLIN

Pretty sure bet that WHITNEY HOUSTON will beat out MADONNA in the race for number one, but Mrs. Sean Penn is a lock to secure the top spot in another few weeks. OMD chalks up their first solid top ten hit...gain reported at WKHI (8-2), WHTT (19-11), WBBQ (9-5), WIFX (19-8), B-97 (11 -7), WCLG (11-5), WLXR (15-6), WBNQ (14-6), KDVV (18-6), KCPX (12-7), KJQN (12-5), KEZY (11-5), KWOD (13-8), KYNG (20-9), etc. LEVEL 42 moves into top ten levels at KZZK, KTMT, Y108, KPKE, KPUR, KIVA, KSER, KQLA, Y94, KKXL, WNPT, 94Q, WHTT, PRO/FM, etc.

NUSHOOZ continues on a roll chartwise, going from 40% to 68% in Hit Factor. Bob Case and Wendy Christopher at KUBE-Seattle move it 2-1...also number one for Paul Marcu KRKE-Albuquerque. Heavily requested, it's one of the hottest inside the Top twenty. Right along side NUSHOOZ is LABELLE and MCDONALD, destined to be one of the first big hits of summer '86. Scott Shannon charts it number two at Z100-New York, confirmed by KMEL-San Francisco 21-8, KMJK-Portland 30-21, KZPS-Dallas 27-18, WLS-Chicago 20-6, Y100-Miami 14-8, 94Q-Atlanta #3, WTIC-Hartford 14-7, etc.

BOYS DON'T CRY should be smiling this week...one o the year's real sleepers picks up 33 new believers as it stays at number one for KWES -Odessa/Midland. Jumps 28-14 at 93Q-Houston, 21-10 KAKS-Amarillo,

22-13 WVIL-Lansing, 29-16 WKZQ-Myrtle Beach, 23-14 WZON-Bangor, 27-21 KHTZ -Reno, etc. DREAM ACADEMY on the way to their second hit debuting #30 at 106X, #30 WWYO, #30 KZZO, #29 KBLQ, #27 KTYX, #27 KZHR, #26 KSXO, #30 KOZE, etc.


EL DEBARGE piling up plenty of airplay with 49 adds, including WJET, KSAQ, KTAM, WZOK, KYYY, WIQQ, WBBQ, KTAG, KFMY, KZZU, KSWB, KYNO, KS103, KITS, KIIS/FM, etc. JETS, a former Record To Watch, now has a 15% Hit Factor and blows right past chartbound for a slot on the Top 40. Nick Bazoo debuts it #30 at B-94-Pittsburgh, as does Steve Kingston B104 -Baltimore. Top ten for John Hampton KSTN-Stockton, Mark McKay B-95 -Kansas City, Bill Sellars WZYZ-Fairmont, Roger Gaither WKQB/FM -Charleston, etc.

MODELS top the 100 mark in reports with a healthy 23 adds, including PRO /FM, WKTI, KDWB, WLS, WBNQ, KDON, KOZE, KIYS, KSYZ, WJXQ, etc. **BOURGEOIS TAGG** continues to build a very impressive chart story. Closing in on Chartbound status with 108 reports, they move 23-19 at 106, debut #18 WEBE, 17-13 WHNY 14-8, KFMN 15-11 KIXY, 14-7 WLRW, 12-9 KCLD, 23-17 KTXY, 20-11 KZFN, 26-20 KWOD, 14-6 KHTY, 7-5 KHWK, 14-10 KZZU, etc.

ATLANTIC STARR big on two fronts, Urban and A/C,

and beginning to come on in the early stages for Top 40. Added by Bruce Stevens WBBQ-Augusta, Darrell Duvall WBGN-Bowling Green, J.J.McKay 100KHI, Dan Brannan KFYR -Bismarck, Todd Guthrie KCPI/FM-Albert Lea, Tony Waitekus WCIL/FM -Carbondale, etc. Last week's Record To Watch, those wild and crazy **BLOW MONKEYS** nearly double in reports with new airplay on WRCK, WKAU, OK95, KUBE, KYMO, KEYP, etc. New believers in the Far West include KATD, KFIV, KHOP, KIIS, KMGX, KSTN, KXGO, KYNO, KHTY.

