Spinal Tap Tapped For Seminar Performance

In what will be their second stateside appearance since the untimely death of drummer Joe "Mama" Besser, English rockers **Spinal Tap** will headline the Gavin Seminar '92 with a performance immediately after the star-studded cocktail party Friday, February 14.

This special Valentine's Day gig will feature songs from the band's newest album *Break Like The Wind*, the long awaited followup to their hit recording *Smell The Glove*. Original members **Derek Smalls**, **David St. Hubbins** and **Nigel Tufnel** (**Harry Shearer**, **Michael McKean** and **Christopher Guest** respectively), promise to put their collective hearts into this special Valentine's Day performance, to be held in the Colonial Room at the Westin-St. Francis Hotel. Don't miss it! See the band's latest drummer while he's still alive!

Spinal Tap's appearance is only one of the many showcases that will mark this year's Seminar as our most outstanding to date. On Thursday, February 13, a Jazz Showcase held in the California West Room and sponsored by Sony Music will feature

Ottmar Liebert and legendary **Weather Report** founder **Joe Zawinul**. Liebert will perform material from his newest album *Solo Para Ti*. Later that evening, also in Cal West, will be a very special appearance of **Warner Bros.** artists **Bob James** and **Earl Klugh** who are recording together, and will give Seminar attendees a preview of their upcoming album. Thursday night will also feature a special one-of-a-kind showcase featuring special artists we'll announce next week.

On Friday, in addition to Spinal Tap, multiple sets will follow the cocktail party. **Manhattan** recording artist and newcomer **Holly Cole** will perform, and later in the evening **Mesa/Bluemoon** artists **Strunz and Farah** will be joined by guitarist **Al DiMeola** for a special Jazz show in the California West Room.

Dublin can be a rambunctious city. The written word and Guinness have long been its prime exports. From the northern perimeters of Barrytown to Clery's clock on O'Connell to the waves of shoppers on Grafton Street, Dublin is a virtual music factory. The electro-acoustic magnetism of a new band like the Saw Doctors reflects the active edge of the city. The writings of Roddy Doyle (who invented *The Commitments*) is cheeky yet steeped in Irish working class values. At the same time, Dublin can offer moody sustenance for grizzled expatriates, like Van Morrison and Shane MacGowan, who are starving for historic epiphanic images. Over the past two years, Enya has joined the world music elite in terms of a global impact. Her music reflects not only the magic tranquility and patience of a glorious Eire countryside, but of a special kind of Dubliner who is familiar with mixing traditions with technology.

When we last left Irish composer/singer Enya and her creative partners Nicky and Roma Ryan in 1988, their debut release *Watermark*, and its global hit "Orinoco Flow," created a swelling sales current that has since surpassed a worldwide sales total of over four million records. Three years later, with the release of *Shepherd Moons* on Reprise, the trio remains intact in purpose. Roma Ryan, with almost mystical coincidence, encircles Enya's delicate, Celtic-based melodies with lyrics brushstroked from a venerable subject palette of

history, astronomy, geography, mythology and ingrained familial remembrance. As producer and studio mentor, Nicky Ryan fends off the hazardous breezes of impersonal digital replication, striving always to keep the sound rounded and wholesome. Layer upon layer of vocals and multi-tiers of instrumentation are still painstakingly stitched together in real time, with nary a trace of machine-generated keyboard sequences.

With the addition of a modern digital recorder to their home studio, the demo process has been mostly eliminated, and the trio no longer needs to travel down to London for excessive re-recording, save the mixing process, the occasional overdub or the sparing use of extra musicians. Creating Enya's music is an expanding home-grown process that takes place minutes outside of Dublin on a three acre patch of land. Nicky Ryan explains.

"The fact that we put money aside for our own recording equipment means we don't have to worry about pouring money down the drain. We're getting to the point where we can do almost everything in-house. We still have the old studio, where we did the original demos for Watermark, but we've installed a thirty-two track digital machine in that facility. We worked on Shepherd Moons in the same way we worked on Watermark. Only this time they weren't demos. We mixed it all in London and did a little bit of recording at Trevor Horn's studio, Sarm West. Next time

around we'll mix it in Ireland, too."

For Nicky, a studio doesn't have to be a sterile work mill, especially for music as steeped in tradition as Enya's. Ryan sees it as a room with a view, with the musician's sensibilities in mind.

"The building was deliberately designed to look old. It matches a church that's not too far away from us. It's almost an exact duplicate built in stone. We wanted windows in our studio, so we put them in. You can see things outside. On a good day we're twenty minutes outside the center of Dublin. It's a perfect location. We have a touch of the countryside and three acres of space."

Even with London relegated to post-production status, Enya looks to future days when her albums will be totally finished in Dublin, away from thoughts of hotels, traveling and business matters.

"In the beginning it was difficult to adjust to mastering as we went along. We thought it was great having a 32-track digital machine recording everything that happened. We felt quite paranoid in the beginning. We were extra careful and it took a while to relax. It didn't happen overnight. It was strange still taking all this work to London because it's so personal and no one had heard it yet."

Nicky now looks to their final technical challenge—joining the sonic distinctions of digital and analog as one.

"Next time, we still want to try and combine analog and

digital—get the squash into it. Analog is great because of its imperfection and it gives you this warmth. It adds something to the sound. Digital takes and gives it back. I think it's possible to someday create an analog sound after digital. You have to do it from the desk. We're going to go for it next time around.

"I've been faulted for not having an edge to Enya's sound. But we deliberately avoid edge. There is an inherent distortion in analog recording that is wonderful to the ear. The Japanese tend to edge that up with the design of their speakers. They push things even further. I find that objectionable in a way. I don't do it for my hearing. That's the way the melodies speak to me. They say, 'I want to be warm. Don't put snare drums in.' "

With the technology dragon slain, Enya still sees little time saved in the insulated process of composing and performing. It's a careful quest of preserving the melody without getting overly engrossed in sound for sound's sake.

