

## VING THE RIGHT ( POWER PIG, HOT 194, OTHERS ACHIEVE NICHE SUCCESS

Although the early Arbitron Spring numbers were, at best, lukewarm for the major -market Top40s, the results of markets released in the past week have been far more encouraging. Several success stories have cropped up, and not only in single Top40 markets. While the winners attribute their success to superserving their core audience, that audience can be either Dance music fans on the lower end of 18-34, or the Adult fans on the higher end.

Among the more notable results

• Phoenix: Despite the departure of

PD Rick Thomas, KOY's jump from 4.2 to 4.8 overtook KKFR's dip from 4.9 to 4.6. Although KVRY's increase was a minimal .1 12+, it made significant gains in its target 25+ demos, especially in females. PD Stef Rybak has a lot to crow about this Spring.

· Tampa. POWER PIG reasserted its dominance, leaping 1.6 points to 7.1, while Mason Dixon's MIX96 rocketed 2.7 points to 6.2. Q105, on the other hand, dropped 1.7 to 4.6. The winning PDs both claimed that their respective stations locked up their target demos, leaving Q105 in the unenviable

position of being in the middle.

"With a few more adjustments, we can be #1 25-54," MIX96 PD Mason Dixon told HITMAKERS. "We'll be a solid contender 18-34, but there's no way to ride on top of both demos. It's too divided now. We've got the upper end covered and POWERPIG has the lower end covered. We're dominating 25-34 and we don't want to give that up. By playing R.E.M. and the Scorpions, we can retain a hip image to the 27 year-olds and still be palatable to the adults."

We still have plenty of room to

grow," POWER PIG PD B. Harris said. "The music first leaned AC, then it went Rock with R.E.M. and the Scorpions. We've been playing the hits and we've had upward growth, but when the big Dance records come out, we'll grow even more. The key is to stay consistent and keep a fun factor so people will enjoy listening to a positive, entertaining station. That's what keeps you a cut above the other guys."



## **CITADEL COMM.** Adds Time Brokerage For KKFM, KKMG

CITADEL COMM. CORP., owners of KKFM Colorado Springs, has added programming to its time brokerage service for KKMG. At KKMG, Joel Belik has been upped to GM, while Chris Baker will be Director of Programming for both properties.

KKFM VP/GM Bob
Proffitt told HITMAKERS that the move is the second phase of an agreement which began last December. "In the the original time brokerage agreement, we had this option,' he said. "It was our intent to do the time brokerage first and the programming brokerage second. After we completed our billing operation, we felt we could further the level of programming, and increase the ratings and revenue, by

providing it to them. We wanted the programming under one roof. We have a lot of resources at KKFM that we could use for KKMG to enhance the product."

KKFM will continue as a Classic Rock, while KKMG will continue to be a Top40. "They both sound exactly as they did yesterday, except that they share the news department," he said. "It's very similar to an AM/FM combo. Although we don't own KKMG, we provide the programming and retain the sales rights by giving them a fee

Proffitt noted that they will begin research for KKMG, and they have undertaken a remodeling project to improve the station.

MCA Records has opened a Regional Pop/Rock A&R office in Nashville. A&R Director Kurt Denny will run the office, which was created to serve as a direct link between Southeastern artists and the label's A&R department.


Emboldened by that training, it seems imperative that we pass our knowledge along for the benefit of of not only your individual circumstances, but for the industry as a whole.

## Summertime Programming

## **TOP40 COLUMN**

As the song goes, the living may be easy in the summertime, but making a living on Top40 is especially busy during the hottest months of the year. It's a time for stations to raise their profile and reflect the carefree, funfilled attitude of summer.

"We encourage our air personalities to talk about the summer lifestyle, the fun in the sun, vacations, nightlife and outdoor concerts," noted **Don London**, OM/PD at WZPL Indianapolis. "We're even more visible in summer than other parts of the year. We'll be passing out soft drinks, prizes and other merchandise at popular outdoor lunch spots, as well as broadcast live from outdoor concerts and fairs."

"We try to come across with a fun, outdoors approach," confirmed **John McFadden**, PD at THE FOX in Detroit. "We try to target our sweepers and top-of-the-hour IDs and things like that to a summertime, outdoor attitude."

#### **Raising The Profile**

To capitalize on the outdoor activities of its listeners, the FOX regularly sends its van out for remotes and promotions. "Obviously, we've been going out at night, looking for to-be-noticed activities we can get involved in. During the current heat wave, we've been sending our station van out to take over ice cream and yogurt stands, and the first 99 people to come by get free ice cream and yogurt. In this weather,

that doesn't take very long."