Expect ART OF NOISE's "Peter Gunn Theme" to work it's way into Up & Coming next week...now on KMEL, FM102, KEYP, KIXY, WZON, WSPK, WNPT, WJXQ, etc. Gerry DeFrancesco, Mike Schaefer and Gene Sandbloom chart BRONSKI BEAT 14-12 as it picks up adds in Phoenix at KZZP and Yakima at KZHR. John Raymond at KIXY-San Angelo notes his most requested record is "Pluck Khadaffy Duck" by Roger Hallmark on Ronnie's Records (phone 609 -456-0190). John reports calls from all demo's. ANNE MURRAY - "<u>Who's Leaving Who"</u> (Capitol) One of the tracks from her excellent new LP, produced by Jack White, who's responsible for a lot of Laura Branigan's recent success. Annie picks up the tempo and 30 stations who can't wait. BANGLES - "<u>If She Knew What She</u> <u>Wants"</u> (Columbia) It took months for these ladies to overcome their "image", which preceeded and prejudged the ultimate hit "Manic Monday". No shortage of convinced programmers this time out-of-the-box. The song is incredibly simple and hook-laden. We hear them now in a different light. HIROSHIMA - <u>"One Wish</u>" (Epic) There's a certain prejudice carried eternally by programmers which handicaps instrumentals. But this smooth and relevant track, re-mixed by Paul Hardcastle, is capable of "overcoming".

FORCE M.D.'S - "Here I Go Again" (Tommy Boy/Warner Bros.) Here they go again. It's ballad time for the second time in a row. Lead vocals are reminiscent of Smokey Robinson. There's no "Krush Groove" soundtrack to support this one, but I don't think that made much of a difference with A/C listeners on TENDER LOVE and it went to #1.

CHRISTOPHER CROSS - "Love Is Love" (Warner Bros.) Crossed-up! It's usually his soft side that we hear. But on this one, the third single from the LP, everything is punctual and bright. The little percussive elements like the steel drum effects give it a boost.





fighting off boredom with john lydon of PIL



"I'm bored, period."

John Lydon of Public Image Limited (formerly Johnny Rotten of the Sex Pistols) is a one man crusade against boredom. During his famous punk Sex Pistols days, John forced established millionaire artists to rethink their musical motives and also opened the door for many new and fresh musical points of view. Eight years after forming PIL, Lydon's finest work is now upon us. ALBUM is by far 1986's most exciting album. One reason is the far reaching selection of players used for the sessions. People like Cream's Ginger Baker and famous Miles Davis drummer, Tony Williams are iconoclastically teamed up with bassist/producer Bill Laswell and monster metal

guitarist Steve Vai, who has just recently joined forces with David Lee Roth. (That's also Vai playing the devil possessed metal guitarist in the movie Crossroads.) In print, Lydon can look misleading. His razor sarcasm and snide insults are ploys to put you on the ropes. Yet the spirit of his communicative exchange is one of fun and anti-boredom. In his first Gavin interview, Lydon gets the first and last word.

JL: This is the interview I've been looking forward to.

KZ: Why's that?

JL: The rest have been so naff! (a British slang term for dull)

KZ: You're putting me on the spot.

JL: I know. You've got to entertain me now. Let's get on with it!

KZ: This interview is geared toward radio-

JL: Listen. I've had ten years of this guffaw. You don't need to explain anything to me. I realize you're going to be embarrassed by a lot of the nonsense you're about to ask. I'm a kind hearted chap and I will let you off lightly. Okay? I hope you taped that. That's the stuff to print. (laughs and then ponders) Johnny's kind.

KZ: Whose idea was it to go generic?

JL: Mine. All artwork is my responsibility. Always has been in Public Image. Except for the last album cover. And you can fully understand when you look at that why I've now taken it over again. I wanted the artwork to be as simple as possible. It's unfortunate now that me and my simplistic ideology has now turned into (in a big brother voice) "Big Business". AD. POSTER. T-SHIRT. BADGE. (laughs) God, I've created a monster. Again.

KZ: Do artists put too much information on their record sleeves?

JL: I think so and I think it's all irrelevant. It's like this: If you like the record then you're going to bother to find out who did what. That information is readily available. It's no big secret. I don't want the cover cluttered up with this rubbish! I'm so BORED with it! Endless thank-yous to this, that, and the other. What a wonderful studio that was. Nonsense. It doesn't help anybody.

KZ: You mean you didn't thank God?

JL: No I didn't. (*pause*) Thank God I didn't. KZ: Have you ever noticed how many recording artists thank God?

JL: Oh God! (*laughs*) If you don't mind the pun. Well, there we go. There's a hoot anyway! God is now a pun. I have achieved something. KZ: Was there any other reason to go generic? Maybe because it it looked cool? JL: I just wanted it to be simple. Here you go. There it is. If you like it, buy it. If you don't, don't bother. I don't like that hard sell nonsense. I'm not going to ram anything down anybody's throat. (pause) At the moment. (laughs) I don't burn my bridges.

KZ: Who is playing on the record? Should I go find out on my own?

JL: All right. I'll tell you if you want. ME! (*laughs*) Let's see. We've got Bill Laswell on bass. We've got Steve Vai on guitar. We've got Ryuchi Sakamoto on keyboards. (a famous and prestigious Japanese musician)

KZ: Oh! I've got to ask you about him.