"We steer away from taking any shortcuts. The two of us are fine tuning all the time. We refer back to each other constantly to see if we're treating the melodies the right way. We don't look for anybody else's opinions, except Roma's.

"On Shepherd Moons, like on Watermark, there were a lot of tracks we had arranged and thought were finished. Listening back a few weeks later, they didn't work for us because we got involved in sound and forgot about the melody. The melody wasn't saying what it wanted to say. We listened back to the track 'After Ventus' and were very disappointed. We swallowed hard and stripped it down again to the melody and improvised another melody on top of it. We ended up with two and put them together until they overlapped. It became counter-melody, then it started working for us again.

"Then we stuck two sets of lyrics in both directions. You have two sets of Latin lyrics fighting each other, interweaving. It was not a perfect rendition. It was as far as we could take it. The time is important to

us. We now have the time to listen back because we don't have other influences or opinions to depend on."

Oddly, Nicky sees the spontaneous creative process for rock n roll bands as the exact opposite of Enya's meticulous composing methods.

"It works in reverse for rock n roll bands. They get it right the first time and then they go in and beat it to death and sweeten it. For Enya, it's a matter of chipping away. The fact that it is all played in real time—piece by piece without sequencing—makes it slightly adrift and gives it a human feeling."

Enya's first single from Shepherd Moons, "Caribbean Blue," could be the first world-wide hit in a long while done in a rolling 3/4 waltz style. It also gave Enya a glimpse of how her melodies evolve.

"I played 'Caribbean Blue' for Nicky in waltz time from the beginning. I wasn't aware at first, but it's been pointed out to me that when I'm composing I always accompany myself singing the melody. I was playing 3/4 time and humming the melody. I found out I rarely compose a melody on a keyboard. I sing the melody thinking I'd written it on the keyboard."

Playing on an Enya track can be a trying experience—even for the trained player. Enya explains.

"Soloists are aware of the difficulties of performing my music in real time. When we were recording in Sarm West, we brought in some of them. They just stood there and said they couldn't understand some of the time signatures. I will hum or sing the solo I want performed—I want it exactly where I pause, build up or pull back. One soloist, the Uilleann piper Liam O'Flionn, was the exception. He really listened to how I was singing. He'd go out to record it, then stand behind us and listen again to how I was singing it until he got it exactly right. It wouldn't work when the musicians would listen to the notes and try to put it in their time.

"The cornet player we used on the record was an excellent musician, but he kept missing the

point," Nicky laughs. "He kept thinking Enya was making a mistake. Instead of playing exactly what she sang, he thought it had to be done his way or the way it would be done in a book or something. That's the problem with using other musicians, except for traditional musicians. They need to drift with the music and not

worry about the time."

"It could be an Irish thing. There aren't any metronomes in Ireland."

"We went down some creative dead ends with 'Caribbean Blue.' We had to find our way all the way back and wipe it all out and start again. There went three months work. It's like something has won a game against you. You must keep at it so you won't get that sense of failure. It can be very stressful, but that's the price you pay for getting it right."

"There were so many stages when we felt, 'Let's forget this piece,'" Enya adds. "There's a part of us that has grown to love this melody and won't let us forget it. We always listen back after we leave it and try working on something else. We put a lot of ourselves in the music, so we go back, not because of the failure, but because we love the track. We like to treat each song with the same feeling. We're

afraid to veer towards one or have a favorite in the studio.

"We work around coincidences in the studio. We get very involved with this. Roma will suggest a theme and then the next thing we know, we'll read about it or see it on TV. We feel it's a sign for us to work on this song. It happens so often. When we decided to record the Shaker hymn, 'How Can I Keep From Singing?', there was a documentary on TV about them. Then Roma was reading an old reference book and found that during the famine in Ireland, the Shakers had sent over grain. We felt this bond. We enjoy these coincidental occurrences."

"The last song, 'Smaointe...', had to be about Enya's two grandparents." Nicky emphasizes. "There was no question about it. It became that immediately."

"Smaointe translated means thought." Enya points out. "I have lots of thoughts about my grandparents all the time. Roma seemed aware of this without me telling her. I didn't say anything, but when I played her the melody, I thought of them like I

called 'Marble Halls.' It from an opera called the Bohemian Girl and written by an Irish composer, William Balfe. It's actually a romantic song. It's my first love song and it's a hundred years old. The melody was so beautiful, but it was sung by an opera singer. I adored the song, but thought that it had been sung so well, what was the point? But if I were to sing it, I could do it in a different way."

Nicky interjects proudly. "Johann Strauss paid Balfe the supreme compliment by saying he was the master of melody. He was born in Dublin."

"There's a strange story behind 'Marble Halls,'" Enya recalls. "I remember being immediately drawn to it as a melody. Then I was at home for a week with my mother in September. I was talking to my mother about what I recorded because my parents never hear anything until I'm finished. I mentioned to her that I recorded a song called 'Marble Halls.' She used to perform the song at school when she was a teenager in boarding school."

Enya pauses and smiles, then



always do. She went away to work on the lyrics and came back with the lyrics being about them. It was wonderful for me, because I didn't have say to her what the melody was about. Roma had felt it.

ABOUT RECORD PROMOTION

No topic I've touched on, since writing about the issue of "speeding up records" in October of 1988, has so apparently touched a nerve as the column of last December 6 entitled "Music Promotion Pressure." I have several letters in response, although none, so far, from the record promotion fraternity. I would like to hear the pluses and minuses of dealing with radio station music personnel from a record promoter or two, since the matter is hardly a one-way street. I'm printing all comments received on this subject anonymously so nobody writing risks any form of retaliation.

