



Keeps Mouth Shut

Refusing to comply with a court ruling that he must file a financial disclosure form to run for Governor of New York, Howard Stern has withdrawn from the race.

"How much money I make is none of your business; screw you," the alwayscharming Stern told a reporter August 4 in an onair news conference from his anchor station, WXRK-New York

Stern, who'd announced his candidacy in March and hooked up with the Libertarian Party for the effort, claimed, on an appearance with David Letterman last week, that he'd reached 18% in the polls.

"I truly wanted to be governor...I would've won...I know, deep in my heart, I would've been the next governor of New York." But, he said, "I don't want to disclose how much money I have. If I did, then if a plumber came to my house, he's going to charge me a fortune. I've got kids...neighbors...they're going to drive me crazy."

"Always looking out for the voters," Letterman responded. "Howard Stern-always worried about the constituents 1

But Stern was so adamant about not revealing his riches that he challenged the disclosure law. When a court upheld it, he withdrew, saying he'd willingly disclose such information as to which stocks he owns. Stern did say that he had spent more than \$50,000 on the campaign.

Letterman, in his own way, pressed Stern on the issue of his earnings. "Ten million?" he asked. Stern wouldn't say. But when Letterman asked, "Fifteen million?" Stern said: "Nowhere near there." "\$70,000?" "More than that," Stern allowed.

While Stern maintained an official secrecy on his personal finances, Newsday reporter Paul Colford did some digging and calculated that the syndicated personality pulls in some \$10 million a year from radio alone, between his estimated \$2 million from WXRK and sixfigure payments from many of the 15 other stations that carry his show.

On Letterman, Stern made another of his occasional promises to leave radio. Saying that his gubernatorial run was no "DI stunt" and that "I hate disc jockeys," he added: "Seventeen months from now, when my contract runs up, I will retire from radio," he said. When he heard applause from the audience, he smirked. "That makes me feel very comfortable," he said. "Thanks."

Setback for Music Vets

A Federal judge in Atlanta has dismissed many facets of a lawsuit filed by veteran singers who claimed that they were defrauded of millions of dollars by their union and by record compa-

Plaintiffs in the suit, filed last year, include Sam Moore (of Sam and Dave), Curtis Mayfield, Jerry Butler, and Felix Cavaliere. They claimed that they were exploited by their record comapnies and their union, AFTRA.

While throwing out many aspects of a lawsuit that originally named 55 record labels, U.S. District Judge Clarence Cooper allowed a civil racketeering claim against ten record companies to proceed.

Stern Shocks Nation, WBCN Ruffles Eagles' Feathers

Just before the band's sold-out appearances at Great Woods last weekend (August 5 and 6), the rocker launched "The WBCN Eagles Greed Rebate," saying they'd give \$50 cash rebates to listeners who bought tickets or to people unwilling to shell out the ticket prices (ranging from \$49.50 to more than \$100.) Runners-up were offered a limited-edition WBCN "Pearl Jam Live" bootleg double-CD set.

The promotion irked the band so much that while onstage, Glenn Frey said he would personally refund tickets to anyone unhappy with the show, and gave out his home address.

America's newest fun couple, Michael and Lisa Marie, have announced plans to perform together at an Elvis Presley tribute concert October 8 in Graceland. The two will perform at least one Elvis classic together. Presley-Jackson reportedly tried to secure a record deal in 1992, but didn't get any takers.

The special, Elvis Aron Presley-The Tribute, is expected to feature a reunion of Naomi and Wynonna Judd as well as appearances by Elton John, Bon Jovi and Lyle Lovett-all of whom will sing Elvis songs.

The pay-per-view event is being put together by Attractions. Avalon

PolyGram and the Presley estate. PolyGram subsidiary Island Records will produce a live recording, and proceeds from the show will go the T.J. Martell and Foundation the Memphis-based St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.

In other news from the Jackson/Presley-Jackson watch, the newlyweds spent last week touring Hungary, bringing gifts to childrens' hospitals. While in Budapest, they offered to pay \$120,000 for 4-year-old Bela Farkas' liver transplant.

Michael Appeals

As expected, George Michael filed an appeal last week in London, asking the courts to overturn its decision that he remain with Sony Music for the duration of his contract.

GAVIN'S sources in London say the appeal is set for sometime in early 1995 and is only expected to last a few weeks. The proceedings will be centered on the grounds of restraint of trade, and there will be no new witnesses or evidence introduced.

Michael is trying to extricate himself from his deal with Sony, which runs through 2003. To date, the proceedings have cost the singer more than \$10 million.