JL: What about him?

KZ: I really like YMO. (Sakamoto's previous band in Japan)

JL: Me too. And he wanted to do this as well. Let's get back to that. Let me finish who else is on it. Ginger Baker on drums and also Tony Williams on drums.

KZ: Which one plays drums on what?

JL: Which one is which? (authoritative voice) Well music lovers! That's for you to decide. (laughs) Both are outrageously good. In very different ways. If you want any clues to that; Tony Williams is very rock steady and Ginger is much more open and much more flim flam.--BURP--And now back to Sakamoto.

KZ: Did you seek him out?

JL: He always wanted to work with me for quite some time apparently. He was coming to New York to do his wife's (Akiko Yano) album. He came down and went (*slipping into Japanese accent*) "AAAH! I have to work on this," (*laughs*) Fine. Brilliant. And he is. And I like him a lot. Lots and lots and lots. He's very much like an English gentleman. Quite odd for a Japanese chap. KZ: Does he speak English well?

JL: No. Very badly. That's why he's very much like an English gentleman. But you know what they're like with their port and brandy. He can achieve the same results completely sober. KZ: He didn't speak English very well so you had

no trouble communicating with him? JL: Neither do I, as you might have guessed. KZ: Your bio says you want to be stinking rich.

JL: I've always said that! But only on my own terms. I don't make records for mass appeal. I, in all honesty, con- sider this album to be a contemptable piece of work according to (the) general public. That doesn't seem to be the case, does it? Well, times they are a changing. KZ: Have the times changed with you or you with them?

JL: I've messed with many musical fields. But hard rock was something I wanted to get back to quite briefly. I've done very well at it, I thought. And I can't see too much in the way of competition with that, really. It's quite a sad thing to say because there are a lot of bands that do nothing but hard rock and have not the SLIGHTEST understanding of what they're doing. They just don't have that energy and I think this album does. That's not being egotistical. That's being realistic. *(sings)* It's hard to be humble when you know you don't mean it...That's my philosophy.

KZ: Steve Vai playing with Tony Williams?

JL: Good team, huh? On paper this wouldn't really be very-- (laughs) It's not understandable.

The record company completely freaked. They thought I was going way over the top--which of course I was. They don't have my insight. *(continues in a deadpan monotone)* I had a view to an end conclusion. And I concluded well.

KZ: It's your best album.

JL: Is it? According to you. I beg to differ. But never mind.

KZ: Did all these musicians play together in one room at the same time?

JL: No two people were in the studio at the same time. The drums were done first. Then the bass. Then the keyboards. Then the guitar. Then we mixed it.

KZ: What about the vocals?

JL: The vocals were somewhere in there. (pause) Actually. How outrageous of me! I forgot about me. (loud laugh) Damn. The truth comes out. I'm a shy boy after all. Each thing was done separately. There's a major achievement for starters because it does sound like a live album. Every- thing was done in one take. Each particular (musician) did his bit in one take. We don't mess about. I couldn't afford to , quite frankly, because (in low sarcastic voice) my record company were not into giving me outrageous advances. I'm working on the principal of one sixteenth of a Duran Duran record, for instance. KZ: Was the material written before the sessions? JL: I had the material written. I had the basic ideas written. There were a few songs that me and Bill wrote in the studio. Only a few.

"You chaps over here, you've got to realize what it really means to be a peasant. You don't have to be black to be poor."

KZ: Were you and Laswell good partners? JL: Yes. I like Bill very much. He's never worked with (pause) rock n roll???--before. (laughs) KZ: But you're not rock n roll anymore (knowing Lydon detests musical labels of PIL). JL: Well, I did say that with a wheeze in my throat. KZ: Why did you use Ginger Baker? JL: Let me tell you. Years ago, as an April Fool's joke, I sent in this piece of information to the NME (New Musical Express weekly in Britain) that Ginger Baker was joining Public Image. And they printed it. Ha, ha, ha. Happy April Fools, NME. Over the years, it came to be that that really wouldn't have been such a bad idea after all. I definitely always wanted to work with him. He introduced African music to Europe. I thought that it was a brave brilliant thing to do. He's never been fully appreciated for that. Although African music is currently (in a scoffing tone) "fashionable" in England. People like Fela Kuti

are good friends of his. You see, the man is varied. You cannot judge him by Cream alone. Or Baker Gurvitz Army--which we will all forget about immediately. The same with Steve Vai. You cannot judge Steve by Al Catrazz (Vai's previous metal band Alcatrazz). That would be most unfair. (laughs)

KZ: Whatever happened to (former PIL co-founder) Keith Levene?

