

Ain't no denying the first single's staying power and reaction magnetism. Radio pix this and "2X4."




SPONGE "Wax Ecstatic"

Trying to decide if Porno For Pyros fits KLOS in its current rotation... Like the Primitive Radio Gods

record. Serious consideration... **Prong** is strictly Pure Rock Sunday Night stuff... **The Scorpions** is testing mid-stack for us... Sort of like **Screaming Trees**' "**All I Know**." Warming up to it... **Smashing Pumpkins** is testing medium... No to **Solution A.D.**... Good response to **Soundgarden**'s "**Burden In My Hand**," and starting to get good breakout scores... Don't know yet about the **Spacehog**... "**Trippin'**..." is a big testing record, Top 5... Not yet on the **Super 8**... **Hole**'s "**Gold Dust Woman**" went straight to heavy. Only kidding... Really like **The Hunger** record. Getting pretty good requests on it. When we play "**Vanishing Cream**" on our club nights, people go ballistic. Really believe in that record, Good track.

Jerry Cantrell's "Leave Me Alone" is fair, not in the Top 20 test-wise yet. Early... Not any good test results on the Def Leppard... Everclear's "Heartspark Dollarsign" is mid pack. Not following up with "Santa Monica."... The Goo Goo Dolls is starting to show some good research... Green Day tests really well in the Bay area... Won't use the Imperial Drag... Metallica is a Top 3 testing record... Ozzy Osbourne isn't getting a lot of burn,

but a little less passion for "I Just Want You" ... Can't hear the Porno For Pyros... The Scorpions tests okay in San Jose. This seems to be a hotbed for them... I'm kind of jaded by "Nearly Lost You" when it comes to the new Screaming Trees' track... Need to listen to Sepultura more... Early on the Smashing Pumpkins, but should test okay... Solution A.D. has sleeper potential... Medium testing now for "Pretty Noose" ... I think Stabbing Westward is gaining in stature as more and more people become aware of who they are. Very good uptempo rock record... "Trippin'..." is right up there in the Top 5, test-wise... Super 8 is okay. Not a priority... Hole's "Gold Dust Woman" - Geez... The Hunger is gaining very well. They know they're **Pantera**... I like Tonic better than **Screaming Trees' "All I Know**."... I liked

Semisonic from the beginning, but no room for "If I Run" the first time around... Everything so far from the Pumpkins has done fabulously. We expect no less from "Tonight Tonight"... Initial thoughts were that Solution A.D.'s "Fearless" was happening. Right now we're still considering it... Soundgarden is strong, but "Burden" is stronger... "Pepper" is performing very well, and looks like it's going to be around for quite a while... The "street vibe" on "I Get High" is pretty cool. I like it... Goldfinger has been a pretty good performer for us. I was encouraged to see them out on tour with the Sex Pistols... "Walking Contradiction" is no-nonsense straight ahead Green Day... "I Just Want You" is a great song... We got a solid reaction on "Tahitian Moon."... Prong's "Rude

Awakening" is still developing. I think that could be around for quite a while... Screaming Trees' "All I Know" is definitely one that you like the more you hear it... "Ratamahatta" is getting a good reaction. I think people will look back and say this track was way ahead of its time... "Tonight Tonight" is doing well in testing... "Burden In My Hand" is getting super feedback. The feeling here is that this could be the best song on the album... Spacehog's "Cruel To Be Kind" is doing pretty decent... Stone Temple Pilot's "Trippin'" is performing extremely well for us as well... "Vanishing Cream" is developing very nicely. Still fairly unfamiliar, but the potential is very encouraging... The Nixons "Wire" may not be as big as "Sister," but the station has a relationship with the band that's been going on for a long time. WAAF supports bands that support us.

APD/MD Jo Robinson/WRCX Chicago



We really like "Long Way Down." No response yet... "Walking Contradiction" opened up full time. The video seems to be pushing this track... We will throw the Hazies' "Skin & Bones" in during the day a few times to get a reaction... "Until It Sleeps" is a huge tester immediately. Tons of familiarity... I've noticed that Q101 is backing way off of "Tahitian Moon."... "Rude Awakening" has me surprised and bummed. Not feeling anything at all...

Scorpions' "Wild Child" is doing nothing except selling well... It's the third time we've re-added Smashing Pumpkins' "Tonight Tonight." We know it'll do well for us... I like "Fearless." I want to play that song... "Burden In My Hand" is a fabulous song. Too early, not enough familiarity on the test... It's way too early for Stabbing Westward's "Shame." That song is so urgent, I love it... Stone Temple Pilots "Trippin'" is a midpack tester... Super 8 is not us, but I like it... "Vanishing Cream" is still in the top 3 requests.

PD John Stevens/WSFM Wilmington

311's "**Down**" is the king around here. We played the other two releases as well. Very substantial CD sales from day one. The other two tracks were stronger, but it's early. A little negativity about the almost rap beginning... **Butthole Surfers**' "**Pepper**" is huge, #1 phones. Sales are picking up, really doing pretty well... **Cracker's** "**Nothing To Believe In**" lives up to its name.

Seriously, I'm doing a hide and watch on this song. Really like the group and want to see them do well. Much better than the first, but taking a while to sink in... Initial response was better on Dada's "I Get High." We've dropped the spins down somewhat - not getting what I anticipated ... Dog's Eye View's "Prince's Favorite Son" is in light rotation, daytime play only. "Everything Falls Apart" is such a huge tester that it's getting a play a day in recurrent... Gin Blossoms' "Day Job" is dropping down in spins... "Walking Contradiction" could be the first Green Day mid-charter... Hazies' "Skin & Bones" is huge for us. Not only does this record sound good, it has good lyrical content. They've been in the market twice, and I think this thing is a legit piece of music... Imperial Drag's "Boy Or A Girl" is not really seeing much. Limited to nights ... Metallica's "Until It Sleeps" is huge. People can say what they want, but Lollapalooza speaks for itself. Not the #1 seller, interestingly enough, but it's big... I like Pete Droge's "Mr. Jade" personally, but I'm not going to jump on it... Love Porno For Pyros' "Tahitian Moon." We want to see it come home. A mature-sounding, sophisticated record. It has everything that a great tune needs except requests and sales and that could happen eventually... Oh man! Primitive Radio Gods' "Standing Outside A Broken Phone Booth..." is ringing the phones already. Up there with the Butthole Surfers... I like "Route." Had Son Volt in town a month and a half ago. Not a huge show, but college wasn't in session... Switched to Soundgarden's "Burden In My Hand" track, because I was getting requests for it... Sponge's "Wax Ecstatic" has some early reaction. This is a song I don't hear personally, but from what I'm seeing this thing could be big... The Nixons' "Wire" is not as strong as the last release.