LA Radio's New Stars: Vidals Locos

KPWR-Los Angeles, in the midst of the unending dogfight that is Los Angeles radio, took a chance when its PD chose a pair of brothers from Bakersfield (the 86th ranked market) to fill its morning slot.

But the gamble—in the large forms of brothers Eric and Nick Vidal, aka "Two Fat Mexicans" and "The Baka Boyz" (or "B-Boyz")—has paid off big. The morning slot's ratings have soared from 13th to sixth place, according to Arbitron.

The B-Boyz pepper the station's hardcore hip-hop playlist with rapid-fire wise-cracks, playful epithets and live mixing, and their pratfall and patter is just like tuning into two natural born comedians arguing in front of the TV set at home.

"Answer the question, jackass," says Eric, 24, to his less verbose, 21 year-old brother during our phone interview. Though they may be "jackass" to each other, the brothers could hardly be considered the fools when it comes to their profession. This savvy, they claim, explains their popularity. "There's a lot of bullshitters in the industry," says Nick. "But more and more," Eric interjects, finishing his brother's thought, "radio is looking for street-wise people who know the music."

The Baka-Boyz, who'd

been on KKXX in Bakersfield, came to KPWR after meeting DJ Dave Morales and sending in a demo tape. They won a Friday night hip-hop show on the station in March, 1993, and when morning DJ Jay Thomas left two months later, the brothers tried out for and got the morning slot.

Although theirs is a high vault from Central California

to the top market in the country, "We don't try to consider it a big come-up," says Nick, "because we figure whatever comes up must go down. That's what I like to keep in mind."

Promotions director John Boyle attributes the success to the B-Boyz' natural flair; the siblings' quirks are so boldly front and center that people are drawn by the authenticity. "It's all part of who they are. They fight on the air as well as at home. They're two real guys, proud to be Mexican and fat, two things most people perceive as being bad."

With the brothers' success, Nick claims, other programmers are emulating this format style. "It just shows that people are looking for something new."

Resnik Joins Gavin Marketing

GAVIN is beefing up its sales and marketing team with the addition of well-known industry executive Steve Resnik, who will concentrate on Top 40 business. The team, co-ordinated by Lou Galliani, is being restructured following the appointment of Bob Galliani as commercial director and further appointments are expected shortly as Gavin develops new products and services.

"Steve loves the business and is a round peg in a round hole as far as I'm concerned," says GAVIN CEO David Dalton. "Persuading an executive of his pedigree to join GAVIN is a real coup for us."

For the past two years Resnik published, along with Tom Noonan, *The Charts*, which was distributed to 15,000 independent retail dealers. Before that, he owned New Marketing, a market-research company.

Resnik made his name in the industry during his 11



years with A&M Records, where he was director of national promotion, working alongside Charlie Minor. He began his music industry career as a college radio disc jockey in Southern California, but an offer to work for a label led to his career in promotion.

In collector's circles,

Resnik is known for his world-renowned singles collection, which encompasses every single to hit the *Billboard* Hot 100 in the past 41 years. His museum includes 6,000 pieces of record company memorabilia.

"Having the opportunity to work daily with Steve after a 15-year friendship is a personal top ten thrill," says Lou Galliani. "He's obviously perfectly qualified to help as we reach our Gavin goals and he'll also be able to fill in as starting wide receiver on the Gavin football team."

"Throughout my 23 years in the record business, GAVIN has always been—and still is—the most respected trade in the business," says Resnik. "It's a distinct honor to be part of a team of people I like."

VidGrid Mixes Videos, Puzzles

Dubbed "the Rubik's Cube of rock 'n' roll music videos," VidGrid is a first-of-its-kind multimedia interactive video game. Geffen Records and Jasmine Multimedia have linked forces to produce the CD-ROM game which features nine music videos by artists ranging from Jimi Hendrix to Soundgarden.

VidGrid, which debuts in September, is the first computer software to allow users to manipulate various segments of moving video pictures. Described as "a moving jigsaw puzzle," the screen is divided into scram-



bled squares as it plays a music video. Players try to unscramble the screen and assemble the picture before the video ends, and the game has multiple levels of difficulty.

VidGrid is the brainchild of Norman Beil, head of new media for Geffen Records. Beil hatched the idea when he was putting together a jigsaw puzzle with his kids, and bounced it off David Geffen. Initially, Geffen was skeptical until Beil developed the concept of turning music videos into a game. Geffen warmed to the game after seeing a prototype.

"VidGrid is a great game," Beil told GAVIN. "It's going to get noticed because of the music, but it has to stand on its own merit as a game, and we believe it does." Music is the cornerstone of VidGrid and Geffen rounded up an all-star roster of videos. Aerosmith's "Cryin'," Peter Gabriel's "Sledgehammer," and Guns N' Rose's "November Rain," are Geffen videos, but the Red Hot Chili Peppers' "Give It Away" and Soundgarden's "Spoonman" are culled from other labels.