JL: Not a lot, I do believe. But then again, he is another one of those talentless people that fell by the wayside. They claim to be responsible for doing everything. Then if that was the case, (in a voice reminiscent of The Sex Pistols) WHERE ARE YOU NOW? (pause) I keep getting this from people I used to work with, saying they did everything. This is all nonsense. You mustn't take any of that seriously. It's a name you shouldn't even be bothered to mention. (in a disciplinary tone) SHAME ON YOU!

KZ: You mentioned here in your bio-

JL: (playing dumb) What bio was that? (laughs) Is it the generic one with the boxes? Oh good. I told them to fill it out for me.

KZ: I don't believe that.

JL: Okay. I'm a liar. (laughs)

KZ: What were you like as a kid?

JL: Very shy. Up until the age of thirteen when I decided I had enough.

KZ: Were you living in council flats (British tenements)?

JL: Oh yeah. All of that. Tin bath in the backyard nonsense. No running water. I mean, that's fairly English. You chaps over here, you've got to realize what it really means to be a peasant. You don't have to be black to be poor. You just have to be alive. I obviously don't have a title. And I'm not a member of the Royal family. I'm sorry. I won't let anybody bracket me into that you-are-a-pauper-for-the-rest- of-vour-life nonsense. If I've got ANY message for anybody, it's that. Just go at it. If you think you've got talent, fucking go for it, boys and girls. Don't let them manipulate you. (in an earnest theatrical voice) Don't let the bastards grind you down. KZ: Are you a painter now?

JL: Now? I've occasionally done the odd wall. KZ: Let's go back in time. Are you totally bored with Sex Pistols questions?

JL: I'm bored period. Carry on though.


KZ: Bleeker Bob's record store in Greenwich Village has a copy of "God Save The Queen" on A&M Records for a thousand dollars.

JL: Oh god. I know. The last time I went in there, I needed to make a phone call and I didn't realize it was Bleeker Bob's. Oh God! He came running up with it in his hands. (laughs) Johnny learned: mistake. Always check out the sign above the door. He just wanted me to see it. It was nice of him in a way because he gave me a free phone call.

KZ: What did you think when you saw it?

JL: I thought it was very funny because I don't believe in that naff collector nonsense. I don't think it's very valid. It's got nothing to do with anything except death. I'm sure most collectors would love me to be dead immediately. I'm a collectable item.

KZ: Did you screw up (British television host) Bill Grundy's TV career when you and the Sex Pistols



swore on his live show?

JL: Do you mean, did I have sex with him? No. (laughs) Listen, he screwed it up for himself. I had very little to do with it, other than being goaded into swearing on live TV. If somebody is going to keep saying, "Go on, go on. I dare you. to swear." Fine. Okay. Chairman says I should swear. I swore.

KZ: What about Tom Snyder's late night show? You were a terror on that show.

JL: Another career down the tube. (laughs) The same kind of nonsense. How many times can you be asked the same question and answer in different ways? That's what that interview was about. Endless repeats. Stop it. Then he tried to stop me smoking one of his cigarettes which were only for his "favorite guests." In the interval, he tried to have us removed by the security. It's a shame now that you get bands like Sigue Sigue Sputnik DESPERATELY trying to achieve this by manipulation. Things like that just happen. You cannot reproduce them mechanically and I've never made no big deal about it either.

KZ: What kind of interviews do you like?

JL: I love the vicious ones. You know the ones that want to have an all out go at you? Ha! Ha! Ha! Oh yes, I love a good banter. Because I'm not exactly what you'd call dumb.

KZ: Did you hear about the movie being made about Sid Vicious and his girl friend?

JL: Oh Yes! While we're on the subject of dumb. What a dumb maneuver that was. They've no right to dare have the sheer audacity to try and represent us without asking for our permission. I know nothing about that film whatsoever. And yet they've got this actor in there standing up for me. And I think that's evil. And Malcolm (McLaren) is badly represented too. So if I'm going to take legal action about that film, -- isn't this a hoot boys and girls--I'll be fighting on Malcolm's part. (laughs) And I would, guite frankly. As much as me and Malcolm don't like each other, I don't want to see him misrepresented either.

KZ: Did Malcolm McLaren manipulate you (as manager of The Sex Pistols)?

JL: He tried. And we all see where that got him in the court case. I recently wiped the floor boards with him. To put it politely. KZ: Are you stinking rich now as a result?

JL: No. I'm stinking of course because I don't believe in washing. No, I'm not one of the

nouveau riche. Whatever money there is, there's a taxman to consider. On paper, it looks like "Ooh! One million, ooh lovely!" But there are five different parties involved here. And I'm two of them. I won my case. I haven't been stupid. I am an ongoing process. You must understand. To try to rip me off is a most foolish maneuver. I am the devil personified when it comes to that. (in a dramatic tone) Revenge is mine, said the lord! KZ: Do you ever see the other two guys from the Sex Pistols?