PD Duane Doherty/KEGL Irving

The Butthole Surfers' "Pepper" is huge. Testing really strongly. The phones are actually 2 to 1 over the new Metallica, and that should tell you something ... Jerry Cantrell's "Leave Me Alone" is testing mid-pack... Dave Matthews is another midpack record. Testing better with younger than older listeners... "Heartspark Dollarsign" is starting to get some phones, but it's nothing like "Santa Monica"... Not a whole lot of action on the Gin Blossoms. Nothing really positive... The Goo Goo Dolls testing is about mid-pack, doing alright in all demos... I'm sort of on the fence about the Green Day ... "Skin & Bones" is also pretty much stuck in the middle... Nothing yet on Imperial Drag... Jars Of Clay is a Top 10 tester... Metallica's "Until It Sleeps" is also showing Top 10 scores... I think "Suicide Note #1" is different enough for Pantera. It has more hit potential than "Drag The Waters," which was obviously very narrow... No time soon for Porno For Pyros... I think the Primitive Radio Gods song is a hit, but I don't know if it's a hit for us... Nothing really on the Prong... I just saw the Scorpions last night, and they were actually great. They are on. Testing could be better... The Screaming Trees' "All I Know" is growing on me. Good hook, but I don't know ... No testing on "Pretty Noose," but everybody I've talked to loves it, though they didn't hear it at first... Stone Temple Pilots is just testing okay for me. Still unfamiliar... Super 8 is not testing, but sounds great... The Hunger is about 15 out of 30. Testing really well low, and okay upper... The Nixons' "Wire" won't be as big as "Sister," but it is still a great song.

PD Rich Hawk/KILO Colorado Springs

Spiked Cracker's "Nothing To Believe In" this week, and didn't get much out of it. I still think it's a good song, but it's not quite breaking through... Still feel Dada has a lot of potential. Top 10 phone reaction ... "Work It Out" is getting to its peak. Sales are pretty good - Top 30 retail. Still more potential to go. Like the next cut... Green Day's "Walking Contradiction" is Top 15 phones, not too bad from limited play... Still not getting anything on The Hazies - extremely passive... I think the Hog is okay, if I had a slot... Imperial Drag is just a day song at this point... Don't believe this new Kenny Wayne Shepherd is a song for us... Kicking Harold's "Kill You" is doing well for the minimal amount of play. Top 15 phones every week... Think Metallica's "Ain't My Bitch" is the one that will surface... Good early response on "Suicide Note #1." Playing afternoons on... Put Porno For Pyros back on. Still feel it's a fairly decent song. Not enthused about the rest of the project... Don't have a clue what to do with the Primitive Radio Gods ... Prong has been a little slower than I thought it would be. Will hang with it... The Scorpions is amazing. "Wild Child" is doing alright. Sales look pretty good... Still watching Solution A.D... Soundgarden's "Burden In My Hand" is Top 10 phones, requests kickin in. Sales are very strong... Put the **Spacehog** on this week. Trying it days only to see how it works... Too early on Sponge. I bumped it up to heavy this week to get it out there and exposed... "Trippin'..." is testing wonderfully. It looks strong... Still watching the Super 8... Don't know what to think about Hole's "Gold Dust Woman"... The Hunger continues to maintain. Backed off a bit on the phones.

PD Curtiss Johnson/KRXQ Sacramento



Just got research back on **7 Mary 3**'s "**My My**," and it's very strong. Up there in the potential index around the likes of Dishwalla and "Heaven Beside You." About 250 spins underneath that thing... "**Leave Me Alone**" is off to a very good start, though still somewhat unfamiliar. Shows some pretty strong signs, especially for that AIC sound which normally takes forever to come around... **Dada** is off to a moderate start. Good phones, moderate

test... No test yet on the Goo Goo Dolls... Decent test on The Hazies. About a mid-pack performer, and is starting to pick up more phones... Very poor testing on Imperial Drag. Very familiar, but some very high negs... Huge testing on Metallica. Very huge. Still somewhat unfamiliar with the total population, but fourth overall... Popped The Nixons' "Wired" right away. Was playing "Sister" at Christmastime, and it just wouldn't burn... Porno For Pyros feels fair. Will do okay... Greg Mull loves the Primitive Radio Gods... Prong just sounds so good. Decent phones considering the traffic... Like the sound of Solution A.D.'s "Fearless." Just waiting for them to do a Quad show in town... "Pretty Noose" is my #1 tester. I'm surprised at that... When I first heard Spacehog's "Cruel To Be Kind," I wasn't sure, but it sounds really good on the air... Good phones on the Sponge now... "Trippin' ... " is a Top 3 tester ... Looking at Super 8... No to Hole.

PD Greg Bergen/KRZZ Wichita

Deep Purple's "Vavoom: Ted The Mechanic" is not a bad song. We stuck it on and got some reaction. We may end up playing it... "Work It Out" is still strong for us. Not the strongest, but enough to be a heavy record... Really nothing yet on the Gin Blossoms. I assumed that they would've gotten some reaction by now. Sounds fine... Green Day is not for us... Imperial Drag isn't gonna happen for us... There is potential interest in King's X. Looking at the full. A good rock band... Metallica has huge phones. Great rock record. Everyone can try to claim this, but it is rock... There's probably not as big a reaction as the first two, but Ozzy Osbourne's "I Just Want You" is fine. It probably won't get into heavy... For us, Eric Clapton's "Change The World" is doing well. Huge phones and a great daytime record... Like the Primitive Radio Gods personally, but I don't know if that will happen here. Very funky... We spiked Prong in. We may be able to do a bit, but not much... I like Semisonic's "If I Run." We'll see what happens... Sepultura is great for the metal show, and a funny song. That is a crazy sounding record. Far and away, the best song on the album... Solution A.D. will have to prove itself... Like "Route" a lot. I love Son Volt - probably my favorite cut off the album... We aren't going to be the first on Sponge. We'll look at some other reactions first... I need to listen to Stabbing Westward again... I love the sound of the Super 8 record, but it's early... Still not a big fan of **The Hunger**. Too many other records that seem to be doing better... I like The Nixons' "Wire." Looking at that for the next couple of weeks... Zakk Wylde has a nice organic sound. Not at all what I was expecting, but a pleasant surprise.

APD/MD J.J. Jeffries/KUPD Phoenix

Hog's "You Don't Know Me" is a good hooky song, a little Green Dayish... "Sometime" is a good song, added it... "Until It Sleeps" is a hit. Huge phones for the whole album. We researched, and it came back very strong after 70 spins... Pantera's "Suicide Note #1" might take a while, but it gives you more ability to play in different dayparts... Porno For Pyros is not us... I have no idea about the Primitive Radio Gods... No interest in Prong... Also no interest in "Ratamahatta"... "Pretty Noose" is a great song. B+. Research this week... I love Sponge's "Wax Ecstatic." Early phones... Stabbing Westward might take a while to grow. We had success with the first, but it's early... "Vanishing Cream" gets a B+. Big phones, it's performing all around in research... Still early on The Nixons... Zakk Wylde sounds great on KDKB.

MD Andy O'Riley/WKLQ Grand Rapids

Considering the **311**. Everybody here is warming up to it... Love Cable Guy's "Leave Me Alone." It sounds great. Not a ton of phones, but they may be confused with Alice... Def Leppard's "Work It Out" seems flat ... Goo Goo Dolls' "Long Way **Down**" is a good follow-up, and the last tune from the record... "Guilty" is still doing well, good night phones. Helps give us a street image... "Walking Contradiction" is early, but it's Green Day and they had a turnaround with "Brain Stew"... Hog's "You Don't Know Me" is under serious consideration Metallica's "Until It Sleeps" - talk about a record that will be around for two years - almost every song has single potential... No daypart on Pantera's "Suicide Note #1," so we'll see how it does in afternoons... Sepultura's "Ratamahatta" is a gangbuster on Outta Control Saturday night, but nothing for regular rotation. Watching it... Spacehog's "Cruel To Be Kind" has really hip image. It's kind of a nice uplifting thing... Sponge's "Wax Ecstatic" is a very cool song, and I look forward to doing a lot with them on this record... The Hunger's "Vanishing Cream" a definite smash. They are coming in to do a free show, and have a really unique sound. Good phones... Zakk Wylde's "Between Heaven & Hell" is a little too upper demo, although I like it myself.