Requirements to play the game, which retails for \$34.95, are a 486, a double-speed CD-ROM drive, Windows, and a sound card.



Hank Williams's So Lonesome We Could Cry

HANK WILLIAMS THE BIOGRAPHY by Colin Escott with George Merritt and William MacEwen (Little Brown and Company)

Reading *Hank Williams* is like reading a *New Yorker* article. You learn everything about the subject, and

everything about everyone related to the subject. If you're looking for a light read that concentrates on Hank Williams' suicidal behavior, don't bother. But if you're interested in a well-written and meticu-

lously researched book that painstakingly examines the life of one of country music's most incredible yet tragic figures, dive in.

By virtue of Escott's attention to detail, *Hank Williams* can at times seem tedious. But the material is

fascinating, and the reader finishes nearly understanding why Williams was an alcoholic, why he wrote such heart-wrenching songs, why he entered into

> a marriage that made his life a living hell.

> Williams came from a lower-class family whose father disappeared early and whose domineering mother held the family together with

maddening grit. Addicted to alcohol at a young age, Williams' frustration came out through song. He married a woman who, by all accounts, was a moneygrabbing shrew. Seemingly hell-bent to die young, Williams burned himself out on booze and painkillers, but not before legitimizing "hillbilly" music through hits like "Cold, Cold Heart" and "I'm So Lonesome I Could Cry."

Especially fascinating was radio's role in Williams' success. He was singing on the street and selling peanuts when discovered by an executive at station

WFSA in Montgomery, who eventually ran a remote mic down to the sidewalk so Williams could broadcast live.

According to Escott, stories about Williams have become blurred over the years. And since Williams' behavior was so erratic, his stories about himself have been called into question. Escott, however, weaves all the stories into a neat knot, supplying footnotes and a detailed index.

The characters, many of them familiar and still active, keep you turning the pages. The story is not just a chronicle of Williams' life, it's a vivid picture of country music during his life, which began in 1923 and ended in 1952. During those years, via radio, country music's popularity grew beyond being a southern phenomenon, and began its swim toward the mainstream.

Hank Williams: The Biography is a glimpse of where his music came from, a place so tortured that it couldn't sustain life beyond 29 years. But the music—oh, the music—will burn forever.

CBS Serves Gravy at Woodstock

In the onrush of pay-perview, MTV and other TV coverage, and an ultimate movie of the event, radio has had a relatively minuscule role in "Woodstock '94."

But CBS did its bit, hooking up with original Woodstock MC Wavy Gravy for a series of "Woodstock Flashback" features that aired over the CBS Radio Network during the three days of the 25th anniversxary festival.

Gravy (who was scheduled to appear at Woodstock '94), along with Paul "Lobster" Wells of KRQR-San Francisco, produced 21 90-second features to supplement CBS coverage of the festival in Saugerties, NY. Like Gravy, Wells and cowriter Kevin Aspell attended the 1969 Woodstock, where Gravy is warmly remembered for announcing "breakfast in bed for 400,000 people."



JAZ COLEMAN TALKS ABOUT:

THE BAND'S NAME: "The

personalities in the band were frustrated. We used the term 'killing joke' when we envisioned what it would be like to go through the music industry. We studied a lot of bands who had high ideals when they started and by the time they had gone through it, they were a homogenized version of their original ideals, I can remember being with the band in 1978 and imagining how it would be for us. Now, of course, Killing Joke means the laughter that comes with the knowledge that you have total control of your destiny. Things have changed in 15 years, yet Killing Joke is synonomous with the level of awareness we had right from the beginning."

RECORDING IN THE PYRAMID: "It

was a marvelous experience. We recorded two songs, 'Exorcism' and 'Millennium.' I had already recorded in Egypt, so I knew a lot of people there. I go there at least once a vear-sometimes twice. With a few bribes here and there we managed to go through the Minister of Culture. We spent two whole days in the King's Chamber. It is just magnificent. How can I put it into words? I knew the guys in this band when we were all 17 and 18 years old. We've been through so much together and then to celebrate this album in Egypt as well as in New

Zealand—we give thanks. "