The first letter received comes from a smaller market station in the west. "As in many smaller markets, I am PD/MD/PM Drive. My time is tight. I offer a specific 2 hours a week for 'music calls.' Just for the 'What the hey?' of it, I started charting calls while we were talking:

"The guys with the 'better' records average about 6 minutes a call. The ones with 'marginal' tunes use up about 16 minutes a call.

"I hope you won't mind this letter losing form and going to 'notes,' because I...could be sitting here for a couple of hours [otherwise]...

"When the trades started tracking rotations instead of chart positions, nothing changed... I don't really care how many 'points' my station may be worth... It's a major pain when, after speaking with the 'label,' several more calls are received on behalf of the same record from independent promo people... It's a pain when the same guy says the same things every week, seemingly to keep me on the line so that others may not get through (we've had to install a special line because these guys would stay on hold

and jam the station switchboard)... When you're in a smaller market (as in 'limited \$\$\$' for research purposes) the radio station will have a tendency to take on a very real personality of its own—almost a mirror of the MD's ideas and attitudes. But when 'these guys' call, armed with research stats from majors across the country, and all I can say is 'I don't think that'll work as well here,' and that's when the language wars begin...

"Playing defense is a crummy way to spend any given two-hour period. I wonder why 'these guys' send songs they're not actually working, if they're going to object to my playing them. I really hate the 'I'll trade you this one for that one' routine! At the end of each call comes the invariable 'Anything I can do for you?'—which is when I recall 'there ain't no free lunch'.

"This venting could continue, but what I'm hoping for is some sort of statistical survey among MDs, circulated throughout the industry, that could possibly show 'these guys' that the harder they hammer, the more resistant people like me are likely to become. It's great having the advantage of industry contact, but after seven years of this I'm about ready to just blow off all music calls. 'You send 'em, I might play 'em.' That, after all, was the deal in the first place.

"At our station we're very fortunate to have a decent market rating. Unfortunately that seems to compound the pressure... Some might read this and remark upon the 'egomaniac' running that radio station, perhaps. But let there be no mistake, I work for this radio station, not the recording industry. That our interests are frequently similar is fine. But when the going gets tough, it's my gig on the line, and there ain't no record company guy gonna bail me out or make my next rent payment.

"Well, I feel better now—at least until tomorrow when they call again."

I thank this PD/MD for his comments on the subject. I can't help but reflect that there are many radio people who long for attention from the record people, but because they are not "reporters" or prominently rated stations, they can't get the time of day from the record industry. Indeed, if I have a complaint about record promotion today, it's that promotion has narrowed considerably from what it was a decade or two back, with promotional efforts now concentrating on a much smaller group of stations, and the promotion on those stations is much more intense than it was before. Undoubtedly the record industry has a rational explanation for this strategic change, but it seems to me to be the reason why the majority of radio stations in the United States feel neglected by promoters, while a minority feel battered and sometimes abused by an intense barrage of promotion!

More letters on this subject next week. In the meantime, I repeat—I'd love to have some responses from the record industry side of the issue! Write me c/o The Gavin Report. ■

Robbie Robertson has been scheduled to perform a couple of tunes from his new Geffen *Storyville* album on "Saturday Night Live." He'll be sharing the stage with host Chevy Chase on January 18...Danzig is in closed recording sessions and targets mid-1992 for release...Beginning with the January 3 show, "ABC In Concert" was renewed for an additional 24 weeks. That night's show featured Keith Richards and His X-Pensive Winos from The Palladium in New York. No hints as to performers the next 22 weeks...Producer Tom Werman will produce the next Steelheart album...Super Bowl XXVI will be held on Sunday, January 26 at the Metrodome in Minneapolis. Gloria Estefan

will take a break from her world concert tour to perform in the halftime spectacular...While *Exodus* finishes up their new album in Europe for Relativity there's help to get you through the wait. *Good Friendly Violent Fun* was recorded at the Fillmore in San Francisco during the summer of '89 and includes a great cover of AC/DC's "Dirty Deeds Done Dirt Cheap"...Those Black Crowes are planning to release their Def American follow-up to the five million plus seller, *Shake Your Money Maker*, sometime this summer. They're working in Atlanta with a new guitarist, Marc Ford, and with producer George Drakoulis...

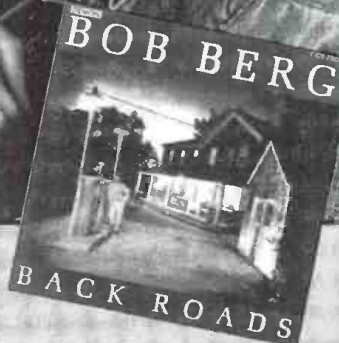
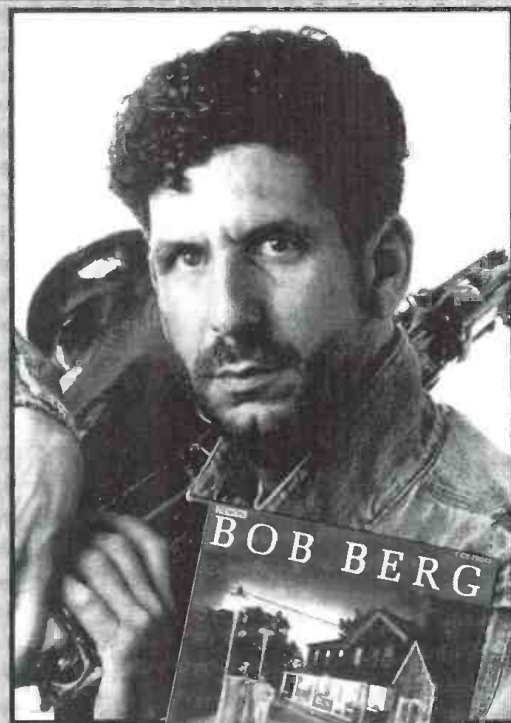
PACIFIC COAST HIGHWAY - CHRISTOPHER FRANKE (PRIVATE MUSIC)