311 may be a new band, but they do have a following. We got some cool reaction to testing on "Down" so we got on it... Cable Guy's "Leave Me Alone" is still holding its own... We just got on Deep Purple's "Vavoom: Ted The Mechanic" yesterday, and had a good laugh looking at the picture. It's hard to believe that anything they could do would stand up to their classics... Garbage's "Stupid Girl" is doing well already, they are opening for the Pumpkins. We are getting behind this one... "Day Job" sounds great, but not a lot of response, which is what we expected... I don't know how well it will do... Dada is a very good record for us. Extremely good testing. Calls have dropped off a little, but we still like the song... Foo Fighters has some phone reaction. sounding terrific... Some interest calls on the **Scorps**. "Wild Child" THE HARD REPORT doesn't sound as bad on the radio as I thought it would... Screaming Trees' "All I Know" is very good, but not instantly accessible. Not an instant match for guitar-driven rock stations. Kind of a moody, emotional record... We featured the album and people are calling for all sorts of songs from it ... Goldfinger's "Here In Your Bedroom" tested pretty well so we added it. Getting a spattering of calls... THE HARD INTERVIEW

Breaking Into THE WHY STORE An In-depth Look At How To Build Business.

When we landed at Indianapolis International Airport, all seemed normal. And as we taxi toward the gate, we pass the mooring for the Goodyear Blimp. Since it's May in Indy, the airship Akron sits tied down and presumably prepared to make the countless circles over the Speedway, located just a few miles northwest of the airport. Even the blimp - generally considered by the sporting world as a sign of hyperactivity - seems sleepy.

Standard Indianapolis pace and vibe is somehow laconic; it's not for lack of stimulation, sincere amounts of apathy or a loathsome economy. It's just a kind of jade.

Don't get me wrong. There's nothing like Indianapolis in the month of May. It is possibly the greatest time and place convergence in the world of motor sports. Historically, it's the Gettysburg of racing. In recent years, May has also been value-added with NBA playoff basketball, courtesy of Reggie Miller and the exciting Indiana Pacers. The promotional events that surround the city are as numerous as you might imagine. From bars to ballrooms, there's no dry day or night in the month of May in Indianapolis.

While I navigate Interstate 70 across the very southern side of the center of the city, a storm is rolling into town from the north. Against the slightly-green, dark and curdled sky, there seems to be no real alarm. Local radio, usually quick to report severe weather, doesn't give me any details in the 15minute scan I make of the dial. I seem to be the only person looking up to glance the ominous darkness that must surely be precursing a tornado or severe thunderstorm. I turn off



the highway to head through town on the way to The Why Store's soundcheck for my interview with the band, and I notice that people are moving around at a surprisingly normal pace. I make a couple of extra laps around the city, listening to WRZX, catching their promos of tonight's record release party, and I think about when the band first got going in Indianapolis.

By the time that WFBQ's Bob and Tom show began spinning this new, as-yet-relatively-unheard local band The Why Store, they had already begun chipping away at the fibrous paint that was the city's musical mainstream culture. Singer and songwriter Chris Shaffer had been watching friends and musicians from both Indy and nearby Bloomington succumbing to the demand of the local and regional club scene for years. Covers were what the owners were willing to pay for, and the club regulars were accustomed to the gleam of the sound and lights surrounding the various acts that splintered the MTV and radio tunes to finely-targeted repertoires.

To get a gig in one of the four most-desirable clubs in the region (The Vogue, The Patio, The Bluebird or Jake's, all owned by the same owner, Entertainment One), you had to practically know REM's entire catalog. One band that was hot on the circuit for a couple of years actually resorted to introducing original material as "Here's something new from The Black Crowes" to thwart the dance floor exodus that "Here's one of our tunes" typically precipitated.

Chubby's Club LaSalle was a honkytonk on the less-preferred west side of the city, and Chubby's was one of the places where original music was the norm, not the curse. As Shaffer and drummer Charlie Bushor (a former member of once-popular cover band P.S.: Dump Your Boyfriend) told it before The Why Store's record release party for their Way Cool/MCA debut recording, it was a helpful place to get started.

"We went into The Patio and somebody told us we could get a gig at (Chubby's)," said Bushor. "We said, `Yes!,' because we had our own original music, we weren't a cover band." Added Shaffer, "Chubby got us going. We went to play there, he loved us. He said we could come and play every night if we want."

"And we almost did," laughs Bushor.

For 10 or 12 people a night, the band began playing their own material. "And so we went into the basement of this place and just got super stoned and went up there and played the four or five songs we knew," said Bushor. "And then we just kind of looked at each other and went, `Start something.' And Chris would just start playing and we'd start jamming along and it would turn into a song. We still have a song called "DJam" because that's how it was on the list of songs for awhile."

"We were sick of doing covers, we were going to help change the scene," chimes Shaffer. "And it was stupid to do other people's music. (pauses, rethinks words) It wasn't stupid, it just wasn't what we wanted to do." Before long, the fanbase they had cultivated grew to a largeenough number to be noticed by the manager of The Patio, who then allowed them opening slots for cover bands. In short time, they were headlining there.

"The loyalty of the fans is the key point," explains Bushor. "They stayed all night and drank like fish."

"Our merchandiser Mike Moore decided he was going to get a petition together to give to Dennis Burris (co-owner of Entertainment One) to let us into The Vogue," says Shaffer. "Then one night we were playing a Christmas party for Nuvo Newsweekly (the main alternative newsweekly in the city), and he was there. We didn't even give him the petition - that night he came up to me and said 'I want you to call me tomorrow, and I'll make you a star.' I called, and he gave us our first Wednesday night."

"We packed it," said Bushor. "There was about 500 people."

"When the screen went up and we started our first song - I'll never forget it, it was 'Heaven In You' - everybody was so keyed up. Because it was really a group effort, everybody felt like, `We won!' The crowd had felt like they had won by getting the band."

After some time at Charlie's father's recording studio called Skeets, where voice-overs were the main source of business, the band had a 4-song demo. They had little idea of where it would end up in a few weeks.

"We were playing Hard Day's Night on the north side, it was Bob's (Kevoian, of the infamous top-rated WFBQ morning show Bob and Tom) club. Greg Gardner, (bassist) went to talk to him and he said, `Oh, you have another one, well just give me the other tape.' Greg gave it to him. It was just the demo.

"So we hand him the tape and I'll be damned if the next day it was on the radio, and we were like, `Oh God, we only have a demo!' So we went immediately and recorded *Welcome To The Why Store*.

"We printed up a thousand and they were gone in like three days. So we had to print up another thousand and we're all estimating, `Oh we're going to sell millions.' And I'm like, `Man if we sell five grand we'll be lucky,'" said Shaffer.

Radio airplay on WFBQ and WTTS brought more than just record sales (over 30,000 units of the band's 2 independent releases to date). "I think the only other thing radio play earned us was probably rejection letters from major record people. We have a million of them," said Bushor.

The Why Store still holds the one-night attendance record at The Vogue, a record previously held by a cover band. The band's audience in town had grown from a small vocal crowd of rebels to a horde of regular Biffs and Buffys, in addition to an even larger segment of adventurous music-seekers. If you think about it, this band's growth parallels the proliferation trend of Modern Rock and Active Rock radio in this country.