WZPL also takes part in a variety of outdoor activities. "We have theme water parks in the area, where we give out a ton of soft drinks and free water park passes," London noted. "We literally make the most out of a sticky situation. In fact, we'll be out there doing remotes a couple times this week."

necessarily on the air," he added. "We're constantly asked to give away what we call 'kickback' prizes. For instance, if Ace Hardware wants us to give away hammers, which, to be honest, is not a very exciting prize, but it does appeal to males 25+ and 35+. So, we won't have listeners call in for a hammer, but we'll go out in

London explained that he regularly contacts the 'ZPL Sales staff for potential summertime promotions. "We communicate with them as much as possible, so they can go after the advertisers that we'd be interested in doing promotions and appearances with," he said. "It has dramatically increased lines of communication between the two departments, so they have better understanding of what we'd like and we have a better understanding of what they have to go through out there.

"You can give away just about anything through the station, and not our van and hand out hammers and Tshirts with logos on them. This way, they're happy they won a prize and you haven't cluttered your airwaves."

#### **Altering The Playlist**

Not surprisingly, the music programming is also affected by the heat, not only in the kind of songs played but in how they're dayparted. "Musically, we open the dayparts up and move the music up one grid," London said. "For example, if a song is restricted to plays after 3 pm, it might be moved up so it plays after 12 noon. A song restricted to after 12 noon will be moved up one time

period to after 10 am. It all goes up one time period."

McFadden concerns himself with the choice of music. "Musically, we try to eliminate a lot of our ballads that would normally be in recurrent or gold recurrent," he said. "Of course, we'll still play the current hit ballads, such as the ones by **Bryan Adams**, **Extreme** and **Hi-Five**, the absolute monsters. However, we will scale our Gold library back a bit, so the station stays pretty much uptempo and, again, has that 'put your top down' feel to it.

"Certainly, we'll grab a couple records with a summertime theme sound, such as **Bananarama**'s *Cruel Summer*, but more often our playlist reflects the music we wouldn't add," McFadden added. "A marginal ballad that would probably get played in fall or winter won't get played in summer."

And when does the summertime push end? "We usually end it around Labor Day," McFadden said. "That's when the kids go back to school and people gear towards Fall. We do have the occasional Indian summer in October, and then we'll heat things up for a while.

"When we get a day in March that pops into 70s and 80s, everybody here goes wild, so if we know that's going to happen over a weekend, we'll adjust the music to make it a bit hotter to, again, give people a 'roll down the windows' sound."

# PROGRAMMER'S THINK TANK

## HINK TANK Radio's Belt Tightening

A friend of mine and I went to the Bronx Zoo recently, and the place was packed. It was particularly crowded around the gorilla pavilion; people were standing, five or six deep, struggling to get a view.

My friend and I noticed a vacant cage nearby. So we went over to to the restraining wall in front of the vacant cage and started leaning over the edge, laughing loudly and pointing at the antics of the non-existent animals. It wasn't long before the frustrated people jumped out of the mob in front of the gorilla cage to see what was happening. We kept laughing and pointing, so the newcomers started pointing, trying to locate the hilarious animals. Soon the shouts of "where?" grew louder, which attracted even more people. At that point, we quietly slipped over to the gorilla exhibit, which was virtually abandoned. As our ruse illustrated, people are never really happy with things unless they're sure what they have is the best and most popular.

Now the Spring book's out, and as usual, some new openings have cropped up. And who goes after those gigs? Usually PDs who are currently doing well or at least secure where they are. These PDs could be the spectators at the Bronx Zoo. They check things out each opening, just because it's there.

To be sure, ambition is an admirable trait. Far be it from me to ever discourage that in anyone. Blind ambition, however, is very dangerous. Someone once said that "a known devil is often better than an unknown one." After all, a PD gig is a lot like a marriage. First comes the honeymoon, then the first fight, then things get routine and boring, and

suddenly having an affair looks pretty tempting. In a disposable society, when we tire of something and it doesn't excite us anymore, we click the remote and off it goes—be it a TV show, a relationship, or a job.

What makes this so disturbing is the fact that radio is in the dumper economically. Check out the radio groups that were on the tip of everybody's tongues two years ago. Today, if they haven't already gone Chapter 11, they're selling off their stations to anyone with a check that doesn't bounce.

I don't have to tell you that the banks have lost confidence in radio as an investment. If they're not foreclosing on one property, they're denying loans to purchase another. That means owners who buy a station today probably had to sink every penny they have into the down payment and, therefore, have no operating money except what they can generate as they go along (and that revenue usually goes right to the bank to pay off the loan).

So you're pissed that the GM won't give you a raise; he's cut your TV budget in half and nixed your fall promotion. You explain that these things generate the audience needed to sell to advertisers, but that falls on deaf ears. So you blow your fuse to the first sympathetic record rep who calls. You tell him it's time to move on. He tells you about this great opening,

and he knows someone who knows the GM or the consultant, and you're on your way. What was a marital dispute over household finances in a recession just turned into a potential divorce and new marriage.