After eighteen years with *Tangerine Dream*, synthesist Christopher Franke decided to pull up stakes and move to Los Angeles. For reasons ranging from earthquake paranoia to the comforts of Germany, TD co-founder Edgar Froese chose to stay behind. Franke is one of those pioneer Adult Alternative artists who can have it both ways. By being in LA he can continue to pick up motion picture soundtrack assignments because of his success with such film classics as *The Sorcerer*, *Risky Business* and Michael "Miami Vice" Mann's *Thief*. In each, the music played a major role in each movie's distinctive personality. Also, since Franke has grabbed Hollywood's attention, he's formed his own label, *Sonic Images*, and together with *Private Music* can pursue his dream of becoming the next *Vangelis* while recording other talented friends. Adult Alternative interest in *Pacific Coast Highway* has soared in the new year. There's a lot to choose from on PCH. It's broad in feeling and performance depth—a little classical mixed with a lot of mystery, intrigue and atmosphere. Try tracks like "Mountain Heights," "Lontano Mystery," the lonely and scenic "Malibu Avenue" and "Big Sur Romance." For maximum commerciality try "Driving Into Blue." Franke now drives the PCH instead of the Autobahn. His chips are on the table for the future of this music.

SLOW BOAT - AKIRA JIMBO (OPTIMISM)

We're glad to see a new Akira Jimbo CD, which helps crown the new year. Jimbo's last record was filled with tasty grooves and slappin' rhythms. He works great with the heavy talents that seem to adorn each track. You know the names—Herbig, Ferrante,

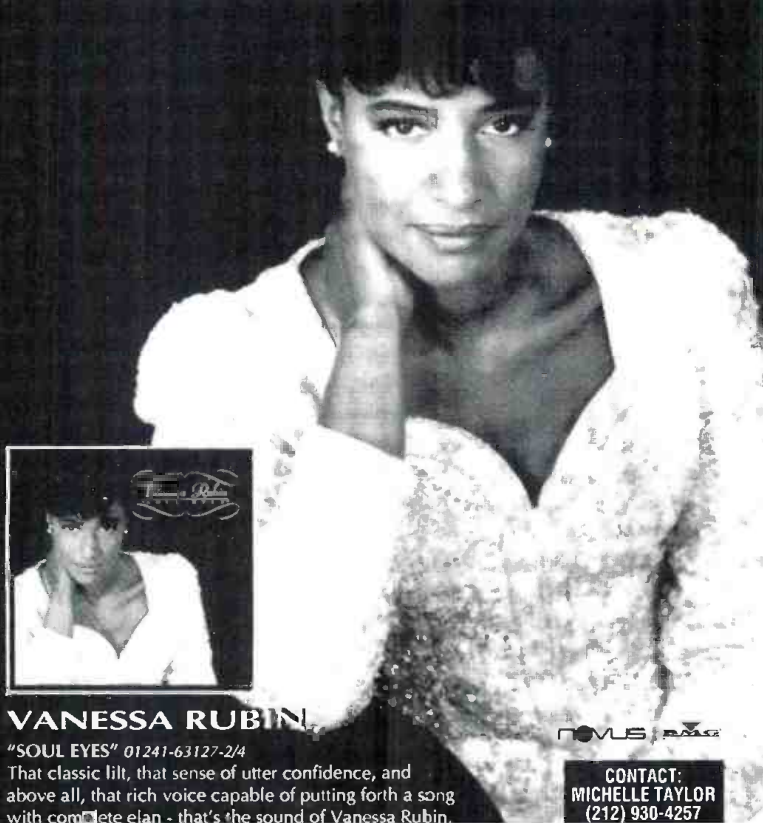

Jackson Jr., Albright, Rotella, Cameron, etc. With the opener "Roll Over 90's," Akira throws a curve by using chromatic harmonica soloist Chris "Hammer" Smith. Akira adds a dominant vocal presence throughout. It succeeds better when he employs a female vocal trio to augment the main arrangements like "Get Down To The Wire." More traditional Jazz ears might try the big band trumpet flavored "Mosaic." Still, our favorite element of Akira's music is his rollicking percussive ways. You get super reliable, anchor bottom drums sending off each tune. Stretch out with the fluffy, funky "Sincerity," which features Gerald Albright's flirtatious soprano sax. Our pick? "Rain And Shine" is a very "up," celebratory piece for AA, packed with mucho Jimbo back-beat punch. Love those drums. Turn it up!

PASSAGES - TOM HARRELL (CHESKY)

Oooh...Tom Harrell and the Chesky sound...ahhhh...with Paul Motian on drums and Joe Lovano on sax. It's a made to order hard Jazz production. Harrell goes through stages when he records. He'll cut some really close, intimate solo/rave-up sessions, or he'll dive into larger ensemble arrangements armed with rich compositions. Passages veers toward the latter. Acoustic Jazz aficionados should start with the jumpin' "Papaya Holiday." The extra layer of percussion by Cafe mellow roasts the rhythm section of Motian and bassist Peter Washington. Danilo Perez injects some Latinized piano chord spreads. Lovano and Harrell float, twist and swing in unison like two Bop kites joined on the same line. "Lakeside Drive" is a breezy convertible car ride back in time through Mulligan/Baker/Pepper's turf dur-

ing LA's Cool Bop daze. The pieces stretch out a bit, including another Latinized trek into the fifties, "Expresso Bongo"—named after the British Beatnik film starring—that's right!—Cliff Richard. Harrell's solo here will nail you to the wall.