THE WRITING: "The thing that people have to remember about us is that nothing is planned. We have a rough outline. With this particular album we wrote a lot of music before we went to the studio, but when we went to work we threw it all away. Pandemonium was pretty much written on the day we actually went into the studio. We just created this awful atmosphere. attacked each other with character assassinations and challenged each other's morals and philosophies. Normally our personal life goes to shit as soon as we start making a Killing Joke record, and it's an explosive and beautiful time. What I'm trying to say is that we don't preconceive songs before we record them, when we do it never works. Our recording process is spontaneous crisis and has very little to do with the intellect. It has to do more with emotion, intuition and spontaneity. It's an open workshop sort of thing where anything can happen, and normally it

THE PRODUCTION: "Youth used to get involved in dubbing up and mixing. He focused on those elements over the years we've been apart. When it comes to performing live I rehearse the band. That's my domain. We just collaborate. It's an open workshop. Each one of us can pretty much do what you want. There are no restrictions other than the fact that if it doesn't send shivers down your back, you're doing something wrong. We just work it until it scares the shit out of us."

Touring: "It will be quite an event when we do play. It probably won't be until the end of October before we're back in the states. I'm interested in meeting achievers and people with refined tastes. These are the kind of people we meet when we go out as Killing Joke. The music becomes personified by all these people when you're out on the road. It's more than music coming out of two speakers, it's a living thing. We seek to heighten the experience of life and sharpen our awareness and our perceptions on every level. We're always trying to push ourselves and I'm looking forward to meeting up with a lot of people when we come out."

Hard Rock Releases

ACID BATH When The Kite String Pops (Rotten)

Climbing out of the Louisiana Bayou swamps is Acid Bath (Dax Riggs, vocals; Sammy Duet, guitar/vocals, Mike Sanchez, guitar/vocals; Audie Pitre, bass/vocals; Jimmy Kyle, drums), creating havoc in the hard rock/metal scene with their debut release, When The Kite String Poss A combination of death metal ard psychedelic rock mixed with a dash of industrial, Acid Bath's hazardous rock grooves and punchy rhythms will attract listeners who dig aggressive, guitar-buzzing rock. You won't find any preachy lyrics; instead, Riggs pummels you with hair-raising vocals that force you to form your own interpretation of their message. Programmers may want to give each track a careful listen so you don't inadvertently play something that may offend your listeners. For those of you whose listeners enjoy being offended, go crazy and play the whole thing. "Jezebel," "God Machine," "What Color Is Death," "Toubabo Koomi" and "Dope Fiend" (hey, how did they know?) will please your death metal fans with their deep guitar hooks, sonic drum smashing and viscous vocals. On the other side of the spectrum is "The Bones Of Baby Dolls" which feature acoustic guitar melodies and ghostly vocals. "Scream Of The Butterfly," "The Blue" and "Tranquilized" are worth a listen. Get the glam out and take an Acic

M.O.D. **Devolution** (Energy)



Rock radio has been saturated with some great hard rock/metal releases the last couple of weeks with from the likes of Machinehead, Marilyn Manson, Epidemic and Killing Joke just to name a few. And just like a swelling, intense p.t, there's always room for one more Resurfacing from a couple of years

of obscurity, Method Of Destruction (Billy Milano, vocals/rhythm guitar; Tom Klimchuck, lead guitar; Rob Moschetti, bass/vocals; Dave Chavarri, drums) presents Devolution, an explosive new album consisting of 12 ripping tunes that'll bowl over even your most ardent listeners. A potent mixture of rock, metal and thrash, these New York rockers deliver waves of grinding guitar hooks, pummeling drums, bass slams and furious vocals loaded political and personal messages. Produced by Rob "Wacko!" Hunter and Milano, and mastered by Alex Perialis (Testament, Pro-Pain, Anthrax), each track has the energy of sharks in a feeding frenzy. "Crash N' Burn," "Super Touch," "Behind," "Time Bomb" and "Running" will have your thrash listeners kickin' up a storm, while the title track, "Land Of The Free" along with "Repent" "Resist" and "The Angry Man" focus on a more metallic approach. A frightening display of power that metal radio won't ignore.

KERBDOG (Mercury)

Storming out of the modest touristy town of Kilkenny, Ireland is Kerbdog (Cormac Battle, vocals, Dara Butler, drums; Billy Dalton, guitar, Colin Fennelly, bass), introducing their version of hard rock with their alternative metallic selftitled debut album. The single, "End Of Green" was warmly received at rock radio, capturing last week's number three Most Added spot with 17 adds. Now it's time to dive into the full album anc treat your listeners to a barrage of energetic tunes that showcase perpetual metallic guitar hooks, tight bass thumps, smashing drums and Battle's melodic vocals. Kerbdog delivers a current sound that's hard enough for metal radio yet soft enough for commercial stations reluctant to play anything with an edge. Kerbdog's edge is sharp but disguised by Battle's smooth vocals and the identifiable guitar and bass rhythms. "Cleaver," "Dummy Crusher," "Schism" and "Dry Riser" will appeal to your metal listeners while "Dead Anyway," "The Inseminator" (note the Metallica influence), "Scram" and "Earthworks" will get the nod from commercial programmers who have an ear for current rock. An impressive first effort that's worth spinning.




