minem is not only a movie star, he's dominating the record charts as well, with two hit albums, giving Jimmy Iovine's Interscope label group four entries in the Top 10.

Shady/Interscope/UMG Strx's 8 Mile spends its second week at #1, topping the debut from NSYNC's Justin Timberlake on Jive (#2) and Interscope labelmates U2's Best of 1990-2000 (#3), while The Eminem Show remains strong at #9.

Wherehouse's Bob Bell put on his rubber gloves, grabbed the bleach and hacked off Ralphie's head and hands before adding: "This is a huge solo debut for Justin Timberlake, which would easily have been #1 in any normal week. But, of course, any week where there's an Eminem record is not a normal week. This shows he's a real artist who's going to be around for a long time."

DGC's Nirvana restrospective held at #7, making it the fourth Interscope Top 10 entry. The HITS list is rounded out by RCA's Christina Aguilera (#4), Arista's Santana (#5), WB's Faith Hill (#6), Philips' Andrea Bocelli debuting at #8 and RCA's Dave Matthews Band, whose live album enters at #10, giving Nipper a pair of Top 10s.

The Q4 release slate kicked into high gear this week, with 12 albums scoring more than 100k in sales, including WB's Jaheim, debuting at #11, while Riviera's Insane Clown Posse just missed the magic six-figure mark with 96k and a #13 bow.

Other Top 30 debuts were scored by ATO/RCA's David Gray (#17), Murder Inc./IDJ's Irv Gotti Presents the Remixes (#26), Interscope's Wallflowers (#28) and Columbia/CRG's Tony Bennett/k.d. lang (#30).

Added Bell: "We also saw very strong sales this week from U2, Dave Matthews, Insane Clown Posse and David Gray. The performance of the last several weeks of new releases has been very encouraging for the overall holiday season. Now will you please tell the chubby old man with the beard and the red suit to move away from the store entrance? He's scaring away customers."

Double-digit increases in sales were registered by J's Rod Stewart (11%), Blue Note's Norah Jones (11%) and several country acts whose names escape us.

They're being rewarded for the channel's success as the top-rated cable network for the 12-24-yearold demo. MTV/VH1 President Entertainment Brian Graden took a moment from scouring David and Liza's oven to make the announcement.

Tom Calderone "Wasn't Built in a Day" is promoted to Executive Vice President Music & Talent Programming for MTV/ MTV2. He will continue to oversee the Music & Talent Programming group and staple Steve-O's gonads to his leg.

minem can raise his middle finger with pride. The hip-hop superstar is #1 at the box office as well as on the HITS albums and MPS charts this week, after the stunning \$51 million opening for Universal's 8 Mile.

Eight million people bought tickets to see Eminem in his first starring role (he had a small part with mentor Dr. Dre in last year's *The Wash*), even more than the 7 million units in sales generated by *The Eminem Show*. That means the film, with Interscope Geffen A&M's Jimmy Iovine as co-producer and Em's manager Paul Rosenberg as one of the executive producers, succeeded in bringing in a whole new audience for the rapper.

Said Rosenberg: "We're out of our minds. I thought it would do well, but to have the secondlargest opening for an R-rated movie ever is beyond what anybody expected. It just keeps raising the bar."

According to exit polls, Eminem didn't merely attract his fans, he connected with a whole new audience. While a majority of the audience (65%) was, not surprisingly, under 25, 53% were female, which runs contrary to his angry-youngman rep. Even the right-wingers, previously a thorn in his side, have either been won over or now view Saddam Hussein as the bigger threat.

The \$41 million movie, loosely based on the rapper's troubled Detroit upbringing, received critical raves as well. Said *Newsday*: "Eminem possesses a gift for projecting honest inner turmoil, the kind born of poverty, of neglect of economic stasis and of amorphous racial identity." We don't know what it means, either, but is shore sounds purdy.

8 Mile's first-week total was the largest ever for a movie opening in fewer than 3,000 theaters (the actual total was 2,470). It's also the most successful for any rock-star biopic. Prince's 1984 Purple Rain took in \$7.7 million at 917 theatres on its way to a total of \$68.4 million, a gross, adjusted for ticket-price inflation, equal to about \$116 million today, which 8 Mile will easily surpass.