JL: Yes, I've earned them quite a sizeable amount of money. And yes we are friends. KZ: Are you going to put together a touring band? You can't possibly use the guys from the album.

JL: I can do whatever I want. I don't think that would be economically viable. (laughs) Listen sod! You'll get what you're given and you'll like it too. I'll have you know, the only one who counts is me. ME! ME! ME! I tell you. (laughs) Where's a good venue in San Francisco?

KZ: Think about using the legendary Fillmore when you come to San Francisco.

JL: I will. On the way to a serious venue. Yes.

KZ: Are you living in New York or Los Angeles? JL: London. For the moment. That's where I'm rehearsing.

KZ: I thought you were going to buy a condo and live in the Valley. (Lydon spent some time in LA recently.)

JL: Eat shit and die. Real quick. Encino. Here's an agony to report. On the way over, I unfortunately had to fly British Airways and yes, everybody was toasting (Prince Andrew) the Royal fiasco. Except me, you understand. I was made to sit on my own. (laughs)

KZ: Are you planning on making any more movies?


JL: No Cop Killer Two.

MORE ON CASSETTES



here are clearly more stations making use of cassettes in broadcasting music than most people would have thought. Our periodic columns on the subject have drawn a response from yet another station that's been doing it with great success for guite a while now.

David Doughty, Chief Engineer of WTLB and WRCK in Utica, New York, writes: "I read with interest your article dealing with 'Success With Cassettes' in the March 14th issue.

"We have been using cassettes as the basis of our oldies library at WTLB since early 1984, when we made the move to AM stereo (Kahn System). We found the cassette system so satisfactory that we also now have our entire A/C format playlist on cassette.

"We use 3 Akai GX-F66RC random-access machines in the control room, and a model GX-F44R to record the tapes. Not only do the machines find the selections by pushing numbered buttons on the keypad, but with a minor circuit modification they were made to cue precisely to the beginning of the desired cut. The system has been in use now for over two years with surprisingly few failures. Akai machines use glass epoxy heads, which seem to stay clean and never wear out. (Indeed, they are guaranteed for 17 years.) About ten songs are on each of the tapes, which are Maxell XL-II (C-90's). Dolby "C" noise reduction is used.

"I also installed a similar setup at WIBQ (FM), this time using two Technics RS-B78 programmable access machines, and dbx noise reduction. I prefer dbx over Dolby "C" because it is less prone to mistracking. I wish Technics had Akai's head technology. These machines, which are still in current production, can also be made to cue precisely, and are very simple to operate. I bought them for about \$300.00 each.

"The key to success with cassettes is to use an excellent phono pickup cartridge in the tonearm to record the music onto the tapes --like the Stanton 881-S or 861EEE-II-S. Be sure to clean the record and stylus before recording each cut."

Very useful information from Mr. Doughty, and I've written back to see if he's willing to share the "simple circuit modifications" that make automatic exact cueing possible.

Cassettes are superior to carts, in my opinion, in most ways, for radio music library use--a large amount of music can be stored in stereo and very high fidelity in a very compact space, rapid access to any song in the library is possible (great for requests or special programs), and the cost of the tape is affordable for even the smallest station, if professional supply companies are used. Cassettes (on the right machines) have been relatively easy to cue, but not as convenient as carts. It appears that difference is increasingly being overcome. If you are using cassettes, or are thinking about it, or just have questions about the subject, I hope vou'll write.

Face it. The most exciting aspect of our gig is watching the underdog acts bloom despite the overwhelming odds. Artists like Canada's Jane Siberry work within different realms of rock n roll taking full advantage of the visual and performance aspects as well as the flat disc format. For artists like Siberry, vinyl is a bit of a constraining medium anyway, which is why you should be pouring over the visual lyric insert, searching for clues. Siberry and her fine band are well on their way towards cracking metropolitan America. Outside record labels have even attempted pirate coups to woo this talent their way. Thinking back, her image has a tinge of backwoods highbrow mixed with an arty urbane hipness. On paper this may sound strange. Onstage it's a very elite, intellectual experience. Track the album in a semblence of solitude.

Mistrial - Lou Reed (RCA)

On the heels of his finest solo LP. New Sensations, Mistrial is a spare, edgier work--well sometimes. Full sounding productions do edge their way to the foreground. Side two's opener, "Spit It Out", for instance, sounds much more like a band than the two person core it actually is, which is Lou himself and bassist Fernando Saunders. "No Money Down" and "Mistrial" will round out the airplay favorites. A personal fave is the rappin' "Original Wrapper".

The vocals are meticulously layered, but the instrumentation is forwardly staunch. Right now GT are mega huge in Canada. Once you hear the whole LP, you'll understand the depth this band carries around. Is this album a debut?