DELIRIUM - CAPERCAILLIE (SURVIVAL/BMG-Import)

A few of us got hip to the Northern Scottish Gaelic band Capercaillie in 1989 when Green Linnet released the stunning *Sidewalk*. Back in October of 1990 we jumped at the chance to catch the band live when they did a special Gaelic society gig on a plush barge-turned-nightclub overlooking the river Clyde in Glasgow, Scotland. Little did we know the band was in the studio that same month recording this latest gem. On Hogmanay (New Year's Eve) in Scotland, BBC 1 invited the band to perform on their television special to bring in the new year. Delirium has jettisoned Capercaillie into the same breathless blend of Celtic virtuosity and progressive spirit that Macalla accomplished with *Clannad*. It contains impeccable vocals by Karen Matheson, and the guys in the band are consummate soloists on fiddles, whistles and accordion. Make no mistake, this is music for the nineties. Perfect for the pushing the Wave envelope. Key trax: "Rann Na Mona," "Waiting For The Wheel To Turn" and "Coisich, a Ruin." BMG distribution meant it was easy to pick up the disc all over the UK.

CAN'T GET THROUGH - CORNELL DUPREE (AMAZING MUSIC)

Cornell Dupree's southern fried flamin' Telecaster has those unmistakable strains of Texas blues, gospel and funk all rolled into one. That's the Cornell Dupree sound that many singers, like Aretha, Streisand and Robert Palmer, used on some of their tracks over the years. You won't hear guitar licks masked in underwater effects on this disc. *Can't Get Through* is unabashed in its homage to King Curtis and the Atlantic Soul era. The high flying, opening title track will attest to that. "Southern Comfort" is as sweet and deceptively lethal as its namesake. Jazz/AA stations everywhere are relying on *Can't Get Through* to provide them with their minimum daily adult requirements of badass licks. Even a more melodic piece like "Sweet Thing" comes wrapped in some clawing Memphis styled horn pows.

BEYOND WORDS - MARK EGAN (BLUEMOON)

It's not beyond words to say that Mark Egan delivers another textured, double-format delight. His *Elements* cohort, drummer Danny Gottlieb, stays in the distance, lending some valuable live drums on most tracks. The melodies are classic Alternative Adult, but the musical muscle inside the bytes is all Jazz. That glissando bass solo sound that Egan slips into cruise control is drawn from a number of different stringed configurations—ranging from fretted or fretless four-, five- or eight-string basses. On "Swept Away" and "Durango Kid," Toninho Horta's indigenious acoustic guitar musings blanket an environmentally sound aura. AA should audition the exotic, scenic postcard called "The Bamboo Forest." Jazz ears will scarcely recognize Coltrane's "After The Rain," which is done in an upbeat conga fueled swagger. As a bonus, Egan throws in Steve Khan's full range, stereo-affected guitar posturing.


IMAGINATIONS - GARY LAMB (GOLDEN GATE)

It's nice to see some synthesists moving a little past passive atmospherics and adding some beat-orientated material to their

musical menu. With Gary Lamb's latest release, his sixth, you get the tuneful splendor of tracks like "Dancing In The Twilight" (nice blend of grand piano and synth here) and the cello-sampled "All That I Have Is You." Those titles are matched by more bouncy, chunky nuggets like "Sailing Vancouver" and the pop-like title track "Imaginations." Our vote for the most ambitious track, in tones and sounds, is the hypnotically rhythmic "Cruising Hong Kong." Its quaintness is somewhat reminiscent of our Japanese music idols Sakamoto and Takahashi. *Imaginations* is easily Lamb's best project to date—filled with a bounty of electronically created moods, settings and tempos.

JADE VISIONS - DAVE CATNEY (JUSTICE)

In the tradition of Rebecca Coupe Franks and now, the newest from Dave Catney, Justice Records is starting to rival the Cheskys with direct to disc, first take recordings. *Jade Visions* is as intimate and cuddly as the posh booth in your favorite Jazz nightclub. Hired guns Marc Johnson and Peter Erskine give pianist Catney lots of room to groove and explore. *Jade Visions* is standards seen through green colored glasses, and features renditions of pieces by Kern, Weill, McLean, Brubeck and Lafaro. As with any acoustic trio, each player is stylistically naked to the listener. Fortunately, Catney, Erskine and Johnson stand up to close inspection. Catney has taste in that he can pull back and ride with the rhythmic current like he does on the strutting "Come Rain Or Shine." But he is a fluid time bomb ready to explode anytime on the disc's up-tempo title, "This Is New." The flurry of notes do come, but smoothness prevails and luckily there's no hint of overplaying.

HUEVOS RANCHEROS - ROCKET TO NOWHERE EP (Estrus Crust, P.O. Box 2125 Bellingham, WA USA 98227-2125)

Los Tres Huevos serve up four surf instrumentals that swell, scrape and howl like scurvy curs. Take a pearl dive into the thick guitar crust of the cover of Link Wray's "Ace O' Spades" and discover why surf music is still alive. "Ace's" bass scrubs along as the guitar orbits a planet teeming with percussion. "Rocket To Nowhere" blisters along via hip-hugging drums and a rumbling bass. As usual, the sheer guitar strangles everything in its path with peak rinse. Those Beantown icebergs melted all over the dance floor in the face of the heat blasting from one of the hottest funk/soul/jazz bands the city's ever seen—ah—heard. The HMH style is an amalgamation of themselves—mostly themselves—Tower of Power,

Muscle Shoals and Miami Horns. Their dare-you-to-sit-still style translates successfully onto this CD. I'm inclined to lean toward vocals, so my primary recommendations are "You Make Me Wanna Rock," "Everybody Fall Back" and "Champagne," but also try "Pepper Pot" and "Gruveando." TARUMBAE - WARZONE (Utopia West Creations, P.O. Box 192185, San Francisco, CA 94119)

Tarumbae is the alter ego of Ron Hardy, who conceived, arranged and produced this eight-song cassette packed with reggae/funk and funk/reggae. Enough can't be said about Hardy's versatility, because for a relative unknown he's put together an impressive, quality set. The messages are heavy—but hey, so are the times. Try "War Zone" ("If this don't get you, that will"), "Getting High" and "Free The People." Take it from there. BM