"Been there and done it," punctuates Bushor.

"Everybody seemed curious," Chris says of the growth period and the initial fascination. "That's the thing about the demographic that the band has, it's so broad. Who exactly was there? We had hippies, yuppies, older rockers that started out listening to Fleetwood Mac and The Allman Brothers. Business men in suits showed up. My grandmother likes the band. It's a real mix. And when we play an under age show, you'll see it again, there are kids moshing out there. You'll have your hippy contingent in the back doing all the hippy things and you'll have the yuppies in the middle, going, `Dude.' And then you'll have the kids down front moshing. Then my grandmother is going to be here in the back."

The band's built-up mailing list has increased from a few hundred to over 6,000. A business/marketing major in college, Chris points out that he always wanted the band to be able to build without radio. "We have this really cool map that has all the pins in the places where (our music's) been," says Shaffer. It's worldwide, not just the United States. In England, Japan, Germany. Servicemen crossover the States that take our CD to other servicemen that are going across the country. It's unbelievable. We promote the mailing list at every show. We have a nice display set up and it just has been paying off. It grows at every show." Chris and the guys list bands like Allgood and Jupiter Coyote as models for grassroots marketing and fanbase building.

Being in the basement of a very old, solid brick building has its advantages. As Chris and I walked up the stairs back to the stage area after the interview, people were talking about the storm that passed. The sidewaysdriving rain, the trash cans flying by the windows, stuff like that. Apparently there was at least one tornado within the city limits, and plenty of wind and lightning. When Way Cool's Mike Jacobs arrived at the venue a few minutes later, he said his hotel's power was out for a while. Chris and I laughed a little to ourselves. Guess it was a good interview.


After dinner, I walk with Jacobs, WFBQ's Marty Bender and Ace Cosby (also sister station WRZX's drive time personality), Sam Gennaway and local TV anchorman Ken Owen back over to the venue, a cavernous room adjacent to the Murat Theatre called The Egyptian Room. We walk in the stage door just as Chris, Charlie and the rest of the band make their way to the side of the stage. They were focused and energized by the mur-

mur of the sold-out room. We've got enough time for a high-THE HARD REPORT five before Cosby hits the microphone for a thunderous intro. 40 or 50 large candles scatter light around the stage behind him, as the band plugs in. At the peak of the crowd's rise, the band kicks into their first tune, and the theatre's lights wash the stage with colors.

"Welcome To The Why Store!" bellows Shaffer into the echoing mosh of audience, towering ceilings and rectangular corners. The crowd, as inspired and passionate as the one that showed for the band's very first Vogue gig, went nuts.

The giant metallic clank I think I hear while the band rolls through their set is only the shifting of some larger gear in the engine. With the heat of Jacobs' promotional savvy and Way Cool's commitment, this band will make the scene in many more cities and towns much like the way they reinvented Indianapolis.

Learned advice? "Don't stop. Don't give up," advises the former salaried drummer for the successful cover band who gave up the gig to pursue The Why Store. "If you believe in your music, first of all keep the band together, keep writing and keep playing. Because that's basically the bottom line of it, that's what we did. We're like, `Fuck this, this will work, we like it, and we like playing it. Some people like it. So we're going to keep on doing it.""

Blues Plate Special Saffire — Uppity Blues Women, <u>Cleaning House</u>, Alligator Records

But do they do windows? With their wonderful new release, Cleaning House, Saffire — The Uppity Blues Women blend their irreverent humor with more straight tunes for a delightful new CD from Alligator. Long-time Saffire fans will love the attitude and hellfire lyrics of "Hungry Woman's Blues" and "I Want My Money Back." But the true heart of this recording is in the wellcrafted blues tunes like "In My Girlish Days." The Uppities have relied less and less on innuendo and mirth with each successive (and successful) release. That trend continues here. This is the most musically complex and complete of all the Saffire output. Pervasive boogie piano from Ann Rabson, the tasteful mandolin of Andra MacIntosh and the powerhouse vocals and guitar playing of Gaye Adegbalola make Cleaning House wonderful to listen to. Stylistically, this CD

covers a great range, from the Big Bopper rock 'n' roll feel of "Bad Debt" to the slow-burning update of Lucille Bogan's "Sweet Black Angel." (Check Gaye's smoky harp intro.) Each of the 17 cuts enhances the style it adopts. The versatility of the Blues Women is amazing. From sexy soul to hot call-and-response, Cleaning House is a fine blues record. So get out a bucket and rag, put the Uppity Blues Women on loud, and do your own windows!

programmer spotlight Scott Allman, host, Capitol City Blues Cruise, WJXQ, Lansing, MI

I've been producing and hosting the Capitol City Blues Cruise since June of 1987. We've been on WJXQ since 1990. WJXQ is a 50,000 watt commercial AOR station located in mid-Michigan and our signal reaches seven major metropolitan areas in central Michigan. On the Blues Cruise, I try to touch on all types of blues from the earliest known recordings to what's currently being waxed around the country. I've even been known to push the envelope a little bit, sneakin' on some Django Reinhardt, the Pahinui Bros., and Gil Scott-Heron. I really enjoy having four hours on Sunday night. It gives me a chance to stretch out a little bit, develop themes and feature live performances. I want to keep the program fresh for our regular listeners as well as fun and accessible for new listeners. WJXQ has always been heavily involved in the community and I've been takin' the blues out of the studio to the listeners in person. I play music in two different bands and we've done several "blues in the schools" appearances playing live and talking to kids about blues and how it is the foundation of the music they listen to today. I think one of my favorite parts of the Blues Cruise is having blues artists performing live in the studio. We've covered the spectrum, lemme tell ya! The studio ain't that big, but we've gotten whole bands in there before. Everything is done "Chess style" (everyone is picked up by two mics) the closest is the loudest so you gotta watch the dynamics. As far as programming goes, I try not to get too esoteric. I think it's important to not go too far over the heads of your listeners. I have new listeners who just enjoy being turned on to something new and I have listeners who have been listening to blues music for years and are very knowledgeable. Sometimes we'll set the way-back-machine for 1928, but that doesn't mean we're gonna spend the whole night there. I think today's blues artists and the music they're performing is as strong as the blues has ever been, and I try to make sure they get as much air time as possible. As long as the listeners are out there, we'll be throwin' down, it's been big fun.



THE BLUES Review Paul Black, King Dollar, House of Blues

By Bruce Bjorkman, host 1490 Bluez Blvd - KZBY Radio, Salem, OR

From almost the very first slide riff that emanates from this cd, your hair begins to crawl, like a spider threading its way up your arm. You get the feeling that **Paul Black & The Flip King**'s new release, *King Dollar*, has got something special going on. A one-time circus roustabout and former member of Sonny Landreth's traveling band, Black and The Flip Kings are tight, polished, and have their own unique voice and personality. This is especially evident on the covers of the three Robert Johnson tunes contained in this release, "Malted Milk," "Honeymoon Blues," and "Dead Shrimp Blues." The band also pays homage to The Rolling Stones' Richard-and-Jagger songwriting team, putting a blues twist to "This Will Be The Last Time" and "Factory Girl." They also do justice to an extended version of Willie Mabon's "The Fixer," one of my favorite cuts on this release. There's plenty of Black's "moanful," well-placed slide work that hooks and holds you like a trout on twenty pound test line. His skillful playing is augmented by a gritty, road-polished voice, heavy with gravel, yet when needed smooths out like a belt of asphalt. Band mate Andy Linderman provides sharp harpwork that's not overblown, nor does it upstage either the vocals or melody lines. Bassist John Tubbs gets some nice runs in on the song, "G Baby and The Fixer." You'll even find original material here which isn't half bad. Strongest of Black's five personal contributions are "The Hard Way" and "Crosseyed Baby," co-written by John Tubbs.