With a stem to stern triple digital LP now available, Icehouse's flagship track continues to be the opening track, "No Promises", not only produced by Rhet Davies but also featuring the drumming of ex-Japan Steve Jansen (David Sylvian's brother). Also appearing elsewhere is Brian Eno. Davies produces half, the better half, of Measure For Measure, Guitarist and co-conspirator Robert Kretschner gives the material the guitared edge necessary to keep things unpredictable. "No Promises", however, is still Icehouse's trump card by a mile.


Closer To The Flame - Rob Jungklas (Manhattan)





STATION IDENTIFICATION COUNTRY IN THE CITY OF BROTHERLY LOVE by Lisa Smith

In 1983, WIFI in Philadelphia changed its call letters to WXTU and changed its format from AOR to Country. In June of '85, General Manager C.J.Jones brought in Bob Young (whose many successes included WMC in Memphis and KNEW/KSAN in San Francisco) to program the station. During our recent Gavin Seminar For Media Professionals, WXTU was among the five finalists for the Country Station Of The Year Award.

While WXTU is currently the only Country station in Philadelphia, and Philly is not a town traditionally known for Country music, Young has faith in Country's ability to succeed there. "You've got to remember that because of the current media mix, people are exposed to Country music more and more. I don't think there'll be much of a problem in the Philadelphia area getting people to admit that they listen to us. In some counties in the Philly metro, we're already number one in our demographics. I think it's just going to take some time. We went from a 3.3 to a 3.6 in the latest Arbitron. So it can happen here - it will happen here!" WXTU is the fourth station to try a Country format in Philadelphia, but the first to ever turn a healthy profit. "I think we probably take it a lot more seriously than anybody else has."

Just prior to arriving in Philadelphia, Bob was programming KHEY/Y96 in El Paso. He acknowledges that programming for a Country station in the Northeast is quite different than programming for a Country station in Texas. "Although the acceptance of Country music in Philadelphia has come a long way, in Texas it's a way of life. Here you have to make it a lot more fun to listen to than you would in Texas. For example, George Strait is probably the hottest artist in Texas, yet he's just starting to happen in Philadelphia. Johnny Rodriguez in an institution in Texas, but not here. On the other hand, Reba McEntire and Hank Jr. are

incredibly hot here. So one of the main differences in programming here is that we're not as deep with some artists as we were there."

Promotions are a way of life at WXTU. They have a mascot called the WXTU Critter, and they throw quite a few free concerts throughout the year. Any place where a large group of people gather - be it a sporting event, parade, or other special event - WXTU tries to be visible. "It's important to have your jocks out there. Believe it or not, a lot of stations don't do this."

Young considers Philadelphia to be a unique radio market. "I think people here are more into radio than any place I've ever been. They the time, but there is pizazz between the music sweeps and we contest a lot". Bob thinks that the music's rotation is important, but "it's what you do between those songs that makes you the winner overall".

notice personality changes a lot more than any place I've ever been. In some instances, if you change personalities,the audience almost takes it personally."

Except for some jingles that talk about "America's music" and some special programming around July 4th, WXTU doesn't play on the historic aspect of Philadelphia. "We try to be a station that appeals to our entire area, which includes part of New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, and all of Philadelphia. So we've got to be good enough and exciting enough that whenever people want Country music in the Delaware Valley, they think of us."

Bob doesn't agree with the naysayers who claim that the popularity of Country music has peaked. "I don't think Country music has peaked. Every time all of us despair and say that the music is getting boring, along comes a new batch of good stuff. But I do think that the strictly 'play three in a row and don't say anything' type of Country radio has peaked. Now I think people want a little bit more excitement - a bit more of a show. I think that a lot of people went over to Top 40 radio because of the excitement and the presentation, not necessarily for the music."

Bob uses this school of thought to program his station. "We're pretty full-service oriented in the morning. We have a helicopter, weather person, and enjoy the humor of 'The American Comedy Network'. We do play a lot of music all meetings is a songs' tempo.

"Philadelphia, for whatever reason, is very tempo conscious. We (Young and Music Director Gina Preston) work hard at keeping the tempo up as much as possible without sacrificing some of the obvious ballads. It's not frantic, but we certainly don't want to put the people to sleep".

Even though they're the only game in town as far as Country radio is concerned, Bob feels that it's more of a demographic battle in Philly than a format battle. "We share a lot of listeners with AOR, Top 40, A/C, Beautiful Music and News stations. So what we do is keep the

tempo up , have a lot of fun, and try to super-serve the 25-54's of the Delaware Valley that like Country music. If I get them, I'm a hero" Young's biggest challange at WXTU has been getting people to believe in the station. "A lot of people didn't want to believe in us because they had been burned by other stations who had played Country music. We've taken the stance that we are Country, we are here to stay, and we are going to be a first-class operation!"