LLAMASAURAS - (29 Washington Place, Northport, NY 11768)

With album cover art that suggests, say, Danzig, I half expected some sort of evil metallic noise to arise from this Llamasaurus creature. Well, it turns out that the possessed mutant llama coverboy is instead a spokesmodel for some good grunge guitarwork. This trio mixes '70s power rock, psychedelia, and post-post-modernist anti-establishment attitude to create a sound that's not altogether like any of the aforementioned. The disc kicks off with the catchy "You Don't Love Me," which vocalist Barry Walker tears into with a no-nonsense style that is both confident and vulnerable. "I've Been" is my favorite—it's a simple song ("I've been drinking/I've been thinking")—but it's unaffectedly profound as well. Definitely listen to "Changed My Mind" and "Remember Me" for a no frills, forthright escapist journey, 'cause there ain't no Llamasaurus rides at the petting zoo. BRETT DURAND ATWOOD

ALBUM NEW RELEASES

MAGIC AND LOSS - LOU REED (SIRE/WARNER BROS.)

On his last album, *New York*, Lou Reed touched on the subject of death by probing the last thoughts of Andy Warhol. With *Magic And Loss*, he explores the subject much further after the loss of two personal friends. Like the title suggests, Reed the poet hones in on both the moribund and the speculative sides of a subject with which we all must ultimately deal. While some of the tracks carry the storyline and are slow tempo thought pieces, cuts like "What's Good" (the leader from the Wim Wenders film soundtrack *Until The End Of The World*), "Sword Of Damocles" and "No Chance" are progressive airplay contenders. "Damocles" has a Phil Spector touch to it, perhaps a tribute to the late Doc Pomus. As on *New York*, Reed throws in a few surprises including an odd appearance by R&B great Little Jimmy Scott on "Power & Glory" and a bizarre narrative, "Harry's Circumcision," harking back to "The Gift" by the Velvet Underground. Reed saves the best for last, as he did on *New York*, with the dramatic conclusion of the title track, subtitled "The Summation," the vital ink red lyrics screaming out both personal and intellectual trauma.

ON TRACK - BUCKWHEAT ZYDECO (CHARISMA)

As the radio billboard used to say, Use An Accordion, Got To Jail. However you'd have to acquit Mr. Buckwheat Zydeco (alias Stanley Dural, Jr.) because he's back On Track. And what a gas! He and his band of swamp



outlaws (backed occasionally by the Uptown Horns) put together the best Buckwheat yet. As usual, Buck' and the boys are careening all over the road. They rock out ("Hey Joe"), they moan the blues ("Won't You Let Me Go?"), they pump up the reggae mon ("The Midnight Special") and they do the Saturday Night Cajun Fever ("Everything Hurts [Tout Que 'qu' Chose Fait Mal]"). Lots of reasons to listen in here. The dual guitar leads work well with the rest of the band, presented here in all its low tech glory. As Buckwheat himself says, "You know, I've made eleven albums since 1979. On Track is the first one I can honestly say I'm 110 percentsatisfied with."

FOX BASE ALPHA - SAINT ETIENNE (WARNER BROS.)

Another vital deviation for the norm is Saint Etienne (roughly pronounced Saint A-T-N), who veer into parts unexplored using a mixture of samples, deep dub, rock and starry-eyed pop as only the Brits can concoct. Neil Young fanatics are either gonna love the obscure cover of "Only Love Can Break Your Heart" or book the gallows for this trio. (I have a feeling Neil would be extremely amused, probably flattered.) Beyond that single, Fox Base Alpha is brimming with memorable and unique moments. "Spring" into "She's The One" really shows off the ideas this outfit is able to put together, as fifty eight minutes flies by like five. Those who got off on Primal Scream's tangents will find

this the an ideal companion piece. Note: fans of David Mamet's *House Of Games* film will crack over the liberal dose of dialogue on "Etienne Gonna Die" lifted from the poker game scene in which actor Joe Mantegna proclaims his allegiance to "the United States Of Kiss My Ass."

"BAD LUCK" - SOCIAL DISTORTION (EPIC)

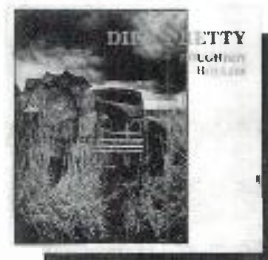
One of my very favorite American bands appears to be in awesome shape for the New Year. To hear Mike Ness growling this kickoff track from the new *Social D* record damn near made my whole week. I think this band is ready to go up to the next rung of the rock n roll ladder as *Social Distortion* completes their evolution as one of America's best bands.



MOON IN SCORPIO - THE FAMILY STAND (EAST WEST AMERICA)

With *Mother's Finest* reportedly getting ready to stage a comeback, it's looking like the black rock movement is growing slowly but surely. With Prince charting the regions of pop, bands like Living Colour, *Mother's Finest*, Eric Gales, *The Family Stand* and many more are using a combination of soul and decibels in order to stand up and be counted. I was first hipped to this band while watching the *Gavin Video Magazine*. When you get further into the album you'll find an interesting rock interpretation mixed with elements of psychedelia and so-

cial realism. Of course, there's the tip of the hat to Sly, Prince and more obvious influences. Start with "New World Order"—probably not what George Bush had in mind when he started using that term. Also key is "Plantation Radio," a cogent comment from a band who calls it as they see it.



DOUGHBOY HOLLOW - DIED PRETTY (BEGGARS BANQUET/ RCA)

Two weeks in the Alternative Most Added slot makes it harder and harder to ignore this band. *Died Pretty* have been knocking around their native Australia for well over a decade. Well, after ten years of minimal American penetration, this could be the one. *Doughboy Hollow* is loaded with contestants, specifically "Sweetheart," "Satisfied" and my fave, "Stop Myself." Thankfully they didn't.