With a chaotic, dissonant delivery, it may have taken a few years, but music tastes have come around to meet the cacophony of **Barkmarket**. Sounding as ferocious as ever, the songs on *L Ron* don't fit neatly into any niche or genre - similar to Therapy? or

Helmet - but "Visible Cow", "How Are You?", and "Falling" all sound better with the volume turned way up. With 40 adds this week, bringing them in at #3 Most Added, it seems that hard radio is ready to embrace **Barkmarket**. Headcrash, Overdose on Tradition (Discovery)



This German based band made up of two Americans along with a slew of locals combines the layered electronics of industrial, hip hop vocal style, and non-stop barrage of guitars. With a unique combination of musical styles, this may be a welcome surprise to hard rock radio.

Gorefest, Soul Survivor (Relapse/NBA)



This is another European death metal import, but Gorefest have been able to rise above the pack with musicianship that makes their songs very listenable to people who may not be death metal fans. With the guttural vocals and a metallic back bone, long time fans will also be satisfied.

Sense Field, Building (Revelation)



You can't underestimate the strenght of word of mouth strength and the underground because despite lacking major label distribution and a high profile tour, Sense Field managed to sell over 30,000 of their last release. Their sound harnesses the melody of West Coast punk with the aggression of hardcore, with a bucketful of credibility.

They are a good pick for fans of modern hardcore.



A Quebec couple say they won't change their telephone number, even though they've been getting unwanted calls since **Bon Jovi** released the "These Days" album, which includes **Wilson Pickett**'s 1960s song "634-5789." Robert and Line Mainville are the only people in North America with that number. "There were more than 50 calls the first day it came out," says Line Mainville, a 50-year-old mother of two. "We're still getting 10 or more a day." Most of the callers are "very polite" kids who want to speak to Jon Bon Jovi. "I tell them that I don't know Mr. Jovi," she says. Bon Jovi's Canadian record label says it offered to change the Mainvilles' number, but they don't want it changed. "We have friends and family across Canada, and we don't want to have to contact everybody to give them a new number," Line Mainville says.

Jimi Hendrix and his music will be featured in advertisements for Aiwa America's audio, video, car stereo and multimedia products, in the first licensing deal since the Hendrix family won control of his music last year after a lengthy legal battle. Hendrix' "Star Spangled Banner" will be used in an Aiwa television commercial which will see Hendrix flashing the "V" peace sign.

Canadian band Eric's Trip is breaking up, after a farewell show in the band's hometown of Moncton, New Brunswick, Guitarist Rick White says he decided to split the band up after six years during a long drive back from a New York City show last month. "It was May 11, and it was a real foggy morning, and you couldn't see anything," he says. "It was all very surreal. And that's when I made the decision. There's a song on the 'Love Tara' album called May 11 that talks about a foggy morning. I always loved that song, but never knew what it was about. Now we know." White jokes that the band is breaking up "just when we are starting to make some money." The band had a successful Canadian tour last summer with The Tragically Hip. Hip lead singer Gordon Downie is a big fan and mentioned Eric's Trip in a song on the Hip's charttopping album "Trouble At The Henhouse." "He'd always come out and sit on the side of the stage and watch us, all through the tour," White says. "It's funny, though, we were never big fans of The Tragically Hip before that happened." White says that Eric's Trip, who always insisted their releases be available on vinyl, simply grew apart musically and personally. White, his wife Tara, and drummer Mark Gaudet have formed a new band called **Elevator To Hell.**

A music fan in South Carolina, has been given a college scholarship with money from t-shirts sold during **Hootie & The Blowfish**'s MTV "Unplugged" concert in their hometown of Columbia. Loria Ann Cass of Walhalla, South Carolina, is the recipient of the Hootie & The Blowfish/Carolyn Rucker Scholarship, named for the late mother of lead singer **Darius Rucker**. The band wanted to give the award to a student with an outstanding academic record and a financial hardship.

Mike Leander, who wrote and produced many of **Gary Glitter**'s 1970s hit including "Rock & Roll Part 2," has died of cancer at age 54. Leander was also producer of Andrew Lloyd Webber's "Jesus Christ Superstar" and arranged "She's Leaving Home" on the **Beatles**' "Sgt. Pepper" album. Before his death, Leander had been working on a musical version of "Doctor Who," with the permission of the BBC.

Irish journalist Bill Graham has died of a heart attack at age 44. Graham was a leading writer for the Irish music newspaper "Hot Press" ever since it began in 1977. In an interview with the British music paper New Musical Express, **U2** lead singer **Bono** credited Graham with discovering the band. "He was the first person outside of our little scene that believed in us. He had great faith in us and was extraordinary in that way. He wasn't so much a critic as a kind of catalyst or visionary," Bono says. "His whole thing was connections. He'd see the influences of surf guitar in Edge's guitar playing, and he'd get **Country Joe & The Fish** albums for him. Or he'd get me **Arthur Lee's Love**. Always connections." Bono and **The Edge** performed **Leonard Cohen's** "Tower Of Song" at Graham's funeral in Howth, County Dublin, where **Gavin Friday**, formerly of the **Virgin Prunes**, sang **Bob Dylan**'s "Death Is Not The End." U2 have been recording a new album in Miami.

Brian Eno has a book out in England called "A Year With Swollen Appendices" which is basically a diary of Eno's activities, thoughts and ideas in 1995. "I had been trying for about five years to collect together the ideas I was talking about and lecturing about and so on," Eno says. "It's a very easy thing to read. You can just stick it in the toilet and read a day now and again, whenever you go in."

Henry Rollins' former record label (Imago Recordings) has sued his new one (DreamWorks) for \$50 million claiming the label interfered with Rollins' contract and caused him to breach it. The lawsuit, filed in U.S. District Court in New York, says DreamWorks met with Rollins while he was under contract and signed him even after Imago protested. Imago President Terry Ellis says Rollins owes the label as many as 11 records under his existing contract and related options. The lawsuit contends that DreamWorks, a new label, is "unlawfully prey(ing) on smaller record companies" in an "unconscionable and dangerous assault upon the record industry." "It's a complete shock to me that they would behave in this way," Ellis says. "They must be under such pressure to perform that they are not thinking clearly." The new legal action is an amended complaint to a claim Imago filed against Rollins in April, contending that he had given the label only two of the eight albums required under his contract. Rollins had told Imago last summer that his contract became void after the label severed its ties with a major-label distributor. He reportedly signed a multi-million dollar deal with DreamWorks after getting offers from other major labels (Virgin Records and Sony Music). Imago's lawsuit says DreamWorks has launched an "unlawful scheme...to create, virtually overnight, a profitable record company by using its enormous financial resources to pirate away successful recording artists signed to record companies and production companies whose financial resources do not match those of DreamWorks Records."