MR. FREEZE AND THE HOMEWRECKERS Oh Suzanna! (Radical)





Joi's sense of musical adventure is poised to change the way we listen to music. It may be just the force radio needs to re-examine the confining parameters that have been drawn in programming. What she and Dallas Austin have created with The Pendulum Vibe, her sparkling, sultry debut, is a sonic collage made of songs that have what it takes to shine in radio across formats. "Memories" is tailor-made for AC and quiet storm play, and "Sunshine and the Rain" found a home on mixshows. The result is so compelling that you wonder how the songstress and the hitmaker hooked

"I met Dallas three years ago when he was recording the Highland Place Mobsters album," 101 says. "He had no idea that I sang or wrote, 'cause I never said anything. But word kept getting back to him after he left. We kept in touch, and I came to Atlanta summer of '92. Dallas and I would see each other around, and he'd say 'still writin'? I'd say, 'yeah'—he'd say, 'you know I wanna do work... 'Yeah right,' I'd think to myself. Then one day, more than a year later, he invited me to the studio. He played 'Sunshine and the Rain,' and I incorporated what I was feeling. One take in the booth and he called EMI (the label to which Joi is signed through Dallas Austin Recording Projects) and told them he was ready to do the album. I had never met anvone who saw my vision exactly as I did. Initially, I didn't know if Dallas saw it. Then I heard 'Sunshine and the Rain' and said, 'you did this?!' I realized then that the waters ran deep. It all came out in the music. I knew then that he had a lot more inside than he was letting on.

What Joi didn't know was that Dallas had Joi in his mind for Dallas Austin Recording Projects (DARP) all along. For musical authenticity that matched Joi's vocal power, Dallas brought in his older brother's band, the Claude Austin Jazz Ensemble.

collectively known as Caje'. Joi was inspired and impressed with them. "They're a crew of professional, over-forty, disciplined, cats. Dallas played conductor and we cut the album in two weeks."

JOI & RADIO "It's frustrating

for me. Radio wasn't ready for Sunshine and the Rain,' but it blew up underground and I'm glad it happened that way because the street is an important foundation. 'I

Found My Niche' is more radio-oriented, and maybe after that, 'Sunshine and the Rain' will be appreciated. I think that if you feed the public garbage and they don't have anything else to eat, they'll eat the garbage because they're starving. But if you feed 'em good healthy stuff, they'll eat and get accustomed to it, so when garbage is put before them they'll say 'get that garbage outta here!' Unfortunately, when something good comes along, it's an unfamiliar taste and they're not trying to go there.

UNDERGROUND SENSATION

As is proving to be the case with many new soul acts, Joi is benefitting from respect and word-ofmouth excitement generated by rappers and hip-hop fans about her sound. Joi finds how she's been received by the twentysomething generation to be refreshing; indeed a reflection of her own innovative

"I'm not a serious hip-hop head, but I have respect for the culture utmost. They have given me a lot of love. One of the times I was moved the most was when I was at Outkast's premiere party. They put on 'Sunshine and the Rain' and started freestylin' over it after their show. That brought tears to my eyes that they had chosen my stuff-and everyone was vibin'.

"Rap is the most exploited form of music. It disgusts me to see these Fruity Pebbles commercials and cartoons that have taken our way of life and manipulated it for the sake of dollars and cents. I think getting back to live music is good, because bless George Clinton's heart, how many times can we use that drum sample? We should push our creativity to the max. It's okay to emulate, but you gotta bring your own stuff to the table."

Radio, get ready. Joi's coming with a cornucopia of flavors destined to satisfy.

Your response to our editorials is very encouraging, I've gotten feedback about topics that have appeared in this section. One of the topics that prompted a response was the question of whether or not Urban radio is becoming more artist driven than song-driven? Vic Clemmons, music director at WGCI-Chicago says, "WGCI is song-driven, however at one point we were playing three cuts from AAliyah, four or five cuts cuts from R.Kelly, two cuts from Janet, and about four cuts from El Debarge. We still consider ourselves song-driven. We look at each record with hit potential and what sounds good on WGCI. Album cuts are playing a prominent role in this phenomenon. The trades are also playing a part in this with spins per week You can't hide from it!... Lenore Williams, music director at WUFO-Buffalo says, " It really doesn't matter if you're song-driven or artist-driven because if an artist becomes so large that radio is an automatic (in many cases they're multi-format out of-the-box), you're going to play whatever tests well, even if it's multiple cuts. Some get a reaction as soon as you hear their voices and you know you're going to play them. Look what videos have done. They certainly make you notice