The question now is whether the record business can capitalize on this benchmark in multimedia packaging. The Shady/Interscope/UMG Soundtrax album, which features three Eminem tracks, including the #1 song "Lose Yourself," sold 746k its first week out, and that was before the movie opened. This week, it did better than 500k, bringing its two-week total to 1.2 million—which means there are still around 6.8 million people who've seen the movie but haven't purchased the album. While the ubiquitous rap music by Shady artists Obie Trice and 50 Cent—as well as cuts from Nas, Jay-Z, Macy Gray, Xzibit and Gangstarrplays an important role in the film, the expected payoff of Em singing "Lose Yourself," promised in the trailer, never actually occurs in the movie.

Indeed, the final shot of Marshall Mathers walking off like he's John Wayne in *The* Searchers could be setting up a sequel, but Rosenberg insists he and Eminem have already accomplished what they set out to do: proving the rapper can act.

"I'd be very, very surprised if we took this story further. Will he do something else after the success of this movie? How could he not?"

few years ago, the idea of 30% marketshare was unthinkable in the music biz. Then came UMG. The Doug Morris-led music group's 30% share looks like it's headed even higher as we approach the halfway point of the fourth quarter, with Interscope's 8 Mile soundtrack propelling (and riding) the wave of Eminem-mania a phenomenon that's also boosting sales of The Eminem Show, the year's biggest seller at around 7 million domestically.

Interscope isn't the only label that's getting the job done for UMG. Island Def Jam's new Jay-Z release will bolster an already impressive 2002, which will continue to see Ashanti sell through Q4.

BMG's second-place standing has a lot to do with Arista, which added Santana to Avril Lavigne, while RCA's Christina Aguilera is helping that label's fourth-quarter push. And although the teenpop boom has subsided, Justin Timberlake's sales won't hurt the bottom line at Jive.

Sony's in third place, as Columbia remains the model of consistency on the label side, posting a better than 8% marketshare by crossing the Dixie Chicks, breaking young artists like John Mayer and schooling the rest of the industry about the commercial power of veteran acts like Bruce Springsteen and James Taylor. Sister label Epic's 6% share should grow in the second half of Q4 via Jennifer Lopez, Audioslave and Pearl Jam.

WMG is expecting a strong quarter from WB's Faith Hill and should see its marketshare increase with new ones from Atlantic's Matchbox Twenty and Elektra's Missy Elliott.

Fifth-place EMI, which continues to rebuild its North American operations under Alain Levy and David Munns, has a phenomenon on its hands with Blue Note's Norah Jones. The Q4 slate contains a pair of Beatles, as Capitol comes with a Paul McCartney live set and George Harrison's final album.





The roll call for this Tuesday (11/12) is topped by Goldmind/Elektra rap queen

Missy Elliott, whose new Under Construction album features one of the biggest hits of her career, "Work It." Arista's TLC, who collaborated with Elliott on tracks for both of their new albums,

return minus the late Lisa "Left Eye" Lopes (who does appear on four tracks) with 3D, their first album since '99's Fanmail, which sold a total of 4.7 million OTC. Roc-A-Fella/IDJ rapper Jay-Z's The Blueprint 2: The Gift and the Curse, is Def Jam's first-ever double-CD. The rapper also has a track, "Back in the Day," on Elliott's album. Other R&B artists on




tap include Def Soul/IDJ soulsters Dru Hill, whose last album topped 2.2 million OTC and Terror Squad/Atl.'s Fat Joe.





limmy De Castro, the radio veteran who signed on as the troubled online giant's President of Interactive Services a mere seven months ago, is ankling the company in pursuit of "new opportunities," AOL reports.