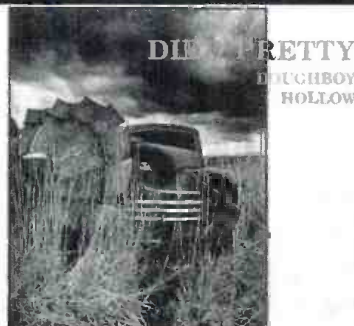

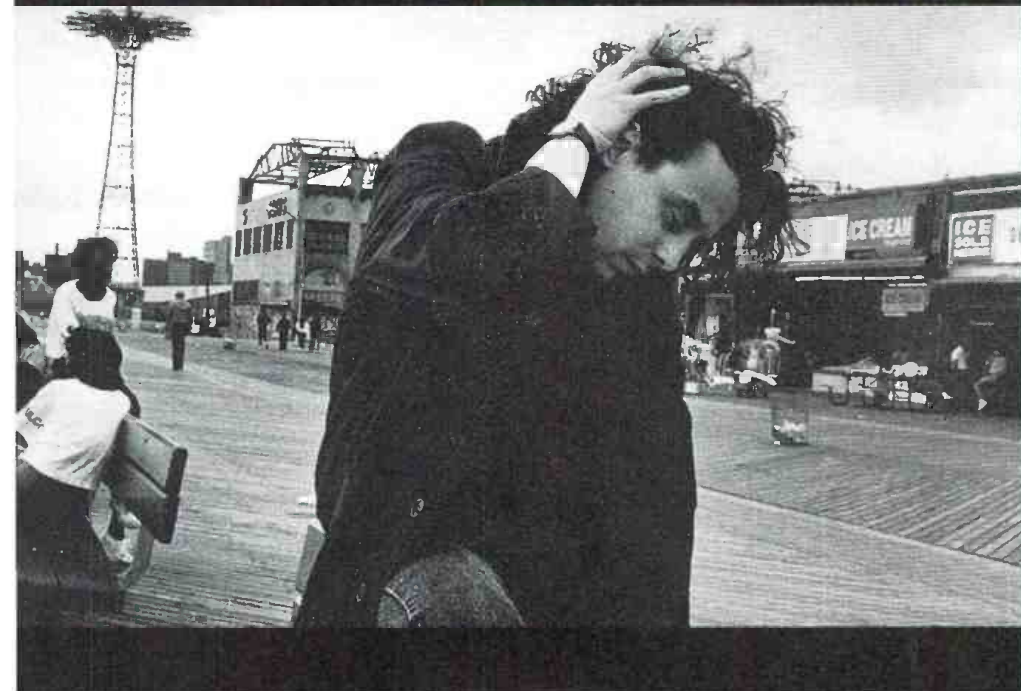

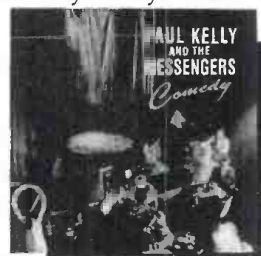
LUKA BLOOM - "I NEED LOVE" (REPRISE)