Granted, all divorces aren't wrong. Many job changes are great career moves, but many more are not. As creative people, we hate it when we feel unappreciated by our superiors, who we rely upon for that validation. On the other hand, someone trying to hire you is brimming with smiles, compliments and lofty promises. But keep that in mind when you're being courted by a GM or group operator that almost nobody is throwing around bonus money, promotional bucks or anything else like they used to. If they promise any of those things, be sure to get it in writing.

I've told too many PDs, "You don't have any idea of what you've got right now. Everybody is tightening their belts. It's just a phase. Radio will soon recycle and there will be money again and lots of perks. Now, though, is the time to hold onto what you've got and weather this storm. A bigger market is not necessarily the right move—especially if you don't have the budget to support your talents and ideas.

Even if you're working for a cheap family outfit that owns only one station, you may be better off than at a corporate chain station with no feeling of responsibility to anyone. Meanwhile, you're in line at the gorilla exhibit to see a show you know exists. Are you going to let a couple of jealous, envious people lure you to an empty arena by acting excited? Don't fall for it.

# PASSIVE RECORDS: THE LOST HITS OF TOP40?

In an era of active-oriented, instant-gratification radio, passive, Adult-oriented records often get lost in the shuffle. Many Mainstream and especially Dance/Crossover stations are geared more to the active listener and don't have the luxury of time to break those records. How do you prevent passive records from falling through the cracks?

## GARY BERKOWITZ, Pres., Berkowitz Broadcast Consulting

I've felt since I began programming that we moved records too quickly and didn't give them enough of a chance. I can cite probably 35 records in the past 18 months that were "lost" because they were not given enough time. Certain records, especially the Urban/Rap ones, get instant response and cause phones. Then there are records like Jude Cole's <u>Baby, It's Tonight</u> and Phil Collins' <u>Something Happened On The Way To Heaven</u> that don't cause the younger end to react, but were still smash hits.

I have to make a commitment to the record. It's tough

to say, "This record is right for this station at this particular time," but you have to stick with it. If you're committed to it, it's not going to hurt you.

If you're a successful Mainstream Top40, you must gauge your music for adults differently than you do for teens and 18-24s. There has to be a whole separate set of rules. The Top40s in the next year or two are going to heavily research their adult core because they have totally different habits. Different and unique research methods are going to have to be discovered.




## DAVE SHAKES, PD, B96, Chicago

Generally, I don't like to go on Adult core records early. I prefer to see other radio stations break those for us. After they've been proven that way, we can hop on the bandwagon at the end.

In our situation, we'd prefer to go on records that start with young demos and then grow into adult demos, rather than records that start with adults and "grow down" to the teen demos. So it's difficult for us to get on a record like a **Luther Vandross** early and have success with it, because it takes so damn long to find out if it's

going to be a hit or not.

It's easier in our situation to check the success of a record like that on the Top40 stations that have a different philosophy, and are willing and able to go on Adult demo records in the first weeks. Usually, we're so late that we go on it on the faith that since it's worked so well for these other stations, it's going to do the same for us. That's why we're willing to wait the six or eight weeks it's going to take for it to kick in.



## JOEL FOLGER, PD, KEGL, Dallas, TX

As much as we'd like to think that this business of music is a science, it's not. There's no set magical number of total weeks needed for a record to establish itself as a contender. So many different factors determine when to get off or stay on a record. We try to use as many different barometers as we can and weigh them all at the same time. That's when you make your gut call.

We have a pretty good track record in picking those records that eventually mid-chart and fall by the wayside and getting rid of the dead weight. Hopefully, we stick with the right records that go all the way to the top like Extreme and Rythm Syndicate.

Once we add a record, we've been good at sticking with the ones that are going to go on to be hits, and identifying early those that sounded better in the office than they do on the air. Listeners identify the same thing. We use all the factors--callout research, sales, requests--and then make our determination if a record's going to stay or go.



## BILL PASHA, PD, STAR 105, Dallas, TX

As an Adult Top40-leaning Hot AC, we don't find that pressure on a record, because most of those records have been established in one form or another before they ever get on the air in Dallas.

It is very difficult to judge an Adult record through sales or callout because even a 15-week-old record is new and unfamiliar to a great portion of the adults that might be listening. We're very fortunate that Bolton Research is very good at helping us identify what the right currents and the wrong currents are, especially

considering how tight our format is. In any given week, I might run anywhere from 7 to 20 currents; it just depends on what's out there.

Every record for me is a passive because I don't have a number of adults sitting on the phones and voting for their favorite records. But if someone could come up with a system which would give me information about how adults feel about a new record, that would be exceptional. I just can't conceive at this time of a way of doing that because it's so difficult to test unfamiliars.


## ADAM SMASHER, PD, KWOD, Sacramento, CA

If a song is working, it's working, so let it stand on its own. For instance, I think **R.E.M**, is becoming a very passive to the listeners, so you should let them feel comfortable with it.

There's nothing wrong with a passive hit. Every song you play will not make the phones rage. Those are the songs you have to make gut reactions to, but each song is different. If we've played a song for two weeks and it's doing real well in retail and on the charts nationally, but it just sounds like a train wreck on the radio and maybe

it's getting some complaints in research, I'll pull it. You have to go on a gut feeling and trust your own judgement.