NEAR TRUTHS

BY I.B. BAD, LOS ANGELES

Lips flapping over the huge \$51.2 million opening weekend for Universal Pictures' 8 Mile and, of course, the #1 Shady/Interscope album (now in its third week), as conversations turn to Jimmy lovine, whose guiding hand in turning his #1 artist into a #1 movie star for the Vivendi Universal mothership has sent his stock soaring. Yet with Eminem mania at its peak—his Eminem Show is already easily the biggest album of the year-many pundits scratching their heads as to why more of the approximately 9 million people who saw the movie over the weekend aren't buying the soundtrack. As the album cools to a still-strong (and #1) 505k this week, those same pundits wondering whether there will be a resurgence after the initial blast. Regardless, some believe this kind of multimedia event marketing could be poised to become the template for future releases... And with Eminem leading the charge, lovine's IGA (which includes DreamWorks) is #1 with 9.7% marketshare, as the current-album race enters the home stretch. That's a healthy 1.5% ahead of Don lenner's Columbia (8.2%) and Lyor Cohen's IDJ (8.1%), which are in a virtual dead heat for #2. (Once again, Columbia is the frontrunner in the overall category, which includes catalog, where the label also has an 8.2% share.) With one yearto-date marketshare point currently worth approximately 5.5 million albums, IGA is about 8.25 million units ahead, with Nirvana, U2, Tupac and half of Audioslave joining Eminem to drive a strong finish. Jockeving for fourth, meanwhile, is Epic (6%), looking to catch Warner Bros. (6.2%). With a major portion of the year's registerringing still ahead, this could get interesting... What two major labels could be on the verge of playing musical chairs with certain members of their A&R staffs, all clients of Steve Moir?... The growing trend among top label execs of giving themselves "executive producer" credits on certain of their labels' albums said to be meeting with some snickering from the producer rank and file... Much chatter about the Axl Rose show cancellation, with Clear Channel brass said to be more than a little nervous about the major advance they reportedly peeled for the singer's services... Some of the biggest music executives said to be already talking free-agency as their deals come up for renewal at the end of '03...

HITS dialogue with
Trans Continental's
Lou Pearlman

Whether you call him a svengali or Satan, one thing you have to say about Lou Pearlman—in business, he's pretty darn savvy. Born in Queens, the son of a dry-cleaner, Pearlman showed his skill as an entrepreneur early on, buying up his neighborhood newspaper routes as a kid before parlaying his love of flight into a helicopter commuter service, then an aviation leasing company with a fleet of planes, jets and blimps. Always a music fan—he is Art Garfunkel's cousin and was in a variety of bands as a teenager—Lou turned his love into a full-fledged business, forming and then breaking such acts as Backstreet Boys and NSYNC.

These days, Pearlman is as busy as ever, promoting his newly published Bands, Brands & Billions: My Top 10 Rules for Making Any Business Go Platinum (McGraw Hill), in which he gives the kind of practical advice that applies to any undertaking, not just the music industry. He talks about creating NSYNC as "Pepsi" to the Backstreet Boys' "Coke," and details how to recognize and exploit gaps in the marketplace. After receiving the World Business Award 2002 from Mikhall Gorbachev in Vienna earlier this month (Richard Branson's was last year's winner), Pearlman's Orlando-based Trans Continental Entertainment family will do more than \$100 million in 2002. The company now includes a state-of-the-art recording studio, a record company, talent management and marketing divisions, a music publishing arm and a talent roster that includes new acts O-Town, Natural and C-Note as well as veterans like Jose Feliciano, KC and the Sunshine Band and Kenny Rogers. In addition, he still owns the aviation business and two NYPD restaurants (New York Pizza & Deli) in the Orlando area.

Recovering from a recent kidney infection, Pearlman is still optimistic about the record business, despite the apparent end of the teenpop boom and the non-stop haranguing of *HITS*' own boy band idle, *Roy "NSUNK"* Trakin.

Are you still bullish on the record business?

I'm bullish on the business, though not necessarily on the act of selling records. But I am bullish on the fact that we're doing quite well with our artists. Our new group, Natural, is putting the "band" back in boy band. They're actually breaking big over in Europe. Their album is #2 in Germany.

So you're going back to your original strategy of breaking groups overseas first.

If it ain't broke, don't fix it.

Isn't teenpop on its way out at this point?

Everybody asks me when this boy band thing's going to end. I know exactly when. When God stops making little girls. The music style will change, from pop to R&B to hip-hop to poprock. What will never change is teenage girls loving good-looking guys.