"URBANIZING"

"URBAN CONTEMPORARY: IS IT REALLY A MINORITY FORMAT?"

oday, in many markets, particularly the East and the Southeast, urban contemporary radio enjoys near parity with a number of other general markets formats. In an ever increasing number of markets, FM urban /black formatted stations surpass even optimistic owner's early predictions, scoring consistent and impressive ARBitron victories. Although the future is bright, buyers and agencies cite two key problems - lack of personalities and drivetime availability. At the same time, Madison Avenue says it already has what it takes to match most advertis r needs.

Now for those of you who find the term "urban contemporary" a kind of 'softer' word for black, perhaps you're right. A lot of general market media folks had a hard time accepting CHR in place of Top 40. But the truth is that as times change, words change and new meanings that more accurately describe or define terms we had accepted for years are a reality. At one time urban radio was called black, before that R&B and at one time even "race music". What it's called is far less import than what it is. And what it really is...is crossover music radio, with a split personality.

WHICH SLIDE OF THE PIE?

At one time you had to dial up to the end of the AM band to find some soul. Now you can find it at any point and in many forms - AM and FM. There are the old line gospel-flavored black music stations still lingering in the shadows of their FM big brothers.

IS IT REALLY A MINORITY FORMAT?

Lately urban FM has had a split personality. On one hand it wants to be considered on the same basis as general market radio: same ratings potential, same salary base, same well-produced agency commercials, same equipment, same research, and the list goes on and on. On the other hand, today's black and urban stations


insist that they be recognized and credited for its distinctiveness. After all, isn't that really why it's winning? I mean if the listeners of stations like WRKS/FM in New York, WUSL in Philly, WKYS in Washington, Majic 102 in Houston or WYLD/FM in New Orleans...whew!..the list of top-rated mentions is getting longer...but, if these station's listeners wanted to hear Top 40, chances are there are at least two or three stations that will give it to them. Could be what they really want is a chance to hea Nu Shooz, Stephanie Mills and Prince. Hearing some black superhits in full blown stereo can be addictive, especially if you're in the mood.

The problem is even WINNING black radio often gets the short end of the stick when it comes to advertising dollars. In a new appraisal of modern urban and black radio as an advertising force, we repeatedly encounter resistance from those who are convinced that an effective media campaign need not necessarily include ethnic buys. Agency radio time buyers, advertisers who use radio and sellers of radio in general often do not know how brand loyal our listeners are and what an impact a well-directed campaigri which includes our format can be. As a result, an industry that generated a record \$6.7 billion in advertising revenue in 1985, often doesn't even have a small slide for us.

TRUTHS NOT SELF-EVIDENT

Struggle is nothing new for many of us. Even the truth is not self -evident and the story must be told and retold and then told again. Timebuyers are like everyone else. Eventually one of them will take a chance and that will lead to others who may take a chance. As long as Bill Cosby has a number one television show and Dionne Warwick keeps hosting "Solid Gold" there is hope.

What agencies know most about our format is that there are differences and that the differences are both qualitative and technical.



Pretty soon it will be just radio. And what both time-buyers and agencies find especially attractive in black and urban radio is its growing strength in the youth market and the audience between 25 and 34.

COLLEGE CROSSOVERS

One of the things that is almost a direct by-product of integration is crossover. And many young black students who go away to attend a predominately white university have learned in ways both subtle and blatant that attending a white college that is trying to become less so, can be a daunting experience. One group of students we talked with recently said that as freshmen they were lectured on race relations during orientation week. "We're two or three years away from where we should be in terms of attitudes on this campus, but they (white students) all love our music." Another said, "We have to face majority attitudes. The black student assumes his roommate will be white. Unfortunately, that's also what the white student assumes." Naturally, we learn to share and one of the things we shared was the stereo. Afterwhile, I found that I kind of liked Phil Collins and Journey and Bob Seger."

So maybe black and urban formatted stations are not really minority formats...maybe they're specialty formats and like specialty boutiques.. when they're hot, they're hot and right now, there are a lot of hot urban specialists. Urban music speciality shops are growing. (Next we look at the format <u>within</u> the format "The Quiet Storm.")

The two items to watch in Chartbound are the YARBOROUGH & PEOPLES, who jumped in with 10 more adds this week, and the MIDNIGHT STAR, which was last week's Most Added and this week's second most added. They both look like the hottest 'bounds for the chart. And now for quotes: Melvin Jones at KRNB-Memphis says that the STEPHANIE MILLS "Power Of Love" is a knockout. "It's the first record that 100% touches the black audience ... " from Ms. Mills,