an artist, and you know the listeners have noticed it too....On the topic of changing your music to fit the seasons of the year KACE-Los Angeles music director Mark Gunn says, "You should judge music by seasons. In other parts of the country there are a lot of factors to consider. Daylight hours and the weather itself-and many other things. Here in Southern California it's always hot like Indian summer, so we don't have to shift as drastically. You also shouldn't neglect your young-end listeners with the shift in tempo. It takes some serious dayparting, and radio has to react by skewing 18+ because that's the prime active listener base. Also, when you

talk about Adult stations you have to define exactly what adult is in your market. Adult doesn't have to mean slowing down. You can become so slow that you lose your base and then you've fallen into a trap of saving, We're adult, we have to play more ballads. I don't think that's necessarily the case because remember many of your listeners are in the 25-49 cell, and are familiar with younger-end music like some rap and some hiphop. They've heard it, and many have even watched it grow, so it's somewhat familiar and some of those artists have adult appeal."...Stan Boston formerly of WNHC-New Haven has left to join the air staff of WKYS-Washington to do evenings. Bently Clark will take over programming duties. Because of the shift, Lenny **Green's** duties will be expanded he'll continue as music-director... WYBC-New Haven has changes in their programming department. The new program director is Juan Castillo and the new music director is Paul Washington. They both were upped from in-house. Derrick Daniels and Wayne Schmidt have been reassigned to other duties in the station...For the first time in years there is a lot of good music out this fall. The new BeBe and CeCe Winans is great. The new Anita **Baker** is a standout, there is also something new from Russ Freeman and the Rippingtons featuring Jeffrey Osborne, the hot new trio Emage, Gladys Knight, Gerald Levert, Betty Wright, Tyrone Davis album and so many more. 





Amy Grant is shown in the photo (above) flanked by Gavin's Ron Fell and Diane Rufer at a pre-release listening party in Los Angeles last month. And lo & behold, this week's HOTTEST track in the format by a wide margin is Grant's "Lucky One" which is already at #16 after just 14 working days. It captures #1 MOST ADDED again with 80 new this week to go with the 96 new last week. Less than 60 of a possible 235 stations are yet to hear it. Top spins commitments include better than three times a day from WOTU, WDAY, KBIG, WMJQ, WQLH, KXYQ, WZNY, K99, WRQX and KVIC.

After just two chart weeks the **Pretenders'** new single, "I'll Stand By You" is already at #28 and it's cleared the 100-station mark with 15 ADDs this week from KBMG, WKSQ, WAHR, KMGQ, WNUY etc. Its increase in Spins Per Week Per Station of 2.53 is tops in the format, even including Amy Grant.

We took Paula to A3 on July 5, stressing the track

"I Am So Ordinary." Her success at the format was immediate, and she has continued to move forward by leaps and bounds. There is no question that Paula's music transcends categorization and we plan to take her to Alternative and Top 40 radio following our establishing a firm base in A3.

In addition to our efforts at rado, we have made a wonderful video for "I Am So Ordinary," which celebrates the unique nature of every individual. We are working the video at the regional and local levels initially before taking the video to the national outlets.

One the tour front, Paula is opening several Counting Crows shows throughout August as well as performing with Peter Gabriel in the last few shows on this tour, including an appearance at the Woodstock Festival. We are excited to have Paula appearing at the GAVIN A3

Summit conference on August 25 with Lyle Lovett and Luka Bloom, immediately following which she will be touring with Jules Shear.

Back To The Love Of Music

When I first met Paula Cole I had just moved back to San Francisco after almost 20 years of doing A&R and record production in Los Angeles.

I had seen it all, done it all, and become an unbearable know-it-all. I was one burned cynic. Toast. Enter Paula...

I recorgnized her potential immediately. We started to work together and I began preaching the Gospel according to Carter: the process, the percentages, the predictable. Blah, blah, blah. I tried to school Paula but she taught me the most important lessons: Integrity above all. Be true to yourself. Art. Paula reintroduced me to the reason we are all in this crazy business: The love of music. The rush of discovery. The urge to pass it on.

I have been involved with more than my share of incredible talent, but there is no one that is as uniquely gifted as Paula Cole. I have seen her audience brought to tears. I have seen them through my own tears. Her lyrics, her music, her voice, her performance.

She is the essence of artistry.

The Editors Talk About Paula Cole..