The one thing you've never been able to achieve is giving these acts longevity, like the Beatles ushered teenyboppers through maturity. How can you get the audience to grow with you?

You're into the next generation of teenpop, like Avril Lavigne, for example.

That's right. Natural have credibility with the disc jockeys and program directors because they're a real band. We released Natural's single, "Put Your Arms Around Me," last year ourselves, and it went gold. We distributed it through Madacy and Handleman. We have a deal on them now with BMG International, who are doing a wonderful job.

When you started Trans Continental, you wanted to keep as much in-house as possible for control. Does that extend now to having your own record label?

You have to be selective. Not every label is going to take you Top 10. Not every label will make your act a priority. That's why we've been working with BMG. We have that experience with Backstreet and NSYNC, which were originally broken by BMG Germany. That's where they got their first gold records.

It must have amused you to see the success of American Idol after your own Making the Band.

Absolutely. I know Simon Fuller and Simon Cowell. They followed our concept with Making the Band, bringing in the au-

We figure a boy band is going to have about a five-year run. After that, it's all about, can they sell records? Do they have great music? Do the fans want to grow with them? Look at the Rolling Stones or Pink Floyd. The bottom line is, if they want to continue, they will. If the music's good, people will grow with you. If it's not, you're going to die out. Unfortunately, these boy bands die out because they don't have good songs. Now, look at NSYNC and Backstreet; the youngest member from each group's going solo. God bless them and let's see what happens. Hopefully, they do well and keep going.

You still have a financial interest in both bands. Of course. We're still making our money.

Do you second-guess any of the career moves either group has made?

No, I'm asked my opinion. I just saw Chris Kirkpatrick yesterday. The bottom line is, I'm cordial with everybody. The hardest part is breaking the group, which I do. The easiest part is running it.

You keep reiterating in this book, once a project is off and running, you sort of lose interest. You'd rather delegate responsibility and then go off and develop something new.

I'm continually making my money. But it's not only about the money. The challenge is in breaking new groups. For example, Natural play their own instruments. I love watching them break in Asia, the Philippines, Singapore... dience. I think Simon Cowell gives it an edge, which spices it up a bit. I think you need that.

How did you feel when Clive Calder negotiated his \$3 billion payout with BMG?

I like Clive Calder. He was there at the beginning. When I put \$3 million into Backstreet, he came in and helped me out on the record side. His biggest act at the time was R. Kelly. It was great to see all that happening. With Backstreet, NSYNC and Innosense...Britney [Spears] would have been the youngest member of the band, but she decided to go solo. Because he had the machine, and invested all that money over the years to develop that machine, with the help of Mutt Lange, Barry Weiss and the whole team over there, they certainly deserve what they got.

Do you have any ideas as to how to cure the music industry's current doldrums?

My belief is the record industry will change. You can't just sell a CD. You have to sell an album via a book with a nice presentation of the artist. That nicely bound book is what you're buying. And then you get the album as a freebie.

So the disc itself is a loss-leader to sell other merchandise which accrues around the brand name.

You have to brand your artists. The record industry has to wake up and smell the coffee. That's the only way you're going to sell to the young market. The older fans aren't into downloading or CD-burning; they're into buying what they like.

But for the young masses that can download every single or album they want, you have to offer something more.

Are these overall deals, like the one EMI just did with Robbie Williams, where they're partners in touring, merchandising, etc., the future of the record industry?

That's the way it has to go. The days of the record companies selling millions of albums and people lining up to buy them are over. Not when there are downloads available in advance. You have to give them added value, like in the form of a book that

make it, and I make \$50 million, what's the problem with that?

People don't understand you're putting up your own money. Record companies are putting up shareholders' money.

I put my money where my mouth is. If I didn't, I would be the one suffering. I don't mind renegotiating, like in sports. There's a legal way to do that, and we settled everything amicably. I can see any of our artists and they all give me big hugs. And why not? I made them all millionaires. The problem is, in this day and age, people come out of the woodwork, trying to at-

includes all the background and detail. Or an enhanced CD, or special access to a website. We have our own website for aspiring talent, Tctalent.com. Models, actors, musicians have a chance to make themselves known. One day, the record companies will turn around and say, "We should make a deal with Lou Pearlman. He's bringing us the talent." They're too busy worrying about their jobs to be concerned with where the talent is coming from. I don't just spot and develop talent, I create it. And the record companies haven't realized that.