and he feels it's her best! Max Fyre at WLUM-Milwaukee says that "...the JANET JACKSON is on fyre ... " in his town and his listeners can't get enough of it, according to his request lines. Jas Owens at WFXA-Augusta states that the female talent is winning on the request side at his station: PATTI LABELLE, WHITNEY HOUSTON, and PATTI AUSTIN are raking in the calls. Frank Cerami at WUSL /FM-Philadelphia says that he too is getting huge requests for the PATTI LABELLE, but he also mentions that the biggest teen requests have been for the JOESKI LOVE for weeks now. Frank also says that the E.G.DAILY is "a big club record as well as getting big requests." Then, Tony Wright at WJIZ-Albany commented on the WILLIE COLLINS. He says, "Could be another Freddie Jackson!" It's causing the

audience to call to ask, "Who was that?" And if you need to know what's happening in Denver, Danny Harris says, "The Timex Social Club is really exploding in Denver!" Check those out if you're looking for the rest of the best ... Most Added was a close race this week, with only one point separating the first, second and third places teams: SKYY wins, MIDNIGHT STAR places, and MTUME shows, as they say at the track. Pay attention to the PAULI CARMEN (former lead singer of Champaign) single, it was tough in the adds department this week and could be a good first one for his solo career. Another top prospect because of good adds is the ARETHA and the first single from CHERRELLE since her hit duet with Alexander O'Neal, "Artificial Heart". Could be another winner for her.

<u>BELINDA CARLISLE - Mad About You (IRS/MCA)</u> Hearing her voice again it's evident that she was certainly one of the sparks that made The Go -Go's go up the chart. Mature, less juvenile, but still youthful, this is pop music with across-the-board appeal. It's Belinda's style which brings home the message of the song.

JANET JACKSON - Nasty (A&M) Exploding

Urban/Contemporary radio across the country, while a handful of agressive Top 40 outlets are already playing it and picking up immediate response. Though early for most, as her current single is still strong, I list it here to add a vote o;f confidence for one dynamite record.

<u>LIMITED WARRANTY</u> - Victory Line (Atco) Always nice to hear a new band with its own musical identity. Here's a Minneapolis discovery receiving hometown play at KDWB and WLOL, but after a couple of spins there's plenty of reason to believe airplay won't be limited to that market. Timely lyric gets the point across in the positive way.

BANGLES - If She Knew What She Wants (Columbia)

Music from writer Jules Shear is a perfect fit for this hot foursome. Doesn't hit you over the head instantly, as did "Manic Monday", but achieves the desired result in its own subtle way.

JERMAINE STEWART - We Don't Have To Take Our

<u>Clothes Off (Arista)</u> Just the title is enough to grab audience interest. But there's a lot more here than a cute title. Stewart develops a hook that rivals last year's tremendous effort, "The Word Is Out". Under the guidance of producer Narada Michael Walden, it should be obvious that this is an artist we'll be hearing a lot from in the future.

JEAN BEAUVIOR-Feel The Heat (Columbia)

Exceptional debut effort for this former member of The Plasmatics who also played alongside Little Steven and The Disciples Of Soul. Pronounced Jawn Booh-wah, I'm told the video that backs this tune is very hot. If it matches this record, it must be intense.



Patti LaBelle - "Winner" (MCA)

If she had a problem in the past, it was that she over-sang songs. She has such a powerful voice, one trained in gospel, that "emotion" often got the best of her. Lord knows Aretha has had that "problem" at times too. With the pop guidance of Richard Perry and the firm of Bacharach & Sager, this pre- Madonna chanteuse is collared just enough to make her most playable album in history. Anchored by the magnificent duet with Michael McDonald, ON MY OWN, the project should pay great dividends. Other tracks of special merit include: OH PEOPLE, YOU'RE MINE TONIGHT (another new attitude) and BEAT MY HEART LIKE A DRUM.

Neil Diamond - "Headed For The Future" (Columbia)

"Headed For The Future" is the kind of LP which could only be made by a man with Neil's twenty years of experience. His Tin Pan Alley start through his "I Am A Rock Star" film venture hasn't necessarily humbled him, but has lent his recent records a special level of maturity. What makes this new LP so fresh is his decision to seek outside musicianship and production/direction; David Foster, Maurice White, Greg Phillinganes, Bacharach/Sager and even Stevie Wonder. Now that I've got your attention, check out: LOST IN HOLLYWOOD, THE MAN YOU NEED, IT SHOULD HAVE BEEN ME and the first single, HEADED FOR THE FUTURE.

<u>Moody Blues - "The Other Side Of Life" (Polydor)</u> While their professional association has been tentative for nearly a decade, it's good for all concerned that they can get it together every once in a while. Having shed their image as spacial messengers of oblique art rock long ago, this LP can't be labeled as a "change of life" set. This may prove to be the most accessible, least excessible LP in their 20+ years of recording heritage. Though they retain occasional bits of ethereal ambiance, the tracks are pop to those who listen. YOUR WILDEST DREAMS, THE OTHER SIDE OF LIFE and TALKIN' TALKIN'.