I refuse to say. "we'll never play a certain song if it sounds like this, this or this." That's up to the audience again. It goes back to the old phrase. "I will not program the market, the market will program me." It would be ridiculous for me to say that we'll never ever play a Rap song again. I don't see us playing a Rap song right now, but who knows what the audience will want in the future?



## JOHNNA CECCOLI, MD, Y100, Miami, FL

Every so often one of those records will come into our playlist and we'll stick with it because we really believe in it. For example, we stuck with The Rembrandts' *That's Just The Way It Is Baby* a couple months ago, and it proved to be a big record for us. In fact it's still testing very well for us. If we gave up after the first couple of weeks, we'd have never found out how good it was.

You should stick with certain records that you feel will eventually make it. A lot of it has to do with your gut

feeling. too. If you're playing a record for four or five weeks and it's just not happening, some people would just jump right off and forget it, but if you really feel it could happen, just go with it for another couple weeks. If it does happen, you'll be glad you stayed with it.

These records are not going to get the initial 200 phone calls. It's really just a gut feeling. Of course, you always watch how it's doing elsewhere, too. Sometimes you can judge on that.



## BOB LEWIS, PD, KGGG, Rapid City, SD

It's all about balance. You need to balance all the music categories, so you're going to have to play records that people don't call for. Most passive records will research poorly except for certain demographics. If it does well in the 25-29 cell and 30-34 cell, you can afford to stick with it.

It has a lot to do with not using research as your only map, but using your gut as well. Leaving a Marc Cohn or UB40 on your station might not show right away, but it will add the right balance. You can't have all reactionary records, either, because after burning those songs out after seven weeks,

what are you going to play next year as Gold--*Rock Me*, *Amadeus* by Falco? That record was burned so badly that it will never get played again, while Marc Cohn will be played.

As a Mainstream Top40, you can't be too slow, too fast, too Rock or Dance, too male or female, or too intense or boring. You have to break it down to the smalllest scale, from hot to new music to power gold. I've still got reactionary records in a gold rotation. While *Red, Red Wine* has a high burn, it researches well and people still ask for it. If you think you can't afford to wait for a passive record to work, you actually can't afford not to.




## PETER FALCONI, PD, WERZ, Exeter, NH

Part of reason some passive records slip through the cracks is that as Top40 tries to service an instant-gratification society, programmers are looking for records that grab people by the ears. Second of all, a passive record isn't going to test well, or it will take so long to show results that it won't survive on a playlist that accentuates the best-testing records.

A passive record has to fit in with the sound of the station. For instance, a nice Urban ballad may not be an

active record or test well, but on the other hand, it may fit sound of station perfectly. Then it becomes the job of PD and MD to fill the holes in their playlist with those type of records.

We've been playing **Dave Koz**'s *Nothing But The Radio On* for several weeks, and while it hasn't lit the phones up or generated a whole lot of reaction, it doesn't turn anyone off, either, and it really compliments the flow of station.



## MATT McCANN, PD, WLRW, Champaign, IL

Although this is an era of instant gratification, it sometimes takes the public a little longer than we'd like to get used to a record and decide whether they like it. We have to understand that and not dump a record after three weeks because it's not in the Top-5 at Nine.

If you're going to commit on a record, you need to give it an opportunity to make it or break it on its own. If you run a station totally with active records, using active forms of research, you'll probably be unhappy when the Arbitron guy calls with the numbers. You've got to use some common sense when evaluating a record. It took up to six weeks for **Luther Vandross** to kick in, but once it did, it was an obvious hit record. You just have to see how each song sounds on the station, and how it mixes with other songs.

Five weeks isn't that long to wait for a record to happen if everything else in your gut says it deserves to be on your station. It does force the progarmmer to think more than one way on each individual record, and if it's a passive record, you've got to think a little bit harder.







leaped 1.4 to 6.2 and XL106.7 jumped 1.2 to 4.9. In Louisville, WDJX zoomed 2.1 to 8.9 while WZKS (KISS104) upped 1.1 to 5.0.

• Syracuse. WNTQ soared 1.4 to 10.7, making it second in the market. Although PD J.J. Cook admitted to having AC tastes, he credited Burkardt/Douglas consultant Don Benson for focusing on the 18-34 core. "By concentrating on that, we've been able to drag in the fringe," he told HITMAKERS. "The 25-34 female cell will drive the 25-54 numbers up.

"We're going to focus even more and keep superserving 18-34," he added. "With a market so fragmented where everyone goes after 25-54, going after that would fragment our music to the point where people don't know what we are."

• Rochester. 98PXY leapt 1.1 points to 10.4, stopping a four-book slide. PD John Ivey credits the turnaround to concentrating solely on females. "We ran an auditorium test that covered only 18-34 women, which made us slow down our currents and tighten up the playlist," he told HITMAKERS. "We've also cut down on the jock chatter. Although they talk less, what they say means more.'