Though achieving total consensus at top 40 is difficult due to splintering caused by rhythmic/urban leaning or alternative leaning stations, there's still that down the center slot mainly occupied by so-called adult/mainstream top 40 outlets. Anyone targeting that audience should be alerted to Paula Cole.

Cole's debut album displays exceptional songwriting. Her lyrics are bound to hit home with an upper demo female audience. Be sure and listen closely to "I Am So Ordinary" and "Happy Home" but the entire project is worth taking the time to listen to. If success was solely based on an emotional scale this project would be an automatic homerun.

With her warm, beautiful voice and smooth delivery, Paula Cole might not be an obvious choice for grunge-leaning, alternative rock stations. But the trend reflecting Alternative radio's cozy relationship with a number of not-so-obvious female artists shows no sign of waning, as the recent success stories of Tori Amos, Sheryl Crow and Mazzy Star clearly indicate.

Paula Cole's crystalline voice and poignant lyrics—especially in songs such as "Saturn Girl," "Dear Gertrude" and "Hitler's Brother"—make the perfect foil for alternative stations that are tiring of the guitar-oriented rock currently dominating playlists. Her sound is exactly what stations actively seeking out an upper demo female audience is looking for.

We first heard about Paula Cole from Bonnie Simmons during the planning stages of putting on SFO1. Here was this new artist who, after working two years in the Tassajara Bakery in San Francisco, had signed to Imago Records and joined Peter Gabriel on a world tour. We learned that she was managed by Carter, who has built an excellent reputation working with women like Tina Turner and Martha Davis of the Motels. Carter sent a rough dub that wasn't yet sequenced, but sounded great. At its time of arrival, the record wasn't scheduled to be out for months.

It wasn't until we were putting together On The GRIDdle for this year's GAVIN Seminar that we experienced the programming power of Cole's music.

Months later, Keith and I were having lunch with Luka Bloom who was extremely excited about playing Boulder on the opening night of the Fox Theater. When he learned that Paula Cole was on the bill, he leaned over his steamed vegetables and began singing, "I Am So Ordinary," which he'd learned listening to a demo tape.

Like all great artists, in time Paula Cole's message will transcend a specific group and spread to admirers that will span age and sex brackets.

Bassist Steve Swallow puts some heavy jazz cats like Mulgrew Miller and Jack DeJohnette through some wacky sounding tunes.

RECORD TO WATCH



CHARLIE HADEN THE MONTREAL TAPES (VERVE/POLYGRAM)

Why should a live concert staged five years ago interest jazz radio today? The Montreal Tapes is only the opening salvo of what promises to be a fine collection of live recordings from one of jazz's most important bassists. From July 30 to August 8, 1989, Radio Canada recorded what must have been a scintillating, unusual tribute at the Festival International de Jazz De Montreal: eight continuous concerts featuring and honoring Haden in various onstage configurations. Each performance spotlighted Haden in various duos and trios, and culminated with a rare live gig with the full Liberation Music Orchestra, arguably the finest large ensemble in jazz today. One night, Haden played with Geri Allen and Paul Motian, another with Pat Metheny and Jack Delohnette. The Montreal Tapes, the first release, focuses on the third night's gig, an "Ornette-less" trio with the esoteric and unpredictable Don Cherry on pocket trumpet and the Ed Blackwell on drums. Clearly pumped by the challenge, Haden straddles the role as swing-meister and secondary soloist, testing every fiber of his time keeping and soloing expertise. We wonder how this spacious live trio recording will compare with future recordings from the festival. With no rap on Blackwell and Cherry, we can't wait to hear the tapes featuring Allen, Metheny and the entire LMO.

INTERCHANGE (MUSE)


Here's our vote for coolest Muse release of 1994. Last week, radio sang the praises of guitarist Pat Martino's second comeback attempt, Interchange, by making it a most added selection, not to mention the individual comments we heard from PDs. This is a special recording because it truly marks the full comeback of Martino's explosive guitar swing since recovering from a congenital brain aneurysm in 1980 that robbed him of his memory and musical motor skills. Martino spent all last year practicing at a feverish pace, and on this recording date his guitar solos dominate each tune. Martino barrages each performance with a sea of notes, regardless of whether the tempos dictate a slow ballad like "Black Glass," a challenging fast-paced cooker ("Just For Then") or a mid-tempo piece like the title cut. Interchange, Martino's real comeback release (PM's 1987 live Muse recording, The Return, fell short) is guided fastidiously by Sherman Ferguson, his loyal drummer since 1964. Ferguson meets the rigorous demands of Martino's sweeping solos by adapting to an inthe-pocket rhythmic stance. Bassist Marc Johnson also capitalizes on Martino's fierce swing tendencies as these sessions generated a majority of first-takers. Martino benefits from Muse's set-up-and-go-for-it style of recording.