Wal-Mart stores have announced they won't re-order the **Goo-Goo Dolls**' latest album, "A Boy Named Goo," because of its cover of a naked baby dripping with blackberry juice. The chain says it hasn't banned the album, but once existing stocks sell out, they're gone for good. Wal-Mart spokeswoman Shauna Parker says some people complained because they didn't like the naked baby. Some said it suggested child abuse, while others believed the liquid was blood. The cover art came from a 1987 book of photographs taken by Vance Gellert of his son Carl. "The album cover is as offensive as a bearskin-rug photo of a baby," says band member **Johnny**

Rzeznik. "To think that it would promote child abuse is ridiculous. Anyone who looks at this and sees it as a dirty picture has a problem. The name of the album is 'A Boy Named Goo.' The picture is of a boy covered with goo. What part of this concept are they unclear on?"

Polly Harvey releases an album in September called "Dance Hall At Louse Point," which sees her collaborating with **John Parish**, who co-produced **PJ Harvey**'s last album and played percussion wuith the band last year. **Nick Cave** makes a guest appearance on the LP, which also includes a cover of **Peggy Lee**'s "Is That All There Is?" British choreographer Mark Bruce plans to use the album as the basis for a contemporary dance piece commissioned by London's South Bank Centre for a British tour early next year, with Harvey and Parish performing the music live. "John and I have wanted to do an album together for a long time," Harvey says. "This is the first time I've written words to someone else's music. It's been an enlightening experience and I feel it has changed my approach to songwriting in a positive way."

The Bee Gees, Black Sabbath, Buffalo Springfield, Solomon Burke, Crosby Stills & Nash, the Dominoes, Lynyrd Skynyrd, The Mamas & The Papas, the Meters, the Jackson 5, Joni Mitchell, the Moonglows, Parliament-Funkadelic, Gene Pitney, Lloyd Price, the (Young) Rascals, and the Stooges are the acts under consideration for induction into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame at the 12th annual ceremonies which will take place in January in Cleveland.

Perry Farrell is planning a concert tour this year that would feature "music all night under the stars" as well as "communal eating" and "seeding." "We're gonna seed this land," he says "Lollapalooza was all about trampling. Treading." Rumored participants in the tour include **Bjork**, the **Chemical Brothers**, **Love & Rockets** and Farrell's **Porno For Pyros**.

The **Tea Party** is working on a new album at its home studio in Montreal, where the band has completed demos for eight songs. "It's really turning out well," says bass player and keyboardist **Stuart Chatwood**. "It's more raw than anything else we've recorded. We've included break beats in some songs. I think people are really going to be shocked." The album may be out in October, while a CD-ROM may come out the month before, featuring an unreleased song called "Time," written with British songwriter **Roy Harper** during the sessions for "Edges Of Twilight."

Ozzy Osbourne had to postpone a concert in Vancouver last week after a chest infection caused him to lose his voice. He's been antibiotics since then and says "it's been going great."

Soul Asylum made a surprise appearance opening for the **Carpetbaggers** at their record release party at a Minneapolis club. Soul Asylum's set consisted of entirely new material. The Carpetbaggers' new album is called "Sin Now...Pray Later" (on HighTone Records).

Rosanne Cash is beginning a series of solo acoustic shows in support of her "10 Song Demo." For the first shows on the tour she'll be accompanied by her husband, producer and guitarist **John Leventhal**, who worked with her on the 11-song album.

Tish Hinojosa has begun a U.S. tour that will include an appearance during the Summer Olympic Games in Atlanta. Hinojosa recent-THE HARD REPORT ly performed at the White House during a reception honoring Hispanic leaders from around the country. Her latest album, "Dreaming From The Labyrinth," was recorded at a former convent chapel that dates back to the 1920s in Hinojosa's hometown of San Antonio.

St. Louis folk-rock quintet **Wagon** has a new album called "No Kinder Room" just out (on HighTone Records). The LP was produced by Lloyd Maines and was recorded in Austin, Texas.

An "Elton's Closet" sale of clothes **Elton John** didn't want any more raised more than \$250,000 during its first few days in Atlanta. Proceeds from the sale go to the Elton John AIDS Foundation. A similar sale in London two years ago raised \$240,000.

The first foreign song to reach number one on the Japanese charts in 12 years is **Celine Dion**'s "To Love You More," which quickly sold 1.3 million copies after being used as the theme song for a popular television drama series "Koibito yo" ("My Dear Lover"). There are no immediate plans to release the song in North America.

Joe Satriani went back to his blues roots for his latest album, which was produced by Glyn Johns. "I played blues as the first style of music I ever learned how to play, but I never thought that I measured up to the blues artists that I liked listening to. So I always thought, 'Well, with age will come the right sensibility to learn how to play that kind of music.' But I always thought it would come maybe 10, 15 years from now, and it sur-

thought it would come maybe 10, 15 years from now, and it surprised me that this record had some moments on jt that were truly blues." Satriani says he wanted a "more organic, truthful" album and didn't resort to any overdubbing on the LP. "Normally I might lay down six or seven different guitars with different equipment and different technical attitudes before finally mixing them together to make a song. In this case, I knew there was just going to be one of me and that was it," he says. "So I had to somehow consolidate all the feelings I had about the song into one guitar plugged into one amp...and I had to make it convincing. That's pretty intense. Everybody in the band was in the same position."

Willie Nelson's Fourth of July concert in Luckenbach, Texas, will be a Farm Aid benefit, starring Waylon Jennings and Leon Russell, among others. Farm Aid program director Harry Smith says the drought is turning into "the largest natural disaster" for farmers this year.

A U.S. District Court judge in Los Angeles has ordered **Garth Brooks** to turn over tapes of his song "Standing Outside The Fire" to a compose who has filed a copyright infringement lawsuit claiming he wrote the song. The lawsuit filed last year by Guy Thomas seeks an unspecified amount of profits and damages, claiming that Brooks' hit was based on his song "Conviction Of The Heart." Judge Ronald Lew has ordered Brooks and Thomas to exchange recordings of both songs and return them within two weeks. Brooks is scheduled to give a deposition in the case in Nashville in July.

Jane Siberry is starting her own record label (Sheeba Records) after she "mutually parted camps" with her major record label. "I can be as eclectic as I like now," she says. "I can release to only a few thousand people certain projects that wouldn't have a wide appeal — projects that I feel have to be done." Her label disagreements stemmed from their desire to have outside producers

work with her, while Siberry says she prefers to produce herself. "It's probably because I'm not creating commercial records and they're losing money. A record company isn't a charity. It's a business and I totally respect that," Siberry says. "Now, there's not a big machine to rev up every time there's a record release." Siberry is to release an album called "Teenager," composed of early material. "This is a symbolic release. These are songs I wrote before my first album. I'm reaching back before I move forward," she says. Siberry also plans to publish some books next year. "One is a trilogy of stories that I've read live at spoken-word performances. Another is a collection of prose and poems and then there are song books, which I've never done."

Mariah Carey has a lengthy list of demands for items to be provided in her dressing room, according to Entertainment Weekly. The magazine says her backstage requirements include Cristal champagne, Simple Peche sparkling wine and Bel Arbors red wine (each with appropriate glassware), a compete tea set up including hot water, cups, spoons, milk, assorted teas (Celestial Seasonings lemon zinger and camomile, and regular Lipton tea), and honey served in plastic honey bears; wet and dry Handiwipes; Dove white liquid hand soap; Famous Amos fat-free fig, strawberry, and apple bars; S&W-brand large stuffed olives; Tostitos fat-free mild salsa; Newman's Own low-fat microwave popcorn; Guiltless Gourmet Baked Not Fried tortilla chips; Drake's coffee cakes; Wonder low-fat, whole-wheat bread; Coca-Cola Classic in bottles; Ricola drops (lemon, mint and yelow); Borden evaporated milk; and Dijon mustard.