· Honolulu. For the first time ever, HOT 194 became the market leader. zooming from a 9.3 to 12.7. PD Jamie Hyatt attributed the rise to "playing the right music, improving the air staff and

being very promotionally active. We stuck with our 18-43 core who like Dance music and superserved them."

Unlike other PDs who claimed to have success without Rap, it worked well for Hyatt. "We have no problems with it, and our upper demos went up," he said. "You just have to know what time of day to play them and what artists to play. You want the melodic, sing-along Rap songs.

"I've read articles where people say that you can't play Mariah Carey and Rap at the same time, but I don't think that's true by any means. They love both here, and they do at KMEL. HOT97.7 and KDON, too. If you stick to your core, you'll do well."

• Probaby the biggest winner in Top40 has to be in Lafayette, IN where WAZY went into orbit, from a 9.7 to 19.9, and in 18-49, a 10.4 to a 24.8. It was PD Jim Stacy's seventh consecutive #1 rating. He programmed the station from 1983-1986, then left before returning in February of this year.

WMMS Cleveland, I decided to move him from Artist Development to AOR Promotion because he'll do great with it."

Baumgartner stressed the need for grassroots artists development to break new Rock talent, with the ultimate goal of crossing them over into Top40. "Old-fashioned artist development still works," he said. "We're going to do old-fashioned promotions. A lot of new, developing artists are opening up for major acts.

Chris Whitley will open for Tom Petty, Alice In Chains got the Van Halen tour, and Deacon Blue will open for Robert Palmer. We're going to take advantage of that by having

them visit the local radio stations and doing special shows.

"AOR is doing fine and will be a big part of the '90s," Baumgartner added. "When Q106 PD Kevin Weatherly tells me that he lost a part of his audience to the Rock station. that's because Top40 is turning themselves into a Dance or Rap niche format. We're going to stick with ground-level artist development so when they move back into the Mainstream, we'll be part of it. It's like the Black Crowes, who developed themselves on the road for a year before breaking Top40."

"Derek came to ATCO as a true music man, and his instincts and skills have served him well," noted ATLANTIC GROUP Co-Chairman/Co-

CEO Ahmet Ertegun. "In keeping with the label's rich musical heritage. he has established artists to new levels, while nurturing developing talent in a variety of musical styles."

Shulman believes the key to the label's future success is developing talent, not just going for the one-shot hits. "The key to our heritage is in building great acts," he said. "We're not talking about killer records, but killer acts. AC/DC is a heritage band, and we plan on making The Rembrandts and The Panteras heritage bands as well.

"There's a huge underground out there comprised of fans who don't care about MTV or radio. They'll break acts like the Panteras, a band that has sold 200,000 albums through touring alone. You'll see other non-Mainsteam bands break through from the left and right, Rap and Metal."

"Under Derek's tutelage, ATCO has become a pillar of the ATLANTIC GROUP of labels as we move into the '90s," stated Co-Chairman/Co-CEO Doug Morris. "I look forward to continuing our exciting and fruitful partnership in the years ahead."

## JOHN McFADDEN

Program Director, WDFX, (THE FOX), Detroit

## HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN IN THE DETROIT MARKET?

Almost three years. I arrived in October of 1989 and the station had signed on in August of '89. I was brought here as Assistant PD/MD, midday personality, night watchman, gofer, executive zoo chef and everything else in between. Chuck Beck was the PD at the time. We were doing a pretty Mainstream Top40 approach with a little bit of the Rock that wasn't being serviced in the market and at that particular time, it was Guns N' Roses, Def Leppard, Bon Jovi, Poison and Skid Row. 'HYT and 'CZY, which is now Q95, were not playing much of these artists, so we had a very neat and successful debut with a 5.4.

# SINCE YOU'VE BEEN THERE, THE WHOLE COMPLEXION OF THE MARKET CHANGED. Q95 IS NOW AN ADULT TOP40 AND YOUR STATION HAS SKEWED TOWARD DANCE/CROSSOVER.

Yes, it has. We started off being fairly Mainstream. All those Rock bands had massive albums, and there were large amounts of product available at that time. 'HYT was servicing the Dance niche of the format, while 'CZY went down the middle, trying to be a lot of things to a lot of people. They have Dick Purtan in the morning, which, for an Adult Top40, is a slam dunk. He's a very good personality, and most of your Adult Top40 audience grew up listening to Dick.

We started leaning toward the Rock side and pioneered, along with Brian Burns, the folks at PIRATE Radio, and Mark Todd at 92X in Columbus, a Rock40 approach. HITMAKERS was very instrumental in putting together Rock40 conference calls. We networked every week and talked about the available records. The format did pretty well, but like a lot of niche formats, when the product dries up, you begin crutching on whatever records you can find, and you end up burning out your recurrent, gold and post power rotations.