PHAREZ WHITTED (MOJAZZ/MOTOWN)

With labelmate Norman Brown's chartopping A2 success, coupled with the simultaneous top-ten action of Rick Braun's Night Walk, another trumpet player named Pharez Whitted has a trail blazed to make his move. With the saxophone and the guitar rivaling as A2's favorite solo instrument, Whitted, like Braun, walks a knife's edge between bolder improvisations and fluid grooves. As a producer, Whitted bathes his horn in layers of reverberation and utilizes floating electronic keyboard accompaniment, Latin percussion and legato, plugged-in bass to extract some of the bop sting from his arrangements. Being 70 minutes and a dozen tunes deep, there's plenty of improvisation and band chemistry. On the first few listens, "Timeless Traveler" will provide A2 with a stylistic change of pace.

BOBBY LYLE RHYTHM STORIES (ATLANTIC)

The funk and melodic elements of Bobby Lyle's piano come alive on Rhythm Stories, his latest Atlantic effort, recorded on both coasts, some in New York and some in sunny, quaking Southern California. Lyle likes to leave his tasty imprint on all different modes of jazz-pop; "B's Mood" tests his improvisational skills on a bed of easygoing chord progressions and rolling sax lines; Stevie Wonder's "Here We Go Again" and "Higher Ground" will jar many a listener's memory as Lyle masterfully mixes the main themes with acoustic piano and Hammond B-3-ish keyboard. If Lyle has such a thing as a trademark, "Cool Walk" is it. His stinging, syncopated, acoustic piano darts around some lively stops and starts. Gerald Albright "cool walks" his alto sax parts across a lively percussion-filled sound canvas, volleving nicely against Lyle's spiked piano attack. There's even a "jazz-hip hop-funky-bebop" synthesis on a tune entitled "Funk Street." Kenny Garrett tosses in more than a few post-Miles style fills here. Another easy choice would be the breezy "Exotic Love" featuring Everette Harp on sax. Lyle's acoustic piano, steeped in funk roots, is both lush and flash enough to set a credible, but satiny, mood.



REAL MCCOY Another Night (Arista)

An amazing debut by this singer/actress who also displays her skills as a writer. As a youngster, Danielle made her mark on Broadway in Annie, and seems to be one of those blessed with many creative abilities.

BOSTON What's Your Name (MCA)

To many, the name Boston is synonymous with the very finest in rock production. Tom Scholz has been called a perfectionist, and the group's re-entry on the chart proves that he still demands nothing less than the best.

ALICIA BRIDGES I Love The Nightlife (Mother/Island)

Just when you thought it was safe on the dance floor, disco returns. Heard on the soundtrack to The Adventures of Priscilla. Queen Of The Desert, a wacky film about drag queens stuck on a bus in the desert, this 1979 disco classic could enjoy a second run as an action side on radio.

Albums

City Of Sin (Dedicated/Arista)

City Of Sin marks the second album from this English foursome, and like their debut, it's full of beautiful, often disturbing songs that can wrench the heart right out of you. Songs like "The Great Escape," "Highrise" and "Fire In The House" have a claustrophobic quality to them that verges on panic-attack; they're very dark and very sexual. Others, like "Rains Like Fire" and "Hands On My Soul," seem less angry, and more hopeful—perhaps more resigned. GEORGE HOWARD A Home Far Away (GRP)

It's the second half of the ten songs on A Home Far Away, soprano saxophonist George Howard's fourth disc for GRP since 1990, that really tells the story. "Grover's Groove," is a funky tribute to Grover Washington Jr., the mentor who gave Howard early exposure during a 1979 tour. Then Howard gives a passionate workout of Sade's "No Ordinary Love." The final three tracks, the title song, "For Our Fathers" and "Renewal," are exotic departures, much more progressive adult alternative based than Howard's usual Ouiet Storm/urban leanings. -KEITH ZIMMERMAN



L YOUNG AND CRAZY HOR is With And

It must be a tough hit to find your work incorporated into a celebrity's suicide note, which is what happened to Neil Young. Such an incident is bound to cast a mean shadow across your work. Still, Neil Young seems to have dealt with it by recording an album with plenty of rust, mud and low key—dare I say—grunge. The mood of Sleeps With Angels seems down as Young combs the ravages of Crazy Horse's dark side. While "Change Your Mind" has plenty of harmony and grind, many of the songs might remind you of Tonight's The Night, another classic Neil Young album that was born on the dark extremes. —KENT ZIMMERMAN