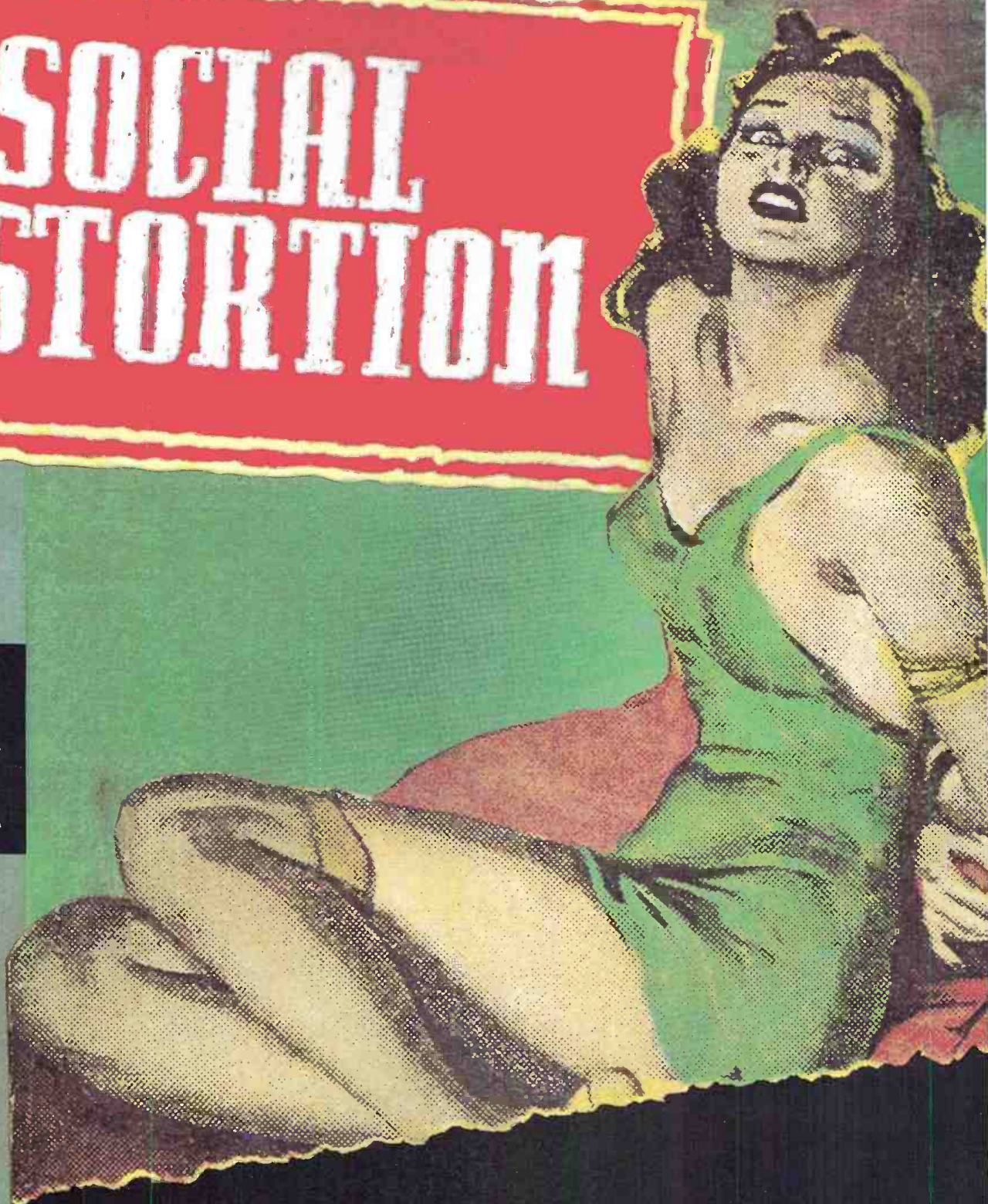

PERSONAL PICKS

SINGLES by Dave Sholin

GENESIS - I Can't Dance (Atlantic)

Even those who can't dance will find it impossible not to move when this song comes on. Known for their highly identifiable sound, the Banks/Collins/Rutherford brain trust conjures up something totally fresh and extremely hot. The public has come to expect nothing less than top-notch production from this crew who deliver the goods song after song.

ATLANTIC STARR - Masterpiece (Reprise)

Last week's RECORD TO WATCH re-appears on the "Picks" page just ahead of its "official" add week. Song master Kenny Nolan wrote what is clearly a captivating ballad made to order for Urban Contemporary, A/C and Top 40 audiences. Plenty of brides and grooms made "Always" their song during the late eighties and it won't be surprising to see this tune become the next favorite of newlyweds.

CURTIS STIGERS - You're All That Matters To Me (Arista)

At its core, the music business is essentially the

song business, and that means it relies on artists like Curtis Stigers, who come along all too rarely these days, to remind us of that premise. Bridging Pop and R&B, Stigers somehow manages to top his brilliant debut effort "I Wonder Why," clearly making him one of the year's most promising newcomers.

COLOR ME BADD - Thinkin' Back (Giant/Reprise)

If there were more acts creating music like this, we'd all hear a lot less about the musical generation gap. Earning a well-deserved Grammy nomination in the "Best New Artist" category, the pride and joy of Oklahoma City haven't missed yet, and this beauty will make 'em four for four.

VAN HALEN - Right Now (Warner Bros.)

Play the intro on this song for folks and dare them to identify the group. No, keyboards aren't usually the first thing that comes to mind when the name Van Halen is mentioned, and the drama they add to Sammy Hagar's stellar vocal performance is undeniable. Edit

makes it readily accessible for Top 40 listeners.

TOM PETTY AND THE HEARTBREAKERS - Kings Highway (MCA)

It doesn't seem possible, but it's been fifteen years since TP first exploded on the scene with the now classic "Breakdown." Through all that time he's proven to be one of the few who consistently live up to the expectations of his fans. As with so much of his music, this latest release makes listening both an enjoyable and very comfortable experience.

MC BRAINS - Oochie Coochie (Motown)

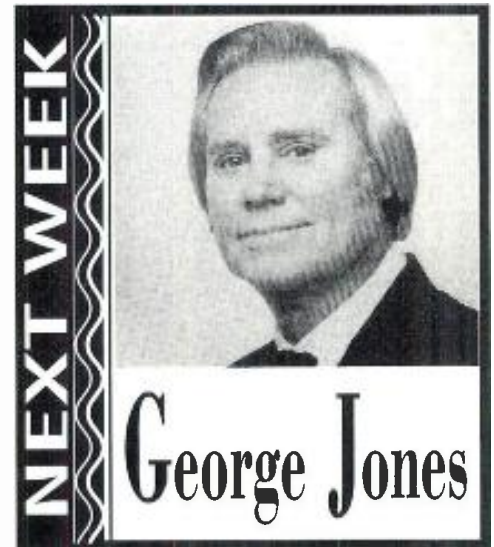
Play this a few times and just see if you can stop walking around all day singing, "oochie coochie la la la." (Just ask Annette M. Lai.) BBD's Michael Bivins gets credited with co-writing this incredibly catchy track, which already charts Top Ten at KMEL San Francisco, top fifteen on WBXX Battle Creek and WHYT Detroit, and top thirty at HOT 102 Milwaukee.

ALBUMS by Ron Fell

LOU REED - Magic And Loss (Sire/Warner Bros.)

Pretty it is not. Lou Reed composes a tense set of connected notes derived from the loss of two friends between two Aprils. (His way of saying a year's time.) Interestingly enough, one of the songs, WHAT'S GOOD, which most closely details the pain in his heart is the song he contributes to Wim Wender's film, "Until The End Of The World." Another detailed narration of the life-to-death trauma is the moving sequel, POWER AND GLORY. The feel of this Lou Reed is intensely personal, intimate, vulnerable and religious. His sense of wonder and respect for the process of death

is directly contradictory to his wild, street sense of a creature that survives thanks to a tough exterior. His credibility is further enhanced by the album's almost totally acoustic instrumental treatment and close-to-the-mic reading. This project is so precious, so serious, that it's hard to imagine such gimmicks as "singles" and "re-mixes." This Lou Reed should be taken at face value, not enhanced. Its poetic angst and primal arrangement are essential to the presentation. Though this is a project focused on the narrator, Lou Reed, it's worth noting the lyrical bass of Rob Wasserman. His bottom line brings a sobering foundation to the whole package.