Also, Paula Abdul, Bobby Brown, M.C. Hammer, Young M.C., and everybody else put out career albums, and that's what people wanted to dance to, so we quickly changed our approach to a more Pop/Dance lean. During the day, we'll still play Roxette, Rod Stewart and the Extreme record, but on the weekends and at night, we just pick it up on the Dance end.

## WHERE DID YOU START YOUR RADIO CAREER?

In 1978, I started in the small town called Sylva, North Carolina, which is about 50 miles south of Asheville. I started doing "Sunday Down South" and running countdown shows, gospel

tapes and stuff like that. I was a junior in high school and was real excited about being given the chance to be on the radio. A good friend of mine who worked there got me into the business.

## HOW DID YOU GET YOU FROM SYLVA. NC TO DETROIT?

There were a lot of miles and Mc Donalds hamburgers in between the jump. I went from there to working at a small AM station in Cheraw, South Carolina, for \$150 a week and all the records I could steal. It's near Florence and Myrtle Beach, SC, and it's a nice place to live. I learned a lot there. The GM was also the owner, the General Sales Manager, and he also did an airshift. In addition to that, I was doing an airshift, local news, local sports, MD, eventually PD, and I even sold some time. It really gave me a great education in all facets of the business.



From there, I worked at a little station outside of Charlotte in Monroe, NC and that's where I got my first real taste of doing Top40 radio. Some old jocks and people who had been at Big WAYS in Charlotte, back during its heyday, were now working at this radio station. R.C. Chrysler (Bob Chrysler), was the PD. He went to program WJZR in Charlotte. It was a high-energy Top40. I went to work for Bob there as Research Director, and I also did middays.

While I was on the air there, Randy Kabrich heard me. He moved to Charlotte to work for Stan and Sis Kaplan. Randy took WROQ, which had been a big album station for years, and turned that around to do Top40. I worked with Randy, J.J. McKay, Jack Murphy and Bill Catcher. We had a great air staff. Randy then left to go to Q105 in Tampa. Reggie Blackwell came in. Reggie was there for about a year, and while watching Randy and Reggie work, the programming bug really started biting me. When Stan and Sis had to sell the station, I said, "This is the best time to get out and try to find a programming job." So I typed up my programming philosophies and sent them out to a station in Fayetteville, North Carolina, which was Q98 at the time.

I programmed the station there for a year and a half, and meanwhile I kept

in touch with Chuck Beck, who, by the way, is also from Sylva. He and I had worked together at the station there, and we had kept in contact over the years. He got the programming job in Detroit and was looking for an assistant. He called me up, and I came up here and looked over the city. It's really a nice place to live, so we started working together. When he went to WAVA, I got this position.

## WAS YOUR PROGRAMMING PHILOSOPHIES AT THAT TIME ANY DIFFERENT FROM TODAY?

I was probably a little more conservative then, because it was the South, and having worked at some smaller markets, I probably would not have taken the chance on records like I will now. Basically, I like a good, entertaining station, and I hire jocks and let them do what they do best. I

don't get real bent out of shape if they don't talk about exactly what's on a liner sheet. Give them the freedom to create, let them be personalities, and play hit records that work in your market. I don't care if a record is number one in Timbuktu. If it's not working here in Detroit or whatever market I'm in, then we're not going to play it. Find your target and go for it.

## WHAT IS THE CURRENT STATUS WITH THE FOX'S PENDING SALE?

We're still looking for an owner. Bob Sherman of Sherman Broadcasting had put together a deal, but it fell through for various reasons. He disbanded his company and came back with new equity partners to put in another bid, which also fell through. It's a day-to-day thing. Every day is the deadline, and for some reason there's extensions and extensions. We're still for sale; it's been going that way for about 10 months now.

#### HOW DO YOU MANAGE TO KEEP THE STAFF MORALE UP AND MOVING FORWARD?

As I've told everybody on the airstaff, the support and promotions staffs, it's really something that we cannot control. We don't have the

option of saying who we want to buy us. We have no direct control of that situation. What we might have control over is whether the station stays Top40. If we perform to the best of our abilities, and not have a self-pity party, we might be able to show our new owner the need to retain this format. I've told people to have fun, be a professional and be glad that you're still employed, because there are a lot of people out there who are on the beach. It's a tough time. I get tons of tapes every week. Some really good people are looking for a job.

### GIVE US A BRIEF OVERVIEW OF THE MARKET.

Basically we have multiples of every format imaginable. We've got two Jazz stations, three Top40s, a slew full of ACs, a couple of Golds, three AORs, a couple of Urban stations and three News/Talk stations, so it is a very, very over-radioed market.

We share the most audience with 'HYT. We share a little bit of audience with Q95, which is the Adult Top40, and we also share a little bit of audience with WLLZ and WRIF, which are AORs, and WCSX, the Classic Rock station. Now that we're playing more Dance music, we're also sharing more of the audience with 'JLB as well.