Sloan has released a new album in Canada on the band's own record label (murderecords), after two albums with a major U.S. record company (DGC Records). "One Chord To Another" was recorded in December and January at a studio in Halifax, Nova Scotia. "If you're doing it on your own, you can set your own agenda," says guitarist and singer **Jay Ferguson**. "It's less stressful, knowing your situation is in your own hands. I think we'll put out more records sooner and more singles." It's uncertain when the 12-song album might be released in the U.S.

Greg Kihn is now the evening disc jockey on a classic-rock radio station (KUFX) in San Jose, California. "I'd gone from opening for the Rolling Stones and playing on `Saturday Night Live' to Thursday nights in Chico," Kihn says. "What I bring to the party is a whole bunch of really unusual backstage stories. Everybody you can name who we play I've probably either opened for or toured with." Kihn, who's promoted by the station as "a guy who used to throw TVs out of hotel windows," says his career "had gone all the way up and all the way down twice" after his hits "Jeopardy" and "The Breakup Song (They Don't Write 'Em)." "I used to really, really worry about having another hit record," he says. "Can you imagine what it's like to be a rock star on the downside of his career, who's gotta play three or four nights a week to pay his bills, and to be looking at a music business that's basically closed up around him? That's really scary." Kihn still dabbles in music and his most recent album was an acoustic record (on Rounder Records). He's also planning to publish a book in October about a low-budget horror film director. Both the book and an acoustic album he'll be releasing this fall will be called "Horror Show."

The **Beastie Boys**, organizers of a "Tibetan Freedom Concert" in San Francisco, are calling for a boycott of all goods made in China.

Nick Cave & The Bad Seeds are playing a couple of British dates in mid-August and the band will be playing a number of European festivals this summer. They'll have a new album out next year.

Mark Stewart, co-author of Tricky's first single "Aftermath," is just releasing an album called "Control Data." Stewart, who formed The Pop Group in 1978, worked with long-time collaborator Adrian Sherwood on the new LP. Stewart's also working on a "Control Data — Info War" CD-ROM, with visuals and music, for release next year. Users will be able to play related computer games and access information on controversial history and politics.

Little Feat's new "Live From Neon Park" double-CD (on Zoo Entertainment) was recorded last December in San Francisco, Los Angeles and Portland, Oregon. The title refers to the late artist Neon Park whose artwork has been used on every Little Feat album, including "Sailin' Shoes." The cover for "Live From Neon Park" mixes the band's signature "Sailing Shoe" logo and the tomato from the "Waiting For Columbus" cover. Inara George, daughter of the late Little Feat founding member Lowell George, and Miles Tackett, son of Feat guitarist Fred Tackett, are among the guests on the LP.

An entrepreneur in Budapest is selling pieces of the carpet from **Madonna**'s hotel room where she stayed while filming "Evita." The Kempinski Hotel made her pay for a replacement rug after her dog pissed on the carpet in several places.

Michael Jackson is being sued by the father of a boy who accused Jackson of child molestation. The lawsuit filed in Superior Court in Santa Barbara, California, claims Jackson violated the terms of an out-of-court settlement by denying the molestation allegations during an interview on the television program "PrimeTime Live" last June. The lawsuit says Jackson, his then-wife Lisa Marie Presley, Jackson's companies, ABC/Capitol Cities and program host Diane Sawyer are among those who "developed, orchestrated, participated and carried out a scheme to falsely accuse the minor...in the news media of lying about his claims that defendant Jackson had sexually molested and assaulted the minor."

Bob Geldof and his former wife Paula Yates have attended another hearing at a London High Court as they work towards a settlement of their divorce. The former **Boomtown Rats** singer and Yates were given a "quickie" divorce last month, but Yates is reportedly asking for the \$1.2 million home in Chelsea she had shared with Geldof and wants more than the agreed-upon \$500 in weekly child support payments for the couple's daughters, Fifi Trixibelle, Peaches and Pixie. Yates, who is six months pregnant by **Michael Hutchence** of **INXS**, is said to have debts of \$150,000. She plans to marry Hutchence before the birth of their baby, who is to be named Heavenly Herani. Geldof is reportedly worth \$30 million and now lives with French actress Jeanne Marine in a \$1.8 million mansion in Kent.

Zakk Wylde is releasing his debut solo album, after two years with his first band, Pride & Glory. The 11-song album is called "Book Of Shadows" (on Geffen Records) and it was recorded on piano and acoustic guitar at Wylde's home in Los Angeles. The title refers to a notebook that Wylde uses to keep ideas for songs. "I come up with short lyric ideas and just jot them down in the 'Book Of Shadows,'" he says. "Then I put them together to

make something tangible out of them."

The second in a three-volume series highlighting film composer John Barry's work before he became known for soundtracks to James Bond albums has been released (on Scamp/Caroline Records). "John Barry: The EMI Years Vol. 2" includes mostly twominute tracks, almost half of which have never before been released.

Former **Wonder Stuff** member **Miles Hunt** has been touring England with his new band called **Vent**, which is to record its debut album with Steve Albini for release in August. "Albini wouldn't have been my choice if I was still in The Wonder Stuff," Hunt says. "But we wanted to move on and do something a lot different, a lot more jarred, a lot more jagged. I also wanted to avoid the studio tricks that you learn over the years to tart up songs that aren't strong enough. You can put bits of tambourine on the choruses to beef it up, but somebody like Albini ain't gonna let us do that."

Jaz Coleman of Killing Joke has labeled the new wave of so-called "Britpop" bands as "regressive" and "superficial." Coleman says Killing Joke canceled a planned British tour because of "the country's ongoing infatuation with all things Britpop." "The industry is absolutely obsessed with music made by bands with little or no substance who will be back down the job center this time next year," Coleman says. "Thankfully, living as I do in New Zealand, I'm a long way away from it. Britpop is regressive, while Killing Joke is progressive." Coleman says Killing Joke will probably tour Britain this fall when "the love affair with Britpop will be over." Former **Prong** bass player **Tony Gregory** has temporarily replaced **Youth** for the band's tour dates elsewhere this summer.

Former **Daisy Chainsaw** guitarist **Crispin Gray** has formed a new band called **Dizzy Q Viper**.

The **Chemical Brothers** have remixed tracks by the **Charlatans**, **Meat Beat Manifesto** and **Eric B & Rakim** for a compilation album out in England called "Live At The Social Volume 1." The band is still having trouble with **Noel Gallagher** over a song they recorded with him called "Tomorrow Never Noels." Gallagher is apparently upset at the way they've distorted his vocals.

Henry Rollins has recorded a cover of Lipps Inc's "Funky Town" with RuPaul, though it's unlikely the track will be released.

Dave Grohl says he wants **Foo Fighters**' next album to sound like a mixture of **Queen**, **Prince**, **Tom Petty** and **ELO**. "When I listen to the Foo Fighters record, I don't enjoy it any more. It just sounds too one-dimensional," Grohl says. "The new songs are so different in that we're experimenting with different rhythms. I hate albums where you have the same rhythm every song, just slower or faster. To me, it's important to make every song different." Grohl says the band will begin recording the LP by September.

Evan Dando has begun work on a new album but it's not known if it will be a **Lemonheads** release or a debut solo album from Dando, who has been working on material with former **Dionsaur Jr** drummer **Murph** and **Eugene Kelly** of **Eugenius**.