Isn't there something a little weird in building an assembly line with human beings?

We've sold 170 million albums to date. That's a nice tinkle to the cash register. What we do is cultivate the talent. We don't inject into their heads or throats the ability to sing and dance. God does that. What we do is take that talent and cultivate it.

What you've shown is success in this business isn't just about talent, but a lot of perspiration, discipline, routine and hard work, too.

Absolutely. Making the Band was a behind-the-scenes look at what you have to go through. That's something you don't see on American Idol. We were the first with the reality-based TV shows. We were first with the boot-camp, assembly-line method...whatever you want to call it. We're here to stay. We've proven ourselves. The market's not going to die. As long as we keep coming back with good music. O-Town's new single is getting a lot of airplay. We just keep doing what we do best

Did you actually get laid out of this whole thing? [Laughs] I better have.

You never had children of your own?

I never did, but I almost got married twice. My girlfriend now is a nurse.

You said she took care of you after your kidney operation. Right, exactly.

Are you upset with the way you've been portrayed in the press? It's like I said in the book, if I can make you \$10-20 million by putting up \$3 million that you won't have to pay back if we don't

tack whatever success you have. Lawyers try to get in there to get their piece of the action. That's our society.

What's your take on the record industry's future?

The problem with the record industry, plain and simple, is that there are no more new formats for people to re-purchase the back catalogues. They didn't understand how deep this downloading or CD-burning would affect it. You can't buy a computer without a CD-burning capacity. Any kind of copyguards are useless. These record companies should be talking to us... We're the marketing guys. We're out there in the trenches. They should be asking themselves, what's the next step? Which is where my extra-added value comes in. You can't download a book with glossy pages. In the case of Bertelsmann, they have Random House and Doubleday. They have the capability to publish a book and manufacture a record.

Are you happy with BMG?

Yes. But we also do business with Universal, ArtistDirect and other labels as well. We find BMG most responsive to our needs. They've gone out there and taken chances, while others haven't.

What if BMG asked you to come in and run their operations? I'm not interested in that. Record companies today will be a thing of the past. They're dinosaurs. They have to come up with an extra edge. It has to do more than just sell records. And that's what we do. We're providing that edge. We're making things happen. That's what we're offering to the consumer.

Is it fair to have that kind of control over your acts, managing them and acting as the production company?

We're not allowed to do both. We're managing Natural, Jose Feliciano, Nelson, KC and the Sunshine Band, LFO's Rich Cronin, all of whom we don't have production deals with.

Are you still in the aviation business?

Sure we are. We have 49 jet, 747s, 727s and corporate Gulfstream jets that we still operate today. We're also in the food business. We have NYPD, New York Pizza & Deli, two of which are here in Orlando. That's where we held the party at which we presented NSYNC with their first German gold record.



So I introduced the band...and it's a very smart, very YOUNG emo-looking crowd, and before I went up, every time Tyson from the band made a soundcheck appearance on stage, this Beatles-in-'64 scream went up from the crowd. When Peter Gunn took on music responsibilities at the newly signed-on KLEC in 1999, HITS APM Editor Mike Morrison then promodweeb at E Pluribus Unum Recordings—got Gigolo Aunts for their first birthday bash. "There were about 20 people there, including staff," said Gunn. "But the Aunts rocked hard." That was then. Now, the station's show lineups are populated with names like Staind, Disturbed, Godsmack and Alien Ant Farm, and are attended by thousands. And the station that brought PoMo to the home of our last President is now regularly Top Three 18-34, and has hit #1 on several occasions. When his boss took a powder for a gig in Baton Rouge, Peter was elevated to interim PD. (The three-month probationary period is routine. Gunn has been running the station all along!) Peter's first move as the official man in charge? "I'd like to introduce Tear-away Pants Thursdays. If you love velcro, please forward me your resume and tape."