## HOW DOES THE FOX FIT IN AS FAR AS NUMBERS GO?

It depends on what ratings survey you look at. Right now, we are consistently the #2 Top40 behind 'HYT 12+. There are various demos that we do beat them in, and in the mix somewhere is Q95. We are usually on top of the two AOR stations, and 'JLB is usually first or second in the marketplace.

## HAS THE FOX SLOGAN BEEN IDENTIFIED WITH ROCK BECAUSE OF ITS HERITAGE?

Not really. We thought about dumping it when we progressed in more of a Dance-Pop area. We thought it was a lot of extra-heavy baggage, but we really haven't found that to be true. People don't think THE FOX is a Rock slogan. I know a lot of Classic Rock stations around the country use the slogan, but it has a very good Top40 image in Detroit.

#### LET'S TALK ABOUT YOUR AIRSTAFF.

In morning drive, we've got a very funny and still growing morning show in Savage and Steve. Andy Savage was initially the night jock here and Steve Courtney was doing weekends. Andy's a good interviewer. He's very timely in doing phone bits and is well prepared, while Steve is probably one of the funniest individuals I've ever come

(Continued from previous page.) across. He's very quick, does some great character voices, and in the process of two-and-a-half years, we've molded them into a morning show.

#### AS NIGHT JOCKS OUTGROW THE NIGHT DEMO, CAN THEY SUCCESSFULLY MAKE THAT TRANSITION TO MORNINGS?

Most night jocks have always been given the freedom to communicate with their audience. It's always been "Okay, let the night jock get out there, just be crazy, do good phone bits and talk to those kids." In doing that, they've learned how to communicate, how to work the telephones and how to talk to people on a one-on-one manner and pull things out of them, which is exactly what Andy can do.

These guys have come a long, long way. The GM and I spend about an hour with them every day. We work together on what we're going to do the next day. The show is basically pre-planned, and I'm seeing a big turnaround in just their basic image.

In middays, we've got a market veteran in Karen Dalessandro. She was doing 10-2 at night for a long time, and when I came off the air about 10 months ago, we moved her to middays. Karen is very smooth and one of the best female talents out there. She does a lot of national voice-over stuff and is just a little sparkplug.

In afternoons is Marc Mitchell. He's also a Carolina boy; he's worked at WAVA in Washington, 'ZOU in Boston and in St. Louis. When we got him, he was doing mornings in Albany. He's very quick and a little left of center from time to time. He comes up with some of the most interesting analogies for various situations.

At night, from 6-10, is one of the most energetic and hottest night talents out there, The Janitor. We got him from POWER99 in Atlanta. He's doing a very good job at night with the young audience. He communicates very well and, like Andy Savage in the morning, does great phone bits.

From 10-2 at night, we've got Thrilling Paul Shilling, who has been in the market for a while. He does "Love Lines," an all-request dedication show. He's real hip to what is happening. Our overnight person is Louie Louie, from Toledo.

On the weekend, we have Spike On The Mike, who does afternoons at CK105 in Flint. We've got Joey B, Pete McRae, who's a market vet, and Freddie Cruz, formerly of WVIC in Lansing.

## DO YOU MISS BEING ON THE

Initially, no. I'd been on the air for 10 years, and since this is the first station that I've worked at that I've been able to program and not be on the air, it was kind of a relief. Now whenever I do a weekend shift in an emergency, I really enjoy it.

When you're doing an airshift six days a week forever and ever, the passion starts to diminish, but if you step back, give yourself a break, then just do a weekend shift, it becomes fun again.

#### WHAT PROMOTIONS DO YOU

## DO TO MAINTAIN A HEAVY STREET PRESENCE?

We do as many club nights as possible, and a lot of to-be-noticed type promotions. We've got an amusement park on an island called Boblo. A couple of times during the summer, we'll take listeners out on the Boblo Boat, play music and party.

Our van is on the street every day. We send one of our promotions people, called Captain Intersection, out in the van all the time. He'll pull over at a certain location, get on the air, and the first x number of people who stop by, get free movie tickets, concert tickets, T-shirts, whatever.

We've been going through a heat wave here, so we've taken over a frozen yogurt store or a Baskin Robbins ice cream store. He'll get on the phone and say the first 99 people who come by, get free ice cream. We do a lot of that stuff. People are expecting them now; they're calling us, asking where the Captain is going to be today. It has created a real strong street buzz.

Any time there is a big concert, our van is there. We also have a three-story inflatable fox that we take to all club nights, concert events and any place that people will let us put him up.

## HOW LARGE OF A PROMOTION STAFF DO YOU HAVE?

We've got three basic Promotion Directors: Deanna Kaminski is our Promotion Director, Ann Boss handles the administrative end, and Terry McCabe is Captain Intersection who does a lot of the physical stuff. We also have a promotions staff of about 10 people who go out and decorate for events, who put up the inflatable fox and helps Captain whenever we send him out. We've got a fairly good-sized promotions staff and a very good one.