The third **Beatles** "Anthology" album comes out in mid-October, though a track listing won't be disclosed until August. Some acoustic demos from the "white" album are to be included as well as material from the "Get Back" sessions.

Sonny Bono, the California Congressman formerly of **Sonny & Cher**, says he can't accept the idea of homosexual marriages even though his daughter, Chastity, is a lesbian. "I'm not homophobic. I'm not a bigot. I'm not pandering to hatred," said at a House Judiciary Committee meeting. "I simply can't handle it. It's nothing else, but at least I want to honestly say that to you and throw aside all the legal rhetoric." In the January issue of The Advocate, Chastity interviewed her father, and he said at the time that gay marriage "seems fine if that's what they want to do. Yeah, I'll support that, unless there are any costs involved, but there don't appear to be any." However, a Bono spokesman says his comments were taken out of context.

Soundgarden will play one of a series of concerts at Underground Atlanta sponsored by Miller Brewing during the Olympics, even though competitor Budweiser is the official Olympic Sponsor. Miller plans an 18-day series of music concerts during the Games that will also feature **Sheryl Crow** and R&B act **R. Kelly**. A Budweiser executive calls the concerts "ambush" marketing, and Bill Ferguson, the director of sponsorship protection for the Atlanta Committee for the Olympic Games, says the shows are "a potential problem."

Nick Cave, Patti Smith, Ray Davies and **Damon Albarn** of **Blur** are particiating in "A Hip Mass; The Superjam," a sort of "poetry Olympics" scheduled for London's Royal Albert Hall on July 7.

Oasis will be allowed to play two U.K. concerts at Loch Lomond in early August 4 even though local residents had complained promoters didn't arrange for enough portable toilets. Oasis will come back to the U.S. after playing Britain's Knebworth festival on August 10.

Kelley Deal says she's not sure the Breeders will ever work together again. She plans to meet with her twin sister Kim in August to "generally work shit out." "It's just not that heavy a thing to think about," she says. "It is not brain surgery, you know. If we get together, great. If we don't, who really gives a shit?" The Breeders aren't under contract for any more albums, so Kelley Deal says there is no pressure to reform the band. "Kim was the only one who signed and as such she owes the label albums, nobody else does. And those albums can be anything she wants. I love my sister and I love playing and singing with her and that motivates me more than anything. I think The Breeders have a really good chemistry and we have a lot of fun together, I think people can see that," Kelley Deal says.

The **Levellers** have spoken out against a proposal by Britain's Labour Party to impose curfews for young people to reduce crime. Bass player **Jeremy Cunningham** says the government should "stop looking to America" instead of addressing Britain's own problems.

Sebadoh releases a new 18-song album in August called "Harmacy." After working with **John Davis** on **Folk Implosion**, **Lou Barlow** is said to be concentrating full-time on Sebadoh.

Former **Milli Vanilli** member **Robert Pilatus** has entered a Los Angeles rehabilitation center after walking out of a center in North Hollywood, where he'd been ordered by a court to undergo treatment. A judge recalled the \$60,000 arrest warrant he'd issued after Pilatus' attorney explained that Pilatus went directly from one center to the other. A probation violation hearing has been scheduled for June 24.

Bob Geldof is to move into the London house of Michael Hutchence, frontman of INXS and lover of Geldof's former wife, Paula Yates. Yates and her three children will move into a house owned by Geldof and valued at over one million dollars. The announcement was made via a handwritten note distributed after three days of legal arguments in a London High Court. Dated twelfth of June 1996, the note said: "After three days of complete bloody nightmare in the High Courts of Justice, Bob and Paula have with collective sighs of relief arrived amicably at a half decent solution to their housing arrangements. Paula and the kids will move into the house in Chelsea. Bob will move into Michael's house down the road. Thanks very much." The note was signed by both and a P.S. was added: "Neither of us will talk about this any further so please don't doorstep us. Thanks." Despite the argument, Yates and Geldof were seen arguing together outside the court. At one point Yates commented, "Nineteen years and you want to see me on the street?" However, the argument later calmed down and the two joked and laughed. Yates said, "We are like the Addams family." Yates had gone to court to try to get an increase in her \$450.00 per week maintenance and to win Geldof's house. As The Hard Report went to press, a deal was about to be formalized in front of Judge Morton Jack. Outside the court, Geldof said, "There's a world outside, a very serious world, and where Paula and Bob live is of no significance." The announcement appears to end a very public dispute homewrecker, criticized Geldof publicly, saying he had affairs with six women when the two were together. "Bob is not the saint he would like the world to think he is," she said. Hutchence also complained about the portrayal of himself and Yates, "I've been made to look like some sort of evil stepfather, an old rock star who'll corrupt Paula and her young children." After Yates and Geldof separated, Yates ran into financial problems. At one point there were fourteen writs against her for unpaid debts, despite a reported salary of \$150,000 as a newspaper columnist. Geldof now lives with actress Jeanne Marine and has made few comments over the break up of the marriage... The Tribal Gathering Festival will go ahead on June 29th. The festival, which was due to take place in May but was not granted a license after police objections, will take place at a site near Oxford, south-east England. After lengthy negotiations with police over possible problems with traffic congestion, the festival was granted a license on June fifth. Artists appearing at the danceorientated event will include Black Grape, The

Chemical Brothers, Leftfield and Goldie... Oasis' shows at Bulloch County Park, Scotland on August third and fourth will go ahead. There were fears the event might be cancelled after some local residents voiced concern over the number of fans who would attend... Crowded House have split. The band had planned to announce the split at a London show on June third, but instead Neil Finn issued a statement the next day. According to Finn, "I have every desire to keep making records and find the challenge of new possibilities exhilarating." Over the next few weeks, Finn will tour with his brother Tim as the Finn Brothers... Bis have signed to Wiiija Records, the London-based independent label. The band were reported to be the subject of bids from forty-seven companies, but opted for a fivealbum deal with the small independent. The deal will cover all territories except the USA. According to Wiiija's head Gary Walker, "It's the biggest deal I've ever done as a label and I'm really excited to be working with them. I think a lot of people thought Bis would go to a major, but they trusted us. They wanted total artistic control, which we were more than happy to give them, and they wanted to work with someone who came from the same background as them." The band are writing new material and will release their debut album in the fall... Lou Reed, Glen Matlock, Damon Albarn, Billy Bragg, Melanie Garside, Phil Collins and Holly Johnson have all contributed works to an art exhibition about AIDS. Body Parts will run at the Salford Museum and Art Gallery, north England from June 20th to July 10th. All exhibits will be auctioned with the proceeds going to AIDS charities... Alan McGee, the head of Creation Records, has signed a deal which renews the label's relationship with Sony. The deal is reported to be worth \$18 million. Sony had wanted to take up an option they hold on fifty-one per cent of the company, but McGee was able to persuade representatives of Sony that a major reason for the label's success was because bands feel a personal loyalty to him. Creation's roster includes Oasis, Primal Scream, Bob Mould, Glen Matlock, The Boo Radleys, Super Furry Animals and Teenage Fanclub. McGee, who had threatened to guit if Sony had taken over Creation, commented: "The money is in the bank and I'm thinking about what to do with it. I think Noel and Liam are pleased I've stayed. If I'd gone, I think there would have been a very long wait for the next Oasis album." Last week, McGee refused to attend a meeting called by the Secretary Of State For National Heritage Virginia Bottomley. Bottomley had wanted