SEND THE PAIN BELOW: There are few things I find more exhilarating than seeing an artist make an intimate connection with a live audience. When Ivana played me the Corey Taylor song "Bother" from the Spider-man ST seven months ago, I would have never thought that some day I'd be standing in the House of Blues with a roomful of Stone Sour fans singing along to every word with their fists in the air. It was crazy. He was actually using the crowd's collective voice to harmonize with. They also went nuts for Chevelle and reciprocated the band's energetic show with much pit love... I also enjoy watching an underdog dominate. Seven years ago, four unknown guys in Tallahassee formed a band named Naked Toddler. They signed with a label nobody had ever heard of, and now Creed and Wind-up have sold over 20 million records together. The band is just as relevant today, with only Metallica, Puddle of Mudd, Godsmack and Staind played more at Active so far this year. There are 12 Creed songs that have been played 2000+ times in '02. Given the HUGE impact week Alan Galbraith had with "Weathered" and all the early adds, this one will definitely make it 13. **KQRC**'s **Don Jantzen** turned down the monitors long enough to shout: "It's the best song on the album and we're stoked it finally got delivered to Rock radio. Top 40 radio can kiss my Irish ass"... Everyone I talk to loves the Ra song. Even a very tired J.J. Jeffries perked up when saying: "They're very hot here at KUPD. 'Do you Call My Name' is a staff favorite, and we get reaction every time we play it." J's back on

the air doing mornings and was spent from the previous night's bus trip with listeners to the Pop Sux Tour. Getting up before dawn for the morning show and trudging through the sleep-deprived day, handling PD responsibilities is rough, but as J says, "so worth it because I'm that much closer to the audience now. 





By the way, Chrissie and Co.'s new CD, Loose Screw, streets this week... Redline continues to smoke as KINK, KTHX and WMPS add Brad's "Shinin'" and WMMM and WOKI hit their great Chris Robinson record... Congrats to Jive's Lorraine Caruso on picking up Paul Simon adds at KINK and WTTS ('member Lorraine was MD at WNEW when it was a great rock station? We love you, gurl!!) ... I saw Jason Mraz on Scott Register's Reg's Coffeehouse playlist and emailed him that I love Mraz. He replied, "Me too. 'Curbside Prophet' is a smash!" Incidentally, Dave Matthews, being a major Mraz fan, invited him to open select dates on the next leg of his never-ending tour... Watch for a package from Or Music, a new label started by longtime Epic A&R man (and Adult music fanatic) Michael Caplan. His first signing is a young singer-songwriter named Essence. When you hear her song "Sleeping With the Driver," you'll be looking for space on your list for this sure-fire reaction record... Remember those Ike Reilly demos I told you about a few weeks ago? His new "Good Good Feeling" could be the "feel-good" hit of the year. Look for it on his new record, Pollyanna, which is on your desk now... hitsmm@aol.com...

Pretenders, Loose Screw (Artemis): Nearly 23 years after kicking off the 1980s with a spectacular debut, Chrissie Hynde remains as cool as ever. Hynde's tough and tender sides are each in full effect on her longtime band's 10th album, which comes off as a sustained confrontation with a wayward significant other. Loose Screw opens with a blast of judgmental rage in the rocker "Lie to Me," but a number of the tracks that fol-

low, including single "Complex Person," roll along on willowy reggaefied grooves, allowing Hynde to project vulnerability in a disarmingly candid way. The best of these songs, like "The Losing" and "I Should Of," contain the assertiveness of soul music and the victimized plaintiveness of pure country, but refracted through Hynde's dynamic sensibility, it's all rock & roll. (BS)

The Streets, Original Pirate Material (Vice/Atlantic):

"This ain't your archetypal street sound," boasts 23-yearold one-man band Mike Skinner over the plaintive horns and pungent ska beat of "Let's Push This Thing Forward," the first single from his brash debut. Dubbed the Eminem of Cockney rap, he's more like an Ian Dury-esque bloke (the jaunty "Don't Mug Yourself") crossed with the neobeat poetry scat of Patti Smith ("Weak Become Heroes")



and pre-Swept Away Guy Ritchie (the testosterone-fueled "Geezers Need Excitement"). Carrying the banner of a post-rave variant on house music called garage—which, unlike its American punk counterpart, combines hip-hop, two-step, funk, dub, reggae, jazz and soul—this U.K. MC from the heart of Birmingham manages to fill those grimy industrial Streets with a dance-floor celebration. (RT)