Another person who has been very instrumental in our success is our Production Director, Paul Turner, who is also from Sylva, North Carolina. Paul has the voice of God. A protege of Bumper Morgan, he was the production voice down at the POWER PIG before coming here. Being around the boys from JACOR, he has picked up a lot of twisted ideas.

He is very creative in his own sense. I basically will give him a skeleton or a few bullet points as far as promos we want to do; he'll sit in his own little world and come out with the most phenomenally twisted, creative promotions.

there? What are people into?" The doors are never shut. Sometimes, the involvement, depending on who's around the station, can be limited. The sales people can be out making calls, so we try to let everybody know when we're going to do stuff. I try to pull the jocks together and encourage their input because a lot of people have worked in various markets.

## DO YOU KEEP YOUR SALES STAFF EDUCATED AS TO THE STATION PHILOSOPHY?

Our General Sales Manager, Mike Schiefer, is very good to work with on a programming basis. Michael came from a radio family, so he knows the programming side as well. Our GM is not your typical GM, either. He has a good programming mind as well. We do get the support of sales when we need it, and we in turn keep them abreast of what we're trying to do. They are, from a programming aspect, pretty well educated in the philosophies and ideologies of Top40 radio.

## SO OTHER THAN SELLING JUST NUMBERS, THEY'RE SELLING THE ATTITUDE AND THE LIFESTYLE OF THE FOX.

Exactly. They're selling results and what we can do for that particular client. Some of our best things were not number-driven. We can go to a club night and draw 3,000 people. It doesn't matter whether you've got a six share or a two share, all the clubowner knows is that you've sold out his nightclub, so he's going to go with you again.

## WHAT DO YOU SEE FOR YOURSELF IN THE NEXT YEAR OR SO?

All of us here would like some form of normalcy in the station's sales situation. I don't think that the sale is doom or gloom. If somebody buys us and we change format, so be it. The paranoia that everybody went through the first couple of months has really subsided. People are moving on. It's almost to the point where we get tired of people asking us about it. We're just going onward and upward. We're trying to become Detroit's #1 Top40 radio station with the limited resources that we have and just do it with our people.

## HOW IS YOUR FAMILY? ARE THEY SUPPORTIVE OF YOU?

Very much so. My wife loves me and my dog doesn't bite me on the ankles.

## DO YOU HAVE ANY CLOSING WORDS?

It's definitely been a learning experience. I know that the radio industry is not in the best shape right now; a lot of broadcasting companies are having a tough time and a lot of stations are being sold. I was talking to Chuck Beck the other day. I said, "If we're lucky, we'll only have to go through a station sale once." If it happens, it happens. It's nothing to get wigged out over. If you're good, you'll land on your feet.

## HOW ABOUT LOW-COST PROMOTIONS THAT GENERATE A LOT OF STREET TALK?

The morning show does a lot of tobe-noticed street events. Back during the elections we would have the Savage and Steve yes-no poll. They would be standing on the side of the road and you had to flash your headlights or honk your horn to vote yes or no. During Halloween, we had Pumpkin bowling, Pumpkin seed spitting, Pumpkin basketball and a carving competition. We did the same thing at a Christmas tree lot.

Every once in a while, we'll have the Savage and Steve yard sale. The state of Michigan is not in the most healthy shape financially, so we decided to help out the State deficit by hosting a yard and bake sale. We sold anything we could get our hands on. People donated cases of motor oil or a free makeover at a beauty salon. We were selling the stuff for five and ten cents, and we raised a couple hundred dollars. We donated the money to the State to help with the deficit.

We'll take over a beauty salon and give away haircuts for 99 cents, with all monies going to Muscular Dystrophy or something like that. We also do a lot of mall events. The weather can get really extreme here, so people go to malls during the weekends and just hang out. You've got a very big audience there that is very Top40-oriented.

#### IS HE THE VOICE OF THE FOX?

He basically does our promos, and Mark Driscoll does our sweepers.

## DO YOU HOLD REGULAR PROMOTION MEETINGS ON A WEEKLY BASIS?

We schedule two meetings a week, usually on a Monday and a Thursday, and we also have emergency meetings if needed. At least once every two months, we hold a marketing meeting to do a lot of brainstorming of new creative ideas and set the docket for the next couple of months. We don't want to miss key opportunities.

I practically hold promotions meetings in my office every day. Sales people come in with, "Let's do this, let's do that." Some PDs shut their office door to sales people and don't want to mess with them, but a lot of good promotional ideas and opportunities have come from the sales staff. Not only does it benefit the station on a financial end, but it can also help us on the creative end. It's just a matter of communicating, keeping your brain moving and your ears open.

## DO YOU INVITE EVERYBODY INTO THESE MEETINGS? CAN THE RECEPTIONIST OFFER HER TWO CENTS' WORTH?

Sure. I'll go up to the receptionist and say, "Hey, we're going to be doing something. What are you hearing out