Halo Friendlies, Get Real (Tooth & Nail): From the opening power-pop attack of single "Sellout," it's apparent the four gals who make up the HF mean business, and their self-described "girl sass-pop" rocks infectiously. Produced by Muffs singer/guitarist Kim Shattuck and featuring Lo-Ball bassist Ginger Reyes, this debut full-length alternately emphasizes the power and the pop, coming across as an edgier Go-Go's or Bangles, with

more lyrical depth and melodic sense. Besides "Sellout," the rock is showcased on hard-hitters "Run Away" and "Disappear," while the big, swingy pop chorus of "Just Like You" redefines catchy with TV-theme conciseness. And don't miss the lovely, hushed "Unsaid Goodbyes." Listener-friendly and then some. (JO)

Snakeoil Revival, Sour Mash (Whiskey Records): You might get the impression from the booze-label cover art, album title and label name that this briskly selling indie disc was a hard-driving, Southern-accented rock set full of songs about excess, garnished with bitchin' Strat soios. You'd be correct. These SoCal hellraisers kick out the greasy riffage with a balls-out enthusiasm that will gladden the heart of Zep and Black Crowes



fans, driven largely by Oliver Fiedler's fretwork and Mark Velasco's boogie-inflected drumming. Singer Wil Kimbrel's 100-proof, upper-register vocals lend authority to barnburners like "Laid Low (Again)," "Hey Now" and "I Feel Alright." (SG)



I'm not a fan of the artist, but I think the remix could work. So, for all you rhythic guys, get with "Breath." Both the Sean Paul and E-40 remixes make a difference... I love R. Kelly's "Ignition." You can't go wrong with classic Robert anywhere anytime. And I don't wanna hear about the trial shit. I'm over it already. The man is an icon who creates timeless

Franco's doing a "fabulous" job (corny pun intended)... And finally, Snoop's "From Tha Chuuuch To Da Palace" is moving nicely for Danny. 
There's plenty of hand-wringing going on about the seismic changes happening at Tower Records. In the wake industry giant and chain founder Russ Solomon's retirement, the exit of the beloved 35-year vet Stan Goman and the addition of turnaround specialist Betsy Burton as interim CEO. Tower just announced a 15% cut in personnel at the corporate level. President Michael Solomon characterizes the changes as a rebirth. Stressing that he's been promoting from within, Solomon sees it as a passing of the torch. "I would call it the beginning of an era. These changes have allowed some very talented young executives to rise into a position of power and control." Solomon also takes umbrage with the characterization that the company is now being run by the bank. "That's simply not true. First of all, I haven't spoken to any member of the bank since we closed [escrow]. The banks wanted us to make some fundamental changes. And what they insisted upon was that we hire someone like Betsy

Burton. They had no influence on whom we interviewed. They did approve her. But she's really more of a consultant. We are calling her CEO because she needs to be empowered to make these very difficult decisions, which quite frankly, would be very hard for me to make." Solomon expects Burton to stay no longer than 18 months. He puts the 15% cuts in corporate staff into perspective: "Bear in mind that we also cut our sales in half by the other segment of our reorganization [the sale of the Japan stores]. So much of our foreign operation depended on the corporate staff in Sacramento." He added: "There will be no wholesale closings of stores. I can assure you of that. We are evaluating the performance of stores, and frankly we do have some that are underperforming." But he says that even for those stores, it would depend on the status of the lease before it would be closed. "From what we've already looked at, it won't be more than a smattering of stores that will be affected"... Those investment groups that wanted to dismantle Liquid Audio and sell it for parts instead of letting the merger with Alliance Entertainment go through won out. Very shortsighted as we see it. Does this mean AEC's valuable Red Dot Network and AMG might not be spun off as separate companies now? Word has it AEC will be part of EMI's download program. Don't be surprised to see AEC make another play into digital distribution sooner than later.




